J. EDWARD DAY was interviewed at his office, 21 Du Pont Circle, Washington, D. C. by SA on December 20, 1976. He advised ne knew the appointee, THEODORE SORENSEN, when DAY was Postmaster General during the KENNEDY administration.

DAY described the appointee as having an unusually important role in the White House at that time, involving a great many matters of substance. He described the appointee as having integrity, patriotism and great intelligence. DAY conferred personally with SORENSEN on many matters of budget and legislation during that period but has had only limited contact with him since that time. He has had almost no social contact with him.

He described the appointee as politically ambitious who made a pitfully poor showing during a United States Senate race. Mr. DAY advised the appointee stood above the other White House staff members during that administration.

When asked if he knew anything derogatory concerning the appointee, Mr. DAY stated only his rocky marital histroy and the alledged fact that the appointee was one of TED KENNEDY's counselors immediately after Chappaquiddick, who helped TED KENNEDY decide his course of action due to that incident.

DAY gave a qualified answer when asked if he would recommend SORENSEN for a position of trust with the government. DAY stated he assumed the possible appointment was that of CIA Director and stated he would not recommend the appointee until he knew who else might be under consideration but would prefer SORENSEN over many others he could think of that might be under consideration.

He throught the appointee was rather liberal for such a post and was surprised the appointee would





The information in this summary memorandum covers the period since November, 1960. Mr. Sorensen was born on May 8, 1928, in Lincoln, Nebraska.

From January, 1961, to February, 1964, he was employed by The White House Office, Washington, D. C., as Special Counsel to the President.

Mr. Sorensen was self-employed from March, 1964, to February, 1966, as a writer, lecturer, and consultant. During this period, he variously resided in Massachusetts and New York.

Mr. Sorensen has been employed by the law firm of Paul, Weiss, Rifkind, Wharton and Garrison, New York, New York, since February, 1966. He served as an attorney from February, 1966, to November, 1966, when he was promoted to his present position as a partner. He took leave of absence from the firm from March, 1968, to June, 1968, and from April, 1970, to July, 1970.

Edward M. Kennedy, United States Senator from Massachusetts, advised in Washington, D. C., that Senator Kennedy is unavailable; however, he is authorized to speak for him concerning Mr. Sorensen. He said Senator Kennedy has known Mr. Sorensen since about 1960 on a personal, political, and professional basis. He said Senator Kennedy considers Mr. Sorensen to be a brilliant, capable, honest, and trustworthy individual, and he would recommend him for a position of trust and confidence.

Robert S. McNamara, President, International Bank for Reconstruction and Development, Washington, D. C., and former Secretary of Defense, advised that he has known Mr. Sorensen for many years on a professional and personal basis. He said Mr. Sorensen is an intelligent individual in the legal area, and he also possesses a vast knowledge of problems of the world. He said Mr. Sorensen handles difficult decisions in an excellent manner, and he would never compromise his high standards of personal integrity. He said Mr. Sorensen is a loyal American citizen of excellent character, reputation, and associates, and he would recommend him for a responsible position with the United States Government.







WF T-1 stated that upon completion of the above necessary security checks approximately two weeks later, the results of these checks were provided to members of JWRA. WF T-1 stated that the members noted that two individuals on the list had not been cleared: PIERRE SALINGER and THEODORE SORENSEN. It was noted from a review of the results of the security checks provided by J-2 that SALINGER's mother was a member of the Communist Party in California and SORENSEN was noted as being a conscientious objector "of the category that could not be cleared for sensitive matters". WF T-1 advised that it was later explained to him that there are three categories of conscientious objectors and that SORENSEN was of the category that declared that "if called to serve in the Armed Forces of the United States in any capacity, he would not do so".

WF T-1 stated that the findings of these security checks were then provided to the White House. WF T-1 pointed out that JWRA did not, as a matter of routine, make any recommendations one way or the other as to who on the list should or should not be briefed on SIOP, but rather simply submit the results of these checks to the White House for their review and evaluation.

WF T-1 stated that after submitting this information to the White House, a final list of names were returned to JWRA from the White House of those individuals who would attend the first briefing on SIOP. 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

The information in this summary memorandum supplements information contained in summary memoranda dated December 23, 1976, December 29, 1976, and January 14, 1977.

Interview

A high-ranking military officer who requested confidentiality voluntarily contacted the FBI and advised he desired to furnish information concerning Mr. Sorensen.

This officer advised that in the fall of 1962 a highly sensitive and classified plan pertaining to nuclear attack and retaliation was completed at the Pentagon. He said arrangements were made to brief then President John F. Kennedy about the plan along with a small select group of military and civilian personnel. The White House, at the time, submitted a list to the Pentagon containing the names of about twelve individuals who would be in attendance at the briefing along with President Kennedy. Mr. Sorensen was one of the names submitted on the list. The purpose of submitting the list to the Pentagon was for conducting a security check of the proposed attendees at the briefing.

This officer stated that the results of the security checks were furnished to The White House without any recommendation; however, when the list was returned from The White House containing the names of the persons who would actually be attending the briefing, Mr. Sorensen's name and one other individual were not on the list. This officer is of the opinion that then President Kennedy was the individual who deleted Mr. Sorensen and the other individual from the briefing. He said he also assumes that the deletion was made by President Kennedy after he, President Kennedy, reviewed the results of the security checks on Mr. Sorensen and the other individual. He said

it is his opinion that Mr. Sorensen's name was deleted from the list because information existed that Mr. Sorensen was a conscientious objector "of the category that could not be cleared for sensitive matters."

He said the briefing was subsequently held and handled by General Hardin, whose first name he does not know. He said other individuals from the Pentagon who were in attendance at this briefing were Colonel Colonel Phillip G. Cobb, Captain and Lieutenant Colonel Charles L. Tucker.

This officer stated that he has never met Mr. Sorensen; however, he felt it was his duty as a concerned citizen to make available the aforementioned information inasmuch as Mr. Sorensen is being considered for an extremely sensitive position with the United States Government.

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

In describing the job, Neustadt started with the proposition that the CIA was in trouble. He felt it lacked the confidence of the public, of the Congress and of the incoming administration:

He further felt that it was absolutely essential that the agency be rebuilt. He assumed that the rebuilding should be supervised by a person in whom the President elect, had complete confidence; who knew his way around both the executive branch and the Congress who was sensitive to issues of civil liberty; who was familiar with the needs of the ultimate consumer of intelligence, the President thimself; and who was bright and experienced enough to penetrate any self-serving project the CIA might try to put over

telligence post: Sorensen accepted ; At that time, however, Sorensen indicated—and this should put an end to the canard that he is somehow out to do in the agency—that he did not want to make any advance judgments as to the organization of the intelligence community, In particular, he was not committed, as Vice President elect Walter. Mondale apparently is; to stopping all covert activities Nor does he have any advance commitment to the proposition that the Director of Central Intelligence should withdraw himself from the CIA and supervise all parts of the intelligence community. rensen wants to wait and see No doubt the designation of Sorensen is unorthodox. He is an avowedly political man, not the kind of antiseptic poohbah usually picked to build public con-fidence. Unlike most previous directors, his primary experience has not been in foreign policy—certainly not in fighting the cold war. Neither does he have vast administrative experience nor special knowledge of intelligence.

But Sorensen undoubtedly has other. qualities. He is intelligent, experienced and honest He has been a "President's man", and knows what a President needs He does have the complete con-tidence of Jimmy Carter.


