He said, "Those folks out there at Mount Carmel have 19 20 never caused us one bit of trouble." 21 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's true. 22 That's what he told me. And he said in JIM: '87 or '88 this guy Roden, I don't know his first name. 23 24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Ben Roden. 25 Yeah, and he, he got in a conflict with you guys, there, there was some kind of gunfire and,

and there was a trial. 1 2 MR. SCHNEIDER: And it was all directed by a 3 man by the name of Dickerson, the Sheriff Dickerson. 4 JIM: Well, he didn't, he didn't tell me 5 that. 6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, of course he's not 7 going to tell you that. Our guys heard that this nutty Ben Roden had dug up a grave on the property. 8 9 JIM: Yeah. 10 MR. SCHNEIDER: We were at another place. Oh, his name was George Roden, I'm sorry. 11 12 What, what did he dig up a grave for? JIM: 13 MR. SCHNEIDER: He -- the guy's loony and he 14 wanted to challenge David here to see who could raise this body. And he even called him up and David, you 15 know, made him look like he -- well, just what he is. 16 He says, "Not today, George" and hung up on him. 17 18 Well, the -- you know, the full facts of all 19 that case are on the record and, you know, you --20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, yeah, but if they're all on record then, I mean, I'm, I'm hearing everything 21 22 but what actually happened. 23 JIM: Yeah. 24 MR. I think that they're, you know, in foster care and I think that should be good, you know, in good 5 shape, but of course you're going to miss them. 6 7 SITA: What? 8 HENRY: I'm saying that they're in good shape and I know being a good parent, you have to be 9 10 concerned about them. 11 I'm sorry, can you speak a little bit SITA: 12 -- I can't hardly hear you. 13 HENRY: Okay. Hold on a second. I'm saying being a good parent, you must be concerned about them. 14 15 SITA: Well, I try, try to be a good parent, 16 but --HENRY: Well, I'm sure that you are, I'm sure 17 that you are. Kids are very important to all of us. 18 Family is very important. Anybody that's a good 19 Christian has a, has a sincere interest in seeing that, 20 that the welfare of their children is, is, you know, is 21 22 taken care of. 23 Well, what I have heard on the radio really, I don't know if I did the right thing. 24 25 HENRY: Of course you did the right thing.

You know, as, as --

SITA: I know they're safe out there, but the way I heard on the radio the way they've been treated, it really -- oh, God.

HENRY: Well, I think you're just in a difficult position and as a good parent you have to do whatever you feel is the best thing for your, for your kids. Sometimes decisions are difficult to make but I think you're trying to put yourself in a, in a situation of what is the best thing for my kids and I think that you've done that and I think that that's good.

SITA: I thought so when I heard all the comments where are they going and they're putting -- they're questioning them --I heard so much different -- I heard so much different kind of news on the radio and I don't know what to believe, if you guys going to keep my kids safe and not to harass them.

HENRY: Well, I don't think that anybody wants their kids to be harassed, I'm sure that you don't. And as you say, you want this, you want this whole thing to end so that you can be reunited with your kids. I think that that's what everybody wants and I think that that's, you know, that's what's going to happen. One of the things that I want you to realize though --

SITA: That's what I, I wrote on my -- hello?

1 HENRY: Yes? 2 SITA: Hello? HENRY: Yes, I can hear you. I think that 3 that cord that you have is -- you know, if you move the 4 phone something happens, I'm not sure exactly what. 5 6 SITA: Yeah. 7 HENRY: Well, you know, the, the news media speculates a lot. They guess, you know, and 8 surmise that things might be happening, but they don't 9 really know what's going on, you know, honestly they 10 don't. You know, they, they need to say something and 11 I'd say at least 50 percent of the time they're wrong. 12 They're just speculating, they're guessing. They're 13 trying to make a story sound interesting, they're 14 15 trying to sell news. 16 SITA: Well, that's -- I used to believe the 17 news --18 HENRY: Well --19 -- and the radio, but what I've been 20 hearing and what I saw --21 HENRY: Um-hum. 22 SITA: -- it doesn't -- it's giving me so much negative right now. 23 24 Well, I think that that gives you a perspective, a true perspective on what is true and 25 what is not true; that is, because you're having a

first-hand experience in dealing with the news media. We see it, you know, working in law enforcement and 2 3 people, you know, say why don't you tell the news media everything that's going on, they need to know? But a 5 lot of the times they speculate anyway. So you wonder, you know, is it helpful or is it not helpful. 6 believe that in a situation like this when people's 7 8 lives are at stake, you know, when people have concerns, people like yourself, who is forced to be in 9 a position where you're separated from your kids, you 10 know, we feel that it's in your best interest and 11 everybody's best interest that a lot of information 12 13 doesn't get out. You know, because you're concerned 14 and because you are a good parent, we would like to see 15 you come out, but --

HENRY: -- of course that's up to you and that's a decision that's -- that -- it's a difficult decision, it's a very troubling decision because you have a situation of having to make a, a, a choice and it's a difficult choice. Your loyalties are with your children but they're also with the family that you're with at this time.

SITA: That's one thing I, -- that's one thing I just wrote my, my parents-in-law's name so that I'll know they'll be safe.

1 HENRY: Uh-huh, uh-huh, well --2 But I'm hearing they're going to the social worker or foster home, they're going there, over 3 here -- here and there. 4 5 HENRY: Well --6 And those, those -- that -- what car SITA: 7 trailers came in --8 HENRY: Um-hum. 9 SITA: -- it's unbelievable. It's like just -- I can only see this in a movie. 10 11 HENRY: Okay. One of the things that, you know, it's like you say, you know, you can't believe 12 everything that you hear in the media because a lot of 13 that information is incorrect. They're speculating. 14 You know, some of the information that, that the news 15 media has broadcast about David and about all of you is 16 not true. Isn't that so? 17 18 SITA: When they talk to David --19 HENRY: Um-hum. 20 SITA: -- they can change or manipulate what 21 he said. 22 There you go, there you go, that's HENRY: exactly what I'm talking about. 23 24 SITA: But there is no connection with them 25 right now. That's right, that's right, there **HENRY:** 

isn't. 2 SITA: There's no connection. 3 HENRY: Exactly. 4 SITA: So how can -- I guess I -- Steve just walked in. Do you want to talk to him? 5 6 HENRY: Well, I'd like to finish talking to you if I could. I will talk to Steve, we -- you know, 7 but not in a hurry for, for anything. You know, I have a concern about you. I feel that you're a sincere person and you have a great, strong, sincere, keen 10 11 interest in your children and I'd like --12 Strong? I wasn't -- I am always on SITA: the background before, always. I didn't want to make 13 14 no trouble, I --15 I understand. I understand. 16 SITA: I'm alone and stuff. 17 HENRY: And being alone --18 SITA: Not alone, but --19 HENRY: In terms -- and when I say --20 SITA: What's going on now. 21 **HENRY:** I mean separated from your children. It's, it's a difficult thing, you know? Family to, to 22 somebody like yourself and to a lot of us is, is the 23 most important and the number one thing, okay? And we 24 want you, and we want everybody, to be reunited with 25 their loved ones as soon as possible. I know that,

that David feels that, that he's in a situation where
he has to follow the course that he has chosen and to
see this thing through, you know, and everybody is
being as patient. You are, Steve, is, the children
are, you know, and there are certain needs that have to
be addressed. Everybody still has to eat and life
still has to go on and your children need you and you
need your children. That doesn't mean that you don't
need Steve, you know.

SITA: No, I don't need Steve.

HENRY: I'm sorry, you need Steve and you need David and you need everybody because they're part of your family. But your children have a, a direct link to you because they're your kids and I know that you feel that very strong, strong obligation and love and, and because of that love, those children need to be nurtured by you and we want that for you, okay? So if you are -- if you feel that you can leave, we want to help, we want to help you bridge that gap so that you can as a matter of fact be reunited with your children.

SITA: Just a minute, please.

HENRY: Okay.

SITA: Hello?

SCHNEIDER: Jim -- in fact, the truth is he talked almost the whole day right until I would 14 15 imagine an hour or so ago with David. 16 HENRY: Um-hum. 17 MR. SCHNEIDER: From what I understand he spent a lot of time on the phone with him. 18 19 Yeah, and it's my understanding that HENRY: 20 David was, was going to be sending -- continue sending out some, some kids. 21 22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Is that right? 23 **HENRY:** Yes. 24 MR. SCHNEIDER: See, I -- yeah, I don't know anything about it because most of the day I have been 25 helping a couple of people out here and --

1 HENRY: Okay. One of the things I want to 2 caution you about --3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. 4 HENRY: -- and I, and I wanted to talk to you about, and that is we need to ensure that if anybody 5 does walk out, you know, that they're not armed, okay? 6 7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right. 8 HENRY: We don't want -- and see, and that's why we want to do the -- or we want to try to see about 9 handling of those burial of those dogs tomorrow during 10 the daylight because we don't want anybody to confuse 11 12 those shovels with weapons. 13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Uh-huh. 14 HENRY: You know? So --15 MR. SCHNEIDER: If -- you know, if you don't mind me saying so, it seems kind of -- it, it seems 16 funny because of, you know, like a tank with men 17 sitting inside it not that far away and, and here's 18 19 maybe a --20 HENRY: We, we, we just don't want any --21 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I -- believe me --22 HENRY: -- you know, we, we've worked so 23 hard, you know. 24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, but look at this 25 though, Henry, look at this --HENRY: Yes, yes.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- you know, on that day 2 Sunday when that happened --3 HENRY: Uh-huh. 4 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I mean that started so I was down at the end of, of this building and 5 I'm, "What on earth is going on?" I'm talking to 6 7 someone. 8 HENRY: Sure, sure. 9 MR. SCHNEIDER: We hit the phone 911 immediately --10 11 HENRY: Sure. 12 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and started -- Wayne Martin the attorney and me started screaming --13 14 HENRY: Uh-huh. MR. SCHNEIDER: -- we said -- and this Lynch 15 got on the phone and we started saying, "What is going 16 on?" And he identified himself, Wayne did, we started 17 screaming, get involved, you know, call this off --18 19 HENRY: Um-hum. 20 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- there's women and children --21 22 HENRY: Um-hum. 23 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- what happened to communication? 24 25 HENRY: Um-hum. MR. SCHNEIDER: So from that time after I

mean, everything since then -- I, I was going to say 2 something about it, I can't remember what it was, oh yeah, when the part came when --after about an hour and 3 a half of that kind of nonsense, then of course the 4 negotiations started about you people being able to 5 come on and get those that were wounded. Well, we were 6 7 all for that --8 HENRY: Um-hum. 9 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and we kept on assuring 10 and reassuring and, and more than --11 HENRY: Uh-huh. 12 MR. SCHNEIDER: And of course, and when the 13 time was when your men were standing out there -- one 14 of the guys just told me today there were 25 guys out 15 there that could have been picked off. 16 HENRY: Yeah. MR. SCHNEIDER: But we're not into that, 17 never. Nobody here has ever shot. No one's been in 18 any war. No one's been in like Vietnam or anything 19 20 like that. 21 HENRY: I understand. MR. SCHNEIDER: So I mean, the truth of the 22 23 matter is, you know, we're not out there to harm 24 people, yourself or anybody that's sent out here, I 25 mean, not, not in the least.

HENRY: Okay. I understand that.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: So, I mean, but if you guys -2 - if you're, if you're concerned about somebody coming 3 out with a shovel and, I mean --4 HENRY: Well --5 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- at times I'll tell you what, I mean, it seems almost absurd though. 6 7 HENRY: Well, but, but, but that's just in the evening hours. We'll, we'll work through this 8 tomorrow --10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okav. 11 HENRY: -- during the daylight. 12 MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, I'm just talking 13 about myself. Don't --14 HENRY: Yes. MR. SCHNEIDER: -- don't get, you know --15 overall I guess, you know, I -- it's -- you know, after 16 all this time I guess one just wonders at the time 17 18 where, where all this is going to and --19 HENRY: Um-hum. We just, we just want to make sure that there's no accidents, that nobody has a 20 21 question about anything. MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh yeah, I understand, I 22 23 understand. 24 HENRY: And, and I appreciate your 25 cooperation on this -- I appreciate --MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh yeah, you know I would do

1 any -- whatever, whatever --2 HENRY: -- your working with me. 3 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- will help and make the matters easier, whatever else, you know, I'll always 4 5 work with that. HENRY: Okay. 6 7 MR. SCHNEIDER: So --8 HENRY: Can you check on that, Steve, for me? You know, maybe I can continue talking to Sita while 9 you check on that, see if we can get a couple more kids 10 11 out? MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, see, the whole -- what, 12 what actually was all said then with David because now 13 you know the guy --14 15 HENRY: David said --16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Why is he going -- now he 17 passes out on me. 18 HENRY: He passed out? 19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, he's sleeping again. He, he's been awake all this time. I just, I 20 just came down to see him and now I came, I was going 21 to ask him a few questions and the guy's out again. 22 23 But he was awake the entire day so maybe --24 **HENRY:** Okay. 25 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- so maybe he's just taking a -- I, I hope -- I'm hoping here he's just taking a

1 | short nap. 2 HENRY: How is he in terms of his medication 3 condition? 4 MR. SCHNEIDER: You know, it's remarkable. It's like the guy he -- well, I don't know what Jim 5 told you, but when I came to talk with him, he was 6 7 talking with Jim on the phone --8 HENRY: Um-hum. 9 MR. SCHNEIDER: I was amazed at how he was sitting up, talking, the strength in his voice and he 10 11 seems to be recovering. 12 HENRY: Good, good. 13 MR. SCHNEIDER: So, I mean, it's, it's quite amazing. Just like the other night when you were 14 asking -- was that last night you were asking about 15 16 blood pressure and --17 HENRY: Um-hum. 18 MR. He's kept his word. He said he was going to send two children out at a time and, and that's exactly what he did. And he asked about this and he asked about that

and, and whatever -- either whatever he said or inquired about he was being truthful, he is being honest, he is being sincere.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

HENRY: Since -- you know, since he didn't come out, you know, we've, we've had a situation where we didn't -- and when I say we, I'm talking about the bosses. The bosses have not felt that he was -- you know, that he didn't keep his word and we don't have the good working relationship that we have. I want to continue that and that's one of the reasons that I've been pressing to get some other children out so that the bosses here feel comfortable that we're moving in the right direction. We want to establish some trust and faith and confidence with one another and that's, that's why we want to continue that.

But the truth of the matter is these people aren't bothered because we -- like I said, you know, it's hard to understand for anyone else but we believe that there is a God seated on a throne, number one. That God is a powerful

1 | God. 2 **HENRY:** Um-hum. 3 MR. SCHNEIDER: You and I will stand before him. 4 5 **HENRY:** Sure. 6 MR. SCHNEIDER: He's, he's got some things he's going to do that's going to shake this whole world 7 8 9 **HENRY:** Absolutely. 10 MR. SCHNEIDER: So I'm in a -- we're, we're in a place here that is not pleasant, but in the 3 4 process, process of, of it all I have talked to men 5 that I hope have caught a higher vision of something 6 better even for themselves. **HENRY:** 7 Um-hum. MR. SCHNEIDER: And in the process of it all, 8 9 I mean we, we have communicated, we've tried our best 10 and in the, in the process of this certain things have been said that would be taken care of are done. 11 12 don't keep on bringing it up because once it's been 13 noted and so forth -- well, you know, just like what 14 happened yesterday like what you say and like Jim and 15 going to the bosses and so forth. But I -- you know, I 16 explained as clear and plain as one could as to why that is. It always comes down to fear in God and that 17 God said to him wait and that was -- there is no other 18 answer, there is no other reason than that. 19 20 **HENRY:** Um-hum. 21 MR. KORESH: Especially watching all these tanks come around here like they've been coming. 7 8 HENRY: Um-hum. 9 MR. KORESH: I mean, I'm not talking about in 10 -- just inside the property. I'm talking about here, you know, 20, 30 feet outside our building here, you 11 know, and that's kind of like they're kind of like 12 13 moving around and saying watch us knock down your buildings and now we're fixing to knock down your main 14 15 building. 16 HENRY: Well --17 MR. KORESH: You know, well, I mean -- what can we do? 18 19 HENRY: Well, they've been ordered not, not to -- you know, not to go in there (indiscernible). 20 MR. KORESH: How many times? They're doing 21 it. They're not listening to you. 22 23 HENRY: See, I'm not one of the bosses, you 24 know? 25 MR. KORESH: I know.

HENRY: I, I, I, I -- you know --

(tape ends abruptly)

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DAVID: -- just going to have to, you know, your job, you're going to have to bear with the responsibilities when, you know, you lost a lot of innocent lives, that's all I can say. You're going to have to, you know, you're going to have to take a look at some of the pictures of the little ones that ended up perishing, because, you know, you don't have that much jurisdiction, do you?

HENRY: Well--

DAVID: I mean, but the thing is this, you know, on the other hand, our God who sits on the throne is keeping better order of things than you guys are.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: I just wish you understood the reason why the Bible was written is because the Prophets were told to seal their Book till the end of time.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And how many times have all these churches been honking their heads saying that the end could come any day. You know, the longer, longer time takes, the less sin seems to be sinful. You know, today we have all these people doing all these terrible things in the name of theirself, you know?

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And it just seems to be normal routine life. I mean half the story is not even told.

Well I think this whole incident is 1 HENRY: very unfortunate and, I, you know, I sincerely wish 2 that it had never happened. 3 4 DAVID: Well, I wish Robert would have called me because, you know, I think, I think, what would have 5 been better, now this is hypothetical--6 7 HENRY: Uh-huh. 8 DAVID: --Just to make a point, maybe we should have taken Robert as a hostage, huh? We could 9 have avoided a lot of bloodshed, couldn't we? 10 HENRY: Well, you know--11 12 Don't you think? DAVID: 13 HENRY: Well, I have no, it's difficult to 14 say--DAVID: -- then we'd be in trouble for taking 15 16 a hostage. 17 HENRY: -- if that had happened exactly. Okay, you have a responsibility for the safety of the 18 people that are there with you, okay? 19 DAVID: 20 Uh-huh. HENRY: And I think that you are leading your 21 people in, in the fashion that you feel is the most 22 23 responsible way for you to do it. That I know is to be done, right. 24 DAVID: HENRY: Exactly, exactly, and I think that 25 you're doing the right thing in terms of, of saying

look, these children, that, you know, need to go out, and then, and you're willing to, to show--2 3 DAVID: And give these people, give these people--4 5 HENRY: Exactly, exactly--6 DAVID: --time to look at what they're 7 dealing with, to look at you big boys--8 HENRY: Exactly. 9 DAVID: --to watch your maneuvers, look at 10 all your show of might--11 HENRY: Well--12 DAVID: No, listen, let me, let me, let me--13 **HENRY:** Sure. DAVID: --paint the picture, so we can watch 14 15 this exactly how this government and this world really 16 works. You know how this peaceful lamb-like beast really under its breast, speaks as a dragon, you know. 17 18 HENRY: Uh huh. 19 This is one of the greatest soci-psychological formulas of man's division. I mean, it's 20 just like, you know, I realize, you know, the three, 21 22 the three men have talked with us thus far, are very 23 smooth, very calm, very understanding. But, what really amazes me is how like with Jim, when I read to 24 25 him plainly from the Prophecies about an event, a Messiah, dealing in a situation with chariots that ran

like lightnings, that made thunders, that had flaming torches--2 3 HENRY: Uh-huh. DAVID: -- that jostled in the streets, that 5 made the fir trees shake, I asked him, I said where in the New Testament did you hear anything about Messiah 7 being involved with tank, with chariots with flaming torches. 8 Now mindful of the fact, we know that the Prophets 9 in their day could only understand the things of their 10 world. 11 12 HENRY: Right. 13 I mean, you know, when it talks about th--and their horses shall be as, you know, like the 14 evening wolves that are more terrible than the 15 16 leopards, and faster than leopards, you know, is the 17 Prophet really talking about real horses or is he only trying to point out that he sees men which he can 18 19 identify men--20 HENRY: Uh-huh. 21 DAVID: -- and he sees vehicular transport that's way beyond his comprehension and he's trying to 22 explain it with the things of his natural world. 23 HENRY: Which he can understand. 24 DAVID: Which are the things that he's trying 25

to relate.

HENRY: Uh-huh. 1 You know, and if they roar like a 2 DAVID: 3 lion, does that mean that they're a lion or is a lion just the only reality that he knows in his life that is 4 fearful. 5 6 HENRY: Uh-huh, right. 7 DAVID: And so, you know, it's just like, when Ezekiel says that God travels on this chariot, and 8 that there's these flames, and there's these torches, 9 and it sounds like the thunders of the Heaven. You 10 see, is he really talking about a cloud or is he 11 12 talking about some kind of vehicle with lights, and 13 some kind of vehicle with, you know, makes a noise of thunder, because it's really a highly sophisticated, 14 you know, implement of the higher universes. 15 16 HENRY: Uh-huh. 17 DAVID: You've seen the documentary, Chariots of the Gods? 18 19 HENRY: Uh-huh. 20 It kind of develops a good scientific DAVID: 21 question, doesn't it? 22 HENRY: It sure does. 23 DAVID: Right. Well, do you actually think

DAVID: Right. Well, do you actually think that man, mankind, as you know mankind, could have been realistically a part of a universal society? Remember, our ancient fathers have given us record—

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1 **HENRY:** Uh-huh. 2 DAVID: -- that men from other worlds have 3 visited our world. 4 HENRY: Right. 5 DAVID: Now this is not biblical. 6 scientific. 7 HENRY: Uh-huh. 8 You know, so all the, all nations, DAVID: the hieroglyphics, the technologies of the past 9 ancients, well, I wonder, I wonder why that the concept 10 of good and evil is such an important part of every 11 social direction of man. Everyone has the question of 12 13 the right and wrong way of doing things. 14 HENRY: Uh-huh. 15 DAVID: But, you know, isn't it strange how that God would wait to the latter days before he passes 16 judgement on the world? Because a lot of the 17 prophecies of the bible cannot really be understood--18 19 HENRY: Right. 20 --until man's technology so advances to a degree that he can understand the real meanings of 21 22 the prophecies. 23 HENRY: Uh-huh. Now we know the flaming, the chariots 24 DAVID: with flaming torches that make noise like thunder, you 25 know, we know what that really is, don't we?

1 HENRY: Sure. 2 DAVID: What is it? 3 HENRY: Well, the same thing that you're 4 talking about. 5 DAVID: Tanks. 6 HENRY: Right. 7 DAVID: Okay. Now, how would the Prophet be justified of such an event saying that Messiah is being 8 confronted with a situation and yet we know clearly 9 from Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, no such thing 10 happened. 11 12 HENRY: What do you think? DAVID: Well, it would make the Prophet 13 14 false, wouldn't it? 15 HENRY: Sure. 16 But of course Christ says "think not DAVID: that I've come to destroy the law of the Prophets," 17 18 that's what he told his disciples. 19 HENRY: Uh-huh. 20 DAVID: Some come not to destroy, but to 21 fulfill. 22 HENRY: Right. 23 And, until Heaven and Earth pass, not DAVID: one jot or tittle shall pass from the law or the 24 prophets until all be fulfilled. Heaven and Earth 25 shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away.

Now what are the words of Christ? Well, John, he always keeps telling the Jews that this doctrine is not 2 his own, but the doctrine that he received from his 3 father. . 4 5 HENRY: Uh-huh. 6 Revelation, what are those seven DAVID: 7 seals, I wonder. It's probably a situation that when Christ does come, he's going to get into a situation, 8 'cause remember he is a political leader, isn't he? 9 10 HENRY: Uh-huh. 11 DAVID: Would you consider Christ a political 12 leader? 13 Leader of all, you know, political --HENRY: DAVID: Well, I mean, I'm sure that if he was 14 to come today in the clouds of glory, I'm sure that 15 your, your national leaders and all of your great empire directors and all that would no doubt have a 17 united, United Council, the Pontiff and all the leaders 18 of all churches and of all governments would come 19 together and sit down and talk about some things cause 20 naturally his armies of the universe is far greater 21 than the armies of this world. 22 23 HENRY: Uh-huh. Okay. Well that's going to happen. 24 DAVID: 25 HENRY: Sure. But the thing of it is, it happens DAVID:

after a catastrophe. Because, you know, I bet that the gentiles of today are really no better than the Jews of yesterday. What would you want to bet?

HENRY: I'm sure that that makes a lot of sense.

DAVID: You know, Isaiah said that Israel didn't believe the prophets, that's what he tells us in Chapter 1 and that God's going to forsake his people because they're like the Philistines. They're soothsayers and they have their own imaginations, but they don't walk in God's word.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: What Isaiah says in Chapter Two, verse One, he says, "but in the last days, it shall come to pass, but the mountain of the Lord's house," that was Mt. Zion, Mt. Zion,--

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: That's where the ancient throne of David once sat, "shall be established in the top of all mountains and shall be exalted of above all hills, and all nations shall flow in to it." Excuse me here.

HENRY: Okay.

DAVID: Now, if that's the case, then on the last days we should be waiting for that to happen. Is it spiritual, is it literal, well it says that he shall sit upon the throne and rebute many nations of far off

and they shall beat their swords and their plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks. Nation will not lift up sword against nation. Neither will they learn 3 more anymore. That sounds good, don't it? 5 HENRY: Well, I don't know, you know, if it's going to be good. 6 7 DAVID: Well, I mean if someone big enough, 8 bigger than the world intervened and told all these 9 brothers and sisters of this old world to put their weapons down, it's kind of like -- have you ever had a 10 11 brother before? HENRY: 12 Sure. 13 Did you ever like get into a fist 14 fight with your brother? 15 HENRY: Well, not since I was a kid. 16 DAVID: Okay, that's what I'm talking about. But then dad kind of stepped around the corner of the 17 18 hallway? 19 HENRY: Uh-huh. 20 DAVID: Kind of brought peace, didn't it? HENRY: Sure did. 21 22 Okay. Well, that's kind of like what DAVID: has to happen because, the world, even though men may 23 grow to maturity, they're still really in a large way, 24 25 children. HENRY: I think you're right.

1 DAVID: And, just a lot of these children have this cover called refinement, eloquency, you know, 2 they're good orators. It makes man seem a little more 3 on the outside than what really man is on the inside. Now I'm sure even Pope John Paul likes to every once in 5 awhile, I don't know, he might like to fly model 7 airplanes or something. 8 HENRY: Laughter. 9 He might like to -- he might have a choo choo train, now come on, you see what I'm saying? 10 11 HENRY: Yeah. 12 I'm sure he might have his favorite DAVID: 13 fishing pole. 14 HENRY: Uh-huh. 15 DAVID: Because nobody likes to just sit all 16 day long and read out of the Bible or read out of 17 catechism. 18 HENRY: That's true. DAVID: And even Solomon, that Solomon says 19 much studiness, much study is a weariness to the mind. 20 21 HENRY: Uh-huh. DAVID: Okay, so Solomon did say though, that 22 23 in all of his wisdom as a great king, and you know, some of the greatest wisdom in all of the world 24 25 literature wise, comes from the Bible, wouldn't you think?

HENRY: Absolutely.

DAVID: A lot of it's so deep a lot of people don't know the meanings of it but definitely it's an inspired book even if it's just poetic. You know, in high school you can learn bible as lit which is not a doctrinal thing, but just it kind of looks at the poetry and the connection of language, the flow of thought that the ancient writers had.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: Anyway, Solomon, he makes a lot of comments in Ecclesiastes about life and death, love, hatred, the meanings of man, oppression and power and weakness, and he finally says in the conclusion beginning in chapters 11 and 12 of Ecclesiastes, he says, "now young man," he says "go ahead and go in the way of your heart, do what is right in your own eyes."

He says, "but no, that for these things, God will bring you into the judgement." He said "now remove sorrow from your heart and tears from your eyes," he says "fear God now in the days of your youth before the evil days come when you will have no pleasure in them. Before the time when the time will come when the sun, moon and stars will be darkened."

Now, soon the stars will be darkened. Do you know of any event in the Book of Revelation about the sun, moon and stars being darkened? Do you remember that

last night? 2 HENRY: Uh-huh. 3 DAVID: The sixth seal? 4 HENRY: Right. 5 DAVID: Some of the stars were dark and the 6 stars fell due to the fig tree shaking? 7 HENRY: Uh-huh. 8 DAVID: It says at the time when the clouds will return after the rain, of course there's supposed 9 to be a rain, the prophecies teach that there will be a 10 rain according to the time when Messiah is trying to 11 warn the world. (indiscernible) Nahum and it says that 12 the clouds will come, it will have a short rain, and 13 14 all of a sudden it will stop. 15 HENRY: Okay. 16 And clear up. But it talks about this belligerent power that, you know, flaunts its 17 might, magnifies itself against the truth, the Lord, of 18 course it says in the Habakkuk, it says regard ye 19 amongst the heathen and wonder marvously. For I will 20 work will work in your day that you will not believe 21 what we told you. Of course that's just the way 22 heathens are. You know, they don't take any real 23 warnings from God. They don't fear God. 24 25 HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: But anyway it says in Ecclesiastes

that you know, fear God before the sun, moon and stars 2 are darkened, before the clouds return after the rain. Because the next time the clouds return, oh boy. The 3 prophets teach something about these latter clouds. The gathering of these clouds in thick darkness. Just like it was two thousand years ago when Messiah was 7 being killed--8 HENRY: Uh-huh. 9 DAVID: -- the clouds came, the thunder in the 10 heavens--11 **HENRY:** Uh-huh. 12 DAVID: -- and darkness was over the earth--13 HENRY: Uh-huh. 14 DAVID: Yeah, well, that's going to be repeated. But it says when He, God, shall rise up at 15 the voice of the bird. Now at the voice of the bird, 16 what bird? You know, Isaiah talks about Messiah and 17 Isaiah calls him a ravenous bird from the east. Of 18 course we know in Revelation, the one who seals the one 19 hundred and forty four thousand are sins from the east. 20 Now, this is a very clear light. As lightning 21 (indiscernible) from the west. You know, when 22 lightning flashes, everybody sees it don't they. 23 24 HENRY: Uh-huh. 25 DAVID: In Heaven there's lightnings, thunders, and voices isn't there?

1 HENRY: Uh-huh. 2 DAVID: God likes a lot of rain showeres, 3 doesn't he? HENRY: Sure does. 4 5 DAVID: Okay, so you know, these seven thunders no doubt emphasize a fact that God wants men 6 to hear his word in thunder tones. Like in the Book of Job, God is talking to Job and God says that wisdom will be found at the end of the world in the secret 9 places of thunder. Have you ever heard of the seven 10 11 thunders yet, Henry? 12 **HENRY:** Seven? 13 DAVID: Seven thunders. Revelation 10, verse 14 7. 15 HENRY: Okay. 16 (indiscernible) mystery of God the DAVID: seven thunders will be finished. 17 18 HENRY: Okay. 19 DAVID: The seven seals. HENRY: Okay. That's what we talked about, 20 21 yes, okay. DAVID: Right. Now you know, a lot of people 22 are saying that I jump all over the Bible. The reason 23 why I do that is because all the prophets have talked 24 25 about this event.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

1 DAVID: And Isaiah talks about, 2 (indiscernible) says, he says, "send ye the lamb." 3 Now we know who the lamb is, don't we? 4 HENRY: Right. 5 DAVID: Send ye, now this is Isaiah 16, "send ye the lamb to the rulers of the land from Sela for it shall be in the wandering bird cast out of his nest. 7 Now who's a wandering bird? The lamb's a wandering 8 9 bird. 10 HENRY: Uh-huh. 11 DAVID: Cast out of his nest. And it goes on 12 and talks about this bird being amongst the heathen and 13 it says about the heathen, it says, "take counsel," which is what we're doing now we're taking counsel. says "execute judgement" We got to, we got to do some 15 judging now here. It says "bewray not him that 16 wander. " You know what bewray means, don't you? When 17 you bewray someone? 18 19 HENRY: Yeah. 20 DAVID: It means you scare them, right? 21 HENRY: Right. 22 DAVID: It says "scare not him that 23 wandereth, " okay? 24 **HENRY:** Uh-huh. 25 DAVID: It says, "let my outcast dwell with Okay? Now, who is this wandering bird cast out

of its nest? Well, you know, right before the armies of Israel were to destroy Jericho, God placed in Jericho some spies, and these men were spies that were sent from Israel to get inside the city and to watch and to see the activities of the city.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: Well, the leaders there discovered this and they started searching for them. And these men made their way and finally came to a harlot's house and we know harlots don't have a good reputation in sociality, do they?

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And her name was Rayhab. Now these spies asked of Rayhab a very unique favor. They asked Rayhab to hide them. Now Rayhab had been raised with the Gods of the, you know, Philistines, the Gods of that time, Miradoc (phonetic), you know Bale (phonetic), different Gods, Ishtar and everything, and she pretty much concluded in her days of her youth that this all baloney.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And she entered into a profession that she knew what religion was. She knew that men didn't love her. Men loved it. So she wasn't going to be deceived by all this so called forms and regulations of worship. She was going to do what was natural and

what was carnal. But when she saw the power of the God of Israel in dealing with the Gods of Egypt, --now remember in the days of Egypt they had long forgotten the miracles done in the days of Joseph.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: For the Pharaoh rose up and knew not Joseph, so Israel, Egypt was once blessed, just like America is. But they moved far beyond the beginning point of where those blessings came from, so they came up to the point where they had to be judged and so God was going to use Egypt as an example to all other nations.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: Okay. so now here, Rayhab, the harlot witnesses this. Now she knows there's a living God in Egypt. Well she says to these spies, you know, why should I hide you? Your God is a true God.
You know, but she did, but she asked, she says, look, if I show you this mercy, will you not have mercy upon me and my house?

And so what happened was, is that they promised her that not just her, but all the people of Jericho, if they would come into her house, you know, that they would be spared.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: So this is the way Christ still shows

1 | mercy in the face of a pending judgement. In the face of a catastrophe, that God's going to execute judgement upon the cities and the nations of men who know him 3 not. 4 5 HENRY: Right. 6 DAVID: Okay, now so the only ordained 7 minister in all of Jericho, was a prostitute, and that just kind of goes to show you, you can't judge people 8 9 because to whom mercy comes, the conversion comes. 10 HENRY: Uh-huh. 11 DAVID: And these are usually more zealous is getting the free gift than others who don't need as 12 much mercy. Christ emphasizes this with Mary Magdalene 13 14 to whom much is forgiven--15 HENRY: Exactly. DAVID: They love much. 16 17 HENRY: Right. 18 DAVID: Okay, so when we, when we look at Nahum and we say to ourselves, now, this is kind of a 19 complicated book and that's why a lot of people call 20 21 Isaiah, (gap) hello? 22 HENRY: Yeah. 23 DAVID: Well, you know, they call Isaiah, 24 (gap) hello? 25 HENRY: Hello, what is happening? Someone stepping on the line. We got DAVID:

it fixed. 1 2 **HENRY:** Okay. 3 DAVID: When they read through the 4 prophecies, there's so much there they don't understand, they can't seem to put the pictures and the statements together. There's a reason for that. Because like I said before, we've got Matthew, Mark, 7 8 Luke and John, it seems to be quite plain about a 9 crucified Messiah who's non-violent. He overthrew some tables in the synagogue a couple of times, you know. 10 11 He made a whip, you know, and kind of, you know, 12 whipped some people--13 HENRY: Uh-huh. 14 DAVID: You remember that, don't you? 15 HENRY: Sure. 16 DAVID: Some people don't really realize 17 that, but he could raise his voice a little bit. called people fools. He told, he told, go tell hare 18 that old fox, you know. 19 20 HENRY: Uh-huh. DAVID: But you know, on the over all, it's 21 true, like the lady said, when they went to Gethsemane, 22 Christ did tell his deciples to take two swords, didn't 24 he. 25 HENRY: Uh-huh.

But that's all they had.

DAVID:

thing of it was is that when it came right to himself, 2 you know, Peter jumped the gun and chopped off the 3 Centurion's ear. He was a bad shot, wasn't he. He was going for the guy's head. Well anyway, the thing of it is, is that Christ did say that he could bring several 5 6 legions of angels down, right? 7 HENRY: Right. 8 DAVID: But Christ didn't want to do that, did he? 10 HENRY: No. 11 DAVID: Cause he knew his own deciples really didn't believe in him yet. 12 13 HENRY: Uh-huh. 14 DAVID: Now he did tell Pilot though, you'll find this in the record of John. 15 The question was, are 16 you a king? Now we talked about the bird, the 17 wandering bird, the lamb. 18 HENRY: Uh-huh. 19 DAVID: And the lamb that bird that's supposed to bring about judgement and counsel, God says 20 do not scare him. God says hide him from the face of 21 22 the spoiler. Okay, now the spoiler must be someone that's going to be going against this bird. 23 I mean God says he'll raise up a ravenous bird from the east. 24 25 HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: Ecclesiastes says God will rise up at

the voice of the bird. (gap) Hello? 1 | 2 HENRY: Yes. 3 DAVID: Hello? 4 HENRY: Yes. Can you hear me? 5 DAVID: Yeah. 6 HENRY: Okay. 7 DAVID: Who's on the line now? 8 HENRY: No--9 DAVID: --try it. 10 HENRY: Okay. 11 DAVID: So Ecclesiastes says God will rise up 12 (gap) the bird. **HENRY:** 13 Uh-huh. 14 Isaiah talks about the wandering DAVID: 15 bird, the ravenous bird from the east, okay? Now what 16 is this counsel and this judgement that we're supposed to be thinking about in regards to this bird, this 17 lamb, this wandering bird? Why are we supposed to hide 18 him for, from the face of the spoiler. Well, what 19 happens is, it says in this time, from that day the 20 21 kingdom shall be established in mercy. 22 HENRY: Uh-huh. 23 DAVID: And he shall set up on the kingdom in the house of David judgening (sic) and hasting judge-judgement and bringing everlasting righteousness. 25 HENRY: Uh-huh.

1 DAVID: Now, it's kind of like wow, we know, when does that happen? How does that happen? You know, what does it mean, God rises up at the at the 3 voice of the bird? Well what position is God in according to Revelation, do you remember? Is he laying 5 down? Is he standing up? Or, what's he doing? 6 7 HENRY: In Revelation? 8 DAVID: Yeah, what's he doing on the throne? 9 HENRY: He, he's sitting on the throne. DAVID: Well, he sitting, he's in the sitting 10 position. So that's a good observation. Because when 11 all the prophecies talk about God arising up, that 12 13 means he stands up off the throne, don't it? 14 HENRY: Right. DAVID: Now when he stands up off the throne, 15 I wonder what he's going to do. Well if he rises up 16 17 (gap) hello? 18 **HENRY:** Hello? 19 DAVID: Steve, can you, can you fix this line right here? It's, the cat, I think the cat over there 20 is -- just wait a little bit here. They never brought 21 us our phone yet. (gap) 22 23 HENRY: What? 24 Yeah, I guess that's better. okay. We just, we had to rob a lot of phones and take 25 their little cords and stick them all together, you

know how flimsy those little inserts are, right?

HENRY: Uh-huh, oh, okay, I see what you're

3 saying.

DAVID: Cause where I fell, I haven't been able to get up yet, and you know, we kind of have to stretch a phone to me.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: So anyway, as we're looking at the picture, we know God sits on a throne, he gives the book to the lamb. We know he's going to come. He's going to come and his testimony is going to be the spirit of prophecy. He's going to try to teach and forewarn the generation of which he comes in of the soon coming impending events of the judgement.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: So that men might divert the penalties for not listening to this great mercy that's revealed in truth. The truth will set them free. It's going to be their natural nature not to want to know truth. Cause the carnal man doesn't believe in the things of God. So the way that we have to really realize there's a God, is we have to stop and ask ourselves, now wait a minute, in the book of Nahum, are those chariots really two wheeled carts made of wood? Or are they really machinery that transport men that have actually flaming torches that shake the earth and

sound like thunder and causes the trees to shake. 2 HENRY: Uh-huh. 3 DAVID: I mean was the prophet really looking 4 at a tank? 5 **HENRY:** He was looking with the experience that he had at the time. 6 7 DAVID: And he was trying to describe what he 8 was seeing. 9 HENRY: Exactly. 10 Do you know what, do you know what DAVID: they could have done in those days if they had a tank? 11 12 (slight laughter) HENRY: 13 DAVID: Do you know if we had a take in the days in two hundred years ago, we had one of these 14 Brads what we could've done? There wouldn't have been 15 no Indian problem, would there? But I tell you what, 16 these things are all a part of the gifts of creation. 17 18 HENRY: Uh-huh. 19 DAVID: When God said in the Book of Daniel 20 that in the last days much knowledge should be increased, he means it. And the reason being is, is 21 that because of a lot of minds of men, in their own 22 reasoning, they, they create within themselves oh, an 23 infidel type spirit. Like people will say you know, oh 24 how can God write all my sins in a book? You know and 25 it seems like it would take a lot pages wouldn't it?

HENRY: Sure would.

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DAVID: Well, you know, the God, God had to in the ancient times, he had to communicate with man according to the light that they had in the world. And the form of communication was developed through the hieroglyphics and finally became more short formed into the structure of sounds, the syllables, the oratations (sic) of communication, the meaning of signs and syllables, which became alphabets, numerologies. And, you know, man, man, like I say has been able to communicate, whereas in the days of Moses, God very clearly required that the Hebrew inform men by the structure of lettering, or reading, which Hebrew is refined hieroglyphics, you know, and God so inspired it by writing the, the dialogue, the Ten Commandments, and you know, God had chosen this means of communication for men to be able to transfer thought from one to another.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: Although we know that this means sometimes falls short of actually, presenting the actual mind of one man to another.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: I mean you can read some--you can read your girlfriend's letter and really don't understand what she said. So you'd have to ask, you'd

have to say, sweetheart, I got your letter, but what 2 did you mean? 3 HENRY: Uh-huh. When you said blah, blah, blah? 4 DAVID: 5 HENRY: Right. 6 Okay, well the same holds for any of DAVID: 7 the prophetic writings. 8 HENRY: Sure. 9 Isaiah made a lot of statements but DAVID: 10 we might, we might read his writings, and we might say 11 to ourselves, well, Isaiah, what did, what did you 12 mean? 13 HENRY: Uh-huh. 14 DAVID: What did you really see? Of course. 15 Isaiah's dead. Jeremiah's dead. Just about all of the prophet writers are dead, aren't they? 16 17 HENRY: Absolutely. 18 Yeah, you see, so it's kind of like, when someone translates their writings from Hebrew or 19 Aramaic into English, whatever, we're kind of left to 20 21 the mercies of the interpreters, aren't we? 22 HENRY: We sure are. The translators and that kind of 23 makes the Bible a little more weak, doesn't it? 25 HENRY: Well. DAVID: Well, it does, because, like I say,

any fundamentalist will have a certain knowledge of scripture, but if he got into higher ranks of theology, with the gentlemen up there that earned their professors and doctor degrees and all that, right?

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: He wouldn't be able to contend would he? Because like for instance when you talk about wisdom in Proverbs 8 and 9, our person wouldn't say well wisdom in Proverbs 8 and 9 is talking about knowledge of man.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: But of course their Rabbi would say, you know, he'd say not so, he'd say the word, hokoma (phonetic) which means wise woman, which goes back to the ancient concept of life. Whereas, you know, we procreate through a woman, made in the form and fashion of dust as we are. But our Creator brought this woman from our side which is a mystery of how God with His wisdom, the Mother of all Creation, His word, His spirit, that gives life unto man, can also be taken from man to make a compatible image for man. In other words, they twain are one, aren't they?

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: You're not complete unless you have a man and a woman.

HENRY: Right.

1 DAVID: One is not complete without the 2 other. 3 HENRY: Uh-huh. DAVID: Okay, so it takes two heads to make 5 one. HENRY: 6 Right. DAVID: Okay, and that's fruitful then. 7 8 HENRY: Uh-huh. 9 DAVID: Communication, you got to love the person you're talking to. You got to understand the 10 person you're talking to. You come together in this 11 communication. And the highest communication is is 12 13 that you all become two as one. 14 HENRY: Right. 15 Offspring. So it bears fruit. DAVID: every good conversation should bear fruit, shouldn't 16 it? 17 18 HENRY: Sure. 19 DAVID: Now, now Christ he doesn't, two 20 thousand years ago, he doesn't, he doesn't take women and speak to them when and then come into their bodies, 21 22 does he? 23 HENRY: No. 24 Okay, so, so we know that out of Adam, came this power to communicate, to reason, to 25 become one with oneself in the nature of God, and she

was Eve, she was Eshia (phonetic). 2 HENRY: Uh-huh. 3 DAVID: He was Esh (phonetic) and she was Eshia. But when they sinned, they were naked and there 5 was a discommunication, wasn't there? 6 HENRY: Uh-huh. DAVID: Okay, but now, when Christ came, Paul 7 8 says he was the fullness of the godhead bodily. And he never had a woman, but on the cross, when they pierced 9 his side, a woman didn't come out, right? 10 11 **HENRY:** No. 12 DAVID: But blood and water came out. water seems to be a symbol of the spirit. 13 submersion in the spirit, pure and holy water of 14 15 cleansing. You know, just as we have a dirty body, we 16 wash our bodies with water, we become clean. 17 HENRY: Uh-huh. DAVID: Well what if you have a dirty mind? 18 How can we wash our minds from filth? Well, we have to 19 20 have a different kind of water, don't we? HENRY: Uh-huh. 21 DAVID: Christ talks about living water. 22 talks about a spiritual water. He was at a well with a 23 24 woman who was a Samaritan woman, and no Jewish man ever went down to Samaria unless they were looking for 25 prostitutes.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: So Christ was in Samaria by this well and this woman in Samaria is there and she comes up and Christ says, you know, "Give me to drink, please." And she looks at him kind of like out of the corner of her eye, and she says, "Sir, how, how is that thou being a Jew asketh me a Samaritan woman," you know, "for a drink of water, for the Jews have nothing to do with Samaritans?" And of course you know, she's questioned this because that's just the way it was.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And the Samaritans considered, they were considered half breeds. They were considered, you know, mingled amongst the Gentiles (indiscernible) second temple time and the Jews just thought they were too pure them.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And Christ says, "Woman, if you knew the gift of God, and who it is that asketh of thee to give me drink, you would've asked me and I would've given you living waters." Now the woman looks at him kind of funny because what that means to her is that he's making a pass at her.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: She says, "Sir, how giveth me those living waters seeing that the well is deep and thou has

nothing to draw with?" Now what happens is, Christ tells her to go call her husband. Go call thy husband. 2 3 So that startles her. That shocks her. She says. I have no husband. And he says, well you (indiscernible) said you don't have a husband, but you've had five 5 husbands. And the man you're with now is not your husband. Yeah, you're telling the truth. Now, that 7 8 floored her. Okay? 9 HENRY: Uh-huh. DAVID: Now, those living waters was the 10 spirit of prophecy. The ability to know that to deal 11 with the very necessities and needs of a simple heart. 12 She said "Sir, I perceive thou are a prophet." And 13 then she went into the subject of, we know the Messiah 14 is coming and when he cometh he will show us all 15 things. Then Christ tells her, I've been talking with 16 (indiscernible). Then she goes and she tries to talk 17 about the Samaritan saying that we're supposed to 18 worship God in the mountains of Samaria. 19 20 HENRY: Uh-huh. 21 DAVID: And the Jews say we're supposed God 22 in the Temple of Jerusalem. 23 HENRY: Uh-huh. 24 Then she says, "Wwhat do you say?" DAVID: He says, "Woman, verily, verily I say unto you, the 25 time is coming and even as now, when they, the true

1 | worshippers of God, will neither worship God in 2 Jerusalem now in the mountains of Samaria." 3 that's very important information. He says, "for God is a spirit, and those that worship the father, must 5 worship him in spirit and in truth. " Now, see this 6 living water, it's a unique thing to cleanse our minds. 7 to help our minds to know where we're coming from. where God's coming from. So in Revelations 22nd 8 9 Chapter, there is a River of the Water of Life, clear as crystal. Proceeding from the throne of God and the 10 throne of the lamb, right? 11 12 HENRY: Uh-huh. 13 DAVID: And what is this living water? Well John says he was in the spirit. When he literally went to heaven or whether he had a vision, makes no 15 16 difference. The point is, we literally see God on the 17 throne. Must be. If we have anything to do with this 18 Bible, must be. New Testament, you know. 19 HENRY: Uh-huh. DAVID: And he must give his book to the 20 lamb. Must be, now that doesn't mean the lamb really 21 It doesn't mean he has really seven eyes. 22 is a lamb. It doesn't mean he has really seven horns. But it does 23 mean that whatever that book contains, the lamb has 24 25 authority over it, that's why the horn's a symbol of it isn't it?

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And he also has perfect vision of it.

He knows what's in his father's book. So that when the time comes and there's time no longer, when this mystery of God has to be finished, this subject will judge the greatest nation that's ever been, and a nation that's been more blessed than any other mation in the world.

HENRY: That's right.

DAVID: And the keynote is is that sad to say, scripture forewarns that the heathen will not understand.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: It even goes to explain why they won't understand. You see Pharaoh believed he was God. Now most people believe that whatever they think in their mind is of God. That's what I'm being accused of right now. There saying, well, he thinks God's talking to him, so he's just putting a kink, you know, im our plan or he's scared and he's trying to buy time, or you know, this is natural for the way men think. A natural terrorist would do that. A natural, you know, person that's into apparently a lot trouble would do that.

HENRY: Right.

DAVID: But really, like I was telling Jim, and of the two negotiators that really have it under

the belt, I have to admit that you and Jim have it 2 together. HENRY: Well, thank you. 3 4 DAVID: Not all the guys there. Some of them, some of them are kind of, you know, hey you know, 5 it's kind of like psychology is supposed to be really a 7 sympathy thing. A good psychologist does more 8 listening than talking. 9 HENRY: Uh-huh. 10 DAVID: Because when a person talks out their mind, you know, they're able to reach into their, their 11 emotional system, the genetics, the way the mind has 12 been taught, the way the brain cells have encoded 13 knowledge and experience. And, sometimes people have 15 bad knowledge and bad phases of experience, that are encoded into their mind, and their mind actually 16 17 produces a physiological affect on their nervous 18 system. 19 HENRY: Uh-huh. 20 DAVID: Which produces an ill effect on their 21 physical system. 22 HENRY: Right. 23 DAVID: And people become really torn down physically. Mental sickness is a likewise a physical 24 sickness. They both go in hand in hand. 25

1 DAVID: Okay, so, so a psychologist begins at 2 the source of all evil, and the source of sickness by 3 allowing the person to let the wounded heart bleed a bit. 5 HENRY: Uh-huh. 6 DAVID: Let the sore ooze, you know, get the 7 poison out. 8 **HENRY:** Right. 9 DAVID: And instead of a psychologist telling 10 a person under such drama immediately what to do, they 11 realize that the person that's having this drama has 12 already done a lot of things which has produced an ill effect upon his perception or his course of life. 13 14 HENRY: Uh-huh. 15 DAVID: And so the person really just needs the time to backtrack and audibly speak without restraint their views which has led them to the point 17 18 of their crisis. 19 Exactly. HENRY: 20 So you know, this is where you and DAVID: 21 Jim have definitely done your job well. 22 HENRY: Well, you--23 DAVID: Go ahead. 24 Well you do your job pretty well too. HENRY: 25 And I think, you know--DAVID: --not bad for a ninth grade dropout,

11	glorified, but he," the one they really don't know,
12	"Shall appear to your joy, and they shall be ashamed."
13	What happens? "A voice of noise from the city, a voice
14	from the temple, a voice of the Lord that rendereth
15	recompense to his what?"
16	HENRY: Enemies.
17	MR. KORESH: Enemies. Huh. "Before she
18	travailed, she brought forth." Now, how do you bring
19	forth before you travail? I thought the girl had to go
20	in pain first, right?
21	HENRY: Um-hum.
22	MR. KORESH: But this says no, it says,
23	"Before she travailed she brought forth; before her
24	pain came she was delivered of a man child." Huh. Who
25	was she? What man child? "Who has heard such a thing?

Who hath seen such things? Shall the earth be made to

1	bring forth in one day? Or shall a nation be born at
2	once? For as soon as Zion travailed, she brought forth
3	her children." Now, what is this talking about?
4	"Shall I bring to the birth and not cause to bring
5	forth? saith the Lord: shall I cause to bring forth,
6	and shut up the womb? saith thy God. Rejoice ye with
7	Jerusalem, and be glad with her, all ye that love her:
8	rejoice for joy with her, all ye that bemoan for her:
9	that you may suck, and be satisfied with the breast of
10	her consolations; that ye may milk out and, and be
11	delighted with the abundance of her glory. For the
12	Lord for thus saith the Lord, "Behold, I will extend
1:3	peace to her like a river, and the glory of the
14	gentiles like a flowing stream; then shall ye suck and
15	ye shall be borne upon her sides and be dangled upon
16	her knees. As one who his mother comforteth, so will I
17	comfort you; and ye shall be comforted in Jerusalem.
18	And when ye shall see this, your heart shall rejoice,
19	and your bones shall flourish like an herb; and the
20	hand of the Lord shall be known towards his what?"
21	HENRY: Servants.
22	MR. KORESH: What's in the hand? The seven
23	seals, right?
24	HENRY: Um-hum.
25	MR. KORESH: "And his indignation towards his
	what?"

1	HENRY: Enemies.
2	MR. KORESH: Those who don't want to learn
3	the seven seals, right?
4	HENRY: Um-hum.
5	MR. KORESH: "For, behold, the Lord will come
6	with fire, and with his chariots like the whirlwind."
7	These things go like this they sound like this,
8	they go, they go, whoo, whoo, I can't do it, can't go
9	that deep. Oh man, they're awesome, wait I mean,
10	there's going to be 20,000 of these things, okay?
11	HENRY: Um-hum.
12	MR. KORESH: And on one melkevah on one of
13	these melkevahs you could put all the inhabitants of
14	the world just on one, that's how big they are.
15	HENRY: Um-hum.
16	MR. KORESH: Now, for "With the chariots
17	like a whirlwind to render his anger with fury, and his
18	rebukes with flames of fire. For by fire and by his
19	sword will the Lord plead with all flesh; and the slain
20	of the Lord shall be many." Well, who's going to be
21	slain? "They that sanctify themselves" See, you
22	can't sanctify yourself. If you try to sanctify
23	yourself that's blasphemy.
24	HENRY: Um-hum.
25	MR. KORESH: You've got to go to a
	sanctuary

HENRY: Um-hum.

MR. KORESH: -- to be sanctified. In nature every animal lives in its natural habitat, right?

HENRY: Um-hum.

MR. KORESH: Okay. Now, why don't you come on up hither? Up hither is my sanctuary. My father sits here on a throne. See all these thousands times ten thousands and thousands and thousands of angels? Okay. Now, my father gave me a book and don't think that I'm proud or arrogant because when I come back here to show this book no one's going to bow before me, no one's going to know where I'm coming from. They're going to call me stupid, they're going to call me crazy because I don't walk to the rudiments of this world. They're going to misjudge me, misunderstand me, but that's all right, I can take it because I love, okay?

MR. KORESH: Now, but come on back up here hither though. In the first seal we see in Psalms 45 who's going to ride prosperously because the truth, we know who's going to win, no problem, okay? And we want to learn who's going to lose. "They that sanctify themselves." The word sanctuary is tied in with the word sanctification. When you adapt to your surroundings then you're sanctified to that sanctuary or place of dwelling, right?

1	HENRY: Um-hum.
2	MR. KORESH: Now, in this sanctuary up hither
3	we are sanctified by the knowledge of seven seals,
4	right?
5	HENRY: Um-hum.
6	MR. KORESH: And that's the sanctification of
7	the God who sits on the throne.
8	HENRY: Um-hum.
9	MR. KORESH: But, "They that sanctify
10	themselves and purify themselves in the garden behind
11	one tree in the midst," what tree do you think they're
12	eating of, figuratively? What's the tree that Adam and
13	Eve wanted to eat?
14	HENRY: The tree of
15	MR. KORESH: Knowledge of good and evil.
16	HENRY: Um-hum.
17	MR. KORESH: I guess everybody likes that
18	tree, don't they?
19	HENRY: Um-hum.
20	MR. KORESH: Yum, yum, yum. They don't want
21	to do what God says, do they?
22	HENRY: No.
23	MR. KORESH: They want to take not of the
24	tree of life, but they want to take of the tree of
25	knowing what it means to do against God's will and get
	the bitter curse for it.

1	HENRY: Um-hum.
2	MR. KORESH: Now, but these people revealed
3	this in the midst eating swine's flesh, "And the
4	abomination, and the mouse, " you don't think people eat
5	mice, do you?
6	HENRY: No.
7	MR. KORESH: Well, people used to.
8	HENRY: Um-hum.
9	MR. KORESH: But another thing is this, you
10	know, your RDA and all that, these regulations, have
11	you ever been to a bread mill before in our country?
12	Have you ever seen the mass amount of wheat that's put
13	into these granaries and everything?
14	HENRY: Uh-huh.
15	MR. KORESH: They wash it, don't they?
16	HENRY: Um-hum.
17	MR. KORESH: Well, we used to combine wheat
18	when I was a young boy and I used to go down to the big
19	silos and we used to we, we had a, we had a city co-
20	op granary.
21	HENRY: Um-hum.
22	MR. KORESH: But things started changing, you
. 23	know, the, the Dallas and Richardson area and Garland
24	area stopped farming cotton and wheat like they used
25	to.

HENRY: Um-hum.

1 MR. KORESH: But what happens -- we used to 2 go down there, we used to see these, these -- some of these rats were like a foot and a half long everywhere. 3 4 HENRY: Um-hum: 5 MR. KORESH: And some of the grain would end up with so much rat crap in it you couldn't, you 6 7 couldn't believe it. 8 HENRY: Um-hum. 9 MR. KORESH: And not all that stuff gets washed out, but it does get ground up though and it is 10 made into flour, you know? Now, if they bleach it 11 12 that's pretty good, of course, bleached flour is not that good for you anyway. But these people are eating 13 these cal-free, talking about eating this whole-wheat 14 15 bread and all that? 16 HENRY: Um-hum. 17 MR. KORESH: They're getting a little part of mouse, that's the waste part of a mouse. But anyway, 18 it says, "Shall be consumed together saith the Lord. 19 For I know their works and their thoughts: it shall 20 come that I will gather all nations and tongues; and 21 they shall come, and see my glory. And I will set a 22 sign among them." You know what the sign is, don't 23

25 HENRY: Um-hum.

you, the end sign? It's a great one.

MR. KORESH: From the rise of the sun to the

1	west everyone's going to know who the Messiah is
2	because God's going to, God's going to judge the
3	greatest nation in the world in the latter days to show
4	the whole world that no matter how big you get, no
5	matter how powerful you get, no matter how intelligent
6	you get, watch the little guy. If you don't watch out
7	for him you know, Robert, you know, I was going to
8	let him stay here with me for two weeks.
9	HENRY: Um-hum.
10	MR. KORESH: You know? He could have lived
11	right here with me. He could have, he could have
12	discovered everything.
13	HENRY: Uh-huh.
14	MR. KORESH: I sure wish he had waited for
15	that because he said he was going to.
16	HENRY: Uh-huh.
17	MR. KORESH: You know, really in all honesty
18	and in all judgment
19	HENRY: Um-hum.
20	MR. KORESH: the problem did not begin
21	with us here.
22	HENRY: Uh-huh.
23	MR. KORESH: And that's why I wanted to talk
24	so bad to Robert, because, you know, he met some of the
25	guys, we knew who they were when they first moved in.
	HENRY: Uh-huh.

1 MR. KORESH: You know? 2 **HENRY:** Uh-huh. 3 MR. KORESH: And I sent some of the boys over there and I said, well, this is the way the system is 4 working and I said, remember, that these guys don't 5 know us, they don't know me and we're going to treat 6 7 them just like we treat everybody else. 8 **HENRY:** Okav. 9 MR. KORESH: And we sat over there and all that, we gave them them beer, cause like I say in 10 scripture we're supposed to thithe the weak and strong, 11 we did not excessively drink alcohol. We had maybe one 12 13 beer at a time, maybe two, within a period of like -we'd regulate -- yeah, I'm a boss, I, I regulate it, 14 one beer within an hour. I do not believe in 15 intoxication, but you know, God has allowed men to have 16 certain things to allow their nervous system to rest in 17 18 moderation. 19 **HENRY:** Uh-huh, uh-huh. When you said you had a few beers over there, what are you talking about? 20 21 MR. KORESH: Over with, over with Robert and 22 them. 23 **HENRY:** Oh, okay. MR. 6	HENRY: Um-hum.
7	MR. KORESH: You know, I mean it's, it's just
8	like man, it's like people have to always deceive
9	and lie and, and, you know so anyway, we allowed
10	them to come over. And, and I told Robert, I when
11	Robert brought his AR-15 over here, one-seven twist,
12	you know, he had, he had that trigger job done so
13	immaculate, you know, and he's, he's trying to act like
14	he doesn't know nothing about it. Well, there, well,
15	there's one thing that, that, that you can never fake.
16	You know what that is?
17	HENRY: What's that?
18	MR. KORESH: Experience. You can never act
19	like you don't know how to drive when you do.
20	HENRY: Um-hum.
21	MR. KORESH: You can act like you do know how
22	to drive and people will say you don't. But if you try
23	to act like you can't ride or you try to act like you
24	can't ride a bicycle, you'll, you'll be able to show
25	everyone that you can.

HENRY: Um-hum.

1	MR. KORESH: So when Robert comes over here
2	and he brings this pistol with the pin-point scope on
3	it and all that and everything's feathered and
4	everything and the action and all that super set on
5	it
6	HENRY: Um-hum.
7	MR. KORESH: you know, and wants to ask me
8	about it? You know, I told him, I says, Robert you
9	know everything about this pistol, you know?
10	HENRY: Um-hum.
11	MR. KORESH: When he comes over and he wants
12	to talk about, you know, can he, can he shoot his
13	pistol and all this kind of stuff, you know, I said,
14	fine, I says, you can come over and you can shoot at
15	the back part of the property. I says we shoot out
16	there sometimes.
17	HENRY: Uh-huh.
18	MR. KORESH: You know?

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

HENRY: Um-hum.

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

The same God who had the power to destroy in the days of Noah, was the same God of which Christ says, as it was in the days of Noah, it will be in the days of the son of man. He's referring to himself, as the son of man, right?

HENRY: Um-hum.

DAVID: They'll be eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, and we'll know not until the flood comes and takes them all away.

Now, today, that God who sits in heaven on the sea of glass, that God that has on his throne lightnings, thunderings and voices, has above his throne a rainbow. Now, God means what he says, and those who go contrary to what God has written in his book are in deep fire. The prophets have told us there will not be a flood the next time. It'll be with chariots and it'll be with fire. But let me explain, the fire that the prophets saw, it's not like the fire you light with a match. It's not a flamethrower fire either, but this world is going to witness a celestial display of armed forces that they've never dreamed of.

I'm the little guy. I need so much tender care.

I need so much, I mean, my poor, weak brain, I'm just a
temporal cult leader out here, in the middle of
nowhere, desolate Waco, Texas, I mean, you got to be
crazy to be in Waco, Texas. What's good in Waco? But

you know, I'm in big trouble with you people, and --2 HENRY: Well --3 DAVID: -- I know that, but you know something else? What really grieves me is that if this 4 bible is true, you are in a lot more trouble than me 5 and I would do anything, anything in this whole world. 6 I'd make any sacrifice to keep the event that you know 7 not about, for lack of your knowledge, to come upon you 8 9 or anybody in the world else like you. You know, let's keep negotiating and let's keep 10 listening to this fool and let's keep understanding 11 that whereas you give us time, and I thank you so very, 12 very much, for my sake and for yours, that you're not 13 only allowing my God to judge you, because it's a very, 14 you know, hey, when a person loses eternal life, it's 15 16 forever. 17 HENRY: That's right. 18 DAVID: Now, think how precious that is. Now, it's also allowing these people that have chosen 19 the doctrine that I have presented, they see your arms, 20 they see your might, they see the definite threat 21 22 against their humanity. 23 HENRY: Uh-huh. 24 DAVID: And they also realize that for their faith, be subjected to you, they will have also 25 forfeited their rights of their humanity.



HENRY: Well --

DAVID: But, what I am saying is, that there is necessity for time to be given for, especially these women, to stop and judge in their hearts in regards to how they perceive the giving up of their children.

HENRY: But, one of the things though, is, I get the impression, when I speak to some of these people, and to include Steve, that they cannot act or make any decision without your specific instructions.

DAVID: That is not true.

HENRY: I understand, I understand what you're saying, but it might --

DAVID: That's why I'm telling the guys around here to watch out -- that's why me and Jim have been so careful, 'cause I have to, these are human beings around here. They have their own mind and that's why I, you know, I instruct certain of these guys here not to fire on you all. You know, and I have to keep telling Jim, I say now Jim, listen, you know, these people are beings of the, of the clay, they've got nervous systems, they have a certain way of seeing, and just as you may have individuals that you train and teach, right?

HENRY: Um-hum.

DAVID: They may still, under a real crisis, make a mistake, as we saw already, right?

1 HENRY: That's right, and I think a lot of 2 mistakes were made, you know, and --3 DAVID: And same as these individuals here. **HENRY:** That's right, because, because you 5 have arms too. --6 DAVID: Exactly. 7 **HENRY:** -- that caused a lot of destruction, 8 you know, on both sides. I don't think it should have happened, but it happened. 9 10 Yeah, it should never have happened. DAVID: 11 **HENRY:** Exactly, exactly, and I agree with 12 you 100%. But I would like to see some of these people start to come out. I really, I really think it's, it's 13 good for everybody. 14 15 DAVID: Well, what you think is good for you, what God thinks is good for all of us. 16 17 HENRY: Do you think that --18 Let's, let's humble ourselves just a 19 moment and let's look up, and let's look in our 20 scriptures and let's see who is above us all. Let's 21 really fear God, let's really look at Psalms 45 in the 22 light of the first seal, and let's really be honest with God now, because Psalms 45 is basically telling 23 you what God's going to do with his king. 24 25 HENRY: One of the things though, that I think that we need to agree with, is that nobody is



going to use arms against each other.

DAVID: I'm not preparing to.

HENRY: Okay, well, you know, I'm glad, I'm glad of that and I'm glad also that --

DAVID: But I guarantee you what, if we didn't have them, you all sure would have come into here and flared your around, yours around, and busted me around and I'd never be able to say nothing. Now be honest with me.

HENRY: Look, I, I can tell you this. I work for the FBI, okay? I can tell you what I would do if I were there. I can't speak for anybody else except for, for Henry Garcia.

DAVID: Okay, so, so the, so the oppression, which always is desired to be, you know, pacified, you know, always the, the -- we always have to understand that the, the ones in charge, the ones given from the bureaucratic system, the power to exercise judgement and wisdom in discerning situations and circumstances, that if it's abused, we have to tolerate it because it's the best we have. Yes, we know you have all the media and you have all the insight to cover your butts on that. We know that. Now, a secondary --

HENRY: Okay, now, let me ask you this, --

DAVID: It may be, it may be factual also, that such people that commit crimes --

1 **HENRY:** Look, I don't, I don't have the facts 2 because I was not there. 3 DAVID: Okay, okay. I don't have any idea. I know --4 HENRY: 5 DAVID: But you guys were involved ahead of 6 time. You were already informed about the situation a 7 long time ago. 8 **HENRY:** I have -- I knew nothing about 9 anything. I didn't even, you know, how would I know --10 DAVID: Maybe not you --11 -- what was going on, you know -- I didn't have any idea about any of this, but, but let me 12 say this, you -- just like you said, it shouldn't have 13 happened, it shouldn't -- things have happened on 14 15 either side, you know, I mean, things happened from either side, so, I'm not judging you, I'm not judging 16 17 them --18 DAVID: Well let me, let me take these ATF agents, and let me, let me get my jury together --19 20 I'm sure that what's going to happen **HENRY:** 21 22 DAVID: -- and, and let me, let me try them 23 under my law. 24 Well, you know, --HENRY: 25 Does that sound okay for you? Can, DAVID: can the United States of America allow that?

1 **HENRY:** Well, God will judge them --2 Oh, definitely, God is judging them, DAVID: 3 no doubt about it, but --4 **HENRY:** Okay, and the facts will be judged in 5 the court of law and that's why --6 DAVID: Now, wait a minute, whose court of 7 We already know your court of law. We already 8 know in 1988, that I sat and I was given statements 9 from a prosecuting attorney such as this, Okay, 10 Mr. Howe (Phonetic), the night you went out there to 11 murder George Roden (Phonetic), did you ever stop to 12 think that what you was doing was wrong, yes or no? Now, I do need to explain. I -- no, I just want a yes 13 or a no. You see, that, that is a hanged statement, 14 15 and that, you know, that should not even be allowed in a court of law. But it was in my case. 16 17 HENRY: Were you found innocent or guilty? 18 DAVID: What happened to me was, is that according to the laws and precepts of the law, when a 19 jury is chosen, it is required that no member of that 20 21 jury is to be associated with either the defense or the 22 prosecution, right? 23 HENRY: Um-hum. 24 They're to be strangers, aren't they? DAVID: 25 HENRY: Um-hum.

Well, then why was it allowed that

DAVID:

one of the black individuals was a close friend of Mr. Shabaz (Phonetic)? Why was that allowed? And why was it that the jury could not make a decision on my case? Well, what happened was, after the decisions were made and the acquittal of the seven others, we threw a little party down at our studio. We had a little music studio down off of 17th Street, and we invited the jury members to that party.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: Huh?

HENRY: I'm saying uh-huh.

DAVID: Okay. Well, what happened was, some of the -- well, the man that was in charge of it, they began to explain, they began to say, now, look, we don't know why, but there was an individual and another individual that, which these people did not come to the party, okay?

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: It was the two black members. And that no matter what we reasoned, what we said to them, they would not admit that you were not guilty, and we couldn't -- we worked on it for hours, we, you know, we talked to them, they said, but, but Mr. Howe, they says, you know, -- So finally, what we decided to do, is we decided to agree that we was going to, going to go ahead and acquit the other seven and they was going

to come back in again and vote on you, and then we was going to make you guilty. And so they agreed with that. So, we went ahead, and we gave our decisions on the seven, went back in on you and then we went ahead and it was a hung jury again.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: But they had to do this, they had to, the people that heard the evidence on both sides, after the second they had decided what was taken place here, you know, originally, -- Well, you'd know, you should know at this time about the speculations of Vic Fazell (Phonetic) and his dealings with the, you know, you know, Waco is known for its methamphetamine, you know, that don't you?

HENRY: Um-hum.

DAVID: Okay, and it's drugs?

HENRY: Um-hum.

DAVID: I mean, you know, it's such a nice place around here and everything. Well, we came back on the property in 1988, that's what they were in the process of doing. Now, the sherriff's department knew about that. They knew completely about that. Especially with individuals such as Donny Joe Harvey, Roy Borwells (phonetic), you know, George Roden, you know. The thing of it was is that individuals who'd been saying that George was into the experimentation of



a little coke here and there, you know, all hearsay stuff, but of course, the purposes of this is that when he started digging up the cemetery, you know, the cemetery, the question was, what is this man doing? Where is he coming from? Well, what did I do? I simply went to the sherriff's department, and I explained to, you know, the sherriff, Dickerson, who's now, you know, he has Parkinson's Disease or something, off the force, I explained to him the situation and I asked that he would go out to Mt. Carmel and look into this and deal with it. It's called corpse abuse.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: He wouldn't do nothing. Kept telling me we had to have evidence. Well everybody could see him out there anytime, digging in the cemetery with a, with a John Deere 1010 tractor.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: Okay, well, what happened was, is it was really kind of funny. So then, I'm down in Palestine where we had to purchase a property down there because of all the people that originally were, had bequeathments and second tie rights for the property here, we had to re-locate them because George had, had ran them all off with a semi-automatic Uzi. When his mother, who was the director at that time, tried to talk to the people to give her time to work

with them, they, in Christian faith, you know, went ahead and didn't enact a restraining order against him, 'cause he had a restraining order against him since 1978, which, in allowing him to come back on the property, that violated the rights to enforce the restraining order.

HENRY: Um-hum.

people couldn't move back, and the law was not going to enforce it. Okay, so, we had, we had a waiting period there. Then all of a sudden this George guy calls me up and tells me that he's got this lady that was buried twenty, some twenty years ago, back in '88, and, you know, challenged me to a duel to resurrection. And I told him, I says, "George, not today." You know, George, like a lot of people, didn't understand where I was coming from.

George became upset when I first came here in 1981, because this little group of people were known for many years to be people who have ever accepted light as it unfolds. Okay, so naturally when God's going to do work, he's going to choose people and have ears to hear and eyes to see, right?

HENRY: Um-hum.

DAVID: So I began to come here and these people were considered to be one of the top bible

people in the whole world. I mean, that's, that's all they've done ever since the '30s, is they've studied the prophecies.

Well, when I came, all of a sudden the mysteries unfolded. Well, this outraged George. George has this idea that he's supposed to be the heir of this property because his mother and father was the original originator of this association.

HENRY: Um-hum.

DAVID: Well, things didn't work out so he took the situation by force. Dickerson told us that if we would get pictures of the casket, then he would come out here and deal with the situation.

HENRY: Okay.

DAVID: I hired a guy that was allowed to come back and forth, his name was Sam Jones, you know, who started a connection with George, and I hired him and I gave him a little camera, a little Instamatic. He came and he walked into the church. He took all these pictures from all angles. So we had the pictures developed, went back to the sherriff's department, and did they move on it? No. You know what his reply to me was?

HENRY: What?

DAVID: He looked through them, he looked kind of worried. He says, well, I don't know that



take the pictures.

1 and I went to K-mart and I bought, you know, shot guns

2 and stuff like that and the whole plan revolved around

3 diversion. Diversion. We got eight guys together.

4 | Some came up by the, by the lake. The others were out

5 | by the dump ground out here, where some of your guys

are at right now. You know, it's in the back here.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And me and Dave and a guy named Mark, -- a van drove by, it was like 2 or 3 in the morning, real slow, we hopped out, we crawled across the road and crawled all the way over to the church, which is the front and foremost building, and we, you know, we watched and everything and, and Mark went inside to

Well, what happened was is that as we was standing there, or actually staying a good odd distance. There used to be an old trailer out here between the, where church building use to be, up towards the front, and to where the old, old truck trailer is, towards the back of the property there. You'll see it there on the right if you're looking towards the front of the building, in front of the property.

HENRY: Um-hum.

DAVID: And there was a trailer, a double-wide trailer, that was where George lived. I'd say it's about a 150 yards away from the church.



HENRY: Okay.

DAVID: Well, so we're there and all of a sudden this dog comes walking up. He comes walking up on the road, he looks over and he sees me and he just turns around, he just walks real calmly, slowly, all the way back. When he walked back he went into the trailer kind of like, and all of a sudden there's barking everywhere. These dogs are from everywhere. So George's lights went on and, and where we're looking for him we saw him get up and look out his big window there and he was in his t-shirt and in his underwear. He grabbed this big spotlight and started shining everywhere. So, Mark came out of the church and says, you know, the casket's not there.

HENRY: Um-hum.

DAVID: The casket's been moved. So the dog's are hollering and running so, so we commenced to crawl all the all the way out to the, to the road there, Double E Ranch Road, and you'll notice where the two water towers is, between there and our entrance is that little barn down there, a little tin shed and a little -- block shed, where some of the agents right now are at.

HENRY: Um-hum.

DAVID: So we crawled on our bellies all the way down that ditch line, all the way over to that

building and ran way on out in Perry's field to circle completely around the back of the property, all the way to the back of the property. So we met with the other 3 guys and then we went all the way back out towards the power lines and we all re-met at the power lines. Nothing happened. Okay? George wasn't shot at. George wasn't killed. Nothing happened. Now we're all down there, and we're saying now, look at this. He moved the casket. What's going on? The old people are living in Palestine -- now, now listen to this. HENRY: Um-hum. DAVID: They were living in Palestine, ranging from ages of 40's, well actually 50's, up to 80 something years old, originally they possessed the 13 houses out here, but they were all moved off, and we had to build little sheds down in Palestine, 8 X 16, HENRY: Uh-huh. -- all plywood, 2 X 2 framing, just DAVID: as a standard housing thing. Most of these people been in religion for years and they've outlived their kids. HENRY: Um-hum. DAVID: So anyway, so we're saying, we've got to find that casket, what are we going to do?

DAVID: Well, what took place was we came in the morning, early in the morning. We slept outside that night. Early in the morning we re-gathered up around where the dairy barn is over here, where your agents are right now. Good locations, I have to admit.

HENRY: Okay.

DAVID: And we, we came up and I said, "This is what we're going to do. We need to wait until, you know, everybody leaves, if we can make sure everybody leaves the property and look around a little bit and, you know, stay out of sight, and see if George has dumped this casket somewhere.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: So all the house -- but the place looked like trash. The houses, they were had -- they had had no paint on them for a year and a half, and you have to paint the houses out here at least once a year 'cause the way the humidity is and all that, it's just the paint cracks off. So, like I said, we were armed, that's true. But why we were armed, well, that was already, that was clearly made known, even after the so-called gun battle. The gun battle took place with lots of rounds being fired right into the ground.

HENRY: Okay.

DAVID: I mean there was no, there was no bullet holes in no houses, no bullet holes in no cars,





no bullet holes nowhere but in one tree.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: Now, you see, the people, the people don't -- now there's bullet holes everywhere, it's different now.

HENRY: Yes, absolutely.

DAVID: But here's the deal. The deal was, is that, you know, we started up, and I went into the first house on the far side of the property, man, it was trashy. It had trash in there, it had goat crap in there, it was like, you know, old beds, like, someone had been in there doing some wrong things, you know, you know how drug addicts do.

HENRY: Um-hum.

DAVID: And, you know, and the second house, no one's there, and the third -- now, we waited. This took about, about, till about eleven, or so, o'clock, 'cause we had a, a zoom scope, and, and we was, we was doing our little ATF work then ourselves, okay? You understand?

HENRY: (Laughs)

DAVID: So, you know, we were being very cautious and everything, and so, we finally came up to some houses, and we looked in one house and, you know, it was like, all these houses were trash and which we got all the pictures to show that. And pornography



everywhere.

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HENRY:

DAVID:

I mean, Playboy, Penthouse, I don't know,

2 just, everything. Anyway, just a lot filthy stuff. 3 HENRY: Um-hum. 4 And so we came to one house and we looked, we looked in the door there and there was this 5 6 shotgun there, and we picked up a couple of weapons. It was just like laying close to the doors, you know? 7 8 **HENRY:** Uh-huh. 9 DAVID: And they were confiscated along with our weapons too, and they were saying they were ours, 10 but they really weren't. So what happened was, we 11 12 finally came up to this one house, we're behind this 13 house and like, two guys at a time, right? 14 HENRY: Um-hum. 15 DAVID: And two guys, like, move up behind each house 'cause our, our plan is that if anything 16 17 happens, we want to divert, we want to get out of there. ' 18 19 **HENRY:** Um-hum. 20 DAVID: So finally we're there and all of a sudden, lo and behold, this girl comes out of this 21 22 house and she's, she's, you know, she's walking in these real short shorts, I've never seen them before, 23 24 and you know --

Wait hold it, what?

Short shorts.



**HENRY:** 

Um-hum.



1 **HENRY:** Oh, okay. 2 DAVID: Which, you know, this religion, we don't do that. 3 4 HENRY: Um-hum. 5 DAVID: Of course, it was not a religion when George Roden was occupying the place. 6 7 **HENRY:** Um-hum. 8 DAVID: And I need to tell you also, his mother had passed away too, while he was there. 9 10 **HENRY:** Um-hum. 11 DAVID: And so what happened was, is she had her halter top off and she came around and she walked 12 right by two of those guys and, you know, she came by 13 14 and all that and, you know, she sees us there and 15 everything and we had bought some K-mart, you know, 16 those deer hunting suits? HENRY: Oh, yeah. 17 18 So she comes around and she says, DAVID: what, and I says, I says, come here. You know. 19 20 says, what are you? Are you all policemen or what? And I says, look. I says George Roden's got a casket, 21 22 out here right? And she goes, yeah. You know, and I says, we're here to, to find out where this casket is. 23 She goes, I don't know where they put it. You know? 24

DAVID: So right there we knew, okay? So





then this, this other girl comes out and she's, she sees two guys there and, you know, like, they're face to face, and she goes, who in the hell are you?

HENRY: Um-hum.

DAVID: You know, and this guy, he goes, we're here to, to try to find the casket that George Roden's been digging out. And she curses him out, steps on out the door, gets to her little car out there, you know, and drives up to the trailer --

HENRY: Um-hum.

DAVID: -- where George is residing. We're going, oh no, what's going on now, right?

HENRY: Um-hum.

DAVID: So this girl, you know, she's standing there by us, and this is even her own testimony, you know? She says, you know, I said, I said, look, you know, you need to be going out of here, you know, we may have some trouble, or something like that. And she goes, no, I'll stay here. You know. And she goes, she said something like she had worked at the police department before or something like that. So we're there and all of a sudden this George comes walking down from the trailer, walking down the road, and he's got, you know, his t-shirt, and he's got his pants and he's got his black cowboy hat on and he's got this Uzi, side-strapped to his right shoulder.





HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: I mean, just as strutting and as proud as can be, you know. So he stands out there at the corner and he's right there in the middle of the road, you know, right in dead sight. Now tell me how eight guys, heavily armed, is what all of the t.v. shows say, how do eight guys heavily armed, miss a fat guy standing in plain sight, ranging from the distances of, oh, 40 yards to no more than 75 yards, how do they miss him?

HENRY: Good question.

DAVID: Okay, now, here's the deal. Stan had moved over from one house and, the building that's now here wasn't here. The old building had burnt down.

And he had moved over towards the structure and George came up and says, you know, state who you are, you know? Show yourself, you know?

HENRY: (Laughs)

DAVID: And what happened was is Stan, Stan had been raised with George. This is what's really irony. Stan and George had been like, you know, known each other for years. And Stan, you know, he's moved back from Massachusetts and he says, he says, George, we don't want no trouble. What did you do with the casket? Put your gun down. And all of a sudden, you know, George steps back and fires in the direction of



Stan, and the bullet hit a part of the concrete and ricocheted up and hit Stan in the leg.

HENRY: Um-hum.

DAVID: Now, when I was at K-mart and I was buying one of these suits, some of the other guys were, you know, buying some too, they had a sale on these pocket knives where it has like a spoon, and a fork, a little knife, you know, a pair of scissors in it.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: So we had bought a bunch of those and I bought him one. I bought two or three of the guys one, and he had had that in his pocket and that's where that bullet, that bullet hit from a ricochet, it wasn't a direct hit, that bullet hit that knife and just, just dented the whole thing right up. You know, so, that's how luck ran. Okay, so at that time, the guys had been told before we was to create a diversion. We hadn't really, you know, really planned anything so all of a sudden here comes, you know, six or seven firearms, blasting away. It sounded, it sounded like Viet Nam, you know, bam, bam, bam, right? So George, his eyes get real big, you know, I mean, real big.

HENRY: (Laughs)

DAVID: And he starts back pedaling his little fat butt as fast as I've seen any, any, any fullbacker, you know, running back do it. I mean, this



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guy, this guy is beyond NFL pro.

**HENRY:** (Laughs)

3 DAVID: He is back pedaling like everything -- he never in his life realized. But the thing of it 4 5 was is that, hey didn't drop because nobody was shooting at him. Everybody was shooting right into the 6 ground. Now, you know, 223, which, you know, we bought 7 some of these ruggers (Phonetic). We had some shotguns and, you know, some had some .22s. Now, you know, those ruggers are loud. They're louder than the shotguns were. But boy, it sounded like earth thunder. This guy was back pedaling and, like I say , he, he, you know, with all that firing at him, all those eight lousy shots, you know, 'cause I, I hadn't fired yet, I'm, like, thinking, oh, no, you know. He back pedaled all the way from where he was standing which was closer to the, let me see, let me give you a point of position, okay, do you know where our sandbox is?

**HENRY:** No.

DAVID: In the front of the property? If you were standing right in front of our building, the far left of our building there is a sandbox for the kids to play in. Okay, you know where the water tower is?

> HENRY: Um-hum.

Okay, if you were standing on the DAVID: road facing the water tower, that's where he was



standing.

HENRY: Okay.

DAVID: And, like I say, I was about 45, about 45 yards from him, I guess. Okay. And Stan was about, oh, maybe, I don't know, twenty something or thirty yards away from him, from a side direction.

HENRY: Um-hum.

DAVID: And of course there was each little house had two or three guys standing behind it. So, you know, everybody's just banging, banging, banging, and this guy thinks he's dead a hundred times over, and he back pedals and he goes behind these cars and he keeps going, so I came from in the house and I told him, and I says, throw your gun down, George. You know, we don't want any trouble. Of course, you know, yeah, he thinks that, right?

HENRY: Um-hum.

DAVID: So anyway, so he runs around to the back side of the house that was where, where our bus is right now. Okay, where our bus is right now on the property, there use to be a house there.

HENRY: Okay.

DAVID: As a matter of fact, the foundation is still there. 'Cause that's where his mother use to live.

HENRY: Oh, okay.



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DAVID: And he ran back to that area and he stood to the side of it, the far side of it, --

HENRY: Um-hum.

DAVID: And what happened was is I was running out towards the back part of the field so I could come to the back side to see where he was going. Anyway, the two oldest men, Floyd and Stan, which, like I say, both of these guys are in their 50's, yeah, yeah, they're in their 60's -- they were in their 50's then, they had, they had gotten themselves out in the open and all of a sudden George re-emerges on the back side of this far house and I'm out there in the open and all of a sudden I, I hear this zap, zap, zap, and his Uzi, if I'm not mistaken, shoots .45s, and those things whistle. When they sound like, they sound like a jet coming through the air. And that's the first time I ever had an experience with a projectile coming close to my body.

HENRY: Um-hum.

DAVID: So I'm going like, whoa, God, you know, we need some help on this one. So I quickly ran out to a farther part of the field where there was an old car, and I jumped back behind this old car. It was an old, I forgot, one of those, like a Studebaker, but it was a different kind of a Studebaker, but anyway, I was back behind there and next thing is I hear this



rap, rap, and I see these two older guys. There is a foundation out of the ground, out here they pour -- they pour furrows, they pour foundations like a pair of beams?

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And they were, they were back trying to get down and there was still, you know, ashes and soot from where the building originally stood, that was still settling into the soil, and this stuff was flying up like, big old clouds, smoke is -- George is actually aiming to hit these two guys. And that's when it got real serious. That's when everything was out of hand. But what, what should have happened though, is that these guys should have, you know, stayed back behind the houses. You know, they should have stayed back behind the houses. But, you know, that's why I understand, humans are humans.

HENRY: Sure.

DAVID: And they weren't shooting at George at all.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: So then what happened was, where I got involved is that, you know, here he's shooting so I started shooting real, you know, real fast, so George back-tracked again and got behind this tree. The tree still stands over there near the, near the far right of





the property where the little boat shed is.

HENRY: Okay.

DAVID: And George got behind this tree, and so George starts shooting out behind, from behind this tree. And Stan and Floyd were still pinned down to the ground. All right. So I had to make decisions. I didn't really want to shoot directly into the air because what direction is that?
