2 JOHN: -- agents and so forth. However, I --

3 DAVID: Well, you know what the Seven Seals  
4 are, don't you? You know what they are, don't you?

5 JOHN: It's something like the just can-you-  
6 get-it type of thing. It's basically a --

7 DAVID: No, no, no. Wait a minute. Wait a  
8 minute. Whoa.

9 JOHN: All right, but, David, we can't get  
10 into this. You know that.

11 DAVID: Steve. Steve, this guy wants to talk  
12 to you.

13 JOHN: No, David. You're scaring me off now.

14 DAVID: Why would it scare you off?

15 JOHN: No, 'cause here we're -- I thought we  
16 were having a nice little conversation. I'm trying to  
17 get to certain points.

18 DAVID: But your psychology is really  
19 putrefying when it comes down to it. I mean, like the  
20 Shabbat. Have you ever, have you ever read any of the  
21 laws of God, what God has required of old, what he  
22 requires of today? I mean, come on, let's be honest.  
23 Isaiah 58, what does the prophet say about the --

24 JOHN: Unfortunately, I'm not up on the good  
25 book. I can't stand toe to toe with you, quoting

1 various scriptures. That's just not my thing. And  
2 what I'm here for --

3 DAVID: Then God is not your thing then.

4 JOHN: I wouldn't say that, but the idea is  
5 I'm dealing on an entirely different level right now.  
6 I'm on the level of reality pertaining to trying to  
7 establish a time when you and you can take your friends  
8 out of there.

9 DAVID: Okay, exactly. Let's come to  
10 simplicity on the basis of reality, okay? The basis of  
11 reality is we've got a situation here that is a  
12 reality.

13 JOHN: That's correct, that is reality.

14 DAVID: Now, reality --

15 JOHN: I'll go with that. Go ahead.

16 DAVID: Now, the reality of it is is that  
17 that Sunday morning when this all got started, who was  
18 out on the front porch? Who was coming out?

19 JOHN: All right. You know how it happens on  
20 this. You've talked with other guys. We can't talk  
21 about the 28th, we can't talk about ATF. And I don't -  
22 - go ahead.

23 DAVID: Wait a minute, wait a minute, wait a  
24 minute, wait a minute, wait a minute, wait a minute.  
25 Let's get back to earth now. Let's --



1 JOHN: I am, I'm right here. Never left.

2 DAVID: Who went out the front door to  
3 confront the officers who were approaching the  
4 building?

5 JOHN: I'm sorry, I wasn't there and I really  
6 don't want to talk about it.

7 DAVID: Me. It's on tape. I was coming out.

8 JOHN: Um-hum.

9 DAVID: Why did I quickly come back in?  
10 Because I was fired upon. Now, that creates a problem.

11 JOHN: Um-hum.

12 DAVID: A big one.

13 JOHN: Right, okay.

14 DAVID: We have, we have --

15 JOHN: But that's in the past and we have to  
16 address it in the future.

17 DAVID: Well, the present is now the future.  
18 We, we asked counsel since day one, you know, what if  
19 this happened --

20 JOHN: Right.

21 DAVID: -- to where the government who says  
22 in God we trust on the currency, the government who  
23 proposes a constitution, freedom of religion, freedom  
24 of state -- church and state separation, has barged in  
25 upon a religion at a time of religious service to, to

1 | impend upon us --

2 |           JOHN: Well, I thought your Sabbath was from  
3 | Friday sundown to Saturday sundown. So Sunday wasn't  
4 | your --

5 |           DAVID: That was the daily. Twice a  
6 | day -- you need to read Daniel and the Prophets about  
7 | the daily. Twice a day there's an ordination of  
8 | service called the daily. The Catholic Church calls it  
9 | the time of Communion.

10 |           JOHN: Yeah, but that can be at anytime  
11 | during the day.

12 |           DAVID: No, it's not. It says -- according  
13 | to being the sixth hour, which is basically, in our  
14 | time, between eight and nine and two and three.

15 |           JOHN: Okay.

16 |           DAVID: That's like the prophecy says --

17 |           JOHN: You know, I don't know about that.

18 |           DAVID: Well, read your Bible.

19 |           JOHN: Well, no, no. I'm talking about when  
20 | you can have communion, because I'm thinking of 5:30,  
21 | I'm talking about 6:30 in the morning.

22 |           DAVID: The Papacy changes it all around.  
23 | They do what they want to do, but the laws of God --

24 |           JOHN: But you wouldn't think of something  
25 | like that, would you, David?

1           DAVID: Well, it's just the laws of God tell  
2 you what time God wants it done, and the Papacy, like I  
3 say, they do what they want to do.

4           JOHN: I see.

5           DAVID: Either you go by the book or you go  
6 what you want to do. I mean, you know, you don't have  
7 to be a Christian, you don't have to be a Jew. You can  
8 be all kinds of religion. You can be Islamics, you can  
9 be Hindu, whatever. But irrespective, the agent knew  
10 what times we have our worship, our holy convocation.

11          JOHN: Um-hum.

12          DAVID: And the raid was planned to come and  
13 bust us at that time.

14          JOHN: Well, I don't know anything about that  
15 and I wasn't involved in any of that. My situation now  
16 is to talk to you and to resolve this matter, and,  
17 hopefully, I think you're doing the right thing by  
18 talking to your attorneys, trying to get all these  
19 little points ironed out.

20          DAVID: After a month later, finally.

21          JOHN: Well, there's a situation like this  
22 we're --

23          DAVID: And also --

24          JOHN: -- trying to -- we're going out of our  
25 way, which we normally don't do, to resolve this thing

1 mutually.

2           DAVID: I'm also glad to see that some of  
3 your agents around here are coming more out in the open  
4 and they're not just, you know, trying to hide all the  
5 time. And, like I say, our purpose was never to hurt  
6 anybody.

7           JOHN: Um-hum.

8           DAVID: You know, it took you a month to  
9 realize that we're not some kind of savage cultic type  
10 of people that are out just trying to grunge and kill  
11 the world. I mean, that's just not the way it is.

12           JOHN: I don't think that was ever an issue.  
13 I think the situation here is that you have a point  
14 that you want to argue and the best avenue to argue it  
15 or venue to argue it is in the, in the --

16           DAVID: Sure.

17           JOHN: -- court.

18           DAVID: Come and pin the, come and pin the  
19 crime on somebody --

20           JOHN: No.

21           DAVID: -- just out of hearsay and then make  
22 him go through judicial system, makes him pay thousands  
23 and thousands of dollars, that afterwards, afterwards  
24 where you have hundreds and hundreds of thousands, and  
25 afterwards when he's innocent, then all of a sudden you

1 | guys go well, he was an innocent guy. But who's got  
2 | all the money? Are you going to pay the bills?

3 |           JOHN: Well, a situation like that, I'm sure  
4 | that was addressed by your attorney. There are all  
5 | sorts of civil suits --

6 |           DAVID: Well, it just goes to, goes to show  
7 | our judicial system has flaws in it, doesn't it?

8 |           JOHN: Nothing's perfect. Law enforcement's  
9 | not a perfect science. And you know that and I know  
10 | that. As much as we'd like to have it be perfect, a  
11 | lot of times it isn't. However, in a situation like we  
12 | are in now --

13 |           DAVID: Did you know that there's a judicial  
14 | system that's, that's in heaven that's based upon a  
15 | jury of 24? Very clearly, in the Book of Revelation,  
16 | John says what must be hereafter is going to be a  
17 | judiciary of 24 elders. It took place already.

18 |           JOHN: Um-hum.

19 |           DAVID: And there's only one question in that  
20 | judiciary system. The question revolves around who is  
21 | willing to open a certain book with Seven Seals. Of  
22 | course, it says --

23 |           JOHN: Oh, are you going to pitch me on the  
24 | Seven Seals now?

25 |           DAVID: It says, it says when there's time no

1 | longer this mystery will be finished.

2 |           JOHN: Uh-huh.

3 |           DAVID: And it's already finished.

4 |           JOHN: I see.

5 |           DAVID: If people don't -- mankind doesn't  
6 | realize that by his neglect of research in regards to  
7 | the writings that have gone beforehand, such as the  
8 | prophetic writings of the apostles and the prophets. A  
9 | man who is negligent and ignorant of these things is  
10 | going to be punished because, you see, by rejecting  
11 | knowledge, Hosea says God will reject them.

12 |           JOHN: David, what are you going to do about  
13 | feeding those kids?

14 |           DAVID: Well, we're feeding the kids. It's  
15 | just they want some milk.

16 |           JOHN: The, the milk is out there, David.

17 |           DAVID: We gave you a thousand bucks. I gave  
18 | you a thousand American dollars.

19 |           JOHN: You gave me \$1,000? I don't know  
20 | anything about -- tell me more about this. I, I don't  
21 | --

22 |           DAVID: Well, in the beginning when I sent  
23 | the first set of kids out, I gave you \$1,000.

24 |           JOHN: Okay, you're right. I'm sorry.

25 |           DAVID: -- milk and everything.

1 JOHN: Yeah, I've been told -- all right.

2 DAVID: But to you guys, to you guys, you  
3 know, like I say, it's all a business. It's  
4 like --

5 JOHN: It's not a business.

6 DAVID: You know, (Indiscernible) restaurant,  
7 you know. It's like number five is a cheeseburger,  
8 number six is a burger without onions, number seven is  
9 --

10 JOHN: David, my, my wife's a kindergarten  
11 teacher and she's very concerned about the children in  
12 there. And I talked to her about it, and when Nicole,  
13 and I spoke with Rachel about this, these are some real  
14 serious problems. We're talking about developmentally  
15 impairing these children. These children are yours.  
16 And she's saying, this is my wife, doesn't he realize  
17 the social emotional damage, that he's scarring these  
18 kids for life?

19 DAVID: Well, damn you. Why don't you turn  
20 this music off on the outside out here? You know so  
21 much about social and physiological sciences and all  
22 that, buddy, what do you think you're doing?

23 JOHN: Hey, I'm not doing it.

24 DAVID: This is, -- wait a second, this is  
25 such a -- this is -- well, you and your commanders, --

1 | this is home for these children. They were born here.

2 |           JOHN: David, the situation --

3 |           DAVID: Wait a minute.

4 |           JOHN: -- is your responsibility because  
5 | you're the leader.

6 |           DAVID: You started the subject, you started  
7 | the subject. Now, listen to me.

8 |           JOHN: Okay, David, go ahead.

9 |           DAVID: Now, this is their surroundings.  
10 | They know these women, they know their mothers, they  
11 | know their father, they know their home, they know  
12 | their toys and their surroundings.

13 |           JOHN: Right. You're absolutely right,  
14 | 'cause the care and welfare are your responsibility.

15 |           DAVID: Exactly.

16 |           JOHN: And you're supposed to be -- but look  
17 | what you're subjecting these, these kids to --

18 |           DAVID: Look what you're --

19 |           JOHN: -- by not bringing them out, by you  
20 | not coming them out.

21 |           DAVID: Hey, man --

22 |           JOHN: David, how can you live with that?

23 |           DAVID: -- get real.

24 |           JOHN: I am being real, David. You're the  
25 | one -- and the way out there.



1           DAVID: Bring your children here.

2           JOHN: Hey, I would. Unfortunately, let me  
3 see, one's 24, the other's 22.

4           DAVID: You got me on that one.

5           JOHN: Yeah. This is going to work out.  
6 This is not a game, this type of thing, it's not a who  
7 got you, who can skunk each other. We're trying to  
8 resolve this situation here, David, and you know it and  
9 I know it. You know the right thing is that you guys  
10 have suffered enough in there. You've got to take  
11 these people out. It's just not going to be right.  
12 It's just not going the way it should be going for  
13 them.

14           DAVID: You seem to be blinded to a certain  
15 principle that's really the most evident of all.

16           JOHN: All right.

17           DAVID: And that is people have come from all  
18 around the world, educated people.

19           JOHN: Looking for a better life.

20           DAVID: No, no, no. It's not a purpose of  
21 looking for a better life. It's adhering to a fluent,  
22 intelligent, clear knowledge of what life pertains to  
23 in the realms of God.

24           JOHN: Do you think life is living like you  
25 guys are right now, for the last 30 days?

1           DAVID: Hey, do you think that Christ 2,000  
2 years ago came to live that life that he lived to be  
3 placed on record to be a mockery against those who  
4 comfort themselves in leisure of the world without the  
5 knowledge of God?

6           JOHN: I think God's --

7           DAVID: Do you think that mockery --

8           JOHN: -- last couple -- his last three years  
9 might have been a little touchy, but --

10          DAVID: -- mocking Christ?

11          JOHN: Say it again.

12          DAVID: You're mocking Christ.

13          JOHN: Uh-huh. How do you get --

14          DAVID: You're mocking -- you're --

15          JOHN: All right, I'll bite, how am I doing  
16 that?

17          DAVID: Well, first of all, by implying that  
18 our situation and circumstance is something that we  
19 have readily chosen to be. No, you turned it into  
20 that. We didn't turn it into that.

21          JOHN: Once the situation had started, you  
22 were given the option to take your people out and the  
23 children, everybody come on out and not subject them to  
24 what's going on in there now.

25          DAVID: Okay, now, wait a minute. Let's back

1 up now. You're completely correct. Now, here's the  
2 deal. So right off the bat, when I talked to  
3 Jim -- we called the cease fire. We called 911, we  
4 talked to Lance, we called the cease fire. We're the  
5 ones who called it that you might take and retrieve  
6 your wounded and we're the ones who asked in assistance  
7 that you would send some medical in here that we could  
8 have ours taken care of and --

9           JOHN: That's true, you're absolutely right.  
10 You did the right thing and you were on a roll. You  
11 were going in the right direction at that time.

12           DAVID: -- you, that is, I call you  
13 you -- I mean, I'd rather meet you somewhere going --

14           JOHN: Hey, absolutely.

15           DAVID: But now, but because we're on two  
16 sides --

17           JOHN: We're not on two sides, we're on the  
18 same side. We're trying to resolve this situation.

19           DAVID: Wait a minute, wait a minute. Now,  
20 let's, let's back up. Once you obtained that which is  
21 paid by the nation or by the government or by the  
22 system, retrieved its wounded and its dead, then all of  
23 a sudden you shut us out by saying we're not going to  
24 send a doctor in there, we're not going to pick up your  
25 dead. You all come out to us.

1 JOHN: Well, under the circumstances, I don't  
2 think that's out of the question.

3 DAVID: So I -- well, you lied. Now --

4 JOHN: Oh, no, no, no, no.

5 DAVID: I sent the children out because it  
6 was according to our purpose and --

7 JOHN: I think you did very well on that.  
8 You were making -- you were doing the right thing at  
9 the right time.

10 DAVID: Under certain conditions and  
11 promises.

12 JOHN: Okay.

13 DAVID: And those promises, as we say, were,  
14 were, were denied.

15 JOHN: Okay.

16 DAVID: And so then things began to back up  
17 to say now, wait a minute.

18 JOHN: David, why didn't you send all the  
19 children out?

20 DAVID: Why didn't I?

21 JOHN: Yeah.

22 DAVID: What do you think?

23 JOHN: I don't know. I think you were moving  
24 in the right direction. This is something -- if I were  
25 in your position, I would definitely want to get the

1 | women and children out. This is a man's type of thing.

2 |           DAVID: Oh, really?

3 |           JOHN: I wouldn't want to -- see, people are  
4 | saying you're hiding behind these children. I don't  
5 | think you're doing it, but that's what it appears to be  
6 | doing.

7 |           DAVID: This is a thing of guns and bombs and  
8 | blowing their asses up, boys.

9 |           JOHN: Nothing like that.

10 |           DAVID: We just kill those fuckers the first  
11 | time we went in there. Shit, let's go ahead and just  
12 | get the women and children out. We'll put them all in  
13 | jail and put the kids with foster parents and all that.  
14 | We'll go --

15 |           JOHN: Are you really hiding behind these  
16 | kids? I don't think you are, are you?

17 |           DAVID: No. You know I'm not. As a matter  
18 | of fact --

19 |           JOHN: By the way, you've got a very amazing  
20 | sense of humor, David.

21 |           DAVID: If you knew, if you knew what we  
22 | people here understood and what we know and the reason  
23 | why I even have these kids, you'd be shaking in your  
24 | boots.

25 |           JOHN: Well, you know, what I'm looking at

1 | here, David, is that you --

2 |           DAVID: You don't --

3 |           JOHN: -- sent out the kids that were -- not  
4 | your kids, the kids that didn't count. Is that what it  
5 | was? 'Cause you sent almost like the, oh, the -- huh?

6 |           DAVID: You want an answer to that?

7 |           JOHN: Yeah. I'm kind of curious, why?

8 |           DAVID: Well, how many parents came out?

9 |           JOHN: I don't know. I haven't got the  
10 | number.

11 |           DAVID: Of those kids?

12 |           JOHN: I'm not sure.

13 |           DAVID: Well, see, there's one, two. I guess  
14 | that's it, two.

15 |           JOHN: Um-hum.

16 |           DAVID: Now, one thing I kept telling you  
17 | over and over is you'll play back the tapes.

18 |           JOHN: What tapes?

19 |           DAVID: Is that every individual here that's  
20 | been a student of mine is an individual.

21 |           JOHN: Well, aren't -- isn't everybody in  
22 | there a student of yours?

23 |           DAVID: Well, definitely.

24 |           JOHN: Yeah, from newborn right on through?

25 |           DAVID: -- students, they're students who

{ 1 | adhere to the teachings of the teacher, who not only  
2 | become equivalent to the teacher but finally excel.  
3 | You know, graduation is far from their -- from  
4 | enlisting in a class. I mean, when you first start  
5 | ninth grade, it's different than when you're in ninth  
6 | grade, huh?

7 |           JOHN: You've got that right. David --

8 |           DAVID: Okay, so --

9 |           JOHN: -- are you keeping these kids in there  
10 | to keep us away? Is that what this is all about? This  
11 | is what -- my wife is saying this. Now, this is the  
12 | teacher's room saying -- the people out here are saying  
13 | you are keeping those kids in there because you're  
14 | afraid of us and that you want to keep --

{ 15 |           DAVID: Hey, if I, if I, if I was afraid of  
16 | you, we wouldn't be in this situation, would we?

17 |           JOHN: No, I don't think so. That's why I  
18 | understand, but I want you to --

19 |           DAVID: Hey --

20 |           JOHN: -- and the only way we're going to  
21 | resolve this with these other folks, a lot of them will  
22 | want to hear what you have to say, is for you to come  
23 | out of there, guy.

24 |           DAVID: Hey, look, there's no problem to  
( 25 | that, all right? Now, why don't you just simply sit  
(

1 | back, sit in your easy chair --

2 |           JOHN: I wish I had an easy chair. You ought  
3 | to see what I'm sitting in. You're probably sitting --  
4 | you're probably more comfortable than I am.

5 |           DAVID: I don't think so.

6 |           JOHN: But go ahead, what do you have to say?

7 |           DAVID: So, you know --

8 |           JOHN: The things with the kids, we can't  
9 | really let this go, guy, because you're being viewed as  
10 | some sort of an ogre that's hiding behind these kids.

11 |           DAVID: Well --

12 |           JOHN: I don't personally feel that you're  
13 | that way.

14 |           DAVID: My father will have to work that out,  
15 | won't he?

16 |           JOHN: Your father?

17 |           DAVID: Yeah.

18 |           JOHN: Upstair -- in heaven, you mean?

19 |           DAVID: There's so much you just don't  
20 | understand.

21 |           JOHN: Well, okay.

22 |           DAVID: We don't understand with our, with  
23 | our mouth talking, do we?

24 |           JOHN: I think we understand each other,  
25 | David.



1           DAVID: No, we don't. I understand you,  
2 where you're coming from.

3           JOHN: Um-hum.

4           DAVID: But you don't understand us and where  
5 we're coming from.

6           JOHN: Oh, I think I have a working knowledge  
7 of what you want to do. I think --

8           DAVID: A knowledge is, is quite off the  
9 foundation of where we're launched from. And, like I  
10 said, by trying to detach us from our religious views,  
11 you don't catch our vision.

12           JOHN: Well, I'm not trying to detach you  
13 from your religious views.

14           DAVID: Exactly. Exactly.

15           JOHN: I want you to take your religious  
16 views out with you and tell other people and share your  
17 message with other people out here. You're not getting  
18 anywhere where you're -- back there, David.

19           DAVID: Anyway, I think you need to grab your  
20 Bible, read Revelation 4 and 5 and learn a little bit  
21 of respect.

22           JOHN: Well, that's what I'm trying to do  
23 here, David.

24           DAVID: When you read Revelation --

25           JOHN: I'm trying to help you out.

1 DAVID: When you -- no, I'm trying to help  
2 you out.

3 JOHN: Okay, we're both trying to help each  
4 other out. I can accept that.

5 DAVID: Let me explain from what foundation  
6 I'm trying to help you out.

7 JOHN: Okay.

8 DAVID: Okay? Now, take heed to what I'm  
9 saying.

10 JOHN: Go ahead, I'm listening.

11 DAVID: Two thousand years, two thousand  
12 years is a pretty good while, isn't it?

13 JOHN: Go ahead.

14 DAVID: It's a good time for Rome to fall, to  
15 become Europe. Europe had a lot of strong nations, a  
16 lot of weak nations. Papal Rome ruled over Europe.  
17 The kings were subject to the Papacy for a long time,  
18 over 1500 years.

19 JOHN: Um-hum.

20 DAVID: And a lot of guys tried to talk  
21 against, like Hesterone (phonetic sp.), Tyndell, Wynert  
22 (phonetic sp.), all these different guys. They got  
23 their heads cut off, they got burned, they got  
24 tortured. You didn't talk against the Papacy at one  
25 time.

1 JOHN: Um-hum.

2 DAVID: But there was finally one old guy  
3 named Martin Luther. He finally wrote these theses up  
4 and he says hey, wait a minute, the scripture says one  
5 thing and our catechism teaches another.

6 JOHN: Reformation sit-in, right?

7 DAVID: And being brought before the councils  
8 and all that, certain lawyers and certain educated men  
9 looked back and says wait a minute, this guy's got some  
10 points here. And over the next few years, between 1530  
11 and the 16th Century, a lot of things changed.

12 JOHN: Um-hum.

13 DAVID: But the next couple hundred years,  
14 and by 1798, somehow, some way that strongest political  
15 power that was ruled by that -- what amounted to -- was  
16 overthrown by -- Europe --

17 JOHN: David, this isn't one of your stump  
18 speeches, is it?

19 DAVID: No, this is, this is history.

20 JOHN: Okay.

21 DAVID: Don't you have respect for American  
22 history?

23 JOHN: Hey, way back when. I think it  
24 touches both bases. This isn't only American. I think  
25 we drifted across and talking about Romans and a few

1 | other folks.

2 |           DAVID: No, no, no, no, no. See, you've got  
3 | to remember America consisted of Europe.

4 |           JOHN: All right.

5 |           DAVID: America is a bleed-out of Europe.

6 |           JOHN: Okay.

7 |           DAVID: The forefathers are all European.

8 |           JOHN: Um-hum.

9 |           DAVID: And they came over to this nation  
10 | because they got tired of the tyranny of the church  
11 | state, religio-political confederation. And so what  
12 | happened was was that when they finally found out the  
13 | freedom of mind and freedom of thought and freedom of  
14 | expression, technology came into being.

15 |           JOHN: Um-hum.

16 |           DAVID: So the forefathers came over here and  
17 | they built a nation. They had some problems and stuff  
18 | here and there, but finally the states began to  
19 | develop. Still, every problem -- beginning was  
20 | religion, the Quakers and the Shakers and the, you  
21 | know --

22 |           JOHN: Right.

23 |           DAVID: -- all the witch hunts and all that  
24 | kind of stuff. The usual stuff. Still a lot of that  
25 | European tradition came in, you know, if it's not like

1 | what we think, then we want to do something about it.  
2 | That's fine. They finally developed and we finally got  
3 | 50 states and we've got a wonderful Congress going and  
4 | all this and legislation and more legislation and more  
5 | control and more control. But, nonetheless, church and  
6 | state has primarily been separated, but by 1929,  
7 | something in Europe happened, a devastating event  
8 | happened. The Vatican was given back its political  
9 | power.

10 |           JOHN: Okay. You know, we talked a little  
11 | bit about this. Let me just interject one thought,  
12 | okay? May I?

13 |           DAVID: How'd that happen, do you think?

14 |           JOHN: Well, what I'm concerned about here,  
15 | again, listening to what you were saying and listening  
16 | to everything that was going on here, I'm concerned  
17 | about the kids again, 'cause what leads to one thing  
18 | leads to another. When I asked you why you didn't send  
19 | out the kids, you said essentially that if I did that  
20 | you, you guys would come in and get us.

21 |           DAVID: I didn't say that.

22 |           JOHN: This implies that you're keeping the  
23 | kids --

24 |           DAVID: I didn't say that.

25 |           JOHN: -- for your own protection.

1           DAVID: I never said that. I never said  
2 that.

3           JOHN: This is what is sounded like to me,  
4 old man.

5           DAVID: That's what you're saying.

6           JOHN: No. You tell me --

7           DAVID: This is what we call punk talk.

8           JOHN: No, I don't do punk talk.

9           DAVID: Yeah. Well, punk talk is where you  
10 try to antagonize a person with statements about his  
11 mother, statement about his wife, statement about his  
12 kids.

13           JOHN: We don't try to -- no, that's not our  
14 game. That serves no purpose. Our purpose is to have  
15 two rational conversations blending into two minds,  
16 getting into one and resolving this issue. By heating  
17 you up or heating me up, it resolves nothing. Don't  
18 you agree with that?

19           DAVID: Well, I never get heated up, but  
20 here's what --

21           JOHN: Oh, I know that you -- ohhh, gee, I'm  
22 glad you told me that one.

23           DAVID: Well, John, I mean, I mean, certainly  
24 --

25           JOHN: David, you're a good guy and I kind of

1 | enjoy what you're saying here.

2 |           DAVID: Hey, John, let me, let me state this.

3 |           JOHN: Go ahead.

4 |           DAVID: If we'd been heated up, if we'd  
5 | actually been, you know, anything else but informed and  
6 | concerned about God and the welfare of man, you know,  
7 | the damage that had been done would have been far more  
8 | extensive than what happened.

9 |           JOHN: David --

10 |           DAVID: You have to realize that we love  
11 | souls and we love people.

12 |           JOHN: Yeah, I'd love to talk to you more  
13 | about the 28th, you know, what happened on that, but I  
14 | can't, okay?

15 |           DAVID: Hey, for your convenience, I mean,  
16 | come on, stop trying to push away the fact of what got  
17 | all this stuff started.

18 |           JOHN: You know it and I know it and we have  
19 | to just shelve that.

20 |           DAVID: Well, you can't just shelve --

21 |           JOHN: That'll be dealt with at another time  
22 | and another place. It's not our position.

23 |           DAVID: You walk in here and punch me in the  
24 | nose and break my nose and afterwards you say look,  
25 | okay, look, David, let's forget about me punching you

1 | in the nose, let's just talk about what I wanted to  
2 | talk about before I punched you.

3 |           JOHN: Okay.

4 |           DAVID: And I'm going look, oh, what do you  
5 | mean?

6 |           JOHN: It isn't that I don't want to talk  
7 | about that, David. It's not the time, all right?  
8 | Later on I want you to sit down and -- with your  
9 | attorney or whatever, you can tell me all about it.  
10 | That's fine. I don't want you to get into that stuff  
11 | without your attorney, all right? That's -- basically,  
12 | it's to protect you. Understand that?

13 |           DAVID: Um-hum.

14 |           JOHN: Okay. That's where we are right now.  
15 | So in a situation along this line, what we're concerned  
16 | of is you coming out here. Now, you've met with your  
17 | attorney. We said this -- we talked about this before,  
18 | but I still have -- we're still going around and around  
19 | and I'm still trying to nail down -- we're talking  
20 | about Passover. It's going to be after Passover you're  
21 | planning on coming out now?

22 |           STEVE: This is Steve, you know?

23 |           JOHN: Steve. He passed you off. My God.  
24 | Okay, Steve, same question to you. When --

25 |           STEVE: It's the Sabbath.



1 JOHN: It's the Sabbath.

2 STEVE: I'm not going to be talking with the  
3 attorneys and all that, but I'll do the same as he,  
4 I'll talk about the spiritual issues. I want you to  
5 live forever, John.

6 JOHN: Hey.

7 STEVE: I really do.

8 JOHN: This tired old out body, I don't know  
9 if I can handle that.

10 STEVE: Yeah, well, especially for that  
11 reason.

12 JOHN: Steve, it's the Sabbath, right?

13 STEVE: Yeah.

14 JOHN: And you're concerned about it and you  
15 want to go back and do some -- are you in a prayer  
16 group now or whatever?

17 STEVE: No. Actually, we're just going to  
18 get together and just -- someone was going to read a  
19 little bit, a few passages.

20 JOHN: Um-hum.

21 STEVE: Can't have everybody together at one  
22 time and place, of course.

23 JOHN: Steve, I'd dearly love to have you  
24 come on out with us. We could grab a couple of beers  
25 and some -- peel back some shrimp or something like

1 | that.

2 |           STEVE: Hey, well, would you want to come in  
3 | and visit for maybe six hours out of a day? I mean,  
4 | seriously, you'd be as safe as the attorneys.

5 |           JOHN: I'll tell you what do, I'd come in if  
6 | you guys would come out with me.

7 |           STEVE: Well, it depends upon -- Well, yeah,  
8 | time. You could come in for a couple days or a week or  
9 | whatever. I don't know, just, you know, it has to do  
10 | with the spiritual, of course.

11 |           JOHN: Yeah. Well, I'm more interested in  
12 | having you guys come out and we'll sit down and chat.

13 |           STEVE: I'm more interested in making sure  
14 | that I'm right and straight on with, with all the will  
15 | of God based on the book.

16 |           JOHN: Um-hum. Okay.

17 |           STEVE: I know, I know there's no way in the  
18 | world to ever get a person like yourself to sit down  
19 | and really look at the issues. I guess it doesn't  
20 | bother you in wondering how you got here, where you're  
21 | going and your life could end any day and what happens  
22 | in this world.

23 |           JOHN: Ah, Steve, that's all been addressed  
24 | on that.

25 |           STEVE: These 6,000 years and this world is

1 getting worse and worse. The environment is ruined,  
2 the soil, the air, the water --

3 JOHN: Sound like something out of the new  
4 age here.

5 STEVE: -- the ozone layer and -- no, I  
6 didn't -- I'm looking by observation --

7 JOHN: Steve --

8 STEVE: -- what I can see.

9 JOHN: Okay. Have you given it some thought  
10 about these kids, like we talked about before David got  
11 on?

12 STEVE: He did a very good job explaining to  
13 you exactly the picture.

14 JOHN: Were you present when he was --

15 STEVE: Yeah, I was, the whole time.

16 JOHN: Okay.

17 STEVE: I sat right next to him.

18 JOHN: He does -- I'm listening to what he's  
19 saying and I can understand what he's saying. However,  
20 that's not going to sweep away the reality of him  
21 having to come back here or come out here and face up  
22 to what's going on. Not only he and you and the rest  
23 of the gang --

24 STEVE: John, I'd do anything in this world  
25 for you. I'd actually give you all my money.

1 JOHN: You don't have any money, Steve. You  
2 gave it all up.

3 STEVE: That's true.

4 JOHN: So that's, that's a big hunk of what,  
5 a big hunk of --

6 STEVE: I've got, I've got a lot of money.

7 JOHN: Uh-huh.

8 STEVE: I'm loaded.

9 JOHN: Uh-huh, right.

10 STEVE: I've got at least five bucks in my  
11 pocket here.

12 JOHN: It doesn't get much better than that.  
13 Okay, Steve, look, why don't you guys think about this,  
14 all right? Think about it hard, about the kids. Look  
15 around --

16 STEVE: Are you going to be on tomorrow night  
17 at this time?

18 JOHN: Absolutely, Steve.

19 STEVE: I'll be talking to you.

20 JOHN: Okay, old man. You take it easy and  
21 have a Sabbath, but think about what's happening in  
22 there, guy.

23 STEVE: Okay.

24 JOHN: It ain't going to get any better.

25 STEVE: Okay.

2 STEVE: Okay, take care, John.  
3 JOHN: Right on.  
4 STEVE: Talk to you later.  
5 JOHN: Bye bye.

21 |           STEVE: Okay.

22 |           JOHN: But we know that doesn't always  
23 | happen.

24 |           STEVE: All right.

25 |           (Pause)

1 JOHN: Okay. Just have him come on out the  
2 front door, turn left, and that's the Bradley that'll  
3 meet him.

4 STEVE: Okay.

5 JOHN: And they'll give him directions as  
6 he's walking down towards it.

7 STEVE: Okay. So just in a few minutes here  
8 or --

9 JOHN: Right now.

10 STEVE: Right now?

11 JOHN: He can go out right now.

12 STEVE: Okay, just a minute.

13 JOHN: And you want to stay on till you see  
14 what happens? Or till he's out the door?

15 STEVE: I'll just give you a call right back.

16 JOHN: Okay.

17 STEVE: Okay.

18 JOHN: That's fine.

19 STEVE: Talk to you in a bit, John.

20 JOHN: Thanks.

21 STEVE: Bye.

22 \* \* \* \* \*

23 STEVE: Hello, John?

24 JOHN: Yes, sir?

25 STEVE: Yeah, he's on his way.



1 JOHN: Okay.

2 STEVE: I think -- it looked like, 'cause  
3 some of the people were looking out the window, it  
4 appears like we've got a little white dog and he  
5 followed him out there. Would those guys have stuck  
6 him in the back of the Bradley?

7 JOHN: Stuck who in the back of the Bradley?

8 STEVE: Our dog.

9 JOHN: I really doubt it.

10 STEVE: You really doubt it?

11 JOHN: Yeah. I mean I don't -- I have no  
12 idea why they --

13 STEVE: He says he has no --

14 JOHN: Who would want a dog?

15 STEVE: Huh?

16 JOHN: I have no idea why they would want a  
17 dog.

18 STEVE: Why they'd want a -- yeah, I know,  
19 because the others have been running around here, also,  
20 so --

21 JOHN: Sure.

22 STEVE: -- that makes sense to me.

23 JOHN: Yeah, I understand that's -- that was  
24 some of the problem on the phone line, huh? Some of  
25 the dogs ate up the phone line?

1 STEVE: Huh? Yeah, one of them might have  
2 chewed on it, 'cause it was a little bit frayed,  
3 yesterday when it was -- it went -- was that today or  
4 yesterday? I'm losing track of time.

5 JOHN: Sometime during the night or whatever.

6 STEVE: Yeah, that was this morning. That's  
7 right.

8 JOHN: Yeah.

9 STEVE: That's right.

10 JOHN: Well, Louis isn't considering coming  
11 out, too, huh?

12 STEVE: He's studying it. He wants to know  
13 more things. He's got --

14 JOHN: Okay.

15 STEVE: -- a lot of questions.

16 JOHN: -- I was just curious.

17 STEVE: Yeah.

18 JOHN: 'Cause I know he, he was in there a  
19 little longer than this fellow.

20 STEVE: Yeah, he was.

21 JOHN: This fellow must have been a quick  
22 learner.

23 STEVE: Not so much. He, he heard quite a  
24 bit and he says okay, thanks. He says I delivered my  
25 message about God and --

1 JOHN: That was all, huh?

2 STEVE: Yeah, that was it.

3 JOHN: Well --

4 STEVE: So -- I mean, he was, you know, he  
5 was genuinely liking people and everything --

6 JOHN: Yeah.

7 STEVE: -- and had concern but he's  
8 definitely totally, completely harmless as far as, I  
9 mean, the thing goes.

10 JOHN: He's now our problem. Is that what  
11 you're trying to say?

12 STEVE: Well, no, he's, he's a person that --  
13 he's got, I guess, his ideas about God, religion, life  
14 --

15 JOHN: Yeah.

16 STEVE: -- and, you know. He wanted to bring  
17 peace, he said.

18 JOHN: Well --

19 STEVE: And he sees that peace is working  
20 out, you know. He saw the attorneys come and he said  
21 so his mission's fulfilled.

22 JOHN: Yeah.

23 STEVE: He just wanted to see things end real  
24 good and --

25 JOHN: Yeah.

1 STEVE: -- that's mainly what he was telling  
2 us. So we says okay.

3 JOHN: Well, I'm glad you had -- you and  
4 David both had a chance to, to talk to your lawyers.

5 STEVE: Yeah. Yeah, it was -- we spent a  
6 little time with them today.

7 JOHN: That's great.

8 STEVE: Yeah.

9 JOHN: That's great, 'cause everything I've  
10 heard, these are two pretty honorable guys.

11 STEVE: Well, that's -- yeah.

12 JOHN: Good reputations.

13 STEVE: Seems that way, from what I  
14 understand.

15 JOHN: But Louis is still learning, huh?

16 STEVE: Yeah, he's still learning.

17 (Laughter.)

18 STEVE: He, he, I guess, didn't learn enough  
19 at the church he was at, so he says he wants to know  
20 more.

21 JOHN: Well, that's good.

22 STEVE: So --

23 JOHN: That's good. Everything else --

24 STEVE: You want, you want to talk to him,  
25 John, or --

1 JOHN: Who, Louis?

2 STEVE: Yeah.

3 JOHN: Sure. I don't mind.

4 STEVE: Okay, just a minute.

5 JOHN: Sure.

6 STEVE: Louis.

7 LOUIS: Hello, John.

8 JOHN: Hey, how are you?

9 LOUIS: I'm doing just fine, sir. And how  
10 are you today?

11 JOHN: Great, great.

12 LOUIS: Good. And how may I help you today?

13 JOHN: Oh, I just -- when I was talking to  
14 Steve and he was telling me that Jesse was coming out,  
15 I just asked him if, if you were coming out, too.  
16 Obviously, Jesse was a quick learner.

17 LOUIS: Well --

18 JOHN: 'Cause you got in there before he did,  
19 and he said no, no, no.

20 LOUIS: Well, what happened was --

21 JOHN: That you're still -- you're learning?

22 LOUIS: Well, what happened was the teachings  
23 in which I was being taught before Jesse got there, we  
24 had to reverse and go back over everything.

25 JOHN: Uh-huh.

1           LOUIS: And right now -- and I'm just at the  
2 Third Seal that I have knowledge of and there are still  
3 four more left to go. And I've been trying to learn  
4 this in churches and nobody has the knowledge to teach  
5 me this, and I finally found a place that, you know --  
6 they're not doing anything wrong to me, you know.

7           JOHN: Well, that's good. That's good.

8           LOUIS: They're treating me fine, you know.  
9 I'm in one room, more or less, to my bathroom and back,  
10 but, you know, that's pretty good, you know. They are  
11 nice people and, you know, they've been feeding me well  
12 and I've been bathing, I've been clothed, you know,  
13 they've been working with me. And the best part about  
14 it is that they're actually teaching me the Bible.

15           JOHN: Well, that's good. That's good.  
16 That's encouraging.

17           LOUIS: And that's the only thing I really  
18 wanted to know. See, I came over here in the first  
19 place 'cause I thought that somebody was around here,  
20 you know, that this religion -- I didn't know what it  
21 was and I, you know, I kept on hearing people talk bad  
22 about them. And I had to check out for myself because,  
23 you know, I'm not the one to judge people unless I know  
24 them.

25           JOHN: Yeah, yeah.

1           LOUIS: What I did is, you know, they said  
2 they was teaching the Bible and I wanted to know. God  
3 sent me here and it was like -- from everything which  
4 I've read out of the King James Bible, I mean, it just  
5 corresponds with everything and it's wonderful.

6           JOHN: Well, that's good. That's good. I'm  
7 glad to hear that you're, you're learning something in  
8 there and it's productive.

9           LOUIS: Yeah, they're keeping me safe.

10          JOHN: That's good.

11          LOUIS: Even though --

12          JOHN: You're, you're up to the Third Seal  
13 now?

14          LOUIS: I'm up to the Third Seal now.

15          JOHN: You've got a little ways to go.

16          LOUIS: Yeah. Even though at nighttime it's  
17 kind of hard to sleep with all these weird sounds. It  
18 reminds me back in Louisiana with the chickens crowing  
19 and I kind of just like --

20          JOHN: Well, at least the nutria don't make a  
21 lot of noise back there, huh?

22          LOUIS: Well, well, true. It's like I'm  
23 getting paid back for not feeding the chickens on time.

24          JOHN: You've got it.

25          LOUIS: I mean, it's like, I mean, if this is

1 one of the things I've got to go through, you  
2 know --

3 JOHN: Listen, Steve and David have told me  
4 that the noise at night is soothing. It doesn't bother  
5 them at all.

6 LOUIS: Well, at times, yeah.

7 JOHN: You just, you just have to get used to  
8 it.

9 LOUIS: Yeah, I reckon so. They've been here  
10 a lot longer than I have and --

11 JOHN: Yeah. Haven't we all?

12 LOUIS: I'll be here for a while, I guess.

13 JOHN: Yeah.

14 LOUIS: 'Cause, you know, there's a lot of  
15 the Bible that a lot of these preachers and teachers  
16 that I've been talking to you since, you know, I was a  
17 child, has, has not been able to show me anything that I  
18 can actually hold onto.

19 JOHN: Well, you may not be there as long as  
20 you think. Apparently, David indicated to, to -- at  
21 least to his lawyer that he'd be coming out after  
22 Passover. So it won't be too much longer.

23 LOUIS: Well, I'm hoping I can obtain all the  
24 knowledge by then.

25 JOHN: I hope you can.



1           LOUIS: Like I say, man, you have a good  
2 group of people here.

3           JOHN: Well, that's good.

4           LOUIS: You've got people from all over the  
5 world and it's like their love in their heart is  
6 genuine, you know.

7           JOHN: Uh-huh.

8           LOUIS: And even the little kids that I've  
9 seen, I mean, they're just -- it's a wonderful group.

10          JOHN: Well, I've seen them on video and they  
11 look like beautiful kids, and the ones that have come  
12 out have been --

13          LOUIS: Only thing that --

14          JOHN: -- nice children.

15          LOUIS: Only thing I ask is that I wish you  
16 would have took the chance to get to know them before  
17 you all honestly took action.

18          JOHN: Hey --

19          LOUIS: You know?

20          JOHN: -- we can't turn around what happened  
21 on the 28th of February, can we?

22          LOUIS: You can't turn that around, exactly.

23          JOHN: No. I wasn't here on the 28th of  
24 February. I was here on the 1st of March.

25          LOUIS: Yeah, well --

1 JOHN: Can't turn any of that around.  
2 LOUIS: Well, I just wish you a good day --  
3 JOHN: Okay.  
4 LOUIS: -- and, you know, you have a good one  
5 and --  
6 JOHN: You bet. Steve still there?  
7 LOUIS: Yeah, he's here.  
8 JOHN: Okay. You be good now.  
9 LOUIS: You too, sir. Bye-bye.  
10 JOHN: Um-hum.  
11 STEVE: Hello?  
12 JOHN: Hey. Sounds like he's doing all  
13 right.  
14 STEVE: Yeah, he seems to be.  
15 JOHN: That's good, that's good. You doing  
16 okay?  
17 STEVE: Yeah, I'm doing fine.  
18 JOHN: Fine.  
19 STEVE: I'm fine.  
20 JOHN: Fine.  
21 STEVE: What I need to do is start looking  
22 over a lot of information that the attorneys dropped  
23 off and make some decisions and try to -- you know,  
24 they had their different things all stated and there  
25 were some --

1 JOHN: Yeah.

2 STEVE: -- discrepancies, so I want to go  
3 over it and raise the questions. They always want  
4 quick answers, but, of course, to digest anything  
5 you've got to really take a little time and go over all  
6 the finer points.

7 JOHN: And find out how deep your pockets  
8 are?

9 STEVE: Exactly. You've got that right.  
10 You've got that right. So I'm trying to work it out  
11 and figure out just how this is to be done and  
12 I --

13 JOHN: Just tell them to have faith in the  
14 Lord, like you do.

15 STEVE: Oh, we went and tried that all day  
16 long.

17 JOHN: It's kind of tough to discuss that  
18 with a lawyer, though, isn't it?

19 STEVE: Yeah, this is true. This is true. I  
20 don't think that's ever something that they really  
21 think about a lot.

22 JOHN: No.

23 STEVE: So, well, I'm going to get going  
24 here.

25 JOHN: Okay. Listen, if you --

1 STEVE: Yeah.  
2 JOHN: If you need us this evening --  
3 STEVE: Okay.  
4 JOHN: -- just give us a call.  
5 STEVE: Give you a call. Will do.  
6 JOHN: Okay.  
7 STEVE: Okay, thanks, John.  
8 JOHN: You bet.  
9 STEVE: Goodbye.  
10 JOHN: Bye-bye.  
11 \* \* \* \* \*  
12 (Dial tone.)  
13 JOHN: Hello? Hello? Hello? Hello?  
14 DICK: Yeah, is that you, John?  
15 JOHN: Yes.  
16 DICK: Good.  
17 JOHN: Who's this?  
18 DICK: Whoops. Wrong gentleman. Is this  
19 Joe?  
20 JOHN: No, this is John. Who's this.  
21 DICK: John. I've got the wrong number.  
22 JOHN: Who, who is this?  
23 DICK: This is Dick Getzy (phonetic sp.)  
24 JOHN: Oh, Dick. What are you, testing the  
25 line?

1 DICK: Yeah.

2 JOHN: Oh, okay.

3 DICK: Yeah, that's not it either. Geez.  
4 We've just got a phone number. We don't know what the  
5 phone number is. Okay, we'll keep trying.

6 JOHN: This is the line to the compound,  
7 buddy.

8 DICK: All right.

9 JOHN: All right.

10 DICK: Bye.

11 JOHN: Okey doke.

12 \* \* \* \* \*

13 JOHN: Hello? Hello? Anyone there? Hello?  
14 Somebody's -- Hello? Hello? It's your dime.  
15 Nothing.

16 \* \* \* \* \*

17 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: -- doing here?  
18 Okay, now I'm on. Hello? Hello? This is a dead line.  
19 They're on, I think, but I'm not getting anything on  
20 this line. Hello? You've got a dead line. Did it  
21 ring yet? I think they picked up, but I'm not getting  
22 anything on here.

23 \* \* \* \* \*

24 (Dial tone.)

25 STEVE: Hello?

1 JOHN-4: Who's this?

2 STEVE: This is Steve. Who am I --

3 JOHN-4: Steve, this is John, John-4.

4 STEVE: Okay.

5 JOHN-4: Okay. I just needed to check and  
6 make sure the phone was working today.

7 STEVE: Yeah.

8 JOHN-4: We'll probably do that between 9:15  
9 and 9:30. How about, how about --

10 STEVE: Our worship is -- because they  
11 switched the time, it's now between actually 9 and 10.

12 JOHN-4: Oh, it is?

13 STEVE: Yeah.

14 JOHN-4: All right. How about, say, 8:45?

15 STEVE: That'd be fine.

16 JOHN-4: Okay. How about -- so we make sure  
17 both ends work, how about if you call me?

18 STEVE: I'll try to do that.

19 JOHN-4: Between 8:30 and 8:45, okay?

20 STEVE: Okay.

21 JOHN-4: Let me ask you a question while I've  
22 got you here for a minute. Have you got dates for us  
23 on Passover, so we can give you some consideration?

24 STEVE: I, I don't. See, what happens is it  
25 always goes by, like, the, the sliver of the new moon,

1 I mean where it's barely seen, and we suspected it to  
2 be Tuesday night, but it was cloudy so we never could  
3 see or tell. So we kept it as from Tuesday sundown to  
4 Wednesday sundown. And, normally, Passover then would  
5 be the same, but we're not certain. So we've been  
6 trying to really look and check to make sure that --  
7 but it's either Tuesday night or Wednesday night.

8 JOHN-4: Okay. So that's, that's tonight?

9 STEVE: Yeah, it's tonight or tomorrow night.  
10 I'm not certain.

11 JOHN-4: Okay. And it, and it runs how many  
12 days, Steve?

13 STEVE: Seven days.

14 JOHN-4: Okay. So starting tomorrow night  
15 for seven days?

16 STEVE: Right.

17 JOHN-4: Okay. How's everything going in  
18 there?

19 STEVE: Everything's going fine.

20 JOHN-4: Okay.

21 STEVE: Other than, you know, I mean, some of  
22 those that like have wounds and so forth, but they've  
23 having some, you know, pain and that type thing. But I  
24 guess it's expected.

25 JOHN-4: Well, you know, when we get this

1 | thing resolved, they'll be taken care of first thing.

2 |           STEVE: Right. Okay, well, I'll be, I'll be  
3 | talking to you probably later.

4 |           JOHN-4: Okay. Give me a call anytime.

5 |           STEVE: Sure.

6 |           JOHN-4: All right.

7 |           STEVE: Okay, bye.

8 |           JOHN-4: Bye-bye.

9 |                           \* \* \* \* \*

10 |           UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Hello. May I  
11 | speak with Kelly Tremont?

12 |           UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Kelly Tremont,  
13 | huh? No, I'm sorry, you have the wrong number.

14 |           UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Sorry to bother  
15 | you, sir.

16 |           UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Okay.

17 |           UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Goodbye.

18 |                           \* \* \* \* \*

19 |           (Telephone ringing.)

20 |           UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: This is their  
21 | holy time, I think.

22 |           (Telephone still ringing.)

23 |           (Voices in background not discernible.)

24 |           (Telephone still ringing.)

25 |           UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Fifteen times.



1 (Telephone still ringing.)

2 STEVE: Hello? Steve here. Who am I  
3 speaking with?

4 DICK: Steve, this is Dick. How are you  
5 doing?

6 STEVE: This is Jack?

7 DICK: Dick.

8 STEVE: Dick. Oh, Dick.

9 DICK: Yeah. How are you doing?

10 STEVE: Not too bad. How's yourself, Dick?

11 DICK: Well, hanging in there.

12 STEVE: Are you hanging in there?

13 DICK: Yes.

14 STEVE: Have you had a vacation recently?

15 DICK: Well, I kind of skipped out Saturday  
16 and Sunday.

17 STEVE: Oh, you did?

18 DICK: And so I got away from Waco for a  
19 couple of days.

20 STEVE: Did you call, by any chance?

21 DICK: Yes, we did. The reason we called in,  
22 Steve, is that we're just trying to kind of set up a  
23 time if you could -- would it be any problem for you to  
24 call us around six, just kind of a -- for a phone  
25 check, so we can make sure these lines are --

1 STEVE: Six in the evening?

2 DICK: Yes, sir. Some, some sort of -- yeah,  
3 I think the day shift had asked that you all call in in  
4 the morning. Just so we, we know the lines are not  
5 messed up --

6 STEVE: Yeah.

7 DICK: -- in case the attorneys call or  
8 whatever.

9 STEVE: Right. I spoke with John-4 and he  
10 asked me to call him somewhere around like maybe 8:45  
11 or something like that, and I told him I could do that.

12 DICK: Okay. How about around six in the  
13 evening?

14 STEVE: Yeah, I could do that.

15 DICK: Okay. Just, just so we can touch base  
16 and make sure these lines don't get --

17 STEVE: Yeah. This morning when I was --

18 DICK: -- messed up.

19 STEVE: -- when I was giving them a time for  
20 Passover, I forgot to mention to him the problem lies  
21 in communication with that. The reckoning of the Bible  
22 for time -- see, like Wednesday actually starts for us  
23 tonight when the sun goes down. So that's, that's  
24 actually when the Passover is, until the sun goes down  
25 tomorrow.

1 DICK: Okay.

2 STEVE: So if you ever look at the Genesis  
3 Chapter 1, it starts with the night portion of that 24-  
4 hours period as the first part of a day.

5 DICK: That's -- you're starting at sundown  
6 today?

7 STEVE: Yeah. When the sun goes down, that  
8 means that's Wednesday. And, at the same time, that's  
9 when the Passover begins. David wanted me to also ask  
10 -- it's a very extremely serious thing for us, and he  
11 was asking that they play no sounds or music in that  
12 24-hour period.

13 DICK: Between now and --

14 STEVE: Yeah.

15 DICK: -- Wednesday?

16 STEVE: Yeah, between now and when the sun  
17 goes down tomorrow at this time.

18 DICK: Yeah. I'll have to check on that,  
19 Steve. I'll, you know, I don't have any --

20 STEVE: He mentioned, you know --

21 DICK: -- sort of authority there.

22 STEVE: No, I know. He said if there's a lot  
23 of good Catholics there, even if they checked with the  
24 Pope, they would know how important certain, certain  
25 things are. You know, I mean, certain days --

1 DICK: Okay.

2 STEVE: -- are to even -- to other Christians  
3 and so forth.

4 DICK: Okay. Let, let me ask you if I --  
5 now, starting now until --

6 STEVE: Well, when the sun, when the sun goes  
7 down, which would be -- what is it, about 8:00 maybe  
8 now?

9 DICK: Yeah, it's at least a quarter till 8  
10 or 8:00.

11 STEVE: Yeah, somewhere in there.

12 DICK: All right. And then is that, is that  
13 seven days or are we talking one day?

14 STEVE: One day.

15 DICK: Okay.

16 STEVE: Yeah.

17 DICK: All right. Sundown tonight till  
18 sundown Wednesday?

19 STEVE: Right.

20 DICK: Okay. All right. And where does that  
21 leave us then, after Wednesday sundown?

22 STEVE: Well, like, like I was telling John-4  
23 today, and I think the attorneys went out to let, to  
24 let them know, too, then the rest of the days are  
25 called unleavened bread for seven days. It's the

1 | eighth day is where it actually ends.

2 |           DICK: Okay.

3 |           STEVE: So during that time, we even have a  
4 | different kind of meals and everything else.

5 |           DICK: Okay.

6 |           STEVE: Yeah.

7 |           DICK: So what exactly is that day? I don't  
8 | have a calendar in front of me here.

9 |           STEVE: Do you know I don't, either. And  
10 | it's actually eight days later after tomorrow is when  
11 | it ends. Or, in fact, an important day or part of that  
12 | would be Sunday. It's all given in the Book of  
13 | Leviticus, like Chapter 23 and --

14 |           DICK: Okay, we're talking --

15 |           STEVE: -- other chapters.

16 |           DICK: -- talking eight days after sundown  
17 | tomorrow, not sundown tonight?

18 |           STEVE: I believe so.

19 |           DICK: Okay. All right. Well, I'll have to  
20 | look at a calendar when I get a chance.

21 |           STEVE: I'm not sure, either. I'm going to  
22 | have to grab one myself. I actually -- Because, you  
23 | know, it's funny, but being here morning, noon, and  
24 | night, the days start running one into another. That's  
25 | why I've got to stop, and I haven't, the truth is, even

1 | really looked at it. I, I do know --

2 |           DICK: Okay.

3 |           STEVE: -- that they've been talking about  
4 | this day being it, but there's times I think that some  
5 | days are Sundays or Saturdays. You know, you get all  
6 | messed up with time being in a building for a month.

7 |           DICK: Okay. All right. Would -- I'll just  
8 | make a note of that, that --

9 |           STEVE: All right.

10 |           DICK: -- Passover begins sundown tonight,  
11 | ends sundown tomorrow, which is Wednesday evening, and  
12 | then you have eight days of unleavened bread.

13 |           STEVE: I believe so.

14 |           DICK: Or is it seven days?

15 |           STEVE: Seven days.

16 |           DICK: Seven?

17 |           STEVE: Seven days.

18 |           DICK: Okay. So, all totaled, we're talking  
19 | eight days then?

20 |           STEVE: Yeah.

21 |           DICK: Okay. All right.

22 |           STEVE: And then it's -- that's it.

23 |           DICK: All right. Well, would a call in  
24 | tomorrow sometime after sundown?

25 |           STEVE: Yes, it actually would be.

1 DICK: Just -- oh, just for a phone check.

2 STEVE: Right.

3 DICK: We've had trouble with the lines  
4 before.

5 STEVE: What I might even do, maybe I can  
6 call you even tonight just before like maybe -- what  
7 time do you have there? Do you have a time right  
8 there?

9 DICK: Yeah, I've got --

10 STEVE: I left my watch off.

11 DICK: -- six -- well, this would count now  
12 just -- we know the line's working since we're  
13 talking --

14 STEVE: All right.

15 DICK: -- to each other. And I know we've  
16 had trouble before.

17 STEVE: If those attorneys for any reason  
18 would want to see us, just in case, you know, there's  
19 -- it would not be good, of course.

20 DICK: Okay.

21 STEVE: In fact, we would not want to see  
22 them at all tomorrow under any circumstances.

23 DICK: Okay. Well, I'll make a note of that.

24 STEVE: Yeah. And there was -- we would  
25 probably need to ultimately see them at least one last

1 | time. There was a few things left in the air and that  
2 | probably would have to be worked out with them.

3 |           DICK: Okay. All right.

4 |           STEVE: And, basically, what they've got  
5 | going is we've asked them if they would take the lead  
6 | then for the others here. And so a lot of the  
7 | questions have been answered.

8 |           DICK: Yeah. Okay. All right. Well, if  
9 | they call in then, do you want us to advise that you --

10 |           STEVE: Yeah, just say there's --

11 |           DICK: At least until after sundown tomorrow.

12 |           STEVE: Exactly. Exactly.

13 |           DICK: Okay. All right. Well, we'll do  
14 | that.

15 |           STEVE: And David says pass this on for some  
16 | understanding. If you have the time, read Zephaniah.  
17 | It's only three chapters. You'd probably have it read  
18 | in minutes.

19 |           DICK: Okay.

20 |           STEVE: Little minor prophet in the Old  
21 | Testament.

22 |           DICK: Zephaniah.

23 |           STEVE: Yeah.

24 |           DICK: Okay. All right.

25 |           STEVE: Okay, Dick? Anything else?



1 DICK: I'll, I'll have to check on  
2 this --

3 STEVE: Okay.

4 DICK: -- the noise.

5 STEVE: Thanks, fellow. That, that is very  
6 important to us --

7 DICK: Okay.

8 STEVE: -- more than anything.

9 DICK: Yeah. One of the fellows just asked  
10 me if you're considering coming out immediately after  
11 the seventh day, the eighth day total.

12 STEVE: That's what he's been -- yeah. In  
13 fact, the truth is he wanted -- you know, just like the  
14 attorneys, I think it was Thursday, I believe it was  
15 Thursday, this last Thursday, or was it Sunday? Boy,  
16 I'm getting mixed up here with time, but I believe it  
17 was Thursday they, they were very sincere and adamant  
18 about well, can you ask your God when you will be out  
19 and -- well, even I was sitting there, along with  
20 Wayne, and we were listening.

21 And he says he really -- he said he was told  
22 to wait and he says he really will, 'cause he wants to  
23 know himself. And he did. And then he called me to  
24 his room and I said so what do you have? And he says  
25 well, it's the same, it's the same answer. He says

1 | wait. And he says he knows what it does to a person.  
2 | I mean, you know, people become anxious. You're  
3 | wondering. You become apprehensive and -- but he  
4 | himself -- it's like he's in the dark when it comes to  
5 | that. Really, I mean, you know --

6 |           DICK: Well, then we're all in the dark.

7 |           STEVE: Well, it's true, and I know you guys  
8 | don't --

9 |           DICK: We can wait when, huh?

10 |           STEVE: No, no. I know. And I know you guys  
11 | don't understand, but, see, I've known him now for six-  
12 | and-a-half years and it's not uncommon. Because in the  
13 | past there are things, like I've -- I think I've told  
14 | some of the other guys that when I first met him even I  
15 | wanted him to travel with me. I said I'd like you to  
16 | share this with some scholars I know and have them  
17 | check you out. And he says I can't do anything unless  
18 | I'm told to go or I get the okay. And, oh, he was  
19 | given the okay the next morning and off we went. And I  
20 | thought well, that's strange. You know, I'd never met  
21 | anybody that was like that before.

22 |           DICK: Yeah.

23 |           STEVE: So -- and ever since then, it's not  
24 | too -- in fact, he even told me, as he has these people  
25 | many time, he says two words that he hears more than

1 | any other, and it's been that way since the -- since  
2 | '85, and that's either trust or wait. He'll say God,  
3 | what should I do about this? And now the word'll be  
4 | trust. In fact, he says humanly speaking, carnally in  
5 | your mind, you sometimes -- it gets tiring when you go  
6 | trust, my son, trust, my son. Or, you know, it's  
7 | almost like you want to do something, you want to act,  
8 | you don't want to wait.

9 |           But he said the experiences he's been taken  
10 | through in the past, he fears God. That is the reason  
11 | why he's learned to wait. Otherwise, he said he'd --  
12 | even now he'd prefer, you know, you sit down with these  
13 | attorneys, you see carnally, humanly what the best  
14 | thing is to do to get out there, get it down, and go  
15 | through the system and all that. You know, that's the  
16 | greatest -- really, that's what a person wants to do.  
17 | And but we've all worked together. We've looked at the  
18 | Bible to this point of time, so it's like we're hanging  
19 | on, trying to do the right thing, you know, spiritually  
20 | speaking.

21 |           DICK: Yeah.

22 |           STEVE: And I know that's one of the hardest  
23 | things --

24 |           DICK: It's hard for me to understand that.

25 |           STEVE: I know it. I know. And that's what

1 I -- exactly. And, believe me, am I aware of that.  
2 You know, I'd give anything in this world if there  
3 could be a clear communication or an understanding, but  
4 --

5 DICK: Well --

6 STEVE: I mean, I mean, before this happened  
7 even -- you've got to remember, Dick, I mean, this is  
8 what we were -- where we were doing that and looking to  
9 this Passover, even before that happened. You know,  
10 aside from all that, that horrible, horrible tragedy.  
11 So --

12 DICK: Well, you know, we're just kind of --  
13 we'd like a day and a time, as you can well understand.

14 STEVE: Right.

15 DICK: And so --

16 STEVE: I'm always like biting at the bit  
17 myself. Like, okay, is this it? Is it? Can I give it  
18 now? Do we have something here? And I know Passover  
19 for sure, that we right from the beginning have looked  
20 to that, even before anything else has happened, like  
21 this was going to be a very big and very important to  
22 us.

23 DICK: Well --

24 STEVE: So, but I'll -- you know, of course,  
25 you know, as soon as I have anything, you'd be the

1 first to know.

2 DICK: All right. Well, I'll be waiting.

3 STEVE: Okay. So I'll, I'll get back to you  
4 tomorrow then about --

5 DICK: After sundown?

6 STEVE: Yeah, after sundown.

7 DICK: All right. Just to make sure, Steve,  
8 that the phone lines are still functioning here. We'd  
9 hate to have the attorneys call or something and get  
10 them caught up in --

11 STEVE: You know what I might do, Dick?

12 DICK: -- two days later the line's not  
13 working.

14 STEVE: Okay. What I'll do, I'll just --  
15 I'll at least, maybe even tomorrow, pick up the phone  
16 to hear if the dial tone's on, because there's always  
17 -- when it's working, that's always on there.

18 DICK: Okay.

19 STEVE: So I'll at least pick it up from time  
20 to time. It is weird that a lot of times the phone'll  
21 be working like now, and I think it was -- not -- was  
22 it yesterday? No, let's see, I think it was Sunday it  
23 stopped working. But then come to find out the cord on  
24 the outside of the door was chewed by one of the dogs.

25 DICK: Yeah.

1 STEVE: And it literally was, because what  
2 happened, they got a hold of one -- in fact, when I  
3 opened up the door and these guys were here, the  
4 attorneys, we were shocked when they showed up here.

5 DICK: Um-hum.

6 STEVE: And when I opened up the door, looked  
7 out on the, out on the porch there, there was actually  
8 a duck. All that was left was feathers and feet, so  
9 the dogs had all --

10 DICK: Dog got it?

11 STEVE: Oh, yeah, dogs got a hold of the  
12 duck. And long with that, they must have chewed on the  
13 cord.

14 DICK: Oh, boy.

15 STEVE: So, --

16 DICK: Well, just -- like I said, if you can  
17 just give us a call around six. In case of tomorrow --

18 STEVE: All right.

19 DICK: -- after sundown, of course, give us a  
20 holler.

21 STEVE: Right.

13 them backwards and forwards, honestly. And so I went  
14 up there and just listened to him talking about the  
15 Passover, why it started, what it was about and all of  
16 that.

17 And he said again, he says, you know, he  
18 wants to know himself. And again he got that one word,  
19 wait. So he keeps on hoping like, you know, the rest  
20 of us that, you know, that it's now or it's close.

2 | But Hebrew style, as Israel had it, of course, sundown  
3 | is, is Wednesday. I should have made that a little  
4 | more clear.

5 |           DICK: Yeah, okay.

6 |           STEVE: So if they want to mention that, they  
7 | can. Of course, Judaism still holds with that, also.

8 |           DICK: All right. Well, we'll consider it  
9 | then sundown this evening until sundown tomorrow.

10 |           STEVE: Right.

11 |           DICK: And seven days after that --

12 |           STEVE: Right.

13 |           DICK: -- the unleavened bread.

14 |           STEVE: I'll, I'll be talking to you even  
15 | about that.

16 |           DICK: Okay.

17 |           STEVE: As, you know, I have some time during  
18 | that, we'll open it up and, who knows, you know,  
19 | anything's possible.

20 |           DICK: You're not trying to convert me,  
21 | though, right?

25 |           DICK: Sure.



1 STEVE: Yeah.

6 DICK: Bye. Have a good evening.

7 STEVE: Okay. Thank you.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Some of these guys think  
24 they're indians out there, running along the building  
25 here, and they act like they're going to come running,



1 | here we go.

2 |           JOHN: You know, Steve, your attorneys are  
3 | hoping you're going to be able to come out as soon as  
4 | possible. They --

5 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: You know what?

6 |           JOHN: What's that noise in the background?

7 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Wait till you see what God's  
8 | got planned for you and I, John. You don't believe in  
9 | God, I do. That's the difference. I believe in the  
10 | God of the Bible. I believe you're going to see some  
11 | awesome, awesome events taking place.

12 |           JOHN: Okay. Can you describe what these  
13 | events are going to be?

14 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I most definitely can.

15 |           JOHN: Okay.

16 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Grab your Bible. Do you have  
17 | your Bible there?

18 |           JOHN: No, I don't do Bible.

19 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's okay. If you  
20 | don't do the Bible, you're not going to get my opinion  
21 | and theories. They're not worth anything.

22 |           JOHN: Oh, your opinions are worth quite a  
23 | bit and we're kind of curious about that. However,  
24 | now, the situation is your attorneys seem to be  
25 | concerned about you.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Here's what my attorney  
2 actually said, John.

3 JOHN: Go ahead, I'm listening.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: He does not want me talking  
5 to you people, doesn't even want me talking to you at  
6 all.

7 JOHN: Um-hum.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: So I'm not going to get on  
9 the phone here like in the past and -- Plus, you people  
10 don't want to hear about what we're into, and I know  
11 you don't.

12 JOHN: Well, what we're, what we're concerned  
13 about is having you come on out. Now, the situation  
14 you're looking --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm more concerned --

16 JOHN: Hey, is David --

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm more concerned about  
18 making sure that I'm totally in line with that -- what  
19 the book has to show and say.

20 JOHN: Do you think that God might be angry  
21 at David and that's why he's not going to be --

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not in the least. If he's  
23 angry with anybody, it's with the people on the outside  
24 that are scoffing and that ridicule, that are showing  
25 the kind of spirit and attitude that they are. If

1 | you'd read the Bible, you'd see you're fulfilling the  
2 | very details of that book.

3 |           JOHN: Um-hum.

4 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: All these prophets died with  
5 | the testimony about seeing something, a vision, about  
6 | the final days, and they used language that was current  
7 | of their day and it doesn't describe well these days --

8 |           JOHN: Right. I can understand that.

9 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: -- plainly.

10 |           JOHN: By the way, did you in your studies  
11 | and all this thing last night during Passover have any  
12 | estimate when you will be coming out?

13 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: It might be next year.

14 |           JOHN: Next year? Well, that's fine.

15 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I'll be honest with you. No,  
16 | I haven't.

17 |           JOHN: Yeah.

18 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: In fact, the truth is I was  
19 | talking with him and, you know, this is the Passover  
20 | week.

21 |           JOHN: Right.

22 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: The day went by. We had our  
23 | studies, as I told you.

24 |           JOHN: Um-hum, right.

25 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: And, you know, the rest of

1 | the week is unleavened bread.

2 |           JOHN: David -- Normally, you're very  
3 | gregarious and very easy to talk to. You have -- It's  
4 | the tone of your voice now that you just don't appear  
5 | to be --

6 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: John, I guess, I guess I'm  
7 | tired of the --

8 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I know it. I can understand  
9 | that.

10 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: -- you know, the old kind of  
11 | questions where -- And if you heard what was -- Can I  
12 | ask you a question? When once in a while, like when  
13 | there's someone on the speakers outside this building  
14 | that say David, pick up the phone, David, pick up the  
15 | phone, who's doing that? Is that across the street?  
16 | Is that at where you're at?

17 |           JOHN: No, no, it's not where we're at. I  
18 | don't know where that's coming from. We have no  
19 | contact with that type of deal.

20 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, that's what I wondered,  
21 | because, I mean, who are these people telling us what  
22 | to do?

23 |           JOHN: Well, -- know about --

24 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Number one -- Listen, but,  
25 | John, they have worked it out with you --

1           JOHN:  -- and this is what they're trying to  
2 do.  They're being --

3           MR. SCHNEIDER:  No, no, no.  Yesterday I  
4 talked to Dek very clearly, I said we would be off  
5 until tomorrow night at this time.  He -- It was so  
6 plain and clear --

7           JOHN:  You're absolutely right.

8           MR. SCHNEIDER:  -- to him, he went and talked  
9 with the commanders.  They were all --

10          JOHN:  You're absolutely right.  You've got  
11 it going there.

12          MR. SCHNEIDER:  So these guys --

13          JOHN:  What we were doing in that situation,  
14 the word was passed on that you, that you were going to  
15 be having your sundown to sunup -- or the other way  
16 around, I guess it was sundown to sundown.

17          MR. SCHNEIDER:  Sundown to sundown.

18          JOHN:  And that word was passed.  Apparently,  
19 there might have been some sort of miscommunication.  
20 By the way --

21          MR. SCHNEIDER:  I'll tell you what I think it  
22 was, and I, I --

23          JOHN:  Go ahead, I'm listening.

24          MR. SCHNEIDER:  -- believe like you that, you  
25 know, 10:30 comes around for a press conference and

1 they've got to -- In fact, if you notice the time --

2 JOHN: Do you listen to the press  
3 conferences?

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not all -- About half the  
5 time.

6 JOHN: Um-hum.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: When I do, of course, it's  
8 very irking. It irritates the heck out of us.

9 JOHN: Yeah, this is why you've got to come  
10 out and let them know what your side of it's going to  
11 be. Do you have any estimate to when you're going to  
12 be coming out, Steve?

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: When do you think, when do  
14 you -- I tell you what, you go to jail with me for six  
15 months, a year, five years or whatever else --

16 JOHN: Well, I'll tell you what we're going  
17 to do. If you want to come out, I'll go with you.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: It'll be very interesting to  
19 see -- More than likely, you're probably innocent  
20 yourself in this world. I would think you probably  
21 are. Maybe you've committed more crimes than I have  
22 even thought of. I mean, I don't know.

23 JOHN: Look --

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: But the whole thing is now  
25 here I am, minding my own business --

1 JOHN: Um-hum.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and people come to take my  
3 life, and I've got to go into jail and go through being  
4 shackled and all the rest.

5 JOHN: Well, I'm sure you talked to your  
6 attorneys and they explained what your situation is.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I, I know what it is.

8 JOHN: Well, your attorneys seem to think it  
9 would be best for you to come out as soon as possible.  
10 Do you have any estimate on this type of thing, Steve,  
11 when you're going to be coming on out?

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: John-5, huh?

13 JOHN: Right. Do you have any estimate,  
14 Steve?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: I have no estimate, I really  
16 don't. I really don't.

17 JOHN: All right, 'cause we're, we're trying  
18 to make this thing as painless as possible for you  
19 people. There's a lot of things that have to go on.  
20 We want to make sure things slide on out.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm at a place -- I really --  
22 I'll tell you the honest truth. I'm not real crazy  
23 about this world and --

24 JOHN: Oh, don't start talking --

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I'm serious, I really am

1 | not.

2 |           JOHN: Steve --

3 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm not crazy about it.

4 |           JOHN: -- look around. Where you are now,  
5 | it's not going to get any better tomorrow.

6 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No, you're right.

7 |           JOHN: It's beginning to get worse in there.

8 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: It doesn't -- I know it is.

9 | No matter --

10 |           JOHN: And you've probably got problems --

11 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: What does it matter if I come  
12 | out today, next year, or, or right this second?

13 |           JOHN: It's going to be worse tomorrow than  
14 | it is today. It's not going to get any better than it  
15 | is today, and this thing is not going to go away,  
16 | Steve. You've got to bear that in mind.

17 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Things like this will never  
18 | go away until people like -- groups like the ATF are  
19 | totally disbanded.

20 |           JOHN: It's not going to go away until you  
21 | come on out and we hear your side of the story. And  
22 | there's a lot of people, Steve, that want to hear your  
23 | side of the story.

24 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: There's definitely a number  
25 | of people that should be up for murder now, and it's



1 | not those in this building that tried to defend their  
2 | lives.

3 |           JOHN: Well, that is something that's going  
4 | to be addressed in court, and your attorneys, Steve --

5 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: -- no one's going to think  
6 | about --

7 |           JOHN: -- want you to come out and tell  
8 | things like that. You've got to listen to that guy.

9 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Both the attorneys want us  
10 | out so they can become more prominent and they can be  
11 | known nationally and so they can make a lot of money  
12 | and --

13 |           JOHN: You have faith with your attorneys,  
14 | don't you, Steve?

15 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I have faith in God and  
16 | that's about all the faith I've got.

17 |           JOHN: I think you're being well represented  
18 | there.

19 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, they're, they're men, you  
20 | know, and they want to do good, well for themselves and  
21 | us, also. You know, of course. You know, this is  
22 | life.

23 |           JOHN: Um-hum.

24 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, you know, I have no  
25 | second thoughts about it. It's very clear where these

1 | guys are at. You know, I mean, they definitely  
2 | wouldn't want to lose. It doesn't -- It's not good for  
3 | the reputation.

4 |           JOHN: Well, I don't know about that.  
5 | They're interested in doing an honest bit of  
6 | representation to you, and their reputation, sure,  
7 | that's a concern. But, nevertheless, they're not going  
8 | to be taking on this case --

9 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I have no problems.  
10 | They're all right. They're more than fine. They're  
11 | attorneys, so, you know, at the same time --

12 |           JOHN: Have you had much experience with  
13 | attorneys, Steve?

14 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I haven't, because I've  
15 | never really had need of them.

16 |           JOHN: Um-hum. Hey, is David around?

17 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: He is not around here.

18 |           JOHN: Okay. I was curious if he wanted to  
19 | talk to us about anything.

20 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No, he doesn't. In fact,  
21 | when I called, it was just because I told Dek that I  
22 | would call back after the sun went down.

23 |           JOHN: We appreciate that. And these are  
24 | things that we -- show your good faith by keeping the  
25 | lines of communication open. Also, to make sure these

1 phones are working. Now -- Hey, have you had a chance  
2 to see about the -- Judy -- talk to Judy about the two  
3 gals that are expecting?

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: No. In fact, she just walked  
5 by. I asked her a question and she thought that one  
6 was due sometime in May.

7 JOHN: Okay. Now, Steve --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: The other, I have no idea.

9 JOHN: -- tomorrow you're going to be calling  
10 in at 8:30 a.m., correct?

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Eight forty-five is what we  
12 said.

13 JOHN: Okay. That's reasonable. And then  
14 tomorrow night for us at about 8:45?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Six o'clock. Six o'clock is  
16 what --

17 JOHN: Six o'clock? Okay, that'd be fine,  
18 6 p.m. tomorrow evening. So we'll --

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, John, how are you doing  
20 for yourself?

21 JOHN: Oh, you know how it's going. I'm  
22 concerned about you, guy, and I'm concerned about  
23 Easter coming up. I realize -- How do you feel about  
24 the fact that a lot of us are going to be missing  
25 Easter?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Easter?

2 JOHN: With our families?

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't even think you're  
4 into it, other than --

5 JOHN: Oh, sure.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: I really -- I mean, you're  
7 into it mainly, mainly as maybe a time to get together  
8 or something, but, I mean, you don't believe in Easter  
9 bunnies and rabbits and fertility rites and --

10 JOHN: Oh, fertility rites? No, I'm a little  
11 bit old to worry about fertility rites.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly.

13 JOHN: And it sort of goes on. But, anyhow,  
14 there are a lot of people here that are very concerned  
15 with that type of thing, and they would like to --

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah. I mean, I have,  
17 you know, there's people that are into whatever, you  
18 know. I respect whatever anybody believes --

19 JOHN: Like we respect your religious  
20 feelings here and what your beliefs are, but we're  
21 concerned about our people. Do you guys have anything  
22 special set for Good Friday?

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, we're not into anything  
24 to do with Good Friday.

25 JOHN: Okay. There's nothing in what you

1 | believe in that comes around on Good Friday?

2 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No. That's more or less --  
3 | That came from Catholicism. It's in the Episcopal  
4 | church, some other -- Lutheran and a few others, but  
5 | other than that, like your Baptist churches,  
6 | Pentecostal church, Charismatic, Seventh Day Adventist,  
7 | some of those are not into that sort of thing.

8 |           JOHN: So it's sort of like a pagan holiday?

9 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: -- into that at all.

10 |          JOHN: Say that again.

11 |          MR. SCHNEIDER: Pardon?

12 |          JOHN: I didn't hear you. Go ahead, say that  
13 | again.

14 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I says the evangelical type  
15 | Christians, Protestants aren't into like -- things like  
16 | Good Friday and Lent and, and that is something that's  
17 | the tradition of men that crept into the early  
18 | Christian church. It's nowhere to be found in the  
19 | Bible.

20 |           JOHN: Yeah. On this day for -- you're going  
21 | to be observing all this business, Steve, are you going  
22 | -- Well, it's the close of sundown tonight. Is this  
23 | going to be six or seven days that you will observe  
24 | Passover?

25 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: It goes for seven days.

1 JOHN: Seven days.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

3 JOHN: From now, right? The seven days' time  
4 is running now?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I'll tell you what.  
6 What I'll do, being that I, I -- It's in the dark right  
7 now, but I'll sit down and maybe tomorrow or tomorrow  
8 morning or sometime tomorrow talk to you about it.

9 JOHN: Um-hum. Yeah, I would -- I always  
10 have my ears open to learning things like this. And,  
11 fortunately, what you're pushing for as far as the deep  
12 Bible study or something like that, we can only look at  
13 that after you come out. I can't get involved in  
14 anything like that over the phone.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: John, I have no -- Listen, I  
16 really -- I have no problem with you, and the only  
17 reason I'm not out now is because -- The only reason I  
18 ever came here and left Hawaii is because I believe in  
19 the God of the Bible.

20 JOHN: Um-hum.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's, that's the bottom  
22 line. The bottom line.

23 JOHN: Okay.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: And --

25 JOHN: That's okay. I don't have a problem

1 | with that.

2 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm more concerned about my  
3 | eternal life than I am what's going to happen to me in  
4 | the court system, this country. I see that this  
5 | country has about filled its cup up. Judgments are  
6 | going to be poured out.

7 |           JOHN: Well, there's a lot of that that's  
8 | possible. Steve, if you wanted to come out, would you  
9 | walk out now?

10 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: If I wanted to? Sure.

11 |           JOHN: Yeah. You and I talked about this  
12 | before.

13 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Sure.

14 |           JOHN: Every once in a while I'll pop this  
15 | question at you.

16 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I can't go against my  
17 | conscience or the convictions I have of the book, John.

18 |           JOHN: Um-hum.

19 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: That's really what it comes  
20 | down to. I mean, of course, you weigh out the issues  
21 | day by day. It's a new day everyday. You know, I  
22 | don't say -- I'm never adamant about anything. The day  
23 | comes, I look at the issues, weigh it out, and make my  
24 | decision. It's a day-by-day decision. It's not like  
25 | one day I joined this group here and this is it. I've

1 | never been that way. There's the Republicans and  
2 | Democrats. I've always looked at the issues, always  
3 | have.

4 |           JOHN: Right. Well, you know, we look at  
5 | the -- now you're a little bit more charming. When you  
6 | first came on this evening, Steve, you were, oh, wow,  
7 | full of --

8 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, not really.

9 |           JOHN: It isn't the Steve that I know and  
10 | love. It's just an entirely different character.

11 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: John, it's the noises  
12 | outside, it's the -- I didn't --

13 |           JOHN: Well --

14 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Listen, I didn't tell you  
15 | right off the show that these guys in the Bradleys put  
16 | on for us.

17 |           JOHN: No, I guess you didn't.

18 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: They're coming up to the  
19 | fence here right in front of the building.

20 |           JOHN: We always have the observation --  
21 | going on out there.

22 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Listen. Oh, I'll tell you --  
23 | No, no. I know, but they came running up to the fence  
24 | and they acted like they were revving it and, and  
25 | popping it a little bit here and there and --



1 JOHN: Um-hum.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- moving the turret around.  
3 They've been doing a lot of things like that, so --

4 JOHN: Well, you know, they're very anxious  
5 to resolve this thing, too, and we got the idea from  
6 you and from your attorneys that this thing is going to  
7 be resolved peacefully.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: What are the uses of these  
9 men in these Bradleys?

10 JOHN: Say it again.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: How the, how old are the men,  
12 are these guys in these Bradleys?

13 JOHN: Very good guy, you know. There are  
14 too many Vietnam vets there.

2 JOHN: -- anybody else to get involved in it.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: A week or so one went down  
4 the road here, flipping the finger the whole way, at  
5 one of the girls that were looking out the window.

6 JOHN: Um-hum.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: And just two nights ago Scott  
8 was looking out the window and one of them opened up  
9 the hatch on the Bradley, flipped the finger, and down  
10 the hatch went again. I mean --

11 JOHN: Well, those things --

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean why, John? You're  
13 wondering is this for real. You know, there's --

14 JOHN: Well, a lot of people are asking if  
15 this is for real. This is why -- explain why you're  
16 not out here. We can understand now for the  
17 Passover --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: There have been -- Some of  
19 the people -- I notice some of the people are starting  
20 to raise questions about bringing the Grand Jury  
21 here --

22 JOHN: What have you heard?

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- where all this evidence  
24 is.

25 JOHN: Where have you heard that one?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: It was on a couple different  
2 radio shows. There's a lot of people looking at the  
3 very issues involved with all their individual freedoms  
4 in relation to the Constitution. There's a lot of  
5 things that are happening here that are totally  
6 unconstitutional, totally.

7 JOHN: Well, have you brought that to the  
8 attention of your attorney?

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Sure did.

10 JOHN: Uh-huh. Well, you know, this whole  
11 thing as far as the unconstitutionality of it, the, the  
12 whole problems you might be having here, this could all  
13 be brought to a head. You guys -- I hate to keep  
14 harping on this thing, but you've got to come out --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: John, I'm innocent. How am I  
16 -- How is --

17 JOHN: -- and get this thing -- You're  
18 probably -- You may very well be, I don't know. This  
19 is something that the courts are going to decide.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Listen, listen. But I've got  
21 to sit in jails for six months because the ATF came to  
22 murder me. And now -- I would rather go sit in jail at  
23 least six months --

24 JOHN: This is an overdramatized thing. You  
25 know --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, it's not.

2 JOHN: Your attorneys have been talking bond  
3 or something like that.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hey, John, I'm already  
5 watching to see what they did with a couple old ladies.  
6 Katherine Madison is blind, for crying out loud.

7 JOHN: Yeah. Well --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: They've got her down for  
9 conspiracy to commit murder, attempted murder, murder.  
10 What --

11 JOHN: Steve, wait till you see what happens  
12 when you guys come out, 'cause a lot of things will be  
13 taken care of then. There will be justice. Everything  
14 will be addressed. But, guy, you can't try to get  
15 justice from out there.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Listen, these guys --  
17 Margaret Lawson is the most humble little Japanese  
18 lady. I met her in Hawaii --

19 JOHN: Uh-huh.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and, I mean, I tell you,  
21 she would do anything for you.

22 JOHN: I bet.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: And, and to think they've got  
24 charges on her and have got her locked up, I mean, what  
25 the heck is going on?

1 JOHN: Well, I can see what you're saying  
2 there. This is a very difficult time for everybody  
3 and, consequently, a lot of things that are going to be  
4 going on will seem very strange.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- power?

6 JOHN: I don't see anything -- I don't see a  
7 problem with it. I can see what they're trying to do  
8 on the big picture. What you're looking at, you're  
9 looking at the individual tree, you're not looking at  
10 the whole forest. And, consequently, you have to break  
11 this down. You have to take this all in stride.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Take it all in stride.

13 JOHN: This is not something that's going to  
14 go away, and this is --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: It's injustice all the way  
16 through.

17 JOHN: Well, there will be quite a bit of  
18 justice. Your attorneys --

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Injustice.

20 JOHN: -- are being retained by you or  
21 whatever and they're going to make sure that you do get  
22 a fair shake out of this thing.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: I've got to find out where  
24 I'm going to get the money to pay for such things.

25 JOHN: Well, how -- Well, again, that's

1 something that you're going to work out with your  
2 attorney.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Holy smoke --

4 JOHN: I think David is working this out.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I've never seen that kind  
6 of money in all my life, because my --

7 JOHN: Uh-huh.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- my whole life has been  
9 trying to share what I understand for people having an  
10 opportunity to have eternal life, and I've never  
11 charged a dime, even though there were a number of  
12 churches that wanted me to be their evangelist, their  
13 minister. I've never in my life charged a dime.

14 JOHN: Well, how does that work when you have  
15 these evangelists going around to the various churches  
16 and so forth to hold something?

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I've done that.  
18 Actually, the only --

19 JOHN: But you -- Do they pay?

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm the only one that has  
21 ever actually done that, John.

22 JOHN: Um-hum.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I went to places like  
24 England and Australia and around America --

25 JOHN: Right.



1 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- different places. And  
2 when I went, I just had to rely on people putting me up  
3 in their homes and I didn't rent some great big  
4 auditorium and I didn't charge any money.

5 JOHN: Did you do anything in Orange County?

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: In Orange County?

7 JOHN: Yeah.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I've talked to a lot of  
9 people there, but I never sat down or was in any kind  
10 of a building or --

11 JOHN: So you didn't have any of the churches  
12 down there, that, you know, Ralph Richardson or Chuck  
13 Smith or --

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Chuck Smith I'm very -- have  
15 been aware of him for about probably 15 years. Why?  
16 You know much about him or --

17 JOHN: Or how about the Reverend Shuyler?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm familiar with him, also.  
19 I've met these men, but I'm aware of what they teach  
20 and preach about.

21 JOHN: Um-hum.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: And --

23 JOHN: I was just curious because you were up  
24 in Orange -- up in, I guess, Laverne for a while.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yes.

1 JOHN: And Orange County seems to be quite  
2 the hot bed of activity in this area.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, it has been, hasn't it,  
4 for years?

5 JOHN: Yeah. And when -- message I would  
6 think it would natural if he came down --

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Got the message? We're open  
8 to talking to people on the streets or wealthy, in  
9 between, high and low.

10 JOHN: Yeah, I kind of put that together.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, the bottom line is if a  
12 person has ears to hear, they can hear, evaluate, and  
13 make a verdict, give a verdict, make a judgment.

14 JOHN: Right.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: There's some information that  
16 we're saying try to controvert us. But, I mean, number  
17 one, you know, most people are interested in this life  
18 and what they can get out of it. And you're going to  
19 find out if you read the very plain statements of  
20 Christ, if you put father, mother, sister, first, if  
21 you look at James, Chapter 4, you look at First John,  
22 Chapter 3, Verse -- and Chapter --

23 JOHN: Well, all those people have got --

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- if you love the world or  
25 the things in the world, you're not of the Father and

1 | you're going to pass away with this world.

2 |           JOHN: Okay.

3 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: So, you know, I mean, that's  
4 | the bottom line. So I've never tired to -- Either --  
5 | Here's the kind of person I've been. Either I'm into  
6 | it 100 percent or not at all. There's no in between  
7 | for me.

8 |           JOHN: I sort of got that impression. I  
9 | think you're doing a very good job of that. By the  
10 | way, let me just -- I was kind of curious. What kind  
11 | of food did you guys eat last night?

12 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: What kind of food did we eat?

13 |           JOHN: Yeah.

14 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I myself had, as I  
15 | recall, some beef stew and some --

16 |           JOHN: This was the vegetarian thing?

17 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: -- meatballs.

18 |           JOHN: I thought it was a vegetarian thing  
19 | the first night. Is that --

20 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No. Well, if it is, I don't  
21 | know anything about it.

22 |           JOHN: I was just curious what you guys --

23 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: See, we're not under the  
24 | Levitical law right now.

25 |           JOHN: Okay, that's --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's the thing.

2 JOHN: Yeah, I was just trying to figure that  
3 one out.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: And when you see -- when you  
5 look into the New Testament, Christ actually, when it  
6 came -- He kept the Passover, but, at the same time, he  
7 became the sacrificial lamb himself.

8 JOHN: Eating that stuff, the meatballs and  
9 that, you're eating what, those MRE's or whatever they  
10 are?

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, yeah, we've got MRE's.  
12 We've got other foods here, too.

13 JOHN: Are you going to be requiring any  
14 special food for the next seven days?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, yeah. I would like a  
16 couple of pizzas if you would.

17 JOHN: It's funny you should mention that.  
18 Now, we have one of our team going out there. We're  
19 going to have what? I think it's going to be sausage,  
20 pepperoni, and probably Canadian bacon. Now, if you  
21 want to come out, I can save you a couple slices.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, see, I can't -- I don't  
23 eat bacon, in the first place. I don't eat pork.

24 JOHN: This is -- Oh, that's true. Well,  
25 we'll stick with the -- In a situation like that, we'll

1 | get you something --

2 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I'll tell you why I don't eat  
3 | pork.

4 |           JOHN: How about mushrooms and --

5 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: They are the prime -- Take a  
6 | look at Isaiah 66, verses 15 through 17. God says he's  
7 | going to come with flames of fire and destroy those  
8 | that eat swine flesh, the abomination --

9 |           JOHN: Yeah, that's true. That gets to be a  
10 | problem. So, so the only special food or --

11 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, could you imagine --

12 |           JOHN: Do you need special food -- having a  
13 | Bible study --

14 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: John, John, can you  
15 | imagine --

16 |           JOHN: I'm trying to follow what you guys are  
17 | doing in there.

18 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: John, can you imagine eating  
19 | a mouse?

20 |           JOHN: Sure.

21 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, a bat or a mole?

22 |           JOHN: Oh, it's amazing. Did you ever go  
23 | through one of the Special Forces survival training?

24 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I haven't.

25 |           JOHN: It's amazing what you eat.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I haven't.

2 JOHN: Well, are you guys -- are you studying  
3 the Bible, too, at the same time as you're going  
4 through all this special diet?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, really, we're not on a  
6 special diet other than we do not eat like pork and  
7 clams, certain -- like lobsters.

8 JOHN: Mollusks?

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Things that are termed in the  
10 Bible as unclean meats, because these are scavengers.  
11 They eat dead things, refuse. Actually, they're living  
12 garbage cleaners.

13 JOHN: So what you guys are eating is not  
14 really special foods. Whatever the MRE's are in there?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: No. Well, the MRE -- At  
16 least they're kosher, see.

17 JOHN: Are they really?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah, they're kosher.  
19 All of them are.

20 JOHN: Well, that's interesting.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Meaning kosher in that  
22 there's no pork, there's no, no unclean meat.

23 JOHN: Um-hum.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's really what kosher  
25 originally was. Now it's to be blessed by a rabbi and

1 | all that, but that's not the case here.

2 |           JOHN: Well, I was under the impression you  
3 | guys are going to be eating bitter, bitter herbs and  
4 | unleavened bread.

5 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, we've, we've had the  
6 | unleavened bread, but when it gets into the details,  
7 | I'll tell you what, I'll take some time maybe tomorrow  
8 | and -- Are you going to be around tomorrow?

9 |           JOHN: Oh, sure.

10 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: They've got you on again,  
11 | huh?

12 |           JOHN: Oh, hey, we wouldn't miss this for the  
13 | world. Seven days a week, you can't beat it. No, it's  
14 | Dek and myself and, and Dwayne.

15 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Who's on now? Dek, you and  
16 | who?

17 |           JOHN: Dwayne.

18 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Dwayne. I don't think --  
19 | I've never talked to Dwayne.

20 |           JOHN: Um-hum.

21 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: How's Dwayne?

22 |           JOHN: If you want to talk to Dwayne, you  
23 | can.

24 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Is he there?

25 |           JOHN: You want to talk to him, seriously?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Sure. Sure. Stick Dwayne  
2 on. I've never spoken with him.

3 JOHN: Okay. What Dwayne would like to talk  
4 about is only things that are serious, about when  
5 you're going to come out and come up with a plan.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, if I know, I'll tell  
7 him, but I can't --

8 JOHN: Do you --

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- tell him something I don't  
10 know.

11 JOHN: Um-hum. Okay. When you want, when  
12 you want to talk to him, let us know. Have you -- Are  
13 you guys keeping a record of all the folks you talked  
14 to in there?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Are we doing what?

16 JOHN: You guys keeping a record of everybody  
17 you're talking to?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Of everybody we're talking  
19 to? Are you talking about yourselves?

20 JOHN: Yeah.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Have you got --

22 JOHN: I would think so.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: A mental note I've kept.

24 JOHN: Well, that's great.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: I basically remember about



1 | all of those people.

2 |           JOHN: Uh-huh. 'Cause it's always nice to  
3 | sit down and chat, but --

4 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: You did send us in a tape, of  
5 | course, a video of some of the guys.

6 |           JOHN: Yeah. This was the early stages.

7 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: That was the night that the  
8 | electricity was turned off and no one ever got to see  
9 | it. I got to see --

10 |           JOHN: Oh, really?

11 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I got to see part of it and  
12 | then the electricity went off.

13 |           JOHN: I see. Okay, so you're rolling along  
14 | here. Everything apparently -- You've got enough food.  
15 | How's your water holding up?

16 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: We probably could -- No, I  
17 | don't know. Probably could -- You could send some of  
18 | that in, if you'd like.

19 |           JOHN: Yeah. I was thinking -- Again, I'm  
20 | getting concerned about these kids, thinking about the  
21 | ladies. Well you sent out Jesse Amen, and if you're  
22 | not careful we'll send him back into you --

23 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: How's he doing, by the way,  
24 | John?

25 |           JOHN: Oh, who knows. I talked with him when

1 | he came out and --

2 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: You did talk with him?

3 |           JOHN: Yeah. Anyhow, you cleaned him up  
4 | pretty good when you sent him out. I've got to give  
5 | you credit for that one.

6 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, yeah.

7 |           JOHN: So I was thinking, man, that was a lot  
8 | of water to waste on that guy.

9 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, no, nothing's a waste.

10 |           JOHN: Answer me one question on this  
11 | situation. When Jesse Amen came waltzing into your  
12 | compound there, he walked in the front door, what  
13 | happened to him immediately, if anything?

14 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: What happened? He came in  
15 | and he -- In fact, as soon as he walked in, he came up  
16 | to me and hugged me.

17 |           JOHN: Okay.

18 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: And then he sat down and  
19 | started telling us why he was here. He went on to say  
20 | something about his father, which is --

21 |           JOHN: Uh-huh.

22 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: -- what was it? Lord  
23 | Lightning Amen?

24 |           JOHN: Yeah, a dynamite guy.

25 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I know.

1 JOHN: When did he meet David?

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: He met David -- Boy, I don't  
3 even remember if it was that night or the next day.

4 JOHN: Okay. Did David do anything unusual  
5 to him?

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: No.

7 JOHN: Okay. He came --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: He opened up -- In fact,  
9 David -- Actually, I remember when he first met him,  
10 and I can't remember if it was that night or the next  
11 day, but I know I was there.

12 JOHN: Um-hum.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: And, and at the time, I  
14 remember he just listened to him, and he said -- he  
15 says what can we do for you? And the man went on to  
16 say something about that he had a message, he had a  
17 password. He had a few things to say about how the  
18 Lord --

19 JOHN: As stable as the day is long. Anyhow,  
20 what I was kind of curious about, did he -- When David  
21 met this Jesse Amen, did he wash his feet?

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Did he do what?

23 JOHN: Did he wash his feet?

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't remember anything  
25 like that.

1 JOHN: If you don't remember it, I'm sure it  
2 didn't happen. His story was as soon as he walked in  
3 David came to him with a bowl and a towel, had him sit  
4 down, and washed his feet.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hmmm.

6 JOHN: Yeah, that's what my thought was,  
7 hmmm.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I mean, you know, the  
9 guy is --

10 JOHN: As I said, if you're not careful,  
11 we're going to send him back.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I don't know if he'd  
13 want to come back.

14 JOHN: Oh, you never can tell.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: I think he's probably on  
16 another mission here, but I don't know what.

17 JOHN: Yeah, I'm sure he is. Yeah, on this  
18 type of thing.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, he's -- I don't know, he  
20 was okay. It's just for 12 years apparently he's been  
21 involved with somebody out west somewhere.

22 JOHN: Would that be his dad?

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: I have no idea.

24 JOHN: Out there?

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Remember, I tried to ask him

1 a number of questions about his experience, what he was  
2 and what he was into. He said something about being a  
3 very good welder at one time and he met three women  
4 that were in white robes or something and --

5 JOHN: Yeah, I think he was hooked up with  
6 another group out in Riverside, his dad's operation.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: It sounds like it, sounds  
8 like it. I don't know much about that.

9 JOHN: Well, no, that was -- I understand  
10 what you were trying to do as far as washing this guy  
11 up. And, boy, that must have taken a lot of water out  
12 of your stores.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: John, you know, this whole  
14 time I'm listening to you, of course, I'm wondering  
15 what your motives are, what you're up to.

16 JOHN: No. What I'm basically trying to find  
17 out, how life is going out there. We're trying to do  
18 the right things for you. And --

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: John, you're something else.  
20 How can you ever reach another human --

21 JOHN: I'm reaching you, guy. I'm trying to  
22 talk to you. I'm trying to show that we have a genuine  
23 interest in you and we have interest in the people in  
24 there. You're not giving us a chance to help you.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: I know. I'm asking --

1 | John --

2 |           JOHN: And I'm concerned about it.

3 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I'm into spiritual things.  
4 | I'm into things that one cannot see with their physical  
5 | eyesight. That's where you and I differ. You're into  
6 | this world and what you can get out of it.

7 |           JOHN: No, no. I'm too old for that. I'm  
8 | quite content.

9 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I know, but you've got -- You  
10 | know, there are certain goals you have, both long-term  
11 | and short-term, and you probably enjoy this world.

12 |           JOHN: Oh, sure I do, and so do you.

13 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I never thought --

14 |           JOHN: Otherwise, you wouldn't be where you  
15 | are.

16 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No, the only thing I've ever  
17 | enjoyed is disseminating information that people can  
18 | look at and weigh out, ask questions, and, and find  
19 | some real deep peace and joy and gladness and hope.

20 |           JOHN: Um-hum.

21 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: You know, if you ever look at  
22 | Zachariah 9, it talks about a people in the final days  
23 | that are actually called prisoners of hope. Seriously.

24 |           JOHN: Prisoners of hope.

25 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes. Take a look in

1 | Zechariah 9. And the reason being is because they see  
2 | something they can't controvert. It's very plain and  
3 | clear. There's a weight of evidence that lies with the  
4 | issues that are laid out. So it's like one has such a  
5 | hope you get stuck to that hope and you don't want to  
6 | move away from that hope.

7 |           JOHN: David --

8 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: See what it's talking about.

9 |           JOHN: David is -- We had this little  
10 | agreement, Steve. You know what the story is on this.  
11 | But the idea is not to get involved with the Bible.  
12 | When you start launching out into this Bible  
13 | situation --

14 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: When one does what now?

15 |           JOHN: When you start launching out on these  
16 | diatribes about the Bible or these religious deals, we  
17 | don't want to deal with that. We want to deal on  
18 | something on a different plane. We're down here.

19 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, see, there's no way you  
20 | can deal with us without dealing with that, because  
21 | that's what we are. That's where you make your  
22 | mistake. That's where everyone makes their mistake.  
23 | When they talk to us, anything that we do revolves  
24 | around God known as a rock.

25 |           JOHN: Um-hum.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: In Revelation 4, he's a rock.  
2 He's seated on the throne. He's going to do what he  
3 says. He doesn't change --

4 JOHN: Well, I can understand --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: He's got --

6 JOHN: Do you think God is happy with what  
7 the situation is here?

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: I do. I believe, in fact,  
9 he's totally happy. In fact, I even believe that he's  
10 happy with you people playing these sounds for us day  
11 after day.

12 JOHN: Well, that's all part -- get a higher  
13 place in heaven maybe, but, unfortunately, he could be  
14 --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, that's what I mean. I,  
16 I --

17 JOHN: -- with David because David has not  
18 chose to do the right thing and come on out.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, he has. He himself,  
20 there's no problem with him. He's definitely right on  
21 with God. I'm not concerned about him, I'm concerned  
22 about myself.

23 JOHN: Okay, how about yourself? Where are  
24 you going to be on this thing?

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I'm supposed to do --



1 JOHN: How do you see yourself coming out of  
2 this thing?

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: How do I see myself coming  
4 out of this thing?

5 JOHN: Um-hum.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: In this world, it doesn't  
7 look too good for me. I, I really think that they're  
8 going to manufacture and contrive all sorts of charges  
9 and things against me. And it's going to be. And I  
10 really hope it isn't because --

11 JOHN: I don't think that's going to happen.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: I really do -- Those  
13 people --

14 JOHN: Nothing is going to be manufactured or  
15 contrived.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- who judge falsely are  
17 themselves going to be in a lot of trouble.

18 JOHN: No.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Seriously.

20 JOHN: I'm sure, but they're not going to,  
21 they're not going to --

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- render unto Babylon --

23 JOHN: The Texas Rangers are going to put  
24 this together and they're going to do the right thing,  
25 just as when you come on out, there's not going to be

1 | any sort of problem. You're going to be represented by  
2 | your attorney and it's just going to -- you're going to  
3 | be judged by a jury of your peers and you have a good  
4 | attorney. Now, look at that, guy.

5 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: You know, these are issues,  
6 | of course, we've weighed out and taken a look out day  
7 | by day and looked, looked at every avenue. In fact,  
8 | the truth is, you know, we talk about it every day.

9 |           JOHN: Oh, I, I would assume you would.  
10 | There's nothing else cooking out there, guy. This is a  
11 | major -- This is what's -- what your life's all about  
12 | now.

13 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: So that's why, you know,  
14 | after the Passover, after this day, I think we've had a  
15 | couple things we needed to wind down with these  
16 | attorneys, and it looks pretty good, actually.

17 |           JOHN: Um-hum. Yeah, I think so. I think  
18 | that you're going to be well represented. I think that  
19 | as you come on through you're going to be given a good  
20 | shake. And, as I said --

21 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I don't think --

22 |           JOHN: -- jury of your peers. Now, these are  
23 | people that, that are going to be able to judge this  
24 | whole thing based on the charges and what your  
25 | attorneys' case --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: But here's the thing, John.  
2 Does it look like -- What would it be? Would it be a,  
3 a federal case, a federal court, or is it going to be a  
4 state and -- What, what do you think?

5 JOHN: At this point, I don't know.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: It would seem to be federal,  
7 wouldn't it?

8 JOHN: I don't know. There's all sorts of  
9 different violations here and I really don't know one  
10 way or another which way it's going to go.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: What would be a violation in  
12 regards to the state? I mean, it would seem to me,  
13 from what I heard -- Well, ATF is definitely dealing in  
14 the federal.

15 JOHN: Yeah. This is what you pay your  
16 attorneys for. I'm afraid they're going to have to  
17 tell you what's --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

19 JOHN: They're going to work that out.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: You haven't been through this  
21 before yourself then, huh?

22 JOHN: Say it again.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I said you haven't been  
24 through this before yourself, huh?

25 JOHN: Well, I've been on -- been through

1 | this thing, but I can't make mention of -- As far as  
2 | you're concerned, just rely on your attorneys. This is  
3 | what you're retaining them for. You're retaining them  
4 | for their advice and counsel. And we can't give you  
5 | anything along that line. That'll just cloud the  
6 | issue. But I think you're doing the right thing is  
7 | dealing with the attorneys. I think you're doing the  
8 | right thing on wanting everybody to come on out.

9 |           Now, as far as the folks in there, we're  
10 | concerned about the gals that are expecting and have --  
11 | Did Judy get back and let us know -- or let you know  
12 | whether or not they're going to be available?

13 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No, she never did. In fact,  
14 | I didn't ask her to.

15 |           JOHN: Okay.

16 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: She herself, her finger's  
17 | doing extremely bad. I mean --

18 |           JOHN: Oh, that's the garlic on the finger is  
19 | not working?

20 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: The which?

21 |           JOHN: The garlic on the finger is not  
22 | working?

23 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Neither is the salt or the  
24 | pepper.

25 |           JOHN: Well, this is something that she had

1 | made mention of. I don't mean to be facetious, but --

2 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, she did? Oh, I  
3 | thought -- Oh, I thought you were kidding me.

4 |           JOHN: No, no, this is what she told us. She  
5 | put garlic on the finger and everything just bounced  
6 | around. And --

7 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, she was probably being  
8 | a little light with you, I think.

9 |           JOHN: I hope. I was hoping that, but you  
10 | never can tell.

11 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I know she's, she's got a  
12 | very dry sense of humor.

13 |           JOHN: Yeah.

14 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Very dry.

15 |           JOHN: You have one, too. It occasionally  
16 | comes off.

17 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't know. I guess right  
18 | now --

19 |           JOHN: So does David, as a matter of fact. I  
20 | enjoyed his sense of humor. By the way, Steve, would  
21 | it be possible for you to put down the phone for a few  
22 | seconds and go and check on those two gals?

23 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no. I, I'll tell you the  
24 | truth. I'm real tired. I'm sitting in the chair right  
25 | now. To get up and go run around, and I, I already

1 | know what the answer's going to be anyway. But what I  
2 | will do is try to get some information, talk with them,  
3 | maybe see what happens for tomorrow.

4 |           JOHN: Yeah. We're -- What we'd like to do  
5 | is have the ladies call us tonight, if possible, and  
6 | we're concerned about their health.

7 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: That's not going to happen.

8 |           JOHN: Now, these gals that are in there,  
9 | it's -- Unfortunately, the diet they're eating, I guess  
10 | there's not a whole lot of fresh food or --

11 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: If you could, if you could do  
12 | something for them, they would call. But if you can't,  
13 | you know, they -- Apparently, I was told, and I was not  
14 | involved when they first called the other day and were  
15 | asking for milk and so forth.

16 |           JOHN: Um-hum.

17 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: And they asked for, if I  
18 | remember right, chicken feed or --

19 |           JOHN: Yeah, something like that.

20 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: -- something. I don't  
21 | remember. But, anyway, apparently they were told to go  
22 | to their attorneys or ask the attorneys or something.

23 |           JOHN: It was something to the effect that  
24 | the one -- They came on out --

25 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, essentially, they don't

1 | want to talk to any of you. Or they decided that if  
2 | that's the way you people are, they're not going to  
3 | have anything to do with you.

4 |           JOHN: Um-hum. Well --

5 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: And I can't do anything about  
6 | it. You know, this is what they told me.

7 |           JOHN: Well, we're concerned about their  
8 | health.

9 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: They don't believe you.

10 |           JOHN: I'm sure you're concerned about it,  
11 | too, aren't you?

12 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: You know, they don't believe  
13 | that because your actions aren't that loud. Seriously.  
14 | Come on, John. I mean, whether you have a part to play  
15 | in this or not, I mean, you know, overall, they're --

16 |           JOHN: We are very -- What do you think we  
17 | talk -- Why do you think we want them out of there?  
18 | This is not going to get any better. You look around,  
19 | the conditions they're living in, their diet is --

20 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I sure wish there was a way I  
21 | --

22 |           JOHN: -- not what expectant, expectant  
23 | mothers should be eating. That's just not the way to  
24 | do it, and you know that in your own heart. This is  
25 | not a place for, for the gals that are expecting, nor

1 | those kids.

2 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: What you don't understand,  
3 | what you don't understand is, you know, literally,  
4 | there were billions of people back 5,000 years ago and  
5 | 8 people got into a boat and were saved. Christ in  
6 | Matthew 24 says as it was in the days of Noah, so shall  
7 | it be in the days when the seventh man is revealed.

8 |           JOHN: There you go again. You're going off  
9 | on this Bible tangent.

10 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, but John, John, John,  
11 | John, listen.

12 |           JOHN: We're talking about these kids, we're  
13 | talking about these women.

14 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: That's what I'm talking  
15 | about. That's why they're not --

16 |           JOHN: Aaahhh.

17 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Listen, that's where the  
18 | whole crux of the matter lies. God's got  
19 | (indiscernible) in the last days the whole world is  
20 | confused. Everybody thinks they know God. They said  
21 | they were followers.

22 |           JOHN: Well, we're talking about reality.  
23 | God is going to put these gals --

24 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Hey, reality, reality is --

25 |           JOHN: Reality is these kids are not getting



1 | food. The women are expecting.  
2 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: It's reality.  
3 |           JOHN: They're not getting the proper --  
4 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: -- it's foolishness.  
5 | They're --  
6 |           JOHN: When was the last time those kids were  
7 | out in the sun?  
8 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Probably yesterday.  
9 |           JOHN: Oh, really?  
10 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.  
11 |           JOHN: Where?  
12 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm not saying.  
13 |           JOHN: Oh, all right.  
14 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: (Laughter.)  
15 |           JOHN: I'd be amazed and astounded if that  
16 | were the case. If that is, well, it's interesting.  
17 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I don't even know. I  
18 | don't know. I have no idea. I just thought I'd throw  
19 | that in there for fun.  
20 |           JOHN: Well, I'm sure you have a lot of fun  
21 | occasionally. As I said, I appreciate your sense of  
22 | humor.  
23 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Is there any sunshine?  
24 |           JOHN: Yeah, sunshine.  
25 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, there's the windows.

1 | You know, they open up the windows. They're getting  
2 | fresh air and sunshine.

3 |           JOHN: Yeah. It's still not the way it  
4 | should be.

5 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: You know, that was really a  
6 | bad thing that -- It wasn't Ricks, it was Swenson I  
7 | guess it was, Dick Swenson. He mentioned how these  
8 | people lifted up the babies in the windows. That was a  
9 | bunch of nonsense.

10 |           JOHN: Did that or did that not happen?

11 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No, it did not happen.

12 |           JOHN: Okay. A lot of people seem to think  
13 | otherwise.

14 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, no, no, it never  
15 | happened. In fact, you know, that was the first I even  
16 | heard of such a thing.

17 |           JOHN: Um-hum.

18 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: All of us are --

19 |           JOHN: Were you guys watching her doing that?

20 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Never have considered doing  
21 | that. Never have. We're not that way. I mean, why do  
22 | you think right now I'd come walking right out the  
23 | front here? I'm not bothered by that kind of thing.  
24 | Don't you -- And these people aren't either. I mean,  
25 | when I came out to talk to Byron Sage when he was in

1 | the tank or in the Bradley --

2 |         JOHN: Right.

3 |         MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I talked to Tom in the  
4 | Bradley, I mean, if they wanted to take me out, I mean,  
5 | it's my time. I'm not --

6 |         JOHN: Okay. Now, let's show you that we are  
7 | serious about getting you out safely.

8 |         MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you can see how serious  
9 | we are about loving people, right from the very day we,  
10 | we called Larry Lynch and the FBI. And we're the ones  
11 | that asked for the cease fire to get these poor wounded  
12 | out.

13 |         JOHN: All right.

14 |         MR. SCHNEIDER: And that's how your FBI guys  
15 | running around here have acted ever -- It's awesome.  
16 | It's actually an insult to our very integrity --

17 |         JOHN: The situation is there. They are  
18 | trying -- They're there to protect you, but they're not  
19 | sure how you're --

20 |         MR. SCHNEIDER: They're not here, they're not  
21 | here to protect us.

22 |         JOHN: Yes, they are.

23 |         MR. SCHNEIDER: -- this property --

24 |         JOHN: All these strange people coming  
25 | through, we don't want anything to happen to you, guy.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: (indiscernible)

2 JOHN: Listen to me, Steve. It's me.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: They flip us the finger and  
4 they make all those gestures.

5 JOHN: Oh, Steve, those things, if they  
6 happened, then I'm sure that's unfortunate. On the, on  
7 the big picture, these guys want you out. They want to  
8 resolve this thing. They want to go home. You want to  
9 get your message out.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: I want to get home, too. I  
11 am home. I don't -- Who ever said we want to get our  
12 message out? Where do you get that from?

13 JOHN: Well, this is what -- Hey, remember  
14 David wanted us to play that message, that 58 --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: That was something he came up  
16 with for that time.

17 JOHN: Okay. He's still talking about  
18 getting his message out. What about the book?

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, but he's never -- And  
20 if he isn't God, God will get it out, or it's a lost  
21 stupid cause in the first place. Isn't that true?

22 JOHN: No.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Take a look sometime at Acts  
24 5 and 6 and you'll see that if it's of God, it'll  
25 stand; if it's not, it's foolishness.

1 JOHN: Yeah.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: It's a waste of time.

3 JOHN: Okay.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: And that's been our attitude  
5 from day one, if there's --

6 JOHN: Something has just happened.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

8 JOHN: Now, let me see, in a situation like  
9 that, are you hungry?

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: What do you mean?

11 JOHN: Are you hungry? You know, pizza, can  
12 try to --

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, not at all. I'm not  
14 hungry. I just ate.

15 JOHN: How about the Colonel?

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: How about the what?

17 JOHN: The Colonel, a little of the Kentucky  
18 Fried Chicken. Remember that?

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: I have no -- All that sort of  
20 thing, I'm not bothered with food.

21 JOHN: Uh-huh.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm a very light eater.  
23 Food's never been my thing.

24 JOHN: Well, David's, David's pretty hungry.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not at all.

1 JOHN: If he was to come out and -- Well, he  
2 enjoys --

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah, which is contrary  
4 to the ATF, also, because him and I were both in town  
5 numerous times the time they said we weren't.

6 JOHN: Um-hum.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'll give you the names and  
8 places and where we went, what we did, where we ate,  
9 and all of that.

10 JOHN: Oh, you enjoyed a good meal now and  
11 then out there, didn't you? Steve.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hmmm.

13 JOHN: You enjoy a good meal?

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, food is not my thing.

15 JOHN: Of course not. But I think it might  
16 be from time to time. It's a little break from what  
17 you're eating now.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, what I'm eating now is  
19 actually pretty good. It really is.

20 JOHN: Oh, Steve.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: It's not half bad at all.

22 JOHN: I've had this a couple of times  
23 myself, and I'm wondering good grief, what that does to  
24 my digestive system.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: None of us -- Obviously, none

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Why not? Hey, look, what I'm  
2 looking for is I'm going to be traveling throughout the  
3 expanses of space and true religion --

4 JOHN: Have they been talking to Amen again?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, listen to me. True  
6 religion is education. You should know that yourself.

7 JOHN: Um-hum.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: It was never meant to be  
9 rituals and some traditional thing without  
10 understanding. Everything that's done, you should have  
11 an understanding about. It's progression of the mind  
12 to the greatest degrees, constantly inventing,  
13 constantly creating, constantly moving forward in joy,  
14 always learning.

15 JOHN: Well, that's great that we're doing  
16 that in life in general, but I, I pursue learning in a  
17 different direction. Look, if you could, would you  
18 check with those two gals and find out how things are  
19 going? We're going to have to take a break right now.  
20 And if you could, if you choose to, why don't you give  
21 us a call back in about 45 minutes or so?

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I'll probably be calling  
23 you in the morning because --

24 JOHN: Okay. Well, that's fair.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'll call you in the morning

1 JOHN: Whenever you're comfortable. And if  
2 something comes up, if you want to bring it to our  
3 attention, bring it to our attention.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Do you have to get off the  
5 phone, John, or what?

6 JOHN: Well, something has come up that we  
7 have to address right now.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Do you have, do you have a  
9 committee meeting?

10 JOHN: No, nothing like that.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

12 JOHN: Okay?

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, John, it's been good  
14 talking to you.

15 JOHN: As usual, Steve, it's always a  
16 pleasure.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: I will pray for you.

18 JOHN: Say hello to David for us. Tell him  
19 that we're --

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'll do that.

21 JOHN: -- thinking about him and, hopefully,  
22 we'll have a chance to meet him fairly soon.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I hope so.

24 JOHN: Okay?

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: I hope on the best of



1 | circumstances.

2 |           JOHN: So do I.

3 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Take care, John.

4 |           JOHN: Bye.

5 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Bye.

6 |                           \* \* \* \* \*

7 |           JOHN-5: Good morning.

8 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Hi.

9 |           JOHN-5: How are you doing?

10 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Who am I speaking with?

11 |           JOHN-5: John-5

12 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, I thought so. Yeah,  
13 | the reason I'm calling is because your guys just shot  
14 | something off, a couple of loud bangs. We don't know  
15 | if it was cannon --

16 |           JOHN-5: Probably flash -- Do you have  
17 | somebody walking around out there?

18 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Nobody.

19 |           JOHN-5: Are you sure? Nobody by the water  
20 | tower?

21 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Positively.

22 |           JOHN-5: Okay.

23 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: What was it? John, what was  
24 | it?

25 |           JOHN-5: Is there someone --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: They, they shot off a flash,  
2 you say?

3 JOHN-5: I don't know. But are you aware of  
4 the rules of safety, right?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, yeah. I mean, no one's  
6 ever gone out of here for any reason. No one goes out  
7 here.

8 JOHN-5: No one's out there?

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Nobody's out there.

10 JOHN-5: No one can exit the building with a  
11 weapon? Nobody --

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: No. In fact, I was just busy  
13 talking and all of a sudden I heard a kaboom, and David  
14 says -- I went up and he says what was that? I says I  
15 have no idea. He says well, call them and find out  
16 what they're doing.

17 JOHN-5: Okay. Steve?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

19 JOHN-5: I want you to check with your  
20 people, all of them, okay? Now, you're not -- If you  
21 were just doing something, you're not sure what  
22 everybody in the compound was doing, correct?

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's correct. But,  
24 you know --

25 JOHN-5: Okay, tell you what you do. Just to

1 | play it safe, play it safe, Steve --

2 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

3 |           JOHN-5: -- go and check with everybody in  
4 | the compound, determine if anybody was outside and why,  
5 | and give me a call back, okay?

6 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, so far, you know,  
7 | here's, here's what the rules are.

8 |           JOHN-5: Now, just -- Steve, Steve --

9 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm going to do that.

10 |           JOHN-5: -- it's for safety for everybody,  
11 | okay?

12 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I know. I'm going to do  
13 | that.

14 |           JOHN-5: But just do it. Do it and then give  
15 | me a call back, okay?

16 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

17 |           JOHN-5: Thank you.

18 |                                   \* \* \* \* \*

19 |           JOHN: Hello, Steve?

20 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: What's going on? How come no  
21 | one's -- Look, is this John?

22 |           JOHN: Yeah, that's right.

23 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Why aren't you answering the  
24 | phone?

25 |           JOHN: We're trying to get everything

1 | straight here. We wanted to make sure -- find out what  
2 | happened on our side, to make sure that everything --

3 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I checked with  
4 | everybody. I had everybody called down around all over  
5 | the place and nobody went outside, not anybody.

6 |           JOHN: Okay. Nobody seemed to know anything  
7 | around here. We're calling up front and something --  
8 | nothing has come back yet. I didn't want to get on the  
9 | line with you until I got the whole story.

10 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I see. Yeah --

11 |           JOHN: I didn't want to waste your time.

12 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I asked everybody and I told  
13 | them to call and ask and check with everybody. They  
14 | did and no one's figured out what's going on.

15 |           JOHN: Okay. Steve, take it from the top for  
16 | me. What happened out there? Now, you were in the  
17 | compound somewhere, and what happened?

18 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I just heard it myself.  
19 | They say -- I heard from five people that are near me  
20 | right now. They said they heard two booms. I only  
21 | heard one. It was louder than like a gunshot. It was  
22 | more like some -- a small, what, what would you say?

23 |           UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: A shotgun.

24 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Like a shotgun is what --

25 |           JOHN: Like a shotgun?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

2 JOHN: Where did it, where did it come from?

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Where did it come from?

4 (Talking to someone else.)

5 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: -- from the rear.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: From the rear of the  
7 building, I guess, which would be apparently the north  
8 or the east side.

9 JOHN: The north or the east side of the  
10 compound?

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

12 JOHN: Okay. And then what -- Was there --  
13 Are you absolutely positive nobody was outside?

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Positively guarantee it, no  
15 question about it. Everybody's accounted, accounted.

16 JOHN: Okay. Nobody said they were outside  
17 for any reason?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly. No one was.

19 JOHN: All right.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: In fact, you know, we've got  
21 a rule here ourselves. We don't want people out  
22 running around or doing things. We always want to make  
23 sure what's going on ourselves. It's a big deal here.

24 JOHN: Yeah, I can imagine. You're fully  
25 aware of the rules for your safety?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, not only that. Even  
2 before you guys made your own rules, I mean, we have  
3 our own anyway that are, you know, it's common sense.

4 JOHN: We don't know what happened here. Our  
5 guys just came on through.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: So they don't know and --  
7 That is weird.

8 JOHN: Yeah. We wanted to get this thing all  
9 nailed down.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: It came from the barn, you  
11 think? (Talking to someone else.) They said it came  
12 from the garage.

13 JOHN: Where would be your garage? I'm  
14 trying --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's, that's north,  
16 north --

17 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: It's already on  
18 the news.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: It's already on the news?

20 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Yeah.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: On the north side of the, the  
22 building.

23 JOHN: The north side. Okay. Is that where  
24 the swimming pool is?

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no. This is way -- quite

1 a distance. It's a white building, it's, it's a block,  
2 block building.

3 JOHN: Okay. This may be -- I have no idea.  
4 This may have nothing to do with our whole operation  
5 here.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. I, I wondered about  
7 that. It definitely didn't have anything to do with  
8 us, 'cause everybody's in the building. (Female voice  
9 in background not discernible.)

10 JOHN: You're hearing something on the radio?

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Here's what they said. The  
12 flare went off and they heard someone say yahoo.

13 JOHN: A flare went off?

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's what someone just  
15 said. They heard --

16 JOHN: Okay, this is, this is way down by  
17 your barn?

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Is that another  
19 one?

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Anyway, they said  
21 that --

22 JOHN: This is way down by your barn?

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes. A flare went off and --

24 JOHN: Okay. How far is your barn from where  
25 you guys are?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: How far is the barn from  
2 here? It's quite a distance. (Talking to someone  
3 else.)

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Two hundred and  
5 fifty yards.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Two hundred and fifty yards?

7 JOHN: Two hundred and --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Or more than that. Three,  
9 four hundred yards.

10 JOHN: So you're looking at about maybe four  
11 or five football fields?

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Easy, yeah.

13 JOHN: Okay. And that's what, north of where  
14 you are?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly.

16 JOHN: All right.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: And they did hear -- I --  
18 They did hear someone say yahoo after it went off.

19 JOHN: A yahoo and then one or two  
20 explosions, you're not sure?

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Two explosions.

22 JOHN: Okay. And that went down the line and  
23 you had nobody down there?

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: No one. No one. No one left  
25 this building. That's why everybody came and said



1 | what's going on.

2 |           JOHN: Okay. Do you know if you have anybody  
3 | down there?

4 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No, positively not.

5 |           JOHN: Okay.

6 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Positively not.

7 |           JOHN: There might be somebody trying to get  
8 | in again, I don't know. I, I -- It may have --

9 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I suppose.

10 |           JOHN: We don't know. It's just --

11 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, no, everybody is here  
12 | and accounted for. No one's left the building.

13 |           JOHN: Okay. Is anybody hurt or anything  
14 | wrong?

15 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No one is.

16 |           JOHN: Okay.

17 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: But they -- everybody's  
18 | asking what's going on, of course.

19 |           JOHN: Yeah, I can easily understand why  
20 | you're concerned. We're concerned about it, too, for  
21 | obvious reasons.

22 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Well, let me -- I'm  
23 | going to go check around here a little bit --

24 |           JOHN: Yeah.

25 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and I'll call back.

1 JOHN: Steve, give me a shout back on that.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, I'll call.

3 JOHN: And, you know, make sure that they  
4 understand the seriousness of this.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah, they do.

6 JOHN: And they understand the rules for  
7 safety.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: They do know. They do know.

9 JOHN: Okay, old man.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'll call you in a bit.

11 JOHN: Okay, bye.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Bye.

13 \* \* \* \* \*

14 JOHN: Steve?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello, John.

16 JOHN: Right.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: So did you ever find anything  
18 out about all that?

19 JOHN: Okay. Right off the bat, how about  
20 your situation? Did you --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I checked everywhere,  
22 and it took me all this time to make sure everybody was  
23 accounted for and no one left the premises.

24 JOHN: Okay. From what we understand, there  
25 was something out there. We don't know exactly what

1 | happened. We didn't do anything. We're hoping that  
2 | somebody was trying to sneak in with something and it  
3 | went off, or something along that line.

4 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Someone that was trying to  
5 | what, come onto the property?

6 |           JOHN: Yeah. Like your friend Jesse Amen, or  
7 | who was the other one? Louie or --

8 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, what they said, what  
9 | they actually heard, there was two booms. The first  
10 | one was a boom, the second was another boom, and then  
11 | it was a flare-like light type thing that went up into  
12 | the air.

13 |           JOHN: Jesus.

14 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. And they heard  
15 | somebody say yahoo.

16 |           JOHN: Yahoo.

17 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: There was a number -- Yeah, a  
18 | number of persons heard somebody say yahoo when the  
19 | second one went off.

20 |           JOHN: Okay. Did any of your people see  
21 | anybody running towards where you guys are?

22 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No. No, because, see, they  
23 | didn't -- By the time -- When they heard the boom, of  
24 | course --

25 |           JOHN: Yeah.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- you know, then everybody's  
2 wondering where did it come from.

3 JOHN: Um-hum.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: And then one -- There was a  
5 couple of people that were looking out and they saw the  
6 light or saw the light up and they said that they  
7 thought it came from the barn or from that garage area.

8 JOHN: Okay. We didn't pick up anybody out  
9 there. I thought they, they had, but nothing along  
10 that line happened.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

12 JOHN: So the thought might be that maybe  
13 somebody was trying to get in. That's, that's what  
14 we're looking at right now.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: So you don't think that a  
16 couple of the guys you've got back here shot off a, a  
17 flare or something to see what was going on?

18 JOHN: I don't think so. That wasn't  
19 reported in to us, and I think they have to be  
20 accountable for all that kind of stuff out there. And  
21 they're saying no up there. So --

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, they thought -- it was  
23 kind of strange, I mean --

24 JOHN: Yeah.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- people around here and --

1 JOHN: You know, you've got all this crazy  
2 stuff going on now and that's, you know, you start  
3 having your crazies and zanies start moving in there.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know yourself some  
5 of the things these guys are doing out and around the  
6 building, I mean, I could tell you a number of things  
7 they did today. And people inside here, I mean, you've  
8 got to remember I'm only one person.

9 JOHN: Right.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: People --

11 JOHN: You're the voice of reason in there, I  
12 hope, Steve.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Pardon?

14 JOHN: You're the voice of reason in there.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, yeah, I've tried to be.

16 JOHN: And you try to make things happen.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: But there are people all over  
18 this building, and when, when you have guys on the  
19 outside doing weird things like some of the times  
20 they're -- I mean, who knows what's going to ever  
21 happen?

22 JOHN: Yeah. That's what we're -- You're  
23 absolutely right.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: You had a Bradley today come  
25 right up to the back of the building here, right up to

1 | it. They dropped the back part of the, the gate or  
2 | the, the back -- whatever you want to call it.

3 |                 JOHN: Steve, you know this could be only the  
4 | start. You've got these groups out here, you've got  
5 | not our guys, but, you know, you have this fringe  
6 | element that comes through here. We're hoping to  
7 | maintain your -- the safety of everybody involved. Not  
8 | only you, but, more specifically, me.

9 |                 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right now I'm more  
10 | concerned -- Well, I'm more concerned about your guys,  
11 | the way they're acting. Like the way they came up to  
12 | the fence here tonight and act like they -- You know  
13 | what I mean? Revving up the engine and --

14 |                 JOHN: Yeah. Okay. You understand your --  
15 | the rules we have for your safety, right?

16 |                 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, yeah.

17 |                 JOHN: Okay. Now --

18 |                 MR. SCHNEIDER: I just hope you don't have  
19 | any (indiscernible) men inside these tin cans.

20 |                 JOHN: Right. I understand about that. Now,  
21 | I think it's getting to the time now, guys, you better  
22 | start thinking, 'cause everybody's safety is starting  
23 | to become a factor. I think you might want to start  
24 | thinking about coming out and start doing some deep  
25 | praying, whatever you guys do, to get the sign to come

1 | out and do the right thing. Because I --

2 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, we --

3 | JOHN: This stuff is just going to start  
4 | continuing.

5 | MR. SCHNEIDER: John, you know we've always  
6 | wanted to do the right thing. I mean --

7 | JOHN: Right.

8 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- that's why we're here  
9 | right now. I mean --

10 | JOHN: And you know the right thing is to  
11 | come on out and get this thing --

12 | MR. SCHNEIDER: The right thing -- lamb of  
13 | God, because, I mean, that's the, the bottom line for  
14 | us. It always has been. So, you know, I mean, God's  
15 | first, man is second. After that, well, you know --

16 | JOHN: Um-hum. And I have a feel, you know,  
17 | God might be telling you something by all these  
18 | incidents out here, that maybe it's time that you took  
19 | your people and came on out and be safe.

20 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, the incidents, 99  
21 | percent of any kind of incidents have been from your  
22 | guys running around in the tanks, the Bradleys, and  
23 | doing some of the things they do out here.

24 | JOHN: Well, regardless of what's happening,  
25 | it's not our guys this time. I can tell you that right

1 off the bat.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well --

3 JOHN: So with a situation like this, it's  
4 starting to, starting to happen.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Your guys are the ones that  
6 are back by the garage, for sure, 'cause I've seen them  
7 with their sandbags. I saw them way back --

8 JOHN: Okay, did you see this thing?

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: People reported to me that it  
10 came right from the garage.

11 JOHN: From the garage?

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes. The flare was shot up  
13 in the air.

14 JOHN: Is there anything in the garage that  
15 you can know of? Is there any --

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, your guys are in there.  
17 They --

18 JOHN: They are in there? Are you sure?

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Positively guaranteed. They  
20 are in there.

21 JOHN: All right. Now, when was the last  
22 time you saw any activity out there?

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: I, I --

24 JOHN: You personally?

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Me personally? Probably last



1 week.

2 JOHN: Well, okay. All right. If we don't  
3 know anything about it, you guys don't know anything  
4 about it last week, so let's take it -- Let's talk,  
5 about -- Okay, how are you doing with the gals that are  
6 expecting? Have you heard anything more about them?

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I haven't, other than I'm  
8 sure they're -- I'm sure they still are.

9 JOHN: Yeah, okay. (Laughing.) That sounds  
10 like -- But I'm curious about their general condition,  
11 'cause that was brought up --

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: They're fat. They're  
13 definitely fat.

14 JOHN: Definitely fat. Uh-huh. And --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: (indiscernible) in the same  
16 way.

17 JOHN: Oh, you never can tell. Things like  
18 that happen. No, we would like to talk to them if  
19 it's --

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: What were you going to say?  
21 You were going to say you were brought up how or what?

22 JOHN: No, we'd definitely like to talk to  
23 them. Now, that's Nicole, as I recall.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Pardon?

25 JOHN: Nicole is one of the gals?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, if she said so I  
2 wouldn't -- I wouldn't doubt anybody here that said  
3 they were pregnant.

4 JOHN: Yeah. Okay.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Anyway --

6 JOHN: Yeah, I'd like to talk with her, if  
7 possibly you could get her on the line.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, of course, no one's up.  
9 Usually, most of those turn in early --

10 JOHN: Yeah.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- if they're pregnant,  
12 especially --

13 JOHN: Are they still doing the lights out  
14 there?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: What do you mean? Your guys  
16 out there?

17 JOHN: Yeah.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah.

19 JOHN: Okay.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Most definitely.

21 JOHN: And there are still some sounds going  
22 on?

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah. Yeah.

24 JOHN: Okay.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I think I hear

1 something in the background. They're always doing  
2 that. I mean, they break once in awhile for a couple  
3 minutes here and there.

4 JOHN: Steve --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah?

6 JOHN: -- the amount of effort that's going  
7 on and the control that you're showing in there, it's  
8 very commendable, but you're going to have to start  
9 thinking about this. You can't put up with this  
10 forever. You're going to have to come out. This is  
11 just -- It's going to continue and continue.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not only do I want to come  
13 out, I mean I really do, I want to come out and go up.  
14 Actually, I'd like to go up more than out.

15 JOHN: Okay, by up, there?

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: No.

17 JOHN: You going to go out and have a pizza  
18 or something?

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: You don't want me -- No, you  
20 don't want me to read all the Prophecies to you.

21 JOHN: Oh, God, no. We talked about that  
22 before.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, John, no.

24 JOHN: But I have to say I'll cut you a deal  
25 on that.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah?

2 JOHN: What I'll be interested in if you in  
3 fact come out and -- within the next day or two or  
4 something along that line, I guarantee you I'd love to  
5 hear what you have to say, and maybe as far as --

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: I doubt that, John, I really  
7 doubt it.

8 JOHN: Oh, no. You'd be surprised. I --

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: I really would be. I would  
10 be.

11 JOHN: Um-hum. No, 'cause I have an interest  
12 in the new age and all this other business.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: New age? Now, why would you,  
14 John, have an interest in new age for?

15 JOHN: My dear friend, we sit down and  
16 discuss that kind of thing.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: I can understand -- What kind  
18 of a background did you have? If you told me your  
19 background, it'd make a lot of sense to me. What your  
20 parents were, what kind of religious affiliation you  
21 had. No, seriously, for years I've always been  
22 interested in people, where they come from, what  
23 they're into, why.

24 JOHN: Well, I can easily understand that and  
25 I'll definitely go into that thing when you come out.

1 | You said something that was interesting before. I'm  
2 | just catching onto it now. What did you mean by go up?

3 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, when I said go up.

4 |           JOHN: Yeah.

5 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, a lot of the Prophecies  
6 | talk about how God's going to redeem his people, you  
7 | know, I mean --

8 |           JOHN: Does that mean you're going to die?

9 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, no, not at all.

10 |           JOHN: I would hope not.

11 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Not at all. I said go up.

12 | You know, some people believe in the second coming of  
13 | Christ, some believe in being raptured.

14 |           JOHN: Um-hum.

15 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: If you look at the  
16 | Prophecies, it talks about the possibilities of God's  
17 | people in the final days being taken out without seeing  
18 | death even. But nowhere does it ever -- I mean, you  
19 | yourself know what the commandments teach about thou  
20 | shalt not kill. I mean, one cannot take -- commit --  
21 | take their own life.

22 |           JOHN: Okay. So you folks are not thinking  
23 | about taking your own lives?

24 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Never, ever. Never.

25 |           JOHN: Not any grand motion, grand --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Let's call it, let's call it  
2 an unpardonable sin, because how can you get -- I mean,  
3 once you're dead, the judgment is set for you. What  
4 can you do to change it?

5 JOHN: Okay, no dramatic move, no final  
6 statement?

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, no, of course not.

8 JOHN: All right, Steve.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: That can never be. Never  
10 could be.

11 JOHN: Don't disappoint me on this.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Don't worry. I mean, there's  
13 no way in the world. I'd be terrified to do something  
14 like that.

15 JOHN: Well, what about, what about David,  
16 would he --

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, it's the same thing. He  
18 would never even consider such a thing.

19 JOHN: Um-hum. All right, because this  
20 business about the -- well, just the feeling we're  
21 getting, we get the idea that you might want to be  
22 doing something like that.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: What on earth? I mean, I  
24 mean, you know Marc Breault, the guy that started all  
25 this, he's a person that said we were going to do this

1 | thing a year-and-a-half, two years ago. Everytime  
2 | there's an event like Passover, something coming  
3 | around, he gets ahold of the press, he gets ahold of  
4 | this agency, that agency, and starts the same  
5 | slanderous rumors.

6 |           JOHN: Um-hum.

7 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: We're still here.

8 |           JOHN: That's why I want you to come out, to  
9 | hear your side of this stuff, guy.

10 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, no.

11 |           JOHN: You get all these clowns running  
12 | around, bad-mouthing you till the cows come home.

13 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Listen, John --

14 |           JOHN: And you have nobody out here --

15 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: -- nobody out there is  
16 | interested in hearing my story and what I'm into,  
17 | looking at a dead dog. I mean, I mean, and -- Let's be  
18 | real, you and I.

19 |           JOHN: Um-hum. See, there are other  
20 | Davidians that are saying --

21 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: You need to get home and --

22 |           JOHN: Wait a minute. There are Davidians  
23 | that are saying that David might do something like  
24 | that. So that's what --

25 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Other Davidians? See, we're

1 not even -- we don't call ourselves Davidians. I'm a  
2 student of the Bible. That's -- None of us here have  
3 ever called ourselves twigs or branches or roots or  
4 anything else.

5 JOHN: Or splinters maybe?

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, not at all. I mean,  
7 isn't that -- Truly, seriously, we don't call ourselves  
8 those things. It was again this Marc Breault that  
9 started calling us branches and all this crap.

10 JOHN: Right.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: But ourselves, people came  
12 here because they wanted -- Okay, this guys says he can  
13 open the book. Well, can you or can't you? Let's show  
14 it, see it, show us.

15 JOHN: Um-hum.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: And the guy's been producing,  
17 so we've remained.

18 JOHN: Um-hum. How's everybody else in there  
19 tonight, since this thing went off?

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: You mean since that kaboom?

21 JOHN: Yeah.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: It made -- David actually got  
23 pretty -- He was -- made some pretty strong statements.

24 JOHN: Like what?

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, he thinks if



1 | it's you guys, you know, he does not -- he said you  
2 | people have been encroaching and doing more and more  
3 | everyday and it doesn't go unnoticed and unchecked.

4 |           JOHN: Um-hum.

5 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: And, you know, I mean, I'm,  
6 | I'm concerned myself about what you guys are doing --

7 |           JOHN: Oh, absolutely.

8 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: -- because, ultimately, I  
9 | know what could happen. I think you and I both know.

10 |           JOHN: Absolutely. That's why safety is an  
11 | issue, as I keep hammering into your head.

12 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, but the --

13 |           JOHN: Safety, safety, guy.

14 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: You've got to remember our  
15 | spiritual safety is first. You've got to know that,  
16 | John. I mean --

17 |           JOHN: Nobody's going to take your  
18 | spirituality away from you.

19 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: You don't --

20 |           JOHN: That's yours, hang onto it.

21 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: You wouldn't understand --

22 |           JOHN: Be my guest, enjoy.

23 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: -- unless you took the time  
24 | to see what some old farting prophets had to say. You  
25 | understand?

1 JOHN: (Laughing.) Oh, me.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, like you have old  
3 Noah. He was an old geezer. I mean, who bought what  
4 he had to say in Jesus' days, you know.

5 JOHN: He managed to pull it off. But just  
6 remember, guy, the business about your spiritual  
7 safety, that's -- you've got yours locked down. It's  
8 no problem. Nobody's going to take that away from you.  
9 But your physical safety, that's everybody's concern  
10 and I'm afraid something crazy might happen in there.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: We're not concerned about  
12 that. You guys love us, you're going to take care of  
13 us. We're coming out. It's just we're waiting to hear  
14 the last of this. I mean, it's happened before, like I  
15 told you, and I know he's going to get the word and  
16 it'll be done and on into the prophets we go.

17 JOHN: Yeah. That's -- Hey, look, that's  
18 inevitable, that's a given.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah. Oh, yeah.

20 JOHN: I can't --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: You know --

22 JOHN: It's got to be worked out, and you  
23 know it and I know it.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: For sure.

25 JOHN: And there's just no way around it.

1 | There's no way we can side-step it.

2 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I actually thought that by  
3 | now it probably would have been, seriously. I really  
4 | have -- I did think so, a lot of us did. So even  
5 | himself, I mean, he's -- he showed quite a prophesy  
6 | last night. He opened up something that was pretty  
7 | deep.

8 |           JOHN: Um-hum.

9 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: And he showed this new guy,  
10 | Louis, some awesome things about physics.

11 |           JOHN: Who, Alaniz or --

12 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes, Alaniz or whatever.

13 |           JOHN: Alaniz, okay. You know, these cajun  
14 | names throw me from time to time.

15 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, boy. That's the first  
16 | cajun I've ever met in my life.

17 |           JOHN: Uh-huh.

18 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: And I'd even seen a movie  
19 | once called "Southern Comfort." It was kind of a weird  
20 | -- crazy, weird movie.

21 |           JOHN: "Southern Comfort," is that, is that  
22 | about the National Guard?

23 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I believe it is, yeah, 'cause  
24 | I only saw part of it, so I can't remember the last  
25 | part of it.

1 JOHN: Same here. I think I read a review on  
2 it or something along that line.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well --

4 JOHN: Okay, guy. So you're here, you're got  
5 everything under control in the --

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah.

7 JOHN: -- compound? Nobody's thinking about  
8 doing anything silly?

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: John, you have -- Listen,  
10 John, you have everything in control out there?

11 JOHN: Well, I wish it was my place to be in  
12 control.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm more concerned about your  
14 safety --

15 JOHN: Yeah, you have a concern to be -- you  
16 have every right to be concerned, because there are  
17 some crazies and zanies. Not our people, but --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, yeah, I know. I ran  
19 into them. Their letters were ATF, as I recall.

20 JOHN: Yeah. Hey, not to get too heavy into  
21 the religious angle, just sort of thinking about it, in  
22 like 15 words or less, what was prophesy David -- what  
23 was the prophesy David was shown?

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: It actually was dealing with  
25 the Seventh Seal, which is Revelation 8 to 22, and its

1 relation to where it's found in the Prophecies  
2 of -- Well, it actually goes from Isaiah to Malachi.  
3 And you said 15 words or less.

4 JOHN: Yeah.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's why I'm already out of  
6 words.

7 JOHN: Right. Okay, so is this the one that  
8 deals with the end of the world or something?

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, yeah. The Seven --
