2 DICK: Don't you? Tell your Mamma that you  
3 want to go out and talk to Dick and you want to go talk  
4 to the other kids.

5 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Well?

6 DICK: Do you want to come and talk to Dick  
7 and your friends?

8 MELISSA MORRISON: No.

9 DICK: Oh, come on now. That's not what you  
10 told me. Tell Mamma that's not fair. Tell Mamma you  
11 want to come out. That's, that's not fair.

12 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Hey. What you mean tell  
13 her to tell Mamma it's not fair?

14 DICK: Well, that's what I'm saying.

15 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Don't speak to her like  
16 that. You asked her the question. She answered you.

17 DICK: I know.

18 MELISSA'S MOTHER: She answered no.

19 DICK: I know. But I heard you talking with  
20 her in the background.

21 MELISSA'S MOTHER: You never heard me. I  
22 never spoke a word, thank you.

23 DICK: Some -- well, I, I heard someone say  
24 that.

25 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Well, look. She's made  
her decision. I've made my mine. Okay?

1 DICK: Listen. It's up to you.

2 MELISSA'S MOTHER: That's final.

3 DICK: It's up to you. If you want to keep  
4 your child there, that's certainly your choice and  
5 we're not trying to force anybody to do anything,  
6 but --

7 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Well, look. You get  
8 Robert on the phone and then we can --

9 DICK: I -- listen --

10 MELISSA'S MOTHER: -- talk to him --

11 DICK: -- I can't get Robert on the phone  
12 right now. I told David I would take a message and  
13 make sure the message was delivered to him, and then  
14 Robert can make his choice. We can't force Robert to  
15 do anything, just like we can't force you to do  
16 anything. We will give him the opportunity. We will  
17 pass the message to him, and we will let him make that  
18 call. Just like you said you'd let your daughter make  
19 the call.

20 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Look. He can do whatever.  
21 He's a law enforcement agent, right? So can you. You  
22 can get Robert to speak to us. That's the decision.  
23 Once Robert has spoken, then she'll come out. She's  
24 told you that and I've told you that. Okay? I have to  
25 take your word for how our children's group is looked  
after. You take my word that that will be -- DICK:

1 I'll tell you what. If you, as the mother, want to  
2 work that way concerning your child's welfare, then you  
3 do that and you make that decision. That's your  
4 choice. That's your responsibility as a parent to do  
5 that. And if you feel that's the way you want to treat  
6 your daughter, then you treat your daughter that way.  
7 That's fine. I can live with that. You're the one  
8 that's going to have to live with it. Okay?

9 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Yeah.

10 DICK: You told me and David told me before  
11 we ever talked to you that Melissa wanted to leave.  
12 And then all of a sudden Melissa will only go --

13 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Hold on a minute.

14 DICK: -- if Robert talks to you.

15 MELISSA'S MOTHER: I never told you that  
16 Melissa wanted to leave.

17 DICK: David told me that.

18 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Melissa -- David did not  
19 tell you that.

20 DICK: David --

21 MELISSA'S MOTHER: David said --

22 DICK: -- told me very s--

23 MELISSA'S MOTHER: -- Melissa, do you want to  
24 leave? She said no. He said, will you leave if we  
25 speak to Robert? And she said okay, yeah.

DICK: But David told me that before he even

1 spoke to Melissa. He said, we have Melissa. Melissa  
2 wants to leave. And, and you, as the parent, if that's  
3 your choice then that's your choice. I'm not going to  
4 try to convince you otherwise. I'm only telling you  
5 that you are responsible for the welfare of that child  
6 --

7 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Look --

8 DICK: -- which you know --

9 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Look, I --

10 DICK: -- which you know --

11 MELISSA'S MOTHER: -- know I'm responsible.  
12 She's my daughter. And, hey, you don't need to speak  
13 (not discernible). I'm being responsible. Okay?  
14 Look.

15 DICK: That's fine.

16 MELISSA'S MOTHER: I've told you the whole  
17 truth.

18 DICK: Then that's your choice. That's your  
19 choice. If that's --

20 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Okay.

21 DICK: -- what you want to do --

22 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Okay.

23 DICK: -- you do it.

24 MELISSA'S MOTHER: I'll, I'll hand you -- the  
25 phone back to Steve or Dave.

DICK: Very well.

1 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Okay. Thank you. Bye.

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE VOICE #1 (BACKGROUND):

3 (Not discernible).

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE VOICE #2 (BACKGROUND): I

5 will. I will.

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Hello, Dick.

7 DICK: Yes.

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: A couple of our guys happen  
9 to be looking out the window down the road and --

10 DICK: Okay.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- of course, there's a lot  
12 of law enforcement agents down there. And first one of  
13 our young guys saw some one of the officers down there  
14 flip the finger to him. He looked again and -- well,  
15 he had done it. We got -- about a half-hour later,  
16 which is not too long ago, we were told that one of  
17 them actually pulled his pants down and showed his butt  
18 up in the air.

19 DICK: Well, I tell you what. If somebody  
20 did that, then they're not a responsible individual.

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, of course not. I --

22 DICK: And you know -- and I both know that  
23 there are -- the people ha-- the, the world is made up  
24 of people like that.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Correct. Correct.

DICK: That's not an --



1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: But I --

2 DICK: -- issue. That's not an issue.

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I just thought I'd see what  
4 you had thought about such a thing.

5 DICK: Well, I think it's --

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: To tell you the truth, I've  
7 never in my life --

8 DICK: I think it's unprofessional as heck.

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: In my life I've never ever  
10 heard of anybody to deal with the sheriffs or with a--  
11 your a-- I'm sure your agents --

12 DICK: Absolutely not.

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- would never --

14 DICK: Absolutely unacceptable.

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I believe that.

16 (Unidentified voice in background not  
17 discernible.)

18 DICK: Absolutely. It, it --

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh, by the way, I will tell  
20 you this for a fact. And this comes --

21 DICK: Okay.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- from all the women, and  
23 they concur on this that when we were raided by the ATF  
24 agents, when they hit us like they did, four women have  
25 told me they heard these agents saying to some of the  
people in the building and so forth -- they called us

1 | Mother F'ers --

2 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: And  
3 | what else?

4 |               UNIDENTIFIED PERSON TO STEVE SCHNEIDER: (Not  
5 | discernible.)

6 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- S-- Sons of -- and, and,  
7 | you know, all that -- (Unidentified voice in background  
8 | not discernible.) -- foul, foul language.

9 |               DICK: That also --

10 |              STEVE SCHNEIDER: Cocksuckers. I didn't  
11 | really want to say it, but --

12 |              DICK: Steve, that's --

13 |              STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yes?

14 |              DICK: -- horribly unprofessional. I know  
15 | it. You know it. Everyone else that, that might be  
16 | involved in that kind of language, it, it's totally  
17 | unacceptable.

18 |              STEVE SCHNEIDER: I --

19 |              DICK: Totally unacceptable.

20 |              STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I'll, I'll tell you the  
21 | truth. I mean, it -- is it, is it not a shock to you  
22 | to hear that professionals or people that are to be  
23 | protectors are, are pulling their pants down and  
24 | showing their bare butts?

25 |              DICK: Take, take note of that. I want you  
to copy that down. I demand --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

2 DICK: -- that you copy that down --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right. I --

4 DICK: -- and that --

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- will do that.

6 DICK: -- you convey that message to, to the  
7 people that make the inquiry into this case.

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. We'll do so.

9 DICK: Note that.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I've, I've never heard of  
11 your department, your agency --

12 DICK: Absolutely not.

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So, so, I mean, I -- to  
14 tell you the truth, I was amazed --

15 DICK: I'll tell you what. If, if somebody  
16 did that in my presence, I'd have them fired.

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I can believe it.

18 DICK: I'd have them fired in a second.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I could believe it.

20 DICK: That's -- absolutely no, no reason to  
21 do that sort of thing. That's not part of the job.  
22 It's just not right.

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

24 DICK: Listen, Steve.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right. Sure.

DICK: It was my understanding when I spoke

1 | with David that Melissa wanted to leave and was going  
2 | to leave and that her mother --

3 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well --

4 |           DICK: -- and I talked to her mother --

5 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

6 |           DICK: -- and she gave me the information  
7 | concerning --

8 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: I've been sitting right  
9 | here just to make sure, you know, that I have it right  
10 | also. When you asked her the question, at first the  
11 | question was asked do you want to leave. She said no.  
12 | And nobody -- I -- nobody by facial expression, by  
13 | movement, by anything encouraged her to do either. She  
14 | said no. And then the question was well, would you  
15 | leave if Ro-- if we were able to talk to Robert, was  
16 | the next question, and then nobody coerced her. She  
17 | said yes. Honestly. And that shocked me, because  
18 | she's not that old where I thought she could discern  
19 | even really what we were saying. Maybe she's not.

20 |           DICK: Steve --

21 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: But --

22 |           DICK: -- if, if that's the way, if that's  
23 | the way you folks want to represent it, you go ahead  
24 | and do that, okay?

25 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no, no. I, I'm talking  
about I was sitting right here. I'm sitting right

1 | here --

2 |           DICK: Listen.

3 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- watching.

4 |           DICK: She was speaking to me. David was

5 | speaking to me. And I have --

6 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

7 |           DICK: -- absolutely no hearing problem. And

8 | I don't want to be argumentative about this because

9 | it's --

10 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: No. No --

11 |           DICK: -- just another issue that --

12 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- no, I'm telling you the

13 | facts. I'm telling you as the first question asked to

14 | her was do you want to leave, she said no. The second

15 | part of the question was in regards to Robert Gonzalez.

16 | She didn't -- you know, the first thing, that she does

17 | not want to leave her mother. But if there is -- you

18 | know, if, if we can work it out and she sees that her

19 | mother would like to see her be in safety or whatever

20 | else, well, then she'll pick up on that and has.

21 |           DICK: Okay. Again, Steve, I don't want to

22 | argue over this. But let, let me just, let me just

23 | tell you what my memory was in talking. I didn't know

24 | Melissa's name at all. Okay?

25 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: No. I know you didn't.

          DICK: That was brought up by --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I know you didn't.

2 DICK: -- by David.

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: By David.

4 DICK: And he --

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That's correct.

6 DICK: -- said that Melissa wanted to leave  
7 and we, we were preparing for her to leave, and then  
8 Robert's name was mentioned. And, and I told, I told  
9 David, you know, much like --

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, let's back up a  
11 little bit further. You've got that incorrect. I was  
12 sitting here. He said there was a woman that made  
13 herself known that she wanted to leave, and I was kind  
14 of surprised to hear that, because I know nothing about  
15 that. Remember that? The first --

16 DICK: Um-hum.

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- part of the  
18 conversation --

19 DICK: Um-hum. And then --

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- on the phone?

21 DICK: -- Melissa's name came up.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No. And then all of a  
23 sudden he started talking about Robert Gonzalez, and  
24 then --

25 DICK: Then it became --

STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- then Melissa's --

1 DICK: -- one --

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- name came up. Melissa  
3 is a little girl. She's not a woman.

4 DICK: I know that.

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Wait, now.

6 DICK: No.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Melissa's a little girl, in  
8 the first place, not a woman, as he stated. So, you're  
9 getting that confused, Dick. You really are.

10 DICK: Okay. Well, let's, let's move on.  
11 Okay?

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

13 DICK: I'm not --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. No --

15 DICK: -- even going to argue --

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- no, I just --

17 DICK: -- that point.

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I just wanted to clear  
19 the air. I wanted to clear -- I know you don't --  
20 there's no need to.

21 DICK: No. There's a, there's a -- no  
22 reason.

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: But here's, here's the  
24 condition though. It's -- it was late. We can go  
25 round and around, but the condition is this. The  
mother is willing to send the daughter out on condition

1 that Robert Gonzalez call us and talk to David.

2 That's, that's plainly what it is.

3 DICK: All right. Steve, listen.

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yes.

5 DICK: Why is it that you always preface this  
6 with, when we do something you will do something?

7 When --

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I -- I'm just -- no, look  
9 it. I just -- he -- the phone was handed to me.

10 DICK: Okay.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I, I don't even know what  
12 is being planned here. I'm sitting here listening and  
13 it's handed to me just to make it as plain and to the  
14 point as possible. That's the only thing. Have --  
15 Okay? Understand that, because --

16 DICK: Let's don't even discuss it any  
17 further, all right?

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

19 DICK: I --

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'm just trying to say --

21 DICK: That's your --

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- look at it --

23 DICK: -- position. Take that --

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no, no. Listen to me.  
25 Listen to me. It's not my decision. Didn't you pick  
up on that? It has --



1 DICK: I, I know.  
2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- nothing to --  
3 DICK: I know that.  
4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- nothing to do with me.  
5 DICK: I know. And, and I'm not arguing with  
6 you.  
7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.  
8 DICK: It's, it's her mother's child, and if  
9 her mother doesn't want her to come out --  
10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That's what it is.  
11 DICK: Fine. Fine.  
12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I -- they're right --  
13 DICK: Okay.  
14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- here standing --  
15 DICK: So, let me --  
16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- the both of them.  
17 DICK: -- let me tell you something about  
18 Robert Gonzalez --  
19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.  
20 DICK: -- so that you know it all so -- I, I  
21 hope --  
22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.  
23 DICK: -- Dave understood it. You folks all  
24 represent the fact that you are free to leave at any  
25 time. Okay? We also represent to you that Robert  
Gonzalez will be given your message and he will have a

1 choice at that time. We can't get a hold of Mr.  
2 Gonzalez now. Like I told David, when there's a  
3 critical incident, and that's what we call it in, in  
4 law enforcement, when there has been a critical  
5 incident, the agents involved in that, that incident  
6 are taken off of duty until an investigation is  
7 handled. In this instance --

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

9 DICK: -- there's going to be a long,  
10 involved, detailed investigation. Robert Gonzalez was  
11 sent to his family with the -- a, a message to --  
12 Listen, please --

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I am.

14 DICK: Get away --

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I am.

16 DICK: No, I'm not talking -- I'm talking  
17 about --

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh, I see.

19 DICK: -- to him.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I see. I see. Okay.

21 Gotch ya.

22 DICK: Leave. Because sometimes agents don't  
23 understand. It's necessary --

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

25 DICK: -- to get back, to cool off --

STEVE SCHNEIDER: That, that makes sense --

1 DICK: -- to rethink the --  
2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- to me. I, I don't  
3 have --  
4 DICK: Sure.  
5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- doubts --  
6 DICK: Sure.  
7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- of what you're saying.  
8 DICK: So, Mr. Gonzalez is gone and we can't  
9 get to him. When, when we're able to, I'll be happy to  
10 send a, a message. In fact, you can write a message  
11 out which we will have delivered to him when we're able  
12 to get to him. I -- well, certainly. We have no  
13 objection to that --  
14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Can I say --  
15 DICK: -- at all.  
16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- something and respond to  
17 that? See, it's not, it's not something that I desire  
18 in the first place --  
19 DICK: Well, David --  
20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- there, there was --  
21 okay. Just --  
22 DICK: I know. It's David.  
23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Just so you understand that  
24 it's --  
25 DICK: Certainly.  
STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- not my request and --

1 DICK: I know. It's David.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: See, a lot of what I'm  
3 telling you, when I come across like I do in the  
4 manner, there is a number of people that's said Steve,  
5 would you be our spokesperson.

6 DICK: Um-hum.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I said okay, I will. What  
8 do you want me to --

9 DICK: Sure.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- say on your behalf? So,  
11 many of the times that I'm speaking, it's not always my  
12 opinion, my decision, but I'm speaking in behalf of  
13 certain --

14 DICK: I know.

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- people. I don't want  
16 to. I'm -- on one hand, they're showing a willingness  
17 to leave. On the other hand, those that have, like I  
18 told you earlier in the day, what they told me their  
19 desire is to have some kind of a connection to a news  
20 service or something to do with a negotiation, maybe  
21 that part, or a telephone line being opened. This is  
22 what they've been relaying to me.

23 DICK: Well, and we asked you this morning to  
24 furnish us with a list of people --

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, remember? I ga-- I  
did give you some names.

1 DICK: Oh, I know. But those are, those are  
2 celebrities. My gosh, they're, they're not --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. What kind of names  
4 are --

5 DICK: Well, that's your --

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- you --

7 DICK: -- choice, not our choice.

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: But, well, give me an  
9 example then. If you're saying those --

10 DICK: Well, somebody --

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- are celebrities --

12 DICK: -- that David, and David obviously is  
13 going to have to make the -- David --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Is Paul Harvey considered  
15 to be a celebrity?

16 DICK: Well, certainly he is. A cel-- we're  
17 talking about someone that you feel comfortable with.  
18 Now, let, let me ask you once.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

20 DICK: Dav-- you were originally concerned  
21 that a warrant should be served by the sheriff. Does  
22 David have faith in the local sheriff here? Is that a  
23 person that he would feel comfortable --

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, he's -- he was, he --  
25 see, I really don't know too much --

DICK: Okay.

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- about them --

2 DICK: Well, I need --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- personally.

4 DICK: -- to talk to David. If you let me  
5 talk to David and then I'll --

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, he just, he just  
7 moved off to try to go to the bathroom.

8 DICK: Well, that won't take long. That  
9 won't take long.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

11 DICK: But, listen. Let, let me explain to  
12 you why --

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

14 DICK: -- why, why I need to talk to David  
15 about that. David must have a list -- or at least have  
16 some folks that he is comfortable with that he can deal  
17 with and that he can represent his wishes to. And  
18 those are the folks we're talking about. We're not  
19 talking about bringing in somebody from Oprah Winfrey  
20 or one of these other shows that, that, you know, some  
21 people consider, you know, trash TV, is what I think  
22 I've heard that, that -- the term called. That's just  
23 -- Sally Jesse --

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no.

25 DICK: -- Raphael or --

STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, I understand. Dick, I

1 | understand what you're saying. When you -- I only --  
2 | you know, there was a few people standing here. You,  
3 | you gave me -- you know, you asked me a question about  
4 | names.

5 |           DICK: No, but I was talking about --

6 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: So --

7 |           DICK: -- what we all would consider --

8 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, I understand that.

9 |           DICK: Okay.

10 |          STEVE SCHNEIDER: I understand that.

11 |          DICK: Okay. So --

12 |          STEVE SCHNEIDER: So --

13 |          DICK: -- they just threw those out --

14 |          STEVE SCHNEIDER: I was --

15 |          DICK: -- to you?

16 |          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Exactly. Exactly. It's

17 | not like, you know --

18 |          DICK: Okay.

19 |          STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- this is what we want or

20 |          DICK: Well, you --

21 |          STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- anything or --

22 |          DICK: Then you need to get back to work on

23 | that then --

24 |          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well --

25 |          DICK: -- when you get an opportunity.

          STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- this is true. See, I

1 | did that just as a response to find out just what you  
2 | had in mind or what, what direction you're going with  
3 | that.

4 |           DICK: Okay. Now, what about this -- Steve,  
5 | let's, let's get back to this original proposal that I  
6 | offered when -- which I felt, frankly, was, was, was a  
7 | real breakthrough. And, and I put a lot of effort into  
8 | this, into this thing. And, and, and just -- you guys  
9 | just kind of dismissed it out of hand.

10 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Which proposal was that  
11 | again?

12 |           DICK: That, that is the one that I, that I  
13 | brought to David's attention that he immediately put  
14 | you on in, in connection with the movement of the  
15 | Bradley vehicles. And I said, David -- and, and David  
16 | said that seems --

17 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, can you refresh my  
18 | memory here?

19 |           DICK: Okay. I, I suggested to him that if  
20 | he will commit to the release -- or to the exodus of  
21 | all you folks out of that house, we'll withdraw the  
22 | Bradleys. And he said well, that's, that's not  
23 | unreasonable. But I, I said, David, if that's not  
24 | acceptable to you, offer me, offer me a proposal that I  
25 | can take --

          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, see --



1 DICK: -- and sell to them.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And here's what, what I  
3 understand clearly the reason for that. It's not --

4 DICK: Okay.

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- it's not that it  
6 wouldn't be under the kind of circumstances you and I  
7 have been talking about.

8 DICK: Okay.

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: It always gets back to why  
10 he starts getting into the spiritual mode with you when  
11 he says his God told him to wait, and you apparently do  
12 not believe that God can speak to a human being --

13 DICK: Now, hold it, please --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no, no.

15 DICK: -- don't put --

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no.

17 DICK: -- words in my mouth. All right?

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no, no, no, no. But  
19 I'm telling -- when I say you, it's generic. It's  
20 overall. Don't --

21 DICK: Okay.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- don't be so literal.  
23 It's --

24 DICK: All right.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- not --

DICK: All right.

1                   STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- it's nothing -- you  
2 know, it's no -- no, I'm not saying you even said such  
3 a thing.  But I'm just saying, you know, basically  
4 that's what it is.  That's the concept.

5                   DICK:  Okay.

6                   STEVE SCHNEIDER:  So, it's not that your  
7 offer is, is foolish, off-the-wall, anything like that.  
8 He --

9                   DICK:  Well, offer me a counter proposal.

10                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  Well, this is what --

11                  DICK:  That's what I've asked.

12                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- I'm saying.  To me, it,  
13 it is, it is something that is reasonable.

14                  (Unidentified whispering voice in background  
15 not discernible.)

16                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  What did he say to say or  
17 what?

18                  DICK:  He -- what I, what I suggested to him  
19 was that --

20                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  Okay.

21                  DICK:  -- he offered me something that I can  
22 take back in to the bosses, and say, listen now, but he  
23 appreciates, he appreciates, you know, your, your  
24 consideration, but this is something that, that he  
25 would be more, be more comfortable with.  And then I  
can take that and go in and, and make a case for that.

1 And that's -- you know, during these last couple of  
2 days we, we seemed to get to a point where we can talk  
3 to one another. But then we talk about trying to get  
4 off of dead center, we're having a difficult time.  
5 And, and it's, it's like, you know, you show me yours,  
6 I'll show you mine. And what --

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, I understand that.

8 DICK: -- we need to do is reason together  
9 and then we have to put some faith in one another. And  
10 I suggested that, that, you know, you send the kids up  
11 the road, four kids up the road, and at the same time  
12 you're doing that I'll have the Bradleys withdrawn.

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, see, number one, in,  
14 in all honesty --

15 DICK: Off your property. Off your property.

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. But, number one, in  
17 all honesty, the Bradleys don't even bother us --

18 DICK: Okay.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- at all. It's just that,  
20 that whole thing to do with the word, you know, keeping  
21 one's word and following through. That's why --

22 DICK: Absolutely.

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- that's why we were --

24 DICK: That's the crux of this whole thing.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, see, that was the  
reason for that. But, like I told you earlier, these

1 | people don't fear things like Bradleys and men and --  
2 |           DICK: Nor should they. We're not --  
3 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.  
4 |           DICK: Well, they're not there --  
5 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. You know, just to --  
6 |           DICK: to put fear in to --  
7 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- reiterate that. At the  
8 | same time, so that -- to that -- see, what they're  
9 | really waiting on, the adults and, and some of the  
10 | children are, they're still waiting -- well, when God  
11 | told them to wait, why? They're wanting to know why  
12 | are we to wait. What is the reason for this? Is  
13 | something going to be shown to us from the Word of God?  
14 | We realize -- we believe we're in the last days. The  
15 | Book of Name is something that is rapidly taking place  
16 | as I even speak with you.  
17 |           DICK: Um-hum.  
18 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: And, like we've talked  
19 | about, the chariots of the flaming torches -- I mean,  
20 | we see that to be those tanks right around us. But,  
21 | anyway, that's why the majority of these people -- it's  
22 | not because they're trying to be unreasonable, that  
23 | they, they don't want to come out or be there. I  
24 | myself want to, Dick. I'd like to come out, get this  
25 | thing taken care of once and for all, sit down, and  
   | talk, speak with you, and, and go through whatever has

1 | to and, and be done with it. But at the same time, the  
2 | reason I came here first of all, like the rest, was to  
3 | hear this book opened, and, and we've not been  
4 | dissatisfied.

5 |           DICK: Is that someplace you have to remain  
6 | to hear that? I mean, David certainly --

7 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Was -- well, we're --

8 |           DICK: -- can put his message down to --

9 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, well, well, let me  
10 | tell you this -- or -- in the past, when I first met  
11 | the man, I was in Hawaii, and I would speak to him  
12 | long-distance by telephone and it cost a humongous  
13 | amount monthly in, in phone bills, along with we tried  
14 | the tape thing, but he's a man that is given  
15 | revelations on a day-by-day basis, which he never  
16 | repeats the same thing twice. He has the ability to  
17 | open up deeper and deeper the mysteries of God as they  
18 | are in that book. So, this is what, what people are  
19 | here for, to hear, to know, and we don't -- I really  
20 | don't see in this world that there are that many  
21 | honest-hearted people that have a deep love for truth,  
22 | whatever truth might be.

23 |           DICK: Steve?

24 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

25 |           DICK: Listen. Please, listen to --

          STEVE SCHNEIDER: I --

1 DICK: -- me for a second.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Go ahead. Go ahead.

3 DICK: I think -- let, let's agree point-by-  
4 point. Have we not reached a point where we're having  
5 a difficult time moving from?

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: We have.

7 DICK: Well -- you apparently have some  
8 concern about the things that I'm telling you. I  
9 haven't seen you follow through on some of the things  
10 I've heard you talk about. So --

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well --

12 DICK: -- how, how --

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- for ex-- like what, for  
14 example?

15 DICK: How would -- well, the first -- I keep  
16 getting back to the first day when we were -- when  
17 everyone was coming out. But let's forget that.  
18 That's in the past. That's in the past.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, that has nothing to  
20 do with me, though. I mean, I can --

21 DICK: Fine.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I told you I tried to talk  
23 to as many people as -- Well, not to --

24 DICK: I know.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- you, but to -- I think  
it was Henry I told that, and Jim.

1 DICK: I understand that.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And I can't coerce or  
3 force --

4 DICK: I'm not asking you --

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- anybody --

6 DICK: -- to.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. But just understand  
8 that. I mean, I --

9 DICK: But I do understand.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I, I can try to talk to  
11 people. I can lay out the reasons, the pluses, the  
12 minuses, but, you know, I mean, that's as far as I can  
13 go. But, remember, that the main things for -- that  
14 are bothering these people, like the young lady you  
15 talked to -- I mean, no one talked to her when she was  
16 called to the phone. I, I could detect a little  
17 animosity there. She was annoyed because, number one,  
18 they see that, you know, there -- that from day one the  
19 Bradleys have entrenched further and further on our  
20 property and these men have done more and more of those  
21 kind of things. A \$1,000 were, were given. The phone  
22 didn't come for much longer than when we gave the money  
23 out for it, and the cord. Along with the six gallons  
24 of milk. That looked bad. Along with a body that's  
25 still on the property whose parents are here right now.  
And -- I mean, you, you've got a spokesman on TV saying

1 | one thing. And I've got the list, by the way, of all  
2 | those statements right here. We wrote them down. If I  
3 | -- you yourself would agree with me that what was  
4 | stated on television to those reporters is not in fact  
5 | the way you guys have responded to us for those  
6 | requests. It is not true at all. I'll read back his  
7 | very statements to you.

8 |               DICK: Yeah, I know, I know what he said,  
9 | Steve.

10 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: I do too. Do you want me  
11 | to go up there? I'll go read them and then I'll tell  
12 | you what you told me. I mean --

13 |               DICK: Well, I under--

14 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: Six gallons of milk aren't  
15 | here. The dead body, contrary to what he said, is on  
16 | the property and you ha-- there have not been a  
17 | willingness to take these things off.

18 |               (Ringing sound.)

19 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: That would show one's good  
20 | faith. But these are the -- some of the things that  
21 | people come to me about and lay on me, and I'm to relay  
22 | that to yourself.

23 |               DICK: All right. Which brings us back to my  
24 | original question.

25 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

              DICK: We have to work with one another and



1 | we have to understand that -- you know, yesterday you  
2 | mentioned this term "bargain." All right. You --

3 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, I, I picked that up  
4 | from the, the news press, the --

5 |           DICK: Okay.

6 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- press release  
7 | conference.

8 |           DICK: Well, in, in a sense it is a bargain.  
9 | In any sort of negotiation or bargain, much the same  
10 | way they do with union activities --

11 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: I understand.

12 |           DICK: -- you present some points that are  
13 | of, of interest to you, I do the same. Obviously,  
14 | we're not going to agree with one another in each  
15 | instance, but we, we do need to agree that we have to  
16 | work to resolve and it takes some concession on both  
17 | our part. After I left you last night, I, I was going  
18 | over and over and over this in my mind. When I came in  
19 | today, the reason I was not on the phone for you --  
20 | with you for some time is because I went in to my, to  
21 | my bosses here and, and suggested, listen, they have  
22 | what I feel are some reasonable, legitimate concerns,  
23 | and obviously why we --

24 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Which are? Can you give me  
25 | some --

          DICK: Well, this --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- examples of what --

2 DICK: -- concern about --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- they might be?

4 DICK: -- Bradleys on the property. The  
5 concern about feeling that the evidence -- you feel  
6 that the evidence will not get to court and that the --  
7 new-- the news account that was filmed might be  
8 doctored, and all those things. So, I've said to him,  
9 please, put that out over to the media so they know  
10 that you're concerned about it, and it -- and, and that  
11 we will comply with all the rules of evidence, and in  
12 good faith we will make all those things available. We  
13 are not going to tamper with those. We're not going to  
14 do any of those things that you suggested. But I will  
15 -- I know that and everyone else knows that, but I want  
16 to make sure that you understand that. So, I went to  
17 him and I said, please, make this clear, that these  
18 folks will have the ability to talk to whomever they  
19 want as soon as they come out of there. And,  
20 additionally, they're concerned about the Bradleys on  
21 the property. And if we can move those Bradleys off,  
22 which is one of the, the points that, that you appear  
23 to be concerned about, then maybe we can get together  
24 and start working once together to resolve this  
25 impasse, to resolve this incident and get on with it so  
that you can make all the information that you're

1 | writing down, all those thoughts and emotions that you  
2 | have, available for scrutiny by anyone that cares to  
3 | look at them, all the news media worldwide, all the law  
4 | enforcement agencies, Congressional inquiries, the  
5 | Senate, the Congress and all those kinds of things.  
6 | It's important you do that and it's, it's, it's, it's  
7 | your --

8 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Ah --

9 |                 DICK: -- responsibility to do that. So,  
10 | what did I do? I went into my boss and said please --

11 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Can I stop you there and  
12 | ask you something? But who are your bosses? How many  
13 | are there?

14 |                 DICK: Oh, my gosh.

15 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Are you talking about the  
16 | FBI or are you talking about more agencies --

17 |                 DICK: Well, this is a, this is a cooperative  
18 | effort between --

19 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Too, how many men  
20 | are you speaking with?

21 |                 DICK: I --

22 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: When I talk with you,  
23 | you're going back to how many people that are making  
24 | decisions here?

25 |                 DICK: There are a number of different pe--  
decision-makers. Obviously, we can't work 24 hours a

1 day and we're in the seventh day now, so there's a  
2 group effort here. There's no one person in charge.  
3 It's an effort, a cooperative effort with ATF and the  
4 FBI and, and, of course, obviously there are the county  
5 sheriffs that are here.

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Someone has to be able to  
7 have the authority to finally say yea or nay.

8 DICK: Absolutely. And that's what I'm  
9 talking about. These folks --

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Is there a person right  
11 there -- is a person that is finally given that  
12 decision?

13 DICK: There is a, is a group -- it's a, a --  
14 several people that represent the --

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: It's a little democracy you  
16 have there that --

17 DICK: We, we always work in that fashion,  
18 democracy. We don't want anybody to make an arbitrary  
19 decision.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no. That, that's not  
21 what I mean. I'm just saying, you know, you're, you're  
22 -- you know, every time I speak with you you've got to  
23 go back to, as you say, bosses.

24 DICK: Well, certainly. Much like you go to  
25 David.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Bosses. Well, what -- so,

1 | what's the agency -- I mean, who's all involved in  
2 | these bosses? Can you just --

3 |               DICK: Well, we have --

4 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- give me a little idea  
5 | about it?

6 |               DICK: Okay. I'll, I'll --

7 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: What, what --

8 |               DICK: -- tell you. You got a pen there?

9 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: Sure.

10 |              DICK: Sure. We got ATF. And you saw the,  
11 | the local -- the ATF man that's representing their  
12 | agency here who -- by the way, this morning I think you  
13 | saw on television he said, we take full responsibility.  
14 | We, in ATF, take full --

15 |              STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, but --

16 |              DICK: -- responsibility.

17 |              STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- what does that really  
18 | mean, though, Dick? I mean, I appre--

19 |              DICK: That means that that --

20 |              STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I appreciate the  
21 | statement, but I've seen others --

22 |              DICK: That means he'll do it.

23 |              STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- say that in the past  
24 | too --

25 |              DICK: You know what?

              STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- and they got their

1 | hands --

2 |           DICK: You know what the --

3 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- slapped or something.

4 |           DICK: He will take full responsibility and  
5 | it will be worked out. There is the FBI, the Texas  
6 | Rangers, folks from other agencies, the Austin Police  
7 | Department, the local sheriff's department here. It's  
8 | just a, a whole -- DPS, the National Guard. I mean, I  
9 | mean, these kinds of incidents, as tragic as they are,  
10 | we all have to work together in the cooperative effort  
11 | because it, it takes a lot of resources. It takes a  
12 | lot of -- a, a, a lot of people, and those kinds of  
13 | things. So, ultimately, the decisions that are made  
14 | are made by the agencies themselves and we -- that is, I  
15 | and, and perhaps --

16 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Are you telling me --

17 |           DICK: -- John Cox --

18 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- are you telling me  
19 | you're going back to a representative of each of these  
20 | agents? Or what are you telling me?

21 |           DICK: Well, there -- we have periodic  
22 | meetings with the heads of agencies here and we explain  
23 | to them --

24 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, who carries the clout  
25 | mainly, though, as to --

          DICK: Well --

1                   STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- what's going on?

2                   DICK:  -- there -- it's a cooperative effort.

3 I mean, there, there is no, you know, head man, so to

4 speak.  They are commanders of respective agencies.

5 And Mr. Ricks is one of those people here.  Again, we

6 have, we have to work in shifts, much like you do.  All

7 of us have to sleep.  And, and, so, there are a number

8 of people.  And that's why we take this responsibility

9 very seriously.  We don't make arbitrary decisions.

10 And that's why you say well, we move so slowly.  The

11 reason is because we want to ensure --

12                   STEVE SCHNEIDER:  What are, what are the

13 possibilities of me speaking with Bob Ricks?

14                   DICK:  The -- there are no possibilities.

15 That would have -- Mr. Ricks has so many

16 responsibilities that he's coordinating this gigantic

17 effort, as are the other folks here, and it's just

18 absolutely impossible.  The man just is, is

19 coordinating --

20                   STEVE SCHNEIDER:  Is he in the same --

21                   DICK:  -- the effort --

22                   STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- is he in the same area,

23 the same building as yourself?

24                   DICK:  No.  No.  We have to get back to him

25 and, and deal with him as often as we can.  But, again,

you know, they're, they're having to stand by.  The

1 | heads of agencies have to conduct these press  
2 | conferences. They have to make policy divisions -- or  
3 | decisions. And they have to talk with the people back  
4 | in Washington, the President. You know, all these  
5 | kinds of people, from the President on down, they're  
6 | all concerned about your safety. And, and, so, there  
7 | are continually decisions that have to be made. And,  
8 | and that's why I'm here to talk with you, so I can  
9 | represent you. That's why I've chosen to be a street  
10 | agent, as we call it, instead of an administrator,  
11 | because -- you know, I, I think it's my responsibility  
12 | to try to work with people and I enjoy working with  
13 | people trying to, trying to resolve some of these kinds  
14 | of, of, of incidents safely. And, so, I pass that on,  
15 | as does John Cox, as does Jim and Henry, and many  
16 | others. Well, you have to have trust and faith in me  
17 | to represent what you said, and I have. I've gone to  
18 | these people and we've gotten concessions, and we're  
19 | willing to do those kinds of things, but we've got to  
20 | work together. We both have to do it. It can't be a  
21 | one-way street. It just doesn't work. It can't work  
22 | that way. When have you ever seen a, a decision made  
23 | wherein one person always makes the decision? You're,  
24 | you're married. Do you always make the decision or, or  
25 | does your wife at times have some input into the --

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Getting back to what



1 | we need to accomplish here, what is it you suggest?

2 |           DICK: I want a counter for you -- from you  
3 | as to how we can resolve this concerning the Bradleys  
4 | and, and releasing folks.

5 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

6 |           DICK: And, and I'll be glad to, to send that  
7 | in to, to the bosses and we'll mull it over and, you  
8 | know, you can't --

9 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, let me -- if you  
10 | remember -- remember what the issues were when we last  
11 | -- over the last day or two that we've been speaking  
12 | have been the encroachment.

13 |           DICK: Absolutely.

14 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, we call, we call  
15 | that, I guess, generically Bradleys then. I guess  
16 | that's --

17 |           DICK: Absolutely.

18 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- the key word. Okay.  
19 | Secondly, it was -- we were speaking about the six  
20 | gallons of milk. And money was paid out from here for  
21 | whatever our needs might be that way, and it seemed  
22 | like you people did want to help. Of course --

23 |           DICK: Let me address that issue. Can we do  
24 | this one-by-one, perhaps, at least?

25 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, I just want to --  
these are the issues that they --

1           DICK: Okay. You, you go ahead and read  
2 them. You go ahead and read them. Okay?

3           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. That's why. They're  
4 going to get back to me with all of this again, so --  
5 and then the body, of course, Peter Gent.

6           DICK: Um-hum.

7           STEVE SCHNEIDER: And his parents being here.  
8 Those are the things, along with -- apparently, the  
9 most recent one would be Robert Gonzalez, but that,  
10 like you say, has to do with his own decision, whatever  
11 he chooses to do if you contact him.

12          DICK: Um-hum.

13          STEVE SCHNEIDER: That -- you know, a lot of  
14 these things do not matter to me per se personally, but  
15 at the same time people are asking me to be a  
16 spokesperson, make it plain and clear what exactly --  
17 where they're coming from and what they're hoping to  
18 accomplish.

19          DICK: I know that.

20          STEVE SCHNEIDER: But, I mean, what -- the  
21 biggest thing of all, the biggest thing of all with the  
22 majority of these people -- now, this is what it is --  
23 has to do with the press, having a line to the press.  
24 They do fear you people. They do. They're saying if I  
25 go out I want my story to be heard. I want the safety  
to know that they're -- we're being viewed and watched

1 and that they're there, that they know ahead of time  
2 what I think, that I might make some statements. This  
3 is what they're asking me --

4 DICK: Okay.

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- and telling me.

6 DICK: And what -- you know, yesterday, on  
7 that last issue, we asked you who would you like to  
8 have here --

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. But --

10 DICK: -- when you come out --

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I just wanted to go one  
12 last time again.

13 DICK: Okay.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: When I get off the phone,  
15 and you asked me to come back with a counter. I mean,  
16 again, this is where we were at -- or this is where the  
17 majority of these people have come to me and this is  
18 what they have requested.

19 DICK: Okay.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay?

21 DICK: Okay. Now, listen. We have to deal  
22 with these issues one a time. It seems as though when  
23 I try to deal with them, you always come up with one  
24 more issue from someone else. And, and I'm, I'm doing  
25 my best to resolve these issues.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, this

1 happens when you, when --

2 DICK: Okay.

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- you're talking to these  
4 people, you know, and right away --

5 DICK: Yeah.

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- they say, well, I --  
7 I'll, I'll say to them, well, you go talk to the man.  
8 He's okay. His name is Dick. No, I don't want to.  
9 You talk for me. And I say well, wait now. It's not  
10 so bad. You know, this is what one goes through.

11 DICK: If you're concerned, please go back to  
12 those people that are concerned that when they come out  
13 they might be hurt or something, that the individuals  
14 that are scared --

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, therefore --

16 DICK: We'll have --

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- you know --

18 DICK: -- anybody here -- we'll ha-- within  
19 reason, we'll have people here to ensure that that  
20 doesn't happen. How better able to, to make them feel  
21 comfortable with that? We'll have that person here.  
22 You, you tell me -- you give me the name of someone;  
23 we'll have them right here. We'll have them right  
24 here. And we'll film it if you want on a, on a  
25 videotape --

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, see, now --

1 DICK: -- if you like.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- you're getting clo--  
3 you're getting closer to what they're hoping for.

4 DICK: Well, I'll be happy to do that. We  
5 told you that yesterday, but apparently it hasn't been  
6 communicated --

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, it has --

8 DICK: -- to the folks that --

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- but that's not --

10 DICK: -- are concerned.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- you know -- we're  
12 getting close I said. Because they were talking about  
13 an open line to the press and so forth.

14 DICK: Well, the open line to the press will  
15 be done when you come out. Okay. You'll have that --  
16 you'll have the accessibility to the press, and we'll  
17 tell you that on television tomorrow.

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'll pass that on again,  
19 but I -- you know, I, I don't know for sure. I'll pass  
20 it all on, what you told me --

21 DICK: Pass it on, please.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- and we'll --

23 DICK: Please do that to --

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- see what --

25 DICK: -- those people that are concerned.

Because I know, like I told you, yesterday, that not

1 | having been in this situation before there are a lot of  
2 | concerns. And, and I understand that and, and I'm  
3 | trying to help you --

4 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Exactly.

5 |                 DICK: -- resolve those --

6 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: You are right about that.  
7 | You hit it on the head.

8 |                 DICK: Sure. And that's understandable.

9 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Well, let me -- it's  
10 | going to take awhile for me to get around here.  
11 | There's -- some of them are starting to eat here, so  
12 | what I'll do is --

13 |                 DICK: Okay.

14 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- just try to talk as much  
15 | as I can, make a list or --

16 |                 DICK: Well, let me --

17 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- see if --

18 |                 DICK: You, you get those people that are  
19 | concerned about those specific issues, and myself or  
20 | John Cox will talk to them directly and we'll discuss  
21 | those issues. But you've got to communicate what we  
22 | say to those people --

23 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah. Oh, yeah.

24 |                 DICK: -- in order to resolve it.

25 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I have. I have. Very  
clearly.

1           DICK: Because, I mean, that's -- that seems  
2 to me to be a very simple issue. If they're concerned  
3 that when they come out they will be -- not be well-  
4 treated, then we'll have --

5           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, it's not --

6           DICK: -- people here --

7           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- even so much as --

8           DICK: -- as witnesses.

9           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- well-treated. They're  
10 talking about the final outcome of what's going to come  
11 of this. They all want to be clearly heard that --

12          DICK: Okay.

13          STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- when, when questions are  
14 asked by the press, the world, the, the, the country  
15 we're living in, that if they really want to know, they  
16 want to have the opportunity to answer those questions.

17          DICK: Not only will I answer those  
18 questions, you will be -- certainly have an attorney in  
19 there that can give them the information concerning  
20 court procedures and hearings and those kinds of  
21 things.

22          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Their -- they want their  
23 voice to be heard.

24          DICK: I couldn't agree more. And I -- you  
25 know, how can I make you understand that we believe  
that you must be heard ourselves? We're not trying to

1 suppress that. We're -- in fact, we're going to  
2 ensure --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Let me pass --

4 DICK: -- that that happens.

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- that -- well, I, I  
6 realize, I hear what you're saying. It's now to be  
7 able to convince these people here.

8 DICK: Well, I'll be happy to convince them.  
9 You put those folks on the, on the line and I'll talk  
10 to them and, and I'll convince them, because that is  
11 the truth. Now, you -- you know, you're not the only  
12 people that have integrity and truth. I consider  
13 myself a very truthful individual. I've never had my  
14 truth --

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I wouldn't --

16 DICK: -- or honesty --

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- deny that. I would --

18 DICK: -- questioned.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I would never --

20 DICK: Never.

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- say that you were. I  
22 mean, I could not judge you --

23 DICK: Never.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- Dick.

25 DICK: Well, I'm telling you.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: I -- you know, I'm not



1 dealing with you as a character or a personality.

2 When --

3 DICK: I understand that.

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- when, when I'm talking  
5 about the concept of truth, it's not in relation to  
6 what -- how you and I live from day to day.

7 DICK: Other honorable -- you know -- okay.  
8 Let's put it this way, Steve. You --

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

10 DICK: -- and I are not the only honorable  
11 people, okay?

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I don't even consider  
13 myself --

14 DICK: I work with honorable people. In --

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

16 DICK: -- fact, I would not work for --

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Probably more s--

18 DICK: -- them if they weren't honorable.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Probably more so than  
20 myself even, because I don't claim to be anything but  
21 as one that tr-- only but tries to be and have the best  
22 motives and so forth, and virtues. But like when you  
23 say -- you may be a much more truthful man than I am.  
24 But the one thing is I want the truth in relation to  
25 issues. I want the truth in relation to the issues of  
eternal life and death. So, that when I --

1 DICK: Well --

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- speak of truth --

3 DICK: -- I can't give you the --

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I'm, I'm even --

5 DICK: -- truth about those issues, life and  
6 death.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, see, that's what I --  
8 so, when I use the word like that, you know, I'm, I'm  
9 not --

10 DICK: Sure.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- talking about it in, in  
12 regards to your own character --

13 DICK: I know it.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- or who you are as a  
15 person. You come across as being one that is as  
16 believable, and, and so far I do believe you. And I  
17 think you are doing as much as you possibly can, and it  
18 does come across, that I know you have to deal with  
19 others that may not sympathize to the degree you do  
20 from talking with us in regards to Bradleys or whatever  
21 else we might be talking about. But we'll, we'll keep  
22 on working on this. I'll, I'll do as you requested.  
23 I'll go to these people and see if they won't come to  
24 the phone, and you can talk with them. You can  
25 alleviate any of their fears in regards to how they  
might be taken out of here, treated, whatever else.

1           DICK: Well, I hope your attorney in there is  
2 also talking to them, because he's the first one that  
3 should be, and, and obviously you should, should have  
4 some belief in what he tells you. That the prosecution  
5 in this thing is, is such that it's going to be  
6 horribly difficult to straighten this out. I gave you  
7 cl-- examples today of --

8           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

9           DICK: -- people that --

10          STEVE SCHNEIDER: I believe that.

11          DICK: -- that beat the cases, if that's the  
12 way you want to term it, because, because juries  
13 believed the folks that were charged. I gave you --

14          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

15          DICK: -- I cited you examples, and, and it  
16 happens.

17          STEVE SCHNEIDER: I do --

18          DICK: It happens.

19          STEVE SCHNEIDER: You, you, you are doing  
20 your best and you will see one day how much I have  
21 appreciated it as a person --

22          DICK: Well, you know what?

23          STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- and the part you --

24          DICK: I feel --

25          STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- have played.

          DICK: You know, I'm --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'm serious --

2 DICK: -- concerned that you --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- about that.

4 DICK: I am very concerned that you and David  
5 have not tried to meet me -- you know, I, I busted my  
6 butt for you --

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: You, you don't realize --

8 DICK: -- and you haven't tried to help me.

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'm, I'm trying to make it  
10 so plain that I'm more than anything else a  
11 spokesperson, trying to gauge the spirit and the --

12 DICK: Well --

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- attitude and, and what  
14 they want. When --

15 DICK: Then take it back --

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- when I go around --

17 DICK: -- to them. Take it back to them --

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. That's --

19 DICK: -- what I said.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- what I'm saying. But  
21 when I have gotten strong, it's because they say well,  
22 wait a minute, we don't want it because we don't trust  
23 them. They say, go relay that for us. This is what's  
24 happened. It -- do you understand? But if it --

25 DICK: Well --

STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- were, if it were you and

1 me, if it was only myself in concern, I'd w-- come  
2 walking out. I'd say okay, here I am, Dick. Let's do  
3 what we've got to do, be done, and let's go on.

4 DICK: Steve, you represent -- obviously,  
5 they've asked you to speak for them. That must mean  
6 they have a lot of faith in your ability to do that.  
7 So, along with that faith in you comes a responsibility  
8 from you --

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I agree --

10 DICK: -- to, to do --

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- with you.

12 DICK: -- to do the right thing.

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I agree with you. And  
14 that's what I've been trying --

15 DICK: And I'm trying to --

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- to do from day one.

17 DICK: -- tell you, and I'm trying to tell  
18 you what I can do for you and will do for you --

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

20 DICK: -- and that is the right thing. Now,  
21 you have to go back and ensure that they know that.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I haven't disagreed. I  
23 haven't disagreed. In fact, I --

24 DICK: It's a big responsibility.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I, like yourself, have  
wanted to move everybody out smoothly, clearly, safely

1 to the place where this is all finally resolved and it  
2 can be finally put to rest.

3 DICK: All right. Well, listen, go back to  
4 those folks and tell David that, that I again would  
5 like to speak with him and we'll work on this proposal.  
6 I mean, we, we got this concession from, from the, from  
7 the commanders and I, I don't --

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: What concession was --

9 DICK: -- want to dismiss --

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- that again?

11 DICK: Well, that is to move the Bradleys.  
12 And, you know, I certainly could --

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And then everybody comes  
14 out?

15 DICK: Well, listen.

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: By --

17 DICK: Offer me something in turn.

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: By the way, that -- okay.  
19 To them that's -- that isn't --

20 DICK: Unacceptable.

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Just to be clear with you.  
22 I, I don't want to even say that to them because --

23 DICK: Okay.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- it will be an insult to  
25 them --

DICK: Okay. Let's go with --



1 other folks maybe do not understand it. So, it's up to  
2 you. It's your responsibility to, to --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

4 DICK: -- pass this on to them, just as it's  
5 my responsibility to try to work with you to try to  
6 clear these issues up.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Well, let's go back  
8 and I'll make the rounds --

9 DICK: All right.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- again and --

11 DICK: We'll be back to --

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- see what --

13 DICK: -- we'll be back to --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- we can do.

15 DICK: -- you a little later then.

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

17 DICK: All right.

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Talk to you later, Dick.

19 DICK: Bye now.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Good-bye.

21 \* \* \* \* \*

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Hello?

23 JOHN: Steve?

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yes.

25 JOHN: John.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: John. How are you doing?



1 JOHN: Fine. How about yourself?

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Not too bad.

3 JOHN: How's David doing?

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: He seems to be doing a  
5 little bit better.

6 JOHN: He sounded terrible last night.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, he did. I was kind  
8 of falling asleep myself when he was talking to you  
9 there. I stayed by just to see how he was doing to  
10 make sure that, you know, he was somewhat stable yet.

11 JOHN: Both you guys got a pretty good  
12 night's, night's rest last night, huh? I didn't --

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: It was one of the --

14 JOHN: -- didn't have you called too early in  
15 the morning.

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Exactly. It was one of the  
17 better nights I've had.

18 JOHN: It -- did, did it help him at all?

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: It did. It actually did.  
20 He was awake a lot of the day. He, he, as usual, you  
21 know, of course, went in and out a few times. He's  
22 still recovering.

23 JOHN: Um-hum.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So -- but he's looking  
25 better today than I've seen him look yet. I think I'm  
-- I'm sure he's going to pull out of it.

1                   JOHN: Did he try getting up and moving  
2 around at all?

3                   STEVE SCHNEIDER: He -- yeah. In fact, he  
4 had -- he got up. He kind of sat up and he even tried  
5 to stand up a little bit, but, you know, still, it's  
6 quite dizzying yet. Gets very lightheaded and it kind  
7 of takes all his energy.

8                   JOHN: Anything about his -- does he look  
9 like he's -- as far as his vital signs and --

10                  STEVE SCHNEIDER: Vital --

11                  JOHN: -- temperature -- you don't think he's  
12 got any infection set in or anything like that?

13                  STEVE SCHNEIDER: It, it doesn't appear like  
14 it. It, it looks like he's okay, even the facial  
15 coloring.

16                  JOHN: Hey, I want to see him up and about --

17                  STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

18                  JOHN: -- walking out of there.

19                  STEVE SCHNEIDER: Sure.

20                  JOHN: You know?

21                  STEVE SCHNEIDER: Sure.

22                  JOHN: And that's what I'm, I'm hoping that  
23 he will stay healthy, you know --

24                  STEVE SCHNEIDER: John, so --

25                  JOHN: -- and, and just --

                  STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

1                   JOHN:  -- get better.

2                   STEVE SCHNEIDER:  When did you come into the  
3 complex there?  I mean, at -- Did --

4                   JOHN:  I'm sorry?

5                   STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- you just come in?  Did  
6 you just come in now or have you been there for a  
7 little while or --

8                   JOHN:  Oh, this evening?

9                   STEVE SCHNEIDER:  Yeah.

10                  JOHN:  Yeah.  I've been here for a couple of  
11 hours.

12                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  Okay.  So, Dick has  
13 probably filled you in then, of course.

14                  JOHN:  Yeah.  Well, you were kind of hard on  
15 him, weren't you?

16                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  Well, I don't know.  See,  
17 being the middleman, you know, it's --

18                  JOHN:  I know.

19                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- a frustration when --

20                  JOHN:  We both are middlemen, aren't we?

21                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  Well, this is true.  I  
22 mean, between yourself and -- like I told him, it would  
23 be no problem if it was myself only dealing --

24                  JOHN:  Sure.

25                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- with you people.  I'd be  
out the door and it'd be over.  But these people are

1 coming up to me saying, well, you know, we want to work  
2 things out right, but at the same time we're -- we want  
3 to be cautious. We're -- and then they're asking me to  
4 be a spokesman and, you know, you get all these  
5 different things at one time there and --

6 JOHN: Well, one of the, one of the things  
7 that I was kind of concerned about is when Dick  
8 mentioned that he was just talking for, for a very  
9 brief period of time with, with David, and then he put  
10 -- David just gave the phone right to you, and that's  
11 why I was concerned. Is David having --

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, he did.

13 JOHN: -- some problems, you know.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: He did.

15 JOHN: Is, is he having some physical --

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, he --

17 JOHN: -- problems?

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- with himself didn't, no,  
19 no. He --

20 JOHN: Oh, okay.

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- did that because he was  
22 insulted by what he claimed to be an offer, you know.

23 JOHN: Okay.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: We'll back --

25 JOHN: Okay.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- off the Bradleys and

1 | you'all will come out. Well -- now, what does that  
2 | mean? What --

3 |           JOHN: Well, I thought there was a physical  
4 | reason that it may have been.

5 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no, no. You see, it's  
6 | a thing of trust. It's a thing of a wor-- you know,  
7 | both of us look at each other somewhat with a little  
8 | suspicion trying to --

9 |           JOHN: Sure.

10 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- to make sure that we're  
11 | going to follow through on what we say. And, well, you  
12 | know, like I reiterated to him toward the end of the  
13 | last conversation, we started off with square one.

14 |           JOHN: Yeah.

15 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: It was agreed with Jim, and  
16 | very clearly so, that they would be pulling up three  
17 | Bradleys to the perimeter of the property but not on  
18 | the property.

19 |           JOHN: Yeah.

20 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: And, of course, after that  
21 | time they've dug in at the back place. They've even  
22 | just, in the past hour, they're in the front yard, back  
23 | toward the gate, but still they're there.

24 |           JOHN: Yeah.

25 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: And the worst thing  
about --

1 JOHN: Out by the tower?

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'll, I'll tell --

3 JOHN: Where the tower used to be?

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- you something. They've  
5 committed a maj-- they've committed a violation,  
6 because they just ran over the top of the cemetery  
7 there, which is against --

8 JOHN: Where is it?

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- the statutes and laws of  
10 the State of Texas.

11 JOHN: Where --

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: It's right out front where  
13 the old church used to be. There's a -- an old --  
14 there's a large furnace unit that is still standing.  
15 It's blue. And of course --

16 JOHN: I'm making some --

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- be--

18 JOHN: -- notes. Just a second.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Between that and the  
20 fence is a cemetery.

21 JOHN: If you went down the road past the  
22 bus? Is that what, is that what you're talking about?

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Do you remember  
24 where the guard gate was --

25 JOHN: Yes. Yes.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- as you drive in? And

1 | then you take a right onto our dirt road that winds to  
2 | the building itself. On the right-hand side is a  
3 | cemetery.

4 |               JOHN: Okay.

5 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: And the attorney even came  
6 | to me, reminded me of what is a very strict violation  
7 | in the State of Texas for mutilating or purposely --  
8 | going over the top of a cemetery. He took the Bradley  
9 | on there about an hour ago, ran through over the top of  
10 | it, twisted and turned around on it. I mean, I keep on  
11 | asking the question to Dick. You know, if these are  
12 | full-grown men in these toys --

13 |               JOHN: Yeah.

14 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- you know, what are they  
15 | doing? I mean, it, it doesn't impress us. It doesn't  
16 | intimidate us. It just slows the process down.

17 |               JOHN: Yeah.

18 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: You know, which I, like  
19 | yourself, I, I, I really respect yourself and someone  
20 | like Dick when you -- I really believe you guys are  
21 | trying, that it's, it's revoltive (sic) to him. And  
22 | then I was -- also passed on to him that one of our  
23 | guys happened to be looking down the road at some of  
24 | the sheriff's department. I, I --

25 |               JOHN: Uh-huh.

              STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- believe maybe that's

1 | them. I don't know who it would be. But one of them  
2 | showed the finger to him. And a little later one of  
3 | the guys, I think an officer, pulled his pants down and  
4 | stuck his butt in the air.

5 |               JOHN: That tells you something, doesn't it?

6 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. I mean, what are we  
7 | dealing with here? What are we dealing with?

8 |               JOHN: Well, I, I -- in my own mind, and I  
9 | can't talk for other people, I --

10 |              STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, he said, you know --

11 |              JOHN: -- I would say --

12 |              STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- if they were --

13 |              JOHN: -- we're dealing with somebody that's  
14 | frustrated and juvenile and, you know, you can go on  
15 | and throw all the expletive --

16 |              STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, I know. But I --

17 |              JOHN: -- deleted out there.

18 |              STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- think if you guys are in  
19 | a position where, you know, you have some authority,  
20 | I'd pull off that kind of foolishness, that juvenile  
21 | attitude.

22 |              JOHN: Well, I'm making notes about it, I'll  
23 | tell you that. The cemetery itself --

24 |              STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

25 |              JOHN: -- is that just an old cemetery that's  
been there for years --



1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, in --

2 JOHN: -- and years?

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- fact, it, it's gotten to  
4 become a little bit known because of this George Roden,  
5 back about six years ago, dug up a body of a woman that  
6 had been buried there something like 20 years ago.

7 JOHN: Oh, that's where that was?

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yes. Exactly. And she was  
9 reburied and it, it got back from the paper --

10 JOHN: Yeah.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- because, I mean, how  
12 many times does a person need to be buried?

13 JOHN: Yeah.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: But --

15 JOHN: But there are several other people  
16 buried out there --

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah. There's --

18 JOHN: -- as well, huh?

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- quite a number in that  
20 cemetery, isn't there? Like, what --

21 JOHN: I, I'm sorry?

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Probably about eight, maybe  
23 ten or so.

24 JOHN: Well, I'll let somebody know about it.  
25 Let me, let me pass a couple of things by that I  
talked --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

2 JOHN: -- to Dick and I talked to some other  
3 people and --

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

5 JOHN: -- obviously there are some issues  
6 that came up during the day and, and some that were  
7 kind of touchy, but I'm not going to bring them up to  
8 make them sensitive or anything else. But I --

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No. See --

10 JOHN: -- I just --

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- that wouldn't be  
12 sensitive. It was just that one --

13 JOHN: I just want to clarify --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

15 JOHN: -- some things.

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right. Go ahead. Go  
17 ahead.

18 JOHN: That earlier in the day they talked  
19 about those considerations that, that David said were  
20 totally unacceptable, and, and that's fine. I  
21 appreciate his posture on that. And it was my  
22 understanding they wanted -- you know, everybody come  
23 out, we'll remove the Bradley vehicles, and that's  
24 basically what the, the statement was, from my  
25 understanding.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

1 JOHN: Is that the way you understand it  
2 as --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That's correct.

4 JOHN: -- well?

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That's basically what it  
6 was.

7 JOHN: Okay. And then there were five items  
8 discussed; the removal of the vehicles, the six gallons  
9 of milk for the youngsters, Peter, a direct line to the  
10 media, and a conversation with Robert. Those --

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That is correct.

12 JOHN: -- those, those five items.

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That is correct.

14 JOHN: And, also, I guess there was a little  
15 girl in there, Melissa Morrison, that they had, they  
16 had some discussion about her leaving and then just --

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

18 JOHN: -- put an end to that.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

20 JOHN: And, and that's about where we stand  
21 from, from today, huh?

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That's correct.

23 JOHN: I, I, I told Dick, I said, geez, we,  
24 we kind of left things in a pretty good vein early this  
25 morning, and what, what's, what's happened out there,  
huh?

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

2 JOHN: So, let, let me throw a couple of  
3 things to you that I have, that I have found out, not I  
4 have determined, but I -- in conversation with people  
5 here. First of all, Robert's not here. Robert's gone.  
6 He's been taken someplace. He's having some  
7 difficulties. And I think you understand what that is  
8 -- that's all about. It's --

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

10 JOHN: -- just some, some trauma. And --  
11 however, if either yourself or David wanted to put a, a  
12 statement together or something on tape, I'll guarantee  
13 you it'll get to Robert. If, if, if we can --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, see --

15 JOHN: -- we could work out any arrangements  
16 you want to work out to get the tape --

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, in --

18 JOHN: -- through to him.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- response to that, I  
20 mean, David -- it's not that he wants to make a  
21 statement so much to Robert, it's just that we have --

22 JOHN: Well, I don't mean a -- you know, a, a  
23 official statement.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no. I, I --

25 JOHN: I'm sure he has --

STEVE SCHNEIDER: I --

1                   JOHN:  -- something he wants to discuss with  
2 Robert.

3                   STEVE SCHNEIDER:  See, David allowed him into  
4 his home and had an open communion --

5                   JOHN:  Sure.

6                   STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- and communication with  
7 him --

8                   JOHN:  Sure.

9                   STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- and there would be --  
10 knowing David, there would be no threats, no veiled  
11 threats.

12                  JOHN:  Oh, yeah.

13                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  He loves, loves this man  
14 so --

15                  JOHN:  Disappointment probably more than  
16 anything else, huh?

17                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  Yeah.  So, I mean --

18                  JOHN:  But if wants to put a tape together  
19 and express his feelings --

20                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  I'll --

21                  JOHN:  -- to Robert --

22                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- I'll pass that on --

23                  JOHN:  -- let him know that --

24                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- if he wants --

25                  JOHN:  -- that certainly --

                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- to make a tape and pass

1 | it on to Robert.

2 |           JOHN: Sure. Maybe it'll do something for  
3 | Robert, you know.

4 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: It might. It might.

5 |           JOHN: You know, and maybe it'll make David  
6 | feel better too --

8 |           JOHN: -- by, by making this statement.

1                   STEVE: -- that after giving \$1,000.00 for  
2 some of the smaller things, not directly for himself.  
3 He's never really asked anything for himself.

4                   JOHN: What was, what was that all about,  
5 Steve?

6                   STEVE: I'm talking about the six gallons of  
7 milk -- oh, the \$1,000.00?

8                   JOHN: No, no, no, about the \$1,000.00 'cause  
9 I've never been really clear about that.

10                  STEVE: Well, it actually originally  
11 originated with Jim and a decent phone and a phone  
12 line. That's how it originated.

13                  JOHN: Uh-huh.

14                  STEVE: And it was also spoken with -- if  
15 there was anything needed for little small things for  
16 some of the babies remaining --

17                  JOHN: Uh-huh.

18                  STEVE: -- or the children for their, their  
19 needs, not even his own. He's never asked for  
20 anything.

21                  JOHN: So, this was after last Sunday he gave  
22 \$1,000.00 out?

23                  STEVE: Yes, it was. It was like a day or  
24 two later.

25                  JOHN: No kidding. With one of the -- with  
one of the youngsters?



1                   STEVE: That is correct. Because, you know,  
2 we've always paid our own way. We don't rely on  
3 anybody.

4                   JOHN: Okay. Okay.

5                   STEVE: So, in the process -- this is why  
6 after hearing the statements by the FBI and the ATF --

7                   JOHN: Uh-huh.

8                   STEVE: -- at the press conferences given  
9 twice a day --

10                  JOHN: Yeah.

11                  STEVE: -- they said they would do all that  
12 they can in regards to -- and those -- I've got the  
13 statements right here -- in regards to, of course, the  
14 wounded --

15                  JOHN: Okay.

16                  STEVE: -- those that are shot, the bodies,  
17 along with the children and their needs but that's what  
18 I said was the frustration. After seeing and hearing  
19 that and then speaking with Dick --

20                  JOHN: Okay.

21                  STEVE: And then coming to this impasse --  
22 well, where's the six gallons that were requested three  
23 days ago. It's a small thing. It's not for David or  
24 myself to be drinking milk. There's a few here -- and  
25 I told Dick, look, if you want to -- if you want to do  
it that way, you will not hear that request again from

1 us. We will deal --

2 JOHN: OKAY.

3 STEVE: -- with water or whatever else we  
4 have.

5 JOHN: Okay.

6 STEVE: But it was only something for us to  
7 see the reaction of that side, of course, as was that  
8 first agreement which related to the Bradleys and being  
9 on the property of which they've been every night,  
10 fooling around, running around, running over shacks,  
11 and doing all sorts of things like that.

12 JOHN: Yeah. Yeah. You know, like I  
13 mentioned to you last night, there's, there's several  
14 different aspects to this whole thing. There's the  
15 aspect that you're dealing directly with and that's  
16 myself, Henry, Jim, --

17 STEVE: Gary.

18 JOHN: You know, that group. Then you got  
19 the tactical end of it, right, the people that are out  
20 there on the (Indiscernible).

21 STEVE: Well, obviously, this is never going  
22 to be resolved if, if your side --

23 JOHN: Well, it's going to be resolved. You  
24 know it and I know it.

25 STEVE: Okay. But I'm talking about, you  
know, if there isn't some kind of an authority that --

1 and, of course, there is --

2 JOHN: Sure.

3 STEVE: There is, over on your side.

4 JOHN: Hey, there's authorities on both sides  
5 and you know people take orders on your side and I know  
6 they take orders on mine.

7 STEVE: Okay.

8 JOHN: And that's why I'm glad you told me  
9 about the cemetery, about the other thing, and about  
10 the \$1,000.

11 STEVE: Well, see -- the thing with --

12 JOHN: I didn't know anything about the  
13 cemetery.

14 STEVE: The thing with the cemetery would  
15 have never happened if the agreement would have been  
16 continued from --

17 JOHN: Uh-huh.

18 STEVE: -- Sunday night. I mean --

19 JOHN: Uh-huh.

20 STEVE: -- we, -- we're not going around  
21 telling you what else is all around on the property  
22 but, you know, I mean, no one wants you to find out in  
23 another manner what is there and what other violations  
24 there may be.

25 JOHN: Hey, I know that, and I'm trying to  
work it out as I discussed yesterday with you.

1 STEVE: You, know, like, like I mentioned --

2 JOHN: I want -- I want this to work out as --

3 STEVE: I mentioned to Dick, you know, about

4 -- here those shacks were running over -- were run

5 over. They don't know what private property was in

6 there or maybe someone has -- I mean --

7 JOHN: Uh-uh.

8 STEVE: I mean that's the thing. If you

9 would have -- like, here's -- it was a frustration when

10 Dick calls me and tells me, well, you know, if you send

11 a guy out, let us know every move.

12 JOHN: Yeah.

13 STEVE: But on the other hand, you know, all

14 these moves are made with even running over guard

15 shacks and things like that and nothing's even stated

16 to me. These guys, when they saw that --

17 JOHN: Let me ask you, is that cemetery

18 marked somehow?

19 STEVE: I -- to tell you the truth, I haven't

20 been out there for some time. I spent a lot of my time

21 in California. So, when --

22 JOHN: But if --

23 STEVE: -- I'm here, I've never really walked

24 around that area and really looked.

25 JOHN: If you, if you went out -- not you but

if someone traveled out the road towards the, the guard

1 | shack that used to be there --

2 |           STEVE: I'll ask. (Speaking to someone in  
3 | the background). Is that cemetery clearly marked or  
4 | can you see where it is now?

5 |           JOHN: Something that I can tell somebody  
6 | exactly --

7 |           STEVE: It's in a fenced area. It's within  
8 | -- just as you get into the gate, to the right side.  
9 | I'm not sure because --

10 |           JOHN: So, it's near the guard shack anyhow?

11 |           STEVE: It is. It is.

12 |           JOHN: In, in a fenced area --

13 |           STEVE: Correct.

14 |           JOHN: -- or used to be a fenced area.

15 |           STEVE: But yeah -- I wanted to tell you, you  
16 | know, some of these guys when they saw that gate go --  
17 | being run over like that and no calls from you people  
18 | who are to be control, they wanted -- they said, okay,  
19 | that's the way it's going to be. They're, they're  
20 | making a statement to us. See, some of these people --  
21 | you know, you get all different types, always get all  
22 | sorts of different types.

23 |           JOHN: Yeah.

24 |           STEVE: Some are passive, some are the other  
25 | extreme.

          JOHN: You know, we find out about some of

1 these things after they happen, believe me.

2 STEVE: It's hard to believe.

3 JOHN: I mean we don't find out --

4 STEVE: It's hard to believe.

5 JOHN: -- before they happen. That's for  
6 sure. Do you think it's any conceivable way that it  
7 could have been an accident that the cemetery --

8 STEVE: Slaps their hands, pull, pull some of  
9 these guys out of the vehicles, stick someone in there  
10 that is responsible, that's mature.

11 JOHN: Well, --

12 STEVE: I mean, obviously, in the military --

13 JOHN: -- you just told me --

14 STEVE: -- you've got thousands and  
15 thousands. If there's some that haven't grown up yet,  
16 well, take them out and put them back in the sandbox.

17 JOHN: Yeah. Let me, let me ask you --

18 STEVE: Okay.

19 JOHN: -- somebody, obviously, witnessed what  
20 happened at that cemetery and --

21 STEVE: Yes, they did.

22 JOHN: -- and it must have happened in broad  
23 daylight, huh?

24 STEVE: It did. It did.

25 JOHN: Did, did it look like an accident or  
did it look like it was intentional?

1 STEVE: Well, see, being that I wasn't there  
2 myself, I can't tell but they said that they went right  
3 over the top of it and, of course, being --

4 JOHN: Yeah.

5 STEVE: -- that those are tracks and you've  
6 got sides and brakes.

7 JOHN: Oh, yeah. Oh, yeah.

8 STEVE: Well, you know, they twisted around  
9 on the top of the cemetery, turn, went backwards, went  
10 forwards. So, I, I don't know.

11 JOHN: Yeah.

12 STEVE: This is what I'm told.

13 JOHN: Yeah.

14 STEVE: Unless I went out there and looked  
15 that over myself, I couldn't really tell from this  
16 distance.

17 JOHN: Yeah. Well, it's something I'll sure  
18 talk to some people about and I know there's not much  
19 we can do other than say, it won't happen again, but  
20 I'll talk to somebody, and I'll sure get you an answer.

21 STEVE: Who's, who's telling these guys right  
22 now to drive into the gate, go over into that area and  
23 sit there in the first place?

24 JOHN: The only answer I could tell you is  
25 it's got to be coming from the command post.

STEVE: Are you not --

1           JOHN: And the command post is not an  
2 individual. It is, obviously, a joint group of  
3 individuals.

4           STEVE: So, you've got a lot of grasshoppers  
5 there, huh?

6           JOHN: They're known as chiefs.

7           STEVE: Chiefs, that is correct.

8           JOHN: Right. And then there are Indians.

9           STEVE: Very few of those I would imagine.

10          JOHN: Well, what can I say. We try to be as  
11 reasonable and rational as possible.

12          STEVE: Well, what, what --

13          JOHN: And I don't want to aggravate a  
14 situation. I don't want to alienate you or David or  
15 anyone else in, in --

16          STEVE: Well, it's not that one becomes  
17 alienated. You start wondering just where this is  
18 headed, if anywhere at all, --

19          JOHN: Sure.

20          STEVE: -- especially when, you know, the most  
21 simple things seem to become such complicated things.

22          JOHN: They always do, though, don't they?  
23 They shouldn't.

24          STEVE: I mean I was surprised. Seriously,  
25 it was -- it actually was an insult when Dick called  
back. He said, now, wait, we're going to be calling



1 | you back by 4:00. We have -- we've come up with an  
2 | awesome thing here. And I, I really expected to really  
3 | hear something. I thought we had really come to some  
4 | conclusion with -- after both him and I had spoken  
5 | about the press and their --

6 |               JOHN: Yeah.

7 |               STEVE: -- part, giving at least a view to  
8 | these people that there would be some measure of safety  
9 | and that there would be, you know, visuals witnessing  
10 | and so forth, a record of that.

11 |               JOHN: Yeah.

12 |               STEVE: So, I thought it had something to do  
13 | with that. He calls back and says, of course, we'll  
14 | back them off to a degree and you all walk out. Say  
15 | what, now?

16 |               JOHN: Let me ask you something.

17 |               STEVE: Go ahead.

18 |               JOHN: You heard this statement that they  
19 | threw, threw out earlier today, the thing that I just  
20 | mentioned, you know, which -- I mean what -- the bottom  
21 | line, my interpretation of that statement is, everybody  
22 | comes out, we're going to back up the vehicles. Well,  
23 | that's -- if everybody comes out, we're going to home.  
24 | I know that, you know that, right?

25 |               STEVE: Well, well, exactly, exactly, John.  
I mean -- exactly.

1                   JOHN: And, so, do you have some thoughts on  
2 this that you can throw my way that I can try and plant  
3 some seed with people?

4                   STEVE: Well, Steve, the thing I've never --  
5 the thing I've never wanted to leave --

6                   JOHN: An alternative is what I'm looking  
7 for.

8                   STEVE: I'm thinking. Wait, I know, but  
9 here's the major thing right here --

10                  JOHN: Go ahead.

11                  STEVE: And try not to forget this because  
12 this is what -- this all revolves around for these  
13 people here, including myself, and that is the only  
14 reason -- again, now, I hate to be repetitious --

15                  JOHN: Go ahead.

16                  STEVE: -- or redundant but the only reason  
17 we're here is because we believe there's a man inspired  
18 by the Holy Spirit that has the ability to open up  
19 exactly what God's timetable is.

20                  JOHN: Sure.

21                  STEVE: So, that same God has told him to  
22 wait. See, that's -- there's that one word, that --  
23 the reason we didn't walk out Tuesday or we haven't  
24 still is because basically this group of people are  
25 waiting to see what God has in mind or what we're to  
do. If, if he were -- if he said and showed us by

1 everything that he has ever told us, he backs by the  
2 Bible. It's one thing to have a feeling, an opinion.  
3 Well, I think, hey, God talks to me and God tells me --  
4 I mean none of us, we're not into that sort of thing.  
5 But if in consistency time and time again the man  
6 performs by showing with results what the Bible says  
7 and it happens that way, well, then, you know, he's got  
8 a track record. And that's what we've been going by.

9 JOHN: Well, it's been -- has David been  
10 doing a lot of praying today, too?

11 STEVE: Well, he has been. In fact, --

12 JOHN: Yeah.

13 STEVE: -- he wants us to do the same. For  
14 you -- praying for you people because we're in a  
15 serious time, not really so much for ourselves. What  
16 -- we don't -- we don't have the --

17 JOHN: Well, it's very serious for everyone.

18 STEVE: Well, no, I'm talking about the world  
19 at large. If there's --

20 JOHN: Sure.

21 STEVE: -- a God and he has spoken to  
22 mankind by prophets, by apostles, by his very son 2000  
23 years ago --

24 JOHN: Uh-huh.

25 STEVE: -- God's got a time period, a time  
schedule that ultimately it winds down. He wants you

1 and I to learn, look, there are billions that went  
2 before you and I, John. They're dead already. What do  
3 you know about them? Really nothing. What do you care  
4 about -- you don't. You only care about the little  
5 awareness that you have through your senses now as I  
6 do.

7 JOHN: Uh-huh.

8 STEVE: But that -- you could be run over by  
9 a vehicle, you know, you could be hit by lightning.  
10 You could have a heart attack like myself. This life  
11 is uncertain. Those that are wise, always looking for  
12 an a surety of something that, that, that's going to be  
13 hereafter. So, our concern is for you, your men, for  
14 everybody. We hold nothing against anybody. So, in  
15 the process -- this is why when that God tell us to  
16 wait through him, that's basically what we're doing.  
17 But he still showed you his good side by sending out  
18 three more people.

19 JOHN: Hey, I can't argue that with you.

20 STEVE: So, even though we're waiting, at the  
21 same time, you know, he cares for you people. The main  
22 reason he's doing that is not so much for ourselves but  
23 for both the individual sent, the age, and for you  
24 people, to try to reach your minds. Whether you  
25 believe or don't believe, maybe there will be a miracle  
one -- where one guy will catch a vision of something

1 | higher than himself that he'll see clearly from that  
2 | book.

3 |               So, see, that's what we're dealing with.  
4 | These side issues, these things like the vehicles being  
5 | on the property, whether they're not or sold, the truth  
6 | of the matter is, as I said to Dick, we don't care.  
7 | You could take one of those tanks or whatever, drive it  
8 | through the building back and forth. It wouldn't even  
9 | matter to these people.

10 |               JOHN: Hey, the bottom line is you and I both  
11 | know --

12 |               STEVE: Do you understand -- but do you  
13 | understand --

14 |               JOHN: Yes.

15 |               STEVE: -- what I'm saying?

16 |               JOHN: Yes, I do.

17 |               STEVE: And, and on the other hand, also,  
18 | when he gets jumpy, when he says that he'd like me to  
19 | tell what our moves are, if we go and drag dead carcass  
20 | of dogs out there, fine. But I told him, look, I'm not  
21 | held to anything like that, you know. If I get -- if I  
22 | want it or if they wanted to, they're free to drag --  
23 | take those dogs out there and I'll tell you, they're  
24 | not afraid. You could mow them down, you could shoot  
25 | them down. They don't have to tell you anything, and  
   | they're not even afraid to do so. And the only reason

1 | why we're staying here together as a unit still is  
2 | because of that one word, wait. It's not because we  
3 | fear man. There's a higher power we have learned to  
4 | fear more so that -- I mean when that God says he can  
5 | destroy your soul and you know what he's talking about,  
6 | we actually believe that is a reality more so than this  
7 | world which will pass away.

8 |               JOHN: Let me ask you something about the  
9 | word, wait. You know it and I know the context and the  
10 | connotation that it was described so far, you know,  
11 | that the Lord did tell David to wait. Did he tell him  
12 | to wait with his people to receive the word, you know,  
13 | or did he just tell him to wait and not leave?

14 |               STEVE: He only -- and all I --

15 |               JOHN: I mean he just said, wait?

16 |               STEVE: Only that one word, nothing else,  
17 | just that word. That's it, nothing. So, he in honesty  
18 | would tell you he does not know.

19 |               JOHN: Yeah. Yeah.

20 |               STEVE: And I've been in -- like I, I think I  
21 | gave you --

22 |               JOHN: Because it kind of confused me.

23 |               STEVE: Well, it doesn't me because let me  
24 | tell you, when I first met him --

25 |               JOHN: Uh-huh.

              STEVE: -- almost seven years ago --

1                   JOHN: Uh-huh.

2                   STEVE: -- I wanted -- because I was so  
3 convicted by what he'd opened up to me, it was more  
4 than any scholar in the universities I attended and all  
5 the lectures I had taken in through the years. Here  
6 was a man that in just three hours went so beyond the  
7 years I had been educated in religion and all the  
8 material that he gave to me, I, I was very excited.  
9 And I just said to him, well, look, I've got a lot of  
10 friends. I've got a psychologist friend, the man in  
11 his sixties, I'd like to have him analyze you. I'd  
12 like you to open up some things before him. He'll sit  
13 there, take notes, and he'll ask you some questions.  
14 He looked at me and told me, Steve, I don't do anything  
15 without God telling me when and where to make the move.  
16 I mean I had a desire for him to come and there -- I  
17 told him for a fact there would be a lot of people that  
18 would sit and give him the time to hear him.

19                  JOHN: Uh-huh.

20                  STEVE: That was my first introduction to how  
21 God works with him. And he wasn't kidding. And -- but  
22 -- what end up being waiting or not moving became by  
23 the next morning, God told him, go. And he did. And  
24 it worked out fantastically. So, see, since that time,  
25 it's -- it definitely is a strange thing in 1993 in, in  
this era, that a man claims --

1               JOHN: You bet.

2               STEVE: -- that there's a voice that audibly  
3 talks to him. It's God. I mean all my life -- look, I  
4 mean --

5               JOHN: Oh, you don't know how difficult this  
6 has been for, for me and for Dick and for the --

7               STEVE: I do, I do realize.

8               JOHN: -- others to comprehend.

9               STEVE: I do realize that because like  
10 yourself, I think those kind of people are safer in  
11 institutions, called mental institutions.

12              JOHN: Uh-huh.

13              STEVE: And I've not ever met a person that  
14 says they have experiences like that that isn't  
15 somewhat off the wall, to say the least.

16              JOHN: Uh-huh.

17              STEVE: And, of course, the rumors that  
18 you've heard about this man and some of the other  
19 things, I mean, of course, you would wonder.

20              JOHN: You know, the, the, the thing that you  
21 hear, though, about the religious aspects of it, I  
22 don't have any qualms about that. I don't have any  
23 problems about that at all because as I mentioned to  
24 you last night, religious freedom is, is a very dear  
25 thing.

              JOHN: Uh-huh.



1               STEVE: And, and it's something we all should  
2 share and I don't want to impose my beliefs onto  
3 someone else and, and -- nor to have someone else do  
4 that to me unless we really got into some serious  
5 dialogue about something.

6               STEVE: Uh-huh.

7               JOHN: The thing that I think has everybody  
8 more confused and more upset than anything else, not a  
9 person's religious belief, but it's the weapons, you  
10 know. Why does somebody have to have Law rockets and  
11 .50 caliber rifles and, and AR 15s and CAR 15s and M-  
12 16s and mini 14s and all of these type of things to  
13 discuss religion and discuss the word of the Lord --

14              STEVE: Dick -- John?

15              JOHN: -- and I think --

16              STEVE: Yeah.

17              JOHN: -- that is the real --

18              STEVE: I'm glad you raised that. Did, did  
19 you -- were you able to raise that question with David?  
20 Did you ask him about that?

21              JOHN: No, because when I called back --  
22 remember I called back last night, he was asleep and  
23 you and I talked.

24              STEVE: Okay. Hold on one second, would you,  
25 please?

              JOHN: Yeah, yeah.

1 STEVE TO DAVID: David, he was saying he  
2 understands so far what you've shared with him with the  
3 Bible, with the word, he says, but he still has a  
4 question, he doesn't see it, that where do we get and  
5 how does it pertain to the Bible and religion that  
6 we're buying AR 15s, M-16s, blah, blah, blah. Where  
7 does it fit, how does it fit? How does it fit with  
8 Christianity? Do you want to talk to him?

9 DAVID: I'll talk to him.

10 STEVE: David will talk to you, John.

11 JOHN: Hey, he's feeling better, huh?

12 STEVE: Yeah. He's right here. He had his  
13 eyes closed but I just asked him and he says, yeah,  
14 he'll talk.

15 JOHN: Did you give him a little nudge?

16 STEVE: Yeah, you've got it. Here he is.

17 JOHN: It's good talking to you, Steve.

18 STEVE: Okay. Take care.

19 DAVID: Hello, John.

20 JOHN: Hey, guy.

21 DAVID: That's a good question.

22 JOHN: You, you didn't sound too good last  
23 night.

24 DAVID: Oh, well, nights, its back and forth,  
25 you know. It's --

JOHN: Don't you go coughing --

1                   DAVID: I'm healing, I'm healing up and stuff  
2 like that.  
3                   JOHN: Are you?  
4                   DAVID: Yeah, definitely.  
5                   JOHN: Don't cough.  
6                   DAVID: I've just got, just got some holes in  
7 me. That's it.  
8                   JOHN: Were you feeling better today?  
9                   DAVID: Oh, yeah. Yeah, I took a little  
10 walk.  
11                   JOHN: Did you?  
12                   DAVID: Yeah, I was just kind of limping on  
13 one leg but --  
14                   JOHN: Hey --  
15                   DAVID: -- you've gotta do it.  
16                   JOHN: It's a step, huh?  
17                   DAVID: Yeah.  
18                   JOHN: That's great.  
19                   DAVID: So, you, you have an honest question  
20 in regards to armaments, right?  
21                   JOHN: Well, I think so.  
22                   DAVID: Okay.  
23                   JOHN: I mean I, I told Steve, I said, hey, I  
24 don't, I don't have any qualms about somebody's  
25 religious beliefs and I, and I certainly would never  
want anybody to, to get that impression because that's

1 something that's kinda dear to all of us, huh? And I  
2 have my beliefs and others have their beliefs and you  
3 and your people certainly have your's. And, and I said  
4 it was very difficult for me to grasp and for others  
5 here who I answer to to grasp the question of --

6 DAVID: I can imagine. It's a stumbling  
7 block.

8 JOHN: -- of the weapons, you know.

9 DAVID: Right.

10 JOHN: Your beliefs, that's your, that's your  
11 business and that's your people's business and others  
12 that want to, to profess it, that's their business, you  
13 know. But it -- the question is why the armaments?  
14 And not just, well, I have a handgun for my protection  
15 because the, the Constitution of the United States says  
16 that I have a right to bear arms.

17 DAVID: Or an AR 15s sporter model or --

18 JOHN: It doesn't mean -- it doesn't mean  
19 I've got a right to bear .50 caliber weapons and, and  
20 Law rockets because I'm going out to hunt pheasant and  
21 feed my people.

22 DAVID: Right.

23 JOHN: And, and I don't mean to be facetious  
24 about it. I really don't. That is probably the  
25 biggest question and the biggest thing that's hard for  
us to understand. And a person's religion is -- that's

1 | their business, you know. But the weaponry, the, you  
2 | know, the fortifications and all of this, it's almost  
3 | like, hey, we're expecting a challenge and somebody's  
4 | going to come challenging us and we're going to defend  
5 | ourselves and if we had nuclear weapons, we'd do that,  
6 | too. That's the scary part about it.

7 |           DAVID: Yeah, very scary.

8 |           JOHN: It is.

9 |           DAVID: Okay. So, you got a Bible there?

10 |          JOHN: I do.

11 |          DAVID: Okey doke. It's -- does it have the  
12 | prophets in it?

13 |          JOHN: I'm sure it does. I've got to get to  
14 | it, though.

15 |          DAVID: Okey doke.

16 |          JOHN: What, what passage?

17 |          DAVID: Okay. What we're going to do is  
18 | we're going to -- we're going to first -- turn to the  
19 | Book of Daniel and just keep your finger there so we  
20 | can resort to it. But we're going to start with our  
21 | foundation again, okay? Found the Book of Daniel yet?

22 |          JOHN: Not yet. I've got somebody trying to  
23 | find it, though.

24 |          DAVID: Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel and then  
25 | Daniel.

          JOHN: Be patient with me.

1                   DAVID: I am. Patience is a virtue.

2                   JOHN: Have it if you can, often found in  
3 women, seldom found in men.

4                   DAVID: (Laughs) Yeah.

5                   JOHN: Right.

6                   DAVID: I have lots of patients. I've had --

7                   JOHN: Okay, Daniel.

8                   DAVID: Okay. You've got the Book of Daniel  
9 now, right?

10                  JOHN: Which chapter?

11                  DAVID: Well, just -- we'll be looking at  
12 Chapter 2 there real quick but we -- I just wanted you  
13 to have it on reference.

14                  JOHN: okay.

15                  DAVID: Now, you turn to the last part of  
16 your Bible, to the Book of Revelation, Chapter 1.

17                  JOHN: Go ahead.

18                  DAVID: Okay, now, the book begins it's  
19 presentation with a commentary. And the commentary  
20 starts off with a statement, the Revelation of Jesus  
21 Christ, which God gave unto him to show unto his  
22 servants things which must shortly come to pass and he  
23 sent and signified it -- which means it's signature --

24                  JOHN: Sure.

25                  DAVID: -- by his angel and to his servant,  
John.

1 JOHN: Okay.

2 DAVID: Of course, the last chapter of  
3 Revelation it clarifies a statement when Christ says,  
4 I, Jesus, have sent my angel. The point we've got to  
5 bring out is that, you know, Christ did send his angel.  
6 Christ didn't come himself.

7 JOHN: Uh-huh.

8 DAVID: He sent his angel. Now, to his  
9 servant, John, who bare the record of God -- which  
10 that's what John claimed this is.

11 JOHN: Uh-huh.

12 DAVID: And of the testimony of Jesus Christ  
13 -- which means what Christ had to say -- and of all  
14 things which he saw.

15 JOHN: Uh-huh.

16 DAVID: Blessed is he that readeth and they  
17 that hear the words of this prophecy. Okay. What are  
18 we fixing to look at, then, in this book? A prophecy,  
19 right?

20 JOHN: Sure.

21 DAVID: Foretelling of the future?

22 JOHN: Uh-huh.

23 DAVID: And keep those things which are  
24 written therein for the time is at hand. So, when was  
25 this book to be acknowledged or to have been read?  
Shortly or as soon as it was received, right?

1 JOHN: Uh-huh.

2 DAVID: John to the seven churches which were  
3 in Asia. Of course, we're not in Asia are we, John?

4 JOHN: Not today.

5 DAVID: Grace be unto you and peace from him  
6 which is and which was and which is to come and from  
7 the seven spirits which are before his throne. What  
8 seven spirits? Well, that's a verdict which later on  
9 is clarified when the scripture tells us that the seven  
10 candles are the seven spirits.

11 And from Jesus Christ who is the faithful  
12 witness -- in other words, Christ is supposed to  
13 witness something to us, isn't he?

14 JOHN: Uh-huh.

15 DAVID: And the first begotten of the dead  
16 and the prince of the kings of the earth. So, when the  
17 kings of the earth are through ruling, who's going to  
18 take over?

19 JOHN: The Lord.

20 DAVID: Christ, right?

21 JOHN: Yeah.

22 DAVID: Jesus Christ. That's, that's what  
23 the scripture says his name is and until we have any  
24 greater light on it, that's, that's what his name is.

25 Unto him that loved us and washed us from our  
sins in his own blood. Is this guy known for dying for



1 | what he believes?

2 |               JOHN: Certainly.

3 |               DAVID: Okay. And has made unto our Gods  
4 | kings and priests -- I mean as kings and priests to our  
5 | God and his father, to him be glory and dominion for  
6 | ever and ever. Amen.

7 |               Behold, he cometh with clouds and every eye  
8 | shall see him and they also which pierced him and all  
9 | kindreds of the earth shall wail because of him. Even  
10 | so, Amen.

11 |               So, John, has kind of a rebellious attitude,  
12 | doesn't he?

13 |               JOHN: Uh-huh.

14 |               DAVID: With the earth having to wail, no  
15 | doubt they're not going to be ready, are they?

16 |               JOHN: No.

17 |               DAVID: But John says, even so, Amen. Okay.  
18 | Now, if he's going to come with the clouds --  
19 | naturally, I haven't come to the clouds, have I? No, I  
20 | haven't.

21 |               JOHN: Uh-uh.

22 |               DAVID: Okay. But that's a statement that  
23 | John makes.

24 |               I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the  
25 | ending, saith the Lord, which is, which was and is to  
   | come the Almighty. So, John, to the seven churches

1 | which are in Asia, right? Okay. John says --

2 |           JOHN: Of course, Asia to him back then was  
3 | an enormous area, too.

4 |           DAVID: Oh, sure, it was.

5 |           JOHN: Sure.

6 |           DAVID: It was a part of the Gentile region  
7 | where the Gospel was to go.

8 |           JOHN: Yeah.

9 |           DAVID: I, John, who also am your brother and  
10 | companion in tribulation -- which we're not in  
11 | tribulation today like John was -- and in the kingdom  
12 | and patience of Jesus Christ -- you know, got to wait  
13 | on him, right? Was in the isle that is called Patmos.  
14 | It's a prison island. For the word of God and for the  
15 | testimony of Jesus Christ. So, in those days you get  
16 | in trouble for preaching the word, couldn't you?

17 |           JOHN: Uh-huh.

18 |           DAVID: I was in the Spirit on the Lord's day  
19 | -- which --

20 |           JOHN: I guess you still can in some parts of  
21 | the world.

22 |           DAVID: Oh, sure. I was in the Spirit on the  
23 | Lord's day and heard behind me a great voice as of a  
24 | trumpet, saying, I am Alpha and Omega, the first and  
25 | the last. What thou seest, write in a book and send it  
to the seven churches which were in Asia. And then the

1 churches are given.

2 JOHN: Uh-huh.

3 DAVID: Okay. In Chapter 2, Verse 1, we say  
4 that he writes to the churches of Ephesus and he writes  
5 and the counsel is given. Okay. This is in your own  
6 leisure time, you can see in the next continuing  
7 chapters that he writes to each and every church.  
8 For instance, in Chapters 3, Verses 14 --

9 JOHN: Uh-huh.

10 DAVID: -- he says, and unto the angel of the  
11 church of the Laodiceans write, these things saith the  
12 Amen. Now, Amen in Hebrew means you can't add to or  
13 take away. When someone says, water's wet, you can't  
14 argue with them. So, the Amen is the faithful and true  
15 witness, the one who sees it, he's got all the details  
16 together, he knows the facts. And besides, the  
17 beginning of the creation of God.

18 Now, we know in the beginning was the word,  
19 right?

20 JOHN: Uh-huh.

21 DAVID: Was with God, was God, and the word  
22 was made flesh wasn't it? So, this is Christ.

23 I know thy works that thou art neither cold  
24 nor hot. I would thou wert cold or hot.

25 So then because thou art lukewarm and neither  
cold nor hot, I will spew thee out of my mouth.

1                   Now, this is the angel of Christ talking.  
2 This is Christ talking to his angel, right?

3                   JOHN: Uh-huh.

4                   DAVID: An indifferent attitude or a  
5 comfortable attitude in this church is going to get  
6 them spewed out of Christ's mouth. Now, if Christ is  
7 to confess your name before the father, you're a goner.  
8 Now, what's the problem with this church here?

9                   Because thou sayest, I am rich and increased  
10 with goods and have need of nothing and knowest not  
11 that thou art wretched, miserable, poor and blind and  
12 naked.

13                   Their evaluation of wealth and greatness is  
14 not so in harmony with God's, is it?

15                   JOHN: Uh-uh.

16                   DAVID: I counsel thee to buy of me gold  
17 tried in the fire that thou mayest be rich and white  
18 raiment that thou mayest be clothed and that the shame  
19 of thy nakedness do not appear. Anoint your eyes with  
20 eye salve that thou mayest see.

21                   As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten, be  
22 zealous therefore and repent.

23                   Behold, I stand at the door and knock. Which  
24 door? If any man hear my voice and open the door, I  
25 will come in to him and will sup with him and he with  
me.

1                   To him that overcometh -- overcometh what?  
2 Lukewarmness. So, you've got to be 100% for or 100%  
3 against, right?

4                   JOHN: Uh-huh.

5                   DAVID: Will I grant to sit with me in my  
6 throne even as I also overcame and am set down with my  
7 father in his throne. How did Christ overcome? He was  
8 the word of God, wasn't he?

9                   JOHN: He died, didn't he?

10                  DAVID: Yeah, but he -- by the word of God,  
11 right?

12                  JOHN: Sure.

13                  DAVID: And through the word of God we  
14 overcome because God's word can never be overthrown.

15                  He that hath an ear, let him hear what the  
16 Spirit said to the churches.

17                  Now, if you sin against the Spirit, you're  
18 going against the Holy Ghost which is unforgivable. We  
19 already learned this in the Gospels. Okay.

20                  After this I looked and, behold, a door was  
21 opened in heaven and the first voice which I heard was  
22 as it were of a trumpet -- which is the angel of  
23 Christ --

24                  JOHN: Uh-huh.

25                  DAVID: -- talking with me, which said, come  
up hither and I will show thee things which must be

1 hereafter.

2 Now, this is to continue way beyond the scope  
3 of the churches of Asia and their messages.

4 And immediately I was in the spirit and,  
5 behold, a throne was set in heaven. And then becomes a  
6 subject of God sitting on a throne, right? And he's  
7 the creator of all things.

8 And in Chapter 5, Verse 1, and I saw in the  
9 right hand of him that sat on the throne a book written  
10 within and on the backside, sealed with seven seals.

11 JOHN: Uh-huh.

12 DAVID: It's a scroll, okay. And I saw a  
13 strong angel proclaiming with a loud voice. Who is  
14 worthy to open the book and to loose the seals thereof?  
15 And no man in heaven nor in earth, neither under the  
16 earth, was able to open neither to look thereon. The  
17 book cannot be open. It's a secret. Now, the great  
18 Apostle, John, says in Verse 4, that I wept much  
19 because no man was found worthy to open and to read the  
20 book, neither to look thereon.

21 And one of the elders saith unto me, weep  
22 not, behold the lion of the tribe of Juda, the Root of  
23 David hath prevailed to --

24 JOHN: How do you -- how do you interpret  
25 paragraph 3?

DAVID: It's simple. No man -- means

1 | absolutely no man.

2 |           JOHN: In heaven?

3 |           DAVID: Neither on earth, neither under the  
4 | earth, who is able to open, neither to look thereon.

5 |           JOHN: Uh-huh.

6 |           DAVID: It's impossible. Only one man, only  
7 | the lion of the tribe of the Juda, the prince of the  
8 | kings of the earth can open this book. It's simple.

9 |           JOHN: Well, it can also mean, I guess, that  
10 | it's not going to be open until you get to heaven, huh?

11 |           DAVID: No, because you'll find as they  
12 | continue on the promise is that it's to be revealed on  
13 | earth.

14 |           JOHN: Okay.

15 |           DAVID: You see, that's the whole key to it.  
16 | But this is where I get in trouble at first, John.

17 |           JOHN: All right.

18 |           DAVID: Once we bring out the truth and bear  
19 | witness to the truth, the fact is no man. So, you  
20 | cannot respect any man according to the flesh. You  
21 | cannot judge. In other words, after John's day, there  
22 | was revelation of Jesus Christ that nobody could reveal  
23 | but who? Christ, himself. Now, why was Christ killed  
24 | 2,000 years ago? Was he just a man? No.

25 |           JOHN: No.

          DAVID: No. He was the son of God, wasn't

1 he?

2 JOHN: Certainly.

3 DAVID: Declared by power.

4 JOHN: Well, he was a threat at birth, wasn't

5 he?

6 DAVID: Well, he was a unique birth, wasn't

7 he?

8 JOHN: Yeah, but I'm saying, wasn't, wasn't

9 -- there was some people sent to look for him and to  
10 destroy him at birth, weren't they?

11 DAVID: Oh, yeah, well that's --

12 JOHN: Certainly.

13 DAVID: -- what Herrod (ph) had tried to do.

14 JOHN: Absolutely.

15 DAVID: The prophet had said --

16 JOHN: So, it shows you the threat began from  
17 the moment of birth.

18 DAVID: Exactly. That's why today it's  
19 avoided and I'll show you how in the prophecies, if you  
20 want to know.

21 JOHN: Go ahead. Go ahead.

22 DAVID: You see, we'll find throughout this  
23 book that in the continuation of the great controversy,  
24 that the subject is going to allow the Gentiles to have  
25 opportunity to be familiar with the prophetic writings  
so that when the man comes, Christ comes as a thief in



1 the night, you see, then the subject will emerge and  
2 those who have been looking and searching will find  
3 him.

4 JOHN: Where's this that it says he's coming  
5 as a thief in the night?

6 DAVID: Oh, all through Matthew, Mark, Luke  
7 and John, Matthew 24.

8 JOHN: Okay.

9 DAVID: Luke. Say, he -- there's, there's  
10 actually more than just the second coming. I'll  
11 explain. Let me, let me continue on.

12 JOHN: Go ahead. Go ahead.

13 DAVID: See, for lack of biblical knowledge  
14 -- like in the first statement, he comes in clouds.  
15 But Daniel 7 will explain when that event takes place.  
16 Okay. Here we go. Now, it says right here that the  
17 Lamb --

18 JOHN: Where are you?

19 DAVID: We're here in Verses 4 again.

20 JOHN: Okay. Go ahead.

21 DAVID: No man, absolutely no man in heaven,  
22 nor in earth, neither under the earth, was able to open  
23 and look thereon.

24 And I wept much because no man was found  
25 worthy to open and to read the book and then look  
thereon.

1                   And one of the leaders saith unto me, weep  
2 not, behold, the lion of the tribe of Juda, the Root of  
3 David hath prevailed to open the book and to loose the  
4 seven seals thereof.

5                   JOHN: Uh-huh.

6                   DAVID: And I beheld and lo in the midst of  
7 the throne and of the four beasts and in the midst of  
8 the elders stood a Lamb as it had been slain. Now, we  
9 know Christ has been slain years and years before John  
10 received the revelation.

11                  JOHN: Uh-huh.

12                  DAVID: But, nonetheless, in heaven he still  
13 is the Lamb that's been slain, having seven horns and  
14 seven eyes. That means complete power and complete  
15 vision, you know. God's number is seven. That's the  
16 number of completeness, isn't it?

17                  JOHN: Uh-huh.

18                  DAVID: Which are the seven Spirits of God  
19 sent forth to all the earth. Now, we seven the seven  
20 Lambs are the seven spirits. The seven eyes are the  
21 seven spirits. Only Christ completely sees what the  
22 spirit of God has to say. Only Christ knows what the  
23 book teaches, clearly. Do you see?

24                  JOHN: Uh-huh.

25                  DAVID: And he came and took the book out of  
the right hand of him that sat upon the throne and when

1 | he had taken the book, the four beasts and four and  
2 | twenty elders fell down before the Lamb, having every  
3 | one of them harps, and golden vials full of odours  
4 | which are the prayers of saints. In the mediatorial  
5 | work of Messiah, he's the high priest. The new  
6 | covenant is based upon his righteousness and that on  
7 | the cross he said, father, forgive them, for they know  
8 | not what they do.

9 |               JOHN: Uh-huh.

10 |              DAVID: I mean he completely knew the  
11 | prophecies, didn't he?

12 |              JOHN: Uh-huh.

13 |              DAVID: It must be fulfilled. He kept  
14 | saying, it must be fulfilled.

15 |              JOHN: Sure.

16 |              DAVID: But then he said, into thy hand I  
17 | commit my spirit, the revelation bears witness to the  
18 | fact that what Christ did not teach, of which he said  
19 | to the disciples, I have many things to say unto you  
20 | but you cannot bear them now. Okay. So, there's a  
21 | continuation sometime after John of these subjects to  
22 | be brought back to view.

23 |              Now, the prayers of saints cannot be directly  
24 | given to the father except were to pray to the father  
25 | in the name of Christ and Christ mediates.

            And they sung a new song, saying, thou art

1 | worthy to take the book and to open the seals thereof,  
2 | for thou wast slain and hast redeemed us to God by thy  
3 | blood out of every kindred, tongue, people and nation.

4 |           And has made us into our God kings and  
5 | priests, and we shall reign on the earth.

6 |           And I beheld and I heard a voice of many  
7 | angels round about the throne and the beasts and the  
8 | four elders and the number of ten was ten thousand time  
9 | ten thousand and thousands of thousands. These angels  
10 | are gathered --

11 |           JOHN: Uh-huh.

12 |           DAVID: -- all around here, too. You all  
13 | don't see them but you'll see in the prophecies what  
14 | we're talking about.

15 |           Saying with a loud voice, worthy is the Lamb  
16 | that was slain to receive power, riches, wisdom,  
17 | strength, honour, glory, blessing. Seven things there,  
18 | huh?

19 |           And every creature --

20 |           JOHN: We're in, in paragraph 11?

21 |           DAVID: Uh-huh.

22 |           JOHN: They're talking about the thousands  
23 | and thousands and you say these angels are surrounding  
24 | here.

25 |           DAVID: Oh, yes.

          JOHN: Why do you say that?

1           DAVID: Well, you're fixing to find out in  
2 the prophecies. See, you're fixing to find out what it  
3 means about the 20,000 chariots and thousands of  
4 angels. See, the prophet -- the prophetic word all  
5 meets its climax in one final --

6           JOHN: And I can say angels are surrounding  
7 where I'm sitting right here.

8           DAVID: Well, true. I, I'm, I'm glad --

9           JOHN: Yeah.

10          DAVID: I hope you believe that.

11          JOHN: Sure.

12          DAVID: Okay. Fine. Okay, now. And every  
13 creature which is in heaven and on earth and under the  
14 earth and such as are in the sea, and all that are in  
15 them heard I saying, blessing, honour, glory, power to  
16 him that sitteth upon the throne --

17          JOHN: Sure.

18          DAVID: -- and unto the Lamb. Okay. And all  
19 the four beasts and everyone says, Amen. Okay. And  
20 they worship. They're going to live forever and ever.

21                 And I saw when the Lamb opened one of the  
22 seals and I heard as it were the noise of thunder, one  
23 of the four beasts saying, come and see.

24                 And I saw and behold a white horse. He that  
25 sit up on him had a bow and a crown was given to him  
and he went forth conquering and to conquer.

1 JOHN: Uh-huh.

2 DAVID: Now, here shows a vision or a  
3 prophecy that Christ reveals in heaven, something that  
4 heaven has to review. A doctrine from God in regards  
5 to the work of Christ that must be reviewed in the  
6 investigative judgment of heaven.

7 Now, does this seem like a peaceful Christ?

8 JOHN: Just because he's talking about the  
9 white horse, he sat upon him with a bow?

10 DAVID: Well, you know, one time in the days  
11 of Ancient David a bow and arrow was a very serious war  
12 weapon, wouldn't you think?

13 JOHN: At one time.

14 DAVID: But not today?

15 JOHN: No.

16 DAVID: So, therefore, if God has foreborn to  
17 fulfill his prophecies from ancient times, then they  
18 have to be modified, don't they?

19 JOHN: Well, that's, that's open for  
20 interpretation, I'm sure, isn't it?

21 DAVID: Exactly. Now, who only can review --

22 JOHN: Goes like this, are, are you in there  
23 with a crown?

24 DAVID: I've got a crown on my head.

25 JOHN: You know, are you sitting with -- are  
you sitting on a throne?

1               DAVID: No, remember, the father sits on the  
2 throne. You're right, an interpretation. But what  
3 have we already learned? The prophets are not subject  
4 to men but subject to one spirit, God's spirit, right?  
5 Okay. As Corinthians teaches us. So, therefore, if  
6 the prophets are subject not to their own minds but  
7 what they were revealed, what God revealed to them,  
8 then we've got to remember that the little game or the  
9 little test which is going to judge the world is based  
10 upon one truth. Whether true or not, is it not stated  
11 that the first seal-- and tells of a white horse who's  
12 rider has a crown, who has a bow, who goes forth  
13 conquering and to conquer.

14               JOHN: Uh-huh.

15               DAVID: And would it not imply that the  
16 conquering is based upon the implement of the bow?  
17 Does he conquer with his bow?

18               JOHN: Well, that's kind of stretching  
19 things.

20               DAVID: Oh, you're not saying that he's using  
21 his bow? Conquer -- to conquer someone --

22               JOHN: He's not saying what, what he's doing  
23 with it. He just says that he had it.

24               DAVID: Exactly. And he went forth, went  
25 forth conquering and to conquer.

                JOHN: Sure.

1               DAVID: Okay. So, maybe he's not using his  
2 bow. Maybe he's, maybe he's just using his crown, his  
3 authority.

4               JOHN: That's a possibility, isn't it?

5               DAVID: Okay. But nonetheless, anyone  
6 conquering and to conquer with a bow would no doubt be  
7 using a weapon to do so.

8               JOHN: Uh-huh.

9               DAVID: The most obvious understanding of it.  
10 But, of course, we could spiritualize. We could say,  
11 well, let's see, the bow is the truth because when men  
12 hear truths, it sticks in their heart. And the crown  
13 is no doubt the inauguration of Christ in his heavenly  
14 kingdom. And the white horse is a symbol of purity.  
15 So, the pure truth goes forth conquering and  
16 conquering, right? We could say that. It could be  
17 spiritual.

18              JOHN: Or we could say that, you know -- you  
19 could go on and on on how, how it could be interpreted.

20              DAVID: And everybody has their own  
21 interpretation.

22              JOHN: And I, I can't argue that.

23              DAVID: Okay. Exactly.

24              JOHN: You know, everybody can interpret  
25 things --

              DAVID: Differently.



1           JOHN: Sure.

2           DAVID: Except for the fact that we know only  
3 the Lamb really knows what this thing is, right?

4           JOHN: You --

5           DAVID: We both agree to that, don't we?

6           JOHN: It's an interpretation.

7           DAVID: Okay. Well, I'm saying but Christ,  
8 himself, would definitely know what this is all about,  
9 wouldn't he?

10          JOHN: I can't argue that Christ would, no.

11          DAVID: Okay, fine. Now, let's just take a  
12 look at one more seal, just to get a picture.

13                 And I saw -- Verse 3, when he'd opened the  
14 second seal -- and I heard the second beast saying,  
15 come and see.

16                 And there went another horse that was red and  
17 power was given to him that sat thereon to take peace  
18 from the earth and that they should kill one another.  
19 And there was given him a great sword.

20                 You know, how --

21          JOHN: Where are you? Where are you?

22          DAVID: We're at Verses 3 of Chapter 6.

23          JOHN: I see 3.

24          DAVID: Okay.

25          JOHN: And he opened the second seal and  
heard the second beast say, come and see.

1                   DAVID: And there went out another horse that  
2 was red.

3                   JOHN: Go ahead.

4                   DAVID: And power was given to him that sat  
5 thereon --

6                   JOHN: Uh-huh.

7                   DAVID: -- to take peace from the earth.

8                   JOHN: Uh-huh.

9                   DAVID: That they should kill one another and  
10 there was given to him a great sword.

11                  JOHN: Uh-huh.

12                  DAVID: Oh. How do these things reveal  
13 Christ, John?

14                  JOHN: You tell me what your interpretation  
15 is.

16                  DAVID: Well, I don't want to do that. I  
17 just, you know --

18                  JOHN: Why?

19                  DAVID: Because mine is no better than yours.

20                  JOHN: Well, you're telling me it is.

21                  DAVID: No, no, no. I'm not going to tell  
22 you but what I'm fixing to do is prove something to you  
23 if you will receive it.

24                  Now, we go back here to Chapter 3. Now, now,  
25 see we're at a deadlock, right? We both agree that  
whatever these seals are being revealed in heaven, that

1 | we both may have different opinions on the subject,  
2 | correct?

3 |           JOHN: Uh-huh.

4 |           DAVID: But, remember, it's neither my right  
5 | nor your right to give our opinion because, clearly,  
6 | John states that this is a revelation of Jesus Christ  
7 | which God gave to him and only he can reveal it. We  
8 | both agree to that, correct?

9 |           JOHN: That God can reveal it?

10 |          DAVID: No.

11 |          JOHN: That Christ --

12 |          DAVID: That only Christ can reveal it.

13 |          JOHN: Sure.

14 |          DAVID: Okay. We agree to that.

15 |          JOHN: However --

16 |          DAVID: However --

17 |          JOHN: -- we do have our own intellect and we  
18 | do have our own ability to interpret things.

19 |          DAVID: Reason together. That's why --

20 |          JOHN: Sure.

21 |          DAVID: -- God says in Isaiah, let us reason  
22 | together.

23 |          JOHN: Sure.

24 |          DAVID: So, we both reason that --

25 |          JOHN: But, but we do have that ability.

          DAVID: Exactly. On, on, on, on the

1 | contrary, if a man does not open his eyes and his mind  
2 | and choose within himself to see the light as it is  
3 | opened, he cannot be of the kingdom of God. Remember,  
4 | Peter tells us that the salvation of God comes in  
5 | truths. So, as we take step by step in perceiving what  
6 | truth may be, then the truth which is a light will  
7 | enlighten their intellect and help us to see things  
8 | even greater than before.

9 |               David says in Psalms 119 that the word of thy  
10 | mouth is like a lamp unto my feet and a light into my  
11 | path which shines brighter and brighter until the  
12 | perfect day. Okay. So, so all we're looking at at the  
13 | present time is that some time after John's day, he's  
14 | being shown a vision of a time when God will sit on a  
15 | throne. He will have a book in his right hand and he  
16 | will give it to his son, Christ.

17 |               JOHN: Uh-huh.

18 |               DAVID: Of which Christ will, in heaven on a  
19 | sea of glass, open the seven seals of which until these  
20 | things are made plain, we will really not know the  
21 | meaning of it. But we're to know what they revolve  
22 | around, though. So, anybody can say --

23 |               JOHN: So, it's like you or I saying Christ  
24 | is, is on a sea of glass. How, how are you going to  
25 | interpret that, too, right?

              DAVID: Well, no, the thing of it is is that

1 | all of the prophecies already tell you what the sea of  
2 | glass is. It's not really a glass.

3 |           JOHN: No.

4 |           DAVID: It's a sea. We know that Christ  
5 | walked on the waters on earth, didn't he?

6 |           JOHN: Absolutely.

7 |           DAVID: And we know in heaven that --

8 |           JOHN: Well, at least some of us believe  
9 | that.

10 |           DAVID: Well, until we really can see it, we  
11 | can only have faith, can't we?

12 |           JOHN: Uh-huh.

13 |           DAVID: You know, I mean until some of us  
14 | really see the manifestation of the power of the glory  
15 | of God, we can only by the hearing of faith have a  
16 | hope.

17 |           JOHN: Hey, it's like the Apostles didn't  
18 | believe it was Christ that came before them after his  
19 | death, right?

20 |           DAVID: Exactly. These things --

21 |           JOHN: And they were pretty strong people,  
22 | weren't they?

23 |           DAVID: Well, they definitely had a higher  
24 | intellect in those days --

25 |           JOHN: But they did have a weakness?

          DAVID: But a great weakness.

1               JOHN: Yeah.

2               DAVID: Okay. So, this is all in  
3 consideration. So, where do we agree? Well, we both  
4 agree that God sits on a throne. We both agree that on  
5 the throne --

6               JOHN: You know, and we can interpret the  
7 throne, I'm sure, too.

8               DAVID: Well, let's don't get too bizarre.

9               JOHN: Well, --

10              DAVID: A throne is definitely a seat of  
11 authority, isn't it?

12              JOHN: That's, that's what's meant by it,  
13 sure.

14              DAVID: Okay. So, I agree with you. Now,  
15 anyway, God who is an authority, God who is the creator  
16 of all things, God who has a book in his right hand --

17              JOHN: Uh-huh.

18              DAVID: -- which is sealed, meaning the  
19 subject matter thereof --

20              JOHN: Uh-huh.

21              DAVID: -- is closed up to the eyes and minds  
22 of the beings in heaven and earth, is a subject which  
23 will be brought to view some time after John's day. I  
24 mean no doubt it will be a big splash, won't it,  
25 because, because when the first seal was opened, he  
heard the noise of thunder, right? Is thunder loud or

1 not?  
2 JOHN: Sure.  
3 DAVID: Okay. Now, if we backtrack just a  
4 little bit, say to Chapters 3 of Revelation, we might  
5 look in the seventh verse and maybe we might be able to  
6 see just a little something that might have us -- give  
7 us a little help about this Christ, okay? You're there  
8 at Verse 7?  
9 JOHN: Don't, don't, don't lose, don't  
10 lose --  
11 DAVID: I haven't.  
12 JOHN: Now, I'm going to lose it. I can't  
13 believe this. Chapter --  
14 DAVID: Three.  
15 JOHN: Five.  
16 DAVID: Oh, we won't.  
17 JOHN: Verse 4.  
18 DAVID: Okey doke.  
19 JOHN: Where, where he is talking about they  
20 should kill one another and given unto him a great  
21 sword.  
22 DAVID: You're talking about Chapter 6?  
23 JOHN: I'm, I'm sorry, Chapter 6, yeah.  
24 DAVID: Yeah, that's the second seal.  
25 JOHN: However, neither you nor I can sit  
back and interpret that all the peoples and religions

1 of the world are going to fight one another.

2           DAVID: Oh, exactly. I wouldn't say that.  
3 That's not what's in my head. Hope it's not in yours  
4 either.

5           JOHN: No, but, but people can look at that  
6 and, and interpret it to the farthest reaches, right?

7           DAVID: Well, I agree with you. That's why  
8 religion is dangerous, we've got to keep church and  
9 state separate.

10          JOHN: (Laughs) But, hey, I don't, I don't  
11 want you to, to think I'm going to try and get into  
12 some, you know, logical dispute with you because --

13          DAVID: Oh, I don't -- I never do that.

14          JOHN: -- I, I'm not that well versed.

15          DAVID: Okay.

16          JOHN: But I'm certainly willing to sit here  
17 and listen to you.

18          DAVID: Okay.

19          JOHN: I'm sorry, you wanted to get back to  
20 Chapter 2, Chapter 3?

21          DAVID: Chapter 3.

22          JOHN: Go ahead. Where?

23          DAVID: Okay. We're looking at Verse 7.

24          JOHN: Uh-huh.

25          DAVID: Now here, again, the angel of Christ  
is addressing John to address the angel of the church



1 | of Philadelphia.

2 |           JOHN: Uh-huh.

3 |           DAVID: Okay. All right. These things saith  
4 | he which is holy. He that is true.

5 |           JOHN: Uh-huh.

6 |           DAVID: He that hath the key of who?

7 |           JOHN: David.

8 |           DAVID: He that openeth and no man shutteth.  
9 | He that shutteth and no man openeth. I know thy works.  
10 | Behold, I have set before thee an open door and no man  
11 | can shut it. Why? For thy hath, what? A little  
12 | strength. And it's kept my word and has not denied my  
13 | name.

14 |           Behold, I will make them of the synagogue of  
15 | Satan which say they are Jews and are not but do lie.  
16 | Behold, I will make them to come and worship before  
17 | they feet and to know that I have loved thee.

18 |           JOHN: Uh-huh.

19 |           DAVID: Because thou hast kept the word of my  
20 | patience. You know, prophecy is something we've got to  
21 | hold on to, isn't it?

22 |           I also will keep thee from the hour of  
23 | temptation which shall come upon all the world to try  
24 | them that dwell upon the earth.

25 |           Behold, I come quickly. Hold that fast which  
  | thou hast, that no man take thy crown.

1                   Him that overcometh will I make a pillar in  
2 the temple of my God, and he shall go no more out. And  
3 I will write upon him the name of my God and the name  
4 of the city of my --

2 DAVID KORESH: -- his name. Do you know that  
3 new name yet?

4 JOHN COX: Besides Jesus? Besides --

5 DAVID KORESH: Oh, yeah. It's a new name.  
6 We already know Jesus.

7 JOHN COX: All right. What's the new name?

8 DAVID KORESH: Well, we know that those who  
9 have the open door will know, right? Now, remember,  
10 we're not in Philadelphia, neither Philadelphia,  
11 America, or Philadelphia, Asia.

12 JOHN COX: No.

13 DAVID KORESH: But this is the message --

14 JOHN COX: What's the new name?

15 DAVID KORESH: This is the message to them.  
16 Okay. So, we want to start the first step. Now, what  
17 does this key of David do? Now, if I was to tell you  
18 the new name, you'd say where'd you get that at? How  
19 do you know that, Dave? Or that's just your opinion.  
20 And, then, we'd have to run all over the scripture,  
21 which you wouldn't want to follow me, because you would  
22 think that I'm being arrogant by trying to show you the  
23 new name. So, we'd have to ask one honest question.

24 JOHN COX: And I'd probably have trouble  
25 keeping up with you, wouldn't I?

DAVID KORESH: Well, yeah. Because we don't

1 | want to, we don't want to overflow our minds. We want  
2 | to make it as simple as possible. So, we, we  
3 | continually repeat. We believe, that is, you and I  
4 | believe that Jesus Christ is the most important thing  
5 | in our lives. Only through him, by him, of him do we  
6 | receive life through God for God, and through Christ  
7 | comes knowledge and truth to save our soul. Now, we  
8 | know sometime after John's day God will sit on his  
9 | throne. A lot of angels will be there and one angel  
10 | will inquire into the value of who's worthy to open a  
11 | mystery, or a book of God that's been sealed. We know  
12 | the subject matter will revolve around, first of all,  
13 | the first seal, a man on a white horse who has a crown  
14 | and a bow who will go forth conquering and to conquer.  
15 | Now, do you like movies, John?

16 |           JOHN COX: Some.

17 |           DAVID KORESH: Okay. Some movies you don't  
18 | want to go and watch unless you kind of know what their  
19 | content contains, right? So, if a movie company --

20 |           JOHN COX: Well, in some -- it, it depends on  
21 | the characters --

22 |           DAVID KORESH: Okay.

23 |           JOHN COX: -- as well.

24 |           DAVID KORESH: So, you like the actors too?

25 |           JOHN COX: Sure.

          DAVID KORESH: Some movies you like to watch

1 | because of the actors?

2 |           JOHN COX: Sure.

3 |           DAVID KORESH: Well, I'm sure you'd like  
4 | movies from Jesus, wouldn't you?

5 |           JOHN COX: I probably would.

6 |           DAVID KORESH: Okay. Well, John, instead of  
7 | going and watching every movie, you'd probably want to  
8 | see a preview, wouldn't you? Isn't a preview a good  
9 | way to advertise?

10 |           JOHN COX: Sure.

11 |           DAVID KORESH: It gives you some action-  
12 | packed scenes in the overall movie without you having  
13 | to watch the whole movie, right?

14 |           JOHN COX: Um-hum.

15 |           DAVID KORESH: Okay. Well, what if the seven  
16 | seals were like a preview, a preview of some action-  
17 | packed events which regards actually a smaller detail  
18 | to a greater detail? Okay. Now, if Christ has this  
19 | key of David and only he can open and none can shut,  
20 | then whatever the key of David opens, it must open  
21 | something that we can go through and be a part of  
22 | another place. Doors do open up avenues between walls,  
23 | don't they?

24 |           JOHN COX: Um-hum.

25 |           DAVID KORESH: All right. And that there's a  
word of patience, meaning that there are certain words

1 | that God may tell us and we have to wait on those  
2 | words, such as Christ saying he'd come soon one day,  
3 | correct? The Christians say --

4 |           JOHN COX: Then you had to wait and interpret  
5 | soon, didn't you?

6 |           DAVID KORESH: Well, the thing of it is is  
7 | that when --

8 |           JOHN COX: Some believe he, he's coming and  
9 | others believe he's not coming.

10 |           DAVID KORESH: Okay. Well, that's what  
11 | their, their choice is.

12 |           JOHN COX: Sure.

13 |           DAVID KORESH: But what do we believe though?  
14 | Do we believe he will come again to the earth some day?

15 |           JOHN COX: Well, I believe I'll see him again  
16 | some day.

17 |           DAVID KORESH: Okay. Good.

18 |           JOHN COX: However it works out.

19 |           DAVID KORESH: All right.

20 |           JOHN COX: And I'm sure you do too.

21 |           DAVID KORESH: Oh, definitely. Definitely.

22 |           JOHN COX: You wouldn't be where you were  
23 | otherwise, would you?

24 |           DAVID KORESH: No. Absolutely not.

25 |           JOHN COX: That's pretty s-- pretty sure.

          DAVID KORESH: Okay.

1 JOHN COX: Go ahead.

2 DAVID KORESH: Now, David was a great king.  
3 We know that Samuel, First and Second Samuel speaks of  
4 David, First and Second King, Chronicles, but there  
5 seems to be something unique about David in that he  
6 wrote 150 Psalms. Okay?

7 JOHN COX: Go ahead.

8 DAVID KORESH: Now, in these Psalms it  
9 appears to be, right here in Psalms 45, a little  
10 message from David.

11 JOHN COX: Hang on. Hang on.

12 DAVID KORESH: Okey-doke.

13 JOHN COX: 45?

14 (Unidentified voices and music in background  
15 not discernible.)

16 DAVID KORESH: Psalms 45.

17 JOHN COX: Your fingers do the walker --  
18 walking quicker than mine. But, but you've been at it  
19 longer. Go ahead.

20 DAVID KORESH: Okay. Now, in some of the  
21 margins it says to the chief singer upon Shoshannim.  
22 Now, some of these titles are really unique and a lot  
23 of Jewish rabbis really have a neat code for these.  
24 Shoshannim means trumpet lilies. Okay. And depending  
25 on how far we get into this, you'll understand  
literally what that means.



1 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

2 DAVID KORESH: But, anyway, somebody is  
3 saying in this psalm, my heart is inditing a good  
4 matter. Somebody is thinking to themselves, correct?  
5 I speak of the things which I have made touching the  
6 king. Somebody's talking about a king, right?

7 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

8 DAVID KORESH: My tongue is the pen of a  
9 ready writer. This individual whose heart is inditing  
10 a good matter speaking of things which he has made  
11 touching the king, how is this person going to  
12 communicate the thoughts of his heart? He's going to  
13 speak by pen, right?

14 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

15 DAVID KORESH: My tongue is the pen of a  
16 ready writer. Well, naturally that's what we've got  
17 here, is we've got a psalm, don't we?

18 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

19 DAVID KORESH: Now, what does this person  
20 think about this king? My work's fairer --

21 JOHN COX: Let me, let me ask you something.

22 DAVID KORESH: Sure.

23 JOHN COX: What has this got to do with  
24 weapons?

25 DAVID KORESH: Well, let's get around to it.  
My work's fairer than the children of men. Okay.

1 JOHN COX: Go ahead.

2 DAVID KORESH: The king is fairer than some  
3 of the men, yes or no?

4 JOHN COX: Go ahead. Yeah.

5 DAVID KORESH: Grace is poured into thy lips.  
6 Should we listen to this king? If we listen to this  
7 king we'll receive grace, won't we?

8 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

9 DAVID KORESH: Therefore God has blessed thee  
10 forever. Gird thy sword upon my thigh, O most mighty,  
11 with thy glory and thy majesty. And in thy majesty,  
12 ride prosperously because of truths, meekness, and  
13 righteousness. And thy right hand shall teach thee  
14 terrible things. Thine arrows are sharp in the heart  
15 of the king's enemies whereby the people fall under  
16 thee. Thy throne, O God, is forever and ever. The  
17 scepter of thy kingdom is the right scepter. Thou  
18 lovest righteousness and hatest wickedness; therefore  
19 God, thy God has anointed thee with the oil of gladness  
20 above thy fellows. What an awesome king, huh?

21 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

22 DAVID KORESH: Huh. Who is this king?  
23 Christ. And who is his God? His father. And he rides  
24 prosperously because of truth. What is the truth?  
25 Well, you know, the first seal, the first seal in  
Revelation. Okay now. So, why is it that in this 45th

1 Psalm man cannot understand that not David of old but  
2 God himself inspired David to write this as a prophecy  
3 pertaining to his son?

4 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

5 DAVID KORESH: Now, all thy garm-- now, this  
6 is a dangerous person, isn't he? You don't want to be  
7 one of his enemies, do you?

8 JOHN COX: Uh-uh.

9 DAVID KORESH: Okay. Fine. Because this  
10 psalm is not written for you to be a foolish person and  
11 become his enemy. On the contrary, this psalm is  
12 written so that you might become wise and not be his  
13 enemy. You see, John, I love you and all the guys out  
14 there so much y'all don't realize, but there's a great  
15 event that's fixing to happen and I want you to be a  
16 part of it. Do you like parties?

17 JOHN COX: Sure.

18 DAVID KORESH: Okay. Well, listen to this  
19 psalm then. All thy garments smell of myrrh and aloes  
20 and cassia out of the ivory palaces, whereby they have  
21 made me glad. Kings' daughters were among the  
22 honorable women. Hmm. Excuse me.

23 JOHN COX: What?

24 DAVID KORESH: Someone's walking over me  
25 here. Okay. Now. Upon thy right hand is standing the  
queen in gold of Ophir. Now, who's this girl going to

1 | be John, do you know?

2 |           JOHN COX: No.

3 |           DAVID KORESH: Okay. Well, we've got to find  
4 | out, don't we? Well, when the lamb comes to earth and  
5 | begins to reveal the seals, no doubt some girl  
6 | somewhere will understand verse 10, that in order to  
7 | become engaged to Christ or to know anything about  
8 | Christ, she has to hearken, O daughter, in what?  
9 | Verse, verse 10.

10 |           JOHN COX: Um-hum.

11 |           DAVID KORESH: Consider, doesn't she?

12 |           JOHN COX: Sure.

13 |           DAVID KORESH: Incline that ear, forget also  
14 | thine own people in thy father's house. So should the  
15 | king, which is Christ, greatly desire thy beauty, for  
16 | he is thy Lord and worship thou him. Now, she can't  
17 | worship him if she doesn't know who she -- he is,  
18 | correct? Correct. And the daughter of Tyre shall be  
19 | there with a gift. Even the rich among the people  
20 | shall entreat thy favor. The king's daughter is all  
21 | glorious within. I mean, you know, she can be 300  
22 | pounds. She can be fat, you know what I'm saying, she  
23 | be ugly. It ain't going to make no difference.

24 |           JOHN COX: Well, we're not talking about her  
25 | size anyhow here.

          DAVID KORESH: We're talking about her heart,

1 aren't we?

2 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

3 DAVID KORESH: She's going to be full of  
4 light, isn't she?

5 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

6 DAVID KORESH: Her clothing is of wrought  
7 gold. She should be brought into the king in raiment  
8 of needlework. The virgins, her companions that follow  
9 her, shall be brought unto thee. With a gladness  
10 rejoicing you shall be brought, they shall enter into  
11 the king's palace. Instead of thy fathers, which all  
12 the created beings of the universe are the father's  
13 children, shall be thy children, whom thou mayest make  
14 princes in all the earth. Just can you imagine Christ  
15 having kids? Isn't that awesome? Some people don't  
16 think he can. But you're going to find out in the  
17 prophecies that he can. You're going to find out in  
18 the prophecies how he can. You're going to find out  
19 why in Isaiah 52 it says, depart ye, depart ye, go out  
20 from thence. Touch no unclean thing. Be ye clean, you  
21 that bear the vessels of the Lord. You're going to  
22 find out about the barren women in Isaiah 54, those  
23 that did not bring forth. You're going to find out why  
24 in the prophecies it'll say smite the shepherd and the  
25 sheep shall be scattered and my hands shall be upon the  
little ones. There's so much we've got to learn, John,

1 about: what must come to pass hereafter. But, anyway,  
2 he says I will make thy name remembered to all  
3 generations. Therefore, shall the people praise thee  
4 forever and ever. Now, is the 45th Psalm instruction  
5 pertaining to the first seal? Yes or no?

6 JOHN COX: I would say so.

7 DAVID KORESH: Go ahead.

8 JOHN COX: Sure.

9 DAVID KORESH: It is.

10 JOHN COX: That's what I said. I said so. I  
11 would say so.

12 DAVID KORESH: Great, John. God bless you,  
13 John. I appreciate that. Now, what does it mean?  
14 Well, it means that don't mess with Christ, he's a  
15 tough guy. Okay?

16 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

17 DAVID KORESH: And if a girl wants to marry  
18 the lamb, she's got to first learn about him, doesn't  
19 she? You can't marry a guy you don't know. And  
20 there's only seven seals whereby this wonderful event  
21 that's going to allow humanity and divinity to be  
22 joined together. Now, in Revelation 18 we're going to  
23 learn about a sad event. Okay? Are, are you there  
24 yet?

25 JOHN COX: Gaining on it. Go ahead.

DAVID KORESH: Okay. In Chapter 18 of

1 Revelation: After these things -- but we've got to  
2 first find out what things. Well, let's just reach up  
3 here to 17, verses 17. 17, verse 17. For God hath put  
4 in their hearts to fulfill his will and to agree and to  
5 give their kingdom unto the beast until the words of  
6 God shall be fulfilled. Now, you probably don't know  
7 what that is, do you? And the woman which thou sawest  
8 is that great city which reignith over the kings of the  
9 earth. So, whoever is in this predicament, ooh,  
10 they're kind of in trouble, aren't they? Well, it says  
11 in Chapter 18: and after these things I saw another  
12 angel come down from heaven having great power and the  
13 earth was lightened with his glory. He cried mightily  
14 with a strong voice, saying: Babylon the Great is  
15 fallen, is fallen. And has become the habitation of  
16 devils and the hold of every foul spirit in the cage of  
17 every unclean and hateful bird. For all nations have  
18 drunk of the wine of the wrath of her fornication. And  
19 the kings of the earth have committed fornication with  
20 her. And the merchants of the earth are waxed rich  
21 through the abundance of her delicacies. If it wasn't  
22 for this nation in the latter days whose expenditure is  
23 so great and national deficit is so great, if it wasn't  
24 for this nation who above all nations is blessed with  
25 toys and things and springs and -- you know what I'm  
talking about --

1 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

2 DAVID KORESH: -- then the rest of the world  
3 would not be as drunk. And everybody likes to come to  
4 America, don't they?

5 JOHN COX: Well, if they --

6 DAVID KORESH: There is --

7 JOHN COX: -- don't, they should.

8 DAVID KORESH: Oh, yeah, exactly. There's no  
9 greater nation.

10 JOHN COX: No.

11 DAVID KORESH: But God doesn't speak too  
12 highly of it. And I heard another voice from heaven  
13 saying --

14 JOHN COX: God doesn't speak too highly of  
15 America?

16 DAVID KORESH: Right. He doesn't.

17 JOHN COX: Why do you say that?

18 DAVID KORESH: Well, God calls it Babylon.

19 JOHN COX: Why do you say that?

20 DAVID KORESH: Well, because you've got to  
21 find out why in Revelation 13 --

22 JOHN COX: How can, how can you say that God  
23 describing Babylon is talking about America?

24 DAVID KORESH: What does Babylon mean?

25 JOHN COX: He could be talking about  
Yugoslavia.



1                   DAVID KORESH: Uh-uh-uh. No one --

2                   JOHN COX: Why not?

3                   DAVID KORESH: -- has -- nobody has  
4 merchandise in Yugoslavia that makes all the nations of  
5 the earth drunk.

6                   JOHN COX: Well, it's all -- see, you and I  
7 can look at it that way, right?

8                   DAVID KORESH: And that's who we're worried  
9 about --

10                  JOHN COX: And, and --

11                  DAVID KORESH: -- right --

12                  JOHN COX: -- and the --

13                  DAVID KORESH: -- now.

14                  JOHN COX: -- and the -- it's like the people  
15 in the Soviet Union could have been saying, gee, this  
16 is a great deal over here when socialism began during  
17 Marx and Lenin and look at all of the great things; or  
18 the people of Germany when, when Hitler took charge in  
19 the, in the mid-30s and said, geez, he's picked us up  
20 from rubble and look what he's brought us to and --  
21 could that have been Babylon?

22                  DAVID KORESH: Well, remember --

23                  JOHN COX: For those --

24                  DAVID KORESH: -- when --

25                  JOHN COX: -- people?

                  DAVID KORESH: Well, remember, according to

1 Daniel --

2 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

3 DAVID KORESH: -- Babylon is a complete body.

4 Between Babylon, we had a Persia, Greece, Rome, Europe,

5 and finally to the point of a lamblike beast in the

6 latter days who speaks of the dragon. It's a

7 culmination of every empire that's been risen up and

8 received riches and honor by the will of God, and yet

9 they have perverted themselves by those very gifts.

10 Okay? It's a whole world spectrum. It's a repetitive

11 thing, we're going to find out. Now -- but it finally

12 comes to an end. Remember in Daniel 2, a stone will

13 hit the feet of the image in the latter days? God is

14 the rock? A truth will come and those that refute it

15 will be destroyed? Okay. Here we go. So, it says

16 here that, in verses 8: therefore, shall her place

17 come in one day. Death and mourning and famine, that

18 she shall be early bird with fire. For strong is the

19 Lord God who judgeth her. That's what's happening now,

20 we're fixing to find out. Remember, the last thing

21 we're going to be judged by is the seven seals, how we

22 act when we learn about these things. And the kings of

23 the earth who have committed fornication and lived

24 deliciously with her shall bewail her and lament for

25 her when they shall see the smoke of her burning,

standing afar off for fear of her torment, saying alas,

1 | alas, that great city Babylon, that mighty city, for in  
2 | one hour is thy judgment come, and the merchants of the  
3 | earth shall weep and mourn over her, for no men buyeth  
4 | their merchandise anymore, the merchandise of gold,  
5 | silver, precious stones, of pearls, of fine linen,  
6 | purple, silk, scarlet, fine wood, all manners of  
7 | vessels of ivory, and so forth and so forth.

8 |               JOHN COX: Um-hum.

9 |               DAVID KORESH: Okay. Verse 17. For in one  
10 | hour so great riches has come to nought and every  
11 | shipmaster and all the company of ships and sailors and  
12 | as many as trade by sea -- that's your merchants,  
13 | right?

14 |               JOHN COX: Um-hum.

15 |               DAVID KORESH: Merchant, seamen? -- stood  
16 | afar off and cried when they saw the smoke of her  
17 | burning, saying what city is like unto this great city?  
18 | They cast dust upon their heads and cried, wailing and  
19 | weeping, saying alas, alas, the great city which were  
20 | made rich, all that had ships in the sea by reason of  
21 | her costliness, for in one hour she is made desolate.  
22 | Rejoice over her, thou heaven and ye holy apostles and  
23 | prophets, for God hath avenged you on her. And a  
24 | mighty angel took up a stone like a great millstone and  
25 | cast it in the sea, saying thus with violence shall  
   | that great city Babylon be thrown down, shall be found

1 | no more. And the voice of harpers is that --

2 |         JOHN COX: Hang on.

3 |         DAVID KORESH: Go ahead.

4 |         JOHN COX: Hang on. No, he says the great  
5 | city Babylon.

6 |         DAVID KORESH: Exactly.

7 |         JOHN COX: He didn't say the great nation  
8 | Babylon, right?

9 |         DAVID KORESH: Now, remember, remember,  
10 | Jeremiah says O Babylon, mount up to the heavens, yet  
11 | she shall be brought down.

12 |         JOHN COX: Yeah, I'm learning something here.  
13 | Go ahead.

14 |         DAVID KORESH: Okay. Now, here's the thing.

15 |         JOHN COX: That's, that's why I'm asking.

16 |         DAVID KORESH: Anciently, anciently, cities,  
17 | like for instance Waco, anciently would have been --

18 |         JOHN COX: Well, that's some for instance.  
19 | Go ahead.

20 |         DAVID KORESH: Well, do you understand what  
21 | I'm saying?

22 |         JOHN COX: Yeah.

23 |         DAVID KORESH: Okay. Now, as, as pe-- as  
24 | nations are allowed to live breaking God's law, they  
25 | populate and populate and populate. So, like Habakkuk  
will tell us, that Babylon will eventually merge the

1 whole earth, but it will have its prime capital or  
2 prime in-sign (phonetic) to all nations based upon one  
3 nation that'll be lamblike. See, we'll, we'll bring  
4 (indiscernible) --

5 JOHN COX: Are we going to say that Waco is  
6 the -- that city within Babylon?

7 DAVID KORESH: No, no, no, no, no. What I  
8 was trying to say was that it originally --

9 JOHN COX: Yeah.

10 DAVID KORESH: -- what we now call cities --

11 JOHN COX: Go ahead.

12 DAVID KORESH: -- were actually countries.

13 JOHN COX: Sure. Sure.

14 DAVID KORESH: Okay? And today the United --

15 JOHN COX: Countries, areas, whatever. Sure.

16 DAVID KORESH: Yeah, okay. And as man begins  
17 to develop and prosper, you know, the vast territories  
18 become broader.

19 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

20 DAVID KORESH: And the voice of harpers and  
21 musicians and pipers and trumpeters shall be heard no  
22 more at all in thee and no craftsmen, of whatsoever  
23 craft he shall be, shouldn't be find any more of thee,  
24 and the sound of the millstone shall be heard no more  
25 of thee, and the light of the candle no more -- and all  
this --

1 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

2 DAVID KORESH: -- and the voice of the  
3 bridegroom and of the bride shall be heard no more at  
4 all in thee, for thy merchants were the great men of  
5 the earth and for by thy sorceries -- you know how  
6 merchants are, right?

7 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

8 DAVID KORESH: They always make their product  
9 better than what it really is -- were all nations  
10 deceived. Even in religion they do this. In her was  
11 found the blood of prophets and of saints and of all  
12 that were slain upon the earth. Now, here's the event.  
13 And after these things I heard a great voice of much  
14 people in heaven saying, Hallelujah, salvation and  
15 glory and honor and power to the Lord our God, for true  
16 and righteous are his judgments. Now, remember the  
17 first judgment? It was doing with a first seal, wasn't  
18 it? Right? For he hath judged the great whore which  
19 did corrupt the earth with her fornication and hath  
20 avenged the blood of his servants at her hand. This  
21 whore, remember, is guilty of hurting the servants of  
22 God. And again they said, Hallelujah, and her smoke  
23 rose up forever and ever. And the four-and-twenty  
24 elders and the four beasts fell down and worshiped God  
25 and sat upon the throne, saying, Amen, Hallelujah. And  
a voice came out of the throne saying, Praise our God,

1 all -- how many? -- all yet his servants, and ye that  
2 fear him, both small and great, and heard the word of  
3 the voice of a great multitude, and as a voice of  
4 mighty waters, many waters, as the voice of mighty  
5 thundering, saying, Hallelujah, for the Lord God  
6 Omnipotent -- I mean, all powerful reignith. Let us --  
7 us means all -- let us be glad and rejoice and give  
8 honor to him, for the marriage of the lamb is come.  
9 Now, remember, the marriage can't come until that girl  
10 in Psalms 45 hearkens and considers, right?

11 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

12 DAVID KORESH: She's got to learn something.  
13 And his wife hath made herself ready. Her. When did  
14 Christ ever get a wife? Now, some people say: well,  
15 this wife is a spiritual thing. Well, sure it is. I  
16 mean, everyone has got a spirit of God as a part of the  
17 wife of God. But everyone that's got a spirit also has  
18 a mate for themselves too, don't they? Adam and Eve.  
19 Right? Okay. So, you and your wife.

20 JOHN COX: Well, everyone that has a, has a  
21 soul certainly doesn't have a mate.

22 DAVID KORESH: Hopefully.

23 JOHN COX: But they don't. You know that.  
24 What about people that don't marry?

25 DAVID KORESH: Well, we've got to learn  
something a little different than what you may

1 understand.

2 JOHN COX: I mean, I'm --

3 DAVID KORESH: And then Christ tells --

4 JOHN COX: -- I'm talking about religious  
5 that don't marry.

6 DAVID KORESH: Okay. Now, here was what  
7 we're talking about. When Christ was conferring to the  
8 Sanhedrim -- who don't believe in the resurrection --  
9 they says, Lord, there was a woman with seven husbands,  
10 and each one had her and each one die without giving  
11 her any seed. In the resurrection, whose wife shall  
12 she be? Of which Christ says, you do greatly err not  
13 knowing the scriptures nor the power of God, for those  
14 who are worthy of that resurrection neither marry nor  
15 are they given in marriage but are as the angels of  
16 God.

17 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

18 DAVID KORESH: Now, the angels of God are,  
19 are cherubim and seraphim. They're male and female.  
20 They're perfectly mated, though, from creation, just  
21 like Adam and Eve was. Now, it says here: she made  
22 herself ready and to her was granted that she should be  
23 arrayed in --

24 JOHN COX: What paragraph are you in?

25 DAVID KORESH: Where -- let, let's -- this  
goes in with verse 7.



1                   JOHN COX: Okay. Go ahead.

2                   DAVID KORESH: Let us be glad and rejoice.  
3 Give honor to him, for the marriage of the lamb has  
4 come. His wife hath made herself ready.

5                   JOHN COX: Um-hum.

6                   DAVID KORESH: The lamb. His wife. The  
7 lamb. His wife. Right? Now, his wife is not us. Let  
8 us be glad and rejoice. All the servants will be  
9 there. They will say let us be glad. Of course, the  
10 lamb and his wife are, again, two separate individuals.  
11 And to her was granted that she should be arrayed in  
12 fine, fine linen, clean and white, for the fine linen  
13 is the righteous of the saint. I mean, she's just as  
14 righteous as you will be, won't she? Okay. And he  
15 says --

16                  JOHN COX: Depending how you interpret it,  
17 sure.

18                  DAVID KORESH: Well, that's not an  
19 interpretation. It's a statement. And he sayeth unto  
20 me -- right -- blessed are they which are called to the  
21 marriage supper of the lamb. So, in Psalms 45, do you  
22 want to fight that lamb and make a mistake or do you  
23 want to go to his marriage?

24                  JOHN COX: Well, what do you think?

25                  DAVID KORESH: Well, I'm inviting you to a  
marriage.

1 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

2 DAVID KORESH: I was inviting Robert to a  
3 marriage. You see? And he said to me these are the  
4 true sayings of God. Now, John fell at the feet to  
5 worship the angel. He said to me, see, thou do it not.  
6 I am thy fellow servant of thy brethren that have the  
7 testimony of Jesus. Worship God, for the testimony of  
8 Jesus is the spirit of -- what? Prophecy.

9 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

10 DAVID KORESH: So, Psalms 45 is a prophecy.  
11 The first seal tells you that this will be some time  
12 after John's day. Who only can come and reveal this  
13 prophecy? Only the lamb. And I saw heaven open and  
14 behold a white horse. He that sitteth on him was  
15 called Faithful and True. In righteousness he doth  
16 judge and make war. See, I know that you do not know  
17 who I am. I also know that you do not understand the  
18 scriptures. I also am waiting on my Father to make  
19 decisions in regards to the attitudes of the people of  
20 this nation. And I am trying -- well, you asked me a  
21 question. I'm going to give you the answer.

22 JOHN COX: Sure.

23 DAVID KORESH: His eyes were a flame of fire  
24 and on his head were many crowns. Do you know where he  
25 gets those crowns? He gets those crowns from the  
judges and the kings who misjudge him, according to

1 | Psalms 2. Those who were the heathen that rage, who  
2 | imagined vain things, that say let us break his bands  
3 | asunder and cast his cords from us. They don't want to  
4 | learn the seven seals. So, my Father that sits in the  
5 | heavens is going to laugh at you. And, then, if I  
6 | can't hold him back a little longer, he's going to talk  
7 | to you personally and vex you in his sore displeasure,  
8 | and then the fulfillment of the prophecy will take  
9 | place. Yet have I set my king upon my holy hill of  
10 | Zion. The same king in Psalms 2 is the same one in  
11 | Psalms 45. Now you know why I have the key of David?  
12 | Let's learn more. And he has a vester dipped in blood.  
13 | He'll buy for what he believes, you know. And his name  
14 | is called the Word of God. So, he's got a new name  
15 | that no one knows but he himself, right?

16 |               JOHN COX: Um-hum.

17 |               DAVID KORESH: And I will give you my new  
18 | name? Well, okay. So, we see that he who has the key  
19 | of David, he that open and no -- but no one can tell  
20 | you Psalms 45 is not the first seal, can they, John?  
21 | You're not stupid. You know that Psalms 45 is a  
22 | prophecy of Christ, a warrior Christ who's going to get  
23 | married, and you know you're blessed if you're invited  
24 | to the marriage supper of the lamb. You know about  
25 | these things, don't you? And the armies which were in  
   | heaven followed him upon white horses clothed in fine

1 | linen white and clean. And out of his mouth go the  
2 | sharp two-edge sword. Um-hum. That -- with it --  
3 | that's the truth -- he should smite the nations. He  
4 | shall rule them with a rod of iron.

5 |               JOHN COX: Where's it say a sharp two-edge  
6 | sword?

7 |               DAVID KORESH: Well, out of his mouth goeth  
8 | forth a sharp sword, that with it he should smite --

9 |               JOHN COX: It doesn't say --

10 |              DAVID KORESH: -- the nations.

11 |              JOHN COX: -- anything about a double-edge  
12 | sword there, does it?

13 |              DAVID KORESH: Not here, but fur-- earlier it  
14 | did. We'll get around to that. Okay? And he shall --  
15 | may he smite the nations and he shall rule them with a  
16 | rod of iron and he treadeth the winepress of the  
17 | fiercest of the wrath of the Almighty God. And he hath  
18 | on his vester and on his thigh a name written, King of  
19 | King and Lord of Lords. Okay. And I saw an angel  
20 | standing in the sun. Now, this is, this is getting  
21 | ready to happen, okay? And he cried out in a loud  
22 | voice saying to all the thousands that fly in the midst  
23 | of heaven, come and gather yourselves together into the  
24 | supper of the great God that you may eat the flesh of  
25 | kings and the flesh of captains and the flesh of mighty  
   | men and the flesh of horses and them that sit on them

1 | and the flesh of all men, both free and bond, both  
2 | small and great, and I saw the beast and the kings of  
3 | the earth and their armies gather together to make war  
4 | against him that sat on the horse and against his army.  
5 | And the beast was taken and with him the false prophet  
6 | that wrought miracles before him with which he had  
7 | deceived them that had received the mark of the beast  
8 | and them that worshiped his image. These both were  
9 | cast alive into the lake of fire burning with  
10 | brimstone, and the rumor is slain with a sword of him  
11 | that sat upon the horse which was preceded out of his  
12 | mouth and all the fowls are filled with their flesh.  
13 | And I know what you're going to say. You're going to  
14 | think well, what is all this about. Well, here's the  
15 | key. The first seal is the first seal. The first seal  
16 | is found in Psalms 45, and now you know that Christ is  
17 | going to get married, right?

18 |               JOHN COX: Um-hum.

19 |               DAVID KORESH: Now, you agree to that?  
20 | That's good if you do because now --

21 |               JOHN COX: But I'm not, I'm not going to get  
22 | into a debate as to whether we're talking spirit, soul,  
23 | et cetera.

24 |               DAVID KORESH: Okay. So, let's, let's turn  
25 | real quick to Psalms 2, then. You know, it's not easy  
   | to teach these things, John.

1                   JOHN COX: You've got to consider what you're  
2 dealing with. Go ahead.

3                   DAVID KORESH: All right. Now, let's just  
4 look around at all the different attitudes we're  
5 dealing with right now. Let's just see if we can't  
6 apply this Psalm here. Why do the heathen rage? You  
7 know, the heathen do not believe in the God of heaven,  
8 do they?

9                   JOHN COX: Uh-uh.

10                  DAVID KORESH: Now, they're raging and the  
11 people imagine a what? A vain thing. Their thoughts  
12 are vanity. Thoughts that we cannot accomplish,  
13 thoughts that we cannot perform. The kings of the  
14 earth set themselves and the rulers take counsel  
15 together against the Lord. That's not too wise, is it?

16                  JOHN COX: Uh-uh.

17                  DAVID KORESH: And against his what?  
18 Anointed.

19                  JOHN COX: Um-hum.

20                  DAVID KORESH: That's not too wise either, is  
21 it?

22                  JOHN COX: No, because there are a awful lot  
23 of them, hopefully.

24                  DAVID KORESH: Saying --

25                  JOHN COX: Aren't there?

                  DAVID KORESH: Anointed ones?

1 JOHN COX: Yeah.

2 DAVID KORESH: No, there's only one. Saying  
3 let us --

4 JOHN COX: Against his anointed?

5 DAVID KORESH: Exactly. Against the Lord's  
6 Anointed. Against his Anointed.

7 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

8 DAVID KORESH: Saying let us break their  
9 bands asunder. I mean, the book belongs to the Father,  
10 you know.

11 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

12 DAVID KORESH: The Father gave it to the Son,  
13 the Anointed One. That's why in Psalms 45 it says, I  
14 have anointed thee above thy fellows. I mean, he is  
15 the King of Kings. Okay. They'll be made kings and  
16 priests, but he's a King of Kings. And the heathen say  
17 let's break his bands asunder and cast their cords from  
18 us. You see, they don't want to get tied into this  
19 truth. They don't want to be shown this message. They  
20 don't really feel it's that important. Seven seals?  
21 Aah, what's that. But that's a sad thing, and it makes  
22 me want to cry because while this is being fulfilled  
23 this very day, he that sitteth in the heavens shall  
24 laugh. The Father has a long time restrained himself  
25 from exercising his power against the sons of men  
thanks to the sacrifice of Christ, but in the latter

1 | days, as Jeremiah 30th said, the fierce anger of the  
2 | Lord shall not return until he's performed the intents  
3 | of his heart. In the latter days he shall consider it  
4 | perfectly. Well, what's perfect, more perfect than the  
5 | fact that the first seal of Psalms 45? God wants me to  
6 | know what he's thinking. He wants to talk about his  
7 | Son. He wants to talk about what he's fixing to do.  
8 | But, of course, he sends his Son. I come, my reward is  
9 | with me, remember, to try to reveal it in peace where  
10 | it's just the truth. No one wants to be confronted  
11 | with a sword or with a, with an arrow. It's better to  
12 | get rid of your enemies by teaching them the truth so  
13 | they can become your friends, wouldn't you say?

14 |           JOHN COX: Um-hum.

15 |           DAVID KORESH: That's what I believe in. I  
16 | don't want to --

17 |           JOHN COX: I truly believe that.

18 |           DAVID KORESH: Well, I do too.

19 |           JOHN COX: I mean, and I hope you do?

20 |           DAVID KORESH: Oh, I have been. Now, he that  
21 | sits in heaven is going to laugh --

22 |           JOHN COX: Don't we have a conflict then?

23 |           DAVID KORESH: Well, that's not my fault  
24 | though. Okay. Let me --

25 |           JOHN COX: Well, well --

          DAVID KORESH: -- explain that too.



1                   JOHN COX:  -- don't we have a conflict if you  
2 believe in that?

3                   DAVID KORESH:  Well, I hope that you and I  
4 don't --

5                   JOHN COX:  What do you mean?  What do you  
6 mean?

7                   DAVID KORESH:  -- that maybe others that  
8 don't know where I'm coming from, they may still have  
9 their own opinions and their own theories.  They may  
10 still be raging.  But, you know, you know, I want you  
11 and me to come together first.  Let us have an  
12 understanding.  Then you might be able to say to  
13 someone else hey, wait a minute, the guy's not as crazy  
14 as you think he is.  Now, what I don't want is for God  
15 to have to talk to himself.  The Lord shall have --

16                   JOHN COX:  Why?

17                   DAVID KORESH:  Well, let me explain.  The  
18 Lord shall have them in con-- derision.  Derision means  
19 confusion.

20                   JOHN COX:  Oh, first -- wait a minute.  Hang  
21 on just a --

22                   DAVID KORESH:  Go ahead.

23                   JOHN COX:  -- second.  When I mentioned the  
24 conflict about weapons or peace and you said that you  
25 believe you are a man of peace, and I said I hope  
you're a man of peace, then why the necessity for the

1 weapons? Do you think if I go into a, a, a rectory or  
2 a minister's home in, in Waco or a rabbi's home or a  
3 synagogue in Waco I'm going to run into a lot of  
4 weapons in there? Yes --

5 DAVID KORESH: Never can tell.

6 JOHN COX: -- yes or no? Do you really?

7 DAVID KORESH: No, I don't think so.

8 JOHN COX: Absolute-- no. I mean, that's,  
9 that's a fair answer.

10 DAVID KORESH: It's a true answer.

11 JOHN COX: And, and you say you are a man of  
12 peace.

13 DAVID KORESH: I am.

14 JOHN COX: Then why don't you get rid of  
15 those weapons?

16 DAVID KORESH: Well, I'm building up to  
17 explain that to you. See, I'm trying to help you to  
18 understand the way I think.

19 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

20 DAVID KORESH: Now, we've both agreed and  
21 learned that the 45th Psalm has something to do with  
22 the first seal, doesn't it?

23 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

24 DAVID KORESH: Now, can Christ have a weapon?

25 JOHN COX: Certainly.

DAVID KORESH: Because he's a king, isn't he?

1 JOHN COX: Well, he's the King of Kings, as  
2 some say.

3 DAVID KORESH: Okay. And --

4 JOHN COX: Now, I said as some say, right?

5 DAVID KORESH: As some say.

6 JOHN COX: My beliefs and your beliefs and --  
7 are not necessarily the same as everyone else's, are  
8 they?

9 DAVID KORESH: Definitely. That's why we  
10 have confusion. That's why Babylon has to be set in  
11 order.

12 JOHN COX: Well.

13 DAVID KORESH: We've got to find out whose  
14 doctrine --

15 JOHN COX: You've got to find out who Babylon  
16 is too, don't you?

17 DAVID KORESH: Well, we've got to find out  
18 what confusion is and why it's based.

19 JOHN COX: Well, I've got an idea what  
20 confusion is.

21 DAVID KORESH: Exactly.

22 JOHN COX: Don't you?

23 DAVID KORESH: Well, it's kind of like the  
24 story that I tell a lot of people to help them to get  
25 the first step in understanding?

JOHN COX: Uh-huh.

1                   DAVID KORESH: I explain to them, look,  
2 there was a time in Noah's day where God chose to spake  
3 to none but one, Noah. Now the world was confused. It  
4 did not believe what God said through Noah.

5                   JOHN COX: Um-hum.

6                   DAVID KORESH: Noah said God was going to  
7 bring a flood, and the world says, no, he won't. God  
8 did. And they perished. So, then, God says to Noah,  
9 I'm not going to bring a flood, and here's my rainbow  
10 so that when you look upon it you may know my word and  
11 my covenant. I am not going to. And the world says  
12 yes, you will. So, they built a tower. The Tower of  
13 Babel. It was called the Tower of Confusion because  
14 God knocked it down. See? God does not allow men  
15 always to finish what they have spent many long hours,  
16 days, and years to build --

17                  JOHN COX: Um-hum.

18                  DAVID KORESH: -- when it's contrary to his  
19 word.

20                  JOHN COX: Um-hum.

21                  DAVID KORESH: So, in the Book of Revelation,  
22 from the papacy all the way through, men in their  
23 ignorance have built churches --

24                  JOHN COX: Um-hum.

25                  DAVID KORESH: -- built faiths, built hope,  
but, really, God who sits on a throne has a rainbow

1 | there. And the last faith that God has given for men  
2 | to have and to believe is that one day Christ will come  
3 | and reveal the seven seals.

4 |           JOHN COX: Um-hum.

5 |           DAVID KORESH: It's simple. If you --

6 |           JOHN COX: Now, is he just going --

7 |           DAVID KORESH: -- don't believe in that --

8 |           JOHN COX: -- to reveal the seven seals to --

9 |           DAVID KORESH: Oh, sure.

10 |           JOHN COX: -- to 110 people inside a  
11 | compound?

12 |           DAVID KORESH: Oh, no, no, no, no, no, no.  
13 | No. The seven seals have been taught ever since 1985.  
14 | Oh, there's thousands of people out there in the world  
15 | that know about the seven seals.

16 |           JOHN COX: The seventh seal.

17 |           DAVID KORESH: The seventh seal?

18 |           JOHN COX: Yeah.

19 |           DAVID KORESH: That's the trumpets.

20 |           JOHN COX: Yeah. Is it all going to be  
21 | revealed just to a selected few or are all going to  
22 | have the opportunity to hear it?

23 |           DAVID KORESH: Well, what happens is, and  
24 | we're dealing with three parts of a harvest. The wave  
25 | sheath is the first of the first roots, as Christ and  
the wave sheath of 2,000 years ago. On the 18th day of

1 | the first month -- right? -- in the morning, first day  
2 | of the week, there's an -- a wave sheath offering to  
3 | the high priest of barley. That's the first ripe  
4 | selected grains of the harvest, and that's offered unto  
5 | God as a thank offering and a guarantee for the rest of  
6 | the harvest. The second part on Pentecost is the wave  
7 | loaves, which contains wheat.

8 |               JOHN COX: Um-hum.

9 |               DAVID KORESH: These are weighed before God,  
10 | and then the commencement of the whole harvest takes  
11 | place, all the way to the final harvest, which is the  
12 | grapes. So, the ceremonial system of God was ordained  
13 | and designed to be a picture of how God in the latter  
14 | days would bring and teach his truth to people on  
15 | earth, and the first ones that would mature in his  
16 | truth seeing eye to eye when the Lord brings against  
17 | Zion, learning the seven seals, the lamb's seven eyes,  
18 | Isaiah's eye to eye?

19 |               JOHN COX: Um-hum.

20 |               DAVID KORESH: You see? Isaiah says that  
21 | the, that the wicked in the nation that the lamb will  
22 | come to will provoke the eyes of his glory. See, God  
23 | has a truth he wants men to know, but he will never  
24 | ever break his covenant. Only through Christ will he  
25 | bring the last message. And this is why the world ends  
up being punished and destroyed, because they will not

1 | hear. Okay. Now, for instance, right here, the  
2 | picture is that he's a-raging, aren't they? I wonder  
3 | why? Well, they don't want the lamb to reveal the  
4 | seals, do they? So, God finally has to said -- to say  
5 | -- I'm doing everything in my power to keep this from  
6 | happening -- God is saying I will speak to them in my  
7 | wrath and vex them in a sore displeasure. They don't  
8 | want this person to have his rightful position with  
9 | God, do they? In verse 6, though, it says yet have I  
10 | set my king upon my holy hill of Zion. Now, you know,  
11 | John, it would be a supernatural thing for God to come  
12 | and impeach, impeach Mr. Clinton and all these  
13 | different leaders of this nation, right? And to humble  
14 | this nation and to --

15 |               JOHN COX: The thought's, the thought's been  
16 | there more than once. Go ahead.

17 |               DAVID KORESH: Well, I mean, I don't want  
18 | that to happen. I would rather have Mr. Clinton be a  
19 | priest and a king.

20 |               JOHN COX: You bet.

21 |               DAVID KORESH: Of a greater kingdom. I want  
22 | ev-- see, I don't really -- where I come from, toys are  
23 | toys, but people are worth more to me than anything.  
24 | Remember, after all of heaven bows down for the lamb,  
25 | there's only one passion on his heart, and that's to  
   | come again in the rhyme of the book, and together,

1 together, the last of the people that shall receive the  
2 kingdoms of eternal glory. Look out there at the stars  
3 tonight. You want to go home? You want to find out  
4 what's out there? Well, let's listen. Yet have I set  
5 my king upon my holy hill of Zion. This is where God  
6 has to intervene and the lamb stands on Mount Zion,  
7 doesn't he? With a-hundred-and-forty-four thousand,  
8 whoever they are? Well --

9 JOHN COX: Um-hum.

10 DAVID KORESH: -- I will declare the decree,  
11 John. Do you know what the Lord said unto me? He said  
12 thou art my Son. This day have I begotten thee. I  
13 know that's hard for you to believe. But it --

14 JOHN COX: He also said that we are all here  
15 to serve him, didn't he?

16 DAVID KORESH: Well, the thing of it is  
17 you're not serving me, because you don't know me yet.

18 JOHN COX: I'm not serving you?

19 DAVID KORESH: Well, you are. I have to  
20 admit you're listening to me and forbearing with me.

21 JOHN COX: That's more than a lot of people  
22 have done, huh?

23 DAVID KORESH: I know, and I appreciate that.  
24 But, see, one thing that --

25 JOHN COX: But I'm serving you in other ways.

DAVID KORESH: Well, that's true too. So,



1 | let's --

2 |           JOHN COX: Well --

3 |           DAVID KORESH: -- continue with the word --

4 |           JOHN COX: I mean, I took an oath to serve

5 | you, right?

6 |           DAVID KORESH: (chuckling.)

7 |           JOHN COX: Didn't I?

8 |           DAVID KORESH: Yes, you took an oath to

9 | serve --

10 |           JOHN COX: -- to uphold the Constitution and

11 | laws of the United States.

12 |           DAVID KORESH: Exactly, which are secondary

13 | to God's laws, correct, John?

14 |           JOHN COX: I can't argue there.

15 |           DAVID KORESH: Okay.

16 |           JOHN COX: But we do have the separation,

17 | don't we?

18 |           DAVID KORESH: Of church and state.

19 |           JOHN COX: Yep.

20 |           DAVID KORESH: But we cannot separate God's

21 | political reality from man's political reality. When

22 | the lamb comes in the flesh, there's going to be some

23 | realistic comotion and some realistic judging and some

24 | realistic action. That's where the spirit no longer

25 | becomes something to think about and becomes something

to feel and to be affected by. Okay. Now. Now, the

1 | Son has already been asked, ask of me and I will give  
2 | you the heathen for thine inheritance. I like my  
3 | heathen in one piece. How do you like yours?

4 |           JOHN COX: Which heathen?

5 |           DAVID KORESH: I'm talking about those who  
6 | know not God are called heathen.

7 |           JOHN COX: Um-hum.

8 |           DAVID KORESH: I like mine with -- walking  
9 | and talking and smiling and carrying on conversations.  
10 | And the uttermost parts of the earth for thy  
11 | possession. Thou shall break them with a rod of iron.  
12 | Thou shall dash them to pieces like a potter's vessel.  
13 | Now, John, you don't want no whipping, do you?

14 |           JOHN COX: I had enough of those.

15 |           DAVID KORESH: Okay. And I don't want any of  
16 | these young men around here to get a whipping. Now, is  
17 | this prophecy revealed so that we can know Christ is  
18 | coming to whup our butts? No. It's revealed so we can  
19 | know not to mess with the man who's got the seven  
20 | seals, because he's going to whip our butts. Why? So,  
21 | it says right here. It says here, be wise now,  
22 | therefore -- John. Ye kings of the earth, be wise. Be  
23 | instructed. Let's learn these seals. He judges the  
24 | earth. I mean, they're waiting to judge me, but they  
25 | are already being judged. Serve the Lord with fear and  
rejoice with trembling. Kiss the Son lest he be

1 | angry, and ye perish from the way when his wrath is  
2 | kindled but a little. Blessed are all ye that put  
3 | their trust in him. I mean, you know, it's so sad,  
4 | Christ having this key of David. I mean, he knows  
5 | every Psalm. There's 150 Psalms.

6 |           JOHN COX: What's the last thing you, what's  
7 | the last thing you just read?

8 |           DAVID KORESH: Kiss the Son, least he --

9 |           JOHN COX: Oh.

10 |           DAVID KORESH: -- be angry.

11 |           JOHN COX: Blessed are all --

12 |           DAVID KORESH: They that --

13 |           JOHN COX: -- they --

14 |           DAVID KORESH: -- put their trust in --

15 |           JOHN COX: -- who put their trust in him.

16 |           DAVID KORESH: Right.

17 |           JOHN COX: Do you think I put my trust in the  
18 | Lord?

19 |           DAVID KORESH: Well, do you put your trust in  
20 | me?

21 |           JOHN COX: Do you put your trust in me?

22 |           DAVID KORESH: Well, that's not what it says.

23 |           JOHN COX: I said do I put my trust in the  
24 | Lord. Do you put your trust in the Lord?

25 |           DAVID KORESH: I know my father. My father  
gave --

1                   JOHN COX: I didn't ask you that.

2                   DAVID KORESH: -- me the seven seals. Yes, I  
3 trust in him. That's why I'm still here.

4                   JOHN COX: Do you trust --

5                   DAVID KORESH: Otherwise --

6                   JOHN COX: -- in the Lord is what I'm asking  
7 you.

8                   DAVID KORESH: Look, I'm showing you the  
9 seals.

10                  JOHN COX: I think you're avoiding the, the  
11 question.

12                  DAVID KORESH: John, I am the Lord.

13                  JOHN COX: See, that's what you're trying to  
14 say.

15                  DAVID KORESH: That's what I said.

16                  JOHN COX: That's right.

17                  DAVID KORESH: Well, look here in Psalms 4,  
18 for instance. Here's what I'm doing right now, in  
19 Psalms 4. Hear me, O -- when I call, O God of my  
20 righteousness. I mean, is God right? Does he have a  
21 book? Is it right? Did he give it to the lamb? Is  
22 that right? Is the lamb going to come with his reward?  
23 I mean, do I have something here that I'm trying to  
24 share with you, John?

25                  JOHN COX: Yes, you do.

                  DAVID KORESH: Thou has enlarged me when I

1 was in distress. Have you ever had a vision? You  
2 know, God can take me back and forth --

3 JOHN COX: What, what did we discuss last  
4 night?

5 DAVID KORESH: What we discussed last night  
6 about -- well --

7 JOHN COX: A vision.

8 DAVID KORESH: A vision.

9 JOHN COX: And, and you seemed to be por--  
10 perplexed as to whether or not I could have a vision.  
11 Now, you're just asking me if I've ever had a vision.

12 DAVID KORESH: Well, have you?

13 JOHN COX: Sure. I know I have.

14 DAVID KORESH: Okay. What did you learn?

15 JOHN COX: But why were you perplexed at the  
16 fact that I could have one?

17 DAVID KORESH: Because there are spirits that  
18 are not in harmony with the words of God that God has  
19 given to me that I might know the path to walk. John  
20 the Revelator had a vision and he said what must be  
21 hereafter is a revelation of the seven seals, Jesus  
22 Christ. Now, if we're not in harmony --

23 JOHN COX: I think you're dodging my --

24 DAVID KORESH: -- with that spirit --

25 JOHN COX: You're dodging --

DAVID KORESH: No, I'm --

1                   JOHN COX:  -- my question.

2                   DAVID KORESH:  -- making a statement saying  
3 you'd better question the spirits.  John tells us to  
4 try the spirits to see if they be of God.  Well, the  
5 spirits of God are subject to the spirit of God.  God  
6 is not the altar of confusion.  What one prophet said,  
7 that's the foundation.  And we must see and be shown  
8 that all the prophets are in perfect harmony.  
9 Otherwise, we're out of harmony with the spirit of God.  
10 That's what I'm saying.  That's why he calls us  
11 Babylon.  The Catholics are not having the same visions  
12 as the Lutherans as the Presbyterian, Methodists,  
13 Baptists, and so forth.  So, we've got to have some  
14 foundation, Brother John.

15                  JOHN COX:  Well, I -- I'm not saying that I,  
16 I or anyone else is having a vision because of their  
17 religious belief, that they are Protestant, Methodist,  
18 Baptist, Catholic.  An individual, not because of his  
19 or her religious belief, but -- a religion per se, but  
20 the fact that they believe in the Lord, can certainly  
21 have a vision.

22                  DAVID KORESH:  Okay.

23                  JOHN COX:  You, you, you --

24                  DAVID KORESH:  So --

25                  JOHN COX:  -- you don't believe that?

                  DAVID KORESH:  Well, I just happen to know a

1 | little bit -- maybe a little bit more about it. Maybe.

2 | You don't know that, but maybe.

3 |               JOHN COX: Well, you're telling me the Lord.

4 | Obviously, you do. But I, I'm just saying that a  
5 | person --

6 |               DAVID KORESH: See, if I tell you I'm --

7 |               JOHN COX: -- because of their strong belief  
8 | in the Lord.

9 |               DAVID KORESH: Look, if I tell you I'm the  
10 | Lord, you cannot believe me.

11 |               JOHN COX: No, I can't.

12 |               DAVID KORESH: You can only believe what  
13 | God's word says. You can only sit there until I've  
14 | shown you the seven seals, and then you will see. You  
15 | have a --

16 |               JOHN COX: But you said they've already been  
17 | shown. Didn't you?

18 |               DAVID KORESH: In heaven they were received,  
19 | but when they're brought to earth the heathen will  
20 | rage --

21 |               JOHN COX: And I asked you --

22 |               DAVID KORESH: -- and say --

23 |               JOHN COX: -- if you were only going to let  
24 | the people in the compound see the seven seals, and you  
25 | said no, others have already seen them.

              DAVID KORESH: I've been showing them ever

1 | since 1985 is what I said to you.

2 |           JOHN COX: But are you going to keep them to  
3 | the people within that compound or are you going to --

4 |           DAVID KORESH: No.

5 |           JOHN COX: -- let the rest of --

6 |           DAVID KORESH: Everyone is --

7 |           JOHN COX: -- the world know about the seven  
8 | seals?

9 |           DAVID KORESH: Well, look, here's what's  
10 | fixing to happen, okay? Let's look at a couple of  
11 | Psalms real quick, and then I'll show you why I've got  
12 | weapons. All right? That's the original question,  
13 | isn't it, John?

14 |           JOHN COX: And we're having a tough time  
15 | getting there, though, aren't we?

16 |           DAVID KORESH: Well, if you're listening to  
17 | learn --

18 |           JOHN COX: Patience is a virtue.

19 |           DAVID KORESH: Exactly. Thank you.

20 |           JOHN COX: Go ahead. Where are we going?

21 |           DAVID KORESH: Psalms 4.

22 |           JOHN COX: Hang on. Go ahead.

23 |           DAVID KORESH: Hear me when I call, O God of  
24 | my righteousness. Thou has enlarged me when I was in  
25 | distress. I'm in distress now, John. Have mercy on  
me --



1                   JOHN COX: Did I put you in distress? I hope  
2 not.

3                   DAVID KORESH: Well, my father says in the  
4 Psalms that the wicked is a sword. So. Hear my  
5 prayer. Oh ye sons of men. You, John, all of you  
6 individuals that are on the outside, how long will you  
7 turn my glory into shame? How long will you love  
8 vanity and seek after leasing? But know, John, that  
9 the Lord has set apart him that is godly for himself.  
10 Come on up hither where I come from, John. Who has  
11 been separated from all of heaven? Who only is worthy  
12 to open the book? Who? The Lord will hear when I call  
13 unto him. Stand in awe, John, and sin not. Commune  
14 with your own heart upon your bed and be still. Think  
15 about this. Offer the sacrifices of righteousness. Be  
16 right. Does God sit on the throne? Yes, Dave. Has he  
17 got a book in his hand? Yes, Dave. To give the lamb?  
18 Yes, Dave. Is this the mystery of God? Yes, Dave.  
19 When there's time no longer will this mystery be  
20 finished? Yes, Dave. Am I going to come with my  
21 reward to give it to every man if they'll receive it?  
22 Yes, Dave. That's righteousness. And then put your  
23 trust in the Lord. There will be many that say who  
24 will show us any good. That's the attitude of the  
25 world right now. The Lord lift thou up the light of  
thy countenance upon us. The father is fixing to show

1 | who his people are, John. Now, would you be --

2 |               JOHN COX: Well, let me ask --

3 |               DAVID KORESH: -- a part of that?

4 |               JOHN COX: -- you something. Christ wasn't  
5 | afraid to reveal himself to, to all of the people, was  
6 | he?

7 |               DAVID KORESH: Wait a minute.

8 |               JOHN COX: Was he?

9 |               DAVID KORESH: I don't think you read  
10 | Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. It says he conveyed  
11 | (sic) in himself a way --
