PURPOSE:

To suggest that consideration be given to affording training at SOG to all Special Agent personnel who may be transferred to Anchorage as additions or replacements to the Anchorage staff; that SAC, Anchorage, be instructed to make specific recommendations as to individual agents who are ordered to SOG for In-Service Training.

DETAILS:

Anchorage will have a tremendous responsibility in retraining persons brought to SOG for initial training as Stay-Behind and Escape and Evasion Agents. Inspector Keay has recommended additional SA personnel for Anchorage to carry out retraining and other phases of the programs.





SA [] recently completed two weeks intensive training at SOG following regular In-Service Training. SAC, Anchorage, has recommended SA Edward A. Plevack be ordered to SOG for similar training and a memorandum in this regard has been previously submitted. In the interest of time and monetary saving, it is believed we should consider individually each SA transferred to Anchorage as an addition or replacement with view to affording this training. It is believed also that SAC, Anchorage, should specifically recommend in each instance whether an SA ordered to SOG for In-Service should be given the training. Thus, we could more rapidly build up the number of personnel who could participate in retraining, speed up the program, and take care of any normal turnover of SA personnel in the Anchorage Office.

RECOMMENDATION :

That the Administrative Division advise Security Division in each instance when an SA is ordered to Anchorage in order that consideration can be given to affording specialized training prior to travel; that SAC Anchorage be instructed to make specific recommendations as to training for personnel ordered to SOG for In-Service.

DETAILS:

Prior to our withdrawal from the Stage Program, we fingerprinted each trainee on his day of arrival, using a "personal identification" card. Through arrangement with the Identification Division, such cards were placed in the Criminal files and permanent stops were maintained in favor of the Domestic Intelligence Division. Stops reflected the individual file number of the trainee and the word "Stage." It was deemed advisable to keep such stops due to the possibility that a trainee might at some subsequent date be fingerprinted for a criminal violation or fingerprinted otherwise under circumstances which would be of interest to the Bureau.

Referral/Consult

In view of our withdrawal from the Stage Program and [redacted] the stops should be changed [redacted] should be advised in the event additional fingerprints are received on these persons. There is no necessity for the information to be relayed [redacted] through the Domestic Intelligence Division.

[redacted] Such additional fingerprint cards should be placed in the criminal file.

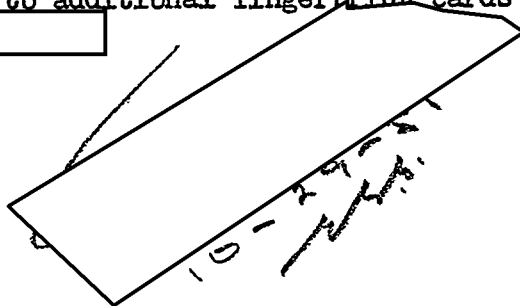

As you will recall, on May 28, 1951 in a discussion of the Proposed Plan for Intelligence Coverage in Alaska in the event of Invasion (Stay-behind program and escape and evasion program), you directed that upon my return to Anchorage, Alaska both of these programs be reviewed, analyzed, and a communication directed to you concerning their adequacy and advise whether the Bureau's responsibilities are completely fulfilled. Your instructions were reiterated in Bureau letter dated June 18, 1951.

Referral/Consult

With reference to recruitment, this office presently has 77 persons recruited as agents in the SEA Program. Training has begun for these individuals and to date, nine persons have gone to Washington, D. C. for training. Others are being scheduled at the rate of two a week. However, this number will be reduced to one a week as soon as [redacted]

[redacted] and one SEA and one [redacted] Agent will be sent to Washington weekly for training.

With reference to recruitment, continued attention will be given this phase. It is realized that certain of the agents already recruited will not measure up, certain will be rejected for physical handicaps not now discernible, and certain of them will drop out of their own accord. This office will be alert for additional persons having special qualifications which would make them effective in the SEA Program.

These data are passed on immediately to the Bureau for its information and guidance during his training. No persons are permitted to proceed to the West or Government until this office has been advised that accident insurance coverage has been purchased and is in effect.

The responsibility of this office in connection with both programs was fully explored to insure that those falling on the Bureau have been completely fulfilled. This office is completely cognizant of its responsibilities in connection with both programs and the same are being handled. The problems of security of both programs, continued training of the Stay-behind Agents who have received instruction at Washington, cacking, and communications were thoroughly explored. The security of both matters have constantly been brought to the attention of all personnel in this office. The security of both matters has again been brought to the attention of [redacted] with the suggestion that he impress upon his personnel the seriousness of this work and the absolute necessity for the maintenance of the same.

It is also believed and recommended that [REDACTED] should be directed to proceed to Washington at the earliest possible time to be afforded this training.

You have been previously advised, in part, in regard to the above program. For your further information and the information of Minneapolis and Detroit, the following is set forth.

The Bureau, [redacted] is presently engaged in a program whereby a number of civilians will be brought from Alaska to Washington for special training. These persons have indicated they intend to remain in Alaska even though that Territory be invaded and occupied by the Russians. It is contemplated that their services will be utilized for the purpose of gathering intelligence information in the event a part or all of Alaska is occupied by an enemy and will assist in the operations of underground routes for the escape of military personnel or perhaps others from Alaska to safe territory.

Plans have been effected to afford these persons appropriate training in Washington, D. C., by [redacted] the Bureau. They will be in Washington, D. C., for approximately two weeks. A representative number of these persons will be given additional training in parachute jumping at Fort Benning, Georgia, for approximately three weeks.

All offices should be alert to such calls and should render every possible assistance. Upon determination of probable schedules, Bureau persons on their return trips to Alaska, may wish to inquire of the Detention. It is possible that some of the persons will spend time in the States for personal reasons prior to return.

You are specifically instructed that the program is of the most confidential nature and is not to be discussed under any circumstances. You should, of course, brief appropriate personnel of your office to insure the handling of any problems which may arise. The Bureau should be informed of any problems which require Bureau attention.

Everybody's a Volunteer Observer

Alaskans on Constant Watch for a Red Raid

By MAX B. COOK

Alaskan villagers, on the threshold of Russia have organized ground observer corps to give warning of enemy attack on the United States.

Alaska is astride the shortest route for Red bomber attacks on the U.S. mainland. Many Soviet bases are close to the Alaskan border. Warning of an attack would give additional precious hours to intercept enemy aircraft.

CONSTANT WATCH

Whole villages maintain round-the-clock watch on the Alaskan skies. The watchers include trappers, hunters, teachers, bush pilots, missionaries and Eskimos.

All 230 residents of Nulato, about 150 miles south of the Arctic Circle, are corps members. Their leader is a Jesuit missionary who has been living there 18 years.

Nulato's population includes three nuns, a nurse, a trader and some 224 native Alaskan Indians of the Tena tribe. Each takes his turn at skywatching.

The missionary spends an hour each week instructing observers. Reports of unidentified aircraft go to either the missionary or his second in command, a native Indian. The reports then are passed on to the Air Force monitor.

There are many other posts, including Little Diomed Island, a stone's throw from Big Diomed, in Russian territory, and at Gambel and Savoonga on St. Lawrence Island, just this side of the Soviet Alaskan border.

CLOSE CO-OPERATION

Alaskan Air Command training personnel visit the remote posts regularly. They use everything from light planes equipped with pontoons

or skis to dog sleds. They bring movies, training aids and equipment.

Close co-operation is being established between the Alaskan observer corps and its Canadian counterpart. The radar screens can cover the skies but cannot detect low-flying aircraft which might slip thru between the radar stations.

Advance warnings from Alaska would provide from one to three hours added time for U.S. interceptors in case of an enemy attack over this shortest route. And both the USAF in Alaska and Canadian Air Force would get the first shot at the invaders.

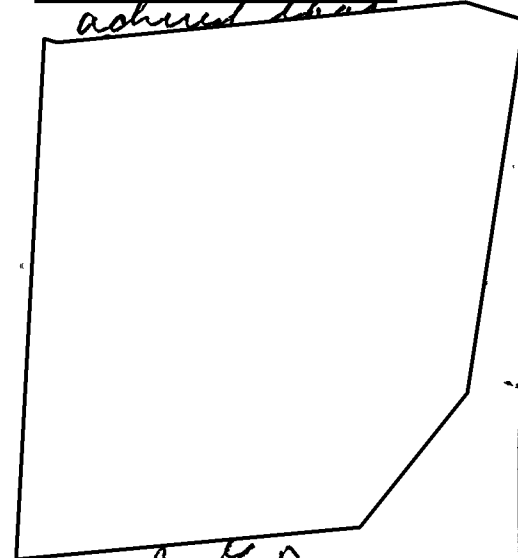

There is set out hereinafter a recapitulation of the Stay Behind Agent Program in this office, including information of an administrative nature, as well as data concerning agents who have been recommended and on whom closing reports have been submitted to the Bureau, together with certain problems encountered and the approach that is being made to this assignment.

[redacted] It is suggested that the Bureau official handling this matter may desire to retain [redacted] and obtaining a better perspective of problems referred to in communications to and from Washington. It is noted that [redacted]

[redacted] Any designated change, of course, will be immediately brought to the Bureau's attention.

I. STAY BEHIND AGENTS

In considering individuals in the territory as potential Stay Behind Agents, accent has been placed on enlisting those who have as many of the following qualifications as could be found.

- 1 - Persons with good health, loyal to the United States and who intend to stay in the territory in case of war or invasion.
- 2 - Persons with an intimate knowledge of the territory or the locale in which they reside.
- 3 - Persons with a knowledge of short wave radios.
- 4 - Persons who own short wave radios and have "ham" licenses.
- 5 - Persons who are airplane pilots.
- 6 - Persons who own airplanes.
- 7 - Persons with the ability to survive in the back country of the territory of Alaska under the most severe conditions for protracted periods of time.

- 9 - Persons who have had experience mushing dog teams.
- 10 - Persons who have had experience with small boats and who know the waters of Cook Inlet, Prince William Sound and the coast of Alaska between Shelikof Strait and Prince Rupert.
- 11 - Persons who own or have access to cabins located in areas which necessarily will be utilized in this program. Referral/Consult
- 12 - Persons who live in and around [REDACTED]
- 13 - Persons who live on and can observe the highways of Alaska.
- 14 - Persons who live on and can observe the railroad.
- 15 - Persons who can assist in the operation and maintenance of a "life and supply line".

II. NUMBER OF STAY BEHIND AGENTS

As has been noted heretofore in correspondence with the Bureau, it is impossible to set a number of Stay Behind Agents who would be adequate in giving ample and comprehensive intelligence coverage during an invasion or occupation. However, the project of obtaining Stay Behind Agents will be continued until the Bureau is satisfied that the strategic areas and all items referred to in I above appear to be sufficiently covered.

All other cases on which preliminary reports have been submitted and Bureau authority requested to conduct an interview, numbering 36 at this writing, have been assigned and Agents are presently on road trips attempting to locate and interview them.

Preliminary reports on 30 additional potential Stay Behind Agents have been submitted to the Bureau with a request for authority to interview them.

Cases on 31 individuals have been closed and the individuals themselves not recommended in view of information contained in the Bureau files, information received here from confidential informants or information contained in the Anchorage files.

As is noted above, continued efforts will obtain additional potential Agents but in the interests of completing as many as possible in the least possible time with the limited personnel, this is being deferred until those concerning whom we have had no opportunity to interview have been contacted and closing reports submitted.

It is noted that we have been able to make several interviews in such towns in strategic areas as Seward, Fairbanks, Anchorage and Palmer. However, we are now finding that persons to be interviewed reside in isolated sections and must be sought out one by one. This is consuming a considerable amount of time. In a number of instances, such persons do not live in areas covered by the established airlines and it is necessary to contact bush pilots on a charter basis so that the Agents can be flown in, waited for and flown out. In some cases it will be necessary to wait until trappers, hunters or other persons in isolated sections come into Anchorage or Fairbanks, where we have resident agencies, to be interviewed. Such persons have no contact whatsoever with the outside world and Agent personnel would not be utilized efficiently if it were detailed to spend a protracted period of time hunting them up one at a time.

It is noted also that this office has been hampered in its efforts to make contacts and interviews in the country surrounding Glenn Allen, Tok Junction and Big Delta by the severe cold. In this area in the past several weeks the temperature has been between 50 and 60 degrees below zero, making travel extremely hazardous.

III. TRAINING

Referral/Consult

Comments concerning training in this program have been made in Bureau letter of November 29, 1950, Anchorage letter of December 5, 1950, and Anchorage letter of January 8, 1951. In the last letter mentioned it is noted that

It is requested that a copy of this be forwarded to the Anchorage Office if it appears to contain material that would help in any phase of this program.

Also with reference to training of the agents when this program reaches that stage, it is contemplated that all agents be fingerprinted and photographed in order that this identifying data will be available to the Bureau and to the administration of this program.

IV. COMMUNICATIONS

Proposed method of handling radio communications was set out in Anchorage letter of December 18, 1950, and comments concerning a review of it by the radio experts in the FBI Laboratory were returned by Bureau letter of January 31, 1951. Inasmuch as it has been decided that the [redacted]

[redacted]

It is noted that almost all radio installations in the territory of Alaska will be in isolated and rugged terrain and it is suggested that possibly more than one man should be detailed to operate each radio. This suggestion is augmented by the fact that in almost every case the radio will need a power unit inasmuch as electricity will not be available. It is felt that more than one man will be needed to make such a radio installation mobile or, if it is stationary, to man it for protracted periods of time. Likewise, it is felt that two men would have a better opportunity for survival, both against an enemy and against the rigors of this climate if they were able to work together.

Referral/Consult

In addition to radio communication, it is possible that a ground to air radio contact may be set up. However, in view of the fact that [redacted] discussions with [redacted] cannot be had at this time.

Communication by courier has been considered but it is pointed out that such relays will be slow to the point of being almost useless. In addition to this, in the winter courier by snowshoes and dog teams will be impossible in many sections.

Referral/Consult

It is noted that considerable time and effort will be necessary to transport radios, power units and necessary accessories to each point of location. The summer is the only season which lends itself to this function. In view of this, it is suggested that the Bureau may desire to point out to [redacted] that almost a whole year will be lost if something is not done in this respect during the summer of 1951.

Likewise, it is noted that summer is the best and only practicable time to carry in materials, build caches and draft maps of the same. If this project is not started in 1951, it will almost necessarily have to be put off until 1952.

V. CACHING

Inasmuch as considerable caching of supplies, arms, ammunition, gasoline, radios and other Arctic survival gear will have to be done, this office is in the process of compiling a dossier on this activity. It is noted that though contact has been made with the Army and Air Force here in the Territory, no written material on it has been found. Hence, we are compiling our information from various sources such as Fish and Wildlife Service; Arctic Survival Unit of the Army, particularly the Big Delta, Alaska, section; hunters, trappers and other individuals who have spent much time in the back country. This dossier will contemplate the following:

A - Essential items to be cached

- 1 - Radio parts and equipment
- 2 - Arms and ammunition and other weapons
- 3 - Clothing
- 4 - Medicines
- 5 - Foods
- 6 - Gear and supplies necessary for agents' cover such as traps, prospectors tools
- 7 - Photographic equipment
- 3 - Gear necessary for operation of agents such as field glasses, cameras where necessary, flashlight, signal panel, signal mirror and signal flags
- 9 - Snowshoes and skis where necessary
- 10 - Gasoline when and where necessary
- 11 - Explosives
- 12 - Camp gear

B - Places for caching

- 1 - In lakes, streams and rivers
- 2 - In caves
- 3 - In ground
- 4 - Stilted caches
- 5 - In trees
- 6 - In cabins

C - Manner of sealing or making weather tight the cached materials

- 1 - In sealed cans
- 2 - In water and moisture proof foil

- 3 - In boxes where cache is not exposed to the elements

It is realized that quite possibly the responsibility for part or all of the caching function will be [redacted]

VI. LIFE AND SUPPLY LINE

As has been noted in the reports received by the Bureau in connection with interviews of those individuals who have been recommended as Stay Behind Agents, it is set out whether such individual is able to operate or owns an airplane. In this regard consideration has been given to the establishment of a lifeline for the Stay Behind Agents. It will be necessary, of course, to supply them from time to time with arms, ammunition, food, clothing and other gear necessary to the success of this endeavor and essential to the existence of the agents.

This office is making a study of the most logical mountain passes, air routes and logical spots for landing by pontoons, skis and wheels. These routes, of course, will necessarily emanate from positions in the territory of Alaska and possibly later in Canada which will be out of the zone of occupation.

While an effort has been made to obtain any type of written material on such a project, none has been found. Hence, our sources thus far have been the Fish and Wildlife Service, which habitually flies over all of this country in bush type aircraft. We are also contacting the CAA here which has detailed maps of all of the country in which we are interested. In addition, we are also obtaining information from bush pilots, big game guides who own planes and prospectors who own planes in order that we may ultimately have a complete dossier on this field.

Referral/Consult

In this regard, it is probably contemplated that such [redacted] however, in view of the fact that [redacted] it is felt that such a study should be made even though it is discarded at a later date.

Referral/Consult

In connection with this project or if [redacted] necessary gasoline caches will have to be made at various places in the territory inasmuch as the type of plane (bush aircraft) will not be able to fly sorties to all Stay Behind Agent locations and return to its base without refueling.

Also with reference to this life and supply line, it is pointed out that gasoline caches will have to be made during the summer months in a great part of the territory. If something is not done on this phase of the program during the summer of 1951, it necessarily will have to be deferred until the following summer.

The following data on caching has been compiled from information obtained through interviews with the personnel of the

[redacted] representatives of the Fish and Wildlife Service of the Territory of Alaska, Department of the Interior; and selected big game guides, trappers and other persons in the Territory of Alaska who have had experience in this field.

This document does not purport to be all-inclusive or to be a standard for caching but rather includes the ideas, suggestions and experience of men who have lived for protracted periods of time in the wilderness of Alaska.

Referral/Consult

According to [redacted]

Mr. HOLGER LARSEN, Chief, Fish and Wildlife Service Office, Anchorage, stated that in his opinion a unit of two men provides a great deal more protection from predators and the rigors of winter weather. Two can be much more successful in hunting, building and the dispatching of duties involved in survival. He added that if a survival unit is composed of more than two men, it often results in a majority clique being formed, making life almost unbearable for a minority group when men are forced to live together for long periods of time in isolation. Such a situation quite often results in violence.

As caches are set up files should be compiled on them and minute and detailed records of everything concerning a particular cache should be included in such a file. Referral/Consult

With reference to the particular problem at hand, it is believed that caches will necessarily have to be established within the proximity of all [redacted]

in certain instances, to be determined, it will be necessary to establish two or more caches in the area of certain of these
[redacted]

The broad and general categories of items to be cached for this program will be food; camp and survival gear; radios and service parts; and gasoline and fuel oil.

The term of time considered in this study with reference to supplies has been arbitrarily chosen to provide for two men for one year without outside aid.

In the opinion of persons contacted with reference to caching, it is being taken as a fact that men cannot survive in the back country of Alaska for protracted periods of time without some shelter other than tents or other temporary shelter. In almost all instances those who do survive in the interior and live there have shelter consisting of a cabin. It is believed that in all instances where caches are established in the proximity of the strategic areas a cabin must be found or must be built. It is believed that in most instances cabins which may be utilized already have been erected.

With reference to the number of caches which must be set up in connection with this program, no specific number can be stated at this time. However, it is reasonable to assume that 12 will be necessary.

With reference to the cost, no estimate can be made, although from a study of this dossier, it is apparent that the cost of each will be considerable in view of the fact that each must be equipped with guns and ammunition, a year's food supply, considerable camp gear, clothing and radio.

It is noted that the terrain in which all of the caches will be established is extremely rugged. Access can be had to the locations of the same by airplane and in some instances by water. In all cases it will be impossible to get into the cabin and cache sites without a bush plane equipped with skis in the winter and pontoons in summer. At the sites of the anticipated locations the weather will be extremely cold in the wintertime, going to 50 degrees below zero. In winter the days are very short and the nights long. In the summer in these same locations the days are very long, the nights short and one of the hardships to be endured is the not inconsiderable plague of mosquitoes.

The problem of caching must be approached with careful preparation and determination and handled by teams who have had some experience in this work.

It has been estimated that a home base camp site for two men for a period of one year should be supplied with more than one cache. Each cache should be an entity in itself, that is, it should contain all items necessary to the survival of the individuals and the operation of this program. In this manner, if one cache is destroyed by fire or an enemy, there will be one or more others upon which to rely.

MANNER OF PACKAGING MATERIAL TO BE CACHED

All materials which are cached for future use must be protected from the elements, from extreme cold, from predators, such as bears, wolverines and wolves, and must be preserved in order that they will be maintained in usable condition as long as possible.

In the opinion of Mr. HOLGER LARSEN, referred to above, the placing of food stuffs and as much other gear as possible in sealed cans will give such items the maximum of protection. This manner of storing items for caching is presently being used in the Territory of Alaska. The type of cans chosen usually are corrugated tin milk cans of 5 or 10 gallon capacity. Items stored in this manner cannot be battered open by predators and will withstand rust and deterioration. Likewise, such cans can be delivered to a location of caching by being parachuted from

a plane or, if the cache is to be located in tundra, may be free dropped without danger of destruction when they are delivered.

All or as many items as possible should be packaged in tin, sealed containers. All items of food, where possible, should be dehydrated or powdered, inasmuch as they will freeze in the wintertime and thaw in the summertime if they contain any liquid. Such freezing and thawing will result in considerable spoilage and in instances contamination of other items placed in the same package if liquids in thawing burst their container and allow the contents to spill over the cache.

In some instances water and moisture proof foil may be used on certain items such as fishing gear, ammunition and other metal objects. If foil is the only protection over such items, they, of course, will necessarily have to be placed in a large metal container with various other items in order that they will be completely protected from the elements and predators.

In a few instances, items may be merely boxed and placed in a cache where such items are not exposed directly to the elements. Such items may consist of rope, axes, hatchets, knives, cooking utensils, etc. In these instances boxes such as this will have to be stored in tight and preferably log caches on stilts.

In a few instances, items may be contained in canvas or burlap. Such items might be susceptible, however, to rust, corrosion and other like phenomena.

In planning a particular cache and choosing the items to be placed in it, the foregoing should be borne in mind to prevent such cached items being worthless when they must be used.

CHOOSING CACHE LOCATION

In the experience of persons who have done considerable caching in the Territory of Alaska, the most common choice of location is one that is partially protected by large trees, rock formations, etc. In connection with this program, there is the added necessity of camouflage. This problem can best be approached by the careful consideration of a location by the person who is ultimately to use the cache and a person who may be qualified as an expert in this field.

Several locations within the radius of a few miles of the home base camp can be chosen and the cache must suitably to that terrain and climate be erected. Each of these caches should contain all items which are necessary for survival and to the operation of this program.

MAPPING AND MARKING CACHES

It is believed that after cache locations have been

chosen, caches built and items to be cached stored therein, a detailed map of this particular camp site and cache location should be made. This map should be supported by specific directions to find such cache. This can be done by reference to certain natural objects as trees, rivers, streams, mountains, etc., in that location. Likewise, the map should show the names of individuals having personal knowledge of the location of the cache in order that such information can be passed on to someone at a later date to enable him to find it without any difficulty whatsoever.

After a cache has been established, in addition to the map referred to above, a detailed dossier should be compiled showing meticulously all items which have been placed in it. Two copies of such dossier should be made in order that one may be placed in the hands of the person who will use such cache and the other can go into the file made up concerning that particular cache.

It is also believed that detailed photographs should be made of all caches, which photos may be valuable later in locating the cache and to determine whether it is sufficiently camouflaged to escape detection.

The location of all caches, after being placed on an elaborate and detailed map, should be spotted on a master map which will be available to persons interested in the administration of this program.

METHODS OF FREIGHTING SUPPLIES TO CACHE LOCATIONS

The only methods available for getting materials and supplies to cache locations in the territory are as follows: Transporting by airplane; transporting part of the way by railroad in certain instances; transporting by water in some instances; and by manually packing such materials in.

Obviously, the most logical of all methods listed above is by flying all materials in by plane and delivering them to the cache locations by parachute or free drop. Hence, this method is the only one concerning which any comment will be made.

The team which has been chosen to set up a particular cache can be on the location ready to receive the items to be cached when they are dropped. This team can chose the cache locations, build the caches, estimate what they need, how it is to be packed and build any shelter at the home base site which is necessary. When the items to be cached are dropped in they can be examined, stored, detailed lists checked and other information mentioned above obtained and caches sealed.

BUILDING OF CACHES

Referral/Consult

It is believed that caches can be built more efficiently and expeditiously by a team consisting of an expert in this field, the agent who will possibly use a particular cache and a member or representative of [] FBI, [] A representative of one of these organizations should have complete knowledge of all caches and should be there to make the complete and permanent record of the cache itself and everything that is in it.

ITEMS TO BE CACHED

(A) Radio parts and equipment

Referral/Consult

- (1) At least one radio of a type to be selected by [] FBI
- (2) Power unit for the radio, it being noted that in almost no instance is there electricity from REA or some municipal plant which would be available. If there were, most of it, of course, would become unavailable in case of an invasion. Hence, all radios must be equipped with power units to operate them.
- (3) Gasoline and oil in ample supply to operate the generator.
- (4) Sufficient spare parts to keep the radio in constant operation.
- (5) Complete set of radio instruction books by which the operators can learn in detail the parts of the radio and make minor repairs.
- (6) At least one complete repair kit to be decided upon by experts of the FBI []

- (7) Complete sets of codes to be used. These will be determined by experts of FBI
- (8) Complete sets of crystals to be decided upon by experts of FBI

As a general statement concerning the radios, they should be small and compact. They should be designed and built with the thought in mind that they must necessarily be operated by one or two men who, though trained in this field, will by no means be experts. They should be as light as possible; as sturdy as possible; and capable of being moved by one or two men. They should not be standardized with all other radios used in this program inasmuch as the detection of two or more in exact duplicate will quite possibly lead to the uncovering of the whole system. With this thought in mind, it is suggested that quite possibly the units can be built into as many brands of well known radio cabinets as possible. The power units likewise should not be all of one kind for the same reason set out above.

(B) Arms and ammunition - per man

- (1) A large caliber hunting rifle, either a 30.06 Winchester, Model 70, with sling; 300 Magnum, with sling; or a 270, with sling.
- (2) A small caliber sidearm should be provided for small game. This can be a .22 caliber Hi-Standard, with holster; a K-22 Smith and Wesson, with holster; or a .22 caliber Woodsman Colt, with holster.
- (3) Ammunition - For the hunting rifle it is believed that 800 rounds of ammunition will suffice and for the pistol it is believed that 1,000 rounds will suffice.
- (4) Small hunting knife and sheath.
- (5) Large marine folding knife.

The above types of weapons are not being given as a standard but as suggestions of the types that are most commonly used and most popular in this country.

It is noted that almost all gasoline taken into the back country of the Territory of Alaska is carried in by airplane and parachuted or free dropped to the earth. The containers are the so-called "jerry cans" which are a rather sturdy 5, 7 or 10 gallon container. Also, the gas can be delivered and cached in the GI gas cans or in any strong drum of more than 10 gallon capacity. It is noted that if the capacity of the drum used is more than 10 gallons the container will split when it strikes the ground and any more weight than that of 10 gallons is exceedingly hard to transport in rough terrain. This is obvious because of the size and shape of gasoline drums.

- (2) Oil of the proper quality and quantity for the operation of the power generators, as well as for any oil cooking unit that may be at a particular camp site.

- (3) Assorted greases for lubrication of equipment

(J) Miscellaneous

There are being attached to this dossier certain material which was submitted in writing at the time this phase of the program was being investigated. These documents have been numbered for ready reference.

CACHING OF SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT

The list furnished by [redacted] was made available to [redacted] big game guide, without his knowing the source of same and after examination he stated that he was in agreement with the list set forth with the following observations:

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Aircraft

He stated his opinion that the Piper Cub was a superior aircraft for consideration under this program as far as single engine planes went. He stated he recommended wing covers for the plane as well as a padded engine cover, pointing out that in an emergency a sleeping bag could be used for this purpose. He also recommended a fire pot and a can into which the oil from the plane could be drained and kept warm.

Regarding overhauling kits, he advised that the top overhauling kit included only rings and a gasket and therefore he recommended the factory major overhaul kit, stating that this included bearings as well as the rings and gasket which could be easily replaced. He further suggested a spare set of valves, together with suction cup, valve grinder and grinding compound.

He advised that besides an extra propeller there should be included extra landing gear, stating that normally if a ski or float is damaged, the landing gear itself is wiped out or damaged. In this connection [redacted] stated he did not believe that floats were interchangeable unless the new Edo float could be used in that manner and that therefore if any spare was to be included it should be a set of floats rather than one. He stated from a practical standpoint it was usually possible to repair any normal damage to floats and as concerning the float repair kit advised that the rivets and gun were not necessary and recommended the following for float repair:

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- 1 box $\frac{1}{2}$ #7 sheet metal screws
- 2 square feet of $\frac{1}{2}$ hard 030 aluminum or 17 SD sheet aluminum together with light canvas and zinc chromite paste

He stated that the metal should be available in a 1' square together with 3 and 6 square inch pieces. He added that a small hand drill and a set of drills up to $\frac{1}{4}$ " should be included for float repair and advised that with these materials he had made repairs to floats which held and remained dry for 2 or 3 years after such patching.

He recommended a spare antenna for the airplane radios, stating that these frequently were lost or damaged in bush operations.

In connection with aviation oil, he advised it was his experience that 15 gallons would be required for each 100 hours of either winter or summer operation and he recommended #20 oil for winter operation and #40 for summer operation but stated that probably #30 oil could be used for either winter or summer operation.

Ground Movement

Concerning ground movement he stated that if such equipment were to be needed he would recommend a weasel for year round operation. He stated he could visualize the utility of such equipment only if it were for the moving of heavy supplies and equipment and that movement of personnel would be faster in the long run by foot. As for any use of the weasel or tractor it would be necessary to cut trails in many instances.

Regarding tents, he advised against the small silk mountain tents because of their tendency to sweat and recommended a good waterproof canvas tent, 8 x 10, and suggested a gray color.

He stated he could recommend only down sleeping bags, suggesting the double bag with both the inner and outer sections, stating that the outer section was good for summer use.

[] recommended against the double bit axe, suggesting rather that something in the nature of a Collins 3/4 axe was the best camp axe and the best for utility as it could be used to cut and also as a hammer. In this connection he pointed out also that no hatchets should be considered in the list of equipment.

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Personal Equipment

[] recommended that all pants, shirts and coats be of wool material, stating that the pants should be full length with no cuffs, allowing them to drape over the shoepacks, and stated that the woolen pants were the quietest for movement in the brush. He also stated that Kersey lined pants were not desirable where one wore long woolen underwear.

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Foods

He stated that dried milk should always be included as well as some canned milk and that butter in tin cans was an excellent idea. He pointed out that the average trapper takes 2 each of 5 pound cans of dried potatoes, stating they were an excellent staple and he believed one pound of dried potatoes was equal to approximately 7 pounds of fresh potatoes. He also recommended raisins and apricots with some prunes and suggested inclusion of bay leaves for the making of stews.

Miscellaneous

[] suggested a small Coleman lantern as well as the Coleman GI stove and stated that the average trapper for a winter supplied himself with 10 gallons of Blazo for the lantern. It is noted that in an emergency the Coleman GI stove can be used as a fire pot for warming airplane engines.

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He advised that a good hunting knife should be included as well as snare wire in the survival kit. He also recommended several good tarps which might be used in an emergency as a small tent and possibly caching as noted below.

[] questioned whether there had been any development in the possibility of filtering smoke from wood stoves and suggested that the individuals might char their wood first, stating that this could be possible on days when it was snowing or overcast and windy, which charred wood could then be utilized on clear days or when there was little wind with the least danger of any smoke being visible.

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He advised that any caches above the ground would have to be built bear proof and any food supplies be sealed to prevent their odor from attracting bears and other predators.

[] advised he has had some experience in free dropping of supplies and equipment from a small plane and cited as an example times when individual bottles of whiskey were dropped into tundra with little or no breakage. It is noted that tundra is the best for free dropping, even better than snow, because of its sponginess which allows it to give and spring back.

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Gasoline Caching

[] stated that it would be possible to cache gas and oil by merely staking them under some cover in the brush, covering same with tarps and placing moss on top of the tarps, which from anything but a very short distance would appear to be a moss-covered mound of earth.

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He stated he had never had any experience in caching gasoline with the idea of concealing same and that in the past in connection with his guiding business and flying he had merely placed cans out in the open beside some lake or stream. He stated that if commercial cans were used he would recommend removing them from the wooden cases which would absorb moisture and pointed out that he has been best satisfied by his own use of a 7 gallon Army gas can which is square in shape and may be easily transported by plane. He advised in this connection that he has had these cans stashed out for as long as a 3 year period with little or no loss

from leakage and rust and that to date none of these cans have ever been bothered by bears. He stated in this connection he did not know whether it was the shape or the heavier metal than is used in a commercial can which produced these results.

He pointed out that the 15 gallon drum was a good item if you had good transportation facilities, stating that one of these drums could be set up in the back seat of a Cub plane and hooked into the fuel line easily within 15 minutes which would then provide the plane with 10 hours of cruising time. He pointed out, however, that normally the 7 gallon container would be all that the average man would want to handle by himself in refueling any small plane when he had to lift it up to the wing tanks and particularly if the plane were on floats in the water.

Mr. JACK JEFFORD, old-time bush pilot and presently Chief Pilot for Civil Aeronautics Administration, advised that while he had never had any experience in attempting to conceal caches of gasoline he had found that in using the commercial cans which come in 2 5 gallon cans in a wooden case it was better to remove the wooden cases as they absorb moisture unless the cans were to be stored along the coast line where salt water spray might get to them, in which event it might be better to leave them in the wooden cases.

Mr. JEFFORD stated he was not certain but believed that the 10th Air Rescue Group of the Air Force had utilized a small 10 gallon drum on occasion but stated that a 5 or 7 gallon container would be better when it was to be handled by one individual because of the weight involved.

Mr. JEFFORD stated on one occasion CAA had cached some gasoline in commercial cans in the wooden cases and upon inspection during the second year they had found approximately a 25% loss due mainly to rust and some shrinkage.

Mr. JEFFORD pointed out that a good rule of thumb for the amount of gas needed would be 10 gallons per hour in any engines of a horsepower from 150 to 185. He also recommended the Piper Cub plane for performance and noted the gas consumption would be less than 10 gallons an hour.

Mr. JEFFORD also pointed out that in his experience he had never suffered any loss from theft along the coast in the vicinity of Nome and north from there but that there had been some pilferage of their gas supplies by the natives along the Kuskokwim River and vicinity.

Mr. MARTIN S. JORGENSEN, Manager, Marketing Department, Standard Oil Company of California, long-time resident of Alaska,

recommended that the commercial cans, if used, be stacked, if possible, to protect the bottoms of the cans, stating that most of the commercial cans today have ridges on the bottoms which have a tendency to bulge and that moisture collects along these ridges, resulting in rust. He suggested that improvement might be obtained by having the ridges eliminated or inverted if a special can were to be considered for use.

He pointed out that the problems most frequently incurred from his experience were that of extreme cold which caused the collapsing of the cans and also salt water which was inducive to rust action. He suggested that if cans could be obtained with better tin plating than normally available commercially, it would cut down on losses from rust. He also suggested that any container used for the storage of gas should be galvanized or made of tin which would also have better lasting qualities. He stated that commercially, as far as he knew without going into the field of special containers, gas and oil were available only in 5 gallon cans which came in cases of 2. He stated that he believed the Air Force in the past had 15 gallon drums which were of heavier gauge metal but pointed out that gasoline would average $6\frac{1}{4}$ pounds per gallon and that a smaller container could be more readily handled by an individual.

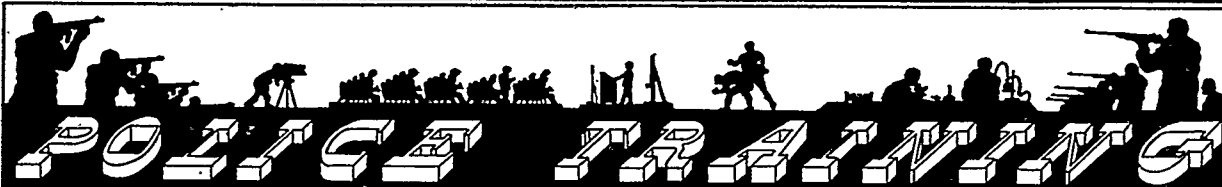

Disarming Methods

x Introduction

WHEN a gun is drawn, anything can happen. It isn't necessarily the formidable weapon it may appear to be. Everything depends on who is holding the gun - and who is standing in front of it. The following outline of disarming methods, as developed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation for the training of its Special Agents and members of the FBI National Academy, is intended to acquaint the law enforcement officer with the offensive and defensive potentialities of a drawn firearm. A knowledge of disarming methods will not only minimize the possibility of a law enforcement officer being disarmed by a criminal but also, in an extreme emergency situation, it may well mean the difference between life and death. The techniques shown herein are as simple as they are effective, but it will be readily apparent to the reader that they must be used judiciously.

PURPOSE

When considering the possibilities of disarming, the reaction of most individuals is apt to be one of complete resignation to the fact that the man with the gun in his hand has complete control of the situation, and that a "hands off" policy is the best one to follow. There is no doubt that it would be fatal to attempt to disarm under certain circumstances, but there are, however, instances when it would be possible to take a weapon from a person without incurring undue risk of injury or loss of life. In connection with the latter situation, this article is intended (1), to show the law enforcement officer how not to handle his gun and (2), to demonstrate how easily a gun may be taken away from him. Forearmed with this knowledge, the law enforcement officer can, of course, use it in wresting a weapon from a criminal.



EVALUATING AND SELECTING METHODS

The first consideration, of course, is that of safety. While physical disarming is usually considered hazardous, it can be done with comparative safety if intelligence is exercised in selection of the methods to be used. A worthwhile method is one that allows you to:

- A. Get your body quickly out of the line of fire - within three-eighths of a second.
- B. Control the gun throughout the entire maneuver.
- C. Obtain possession of the gun or bring the subject under complete physical control in a reasonably short time - within one to five seconds.

Simplicity of plan is fully as important as safety. The disarming method which is chosen must be simple and composed of natural movements so that it can be effectively carried out by any person possessing average physical ability.

No plan is acceptable unless it is effective. A method must be so constructed that when it is executed properly the gun is obtained or the subject brought under control regardless of outside factors, such as strength of opponent, size and type of gun and so forth. In order to meet this requirement, the method must be based on sound principles regarding body mechanics, leverage, utilization of the criminal's strength to bring about his downfall, and concentration of power where the criminal is the weakest. It should be noted, however, that all methods are not equally effective under the same circumstances and discretion must be exercised by the individual in selecting the best disarming method to be used at a particular time.

FACTORS CONTRIBUTING TO SUCCESS

The techniques that can be used in disarming are many, and it is necessary for each individual to develop one method that comes to him naturally. The methods, however, are just as varied in their application as they are in number. It may well be that after lengthy training in utilizing a definite technique, the law enforcement officer will find himself unable to use that method in the case before him. Instead he may have to act on the spur of the moment in formulating a new plan. Being quick offensively or defensively, with or without a gun, is purely a matter of constant practice and is a definite asset in a disarming situation. The practice and development of a natural technique will give a definite method to follow and will make the law enforcement officer sure of himself when disarming presents itself.



Good judgment and surprise are the two most important factors which will contribute to success in disarming. First of all, one must make an almost instantaneous decision as to whether or not any disarming is to be attempted at all, and almost simultaneously one must decide what method is to be used. The law enforcement officer who is successful in disarming a criminal must be something of an actor. If he is able to lead the criminal to believe that he has no intention of disarming him, the element of surprise will be very great and the chances for success will be definitely increased.

A position of balance must be maintained at all times so that a maximum of speed, force and accuracy may be obtained in the disarming. Speed and agility are important because it is well to anticipate that at least one shot will be fired and the initial movement in any disarming plan must be executed with sufficient speed so that this initial shot will be avoided. This can be accomplished only through a smooth coordination of every movement. Last of all, the law enforcement officer must be thoroughly familiar with the disarming plan which he has chosen to execute.

WHAT TO REMEMBER

It is difficult and impractical to give definite rules to be followed in the event a law enforcement officer is ordered to put up his hands by a person armed with a gun. There are, however, certain basic fundamentals which must be considered:

- A. Don't attempt to take a gun that is not "in reach". It is considered "in reach" if you can make contact with a substantial portion of it with your hand by moving only your arm. At your rear, a gun is "in reach" if it is either touching or very close to your back.
- B. Don't telegraph your plan of action. Moving any part of your body prior to moving your hand or arm is very apt to reveal your intentions.
- C. Don't arouse suspicion. Lead the subject to believe that you are thoroughly frightened and want to cooperate fully. Keep talking as much as possible. When instructed to "put 'em up", a good position is with the arms shoulder high, forearm at a right angle to the upper arm and hands slightly in front of the shoulders.

On the other hand, when the situation is reversed and you are covering a subject, do not permit him to distract your attention through talking, and make him raise his hands high above his head. Don't let yourself be lulled into a false feeling of security.



The weapon should be held at one's side, not out from the body, and it must be kept out of reach of the subject's arms and legs. If it is necessary to bring the gun "in reach" the subject should first be placed in some distinctly disadvantageous stance. One must be constantly alert for any movements which would indicate the subject's intentions to make a move for the police officer's gun such as moving an arm slightly forward, bending trunk slightly forward, a general contracting of the muscles, hasty movement of the eyes and shifting of the feet. Briefly, the police officer must be sure that he has complete control of his gun and the subject at all times.

KNOW THE GUN

In grasping a gun held in the hands of a subject, it is well to remember that the action of most revolvers can be stopped by holding the cylinder. Those with unexposed hammers, however, are apt to fire even when the cylinder is tightly held. This is also true of cheaply manufactured guns and those not in perfect working order. When the gun is cocked, one shot will be fired unless it is possible in some way to keep the hammer from falling on the firing pin, but it often is possible to accomplish this by placing the finger in front of the hammer. When disarming a cocked gun, making contact with anything but the gun may cause it to be fired the moment contact is made.

Ordinarily, an automatic pistol is to be treated the same as a cocked gun. It is to be noted, however, when pressure is asserted against the muzzle of an automatic, (exposed hammer type only), the slide moves back slightly and the weapon will not fire.

It is virtually impossible to differentiate between the end of a gun barrel and similar objects, such as a pipe stem, or a finger when either one is held against a person's back. Before attempting a rear disarming method, it therefore is advisable for one to glance over his shoulder to determine whether or not a gun actually is being held in his back and, if so, which hand is holding the weapon and in what position.

IMPORTANCE OF PRACTICE

The difficult part of teaching disarming methods to others is that the student is apt merely to observe the speed and agility that someone else has acquired. The student of disarming must be taught in a progressive manner each of the steps to be followed in the various methods in order that he himself may discover how to take a weapon from a criminal's hand successfully. The important movements must be practiced frequently in order that each of the individual steps may be welded into one swift motion.



PHYSICAL TRAINING

DISARMING METHODS

A. REVOLVER AND AUTOMATIC

1. Preliminary Movement: Push Gun off Body - Retain Grasp - Twist Body.

This movement precedes practically all disarming methods from the front and consists of making contact with the gun with either hand, preferably

over the cylinder with the knuckles up and the thumb under the barrel, pushing the gun to the side so that the muzzle will be off the body (if the left hand is used the gun is pushed toward your right and vice versa), retaining a tight grasp on the gun and twisting the body in the opposite direction to the hand used, (Figures 1A and 1B). Contact can also be made with the wrist if the left hand is used - the middle of your hand should be approximately over the break of the wrist of your assailant,

(Figures 1C and 1D). In the "preliminary movement" the feet move very slightly, the twisting movement being mostly in the knees and hips. It is not necessary to twist the body to such an extent that a balanced position is difficult to maintain. The hand that does not make contact with the gun is carried close to the body and the eyes follow the gun.

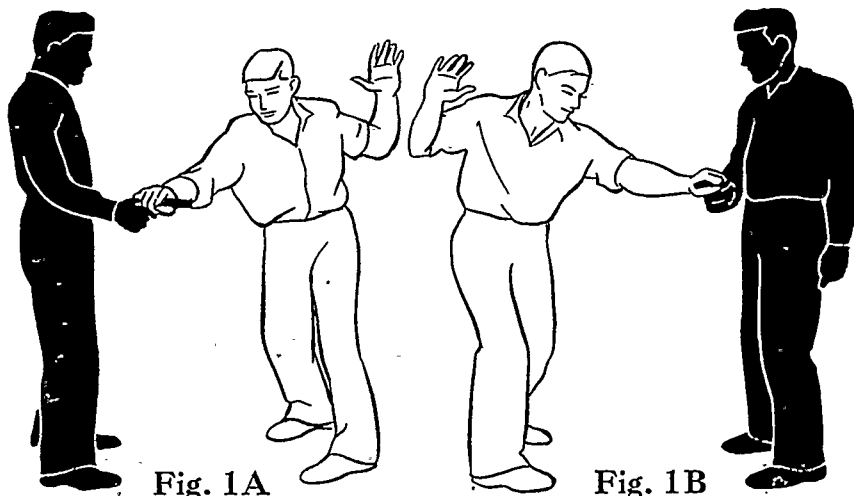

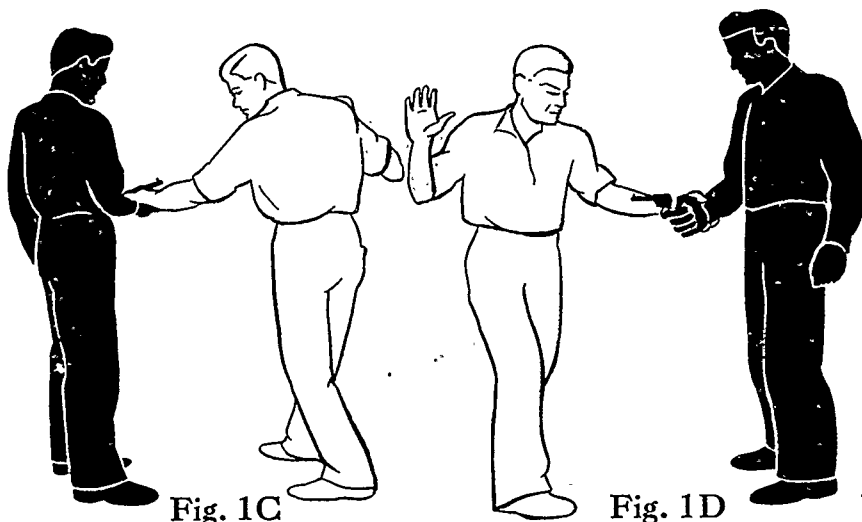

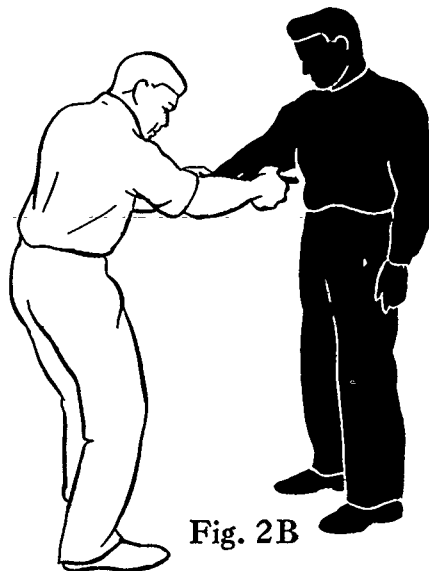

2. On Wrist - Turn Gun Toward Assailant. Execute preliminary movement, making contact with assailant's wrist with your left hand, palm up - gun is pushed toward your right, (Figure 2A). Place your right hand under the barrel of the gun, palm up, and turn muzzle of the gun directly toward assailant keeping the barrel parallel with the floor, (Figure 2B). Get the gun by jerking his wrist toward you while pushing the gun in the opposite direction.

3. On Wrist - Up Toward Shoulder - Twist. Execute preliminary movement using your left hand and making contact with your assailant's right wrist, palm down, gun is pushed toward your right, (Figure 3A). Hit underneath the barrel and cylinder of the gun with your right hand, palm up, forcing the muzzle of the gun inward and upward toward assailant's right shoulder, at the same time twisting the gun counterclockwise. Twisting the gun is absolutely necessary, (Figure 3B).

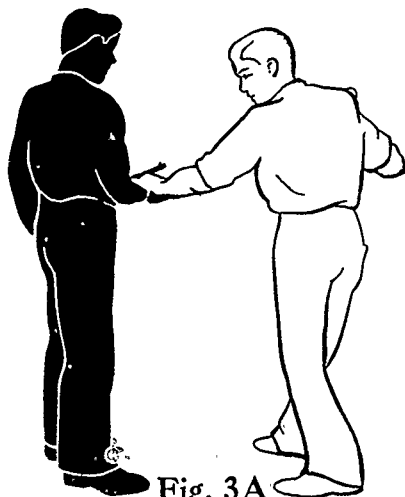

NOTE: This method can also be executed by making first contact on the cylinder of the gun; right hand hits under butt or trigger guard of gun.

X If assailant holds gun close to his hip, push it vigorously into his abdomen; immediately strike a right hand blow to his face or groin and then follow up as illustrated in Fig. 3B.

X Another alternate movement is to execute the preliminary movement as described above and then immediately step across the front of assailant's body with your left foot, throwing your left hip hard into his mid-section. Your right hand, palm up, makes contact with the gun under your left hand and assists in jerking the gun forward and downward and in twisting it toward assailant's left. If the gun is not obtained immediately, pressure may be applied downward directly above assailant's right elbow or blows may be delivered to his face with your left hand.

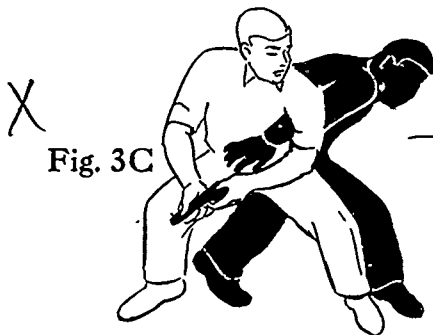

X 4. Back Over Trigger

Finger. Execute preliminary movement, using your right hand and making contact over the cylinder of the gun. Carry the gun just off the body toward your left, (Figure 4A). Start forcing the muzzle toward your assailant and twisting the gun clockwise, (Figure 4B), as your left hand, thumb up, makes contact with gun as close to the muzzle as possible, (Figure 4C).

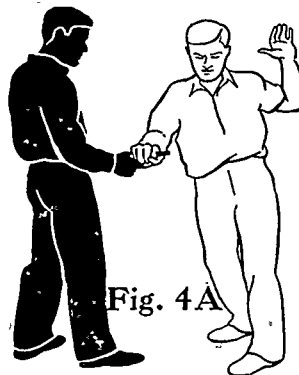

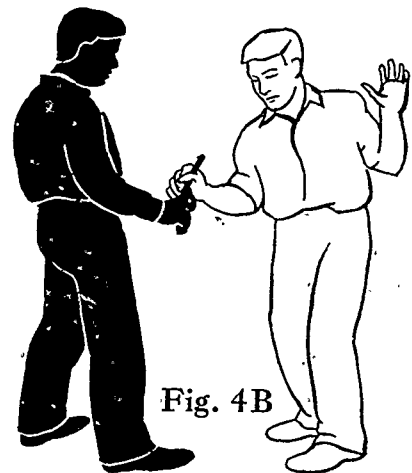

(Edge-of-hand blow may be delivered to back of subject's right hand or wrist prior to placing left hand on barrel of gun.) When the barrel of the gun reaches a vertical position, apply pressure directly backward so that the muzzle of the gun is pointing toward the crook of the assailant's right elbow, thus catching the trigger finger in the trigger guard, (Figure 4D). Gun is ripped off trigger finger to the right side of your body, muzzle still pointing in direction of assailant.

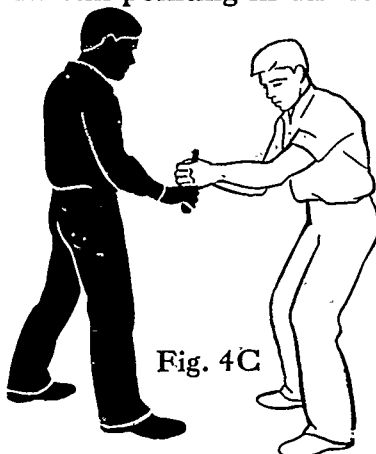

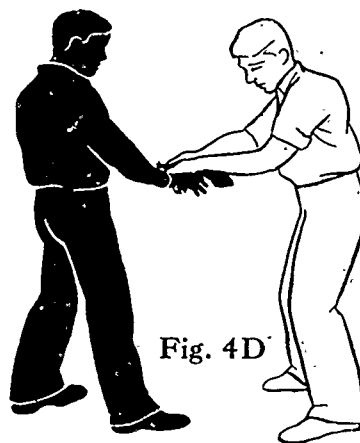

✕ **5. Sling Across Body.** Execute preliminary movement, using right hand, making contact over cylinder of the gun. Push the gun sideward and slightly upward toward your left, keeping the barrel parallel to the floor and forcing the muzzle back in the direction of your assailant, (Figure 5A).

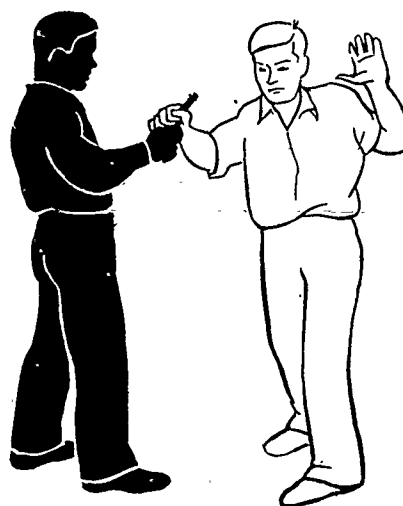

Just before your arm becomes fully extended, change direction and start swinging the gun across assailant's body toward your right. Immediately after you change direction from left to right, your left hand comes up (palm up) and makes contact with the gun under the cylinder to assist your right hand in the action, (Figure 5B). Throughout the entire maneuver, the barrel of the gun is kept continually forced back toward your assailant. His trigger finger will be caught in the trigger guard and he will be unable to retain his grip on the gun, (Figure 5C).

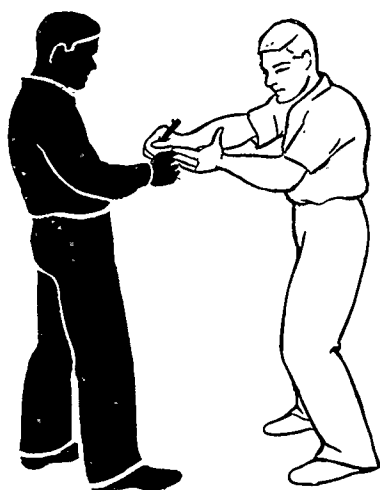

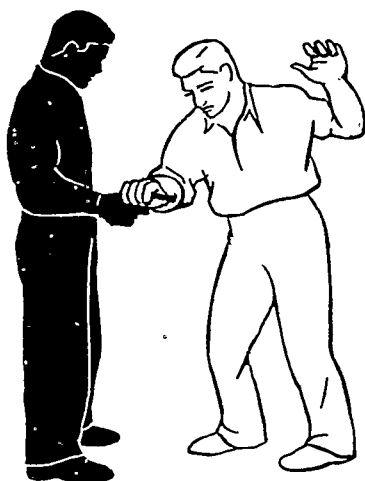

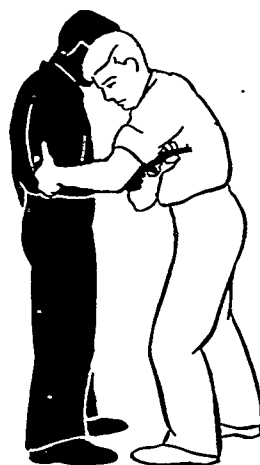

X **6. Trap Gun Under Left Arm** (Primarily for use against an extremely small or short-barreled weapon). Execute preliminary movement, using your right hand, palm down, and making contact over the cylinder of the gun - gun is pushed to your left, just off your body and right foot is advanced slightly, (Figure 6A). Immediately step forward with the left foot and at the same time bring your left arm over subject's right arm, grasp outside or behind his elbow with your hand and trapping his forearm as near the wrist as possible between your arm and body, (Figure 6B). Follow up immediately with right hand blow to chin or knee-lift to groin, (Figure 6C). It is to be noted that a blow can also be delivered to opponent's face with the top of the head. Do not release subject's arm until he is definitely under control or you have obtained the gun. If subject attempts to jerk gun from under your arm, do not resist but go with him, making it impossible for him to dislodge the gun. After initial blow has been struck, you can follow up further by bringing your right leg outside subject's right leg, placing your right foot behind and inside subject's right foot and striking heel-of-hand blow (and push) to chin, (Figure 6D). Assailant will be forced to floor (his right forearm remains trapped under your left arm) where other blows may be struck or pressure may be applied on the back of his elbow, (Figure 6E).

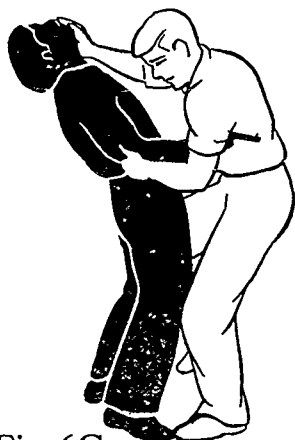

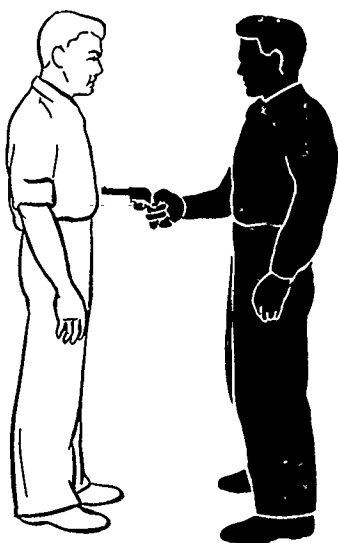

7. Both Hands - Simultaneous Movement (Hands down only). A gun is placed in your stomach and you are commanded to put your hands up, (Figure 7A). As your hands reach a point several inches below the gun the right hand goes to the inside of your assailant's wrist and at the same time your left hand makes contact with the barrel of the gun close to the cylinder; thumbs are up, (Figure 7B). The heel of the right hand hits hard and the fingers close around the wrist. The left hand pushes the barrel of the gun sideward under your right forearm, then downward and inward until the muzzle points under the assailant's right arm, (Figure 7C). Complete movement by jerking the wrist toward you and pushing the gun in the opposite direction, (Figure 7D).

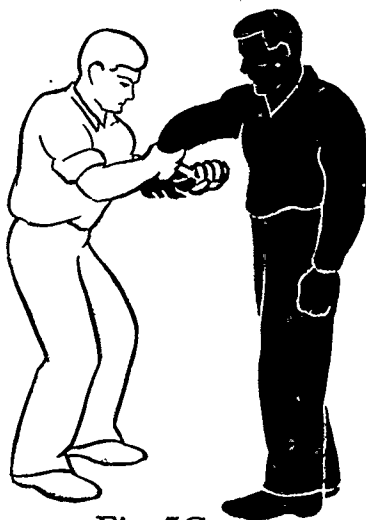

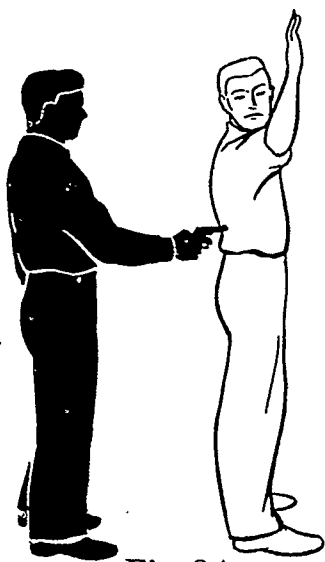

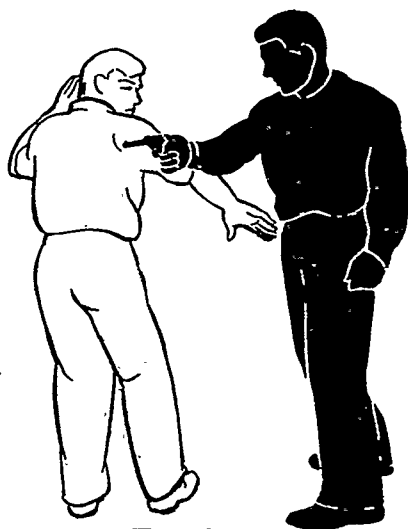

8. Right Turn - Strike Gun or Arm Forcefully. Opponent places gun in your back. Glance over your shoulder to determine which hand is holding the gun, (Figure 8A). Bring right arm down forcefully as you turn to your right, pivoting on the left foot and moving the right foot to the rear. The arm should straighten out and you should strike the gun or assailant's wrist with your hand or forearm, (Figure 8B). Contact is next made with the left hand on your assailant's forearm, thus controlling the gun arm, (Figure 8C). Right hand then grasps the gun under the barrel close to the cylinder, palm up, as the left hand slips down the forearm to the wrist, (Figure 8D). The muzzle is forced inward and upward toward assailant's right shoulder and at the same time the gun is twisted counterclockwise, (Figure 8E).

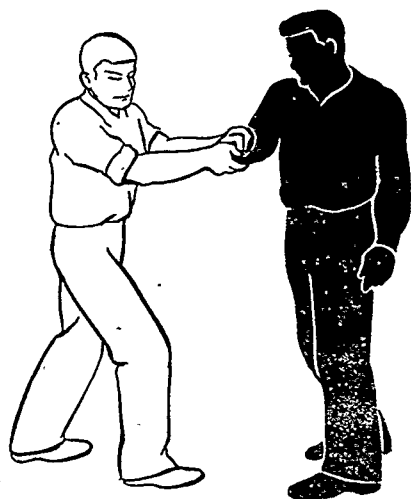

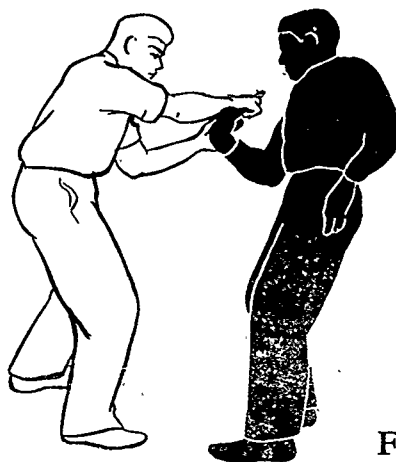

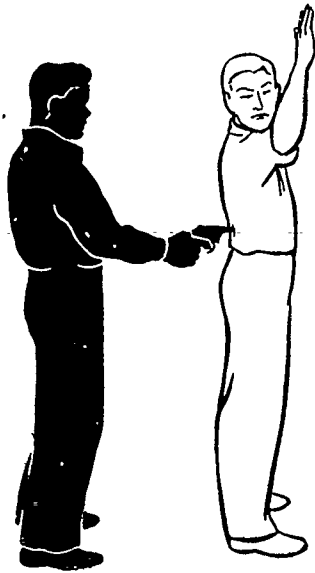

9. Right Turn - Wrap Gun Arm. Assailant places gun in your back. Glance over your shoulder to determine which hand is holding the gun, (Figure 9A). Bring your right arm down forcefully as you turn to your right, pivoting on the left foot and moving the right foot slightly to the rear. The arm should straighten out and you should strike the gun or assailant's wrist with your hand or forearm, (Figure 9B). (If the gun is held high on your back, the elbow may be used to strike the blow.) Immediately pass your arm under and then over assailant's forearm, trapping his wrist in the crook of your elbow, (Figure 9C). Place your left hand over your right and lock subject's forearm tightly to your body. Force the gun up toward subject's right shoulder by exerting pressure downward with your arms and by bending the knees and trunk forward pressing your right shoulder against subject's gun hand, (Figure 9D). Reach up with left hand; twist gun from assailant's grasp.

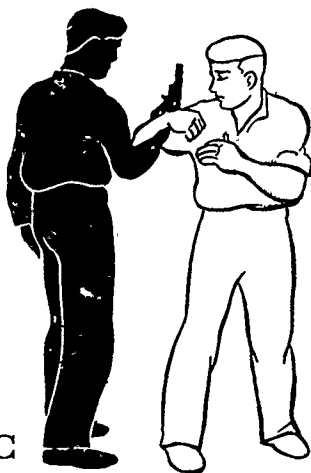

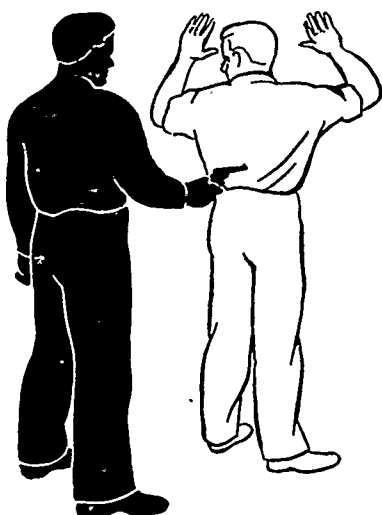

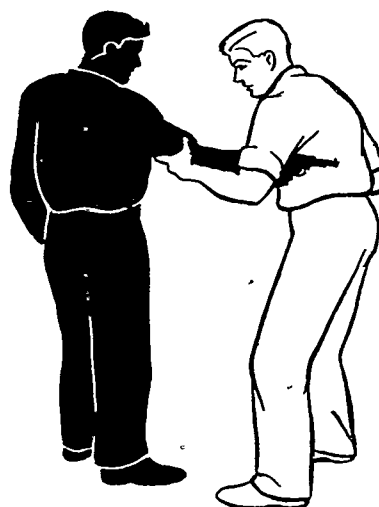

10. Left Turn - Trap Gun Under Left Arm. Assailant places gun in your back. Glance over your shoulder to determine which hand is holding gun, (Figure 10 A). Turn to your left, pivoting on your right foot. Your left arm remains bent, elbow passing over assailant's forearm, and trapping it as close to the wrist as possible, between your left arm and body. Left hand should either grasp assailant's arm near elbow or go under his forearm, catching his wrist in the crook of your elbow. When pivot is completed, your left foot should be slightly outside of assailant's right foot and you should be facing him at about a 45° angle, with feet comfortably spread and knees slightly bent, (Figure 10 B).

Follow up immediately with right-hand blow or blows to vulnerable spot or knee-lift to groin, (Figure 10C). If assailant attempts to jerk the gun from under your arm, do not resist but go with him, making it impossible for him to dislodge the gun. Also, do not release the gun from under your arm until assailant is definitely under control. Follow up further as illustrated in Figures 6 D and 6 E.

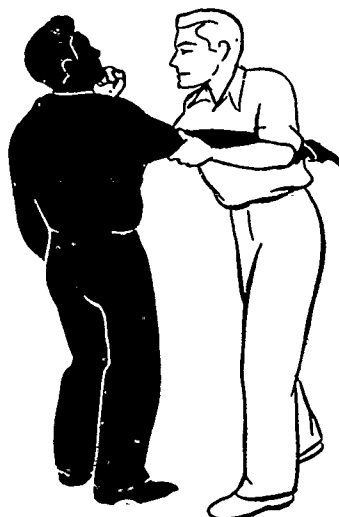

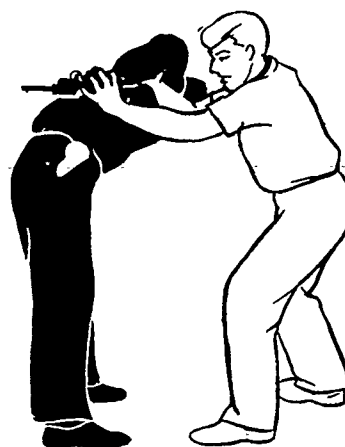

11. Against Hip Draw. As your assailant attempts to draw a gun from a hip holster, grasp either his wrist or the barrel of the gun with your left hand, (Figure 11A), and hit and grab the inside of his elbow with your right hand, (Figure 11B).

NOTE: The initial grasp may be made with both hands. In this case the right hand is released immediately to strike blow on inside of elbow.

Jerk the elbow toward you and push the gun to the rear, going into a rear arm hold. Force his hand up his back until he releases the gun, (Figure 11C).

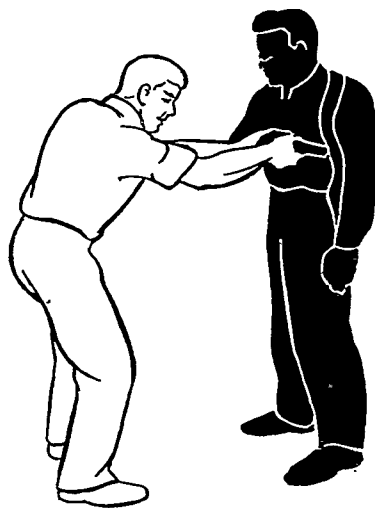

12. Against Shoulder Draw. As your assailant attempts to draw a gun from a shoulder holster, grasp his right wrist with your left hand, (Figure 12A). As he pulls the gun free of the holster, hit underneath the cylinder with your right hand, palm up, (Figure 12B), carrying the gun inward and upward toward his right shoulder (Figure 12C), and at the same time twist it counterclockwise, (Figure 12D).

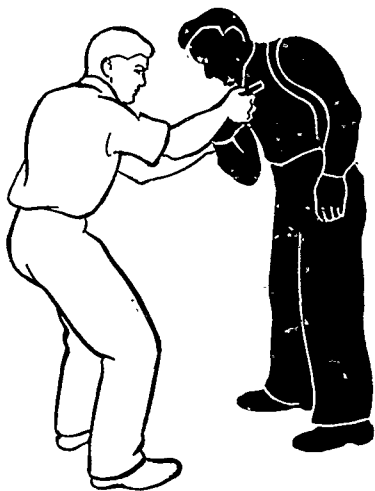

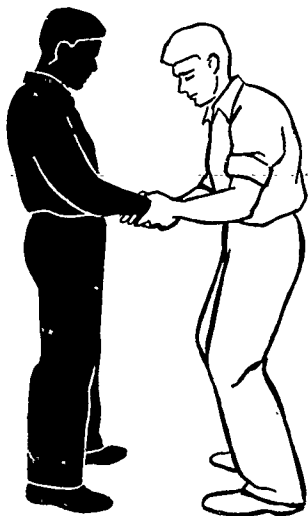

13. Jamming an Automatic. Assailant places an automatic (exposed hammer only) very close to or against your abdomen while your arms are still at your side. As you raise your hands, your right hand goes to the wrist (thumb should be placed on or in front of hammer) and your left hand over the back of his right hand. Jerk the gun into your abdomen as you tighten your stomach muscles, (Figure 13A). Immediately twist toward your left so that the muzzle of the gun leaves your body, (Figure 13B).

Retain your grasp with the right hand and grasp the gun with the left hand, thumb up, and force the muzzle back toward your assailant, catching his finger in the trigger guard, (Figure 13C).

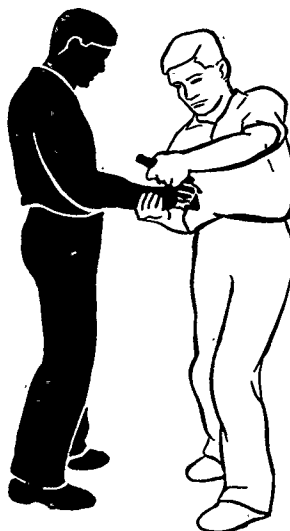

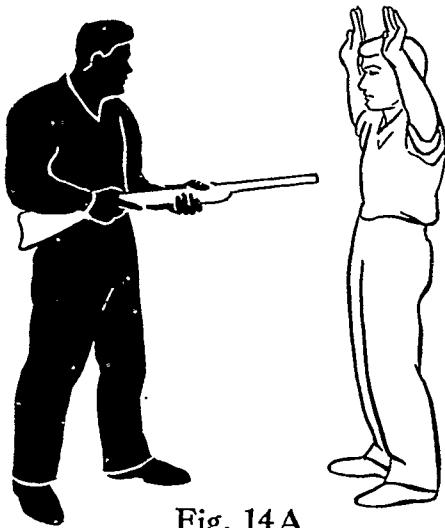

X **14. Left Hand on Barrel - Right Hand on Stock - Twist.** Assailant has shotgun on you, your hands are raised, (Figure 14A). Grasp the barrel of the gun with your left hand, pushing it sideward and then upward toward your right and at the same time twisting your body in the same direction, (Figure 14B). Immediately step in with the left foot and grasp the stock or butt of the gun with the right hand - this movement must be executed swiftly to guard against a possible butt stroke, (Figure 14C). Twist the gun counterclockwise or toward your left, thus causing assailant's arms to cross, (Figure 14D). Continue twisting and then jerk the gun free.

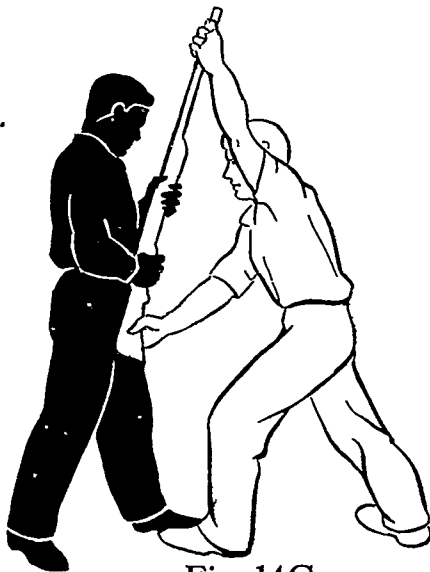

15. Right Hand on Barrel - Strike Point-of-Elbow Blow. Assailant places a gun close to your stomach, your hands are raised, (Figure 15A). Grasp the barrel of the gun with your right hand pushing the muzzle sideward and then upward toward your left, and at the same time twisting your body in the same direction, (Figure 15B). Immediately step in with the right foot and grasp the stock of the gun with the left hand, (Figure 15C). 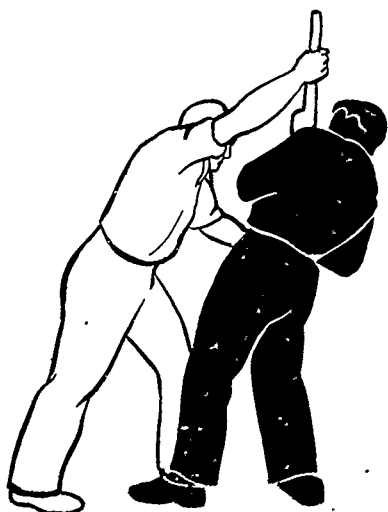

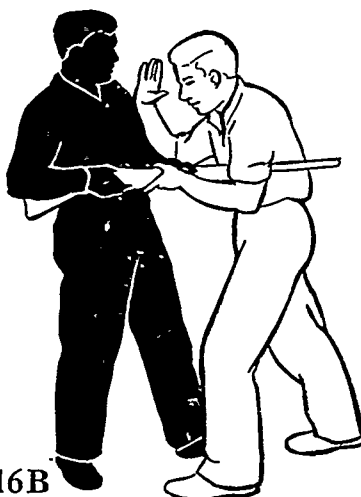

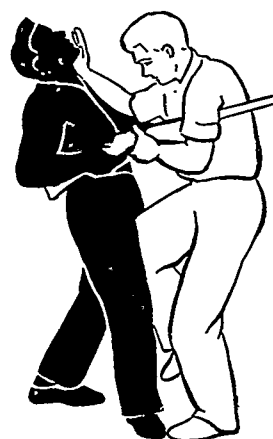

X **16. Right Hand on Barrel - Trap Gun Under Left Arm.** Execute in same manner as illustrated in Figures 6A, 6B and 6C, except left arm and hand traps and grasps gun instead of assailant's arm (Figures 16A, 16B and 16C).

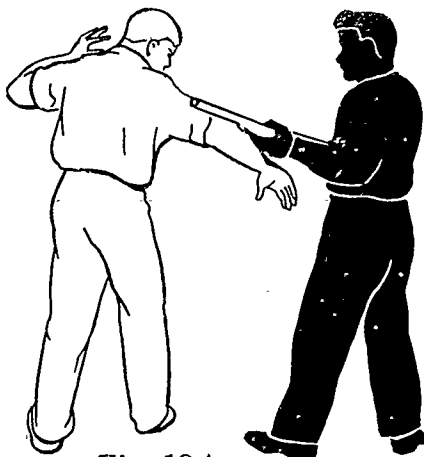

Investigation by the Fish and Wildlife Service at Kodiak disclosed that Madsen refused to return Wiley's deposit only when it became impossible for Madsen to fill the hunting period previously contracted for by Wiley. The records reflected no additional information on Madsen.

It should be noted that the above information was furnished on a confidential basis and the source of this information should not be disclosed.

The files of this office reflect that two Russian produced motion pictures, one a fantasy entitled "Rockflower" and the other, a Russian historical film, were displayed in the Orpheum Theatre in Kodiak, Alaska, in 1947. These pictures were secured by Mr. James Martz who was manager of the Orpheum Theatre as the result of his having talked with Mr. Charles Madsen who had just returned to Kodiak from a visit in the States. Mr. Madsen saw both of the films while he was in the States and suggested to Mr. Martz that inasmuch as most of the native population of Kodiak spoke the Russian language, he thought it would be a good idea if Mr. Martz could obtain them for showing in Alaska.


It was reported that Mr. Madsen had gone to the trouble of obtaining the names and address of the firm in New York who were acting as distributors for these Russian films and that he had turned this information over to Mr. Martz. No further information in regard to these pictures is contained in the files of this office.

Special Agent Edward A. Plevack of your office was afforded intensive training at SOG during the period September 3-12, 1951, inclusive, in connection with the Stay-Behind and Escape and Evasion programs. His training was discontinued following the Bureau's advice [redacted] of our withdrawal from participation in the programs.

The training was designed to instruct Special Agent Plevack whereby he could function effectively in the retraining of Stage personnel in Alaska in those subjects for which the Bureau had responsibility.

Special Agent Plevack received intensive individual instruction as to all security aspects of the program and attended lectures afforded to Stage personnel in each of the following subjects: "Deception and Security," "Selection and Training of Subagents and Informants," and "Soviet Methods of Counterintelligence." He was attentive, participated intelligently in discussions, and appeared to fully understand the significance of all discussions.

Special Agent Plevack received approximately thirty hours of cipher instruction to familiarize him with the cipher systems given to Stage trainees. In addition to individual instruction, Special Agent Plevack received training actually afforded to Stage personnel. On completion of training, he appeared to be thoroughly familiar with the cipher systems taught and would, with practice and review, be in a position to afford training in these matters.

Special Agent Plevack received intensive instruction in the preparation of messages in the two secret writing methods used in this program. It has been brought to the attention of this office that each Stay Behind Agent who receives reimbursement in connection with this program should be advised that such compensation is taxable under the Federal Income Tax Laws and should be reported as income by him. It is suggested that if an individual must file a federal return to report income from another regular source, income from this program could be shown under Schedule D of Page 2 of the return as income received from other sources "for personal services rendered" without specifically designating the source of this income. It appears probable that all Stay-behind Agents will fall in this category.

It is suggested that your office may desire to make further inquiry into the Income Tax Regulations and to take whatever steps may be necessary to insure that all Stay Behind Agents are advised of this fact and to insure full security for the program. To date all Stay Behind Agents who have returned from training and been reimbursed have been instructed in regard to the above.

It has also been brought to the attention of this office that beginning on August 21, 1951 and every Tuesday and Thursday thereafter the Anchorage Amateur Radio Club will sponsor a series of code practice sessions. The sessions will start at 9:00 p.m. and will last for one hour. The frequency used will be 3870 KCS and the call letters KL7AA or KL7BK will be used. These practice broadcasts can be received on any radio that tunes the short wave band. The hour broadcast will be divided into three sessions, the first 20 minutes of which will be 1 to 2 groups per minute, the second 20 minutes will be 5 to 10 words per minute and the final 20 minutes will be 15 to 16 words per minute.

It is suggested that Stay Behind Agents who have already received training could use these broadcasts as a source of practice to build up their proficiency in code.

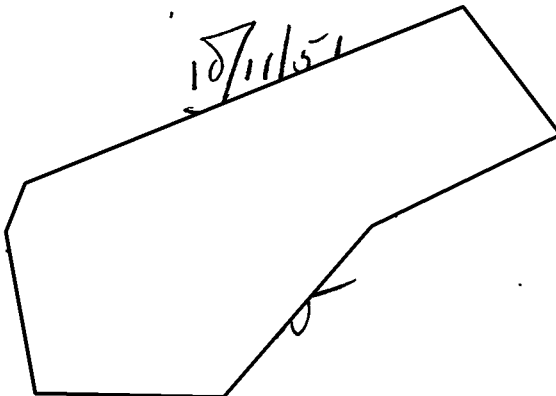

An analysis of expenditures made in connection with the instant program reflects a total of \$9623.42 was disbursed through October 9, 1951.

On the basis used of "Date Paid" as regarding fiscal years, the total of \$9623.42 is made up of \$798.04 for the fiscal year of 1950, of which \$9.75 represents miscellaneous expenses, and \$8825.13 for the fiscal year of 1951, of which \$10.73 was for miscellaneous expenses.

The balance of the totals for both fiscal years represents moneys paid to the individuals.

In the schedules attached herewith, the miscellaneous disbursements are detailed as to whom payment was made, the date and amount of payment, together with an explanation for same. The schedules setting forth details of disbursements to the individuals reflect the name of the individual paid, his Bureau file number, date paid, period for which paid, together with a total amount of payment which is broken down into salary, per diem and miscellaneous. The miscellaneous items are mainly made up of hotel expenses.

In connection with the Bureau file number set forth, it is noted that after each individual was paid, a letter was directed to the Bureau furnishing the pertinent details of the calculation and payment.

It is specifically noted that all payments made, either to individuals or for miscellaneous expenditures, were made in cash. 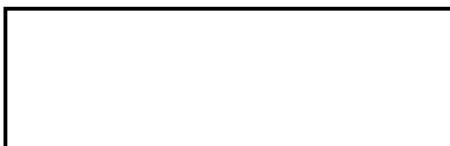

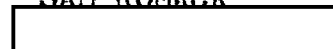

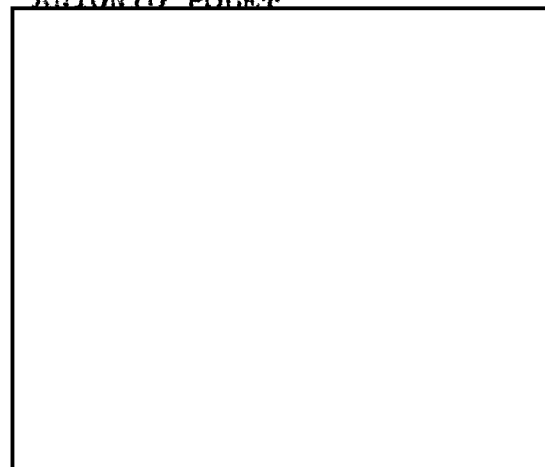

Reurlet October 5, 1951, in which you made reference to Burad October 1, 1951, relating to forwarding Anchorage files to the Bureau and removal of all references to the program from your indices.

The question of handling investigation of leads in the continental United States with respect to future recruits is covered in Bulet dated October 5, 1951.

In the interest of uniformity and in order that your office may appropriately supervise investigations, you should open and maintain until closed, a separate file on each individual on whom investigation is necessary. Following completion of investigation and closing of your file, the file of your office should be sent to the Bureau for maintainence with other files you have forwarded and all reference to the investigation should be removed from your office as in other previously closed cases.

Referral/Consult

When a name check only, it will be satisfactory for you to include the necessary communications in the general Stage file in your office. The open section of the file should be maintained securely with top priority for destruction in the event of emergency. When a reasonable amount of correspondence has accumulated, or a reasonable time has elapsed, the section should be forwarded to the Bureau for maintainence with the other previously forwarded files. A new section can be opened in your office if and when the necessity arises.

With regard to the procedure of handling name checks, your indices should be checked first and the name check then requested of the Bureau, if required, rather than conversely as might be implied from the language in paragraph three of your letter.



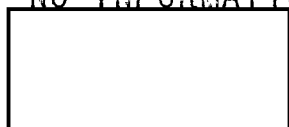

On January 15, 1952, the above-captioned individual appeared in the Anchorage Office and advised that he had just returned from Seattle where he had been having an operation on his hand. FRISBEY stated he had received a letter from this office about December 1950 requesting him to contact this office upon his return from Seattle. FRISBEY stated that the letter had merely stated that we desired to discuss a confidential matter with him and he had destroyed the letter immediately after receiving it.

The letter referred to by FRISBEY is probably the letter which we directed to him when we were considering recruiting him for the above program.

FRISBEY stated that he believed that we had wanted to talk to him about a guerilla program which PHIL HARDING and a number of people in the Seward area had been talking about organizing in the case of hostilities and he had gathered from his conversations with HARDING that the FBI was clearing people for this guerilla program. FRISBEY did not seem to be aware of the true nature of the program.

It should be noted that prior to the time HARDING was recruited into the Stage Program, he had been making plans to form a guerilla group on the Kenai Peninsula but had supposedly discontinued this when he was recruited into the Stage Program.

FRISBEY was advised that this office was not at the present time and never had been connected with the formation of any guerilla group in the event of hostilities in Alaska. He was advised that the letter which he had received in Seattle was probably in connection with another investigation being conducted by this office on which we had desired to contact him. FRISBEY was advised that this matter has since been cleared up and we no longer desired to talk to him in connection with this matter. It was explained to FRISBEY that our reason for wanting to contact him was probably in connection with someone he had formerly worked with or been acquainted with but there was no way at this time of telling what particular case was involved.

With reference to your letter of February 12, 1952, the files of this office reflected no information identifiable with Peters.

Central files of the FBI, Washington, D.C., reflected Vincent F. Peters arrested September 7, 1940 on complaint filed by Forest Ranger [redacted] charging him with theft of government sleeping bag. He was arraigned in Justice Court, Conrad, Montana September 10, 1940. He pled not guilty and was released on \$300.00 bond. The county attorney stated he did not wish to prosecute Peters but would continue trial until such time as the Federal Government was in a position to prosecute. On February 23, 1941 the Assistant United States Attorney at Butte, Montana informed that no Federal prosecution would be had in connection with Peters. No disposition is reflected on this charge.
