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## WACO Negotiation TRANSCRIPTS Received from Department of Justice.

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DAVID: -- was just way too cool. When, when you take a man who claims he don't know nothing about a firearm, and he pulls out a 1 & 7 twist chromolang (phonetic sp.) Colt, you know, and it has a trigger job with a, with a very, very quick snap sly, you know, on the trigger.

DICK: That's a clue to you.

DAVID: Well, no, it's not just that. I mean that's just somebody that knows how to set up a rifle.

DICK: Uh-huh.

DAVID: It's, it's a sniper series rifle for the heavier, the heavier 225.56 round. The 1 & 7 is the present military twist that they use in the military, and they use it primarily for tracer rounds. Stabilizes the larger bullets in other words.

DICK: Um-hum.

DAVID: As far as using them for like say automatic stuff like that, burns the barrels out too much. But as far as a sniper rifle it's excellent. Stabilizes large rounds.

But the thing of it is is this. What gives, what gives the man away is his technique of firing and his, and his mannerisms of, you know, shootery (sic) expertise. You know. So the guy can try and talk as ignorant as he wants.

And I'm here all along telling him, I'm

saying now come on, Robert. You know all about this 1 | Now come on, Robert. I've been telling you the 2 stuff. I've been showing you the Book. Now come on, 3 truth. tell me the truth. You know, you know what you do for a living? And you know, he just kept looking at me 5 6 kind of funny all, all, every step of the way. But when he finally did sit down and I gave 7 8 him some definite studies in regards to the Lamb in Zachariah 14 and the way the events would develop if 9 the system of which we're dealing with progressively 10 moves on and violates the, the limits of God's 11 forbearance. 12 You know, he began to get kind of worried. 13 14 And he says, he says well, you know, I definitely see 15 this is different. And you got something here. DICK: Well, Dave, I don't think --16 17 DAVID: Well, that morning that --18 DICK: Don't give us that. You do have, you do have some very --19 20 DAVID: That --21 DICK: -- very good teaching. DAVID: Well, see, the, the -- no, his 22 punishment is going to be extreme. Because that 23 Sunday -- Saturday morning when, when he came over and 24 25 we looked at the paper. We had Sabbath together, you know, the paper started, you know, well, right then and

there when the paper come I thought here we go again. 1 I mean this is, this is the Mr. Markbros (phonetic sp.) 2 accumulation of the dirty deeds of David, excerpts of 3 tapes. And I do teach a very deep subject which I was 4 trying to get into last night with, with Henry. 5 DICK: Um-hum. 6 But like I say, the nature of man is 7 a very deep science in itself. It has an author and it 8 has an originator. The, the complexity of the human 9 agent and the simplicity of the human agent is all a 10 deep and a high, a sweet and a sour revelation of God. 11 DICK: What was his response? What was his 12 response to that? I mean did you think --13 DAVID: Well, I don't --14 DICK: -- you think that he was listening and 15 16 learning? 17 DAVID: Well, last night -- oh, you talking about Henry? 18 DICK: Well, no, I'm going back to Robert 19 20 now. DAVID: No, Robert, I never got into that 21 with him. 22 Okay. So you're talking about Henry 23 24 last night. Okay. DAVID: Talking about Henry last night 25

because he --

DICK: I understand you had a long conversation with him.

DAVID: He was already, he, he was already a man of deep principle when it comes to, you know, his perception of family and things like that. And I could go ahead and share a few things with him.

But now Robert, you know, I, I kept trying to show him about this, this day of vengeance which the scripture calls the day of the Lord is at hand. A day when, when God moves in to order his purposes and his mandates in which he's already given the rule over the nations of the earth in regards to what nations shall rule over his people. And what, and what times have been put in the hand of God that the people of God shall be mandated underneath these governments.

Now anyway. So, so he got a study on Daniel 2 where it says in the days of these kings God of heaven will set up the kingdom referring to the seed and the image of Daniel which, you know, consecutive of the head was Babylon, the arms of silver, the belly was -- excuse me, the belly was Grecia, the legs were iron, the feet part of iron, part of clay were Europe. You know, the broken state of Rome after Rome was the, began to become divided by the Nomadic Kingdoms.

And God or the prophecy of Daniel specifically says in the days of these kings God will

set up the kingdom. Although when the Revelation takes up the subject, because remember, Christ was not fully accepted 2,000 years ago, and there's a postponement so that the gentiles might have a chance to, to believe what the Jews refused to believe. That is they refused to believe the prophets.

The gentiles have a probationary time to learn the prophets. Of course, they're not going to be able to just like the Jews weren't able to. The, the whole prophetic teaching gives us insight which says that right before the fulfillment the Messiah himself will come. And that's the basis of the foundation for Israel receiving the covenant promises. They must accept the full light, the day spring, from Christ. Of course when he came they, they didn't. They, they killed him.

So the same to the gentiles. When the gentiles are to be at the very verge of the kingdom, the promises of all the prophets and all their testimony, a new slant — in Revelation there's something written within and on the backside of the book. There's an addition to it. In the backside of the covenant is this new covenant which deals with when in heaven the judgment begins sometime after John's day it will be initiated by God in heaven to established first in heaven what the basis of judgment will be.

And it will be not based on -- Tibido, you're on the line -- it will not based, be upon, based upon any man's deeds or acts -- Tibido, you're still -- there you go. It will not be based upon any man's actions or faults based upon the law of the covenant, of the first covenant. It will revolve around their perception and their admittance to a righteousness of God which, you know, God cannot say that he condones breaking his law. Do you understand that?

DICK: Um-hum.

DAVID: You know, God's law, he never, he never condones the breaking of it. But God wants to be known to those which God will show mercy to --

DICK: But doesn't God understand that that's being done and not be design but that none of us are able to, to get by without some missteps?

DAVID: Well, that's the whole beauty of why Christ himself is the, is the lawyer in the case. That's why he's called the vice chair. In other words, in a bargaining situation, Paul tries to explain — remember this is a political thing. It's always been a political thing when it came down to the persecutions when the government and, and political churches were, were together in co-ops. And then the God would have a message for his people. And it was always a political thing.

But, but you know, the God who sits on a throne which is a judiciary in heaven, you know, doesn't say anything because God is, in this revelation God is basing his same plan of salvation to mankind just as it was in the days of Noah. God is not wanting to exercise punishment on humanity because they have sinned, you know. But instead, God wants man to be on his side and admit his righteousness by adhering to the plan that he's devised. Such as in Noah's day if anybody will admit that they're a transgressor, that they need help, then God is preparing an ark.

You see, now, now God wants me to realize that sin is a disease. And then, you know, at first it seems fun. It seems kind of fun at first. But as a man progresses through life, he finds out this disease is not quite so easy to get rid of. And it actually decays his physical and spiritual being. So then men begin to receive the wages of sin which is the disease and death. And then they need God, they need help from God. Well, well God's always trying to bring men around to this knowledge.

But then that's where the key of knowledge comes. You know, we have to look to Christ who on the, who on the cross the gospels tell us that Christ says Pather, forgive them, for they know not what they do.

That's the first -- let's call that, let's call Christ

the Ten Commandments in the flesh, okay? 1 2 DICK: Okay. So, so let's say that if you look at 3 DAVID: the Ten Commandments as a rule for you to be righteous, 4 forget it, buddy. Okay? 5 6 DICK: Um-hum. 7 DAVID: But let's say that now with, with the Ten Commandments being a revelation of Christ's divine 8 9 nature, let's see that every time we're around Christ and we don't act like him let's say we get embarrassed. 10 He kind of turns around, looks at us, and we, and we 11 12 feel kind of embarrassed because we made another mistake, right? 13 But yet we love this man, you know. Because 14 this man doesn't condemn us, you know. This man we 15 want to follow him, because he's a living law. You 16 know, and he's a living God. And we want to be around 17 him, but we're just like a bunch of children making 18 mistakes. Okay now, now that's the picture of the law 19 20 in Christ. Now the Jews don't want this kind of 21 personage, and so they've got him, they've got this law 22 lifted up by crucifying him on the cross, okay? 23 DICK: Okay. 24 That's where they like their law. 25 DAVID:

They like their law broken and dead, okay? Now on the

cross let's say there's, there's another commandment added. Let's make this complete now. Let's say the lith commandment is, is the very words which on the cross says Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do.

Now that commandment is not directed to man. That commandment is by the law, Christ being the law, is directed to God. Okay? So the law which is righteous that's being crucified, rejected by Israel, right, is the law that by rejecting it is the law that is actually justified now by saying to God, God, here's your law. You've got to forgive them, because they are ignorant of what they're doing, right?

DICK: I, I agree with you. I mean that's -DAVID: Okay. So now here's the point. This
is what establishes the new covenant. All, all the
way, Caiaphas, you know, everyone of that generation
was freely forgiven.

Now but here is the problem. Just like in Noah's day nobody, God had no intention of destroying anybody. But in the communication that we're given through Noah, Noah clearly stated that all those who realized that sin was a mystery and evil were to avail themselves by getting into the ark as a witness against the sin, against the evil, and that God would preserve them from the evil. Okay. But of course, that

generation did not wise up to these things.

2 But now on the cross, Christ being on the cross, the covenant begins with the Father's 3 forgiveness based on the people's ignorance, okay? So God had this already planned. Now the -- that's the 11th commandment. Now the 12th commandment is while on the cross Christ finally cried it is finished. And he stated into thy hand I commit my spirit. And Christ gave up the ghost and died. Okay?

DICK: Okay.

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DAVID: Now what, what are we looking at then? Well, we're looking at a mystery about the connection between God the creator and the word of God made flesh. A message was in the life and in the teachings of Christ. A secret communication that the proud and the arrogant, the self-determined and selfwilled, the self-supportive. The Bible calls them islands. You know, the independents would not perceive.

Well, in the Book of Revelation again, remember, the holy spirit, the angel of Christ, is talking to John, the revelator. And after counseling the Seven Churches of Asia, specific direct counsels, the spirit addresses John in the fourth chapter by saying come up hither. Come on up hither, and I will show you that which must be hereafter.

Now Revelation says blessed are those who hear the words of this prophecy and those who keep the things written therein. Now you cannot keep what you don't understand. Okay? But the blessing is based upon reading the words of this prophecy. A prophecy is a forecast of the future of which God who made heaven and earth by his word no doubt by the same word can create the future to bring about the events he foretells shall come to pass. That's in the providence of God, isn't it? Okay.

Now John witnesses in that event. He ascends to heaven. He's in the spirit and he has sins. And he sees a throne set in heaven. So a judiciary is established. That, that thing is taking place right now while we talk. And this is where people may be laughing for lack of understanding.

And this is what I'm presenting to the

Fathers that, that, you know, people today -- I've been
here 33 years now. And I know about all the high
sophistications of television, you know, cartoons.

There's just so many things to engross the human mind
that, that the attention span and the perceptions of
mankind in this generation are so perverted unlike any
other generation that men, they don't --

DICK: You still there, Dave?

DAVID: Yeah, I'm still here.

Can you hear me? DICK: 1 I'm here. Men --2 DAVID: I'm hearing a lot of noise on your 3 DICK: end. 4 DAVID: Men don't properly know how to learn 5 in an absorbent form. Men want to learn things quick. 6 You know, Jack-in-the-Box, you know, Taco Bell. 7 want it now, we want it quick, don't we? 8 DICK: Absolutely. 9 DAVID: Okay. This is our world. 10 Get it and get on your way. 11 DICK: 12 DAVID: Exactly. And so, you know, I'm trying to present to, to my source or, or let's say to 13 my boss that, you know, sufficient time has to be 14 15 administered because the thing that I gave is, is something which is, has to be looked at and absorbed. 16 And a lot of people don't have a mind to do that. 17 But here's the thing. In this judiciary, the 18 time comes and this, this must be the faith of the 19 Christian remember, is that what must be hereafter the 20 21 spirit says I will show you that which must be. Okay. So I always teach this like in a question. 22 23 John says he saw a throne in heaven and one sat on the 24 throne. And he had a rainbow around about him. He was to look upon like a, jasper stone, sardine stone. Like 25 a -- he was a rock. This guy is solid. The reason

1 | being is he's mad.

And what happens is there's these 24 elders in the midst of this throne which is a jury. Now these, these people are, have been saints that have been translated from the beginning of time. We'll go into this later. But anyway, these are men who have lived in this world before who were -- well, like I say I was telling, I was telling Henry last night about, you know, the chariots of the Gods, you know -- we're not talking about religious, we're talking about documentations.

DICK: Um-hum.

DAVID: From all nations, from different, from different beliefs and faiths how that there has been communication and actual transportation of, of beings from other worlds into our world. And even so much that agree that, that ancient empires have actually built landing strips and things like that for such large capacity vehicles.

You know, the, the prophets of old living in the natural realities of their world, you know, could only identify the things that they saw out of their world by things in their world. So when a prophet talks about a chariot with flaming torches, you know, that sounds like the thunder and things like that, you know, what are we really looking at?

1 Well, the prophecies could not have been understood in their day, because God who gave the 2 3 prophets the vision or showed them the experience that they were shown were told that their books would be sealed until the end of time. 5 Now in the end of time, after the 6,000 years 6 7 of probation which God has allotted to man, and we're coming to this time now, after the end of time, there's 8 to be a message which is proposing to be able to unlock 9 10 these mysteries of the ancient worlds and begin to explain to us that well, what these prophets saw we can 11 12 see today, because God has given to man certain 13 technologies to help him comprehend chariots with flaming torches that when they run sounds like the thunders, okay? 15 16 DICK: Well, David, when I hear you talk 17 about these things it makes some sense to me. However, 18 how, you know, how can we use this ability that, that 19 God gave you in a positive way? 20 DAVID: Well, not by, not by trespassing over 21 our perimeter and --22 DICK: But Dave, David, David --23 DAVID: -- and shooting me. 24 DICK: How, how can we --25 DAVID: Because that's --DICK: -- how can we take this, this

predicament that we're both involved in now and put it to a positive use?

DAVID: Well, now this is what we're --

DICK: How can we do that?

DAVID: -- this, this is what God at the present time, this is where my headquarters is coming from is, is telling me to wait because of what has been taking place on your side in regards to actual literal conversations between certain of the leaders as which you call bosses and certain of their proper plans and all that. Now let, now hear me out for a second.

DICK: Okay. Sure. I'm willing to.

DAVID: This, this is where, you know, the -okay. Of all the technologies of man, the high
disciplines of science, the breakdown of, of, you know,
where we, where we break away from hypothesis and come
into the realm of fact. When, when theory becomes, you
know, a working fact, then we build upon facts, you
see. But we, we search upon, you know, we search upon
theory. But we build upon facts. Now our facts become
our concrete foundation.

DICK: Um-hum.

DAVID: And from that point we, we look up a little bit further based upon what we are standing on solidly, and we, we kind of say well, if this has worked by this means and that means then possibly my

hypothesis is that it's, if I do this then it's going to come out like this. Well, of course, as we begin to work it and see if it holds together, if it falls apart then, then we realize we've made a mistake. Okay.

But man has become so proficient in the knowledge of so many things that expertise and specialty becomes very important. Like say in the building of the space shuttle I mean, you know, there are so many professionals and experts extremist in such minute degrees. Like in the medical field. First you have a general practitioner who knows basically about, you know, head, nose, ears, eyes --

DICK: Sure. Sure.

DAVID: -- you know. That where it hurts in your elbow.

DICK: Some general, some general things, right.

DAVID: Yeah. But then, but then there -but then because the; the vast of humanity and the, and
the promises of God based to the prophet, Daniel and
the prophets about how he promises that though man will
be unperceptive of it he will develop in man knowledge
and wisdom in the latter days to bring them to the
point of judgment. In other words, he'll give them
keys and knowledge that their whole existence in the
form of humanity will all of a sudden abruptly change

from the patterns of approximately 5 and 6,000 years 1 and finally to where in the last, the last centuries, 2 you know, they will elevate to such a promoted form of 3 natural man. DICK: David. Excuse me for just a minute. 5 I apologize for just one second. Hold for just a 6 7 second. DAVID: Okay. 8 [gap] 9 Yeah, I just saw one of the fellows DICK: 10 that's responsible for putting that tape together. And 11 they've assured me that it, it's been taken care of. 12 And I want to get that out to you while I'm still here 13 talking and listening to you. 14 DAVID: The other one was blank I heard. 15 DICK: That's what I understand. That's --16 did you rewind it, David? Was it rewound and, and --17 DAVID: Yeah, they, they did that. 18 DICK: -- you gave it (indiscernible). 19 DAVID: Sure. 20 DICK: Okay. Well, we're going to get 21 another one out to you. I apologize. I give you my 22 personal apology for that. You know, how that 23 happened, God only knows. 24 DAVID: Well, it's just -- it could be a 25 simple error as far as a button, you know. Just

1 pushing --It can be. I'm glad, I'm glad you 2 DICK: gave that to us. Because you know, you could have --3 that's embarrassing for me to, to suggest that we're 4 sending out a tape, and then it comes out blank. I 5 mean that's embarrassing. 7 DAVID: No problem. It's personally embarrassing to me. 8 DICK: 9 DAVID: No problem. Personally embarrassing to me. 10 DICK: DAVID: No problem. That's where grace is so 11 12 important, you know? Did you get a chance to look at the 13 DICK: kids' pictures? 14 DAVID: Not yet. Like I said, I just, I just 15 come to here from kind of a --16 17 DICK: Yeah. 18 DAVID: -- intoxicated sleep. But --(Laughing.) 19 DICK: 20 DAVID: -- back to the subject now if we can. If, if you'd like to, it will give you a better 21 understanding of, of basically what you're dealing with 22 23 on this side. Okay. Now so in particulars of all the 24 25 knowledge and technology that's been emerging it's also required in the realm of religion for man to finally

1	become aware that his present state of darkness or
2	ignorance to the whole tenor of scripture has to now
3	be, you know, ceased. It has to be accomplished.
4	Now what happens is, is that I'm, I'm
5	probably well, knowledge of scripture because of the
6	experience that was given to me, you know, I
7	probably well, let me just I'm not trying to brag
8	or nothing. It's just nobody in the world knows
9	DICK: You have a, you have a right to
10	DAVID: Nobody in the world knows
11	DICK: You have a right to.
12	DAVID: the Book
13	DICK: Like you do.
14	DAVID: Yeah (indiscernible.)
15	DICK: I will give you that. I will give you
16	that.
17	DAVID: Okay?
18	DICK: I'll give you that.
19	DAVID: But there's a reason for that.
20	DICK: You worked hard on it.
21	DAVID: No, that's not true.
22	DICK: Okay, it's been given to you, this
23	gift.
24	DAVID: And exactly. In other words, for
25	instance, the best way to explain it is, is that okay,
	for instance, Satan once dwelt in heaven, okay? Satan

1 once --Okay. 2 DICK: 3 -- dwelt in the other universes, DAVID: 4 okay? 5 Um-hum. DICK: 6 DAVID: And so Satan knows about wisdom. He 7 knows about the measure of God where God allows his 8 beings to be imparted knowledge and wisdom and 9 understanding. Okay, a movie, though not in 10 particularly true in every degree but theoretically 11 having a, a simulation of like to what I'm talking 12 about is a movie called Lawnmower Man. Have you ever heard of that movie? 13 14 I have. My, my son and my daughter 15 have seen it. I have not seen it. 16 DAVID: A very -- you know, when you get a 17 break you should, you should get that on video. And 18 you should, you should sit down and look at that. Now that's basically what happened to me. 19 DICK: I'll do that. I'll do that. 20 I promise you on your, on your recommendation. 21 22 DAVID: Okay. Now the reason being is, is 23 because this, this reality formulation of teaching what it does is that it, it exercises the mind to where the 24 25 many, many millions of brain cells which lie dormant in the, in the head of humanity because the access to them

is deleted, you know, they are awakened and quickened in the storage of information, and the call-back 3 processes are not hindered. And so man becomes a very intelligent being above and beyond what he normally 5 would have been. This is what took place on the day of 6 Pentecost. When the cloven tongues of fire ascended 7 8 upon the apostles, we were dealing with regeneration or the scripture calls it a quickening. 9 10 Of course, we're dealing also with, you know, there's two sides of the brain. And the two sides of 11 12 the brain have their proper work in humanity in the 13 form of man, and they both have two opposite capabilities of, of two spectrums of genius. One for 14 15 the natural and one for the supernatural. Now what I'm 16 calling supernatural is really natural. It's just 17 humanity has been punished or let's say he's been kept from being able to communicate with this supernatural. 18 19 Okay, for instance, to make it plain if I might. Christ was a natural being in the flesh, wasn't 20 21 he? 22 DICK: He was. 23 DAVID: But on the other hand, he was a supernatural being too, wasn't he? 24 25 DICK: Absolutely true. DAVID: And what, what was supernatural his

ability to command the elements, right, caused him to be considered a miracle worker. Now being a miracle worker just simply meant that he was doing works that were not known and not common amongst the normal or natural man of his day. Okay?

DICK: I understand.

DAVID: Now but the thing of it is if, if man could be given this power or this key, then he would be more closely related or identified with Christ which on the day of Pentecost it is recorded and written that those who believe in him to them gave he power. And this is something from an outside force --

DICK: Um-hum.

DAVID: -- to become the sons of God. Now those Nethinim, the 120 were given such a manifestation. And 2 tons of fire, let's say we could call it two electrical currents, okay, were administered upon each one of those individuals, and they were given the ability to speak in every language.

DICK: Okay.

DAVID: Okay. Now some people today that they try to make this called, you know, speaking in tongues, jibber-jabber talk.

DICK: Um-hum. Yeah.

DAVID: But very clearly manuscript states that of all the Jews that had been scattered amongst

the then known nations who had, who had come back to

Jerusalem for the feast, they could hear these, these

individuals speak the gospel very highly fluent in

their tongues that they had picked up from the

DICK: Okay.

gentiles.

DAVID: So you know, the Hebrew language was something used in the hierarchy of Jerusalem. But the national language in those days was Aramaic just like English today is, is the, is the world language of today.

DICK: Um-hum.

DAVID: But still the Phoenicians and the Greeks and the different, you know, Libyans and stuff like that had their definite dialects. And these, these Jewish people after receiving Pentecost could communicate with such a clear, high level of understanding in these different languages. And it was all done by this quickening.

Okay. Now what we're looking at is that the same quickening gave unto the apostles the power, and this is the Book of Acts, to not only speak with wisdom but also to raise the dead, heal the sick, and do all the miracles which Christ himself had done. Okay?

DICK: Um-hum.

DAVID: Let's call it the key to the command

of the cosmos. Bringing the anti-matter into the 1 matteral (sic) form and constructing -- because let's 2 like for instance today man could it in a degree. We 3 can go and buy a piece of candy if we wanted to and like, like for instance, what are those banana -- what 5 do they call them? Anyway, let's say a banana candy or 6 7 DICK: 8 Okay. DAVID: -- strawberry candy. 9 I know what you mean. Those soft --DICK: 10 DAVID: And you know --11 -- those soft, little soft things. DICK: 12 DAVID: Right. I forget what they call them. 13 But anyway, and here we are enjoying these wonderful 15 flavors as we're, you know, driving down on our trip. DICK: Uh-huh. 16 And munching on these things that are 17 DAVID: 18 not good for our body or anything. But it's good for our attitude so temporarily --19 20 DICK: (Laughing.) Little sugar? DAVID: Little sugar, you know, and --21 DICK: Sugar, it will get you going. 22 23 DAVID: And actually, and actually there's nothing to do with the banana in these things. 24 25 DICK: Nothing. DAVID: Nor anything to do with a strawberry

or a cherry or a lemon. All of these are biological simulated flavors.

Of course, a flavor is the chemical reaction in the body, we understand this, that's picked up by the brain. You know, and so many parts of this and so many parts of that formed together and compiled together in the proper, you know, numerical value. And all of a sudden it tells our brain, our brain picks it up as being a certain identity. We call it a flavor, you know.

But yet we have artificial flavors. We get the, we get the stimulation. We get the reality of, of enjoying this flavor. But, but all we are doing is, is putting a chemical, a counterfeit chemical into our body. In other words, we're hallucinating cherry.

We're hallucinating banana. You see?

DICK: Um-hum.

DAVID: And it's also known that, that some of the ways that, that men are achieving to develop these flavors is actually cancerous. It has a, has a negative effect in the biochemical part of our body. So you know, a lot of flavors and stuff over the years they've found out, you know, needed to be banned and stuff.

DICK: Yeah. Wasn't, wasn't good for anyone.

DAVID: Yeah. But nonetheless, so we're

seeing that there's more to life and humanity than just 2 the good old country living. I mean there is a 3 sophisticated and very complex reality of our being that we need to discern. Because when it comes down to 5 the final days, when men are witnessing technology and 6 science, possibility and eternal research, when men are 7 beginning to realize that God didn't really write down 8 all their sins in a book, did he? DICK: No. Not all of them. 9 10 No, what I'm saying is I'm saying DAVID: 11 that, that with man's ability in the computer spectrum, you know, remember that a computer is really just a 12 13 very basic, basic, basic, highly basic form of the 14 first steps of creating mankind. Okay, now remember a computer is taken from the same substances of the earth 15 of which man himself likewise is made. True or false? 16 17 That's true. DICK: 18 Now when a computer system is highly DAVID: 19 sophisticated it takes up rooms, doesn't it? DICK: It can. 20 21 We used to, we used to build the elevator floors for high-tech computer systems. And --22 23 DICK: Where was that? 24 DAVID: This was down in Dallas years ago. 25 Just a construction company. I used to -- you know, I'm a carpenter and stuff, you know?

Are you? Finish carpenter? DICK: 1 DAVID: Yeah, I used to do trim work too. 2 3 DICK: Did you? DAVID: Used to know how to mold and all that 5 chair rail and everything. DICK: Really? 6 7 DAVID: Really. I'm not lying. I just had some guys do something like 8 that in my home. Boy, they get big dollar for it, but 9 it's a skill that's fastly (sic) disappearing. 10 DAVID: You know because there's just not 11 that much work for it anymore. 12 DICK: No. 13 DAVID: Back in the '70s and '80s that's when 14 it was really predominant. 15 16 DICK: Yeah. DAVID: When a man could make a living on it. 17 But anyway, what I'm saying is I'm saying that even 18 though, even though a man might have every link 19 computer bank system in the world, still the human mind 20 21 has the capacity and capability of going far beyond, no comparison beyond any computer system. 22 DICK: Um-hum. 23 24 DAVID: But the problem is, is that the one who has developed this on-board computer system has 25

limited it because of an oracle of something called

perceptive judgment. In other words, man is to

experience in this realm of existence under probation

two opposites of existence, good and evil.

And that, that is found in everything we perceive. The degree of good and the degree of evil of the thing we perceive. No matter what it is. Banana flavor is good, and yet banana flavor can be evil.

Natural banana flavor chemically developed through the sciences of God's creation through the chromosome of the seed.

You know, God places this genetic in every seed of every thing. It's already been encoded in everything that's of the seed, right? And God mandates that this process once being applied to the soil of the earth, bring the proper nutrients and minerals from the earth and develop the plant, the stem, the water system, the photosynthesis system and, and develop this flavor through natural chemical reaction. And man's supposed to enjoy this flavor banana. That's good.

But of course, when man tries to construct it without the full process, he frustrates the process and causes a deadly chemical which is evil. So we can be enjoying banana flavor which is good and banana flavor which is evil. And one has two different opposite effects.

Okay, so, so now that we've come to this time

in the world's history, we finally have to come and make things very simple. Okay, simplicity. Let's go back to simplicity.

Now in the Bible in the Book of Revelation, you know, we love the Lord Jesus. He, he committed his spirit, and he knew he was going to die. He knew that his mind was going to be rejected of the world in his days. And I so -- and so our good Lord Jesus, you know, all the knowledge he had and, and all the light he had within his soul, everything he could have done for man was being rejected. And so he just asked his Father to forgive them all because they were so ignorant. And he asked him, Father, he says, into your hand I commit my spirit.

So in, in the Book of Revelation we find that John writes that in the right hand of God there is a book. And this book has been sealed. Now why is this book sealed? Well, it's because the contents are being kept from somebody.

And in this final judgment which must be sometime after John's day, John said so, we find a large number of personages found in heaven, ten thousands time ten thousands and thousands of thousands of angels. And we find a jury of 24 elders. And we find a mighty angel questioning all that humongous host of beings of an empire far greater and far powerful

than anything of the universe. Because it is constructed of the universes of universes.

And this one question in this judiciary is who amongst heaven and all of the authority thereof, who is worthy to open this book in the right hand of God, something that Christ committed there, something to do with the word there, something to do with the life there, the spirit there. Who is worthy to open this book and to loose the seals thereof so that these seals might be known?

Well, now, our, our visitor from, from earth, the one of the disciples of Christ says that he witnessed that no man in heaven neither on earth, neither under the earth, that's buried, was able to open, neither look thereon. And he himself, that great apostle, wept much. Because no man was found worthy.

So that's the even that scripture tells us in Revelation 4 and 5 is something that should put us all on our toes. Because in rejecting the Lord Jesus Christ he did commit his spirit to the hand of God. And there is something about Christ that nobody knows because nobody wanted to know. There's things about Christ that nobody will know until the time comes in the future, sometime after John's day. It's of the good pleasure of the Lord for men to know it.

Now as John weeps much, one of the elders

says to John, weep not, John. Behold the Lion of the 1 2 tribe of Juda. Now the Lion we know is a symbol of 3 power and authority. And he's of the tribe of Juda. We know that of Juda God chose anciently King David to rule over his people. And that this nation, it's 5 purpose was to destroy any and all that rise up and 6 oppose against the good principles of the Lord. 7 is the law of God which we know is the divine nature of 8 9 Christ. Now we see this Lion of the tribe of Juda. 10 11 And John says that when he beheld in the midst of the throne instead of seeing a Lion he saw a Lamb. 12 13 DICK: Okay. 14 DAVID: As it had been slain. Now he's a 15 Lion. But the thing John says when he looked he saw a Lamb. 16 17 DICK: Are you getting hoarse? Something in 18 your voice --19 (Clearing throat.) DAVID: 20 You've got a catch. DICK: 21 DAVID: No, I've got it now. 22 DICK: You want, you want to get something to 23 drink? 24 DAVID: No, I want you to listen. 25 Okay. I just wanted to make sure that, you know, you were comfortable.

DAVID: Yeah, I'm going to get something to drink real quick here. Just one second.

DICK: Okay. Okay. I'm listening.

DAVID: Got it. I had to get a drink.

DICK: Okay.

DAVID: So what happens is, is that as he sees the Lamb as it had been slain, he sees this Lamb has seven horns and seven eyes which are the seven spirits of God sent forth into all the earth.

Now this Lamb, John says, he beheld approached to the Father. And he took the book from the right hand of the Father. And when he had taken the book, all of heaven fell down and bowed before him. All of heaven saying thou art worthy to take the book and to loose the seals thereof. For thou was slain and has redeemed us to our God by your blood. Out of every kindred nation people in tongue. And has made us to our God kings and priests. And we shall reign on the earth. And then all the heavens says worthy is the Lamb to receive power, glory, riches, wisdom, honour, might, strength, glory. You know?

And so it's such an awesome, magnificent, powerful display of one who was a nice guy, one who was a Lamb, one who could have done great damage. But instead he said Father, forgive them. But not at Gethsemane it has to be Christ. Because when Peter

rose up and cut off the Centurion's ear, Christ told him to put his sword up. Because if he needed to, he could call legions of his angels down.

So you know, the earth was just about at the point of extinction 2,000 years ago, but nonetheless through the mercies of one man, one son of man, one son of God, two blended together as one. There was negotiations made out of one heart, and the request was forgiveness based upon men not knowing what they're doing.

And the knowledge which is to yet return someday is going to be contained in a simple format. Well, Jesus saves, Jesus loves. And so therefore, one is committed to the Christian church. But the example to love your neighbor as yourself.

But in the end of time, this Lamb in heaven receives this book. And again, there is to be brought to view in the front of all nations a witness that if it be rejected, if it be not adhered to, if it be overlooked, if heaven is insulted by proud and arrogant humanity who has made so much prosperity and so much blessing because of it's incorporated In God We Trust.

Prophecy talks about an empire that will be Lamb-like. Revelation 13 tells us that there will be a nation that will be Lamb-like, but it will speak as a dragon. Now that doesn't sound too good.

Well, what happens is, is that in the midst 1 2 of all of this reality and situation, according to the 3 purposes of God, God designs for a truth to be known. And if that truth does not bring about the fear of God 5 in the hearts of men, then what will take place is, is that God will instill his judgments and destroy that 6 nation which he has formerly so blessed. 7 Because in stepping over the boundaries of 8 9 truth and conscience when the nation after being told 10

honestly what is at stake, when they are brought to the attention of God on a throne which nobody can deny that.

> DICK: I don't think anyone can deny that.

DAVID: And God having a book with seven seals. Nobody can deny that.

> DICK: Okav.

DAVID: And when the subject is clear, only the Lamb can reveal that. Nobody can deny that, right?

DICK: No, I'm certainly not going to deny

20 it.

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DAVID: Okay. So then the subject returns with chapter 10 by saying this little book comes to earth and seven thunders are uttered. Which nobody denies the seven thunders are the seven seals. When the Lamb opened the first seal, there was the sound of thunder. When there's time no longer, this mystery of

God will be finished as God has declared to his servants, the prophets. 2 3 So step by step God designs before he lets his big guns fly, before he fulfills what he promises 4 he's going to do to that last nation that shall be 5 preeminent, eminent above all nations, the nation he 6 has blessed the most who has, you know, has received 7 the greatest privileges. Before he brings such a 8 nation into judgment, he wants it to be clearly 10 understood that what causes it is when that nation 11 steps over the boundary lines. Because in the -- well, like for instance in Revelation 22, who promises to 12 come? It says I Jesus, have sent my angel to testify 13 these things unto you and the churches. 14 15 DICK: Excuse me, Dave. Hold on for just a 16 second. 17 DAVID: Sure. 18 [gap] I just got, I just got a little 19 Yeah. charley horse here. Listen, how are the kids doing, 20 21 Cyrus and Star? DAVID: Are we going to finish this? 22 23 DICK: Well, I want to, I want to get a 24 couple things in to you, too. I've been --DAVID: No, wait a minute. Now if we were --25

DAVID: I would love to do that.

DICK: You can, David. And you have the responsibility to do that. Not only for yourself but for the others that share your concerns and to ensure that it doesn't ever happen to anyone. You have been given a forum that no one else in this country has been given as it relates to this kind of incident. No one else will be able to get up and to, and to go ahead and do this.

Maybe this was, maybe this was directed by God so that you can get out here, and you can tell the rest of this country and the world what happens when law enforcement authorities unfortunately get into a position where, where something like this happens.

Now there were people hurt in the law enforcement community, and all of us are grieving for those people. We also grieve for the people inside there that are close to you. We're not selective in our grief. We grieve for all of you and all of them. But let's, let's make something positive out of that. Let's don't ever let this happen again.

You, you have a gift that all of us would love to have. You can take and make something positive out of this by going up front in front of a Congressional committee by, by offering testimony, by ministering, by doing these kinds of things that only you can do, David. I cannot do it. I cannot do it.

Sita mentioned to me today why don't you go, Dick, and, and provide this information to these interested parties? I said I can't do it. I can't do it. I wasn't there. Only you can do that. Only you have the ability. Only you have the gift that people will, will listen and understand what you're saying. And you know, to pass that up is a horrible, horrible waste.

You can do it. You can come out. You can go to these people and make it clear. You can represent those folks and every other person that feels in the same way you do. It's your responsibility. It's, it's an absolute must that you do that. It's an absolute must. You can do it. I can't do it.

Some of the folks you have inside are able to articulate some of that stuff, but not like you, David. You have what so few of us have ever been given, the ability to do that and to convince people and to make them know that you know and you believe and you have that conviction. What you need to do is, is take it upon yourself to do that. And, and to not do so is a waste.

Show us a sign. Get out there. Send those kids out there. You get ready, you come out there, and you get it done. You get it done. Don't pass on this opportunity. You cannot pass on this opportunity. You must make, take advantage of it. You're not going to be given this forum. This is, this is just has never happened. Was, was it perhaps ordained that this happen so that you could get out and correct and rectify these kinds of problems? Is that possible?

DAVID: Well, I wish that you were the voice of God. I would be up and out right now. I mean I wish that you were actually God so that I could abide

by and follow your instruction. But that's not the 1 2 instruction that God has given. DICK: Well, I'm not suggesting I'm trying to 3 give you God's instruction. What I am telling you from 4 5 a --DAVID: Is what man --6 7 -- practical point. Absolutely. DICK: Yeah. Man's practicality but not DAVID: 8 God's. 9 I don't speak for God. And you know 10 DICK: that. And I know that. But what I do, what I do tell 11 12 you is that you have an opportunity to go before the court of public opinion. You go before that court. 13 You make your, your thoughts, your emotions and your 14 15 knowledge known. Okay? You do that. Not Dick. Not Not anybody else. Do it. You have the ability 16 I don't. You know, 2,000 years ago as Christ DAVID: 1 sat before Pilate, he told Pilate I can do nothing in 2 myself. 3 Well, listen, you have --4 DICK: Only that which I receive of the 5 DAVID: Father. 6 The power is here, and it's here now. DICK: 7 What I want you to do for me is, is give me, give me 8 something so I can go to my boss and say listen, the 9 man wants to get out and do this thing. Okay? I don't 10 want to go in to him say well, he may come out next 11 week and next year. I want you to come out now, take 12 advantage of, of the opportunity. 13 You have the responsibility. You've been 14 given a responsibility. You represent the people 15 inside there. Don't let it get away from you, David. 16 Don't let it get away from you. 17 This is power like few people in this country 18 have ever been given. I'll never have an opportunity 19 like that. You cannot waste it. 20 DAVID: My --21 You absolutely cannot waste it. 22 DAVID: My authority and my power is not 23 measured in the realms of man. 24 DICK: But let's work on that. 25 DAVID: Well, let me explain, please. Let me

try again. If you would do me a favor, if you would --1 DICK: Let's exchange favors now. 2 DAVID: Well, now wait. 3 DICK: Okay. 4 I mean this, this is to your 5 DAVID: 6 advantage. Okay. is the book, the first seal, has something that pertains to a noise of thunder and behold a white horse. He that sit upon him had a crown, right? He had a bow and he went forth conquering and to conquer.

Now a person would have to be honest by saying well, I don't know how this really reveals

Jesus. But of course, men might stand in the way and say, well, a horse could mean this. White could mean this. A bow could mean -- which is speculation. And it's very vast. But scripture has already deadlocked the key by saying that whatever this mystery may be will have to be according to God declaring it to his servants, the prophets.

Now we already know that Moses was a prophet. Elijah was a prophet. Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Daniel, Hosea, Zephaniah, Habakkuk, Malachi, you know. Such and of the sword, Zechariah, Haggai. Now we already know that these men are content of our scriptures or our Bibles which we say is the word of God. If we do not understand their testimony, then it goes right back to what I said earlier.

I have found it 11 very enlightening --12 DAVID: Okay. 13 DICK: -- talking with you. And I hope to 14 continue to talk to you. 15 DAVID: Let's, let's cause the judgment to 16 start here now. better sit home and be holy.

DAVID: Although when Dr. Walter Martin, you know, the late Walter Martin, when he confronted them, they would always deny their doctrines and deny their LNG White as a prolific prophet of God. And they would in turn go right back to the same old basic Evangelical well, no, we believe in doing good. And we believe in being just Christians. And, and this, that and the other.

When you confront the institution with the seven seals, they will tell you that they know clearly

what the seven seals are. Okay, that's their right as well as any other organization in this country.

But when it comes down to the right of freedom and speech -- when I went to Australia, I presented the seals to certain students in schools and to certain people. And one night as we were having a study, there were eight men, the conference president of the Adventist Church was one of them. Some of their top ministers came over, came in very aggressively into our meeting, and they sat there wanting to know what this was all about.

Okay, very politely I said well, sirs, it's very simple. And we began to read Revelation 4 and 5 about well, this be hereafter, God on the throne, a book in his hand, gave it to the Lamb who only can open the seals.

DICK: And they didn't appreciate it.

DAVID: Well, I mean they, they couldn't say nothing. Because we was reading word for word.

DICK: Um-hum.

DAVID: And I'll just read a few words the way I teach and ask a question. Well, does this not mean and then I'd read the same words again. Everyone goes yeah, that's what it means. Okay.

DICK: Um-hum.

DAVID: So then I said sirs, the point of

issue here is that I would like you to allow me to
serve you. I would like to emphasize that many
minister of this world will have the nerve to tell you
that that book is the Lamb's book of life and that it
has our names in it. Although scripture says no one
knows what's there. And of course, they kind of like,
you know, well, yeah, yeah.

I said now it would be an unjust statement for a minister to tell his denomination that our names are written in that book when nowhere in the Revelation does it say that. You know?

I said now this is very unique, isn't it?

Hold on just a minute. 23 JUDY: 24 DICK: Okay. Oh, here's Sita for now. JUDY: 25 All right. Sita? Sita? DICK:

SITA: Hello? 1 Sita? DICK: 2 3 SITA: Yes. I just spoke to your husband DICK: Dick. 4 and he and David both told me that, that you're able to 5 6 leave. I told Jim that already. 7 SITA: Yes. Okay. Well, let's, let's go ahead and 8 DICK: get your coat on and then come on out. That way you 9 can take care, take care of the kids and your husband 10 can stay in there and he and David can sort out what 11 they have to do there. You come out and take care of 12 the kids. We're reunite you with the kids. 13 That's what they said. SITA: 14 DICK: Both of them said that. I just talked 15 to both of them. 16 17 SITA: No. DICK: Pardon me? 18 When I brought my kids, Jim promised 19 to call, whatever, my parents-in-law, call them up --20 Sita, listen, listen. You listen to 21 DICK: me for a second, please. I will handle that for you. 22 We will handle it. It's being done. It's being done 23 as soon as we can and in a fashion that assures the 24 safety and welfare of your children. That is the only 25 way we'll do it and that's the only way you would have

us do it. Isn't that what you want us to do, to ensure 1 | the, the well being of your child? Isn't that what you 2 want done? If that's not what you want done, tell me. 3 SITA: I want my kids --4 Absolutely. And that's what I want 5 DICK: done and that's what's being done. 6 SITA: And the only thing -- I brought them 7 out to be saved and to be with their parents, 8 9 grandparents, so that they can watch them --DICK: You know, listen, grandparents, 10 grandparents are a poor substitute for their, their 11 12 natural parents. 13 SITA: Well, for now, for now -- they were 14 here a month ago. 15 DICK: Okay. 16 SITA: They were just here. Sita, come out and take care of your 17 DICK: 18 kids, okay? I know you've been thinking about it because you've indicated as much to me and to, and to 19 the other fellows that you spoke with. You're 20 concerned. You're a good mother. 21 SITA: Oh, okay. 22 DICK: You have a responsibility to those 23 kids. You brought them into the world. It's your 24 responsibility to take care of them. You have that 25 responsibility. God understands that responsibility

and you must understand that responsibility. You
brought those children into the world. Come out and
take care of those children. They want you. They need
you and you need them.

good mother. Both those men, both of those men I just talked to, both David and your husband Scott, have indicated to me that you have the right to leave and the choice is yours. The choice is more than a choice, it's a responsibility. You have a responsibility to those children. Take that responsibility. Come out here and deal with those children. What I want you to do is to tell David, where I can hear you, and to tell Scott in my hearing that you want to leave and that you want to go out and to take care of those children. That does not mean that you support them any less, that you can support them from without the compound.

One of the guys 5 spotted or finally found -- we have been -- one of our 6 7 people have been missing for a while. DICK: Okay. 8 STEVE: And his name is Peter Gent. He's --9 DICK: Yes, that was mentioned. David 10 mentioned that earlier today. 11 STEVE: Oh, did he mention it? 12 13 DICK: Yeah. STEVE: Okay, they found the body. The body, 14 15 they finally -- it's decaying, so, you know --DICK: Who found the body? 16 STEVE: One of the guys did here. 17 It's in the compound? DICK: 18 Right, it is in the compound. 19 STEVE: DICK: Okay. 20 STEVE: And we wanted -- because he is, of 21 course, getting old and everything, we wanted -- they 22 were wondering just what to do about it. 23 DICK: Well, where, where is he in the 24 25 compound?

just -- they came and told me what the details were and 1 I says well, let me go call and find out what to do. I 2 didn't really worry about so much where he was. 3 DICK: Okay. DICK: I would like you to do that. 1 STEVE: We will do that. We will start doing 2 it right now if you want. 3 Well, listen, listen. DICK: 4 5 STEVE: Okay. You let me know before you go outside. 6 DICK: I want to know and I want to alert the folks outside as 7 to what we're doing. 8 STEVE: Okay. I heard that his parents are here. Let 17 them identify him. I'm sure they will. 18 DICK: Well, I'm not sure that they are here. 19 How do you know that they're here? 20 STEVE: Oh, by the press. Very clearly by 21 the press. Oh, by, by your agency also gave me the 22 names of at least five families that were here. 23 DICK: And, and Pete Gent's family was here? 24 That is correct. And I do believe STEVE: 25 you probably know that. I'm sure you would have any

and all information at your fingertips. I'd be --DICK: Listen, hold it. You give me more 2 credit than, than I'm due, okay? If I had that 3 information, I would give it to you. I told you I'm not lying to you. I haven't lied to you, I'm not. 5 6 STEVE: Well, have them bring -- you're at a command post, from what I understand --7 DICK: Exactly. DICK: Listen, how long has, how long has he 25 been lying there?

I would imagine since Sunday. 1 STEVE: DICK: Okay. Then you brought this to my 2 attention approximately 20 minutes ago. Nothing 4 DICK: can be accomplished if we don't talk to one another, 5 can it? 6 7 STEVE: Correct. DICK: Okav. Let's deal with that then and 8 you talk, you talk to David and you two try to work out 9 some of your concerns there and, and we'll discuss them 10 at length later, and, and we'll see what can be done. 11 STEVE: All right. 12 In the meantime, you know what? We're 13 DICK: going to get -- try to get that tape out to you. And I 14 still want to talk to some of the other parents there, 15 although, frankly, I'm probably going to be leaving 16 here for a short while because, you know, talking to 17 you guys I want to be fresh to, to be able to talk to 18 you and make, make the decision, good choices. 19 STEVE: Um-hum. 20

DICK: And I believe Henry or one of, one of the fellows will be here to speak to you, but, you know, I've been -- we've talked and gotten along well and there's no reason why we can't continue to do that.

STEVE: Okay.

DICK: -- what, what I, what I need 1 you -- what I'm asking you to do, because we get along 2 well, I think, don't you? 3 I do so. As we have done in the past, as you DICK: 1 suggested today, at the press conference this morning, 2 3 corrected some things that you were concerned about. We'll continue to try to, to resolve those issues. STEVE: All right. 5 DICK: And we'll work together. 6 7 STEVE: All right, good. David did want me to pass on to you that as it states clearly from the 8 scripture, it says that only the lamb could open the 9 seals. 10 11 DICK: Okay. 12 STEVE: And he offers to do that for anyone. And the question that is asked in the Book of Luke is 13 14 how (Indiscernible) says in Luke, Chapter 10. DICK: All right. In order to open those 15 16 seals --17 STEVF. Do you understand? -- if the people --18 DICK: STEVE: Do you understand? 19 20 I, I understand what you're saying, but understand --21 22 STEVE: Okay, but he never comes right out 23 and says I am Jesus Christ, I'm this, I'm that. I understand that, but, listen --24 DICK: 25 STEVE: He says may I serve you, is the question.

That's, that's certainly acceptable, 1 DICK: but in order to understand those things, we have to 2 understand one another, we have to work together. 3 STEVE: This is correct. 5 DICK: We have to show some positive -- some 6 influence on those things that we can influence, okay? 7 STEVE: All right. 8 I can influence certain things, you can influence certain things. You need to influence 9 David to be -- to, to keep an open mind and I need to 10 11 influence others here that I'm speaking with that we must keep an open mind. That's your job and my job. 12 It's our responsibility. 13 14 STEVE: Well, we'll keep working at it, won't 15 we? 16 DICK: Line up those gals for me, if you 17 will, if I, you know, so I can speak to them later. Or, or perhaps Henry can speak to them and we can 18 ensure that they'll feel comfortable about the, about 19 the care that their kids are being given. Can you do 20 21 that for me? 22 STEVE: Well, I'll see what I can do. All right. 23 DICK: 24 STEVE: Okay? 25 DICK: Hold on for a second here. I'm, I'm

going to ask a couple questions of some folks here to

make sure that I leave you with, with, with the right understanding of what we're doing. 2 3 STEVE: All right. DICK: Hold on. 5 STEVE: Sure. 6 Steve, I was just told that there's DICK: 7 somebody walking around in the back of the complex there with a tube in hand. Now, what, what kind of --8 what, what is that? What is that? Would you find out about that right now while I hold the phone, and find 10 out who's doing that? They didn't do it at your direction or David's direction, did they? 12 13 STEVE: Pardon? 14 They didn't do it at your direction, 15 did they? 16 STEVE: What's that? 17 They're outside with tubing in their DICK: 18 hand, what appears to be tubing. Oh, near the -- I'm 19 sorry, near the tubing. They're outside in the back 20 near some copper tubing. 21 STEVE: Who is? 22 One of your -- one of the folks from inside there. 23 Oh, it's possible. Maybe it was with 24 25 the body. I don't -- I think it's where they found the

body.

DICK: No. I told you, and we talked about 1 this yesterday, you cannot send somebody outside 2 3 without letting us know that we can agree on that. We talked about that. 5 STEVE: I thought you were talking about 6 taking the body to the gate. DICK: But I told you --7 8 STEVE: Where the body is right now is no 9 good. 10 DICK: I understand what you're saying, but we've got to work on that and we'll get it done. 11 12 STEVE: All right. DICK: But I don't want people going outside. 13 14 It's just not good. We talked about this yesterday and 15 we understand one another, I thought. If you're talking about there are 16 STEVE: 17 some guys out there, apparently by some cooper tubing, 18 wherever that is --19 DICK: Not some guys, one guy, I believe. 20 STEVE: One guy? 21 DICK: One guy. 22 STEVE: Okay. 23 Get him back in the house, okay? DICK: 24 That's --25 Well, he said there's some guy out STEVE: there by the copper tubing. Apparently, I think that's

maybe where the body is right now or something. And, 1 yeah -- (Talking to someone else.) 2 DICK: Did you send him out? 3 No, we didn't. Apparently, he might STEVE: have gone out to check, thinking that he was supposed 5 to. 6 DICK: Well, you know what you need to do is 7 you need to go over these, these things with the folks 8 there so they understand that, that --9 STEVE: I think someone wanted to check to 10 make sure what the identity or the person was for sure. 11 He has been missing, along with someone else, so --12 DICK: Okay. But we discussed this and you 13 were going to -- we were going to talk about these things. And we don't want these things to happen, for 15 everyone's safety, okay? 16 STEVE: Yeah. 17 DICK: All right. You know, things like 18 happened Sunday would not happen if we talked together 19 before those kinds of things are done. You cannot 20 do --21 I couldn't agree with you more. 22 Okay, then let's don't do it then. 23 DICK: I couldn't agree with you more. STEVE: 24 You agree with me, I agree with you. 25 DICK: Let's not do these kinds of things, okay?

STEVE: Well, that's -- this is correct. 1 2 All right, get that fellow back 3 inside, okay? Then next -- and, and I hope STEVE: Okay. 5 not to -- You know, today, myself, I looked through one of the scopes, and what you just told me is fine, but 6 7 here you've got these guys behind sandbags in our garage, on our property. 8 It's for, it's for safety. 9 DICK: 10 I don't give a damn what it's for, STEVE: Dick. 11 No, listen. 12 DICK: Listen to -- no, you listen to me. 13 STEVE: Didn't you tell me we weren't going to 14 DICK: do that? 15 Dick, you listen to me. were some agreements made with David that didn't -- he didn't follow through on. 2 STEVE: That one was two, three days before 3 the one that you are speaking of, the one that --4 DICK: So you're saying the one that -- the 5 most recent one is the most important one? Listen, 6 7 listen --I'm saying, I'm saying that's been an STEVE: 8 9 ongoing thing --DICK: Okay. 10 -- since day one. 11 STEVE: DICK: Listen, you know what? Let's work, 12 let's work together on this. 13 STEVE: Well, let's do it then. 14 DICK: Let's work together and let's get 15 these things accomplished. 16 STEVE: But, I mean, the way you reacted to 17 me about telling me not to have the guy come out, well, 18 you tell the 20, 30 that have been roaming around here 19 in cars, behind the building, doing everything contrary 20 to what was agreed to. Can we do that? 21 DICK: You know, I'm going to pass on --22 STEVE: Can we do that? 23 I'm going to pass on your concerns 24 and, again, you know, I don't make all the decisions. 25 If, if it were me, I might make a different decision,

1 but --2 STEVE: Okav. -- you know what? I'm not paid to 3 make decisions at all. Somebody else is making those 4 decisions. What I am trying to do is work together 5 with you so we can reduce --6 STEVE: Well, we're not doing too well right 7 now because those that you have to answer to apparently 8 are the guys that, that choose to do their will one way 9 or the other. 10 DICK: What did we talk about? Those kids 11 12 and those tanks, didn't we? Didn't we talk about that today, the Bradleys, the people, the tactical people? 13 You and I are not tactical people. 14 STEVE: You and I are talking about them. 15 They're digging in to the contrary of the requests made 16 17 and the agreement made. DICK: Listen, I -- whatever they do, they 18 are not going to cause any harm to come to you or 19 anybody else in that building. Now --20 DAVID: You're speaking out of two sides or 21 22 your mouth, Dick. DICK: No, I'm not. 23 No, no, no. On one side, when you as 24 STEVE: agents, when you, representing the rest, say that 25

you're not going to come any further on the property,

just the perimeter, but then you do it and then you say they're not going to hurt -- what is -- I mean, which, which thing should I believe? Because one thing is 3 false, for sure. DICK: Let me, let me suggest something now. 5 I mean, that's -- in the first place, 6 STEVE: 7 it's very intimidating. If it's intimidation --DICK: I agree, it is somewhat --8 STEVE: -- different --9 10 DICK: Do you know what was intimidating to me today? 11 STEVE: What's that? 12 When David said that he had some sort 13 14 of a device, a rocket or something there that he would 15 shoot at those Bradleys, I became a little concerned about that. David told me that he had 19 some sort of a rocket or some other device up there --20 STEVE: Well, where does it -- you know what 21 22 it's like? I've never heard anything like it in my life. It's almost like well, I've got this and I've 23 got that. Well, what, do you -- should we destroy each 24 other maybe, is that the idea? 25

DICK: That's exactly what I've been arguing

very perimeter or the very bounds of the property, 2 and --3 JOHN COX: Well, I think I may have, you know, a response for you there. 4 5 STEVE: All right. 6 JOHN COX: Now, whether it's, you know, 7 whether it's going to be an acceptable response, I don't know. But at least I'll, I'll give the, the 8 response. And that's the vehicles were initially 9 10 brought up with a purpose in mind, and that was the purpose that the people were coming out of there 11 12 following the statement that was issued and the statement that was put out to the media. So they were 13 14 brought up in more a controlled environment and, and to -- for security purposes, more than anything. And 15 then --16 17 STEVE: Well, correct me if I'm wrong. 18 JOHN COX: -- nothing happened after that. STEVE: I believe --19 20 JOHN COX: The agreement was broken. 21 STEVE: John, was it not -- As I recall very 22 clearly, unless I'm very faulty --23 JOHN COX: Go right ahead. 24 STEVE: -- with my memory, but I believe that 25 it was Sunday night that it was already brought up by Jim that these vehicles would be on the perimeter of

the property, but not on the property. But that has never been held to. And even though days later, two 2 days later, when it was stated, as you mentioned, in 3 regards to coming out, it was still -- he says let's wait and see how much -- and if they do keep their own word, and he went on to open up a few other things. And, of course, in regards to all the negotiations between myself, Henry, and even Jim at that time, Gary for a moment or two, but it --

JOHN COX: Sure.

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STEVE: -- it all came down to I said look, you've got to understand the spiritual aspect, and it always came back to this guy's either inspired or he's not. If he is, the reason I'm here to hear his information is because he has gotten it from a source that I've seen a scholar to be able to obtain the same information. So this man says his god said to him to wait. And as whatever that may seem to anyone and, and what it might look like to my own name or association, it still came down to either I fear God or I fear man. So, you know, we went through those issues, around and around. But it still remained before or after that --

JOHN COX: You know, I'm not, I'm not going to argue that the spiritual issue --

STEVE: No. No, no, of course not. But,

1 John, that --JOHN COX: And I know it's both a logical 2 issue and a spiritual, factual issue. 3 STEVE: Okay, but it still comes down to --4 JOHN COX: And they're there. 5 STEVE: John, but it still comes down to 6 every day and in the evenings these men are doing the 7 maneuvers. I mean, they're coming as close as like 50 8 to 100 feet near the back building. Men are deployed. 9 They're out running around, they're in vehicles, 10 they're digging around, you know, all of these kind of 11 They're -- They've got certain calls and 12 things. 13 sounds. JOHN COX: Let me, let me respond to a couple 14 of those issues --15 STEVE: All right, go ahead. 16 JOHN COX: -- that you have. Again -- And 17 again, it, it may not be satisfactory in, in your point 18 of view, but I'll be happy to respond to them and, and 19 we can kick around a little bit. 20 STEVE: And keep in mind, though, not happy 21 and satisfied because of the statements made from night 22 one, the evening and the, and the beginning night that 23 we started negotiating. 24 JOHN COX: Um-hum. 25

STEVE: Go ahead.

JOHN COX: Okay. And we can probably argue 1 the issue about the, the tract vehicles that are out 2 They're out there. They're not probably going 3 to infringe any further, but they were put out there with a purpose in mind initially, and that was we are 5 aware that there's a lot of weaponry out there and, and 6 some that we would consider some devastating weaponry. 7 And, as a matter of fact, David brought up an issue of 8 some of it last night and, and we didn't want to pursue 9 that with him. And I, and I have no intention of 10 pursuing, you know, raising threat levels, lowering 11 threat levels. I'd just like that to remain neutral. 12 As far as whether you saw people in, in 13 bunkers, you're talking sandbag positions --14 STEVE: Well, see, you don't --15 JOHN COX: -- it's because of --16 STEVE: What David says about -- Understand, 17 John, you don't -- you yourself, from your perspective, 18 from your position, you don't need to say anything. 19 It's your actions, by what these men are doing, 20 contrary to what was stated, the word given the first 21 night. Think of that, keep that in mind when you're 22 talking to me about maybe threats or what he was saying 23 or anything else. 24

JOHN COX: No. You understand there's a, you know, there's about three or four mindsets bouncing

25

around out here. You've got the theologian mindset 1 going, you've got the, the negotiating mindset --2 STEVE: I do understand --3 JOHN COX: -- that we're certain trying to 4 do, you've got the tactical mindset out there that 5 we're trying to keep that to a minimum. And even 6 though we all have a purpose, and the purpose is, is 7 safety --8 STEVE: Okay, John --9 JOHN COX: -- and control --10 John, David wants to talk to you. 11 STEVE: JOHN COX: Go ahead. Go ahead. 12 STEVE: Okay, here he is, John. 13 JOHN COX: Fine. 14 This is, this is David. STEVE: 15 JOHN COX: Fine. 16 DAVID KORESH: Hello, Mr. Cox. 17 JOHN COX: Hey, David, nice to talk to you. 18 19 DAVID KORESH: Nice to talk with you, too, sir. The issue that we're trying to resolve here is 20 that, you know, definitely in our, our crisis, at our 21 present position, is that it is stated, it's stated 22 publicly that investigations some eight to nine months 23 ago have unveiled and proven that we have stockpiled an 24 enormous amount of, of military-type weapons. 25 that it proves that we have .50-caliber machine guns

and possibly destructive devices. JOHN COX: Yeah. 2 DAVID KORESH: Now, based upon this premises 3 or this fact, of which, you know, the public is 4 hearing, you see, what happens is that we have -- we've 5 been confronted, they say, with a warrant, you know. 6 7 JOHN COX: Well, again, we're not saying it's fact, David. We're saying that we, we believe we have 8 probable cause to believe, all right? 9 DAVID KORESH: Exactly, probable cause --10 JOHN COX: That's what we're saying. 11 DAVID KORESH: -- to believe --12 JOHN COX: Sure, go ahead. I didn't mean to 13 14 interrupt you. You go right ahead. DAVID KORESH: Okay. All right, now, now, 15 this probable cause I know as a fact is based upon 16 hearsay of which students in the past that I have tried 17 to teach have taken from certain prophetic writings in 18 certain degrees, such as the book of Nahum. I've tried 19 to explain this. And they have seen in picture, a 20 layout of what God foretells in the future. Okay. And 21 certain, certain passages would not be properly 22 understood until certain mechanical modernization or 23 such devices of modernization of today was to be 24 obvious and seen in our today's world. 25

Certain passages of scripture would not be

understood in the past decade because --JOHN COX: We're not talking about a matter 2 of misinterpreting passages or what somebody's 3 observed. DAVID KORESH: Yes, yes, we are. Now, here's 5 the thing. You are saying, in one degree, that we are 6 well armed. Okay? And so on the other hand --7 JOHN COX: No, I'm saying that there's that 8 feeling in mind. 9 DAVID KORESH: -- you are saying that you are 10 concerned with not just the safety of us, but the 11 12 safety of your personnel. JOHN COX: Well, that's reasonable, isn't it? 13 DAVID KORESH: It's reasonable, very 14 reasonable. And on the other hand, the negotiators 15 have stated very clearly that their purpose is to 16 provide a perimeter of safety, not so much for, for the 17 purpose that they're afraid of us, 'cause we've given 18 our word, but they're concerned about people coming in 19 from the outside of the property. Okay, now --20 JOHN COX: Well, it is a two-way street. 21 know how many -- Well, you may not know physically, but 22 you have a pretty good idea that there are a lot of 23 24 media people in very close proximity out there. And

per se you keep them out of harm's way. We have an

obligation, not just, you know, some administrative

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procedure, we have an obligation to ensure the safety 1 | and the welfare of those people, as well as we really 2 have an obligation to see that we don't have another 3 problem like we had last Sunday, and we want to ensure that that doesn't happen. And don't you agree there? 5 DAVID KORESH: Yeah, I definitely agree with 6 this now. 7 JOHN COX: Sure. 8 DAVID KORESH: When the wisdom of speech is 9 now being presented, we would consider it if we was 10 11 able to consider it at an earlier time. Now everyone's got the right words to say. Now, but what you're --12 JOHN COX: Well, we're trying to rectify --13 DAVID KORESH: You didn't let me finish. 14 JOHN COX: -- maybe things that have gone, 15 gone wrong before. You know that and I know that. 16 DAVID KORESH: You didn't let me finish. 17 18 JOHN COX: Go ahead. DAVID KORESH: Now, Robert Gonzalez, I have 19 asked the, you know, mediators there --20 21 JOHN COX: Sure. DAVID KORESH: -- let me speak to this young 22 A young man that knew every day that I jogged. I 23 jogged up and down. We've got a mile-and-a-half road 24 here, from one end of the water towers down to the other end of this dirt road. At any -- Now, at any

time you boys -- Of course, you're FBI, but the --JOHN COX: We've got all the different 2 agencies around here. 3 DAVID KORESH: Anyway, right now -- Or the 4 Sheriff's Department had any question in regards to my 5 so-called stockade, you could have taken me any number 6 7 of times that I go to town or I go to Wal-Mart -- And the report that I've been here for two years without 8 leaving is a lie, a bad lie. 9 JOHN COX: What would, what would they have 10 11 taken you for? DAVID KORESH: They would have taken me, 12 given me a warrant in regards to my premises, a search 13 warrant for illegal weapons. Very naturally, what they 14 say is my violation. 15 JOHN COX: But that would have to be served 16 -- That would have to be served upon you at the 17 18 premises. DAVID KORESH: Well --19 JOHN COX: It's a warrant for the premises, 20 not for the person. 21 DAVID KORESH: For -- Okay, look -- For the 22 23 premises? JOHN COX: Sure. 24 DAVID KORESH: Wait a minute. This is 25 supposed to be against David Koresh.

JOHN COX: No, it's not. It's for the 1 premises known as, not for the individual known as. 2 DAVID KORESH: There, there, there again, 3 there again, this is a problem with what you, the ATF agents, have stated on national TV and what now you're 5 telling me now. Okay. 6 JOHN COX: No, I don't think there's a 7 conflict at all. 8 DAVID KORESH: It's --9 JOHN COX: No one had a warrant for your 10 arrest or -- to my knowledge. 11 Steve. Wait, wait one moment. DAVID KORESH: 12 Now he's saying no one had a warrant for my arrest. 13 JOHN COX: I'm not aware of it is what I'm 14 telling you. But I am telling you --15 DAVID KORESH: Unbelievable. 16 JOHN COX: I'm telling you that they had a 17 warrant to search the premises and --DAVID KORESH: Unbelievable. 19 JOHN COX: Hang on. 20 21 DAVID KORESH: Well, again --I'll, I'll get it clarified. But JOHN COX: 22 I do know that they had a warrant to search the 23 24 premises. DAVID KORESH: Well, Robert Gonzalez, who is 25

the informant, which we knew he was --

JOHN COX: And they did have a warrant to 1 2 arrest you. DAVID KORESH: Okay. 3 JOHN COX: But that was as of that time, 4 okay? 5 DAVID KORESH: Right. Now, Robert Gonzalez, 6 as you know, preparations were made for him to move in 7 here. 8 JOHN COX: Sure, sure. 9 DAVID KORESH: Now, the thing of it is is 10 that if you all had desired to be so cautious in all 11 those respects, you know, except for maybe possibly 12 other reasons that you haven't quite stated as of yet, 13 you know, Robert Gonzalez who was developing a pretty 14 good friendship with us over here -- Excuse me, uhhhh. 15 JOHN COX: Why don't you get yourself 16 something to drink? 17 DAVID KORESH: Well, it, it comes in and out 18 like that. 19 JOHN COX: All right. 20 DAVID KORESH: That morning, that Sunday 21 morning, you know, I sat down and had a real close talk 22 with him. And it just appears to me that in the 23 promises that I have been given, that I got in 24 Australia, the threats and the warnings, and also, you 25 know, the -- when I was over in England last and stuff

like that, it seems to me that an agency, either 1 knowingly or unknowingly, is being utilized to possibly 2 genocide a work or a people, even though they may make 3 up lies to, to try to bring about something which really -- it comes down to a conscience freedom. 5 Now, I've explained this so many times to 6 every different agent that I've talked to so far. 7 JOHN COX: I've been pretty, pretty privy to 8 most of the, the dialogue that's been going on. 9 DAVID KORESH: Okay. So --10 JOHN COX: You know, not 24 hours a day, but 11 throughout the period of time I have and, and, you 12 know, you're, you're raising the issue of genocide and, 13 14 and --DAVID KORESH: Again --15 JOHN COX: -- I think that's a, that's a 16 pretty false term to be throwing out. 17 DAVID KORESH: Again, again, we find another 18 lie being presented here, because, very clearly, Jim 19 20 and --21 JOHN COX: John. DAVID KORESH: No, Jim, Jim was the first one 22 we was talking to --23 JOHN COX: Okay. 24 DAVID KORESH: -- before Gary, and then came, 25 you know, Henry.

1 JOHN COX: Go ahead. 2 DAVID KORESH: You know, they're always acting as if no one hears what we're saying but them. 3 Now, here you are implying that you all are privy to 4 it. I mean, you know --5 6 JOHN COX: No. 7 DAVID KORESH: -- you guys are not very good 8 when it comes down to being honest. JOHN COX: No, no, no. Listen, I've been 9 sitting here with Henry most of the time. 10 11 DAVID KORESH: Right. Now, I like Henry, too, just like I like --12 JOHN COX: And, and that's why I say what I 13 14 I have been here with Henry, accompanying Henry and, and I'm an associate of his. I'm not out running 15 16 around some other area or, or in a different area. 17 I've just been here, so I've been privy to most of the 18 dialogue that's going on during the --19 DAVID KORESH: So where's Jim at right now? JOHN COX: Henry's got another assignment 20 21 right now. Okay. 22 DAVID KORESH: JOHN COX: He's not assigned here permanently 23 and I, I can't tell you he'd be back here in an hour, I 24 25 can't tell you he'd be back here in a day. He just --As a result of his work, you know.

DAVID KORESH: Okay, we'd appreciate that the 1 gentlemen don't try to, you know, that they stay out of 2 the sandbox tonight, okay? 3 JOHN COX: Well, I think they pretty well 4 stayed out of the sandbox the last couple of nights. 5 6 Things were pretty peaceful and quiet out there. DAVID KORESH: Okay. Well, I'm just, I'm 7 just saying you guys are saying that you want peace and 8 I'm just --9 JOHN COX: Well, we do. 10 DAVID KORESH: -- saying be sure to --11 JOHN COX: Don't you? 12 DAVID KORESH: -- tell the people to stay out 13 of the sandbox. 14 JOHN COX: You know, something that you 15 brought up kind of struck a nerve with me and I hope 16 you didn't really mean it seriously, and that's when 17 you talk about the issue of genocide. And I think 18 that's an awful strong word to come up and, and we know 19 that we can talk freedom of speech and freedom of 20 religion and all of these items. And, really, the, the 21 only way others are going to hear about your, your 22 thoughts here and your, your opinions and -- is really 23

Now, whether it's discussing it with the media, whether it's through the judicial system, you

for you to discuss them.

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know, we've got from the old days of political science 1 | we've got our three systems. And, of course, we're 2 only one of them, right? We're the executive branch. 3 And the judicial system's going to resolve this in the end. And it's the best system there is. You may not 5 as a result --6 DAVID KORESH: Well, it's patterned after 7 other worlds. 8 JOHN COX: Yeah, but if you want to, if you 9 want to look at any other systems in the world --10 DAVID KORESH: Okay. 11 JOHN COX: -- what we have is the best and 12 it's as close to the peers as it'll ever get. And, and 13 we have to accept it from, from a law enforcement 14 standpoint, and it's a good adversarial system. But 15 we're -- Certainly, certainly genocide is a strong, 16 strong word for you to throw out. And you know better 17 than that. 18 DAVID KORESH: Well, now, let me --19 JOHN COX: You know what I'm talking about 20 21 there. DAVID KORESH: Let me, let me make another 22 statement. Let's be realistic now. You have an agent 23 in here -- Not you, this is the ATF. 24 I know what you're talking about. JOHN COX: 25

DAVID KORESH: You know, ATF is, is not well

experienced as, as the guys in the FBI. Now, the FBI, that's the top, no doubt about it. You are the top.

JOHN COX: Well, I'm not going to make any

disparaging remarks about them, either.

DAVID KORESH: I'm going to just state some facts. A month ago, possibly two months ago, several young men moved into a house across the street, all of them possibly from their, you know, thirties, midthirties to early, early forties. Each one drives a new vehicle, you know, a late model vehicle, and each one begins to state that they are going to junior colleges to, to take certain classes. Now -
JOHN COX: Sure, what's you're saying, it's a

JOHN COX: Sure, what's you're saying, it's a sham, right?

DAVID KORESH: Well, what I'm saying is is that the, the undercover didn't need to be in the first place. The undercover was very poor. Well, anyway, we, we went ahead and sent some friends over. Like I say, there's nothing that I, that I like more than to be understood, you know.

JOHN COX: So I understand.

DAVID KORESH: And so the thing of it is is that I -- we sent some guys over to talk with these individuals and, and, of course, when they addressed individuals, individuals are kind of jumpy and nervous and --

JOHN COX: Sure.

DAVID KORESH: -- you know. And so, finally, what happened was is Robert Gonzalez came over and another guy, I think Jeff -- And who's the other guy, Steve? Jim? And the first thing they wanted to start talking about is, is guns.

JOHN COX: Um-hum.

DAVID KORESH: You know, Jeff and -- Anyway, and the subject they wanted to bring up was AR-15's. They said they had just purchased two AR-15's and tried to act very naive in regards to what they had purchased. Of course, they had paid some sum of 900 and some dollars apiece for these and wanted to know if I knew anything about it, which, of course, I says to them -- 'Cause I do go to a lot of gun shows, and this is where the trail began in the first place.

So what happened was is that in going to these gun shows and obtaining knowledge and stuff on these things, we started a conversation and they came over and, and he brought a pistol over that he wanted to show me, which was a little target pistol.

JOHN COX: Um-hum.

DAVID KORESH: And just the way the thing was feathered and everything, it was definitely a gun that a novice would not have.

JOHN COX: Okay.

DAVID KORESH: Okay? So he asked if he come over and if he could shoot. I said sure, we've got a place in the back where we, where we practice at, you know, we have a place where, where me and some of the guys out here practice. And, and definitely, anybody that wants to come around can fish on our property and they can come and --

JOHN COX: Sure.

DAVID KORESH: And if we have, you know, a proper day and stuff like that where no one's -- no activities are too involved, then sure, you know, a little handgun practice is all right. So, anyway, though his mannerisms were trying to be naive, there's just one thing that, that you cannot hide, and that's proficiency. So then he started asking me all these questions about this AR and I kept saying now, now, Robert, you know, I says, you know in your line of work you know what this is. I gave the man every opportunity to come straight across the table and to confront me. Okay.

He says to me, he says well -- I explained to him one time he had better be careful because he had mentioned about when he first got his pistol back from the shop that he went out and put a clip in it and all of a sudden it just went -- fired all the rounds out of it. And so I says, I says hey, I says you better be

careful. I says because one time --JOHN COX: Well, you're talking from a safety 2 3 standpoint or --DAVID KORESH: Well, no. 4 JOHN COX: -- a proficiency standpoint? 5 DAVID KORESH: Well, see, the thing of it is 6 not only safety, he said he'd had some work done to it 7 8 and it was firing full auto. It was emptying the whole clips out of it. Okay. So I told him, I says look, Robert, I says you've got to be careful with that 10 I says one time at a gun show we purchased a 11 little unit that they were advertising. It's called a 12 hell fire. It's a little spring thing that fits on the 13 back of a trigger well for a mini 14, or they have them 14 for AR-15's or such like guns. And, and you put this 15 little spring back behind this trigger and you, and you 16 hold the gun a certain way and, and you kind of hold it 17 18 there and it kind of fires rapid fire, faster than what you can do it yourself. 19 JOHN COX: Um-hum. 20 DAVID KORESH: I said now, we had, we had --21 we bought a couple of these and, and we put them on a 22 .223 rifle one time and we was out in the back and we 23

JOHN COX: But it's still not an automatic weapon, though.

were having a blast.

Every 17 -- Any --18 JOHN COX: You didn't, you didn't address 19 that as Robert can come out, you're basically talking 20 21 about --DAVID KORESH: No, no, this is before Robert 22 and them came. 23 24 JOHN COX: Sure. And so he kind of came back and he says, 11 kind of, you know, very steadfast, he says, he says you 12 know, that's, that's the problem. He says that's what 13 we're here for, there's a lot of things we don't 14 understand, maybe we need to understand better. I said 15 okay, let me sit down and explain some things to you. 16 JOHN COX: You know, that's the best thing in 17 the world. 18 DAVID KORESH: Well, that's what we did that 19 20 day. JOHN COX: Sit down and communicate. 21 DAVID KORESH: And we all sat down and I 22 asked them if they wanted a soda pop and stuff and 23 they, they did drink one, didn't they, Steve? They, 24 you know, and we sat out there for about an hour-and-a-25 half, two hours while the social workers were going

through the building and stuff, you know, and talking to the individual children and things, off, you know, 2 on the side. And, you know, we had, we had a couple of 3 little problems with certain parents not trusting these 4 ladies, but we worked it all out. And I went ahead and 5 6 I --7 JOHN COX: Communications works, though, doesn't it? 8 It can if people are willing 9 DAVID KORESH: Now, so when I explained to them -- I said now, 10 11 look, you two men, have you ever been to church before -- And, of course, they, they admitted they had. 12 JOHN COX: Sure. 13 DAVID KORESH: I said now, we all know the 14 15 good ole Gospel, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. I says 16 but, you know, there are so many different 17 denominations, some old, some newer, some new ideals, some old traditional concepts. 18 19 JOHN COX: Sure, they all have to be 20 respected, right? 21 DAVID KORESH: They all are to be respected, 22 especially under the United States of America. 23 JOHN COX: Won't happen anyplace else. 24 DAVID KORESH: Which is a nation built up of nations who the forefathers came from their nations to 25 escape the tyranny of their political problems --

JOHN COX: That's why they came here. 1 2 DAVID KORESH: -- of their, their days. Okay. We all agree, Lady Liberty. Okay, now, but what 3 happens is, as I said, well, you know, the thing -- the place where we're coming from that gets us into a lot of trouble is that connected with religion is also a 6 form of politics. In other words, churches as well as 7 political powers, they have their presidents, their 8 vice presidents, their board of trustees. They have 9 their elders, they have their, you know, their little 10 pyramid system of government. 11 JOHN COX: Sure, they all do. 12 DAVID KORESH: Exactly. And they have an 13 14 economic government. JOHN COX: You have to have some structure to 15 any, anything. 16 17 DAVID KORESH: Definitely. You have to have some organization. 18 19 JOHN COX: Sure. DAVID KORESH: But now, the point is this. 20 That organization, nonetheless, states clearly that it 21 is dedicated to the service and worship of Christ. 22 That's one thing they all harmonize on. 23 24 JOHN COX: Sure. DAVID KORESH: They're doing it because of 25 the reality of Jesus. They're, they're doing it in the

name of Jesus. Jesus owns it, really. Jesus is really in charge of them. You see what I'm saying? JOHN COX: Um-hum. 3 DAVID KORESH: And they're really just doing 4 it 'cause Jesus wants them to. And when Jesus comes 5 back again, they're going to turn it all over to him 6 7 and, you know, they're all going to go to heaven. And this is the whole overall picture of the hope of 8 9 Christianity. JOHN COX: You bet. 10 DAVID KORESH: Okay. 11 JOHN COX: Everybody's looking for the same 12 ideals. 13 DAVID KORESH: Right. Now, so when you, when 14 you back-track and you confront the Christian church, 15 the question is do they believe in Matthew's record of 16 17 Christ? Yes, they do. Okay. Do they believe in Mark, Luke and John? Yes, they do. Okay. 18 JOHN COX: Sure. 19 DAVID KORESH: Now, do they believe in the 20 record of Acts and Paul's writings and Timothy and, and 21 Romans and James and Jude and John? Definitely, they 22 do. They may not understand every record clearly. 23 24 JOHN COX: And they may interpret them a 25 little differently.

DAVID KORESH: Exactly. And so, but that's

their right. 1 | JOHN COX: That's human, human logic, huh? 2 DAVID KORESH: Exactly. And that's just 3 something we all have to, to tolerate, especially in religion. 5 6 JOHN COX: Sure, it is. DAVID KORESH: Now, remember, some people 7 with their opinions can become quite convicted and 8 become guite aggressive or zealous for their opinions. 9 So we know what the Jews did to Christ 2,000 years ago 10 with their opinions, right? 11 JOHN COX: Sure. 12 DAVID KORESH: So, you know, we know what 13 the Papacy --14 JOHN COX: Well, we can go through, you know, 15 one religion after another there, can't we? 16 DAVID KORESH: 17 Exactly. JOHN COX: Sure. 18 DAVID KORESH: So, you know, we know that the 19 Papacy, when it was questioned by the Lutheran Reform, 20 or even before by Hush, Jerome, Tenda, Wynard, Wycliff, 21 whatever, we know that when it was questioned, instead 22 23 of producing, you know, very simple and conclusive 24 answers, it rose the sword and killed these men. JOHN COX: No guestion the strength of the 25 Papacy.

DAVID KORESH: Exactly. So the Europe which 1 was once ruled by Roman Catholic Catholicism which, you 2 know, the name in itself tells you its, its purpose is 3 for Rome to rule universally. Catholic, you know, It takes on the garment of religion and 5 everything. still holds the power of policy and anything that goes 6 against its religion is going to get this policy, and 7 the policy has the power to execute, capital 8 9 punishment. And so those who went against the religion were going against the government, and they were 10 proscribed and they were condemned and put to death. 11 Now, the --12 JOHN COX: Yeah, you can't argue that fact, 13 14 can you? DAVID KORESH: Exactly. The Inquisition was 15 a political religious move. So, now, we, the United 16 States of America, God bless this country, we 17 understand the, the importance of having the right to 18 think. We also know that Christ on the cross, when he 19 died, he made a very clear statement for all men to 20 hear, and that his Father, forgive them for they know 21 not what they do. 22 JOHN COX: Yeah. 23 24 DAVID KORESH: Now, whatever God knows and

whatever Christ knows, we don't know, but we know that

Christ does know we don't know. And so, therefore,

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Christ confers to the Father and asks the Father to forgive us based on our ignorance. Okay. So now, if 2 3 Christ can do this --JOHN COX: Well, I think that's one of the strongest teachings of any religion, right? Is 5 forgiveness, isn't it? 6 DAVID KORESH: The whole teachings of the new 7 8 covenant. JOHN COX: 9 Sure. DAVID KORESH: Okay. Although the Papacy in 10 the same name didn't quite so forgive. And the blood 11 12 we share --JOHN COX: Well, that's a few years ago, too. 13 DAVID KORESH: Exactly now. 14 15 JOHN COX: Sure. DAVID KORESH: But, but remember that because 16 it was such a, you know, nonevasive fact for that time, 17 the forefathers finally developed the desire and the 18 knowledge to be able to come to a country, which this 19 country opened up, and they began to realize by 20 experience that the oppressive tyranny of religion and 21 politics must be done away with, avoided, by a definite 22 23 rule of church and state separation. JOHN COX: Absolutely. 24 DAVID KORESH: There needed to be a political 25

law which was good for all men and just for all men,

not based upon some religious opinion or one or one 2 group's opinion of what they thought scripture or God 3 might say or do. And so, therefore, the church and state policy was one of the parts of our Constitution, 5 church and state separation. You don't want to have to go to court one day and stand in front of the judge and 6 7 when he finds out you're a, you're a Baptist and he's the Church of Christ, he charges you \$100 for running a 8 9 stop sign, whereas the guy behind you, being a, a 10 Baptist like him, is only charged \$10. 11 JOHN COX: Hey, that goes all on all --DAVID KORESH: Because if it were --12 13 JOHN COX: -- goes on all over the United States, though, doesn't it? 14 15 DAVID KORESH: It does, doesn't it? Good 16 point. 17 JOHN COX: I mean, depending what area you 18 may be in and what seems to be the 19 DAVID KORESH: Color and creed. 20 JOHN COX: -- predominant feeling at the 21 time, huh? 22 DAVID KORESH: Color and creed still has its 23 power, doesn't it? 24 JOHN COX: It does. I can't argue that with 25 you. I, I think everybody, you know, I can look at someone like my father who I think is just as straight

as can be and God bless him. Yet, do we all have some prejudices? Do we all have some things that are --2 that aren't the way they should be? Sure, they are. 3 Well, the system is, too, isn't it? Like you were saying, you can go to different places and, because of 5 who someone perceives you to be, you get whacked. 6 DAVID KORESH: Well, you said it and I 7 8 agreed. JOHN COX: Sure. 9 DAVID KORESH: Now, here's the deal. So I'm 10 explaining to these gentlemen out here in my front 11 yard, we're sitting out here, and I'm saying now, now 12 where I come from, what gets me into a lot of trouble 13 with denominations and with -- You know, denominations 14 are people. People made up together are denominations, 15 aren't they? And they name themselves, to entitle 16 themselves to be distinct and separate from another 17 group, not to be, you know, excused as another group. 18 So they have their denomination. 19 And so I come along and I, I refocus back on 20 the subject of the one reason for there even to be a 21 profession of Jesus Christ, and that's Jesus Christ. 22 JOHN COX: Um-hum. 23 DAVID KORESH: And so very clearly I try to, 24 to tell the brethren, the fellow humanity, that well, 25

is it not true that maybe we might not know exactly

what we're doing? I mean, you know, we may think we know what's right, but maybe we might be wrong. Could be. And none of us should escape that possibility or to deny that possibility. You know, there's women and men, you know, that seems to be right, but they may be leading to death, you know. It's, it's a sad thing, but we can only go in the best obvious light that we perceive, giving ourselves over --

JOHN COX: And it's very difficult to criticize someone else's feelings and someone, you know, whether they're religious, moral, ethical feelings, unless you sit down and listen to them and listen to what they have to say.

DAVID KORESH: Exactly. Now, Christ on the cross didn't say much, but what he said was important. He says into thy hands, Father, I commit my spirit. And that's the thing I've been trying to illustrate to each one of the individuals thus far I've spoken to.

JOHN COX: Sure.

DAVID KORESH: Now, in the hand of God, John, the last -- We know he was an apostle, we know he was accepted. He was a part of the ones that received Pentecost. He was taken to heaven to be shown things that must be hereafter and he was shown that what must be, sometime after his day in Chapter 4 of Revelation, he was shown in Chapter 5 a God sitting on the throne

and a book in his right hand.

And if it's true what Christ said, if his life and his knowledge, as man think it's so easy, the way he purported himself, that way that he knew how to do what he did, if it was in his spirit, his life, his light, his mind, he committed that back to where it came from, the hand of God. Now, we find in the hand of God there is to be a book, and, of course, we see that the apostles state that Christ is the word of God made flesh. You know, all of those are made by God, by one spirit, God's spirit. All things are created from God. There's only one God, there's one spirit, there's one knowledge, one power, one reality.

And if we're out of tune with this source, then definitely we may be involved with many ideals of God which means we're worshipping many ideals of God's.

Many gods, in other words. Many --

JOHN COX: And that's, that's a difficult point, you know, where you're saying are we in tune with it or aren't we. And, and that's what searching's all about, isn't it?

DAVID KORESH: Exactly. And that's what freedom in this country has been blessed by God -JOHN COX: Sure.

DAVID KORESH: -- because naturally God has blessed this nation above any nation, hasn't he?

JOHN COX: You bet. 1 DAVID KORESH: This nation has been blessed 2 3 with any nations because for the longest time, since its birth, this nation has purported and proposed not 4 to restrict or to interfere with the conscience of man. 5 In other words, we have a political law which says that 6 7 if you do this, irrespective of whether it be of God or of man, then we the state, we the nation, must do this. 8 JOHN COX: And we, we all have to accept 9 that, right? 10 DAVID KORESH: Oh, exactly. 11 12 JOHN COX: Sure. DAVID KORESH: This is why people come to 13 this county. 14 JOHN COX: You know, neither you nor me or 15 anyone else is above the law. 16 17 DAVID KORESH: Exactly. JOHN COX: You know, the only way we get the 18 law changed is through legislation, right? 19 DAVID KORESH: Exactly. 20 JOHN COX: Sometimes we don't like it. 21 22 Whether you like it or I like it, you know, there are laws that I don't like, but it's something we have to 23 live with, huh? 24 DAVID KORESH: It's something that we have to 25 be really perceptive of.

JOHN COX: Sure. Sure. DAVID KORESH: Okay, 'cause that's what our life is, is one day-to-day, another perception, another lesson of life to learn. So here's the point we're developing now. So I'm talking with these Sheriff Department who come out here --(End of Tape #59.)
