And that's all we want, is your safety and the safety of everyone The kids especially, all of us want to insure here. the kids' safety first and foremost but things have been done here to insure that when you come out, that you're, that you're going to be handled very, very quickly, very compassionately, and so that you can get your folks back to your families as soon as possible.

And, certainly, I'm not going to lie to you, there are going to be some charges with, with some folks but the majority of the folks are going to be -are going to be interviewed and, and they're going to get an opportunity to, to tell us what happened. And then they're going to be reunited with, with family members, with the kids and that sort of thing.

So, please pass that on to the folks in there.
