MEMORANDUM TO THE FILE

SUBJECT: FINDINGS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE OFFICE OF THE  
INSPECTOR GENERAL REGARDING FORENSIC WORK PERFORMED  
BY TERRY RUDOLPH

The purpose of this memorandum is to commemorate, in all relevant case files, certain findings made by the Department of Justice Office of the Inspector General (OIG) regarding forensic work performed by former Special Agent Terry Rudolph. The OIG's findings were issued in connection with a broader investigation of three units in the FBI Laboratory: the Explosives Unit, the Materials Analysis Unit, and the Chemistry-Toxicology Unit.

The OIG reviewed Rudolph's work in the Psinakis case, as well as several other matters. Based on that review, the OIG criticized Rudolph strongly, and reached the following conclusions:

- Rudolph failed to conduct appropriate scientific analyses or to adequately document his work in a substantial number of cases;
- Rudolph did not perform his work as an examiner in a manner that would withstand peer review or judicial scrutiny; and
- Rudolph's "lack of competence" was not isolated to one case.

Based on these findings, the OIG specifically recommended that a notation regarding its findings with respect to Rudolph be placed in each case file in which Rudolph was the principal or auxiliary examiner. If the forensic work performed by Rudolph in this case is used in any way in the future, both the OIG's findings and Rudolph's forensic analysis should be reviewed. In addition, legal advice should be obtained as to the FBI's disclosure obligations.

Synopsis: To place this document on record in the Task Force control file and to place a copy on the top serial in every investigative file containing forensic work performed by any of the thirteen Laboratory Examiners whose scientific work was criticized by the OIG.

Reference: 66F-HQ-A1211968 Serial 82

Details: BE ADVISED, one or more of the Laboratory Examiners who performed scientific analysis in this investigation was criticized in the OIG's report issued on April 15, 1997. The OIG conducted a thorough review of allegations of wrongdoing and improper practices within certain sections of the FBI Laboratory. It issued a report which, among other findings, was critical of the scientific work performed by thirteen individual examiners assigned to the Lab. The allegations and criticisms concerning these individuals varies greatly and in some instances is case specific.

If the forensic work contained in this file is used in any way in the future, both the OIG's findings and the forensic analysis of the examiners should be reviewed. In addition, legal advice should be obtained as to the FBI's disclosure obligations.

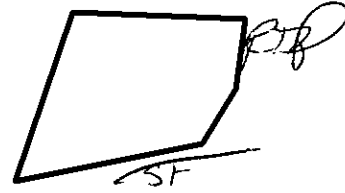

THE CAPTIONED INVESTIGATION HAS BEEN DESIGNATED AS A BUREAU SPECIAL AND ALL LEADS ARE TO BE REGARDED AS PRIORITY MATTERS AND EXPEDITIOUSLY COMPLETED, WITH FULL DOCUMENTATION FORWARDED TO THE UNABOM TASK FORCE (UTF) IN TIMELY FASHION. (Refer to lead #VSF649).

Enclosed for receiving office are copies of letters that were sent by McCONNELL to various Professors in 1985 and a listing of those professors in each division. Enclosed also, is a Federal Grand Jury (FGJ) subpoena requesting necessary data.

The UNABOM Task Force is conducting an investigation regarding a series of fourteen (14) bombings which occurred across the country between 1978 and 1993. These bombings have resulted in the death of one individual and serious bodily injuries to others. As part of this investigation, a team of investigators from the FBI, U.S. POSTAL INSPECTION SERVICE (USPIS) and the BUREAU OF ALCOHOL, TOBACCO, AND FIREARMS (ATF), is conducting a comprehensive

review and analysis of the backgrounds of each of the victims of these bombings in an effort to discern a nexus between them which may aid in identifying a possible suspect. To do this, important background information concerning each victim is being compiled and automated for comparison purposes.

One of these victims was Dr. JAMES V. McCONNELL, formerly a professor of Psychology at the UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN. McCONNELL was employed at the UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN from 1956 to 1986. He is now deceased.

On 11/15/85, JAMES V. McCONNELL, received a parcel at his home address which contained an explosive device. The return name and address on the package listed RALPH C. KLOPPENBURG, Department of History, UNIVERSITY OF UTAH, Salt Lake City, UT 84112. The package had been mailed from Salt Lake City, UT, on or about 11/12/85. RALPH C. KLOPPENBURG is a fictitious name. Attached to the outside of the package was a letter to McCONNELL signed by KLOPPENBURG requesting that McCONNELL review and critique the enclosed manuscript. [redacted]

McCONNELL was interviewed on several occasions. During the course of the interviews, he advised that he had attended LOUISIANA STATE UNIVERSITY in Baton Rouge from 1942 to 1947. McCONNELL also attended CENTENARY, TULANE, NORTHWESTERN, and HARVARD during these same years. He graduated with a Bachelor's Degree majoring in Psychology in 1947. After completing his undergraduate work, he was employed as a Radio Station Announcer in New Orleans and Lake Charles, LA. In 1949, he was the Program Director for a Galveston, TX radio station and became a writer for a television station in Cincinnati, OH from 1950 to 1951.

In 1951, he was employed at his family's cafe on a part-time basis while he pursued his graduate studies at the UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS. McCONNELL received his Master's Degree in Psychology in 1954. He received a Fulbright Scholarship to attend the UNIVERSITY OF OSLO in Oslo, Norway from 1954 to 1955. He returned to the UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS in 1955 and received his Ph.D in Psychology in 1956. His advisor at the UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS was KARL DALLENBACH.

In 1956, McCONNELL became an Instructor in the Department of Psychology at the UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN. He became a Professor in 1963 and was employed in this position until his retirement. From 1963 through 1980, McCONNELL had a research appointment with the Mental Health Research Institute



at the UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN. During this research, he was the Director of the Planarian Research Group. This research dealt with operant conditioning of flatworms. From 1973 to 1986, he was also a lecturer for Management Training Programs for U.S. STEEL CORPORATION, OWENS/CORNING FIBERGLASS CORPORATION, IBM, FORD MOTOR COMPANY, PENNSYLVANIA BELL TELEPHONE CO., NATIONAL STEEL CORPORATION, BLUE CROSS/BLUE SHIELD. McCONNELL was a Consulting Editor for HOLT, RINEHART & WINSTON., New York City, NY, from 1977 to 1985. He was on the Science Year Editorial Advisory Board, WORLD BOOK, INC., Chicago, IL, from 1983 to 1987.

On 10/11/85, McCONNELL sent a form letter to 142 professors across the country using stationary which listed his business and residence addresses. In this letter, he requested professional input and feedback regarding the fifth edition of his book, UNDERSTANDING HUMAN BEHAVIOR. A month later, McCONNELL received an IED addressed to his home accompanied with a letter. The content of the suspect letter was similar to the letter that McCONNELL mailed on 10/11/85. Dr. McCONNELL had only lived at this address since the fall of 1983.

A review of the 142 letters revealed 100 universities had professors employed at their respective institution which received the form letter. This analysis revealed that 32 sales representatives for HOLT, RINEHART & WINSTON were mentioned in these letters by Dr. McCONNELL as contacts for these professors with the publishing firm. An attachment is enclosed with the names of these individuals and their marketing territory.

A review of the fifth edition of UNDERSTANDING HUMAN BEHAVIOR revealed that Dr. McCONNELL had also acknowledged the enthusiastic reception given by HOLT, RINEHART & WINSTON marketing and salespeople. These individuals were listed in the prologue section of UNDERSTANDING HUMAN BEHAVIOR for their contributions in the success of previous editions of the text. An attachment is enclosed with the names of these individuals.

Dr. McCONNELL also made a presentation to a group of more than 100 sales representatives for HOLT, RINEHART & WINSTON. This meeting occurred in Toronto in August, 1985.

2. Determine if HOLT, RINEHART & WINSTON has a listing of each professor at these institutions which utilized this text for classroom instruction.

3. Determine from the publisher if they furnished/provided to McCONNELL the names of the professors to whom McCONNELL corresponded in 1985 to market the Fifth Edition of his text? If yes, obtain a copy of the "source" document - the methodology to establish the list of names and the name of the individual responsible for compiling the names of the professors.

4. Determine if a similar "marketing" technique was utilized by the publisher for McCONNELL's prior editions of UNDERSTANDING HUMAN BEHAVIOR for the years 1974, 1977, 1980 and 1983. If yes, obtain the names and locations of those professors for the previously requested years as well as copies of the prior marketing letters (if available) to compare the contents of those letters with the 1985 McCONNELL letter, the methodology to establish such a list and the name of the individual who compiled the list for the previous years. If a similar marketing technique was not utilized prior to 1985 - determine "why not" and how was the text marketed.

5. Obtain from the publisher any documentation or correspondence regarding any comments pertaining to McCONNELL'S textbook for all editions.

6. Obtain from the publisher any information regarding a meeting in which Dr. McCONNELL made a presentation and was attended by more than 100 HOLT, RINEHART & WINSTON sales representatives in Toronto in August, 1985.

7. Obtain a complete listing of sales representatives who marketed UNDERSTANDING HUMAN BEHAVIOR for the years 1977 through 1986. The information requested should be name, DOB, SSAN, hire date, date of termination,

TOOLMARKS:

The toolmarks present on the Q115 (North Caldwell device) wire end were compared with the toolmarks present on the wire ends in specimens Q7 (Tiburon device), Q71, Q87, and Q89 (Yale device). A significant portion of the toolmark on each wire is not present to form a conclusion. It is this examiner's opinion that the same tool could have formed the toolmarks with different portions of the tool's cutting edge.

The manufacturer's toolmarks present on the Q115 and Q87 could have originated from the same machine; however, sufficient toolmarks could not be associated to form a conclusion.

There are several interesting points about O'Neill, his personality, his works, etc., which might play some role in the UNABOM subject's behavior. For example, device #4 was concealed in the book Ice Brothers; one of O'Neill's most noted plays was The Iceman Cometh.

O'Neill was responsible for introducing innovative uses of symbolism to the American theater in the early 1900's. Some critics complained that his symbolism was obscure and was lost on the audience. There is little question that the UNABOM subject also engages in much symbolism. Unfortunately, unlike most serial violent offenders with a message, the UNABOM subject has not communicated his message and the meaning of his symbolism is lost.

The ISU intends to further explore Eugene O'Neill and his works for other parallels to UNABOM.

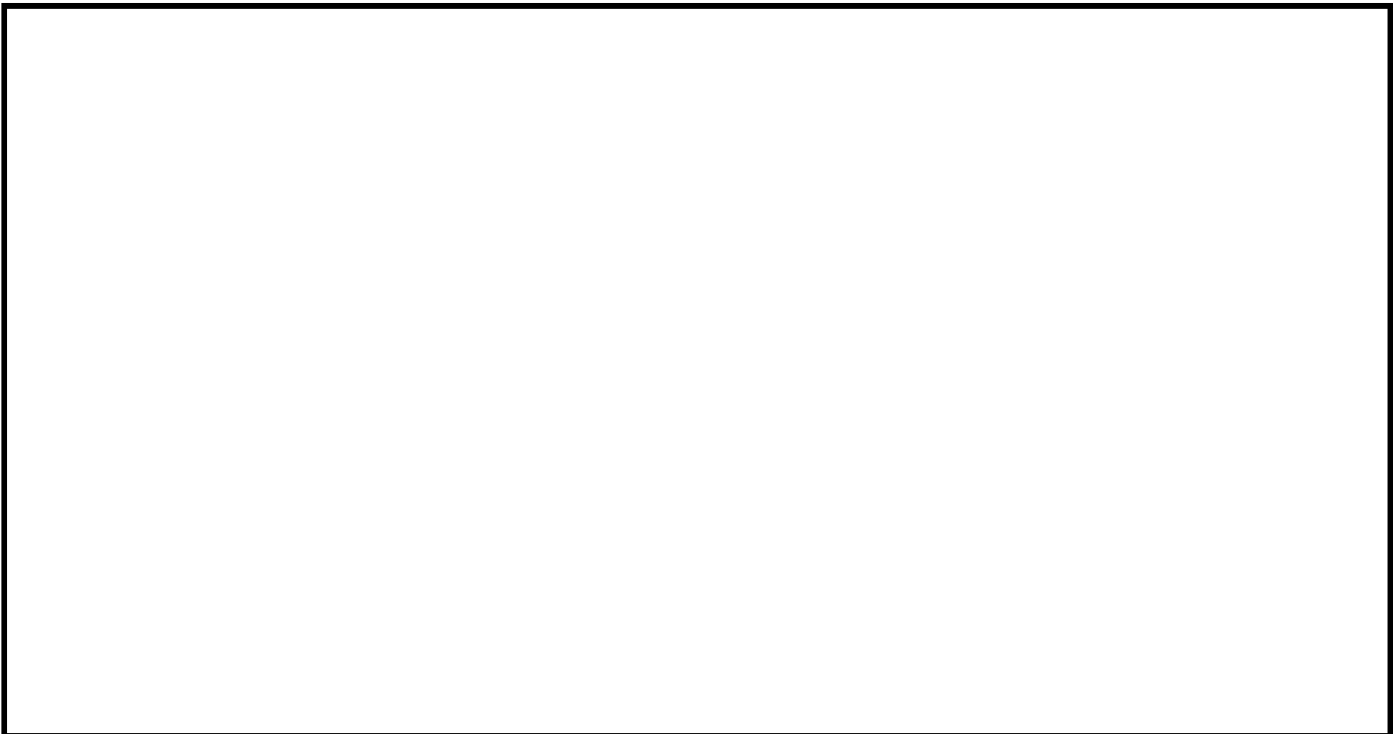

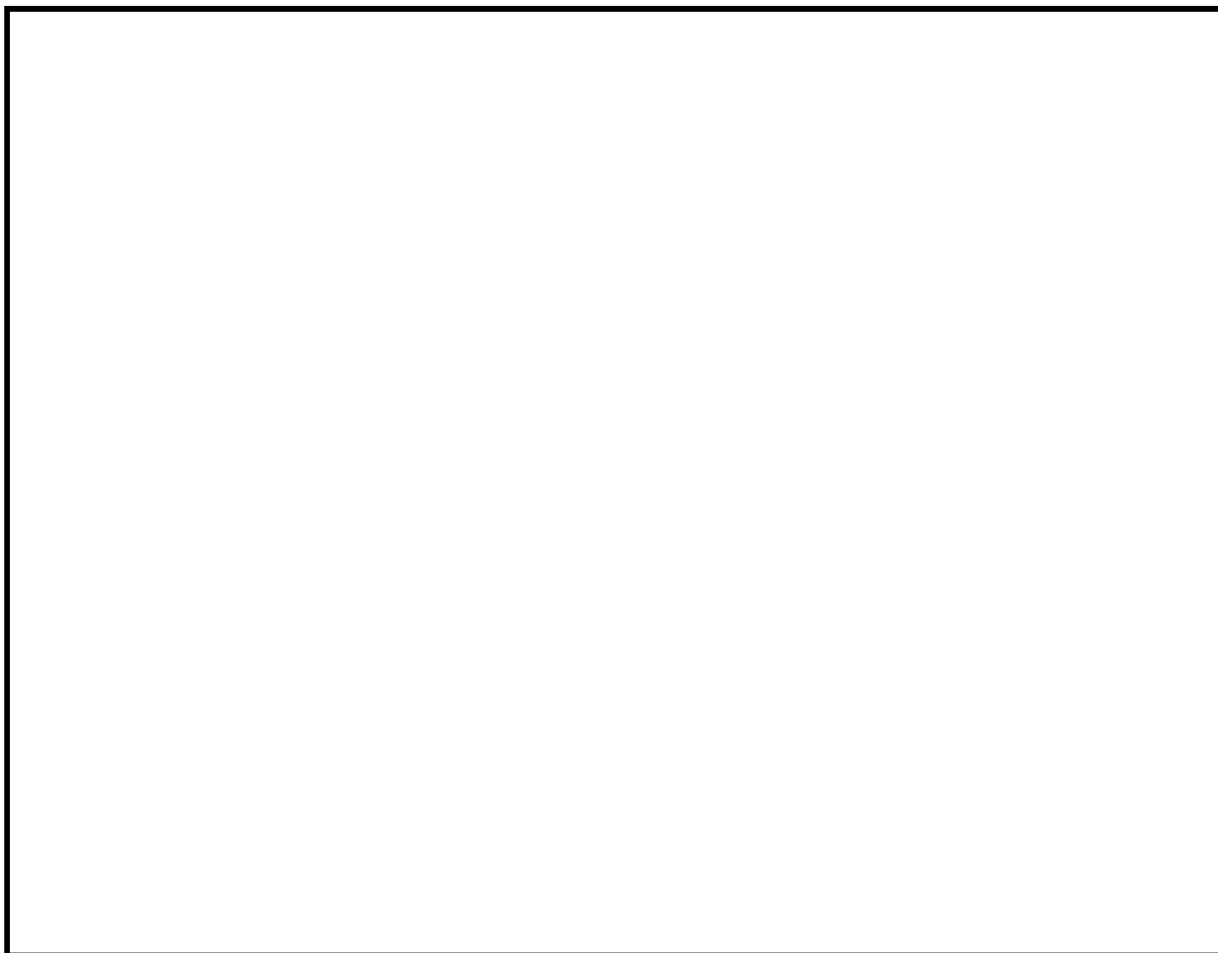

Re: Refer to Lead SF 116 in response. Obtain Historical and Biographical information on postage stamps utilized in UNABOM.

Eight of the 14 devices had postage stamps affixed (in addition to the NY Times letter). A total of seven different postage stamps were utilized.

Two of the stamps featured the U.S. flag (one had the flag over the U.S. capital), three of the stamps were part of the prominent Americas series (EUGENE O'NEILL, FREDERICK DOUGLASS and LUCY STONE), one stamp was part of the Americana series (Rush Lamp and Candleholder, aka, America's light fueled by truth and reason), and the final stamp was a part of the performing arts and artists series (WILL ROGERS).

Five of the stamps were used on more than one device. The flag with Olympic Rings was used on the two devices plus the NY Times letter; the flag over the capital was used on two devices; the Rush Lamp and Candleholder was used on four devices; the EUGENE O'NEILL was used on three devices, the FREDERICK DOUGLASS was used on two devices; and WILL ROGERS and LUCY STONE were each used on one device.

The EUGENE O'NEILL stamp (sheet version) was removed from sale on 10/31/79 and was used on devices on 5/25/78, 11/14/79 and 5/5/82. The other stamps were available for sale at the time they were utilized.

The two stamps featuring flags were produced in booklet form for sales through vending machines.

A summary of the Historical and Biographical information supplied by the USPS library [REDACTED] is attached as is a description of the stamp placement on the parcels.

This stamp was issued on July 2, 1979 in San Francisco, California as a part of the Americana series of stamps. The issue date was changed from July 31, 1979 to July 2, 1979 so that it could be issued on the same day as the \$1.00 Susan B. Anthony coin.

The \$1.00 stamp was designed by JAMES SCHLEYER of Burke, Virginia, who has designed several other Americana Series issues for the postal services. Following the lighting device theme of other SCHLEYER designs, the vignette depicts a stylized combination rush lamp and candleholder of the type used by early settlers of the United States.

The stamp design was modeled by V. JACK RUTHER and the engravers were GARY M. CHACONAS (vignette) and JAMES L. GOODBODY (lettering and numerals). All are with the BEP.

The image area size of a single stamp is .75 x .87 inches or 19.05 x 22.09 millimeters. The overall size of a single stamp, from perforated side to perforated side, is .84 x .99 inches or 21.33 x 25.14 millimeters. There were 100 stamps per pane.

This stamp was withdrawn from philatelic sale on February 28, 1987.

4) \$1.00 EUGENE O'NEILL STAMP

A total of 15 of these stamps were used on three devices:

A) May 5, 1982; Fischer device mailed from Provo, Utah to State College, Pennsylvania (three stamps).

B) November 14, 1979; American Airlines Flight 444 (two stamps).

C) May 25, 1978; Crist-NWU device found at University of Illinois (ten stamps).

This stamp was first issued on October 16, 1967 at New London, Connecticut, as a part of the Prominent American series.

This stamp was also issued as a coil type stamp on January 12, 1978 in Hempstead, New York. It was in coil form to be utilized in self service postal units for mailing parcels.

The sheet version of this stamp was removed from sale on October 31, 1979. All three devices had the sheet version of

the stamp.

O'NEILL is the first American playwright to be honored with a United States stamp. His plays received four Pulitzer Prizes and the top world award, the Nobel Prize for Literature.

[redacted] a member of the Postmaster General's Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee, designed the stamp. It is based on a photograph of O'NEILL that appeared in the books section of the New York Times, September 22, 1957.

EUGENE O'NEILL's first produced play was staged in 1916 in an abandoned fish house on a wharf and was viewed by a small audience that sat uncomfortably on benches. It was a play about the sea, so the Atlantic Ocean, not scenery was the backdrop. O'NEILL's father, a well-known and prosperous actor, subsidized him with an allowance of \$1 a day while he learned his craft with the Provincetown Players.

Just a few years later in 1920, O'NEILL's first Broadway play--"Beyond the Horizon"--won the Pulitzer Prize.

EUGENE GLADSTONE O'NEILL added Pulitzer Prizes with "Anna Christie," 1922; "Strange Interlude," 1928; and "Long Day's Journey into Night," posthumously produced in 1957. In 1936, he won the world's top award for literature--the Nobel Prize.

He is widely regarded as America's greatest playwright and ranks with SHAW as the most frequently produced of this century.

With one exception, the comedy, "Ah, Wilderness," O'NEILL wrote tragedy. The playwright's personal life was repeatedly scarred by tragedy. He once wrote: "Sure, I'll write about happiness if I ever happen to meet up with that luxury..."

In early manhood, O'NEILL was a merchant seaman, a gold prospector, a warehouse laborer and a newspaper reporter on a New London, Connecticut newspaper.

After recovering from tuberculosis in 1913, O'NEILL returned to school--he had had one year at Princeton--entering Professor GEORGE PIERCE BAKER's celebrated class in play writing at Harvard.

His one act plays produced by the Provincetown Players were judged by many critics as the best abbreviated dramas ever written in this country. They brought him no money, but eventually attracted Broadway producers.

O'NEILL was born October 16, 1888 in New York City. He died at Boston, Massachusetts, November 27, 1953.

5) \$.25 FREDERICK DOUGLASS STAMP

This stamp was used on two devices:

- A) June 10, 1980; Wood device mailed from Chicago to Lake Forest. (1 stamp)
- B) November 14, 1979; American Flight 444. (6 stamps)

This stamp was issued February 14, 1967 in Washington, D. C., which is believed to have been his birth date in 1817.

The \$.25 Douglass stamp is in the "Prominent Americans" series of regular stamps. It was designed by WALTER DUBOIS RICHARDS, of New Canaan, Connecticut, who makes his debut as a stamp designer. RICHARDS, a graduate of the Cleveland School of Art, is represented in the permanent collection of the Whitney Museum, in New York City and the Cleveland Museum of Art.

Born FREDERICK AUGUSTUS WASHINGTON BAILEY, a slave on Colonel ED LLOYD's Tuckahoe, Maryland plantation, he fled to New Bedford, Massachusetts where he changed his name to DOUGLASS, to avoid detection. He took this name in admiration for the character in Sir WALTER SCOTT's "Lady of the Lake."

He was aided in his self-education by Abolitionist WILLIAM LLOYD GARRISON, although their views on how to obtain civil rights for Negroes differed. GARRISON advocated withdrawal by the North from the Union; DOUGLASS campaigned for political action.

Following a lecture trip to England, friends there contributed \$750 to buy his freedom.

November 15, 1985 - McConnell Device - .22 Of the People, By the People, For the People, (flag over the capital) (four stamps) \$1.00 America's light fueled by Truth and Reason (eight stamps). The twelve stamps are in two rows of six stamps. The \$1.00 stamps are in two groups of four stamps. The .22 stamps are in two groups of two and are on the left side of the rows.

May 8, 1985 - Boeing Device - .22 Of the People, By the People, For the People (flag over the capital) (two stamps). \$1.00 America's light fueled by Truth and Reason (eight stamps). The America's light stamps are in two rows of four stamps. Six of the stamps are still connected and two have been separated. The two .22 stamps are connected and are in line with the two rows of \$1.00 stamps and to the left side of the rows.

May 5, 1982 - Fischer Device - \$1.00 EUGENE O'NEILL (three stamps)

The three stamps are above the address label in normal position. Two stamps are still connected, the third has been separated from its sheet.

June 10, 1980 - Percy Wood Device - \$1.00 America's light fueled by Truth and Reason (one stamp). .25 FREDERICK DOUGLASS (one stamp). .15 WILL ROGERS (one stamp).

The three stamps are side by side. The WILL ROGERS stamp is turned on its right side and is the first stamp on the left followed by the FREDERICK DOUGLASS and then the America's light stamp. The ROGERS stamp is rectangular and its width is the same dimension as the height of the other two.

November 14, 1979 - American Flight 444 - \$1.00 America's light fueled by Truth and Reason (three stamps). .50 LUCY STONE (five stamps). .25 FREDERICK DOUGLASS (six stamps). \$1.00 EUGENE O'NEILL (two stamps).

The stamps were arranged in four rows of four stamps in the upper right corner of the parcel. The four rows starting from the top:



The Investigative Support Unit (ISU), Critical Incident Support Group (CIRG), has reviewed each of the questions posed by reairtel, and the following provides a response to most issues raised. However, it is not possible to answer, with specificity, several of the questions posed, in view of the absence of physical evidence or evidence of the offender's behavior necessary for interpretation or analysis. Speculation as to possible reasons for the UNABOM subject's behavior could be counter-productive to the investigation and negatively impact on an expeditious identification and apprehension of the subject.

assumed that was his intent. It should also be considered that the changes and/or modifications the UNABOM subject has made to his devices over the years is likely his way of "customizing" his devices for a specific victim based on his personal feelings toward that victim.

**QUESTION #8 - Eugene O'Neill Stamps**

The Eugene O'Neill stamp has importance and meaning to the UNABOM subject. However, within the realm of possibilities, no one can say with certainty, what this significance or importance might be. Without any forensic evidence or specific behavior on which to base an analysis, drawing a specific connection between Eugene O'Neill's anarchist views and the UNABOM subject's goals would be speculative at this point. The only person who knows the reason or reasons these stamps are important is the UNABOM subject, himself.

It is not uncommon in a serial investigation for investigators to be perplexed by some aspect of the case or the offender's behavior. However, there are not always answers to these puzzles, until such time as the offender is interviewed and provides the explanation. In some cases, "puzzles" to which investigators attach some significance or special meaning, in fact, were determined to have no particular meaning to the offender.

(For additional analysis of possible connections with Eugene O'Neill, UTF should refer to CIRG airtel dated 7/26/95.)

**QUESTION #9 - Survey of Serial Bombing Cases**

As UTF is aware, ASAC Terchie, Acting SSA [redacted] and SA [redacted] participated in the 5/11/95, UNABOM conference at Quantico, facilitated by ISU personnel at the request of San Francisco. Also in attendance were representatives from FBI Headquarters; the Department of Justice; Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms; and Postal Inspection Service. Different style serial bombing cases were the subject of this meeting and several cases were exhaustively discussed throughout the day. All significant material was disseminated at that time to UTF personnel, and everyone was encouraged to take notes. Therefore, unless UTF advises that providing a written summary of this survey is critical to the ongoing investigation, one will not be provided at this time.
