You're the one 7 that's going to have to live with it. And, and I put a lot of effort into 7 this, into this thing. And, and, and just -- you guys 8 just kind of dismissed it out of hand. 9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Which proposal was that 10 again? 11 That, that is the one that I, that I DICK: 12 brought to David's attention that he immediately put 13 you on in, in connection with the movement of the 14 Bradley vehicles. And I said, David -- and, and David 15 said that seems --16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, can you refresh my 17 memory here? 18 DICK: Okay. I, I suggested to him that if 19 he will commit to the release -- or to the exodus of 20 all you folks out of that house, we'll withdraw the 21 Bradleys. And he said well, that's, that's not 22 unreasonable. But I, I said, David, if that's not 23 acceptable to you, offer me, offer me a proposal that I 24 can take --25

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, see --

DICK: -- and sell to them. 1 2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And here's what, what I understand clearly the reason for that. It's not --3 4 DICK: Okay. 5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- it's not that it wouldn't be under the kind of circumstances you and I 6 7 have been talking about. 8 DICK: Okay. STEVE SCHNEIDER: It always gets back to why 9 10 he starts getting into the spiritual mode with you when 11 he says his God told him to wait, and you apparently do 12 not believe that God can speak to a human being --13 DICK: Now, hold it, please --STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no, no. 14 15 DICK: -- don't put --STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no. 16 17 DICK: -- words in my mouth. All right? 18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no, no, no, no. But 19 I'm telling -- when I say you, it's generic. It's 20 overall. Don't --21 DICK: Okay. 22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- don't be so literal. It's --23 24 DICK: All right. 25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- not --DICK: All right.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- it's nothing -- you 1 know, it's no -- no, I'm not saying you even said such 2 a thing. But I'm just saying, you know, basically 3 that's what it is. That's the concept. DICK: Okay. 5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So, it's not that your 6 offer is, is foolish, off-the-wall, anything like that. 7 8 He --DICK: Well, offer me a counter proposal. 9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, this is what --10 DICK: That's what I've asked. 11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I'm saying. To me, it, 12 it is, it is something that is reasonable. 13 (Unidentified whispering voice in background 14 not discernible.) 15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: What did he say to say or 16 what? 17 DICK: He -- what I, what I suggested to him 18 19 was that --STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. 20 DICK: -- he offered me something that I can 21 take back in to the bosses, and say, listen now, but he 22 appreciates, he appreciates, you know, your, your 23 consideration, but this is something that, that he 24 would be more, be more comfortable with. And then I 25 can take that and go in and, and make a case for that.

And that's -- you know, during these last couple of days we, we seemed to get to a point where we can talk 2 to one another. But then we talk about trying to get 3 off of dead center, we're having a difficult time. And, and it's, it's like, you know, you show me yours, 5 6 I'll show you mine. And what --STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, I understand that. 7 DICK: -- we need to do is reason together 8 and then we have to put some faith in one another. And 9 I suggested that, that, you know, you send the kids up 10 the road, four kids up the road, and at the same time 11 you're doing that I'll have the Bradleys withdrawn. 12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, see, number one, in, 13 14 in all honesty --15 DICK: Off your property. Off your property. STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. But, number one, in 16 17 all honesty, the Bradleys don't even bother us --Okay. DICK: 18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- at all. It's just that, 19 that whole thing to do with the word, you know, keeping 20 one's word and following through. That's why --21 22 DICK: Absolutely. STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- that's why we were --23 That's the crux of this whole thing. 24 DICK: 25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, see, that was the reason for that. But, like I told you earlier, these

people don't fear things like Bradleys and men and --

DICK: Nor should they. We're not --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

DICK: Well, they're not there --

I'd like to come out, get this thing taken care of once and for all, sit down, and talk, speak with you, and, and go through whatever has

to and, and be done with it. But at the same time, the reason I came here first of all, like the rest, was to hear this book opened, and, and we've not been 3 dissatisfied. Is that someplace you have to remain 5 to hear that? I mean, David certainly --6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Was -- well, we're --7 DICK: -- can put his message down to --8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, well, let me 9 tell you this -- or -- in the past, when I first met 10 the man, I was in Hawaii, and I would speak to him 11 long-distance by telephone and it cost a humongous 12 amount monthly in, in phone bills, along with we tried 13 the tape thing, but he's a man that is given 14 revelations on a day-by-day basis, which he never 15 repeats the same thing twice. He has the ability to 16 open up deeper and deeper the mysteries of God as they 17 are in that bor'.. So, this is what, what people are 18 here for, to hear, to know, and we don't -- I really 19 don't see in this world that there are that many 20 honest-hearted people that have a deep love for truth, 21 whatever truth might be. 22 23 DICK: Steve? STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. 24 Listen. Please, listen to --25 DICK: STEVE SCHNEIDER: I --

one thing. And I've got the list, by the way, of all those statements right here. We wrote them down. If I -- you yourself would agree with me that what was 3 stated on television to those reporters is not in fact 5 the way you guys have responded to us for those requests. It is not true at all. I'll read back his 6 7 very statements to you. DICK: Yeah, I know, I know what he said, 8 Steve. 9 10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I do too. Do you want me to go up there? I'll go read them and then I'll tell 11 12 you what you told me. I mean --DICK: Well, I under--13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Six gallons of milk aren't 14 The dead body, contrary to what he said, is on 15 here. the property and you ha -- there have not been a 16 willingness to take these things off. 17 18 (Ringing sound.) 19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That would show one's good faith. So, 9 what did I do? I went into my boss and said please --10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Can I stop you there and 11 ask you something? But who are your bosses? How many 12 13 are there? And, and, so, there are continually decisions that have to be made. 7 and that's why I'm here to talk with you, so I can 8 represent you. That's why I've chosen to be a street 9 agent, as we call it, instead of an administrator, because -- you know, I, I think it's my responsibility 11 to try to work with people and I enjoy working with 12 people trying to, trying to resolve some of these kinds 13 of, of, of incidents safely. Do you always make the decision or, or 24 does your wife at times have some input into the --25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Getting back to what

we need to accomplish here, what is it you suggest? It's a stumbling DAVID: 6 7 block. -- of the weapons, you know. 8 JOHN: 9 DAVID: Right. JOHN: Your beliefs, that's your, that's your 10 business and that's your people's business and others 11 12 that want to, to profess it, that's their business, you know. But it -- the question is why the armaments? 13 And not just, well, I have a handgun for my protection 14 because the, the Constitution of the United States says 15 that I have a right to bear arms. 16 DAVID: Or an AR 15s sporter model or --17 It doesn't mean -- it doesn't mean 18 I've got a right to bear .50 caliber weapons and, and 19 Law rockets because I'm going out to hunt pheasant and 20 feed my people. 21 22 DAVID: Right. And, and I don't mean to be facetious 23 about it. I really don't. That is probably the 24 biggest question and the biggest thing that's hard for 25 us to understand. And a person's religion is -- that's

1 | their business, you know. But the weaponry, the, you know, the fortifications and all of this, it's almost 2 like, hey, we're expecting a challenge and somebody's going to come challenging us and we're going to defend ourselves and if we had nuclear weapons, we'd do that, 5 too. That's the scary part about it. 6 Yeah, very scary. 7 DAVID: JOHN: It is. 8 9 DAVID: Okay. So, you got a Bible there? JOHN: I do. 10 DAVID: Okey doke. It's -- does it have the 11 12 prophets in it? JOHN: I'm sure it does. I've got to get to 13 it, though. 14 15 DAVID: Okey doke. What, what passage? 16 JOHN: DAVID: Okay. What we're going to do is 17 we're going to -- we're going to first -- turn to the 18 Book of Daniel and just keep your finger there so we 19 can resort to it. But we're going to start with our 20 foundation again, okay? Found the Book of Daniel yet? 21 Not yet. I've got somebody trying to 22 JOHN: find it, though. 23 Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel and then DAVID: 24 25 Daniel.

JOHN: Be patient with me.

I am. Patience is a virtue. DAVID: 1 JOHN: Have it if you can, often found in 2 women, seldom found in men. 3 DAVID: (Laughs) Yeah. JOHN: Right. 5 I have lots of patients. I've had --6 DAVID: 7 JOHN: Okay, Daniel. DAVID: Okay. You've got the Book of Daniel 8 now, right? 9 JOHN: Which chapter? 10 DAVID: Well, just -- we'll be looking at 11 Chapter 2 there real quick but we -- I just wanted you 12 to have it on reference. 13 JOHN: okay. 14 DAVID: Now, you turn to the last part of 15 your Bible, to the Book of Revelation, Chapter 1. 16 17 JOHN: Go ahead. DAVID: Okay, now, the book begins it's 18 presentation with a commentary. And the commentary 19 starts off with a statement, the Revelation of Jesus 20 21 Christ, which God gave unto him to show unto his servants things which must shortly come to pass and he 22 sent and signified it -- which means it's signature --23 JOHN: Sure. 24 DAVID: -- by his angel and to his servant, 25 John.

JOHN: Okay. 1 DAVID: Of course, the last chapter of 2 Revelation it clarifies a statement when Christ says, 3 I, Jesus, have sent my angel. The point we've got to 4 bring out is that, you know, Christ did send his angel. 5 Christ didn't come himself. 6 7 JOHN: Uh-huh. DAVID: He sent his angel. Now, to his 8 servant, John, who bare the record of God -- which 9 that's what John claimed this is. 10 JOHN: Uh-huh. 11 DAVID: And of the testimony of Jesus Christ 12 -- which means what Christ had to say -- and of all 13 things which he saw. 14 JOHN: Uh-huh. 15 DAVID: Blessed is he that readeth and they 16 that hear the words of this prophecy. Okay. What are 17 we fixing to look at, then, in this book? A prophecy, 18 right? 19 JOHN: Sure. 20 DAVID: Foretelling of the future? 21 JOHN: Uh-huh. 22 DAVID: And keep those things which are 23 written therein for the time is at hand. So, when was 24 this book to be acknowledged or to have been read? 25 Shortly or as soon as it was received, right?

JOHN: Uh-huh. 1 John to the seven churches which were DAVID: 2 Of course, we're not in Asia are we, John? 3 in Asia. JOHN: Not today. 4 DAVID: Grace be unto you and peace from him 5 which is and which was and which is to come and from 6 the seven spirits which are before his throne. What 7 seven spirits? Well, that's a verdict which later on 8 is clarified when the scripture tells us that the seven 9 candles are the seven spirits. 10 And from Jesus Christ who is the faithful 11 12 witness -- in other words, Christ is supposed to witness something to us, isn't he? 13 JOHN: Uh-huh. 14 DAVID: And the first begotten of the dead 15 and the prince of the kings of the earth. So, when the 16 17 kings of the earth are through ruling, who's going to 18 take over? The Lord. 19 JOHN: Christ, right? 20 DAVID: JOHN: Yeah. 21 DAVID: Jesus Christ. That's, that's what 22 the scripture says his name is and until we have any 23 greater light on it, that's, that's what his name is. 24 Unto him that loved us and washed us from our 25

sins in his own blood. Is this guy known for dying for

what he believes? JOHN: Certainly. 2 Okay. And has made unto our Gods 3 DAVID: kings and priests -- I mean as kings and priests to our God and his father, to him be glory and dominion for 5 ever and ever. Amen. 6 Behold, he cometh with clouds and every eye 7 shall see him and they also which pierced him and all 8 kindreds of the earth shall wail because of him. Even so, Amen. 10 So, John, has kind of a rebellious attitude, 11 doesn't he? 12 Uh-huh. JOHN: 13 DAVID: With the earth having to wail, no 14 doubt they're not going to be ready, are they? 15 JOHN: No. 16 DAVID: But John says, even so, Amen. 17 Now, if he's going to come with the clouds --18 naturally, I haven't come to the clouds, have I? No, I 19 haven't. 20 JOHN: Uh-uh. 21 DAVID: Okay. But that's a statement that 22 John makes. 23 I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the 24 ending, saith the Lord, which is, which was and is to 25 come the Almighty. So, John, to the seven churches

which are in Asia, right? Okay. John says --JOHN: Of course, Asia to him back then was 2 an enormous area, too. 3 DAVID: Oh, sure, it was. Sure. JOHN: 5 DAVID: It was a part of the Gentile region 6 7 where the Gospel was to go. 8 JOHN: Yeah. I, John, who also am your brother and 9 companion in tribulation -- which we're not in 10 tribulation today like John was -- and in the kingdom 11 and patience of Jesus Christ -- you know, got to wait 12 on him, right? Was in the isle that is called Patmos. 13 14 It's a prison island. For the word of God and for the testimony of Jesus Christ. So, in those days you get 15 in trouble for preaching the word, couldn't you? 16 17 JOHN: Uh-huh. DAVID: I was in the Spirit on the Lord's day 18 19 -- which --I guess you still can in some parts of 20 21 the world. Oh, sure. I was in the Spirit on the DAVID: 22 Lord's day and heard behind me a great voice as of a 23 trumpet, saying, I am Alpha and Omega, the first and 24 the last. What thou seest, write in a book and send it 25 to the seven churches which were in Asia. And then the

churches are given. JOHN: Uh-huh. 2 DAVID: Okay. In Chapter 2, Verse 1, we say 3 that he writes to the churches of Ephesus and he writes 4 5 and the counsel is given. Okay. This is in your own leisure time, you can see in the next continuing 6 chapters that he writes to each and every church. 7 For instance, in Chapters 3, Verses 14 --8 9 JOHN: Uh-huh. 10 DAVID: -- he says, and unto the angel of the church of the Laodiceans write, these things saith the 11 Amen. Now, Amen in Hebrew means you can't add to or 12 take away. When someone says, water's wet, you can't 13 argue with them. So, the Amen is the faithful and true 14 15 witness, the one who sees it, he's got all the details together, he knows the facts. And besides, the 16 17 beginning of the creation of God. Now, we know in the beginning was the word, 18 19 right? 20 JOHN: Uh-huh. DAVID: Was with God, was God, and the word 21 was made flesh wasn't it? So, this is Christ. 22 I know thy works that thou art neither cold 23 I would thou wert cold or hot. 24 nor hot. So then because thou art lukewarm and neither 25 cold nor hot, I will spew thee out of my mouth.

Now, this is the angel of Christ talking. 1 This is Christ talking to his angel, right? 2 JOHN: Uh-huh. 3 DAVID: An indifferent attitude or a 4 comfortable attitude in this church is going to get 5 them spewed out of Christ's mouth. Now, if Christ is to confess your name before the father, you're a goner. 7 Now, what's the problem with this church here? 8 Because thou sayest, I am rich and increased 9 with goods and have need of nothing and knowest not 10 that thou art wretched, miserable, poor and blind and 11 12 naked. Their evaluation of wealth and greatness is 13 not so in harmony with God's, is it? 14 JOHN: Uh-uh. 15 I counsel thee to buy of me gold DAVID: 16 tried in the fire that thou mayest be rich and white 17 raiment that thou mayest be clothed and that the shame 18 of thy nakedness do not appear. Anoint your eyes with 19 eye salve that thou mayest see. 20 As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten, be 21 zealous therefore and repent. 22 Behold, I stand at the door and knock. 23 If any man hear my voice and open the door, I 24 will come in to him and will sup with him and he with 25 me.

To him that overcometh -- overcometh what? 1 2 Lukewarmness. So, you've got to be 100% for or 100% against, right? 3 JOHN: Uh-huh. 4 5 DAVID: Will I grant to sit with me in my throne even as I also overcame and am set down with my 6 7 father in his throne. How did Christ overcome? He was the word of God, wasn't he? 8 JOHN: He died, didn't he? 9 DAVID: Yeah, but he -- by the word of God, 10 right? 11 12 JOHN: Sure. DAVID: And through the word of God we 13 overcome because God's word can never be overthrown. 14 He that hath an ear, let him hear what the 15 Spirit said to the churches. 16 Now, if you sin against the Spirit, you're 17 going against the Holy Ghost which is unforgivable. We 18 already learned this in the Gospels. Okay. 19 After this I looked and, behold, a door was 20 opened in heaven and the first voice which I heard was 21 22 as it were of a trumpet -- which is the angel of Christ --23 24 JOHN: Uh-huh. DAVID: -- talking with me, which said, come 25 up hither and I will show thee things which must be

hereafter.

Now, this is to continue way beyond the scope of the churches of Asia and their messages.

And immediately I was in the spirit and, behold, a throne was set in heaven. And then becomes a subject of God sitting on a throne, right? And he's the creator of all things.

And in Chapter 5, Verse 1, and I saw in the right hand of him that sat on the throne a book written within and on the backside, sealed with seven seals.

JOHN: Uh-huh.

DAVID: It's a scroll, okay. And I saw a strong angel proclaiming with a loud voice. Who is worthy to open the book and to loose the seals thereof? And no man in heaven nor in earth, neither under the earth, was able to open neither to look thereon. The book cannot be open. It's a secret. Now, the great Apostle, John, says in Verse 4, that I wept much because no man was found worthy to open and to read the book, neither to look thereon.

And one of the elders saith unto me, weep not, behold the lion of the tribe of Juda, the Root of David hath prevailed to --

JOHN: How do you -- how do you interpret paragraph 3?

DAVID: It's simple. No man -- means

absolutely no man. JOHN: In heaven? 2 DAVID: Neither on earth, neither under the 3 earth, who is able to open, neither to look thereon. 4 JOHN: Uh-huh. 5 DAVID: It's impossible. Only one man, only 6 the lion of the tribe of the Juda, the prince of the 7 kings of the earth can open this book. It's simple. 8 JOHN: Well, it can also mean, I guess, that 9 it's not going to be open until you get to heaven, huh? 10 DAVID: No, because you'll find as they 11 continue on the promise is that it's to be revealed on 12 13 earth. JOHN: Okay. 14 DAVID: You see, that's the whole key to it. 15 But this is where I get in trouble at first, John. 16 JOHN: ...ll right. 17 DAVID: Once we bring out the truth and bear 18 witness to the truth, the fact is no man. So, you 19 cannot respect any man according to the flesh. You 20 cannot judge. In other words, after John's day, there 21 was revelation of Jesus Christ that nobody could reveal 22 but who? Christ, himself. Now, why was Christ killed 23 2,000 years ago? Was he just a man? No. 24 JOHN: No. 25 DAVID: No. He was the son of God, wasn't

DAVID: Oh, all through Matthew, Mark, Luke 6 7 and John, Matthew 24. 8 JOHN: Okay. DAVID: Luke. Say, he -- there's, there's 9 actually more than just the second coming. 10 11 explain. Let me, let me continue on. JOHN: Go ahead. Go ahead. 12 See, for lack of biblical knowledge 13 DAVID: -- like in the first statement, he comes in clouds. But Daniel 7 will explain when that event takes place. 15 16 Okay. Here we go. Now, it says right here that the 17 Lamb --JOHN: Where are you? 18 DAVID: We're here in Verses 4 again. 19 20 JOHN: Okay. Go ahead. No man, absolutely no man in heaven, 21 DAVID: nor in earth, neither under the earth, was able to open 22 23 and look thereon. And I wept much because no man was found 24 worthy to open and to read the book and then look 25

thereon.

And one of the leaders saith unto me, weep not, behold, the lion of the tribe of Juda, the Root of David hath prevailed to open the book and to loose the seven seals thereof.

JOHN: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And I beheld and lo in the midst of the throne and of the four beasts and in the midst of the elders stood a Lamb as it had been slain. Now, we know Christ has been slain years and years before John received the revelation.

JOHN: Uh-huh.

DAVID: But, nonetheless, in heaven he still is the Lamb that's been slain, having seven horns and seven eyes. That means complete power and complete vision, you know. God's number is seven. That's the number of completeness, isn't it?

JOHN: Uh-huh.

DAVID: Which are the seven Spirits of God sent forth to all the earth. Now, we seven the seven Lambs are the seven spirits. The seven eyes are the seven spirits. Only Christ completely sees what the spirit of God has to say. Only Christ knows what the book teaches, clearly. Do you see?

JOHN: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And he came and took the book out of the right hand of him that sat upon the throne and when

he had taken the book, the four beasts and four and twenty elders fell down before the Lamb, having every 2 one of them harps, and golden vials full of odours 3 which are the prayers of saints. In the mediatorial work of Messiah, he's the high priest. 5 covenant is based upon his righteousness and that on 6 the cross he said, father, forgive them, for they know 7 8 not what they do. 9 JOHN: Uh-huh. DAVID: I mean he completely knew the 10 prophecies, didn't he? 11 Uh-huh. 12 JOHN: DAVID: It must be fulfilled. He kept 13 saying, it must be fulfilled. 14 JOHN: 15 Sure. DAVID: But then he said, into thy hand I 16 commit my spirit, the revelation bears witness to the 17 fact that what Christ did not teach, of which he said 18 to the disciples, I have many things to say unto you 19 but you cannot bear them now. Okay. So, there's a 20 continuation sometime after John of these subjects to 21 be brought back to view. 22 Now, the prayers of saints cannot be directly 23 given to the father except were to pray to the father 24

And they sung a new song, saying, thou art

in the name of Christ and Christ mediates.

worthy to take the book and to open the seals thereof, for thou wast slain and hast redeemed us to God by thy 2 blood out of every kindred, tongue, people and nation. 3 And has made us into our God kings and 4 priests, and we shall reign on the earth. 5 And I beheld and I heard a voice of many 6 angels round about the throne and the beasts and the 7 four elders and the number of ten was ten thousand time 8 ten thousand and thousands of thousands. These angels 9 are gathered --10 JOHN: Uh-huh. 11 DAVID: -- all around here, too. You all 12 don't see them but you'll see in the prophecies what 13 we're talking about. 14 Saying with a loud voice, worthy is the Lamb 15 that was slain to receive power, riches, wisdom, 16 strength, honour, glory, blessing. Seven things there, 17 huh? 18 And every creature --19 We're in, in paragraph 11? JOHN: 20 DAVID: Uh-huh. 21 They're talking about the thousands 22 and thousands and you say these angels are surrounding 23 24 here. Oh, yes. 25 DAVID:

JOHN: Why do you say that?

DAVID: Well, you're fixing to find out in 1 the prophecies. See, you're fixing to find out what it 2 means about the 20,000 chariots and thousands of 3 See, the prophet -- the prophetic word all 4 meets its climax in one final --5 JOHN: And I can say angels are surrounding 6 where I'm sitting right here. 7 DAVID: Well, true. I, I'm, I'm glad --8 JOHN: Yeah. 9 I hope you believe that. DAVID: 10 JOHN: Sure. 11 DAVID: Okay. Fine. Okay, now. And every 12 creature which is in heaven and on earth and under the 13 earth and such as are in the sea, and all that are in 14 them heard I saying, blessing, honour, glory, power to 15 him that sitteth upon the throne --16 JOHN: Sure. 17 DAVID: -- and unto the Lamb. Okay. And all 18 the four beasts and everyone says, Amen. Okay. 19 they worship. They're going to live forever and ever. 20 And I saw when the Lamb opened one of the 21 seals and I heard as it were the noise of thunder, one 22 of the four beasts saying, come and see. 23 And I saw and behold a white horse. He that 24 sit up on him had a bow and a crown was given to him 25

and he went forth conquering and to conquer.

JOHN: Uh-huh. 1 Now, here shows a vision or a 2 3 prophecy that Christ reveals in heaven, something that heaven has to review. A doctrine from God in regards to the work of Christ that must be reviewed in the 5 investigative judgment of heaven. 6 Now, does this seem like a peaceful Christ? 7 Just because he's talking about the 8 white horse, he sat upon him with a bow? 9 10 DAVID: Well, you know, one time in the days of Ancient David a bow and arrow was a very serious war 11 weapon, wouldn't you think? 12 JOHN: At one time. 13 DAVID: But not today? 14 JOHN: 15 No. DAVID: So, therefore, if God has foreborn to 16 fulfill his prophecies from ancient times, then they 17 have to be modified, don't they? 18 Well, that's, that's open for 19 JOHN: interpretation, I'm sure, isn't it? 20 Exactly. Now, who only can review --21 22 Goes like this, are, are you in there with a crown? 23 I've got a crown on my head. DAVID: 24 25 JOHN: You know, are you sitting with -- are you sitting on a throne?

DAVID: No, remember, the father sits on the 1 throne. You're right, an interpretation. But what 2 have we already learned? The prophets are not subject 3 to men but subject to one spirit, God's spirit, right? Okay. As Corinthians teaches us. So, therefore, if 5 the prophets are subject not to their own minds but 6 what they were revealed, what God revealed to them, 7 then we've got to remember that the little game or the 8 little test which is going to judge the world is based 9 upon one truth. Whether true or not, is it not stated 10 that the first seal -- and tells of a white horse who's 11 rider has a crown, who has a bow, who goes forth 12 conquering and to conquer. 13 JOHN: Uh-huh. 14 DAVID: And would it not imply that the 15 conquering is based upon the implement of the bow? 16 Does he conquer with his bow? 17 JOHN: Well, that's kind of stretching 18 things. 19 20 Oh, you're not saying that he's using Conquer -- to conquer someone --21 his bow? He's not saying what, what he's doing 22 JOHN: He just says that he had it. 23 with it. Exactly. And he went forth, went DAVID: 24 25 forth conquering and to conquer.

JOHN: Sure.

DAVID: Okay. So, maybe he's not using his 1 Maybe he's, maybe he's just using his crown, his 2 3 authority. JOHN: That's a possibility, isn't it? DAVID: Okay. But nonetheless, anyone 5 conquering and to conquer with a bow would no doubt be 6 7 using a weapon to do so. 8 JOHN: Uh-huh. The most obvious understanding of it. 9 But, of course, we could spiritualize. We could say, 10 well, let's see, the bow is the truth because when men 11 hear truths, it sticks in their heart. And the crown 12 is no doubt the inauguration of Christ in his heavenly 13 kingdom. And the white horse is a symbol of purity. 14 So, the pure truth goes forth conquering and 15 conquering, right? We could say that. It could be 16 spiritual. 17 JOHN: Or we could say that, you know -- you 18 could go on and on on how, how it could be interpreted. 19 DAVID: And everybody has their own 20 interpretation. 21 And I, I can't argue that. 22 JOHN: DAVID: Okay. Exactly. 23 You know, everybody can interpret JOHN: 24 25 things --

DAVID: Differently.

JOHN: Sure. 1 DAVID: Except for the fact that we know only 2 the Lamb really knows what this thing is, right? 3 JOHN: You --4 DAVID: We both agree to that, don't we? 5 It's an interpretation. 6 JOHN: DAVID: Okay. Well, I'm saying but Christ, 7 himself, would definitely know what this is all about, 8 wouldn't he? 9 I can't argue that Christ would, no. 10 DAVID: Okay, fine. Now, let's just take a 11 look at one more seal, just to get a picture. 12 And I saw -- Verse 3, when he'd opened the 13 second seal -- and I heard the second beast saying, 14 come and see. 15 And there went another horse that was red and 16 17 power was given to him that sat thereon to take peace from the earth and that they should kill one another. 18 And there was given him a great sword. 19 You know, how --20 JOHN: Where are you? Where are you? 21 DAVID: We're at Verses 3 of Chapter 6. 22 JOHN: I see 3. 23 24 DAVID: Okay. And he opened the second seal and 25 JOHN: heard the second beast say, come and see.

DAVID: And there went out another horse that 1 2 was red. JOHN: Go ahead. 3 DAVID: And power was given to him that sat 4 5 thereon --JOHN: Uh-huh. 6 7 DAVID: -- to take peace from the earth. JOHN: Uh-huh. 8 DAVID: That they should kill one another and 9 there was given to him a great sword. 10 JOHN: Uh-huh. 11 DAVID: Oh. How do these things reveal 12 Christ. John? 13 You tell me what your interpretation 14 ` JOHN: 15 is. DAVID: Well, I don't want to do that. I 16 just, you know --17 JOHN: Why? 18 DAVID: Because mine is no better than yours. 19 JOHN: Well, you're telling me it is. 20 DAVID: No, no, no. I'm not going to tell 21 you but what I'm fixing to do is prove something to you 22 if you will receive it. 23 Now, we go back here to Chapter 3. Now, now, 24 see we're at a deadlock, right? We both agree that 25 whatever these seals are being revealed in heaven, that

we both may have different opinions on the subject. 1 2 correct? 3 JOHN: Uh-huh. 4 DAVID: But, remember, it's neither my right nor your right to give our opinion because, clearly, 5 John states that this is a revelation of Jesus Christ 6 7 which God gave to him and only he can reveal it. We both agree to that, correct? 8 JOHN: That God can reveal it? 9 DAVID: No. 10 JOHN: That Christ --11 12 DAVID: That only Christ can reveal it. 13 JOHN: Sure. 14 DAVID: Okay. We agree to that. JOHN: However --15 DAVID: However --16 17 JOHN: -- we do have our own intellect and we 18 do have our own ability to interpret things. 19 DAVID: Reason together. That's why --JOHN: Sure. 20 21 DAVID: -- God says in Isaiah, let us reason together. 22 23 JOHN: Sure. 24 DAVID: So, we both reason that --25 JOHN: But, but we do have that ability. DAVID: Exactly. On, on, on the

contrary, if a man does not open his eyes and his mind and choose within himself to see the light as it is opened, he cannot be of the kingdom of God. Remember, Peter tells us that the salvation of God comes in truths. So, as we take step by step in perceiving what

truth may be, then the truth which is a light will enlighten their intellect and help us to see things even greater than before.

David says in Psalms 119 that the word of thy mouth is like a lamp unto my feet and a light into my path which shines brighter and brighter until the perfect day. Okay. So, so all we're looking at at the present time is that some time after John's day, he's being shown a vision of a time when God will sit on a throne. He will have a book in his right hand and he will give it to his son, Christ.

JOHN: Uh-huh.

DAVID: Of which Christ will, in heaven on a sea of glass, open the seven seals of which until these things are made plain, we will really not know the meaning of it. But we're to know what they revolve around, though. So, anybody can say --

JOHN: So, it's like you or I saying Christ is, is on a sea of glass. How, how are you going to interpret that, too, right?

DAVID: Well, no, the thing of it is is that

all of the prophecies already tell you what the sea of glass is. It's not really a glass. 2 JOHN: No. 3 DAVID: It's a sea. We know that Christ 4 walked on the waters on earth, didn't he? 5 JOHN: Absolutely. 6 DAVID: And we know in heaven that --7 8 JOHN: Well, at least some of us believe that. 9 DAVID: Well, until we really can see it, we 10 can only have faith, can't we? 11 JOHN: Uh-huh. 12 DAVID: You know, I mean until some of us 13 really see the manifestation of the power of the glory 14 of God, we can only by the hearing of faith have a 15 hope. 16 JOHN: Hey, it's like the Apostles didn't 17 believe it was Christ that came before them after his 18 death, right? 19 DAVID: Exactly. JOHN COX: Um-hum. 5 DAVID KORESH: Noah said God was going to 6 bring a flood, and the world says, no, he won't. God 7 did. And they perished. So, then, God says to Noah, 8 I'm not going to bring a flood, and here's my rainbow so that when you look upon it you may know my word and 10 my covenant. I am not going to. And the world says 11 yes, you will. So, they built a tower. The Tower of 12 Babel. It was called the Tower of Confusion because 13 God knocked it down. See? God does not allow men 14 always to finish what they have spent many long hours, 15 days, and years to build --16 17 JOHN COX: Um-hum. DAVID KORESH: -- when it's contrary to his 18 19 word. 20 JOHN COX: Um-hum. DAVID KORESH: So, in the Book of Revelation, 21 from the papacy all the way through, men in their 22 ignorance have built churches --23 JOHN COX: Um-hum. 24 DAVID KORESH: -- built faiths, built hope, 25

but, really, God who sits on a throne has a rainbow

13	No. The seven seals have been taught ever since 1985.
14	Oh, there's thousands of people out there in the world
15	that know about the seven seals.
16	JOHN COX: The seventh seal.
17	DAVID KORESH: The seventh seal?
18	JOHN COX: Yeah.
19	DAVID KORESH: That's the trumpets.
20	JOHN COX: Yeah. Is it all going to be
21	revealed just to a selected few or are all going to
22	have the opportunity to hear it?
23	DAVID KORESH: Well, what happens is, and
24	we're dealing with three parts of a harvest. The wave
25	sheath is the first of the first roots, as Christ and
	the wave sheath of 2,000 years ago. On the 18th day of

the first month -- right? -- in the morning, first day of the week, there's an -- a wave sheath offering to the high priest of barley. That's the first ripe selected grains of the harvest, and that's offered unto God as a thank offering and a guarantee for the rest of the harvest. The second part on Pentecost is the wave loaves, which contains wheat.

JOHN COX: Um-hum.

DAVID KORESH: These are weighed before God, and then the commencement of the whole harvest takes place, all the way to the final harvest, which is the grapes. So, the ceremonial system of God was ordained and designed to be a picture of how God in the latter days would bring and teach his truth to people on earth, and the first ones that would mature in his truth seeing eye to eye when the Lord brings against Zion, learning the seven seals, the lamb's seven eyes, Isaiah's eye to eye?

JOHN COX: Um-hum.

DAVID KORESH: You see? Isaiah says that the, that the wicked in the nation that the lamb will come to will provoke the eyes of his glory. See, God has a truth he wants men to know, but he will never ever break his covenant. Only through Christ will he bring the last message. And this is why the world ends up being punished and destroyed, because they will not

hear. Okay. Now, for instance, right here, the picture is that he's a-raging, aren't they? I wonder why? Well, they don't want the lamb to reveal the 3 seals, do they? So, God finally has to said -- to say -- I'm doing everything in my power to keep this from 5 happening -- God is saying I will speak to them in my 6 7 wrath and vex them in a sore displeasure. They don't want this person to have his rightful position with 8 God, do they? In verse 6, though, it says yet have I 9 set my king upon my holy hill of Zion. Now, you know, 10 John, it would be a supernatural thing for God to come 11 and impeach, impeach Mr. Clinton and all these 12 13 different leaders of this nation, right? And to humble 14 this nation and to --15 JOHN COX: The thought's, the thought's been there more than once. Go ahead. 16 17 DAVID KORESH: Well, I mean, I don't want that to happen. I would rather have Mr. Clinton be a 18 19 priest and a king. JOHN COX: You bet. 20 DAVID KORESH: Of a greater kingdom. I want 21 ev-- see, I don't really -- where I come from, toys are 22 toys, but people are worth more to me than anything. 23 24 Remember, after all of heaven bows down for the lamb, there's only one passion on his heart, and that's to 25 come again in the rhyme of the book, and together,

together, the last of the people that shall receive the kingdoms of eternal glory. Look out there at the stars tonight. You want to go home? You want to find out 3 what's out there? Well, let's listen. Yet have I set my king upon my holy hill of Zion. This is where God 5 has to intervene and the lamb stands on Mount Zion, 6 doesn't he? With a-hundred-and-forty-four thousand, 7 whoever they are? Well --8 JOHN COX: Um-hum. 9 DAVID KORESH: -- I will declare the decree, 10 Do you know what the Lord said unto me? He said 11 thou art my Son. This day have I begotten thee. 12 know that's hard for you to believe. But it --13 JOHN COX: He also said that we are all here 14 to serve him, didn't he? 15 DAVID KORESH: Well, the thing of it is 16 you're not serving me, because you don't know me yet. 17 JOHN COX: I'm not serving you? 18 DAVID KORESH: Well, you are. I have to 19 admit you're listening to me and forebearing with me. 20 JOHN COX: That's more than a lot of people 21 have done, huh? 22 I know, and I appreciate that. DAVID KORESH: 23 But, see, one thing that --24 JOHN COX: But I'm serving you in other ways. 25 DAVID KORESH: Well, that's true too. So,

let's --JOHN COX: Well --2 DAVID KORESH: -- continue with the word --3 JOHN COX: I mean, I took an oath to serve 4 5 you, right? (chuckling.) DAVID KORESH: 6 JOHN COX: Didn't I? 7 DAVID KORESH: Yes, you took an oath to 8 9 serve --JOHN COX: -- to uphold the Constitution and 10 laws of the United States. 11 DAVID KORESH: Exactly, which are secondary 12 to God's laws, correct, John? 13 JOHN COX: I can't argue there. 14 DAVID KORESH: Okay. 15 JOHN COX: But we do have the separation, 16 don't we? 17 DAVID KORESH: Of church and state. 18 19 JOHN COX: Yep. And I don't want any of 15 16 these young men around here to get a whipping. Now, is this prophecy revealed so that we can know Christ is 17 coming to whup our butts? No. It's revealed so we can 18 know not to mess with the man who's got the seven 19 seals, because he's going to whip our butts. Why? So, 20 21 it says right here. It says here, be wise now, therefore -- John. Ye kings of the earth, be wise. Вe 22 instructed. Let's learn these seals. DAVID KORESH: Look, I'm showing you the 8 seals. 9 JOHN COX: I think you're avoiding the, the 10 question. 11 DAVID KORESH: John, I am the Lord. 12 JOHN COX: See, that's what you're trying to 13 14 say. DAVID KORESH: That's what I said. 15 JOHN COX: That's right. 16 DAVID KORESH: Well, look here in Psalms 4, 17 for instance. Here's what I'm doing right now, in 18 Psalms 4. Hear me, 0 -- when I call, O God of my 19 righteousness. I mean, is God right? Does he have a 20 book? Is it right? Did he give it to the lamb? 21 that right? Is the lamb going to come with his reward? 22 I mean, do I have something here that I'm trying to 23 share with you, John? 24 JOHN COX: Yes, you do. 25 DAVID KORESH: Thou has enlarged me when I

was in distress. Have you ever had a vision? You know. God can take me back and forth --JOHN COX: What, what did we discuss last 3 4 night? DAVID KORESH: What we discussed last night 5 about -- well --6 JOHN COX: A vision. 7 DAVID KORESH: A vision. 8 JOHN COX: And, and you seemed to be por --9 perplexed as to whether or not I could have a vision. 10 Now, you're just asking me if I've ever had a vision. 11 DAVID KORESH: Well, have you? 12 JOHN COX: Sure. I know I have. 13 DAVID KORESH: Okay. What did you learn? 14 JOHN COX: But why were you perplexed at the 15 fact that I could have one? 16 DAVID KORESH: Because there are spirits that 17 are not in harmony with the words of God that God has 18 given to me that I might know the path to walk. John 19 the Revelator had a vision and he said what must be 20 hereafter is a revelation of the seven seals, Jesus 21 Christ. Now, if we're not in harmony --22 JOHN COX: I think you're dodging my --23 DAVID KORESH: -- with that spirit --24 JOHN COX: You're dodging --25 DAVID KORESH: No, I'm --

JOHN COX: -- my question. 1 DAVID KORESH: -- making a statement saying 2 you'd better question the spirits. John tells us to 3 try the spirits to see if they be of God. Well, the spirits of God are subject to the spirit of God. God 5 is not the altar of confusion. What one prophet said, that's the foundation. And we must see and be shown 7 that all the prophets are in perfect harmony. 8 9 Otherwise, we're out of harmony with the spirit of God. That's what I'm saying. That's why he calls us 10 Babylon. The Catholics are not having the same visions 11 as the Lutherans as the Presbyterian, Methodists, 12 Baptists, and so forth. So, we've got to have some 13 14 foundation, Brother John. JOHN COX: Well, I -- I'm not saying that I, 15 I or anyone else is having a vision because of their 16 17 religious belief, that they are Protestant, Methodist, Baptist, Catholic. An individual, not because of his 18 19 or her religious belief, but -- a religion per se, but the fact that they believe in the Lord, can certainly 20 21 have a vision. DAVID KORESH: 22 Okay. JOHN COX: You, you, you --23 24 DAVID KORESH: So --25 JOHN COX: -- you don't believe that? DAVID KORESH: Well, I just happen to know a

little bit -- maybe a little bit more about it. Maybe. You don't know that, but maybe. 2 JOHN COX: Well, you're telling me the Lord. 3 Obviously, you do. But I, I'm just saying that a 4 5 person --See, if I tell you I'm --DAVID KORESH: 6 JOHN COX: -- because of their strong belief 7 in the Lord. 8 DAVID KORESH: Look, if I tell you I'm the 9 Lord, you cannot believe me. 10 JOHN COX: No, I can't. 11 DAVID KORESH: You can only believe what 12 God's word says. You can only sit there until I've 13 shown you the seven seals, and then you will see. You 14 have a --15 JOHN COX: But you said they've already been 16 Didn't you? 17 shown. DAVID KORESH: In heaven they were received, 18 but when they're brought to earth the heathen will 19 20 rage --JOHN COX: And I asked you --21 DAVID KORESH: -- and say --22 JOHN COX: -- if you were only going to let 23 the people in the compound see the seven seals, and you 24 said no, others have already seen them. 25 DAVID KORESH: I've been showing them ever

since 1985 is what I said to you. JOHN COX: But are you going to keep them to 2 the people within that compound or are you going to --3 DAVID KORESH: 4 JOHN COX: -- let the rest of --5 DAVID KORESH: Everyone is --6 JOHN COX: -- the world know about the seven 7 8 seals? DAVID KORESH: Well, look, here's what's 9 fixing to happen, okay? Let's look at a couple of 10 Psalms real quick, and then I'll show you why I've got 11 weapons. All right? That's the original question, 12 isn't it, John? 13 JOHN COX: And we're having a tough time 14 getting there, though, aren't we? 15 DAVID KORESH: Well, if you're listening to 16 learn --17 JOHN COX: Patience is a virtue. 18 DAVID KORESH: Exactly. Thank you. 19 JOHN COX: Go ahead. Where are we going? 20 DAVID KORESH: Psalms 4. 21 JOHN COX: Hang on. Go ahead. 22 DAVID KORESH: Hear me when I call, O God of 23 my righteousness. Thou has enlarged me when I was in 24 distress. I'm in distress now, John. Have mercy on 25 me --

JOHN COX: Did I put you in distress? I hope not.

DAVID KORESH: Well, my father says in the 3 Psalms that the wicked is a sword. So. Hear my 4 prayer. Oh ye sons of men. You, John, all of you 5 individuals that are on the outside, how long will you turn my glory into shame? How long will you love 7 vanity and seek after leasing? But know, John, that 8 the Lord has set apart him that is godly for himself. 9 Come on up hither where I come from, John. Who has 10 been separated from all of heaven? Who only is worthy 11 to open the book? Who? The Lord will hear when I call 12 unto him. Stand in awe, John, and sin not. Commune 13 with your own heart upon your bed and be still. 14 about this. Offer the sacrifices of righteousness. 15 right. Does God sit on the throne? Yes, Dave. 16 got a book in his hand? Yes, Dave. To give the lamb? 17 Yes, Dave. Is this the mystery of God? Yes, Dave. 18 When there's time no longer will this mystery be 19 finished? Yes, Dave. Am I going to come with my 20 reward to give it to every man if they'll receive it? 21 Yes, Dave. That's righteousness. And then put your 22 trust in the Lord. There will be many that say who 23 will show us any good. That's the attitude of the 24 world right now. The Lord lift thou up the light of thy countenance upon us. The father is fixing to show
