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MR. KORESH: -- Christ, right? The boss is back, right?

DICK: The boss is back.

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MR. KORESH: Okay, and likewise the Lutherans and the Presbyterians and the Methodists and Christ can say to those who were given talents, you know, well, you've -- I've given you five talents, you've increased them to ten, I've given you four -- I increased them to eight, you know, and sad to say there might be those religious institutions that had one talent and you just buried it in the ground, didn't, didn't produce any increase for their Lord, right? But then, you know, that would be so idealistic, you know -- you know, Christ is going to come, you'll see glorious things bigger than anybody else, nobody can fight against him, no opposition, you know, no quibble of mine, just straight across the table. But it, it seems to appear very clearly, as a matter of fact very factually, that the revelation of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John develops a few mysteries such as Christ talking with his disciples about his second coming. In Matthew 24 he begins to make it very plain, you know, about his second coming. Though he refers to the prophet Daniel, he says, "When you shall see the abomination and desolation," spoken of by the prophet Daniel he tells about his followers leaving Jerusalem. Okay, and then

he says, "In wars and rumors of wars they shall kill 2 you for my name's sake." He says, "Because iniquity 3 will abound (indiscernible) but you endure the same shall be saved." Says, "There will be great tribulation," and the -- and that tribulation, you 5 know, people don't understand the dark ages what kind of tribulation there was. He says, "In the tribulation 7 8 afterwards when they shall say to you he's in the desert he says go not forth; when they shall say he's 9 in the, in the secret chambers," in other words, you 10 know, no one knows where he's at and -- he's in heaven, 11 he's, you know, you know, right? He's up there in the 12 13 secret chambers. "Believe it not. For as lightening shines out of the East even the West will also shall be 14 the coming of the son of man." Now, does this mean 15 like lightning that shines in the East even to the West 16 like, you know, big lightening bolt he's going to come 17 or does it mean that it'll be as clear? I mean, just -18 - when you see literal lightening in nature shine it's 19 clear, isn't it? It's obvious, it's right there in 20 21 front of you, right? 22 DICK: Well, it should be, David. I, I would 23 agree. 24 MR. KORESH: Okay, but then the next statement that Christ makes according to what these men 25 say is, he says, "Wheresoever the carcass is -- " --

no, after he makes the statement of it'll be like lightening that shines in the East even in the West, and he says, "For wheresoever the carcass is there will 3 be eagles be gathered together." So, you know, a 4 5 statement like that puts the, the mind of man into a, into a query saying well, what does that mean? You 6 know, because the statement is not made to be very 7 8 obvious, is it? 9 DICK: Well, it's difficult for a lot of people to understand those kinds of statements, David, 10 and it's --11 12 MR. KORESH: But we know Christ would know what it means. 13 14 DICK: Absolutely. 15 MR. KORESH: And we would know that many would come in his name and he said -- said, "I am 16 Christ (indiscernible)" Now, now, Matthew said Christ 17 was Christ, Mark said Christ was Christ, Luke said 18 Christ was Christ and John says Christ was Christ. 19 there comes a later comer in the scripture when you 20 begin to see the book of Acts how it on the day of 21 Pentecost those who had received him were given power, 22 a definite sign of their acceptance in their purpose to 23 carry the good news not with just words of wisdom but 24 with power. They were given the cloven tongues of fire 25

which definitely had some kind of meaning to it. They,

they were cloven -- two tongues of fire. And they began to explain about -- Peter says, you know, that 2 this Christ same Christ in the heavens shall come again 3 and he shall remain in the heavens until the restitution of all things spoken of by the holy 5 prophets. Now, of course if a person is ignorant of 6 the holy prophets and what they have stated, then again 7 Peter will be making a statement in which the sun would be shadowy. But anyway, as we progress through the 9 Acts we see the Acts talks about certain individuals 10 who were very zealous and persecuting the things they 11 did not understand like Saul or Tarsius (phonetic sp.) 12 and we find that Saul finally got an awakening on the 13 way to Damascus to persecute more Christians when 14 scripture says Christ himself personally appeared in a 15 great light and blinded this man and smote this man to 16 the ground and says to this man, "Saul, Saul, why 17 persecutest thou me? It's hard to kick against the 18 pricks." Now, a lot of people wouldn't understand 19 again why Christ would, would state it's hard for Paul 20 to kick against the pricks. I mean, there's, there's a 21 lot of lingo and statements made by Christ and the 22 apostles which are not of the obvious, more or less in 23 the mysterious. But of course, if a person understood 24 in the day of Moses, Moses, you know, trying to be a 25 deliverer in his own strength (indiscernible) Egypt

have killed an Egyptian, right? And being brought 2 before the judiciary he, he made a run for it and 3 landed up in the land of Goshen over near Midian and there he finally found employment with the priest of 4 Midian and ended up marrying one of his daughters and a 5 good 40 years later deprogramed him from his pride and 6 arrogancy, his kingship type, you know, the way he was 7 raised in the house of Pharaoh, and basically taught 8 this man how to just simply live simple and love simple 9 and, and love to take care of sheep and take the burden 10 of a shepherd. And when the man finally had just about 11 become deprogramed from all of his high deals of being 12 13 somebody high and mighty, then all of a sudden he beheld down to Ararat up the mountain (indiscernible) 14 and he saw there a burning bush. Now, of course, you 15 know, if a person understood, you know, the Hebrew, I 16 mean there is kind of a translation problem sometimes, 17 they would understand that this bush was a thorn bush. 18 And Moses went down to see this great sight because the 19 thorn bush was all on fire but it wasn't being 20 21 consumed. And then of course the thorn bush turned out to be God, right? You know, and, and we find out this 22 thorn bush later on was really Christ before he became 23 24 So again, you know, Moses having been deprogramed from his (indiscernible) was ready to take 25 on the work that God was going to do through him, okay?

So then Moses had to confront the greatest nation of
the day and very humbly present has plea in behalf of
God and when the nation was stubborn and wouldn't
listen finally God had to retaliate because they
started retaliating on Israel and God finally subjected
and destroyed that nation so that all nations might be
prepared to realize that God was back in the saddle
again and he was coming into town.

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DICK: He was coming into town, huh? MR. KORESH: Oh, yeah, you know, God's a cowboy. He's, he's got some horses don't he in the book of Revelation? You know, God's definitely a cowboy. Now, what we're talking about again is that in the days of the new covenant where Christ is being crucified, being handed over to the Roman judiciary, we see a little bit the way corruption sometimes becomes obvious in political systems and that well, Pilot, Pilot in his position knew. I mean, Pilot wasn't one of these crazy religious fanatics. You know -- one time a person said years ago and I remember this that a fanatic is a person who's lost sight of their goal and try twice as hard to accomplish it. You know, and it always struck me, and I said, you know, though it's a statement of man it's very inspired.

DICK: Is that always a negative though, David?

1 MR. KORESH: What, a fanatic? 2 DICK: Yeah. 3 MR. KORESH: Well, like I say, fanaticism is something where men are running in the dark as fast as 4 they can to get to where they don't know where they're 5 6 going. 7 DICK: Well. that's --8 9 MR. KORESH: It could be a dangerous thing. 10 It certain can, but I, I would guess that on the other hand it can be -- it could also be a 11 12 good thing couldn't it? MR. KORESH: Well, I don't think so. 13 14 that being zealous --15 DICK: Okay. MR. KORESH: -- is a good thing, is putting 16 your full strength into something knowing what you're 17 to accomplish and being zealous is being a good thing, 18 but fanatic --19 20 DICK: Well, can I offer perhaps a personal observation? You know, in, in certain respects I 21 consider myself a fanatic. That is, I'm -- I, I want 22 to ensure that while I'm with this law-enforcement 23 24 organization that the constitution is first and foremost in, in terms of what I do with my day-to-day 25 activities and I deal with people that the constitution

is the measure of what, what I should do. And I, I'm 1 very fanatical about that to some degree, that that is, 2 is what I'm about, you know? I want to ensure that 3 when I'm doing the job that I protect the rights of the citizens that I deal with and that's, that's of prime 5 importance. I know this morning Steve was -- indicated 6 to me well, you know, once you folks leave what is 7 going to happen? I said, one thing that we're going to tell you that's going to happen is that the 9 constitution is going to be strictly adhered to. 10 is, that no one is going to circumvent any of your 11 constitutional rights, we will not allow that to 12 13 I know you had expressed several concerns that, that I personally sitting here with, with Jim for 14 the last couple of days have, have shared your concerns 15 with to include the safety of your -- of the children. 16 And I, I think you saw this morning on the press 17 conference that the kids -- there was some suggestion 18 in the media that the kids had been sent out to, to 19 Totally, totally inaccurate. And we 20 foster homes. have prepared for you a, a videotape that will, will 21 show you, you know, in color -- living color that that 22 23 is not the case at all.

MR. KORESH: Well --

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DICK: These kids are being, being treated well and we will not allow anything to happen to those

children. We treat, we treat them like our own. 2 MR. KORESH: Well, the statement was is that it was a planning in the social workers to locate them 3 to foster homes. 5 DICK: Well --MR. KORESH: See, that was the actual 6 7 statement. In other words -- now, I, I know these ladies down here, you know, I know Mrs. Koon and --8 9 DICK: You have some differences with them I 10 understand. MR. KORESH: Well no, wait a minute. 11 like, like my, my position is is that when we had them 12 evaluate us, you know, I mean and it comes to the point 13 to where I could become very picky in that well, first 14 of all I don't believe that a fat lady that sits on her 15 butt all day long and over eats is really a very good 16 mother. Now, if she has a problem to where, you know, 17 you know, she -- thyroid or something like that, you 18 know, she cannot help but to gain that weight then a, a 19 fat mama is a fat mama. But, you know, what I'm saying 20 21 is --22 DICK: (Laughter) 23 MR. KORESH: -- what I'm saying is a woman that is fat and working all day in, in an institution 24 25 that is always putting feminine tendencies above reason, you know, is not really --

1 DICK: David, I couldn't agree --2 MR. KORESH: -- is not really a social work. 3 Now, they --4 DICK: I couldn't agree with you more, couldn't agree with you more. 5 6 MR. KORESH: Now --7 DICK: We want to ensure that that does not We -- you know, all of us I think hear of 8 happen. instances where, you know, where kids are, are sent to 9 foster homes with little regard about anything more 10 than this is a place to put the children. We're not 11 going to let that happen. This is not going to happen. 12 13 MR. KORESH: What's going on? 14 DICK: I'm sorry. You listening to somebody in the background? 15 16 MR. KORESH: Well, it's just, just some little commotion took place and --17 18 DICK: Okay. 19 MR. KORESH: -- I've got, I've got to hold 20 these people down as --21 DICK: Well --22 MR. KORESH: -- much as can -- I can. DICK: Well, I know yesterday when you were 23 talking to Jim I took it upon myself to, to ensure that 24 some of these things got done because I can hear the 25 concern in your voice, as a father I hear that concern

in your voice. And, and not only in your voice but the 1 2 other parents out there are equally concerned. 3 MR. KORESH: Well, what I was -- what was breaking Jim down was is that like I say, you know, I 4 commended Jim for, for his expertise, you know, but the 5 thing of it is is that, you know, as you all are saying 6 one thing to me I, I had to get a little strong with 7 Jim yesterday. And I had to point blank say, you know, 8 now Jim, you are a liar. Now, here's the deal. 9 original, the original program was is that Jim had 10 confirmed and promised that the -- these little, these 11 little tanks and stuff were going to stay on the 12 perimeter of the property. Now, as they -- as, as they 13 all have been saying one thing we have been observing 14 and watching something totally opposite, of course 15 which you all keep saying it's not so which 16 idealistically shows us the fallibility of your ability 17 to, to perceive and know what's going on out here. 18 19 Now --20 DICK: Could I tell --21 MR. KORESH: -- I kept saying --22 DICK: -- could I tell you something in 23 confidence, David? 24 MR. KORESH: Go ahead. 25 In confidence? You know, we here are DICK: trying to do the very best we can and there are a

number of different agencies that we're dealing with.

MR. KORESH: I understand that.

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3 DICK: And you and I both know, let me 4 continue just a second. We all know that sometimes 5 tactical people, you know, they, they like to drive their -- they like to put on their, their gear, they 6 7 like to jump out of helicopters and they like to do those kinds of things, they like to drive around those 8 little tanks and they're -- you know, they're young, 9 they're not a little older and mature that I -- as you 10 and I are perhaps. A certain amount of that -- it's 11 like kids -- your kids going outside over there and 12 doing some things perhaps that you don't necessarily 13 agree on but you say hey, these are young kids, they've 14 got to live their life like you and I did. 15 Some of these folks driving those tanks, you know, this may be 16 17 the only opportunity they ever have to drive one of those Bradleys and boy, I want to get that Bradley up 18 and down the road and, you know, they, they get, they get impatient, they get, they get excited: hey here's my chance, let me push this vehicle, let's, let's see what this baby will do. It's like -- if I can draw an analogy like, you know, those Camaros that you have out I used to have a Camaro years ago and loved it, little Mustang, same way. Hey, this is just another vehicle for them to drive to shift a few gears and, and

probably they don't have a lot of expertise. 2 MR. KORESH: What's your name, Mike? 3 DICK: Dick. 4 MR. KORESH: Dick, okay. 5 DICK: Yeah, Dick. MR. KORESH: Dick, let me interrupt you real 6 7 quick. 8 DICK: Okay. 9 MR. KORESH: These, these young men I'm sure feel very confident in their little vehicles, 10 you know? The, the tactical force, the ATF, says they, 11 they prepared eight months for this. 12 13 DICK: Um-hum. 14 MR. KORESH: Well, we prepared ever since 1985, okay? Now, what I was trying to tell Jim in all 15 earnestness and in all passion is that when this little 16 tank keeps coming around back here it's going to get 17 blown to pieces. Now, that's what I was trying to tell 18 him honestly. You see, that thing -- that Bradley, we 19 know the specs and everything on that little tank with 20 the 25 mm gun and everything and along with, along with 21 Henry -- I kept trying to explain to Henry that when 22 such a vehicle, you know, comes in -- onto our 23 perimeter and crushes over a building that had stored 24 someone else's belongings not associated to this 25 organization and then goes and tears the camper shell

out at the front of the property, runs over these
buildings and then has the audacity to run right beside
our gymnasium right here and, and stand approximately
45 -- well, not even that much, 75 -- let's say 75
feet, you know, behind us, whoever those kids are they
are subject to be fired upon. And in being fired upon,
they're not going to be hit with no 50 caliber. You
know, we --

DICK: Well, that's why we tried --

MR. KORESH: -- understand that if it be, if it be (indiscernible) load or whether it be armorpiercing, that there's only four or five fatal points on that armored vehicle. But, but what they are going to be hit with is not a 50 caliber. Now, if, if --

DICK: David, you've got our assurances that nothing is going to happen --

MR. KORESH: Well now, let me explain to you. That was in my good favor, you see, because I explained to Jim because I love, I love you individuals and you do not understand what you're dealing with and I understand that. You see, you do not understand the importance of where my communication comes from, you know? You do not understand how I labored for the past month and a half with the ATF agents across the street. Very few people understand where I'm coming from and this is why I will spend the time on the phone with you

or anybody else that's willing to reason together with Because see, I'm being, I'm being blockaded from 3 the public which that's all right too because what was done the other day is sufficient for every honest 4 person in this nation to be able to say now, okay, 5 everything aside what did that guy teach the other day? 6 Let's see, he teached something about Jesus not being 7 believed on in his day, huh? And he teached something 8 about a revelation of Jesus Christ God gave him, let's 9 see, God on a white horse and something about a mystery 10 of God when there's time no longer, about seven 11 thunders that the prophets know about. And that guy 12 went back to what, Psalms 45 after showing us about the 13 14 Key of David, something about the Key of David that unlocks something to do with David. Yeah, David did 15 write the Psalms. Now, what does that Psalm 45 say? 16 Huh. Oh, well, that -- yeah, that's right, that is the 17 same as the first seal, oh, and that is the same as 18 Revelation 19, the marriage of the Lamb, blessed are 19 those that are called to the marriage supper of the 20 Well, I don't see -- that, that sounds right --21 that's right there in the Bible, that's in harmony. 22 Well, individuals right now as we speak that are, you 23 know, looking into these things and becoming honest; it 24 doesn't make no difference what they think about me as 25 a person because it's a (indiscernible) and a snare,

1 you see? 2 DICK: Um-hum. MR. KORESH: When Jeremiah the prophet of old 3 who tried to warn Israel about the pending doom of 4 Judea through Babylonian armies they laughed at him and 5 they mocked at him but finally Babylon did overthrow 6 7 Judea. 8 Well, David, there, there -- you know, DICK: we're certainly not laughing or mocking anybody here. 9 I'm --10 11 MR. KORESH: Well, I understand. DICK: I'm very willing to listen to you and 12 I'm trying to work with you to try to get some of these 13 things done. I understand that you asked Henry last 14 night for a suture kit. And we have, we have that and 15 we should have available very, very shortly. 16 MR. KORESH: Okay. Well, I appreciate that. 17 18 In addition to that we, in addition to DICK: that we've got photos and, and tape for you on the 19 20 kids. MR. KORESH: Well, we was asking, asking for 21 the milk if at al possible. 22 DICK: And, and we're going -- you know, let 23 me -- you know, I tried to explain this a little bit to 24 Steve. Can you, can you give a couple minutes of your 25

time to listen to this?

MR. KORESH: Sure, sure.

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2 DICK: I'm here to help you in any fashion I can and, you know, if it were just you and I, I'd have 3 4 that -- I'd be -- you know, as I told Steve I'd be riding down the lane now with milk. But I have to --5 you know, I have to send that up and decisions 6 sometimes in other areas are made by other people. 7 and I can work together, I have absolutely no question 8 in my mind about that, and I -- and you've got my word that I'm dealing with this issues and -- with that 10 issue and, and I have dealt with the other issues. 11 I've, I've gone out on my own yesterday based on what, 12 you know, your request to Jim was and I, and I went up. 13 I said, listen, let's get this done for this -- for, 14 for these folks out here and in turn they, they 15 considered these things and, and they said let's get 16 this suture kit in and the photos, obviously all of us 17 are concerned about the kids, we have the photos for you and we're going to get that in to you and, and it's not going to be much longer before, before those are available. But you know what, my experience in dealing with some of the, some of the bosses is such that -again, this is in confidence just the two of us here, we need to go to them and say listen, boss, I mean, you know, they've been in the Bureau longer than I have and they expect certain things of me. And sometimes they

don't understand as well as, as I do what it is to deal 2 with, with folks like this because it's been a long 3 time since they've been out there, you know, they, they desire to do other things, I've always had aspirations of dealing with people all the time. And they 5 6 always -- they want something. I said, hey, David, make me look good, make me look good to these people or 7 help me out, I can do these things for you and I have 8 done them for you and we'll, we'll have that shortly. 9 How do you want to do -- pick up out at the same point 10 out there? 11 12 MR. KORESH: Yeah, right out at the front. We'll send a girl out there to pick it up. 13 DICK: Okay. Can you do something for me? 14 15 MR. KORESH: What is it? 16 Well, can you, can you, can you help me out with -- make me look good up front up there? 17 MR. KORESH: Well, here's another thing. 18 made Jim look real good but as he continued to lie to 19 me and lie to me, remember, what you do not see is more 20 21 dangerous to you than what you do see. 22 DICK: Well --23 MR. KORESH: Now, what -- now, let me -- hear what I'm saying because see, with your mode of 24 communication you've already changed the subject on me 25 three times.

1 DICK: Well, I apologize for that --2 MR. KORESH: But I know --DICK: -- but I, I know these things are 3 important to you and I want to address them. 4 5 MR. KORESH: -- I know what you're trying to accomplish and I, and I -- as I told Jim, you see, you 6 have your board of directors and I understand very 7 thoroughly and clearly who your board of directors are. 8 DICK: Well, sometimes I don't understand 9 10 that --11 MR. KORESH: But --12 DICK: -- but we have to deal with it the best we can. 13 MR. KORESH: -- I have my board of direction 14 and that's what I was trying to explain last night to 15 But the key is this: my board of directors are 16 17 not so clearly seen or observed. And, and I was explaining to Jim, I was explaining to him that, you 18 19 know, Jim, this nation that says "In God We Trust," God is an unseen thing except a thing witnessed by the 20 prophets. Christ is an unseen thing. All we can see 21 is what men have said based in a book. And that's the 22 truth isn't it? Isn't it, Dick? Isn't that the truth? 23 24 DICK: It is the truth. I, I --25 MR. KORESH: It is the truth. And so --DICK: It is the truth. But you've --

1 MR. KORESH: -- people say -2 DICK: -- got a gift to be able to get that, that truth out to people. 3 4 MR. KORESH: Well --5 I don't think anybody would argue 6 that. MR. KORESH: -- let's, let's don't -- we got 7 a lot of people already out there, Billy Graham and --8 9 hello? 10 DICK: I'm here. MR. KORESH: And a lot of people that are out 11 there, they've been hammering this truth a long time 12 about good old Jesus, you know, loving Jesus. But the 13 thing of it is is that we remember what our original 14 15 conversation was is this Jesus, Pilot would have let him go but it was a bureaucracy thing and the, and the 16 Jews said that if you let him go, you know, friend of 17 Caesar's, we're not going to vote for you next term. 18 And when it came right down to it, Pilot still within 19 himself says, you know, I washed my hands of this just 20 21 person -- " -- you know --22 David, let -- Dave, I'm sorry, again, I apologize, but let me interrupt you for a minute. I 23 just got some information that those buggies are -- the Bradleys are moving around out there, I just want to

make sure that you don't feel uncomfortable about it.

KORESH: See, you're proving to me that you're not listening really --4 5 DICK: I am. 6 MR. KORESH: -- to, to listen. 7 listening to pacify and that's what Jim's doing. Jim was, Jim was saying, "Now, here's our deal, Dave." 8 9 DICK: Okay. 10 MR. KORESH: He says that, that "Our Bradleys and stuff will stay at the perimeter of the 11 property," you know, -- and, you know, "Don't let the 12 guys get itchy," and, you know, "What we'll do is is 13 that we'll, we'll, we'll get these guys back and 14 we'll negotiate this." And I already told him in the 15 beginning that I was going to start sending children 16 17 out. 18 DICK: Okay. 19 MR. KORESH: Okay? Which, you know, I've, I've upheld my word. I -- at first I was sending two 20 at a time because there was this rumor going around we 21 only had 14 kids or 15 and oh, no, it's totally 22 different. But anyway, the point was is that all the 23 while that he was saying these things, you know, the 24 fog came and stuff, you know, and, you know, the --25 it's reported that we have night sights and stuff like

that, you know. 2 DICK: Well, clear those things up. those are inaccuracies that we all have to deal with. 3 You, you cannot believe, David, some of the things that are being brought to our attention. I mean, it's just, it's just beyond belief. And, you know, that's what 6 you and I need to do is communicate to one another. 7 And please, we're all different personalities. Don't, 8 don't hold me to something that somebody else said; I, 9 I will hold myself to things that I tell you, and 10 you've got to deal with me as an individual. 11 MR. KORESH: Well, you know, you can buy, you 12 can buy a top-grade infrared for, for as low as, as, as 13 nine-hundred bucks, eight-hundred bucks, and as high as 14 15 seventeen-hundred bucks. DICK: Yeah, I don't know much about those 16 kinds of things. You know, I'm a law-enforcement 17 officer, obviously I have the basic understanding, but 18 I'm not into, into, you know, rockets --19 20 MR. KORESH: Okay. DICK: -- and night scopes and those -- I'm 21 not a tactical person. What I want to do is, is help 22 Is that a bad reason to be a law-enforcement 23 people. 24 officer?

MR. KORESH: Okay. Now, if you want to help somebody, the way I have always learned, the way I have

learned to be able to help people is that if I confront 2 a talker --3 DICK: Okay. 4 MR. KORESH: -- that I want to help, then I listen to learn --5 6 DICK: Okay. 7 MR. KORESH: -- what they're saying. 8 DICK: Do you think, David, you could learn anything from me? 9 10 MR. KORESH: Well, the thing of it is, I'm learning that you have been hired in your position 11 because you are a good pacifist and that you have to 12 say many things that you hope will disarm contention 13 and confusion and bring about a working trustful 14 relationship with those that you speak with. 15 16 DICK: Is that wrong? 17 MR. KORESH: Well, that is not wrong especially when you're dealing with a person that could 18 be a terrorist or a maniac or a killer or somebody of 19 20 that degree. 21 DICK: Okay. MR. KORESH: But let's say that you were 22 working -- let's just hypothetically say that you were 23 24 working for -- hello? 25 DICK: I'm still here, Dave. MR. KORESH: Okay. You were working for the,

the papacy in the days of Martin Luther. 2 DICK: Okay. 3 MR. KORESH: And let's say that I was Martin 4 Luther. 5 DICK: But you know what --6 MR. KORESH: And you -- let's say that you were using every degree possible because they didn't, 7 they didn't have people like you in their, their days, 8 to cause -- to try to get me to recant without me first 9 presenting to you in full where I was coming from. 10 Now, now, Luther had this very problem. 11 12 DICK: Okay. 13 MR. KORESH: And this was why, you know, in his pleadings in the councils and all this, this is 14 what caused a lot of lawyers and doctors of degree of 15 that time to sit back originally first of all to scoff 16 him but as they begin to, to listen they begin to see a 17 clear-cut reasoning in what he was saying which made 18 them conscientiously begin to question their own 19 steadfastness and what they had held as truth prior. 20 21 DICK: David, why are you such a success at what you do? Because you have the ability to get --22 you're a very strong personality, you have your -- you 23 have a, a gift for talking with people and to 24 getting -- to get your message out. And people 25

understand that and people appreciate that and admire

that. I admire that. I admire the work that you're 2 able to do. 3 MR. KORESH: Not bad for a ninth-grade 4 dropout, huh? 5 DICK: I, I don't believe that. believe you dropped out in the ninth grade. 6 7 MR. KORESH: Well, research the records. Check up for Vernon Howell and see the special schools 8 that he went to. DICK: Well, let's, let's face it, you know, 10 life --11 12 MR. KORESH: (Indiscernible) scholastical ability. 13 Now --14 DICK: Absolutely. 15 MR. KORESH: -- and remember, in Matthew, Mark, Luke and John remember what kind of men Christ 16 chose to entrust with the most illuminous, the most 17 instructive and poetic form of language ever known to 18 man, the Scriptures. Remember, from these writers, 19 their depth, their knowledge, their foresight, their 20 perceptions are so keened that they began to relate 21 22 subjects that not even most scholarly minds of today can perceive the actual meanings. And --23 24 DICK: David, would you agree that, that maybe someone has something of importance to tell to 25 you? I mean, would you accept that premise that maybe

handle all these kids in the same fashion. You know, Steve mentioned, you know, programs and policies. 2 Well, these are children, they're not programs, they're 3 4 not policies --5 MR. KORESH: Yes, they are programs --6 -- they're, they're, they're children. MR. KORESH: -- and they are policies as long 7 as they're in your system of programs and policies. 8 For instance, there is no crime in this nation for a 9 young girl living in the slums of New York to have a 10 baby. Now, they don't just take that baby up and give 11 it to someone who has financial status which is within 12 their region, a status capable of providing so 13 much x amount of middle-class liberty to that child. 14 What happens is is that those who have the babies have 15 the mother's right to the children and if they even 16 have to be on welfare or housing projects that's what's 17 provided for them. Now, what we're dealing with is 18 we're dealing with grandparents --19 20 DICK: Um-hum. MR. KORESH: -- that have been judged by the 21 parent to be worthy and capable of taking care of these 22 23 children. 24 DICK: And you're obviously the best judge of 25 that.

MR. KORESH: Or we're having -- now, now,

that's not the case with some of the people here. 1 Some of the people have stated that they want their 2 brothers, you know, which like I say, the, the age 3 4 category from here --5 Sure. DICK: 6 MR. KORESH: -- to have the children in their later twenties or thirties which they have brothers or 7 sisters that may be older, you know, that are in family 8 situations. But, but anyway, regardless of that, the point being made is that this is what we requested and 10 this is what Jim stated would be done. 11 12 DICK: Um-hum. MR. DICK: Right.

MR. KORESH: Now, the reports from that expertise is that the children are extremely abnormal in the respect that after a dramatic experience they're very pliable, they're very decent, they're very obedient and it's just not normal. Well now, there may be a reason why our children are so well-behaved in regards to the way of their, their upbringing.

DICK: Um-hum.

MR. KORESH: You will observe that our children are not beaten, they do not have, you know, marks of cruelty and bruises over them, they're not beaten into subjection. But there is a statement in scripture regarding to a man Abraham in which God says, you know, shall we hide anything from Abraham seeing that he's the heir of all things and he will direct his children after him? There's a terrible statement in the carnal world, a statement that is used by a lot of

fathers to their sons saying, "Don't do as I do, do as 2 I say." Now, that, that's hypocritical. Okay. Well, children, as I say, that see a unity of mind and a 3 maturity of purpose they will not only see but they Δ will be influenced and learn how this principle works. 5 First of all, all of our children see that any association we have with one another or with anybody 7 else that comes we're very hospitable, very pliable --8 9 DICK: Um-hum. MR. KORESH: -- very agreeable, and then in 10 the projection of truth these children have seen it in 11 studies, they have seen it in illustrations and they 12 have been able to understand and discern to a large 13 degree what direction we as a people are going. 14 Another thing is is that in scripture in the testament 15 of the Bible of which men say in this country they 16 believe, there are children spoken of in prophecy that 17 are the direct product of a truth or a doctrine which 18 comes from heaven. Now, not all the children that you 19 have there have been with us for very long. 20 21 DICK: Um-hum. Varying degrees. 22 MR. KORESH: I had a father that made me fly like a kite when I got mine. And I had a father that 19 because I was a, a student like with dyslexia, learning 20 -- a learning disability, you know, I mean I didn't 21 know my alphabet until the third grade. 22 23 DICK: Well, you sure overcame that if that 24 was a problem. 25 MR. KORESH: And he -- well, this all, this all took place in 1985.

SCHNEIDER: And I -- and we're a group of 19 people here that --20 DICK: We're all introspective to some degree 21 aren't we? MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes. But I mean, what he's, 22 you know, trying to reach with you is there's a lot of 23 men that wrote in a book where almost two billion 24 25 people called Christians or call themselves Christians say they believe in this book called the Bible.

1 DICK: Uh-huh. 2 MR. SCHNEIDER: And all these men left their testimony about final -- the final days of Earth's 3 history. And it's very clear to a lot of people that there's something to it but they're not sure what; they 5 don't have the ability to pull the pieces of the puzzle 6 together for this big clear picture that is formulated 7 8 now for people to look at, evaluate and judge. So I mean what he was sharing with you as I walked up was 9 something he wanted to help give you somewhat of a 10 11 foundation. 12 DICK: Um-hum. MR. I wasn't here at -- what kind of 17 18 comments? 19 DICK: Well, he said, well, he said, "Hey, if these Bradleys come in I've got something that'll take 20 care of Bradleys and we're researched this and we know 21 22 what that might take." 23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, really? Okay. I wasn't 24 here for that. 25 Well, now I'm a little concerned about DICK: things. I don't know what that means.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, probably what it means 2 I mean, I didn't hear the conversation but I, is this. I was here from Sunday on when, when the negotiations 3 began like I told you earlier with Jim when he gave his word as did Gary and a number of others since then that 5 only would these three vehicles come to the perimeter 7 at the very closest, none would ever be on the property. So that was an agreement made right from the 8 9 beginning, that no personnel of any of the agencies or 10 the militia, the military, would be on the property. But that has been violated constantly and as time has 11 gone more and more by even running over guard shacks, 12 13 other kinds of shacks, property they know not what's inside, there could be valuables, they don't know. I 14 15 mean, such disregard in the first place. 16 DICK: Well, I, I --17 MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, but, but last --18 DICK: -- share your concern. 19 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- but the night before --20 was it last night? Yeah, last night 50 feet away from the one part of the building on the back side, 50 away, 21 and then they get up --22 23 DICK: Steve, can I ask you a question? 24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes. 25 DICK: Let me ask you a question. MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes.

DICK: I find that extremely difficult to 1 2 believe, okay? 3 MR. SCHNEIDER: But now I -- we all viewed it 4 though. DICK: You, you heard --5 6 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and not once have you people told us that you were going to do those kind of 11 12 things. That's what I'm trying to say. 13 DICK: Well, we've --14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Even though we've been --15 -- tried to call you -- every time we DICK: know there's going to be movement we have tried to call 16 17 you. 18 MR. SCHNEIDER: That has not happened that way. And then also that message that has come across 19 on the TV is that these -- we called -- when they call 20 us we answer right away. 21 22 DICK: Okay. MR. SCHNEIDER: That's what has been told. 23 And when you call us it's been said that you don't 24 always get us. Well, anytime this phone rings we pick 25 it up to answer and always have to talk to you people.

1 DICK: Steve, the simple answer to that is if 2 that's true, we didn't say that, and secondly --3 MR. SCHNEIDER: It was said and --DICK: I mean I'm talking about me --5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. 6 DICK: -- the guy that's talking to you --7 MR. SCHNEIDER: It was the ATF. 8 DICK: -- or Jim. What we have --MR. SCHNEIDER: It was the man 9 10 (indiscernible) 11 DICK: -- what, what we have is, is equipment -- if we call you and you don't answer maybe the 12 13 equipment is not ringing through. I mean, that, 14 that's, that's a minor thing there. MR. SCHNEIDER: All right. Just, just a 15 16 second --17 DICK: It means absolutely nothing. 18 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- Dick, I'm talking -- I guess there's a request here. Just a second. 19 20 DICK: Okay. Is Greg ready to go out and 21 pick --MR. SCHNEIDER: Dick, is the milk out there? 22 They dropped something off now or --23 MR. DICK: Well, they dropped off the, the 24 kit, the suture kit and --25 MR. SCHNEIDER: The -- suture kit.

1	DICK: and some photographs and
2	MR. SCHNEIDER: Photographs.
3	DICK: videotape.
4	MR. SCHNEIDER: The videotape.
5	DICK: Yeah.
6	MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

quick you, you were able to, okay, he can now come out 2 and, and, you know, they just dropped it off. You guys 3 have some efficiency with the technology and, you know, through communications (indiscernible). DICK: You know, you know when I 5 gave them these photos? I gave them these photos a 6 7 long time ago. Nothing is done quickly, unfortunately and when you're dealing with these numbers of people it can't be. I mean, that's a fact of life. Let's, let's 9 face it. 10 11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, --12 DICK: You're used to that. 13 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- basically, the, the tenor of what I'm saying you can pick up on being that we're 14 somewhat disappointed and, and unsatisfied because of 15 the movement of these men. I think last night might 16 have been the first time they calmed down a little, I 17 didn't really get too many reports. 18 19 DICK: Um-hum, well, good, and we, we keep --20 MR. SCHNEIDER: And I hope that's because of 21 your --22 DICK: Well, we're --MR. SCHNEIDER: -- your involvement and maybe 23 24 Henry, I don't know. 25 DICK: Exactly, we're trying to get this thing -- we're trying to get this thing -- we're trying

SCHNEIDER: But I've had people that i've 7 known that have had good experiences with them. 8 always held certain agencies like that in a very high 9 I grew up as a little boy looking at 10 policemen, firemen in the same light as something one 11 would want to be or at least you'd think to be when 12 you're young and I've always had the highest regard for agencies like this. That one I never knew anything 13 about because I was never involved in alcohol, 14 15 tobacco --16 DICK: Okay. Well --17 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- or firearms was that 18 department. 19 DICK: Let's discuss that a bit. First of all, send, send Greg out, okay --20 21 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right. DICK: -- or whomever. Send them out to tell 22 -- make the pick-up. 23 24 MR. SCHNEIDER: He's, he's ready to go. 25 DICK: Okay. MR. SCHNEIDER: He's got the clearance?

1 DICK: He's got to go on out and take the 2 gear. 3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Go ahead. DICK: Let us know when he's gone just so I 4 5 can pass it on. 6 MR. SCHNEIDER: The tape and suture -- a kit 7 of sutures and forth. Okay. He's heading out. 8 DICK: Okay. He's heading out the door now? 9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. 10 DICK: Okay. 11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, not yet. He's, he's 12 just heading down. He's --13 DICK: He's heading down. He's --MR. SCHNEIDER: He'll be at the door in about 14 30 seconds. 15 16 DICK: Okay. Okay. Well, listen, I -- you know, that, that was a positive note that you passed on 17 to me, I appreciate that. You know, I've been with --18 MR. SCHNEIDER: What was the man's name again that 19 was a spokes person for your department there? 20 21 DICK: Ricks. 22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Rick, that's right. DICK: Yeah. You know, I've been with the 23 FBI for, for a good many years and I've, I've always 24 25 felt --

MR. SCHNEIDER: Very professional.

DICK: -- felt that I could get along with people well and, and our organization deals with people I think very fairly and compassionately.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, so far I would agree with that. I don't know of any incidences that I've ever heard from anybody that has had anything bad to say. I've known a lot of situations that have come where you, you men did very well. I mean, you used a lot of wisdom and sense in certain situations.

DICK: Sure.

MR. SCHNEIDER: I, I've never heard anything really bad to be honest with you.

DICK: Well, we take pride in that. That's what we're here to do. We're here to, to certainly enforce the, the violations of, of law, but, but we're here to do things within the parameters of the constitution.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I like to hear that. That's great.

DICK: And that's, that's -- I've been in the Bureau 20-some years now, 22 years, and I've always, I've always done that and, and the agents I deal with act in the same fashion. And I don't think that you'll have anybody inside there that would quarrel with, with that at all.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

1 DICK: We, we're going to continue to do that 2 and that's why we're dealing with you here. That's why 3 we were asked to go ahead and, and deal with you because we --MR. SCHNEIDER: You know that I would have 5 6 thought that -- there was a few questions actually 7 asked by the press. I would have --8 DICK: Okay. 9 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- thought that Rick would have been able to even answer better than the other ATF 10 11 agent. The guy seems to be very mute and -- I -- well, I suppose if I was in his shoes after what took place I 12 13 guess I would be too and no one wants to incriminate themselves. 14 DICK: Well, that's why -- you know, that's 15 why you guys are going to have to get the word out. 16 17 Now listen, I --18 MR. SCHNEIDER: I would like even ahead of time to -- I'd like to get some of the -- the accounts 19 that were seen as to what happened. 20 21 That's what we're asking you to do. DICK: 22 MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, before walking out, that's what I'm talking about. I'd like to see a 23 little reaction to the -- what -- the accounts of --24 25 DICK: But, but you know what? MR. SCHNEIDER: -- some of the --

1 DICK: You have to tell them. : 2 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I want to tell you something. There were some of these women and young 3 kids that were actually at the, the wall, the front 5 area --6 DICK: Okay. 7 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- when all those bullets started riddling through the sides missing little 8 I -- you ought to -- I ought to take pictures 9 and send the pictures out. 10 11 DICK: Steve, that's exactly what we're asking you to tell the world. 12 MR. SCHNEIDER: You -- you'd be amazed. 13 14 DICK: Okay? No, that's what I'm asking you to do, tell the world. The press wants to hear that, 15 16 the court wants to hear it, the U.S. Congress --17 MR. SCHNEIDER: If they do then put a line -why don't you -- why did you cut our lines off then if 18 the press wants to hear? Let us dialogue with them. 19 DICK: Well, we've got to resolve the --20 21 this, this incident first. 22 MR. SCHNEIDER: No -- you -- actually you're 23 doing it your way of course, you, you say you have to. 24 Yeah, in your --25 DICK: No, no, I said we --MR. SCHNEIDER: -- from your eyes you need

to --2 DICK: -- have to. We have to, Steve. 3 is -- that means -- you still there? MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. 5 DICK: Okay. That means you folks there and 6 us we have to get this resolved. You will have every 7 chance, every chance to tell exactly what you want to tell. And you know what? You're going to tell it to 9 so many people and have so much opportunity you're 10 going to be -- there are going to be people standing in 11 line to represent you. 12 MR. SCHNEIDER: I guess, you know, my reaction to that is kind of ho-hum, of course, because 13 14 there's no better --15 DICK: But why? Why? 16 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- because there's no better 17 time than the present especially with --18 DICK: Yeah, but listen, listen --19 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- something as --20 DICK: -- you told me moments ago that your 21 dealings with the FBI have been --MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I've -- I told you also 22 I've never dealt with them, but my --23 24 DICK: Well --25 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- observations, what I know about them, what I've seen have been --

1 DICK: What you've seen --2 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- held very high. 3 DICK: -- and others, and others that you 4 know that have dealt with the FBI. 5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly. 6 DICK: I am telling you and they are telling 7 you that you will get every opportunity to express those concerns. Congressional oversight is being done 8 9 on this incident. This is not -- this has never happened in law-enforcement history. It's going to be, 10 it's going to be picked apart. It's going to be 11 examined. It's going to be critiqued. It's going to 12 13 be argued. All those things will be done. And you're going to be part of that operation. You're going to be 14 listened to. You're going to get the opportunity. 15 But, you know, what has to be done is you have to come 16 out to be able to do that. How, how else would you do 17 18 it? How else would you do that? 19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Very easy. The communication line is going to be open right now where there can be a 20 21 dialogue, there can be a given a response -- a lot of 22 things can be opened up, many of the issues right from here before one even does that. I've seen too many 23 times in the past through others that have been 24 arrested and so forth that they're taken away never to be heard from again until they're in a court of law and

they never really do because of their circumstances or the environment have an opportunity to really open up 2 3 as to what really took place. DICK: Is Greg, is Greg back, Steve? 5 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, he isn't. 6 Okay. Well, let me know when he comes 7 back in, will you? 8 MR. SCHNEIDER: I will, I will. 9 DICK: Okay. Now listen, a case in point was those two ladies the other day. 10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. 11 DICK: You heard that they'd been charged 12 with this and that. We went --13 MR. SCHNEIDER: By the way, who was behind 14 making such a quick move to do such a thing as that in 15 16 the first place? 17 DICK: Well, you know, it's not us, I'll 18 guarantee you. And again, I told you I'd never lie to you and I'm telling you I don't know but we got it 19 taken care of didn't we? We went to them and said, 20 listen, these are elderly ladies, you think they're in 21 there shooting out the doors? Absolutely not. And 22 what we did, we went to the appropriate people and said 23 24 this is, this is not right, this is just not 25 acceptable. And they took care of it.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. Isn't it funny how in

different countries or societies or situations something can either be murder, it can be war, it can 2 be killing? Isn't it something? Like -- a country, 3 someone's in their home and someone else is trying to blow apart their house. What do they do? Depends upon 5 what country at what time apparently you live doesn't it? Like I'll tell you the truth, what I've seen and 7 noticed from a lot of people for a long time, where 8 were the FBI and the agencies when the L.A. riots were 9 taking place? Where was the protection for those 10 people? If they didn't have some of their own firearms 11 and so forth what would have they done? See, even at 12 this very -- what about the billions of dollars that 13 are being moved around because of drugs and so forth? 14 Where are all the agencies there getting all these big 15 16 guys constantly? 17 DICK: You know what? You know what? I'll, I'll address that issue with you very clearly. I used 18 to work narcotics years ago. 19 20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Uh-huh. 21 DICK: You know, resources are unbelievably short in this country to deal with an issue like that. 22 You think that I do not have the same opposition to 23 those kinds of activities that you do? 24 25 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm sure you do.

100 percent. I've got children in the

DICK:

1 school system, we all do. That is not acceptable to us 2 in any fashion.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, can I, can I give you an example of the way I've seen it through the years?

DICK: Sure, sure.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Like for instance I'm living in Hawaii where one Saturday night there was a church group of us playing a game of volley ball.

DICK: Uh-huh.

MR. SCHNEIDER: And we came back to the cars. One of the cars had been broken in, hundreds of dollars stolen and some different items had been also taken out of the car. We contacted the police. They came an hour and a half later. Never heard from them again. I had a car stolen back in the seventies. Called the department up, also never heard from them again. But one day I'm driving down the street with my wife and a female police officer came off of a, a ramp and hit is broadside. I saw her coming. I tried to get away, swerved in the oncoming lane to give her room —

DICK: Um-hum.

MR. SCHNEIDER: -- but she still got me. And within minutes, within minutes there's like six squad cars there at her help. And what is going on?

DICK: Well --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Do you know what I'm saving? 2 DICK: Absolutely, I know exactly. MR. SCHNEIDER: You always find police 3 officers if you're two, two miles an hour over the law going down the road but when I've ever called them 5 because of theft or because of other problems, 6 7 seriously, I don't know what's happened. 8 DICK: Okay. Well, let me ask you --9 MR. SCHNEIDER: I really don't know what's 10 happened. 11 DICK: -- you mean you've only gotten one ticket in your life? 12 13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, no, of course not. 14 DICK: Okay. Well, how many times? I mean, 15 this is obviously a very minor point. But --16 MR. SCHNEIDER: But, you know, you understand what I'm saying. 17 18 DICK: -- many of the times that you've done -- broken the law -- I mean, let me say this. We 19 all speed. But how many times we've been picked up for 20 speeding because there's nobody there? We -- we, and 21 I'm going to say loosely law enforcement in general, we 22 have only so much ability to address all these problems 23 and please don't hold us to --24 25 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, I don't. I'm just saying overall what the problem is, it starts at a very

small level of course is what I'm saying. 2 DICK: But, but I understand that. The rest of the law-enforcement people understand that. You 3 know --5 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm sure they do because --6 DICK: -- sure we do. 7 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- they're involved in the 8 same process --9 DICK: Exactly. 10 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- the same society and, you know, I mean it, it goes for everyone of course. 11 12 DICK: It's, it's, it's something -- you know, we would love to address all crime. Let's face 13 14 it --15 MR. SCHNEIDER: True, true. DICK: -- we can't do it. 16 17 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I agree. 18 DICK: Absolutely cannot do it. So what we have to do is prioritize certain things and deal with 19 it as best we can with the resources available to us, 20 21 you know? 22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Um-hum. DICK: And what I might want to address and 23 what my bosses might want to address are two different things. In much the same way you probably have some 25 difference of opinion with, with, with David don't you?

MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, by the way, Dick, I 1 wanted to let you know they're back with, with the 2 3 supplies --DICK: Okay. Good. 5 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- inside the building. 6 DICK: Is that, is that, is that what you're 7 looking for? 8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Whoops, someone just stepped 9 on the cord. 10 DICK: Okay. 11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Now, what were you 12 saying? I didn't hear that. 13 DICK: Well, I'm just saying that's, that's what you're looking for? 14 15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Apparently so. 16 DICK: Okay. Well, I'll make note of that 14 and -- in other words one child I know that was taken to the doctor that may have had pneumonia. 15 KATHY: But you don't know who it was? 16 DICK: No, that, that is, that is him. 17 That's he and he was given antibiotics. 18 19 KATHY: Okay. 20 Yeah. His fever is down, gone, and those antibiotics I think took care of it. Of course, 21 they usually do pretty quickly if it doesn't get too 22 far along. So, yeah. 23 24 KATHY: He was real bad Sunday and Monday. 25 I know he was very concerned about you not being there, and obviously you've got the four kids

there. You want to get to them as soon as you can. KATHY: He was, he is very young, so, I mean 2 3 4 DICK: Sure he is. 5 KATHY: He'll be three Sunday and he just --6 DICK: Those kids grow up quickly too, don't 7 they? 8 KATHY: -- hasn't been away from me very 9 often so it's hard on him. 10 DICK: Sure it is. It's hard on you too. 11 KATHY: But --12 As a father, you know, I understand 13 those kinds of things. KATHY: Yeah. 14 DICK: Well, he'll be fine, but do you know 15 what? DICK: Well, I'm sure the kids want to be 15 16 with you too. 17 KATHY: But for their own safety is why 18 they're out there. 19 DICK: Well --20 KATHY: Because there's no telling what these people are going to do to us. 21 22 DICK: Well, now, what people are you talking 23 about? 24 Oh, I know what's out there. KATHY: DICK: Well, but I mean, when you say, "these 25 people" you are including me because I'm one of these

people out here and I'm telling you --2 KATHY: But you may not have the, the same 3 mind frame as some of the others that are out there just doing their jobs. 5 DICK: Well, no, I can answer that for you 6 and, you know, I've tried to communicate this as -have the other fellows that have talked to some of the 7 folks out there and that isn't going to be done. Look, 9 how far along are we? It was Sunday? This is Friday. No one has been hurt. No one is going to be hurt and 10 we're going to reunite you, reunite you and your kids 11 and all the other folks in there with their kids. 12 13 KATHY: Well then why are they still here? You know? I don't understand it. We don't want to 14 come out there. 15 DICK: Uh-huh. 16 KATHY: We have no -- no law says we have to 17 18 come out there, so --19 DICK: Well, listen. Obviously there's, there's a problem here that's got to be straightened 20 out. You know, we can't walk away, that or just deny 21 that it didn't happen, right? 22 23 KATHY: I'm sure there's, there's, you know, lot's of stuff that you have to do, but, myself, you 24 25 know, I have a home here --DICK: Sure.

1 KATHY: -- and I do not want to leave my 2 home.

DICK: I can understand that but we, all you folks are going to have to be interviewed just as all the participants from the ATF are going to have to be interviewed, and the way to do that is just be interviewed, get your interview done and get back with your life, get back to your life. That's the answer to that.

I'm not going to be -- I hope you're not naive to believe that we're just going to walk away from there.

KATHY: And I hope you're not under the -thinking that we don't know, I mean, as close as the
people have come to our building itself, that, you
know, we don't think they're just going to stand there
and wait forever.

DICK: Well, listen. I'm going to tell you that nobody is going to make any moves out there at all. Okay. We went over, I don't know if they instructed you folks, but yesterday we went over the safety rules and -- We're you made aware of those rules? Those safety rules? We call them safety rules. They for both of our mutual protections. Are you aware of those?

KATHY: I, I'm not sure exactly what you're talking about.

1 DICK: Okay, well, yesterday we discussed some of the things that we're concerned about for 2 safety issues. Which is, as long as no one inside 3 there makes any offensive moves at any of the folks that are outside there, in return we're not going to do 5 anything either. I think we have to look at the 6 7 positive side of this. Since Sunday --8 KATHY: What do you mean by anything though? 9 I mean --10 In other words, we don't want anybody DICK: carrying around weapons. We don't want anybody 11 standing at the windows sighting through scopes and 12 those kinds of things. 13 14 KATHY: But, what I'm saying is, we haven't 15 made any of the those types of --16 DICK: No, and I appreciate that. 17 KATHY: But we have things on our property making all kinds of moves which, you know, offensive 18 moves can be made and not even known about by the -- by 19 20 anyone else. 21 DICK: Okay, but again we discussed these rules yesterday for safety, and there -- it's not going 22 to happen, I mean, nobody's going to be hurt. There's 23 24 not going to be any further injury and we're all concerned about that. It's just not going to happen. 25 KATHY: If it doesn't happen, praise the

Lord, but that, I mean, I can't, I can't say what your 2 men out there feel, what, you know --3 DICK: Well, but, I'll tell you how they're feel, how they feel, and that is, you know, obviously 5 with the passage of time, people get a little impatient 6 and, like I was telling the fellows today, some, 7 sometimes, you know, somebody runs up and down the road 8 in a vehicle, it doesn't impact on you or us. It's, 9 it's not, it just isn't going to, you know, in terms of our discussion, it isn't going to mean a thing. Nobody 10 is going to come in there, nobody is going to do 11 12 anything to harm you or any of the other folks in 13 there, your kids --14 KATHY: What do you mean by in there? I'm talking about in the compound 15 DICK: 16 there. 17 KATHY: You mean in the building? 18 DICK: In all the buildings. Yes. We're, we're not going to do that. 19 20 KATHY: But they are in some buildings and 21 they are on the property. 22 DICK: Well, now, I don't know what you're referring to. What are you referring to? In what 23 buildings? You're suggesting that we have people 24 inside the building? The property? KATHY: Not in the main building that we are

1	in, but there are, you do have people on our property,
2	yes.
3	DICK: Where are you talking about? You're
4	talking about in those, in those vehicles out there?

Is that not true? 2 3 DICK: If someone went in and turned it off, yes, and I certainly wouldn't argue that point with you. 5 6 That's the only way, there's the only KATHY: 7 way of turning it off. 8 DICK: Okay. 9 KATHY: So someone has definitely gone out of the vehicle and gone inside. 10 11 DICK: Again, I don't want to argue that point because --12 13 KATHY: Okay, well that's why I'm saying --DICK: -- it's, it's kind of a minor point, 14 but I'm saying that there are other ways for lights to 15 16 go out that we all know about. 17 KATHY: And it's not, that's not the only 18 thing I've seen. That's just one. 19 DICK: Okay. Well in addition to that, sometimes things are done that we believe to be prudent 20 for the safety of, of our people as well as, as you 21 22 folks, okay? KATHY: Let me get back to the, your safety 23 24 rules. 25 DICK: Okay.

KATHY: You said, if we make no offensive

moves then you make no offensive moves, and I'm telling 1 2 you we've not made any offensive moves --3 DICK: And we're not either. 4 KATHY: But you have. 5 Listen. We haven't come in the DICK: compound at all, have we? 6 7 KATHY: You haven't come into the building --DICK: Yes, we're on the property, yes. That 8 9 is true. 10 KATHY: If you were to try to come into the building, we wouldn't let you. We don't --11 12 DICK: We're not going to so that's not a 13 point, a debatable point. We're not coming in. 14 KATHY: Okay, not openly you won't. 15 DICK: We're not, you know, I tried to indicate this to others but maybe they haven't passed 16 it on to you. We are not going to harm any woman, any 17 child or any man in that compound. Okay? 18 19 KATHY: I myself, I don't know what everybody's minds are. Everybody has an individual 20 21 mind. 22 DICK: Um-hum. KATHY: And I, myself, do not trust humanity 23 enough to say, Okay, I believe you, and, you know, I'm 24 safe. That's why my kids are out there. 25

DICK: Okay.

I sent my kids out there not because 1 KATHY: 2 I don't love them --3 DICK: And the children are safe. KATHY: I love them very much, and I want 4 them here with me, not me out there --5 6 DICK: Okay, well I can understand that. 7 KATHY: But, because I don't trust humanity, that's why they're out there. 8 9 DICK: Okay. Well they, they've been well taken care of. They will continue to be well taken care of. 11 KATHY: And I very, I very much appreciate 12 that. I did see the photos. 13 14 DICK: Okay. 15 KATHY: I don't know what happened with the 16 video, but --17 DICK: Well, the video, from what I understand in talking to, to Steve and a couple others, 18 that video doesn't work properly --19 20 KATHY: Yeah. 21 DICK: -- and we are, we're taking steps 22 necessary to correct that. KATHY: Okay. I really appreciate what 23 24 you've done. 25 DICK: Okay, well --KATHY: And I thank you for taking care of

Brian's illness.

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kids?

DICK: Okay, but listen, you give this some 2 consideration. We want to reunite you and the kids, 3 and we're not going to do anything to keep that from 5 happening. It's your mind that needs to make that 6 decision. You have the ability to make that decision. 7 It's within your power to do that and you're going to have to decide yourself how soon you want to get together with the kids. I can't make that decision for 9 There's no one that can make that decision for 10 you except for yourself. And the kids will be here and 11 12 they will be well cared for and they miss you. They 13 want to see you and I know you feel the same way. 14 KATHY: Well, like you say. You're giving me an ultimatum. I mean, the only way I can see kids 15 16 again, you know. 17 DICK: Well, that's not true. I didn't give you an ultimatum. What, what are you saying? What 18 ultimatum? 19 20 KATHY: You said it's up to me to decide 21 whether I want to see my kids again.

DICK: Well, as long as you're in there, it's a difficult, you know, how are you going to see your You have, you have to come out to be with the

kids. That's not an ultimatum, I'm just telling you what, what the fact is.

1 KATHY: That's, that's what I'm saying. 2 DICK: And it may be a temporary thing. You 3 know, we're not suggesting --It may, it may not be either, okay, 4 KATHY: I'm not naive. It may also be just, any way, I don't 5 want to get into that. 6 7 DICK: Well. I'll be happy to answer your 8 question. You're not --9 KATHY: I don't have a question. 10 DICK: Okay. 11 I just, I want to thank you for KATHY: taking care of Brian and getting him to the doctor 12 13 because --DICK: Well you kick this around in your own 14 mind in there and think about it and I'll be happy to 15 talk to you once again, but you folks discuss this 16 amongst yourself and hopefully you'll come to the 17 realization that we're here to just ensure that no one 18 is hurt and that we will get this resolved, you will be 19 back with your kids and you'll be reunited as a family. 20 How -- what can I do to convince you that that's 21 accurate? I mean, you don't seem to want to believe 22 23 what I'm telling you? KATHY: It would be real simple, just --24 25 DICK: Okay. KATHY: But it's not going to happen that

1 way. 2 DICK: Well, what, what simple answer do you 3 have for us? I mean, I'm happy to listen to it. 4 KATHY: I mean, the original reason that 5 people came here --6 DICK: Um-hum. 7 KATHY: -- was --8 DICK: You know, that, that event of Sunday 9 has unfortunately happened and we have to go on from 10 here to try to rectify that, ensure that it doesn't happen again, to ensure that no one else is hurt, to 11 ensure that you're, that ultimately you're reunited 12 with your family. It will happen, okay? 13 14 KATHY: On my, on my property, --15 DICK: On your property. 16 KATHY: -- on my home. 17 I'm, we're talking about a temporary, 18 a temporary situation for a good number of people 19 there. 20 That's what you are saying right now 21 to me on the phone. 22 DICK: Okay. Well talk to your lawyer. 23 He'll tell you the same thing. Don't you have a lawyer in there? Isn't Wayne, isn't Wayne in a position to 24 advise you to some degree about the possibilities that 25 might exist after you leave there? I mean certainly he

must be providing some information to you about legal 2 issues. KATHY: Well --3 DICK: And I'm sure he's not telling you that 5 all of you are going to be sent to jail. 6 KATHY: No, he wouldn't say that, but --7 DICK: But you believe it? Is that what you 8 believe? Is that your -- the problem that you're having? 9 10 KATHY: I have had experience and seen what has happened to people in the past in similar 11 circumstances. 12 13 DICK: What's your experience that you're referring to? 14 15 KATHY: I am referring to what --16 DICK: I'm not trying to be argumentative. KATHY: Well, basically it's what -- it's 17 hard to explain. What everyone around the country now 18 19 is now seeing is that the people that we have in authority, in government in this country, are not 20 honest. They're not coming through with their 21 promises, they're not protecting, they're --22 23 DICK: Kathy, that's certainly not all people 24 25 KATHY: No.

DICK: -- in all government positions --

1 KATHY: No, --2 DICK: -- just as --3 But it's enough to make a difference KATHY: 4 in my life. 5 DICK: Well. 6 See? So, I mean, you may be totally 7 You may have every desire in your heart to do honest. what you say. 8 9 DICK: Um-hum. KATHY: But I cannot, you know, take your 10 word and say that that's what they're going to do and, 11 I mean, whoever else is in authority, if I were to come 12 13 out as you say. DICK: Well, I'm talking about the whole 14 group of you. I'm not talking about you as an 15 individual necessarily, but I'm talking about -- All 16 of you will have to make up your mind individually or 17 collectively and, and you're going to have to deal with 18 some of these issues. To try to deny these issues, and 19 try to just go on without confronting the issues, it's 20 just, you know, it's just a delaying tactic, and it has 21 22 to happen. KATHY: Well, we are all individuals here --23 24 DICK: Sure. KATHY: -- and I am dealing with it in my own 25 mind, so --.

DICK: Well, then you're going to have to 1 make, you know, ask yourself those questions, and if 2 you can answer them -- I know that, as a parent, you're 3 concerned about your children and I appreciate that and 5 the children are concerned about you and I hope that you get together with your children. 6 I really do. 7 KATHY: Just, just do me a favor and pass on 8 the message that I'm -- take, tell them to take care of 9 Brian. 10 DICK: All right. 11 KATHY: And I love them. 12 All right. We'll be in touch, then, 13 Kathv. I hope that, I hope that this is -- this works out for you. I know that it will. 14 Unfortunately you just, in your own mind, just don't think that will 15 16 work, but I'm telling you, it's going to work fine. 17 It's going to work out for you. And it's, it's not going to be easy for you but it will work out for you. 18 19 Is there any possibility that you can 20 set up a way that I can talk to the children? 21 DICK: Well, that will be nearly impossible 22 and, you know, we're trying to do what we can for you and that's why we got the pictures for you and the 23 24 video, and I apologize --25 KATHY: Well, if you can work it out.

DICK: We're going to do what we can for you.

1	KATHY: Okay, 'cause
2	DICK: Who else, who else is
3	KATHY: When I talked to Jake earlier, I
4	didn't get to say much of anything to him, so
5	DICK: Okay. Well, the kids will be fine,
6	but they need you. Who else is there that I might

10	SITA: Hello.
11	DICK: sita?
12	SITA: Sorry, the phone
13	DICK: Yeah, we got, we got cut off a little
14	bit earlier. What did you think of the photo's?

16	DICK: Good. Good. The kids seem to be

I'll indicate it to you and perhaps you can pass it on to others that I might not get an opportunity to talk 2 to, but, it's, the kids are together and there's, 3 efforts are being made to place them, or will be in the 5 future. We hope that you'll be out of there and the kids will be with you, but we're just not in a position 6 to take the kids out at this point and they have to be, you know, their health has to be assured and there are, 9 you know, some formalities that have to be handled and this is not something that can be done overnight. It's 10 much, you know, if I can draw an analogy here, it's 11 12 like giving birth to a child. It's not done over night. We can't resolve these issues overnight. The 13 child welfare agencies cannot do it either overnight, 14 but you have a number of people working on it and 15 trying to do the best they can to ensure that the kids 16 are taken care of properly, that their health is good, 17 they're receiving good care, the food and they're 18 19 getting rest and they're playing with one another and they're being cared for properly, and --20 21 SITA: Well --22 We're not parents, I mean, we're not their parents, but we're doing the best we can. 23 24 SITA: When I talked to Jim. --25 DICK: Okay.

He said he'd make sure what we wrote

SITA:

in the letter, Tasheem (Phonetic) wrote that they go to 2 their grandparents. 3 DICK: Uh-huh. SITA: He gave the phone numbers. 5 DICK: Okay. 6 SITA: The name, and addresses, and --7 DICK: Well, see, that will be done, but 8 again, it can't be done overnight. The, the child care services are aware of that. You know, the letters that 9 went with the kids remained with the kids and those 10 things are being worked on, but it's like, you know, 11 12 we've been here since Sunday, and you know how, you 13 know how long it's taken to try to work some of these problems out, and, you know, this can't be done 14 overnight. People, people that work in these areas, 15 why you may quarrel with some of their own, their 16 procedures, they have the best interest of the kid at 17 heart. Now, you may not agree with what, what that 18 19 might be --20 I agree what you're saying, but it wouldn't have happened if you guys didn't come in just 21 22 attacking us. 23 DICK: Well, listen, that is horribly unfortunate. It's also horribly unfortunate that law 24 enforcement officers were injured. We're all trying to 25

get past that and we're, that's, that's something that

happened and now we are going to have to go forward and try to resolve that. You're going to have the opportunity, as soon as you come out, you and the 3 others, to testify to what happened here, to, to give a 5 message --6 SITA: Testify? 7 Well, I'm talking about to give, give 8 information to, to newspapers, to television stations, 9 to Congress --. 10 SITA: Then can you guys open, open news 11 casts for us to talk to them? 12 DICK: Certainly. When you, when you come 13 out of there you're going to have the opportunity to do 14 that. Sure. The press is very interested in hearing your side of the incident. Absolutely. 15 They're going 16 to be very interested in hearing that. I was telling some of the folks I talked to 17 earlier that, this morning in the Waco paper, there was 18 19 an article concerning Congressional inquiry into this whole matter. It's being scrutinized. This has never 20 21 happened in law enforcement before. SITA: Well, it's never happened to me 22 23 before. 24 No, and, and it will never happen DICK: But that's, that's what you need to tell people 25 again. about. You have to make your knowledge known, I mean,

there are only bits and pieces of what happened that will only be known to you, okay? If you, if you were inside there and you saw certain -- made certain 3 observations, there are going to be people that are, 4 are interested in talking with you, and you'll be able 5 to give your side of the story, and we'll make that available to anyone that has an interest in it; Congress, the press, the courts, the directors of the 8 ATF, the directors of the FBI, all those folks have an 9 10 ongoing interest in this. 11 We all have a, you know, we all have concerns about what happened the other day. I've been in law enforcement for a long, long time, as have many of the 13 other fellows that are involved here and we all want to 14 know what happened too. You know, we just don't 15 arbitrarily watch something like this happen without 16 17 responding in our, in our own fashion. You know, the best thing, and we've talked about 18 it to some degree, is that you get your, you know, you 19 get your case in front of the public. You know, you 20 guys, all you guys inside can tell the public what 21 happened from your perspective. Would you disagree 22 23 with that? 24 SITA: But you guys have the power --25 DICK: We don't, -- Sita, Sita, I don't have

any power, okay? Public opinion is, is the court where

this thing will be resolved. Public opinion is what I don't have anymore power than you do. 2 3 to work, I go home with my family the same way as you I don't have any power. do. That's one thing, you're lucky. 5 SITA: DICK: Well, you can do the same thing, Sita. 6 7 You have to make that decision yourself. I can't make 8 it for you. 9 SITA: No, when they came in, they made the 10 decision when they start firing. 11 DICK: Sita, that's your belief and please, tell that to the world. It doesn't do you any good to 12 stay inside that complex and tell those things to me. 13 14 You have to tell it to the people that are in a position with, quote, power, that you talk about. I 15 16 don't have that power. 17 SITA: Then why don't you let me, open just one line for me to call who I want to talk to. 18 19 DICK: Sita you have a line of communication, and that's me, okay? 20 21 SITA: Yes. You're the only line of communication for me --22 23 DICK: David has, David had, David had the ability and the opportunity to present an hours worth 24 25 of, of his concerns, which we made available for him.

SITA: Wait a minute. I beg your pardon?

DICK: I'm saying back, you know, days ago, 1 David had the opportunity and we were able to get 3 something on television for him, I mean, I'm sorry, on the radio, for him. And he was able to make some 5 comments and that same, that same opportunity will be made available to you, worldwide. You know, people 6 from London and the press, if you see any of the 7 television accounts, there are news reporters from all 8 over the world here, and there are people in there from all over the world and those people can take that word 10 out to their respective countries, the press in their 11 12 countries, the court -- This is something that is going to be examined over and over again. But you have 13 to make it known. I mean, ATF is going to present 14 their side. You've got to present yours. You've got 15 to do that. 16 17 I'm not a good English orator like you SITA: 18 guys. 19 DICK: Sita, it doesn't matter. That doesn't 20 matter. 21 I'm a simple person who just living 22 her life, that's been, like, taken away. 23 DICK: Sita, nothing has been taken away. Nothing has been taken away. You will have every opportunity to make any thoughts that you have 25 regarding this incident known. But you have your, the

responsibility and you have to take that responsibility to make that, those thoughts known. And there are just all kinds of people that will listen. FBI agents will 3 be interviewing you when you come out of there. will be, your comments will be passed on. Newspaper 5 people will be interested in interviewing you. 6 Congressional people will be interested in interviewing 7 people. 8 9 SITA: I don't care about them. DICK: Well if you don't care about it --10 11 SITA: I, it's just --12 So, you're saying you're angry, but DICK: you don't care enough to make your thoughts known to 13 14 others? Is that what you're telling me? 15 SITA: No, I'm not angry. It's something --16 Sita, the most powerful thing that you DICK: can have is the court of public opinion. Okay? That's 17 the power that you folks in there have. You all feel 18 that what happened was ATF's fault. Is that accurate? 19 SITA: As far as I know -- I, for me, when I 20 opened the curtains they get out of their, their 21 22 vehicles and start shooting. DICK: Okay, then people need to know that. 23 24 If, if that was done --25 SITA: Then you tell the newscaster what I said.

I want you to tell them. 1 DICK: You think 2 the newspaper people are interested in interviewing an 3 FBI agent about what happened out here? I wasn't there. They have to have the accounts from people that were there. My account means nothing. I wasn't there. 5 6 I wasn't a witness, so why would anybody want to talk 7 to me? SITA: Because you're tied in, you're help, 8 let's say, you're helping trying to get this thing over 9 10 with. 11 DICK: Absolutely. We would like to get this over with safely so that no one else is hurt. 12 13 SITA: Safely. 14 DICK: Absolutely. 15 Then you tell them what I'm telling SITA: you. 16 17 Sita, people don't want to hear it in that fashion. That's second-hand information. It 18 19 means little. The best information comes from people that were there. 20 SITA: Well that's all they going -- for now. 21 22 DICK: Well, again --23 SITA: Why can't you talk to the news? What we've been, I've been saying and some others that I --24 25 DICK: Sita, there is no interest in what I have to say. I'm an FBI agent that has a job to do and

no one's interested in what I have to say. interested in what Sita has to say. They're interested 3 in what David has to say. They're interested in what Rachel has to say. They're interested in what Kathy has to say, Steven has to say, David has to say, not 5 6 what Dick has to say. What Dick has to say has 7 absolutely no bearing on this incident that took place 8 Sunday. It's your responsibility. It's your right and 9 you have to do what's right, and what's right is for you to come out and you go to those people and you say 10 11 listen, this is what happened, I don't care what others 12 say, this is what happened. You and all of your 13 associates, your friends, your family in there, you all 14 have to do that. You owe it to yourselves, you owe it 15 to the children, you owe it to any other citizens in this country that might be placed in a similar 16 17 position. 18 SITA: Well you said I owe it. 19 You, as an individual. You owe it to DICK: your children and you owe it to yourself. It's the 20 right thing to do. It's the only thing to do. Please, 21 think about that, will you? Your kids miss you, they 22 need you and they want to be reunited with you. 23 24 I miss all of them too. SITA:

Okay. Who else is there that I might

talk to?

DICK:

1	SITA: Just a minute. Excuse me, do you have
2	Peter Gent (Phonetic)?
3	DICK: I'm sorry?
4	SITA: In custody?
5	DICK: Peter Gent?
6	SITA: Yeah.
7	DICK: I don't know a Peter Gent.
8	SITA: (To background) He said he doesn't
9	know him.
10	(Background voice) he doesn't need to
11	know him,
12	DICK: You're talking
13	SITA: Just a minute. He just woke up.
14	DICK: Who David? That's David you're
15	talking to?
16	SITA: Yeah. (To background) You want to
17	talk to him? Okay, just a minute.
18	DICK: Okay, David's going to get on the
19	line?
20	SITA: Nice talking to you, and thank you.
21	DAVID: Hello.
22	DICK: David?
23	DAVID: Yes.
24	DICK: Get a little rest?
25	DAVID: I'm trying.
	DICK: Did you get that medical, those

medical supplies we sent into you? I'm not sure yet, I just, I just, --2 DAVID: 3 DICK: Oh, they're there. My understanding is they're there and they just were waiting for you to 4 wake up to, to try to give you some, some relief there 5 or to assist you. 6 7 DAVID: Okay. I just want you to know, I 8 need to know, I've got to know at this point whether 9 you all have, in your custody, a Peter Gent. DICK: Why is that of a particular interest? 10 DAVID: Well because we haven't, I was told 11 earlier that we can't, we haven't accounted for him. 12 13 DICK: Okay. 14 So we've, we've been looking all over 15 the place here, you know, looking out the windows and 16 stuff, and he's somebody we haven't accounted for. 17 Now --18 DICK: Okay. DAVID: In some of your reports, you were 19 talking about these three guys earlier and we, we think 20 we know who the three guys are. I don't know why they 21 would be coming here, but that would be Mike Schroeder 22 23 24 DICK: Mike Schroeder, okay. DAVID: Possibly Bob Kendrik and a person 25 that I knew by the name Bro, which is a black man. So,

we know that you all talked about three of those persons. We know that no, no three persons went out of here acting like Rambo, you know, and got --3 4 DICK: They did go out of there? Oh, you 5 said they didn't, okay. 6 DAVID: Oh, no, no, no, I'm saying we know 7 they didn't. 8 DICK: Okay. Now, is that Delroy Nash? 9 DAVID: Delroy, anybody know Delroy Nash? 10 That's his name? Delroy? DICK: Yeah, that's Bro. That may be Bro. 11 12 DAVID: Oh, hey, Neil, --13 DICK: Can you confirm that? 14 DAVID: What is, what is Bro's name, real name? Nash? I never knew that. That's him then, 15 16 Delroy. 17 Okay, Delroy is in custody. 18 DAVID: I know him, I knew him by the name of 19 Bro. 20 DICK: Okay. 21 DAVID: That's the name that, that, I think, 'cause he never did talk very plain and, you know, he talked kind of -- He was from England but he talked 23 real, he didn't talk much, but he would talk real, if I 24 25 couldn't understand some times, I'd tell him, I just said, all right, I'm going to call you Bro.

DICK: Yeah, it's difficult to understand 1 Englishmen at times. That, my understanding is that is accurate, that is Delroy Nash and he is in custody. 3 4 DAVID: Okay. Well then so those, we've 5 accounted for those. 6 DICK: Okay. 7 DAVID: There's Don Bonds, we've accounted for him. 8 9 DICK: Don Bonds? 10 DAVID: Don Bonds. DICK: Okay, how do you account for him, I 11 mean, what is his status? 12 DAVID: Well we, we already heard that there 13 was a 62 year old man picked up in town and we know 14 15 that could be, that's Don Bonds. 16 DICK: Okay, now, I'm not aware of that at That might be, that might be accurate, but I, 17 it's not known to me. 18 19 DAVID: Oh, I see. Okay. Well, I'm, I'm pretty sure, I'm pretty sure that's him, Don Bonds. 20 21 DICK: Okay. 22 DAVID: Because we know you got him. 23 let's say, it's Bob Kendrik --24 DICK: Okay. 25 DAVID: 'Cause, you know, these three, actually two guys, Bro was just, Bro was just, you

know, he was traveling around the United States and he, he had just been out to California or something, when 3 he came back, you know, you know, I told him, I said, well, you know, until he could make arrangements doing 5 things, you know, he could probably stay down at the shop for a while or something like that, but --6 7 DICK: Um-hum. 8 DAVID: But I know those three guys were 9 together. DICK: Okay, well, maybe that's the three 10 that --11 12 DAVID: But there's, but there's, but Peter Gent, no one has been able to account for him since, I 13 know this, but since Sunday. 14 15 DICK: Peter Gent, does, has he been living at the compound? 16 17 DAVID: Right. 18 DICK: Okay, and you haven't, no one's seen 19 him since Sunday? 20 DAVID: Right, well, see, there's a lot of people I haven't seen yet, but --21 22 DICK: Okay. 23 DAVID: But, you know, they're, you know, 24 I've been asking, you know, everybody knows, everybody knows more than I do when it comes to, you know, the 25 personages, and, and they were telling me that, you

know, they thought that he was possibly, you know, watching a certain area and come to find out, when I, 3 when I, when I requested that, you know, let's really get a, get a head count and a check and find out, you 5 know, where everybody's at. 6 DICK: Um-hum. 7 DAVID: He's not been uncovered. DICK: Okay, now, I was --8 9 DAVID: And so, what I, what I, we've been trying to look from different degrees around from the 10 11 windows and stuff like that. 12 DICK: Okay. 13 DAVID: And --14 DICK: Well, Don, my understanding is Don was, in fact, stopped on Sunday and released. 15 16 DAVID: Right. 17 So that's, that accounts for him. DICK: 18 DAVID: Okay. 19 You know, I'm glad you mentioned that, you know, the windows and stuff, I think you indicated 20 earlier that, please, make sure that your folks there 21 are very careful, that they don't, you know, that 22 they're not poking weapons out of windows. 23 24 DAVID: Oh, we under, we understand that. DICK: Okay, I just, I just want to reiterate 25 that with you. I just want to --

But, it's just like I was telling Jim 1 2 the other night and whereas people are using their, you 3 know, sniper scopes on us, you know, at the same time, you know, this has to be a fair deal in every degree. 5 If someone, if someone has the, you know, the legal 6 right, instinctive right to be zeroing down on an object, you know, with the, with the high power rifle 7 8 and a scope, that same right is also administered to I mean, this is, this is not -- Our rights were 9 10 violated. You, our government has stepped in and beyond, taking a religious peoples accusations, which 11 is just like what happened, you know, not just like, 12 13 but 2000 years ago the Sanhedrim and Pharisees could not get around the doctrines so they, they made up a 14 lot of things, okay? 15 DICK: Okay, so in this instance you're 16 17 saying --18 What I'm saying, what I'm saying is. 19 is that when the United States of America steps on the door front of a people, see, what I should have done 20 right now, and I realize it now, I tried to, well, 21 hindsight, like I said is always 20-20. 22 23 DICK: Um-hum. 24 I should have, I should have went DAVID: ahead and I should have taken Robert Gonzalez and I 25

should have, I should have, this morning I should have

said, now, you're going to sit right here Robert, and you're not going to leave this place, you know, until 2 you tell me point blank -- See, we didn't get a phone 3 call this morning. That was, there was not a phone 5 call. When, when --6 DICK: You mean Sunday morning. 7 DAVID: Sunday morning. 8 DICK: All right. 9 DAVID: When they, when they said there was a phone call, they wanted to ask me 10 11 something. DICK: Okay. Who was it that called? 12 DAVID: Nobody called. 13 Okay. 14 DICK: 15 DAVID: That's the whole deal. 16 DICK: Well, who wanted to ask you something 17 then? 18 DAVID: Well, Perry and Dave and another individual wanted to ask me something regards to the 19 morning worship. And so I wasn't going -- instead of, 20 instead of, instead of coming in and saying, you know, 21 interrupting a conversation I was having with Robert, they, you know, they needed to know because there was 23 some things we had to get ready, so they said, well, 24 you know, there's, there's a call, can you come to the 25 call? Okay, well, yeah, I went to the call and, yeah,

| well. Steve was still talking to him, and that's where Robert, that's where Robert tried to tell you 2 individuals we were tipped off by a call. But listen 3 to this, I was already explaining to Robert at that point that, you know, we, we have always known who they 5 6 were the very first day that they moved in. I mean, we, we went across the street, we sent some guys over 7 there to, you know, to talk with them, to, to, you know, to get to know them and stuff like that, because, like I've always said, I've always, I've invited the 10 sheriff's department to come in here. Anytime they 11 12 wanted to come fishing and stuff, come visiting --. What's that, what's that lieutenant, Barber, no, --13 14 STEVE: Abner, Larry --15 DAVID: Larry Abner. 16 STEVE: There was another Spanish name. 17 UNIDENTIFIED VOICE IN BACKGROUND: 18 Leondo (phonetic). 19 DAVID: Yeah, Johnny Leondo. 20 DICK: Okay, now --DAVID: Two, two very fine individuals in the 21 sheriff's department that we talked with the last time, 22 and I have all -- look, I understand a lot of things 23 that I may do in religion may not be in the sight of a 24 lot of people, a hundred percent acceptable in this 25 society.

DICK: But you're a gentleman --

DAVID: But there's one thing, there's one thing that, that I have always been and that is I've always been honest and open to anybody who will sit down and look at me in the light of what I perceive in the book called the Bible.

DICK: Um-hum.

DAVID: You see, now, this is where we were working with Robert at. I had already given him several Bible studies in which I'm sure, in all consciousness, he will, because like, he was deeply convicted over what I was showing him.

DICK: Um-hum.

DAVID: Deeply convicted. I had already, this would have been -- I already told him that he could stay here and take one of the rooms with the guys for two weeks.

DICK: Um-hum.

DAVID: And I said, now Robert, there's something you have to understand. A lot of people that observe me, you know, and are trying to look at me, are always trying to figure out where I'm coming from. But I promise that everything about me and every question you may have in regards to me, you will find out and you will know. That's one thing I have never done with my students, is that if you sit down and give

yourself the time, you will find out everything there is to know about me. Okay? And when he came over with the AR-15's, when he said that, you know, he had some 3 AR-15's? 5 DICK: Um-hum. 6 DAVID: Oh, wait a minute, oh, okay. 7 DICK: What's the matter? You feeling --8 DAVID: No --9 DICK: Pain? DAVID: When I had, I had to stretch and it's 10 11 just a sharp pain. 12 DICK: You know what you need to do? You 13 need to get yourself walking a little bit and stretch yourself out or you're going to have, your muscles are going to atrophy. 15 16 DAVID: Well, I, I, yeah. 17 DICK: You know what I mean? 18 DAVID: I need to get myself walking, Steve. 19 DICK: Well, if you're that bad off, then use that stuff we sent into you. Get yourself some medical 20 21 care. DAVID: Here's, here's the deal now. 22 when, when Robert was told that he couldn't shoot his 23 pistol across the street, 'cause he was, you know, 24 25 shooting his pistol --

DICK: Um-hum.

DAVID: The next door neighbor confront him and says, no, we don't need to do that. I went ahead and I told Mark, which is our next door neighbor to go ahead and tell him to come over here. We have a mound in the back, you know, where we shoot at sometimes --

DICK: Um-hum.

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DAVID: -- and, like a little target range.

DICK: Okay.

DAVID: For a small caliber handgun, and I said he's more than welcome to come over here, and so, he took up the invitation and he came over and he brought this Eagle series, you know, .38, actually .45, you know, .38 upper on a basically a .45 lower, you know, revolver, around the Colt model, Colt .45 series, but, you know, a special one. It had a special fly on it, it was all, been tapered, it had a special compensator and everything. Anyway, you know, the guys, the guys telling me, with his 8 point scope and all that, that he doesn't really know that much about guns, and, and the very first thing he does is he brings over this weapon that's, you know, no novice has, and no novice knows to put those pieces together like that, and I checked the slide ratio and I checked the, the trigger pull and everything, and the gun's maxed out, and, you know, --

DICK: Meaning it's been modified?

DAVID: Yeah. What I'm saying is, is that as far as, you know, we already knew, I already knew that he was in law enforcement. See, I mean, okay, for instance, the first day they come over, okay?

DICK: Um-hum.

DAVID: The first day they come over, here's all of these guys and their excuse for moving into this little bitty house is that they're students, college students. Now, come on. Every little one of them was at least in their mids to later 30s, okay?

DICK: A little old for college.

DAVID: Well, the mystery of it is is that another stupid thing was that I already, I had already been, well, this sounds funny. See, when a prophet has a vision, what happens is, is that God communicates to the prophet and shows the prophet pictures and images which allows the prophet to perceive and on some degree what the next steps or what's happening in regards to the will of God. Okay? Like when Christ talks about the armies gathered around Jerusalem and things like that, you know, this is the vision area, this is where heaven uses means and ways of communicating unto mankind in regards to the events that they foresee.

DICK: So you, you've foreseen, you foresaw that that was a police officer?

DAVID: Well, I've been, I've been teaching
