## KAND LEICHTUAN AND ACTIVITY IN HUNGARY DELATED TO INQUIRIES REGARDING PRINTING POULPMENT

When in Poscon WSSR, in the early part of April, 1935, with his Karl Leichtman indicated a desire to return to the United States via Budapest, Hungary. Leichtman noted that he had a twofold reason for wanting to go to Rungary, one of which was to see his uncle, J. Peters, a former functionary of the Communist Party (CP), USA, who is now a Mungarian Government official, and secondly to investigate printing equipment currently manufactured and available in Eungary. In order to arrange for such a trip, the CP, USA representative, who was then also in Moscow, took Leichtman to the Rungarian Embassy. The CP, USA representative The CP, USA representative spoke to the Rungarian Ambassador and cutlined to him tho reason why Karl Leichtman desired to go to Hungary utilizing the primary basis as the desire of the CP, USA wanting him to look at Hungarian press and printing equipment which the Party could purchase. The Ambausador was friendly to the idea of a visit by Leichtman and agreed to communicate with Eudapost in an effort to arrange for Leichtman to come to the country as a representative of the CP, USA. A few days later the Rungarian Government approved the Leichtman visit as an official representative of the CP, USA, and a credential was supplied to him by the CP, USA representative outlining the work he was to carry out while in Hungary.

Around mid-April, 1935, after spending a few days in Loningrad, the Leichtmans departed for Mungary. On arrival in Rungary they were met by representatives of the Rungarian Cocialist Forkers Party and both he and his wife were treated as official guests of the Hungarian Party. His uncle, J. Peters, was assigned to him as a host and guide for the ontire four-day period epent in Lungary. In connection with his stay in Hungary, Leichtran subsequently noted that he had been taken from factory to factory and shown considerable \* printing equipment as well as printing facilities. To also mot with representatives of the Hungarian printing industry. and held discussions with them on printing equipment and the availability thereof for export to the United States. After this four-day stay, Leichtran and his wife departed for Leadon where they speat two more days and then returned to the United States on approximately April 24, 1935.

Later Leichtman advised that during the early part of the week of April 25, 1935, he had received a telephone call at Prompt Press in New York City, and that the caller turned out to be one of the heads of the printing incustry in Rungary with whom he had spoken while in that country. The caller noted that he was now in the United States as part of a delegation and was here looking at various aspects of the printing industry. Later this individual came to Prompt Press and talked to him. During these latter conversations this Hungarian stated that he was amazed at the American printing industry's productivity. He remarked he was particularly astounded by the productivity of a shop like Prompt Press which is antiquated yet produces twice as such as the best and newest equipped shops in Eurgary. This individual suggested to Leichtman that the Party here should carefully think out the problem regarding replacement of its equipment and as to whether it would be to the Party's advantage

to secure such equipment abroad or purchase it in the

United States.

DISCUSSIONS CONCERNING PRINTING EQUIPMENT WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF THE COMMUNIST PARTY OF THE SOVIET UNION, APRIL, 1965

On April 12, 1935, a meeting took place at Central Committee, Communist Party of the Soviet Union (CPSU) Office Building, Moscow, USSR, between Boris N. Ponomarev, a Secretary of the Central Committee and Head of the International Department; V. Korianov, Chief Deputy to Ponomarev, and Mikolai V. Mostovets, Head of the North and South American Section, International Department, Central Committee, and a representative of the Communist Party, USA (CP, USA). Fonomarev, acting as spokesman for the CPSU, in essence remarked as follows.

On the question of the printing machine you desire for your Party. This is a very complicated matter - and involves a number of political questions. For one thing we feel it would be hard for your Party to explain how you have such a Soviet printing machine. We feel your Party, if we could arrange such a transaction, would be maligned as agents of the Soviet Union. We feel such a transaction could create numerous difficulties even if all the labels from such equipment were removed and regardless of the number of bills of sale provided.

Some of the questions that might be asked you are why did you buy this rachine in Moscow? Why if you had the money did you not buy it in the United States? In addition, there are also some practical questions regarding production of this machine. Now we have many difficulties here - the oconomic council plans for the production of this machine for all socialist countries. If we should undertake to produce a Linotype of this sort for you, the CP, USA, we will violate our agreement with other socialist countries. Then you must understand that it takes almost a year to produce such a machine and at the least ten months. If you include delivery this would make a full year. Then these machines are changing and in two to three years it would be outmoded. Then there is a question regarding spare parts. The Canadians already have difficulty and these sometimes arise from lack of very small parts. We think that you should think this question over Then you must remember we gave your Party money for carefully. such purchase of printing equipment. We respectfully ask that the CP, USA leadership carefully give full consideration to this matter.

CPUSA Director of Public Relations, that when the latter was at the Soviet Embassy on 5/9/65, attending a reception there, he discussed the matter of "Cross Currents" with "MAKAROFF" (Bibonetic) (believed to be identical with ALEKSANDR LK MAKAROV, First Secretary, Soviet Embassy, GRU). MAKAROV, according to JOHNSON, told JOHNSON that he was fully familiar with the "Cross Currents" problem and that to his knowledge the Soviets are in complete agreement with GUS HALL's proposal that the CP assume control of the aforementioned publication. In that connection, MAKAROV stated, a Soviet, then on his way back to the United States from the Soviet Union, by name "BALOKAN" (phonetic) (believed to be identical with ALEKSEI SA BELEKON, assigned to the Press Department at the USSR Embassy) would attend a meeting in New York on Wednesday, 5/12/65, where arrangements would be decided with respect to the CPUSA's assuming control of "Cross Currents." According to MAKAROV, BELEKON would confer in New York with MYRON SHARPE and with whatever person the CP might designate to represent it in the conference.

ARNOLD JOHNSON further advised NY 694-S\* that the above-mentioned conference would not take place on Wednesday, 5/12/65, in that the Soviet BELEKON had not yet arrived in the USA. He stated that as soon as possible after the arrival of BELEKON in the U.S. the meeting would be held.

ARNOLD JOHNSON further stated that, pursuant to CPUSA plans, JEAN KARSAVINA (Bufile 100-411626), who presently is employed by SHARPE at "Cross Currents," would assume control of "Cross Currents" in behalf of the CPUSA and would register as a foreign agent, and act as the Party front in the operation of "Cross Currents." JOHNSON also said that KARD LEICHTMAN, Manager of "Prompt Press," would be a "key man" in this operation, but "not openly." According to JOHNSON, MYRON SHARPE owes "Prompt Press" \$3,000.00 but MAKAROV told JOHNSON that that would be no problem, in that they (the Soviets) would see to it that SHARPE pays "Prompt Press" this amount before the CPUSA assumes control of "Cross Currents."

JOHNSON stated that there are "some hidden factors" in this transaction about which GUS HALL is not aware, one of which is the fact that JEAN KARSAVINA expects to be paid a salary of \$10,000.00 per year for operating "Cross Currents" in behalf of the Party. JOHNSON informed NY 694-S\* that when JEAN KARSAVINA assumes control of "Cross Currents" she will "edit, publish, translate and proofread" the aforesaid periodical. ARNOLD JOHNSON described JEAN KARSAVINA as a loyal and trusted Party member. He stated that the only possible "flaw" in this transaction will concern the \$10,000.00 which she anticipates she will receive as salary, and about which GUS HALL, at the moment, knows nothing.

ARNOLD JOHNSON further stated that when the conference in New York is held, it will be held at ther the office of "Prompt Press" or the office of "Cross Currents" and that JEAN KARSAVINA and KARL LEICHTMAN would "do the talking" for the Party. JOHNSON said also that in the event that KARL LEICHTMAN should not be able to attend the said meeting, JOHNSON himself would join the conference.

NY 694-S\* stated that, according to JOHNSON, in the latter's discussion with MAKAROV, MAKAROV frequently injected the name of a Soviet, which was phonetically "BOGACHEN." JOHNSON did not state in what connection the Soviet's name came into the conversation and NY 694-S\* is of the opinion that in some way or other "BOGACHEN" will have some interest in this conference. (It is believed that "BOGACHEN" is identical with VLADIMIR IABOGACHEV, First Secretary at the USSR Embassy and a member of GRU.)

The WFO is being advised by separate communication with respect to the interest of the Soviets in the coming conference in New York, mentioned above.

COMMENTS OF (FIRST NAME UNKNOWN) CARLISLE, ALLEGED GENERAL SECRETARY, COMMUNIST PARTY OF PARAGUAY, FEBRUARY, 1965

A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, in mid-May, 1965, advised as follows:

During the latter part of February, 1965, an individual claiming to be the General Secretary of the Communist Party (CP) of Paraguay and who identified himself as (First Name Unknown) Carlisle (phonetic), in essence made the following remarks:

General Alfredo Stroesser, President of Paraguay, is now in the process of attempting to consolidate his dictatorship. He is going to pretend that there exists some democracy in Paraguay and as a result will call some municipal elections for October, 1965. However, the reason he is doing this is to get additional loans and money from the United States. In an effort to form a united front against the Stroesser Government, the CP of Paraguay will unite with the Febrerista Party.

What the CP of Paraguay would like other CPs of Latin America and North America to do at this time is to send letters to the Paraguayan Government demanding the release from prison of Antonio Maidana, the Second Secretary of the CP of Paraguay. Maidana has been in prison for seven years and is dying and the Party would like to get him out.

The following was supplied by sources which have furnished reliable information in the past.

James Edward Jackson is the editor of "The Worker," cast coast communist newspaper, and a member of the National Board of the Communist Party, USA (CPUSA). He was a member of the CPUSA delegation to the Harch 1 through Harch 5, 1985, consultative meeting of communist parties in Moscow, Russia, on the matter of unity in the world communist imprement.

After the meeting Jackson expressed a desire to travel to Eulgaria and Africa at the expense of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union (CPSU). Representatives of the CPSU, with whom Jackson discussed these requests, were not too responsive because of the cost of the trips and certain hard-currency problems being experienced by the Government of the Soviet Union. After much discussion Jackson was given a veckend trip to Bulgaria with all expenses paid.

Upon his roturn from Bulgaria Jackson reneved his request for a trip to Africa. Representatives of the CPSU. argued strongly against this trip. They pointed out that: Claude Lightfoot, Vice Chairman of the CPUSA, had recently completed a trip to Africa at the expense of the CPSU and

When Jackson continued to press this matter, the CPSU reluctantly agreed to finance this trip as a reward for his pro-Soviet speech during the March 1 through March 5, 1965, meeting which had received considerable favorable comment from other fraternal parties.

Jackson spent eight to ten days in Ghana. His trip was described as a "waste of time" and it was stated he accomplished very little for the CPSU. Jackson did report to the Soviets that Shirley Graham DuBois, an American citizen. residing in Ghana, is actively working for the "Chingse," possibly with the connivance of President Kwame Nkrumah of Ghana:

DITERNAL SECURITY - BRAZIL

In early March, 1965, leading members of the Communist Party of Brazil (CPB) briefed representatives of another fraternal party on the current status of the CPB. The essence of this briefing is as follows:

In the past the CPB saw only the peaceful road to socialism. Now the need to consider the "armed path" is also recognized. Party organization, which had been a weak point in the past, has improved. The recent land-law reforms are boing used by the CPB as a basis to carry out discussions with the peasants on how to use the law and how to organize to get a better law.

Although the CPB and its "pross" are illegal, the CPB is growing stronger and recruiting is increasing. The "Chinese" have considerable influence in the "Sergeant's organization in the Army" and among students. The "Chinese" hinder the CPB's efforts to develop a united front. However, the "Chinese" have little influence among the working classe

The CPB has some members at work in legal movements. such as youth and women's activities. However, there are five members of the National Committee of the CPB and about one hundred rank-and-file members in jail 109

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Contrary to published reports that he has been replaced, Luis Carlos Prestes remains the Secretary General of the CPB.

In April, 1965, the CPB had forces which might have been able to prevent the military coup which deposed ex-President Joao Goulart; however; these forces were not organized. The mistakes of the CPB which permitted the coup to be successful were a lack of class identity and the placing of too much trust in leading politicans like Goulart.

The following information, supplied by sources which have furnished reliable information in the past, is being brought to your attention as a matter of possible interest.

Communist Party, USA - Communist Party of Canada Training School

Preliminary discussions have been held recently between representatives of the Communist Party, USA, and the Communist Party of Canada relative to a joint training school to be held in Canada in 1965. There will be additional discussions on this matter when Norman Freed, Canadian Communist Party representative to the "World Marxist Review," official theoretical organ of the international communist movement, returns to Canada during the Summer of 1965.

As of March, 1965, it was tentatively decided that this training school will have a three-month course of study with the opening session to commence in either September or October, 1965. Courses currently being considered will include philosophy, political economy and history of the international labor movement. There will also be special lectures dealing with problems relating specifically to the United States and to Canada. There will be one comrade from the Communist Party, USA, on the school's staff.

As of March, 1965, a total enrollment of twenty was being considered for this school, consisting of ten students from each Party. All expenses of the students will be taken care of while they are enrolled. Consideration is being given to furnishing married students a \$50-a-week subsidy to provide for their families.

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
### COMMUNIST PARTY OF CANADA

No attempt will be made to arrange any elaborate cover for this school in Canada. The Canadian Communist Party will acknowledge the school and the fact that it is being held. It will be described as a "Canadian Marxist school" and the school will be located in a "normal place" in order to avoid arousing excessive curiosity. However, the fact will not become known generally that there is participation in this school by representatives of the Communist Party, USA. All financial arrangements for the school are being worked out by the Communist Party of Canada with representatives of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union. The size of the budget being presented to the Communist Party of the Soviet Union for this school is not known at this time.

Norman Freed will head this school and will be responsible for maintaining its ideological standards. Freed will meet with a representative of the Communist Party, USA, who most likely will be Hyman Lumer, National Educational Secretary of the Communist Party, USA, relative to working out arrangements for the school. The meeting between these two individuals will take place after Freed returns to Canada.

# William Kashtan, General Secretary, Communist Party of Canada

In mid-March, 1965, William Kashtan, General Secretary, Communist Party of Canada, traveled to Prague, Czechoslovakia, to participate in a symposium sponsored by the "World Marxist Review." When Kashtan arrived in Prague on approximately March 15, 1965, he was in an extremely bad mood. This mood resulted from the fact that Kashtan felt that the Communist Party of the Soviet Union had been attempting to interfere in the affairs of the Canddian Communist Party. This interference in the Communist Party of Canada's affairs to which Kashtan referred reportedly, in part, had to do with the efforts of the Soviets to influence Tim Buck, Chairman, Communist Party of Canada, against Kashtan at the time Kashtan had been elected to take over the position of General Secretary. In addition, there was some indication that the Communist Party of the Soviet Union held the opinion that the Communist Party of Canada under Kashtan's leadership had fallen into the hands of "revisionists." Kashtan indicated that in his opinion the Soviet Communist Party was still "living in the past" regarding such matters and he intended to make it clear to the Soviets that he alone was the boss of the Canadian Communist Party.





The Communist Party of the Soviet Union immediately became aware of Kashtan's mood upon his arrival in Prague and, in an effort to rectify the situation, immediately dispatched some leading Soviet Communist Party officials from Moscow, Russia, to Prague. Among these Soviet officials sent to Prague was one Gregory (last name unknown), the head of the British Commonwealth Section of the International Department, Central Committee, Communist Party of the Soviet Union, under which relations with Great Britain, Canada and other commonwealth nation communist parties are handled. The Soviet officials held special meetings with Kashtan, arranged banquets for him and held special parties both during and after the completion of the "World Marxist Review" symposium. However, the actions of the Soviets during the course of the symposium apparently had little effect upon Kashtan because the position Kashtan took in this remarks to the symposium wase "not good on the main role of the communist parties in capitalist countries."

After the conclusion of the symposium, Norman Freed remarked that Kashtan was neither a "revisionist nor a liquidationist." While Kashtan was angry, he indicated he would not stray from the correct line of the international communist movement if the Communist Party of the Soviet Union would fully recognize him as the leader of the Canadian Communist Party. According to Norman Freed, Kashtan merely wanted the Soviet Communist Party to know that he heads the Canadian Communist Party and once the Soviets acknowledged this, Kashtan would be satisfied.

# Communist Party of Canada - Printing Equipment

In mid-April, 1965, it was learned that the Socialist Unity Party of Germany had reached an agreement with the Communist Party of Canada for the purchase by the latter of some new printing equipment to be shipped to Canada. This new printing equipment that the Communist Party of Canada will secure is a "demonstration model" which had been used at the recent Leipzig Trade Fair. The Communist Party of Canada received a "very good deal" in obtaining this printing equipment. Arrangements have been made for the Canadian Communist Party to pay a small cash amount as a down payment and the remainder of the cost will be handled by the Communist Party of Canada in connection with printing work it will

do for the East German Government. The printing that the Canadian Communist Party will do for the East German Government will be in the English language and much of the material will be sent to East Germany after it is printed. The Socialist Unity Party of Germany has estimated the value of the printing equipment being furnished the Canadian Communist Party as being worth "many thousands of dollars."

## Norman Freed, an Official of the Communist Party of Canada

Norman Freed is a member of the Central Committee, Communist Party of Canada, and the current representatives of the Canadian Communist Party to the "World Marxist Review." Several months ago Freed suffered a severe heart attack. He is still hospitalized and receiving treatment at the Francisco Rozna Sanatorium in Prague, Czechoslovakia. Hislconfinement will continue through the latter part of May, 1965. When finally released from the sanatorium, Freed will be sent on a month's vacation in Czechoslovakia and then during the latter part of June, 1965, he will join William Kashtan on a trip to Moscow, Russia. After the trip to Moscow, Freed may return permanently to Canada.



A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, in mid-May, 1965, advised as follows:

Stefan Heym, a famous author in the German Democratic Republic (GDR), who for a time during World War II resided in Chicago, Illinois, and then after the war returned to the GDR, is presently under attack by officials of both the GDR and the Socialist Unity Party of Germany (SUPG). Heym is being attacked because he was supposed to have written a "slanderous" article on the GDR which appeared in the West German press. While these officials did succeed in getting him to answer some of the "slanders" in his article, he did it as an individual and not in defense of the GDR or the Party. Another famous GDR author, Anna Seegahr, who also at one time had been in the United States, has now attacked Heym personally. Her attack on him was based totally on a defense of the general policies of the GDR. In addition to the above, Heym is also being attacked on a personal basis because he has now divorced Gertrude Gelband, the woman to whom he was married when he returned to the GDR, and is presently living with another woman.



COMMENTS OF COMMUNIST PARTY OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA REPRESENTATIVES DEALING WITH INNER PARTY STRUGGLES

In mid-May, 1965, a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised as follows:

In April, 1965, several representatives of the Communist Party (CP) of Czechoslovakia provided the following information without prejudicial comment and apparently with the idea in mind that this information could not be hidden from public view forever and sooner or later would come to general attention. These remarks were as follows:

The CP youth in Czechoslovakia through their youth magazines, particularly those magazines published in Slovakia, have recently been attacking the CP of Czechoslovakia. In general, these youth publications are demanding that the CP of Czechoslovakia go further in connection with the de-Stalinization program. In addition, the Slovakian youth in their magazine are calling for a greater role of the Slovakia Party membership in the CP of Czechoslovakia.

In addition there is also a fight between the Czech and the Slovak sections of the CP of Czechoslovakia on the question of Party democracy, liberalization of the press, and rehabilitation of Vladimir Clementis, who together with Rudolf Slansky and nine others were executed in 1952 on charges of high treason. The Slovakians are now openly demanding that it is not enough merely to rehabilitate Clementis but that they want him also restored to a position as a patriot of the republic.
