SCLC requested donation in December, 1962, from VAUD BENNETT, Chairman of the CP of Indiana. Leadership of SCLC very favorable toward Southern Conference Educational Fund and CARL BRADEN. [REDACTED] SCLC described it as lacking organization, business finesse and skilled leaders. He also stated that STANLEY LEVISON has MARTIN LUTHER KING's "ear" and is close to O'DELL. LEVISON known to source as a secret member of CP USA. (u)

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On December 27, 1962, [redacted] of the Waluhaje Apartment Hotel, 239 West Lake Avenue, Atlanta, Georgia, advised SA EUGENE D. MURPHY that she had been reading in the newspaper that HUNTER PITTS O'DELL was a Communist and the fact that MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. had released him from the SCLC when he found O'DELL to be connected with the CP. [redacted] stated, however, that O'DELL had registered into the Waluhaje at 12:10 p.m. on December 7, 1962, and represented himself to be with the New York Office of SCLC.

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On January 14, 1963, [redacted] advised that her records show O'DELL registered into room 219 on January 10, 1963, and checked out on the same date. She said he again registered on January 12, 1963, and checked out on January 14, 1963. On both of these occasions he also represented himself as being with the New York Office of SCLC and gave his address as 312 West 125th Street.

On January 4, 1963, AT T-2 advised that O'DELL continues to be involved with SCLC in New York City in a fund-raising capacity, but understood that O'DELL was not currently on the SCLC payroll.

On January 7, 1963, [redacted] of the Waluhaje Apartment Hotel, advised her records showed that O'DELL checked in on December 27, 1962 and checked out on January 7, 1963. At this time [redacted] said that O'DELL requested that his bill be charged to SCLC, but because of the publicity that O'DELL had been fired from SCLC, [redacted] requested him to get confirmation for having the bill charged to the SCLC Office in Atlanta.

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[redacted] advised that EDWINA SMITH, who identified herself as a secretary at SCLC, confirmed to [redacted] telephonically that the bill would be paid by SCLC.

On December 7, 1962, AT T-3 advised that on November 26, 1962, VAUD BENNETT, Chairman of the CP of Indiana, received in the mail a typed letter from MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., 322 Auburn Avenue, NE, Atlanta, Georgia, making an appeal for funds for SCLC.

AT T-4 stated on February 25, 1963, that the SCLC leadership, including MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. and WYATT TEE WALKER, are very favorable toward Southern Conference Educational Fund (SCEF) and CARL BRADEN. [redacted] T-4 stated that (u)

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the Southern Regional Council (SRC) does not want to work with SCEF and does not want to even be in attendance at Civil Rights Conferences with them. ~~T-4~~ said that there was a general feeling among many civil rights organizations regarding the possibility of Communist infiltration in the leadership of SCEF. Another reason for the reluctance to work with SCEF was that BRADEN's methods of operation in the civil rights field does their cause more harm than good. ~~T-4~~ said that when any mention is made to SCLC leadership by SRC regarding their feelings in this matter, KING will not listen or change his mind about working with SCEF. WALKER reportedly becomes abusive in his criticism of SRC for this attitude.

~~T-4~~ also stated that KING has recently given talks in New York City at meetings sponsored by SCEF, and because of his presence, caused a great deal of money to be donated to that organization. ~~T-4~~ said KING was a hero in the North and because of this is a most potent force in the civil rights field. However, KING is not so highly regarded by even some of his own people in the South and some Negro leaders in the civil rights field despise KING.

~~T-4~~ also reported that other civil rights organizations are quite concerned about SCLC, not only because of their apparent closeness to SCEF, but also because they continue to keep HUNTER PITTS O'DELL as their fund raiser in New York City, especially after the recent publicity regarding O'DELL's Communist affiliations.

The characterization of SCEF is included in the Appendix of this report.

CARL BRADEN

Mrs. ALBERTA AHEARN, 2311 Payne Street, Louisville, Kentucky, a self-admitted former member of the CP, Louisville, in testifying on December 11 and 13, 1954, in Jefferson County, Kentucky, Criminal Court, in a state sedition prosecution against CARL BRADEN, identified CARL BRADEN and his wife, ANNE BRADEN, as having been known to her as members of the CP Louisville, from January, 1951, to shortly prior to the time of her testimony.

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The Courier-Journal, Louisville, Kentucky, a newspaper of general circulation, on February 3, 1959, reported that CARL BRADEN had been sentenced to one year in prison on a charge of contempt of Congress on February 2, 1959, in Atlanta, Georgia. The story noted that he had been convicted under this charge on January 21, 1959, and that the charge arose from his refusal to answer questions before the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA).

The Louisville Times, Louisville, Kentucky, a newspaper of general circulation, on February 27, 1961, reported that the United States Supreme Court had, on that date, affirmed the contempt of Congress conviction of BRADEN.

The Courier-Journal, on May 2, 1961, reported that CARL BRADEN had surrendered to the United States Marshal at Atlanta, Georgia, on May 1, 1961, to begin serving a one-year prison sentence for contempt of Congress.

The Courier-Journal, on February 2, 1962, reported that CARL BRADEN had been released from the Federal Prison Camp at Allenwood, Pennsylvania, on February 1, 1962. BRADEN indicated that he would return to his home, Louisville, Kentucky.

The December, 1961, issue of the Southern Patriot which, according to its masthead, is published by the SCEF, identifies CARL BRADEN and his wife, ANNE BRADEN, as field secretaries and editors. The address of the editorial offices of this publication is given as 4403 Virginia Avenue, Louisville 11, Kentucky, which is the home address of the BRADENS.

[T-5] had previously reported the possibility of this being done by SARGEANT CAULFIELD, who was described by [T-5] as a member of the CP from Lettsworth, Louisiana. (X) (u)]

"The Southern Patriot," a monthly publication, shows that it is published by the Southern Conference Educational Fund, Inc. (SCEF).

"The Southern Patriot" was cited as an "organ" of the Southern Conference for Human Welfare (SCHW) by the Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 592, on the SCHW, June 12, 1947.

The SCHW was cited as a communist front by the Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 592, June 16, 1947.

An amendment to the charter of the SCHW changed the name of that organization to the SCEF, and listed its purpose as being to improve the educational and cultural standards of the Southern people in accordance with the highest American democratic institutions, traditions, and ideals. The amendment was dated April 26, 1947.

A source, who is familiar with some phases of Communist Party (CP) activity in the New Orleans area, advised on May 25, 1962, that during the time the SCHW was in existence, CP members were members of and worked actively in the SCHW. However, since the formation of the SCEF, rank and file CP members have not been encouraged to work in the SCEF. The source stated that the SCEF is a progressive, liberal organization, which he considers a CP front organization because it has gone along with the Communist Party on certain issues, particularly on the racial question, and through the years, certain CP members in the New Orleans area have been assigned to work in the organization to further CP principles.

On May 25, 1962, the source advised that in the past he has considered JAMES DOMBROWSKI, the Executive Director of the SCEF, to be a communist, if not an actual Communist Party member, because he followed communist principles.

The source also advised on May 25, 1962, that many people who are officials and members of the SCEF, while liberal in their views, are by no means communists.

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A news item in the Pittsburgh Courier newspaper, dated August 17, 1957, on Page 2, entitled "New Rights Group Launches in Dixie", reported that the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) was officially launched at Montgomery, Alabama, at a mass meeting attended by over 2,000 persons. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was named as president. The article stated that registration lists compiled at this mass meeting showed persons from twelve states and the District of Columbia came in answer to the call of SCLC, which had been formed the year before in New Orleans. The purpose of the conference, according to the news item, is to organize a Southwide register-and-vote campaign among Negroes.

On June 14, 1962, records of the Secretary of State, State Capitol Building, Atlanta, Georgia, disclosed the following:

SCLC was incorporated on June 5, 1958, by order of a Superior Court judge, Atlanta Judicial District. It was indicated that the organization was incorporated as non-profit. Records showed a certified statement for annual registration dated August 23, 1961, which showed the SCLC president to be Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., 208 Auburn Avenue, N.E., Atlanta. This statement described the nature of SCLC business as civic, religious, economical and cultural.

An undated folder captioned, "This is SCLC", was published in 1962 by SCLC, and stated that SCLC is not a membership organization but is constituted by affiliate groups and organizations, such as churches, civic organizations and fraternal groups.

The folder reported that SCLC is a nonsectarian group which has the basic aim of achieving full citizenship, equality and integration of the Negro into all aspects of American life through the means of direct non-violent action.

A confidential source stated on February 12, 1962, that Martin Luther King, Jr., has been described as a confirmed Marxist. On May 10, 1963, [redacted] (u)

[REDACTED] advised that Stanley Levison, an attorney in New York City, has been acting mostly as a business manager for the New York Office of SCLC and has donated large amounts of money to King at times when his finances were especially low. [REDACTED] said that Levison is very close to King and gives advice to King, which advice is readily accepted. [REDACTED] stated that Levison is also very close to Hunter Pitts O'Dell, who was described as head of the New York Office of SCLC. (S) (u) b7D

The confidential source advised during June, 1963, that Stanley D. Levison was a "secret" member of the Communist Party, USA. Source advised that as of July, 1962, the Communist Party, USA, considered Hunter Pitts O'Dell to be a member of its National committee. (S) (u)

A news article in the Atlanta Constitution newspaper dated July 25, 1963, entitled, "Onetime Communist Organizer Heads Reverend King's Office in New York", by Bill Shipp, sets out that Jack H. O'Dell, who also is known as Hunter Pitts O'Dell, and who has been identified as a district organizer for the Communist Party, USA, is now Director of the New York Office of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s Southern Christian Leadership Conference.

The article related that King said on October 31, 1962, that O'Dell had resigned from SCLC.

King said again on December 1, 1962, that O'Dell was no longer with SCLC, and one of King's top aids told the Atlanta Constitution on July 18, 1963, that O'Dell was no longer with SCLC.

An article in the Atlanta Constitution dated July 26, 1963, by Ted Simmons, entitled "Reverend King Denies O'Dell Link But His Office in N.Y. Differs", reported that King denied on July 25, 1963, that O'Dell was presently employed by SCLC, but King said that he could not explain why a United Press International investigation on the morning of July 25, 1963, found that O'Dell was identified by SCLC's New York Office as an "administrator" with the organization.

Current SCLC headquarters are observed to be at 332 Auburn Avenue, N.E., Atlanta, Georgia.

On September 6, 1963, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Harry Belafonte, Negro entertainer, had advised Clarence Benjamin Jones that he wanted Jones to be his lawyer in a matter which involved how the networks have been treating colored entertainers. According to this source, Jones advised Belafonte that this would be a federal case because the networks were involved. Belafonte indicated that the case would have to be taken to the Supreme Court. Belafonte also stated that he had been taken off the air by Revlon because Revlon did not want Belafonte's company (presumably Belafonte Enterprises Incorporated, 120 West 57th Street, New York City) to be integrated. Belafonte stated that he wanted to go into this thing to win, and not just for the publicity. In referring to the networks, Belafonte stated that he wanted "to break their backs" and open things up so that every other Negro artist in the country could sue. Belafonte advised Jones that he wanted to put on a season concert in New York City for the benefit of the Gandhi Society for Human Rights. Jones also indicated to Belafonte that Martin Luther King was seriously entertaining the thought of combining the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) with the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC).

JONES answers "Yes, absolutely, in fact, he would be a little upset if you did". KING then states "I'm trying to wait until things cool off until this civil rights debate is over as long as they may be tapping these phones you know but you can discuss that with him".

The letterhead memorandum is classified "Confidential" because it contains information from NY 4092-S*, the unauthorized disclosure of which could seriously impair the investigation of subversive matters and thereby be injurious to the national security of the U.S.

On September 10, 1963, a confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished information which indicated that on that date Martin Luther King held a discussion with Clarence Jones regarding the March on Washington. One matter discussed was the making of a record album which would contain the speech made by Martin Luther King at the March on Washington. This discussion also included how the proceeds from this record would be distributed. Jones indicated that he felt that the proceeds should go to the three civil rights groups equally and that King should discuss this matter with A. Phillip Randolph (head of the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters) before he entered into an agreement with RCA, because the other groups would think that King was trying to capitalize on the March for the benefit of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) or for himself. Both men agreed however, that King and the SCLC would make much more money if they had the album exclusively. They also agreed that the people would buy the album because of King's speech and therefore it would not be fair to split the money among the other organizations. It was also agreed that King would be in a difficult position in discussing this point with Randolph and that therefore Jones should discuss this matter with Randolph.

King indicated that during the sit-in movement "they" started getting problems regarding Rustin's homosexual problem. 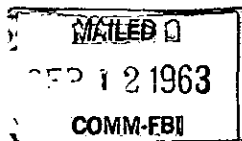

Johnson of Georgia will be the principal speakers at the National Convention banquet program to be held on 9/24/63. Gregory will be presented the SCLC's annual "merit award" for his participations in the civil rights movement.

The article further related that U. S. Senators Jacob J. Avits of New York and Paul Douglas of Illinois have accepted invitations to speak at a meeting 9/25/63.

On September 19, 1963, a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the 7th Annual Convention of the SCLC will be held in Richmond, Virginia, with most of the sessions and activity being held at the Virginia Union University. The convention will open on Tuesday evening, September 24, 1963, with a "Freedom Banquet" at the John Marshall Hotel in Richmond, and will continue daily with day and evening sessions of the convention held at the Belgium Building on the Virginia Union University campus. There will also be morning workshops and clinics to be held daily at the First African Church in Richmond. The theme of the convention will be "Freedom Now" and proceeds received from the "Freedom Banquet" will go to the "Freedom Now Fund". The Virginia State Unit of SCLC is the host to the convention and Dr. Thomas H. Henderson, President of Virginia Union University is Honorary Chairman of the convention. More than 500 guests from the 75 affiliate units of SCLC across the United States are expected to attend. JA.

A planning session for the convention was held in Richmond, Virginia on September 7, 1963, at the Headquarters of the Virginia Teachers Association, a Negro teachers association in Virginia, at which Dr. Martin Luther King and Reverend W. Tee Walker, officials of SCLC, were in attendance. The program called for a public meeting to be held at the Belgium Building, Virginia Union University, at 8 pm to hear addresses by Senator Paul H. Douglas of Illinois and Senator Jacob Javits of New York.

The Richmond News Leader, a daily newspaper, Richmond, Virginia, on September 25, 1963, in reporting on the SCLC convention, stated that Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr., in his annual report, characterized the Birmingham church bombing as the "turning point in the civil rights movement, which is becoming a third American revolution."

This article further reported that Reverend Wyatt T. Walker, Executive Assistant to Reverend King, in his keynote address, stated the recent church bombing in Birmingham and other violence there apparently have not convinced state and federal authorities that there is an "atmosphere of urgency" in the civil rights movement." Further, he was reported as stating the federal government is providing "ambulance service" alone in areas where it should be taking preventive measures. He declared further "the basic approach of the non-violent revolution will not change. It will be marked by its frequency and intensity. It is already evident that the South will not be the chief locus of activity. The entire nation will feel the brunt of the non-violent force's demands. In the South, most of the activity will be focused on schools and public accommodations; in the North, it will be on employment and housing."

The Richmond Times Dispatch, a daily newspaper, Richmond, Virginia, on September 26, 1963, in reporting on the SCLC convention, reported that Reverend Wyatt T. Walker, in his address, stated that Negroes may soon be compelled to stage massive acts of civil disobedience to convince the nation of their impatience with all forms of racial discrimination. The article continued that Reverend Walker envisioned a shut-down of airports, train and bus stations, the traffic of large cities and all interstate commerce

"by the bodies of witnesses non-violently insisting on freedom now." The article continued that Reverend Walker stated a more immediate solution "could well be the implementation of a national program of economic withdrawal during the coming Christmas season." He declared a massive refusal to buy on the part of the Negro community and others of good will "would throw the business world into shock and maybe then, and only then, will we gain the support of the nation's financial leaders to exert some initiative in eliminating the evils of segregation and discrimination."

The article reported that more than 200 SCLC delegates at the First African Baptist Church burst into song at the end of Reverend Walker's address.

This article further reported that Bayard Rustin, Deputy Director of the freedom march on Washington, and a participant in a panel discussion, told the delegates that SCLC's strategy should be to utilize every brutality as a means of encouraging allies to join the civil rights movement.

Major [] advised that there were approximately 600 present at the evening session of the convention held at the Belgium Building, Virginia Union University, to hear addresses by U. S. Senators Jacob Javits and Paul H. Douglas.

Major [REDACTED] Richmond Police Department, Richmond, Virginia, advised on September 27, 1963, that the seventh annual convention of SCLC concluded its final day in Richmond on September 27, 1963, with activities as scheduled and without incident. He advised the sessions of the convention were again held at the First African Baptist Church and the concluding public mass meeting was held at the Belgian Building located on the campus of Virginia Union University. This meeting, according to Major [REDACTED], began at 7:30 PM, with the "freedom sing" and ended at approximately 12:15 AM and there were between 2,200 and 2,500 in attendance. Addresses were given by Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr., President, SCLC and Representative Adam Clayton Powell of New York.

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Major [REDACTED] advised that between 1:30 PM and 2:05 PM on September 27, 1963, Robert A. Lloyd, III, a member of the American Nazi Party (ANP), Arlington, Virginia, who was dressed in civilian clothes, distributed 125 copies of "The Rockwell Report - Is Martin Luther King a Communist?", in front of the John Marshall Hotel in Richmond, where Reverend King and many officials and delegates of SCLC were staying during the convention. He advised that there was no incident in connection with Lloyd's distributing this brochure. Further, he reported Lloyd was observed alone attending the public mass meeting held at the Belgian Building from 7:45 PM to 8:30 PM, when he quietly departed and without incident.

Major [] advised following this meeting on the night of September 27, 1963, Reverend King and members of the SCLC staff returned to the John Marshall Hotel and they were believed to be departing Richmond on September 28, 1963. b6
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The Richmond News Leader, a daily newspaper, Richmond, Virginia on September 27, 1963, reported that the SCLC was requested by the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee, (SNCC) in a proposal submitted by Mrs. Diane Nash Bevel, Field Secretary of SNCC and wife of a SCLC official, who participates in a National Civil Disobedience Campaign, that would include the creation of a "non-violent Army". The proposal recommended refusal to pay state and local taxes; a general work stoppage and the interruption of communications with Montgomery, Alabama by mass sit-ins on highways and railroad tracks. Also, called for tying up telephone lines. According to the newspaper, the SCLC refused to endorse the proposal, because the approach was too drastic and was believed to run counter to the principle of non-violence.

This newspaper further reported that the SCLC convention passed a resolution on September 27, 1963, stating the administration's Civil Rights bill should be amended to provide that all voting cases be tried by judges appointed by Federal Chief Circuit Judges. Also, the resolution called for putting all civil rights cases, both civil and criminal, in Federal courts. Further, that a census should be taken to reduce the representation in Congress of those states which limit the right to vote. Also, the resolution called for broadened public opportunities and attacked "lawless officials" who promote from position of public responsibility practices of segregation.

The Richmond Times Dispatch, a daily newspaper, Richmond, Virginia on September 28, 1963, reported that Dr. Martin Luther King, in his address at Virginia Union University on September 27, 1963, called on the Federal Government to use all its resources to find the perpetrators of the bombing of the 16th Baptist Church in Birmingham and blamed the system of segregation as being responsible for the deaths of the six Birmingham youths. The newspaper reported Dr. King, in a news conference, preceding the address, as stating he would call for a resumption of demonstra-

tions in Birmingham, Alabama, "unless white leaders there satisfy Negro civil rights grievances within the next few days". Further, the newspaper reported Dr. King expressed disappointment, but no particular concern that Roy Wilkins, Executive Secretary of the National Association for the Advancement of the Colored People (NAACP) has been cool to Dr. King's proposal for a nationwide withdrawal from Christmas shopping as a memorial to six children killed in the Birmingham violence. The newspaper quoted Dr. King as stating "we would come to a tragic moment if there could be no healthy, honest disagreement" and he added he hoped Wilkins was expressing a personal opinion and would agree to the suggestion after examining it, "because we need a united front".

The newspaper reported Representative Adam Clayton Powell, in his address, as urging Dr. King to become the leader of a national "black revolution". The article continued that Representative Powell predicted Congress would fail to enact civil rights legislation this year and declared Dr. King's leadership is necessary to bring "the 90% of the black masses" who are not in any national organization into the fight for Negro equality". Further, Powell was reported as urging Dr. King to expand his organization into the north and stated if this were done, he would offer Dr. King the co-pastor of the Abyssinian Baptist Church in New York, which Powell heads.

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The newspaper further reported Powell as stating there are only three organizations which truly represent the Negro masses, namely, SCLC, SNCC and the Negro American Labor Council.

109th Intelligence Corps Group, U.S. Army, Richmond, Virginia, was advised of the above at 9:25 PM, September 28, 1963.

AMERICAN NAZI PARTY, Also
Known As World Union of Free
Enterprise National Socialists,
George Lincoln Rockwell Party

A source advised on February 27, 1959 that George Lincoln Rockwell of Arlington, Virginia had held an organizational meeting of the World Union of Free Enterprise National Socialists (WUFENS) at his residence on February 26, 1959.

Six persons were present and they, according to the source, comprised the beginning of an officer corps of the organization. Rockwell told those present that WUFENS would be an international movement, but that the section of the organization in the United States would be known as the American Party of the WUFENS.

Rockwell, on March 26, 1959, furnished to Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, a copy of the program of the WUFENS, stating that he expected to become the President of the United States through the organization's platform. The main tenets of WUFENS, as reflected in the program, call for the migration of Negroes to Africa and the trial and execution of all Jews guilty of Communist and Zionist treason.

A second source advised on August 15, 1962 that the main activity of the organization in furtherance of these objectives had consisted of picketings with anti-Jewish and anti-Negro placards; talks by Rockwell attacking Jews as traitors to the United States; attempts by Rockwell to form Nazi groups in various cities in the United States; and attempts to form a group of international sympathizers. Rockwell prints large amounts of Nazi literature at American Nazi Party Headquarters, 928 North Randolph Street, Arlington, Virginia.

On June 29, 1962, the State of Virginia revoked the Charter of the American Nazi Party.

SOUTHERN CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE (SCLC)

The November 19, 1960 issue of "The Richmond Times-Dispatch" reported that approximately sixty Negro church, professional and lay leaders throughout Virginia met on November 18, 1960 in Petersburg, Virginia and organized the Virginia Christian Leadership Conference (VCLC) for the purpose of "bringing about civil rights for all".

It was pointed out that VCLC is an affiliate of the SCLC of Atlanta, Georgia.

The purpose of SCLC was reported to "redeem the soul of America by creating the beloved community through organization, by consent of population, for the purpose of creative protest by education, training, developing leadership based on Christian nonviolent principles".

VA. Atlanta, Georgia, was to be the moderator, and the leaders were to be Andrew J. Young, Program Director, SCLC, Atlanta, Georgia; Hosea Williams, Chatham County Crusade for Voters, Savannah, Georgia; and Robert Moses, Student Non-Violent Co-ordinating Committee, Greenwood, Mississippi, GA.

The program called for a public meeting to be held at the Belgian Building, Virginia Union University, at 8 pm, to hear an address by Roy Wilkins, National Executive Secretary, National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), New York, New York.

The Richmond News Leader, a daily newspaper, Richmond, Virginia, on September 26, 1963, in reporting on the SCLC convention, stated that the SCLC officials continued on September 26, 1963 to ponder a technique that would, they feel, completely immobilize a civil rights "target" city. Further, the newspaper reported that officials of SCLC stated directors of the organization were divided over a list of "priority" targets and over the means to be used to attack racial barriers in the communities involved.

SUBJECT ORGANIZATION

The Richmond Times Dispatch, a daily newspaper, on September 27, 1963, in reporting on the SCLC convention, stated that Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., President, SCLC, on September 26, 1963, presented a four-point plan of attack on segregation to the convention delegates, which consisted of the following:

- 1) A "massive and direct action" in Danville, Virginia along the lines of the 1963 demonstrations in Birmingham, Alabama
- 2) A nation-wide "economic withdrawal" from Christmas shopping, in commemoration of the death of the 6 Birmingham Negro children in shootings and bombings on September 15, 1963.
- 3) An immediate "selective buying program" in the South "to force employees to eliminate segregation".
- 4) A march on the state capitol in Montgomery, Alabama on an unspecified date.

The article reported Dr. King as stating a special meeting has been called for next week in Atlanta, Georgia to set the dates and to organize details for the Danville demonstrations and the march on Montgomery, Alabama. Concerning the nation-wide selective shopping program, the article reported that Dr. King stated a national conference of civil rights leaders will be called in the near future for its organization. He further stated that among other things for this campaign, "we have in mind the idea of hiring an expert who would direct it."

The article reported that Dr. Samuel D. Proctor, President of A & T College in Greensboro, North Carolina, in his address to the convention, warned against unnecessary excesses in the combat for equal rights. He suggested that occasionally it is "extravagant" to demonstrate when discussions "around the conference table and on the telephone can go farther."

The newspaper article further reported Roy Wilkins, ✓ Executive-Secretary, NAACP, in a press conference, was "cool" to a Christmas boycott." The article quoted him as stating "I find it difficult to go against the idea of Santa Claus" and he added that the shopping ban would "disrupt" his organization's program, noting "we have a full schedule of activities which will be occupying our chapters until the end of the year."

The article further reported that Wilkins, in his ✓ address to the SCLC convention, urged "caution and statesmanship" in the Negroes' civil rights campaign. He was reported as stating "sometimes we must hit heavily, but at other times a light tap is just as effective to achieve the desired end." Further, he predicted that demonstrations will continue in those localities in which conditions are intolerable for the Negro. He stated the civil rights bill must be waged flexibly by demonstrations, law suits, and legislation, and added "no one of these is the sole solution."

Major [redacted] Richmond, Virginia Police Department (PD), on September 24, 1963, advised that the 7th Annual Convention of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) opened on September 24, 1963 in Richmond, Virginia with registration of members at the First African Baptist Church, which is to be the convention headquarters for day sessions. Other sessions of the convention, which are to last through September 27, 1963, will be held at the Belgium Building, Virginia Union University.

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Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr., President, SCLC, at a press conference in Richmond on September 24, 1963, declared that a "task force" involving upward of 500 civil rights supporters will be sent to Danville, Virginia later this fall in an effort to break racial barriers there. Also, Reverend King stated at the SCLC conference in Richmond on September 24, 1963 that leaders will "charter a course for the future" and decide what other communities will be visited by the task force demonstrators and workers. He tentatively listed as possible targets, Williamston, North Carolina, Gadsden, Alabama, Shreveport, Louisiana, and Clarksville, Mississippi. Also, he stated a time table will be sent for a march on the Alabama capitol in protest of the policies of Governor George C. Wallace. Further, Reverend King stated leaders will map plans for a "Southwide" Selective Buying Campaign against companies that discriminate most severely against Negro employees.

Major [redacted] advised that delegates and visitors in excess of 800 attended the "freedom banquet" at the John Marshall Hotel on the night of September 24, 1963. He stated that many of the officials and delegates are staying at this hotel. He advised the banquet program listed John E. Lowery,

The purpose of SCLC was reported to "redeem the soul of America by creating the beloved community through organization, by consent of population, for the purpose of creative protest by education, training, developing leadership based on Christian nonviolent principles".

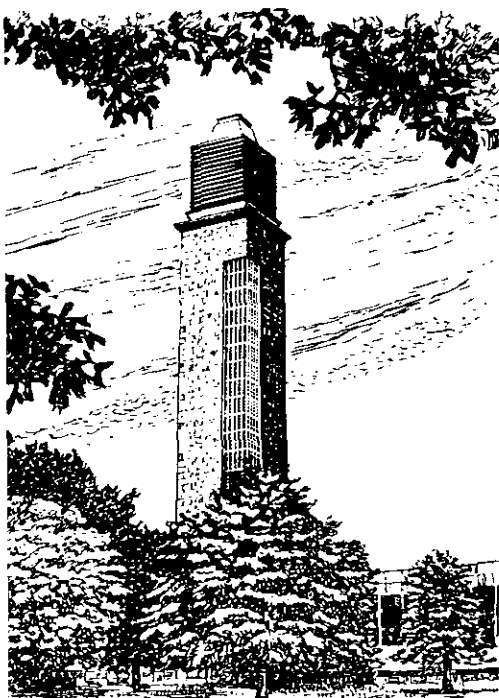

On October 29, 1963, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished information which indicated that Clarence Jones was in contact with Martin Luther King on that date. Jones told King that he and their mutual friend had been favorably impressed by Wyatt Walker's brother as an individual. Jones said that in terms of the specific requirements of the New York Office, there did not appear to be anything in his background which would give him any special experience. mentioned that Walker's brother comes from a background of church relationships and seems to be comfortable in that area. In view of this, it was suggested that Walker's brother, if he were to take the job in New York, he would initially seek to handle those responsibilities which Jack O'Dell had discharged; and that if he did it with the thought of moving away from that slightly and concentrating more in the church area of fund raising, it would give them additional time to get some other person who might have much more specialized qualifications. It was suggested to him that after he had been in the job for a period of time, he would move over from the Jack O'Dell type of work to the work of developing the fund raising base within the church community. King indicated that he would have to discuss the matter with Wyatt Walker.

Jones told King that he (King) and the organization should not feel in any degree "self-conscience" if in hiring a new person it is necessary to bring in Jack O'Dell to show the new person where certain things are and to acquaint him with certain procedures. He pointed out that this is a normal part of transition and that no one could criticize King for doing this.

With respect to the foregoing information, Martin Luther King previously asked Clarence Jones and their mutual friend to speak to Wyatt Walker's brother about the job in New York in order that Jones could give King a candid opinion of him.

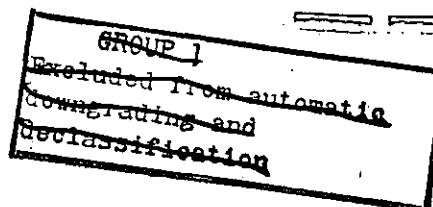

The information from Birmingham source is not verified and we have no way of checking the accuracy. For this reason, it is not believed the information regarding Joey Bishop should be disseminated, however, we are disseminating the information concerning the contact between Jones and Joey Adams.

Included on the Executive Board of the SCLC is the name of D. E. KING, Louisville, Kentucky.

The above D. E. KING would appear to be identical with Rev. D. E. KING, who for a number of years, has been pastor of the Zion Baptist Church in Louisville, Kentucky. KING has long been an outspoken integrationist and has been active in racial organizations promoting integration for a number of years. In May, 1962, Rev. KING was one of the individuals appointed by the Mayor of Louisville to serve on a Louisville Human Relations Commission. On March 19, 1963, when the Attorney General of the United States spoke in Louisville, Rev. KING sat on the platform and gave the invocation. When MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. spoke in Louisville on May 29, 1963, Rev. KING sat on the platform and introduced MARTIN LUTHER KING as the main speaker.

In August, 1962, according to news accounts, Rev. KING was one of five Baptist Ministers, all Negroes, from the United States who, at the invitation of the Russian Baptists, visited Russia for two weeks on a Good-Will Tour and after returning, Rev. KING commented to the effect that the Baptist Church in Russia and the American Negro have a lot in common, and that they both are characterized by oppression. No reliable subversive information has been received concerning Rev. D. E. KING.

[redacted] confidentially advised SA [redacted] that he had recently received information from a highly confidential source, whom he did not identify, that Reverend Martin Luther KING was contacted while in Birmingham recently by a well known screen and television personality, JOEY BISHOP of New York City.

[redacted] from information furnished by above source, it appeared that KING and BISHOP were very close personal friends. BISHOP said that he wished Reverend KING to come to his (BISHOP's) home) during the weekend of November 8 and 9, 1963, to meet a gathering of many influential people, including several millionaires. He advised that should KING be unable to attend on that weekend then he wished him to come to New York the following weekend of November 16, 1963. KING made no definite statement as to when he might be able to visit BISHOP's home.

[redacted] stated that BISHOP told KING he had a scheme whereby "we can raise millions." He stated they could then go to a "city like Birmingham" and "really put on a demonstration."

It is noted that JOSEPH BIRNMAN, self-admitted former member of the Communist Party (CP) and International Workers Order (IWO) and member of the Jewish Mutual Aid Society of Washington, D.C. (JMAS), advised on November 30, 1955, that the JMAS was composed almost entirely of former IWO members and that the organization was formed when the IWO became defunct to preserve fraternal and sick benefits and to maintain social ties.

A source advised during the period June, 1961, to May, 1962, that the JMAS continues to exist and the regular membership meetings, as well as executive committee meetings, are held at 4402 Georgia Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C., headquarters of the Jewish Culture Society (JCS).

In late February, 1962, this source advised that at a meeting of the JMAS on February 25, 1962, it was stated that other Jewish organizations in the Washington, D.C. area were not interested in working with the JMAS because the members were considered "leftists and communists."

Records of the Corporation Office, Washington, D.C., reflect that the JMAS was incorporated on June 30, 1954, for the purpose of rendering "aid to needy members - benevolent and charitable."

It is to be noted that the IWO and JCS have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

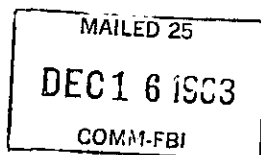

[REDACTED] whose identity should be concealed due to request, made available a copy of a news release type communication of the Southern Conference Educational Fund (SCEF) dated October 30, 1962, which reported that at a Board of Directors meeting of the SCEF held at Gatlinburg, Tennessee, 7 persons were added to the SCEF Board and among those identified were the Reverend VIRGIL A. WOOD of Lynchburg, Virginia.

On March 27, 1963 [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] whose identity should be concealed due to request and who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised [REDACTED]

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[REDACTED] a "Victory Banquet" of the membership committee of the Hunton Branch of the YMCA in Lynchburg, Virginia. WOOD, Negro pastor of the Diamond Hill Baptist Church and leader of the Lynchburg Branch of the SCLC.

Reverend WOOD brought to the meeting a man named CARL BRADEN. During the banquet the chairman of the membership drive introduced BRADEN as a visitor, whereupon BRADEN made a short talk in which he made the following statements:

He is a member of the staff of the SCEF and represents the "Southern Patriot" a publication of the SCEF and also represents "The Daily Gazette" of York, Pennsylvania. BRADEN remarked that he had come to Lynchburg in order to secure information regarding the recent rape trials of THOMAS CARLTON WANSLEY and that he intended to make a "national issue" of the appeals of WANSLEY

which are now pending from the two death sentences he received in the two trials.

On March 27, 1963, [REDACTED]

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[REDACTED] Lynchburg, Virginia, whose identity should be concealed due to request, advised that he had heard that a man named CARL BRADEN was in Lynchburg, Virginia and that BRADEN was affiliated with the SCEF.

This source made available a pamphlet entitled "A Faith For the South", which was identified as a publication of the SCEF, 822 Perdido Street, New Orleans, Louisiana. This source pointed out that this pamphlet contained on the back cover thereof a list of the members of the staff of the SCEF, which included the names of CARL and ANNE BRADEN. He also noted that the pamphlet contained a list of the Board of Directors of the SCEF and included among the members of the Board of Directors was the name VIRGIL A. WOOD.

On March 29, 1963, "The Lynchburg Daily Advance," a daily newspaper, Lynchburg, Virginia, contained an article reporting that CARL BRADEN attended a meeting of the Hunton Branch of the YMCA in the company of VIRGIL A. WOOD. The article reported that WOOD was listed as member of the Board of Directors of the "Communist Front SCEF," along with LEONARD W. HOIT, Norfolk, Virginia, Negro attorney, "who represented BRADEN when BRADEN refused to testify on February 9, 1961, before the Florida Legislative Investigations Committee in Tallahassee." The article further reported that Mr. BRADEN was convicted in Federal Court in Atlanta and sentenced to a year in prison for refusing to testify before the House Committee on Un-American Activities, and that his conviction was upheld by the United States Supreme Court.

On July 23, 1963, [REDACTED] identified above, advised that the SCEF recently distributed a news release type communication, on the trials of THOMAS WANSLEY, Lynchburg, Virginia. The communication identified

It is noted that Rev. FRED LEE SHUTTLESWORTH was born 3/12/22, in Montgomery County, Alabama. He is married to RUBY SHUTTLESWORTH. They are the parents of [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] SHUTTLESWORTH previously resided at 3232 29th Ave., N., Birmingham, Alabama. He was Pastor, Bethel Baptist Church, 3193 N. 29th Ave., Birmingham; also preached at Mobile. Preached in Selma, Alabama, while attending Selma University. He received AB and BS Degrees at Alabama State College. He was President of the Alabama Christian Movement for Human Rights (ACMHR) and a leader of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC).

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During June, 1961, SHUTTLESWORTH accepted pastorate at the Revelation Baptist Church, 1556 John St., Cincinnati, Ohio. SHUTTLESWORTH currently resides at 965 Dana Ave., Cincinnati, Ohio.

Since arriving at Cincinnati, SHUTTLESWORTH has received numerous telephone threat calls at his home. Liaison has been established with him by the Cincinnati Office and he has been contacted on a number of occasions by agents of this office in connection with racial matters. SHUTTLESWORTH was interviewed personally by SAC E. D. MASON on 7/25/62. During this interview, SHUTTLESWORTH specifically assured SAC MASON that he was not a communist and would not knowingly admit communists into his organization.

Sources of the Cincinnati Division have furnished no information indicating SHUTTLESWORTH is engaged in subversive activities of any type.

The following information has been received by the Cincinnati Office concerning SHUTTLESWORTH:

On 10/7/63, [REDACTED] (u) advised SA [REDACTED] that during September, 1963, FRANK WILKINSON was in contact [REDACTED] 14

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with Rev. FRED SHUTTLESWORTH at the Revelation Baptist Church, 1556 John Street, Cincinnati, Ohio. WILKINSON discussed with SHUTTLESWORTH plans for SHUTTLESWORTH to attend a meeting of the Citizens Committee To Preserve American Freedoms, being planned to be held in Los Angeles and San Francisco during January, 1964. During this contact, WILKINSON requested that SHUTTLESWORTH furnish his acceptance letter as a member of the Sponsors Committee of the National Committee to Abolish HUAC (Location) (u)

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It is noted that on 6/9/63, an article appeared in the Cincinnati Enquirer, a newspaper of general circulation in the Cincinnati, Ohio, area, under the by-line of Jack Lotto. The article was headed, "Cincinnati Pastor Named as Head of 'Red Front'".

The article identified Rev. FRED LEE SHUTTLESWORTH, 965 Dana Avenue, as pastor of the Revelation Baptist Church, 1556 John Street. The article shows SHUTTLESWORTH is one of the top leaders of the integration movement in the South and reflects SHUTTLESWORTH "has been named head of a big pro-communist front". The article indicates SHUTTLESWORTH was elected President of the "'Southern Conference Education Fund'" located in New Orleans and active in 17 southern states. The article continues "both the Senate Internal Security Committee and the House Committee on Un-American Activities have described the SCEF as an organization set up to 'promote communism' throughout the South".

Appearing directly adjacent to the above-described article in the Cincinnati Enquirer, is another article entitled "Won't Answer Charges, Accused Minister Says". According to the article Rev. Mr. SHUTTLESWORTH was contacted in Birmingham, Alabama, in connection with his identification in the Jack Lotto column as the President of the "Southern Conference Education Fund". The article quoted Rev. SHUTTLESWORTH as answering "I do not intend to become involved in verbal gymnastics with those, who for years, have prided themselves and made themselves famous for slandering character of others without proof and for making a mockery of the democratic process which says a man is innocent until proven guilty".

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SHUTTLESWORTH is further quoted in the article as praising the "Southern Conference Educational Fund" and criticizing the House Committee on Un-American Activities.

The Birmingham Office advised Cincinnati by letter dated 9/8/61, that indices of that office showed no information which would indicate that SHUTTLESWORTH was a member of the Communist Party.

Birmingham furnished correlation memo of indices of that office which shows many references dealing with SHUTTLESWORTH's integration activities. This memo also shows the following references believed to be pertinent:

WF-1062-S* reported, on 1/7, and July, 1959, that Rev. FRED SHUTTLESWORTH of Birmingham, Alabama, was an overnight guest of MARCUS and ELIZABETH GOLDMAN of Washington, D.C. This informant reported that Rev. SHUTTLESWORTH attended a function of the Southern Conference Educational Fund, Inc., on 1/6/59. WF-1062-S* advised on 5/31/58, that MARCUS and ELIZABETH GOLDMAN consider themselves Communists, but do not use the word Communist even in discussions among themselves or their associates, preferring to use the words, "Left Progressives, we or us", in place of the word Communist. The New York Office, in July, 1961, furnished some information to Birmingham concerning the Provisional Committee for Cooperation with the Japan Council against the Atom and Hydrogen Bombs. Rev. FRED SHUTTLESWORTH was indicated as an individual who would attend a conference of this committee in Japan, on 8/6/61.

The Washington Field Office advised Birmingham on 8/1/61, that Rev. SHUTTLESWORTH's file at the Passport Office, Department of State, Washington, D.C., was reviewed on 7/26/61. It showed that Passport No. 1528930 was issued on 4/17/59, to FREDDIE LEE SHUTTLESWORTH, 3191 N. 29th Ave., Birmingham, Alabama. The application for this passport showed that SHUTTLESWORTH was born 3/18/22, at Mt. Meigs, Montgomery County, Alabama, to an unknown father and ALBERTA ROBINSON, who was born on 8/25/1900, at Birmingham. He was

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last married on 10/20/41, to RUBY LANETTE SHUTTLESWORTH, who was born on 5/30/22, at Birmingham. SHUTTLESWORTH described himself as being 5'9", black hair, brown eyes, and occupied as a Minister. He did not answer the questions on the application pertaining to Communist Party membership. SHUTTLESWORTH indicated he planned to depart from New York, on 7/1/59, via Trans World Airlines, for a 30-day trip to attend the International Conference of the Fellowship of Reconciliation in Vienna, Austria. He intended to travel through France, Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Holland, Belgium and England.

In further connection with SHUTTLESWORTH, Cincinnati was furnished by the Birmingham Division a 78-page Correlation Summary prepared at the Bureau dated 8/18/61. Review of this Summary shows the great majority of references concern report received from various FBI offices concerning the integration activities of SHUTTLESWORTH. None of the references in this Summary show SHUTTLESWORTH to have been a member of the Communist Party or other basic revolutionary group. However, many of the Summary references show that SHUTTLESWORTH has been an official of the Southern Conference Educational Fund, Inc., New Orleans, Louisiana, and has been active on behalf of this group. Other of the Summary references show association with individuals or groups for which characterizations are not available to the Cincinnati Office.

Review has been made of the Bureau Correlation Summary and references believed to be pertinent to characterization of SHUTTLESWORTH have been extracted. These references are listed below set out where possible under the FBI Office where original information was obtained.

It was noted that the appeal was sent to the Soviet Embassy, the Czechoslovak Embassy and the Rumanian Legation, all in Washington, D.C.

WFO advised that "SHUTTLEWSORTH" might be identical with Rev. F. L. SHUTTLESWORTH, 3191 N. 29th Ave., Birmingham, who was associated with the AQMHR.
