City and has printed on the window of the office "Magnetic Research Foundation and Buckhorn Mine." An extension phone connects the offices of NEWTON although they are in opposite ends of the block.	

The Buckhorn Mine basically consists of two properties, one of which is the mining property where the development work is being conducted and secondly a piece of property approximately fifty miles distance on the other side of the county in Vanadium, New Mexico, whereon is located a small mill and custom smelter. The second property is believed to be leased with option to buy. A source actually working in this operation has provided rock samples and a surreptitious assay of these samples for mercury, which is the stated mineral the property is being developed for, show absolutely no traces of mercury in the assay. Statements have been made to also locating silver; however, as of this date the silver assay has not been completed.

A recent conversation between NEWTON, and an unidentified third person was overheard in which it was stated that one of the three was to leave for El Paso where he was to obtain mercury and in addition to that an exclamatory statement was made, "This mill has to operate for only one day, that's all we need, just one day."

AT LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA

A review of the records of the County Clerk, Los Angeles, California, by SA revealed the following information:

The corporation has authorization for 25,000 shares of issued stock valued at \$25,000.

According to the articles of incorporation, the purpose of this corporation was to mine, smelt, refine, convert, prepare for market copper, sulfuric acid, chlorine, cryolit aluminum by-products, gold, silver, lead, zinc, brass, iron, and steel.

The names of the stockholders and the value of the stock was not given on the record and there was no description of the properties held by the corporation in this record.

The following investigation was conducted by SA on September 30, 1970:

AT LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA

File Number A-226576, which is a criminal case in the Superior Court, Los Angeles County, Los Angeles, California, charges SILAS M. NEWTON with illegally selling a security for value without having permission from the Commission of Corporations, State of California. He allegedly sold an interest in an oil well to be drilled in Sedona, Arizona.

attorney for the victims in this criminal case, advised Superior Court Judge RICHARD HAYEEN that complete restitution had been made by NEWTON to the victims, and that mutual releases had been signed with regard to all transactions between NEWTON and the victims.

This case came up for hearing on July 24, 1970, and the defendant entered a motion to withdraw his plea of guilty and to enter a plea of not guilty.

On the court's own motion, the case was dismissed in the interest of justice pursuant to Section 1385 Penal Code (PC), and NEWTON's bail was exonerated.

For the information of the Albuquerque Office, the probation report, which was dated June 30, 1969, contained the following information concerning NEWTON:

He was born on July 19, 1887, at Shelby County, Kentucky. He is divorced and is a college graduate. He has claimed his occupation was that of a geologist, who had an income of \$500 a month, being employed by the Mechanic Research Foundation, Tucson, Arizona. He claims to have a Bachelor of Science in geology from Baylor University and to have studied for six months at Oxford University in London.

NEWTON has been married four times. Two of these relationships ended in divorce, and two with the deaths of his wives. He was last married in 1950, and this wife divorced

him in 1961.

NEWTON has had no military service. He claims to be a life member of the Professional Golfers Association.

He has FBI Number 835 \$61.

AT SILVER CITY, NEW MEXICO

The August 12, 1970, issue of the "Silver City Daily Press," published at Silver City, New Mexico, contained on the front page two photographs bearing the caption, "New Mine Near Buckhorn." The caption under the photographs continued to state that S. M. NEWTON shipped ore samples from the above shown mine to California by air Monday to be assayed. The mine, which is believed to contain silver ore, is located about one mile north of Buckhorn in Western Grant County. The mine is located on the side of a hill on state land and is near an area where NEWTON has been seeking mercury for about five years. A fault runs through the area of the small pit and black rock is located in the earth below the fault.
