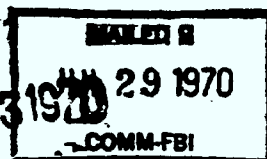

HAS SECOND OPERATION

Concern Mounts Over Lombardi

New concern over Redskins Coach Vince Lombardi's physical condition mounted today following his readmission to Georgetown University Hospital and his second operation in exactly a month.

The 57-year-old coach was described as "resting comfortably" after his latest operation, performed at 4:30 p.m. yesterday by Dr. Robert J. Coffey of the Georgetown University Hospital staff.

The nature of the latest operation was not disclosed by the Redskins, although Dr. Coffey had headed a six-man team that performed surgery on Lombardi on June 27, removing a tumor and a two-foot section of his colon.

The preliminary report following his first operation indicated that the tumor was believed to be benign, but no clarification or statement was made following subsequent laboratory tests.

Additional Surgery

The Redskins announced, in a brief statement, about 4 p.m. yesterday, that Lombardi had been readmitted to the hospital for "observation and tests." At 10:30 p.m. they announced that additional surgery had been performed. No additional details were given.

At his own insistence, Lombardi had attended the Redskins-Colts rookie scrimmage in Baltimore on Sunday. He appeared to be in good spirits, but was noticeably pale and weak. He had to rest frequently.

Despite the obvious strain, he went to the Redskins' locker room to speak with the rookie squad before and after the game. He appeared largely unemotional, but seemed to get pleasure from watching the game and talking with reporters briefly afterwards.

Last Tuesday, only 11 days after he had been released from the hospital, he flew to New York to speak to the pro football owners about the current impasse with the players over pension funds. Lombardi had been a member of the negotiating committee that had staved off a possible walkout two years ago over similar financial matters.

Weigh Closing Camp

During his convalescence following his first operation, Lombardi had insisted that he would make it to training camp at Carlisle when the veterans reported, originally scheduled for July 10. He repeated his intention of "being there" when the veterans report during a conversation with reporters in Baltimore on Sunday.

Several times in the last 10 days, Lombardi turned up at the Redskins' new headquarters at 10th and K Streets NW., going over business matters. He usually would stay from 30 minutes to an hour.

He named Bill Austin, the owner brother of his son, as interim coach for the entire training camp and conducted with Austin daily for plans of the program.

The Redskins gave the coaches for the 1971 season last week, but are waiting over a decision whether to start with the veteran coach or a newcomer with no previous NFL experience. Lombardi will also meet or all the pre-season training.

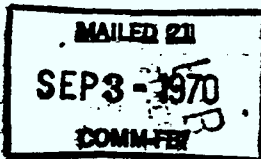
Dear Mrs. Lombardi:

Dear Mr. Hoover:

It has been a long time since I have been able to serve you - almost 13 years. It was always a pleasure to see you enter our restaurant, Leone's, and a privilege to spend some time with you on those occasions.

Since we sold "Leone's", I have remained in the restaurant business but closer to home. I have the Opera Restaurant in Englewood Cliffs, New Jersey, just north of the George Washington Bridge.

Shortly after I moved to New Jersey, I was very fortunate to meet Father Kenneth Moore through Vince Lombardi. Father Ken is a Carmelite Priest who taught at White Friars Hall and Catholic University in Washington for 25 years. In addition to being a very close personal friend of Lombardi, he has been the unofficial Chaplain for the Packers and the Redskins when Vince was the coach.

About four years ago Father Ken was transferred to our neck of the woods to become pastor of St. Joseph's Church in Demarest, New Jersey. In order to raise funds for needy young men to receive an education at the Carmelite Seminary, he and Vince started a Scholarship Dinner. Vince was the first honored guest. Because of the success of the affair and the untimely death of our friend, we decided to make it an annual event and re-named it "The Vincent T. Lombardi Scholarship Dinner".

Father Ken and I can both attest to the respect and admiration Vince had for you, Mr. Hoover. On a number of occasions he mentioned the qualities you possess and I'm sure he transmitted them to the football field and his personal life.

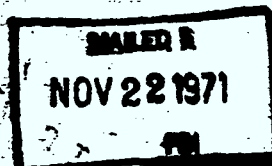
Dear Mr. Bowen:
