A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished the following information in July, 1961, concerning remarks made by functionaries of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union (CPSU) concerning Henry Winston:

It is noted Henry Winston testified on September 20 and 23, 1949, before United States District Court, Southern District of New York, that he was National Organization Secretary, Communist Party, United States of America (CP,USA), since July, 1946. On October 21, 1949, he was sentenced to five years and fined \$10,000.00 for violation of the Smith Act of 1940. On July 2, 1951, Winston became a fugitive upon issuance of a bench warrant by the United States District Court, Southern District of New York. On March 5, 1956, Winston surrendered to Federal authorities, Southern District of New York. On March 26, 1956, Winston was sentenced to three years for contempt of court to be served subsequent to the sentence imposed on the Smith Act conviction. On June 30, 1961, Winston received a commutation of sentence by President John F. Kennedy and was released from custody.

A conference was held in early July, 1961, in the headquarters of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union (CCCPSU).



Shevlyagin remarked that the Soviets admire Henry Winston very much as a Communist and that they are very proud of him and that they have invited him and his family to Russia as guests of the CCCPSU where he will receive all the medical attention available.

Shevlyagin stated that if Winston were to die they would accept his children and raise them in the proper manner and that they would return the children to the CP,USA anytime the said Party so desired.

A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, has furnished the following information:

During the latter part of June and the first part of July, 1961, Timur Timofeevich Timofeev, also known as Timmy Dennis, who is presently employed at the International Department of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union (CCCPSU) and who is the son of the late Eugene Dennis, a former Communist Party, USA (CPUSA) functionary, advised that he has obtained from several sources an appraisal of President John F. Kennedy.

Timofeev learned from the personal political secretary of Premier Nikita Khrushchev, who is a close personal friend of Timofeev, that at the end of the first day of the recent conference between President John F. Kennedy and Premier Nikita Khrushchev in Vienna, Austria, Khrushchev remarked, Well, I guess you want to know what I think of him?" Khrushchev answered his question by stating, "Young and green." At the end of the second day of the conference at Vienna, Khrushchev remarked, "Today was different. I started off from a position of strength by raising my voice and making demands. Kennedy countered me and also raised his voice. I said to myself. ho, ho, what have we here. I took notice that he was clever, tough, and segacious. What convinced me of this was the following: When I told him that we were going through with the signing of the peace treaty with East Germany, Kennedy said, 'It looks like it's going to be a cold winter'."

According to Timofeev, Aleksei Ajubei, son-in-law of Premier Nikita Khrushchev, told Timofeev that while in Washington several weeks ago, he and another Russian had a private conference with President Kennedy. Ajubei described President Kennedy as a most intelligent man, who is sincere and desirous of peace, but that various pressures from other directions, particularly military and reactionary forces, put President Kennedy and his administration into the position that he presently finds himself in. Ajubei said that if President Kennedy had stronger support from the peace and liberal forces, he would be in a better position to carry out his personal inclinations, and, as an example, he would have acted otherwise in Cuba.

Timofeev further stated that the Soviet journalists who visited the United States during the month of Jume, 1961, went to the United States principally to "size up" President Kennedy and his administration. They reached the following conclusions: Kennedy, as president, is intelligent and smart and has put himself in an independent position by appointing men of different viewpoints around him. The one bad influence, singled out by the journalists, was Dean Acheson, whom they described as dangerous and being prejudiced and dogmatic and "thinking in the past."

A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, has furnished the following information:

A conference was held in early July, 1961, in the International Department of the CCCPSU in Moscow, Russia. Among those present at this conference were: An individual by the name of Shevlyagin, whose first name is unknown, who is a Deputy of Boris Ponomarev, Head of the International Department, CCCPSU; Nikolai Vladimirovich Mostovets, Head of the North and South American Section of the International Department, CCCPSU; Aleksei Andreevich Grechukhin, Assistant to Mostovets and also Head of the United States Section of the International Department, CCCPSU, and Igor Michaelov, member of the International Department, CCCPSU and Deputy to Mostovets. Igor Michaelov, in his work in the International Department, specializes in United States trade unions.

This group issued instructions directed to Gus Hall. General Secretary of the Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), which consisted of the following: From now on, and for many months to come, the danger of war and the tensions connected therewith are going to be much greater than they are now or have been in the past and at times that the tension will reach such a high pitch as to indicate that a war is imminent. Hall is instructed to expect this, but to understand that war hysteria in the

United States has presently reached such a high point that partial mobilization of armed forces is now being called for in the United States. Hall is to understand the fact that the United States will be responsible for most of the tensions created, and that the Soviet Union will counter with added tensions. As an example of the above, the aviation show which was to be subsequently held in Moscow was cited and also a speech that Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev would make at a Moscow military academy affair was cited.

This group instructed that Gus Hall is to be advised that despite whatever happens, the peace pact with East Germany will be signed as scheduled (date not stated). This will be done regardless of what Chancellor Conrad Adenauer, or anybody else, will say or do. The Soviets, however, are desirous of avoiding war, if at all possible, and despite the creation of tensions, as previously referred to, the Soviets will attempt to effect world peace. They will stage a World Peace Congress and Gus Hall is being instructed to give priority in helping to mobilize this Congress. The Congress will be similar in nature to, but broader than, the Stockholm Peace Congress. All organizations and all individuals should be encouraged to join in the mobilization of this World Peace Congress. The date and place of the Congress has not yet been decided, and Gus Hall is instructed to keep this matter in confidence, because existence of the Congress has not yet been announced. The purpose of this Congress is to put the onus upon the United States for the responsibility of world tension.

# Inside Czechoslova! ia

In June, 1961, an individual by the name of Handl, first name unknown, who is a member of the International Department of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of Czechoslovakia (CCCPC), in charge of "Socialist Countries," Prague, Czechoslovakia, remarked that the CCCPC is greatly concerned with the low birth rate in that country. Czechoslovakian women simply refuse to have children, Handl stated, and the Party considers the situation to be a scrious problem for the future, particularly in the provincial areas of Slovakia and in large population centers. A concentrated educational campaign among the women is being conducted by the Czechoslovakian Communist Party and the Party hopes that some "incentives" will be introduced to encourage Czechoslovakian women to have large families.

Handl commented that Chinese Communist Party members and officials in Czechoslovalia no longer maintain social contact with members and officials of the Czechoslovakian Communist Party. The relationship between Chinese and Czechoslovakian Government officials, however, is more amicable.

# Albanian Representatives in Trouble

According to Handl, a member of the Albanian consulate in Prague recently asked for and received asylum from the Czechoslovakian Government. This was a "private scandal" when the consulate member went to the headquarters of the CCCPC for safety and was subsequently granted asylum by the Czechoslovakian Government. The Albanian consulate member, Handl stated, claimed that his life was threatened and that he would have been bound "hand and foot" and carried back to Albania to be shot.

On 7/18/61, NY 694-S\* furnished the following information to SAS ALEXANDER C. BURLINSON and GEORGE EDWIN JONES:

Informant advised that during period 6/20-21/61, he had a meeting with ALDRICH KADERKA, of the International Department of the Central Committee of the Czechoslovakian CP, at the Central Committee Building in Prague. This building was formerly known as the "State Transportation Building."

KADERKA extended greetings through informant to GUS HALL, General Secretary of the CPUSA, in the name of the Central Committee of the Czechoslovakian CP and in the name of ANTONIN NOVOTNY, First Secretary of the Central Committee of the Czechoslovakian CP.

At this meeting, KADERKA promised full cooperation in helping any CPUSA members who are traveling to or through Czechoslovakia "illegally." KADERKA also remarked that he would extend an official invitation to ELIZABETH HALL, wife of CPUSA General Secretary GUS HALL, and to PEGGYDENNIS, wife of deceased CP leader EUGENE DENNIS, to visit Czechoslovakia as a guest of the Central Committee of the Czechoslovakian CP on their return trip from Moscow to the United States.

# Free World Conference for Peace

It is proposed that the United States Government sponsor a

Free World Conference for Peace which would meet in the United States
during the next few months and to which the leaders of all noncommunist
nations would be invited.

# United States Leadership

The United States is the undisputed leader of the noncommunist world. The mantle of leadership has been thrust upon it by the unparalleled rise of this Nation under freedom to a position of pre-eminence in the world and by the historical emergence of a totalitarian communist empire bent on world domination. The adoption of this proposal to hold a Free World Conference for Peace would be a forthright recognition of United States leadership of the noncommunist world in opposing communism and an unqualified assertion that this Nation intends to exercise that leadership in a vigorous and responsible manner.

- 1. Take the emphasis and decisiveness from the Soviet Union and the communist bloc and place it directly in the hands of the United States and the free world, opening up multiple avenues for an ever-growing propaganda offensive against communism everywhere
- 2. Have a timely and dramatic impact on world public opinion at this time of increasing international tensions
- 3. Combat the current attitudes of defeatism and apathy which appear to infect so many of our citizens who have been influenced by communist propaganda which proclaims the inevitability of communism and the invincibility of the communist bloc led by the Soviet Union
- 4. Emerge as a fresh articulation and manifestation of the deep-seated desire for peace which people universally have long proposed and evinced
- 5. Lend support to United States foreign policy by exerting pressure on the communist-bloc nations to accede to our sincere and genuine offers of permanent international peace
- 6. Assist in mobilizing and swaying public opinion throughout the world--particularly in the independent and neutral nations--toward the side of the United States
- 7. Aid in compelling the Soviet Union and the communist bloc to agree to controlled disarmament and to negotiate a workable enforcement system
- 8. Provide a focal or rallying point for new and intensified efforts to insure a durable peace
- 9. Cast the United States in its true role as the leader of all those noncommunist nations which wish to pursue a genuine international peace under which they may seek their own destinies

10. Place the onus for heightening international tensions squarely on the Soviet Union and the communist bloc for their refusal and failure to explore all avenues leading to genuine world peace

# **Underlying Factors**

This proposal for the creation of a Free World Conference for Peace is based on the reality of two salient factors which underlie the nature and specific thrust of current communist threats to world peace.

These factors are:

- 1. The communists are continuing to pursue relentlessly their avowed aim of imposing their form of society upon the entire world.
- 2. The communists have had notable success through their propaganda, peace congresses, and peaceful coexistence campaign in identifying the issue of international peace with the cause of communism.

# Imperialism and "Peace"

History is clear on the record of communist imperialism. No country has ever freely chosen a communist government. Communist regimes have had to be imposed by brute force, subversion, and intimidation through Soviet military power. There is no evidence to date that the communist bloc has abandoned this course which it has set for itself.

In recent years, the <u>communists has a had propaganda</u> success in their efforts to identify peace with the cause of communism. They owe much of that success to their effective use of the tactic "peaceful coexistence." If the United States is to pursue, effectively, genuine and lasting international peace, it must contend with the very real and potent communist tactic of peaceful coexistence.

Communist theory and practice are at the root of peaceful coexistence. Communism teaches that the so-called class struggle must be agitated until it erupts into a revolution by which the communists can seize power. Only then, in the communist view, will "peace" prevail. Because the communists believe that class warfare is continuous in all noncommunist countries and because they believe that they must agitate it and cap it with violent revolution, they do not consider that there is peace in the world today. The communists are at war with every noncommunist nation right now. They will pursue this war relentlessly and with a vigor which they confidently predict will bring the only peace they desire—peace, which in their terms, means the total victory of communism.

Peaceful coexistence embraces only certain limited aspects of the political and economic phases of life. Peaceful coexistence applies only in relations between states. In short, peaceful coexistence does nothing more than recognize that communist and noncommunist nations

exist in the world and that, as a practical matter, some dealings must be had between their governments. But the communists insist that all phases of their war being waged against the noncommunist world-including class warfare--must continue unabated until the communist version of peace is established by the complete triumph of communism.

# Tactical Advantages

Today, the tactic of peaceful coexistence continues to give the communists the initiative and the advantage in identifying international peace with their cause. The free world must act to seize the initiative in this area and to dispel the illusion which the communists have deliberately created. Through the tactic of peaceful coexistence, the communists have succeeded in placing peace on the level of conflict. It is incumbent upon the United States to cope with this communist tactic by effectively distinguishing it from genuine efforts at international peace and at the same time by asserting United States leadership of the noncommunist world in the pursuit of effective world peace. Government sponsorship of the Free World Conference for Peace could be a big step towards achieving these aims.

# Double-Edged Sword

While the imperialistic tactics of the communists carried out under the guise of a peace campaign are serving them as effective weapons,

they can also be turned against the communists, for, to the noncommunist world, these inherent and established methods of communism can provide the rallying points of common interest.

avoid the imperialistic domination of world communism so that each independent nation of the free world may peaceably pursue its own destiny. This common resolve to remain free of communist domination is at the heart of such measures as the military, political, and economic alliances of the western nations. This same community of interest can be extended to provide the basis of ever-widening, coordinated opposition to communism, if the United States will project its leadership forthrightly into the realm of all noncommunist nations.

# Nature of Conference

This proposal for a Free World Conference for Peace envisions a conference which, quite frankly, presumes the leadership of the United States and, unashamedly, reports on that stewardship to those noncommunist nations which accept the invitation.

The President of the United States would be the host to the Free World Conference for Peace. It could be held in a location such as Washington, D. C., or San Francisco, California. Invitations would be

sent to the leaders of all noncommunist nations. The Free World

Conference for Peace would declare unequivocally its purpose to pursue
all genuine efforts toward a true and permanent world peace. It would
serve as a vehicle for the implementation of United States leadership and,
at the same time, it would provide our Government with valuable avenues
of communication for the receipt of vital information and the establishment
of better rapport among those nations opposing communism.

As the host to the Conference, the President of the United States would deliver the main address reporting on current factors affecting world peace and outlining United States efforts toward achieving genuine international peace. The President's message would be, of course, the theme of the Conference. By holding meetings over a period of several days, it would be possible to subdivide the delegates, geographically and/or by communities of interest, so that each could attend smaller, more specialized meetings, presided over by United States experts on those areas and dealing specifically with their particular countries.

#### Seize the Initiative

The adoption of this proposal for a Free World Conference for Peace would be an effective means of promoting genuinc world peace. It would serve to highlight the specific threats to peace emanating from the

persistent and calculated conduct of the communist bloc nations led by the Soviet Union. It would expose the spurious nature of the communist tactic peaceful coexistence and dull its impact on world affairs. It would, above all, seize the initiative from the communists.

If the noncommunist nations are to successfully resist communist pressures, they must be well organized and led. As the strongest nation in the world today and as the traditional champion of liberty, the United States must play its true role of asserting vigorous leadership over the noncommunist world so that each nation of the free world may chart peaceably its independent course toward its own destiny.

It is vital for the United States Government to initiate prompt action on the proposal to sponsor a Free World Conference for Peace.

In fact, such a Conference should be held prior to October 17, 1961, if it is to accomplish its major objective. It is on that date that the 22nd Communist Party Congress is scheduled to begin in Moscow. There currently is speculation that Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev intends to exploit the occasion by making an announcement regarding communist plans for Berlin.

It is mandatory, therefore, that the United States move quickly to establish a clear-cut position for all the world to see prior to the forthcoming Communist Party Congress. If our Government does this, it will take the propaganda play away from Ehrushchev and combat the alarm and confusion that any such announcement by him concerning Berlin might produce among the other nations of the world. The world would already be on notice concerning the determination of the United States to stand firm regarding its commitments, to meet its responsibilities as the world leader, and to take any and every step necessary in the defense of free nations throughout the world and for the establishment of a true world peace.

CENTRAL RESEARCH MATTER

Reference is made to my memorandum 7/17/61, same subject, (copy enclosed) which suggested a free world peace conference to seize the initiative from the communists.

Enclosed is a blind memorandum setting forth a plan of action for a Free World Conference for Peace as proposed in referenced memorandum.

My suggestion for this conference was based on a report from our top level informant NY 694-S\* that the Soviet Union was planning to hold a World Peace Congress, date and place as yet undisclosed. Because the report regarding this Congress is Top Secret and because of the absolute necessity of protecting this highly placed source, this information does not appear in enclosed blind memorandum. In its place, the 22nd Congress of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union, which is scheduled for October, 1961, is used as a point of timely reference. If any use is made of the enclosed memorandum, however, it should be made crystal clear that it is actually predicated upon Top Secret information previously disseminated to the White House that the Soviets are planning a World Peace Congress and that this suggestion is designed to seize the initiative from them and to make them react to us.

Re: Merger of the Cuban Communist Party With the 26th of July Movement

A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished the following information in July, 1961:

In late June, 1961, and early July, 1961, the following individuals discussed the merger of the Cuban Communist Party (CP) with the 26th of July Movement:

Nikolai Mostovets, Head of the North and South American Section of the International Department of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union (CCCPSU); Timur Timofeev, son of the late Eugene Dennis, former Chairman of the Communist Party, United States of America (CPUSA), who is currently employed at the International Department of the CCCPSU, who discussed information he in turn had obtained from an individual, name unknown, who is in charge of the Cuban Section in the International Department of the CCCPSU, with regard to the merger above mentioned; and from Ladislaw Kotzman, of the International Department of the Czechoslovakian Communist Party (CP), in charge of English speaking countries.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

Re: Merger of the Cuban Communist
Party With the 26th of July
Movement

Information from the above named individuals reflected that there will be a merger of the July 26th — Movement (Castro Party) and the Popular Socialist Party (CP) of Cuba. Discussions relative to this merger are now beingheld in Cuba and in Moscow, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR), and steps are being taken to effect the merger of these two groups.

For several months past, there have been lengthy discussions in Moscow between Blas Roca, General Secretary of the CP of Cuba, and members of the CCCPSU regarding the aforesaid merger. As yet, there is no name for the proposed merged group. Fidel Castro does not want to be head of this new merged party, nor does Blas Roca.

In the Cuban provinces, there has been, to some extent, a merger of the above-mentioned groups, particularly among the youth.

The CP of Cuba has established Marxist-Leninist schools for the education of July 26th Movement functionaries. Fidel Castro has a personal instructor, who is teaching him Marxism-Leninism. Raoul Castro, brother of Fidel Castro, is not taking instructions, inasmuch as he already has been educated in the principles of Marxism-Leninism.

If the above-mentioned merger is not formally announced by the end of July, 1961, it will be postponed for six months. This postponement will be due to pressure of the CPSU, which does not desire that the Cuban CP "move too fast."

Remarks of a Soviet Official concerning William Z. Foster's Mental Condition

A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished the following information in July, 1961:

In July, 1961, Dimitri Shevlyagin, a Deputy of Boris Ponomarev, Head of the International Department of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union (CCCPSU), made the following comments regarding the mental condition of William Z. Foster, Chairman Emeritus of the Communist Party of the United States of America (CPUSA), who is currently in the Soviet Union:

On Foster's 80th birthday, Premier Khrushchev and members of the CPSU Secretariat visited Foster at a rest home in Borwichyn, outside Moscow, to pay their respects. Before going to see him, they agreed to avoid any political discussions with Foster and to talk to him only about his health and personal matters.

Upon being introduced to Khrushchev, Foster shouted that he wished to discuss his differences with the CPUSA. Khrushchev told him that he had not come to discuss politics, || but only Foster's health. Further, Khrushchev said that the occasion was not opportune for a political discussion. Foster became very angry, and pointing his finger at Otto Kuusinen, member of the Secretariat group present, said, "You are responsible for this. You told them not to listen to me. You are a centrist!" The situation at the moment was tense and embarrassing, in that there were photographers and several other outsiders present. Foster was taken back to his room in a wheel chair. He was told not to excite himself and to I rest for a while before having his picture taken with Khrushchev.

Otto Kuusinen, who is an old friend of Foster, was unable to sleep that night by reason of what Foster had said earlier in the day. In the very early morning of the next day, he visited Foster and said, "Why do you accuse me of being a centrist? What is your definition of a centrist? Perhaps I'll understand you better." Foster hemmed and hawed, but could not give an adequate definition of a centrist. Kuusinen then told Foster that he could not agree with the latter that Kuusinen was a centrist.

On another occasion, Kuusinen received a message to the effect that he should go to see Foster immediately. Thinking that Foster was dying, Kuusinen hastened to see the latter. Upon arrival at Foster's room, Kuusinen was asked by the latter whether Kuusinen had brought Foster's money. Foster said, "Where is my money? I must have American dollars." Kuusinen realized that he was dealing with a very sick man, whom he had to humor. He returned to Moscow, obtained \$100.00 in American money, and took the money to Foster, who, upon receiving it, clutched it and held it close to his chest.

The CCCPSU is at a loss to know what to do about Foster. It would not be humane, however, to prevent people from seeing him. Consideration must be given to the fact that he is a very sick man, and apparently a paranoiac.

from the Soviet Union, and in a report concerning her contacts in Moscow, advised GUS HALL, CPUSA General Secretary, that ANASTAS MIKOYAN had been critical of the CPUSA and of HALL. The letter from CG 5824-S\* further reflected that HALL was extremely angry upon receipt of this information and stated that he would file a protest with Moscow telling the Soviets to mind their own business, and threatening to sever their relations with them.

The letter from CG 5824-S\* further reflected that NY 694-S\*, while in Moscow, should make known to the Soviets the reaction of GUS HALL with respect to the criticism by MIKOYAN of the CPUSA and of HALL.

On 7/5/61, NY 694-S\* contacted ALEKSEI GRECHUKHIN, Assistant to NIKOLAI VLADIMIROVICH MOSTOVETS, Head of the North and South American Section of the International Department of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union (CCCPSU), GRECHUKHIN also being in charge of the U.S. Section of the International Department of the CCCPSU.

NY 694-S\* informed GRECHUKHIN of the contents of the letter which he received from CG 5824-S\*, emphasizing the fact that GUS HALL was extremely angry as a result of the report he had received from DOROTHY HEALEY. He stated that GUS HALL is not adverse to criticism from his own National Committee, but that he is unwilling to be criticized or to be advised by individuals outside the American Party.

GRECHUKHIN, who, according to the informant, is usually "a good natured and jolly fellow," became enraged upon listening to what NY 694-S\* had to say regarding this matter and "stormed off in a huff." He did not even bid the informant goodbye.

Two days later, NY 694-S\* received a telephone call from GRECHUKHIN stating that NY 694-S\* was to accompany GRECHUKHIN to the Headquarters of the CCCPSU at 10:00 a.m. sharp on the same day. The informant was driven by automobile to the Headquarters of the CCCPSU, where he was met by GRECHUKHIN, who escorted him to the office of DIMITRI SHEVLYAGIN, Deputy to BORIS PONOMAREV. SHEVLYAGIN was acting Head of the International Department of the CCCPSU on that date, owing to the absence of PONOMAREV, who was out of town.

The matter reported in the letterhead memorandum was only one of several other matters discussed with SHEVLYAGIN on that date.

Information contained in the letterhead memorandum is classified "Secret" because, by its nature, it tends to disclose NY 694-S\* as the source thereof. This informant provides extremely high-level intelligence information, and continued acquisition of this information is vital to the national defense interests of this country.

To give added security to this New York informant, the letterhead memorandum is being given a Washington, D.C. dateline as was suggested by the Bureau in their letter of 11/2/60, captioned as above, with respect to information furnished by CG 5824-S\*.

For the past three years, the relationship between the CPSU and the CPUSA has been excellent and has been beneficial to both Parties. Many representatives of the CPUSA have visited the Soviet Union in the past year, but at no time have they been told what to do or how to do it. In discussions with CPUSA representatives, CPSU officials occasionally have offered advice, but never have issued instructions as such to CPUSA representatives.

The CCCPSU is particularly proud of the CPUSA delegation that attended the 81 Party Congress in Moscow in November, 1960. It was a remarkable delegation, effective and most helpful. This delegation acted independently and at no time was told what to do. The CCCPSU has great admiration and love for Gus Hall, whom it knows well, and with whose career as a leading CPUSA functionary, the CCCPSU is familiar.

The CCCPSU considers Gus Hall as important in the international Communist movement as it does Palmiro Togliatti and Maurice Thorez, leaders of the Italian and French Communist Parties, respectively.

Dorothy Healey, who reported to the CPUSA the alleged criticism of the CPUSA by a Soviet official, also had talked, while in Moscow, with William Z. Foster. The CCCPSU has no knowledge of the nature of the discussions between Foster and



Endorsement of Gus Hall's Political Thinking By the Presidium of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union

A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished the following information in July, 1961:

Timur Timofeevich/Timofeev, elder son of the late Eugene Dennis, former Chairman of the Communist Party, United States of America (CPUSA), was a member of Premier Nikita Khrushchev's entourage when the latter attended the United Nations General Assembly in September, 1960. He is Head of the Economic Department of the Institute of World Economy and International Relations, an important branch of the International Department of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union (CCCPSU), the said International Department being under the direct control of Boris Ponomarev, and under the over-all control of Mikhail Suslov, member of the Presidium of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union (CPSU).

Timofeev has a very close personal relationship with Premier Nikita Khrushchev, with Anastas I. Mikoyan, Deputy Premier and member of the Presidium, and also with the latter's son. Timofeev also has close personal friends who hold important positions in the Political and Economic Departments of the CCCPSU. Among such persons are the Political Secretary of Premier Khrushchev, and one "Leondid", who is engaged in "Secret Service work" for the CCCPSU.

When Timofeev returned to the Soviet Union after accompanying Khrushchev to the United States in September, 1960, where the latter had attended the United Nations General Assembly, Timofeev was instructed to prepare a report reflecting conversations he had had with CPUSA functionaries Gus Hall, Morris Childs, Jacob Stachel, Elizabeth Gurley Flynn and James Jackson, all members of the CPUSA National Committee, regarding the internal situation in the CPUSA, and the disruptive influence William Z. Foster, Chairman Emeritus of the CPUSA, had on the American Party.

Timofeev's report included information regarding matters in controversy within the CPUSA ten years ago. His report also reflected the role of Eugene Dennis in opposing the political line of William Z. Foster. The report also reflected what the political thinking of Gus Hall had been and would be.

Timofeev did not submit this report "through channels", but submitted it directly to Anastas Mikoyan.

Three weeks after submitting the report to Mikoyan, Timofeev went to the latter and inquired whether the report had been discussed in the Presidium and if so, what the Presidium's reaction had been to the report. Timofeev made this inquiry despite the fact that he was well aware that discussions in the Presidium are secret.

Mikoyan, referring to this policy of the Presidium, said that ordinarily he would not talk about discussions held in the Presidium, but in view of Timofeev being the son of Eugene Dennis, he would tell the latter the following:

For three hours Khrushchev and the other members of the Presidium discussed Timofeev's report and after discussion, they unanimously endorsed the political line of Gus Hall as against that of William Z. Foster, which they condemned as "incorrect."

Mikoyan told Timofeev that Gus Hall could not be told directly about his endorsement by the Presidium. He stated that in order that Gus Hall might become aware of his endorsement by the Presidium, the following would be done:

Gus Hall would be quoted and publicized as much as possible in the Soviet press. Naturally, according to Mikoyan, when Hall should become aware that he is being so publicized in the Soviet Press, he will understand that he is being endorsed by the Presidium.

According to the source, during late June and early July, 1961, the Soviet publication "Pravda" quoted Gus Hall on four occasions.

The relationship between the Communist Party of the Soviet Union (CPSU) and the CP of China is as strained as it was last December. The strained relations continue despite the attempts made at reconciliation at the 81 Party Conference held in Moscow last fall. Representatives of the respective parties have only perfunctory contact with one another.

According to Gorelnik and Handl, Chinese assigned to the "World Marxist Review" appear at their desks for approximately one hour a day and do not participate in preparing articles for the aforesaid publication. Not one article for the Chinese is scheduled to be published in 1961.

According to Timur Timofeev, government relations between China and the Soviet Union are "relatively better" than they were last December. In the last 30 days, the Soviet Union has granted two requests of China: The Soviet Union has sent a number of railroad experts into China and also has sent a number of chemical specialists. Because of the famine conditions in China, the Soviet Union recently has sent to the Chinese two large shipments of food. In that connection Timofeev has reported that he had received recently a letter from one "Cheng", head of the Automobile Industry in China, reflecting that the latter, despite his high position, is experiencing great difficulty in feeding his child. Cheng's letter also reflected that "true Marxism" is separating the Soviet Union and China.

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A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished the following information in July, 1961:

According to Mikolai Vladimirovich Mostovets, Head of the Morth and South American Section of the International Department of the Control Countites of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union (CCCPSU), the story of the noted singer Paul Robeson, Sr. is a tragic one. That since he arrived in the Soviet Union several years ago, Paul Robeson, Sr. has tried to count suigide three times, once by hanging and twice by cutting his wrists and that this is a heart breaking case.

Rikolai Mostovets stated that the reason for this is that Paul Robeson, Sr. Seels that he should have been the leader of the "Magre Revolution" in the United States and that he has missed out on it and therefore he has no desire to live.

Mostovets further stated that just several days ago in London, England, Paul Robeson, Sr. again slashed his wrist and it is only a miracle that the dectors were able to save him. Mostovets remarked that "we" are now flying him back to Musque and he will be in our care.



### INSIDE THE PREMLIN

Officials of the International Department of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union (CCCPSU) held a conference in early July, 1961, in Moscow, Russia, and conveyed a message to Gus Mail, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), concerning the danger of war and the Soviet-proposed World Peace Congress.

### har Danger

From now on, the Soviet officials said, and for many months to come, the danger of war and its accompanying tensions are going to be much greater than at present. Tensions will reach such a high pitch as to indicate that war is imminent. The United States, according to the Soviet officials, will be held responsible for most of the tensions created by the war danger and the Soviet Union will counter with added tensions. Regardless of what happens, the peace pact with East Germany will be signed as scheduled (date not stated).

### horld Peace Congress

Despite the creation of tensions, the Soviets are desirous of avoiding war, if at all possible, and will attempt to effect world 'peace." They plan to stage a World Peace Congress - place and date not yet decided and have instructed Gus Hall to give priority in helping to mobilize this Congress. All organizations and all individuals are being encouraged to join in this mobilization. The nurnose of this Congress, which has not as yet been announced, is to put the onus upon the United States for the responsibility of world tensions.

## Soviet Appraisal of President Hennedy

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the CCCPSU. Timofeev learned from the personal political secretary of Soviet Premier Nikita Ehrushchev that at the end of the first day of the recent conference between President John F. Lennedy and Premier Ehrushchev in Vienna, Austria (June 3-4, 1961), Khrushchev remarked, "Well, I guess you want to know what I think of him?" Khrushchev answered his own question by stating, "Young and green." At the end of the second day of the conference, Khrushchev remarked, "Today was different. I started off from a position of strength by raising my voice and making demands. Hennedy countered me and also raised his voice. I said to myself, ho, ho, what have we here. I took notice that he was clever, tough and sagacious. What convinced me of this was the following: When I told him that we were going through with the signing of the peace treaty with East Germany, Kennedy said, 'It looks like it is going to be a cold winter.'"

Aleksei Ajubei, Khrushchev's son-in-law and Editor of the Soviet newspaper "Izvestia," told Timofeev that Ajubei and another Soviet journalist (Mikhail A. Kharlamov) who visited the United States during June, 1961, and who had a private conference with President Lennedy, came to the United States principally to "size up" the President and his administration. The journalists concluded that President Rennedy is intelligent and smart because he has put himself in an independent position by surrounding himself with men of different viewpoints. The one bad influence singled out by the journalists is Bean Acheson, former Secretary of State, whom they described as dangerous, prejudiced, dogmatic and "thinking in the past."

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



NINA KHRUSHCHEV spoke concerning her visit to the United States and stated that she enjoyed her visit very much, but was sorry that she was unable to see the "working people." NINA KHRUSHCHEV recalled a pleasant occasion in the United States when the chambermaids at a hotel where she was staying presented her with a gift which represented many workers in the hotel.

NINA KHRUSHCHEV stated that she wished to ask a question that her husband wants to raise and that is if GUS HALL cannot come to the Soviet Union "legally" why doesn't he sneak over. ELIZABETH HALL stated that she answered this question by stating that the last time he (GUS HALL) tried to do so, he got 7 years, (apparently referring to GUS HALL's arrest in Mexico).

ELIZABETH HALL remarked that NINA KHRUSHCHEV was interested in talking to her about various women's aganizations and various publications in the United States and wanted also to discuss politics. Our informant has furnished us with the copy of this "Draft Programme.". It is pure Soviet propaganda and is laced with remarks and slogans backing up the Kremlin Party line. It uses the United States as its "whipping boy." The "Draft Programme" states that today there are more than 175 million organized trade unionists in the world: of these, 107 million are members of the WFTU.

Following the Moscow pattern, the "Draft Programme" says the Socialist system is growing and expanding steadily; the capitalist system is rotting away; and the complete defeat of capitalism is inevitable. WFTU's theme and objectives are: (1) peaceful coexistence; (2) complete disarmament; (3) eradication of colonialism; (4) prevent nuclear tests and stop manufacture of atomic weapons; (5) abrogation of Japanese-American military treaty; (6) conclusion of a German peace treaty and transformation of West conclusion of a German peace city; and (7) dissolution of all military blocs, removal of all foreign military bases and evacuation of all troops from foreign soil

Ben-Gurion is now knocking on the doors of the leaders of the imperialist powers in order to secure for himself a dignified position in the framework of their aggressive plans. The question is raised, however, how many people still believe that the imperialists have the power to carry out their plans in the Middle East. Did not Ben-Gurion secure himself a "dignified position" by the triple aggression in 1956 against Egypt? The result is well known. In 1957, when we held our XIII Congress, could the rulers of our country still delude the people by saying that the triple aggression had collapsed because of President Eisenhower's hesitations? Now, it is President Kennedy who has come to power. All the adherents of the "free world" in our country believed that the young President would rejuvinate imperialism. Indeed, President Kennedy has acted highhandedly. What was the result? The invasion of Cuba, organized by American imperialism, did not hold out more than 72 hours.

Let the rulers of our country look for new excuses to explain the failure of their policy which stands in contradiction to the entire development of our times. Let the Kennedys try to stop the peoples from reaching correct conclusions. Let them put the blame on the head of the Central Intelligence Agency or the Secretary of Defense. We fight this anti-Soviet and anti-Communist campaign because it is the blackest of all black screens preventing the people of our country from seeing the wide horizons opening before the eyes of mankind on its march towards peace, scientific development and social progress. We fight this incitement because we want our people to march together with all mankind toward the happiest historical epoch. Communism in our times is the inheritor and fulfillment of all the loftiest ideals of humanity. All the lights in the world will not be able to illuminate the dark future awaiting the colonialist system, capitalism and its Ben-Gurion agents in our country.



The Chinese CP had advised the Consul to tell NY 694-S\* that the letter to HALL was a fraud-that the Chinese CP never sent such letters to anybody. It was common practice for "the enemy" to write letters such as this one.

The Chinese CP also acknowledged receipt of books from the CPUSA, and wished that NY 694-S\* would convey the Chinese CP's thanks to the CPUSA.

With regard to contacts between the CPUSA and the CP of China, the CPUSA may contact the Consul at any Chinese Consulate in the world.

At this meeting with the Chinese Consul, NY 694-S\* informed the latter that he had just received a message from the CPUSA to the following effect: CHARLES "BOB" MOE had been requested to go to China immediately, but COE had not been told specifically why he was to go to China. Inasmuch as COE was not well, and would prefer not to go at this time to China, the CPUSA suggested that possibly NY 694-S\* might be able to go to China in COE's place.

The Chinese Consul telephoned to Peiping regarding this matter and informed NY 694-S\* that he had been advised that COE's going to China did not concern the Chinese CP-that it was a personal matter, in that CHARLES COE's brother, FRANK COE, had requested that CHARLES COE go to China.

No letterhead memorandum is being submitted since it is considered that the information reported above is not suitable for dissemination.



The XIV Congress of the Communist Party of Israel (CPI) charts the path to the unity of the working class, to wide national democratic unity, for the unity of all patriots and progressives in the fight against imperialism, against foreign monopoly capital, against its Israeli partners and the ruling militarists in our land who do their bidding. It charts the path in the fight for a basic transformation of the policy and governments of Israel; for an Israeli policy of peace, independence, neutrality, democracy, fraternity of peoples and social and cultural progress.


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The burning questions of our time are the prevention of a new world war, general and complete disarmament, the liberation of the colonial peoples, and the establishment of lasting peace. The times have gone in which the imperialists could decide arbitrarily whether there will be war. Forces exist today which can frustrate the aggressive schemes of the imperialists. The combined strength of the Soviet Union and the other socialist lands, as well as all forces for peace, make it possible to prevent the unleashing of another world war. The foreign policy of the Soviet Union and the other socialist countries enlists the enthusiastic support of the peoples because it is consistent and principled; because it is a policy for peaceful co-existence and competition; because this policy embodies concrete suggestions for an end to the cold war. The different situation prevailing in the country today as compared with the situation when the XIII Congress was held finds expression in the severe crisis of Ben-Gurion's rule and policies. Within the short period of a year's time since the last elections were held, not only our Communist Party (CP) but all other parties in Israel declared their opposition to the establishment of a Cabinet headed by Ben-Gurion's party. A wide and vigorous opposition to his leadership developed. This change in the political arena reflects the deep changes taking place within the masses and their bitterness and disappointment with the fruits of Ben-Gurion's rule. The revelations concerning the affair awakened a wide mass movement criticizing various aspects of Ben-Gurion's line. The class struggle and the fight of the Arab population against national oppression have likewise intensified. During the period between Congresses, our Party was the only labor opposition in the Parliament and in the Histadrut . On the international situation, the tremendous prestige of the Soviet Union and all the socialist countries stems from the correct answers given to the problems of our time and the fact that all the historic victories of the socialist system are placed at the disposal of the fight for peace, national liberation, democracy and progress, for the





whole of humanity. The deep humanistic traditions of Soviet policies find their noble expression in the call made by Comrade Khrushchev to all nations, on the day of Gagarin's historic flight to the cosmos, for peace and total disarmament.


The epochal victories of the peoples over colonialism were made possible by the all-sided support of the Soviet Union and the other socialist countries to their just struggle. From the Congress we send the warmest of greetings to the heroic people of Algeria, Cuba, Laos and the Congo; to all the peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America, struggling against colonialism and neocolonialism, for peace, national independence and progress.

The official policies of Israel push us in a direction diametrically opposed to the national interests of Israel and the progressive historical processes of our ' day. The roots of the crisis in Ben-Gurion's rule lay in the fact that the recent years have found the rulers of Israel busy harnessing our country even more to the most extreme and aggressive forces of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) in slavish service to the Bonn militarists and the French colonialists side by side with increased subservience to American finance capital. With the formation of new states in Africa, the Government entered the service of the cdonialists, and with the latter's backing, representatives of our country appear in these countries to assist the neocolonialists in the preservation and expansion of their positions. This activity, together with Israeli voting in the United Nations (UN) General Assembly for the colonialists, dooms the attempts to forge real links with these new nations since true friendship can be based only on Israeli support for their anti-colonialist struggle.



One of the reasons for Ben-Gurion's trip to Canada and the United States is his concern at the widespread public questioning of his militaristic, adventuristic and pro-western policies. Ben-Gurion is trying to store up a little honor in an attempt to build up his prestige toward the coming elections, in addition to his desire to try and clear up a few unpleasant misunderstandings with the administration of President Kennedy which likewise stem from the weaknesses in Ben-Gurion's line.

In regard to the Eichmann trial, from the minute of Eichmann's capture our Party proposed the proper method of preparing the trial. We said that the trial must expose the full scope of the Hitlerite crimes and the holocaust of European Jewry. The purpose of the trial should be not only dealing out the death verdict to the mass murderer, Eichmann, but also the historical and political condemnation of Nazism, German militarism, anti-Semitism and racism. The Government chose a different path: it tried to appease the wrath of the masses at its connections with neo-Mazi Germany and to parrow the scope of the trial in order to seek the favor of its partner in the disgusting collusion between Ben-Gurion and Konrad Adenauer. Israeli public opinion and progressive public opinion the world over have caused the Eichmann trial to break out of the straight jacket imposed by Ben-Gurion and Adenauer as the incrimination of Hans Globke shows. If there is no letup in the pressure of public opinion, the trial may reveal mome of the truth about Eichmann's partners swarming in Bonn and other capitalist countries. Particularly abhorrent is the attempt of Israeli rulers to cook up anti-Soviet slander in this contest. The truth is unimportant for All important for them are the lie and antithese types. Soviet defamation. The anger of Israeli rulers stems from the fact that the Soviet and Communist press exposed the attempts to keep Hans Globke and his ilk out of the trial.



In regard to the struggle of our Party for peace between Israel and the Arab countries, the basic premises of our Party for the solution of the Israeli-Arab conflict are the right of self-determination, the fact that Palestine has historically become the homeland of two peoples, Jews and Arabs; and the necessity and possibility of insuring the just national demands of both peoples, the duty and the possibility of solving this problem by peaceful methods, by negotiations and mutual agreement. In the light of these needs, we demand that the Government of Israel recognize the just national rights of the Palestinian-Arab people and eliminate the grave historical injustice done to that people. The people of Israel also need the recognition of the Arab states for their rights. To achieve this recognition for Israel we must recognize the right of the refugees to return to their homeland or to receive compensation if they choose not to return. We must be willing to exchange the temporary armistice demarcation lines for fixed and peaceful borders. All this is on the basis of the right to national self-The recognition of the just national interests determination. of Israel include the right of free passage in the Suez, an end to the Arab boycott, mutual agreement for the exploitation of water sources and the recognition of the state of Israel. Meanwhile the militaristic rulers of Israel base their plans on a military showdown against the Arab countries. is based upon the premise that in return for their services the colonialists will back up the Israeli militarists. orientation is the source of the main dangers confronting our country. Our Party firmly opposes the designs of the Israeli militarists just as we oppose the warlike declarations of Arab rulers on their intention to destroy Israel. War cannot solve the problems of the peoples.



The rulers of Israel are continuing and even stepping up the anti-Arab persecution and discrimination in public life in the economic and cultural spheres. However, the recent past has seen a steady increase in the number of political parties and groups favoring the abblition of military government and opposing the national persecution of the Arab population.

All these policies of Ben-Gurion's regime are inimical to the national interests of Israel and our people and opposed to the vital historical processes of our time.

Our Party calls for the creation of a united working class front as the basis for forging a national democratic front. We are ready to cooperate with all working class parties on an agreed platform and we stand for cooperation with other popular strata and with the petty and national bourgeoist. The defense of the interests of the working class and all toilers in town and country, the defense of national independence and support for the cause of peace, can serve as the basis for this cooperation. Towards the elections we turned to the central bodies of Mapam and Ahdut suggesting the establishment of a working class front which would include the democratic, anti-Ben-Gurion wing of Mapai. Avocan rejected our proposal The leaders of Mapam and Andut and in so doing served the interests of local and foreign reaction. In the light of the splitting tactics of these parties we call on the workers and all democrats to strengthen our Party for the coming elections.

On the ideological front the deep crisis in the Zionist movement today is a reflection of the crisis within the imperialist system and its degeneration. The anti-Soviet and anti-Communist slander of the Zionist leaders reveal their class bias. We counterpose to their bourgeoise nationalism the Marxist-Leninist solution of the Jewish problem based on full equality to the Jewish masses. Historial



experience has proven that the victorious forces of revolution bring salvation and prosperity to the Jewish masses whereas the enemies of progress identify themselves with anti-Jewish persecution and extermination.

In regard to our maximum program the victory of socialism in Israel is our basic aim. We prefer to reach this noble revolutionary goal by peaceful methods. regard to our relations with the Communist movement we can today summarize the growth of solidarity between our Party and other sister parties. We rejoice at the stormy growth of the international communist movement and its increased influence which found expression in the consultation of communist parties in Moscow last November. This consultation increased the unity and solidarity of the world movement on the foundations of Marxism-Leninism and Proletarian Internationalism. The historic documents adopted at the consultation have become the banner and the steady compass in the struggle for peace, democracy, national independence and socialism. The Yugoslavian brand of revisionism has been ideologically vanquished in the ranks of the communist movement. The world communist movement, including our Party, expresses its solidarity with the communist parties and all the consistent democratic and anti-imperialist forces in our region, in Egypt, Syria and Iraq and other countries in their struggle against the cruel terror against the most loyal sons of their peoples in their fight for peace, for democratic freedoms and for social progress. The internal struggles in the United Arab Republic and in Iraq are aimed at eliminating the contradiction between the neutralist foreign policy and the reactionary internal policy.





In regard to the Party, the last card exchange which took place this January showed that in the preceding year the Party membership increased seven per cent. Our XIV Party Congress meets with the Party ideologically, politically and organizationally on the basis of victorious Marxism-Leninism. Our path is just and will be victorious.

Nevertheless, in accordance with the special conditions of our country and with the history of the relations between the Jewish and Arab peoples, the policy of national oppression of the Israeli Arabs has taken on a special character and sometimes appears as a racist line of action whose purpose is to liquidate the Arab national group by uprooting and dispersing it.

This new stage of that old policy began hardly two months after the conquest of the Arab areas during the years 1948-1949, when the inhabitants of a number of Arab villages were deported, even by force. These operations were suspended only under the pressure of the struggle initiated against them by the Communist Party (CP), which mobilized both the Arab masses and the democratic Jewish forces. However, the reactionary rulers of Israel refused to give up their aims. They merely changed their ways and means of carrying them out.

Ben-Gurion's policy towards the Arabs in Israel is a function of his policy towards the neighboring Arab states. His objective is to create a fait accompli which may enable him to maintain the present status quo and avoid recognizing the Palestinian-Arab peoples' right to self-determination. Uri Lubrant recognized this when he affirmed that the factors ruling the Government's policies towards the Arabs were land and security, which must be understood as land robbery and muzzling the victims to prevent them from protesting. To carry out this policy, the Ben-Gurion clique has set up a special apparatus - the Military Government.

What is this policy when translated into facts! In the economic field it means strangulation. In agriculture it may take the form of actual plunder through mass deportations or the legal form of expropriation. Between 1949 and 1953, Arab peasants were robbed through the so-called expropriations of 1,250,000 dunams of land. The result of this unmerciful plunder is that the average size of the Arab agricultural unit fell from 67 dunams in the days before the establishment of the State of Israel to 44 dunams in 1951 and 34 dunams in 1960. In 1953, the Land Acquisition Law was enacted to legalize this shameful robbery a posteriori.

This is not the only form of exploitation. Grazing land, on which the peasants' flocks depend for their existence, are declared "afforestation zones." Practically no credits are granted to Arab peasants for taxation imposed upon them is among the heaviest. The price for their produce is not less discriminatory against the peasants themselves. Urban areas fare no better. Arab villages and towns are fenced in and strict regulations forbid building outside tightly fixed limits. Inside the towns, economic growth and industrial and commercial development are stifled as much as possible and public services are kept at a shameful low. Only eight out of 100 villages are connected to the electrical network, and these at an exhorbitant cost. The health service extended to the Arab villages is the worst in the country. almost all the clinics the one and only doctor must examine 100 patients a day; moreover, the patient simply will not find the prescribed medicine in the clinic. In such conditions, it is a wonder how the Arab peasants hold on to their land, or to the right to their land from which they have been driven.


For those who have been forced to search for new ways of livelihood, Ben-Gurion's policy has found new forms of oppression. The worst luck is, of course, that of the 30,000 deportees who are forbidden to return to their homes.

However, those who remain linked to their birthplace fare no better. All find equal discrimination - jobs they secured are the heaviest, dirtiest and lowest paid. Brickmakers work on a piece-meal basis, earning approximately one pound an hour and must work 14 to 15 hours a day. Those employed on the capitalist cattle-raising ranches, earn between 150 and 200 pounds a month and do not get a single day of rest all through the month.

Although officially the Histadrut has opened its doors to the Arab workers its functionaries are too busy protecting organized labor to pay attention to the unorganized Arab Laborer. When the latter takes the matter of organizing into his own hands, the Histadrut leadership takes its time about receiving him into its ranks. If the Arab workers succeed in joining they are not allowed to handle even their local affairs. The Histadrut has not permitted the establishment of a single elected workers' council in any Arab settlement. Things are worse in the political life. Very few elected local councils have been allowed to emerge. The military government has very little faith in the few lackeys it has been able to mobilize for it knows that these have little influence on the Arab masses. Therefore, the military government is constantly resorting to terror, and its policy ranges from warnings to Arab citizens not to engage in subversive activities (that is any form of opposition to the arbitrary policy of Ben-Gurion's Government), to the denial of the shameful movement permits and administrative detentions. A natural culmination of this repressive policy was the unforgivable and shameful killing of peaceful and innocent Arab citizens at Kaffer Kassemat the time of the Sinal War.

The cultural aspect of Arab policy of the ruling Ben-Gurion clique is just as bad as every other one. Ben-Gurion uses every possible chance to boast of how he has brought the Arabs of Israel a higher standard of living particularly in education as compared with the standards enjoyed by the Arabs of neighboring states. This is a lie as statistics will prove. Whereas, in 1960, the proportion of high school graduates to the population of Iraq and Syria was one to 1,000 inhabitants and in Lebanon one to 700, in Israel there was one high school graduate to 2,360 inhabitants. As a natural result the total number of Arab students at the Hebrew University did not even reach the 100 mark. One should not wonder at such a state of affairs, in view of Lubrani's declaration that it would be easier to manage the Arabs if they remained woodcutters and water carriers.

It is absolutely clear that the end to this situation can only be brought about by means of an active and relentless struggle. For this, we must extend and strengthen the unity and solidarity of all Arab and Jewish progressive forces, in the light of our Marxist-Leninist conception. Among the Arabs an important part may be played by the popular Arab Front which we must support and fortify. The Arab masses consistently stand against imperialism and for the forces of freedom wherever the struggle may take place: Egypt in 1956; Iraq in 1958, and the Congo, Laos, Cuba and Angola today. They are against Ben-Gurion here in Israel since he is the servant of imperialism and they are against his aim for Israel to be used by his masters as the instrument of those masters.

One of our main tasks is to fight against Arab bourgeois nationalism, whose upholders are precisely Ben-Gurion lackeys among the Arab masses. We must increase our efforts to bring about their downfall simultaneously with the struggle of the Jewish progressive forces, which has made Ben-Gurion's position more and more precarious.

Even during the worst moments of the anti-Communist wave in — 1959, the conscious elements of the Arab masses did not lose their heads and our Party remained the strongest Arab political group at the places of the greatest concentration of the Arab population. Although we then lost approximately 2,500 Arab votes, we did keep the core of our strength. Today the situation has changed in our favor, and with the greater experience gained by the masses and by our Party, we must know how to turn our possibilities into facts.

The Arab masses understand more and more the difference between the CP and other parties. On the basic question of Jewish-Arab relations, all the Zionist parties stand for the denial of the lawful rights of the Palestinian-Arab people and accept Ben-Gurion's slogan of "Not a single foot of land, not a single refugee."

The Jewish Communists fight for the rights of their Arab brethren, and thereby they render a great service to their own patriotic cause in the spirit of Lenin's words: that no people can be free which suppresses another people.

Jewish-Arab collaboration inside the CP is a symbol of the future collaboration between the whole of our two peoples. The day is not far when our struggle will succeed in sweeping away from our country both imperialism and its tackeys, and will be able to steer our country to Jewish-Arab fraternity, peace, independence and socialism.

A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished the following information in July, 1961:

According to <u>Pearl Wedro</u>, who is in charge of North CZECK. America for the World Federation of Trade Unions (WFTU) in Prague, Czechoslovakia, the Albanian Communist Party has invited people who work in the WFTU to come from capitalist countries to spend two-weeks vacation as their guest. Wedro stated that this is most interesting inasmuch as the WFTU has been unable to get anyone into Albania recently. Pearl Wedro noted that, apparently, the Albanians are trying to speak to these WFTU members regarding their (Albanian) position.
