MR. KORESH: 20 MR. HARWELL: Yeah, and I don't know how --21 I'm not proficient in, in, in telling you my thoughts. 22 All I can do is talk straight at you from my heart --23 MR. KORESH: Yeah, well, we told them --24 MR. HARWELL: -- that, that I care for you 25 out there and I want -- that's why I insisted on coming

in here and talking to you because I don't want anything to happen. You've been our folks out there. 2 MR. KORESH: Right. 3 MR. HARWELL: You all are part of our 4 community and we've always respected that. 5 MR. KORESH: I appreciate that. 6 MR. HARWELL: And I continue to respect it. 7 So I, I insisted that I have an opportunity to talk to 8 9 you. MR. KORESH: Well, I did everything I could. 10 See, we knew, we knew that there was an agent across 11 the street. We knew that for the past two months. And 12 Richard -- Robert Garcia -- Gonzalez, you know, he was 13 coming over and all that and I told him he could shoot, 14 you know, on the back of the property there. 15 MR. HARWELL: Sure. You've been congenial in 16 that kind of thing out there, yeah. 17 MR. KORESH: Well, we were -- well, see, we 18 don't have nothing to hide but the thing -- everything 19 we do it comes, it comes out of the book, right? 20 MR. HARWELL: Yes. 21 MR. KORESH: And our doctrine is a little 22 different than a lot of people, but --23 MR. HARWELL: Sure, I respect your doctrine. 24 I know you respect mine. 25

MR. KORESH: Right.

MR. HARWELL: And I, I would not -- I'm not 1 skilled at that, but I'm -- I've been an old Christian 2 for as long as I can remember. I'm 65 years old now, 3 I'm no kid --4 Uh-huh. MR. KORESH: 5 MR. HARWELL: -- and, and that's why I'm 6 concerned about you folks out there. We have a -- you 7 know, I love life and I, I know --8 MR. KORESH: Uh-huh. 9 MR. HARWELL: -- that you all do. 10 MR. KORESH: Uh-huh. 11 MR. HARWELL: And that's what I want to do is 12 see all of you come out safely so that you can go on 13 with --14 MR. KORESH: Well, big brother's got us 15 penned in a corner now because they made a lot of 16 promises --17 MR. HARWELL: Well --18 MR. KORESH: -- to me, they made a lot of 19 promises to me and we started sending the kids out and 20 they've not kept any of their promises. And then they, 21 and then they twisted my words around and, and they've 22 made me out on the TV to be a liar and stuff and that's 23 not the way things are really happening here. MR. HARWELL: Well, let me tell you my 25 position here, David. I'm the Sheriff and I do have

some authority here and if you and I talk and I'll tell you it's going to be a certain way that's the way it's 2 going to be. I'm not going to tell you that something 3 will --4 MR. KORESH: Hello? 5 MR. HARWELL: Yes? 6 MR. KORESH: Hello? 7 Yes? MR. HARWELL: 8 MR. KORESH: Okay. 9 MR. HARWELL: Are you there? 10 Yeah. The phone just -- okay, MR. KORESH: 11 go ahead. 12 MR. HARWELL: I want to be honest and up 13 front with you, David. I don't know how to do anything 14 else but just talk to people and be honest with them, 15 don't tell them you're going to do something if you're 16 not going to do it --17 MR. KORESH: Right. 18 MR. HARWELL: -- don't, don't scheme behind 19 people's back, and if I tell you I'm going to do 20 something I'll stand on it. Now, if there's something 21 I can do that you can suggest to me that we could get 22 this thing resolved by doing I'll, I'll sure make my 23 best effort. But that's what I want to do is whatever 24 I can do to help you feel safe in coming out out there, 25 you and your people, not just you but all of you people

out there. You all are our folks and I -- that's my --2 MR. KORESH: Well, you know --3 MR. HARWELL: -- main concern as Sheriff now. 4 I want this thing to, to end with you all's safety as 5 well as the safety of the other folks out here. 6 MR. KORESH: Okay. Well, you, well, you know 7 we were ready to come out the other day? 8 MR. HARWELL: I heard that and I heard --9 and, and David, you're not the kind of man that I know 10 would give his word and not keep his word unless maybe 11 you had some reasoning in your mind. I don't know all 12 the details on that. But I've known you as a man of 13 your word or I would have never let any of my people go 14 out there to visit with you in the past. I've always 15 trusted you. When David said it's that way, it's that 16 17 way. MR. KORESH: Well --18 MR. HARWELL: And I want you to feel that way 19 I, I don't think you've ever caught me 20 telling you something or telling anyone something that 21 I, I didn't speak with my word. 22 MR. KORESH: Well, I've always -- like I, 23 like I told the officers that came out, I said, you know, in '88, you know, you all did us a bad deal. said, but of course we're all human, we all make

mistakes, not everybody knew every detail of that and I 1 says, you know, I don't hold that against anybody. 2 MR. HARWELL: I've made many --3 MR. KORESH: And we --4 MR. HARWELL: -- mistakes, David, yes. 5 MR. KORESH: -- well, that's just a human, 6 human thing. 7 MR. HARWELL: Sure. 8 MR. KORESH: But the thing of it is is that 9 like I told them I said, you know, when we're dealing 10 with the seven seals now we're dealing with a biblical 11 subject that everybody can, can have an opportunity. 12 I've told the feds that all I ask of them is to, is to 13 show me where the seals are found in the prophecies. 14 Now, they've yet to do this. Now, they've got -- most 15 all those guys there are Catholics and, you know, some 16 guys are, are --17 MR. HARWELL: Yeah. 18 MR. KORESH: -- pretty strong, you know, 19 with, with the Vatican and all that. 20 MR. HARWELL: Sure. 21 MR. KORESH: And I've told them -- you got 22 all these preachers and all these teachers and all 23 these great scholars around the world. I says, it's 24 the least minimal thing that I could ask for, you know, 25 just them to show me where the seals are found in the

I, I have certain 10 responsibilities and authority as Sheriff. And --11 MR. KORESH: Why didn't you all -- you know, 12 when I came into town and stuff like that, you know, I 13 jog here every day, Robert Gonzalez knew that, why 14 didn't you all just arrest me on the outside somewhere 15 instead of bringing everybody --16 MR. HARWLLL: David, I can't tell you this 17 because I wasn't involved in this --18 MR. KORESH: Yeah. 19 MR. HARWELL: -- from, from my personal stand 20 21 point. MR. KORESH: It was ATF. 22 I wasn't involved in it MR. HARWELL: Yes. 23 personally so I can't tell you why. I know how I would 24 have done it probably if I had been there. But I can't 25 answer truthfully to you and I don't want to mislead

you and I can't answer to you truthfully about someone else. I'm only held responsible for my, my actions and my, my attitudes and I, I assure you that I will try to be responsible and show you all every consideration that I can, every courtesy that I can, and, and --

MR. HARWELL: -- after this thing is over.

We're not, we're not mad at you folks here locally. I

don't think anyone else --

MR. KORESH: Well --

MR. HARWELL: -- these, these negotiators, I've talked to them and David, believe me, they have been working out of consideration and concern for you folks out there for, for this thing to be resolved and no one else get hurt: that's what we're all concerned -- and then after this is over and we're all settled down and away from all this, this thing that's going on right now, then we can sit down and talk and be reasonable and sane with each other and, and, and show our caring for each other. But right now we're at a stalemate where we can't. According to what I'm told, now, I'm, I'm -- I haven't been in -- you know, I just demanded that I talk to you and, and not knowing all the thing, I know how I feel about you and I wanted to express these things to you personally from my own personal feelings for you.

MR. KORESH: Right. 1 MR. HARWELL: And I can assure you that my 2 authority as Sheriff in this county is much greater than, than most people realize and I, I assure you that I can work with these folks. They are not mean folks, 5 they're just -- sometimes we get in circumstances and 6 we don't understand each other and don't take time 7 to --8 MR. KORESH: To take a look. 9 MR. HARWELL: Yeah, that's right. 10 MR. KORESH: Well, like, like I said, I want 11 to -- I already told them that my intention was to come 12 out. But now like I say, you know, I realize that 13 people are (indiscernible) the spirit of prophecy, but 14 my God tell me to wait and that's why I'm doing and 15 people here are being tested and tried and, and those 16 who want to come out can come out. I know --17 MR. HARWELL: David, is there any way --18 pardon me for interrupting, I didn't mean to interrupt 19 you because I'm not normally a rude person but --20 MR. KORESH: Go ahead. 21 MR. HARWELL: -- again, my concern is the 22 safety and the well-being of you and all the, all the 23 folks out there --24 MR. KORESH: Would you like to talk to 25 anybody?

MR. HARWELL: -- and what I want to do is, is 1 2 ask you to tell me, tell me what it would -- what we 3 need to do, what you would feel comfortable with, tell me personally and I'll see that it's done. I'll talk to the people here. I'm sure I can work with them 5 if -- and I will -- before I do anything I will be in contact with them and be sure that we're working 7 together and that they're not going to do anything except under the conditions that we talk about. So I'm asking you to please tell me what I can do to give my 10 personal guarantee of what I can do to get some counsel 11 12 from you on how we can resolve this thing. 13 MR. KORESH: Well, as I told them before, they, they don't seem to understand or believe me. Ι 14 told them that I am not worried about the judicial 15 16 system --17 MR. HARWELL: No, don't worry about that, David. 18 MR. KORESH: "-- I'm, I'm not worried about --19 I'm not going to commit suicide. I told them point 20 21 blank that I am willing to come out. It just lies between one thing; my God told me to wait and that's 22 all I'm doing. This right now -- the seven seals, the 23 24 subject is going all around the world now. People are

being wakened up to realize that in the Book of

Revelation now there is a revelation of Jesus Christ

25

pertaining to seven seals. When there's time no longer this mystery is to be finished as God declared to the prophets. These are very plain statements that anybody 3 in their right mind can understand. 4 MR. HARWELL: Certainly, and I want you to 5 have the opportunity to, to -- and I will afford you 6 that opportunity. You know I'm, I'm, I'm in a position 7 where I can afford you an opportunity to talk to every 8 news person in this --9 MR. KORESH: Well, that's --10 MR. HARWELL: -- country through one or two 11 people if I can get you to, to help me get --12 MR. KORESH: See, all it is right now is that 13 they're just -- they want to hurry up and they want us 14 I can't -to come out. 15 MR. HARWELL: Well, my only hurry, David, I 16 wouldn't mind sitting here for a month if I knew no one 17 else would get hurt. My concern about hurrying is that 18 I know you have some children out there, I'm concerned 19 20 MR. KORESH: Right. 21 MR. HARWELL: -- about your health because I 22 understand you've been hurt. 23 They promised us milk, they MR. KORESH: 24 promised us milk. They -- I gave them \$1,000, Mr. Harwell. I sent \$1,000 cash. I sent -- we sent Mark

out and we told him now, you know, we, we need six 1 gallons of milk for the babies because the women that 2 have the babies, you know, the, the stress and all that they're losing their milk. 4 MR. HARWELL: Yes. 5 MR. KORESH: And we sent also -- with the 6 first children we sent for one or two gallons of, of 7 milk that we have here. 8 MR. HARWELL: Oh, those are the sweetest kids 9 I had an opportunity to see, so David, believe 10 me --11 MR. KORESH: Well, we still got a bunch more 12 here (indiscernible). 13 MR. HARWELL: Those are the sweetest kids and 14 look --15 They're saying they're abnormal MR. KORESH: 16 because we teach them to respect everybody. 17 MR. I'm not a mean person, I -- and that's what 6 I want to do is get your input or your ideas on how we 7 can resolve this thing under terms that are satisfied -- that's within reason that will satisfy 9 you. 10 MR. And I hope, you know, as we were talking a little bit earlier about the -- putting the news report and the media in proper perspective, that, you know, a lot of people viewing that are going to have to stop and study it and try to, to use -- be a little bit flexible in their perspective in order to understand, you know, where he's coming from and all the relationships there that we might have seen in the tape.

STEVE: Right.

MAX: So it is going to -- And while it is very touching -- And we all agreed out here that, you know, that this kind of redoubled our efforts to, to see a peaceful conclusion to this thing.

STEVE: Um-hum. Well, I'm hoping, you know, like to get him back -- get him on the phone with you and you can work and see what happens, you know.

MAX: Well, I was very encouraged by so many of the things that, that I heard him say.

STEVE: Yeah.

MAX: And it means so much to be able to look at somebody when they're saying something and see the sincerity that --

STEVE: Well, he knows a lot of you guys, like yourself and Harwell, are putting forth an effort and, from your understanding, especially in a -- I know it's hard. It seems like you can do more at times, but it's -- To me the greatest, I guess the hang up right now for any movement -- I mean, really, and it's difficult, there's no question. And that's with him and his experience with his God, when the God says to him, you know, wait. And we're all sitting here wondering what's going on, how long, and -- And even today I had some pretty -- I had a lot of questions for him, okay, what's going on, what now, and how come, and it came back to he says well, the same one that showed

•

me the information that I gave to you.

And he says, you know, you can leave any time you want. He says, but the same one that showed the information that you think is there in the Bible that you haven't been able to controvert or any of the people that you've connected with, and said is the same one that now tells me to wait. I mean, I've -- You know, it's, it's a unique thing in this generation and in the world that someone can go so deeply into sciences. Well, he's not done that with the press or anybody, but he gets into astronomy, physics, matter, antimatter, breaks down molecules, gets into the constellations, gets into sciences I've never heard before, and I, I'm a person that's been schooled and have pursued knowledge and information most of my life.

And when the guy gets into gemstones and, and their laminations, passing laser and the power that comes through the laser beam through these gems and why and how, it's a mind blower. It's -- it is literally a mind blower. Or when he gets into how the pyramids got there and why they sit on sand, such a soft foundation, when each block is made -- It's so heavy and so much tonnage and, of course, they fit so perfectly well. Well, what were they there for in the first place? Why'd they make them?

And we had a couple engineers around once and

he opened that up and, I tell you what, I'd never heard anything like it in my life. But the sense, the logic to it, and it's the same source of information that tells him to wait, same source of information that when I tried to rip him apart from every angle when I first met him, as I'd done with almost every denomination, I was not able to do it. In fact, it actually frustrated me and annoyed me when I couldn't nail him to the wall. And, on the other hand, when I'd hit him with so many questions, what about this, what about that, he'd go back and show me an answer, not give me an opinion or theory.

Like you were saying, many interpretations, but let's see a human being, let's see anybody with asking a question go back in such a volume of chapters and relate them and harmonize them. But, see, this is the reason why I'm here. If it wasn't for that, I would be long ago back in Hawaii, living my life, going to the beach once or twice a week with my exercise program and probably teaching. I mean, that's where I'd be. I really loved Hawaii, I loved the people there.

MAX: That sounds good to me right now.

STEVE: Well, it, it does. The truth of the matter is every day I've got to go through that kind of a battle, you know, the kernel, the fleshly versus the

spiritual. Every day you get the urge to go back and, 2 and live that life. But it comes to an end. I mean, for all of us. I mean, you might live -- be able to 3 live out your X number of years, I might myself, but death comes to every man, every living creature on this 5 This is a cemetery here. Why? What's going on 6 7 here? How do we get here? Is it evolution? creationism? How'd we get here? Where we going? 8 9 We're so complex. We hear in stereo, we see in stereo. So is there an author of life? Is there someone out 10 there saying have you human beings had enough, do you 11 12 agree with me that it doesn't work down there? Man's cried for peace for 6,000 years and all 13 the prophets say when man cries for peace in the final 15 days, sudden destruction comes. So are these guys -- were they drunk? Were they eating pizza late 16 at night and had bad dreams and wrote them down, or is 17 there some reality to the words they speak? So, see, 18 these are the issues I've been wrestling with in the 19 past, especially six, seven years since meeting him. And, you know, of course, you know, the lifestyle out 21 here, as you would hear, is not the most -- one of the 22 most delectable or desirable one would ever want. 23 MAX: Well, just like anything else is 24 25 subject to different interpretations. Everybody has their own heaven and hell, you know. It's the same way

with the assignments, the places that, that people are asked to work during their life. 2 3 STEVE: This is true. 4 There are -- You know, many people would dread being in downtown New York and many others 5 would dread being in downtown Waco. 6 7 STEVE: But, Max, is there a --MAX: And many would feel the opposite, so --8 9 STEVE: Right, but is there --MAX: -- I think we're up to different styles 10 11 here. 12 STEVE: True. 13 MAX: But there's something that's got to hold us all together. There's something that's got to 14 give us a -- towards -- to march towards. 15 16 STEVE: Well, this is true, but some have --In this world there's -- In my lifetime even I met very few human beings that really care where they came from 18 or where they're going or the possibilities of an 19 eternal life. In other words, very few have a love for 20 truth, whether it's in the spiritual realm, whether 21 it's political, whether it's health, anatomy of the 22 body, what makes you tick. I've been one of those kind 23 of people that -- I'm interested in how come disease 24 happens, where does cancer come from, what you eat you 25

are, I've heard.

1 And I have found through a lot of studying that when one eats a very wholesome diet and so forth, you're free of a lot of the diseases that others get, 3 and that's logical to me. You can't just put anything you want in the carburetor of an automobile and expect 5 it to perform. Well, the human body's the same. Well, 6 in the political sphere all my life I've wondered well, why is it the way it is and how come no matter who gets 8 into office it basically progressively degenerates, it 9 10 seems, the society. 11 You look at the spiritual realm, there's a lot of people making money off of a book called the 12 Bible, but yet they can't answer the most stringent or 13 the most simple questions in relation to all these prophets, or even the apostles. 15 16 MAX: On the questions, that reminds me --17 And pardon me for interrupting. 18 STEVE: Oh, no, no problem. 19 MAX: But it's getting a little bit late 20 and --21 STEVE: Yeah. 22 -- I know that you all want to watch 23 some TV later. 24 STEVE: Right. 25 MAX: And we have had a request in here, I believe it was Dick --

1	STEVE: Okay.
2	MAX: yesterday morning Time gets away

4	STEVE: Oh, with me, also. I mean, I, I'm
5	losing total track.
6	MAX: It's like being in orbit somewhere.

25	MAX: We'd certainly like to speak with her.
	STEVE: Okay, hang on a minute. Let me go

7	MAX: I think two of her children were on the
8	tape, were they not?
9	STEVE: Let me think. Yeah, they were.
10	There was a Joseph, I believe, and a Isaiah.

12	STEVE: And, in fact, a third one, Crystal.
13	MAX: Yeah.
14	STEVE: Yeah, three of those were hers.
15	MAX: One of those he called Taco?
16	STEVE: Right.
17	MAX: Yeah.
18	STEVE: A nickname, yeah. Here's Julie right
19	now.
20	MAX: Okay, thank you.
21	JULIE: Hello?
22	MAX: Hello, Julie?
23	JULIE: Yes.
24	MAX: My name is Max. How are you tonight?
25	JULIE: I'm fine.
	MAX: I hope I didn't wake you up.

1 JULIE: No. 2 MAX: We got to talking and time got away from us a little bit. And we were also reviewing a 3 videotape out here in which a couple of your beautiful children were shown to us. 5 6 JULIE: Yeah. MAX: You should be very proud of them. 7 8 JULIE: Yeah. 9 MAX: You had asked Dick to, to see if we could not contact your brother Joe in Arizona. 10 11 JULIE: Yeah. 12 I wasn't one of those that spoke with him, but we did have someone go out. I'm sure -- I 13 know it was one of the female FBI agents that talked 14 15 with him. 16 JULIE: Yeah? 17 MAX: And in doing so, he asked if he couldn't send a message back to you and we said that 18 that would be okay with us. So he made a tape. 19 20 JULIE: Oh, he did? 21

MAX: Yes. And I have it here, and while the connection may not be the best in the world, if you are comfortable and in a position such as you can hear it, it's about a minute-and-a-half long, we'll play it for you.

JULIE: Okay, thank you.

MAX: Okay, hold on. It'll take just a second. The other voice you hear on here will be that of the female agent, I think at the beginning and at the very end.

JULIE: Okay.

MAX: Just hold on and listen.

UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE AGENT: Okay,

whenever you're ready you go ahead.

JOE: Hi, Julie. This is Joe, your brother. Julie, I've been trying for a long time now to get a hold of you. I'm really worried for you and your kids and everybody down there. I want -- I know that you want your kids to be out of there and I'm here to tell you that I will be there for them and I'll take care of them for you. But it's best that you come out with them, Julie. With these threats that Vernon, you know, threatening war against federal agents out there, that is suicide.

And if you stay there, I'm afraid something's going to happen to you. You're going to get hurt. You are no good to those kids dead and they need you. I can't raise five kids, Julie. Don't put me in that situation. I can't do it. But I will take care of them for you as long as -- Come out with them. You're going to

have -- probably have some legal problems at first, but once they find out you had nothing to do with the shooting, 'cause I know you didn't, I know that you haven't done anything wrong, I know you, they'll let you go.

You can come back here to Arizona.

I'll, I'll, I'll help you, Julie, you know I will.

I love those kids. I don't want anything to happen to them, but they need you, too. They need you. You need to come out with them. Your civil rights are not going to be violated. Everything will be -- Everything will turn out just fine, Julie. Just come out and I'll help you. We'll take care of things. The worst thing you can do is stay there and get shot, okay? Please, Julie, everybody's worried about you. Everybody.

I've been getting calls from -- even from Mexico, people worried about you. I can't sleep at night, Julie. Let's end this now, okay? Peacefully and -- start your life over here in Arizona with me. Nobody's there to attack your religion. You can practice whatever religion you want, you can worship your God any way that you want. Nobody is attacking that. The only reason those federal agents went out there is because of all the weapons that are in there, not because

they're attacking your religion. So, please, 1 let's just end this. Please. That's all. 2 3 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE AGENT: Okay. 4 Mr. Santaro, thank you so much. 5 MAX: Julie? 6 JULIE: Yeah? 7 MAX: That was the end of the tape. Did you 8 hear it okay? 9 JULIE: Yeah. 10 That was your brother, you agree? 11 JULIE: Yeah. 12 MAX: Okay. What do you think about what he 13 said? Did he sound serious? JULIE: Yeah. 14 15 MAX: Did he sound like he cared for you? JULIE: Uh-huh. 16 17 MAX: Do you want to come out and do as he asked? 18 19 JULIE: I don't know. 20 MAX: Well, I remember you mentioning the 21 other day that you needed Joe's permission to make the decision and I think you have it now. Would you like 22 23 to come out? It's very easy and I will guarantee your 24 safety. JULIE: If I go out, you guys will put me in 25 prison.

MAX: Did you hear what Joe said?

JULIE: Yeah.

MAX: And that's very true. You might have some legal problems at first. There will be some legal questions that have to be answered. I don't know what you did in there. I can't answer that question. But if you did not do anything to harm anyone, then you have nothing to fear from the legal system. It is a fair system.

JULIE: I already told them that my room was right above the door and all I had was trying to get my children drop onto --

MAX: Then you have nothing to worry about.

JULIE: -- the floor.

MAX: Then you have nothing to worry about. If you can just get yourself and your children out of there and what you say is true, you have nothing to worry about. But the longer you stay in there, the greater the chances are that something will happen in which you might become involved and might make the safety issue more critical and might put you in a position of possibly having more legal problems because of what might happen. Apparently, there hasn't been enough happen to this point for you to be -- for you to have any major legal difficulties.

JULIE: The old ladies that went out are

having difficulty.

MAX: Did you hear the end of that? That those charges have been dropped?

JULIE: Yeah, but there's a lot of lies on the radio, too, about us.

MAX: You're right, there are. And if you can come out and tell somebody your side of it --

JULIE: Nobody will want to hear me.

MAX: Yes, they will. I will guarantee you there'll be lots of microphones stuck in your face. There'll be lots of people wanting to know your side, probably more than you want to address at one time. So what you have to say will be very important, will be heard by lots of people. And you will be able to get legal assistance. You will be -- You know this legal system, it requires that you have a lawyer and before you make any statements, and you will be represented.

David, Steve, and everybody in there has told us, and we saw it again on the tape that he sent out, that everyone in there is free to come out whenever they wish. And you have Joe's permission to do it and you have my guarantee that you will be safe. And you have the guarantee of our government that your legal concerns will be addressed fairly. How many more guarantees do you need to come out and guarantee the safety and unity of your family? It's very simple,

I mean, he will do it. 4 5 JULIE: But some of them don't want to go and 6 I can't --7 I'm sorry, I didn't understand. 8 JULIE: My daughters don't want to go. MAX: Your daughters don't want to go? 9 10 JULIE: No. 11 MAX: How old are they? 12 JULIE: Thirteen and --13 MAX: Julie, do they really know the world as well as you do? Do they really know dangers as well as 14 I think at that age you, as a mother, know 15 what is best for them. When you were 13 years of age, 16 and even a few years older, I think you can look back 17 now and see you didn't have all the answers and you 18 didn't read all the people about you properly. 19 20 JULIE: The what? MAX: I think at that age you and I didn't 21 have all the answers and couldn't read all the people, 22 23 couldn't understand all the problems around us 24 properly, and we had to have adults help us make decisions. And those adults that helped you make 25

decisions were your parents and your family. And

they're there to help you now on the outside and you have to bring your children with you and do the right 2 thing for them, even though they may be influenced a 3 little bit to stay there. 4 5 It's -- We know it's not the right thing in the long run. Your brother said he loved you and he 6 cared for you and he just pleaded for you to come out. 7 You said you placed a lot of faith in what he told you. And you'll have the support of the family in Arizona and Mexico. Remember, he said you were getting calls 10 from Mexico. People down there are concerned, people willing to pitch in and do what was necessary to see you through this. And if you're thinking those -- that your only family is in there --JULIE: My mother's here, too. MAX: Sure. In there? JULIE: Yeah.

> You bring her out, too. MAX:

JULIE: She don't want to.

I'm sure they are concerned about her. Well, your mother may be old enough to decide for herself, but right now you need to make a decision that is best for you and your five children. And you've had Joe to help you. You said that was the thing that you needed. Now you know how Joe stands. Julie, come out with your children, where you know it's going to be

1 | safe. You don't know what -- how safe it's going to be 2 | in there.

I was moved by the emotion and the, the pain and the concern I heard in Joe's voice, and I know that, that you being his brother -- or his sister -- were certainly moved by it. I don't know what more you need to hear, Julie. Come out. Bring the children to safety now. You're the one that's ultimately going to be responsible for yourself and for those children. Why wait until the situation may get worse? Come out now while you still can walk directly into full safety.

JULIE: How can I believe anything you say? Everything that's on the radio is lies, too.

MAX: I didn't say everything was. I said some -- As Steve and I were talking earlier, you have to put those things in perspective and you have to use good common sense and look around and, and hear different points of view and then make your own evaluation about it.

JULIE: You know, all they're doing is getting ready to, you know, getting the public ready to come and, and, and do away with us. They're telling us that -- saying that we're provoking you.

MAX: Do you trust your brother?

JULIE: I'm telling you what I heard on the radio, what I'm hearing on the radio all day.

1 I'm reminding you of what I heard and you heard on the tape. Your brother said that he 2 trusted us and you to do the right thing. He said 3 that, that we would not violate your civil rights and 5 we would --6 Yeah, he could say that. But he JULIE: doesn't know what's going on. 7 8 MAX: Are you sure you know all of what's 9 going on, Julie? 10 JULIE: Well, I know what's going on here and I all I can do is just hear the radio what's going on 11 out there. And what they're saying is a bunch of lies. 12 13 That's a very small part of the whole world that you have in there. I don't know that, you 14 know, you can really say that you know all of what's 15 going on. I see a lot of what's going on out here, 16 too, and I see potential problems and I see weapons, and I'm sure you do in there, too. All these things 18 are not good. They are not a good surrounding for you 19 20 or your children. 21 JULIE: Well, you know, why did they come and, and do this to us, in the first place? 22 23 MAX: Well --24 JULIE: We weren't bothering anybody. 25 Did you see the tape that David sent out? He said that we would have to resolve this thing

and work it out and then see who was at fault, that there would be some investigation to determine who was 2 at fault. And that will be done. That's part of the 3 4 system. 5 JULIE: Nobody could beat the, the 6 government. 7 Wait. With all the media that's watching -- The world is watching this via satellite, 8 you know. How could the government, the ATF, the FBI, 9 anybody now with all this spotlight shining on us do 10 anything improper to you or anyone else? 11 12 They're going to do it. JULIE: 13 MAX: No, nothing improper, nothing illegal. JULIE: Yeah, they're going to come and get 14 rid of us all. 15 16 MAX: Get rid of you? Why would we want to do that? Why would we want to harm you? 17 18 JULIE: Because that's what they, that's what they came over here in the first place. You know, they 19 came shooting at us and climbing all in our windows and 20 everything. You know, this is our home. 21 I mean, what would you do if, if you'd have a bunch of men with guns 22 climbing all over your house and climbing in the 23 windows and, and, you know, shooting at you? 24 25 MAX: Okay.

JULIE: What would you do?

I understand your fear, I understand MAX: 1 There was some lack of communication. There were 2 some things done that shouldn't have been done. 3 was -- That's over a week ago. What has happened in 4 the last week? What has happened since then? You've 5 seen nothing. You've looked around and you've seen 6 nothing but, but guiet. And nobody has been hurt, 7 nobody has been threatened. Nothing has happened since then, since the cease fire was called. And that's what 9 10 we're in this for and that's what we're doing. JULIE: They're saying, they're saying that 11 we'll be treated fairly. Fairly in whose eyes? 12 mean, if we go out --13 In the eyes of the world, in the eyes 14 of the media. 15 JULIE: If we go out, we're going to, we're 16 going to have to go to jail. What about the ATF? You 17 know, they're the ones that came shooting at us and 18 they're free. So is that what you call free and, you 19 know, fairly? We're going to have to go out and go to 20 jail, not -- and they'll be free. 21 MAX: We don't know, nobody knows that you're 22 going to have to go to jail. We went through that a 23 little earlier and you said you didn't do anything. And if you did not do anything, then there will not be

any charges filed against you. That's not the way it

works, especially not with the world watching, with the media watching. 2 JULIE: Well, the media is not watching. 3 They won't let them. 4 5 MAX: Look, everybody cares. Everybody's concerned. Everybody knows the names of the people 6 that are in there and they will be covered by the media 7 and the results of what happens will be covered by the 9 media. And there is no --JULIE: Only what the FBI wants them to see. 10 11 No, no, no. No, no, no. We're talking about the courts, the justice system. 12 13 JULIE: There's no justice. 14 That is now even televised in many I don't have any say over what happens to you 15 places. after you walk out of there. 16 17 JULIE: Exactly. So why do, you know, you 18 have no say, so, I mean, how -- why should I go out by what you say? And then I go out and they're going to 19 do whatever they want with me. They're going to put me 20 21 in prison and throw away the key. 22 That won't happen. I'm saying that I, MAX: as part of the FBI, will not have any ruling on your 23 legal situation once you've come out. That will be 24 25 handled by a court of law, a judge, not the FBI, not

the ATF. Now, we could go on and on about the legal

1 | system all night long. You asked us to play -- to, to 2 | contact your brother. You said you needed --

JULIE: I wanted to talk to him.

MAX: -- your brother to help you make a decision. We did what we could do. We reached out and we got his opinion, we got his very words for you and we brought them to you. And he said Julie, for the sake of your children, for your own sake and for the caring of your family, here and in Mexico, come out, come out and raise your family. And now you're not listening to that recommendation. What more can I do, Julie? What more can any of us do? You said that you wanted to leave yesterday and now it sounds like to me

JULIE: I didn't say that.

MAX: Yes --

JULIE: See, that's why I know that they're lying on the radio 'cause I didn't say that. I told --

MAX: I heard most of your conversation with Dick yesterday. And I know that was --

JULIE: Well, I didn't say I wanted to leave.

I said that if I would go out they would throw me in prison.

MAX: Julie, I got you the response that you wanted, the clue that you wanted from yesterday, and that is Joe. Now, I wonder if I'm talking to you or if

1	I'm talking to someone in the background. If you want
2	to come out of there, you can. If someone is keeping
3	you from doing it, if someone is arguing with me
4	through you, then let's end this. It's not doing
5	either one of us any good. But if you want to come out
6	of there, you've had all the assurances that you've
7	asked for and more. It is your responsibility to you
8	and your children and your relatives to do that, to
9	come on out. Will you do it? Is someone giving you
10	things to say to me? Or is everything you said came
11	from your heart?
12	JULIE: (No verbal response.)
13	MAX: Julie, are you there?
14	JULIE: Yeah.
15	MAX: Are you speaking for yourself or is
16	someone speaking for you?
17	JULIE: I'm speaking for myself.
18	MAX: If I didn't hear the whispers, that
19	would be much easier to believe.
20	(Unidentified voice in background not
21	discernible.)
22	MAX: Julie?
23	JULIE: Yeah.
24	MAX: I'm talking to you and I expect that
25	you should respond to me. When I'm talking to Julie,
	I'm saying Julie, do what your brother, do what the

rest of your family knows is best for you and your children. And, Julie, do what you know is best, and that is come out. Come out where I and the FBI and the 3 courts and the media and the whole world can hear your 5 side of what has happened and see that justice is done for you. You will not be ignored, for sure. Come out 6 to safety. What more can I do, Julie? Tell me and 7 I'll do it. 9 I saw that film, I saw your children. 10 They're beautiful and I would not want to see them neglected or any way and I would not want to, to see 11 them harmed in any way. 12 13 JULIE: Well, they're over there treating the 14 other children that went out like if there's some, you 15 know --16 MAX: You saw the --17 JULIE: -- they're weird or something, like there's something wrong with them. They're not normal. 18 19 MAX: No, those children are together and I 20 -- If you've seen the tape --21 JULIE: Yeah, but they say that they're not -- That's what they're saying on the radio, that, 22 you know, there's something wrong with them because, 23 you know, they're so well-behaved. 24 25 MAX: You know the biggest thing that's wrong right now? They don't have their parents.

1 JULIE: Yeah, you guys took them from their 2 home. 3 MAX: David is the one that has split that home. You have an opportunity to come out with all of 4 your children, be together with them in a safe 5 6 atmosphere. 7 JULIE: David has been good to them. 8 I'm not going to, to argue that. seemed like from what I saw that he has been good to 9 10 them. 11 He has, and the kids love him. MAX: What response do you want me to give 12 your brother now? We'll talk to Joe again and what 13 shall I tell him? What's your answer? 14 15 JULIE: I love him. 16 Uh-huh, and what else? That you are not going to do as he wishes or the family wishes? 17 18 JULIE: My mother is here. 19 I understand your mother is there. Anything else I should tell Joe? Come on, what were 20 you going to say? Please finish. Please finish what 21 22 you were going to say. 23 JULIE: I don't know. 24 MAX: We'll relay back to him any message 25 that you want. What assurances do you need? JULIE: (No verbal response.)

MAX: What assurances do you need? You seem concerned about your safety.

JULIE: Well, see, when I was out there, I mean, you know, before I came over here, I didn't come over here because I wanted religion or anything. I was, you know, I was all, you know, strung out and everything and this is where they helped me.

MAX: We want to help you, too. And, and we can only help you if you tell us how. Please tell us what we can do to help. We don't think that the best future for you and your children is in there, especially with what's going on right now. Neither does Joe. So, please tell us how we can help you and how Joe can help you right now.

JULIE: I guess now the only one that could help is God.

MAX: Well, I believe lots of people have been asking for his guidance and assistance in this and that will continue. And maybe if we all listen closely enough we'll hear our own individual answer that will help us resolve this. But for now, what can we do and what can you do?

JULIE: I don't know.

MAX: Do you believe that it's -- there's some danger in leaving there, that, that you have a security in there that you would not have out here?

1 JULIE: Yes. MAX: Well, I can guarantee that's not true. 2 And I think you heard that in Joe's voice, too, his 3 concern. 4 JULIE: I don't trust the government. 5 6 MAX: Do you trust Joe? Would Joe lead you 7 astray? Would Joe give you bad advice? 8 JULIE: Yeah, but Joe won't have nothing to 9 do with it, no say so in it. Once I go and fall in you guys' hands, that's it. 10 11 MAX: No, it's not a matter of falling in anybody's hands, it's a matter to walking to the safety 12 of the free world. 13 JULIE: Free world? 14 MAX: And the justice system and the media. 15 This is no free world. 16 JULIE: 17 MAX: It's going to be broadcast --JULIE: Look at what they did to us. 18 MAX: -- to the world if you're willing to 19 20 tell it. else. You'll have plenty of opportunities to tell your story. And you'll have an attorney that will represent 2 you and make sure that you --3 JULIE: Yeah, and I leave and then what, what happens to my friends here? They all get killed. 5 out there to tell my story and what about my friends? 6 7 I love them. 8 They should all come out, also. JULIE: Yeah, what for? So they could put us 9 all in jail and throw away the key? 10 That's not going to happen, Julie, you 11 MAX: know that. That is not going to happen. 12 JULIE: Well, you could say that, but what, 13 you know, or the judge and all. I mean, this is the 14 government we're, we're, we're -- we'd be fighting 15 against. We have no chance. 16 17 It's our government, it's yours as much MAX: 18

MAX: It's our government, it's yours as much as mine, and we all are guaranteed equal treatment by a -- You will have every opportunity, every one, to tell your story. You will have other people that will help you tell your story. And there is no reason that I can think of, Julie, that you shouldn't listen to Joe's advice and come out of there.

JULIE: I could see where my brother would be so worried and concerned.

MAX: And I'm just -- want to restate to you what you have heard in the last hour and that is on the tape. And that you know who cares for you and you know who wants you to come out. And I'm asking you to consider that plea, both for you and your children.

Joe may be the answer, may be the person that God has chosen to deliver you. If I could place him down there at the end of the driveway in safety but that you knew it was him or, you know, wherever around there that, that you would that it's him and he would be safe --

JULIE: You would bring my brother here.

MAX: Hum?

JULIE: You would bring my brother here.

MAX: If you would come to him, I would as

soon as I could. I certainly would. 1 JULIE: Well, I think one of the, the guys 2 here, his mother wanted to come and, and you guys 3 wouldn't let him -- wouldn't let her. 4 5 I'm sorry, repeat that. I didn't 6 understand. 7 JULIE: Dave Thibodeau's mother wanted to 8 come over here and you guys wouldn't let her. 9 MAX: Well, you may be talking about just coming over there and walking out across the pasture to 10 that building. That would not be safe for anyone and 11 we could not allow that to happen. But we could allow people to approach with us in those safe vehicles that 13 you call tanks but safe vehicles to a distance where 14 15 you could --16 JULIE: We wouldn't hurt anybody. 17 MAX: -- to a distance to where you could see them and then you would know that you could come out 18 19 safely to them. 20 JULIE: Oh, so, you're using them --21 MAX: But we're not going to --22 JULIE: -- as bait. 23 No. You said that you wanted them there and I said I could bring him here and then you 24 turn him into bait. You asked for him to be here. I 25

said, yes. I will. And you can call him whatever you

want to when he gets here but I'll bring him. Do you 1 2 trust him? 3 JULIE: You have a way, a way of twisting 4 words around. 5 MAX: No, I have a way of listening and hearing what's been said. You have the way of listening to people around you who say things 7 differently on different occasions. I can hear them 8 talking long before I can hear you answering. So, I 9 know where you're getting your answers from. 10 I know where mine are coming from. 11 12 I just need some time. JULIE: 13 I don't think Joe -- that Joe has ever MAX: -- well, that's what you were saying yesterday morning. 14 You said you needed time and you needed a message from 15 16 Joe. 17 No, I said I had to talk to him. JULIE: 18 MAX: Well, you heard --19 JULIE: I didn't get to talk to him. 20 to hear him. 21 MAX: Sure. And I will give him the results of our conversation. 22 23 JULIE: Well, what are you going to tell him, that I don't trust him, that, that he's my enemy and 24 all that? 25

MAX: What would you like for me to tell him?

JULIE: That is what you -- you're twisting 1 2 my words around. 3 MAX: No, I'll tell him what you want me to tell him. 4 5 I just wanted to tell him that I love 6 him --7 MAX: Okay. 8 JULIE: -- and that I would like him to look 9 out for grandmother. 10 MAX: Look out for grandmother. That's the lady that lives in Waco? 11 JULIE: That's -- yeah, my grandma. 12 13 MAX: Okay. If you would come out, you can 14 look after grandmother. 15 JULIE: You guys wouldn't let me. MAX: I believe you'd have ever opportunity 16 in the world. 17 18 JULIE: Yeah, and then they also said on the radio that, that, you know, this -- the trial for this 19 case wouldn't -- it wouldn't be until like a year. So, 20 that means I would have to be in jail for a year before 21 22 it even goes to trial. 23 MAX: No, no, that is not true. That is not 24 true. 25 JULIE: Well, then --MAX: That is not --

JULIE: -- what is true than what they say on the radio? You know, who's -- I mean who's lying, you guys, the, the radio, you know? Then how could I trust anybody.

MAX: I believe that you may have heard that the trial will be a year from now and that's, that's probably right. But haven't you heard of making bond? I mean even for the worst people make bond. And I don't even believe you've done anything to be jailed for. So, you probably won't go to jail anyway and if you did for some short period of time, you'd immediately be available for bond. Your attorney would demand it, you'd get it, and you'd be out taking care of grandma. You're probably not going to jail, and they know you've got five kids to take care of. This is a good system now.

JULIE: They don't care.

MAX: Oh, yes, yes, everyone cares. Nobody can take care of your children better than you can. The judges know that, the world knows that. And if you haven't done anything, you will not be placed in jail. It worked once before. You said you didn't do anything.

JULIE: It wasn't theft.

MAX: You didn't do anything the first time and you weren't charged. You didn't serve any time.

--

1 Yeah, I had to put out a lot of money 2 that I didn't have. 3 MAX: Well, those things sometimes happen. lost money on deals, too. But what is it compared to a 4 5 life of fear and a life of danger and a situation where 6 surroundings are not healthy and there's a potential 7 for great problems? You've seen that. 8 JULIE: You mean you guys coming and wiping 9 us out? 10 No. Who's twisting who now? 11 JULIE: Oh, well, that's what's being heard 12 on the radio. 13 I think if you listen to the radio, 14 you'll hear that everybody is stating that we're going 15 to wait this out. We're going to negotiate and there 16 is not going to be any violence. 17 JULIE: Then why are they saying that this 18 week they're going to be putting those tanks through 19 the building? 20 I don't think anybody's said any tanks 21 were going through the building. If they did, they are 22 not telling the truth. JULIE: They're not telling the truth? 23 24 MAX: No. Because nobody's going to run 25 tanks through buildings that contain people.

JULIE: Why did they take the media away from

They don't want nobody to get any, you know --1 here? 2 MAX: We don't want them hurt. 3 JULIE: -- to see anything. 4 MAX: We don't want them hurt. 5 JULIE: Well, we weren't going to hurt them. 6 For a long time -- there were several MAX: 7 bullets flying around out there for a long time and there's still lots of ammunition out there and there's 9 always the chance of an accident. 10 JULIE: Well, we won't hurt anybody. you guys hurt them, then, you know, --11 12 MAX: The media is here. 13 JULIE: -- then they will get hurt. 14 MAX: The media is here. They're just not within shooting range of the compound. And it's not 15 only the media that we have to be concerned about. 16 It's people, ordinary citizens out there driving up and 17 18 down the road and --19 JULIE: You guys just don't want any witnesses to see what you guys did to us. 20 21 MAX: Julie, that is not true. 22 JULIE: I mean it's been done before. 23 MAX: Julie, it is not true. We are going to wait and resolve this safely. We will guarantee your 25 safety if you come out. JULIE: I guess by the end -- I guess by the

end of this week we will know if you're telling the 1 truth or not. 2 3 MAX: Well, we're going to know some day and you're going to know some day. We're going to sit and 4 wait and we hope that somebody will lead the way. 5 6 JULIE: Well, then if you believe in God, you'll give us time to wait on his word. 7 8 MAX: Haven't we been giving you time? 9 JULIE: Yeah. Well, just don't push us. 10 MAX: Nobody's pushing. We're just making 11 sure that --12 JULIE: Okay. So, what they're saying on the radio is not true? 13 14 MAX: You're starting to twist something here but I'm not sure what you're twisting. What part of 15 16 the media --17 They won't come -- they won't run JULIE: those tanks into our building, will they? 18 19 MAX: No, they won't. 20 JULIE: Okay. 21 MAX: No one has been hurt since the initial misunderstanding in this and that's the way it's going 22 to stay. We're making sure that everyone in there 23 knows that they have an opportunity to remove 24 themselves from those surroundings and come into the 25 rest of the world, the safe world out here, a world

where there's --

JULIE: But that world is not safe.

MAX: A world where -- a world --

JULIE: Haven't you heard of all the things that are happening, all the violence?

MAX: A world where the media and the listening public can hear what you have to say, can hear what David has to say, Steve, any and everybody else is going to have their day to be heard. And nobody's going to come storming in any place and wiping anybody out. And if we can have our wishes, nobody is going to be hurt at all, any time, any place.

David said on the tape tonight that this -that this is being resolved, that things are going to
work out and that we're going to see -- find who's at
fault in this thing. And that's exactly what's going
to happen.

JULIE: Yeah.

MAX: And nobody's going to get hurt. I want to make sure that you, your mother and all five of your children know because I'm going -- I'm going to have to get back to Joe and, and say something, but I want to make sure that you know that I played the tape for you and that I gave you the best understanding of that tape that I could and that we talked about it. And that you know that you can come out of there with your five

children and with your mother at any time you want --1 2 JULIE: (Indiscernible.) 3 MAX: Listen to me. Don't, don't be talking to somebody else while I'm talking with you. 4 5 JULIE: I was just telling my mom to go get one of my daughters. 6 7 MAX: Okay. I want you to know above all that you can come out of there at any time you want to 8 safety and that no one will harm you and that you will 9 get a chance to tell your story. Okay? I believe --10 Joe believes that, I repeated that. I understand that 11 there's going to be a television program that everyone 12 in there is going to watch at about 12:30. 13 14 JULIE: 12:30? 15 I think so. Everybody's going to be in there watching the TV, and it's going to be something about -- David's mother is going to be on TV, and it's 17 probably something that you will all want to see. 18 19 JULIE: Uh-huh. 20 I believe it's 12:30 a.m., up until a little after 1:00 or so, Channel 25, I believe. 21 22 JULIE: Channel 25? 23 I believe so. So, you know, I wanted MAX: to make sure that everybody -- do you all watch much TV 24 while you're in there? 25 Well, yeah, we, we see some of, you

know, some but we have better things to do. MAX: Uh-huh. Well, most of us do a lot of 2 the time. But I think this one might be one to watch. 3 Now, again, you know, we have to put all of it in perspective. We can't believe everything that's --5 that, that may be said, but it might give you, you 6 know, something else to think about. Now --7 JULIE: They killed all our dogs, too. 8 MAX: -- what do you want me to tell Joe, you 9 love him? And anything else I can tell Joe? 10 That I want him to look after JULIE: 11 grandma. 12 MAX: Want him to look after grandma in Waco, 13 that's right. 14 JULIE: To look for her. 15 To look for her. Well, I'll do that. MAX: 16 Now that I know her name -- I wish you could come up 17 with an address and a phone number or something that 18 would help us to find her and we would certainly check 19 into it and see how she was. And we'd let Joe know. 20 We'd get the two of them together. 21 Sheila? JULIE: 22 That TV show is called "A Current 23 Affair." 24 "A Current Affair"? I've, I've heard JULIE: 25 of it.

One of the greatest prophecies is found in the writings of Solomon in the Book of Ecclesiastes, a man who was to be the wisest man that ever lived, summed up all his life's experiences and his testimony in saying, well, it's found in Chapter 12. And it goes on to say

that the creator will rise up at the voice of the bird. 1 What bird? All theologians should be asking that 2 3 question.

I don't think that's the bird they had in mind.

STEVE: Well, no, but if I can -- we could 6 take you through chapters of Ezekiel, Jeremiah, Isaiah. 7 And like Isaiah 56, you'll find out God is hot about 8 people that claim to know him in the final days and do not know his warning message to the world, how you are 10 11 to be prepared, how you're going to miss the catastrophes, the judgments that will be poured upon 12 this world. See, that's the thing. So, like in 13 Malachi Chapter 2, it says God is so mad with ministers 14 15 and priests, he's going to spread the shit of animals 16 on their faces in the final days. Now, the Hebrew 17 literally says the word that I gave. People are 18 shocked to see that God uses language like that but he 19 does because in these final days it's something that's 20 very sharp to the point that people understand.

Okay. Well, there's no problem with there being reported then an increase in profanity if that's the way he planned it.

STEVE: Well, see, well, that's about it.

MAX: Okay.

But, see, like with that guitar, for

instance, when people claim and when they're making money off of a book that they really don't know and understand -- and that's been proven by our traveling the world -- allowing them to open up the pages by asking questions they cannot answer. So, here you have the, all these men just moving the masses by feelings, not by facts, not by the sure word that God said is so true and all true in every generation. So, this is why we had our artist draw a picture such as that. said, this is what we need. Then it gets the reaction of people saying, well, what about this, what are you really saying? Well, glad you asked the question. You want to see something opened up from your Bible? You go wrestle with the issues. We'll show you something, how the pieces of the puzzle fit. You go back and wrestle with the issues. If there's a God, you ask for a spirit of discernment to see what the truth is and what is not. See, this is really what is meant by that. But it's a serious thing when men claim to know God, making money off the masses, moving the masses. But like it says in Isaiah 56, they slumber, they're They, they don't They never get enough. greedy dogs. bark, they don't warn the people as to what God's impending judgments and that which is coming upon the world is. 25
