[redacted] was interviewed by [redacted] who identified himself as a Special Agent (SA), of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). [redacted] who lives at [redacted] West Virginia (WV), telephone [redacted] provided the following information:

[redacted] stated that [redacted] had been looking for a job for several years, since he left [redacted] and had been unsuccessful. He said that he had contacted Senator ROBERT BYRD's office in Charleston, WV, to seek assistance in obtaining a job from [redacted] or [redacted]. [redacted] was not aware that [redacted] had become combative and confrontational at the offices of Senator BYRD in the previous week. [redacted] said that it was his opinion, and he thought the opinion of [redacted] that Senator BYRD office's had genuinely attempted to find work for him. To his knowledge, [redacted] was appreciative of the efforts of Senator BYRD's office.

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[redacted] inasmuch as his thoughts and speech appeared to be getting more disjointed recently. They both felt that this was a result of the stress of not having a job. [redacted] pointed out that [redacted] seemed to be mad at the "system", rather than any individual. He said that the "system" seemed to be generally against him, no matter where he turned. [redacted] stated that [redacted] had only a few friends that he saw on a regular basis. He said that he did not have any extracurricular activities, other than sporadic attendance at church. [redacted] was not aware of any drug use by [redacted].

When [redacted] first began visiting the office, his appearance was unkempt. Then, after a time, he improved his physical appearance, and now his physical appearance has again become unkempt. When he visited the office on January 24, 1989, he was wearing a green Army fatigue jacket, jeans, and appeared scruffy and dirty. [redacted] physical visits have been limited to the Charleston, WV, Office. He has also made calls to the Charleston Office and the Washington, D.C., Office of Senator BYRD.

However, [redacted] has grown increasingly volatile, and his physical appearance has also deteriorated. Apparently he recently had an episode where he became very agitated outside a judge's chambers in the building, and was asked to leave the building by the Marshal's service.

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[redacted] and [redacted] are concerned and frightened that [redacted] has made these subtle threats, and that he might become violent.

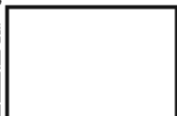

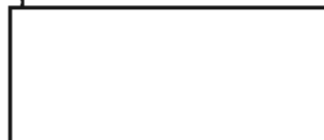

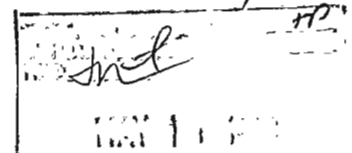
