Moomies beat family

WEST ORANGE (AP) — State Insurance Commissioner James Sheeran says his three daughters "have suffered personality changes" since joining a religious group known as the "Moonies," and says it reminds him of the Patty Hearst case.

Sheeran said several members of the sect, officially called the Internation Unification Church, beat him unconscious in upstate New York.

He said he, his wife and their 14-yearold son were attacked last Aug. 28 by members sect, which follows the preachings of San Myung Moon, who founded the sect in Korea in 1954.

Meanwhile, Sheeran said a Dutchess County, N.Y., grand jury is investigating the sect.

"I will cooperate fully with the grand jury," Sheeran said, "My daughters have suffered strong personality changes because of this group's mind-control program."

He said "changes" in his daughter counsed him of Patty Hearst, whose lawyers are trying to prove is incompetent because she was trainwashed by the Symbionese Liberation Army.

"I've thought about that," Sheeran said. "It's not beyond the realm of possibility."

Fig said melee with the Moonies broke out when he, his wife and son went to a semmaty run by the sect in Barrytown, N.Y. He said the three entered a building and begon calling aloud for their daughters, Joseffe, 21, Jaime, 24, and Vicki, 25.

"I was assoulted very viciously by the director and a number of young men from the ages of 20 to 30," Sheeran, a former paratrooper who was decorated for bravery miring World War II. "At times I and a manchere from 10 to 12 persons lighting me. It was a brawl."

He said he was pinned to the ground, paged with rags and eventually passed out. He said his wife and son were bruised, and that when his wife pleaded to have the gag removed from her husband his assailants threatened to gag her.

New York state police arrived at the seminary threat 90 monates later. In Redhook Municipal Court, Sheeran charged Joseph Fully, director of the seminary, and several other persons with a seminary filed constructionages of trespassing and assemble. All complaints, however, were dropped.

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

The teachings of the Unification Church extend the universality of Judeo-Christianity to replace Oriental concepts of God and man. Copy being sent to Criminal Division in accordance with a prior request that complaints concerning church groups of this nature be forwarded to the Department for consideration of any possible Federal violation.

Representative Minish was advised the Bureau is not in a position to provide a characterization of the Unification Church although we have been aware of Reverend Moon for a number of years. Further, that the apparent voluntary association of daughters with Reverend Moon as well as their maturity do not indicate Moon and the Church are in violation of Federal laws which would enable us to enter the matter. Representative Minish agreed the factual situation appears to be essentially a domestic problem existing within the Sheeran household.

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REVEREND SUN MYUNG MOON

GOOD CONNECTIONS

SAN FRANCISCO, June 9 (PNS)--

For forty days and nights in Washington D.C. last winter, followers of the Reverend Sun Myung Moon marched, prayed and camped out on the steps of the Capitol in a Forgive, Love, Unite crusade on behalf of the Watergate-beleaguered Richard Nixon. Similar demonstrations were staged by Unification Church members in a dozen other world capitals.

Moon, in full page newspaper ads all over the country, invoked a kind of Divine Right in Nixon's behalf. The ads told Americans:

"At this time in history God has chosen Richard Nixon to be President of the United States. Therefore only God has the power and authority to dismiss him." One Unification Church memo entitled "Project Watergate" referred to the soon-to-residence.



as "the Archangel Nixon."

Moon's pro-Nixon stance reflected in part his desire to become a spiritual adviser to the politically powerful in this country.

God told him to speak out, Moon said in his newspaper ads, because "there has been no American spiritual leader speaking out for unity."

Moon's ambition, however, goes well beyond replacing Billy Graham as the nation's number one man of the cloth. He has told his upper echelon followers in writings entitled Master Speaks (available only to the initiate), "The whole world is in my hand, and I will conquer and subjugate the world."

In the meantime, the church's political energies are directed against communism, which Moon regards as the embodiment of Satan on earth. Thus Moon has been a militant advocate of the Vietnam war, and has developed close ties to like-minded political and financial circles, especially in Korea and Japan.

The 55 year old Korean preacher has remained silent in the face of the South Korean government's virtual elimination of civil liberties and its increasingly repressive measures against all suspected opponents.

Last April, eight students and intellectuals -- including practicing Christians -- were executed in Seoul for allegedly plotting to overthrow the government. Christian leaders, including the Roman Catholic Bishop of Seoul and the head of the Korean National Council of Churches, have been arrested and imprisoned, and American missionaries who have protested the Park government's policies have been deported.

FRIENDS AT HOME AND ABROAD

Moon, on the other hand, has enjoyed an especially warm

relationship with the Park government. As early as 1962, Prime Minister Kim Jong Pil, then head of the newly-formed Korean C.I.A., assured the first small group of American converts at a meeting in a San Francisco hotel of his full -- but secret -- support, one of those present told PNS. Today, Moon's machine tool factory -- part of an industrial empire Moon has built under the benevolent eye of the Park regime -- supplies the South Korean army with parts for M-16's.

One of Moon's training centers, located just outside Seoul, gives anti-communist training courses to hundreds of South Korean military officers and civil servants each year. And Moon's Korean Anti-Communist League actively participates in all anti-North Korean and anti-Japanese demonstrations in South Korea.

In the U.S., Moon's "principal evangelist" and interpreter

Colonel Bo Hi Pak heads the Washington-based Korean Cultural and

Freedom Foundation (KCFF), which was established in 1965 to foster

closer relations between the U.S. and South Korea.

Church officials deny any organizational links between the KCFF and the Unification Church. However, a majority of KCFF's board of directors are, or have been, high ranking Unification Church officials, and Reverend Moon's own calling card lists him as "Chairman of the Board and Founder" of one of KCFF's major projects -- the Little Angels Korean Folk Ballet.

Another KCFF project is Radio of Free Asia, which at the height of the Vietnam war produced anti-communist programs in Washington and beamed them to China, North Korea and North Vietnam.

In 1971, Radio of Free Asia came under investigation by several government agencies, including the Justice Department, for

alleged violation of the Foreign Agents Registration Act. question was the radio station's status as a foreign private foundation when the South Korean government consistently gave it free air time on its national network. Colonel Pak acquired the legal services of former C.I.A. Deputy Director of Intelligence Robert Amory Jr., then employed by the Washington law firm of Thomas Corcoran -- himself a top legal counsel to the C.I.A. The investigation was subsequently dropped.

This is the source of recurring rumors that Moon is somehow connected to the American C.I.A. While no hard evidence for this exists, connections between the Unification Church and the Korean Central Intelligence Agency -- created in the early 1960's by Park Chung Hee and the American military intelligence agencies -- are more apparent.

The Boston Globe reported recently that Moon's interpreter, Colonel Pak, has been a member of the K.C.I.A. Korean exiles have told Pacific News Service and the Washington Post that Pak is still connected to Korean intelligence circles, and have pointed out that Moon could not have built his industrial and religious organizations and his anti-communist training centers in South Korea without the implicit cooperation of the K.C.I.A.

The K.C.I.A. gained international notoriety in 1972 when its agents kidnapped South Korean opposition leader Kim Dae Jung from a Tokyo hotel room and spirited him back to Korea. In the U.S., its frequent harassment of anti-Park exiles prompted an F.B.I. investigation and a government warning to curtail its activities.

Members of San Francisco's Korean community have told PNS -and Washington officials have confirmed -- that the K.C.I.A.

frequently uses the Tae Kwan Do karate schools in major American cities as a cover for its agents. The agents are reportedly controlled from the South Korean Embassy in Washington where Colonel

Coincidentally, the largest chain of Korean Tae Kwan Do karate schools in the U.S. is owned and operated by Colonel Pak's cousin Jhoon Rhee, who is well known in Washington as a teacher of martial arts to political figures and columnists.

Pak was a military attache from 1961 to 1964.

Rhee was one of the founders of the Unification Church in the U.S. amd his first karate school served as a recruiting front for the church. Rhee also helped establish the Korean Cultural and Freedom Foundation, but though he still professes support for the church's goals, he insists he is no longer actively involved in church affairs. Through his representation in the World Karate Association, however, Rhee is connected to one of the church's principal Japanese backers, Sasagawa Ryoichi, who founded and heads the association.

Sasagawa is now one of Japan's most prominent financiers and behind-the-scenes political figures. In the 1930's, he was a leading advocate of Imperial expansion and an architect of Japan's war-time strategy. After the war, he was imprisoned for a time as a "class-A" war criminal. Sasagawa admits helping fund the anti-Sukarno coup in Indonesia in 1965, and reputedly exerts large influence over today's Japanese criminal underworld.

Although Unification Church officials deny any financial links between Sasagawa and the church, Colonel Pak told Pacific News that Sasagawa is Moon's "chief ally in the battle against communism."

POLITICS AND RELIGION

Much of that battle is now waged by Moon's International

Federation for the Victory Over Communism. The head of the Japanese branch of the IFVC is former Prime Minister Kishi Nobusuke, a close associate of Sasagawa -- they met in prison after the war. The IFVC, in turn, is a major component of the World Anti-Communist League, a very influential right wing pressure group, especially in Asian affairs, which was founded and financed by Sasagawa.

The American branch of the IFVC, headed by Unification Church President Neil Salonen, is known as the Freedom Leadership Foundation, which claims to be "the standard bearer of ideological victory over communism in the United States." Its "educational and training arm," the World Freedom Institute, offers training courses in anticommunism and plans to build an "international training center" in Washington, D.C. modeled after the center near Seoul.

The Freedom Leadership Foundation is active on Capitol Hill, spending upwards of \$50,000 per year on "educational seminars" and "teas" for congresspeople on such issues as military spending and foreign aid. And it reportedly plans a separate organization in the near future for direct lobbying and campaigning for select political candidates. There is even the hint that members of the church may enter U.S. politics.

In a Los Angeles living room meeting during his latest U.S. speaking tour, Moon told high echelon church members: "I am going to make all you men U.S. Senators and all you women wives of U.S. Senators."

Dear Congressman:

Although I've been a precinct worker for many years, I have never written a legislator about as personal a matter as this.

Our only son became affiliated with the Unification Church of Sun Myung Moon, the Korean evangelist, about 8 yrs. ago when my son was 18. Mr. Moon, however, did not appear on the scene until about 5 yrs. ago. The organization no longer appeared to be a benign religious organization. From come of his writings, he apparently wants to do away with both communism and democracy and substitute his ideology—a dictatorship under his benevolent rule.


After many years of searching, I was able to learn something about Mr. Moon from the press, radio, etc. All of it has been unfavorable. This man was able to gain some form of U.S. citizenship on 4-30-73 according to the Wall St. Journal of 9-20-74. He was imprisoned in Seoul, Korea, in 1955, for sexual offenses. Nevertheless, whe was allowed to become a citizen.

Mr. Moon owns a factory which makes parts for the guns of the Park regime. He also runs an anti-communist school for civilan and military personnel of the Park dictatorship. He probably is the beneficiary of some of our 150 million foreign aid to South Korea. (I heard on the radio, aid was increased from 26 million last year to 150 million this year) I fear brainwashing techniques have been used on our American children to manipulate them into working, as my son does, from early morning until 10 or 11 at night, 7 days a week, selling to raise money for Mr. Moon.

I am enclosing the script of a broadcast on radio station KSAN, San Francisco, of June 9, 1975, giving much information about Mr. Moon. If you cannot use it, please return it.

Congressman Mineta is looking into Mr. Moon's operations for some of his constituents. Will you please add your efforts to prevent this man from preying on our young under the guise of religion and to prevent him from ripping off the taxpayers.

Thank you for your consideration of this case.

MOON REAPS PROFIT IN U.S.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 9 (PNS)--

The new savior of the world lives in a plush mansion right next door to Laurence Rockefeller.

He is the Reverend Sun Myung Moon, and his Unification Church has made more of a splash in the U.S. over the past year than almost all of the other 'new religions" put together.

Sun Moon commands the devotion of up to a million members worldwide who regard him as the new messiah, and he presides over a multi-national, multi-million dollar conglomerate which blends big business, messianic quasi-Christianity, and virulent anti-communism. It is all a far cry from his humble beginnings as the only son of a poor Presbyterian farm family living in what is now North Korea.

But Moon has encountered a great deal of opposition -- some

-more- EMGLOSULE

of it extremely bitter. One critic, Rabbi Maurice Davis of White Plains, New York, who counsels distressed parents of Moon's American followers, says: "I hold this movement to be evil and dangerous." Davis accuses Reverend Moon of being a "charlatan," and "his inner henchmen to be devious, unscrupulous and false."

The I.R.S., immigration authorities and even the State Department have all looked into aspects of the Unification Church. And Rabbi Davis is advising parents to demand that state attorneys-general investigate Moon's church in their home states. One such investigation has quietly begun in California.

BLISSED OUT

Criticism of the movement has not dampened the ardor of Moon's followers -- most of them earnest, conservatively dressed young people who believe that Moon and his religion will literally take over the world in their lifetime.

"Our movement is more important even than Martin Luther's 95' Theses," says Moon's interpreter, and former South Korean military attache in Washington, Colonel Bo Hi Pak. "The Reverend Moon's spiritual revolution will have a thousand times greater impact than the Christian Reformation."

American membership, according to Unification Church calculations, has grown from just five people in 1961 to an estimated 7,000 "core" members -- those who live and work full time for the church -- and 20,000 "associate" members, with communal houses and affiliated organizations in every major city and all 50 states.

In some respects, Moon's cult resembles other "new religions" which have sought to integrate elements of Eastern and Western thought. The rank and file Moonies often share that "blissed out"

look of the Guru Maharaj Ji's followers, and their austere and rigidly controlled living conditions are not unlike those of the Hare Khrishnas.

However, while the other cults have leveled off or declined in support and membership recently, the Unification Church continues to expand in its amoeba-like way. It is close to the American fundamentalist Christian sects in its affinity for right wing politics, and far surpasses the other "new religions" in terms of wealth and corporate complexity.

According to Unification Church American President Neil Salonen, the American branch has an annual operating budget of \$8 million, most of it spent on lavish banquets for civic leaders and saturation advertising preceding Moon's "Day of Hope" rallies in cities across the country. Moon's Madison Square Garden rally in New York last September was estimated to have cost between \$300,000 and \$500,000. CASH FLOW

The cash flow involved in all the activities of the church's subordinate organizations is much more than \$8 million. The overall worth of the church in this country alone -- about \$35 million -- is reflected in expensive property deals. Moon's private residence in Tarmytown, New York cost the church \$625,000. His "principal evangelist," Colonel Pak, lives in a \$115,000 home in Fairfax County, Virginia, which serves as the headquarters of Pak's own lucrative real estate business as well as a branch of the Unification Church.

Other properties include a New York City townhouse, a Washington D.C. office building, 680 acres of prime land in Mendocino County, California (Moon's "International Ideal City," at this point just two trailer houses and a lot of open land), and the \$1½ million

Christian Brothers seminary in Barrytown, New York which serves as the church's main "training center." In January, 123 acres in New York's Westchester County were purchased for \$5 million as the site for a Unification Church "university." Just last month, the church bought the prestigious Columbia Club of New York as its new American headquarters for \$1.2 million.

While some of the money for Moon's American operations may come from the profits of his industrial holdings in South Korea (worth \$15 million), most of it derives from the herculean fund raising efforts of the church members.

In return for no wages and spartan room and board, the Moonies work from dawn to dusk, selling candles and flowers on the streets, or laboring for one of a galaxy of church enterprises, including a printing company, gas stations, a janitorial service, restaurants and a business consultancy firm.

The income from such projects is larger than one might think. Selling candles nets the non-profit, tax exempt church well over a million dollars a year. According to one former church member, a 24 person team operating out of a single church house in Berkeley brought in \$500,000 a year selling roses on the streets of the Bay Area.

The church's fund raising efforts are not entirely straightforward. Donors are often misled about what happens to their money. "The people who bought the flowers never had any idea what they were contributing to," said former Bay Area member Darcy Black. "We would ask them if they would like to donate to 'youth programs.' If asked to elaborate, we would simply lie."

Tyler Cole, who was once treasurer of the church's Laramie,
Wyoming branch, agrees. She told a reporter: "We were going around

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young people that one money we were raising we being used to help young people get off drugs, and for charity, when none of it was going for that. I once confronted the group with this... the consensus was that the goals of Mr. Moon's movement were so magnificent that the means we used to support them were okay whatever they were."

PURE BLOOD

The primary goal of the Unification Church is nothing less than the conversion of the whole world to Reverend Moon's religion. As outlined in the Divine Principle, the church's "bible," most of humanity is in the clutches of Satan as a result of congenital "blood impurity" passed on by Eve's seduction by Satan. Christ's real mission, according to Moon theology, was to re-establish the Kingdom of God by marrying and having "pure" children, whose "pure descendants would erase the taint of Satan. But Christ failed, and told Moon in a revelation Moon claims to have received at age 16 that he was to "carry out my unfinished mission." Moon's children, plus the initiate of the church, are the advance guard of the new, "pure" race come to rule the world.

The millenium, according to Moon's followers, is close at hand and while they would prefer a non-violent conversion of humanity, they are told that the New Age may be preceded by a final, cataclysmic confrontation between the "pure" and those still controlled by Satan. They are instructed to prepare to die for the church if necessary.

Church officials realize that Moon's message may be difficult for the uninitiated to swallow immediately, so they play down Moon's divine status when speaking in public. And they have formed a number of front organizations.

One such group, "New Education Development Systems Inc." (NEDS) has denied any links to the church on its sworn application to the

1.R.S. for tax exemption — even though former members of NEDS insite it is a fund raising and recruitment arm of the Unification Church. Church President Neil Salonen told Pacific News Service that "core" members of NEDS are also members of the Unification Church. Canceled checks show that money paid by "associate" members who thought they were joining NEDS went straight into the bank account of the Unification Church.

There is no privacy and no free time for Noon's followers. If they are not fund raising, then they are seeking converts or reading and discussing Divine Principle. Recalls Darcy Black: "You are never allowed to think. If you're driving in the church bus or in a car, you're always singing. If you're caught just looking out the window or just sitting, you're immediately told to stop spacing out."

Some members rebel against the church's absolute control over their lives -- and leave the church -- while others are strongly attracted by it. Pressure on members to stay, however, can be enormous.

In one case reported by N.B.C., an individual deemed by a Korean woman high in the church leadership to be "possessed by Satan" was forcibly held at the Barrytown training center.

There have also been scattered reports of violence used against Moon's opponents. Tom Riner, pastor of Christ Covenant Church in Louisville, Kentucky told Pacific News of two such incidents -- one last April in Indianapolis where a follower of Reverend Moon pushed the pastor's wife around and took anti-Moon material from her, and another in Louisville last July when two women members of Riner's congregation were slugged by two male supporters of Moon for distributing anti-Moon leaflets.

For your information, The Unification Church, headed by Reverend Sun Myung Moon, a South Korean, is not the subject of a security investigation. It is a religious cult. Review of the available information at FBIHQ fails to indicate that any allegations in the past have been made that this cult supports any violent political thought or any violent revolutionary purpose.

There have been numerous cases, involving this and other similar religious cults, alleging "brainwashing" and "kidnapping" of youth. These allegations are generally made by family members attempting to force the return of another family member who has become affiliated with Reverend Moon's movement. Duress is generally alleged by the complainants. Presentations locally of these alleged kidnapping matters to the United States Attorneys have led to declinations because the alleged victims refused to verify the "kidnapping" aspect. The Department of Justice has been requested by the Bureau to furnish additional guidance concerning the handling of these matters, but to date, no such guidance has been received. The Department has requested the results of any Bureau investigations involving these groups.

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

FBI, Police Probing Korean Cult At

The FBI, Arizona State University and Tempe police are investigating the alleged brainwashing of a 19-year-old former ASU coed who was taken to a Barrytown, N.Y., "seminary" by a Korean religious cult.

Phoenix Agent-in-Charge Richard Long said the FBI wants to know if any federal laws were breached by the bizarre episode.

MEANWHILE, a second case came to light here:

Mrs. Tony Portney of Scottsdale believes her sen by a previous marriage, Nicholas Chiaca, 20, has been "brainwished in a sophisticated way" by the. same cult operating off the ASU campus. He is a cult leader.

The group is identified as the Collegiate Association for the Research of Principles (CARP), formerly the Unified Family, both fronts for the Unification Church of the Rev. Sun Myung Moon, a Korean.

Mrs. Portnoy said her son is "completely indoctrinated" and operates the CARP Center at 228 E. 14th St., Tempe.

Cult members, she reported, "are like, zombies once they are brainwashed. They can't see right from wrong . . . it is a scary frightening organization."



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



Bufiles reveal that Reverend Sun Myung Moon, founder of the Unification Church (UC) was the subject of a bribery investigation by the FBI in December, 1974, and January, 1975. This investigation was predicated upon information received by this Bureau that Reverend Moon of the UC allegedly made illegal payments amounting to \$150,000 to employees of an agency of the Federal Government.

Facts in this matter were presented to the Assistant U.S. Attorney, Southern District of New York, who advised that upon a review of the initial complaint and results of the investigation by the Government agency involved, the allegation did not contain any substantiality or concreteness which would warrant further investigation in this matter.

During the course of the investigation concerning the above-mentioned matter, it was determined that the UC is a Judea-Christian group attempting to unify all the churches in the world and set up missions on the South American continent. The UC is active in most other countries of the world.

The UC was established in 1954 in the Far East and has now various training centers in the U.S. The U.S. head-quarters is located at 1365 Connecticut Avenue, Northwest, Washington, D.C., while the international headquarters is presently located at the Belvedere Estate, Inc., 723 South Broadway, Tarrytown, New York. Members of the church receive training in evangelical work at Tarrytown, New York. Foreign members of the UC have been admitted to the U.S. as nonimmigrant visitors or have applied for admission as visitors and their

inspection has been deferred. Members of the UC have been found soliciting throughout various cities of the U.S. and have been arrested by the local police for such soliciting. However, numerous aliens have entered the U.S. and are admitted for training in the work of the UC and to participate in the activities of the church. As part of their activities, the aliens have been dispatched to many areas of the U.S. where they solicit funds from the public for the UC. Questions have arised whether the aliens have violated their immigration status as a result of these activities.

The Reverend Sun Myung Moon founded the UC in 1954 in Korea. It was incorporated in California in 1961. Reverend Moon entered the U.S. in 1972 as a B-1 visitor. His status was adjusted to that of a permanent resident on 4-30-73. His residence was listed as 7439 Hallcrest Drive, McLean. Virginia.

Enclosed for your information is a copy of a clipping from the 5-5-75 issue of the "Daily News," a newspaper published in the Tarrytown-Irvington, New York, area which contains information concerning the UC and its training center at Barrytown, New York.

Bufiles contain no Congressional report which pertains to the subjects of your request.





It has come to my attention lately by report (whether true or not, I wish you to find out) that the Unification Church holds a contract for cleaning the F.B.I. building in Washington.


I am sure you need'nt be told about the Unification Church, whose members are followers of the self-styled Messiah of the Second Advent, "Rev." Sun Yung Moon.

These matters have been discussed with the Criminal Division, United States Department of Justice, which has advised that such activity does not involve the violation of any Federal statutes. noted, however, that parents in some instances have been able to obtain assistance from local authorities where minor children are involved.

In view of the above Department of Justice decision, the FBI cannot assist in checking on the physical well-being of individuals joining this organization.

I am sorry we cannot be of further assistance to your constituent. but I am sure you understand our jurisdictional limitations in matters of this type.



He was informed that the FBI certainly never became involved in this many of these "kidnap" cases involving victims who were members of their church and was informed that the FBI, on the contrary, has only become involved in a very small number said that the authorities who of them. investigated these cases, including the FBI, have a tendency not to personally interview the victim in all instances after they have been taken by the "deprogrammers" and supposedly returned to their parents' home. He said that many times when the investigators or FBI Agents go to the victim's parents' home they are advised by the parents that the victim is safe at home and therefore do not personally interview the victim. He said that in many instances these adult children are not in fact at home, but are being held under duress by "professional deprogrammers" elsewhere. He requested that in those cases where the FBI becomes involved, that the victim be personally interviewed.

was extremely courteous and upon his departure left with the interviewing Agent, several newspapers published by his church which he said may be of interest to the Bureau. These items are enclosed in the attached envelope.

Our Field Offices were advised by airtel dated 2/25/75, that the Department of Justice recently requested letter head memoranda of interviews with citizens who appeared at FBI Offices complaining that an individual had been taken away by a religious cult through brainwashing or otherwise. This request was made because of numerous citizens' letters and Congressional inquiries regarding so-called religious cults. Complaints involving individuals who have gone off with religious cults usually do not constitute a Kidnaping violation. The Criminal Division, Department of Justice, advised at that time that they wished to be in a position to state that they have reviewed any complaints of this nature and they do not constitute a violation of any Federal statute.



It also occurred to me that your agency may be tapping some phones of members. I understand you may do so with presidential and justice department approval, and without a court warrant in the case of foreign agents.

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NOTE: Since December, 1977, we have conducted an investigation based on information supplied by a former member of the Unification Church to the effect that a member of the Church had information concerning a plot formulated by church members to assassinate President Carter; infiltration of FBI, Congress and White House by Church members; and that the Church is a front for South Korean intelligence in the U.S. Subsequent interviews of the source developed names of Church members having information concerning the alleged assassination plot. We have kept U. S. Secret Service, Department of Justice and U. S. Attorney (USA) advised of results of this investigation. As the investigation proceeded, it was necessary to interview a number of Church members. in his letter of 4/18/78 complains about our interview of a reporter employed by his newspaper and wondered if the FBI might be tapping phones of Church members. He asked to be informed as to the basis for the interview of the reporter and if the President or Justice Department has approved wire tapping of Church members. /

We previously investigated three organizations which are "off-shoots" of the Unification Church in connection with possible violations of the Registration Act. These investigations are closed.

In connection with our current criminal investigation, consensual telephone monitoring has occurred with the approval of SAC, Memphis and USA, Nashville, Tennessee. A body recorder was utilized on one occasion with the approval of the Department. During this investigation, we have advised persons interviewed that the FBI is not conducting an investigation regarding a religious group nor is our investigation based on the religion, philosophy, or beliefs of any of its members.

Moon Church Files Suit **Against House Prober**

By William Willoughby Washington Star Staff Writer

The Rev. Sun Myung Moon's Unification Church and Moon's interpreter, Col. Bo Hi Pak, today filed a \$30 million damage suit against Rep. Donald M. Fraser, D-Minn.

Fraser has been conducting an investigation of the church and its leadership for possible ties to influence buying activities by Korea in the United States.

Moon, who has been subpoenaed to appear before the House subcommittee on international organizations headed by Fraser, has said he will not cooperate with the investigation. He is now in London.

PAK TOLD A press conference today that the suit was filed in U.S. District Court here "on the grounds of conspiracy to violate and deprive the Unification Church and me of our constitutional rights." He accused Fraser of "premeditated character assassination" and of "a predetermined commitment to 'get' Korea and the Unification Church."

"Through this lawsuit we are seeking a court injunction and damages to stop the abuses and the violation of civil and constitutional rights of the church, its leaders and its members," Pak said.

Pak, who has appeared before the Fraser committee five times, including an executive session yesterday, flatly denied that he has ever been a member of the Korean CIA. He accused Fraser of using the technique of the "big lie" and "guilt by associa-tion" in implicating him, Moon and his followers in the scandal.

We believe that Congressman Fraser has an ulterior, hidden motive in this investigation," Pak said. "He is determined to destroy Rev. Moon and the Unification Church and undermine Korean-American relations.

The suit charges that Fraser sent two investigators, Edwin H. Gragert and Martin Lewin to the Unification Church of Washington, at 16th Street and Columbia Road NW, and that the pair "falsely misrepresented them-selves as architects and conducted a secret search of our church."

Pak said there is evidence that, Fraser has been involved in a "reverse Korean payoff scandal," in that he awarded \$2,000 "consulting contracts" to four witnesses who gave testimony detrimental to South Korea or to Moon's church.

ANSWERING CHARGES by Fraser that Moon left the country to avoid being served a subpoena to appear on June 13, Pak said Fraser "led reporters to believe that Rev. Moor had been expecting the sub-poena, and he implied Rev. Moon

might have gone to England to avoid being served."
"Yet previously, his attorneys had told my attorney that there was a very good chance that it would not be necessary to call Rev. Moon. They promised my attorney that the sub-committee would not make any decision about calling Rev. Moon as a witness and would not issue a subpoena for Rev. Moon until after the completion of my testimony. Why should Rev. Moon expect that he would be subpoenaed for June 13 when I was scheduled to testify on June 20?"

He said Moon had planned his evangelistic trip to England for a long time.

Pak said Moon "will not cooperate with such a sordid investigation.



About six weeks ago she mentioned that the Unification Church in New York was planning a mass wedding in Madison Square Garden. There were expected to be about 1500 young women to be present for the wedding. The prospective bride grooms are all Orientals currently living in their native countries. The brides have no choice of who they are to marry. After the marriage and the bride groom is brought to the United States, Unification Church plans that the husband and wife will not live together, but that they will be separated and put in various parts of the country. In fact, during the first 40 days of marriage according to church doctrine, they are not allowed to have any intimate relationships with each other or actually live as a normal man and wife. feels that this may be a ploy of the Unification Church to circumvent the immigration laws of the United States. The wedding was planned for the second week of November, but has been postponed. He does not know the exact date of this wedding.

Moon discovered a series of principles which yielded great insight into the deep questions of human life and faith: the nature of God, the origin of suffering, the purpose of creation and life. As a Christian, he explored many of the puzzling problems of Bible interpretation and found a pattern in the Bible according to which God has been conducting His providence through history and even in the present-day

world. In the light of these principles, the deeper meanings of the Bible could be clearly seen, as well as the purpose of all religions. \mathcal{M}

"Because he tried to share his enriched understanding with other Christians, Rev. Moon was imprisoned several times in Communist North Korea and severely tortured. Finally he endured nearly three years in a prison camp before United Nations forces released him along with other prisoners, and he was free to return to the south. At that time he organized The Holy Spirit Association for the Unification of World Christianity (The Unification Chruch) based on the principles revealed to him during his years of search."

It will be noted that the Headquarters for the Unification Church in the United States is located at 1365 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., Washington, D. C. It has Headquarters in most states in the United States. Its Headquarters in Arizona is 1003 East Pasadena, Phoenix, Arizona. It is represented on the ASU campus by a student organization known as Collegiate Association for the Research of Principles (CARP).

An article appeared in the daily newspaper, "Phoenix Gazette", Phoenix, Arizona, on February 21, 1976, written by John L. Carpenter indicates that CARP was formerly known as the "Unified Family", both fronts for the Unification Church of the Reverend Sun Myung Moon, a Korean. The article indicated that CARP was a cult that lured students such as across the nation by giving them free dinners and encouraging them to drop out of school. 

Bufiles reveal that Sun Myung Moon, founder of the Unification Church (UC), was the subject of a bribery investigation in December, 1974, and January, 1975. This investigation was predicated upon receipt of a letter from the District Director of the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), New York, to the FBI concerning an anonymous letter which was sent to INS, New York, alleging payments to INS employees by Reverend Moon of the UC.

Facts in this matter were presented to the Assistant United States Attorney, Southern District of New York, who advised that upon review of the initial complaint and the results of the investigation conducted at INS, New York, the allegation does not contain any substantiality or concreteness which would warrant further investigation in this matter.

During the course of the investigation at INS, New York, it was determined that the UC is a Judea-Christian group attempting to unify all the churches in the world and set up missions on the South American continent. They are already active in most other countries of the world.

The UC was established in 1954 in the Far East and has now various training centers in the United States.

The United States headquarters is located at 1365 Connecticut Avenue, Northwest, Washington, D.C., while the international headquarters is presently located at the Belvedere Estate, Incorporated, 723 South Broadway, Tarrytown, New York. Members of the church receive training in evangelical work at Tarrytown New York.

Members of the church have been admitted to the U.S. as nonimmigrant visitors or have applied for admission as visitors and their inspection has been deferred. Members have been found soliciting throughout various cities of the U.S. and have been arrested by the local police for such soliciting. However, numerous aliens have entered the U.S. and are admitted for training in the work of the UC and to participate in the activities of the church. As part of their activities, the aliens have been dispatched to many areas of the U.S. where they solicit funds from the public for the UC. Questions have been raised as to whether these aliens have violated their immigration status as a result of these activities.

The Reverend Sun Myung Moon founded the UC in 1954 in Korea. It was incorporated in California in 1961. Reverend Moon entered the U.S. in 1972 as a B-1 visitor. His status was adjusted to that of a permanent resident in April 30, 1973. His residence was listed as 7439 Hallcrest Drive, McLean, Virginia.

Department of Justice, and the FBI have received numerous requests from irate parents concerning the religious conversion of their children to beliefs espoused by Sun Myung Moon and his followers. The requests received by the Bureau have been discussed with the Criminal Division, Department of Justice, which has advised that such activity does not involve the violation of any Federal statutes.

Bufiles contain no additional pertinent information concerning the captioned individual or organization.

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Enclosed for those interested offices is a two page copy of the referenced Bureau airtel of 8/24/79, which set forth a request from the Department of Justice Registration. On Wednesday, May 2, 1979, at 10:00am, there will be a demonstration at Harvard Square staged by the Collegiate Association for the Research of Principles (CARP), founded by the Rev. Sun Myung Moon. The demonstration will begin at Massachusetts Ave. and Quincy St., and proceed down Massachusetts Ave. and around Harvard yard.

Members of Rev. Moon's church enroll at HDS

Serious theological studies accompany Unification students' serious religious commitment.

It came to the Bulletin Editor's attention this winter that several members of the Unification Church had enrolled at Harvard Divinity School during the last two years. Awareness of the presence at HDS of six young people who, it turned out, were unusually bright, serious, interesting individuals caused certain paradoxes to begin tugging at the editor's mind that in turn provided an incentive to write an article. The reality of their presence at a scholarly institution the caliber of HDS did not seem to "libe" with the vague impressions that had been implanted by the media about how Reverend Moon and his organization had "brainwashed" large numbers of unsuspecting youth and turned them into unthinking followers. These were clearly intelligent, thinking people. Although sharing a common commitment to their religion. They were distinct individuals: their personalities did not seem to have become subsumed by that of the group to which they

The article which has emanated from 2-hour interviews with five Unification Church members at HDS is an attempt to achieve a purpose that became clearer as the article evolved. Its overriding goal is to have these people talk about what their religion means to them, in the terms that they choose. An effort was made to avoid centering the interviews around the questions asked repeatedly by the press and the public in general, such as "Do you really think that Reverend Moon is the Messiah?" "Were you pressured into joining the church?" The editor, rather, asked individuals to talk about their religious/spiritual histories and their life stories and about the Unification movement as it bore on the students' religious development. It seemed valid in the publication of a theological school to focus on theological issues: their concept of God, of prayer, of their social responsibility as Christians, etc. The article hopes to give a glimpse of the personal religious truth of these people, to provide some balance to reportorial efforts that seldom honor the motives and goals of young people who commit themselves to this movement.

In the course of preparing for the interviews, the editor came across a newly published would highly recommend to anyone wanting to learn something about the theology of the Unification Church and to think about its emergence in the context of the historical issue of orthodoxy versus heresy in Christianity. Edited by M. Darrol Bryant and Herbert W. Richardson, A Time for Consideration: A Scholarly Appraisal of the Unification Church (New York: The Edwin Mellen Press, 1978) includes articles by HDS Professor Harvey Cox and Herbert Richardson, Harvard PhD 1963, who now teaches at the Unification Theological Seminary in Barrytown, New York. The editor found many of the articles thought-provoking and informative, particularly "Making Crime Seem Natural" by Bart Testa, about the shoddy journalistic techniques often employed by people writing about the Church, and "A Psycho-Social Analysis of Religious Conversion" by Richard DeMaria, a Professor of Religious Studies at Iona College. Prof. DeMaria provides excellent tools for thinking about conversions in the Unification Church in the context of conversion and commitment in the broader history of Christianity.

Six members of the Holy Spirit Association for the Unification of World Christianity, the movement founded and led by the Reverend Sun Myung Moon, are currently pursuing theological studies at Harvard Divinity School. All of these students are active in the leadership of their movement, commonly known as the Unification Church. Five are graduates of the Unification Theological Seminary in Barrytown, New York. The Unification students at HDS are among 24 graduates of the Barrytown Seminary who are now pursuing theological studies around the country, at Yale Graduate School, the Graduate Theological Union in Berkeley, the University of Chicago Divinity School, Union Theological Seminary in New York City and other schools.

The students were recently interviewed by the Bulletin editor about the personal religious experiences leading to their joining the Unification movement and their feelings about being members of a group that has in the past few years become an object of widespread controversy and the recipient of a storm of negative publicity from the media. They also shared their reasons for enrolling at Harvard Divinity School to do graduate work in the theological disci-

The backgrounds of the Unification students here at HDS are diverse, religiously and in other respects. Klaus Lindner, from Bavaria, Germany, and Anthony Guerra, a native of Massachusetts, each grew up as Roman Catholics; both attended church schools. Mr. Lindner headed a Catholic youth group in high school and seriously considered becoming a Catholic priest. Thomas Selover, raised a Methodist, was active in his church, especially when in high school. His family was also influenced religiously by the Mormons, whose religious fervor impressed Mr. Selover as a young man. Andrew Wilson's and Sarah Petersen's families were "not very religious," as they describe them. "During my first year of college I felt skeptical toward Christianity, which for several years I had considered to be mere superstition," comments Mr. Guerra, "I read and pondered Kierkegaard and William Blake I had what I knew were spiritual experiences although I could not say that I believed in God.

While she was attending the University of California at Berkeley, Ms. Petersen says she had no conscious religious orientation. Yet her life was moving in a way that she feels in retrospect was under God's guidance, heading her for a future of religious commitment and service. A good student, she combined academics with some political activism and volunteer work. During her junior year abroad in France, she developed a sense of certainty about her future: Her life ought to be devoted to some sort of professional work, aimed at promoting world peace. She applied to Boalt Law School before graduation from Berkeley. At that time she became interested in the Unification church, a group that she felt shared her values and her goals.

Exposure to the Unification church came during college or right after college for these young people. It was for them the answer to a deep-felt desire for a commitment. It offered a set of values and a life-style they saw standing at a pole opposite the life the secular world had to offer.

All of these students had the prospect of success ahead. They had succeeded academically. Professional or scholarly work appeared to lie in their futures, as well as a good share of material prosperity.

"When I became committed to the Unification movement I was a graduate student in mathematics, doing extremely well and subsidized by the German government. I had a nice apartment, a good car, I had a comfortable secular life," comments Mr. Lindner. He was then introduced to the Unification theology in downtown Regensburg by a church member who had been a former Catholic seminary student. Mr. Lindner and his girl friend both began reading the literature. They were attracted by the theology in the Divine Principle, the main statement of Unification theology, by Reverend Moon. After two months of reading and reflecting, they joined the church. "I felt myself coming back to my earlier desire to serve a religious purpose," says the young German. "I recognized the impulse that had earlier made me consider being a Catholic priest.' The God presented to him in Unification theology was one that he felt he wanted to fully commit himself to in

a life of service. He and his girl friend are both now church leaders.

Thomas Selover speaks similarly of finding in the Unification church a focal point for his religious impulses and his desire to lead a life of commitment and service. He had majored in elementary education at Virginia Wesleyan College, also emphasizing religious studies. Upon graduation he worked for the Waldorf Institute, a teacher training center in Detroit. His job involved traveling around the country recruiting students for the Institute. In Atlanta, Mr. Selover met an international team of the Unification church. They and the people at the Unification Center in Atlanta impressed him, as did the ideas they espoused. He decided to open himself up to the possibility of joining the church and moved into the Center. Shortly, he came to the decision to take on the life of service the church offered. Since that time he has worked as a volunteer in the church; his life today is the disciplined and God-centered one found among members of religious orders, he says.

The introduction of these students to the Unification church and their early experiences in the movement bear little relation to the "brainwashing" stories that abound in the media. Andrew Wilson, for example, says he was attracted to the church because its ideas made sense to him; he encountered the Unification theology after graduating from Harvard with a degree in Biochemistry. After careful consideration he joined the church. The experiences of the other students were similar: They were impressed both by the ideas of the religion and the sense of warmth and community-the agape-they found among its members. But it was not pressure applied by the church that resulted in their decisions to join. On the contrary, they say, a combination of personal prayer, and independent study and reflection, characterized the period preceding their decision to become church members.

Sarah Petersen felt drawn to the ideas, the values, and the sense of community she found at the Berkeley Unification church when she started to attend occasional lectures and workshops. But her actual commitment to the church came after a period of intense spiritual questioning and wrestling with her faith which the visits to the church precipitated. Alone in her apartment in Berkeley, she grappled with her personal doubts about the existence of God. A sense of the certainty of God's presence came from this intense prayerful experience, she tells. She subsequently decided to become a Christian and shortly thereafter joined the Unification church. She felt strongly the responsibility to enter a life of service to God and the world in response to this deep religious experience, she states.

Ms. Petersen then moved into the Unification community in Berkeley, where she anticipated she would "grow faster in the spiritual life, away from the distractions of the secular world." She continued to go to work and later attended law school for a year. Since then she has traveled in the United States, Europe and the Orient, engaging in lecturing and fund raising for the church.

The other students also speak of the vital, sustaining prayer life they have found in the Unification church. It is made possible, they say, by the church's concept of God as a suffering God who is moved by the woes of the world. "For me God is not an immoveable mover, but a parent who suffers more from human suffering than we do," explains Mr. Lindner. Prayer in their religion is more "relational" than "meditational." It is communication with a being that understands man's suffering and shares it. The prayer life is a great source of energy for hard work in the church, Mr. Lindner comments. It generates an enthusiasm, labeled by some people outside the church as fanaticism, that stems from this vital awareness of relatedness to God.

"The real political challenge of the Moonies is not, I believe, that they are a proto-fascist movement or a secret part of a vast right-wing conspiracy. Those would be relatively easy to deal with. The real challenge is that Unification presents to idealistic young people a social vision aimed at peace, racial amity, ecological balance and economic justice based on stories and symbols drawn directly from the biblical sources they have heard since they were young and from the American civil religion that still—despite Watergate, Viet Nam and all the rest—maintains a grip on their imaginations. This seems especially telling since sociologists who have studied the Moon movements tell us a large proportion of its adherents come from second-generation American families where the American dream is still more vital than it is in other sectors. Furthermore, this vision of a Heavenly Kingdom that will start in America is presented as something the members can begin to work and sacrifice for right now. And they do

"I believe the attraction of the Moon movement to naive idealistic youth is not a result of sinister brainwashing but an inevitable consequence of the utter vacuum that now exists on what might be called the "Christian left." The theory that the only things young people are interested in today are beer-guzzling and careerism is simply untrue. Many are looking for a credible, religiously grounded social vision. But little is offered them ... Moon offers toil and martyrdom for a world that must be built anew.

"I am convinced that the only real 'answer' to the Unification religious/political challenge is to provide something better. It must be a political vision based on Judeo-Christian values, open to insights from the Orient, aware of the critical factor of class (which is rarely mentioned by the Moonies)"

After joining the church in the early 1970's, the students spent time lecturing, fund raising and performing administrative duties for the church in various capacities. Several studied at the Unification Theological Seminary in Barrytown, Founded in 1975, the seminary has a faculty of scholars drawn from a variety of denominations including several HDS and Harvard Graduates: Warren Lewis (BD '65), Herbert Richardson (PhD '63) and Constantine Tsirnanlis (ThM'62). The curriculum covers the traditional subjects taught in Christian seminaries: church history; biblical studies; theology; pastoral counseling; religion and society, and so on. The reasons that lie behind the founding of the seminary explain the entry of many of the seminary's first graduates into advanced theological study. According to the HDS students, the church recognizes that as a new movement it needs to understand the Christian tradition from which it has sprung. And, as a young movement in terms of having a high percentage of youthful members, it acknowledges its need to develop a leadership that has been trained in Christian theology and history.

The Unification students at HDS say they welcome the chance to study their Christian heritage and to see within the complexity of Christian history some of the trends that are woven into their church's theology. Two of the students, Mr. Selover and Mr. Guerra, are studying theology. They hope for careers as constructive theologians, working in university settings. "Our theology is not a set of closed doctrines," comments Mr. Guerra. "It is in the process of formation. I see my mission to help formulate it in dialogue with other faiths."

The students welcome the opportu-

nity for dialogue with students of other denominations at HDS. Despite the adverse publicity their church has received, they say they find many HDS students open to discussion with them about their religion and its theology.

The sense these people have of being part of a genuinely Christian movement with an important message to bear to the churches of our day stands in striking contrast, they note, to the view held of their movement by many Christian churches. The church has been refused entry into the National Council of Churches. The state of New York has refused to grant accreditation to the Barrytown seminary, despite the fact that its academic standards are high. Prolonged refusal of the established churches to recognize their contribution to Christianity and their openness to dialogue with the Christian tradition may, in the long run, cause the church to turn in on itself, the students state. But it does not want to be isolated, "ghettoized."

The image of their church and of their leader that the media has promoted is a problem that the students are each struggling with.

The students say they are particularly pained by the image that has been painted of Reverend Moon, who they see as a humble, hard-working, deeply spiritual man, whose life is entirely dedicated to the religion he founded. They have all met him and talked personally with him and find him worthy of emulation. They ask that, rather than accepting the image of their leader as a scheming politician, a self-aggrandizing businessman steeped in Oriental intrigue, the public judge the man by the lives of the people like themselves who are trying to follow his example.

Dean Stendahl announces his intention to remain at HDS as member of faculty

Dr. Stendahl has been dean of Har-

vard Divinity School since 1968. He came to the United States from Sweden to join the HDS faculty in

The holder of several honorary degrees from Upsala College (USA). Thiel, Carthage, Colby, Whittier, St. Olaf and Carthage Colleges and Susquehanna University, Dean Stendahl just recently received another honorary doctorate. In December he was awarded the Doctor of Humane Letters by Miami University. The University highly praised Dean Stendahl for his role in the growth of their department of religion. 

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
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
