SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

SILAS M. NEWTON is president of Kansas Western Pipeline Company, Denver, Colorado, which is a small oil company with three small producing oil wells but no pipeline. NEWTON receives on average about \$200 per month from this corporation. NEWTON reportedly drilling oil well near Los Angeles, California, at present time. NEWTON believed formerly to have received financial backing from [Redacted] New York City. NEWTON reportedly also associated in business with [Redacted] Wyoming. NEWTON well known to [Redacted] Kansas. NEWTON reportedly has made no disloyal or un-American statements in or near McCracken, Kansas. NEWTON maintains no personal bank account at Citizens State Bank, McCracken. The Newton Development Company, of which SILAS M. NEWTON is head official, maintains account at Union National Bank, Wichita, Kansas, but nothing of a suspicious nature appears concerning this account.

DETAILS:

At McCracken, Kansas

[redacted] Assistant Cashier of the Citizens State Bank, McCracken, Kansas, upon interview advised that SILAS M. NEWTON was well known to him and although he did not carry a personal account with this bank, he did do business with the bank as president of the Kansas Western Pipeline Company, which company maintains an account at the Citizens State Bank at McCracken. [redacted] stated that NEWTON was the "promoter" type of individual and was more of an oil promoter. He confidentially advised that in his opinion, NEWTON [redacted] [redacted] stated after referring to the records of the Citizens State Bank that no sums of money have been sent by NEWTON to [redacted] the Subject of this case, from the account of the Kansas Western Pipeline Company in the Citizens State Bank at McCracken. The only withdrawals from this account appeared to be withdrawals of from \$100 to \$300, in favor of SILAS M. NEWTON, and smaller sums of money payable to employees of the Kansas Western Pipeline Company who are working on the three wells located in the vicinity of McCracken. [redacted] advised that Mr. NEWTON does not receive any set salary from this company, but draws on the account of this company according to his needs. He stated that usually the checks will run between \$100 and \$500, and that NEWTON usually cashes these checks at the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, and the Brown Palace Hotel in Denver, Colorado.

[redacted] stated that the oil produced by the three oil wells owned by the Kansas Western Pipeline Company is sold to the Shallow Water Refining Company, a branch of the Atlantic Refining Company, and that the deposits in the account of this company at the Citizens State Bank are from the sale of this oil.

[redacted] advised after referring to the records of the bank, that the address of the Kansas Western Pipeline is 908 Equitable Building, Denver, Colorado. In addition to being affiliated with this company, [redacted] advised that Mr. NEWTON is also president of the Kansas-Wyoming Oil Company at Denver, Colorado,

of the Newton Development Company of Denver, Colorado, and is also president of an oil company the name of which [redacted] did not know, which is drilling a well in California near the ocean.

[redacted] stated he believed that the location of these drilling operations is in the vicinity of Los Angeles. He stated that he had no definite information on this. According to [redacted] NEWTON formerly was connected with the Oriental Refining Company of Denver, Colorado, and also was associated in the oil business with [redacted]

[redacted] advised that Mr. NEWTON had been financed in some of his promotion schemes and operations through J. H. CARPENTER of New York, a financier, who he stated has been reported to him as the owner of the building in which the Columbia Broadcasting Company is located. He advised that his information at the present time is that Mr. CARPENTER is dead.

[redacted] stated that during the time NEWTON was in Kansas he had as his [redacted]

[redacted] stated that [redacted] know more about NEWTON'S business and private affairs than any other individual in the State of Kansas. [redacted] stated that during the time NEWTON was in Kansas, he lived intermittently in Ness City, Kansas, at the Hotel Max . He stated his permanent address, however, appears to be the Brown Palace Hotel in Denver, Colorado, but that he also spends considerable time at the Knickerbocker Hotel and Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles or Hollywood, California.

[redacted] stated that NEWTON is a personable and likeable type of individual, that he appears to be a good American citizen, has no accent in his speech, and has never made any un-American or disloyal or unsympathetic remarks in McCracken, Kansas, or in the presence of [redacted] which would cause him to believe that he was otherwise than a good American. He advised that Mr. NEWTON displayed considerable interest in the last Presidential election and that his political remarks during that election were in favor of the Republican presidential candidate.

[redacted] advised that NEWTON has never resided in McCracken, has never borrowed money from the Citizens State Bank, and maintains a very low balance in the bank at McCracken. He stated that the account amounts to only a transfer account, and that approximately as fast as money is taken in it is paid out to the employees of the company operating the oil wells and Mr. NEWTON. [redacted] advised

that it was about six weeks prior to May 16, 1941, that a withdrawal or deposit appeared in this account.

[redacted] stated that the Newton Development Company, of which Mr. NEWTON is president, has banking connections in Wichita, Kansas, but he was unable to recall the name of the bank that these connections were with.

At Wichita, Kansas

[redacted] Cashier of the Kansas State Bank; [redacted]  
Assistant Cashier of the Southwest National Bank; [redacted]  
Vice President of the First National Bank; and [redacted]  
Assistant Cashier of the Fourth National Bank, all in Wichita, Kansas, were contacted in an effort to locate the bank account of the Newton Development Company, with negative results.

[redacted] Assistant Cashier of the Union National Bank, Wichita, Kansas, upon interview advised that the Newton Development Company maintains an account at that bank. [redacted] displayed to Agent the records and account of this company at that bank, which reflected that the account was in the name of the Newton Development Company, and that S. M. NEWTON was the only individual authorized to draw on this account. The address of the Newton Development Company was given as Box 433, Ness City, Kansas, and later changed to the Broadview Hotel, Wichita, Kansas, and later to Box 3, Dodge City, Kansas, on May 12, 1936. It was subsequently changed to 908 Equitable Building, Denver, Colorado, which according to these records is the present address of this company. [redacted] stated that although the records did not reflect it, he was of the opinion that S. M. NEWTON had formerly been associated with the Moody Interests, of considerable wealth and backing at Galveston, Texas.

An inspection of the records concerning this account of the Newton Development Company reflected that there were no cancelled checks which had not been sent to the company at the Union National Bank. The records reflected that the balance in this account at the time it was inspected on June 18, 1941, was \$215.97. A further inspection of this account reflected that the average balance from March 21, 1941, to May 27, 1941, was about \$300. The deposits during that period were \$1,675, and the largest withdrawal during this period was \$350. This bank does not have a Recordack System, and it was

impossible to determine to whom the withdrawals were made in favor of. [redacted] advised that he does not recall ever having seen a withdrawal from this account made in favor of [redacted]. He advised that if regular withdrawals were made in favor of this individual he would know about it.

furnish confidential information concerning his knowledge of SILAS  
M. NEWTON. [redacted] SILAS

[redacted] stated that he has never heard of SILAS  
M. NEWTON being associated with a woman by the name of [redacted]  
but stated that he believed NEWTON had been married at least twice  
and that approximately three years ago NEWTON [redacted]

[redacted] stated he later learned that SILAS M. NEWTON's wife had  
allegedly left a sizeable estate in stocks, bonds, and jewelry, but  
that NEWTON was unable to get possession of them after her death and  
was very much disappointed.

[redacted] also stated that SILAS M. NEWTON [redacted]

[redacted] and if approached properly might furnish some information concerning  
SILAS M. NEWTON. [redacted] also advised that NEWTON had done  
business with the Citizens Bank at McCracken, Kansas; that he is  
known to do business with the following banks: The United States  
National Bank of Denver, Colorado, The Union National Bank of Wichita,  
Kansas under the name of the Newton Development Company. [redacted]  
states that the account at the Union National Bank in Wichita is used  
by NEWTON [redacted]

[redacted] stated that he is well aware of the fact that MR. J. H.  
CARPENTER, deceased, formerly of New York City loaned large sums of  
money in the past for SILAS M. NEWTON in the oil business. [redacted]

[redacted] states that Mr. J. H. CARPENTER at one time called on him at  
Newton, Kansas and told him that he anticipated turning over three or  
four hundred thousand dollars to NEWTON for investment, stating that  
he was obligated to NEWTON through past business experiences with  
NEWTON; had been the cause of him receiving some large profits.

[redacted] furnished additional information to the effect that SILAS M. NEWTON [redacted] frequently making long distance telephone calls when unnecessary, and stated that he traveled almost exclusively by air.

He added that the only woman who he knew NEWTON to be [redacted] and that when last known to him NEWTON had been traveling [redacted] about 2½ years. [redacted] He stated that when last known to him NEWTON was staying at the Arlington Hotel, Ness City, Kansas, and that [redacted] He stated that [redacted] that NEWTON contended carried [redacted] as he was suffering some physical ailment.

was reportedly residing at the Hollywood Knickerbocker Hotel, Hollywood, California, and had authorized [redacted]

[redacted] to conduct all business with the State Oil and Gas Division for the Newton Development Company. [redacted] advised that she has no record of [redacted]

On October 21, 1941, [redacted] [redacted] of the Hollywood Knickerbocker Hotel, 1714 Ivar Avenue, Hollywood, California, was recontacted, and, in addition to the information which he had previously furnished to the Los Angeles Office and which is contained in the report of Special Agent [redacted] dated March 20, 1941, in instant case, further advised that SILAS M. NEWTON is presently residing at the Hollywood Knickerbocker Hotel and has been a guest at the hotel since March 1941; that for years NEWTON has made it a practice to reside at the Knickerbocker when in Los Angeles, but that he has always lived alone at the hotel and has never been accompanied by a wife, and has never indicated in any way that he is married. [redacted] stated that NEWTON has never discussed his marital status insofar as informant knows. Continuing, [redacted] advised that at the present time Mr. NEWTON [redacted]

He advised that NEWTON is connected in some way with the petroleum business and is associated with [redacted] [redacted] In view of this situation, it was not considered advisable to attempt to discreetly interview [redacted] relative to NEWTON'S marital status or his relationship with subject [redacted]

[redacted] (Special Agent [redacted] discreetly contacted [redacted] regarding the marital status of NEWTON and was advised that [redacted] SILAS M. NEWTON. [redacted] stated that he was cognizant of the fact that NEWTON was or had been married, but stated that he never saw NEWTON'S wife, did not know her name, and did not know whether she was living or dead. [redacted] was of the opinion that NEWTON [redacted]

[redacted] [redacted] volunteered the information that none of the Newton drillers or riggers working for the Newton Development Company knew anything about NEWTON'S marital status, because this subject had come up in a discussion one day, but no one was able to furnish any information concerning NEWTON'S domestic affairs.

The records of the Los Angeles Retail Merchants Credit Association were checked with regard to SILAS M. NEWTON, with negative results.
