We all want to have fulfillment. 1 all want to have what we can out of this life. We want 2 to have a satisfactory life. 3 MAX: Well, just from, you know, the 4 observations and, and what we're able to obtain, again, 5 all taken with a grain of salt, it -- pardon me, but 6 you jump from the frying pan into the fire. And it 7 seems like you've got a situation there where there's 8 more motivations than pure religion going on. Can you, 9 can you argue that I'm wrong. 10 STEVE: You're very hard -- Max, I can hardly 11 -- there's not the kind of connection we had earlier in 12 the day. I don't know what's happened but it's --13 you're very hard to hear. 14 MAX: Well, I'll try to speak up. 15 STEVE: Okay. 16 See, I have a tendency to speak low, MAX: 17 speak low. 18 Yeah, the volume is -- even when STEVE: 19 you're speaking louder, it's not like, you know, a more 20 easy conversation earlier in the day where -- there's 21 no question -- I don't know what happened with the 22 connection but it's just not strong. 23 Just, just listen real close, then, if 24

STEVE: All right.

you would, please.

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I'll try to, to stay with you. MAX: 1 STEVE: All right. 2 What I was saying, basically, just 3 plain straight forward with it is I'm -- as I mentioned 4 to Wayne the other night on the phone, I'm, I'm an 5 investigator. I look around for facts and I look 6 7 around at things. STEVE: You are with the FBI, though, right? 8 MAX: Yes. 9 Okay. STEVE: 10 I'm a Special Agent with the FBI. 11 Okay. STEVE: 12 And I don't always see things in the 13 light of or the shade of religion or theological 14 considerations. 15 STEVE: I'm sure. 16 And, so, you know, looking in -- from 17 all the, the facts and the rumors and, you know, and 18 whatever sources and, again, taken with a grain or salt 19 or whatever, it just appears to me that, you know, 20 there's lots of other motivations besides religion 21 emanating from that compound. I've never seen --22 STEVE: As an example, do you want to give a 23 few or --24 MAX: Well, the, the sexual activity, 25 the monetary -- the way things are budgeted out there.

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In the, in the story you were talking 1 about people being greedy and having other motivations 2 besides religion and, you know, I can just look in 3 there now and it appears to me and it appears to a lot 4 of us out here that, you know, there's a certain amount 5 of greed. There's a certain amount of being 6 domination. 7 Well, let's speak about those --8 STEVE: It's not always, you know --9 MAX: Max, let's speak --STEVE: 10 11 -- apparent as a religious goal. MAX: STEVE: -- let's speak about those issues. 12 Let's speak about those issues, taking them one at a 13 time. What do you observe, what have you seen -- I 14 mean, obviously, you've never met myself or David or 15 many of these people here, none of these people here. 16 So, what, what are you speaking about when you say, 17 let's, let's take one a time, the greed or money that 18 you brought up? What do you see there? 19 I read and I have been -- I have seen 20 MAX: interviews of people who say that there's one person 21 that controls the money in there. 22 STEVE: Okay. If you read -- if you're 23 reading about him by those that say they have known him 24

or been around him, if you take a look, there's a book

that's been written. It's called "The Great

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Controversy", and it was written by an E.G. White. And
many examples are given through the years when
reformers would rise up like Martin Luther -MAX: Well, I thought you might have an

MAX: Well, I thought you might have an opinion.

STEVE: -- like Calvin and Knox -- pardon?

MAX: I thought you might have an opinion on it, being in there.

STEVE: Oh, I do have it. I'm going to get to that opinion in just a moment.

MAX: Okay.

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But when -- anytime you have a person STEVE: that's been educated by David in this group -- like Mark Breault, for instance, was the man that introduced me to David. He was here for three and a half years and he said that -- he told me he had never learned as much in his life as he did in three hours sitting with David, seeing him open up the Bible. This is what he told me. So, when I met David, the same thing held true in my experience with him and it's never been short of that. Mark, after three and a half years, chose to leave but he still called us friend and he said he was going to be -- those problems would be resolved between us. After six months of time, little by little, it became -- he became stronger and pretty soon he was adamant. He started telling us he was

going to use every phase and agency of the government 1 to get back at us. And pretty soon he started making 2 up stories and we let it go. We could have got --3 gained an attorney. We have one here. We could have gone after him for a libel suit, for slander and other such things. But if there's a God in heaven, he's in 6 control. And if this is not of God, it will fall to 7 the wayside and it will be nothing. It will have been a waste of time. On the contrary, if God is behind it, if there's a truth that can't be controverted, of which 10 we open up and share with people, it will stand strong. 11 And it has. So, Mark Breault -- I, I flew back to 12 Australia on behalf of David in November of '90. And 13 we asked him what his message was. This man didn't 14 have one. But he's continued on. He's the one that 15 caused myself and Sherri Jewell to take a trip to 16 Michigan about a year ago in defense of her daughter. 17 Yeah. Well, the question was, does one 18 person in there dominate all the money and the 19 (Indiscernible) and all that? 20 STEVE: Oh, not at -- no, not at all. 21 got plenty -- everybody here -- I could just go right 22 through the, the list. When there's a project that 23 we're working in, we all put in. We contribute what 24

we're --

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STEVE: -- really convinced what it needs. 1 MAX: Okay. 2 There's not anybody here that does --3 MAX: So, my understanding that one person is 4 in control is not correct? 5 It is not correct, positively not 6 7 correct. MAX: Well, why don't you all come out of 8 there, then? 9 10 STEVE: We can. MAX: Come on. 11 The only reason why we're waiting but STEVE: 12 it seems to go over the top of you because -- and I can 13 understand that. I would not judge you because you 14 lack understanding in what I speak of. You're ignorant 15 of the things. 16 MAX: Okay. 17 You can -- you and I can read STEVE Okay. 18 about people in the Bible, what happened to them 2, 19 3,000 years ago. That's not our experience. 20 MAX: Are you trying to say you don't want to 21 come out? I, I -- we're trying to get through so you 22 can watch T.V. So, is that what you're saying? 23 STEVE: No, what I'm -- no, in fact, more 24 than that, I love the outside, I love the inside. 25 love truth more than anything. I want to live forever,

Max. That's the bottom line. All my life, since the time I could comprehend, I've had a desire to know what the truth is about all issues.

MAX: I am really glad.

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Especially the spiritual world, especially the possibilities of lasting, living forever with total happiness. If there's something to that, I want to know about it. I want to ultimately experience that. So, wisdom to me is having your priorities straight. And what I've put first in my life is the pursual of that truth. And the truth has taken me to a source called the Bible, over the Bhagavad-Gita, over the Koran over the Buddha sutras, over those other all so-called holy books on the philosophies of men. that simple. And I have found in that book, by reading Isaiah 40-66 and Hosea 35 and Ezekiel 20 and 34 through 36 and numerous chapters of psalms. It talks about a young man that comes in the final days, doesn't work miracles but he opens the Bible and nobody can controvert him. And it also shows him to be a, a stumbling block because like it says in Psalms 40, he has more sins than the hairs of his head. So, 2000 years ago the Jews judged the Son of God, that we now believe was the Son of God. They didn't believe it. They judged him --

MAX: Steve, where you going, where you

going? Come back, Steve. Earth to Steve. Listen --STEVE: And now we Gentiles -- you and I are 2 Gentiles -- we are now going to be judged because we're 3 going to judge a truth for our day and we're going to 4 reject it just like all the prophets talk about. 5 Come back, Steve. Come back. Come MAX: 6 back. You're going too far. Please. 7 STEVE: See, you and I are in two different 8 veins. 9 MAX: Yeah, that's what I said. 10 STEVE: I told, told -- in fact, the 11 spiritual world is --12 MAX: We agreed on that a few minutes ago. 13 live in a factual world, realism. STEVE: Max, the spiritual world is not a 15 reality to you but it is to me. 16 MAX: Okay. 17 This world around you, the tangible 18 things, the chair you sit in, the car you drive, the 19 wife you look at, the children you probably have, 20 that's what's real to you. It is to me also but it's 21 not some --22 Is Judy still real to you? 23 STEVE: Oh, yes. 24 Do you have to share her with him? 25 STEVE: Not at all.

MAX: Is that right? 1 That's correct. STEVE: 2 MAX: Well, that's what a lot of this stuff 3 is saying out here. 4 STEVE: I know that and that's why I ---5 MAX: And that's not true? 6 STEVE: -- would like -- that's why I'd give 7 anything if you would have an open ear to hear what 8 David has to say. It --9 MAX: Well, I've heard plenty of what David 10 has to say. 11 STEVE: Have you listened to the tapes that 12 were all -- that he had conversation with all the 13 14 others? MAX: Conversat -- no, I haven't heard all of 15 them for sure. 16 I'm talking about like, say, he spoke STEVE: 17 with John and he has spoke with John and there's been 18 Dick and Henry and Gary and Jim. I mean that's quite a 19 few guys, and the majority of these, he's opened up the Bible to. In fact, I believe he opened up a number of 21 the seals to John Cox. 22 MAX: Well, there's been a lot of talk about 23 I know that. 24 STEVE: I, I haven't seen a scholar in the 25 world come forward.

MAX: You said you were happier. 1 STEVE: Pardon? 2 You said you and Judy were happier than 3 you've ever been in there. 4 Oh, most definitely because the. STEVE: 5 closer, the greater the vision becomes of the things 6 that aren't seen by the tangible eye --7 MAX: Are any of those babies in there Judy's 8 and David's? 9 There's babies here that are David's. STEVE: 10 The majority of all of these here that -- or shown are 11 his. 12 Yeah. Does Judy have one by him? MAX: 13 STEVE: Judy has a baby. 14 MAX: By him? 15 I think just for a stumbling block, I STEVE: 16 -- you know what I think I'll do, is I think I'm going 17 to leave that one as a, as an open thing for you. You 18 19 can --I think you answered it. MAX: 20 STEVE: You may say that but give me an 21 opportunity to show you something from the Bible, and 22 I'll give you the answer clearly. 23 MAX: I --24 I think I -- what I need is a little 25 hook with you there, Max.

Well, --MAX:

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STEVE: The sensational is always waiting around the corner for everybody, but there's a truth I definitely would like to have you see and to wrestle I know that you're a person -- I really -- I really have my doubts that you would ever dream we could be in the final days of 6,000 years of human probation, where man can prove to himself he can do no better than those before him. In fact, he only does worse, progressively degenerates, gets worse and worse. There's no peace in the world, Max and --MAX: Well, we all see degeneration a different way, too, don't we? STEVE: Well, this is true. But there's some things that --

There's degeneration of the, the MAX: family. There's degeneration of the government. There's degeneration of this, that and everything else.

STEVE: Positively. Sure there is. One can't, you know, we can't be ostriches, I mean, it's, it's all around you. Of course that's true. But, you know, that -- all that we're about, we have a love for people. We have a love for souls, a love for them to be able to see a truth and not judge their fellow man but judge the truth. I can't judge you, Max. I don't know you. And even if I did, I couldn't because I've

not walked in your shoes. I don't have your mind set. I haven't experienced what you have. That's why Christ 2 hanging on the cross said, forgive them for they know 3 not what they do. That's, that's the greatest opportunity of grace given to mankind since that 2,000 5 year period. So, we're all given an opportunity --6 MAX: Well, --7 -- to see a truth for our day and 8 that's what we'll be judged by. The truth we reject 9 one day will destroy us. That's why you have the story 10 of Noah and the Ark. Those that rejected hearing Noah 11 had to learn how to swim but they didn't swim for long. 12 MAX: Well, I'm accustomed to seeing things 13 or to having thing -- people point out things to me 14 from the scriptures or in theology that I'm -- I 15 haven't seen but I'm not accustomed to, to seeing the 16 communal living like is going on out there --17 STEVE: Of course you aren't. 18 MAX: -- with the, with the cloak of religion 19 and with the cloak of theology and -- on it. You know, 20 it's, it's too unorthodox from my perception. And 21 again, we have different perceptions. 22 I can -- well, of course it would be. 23 MAX: And (indiscernible) having a great 24

MAX: -- with that. 1 STEVE: We really don't because --2 And a lot of people are out here. 3 STEVE: -- if what you're saying is true, it 4 is more than bizarre. 5 MAX: Oh. 6 STEVE: I agree with you. 7 There's no 8 question about that. MAX: Was this ever -- this issue ever 9 confusing to you when you --10 But, remember, remember -- pardon? 11 STEVE: MAX: When you looked in the window and first 12 saw this all happening, before you gleefully jumped in 13 the middle of it, wasn't it odd for you? 14 STEVE: Everything right from the beginning 15 to me was a little out of the ordinary. Granted, no 16 question about it. The very place that these 17 individuals chose to live, it was a stumbling block in 18 19 itself. And the manner and so forth. MAX: How did they persuade you to leave with 20 them --21 It comes down --STEVE: 22 MAX: -- as strongly as you are, without 23 going into a sermon, please? 24 Well, there's no way I can share with STEVE: 25 you without doing that very thing.

Those things that are true must 19 be seen in a context as they are which you've not had 20 that opportunity. Just like in the Bible, there are 21 two reports -- if you ever look at Isaiah, Chapter 8, 22 there's a report called the Uriah Report. There's also 23

We did get the 13 Saturday paper --14 MAX: Uh-huh. 15 STEVE: -- when it first aired. And then the 16 following day Robert Gonzales was nice enough to bring 17 over a paper to us that morning and show it to us 18 before he left and ----19 MAX: Well, I know you don't get them all. 20 STEVE: Oh. Well, he's --21 That's why I thought you might be 22 interested in hearing something about this one, you 23 know, this article since it was about you. 24 STEVE: Max, David was talking to me where he 25

was saying, you know, what we just viewed on Current

Affair, of course, they did mention and showed and talked about the Abrams coming in and --2 MAX: Uh-huh. 3 -- about statements by David. STEVE: 4 here almost every time David has spoken. I've never 5 heard him say the very things that they're implying he 6 has said. But, anyway, you know, that's -- that will 7 be a judgment between you, God and us, I guess. 8 MAX: Well, we'll not argue specific 9 semantics, but I think over, you know, the, the last 10 few days the comments have escalated occasionally to 11 the point when we were both now uncomfortable with what 12 was said. So, we haven't prepared --13 STEVE: Well, you know, like --14 MAX: -- as like you said you all were 15 preparing. 16 There has been, you know, a great STEVE: 17 irritation, of course, because in starting the 18 communication process of Jim, you know, and you've 19 heard this I'm sure by listening to the tapes of the 20 conversations with us over and over again, there seemed 21 to be a very clear agreement with all back Sunday 22 evening, whereas we said that we didn't see any, any 23 problems with having Bradleys on the perimeter of the 24 property but not within or on the property itself. And

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that, and that never --

Yeah, I've heard that gone over many 1 2 times. 3 STEVE: And, yeah, you have, but contrary to that, it's almost gotten to the place of redundancy that the amount of times I've been called late at 5 night, early in the morning, throughout the day. You 6 guys -- your men will see somebody peeking out a 7 window. They'll see, I don't know what, a --8 MAX: We just don't want any accidents. 9 10 just don't --STEVE: But, no, but, you know, it's been, 11 12 it's been a one --MAX: -- one person out of control to cause 13 14 It's been a one way street, though. 15 That's the point. See, it's been a one way street. 16 There's been really --17 MAX: Well, we listen to all your concerns. 18 STEVE: You know, you, you read intimidation 19 by some of the words we've said, apparently, but on the 20 other hand, your actions have spoken louder than your 21 words. 22 Okay. Has anybody been hurt? MAX: 23 On one hand, we -- on one hand --STEVE: 24 That's our main action. Has anybody MAX: 25 been hurt since this whole thing?

STEVE: Well, okay, wait now. Wait, Max, 1 On one hand, you've seen our good intent right 2 from day one when we were barraged by bullets and men 3 who first killed our dogs and they shot up where the 4 women and the children were. 5 Uh-huh. MAX: 6 And they killed an old man, Perry 7 Jones, who's never hurt a flea or a fly in his life, 64 8 years old, no arms, no, no weapons, no anything, standing by the front door. 10 MAX: Most regrettable day. 11 He was killed immediately. Well, not STEVE: 12 immediately. In fact, he groaned and moaned in, in 13 pain for a long time. But that's the way it began. 14 MAX: A most regrettable day and we're all 15 glad --16 STEVE: Most regrettable day. 17 -- that nothing like that has happened MAX: 18 And those are the actions that speak the 19 loudest right now --20 STEVE: But the point is -- wait now, but, 21 Max, Max. 22 MAX: -- that tell us our communication is 23 what it's going to take to resolve it. 24 STEVE: But the point being, we showed even 25 our good intent that when your men -- or not your's,

| what -- the ATF --

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MAX: Okay.

STEVE: I'm the one that initiated the communication, was Wayne Martin and myself --

MAX: Uh-huh.

-- and initiating that communication STEVE: and speaking with Larry Lynch of the Sheriff's Department and then, finally, the FBI, and, of course, the ATF. We were the ones that said, well, come on and get your wounded and get them to the hospital. We didn't fire on anyone. They were all in the sights of those that were here. These guys were mad but they were, they were hurt inside for the people that were hurt and what had taken place. They showed nothing but goodwill and good intent all the way through. And right away that evening, here comes Bradleys, here comes, you know, some pretty strong words on behalf of the agencies. We still then didn't squawk and make a big noise about it. But we have been constantly barraged by, you know, phone calls from yourselves about every time we go to the bathroom or look out a window or something, we're to report to you. run over our guard shacks. You move personal property. You get into personal property, the vehicles in front, with total disregard. I mean even though you haven't called us, you haven't followed through on agreements -

It goes a long way to have something like that, viewing, filming, as one would walk out or there would be a connection ahead of time to see -- I mean right from the beginning, that Sunday and into the evening, we talked with a number of people. And it did not slow down the negotiation process of which we were ready to get involved in right from the beginning. In fact, we were yelling, what is going on here? There are women and men and children. Wayne and I were screaming on the phone, saying, call them off. Whatever happened to communication? Why -- if there was a problem here, why didn't someone come to the door and talk to us. has told all your men that he jogs out front. Him and I had been up to Dallas. We had been in, in Waco doing business as of the last couple of weeks. They could have taken him. The Sheriff could have come and got He knows these men. He's, he's trusted in them. And then Robert, himself, we suspected him, like we've told the story over and over again. And I'll tell you the details why. But, still, we liked the guy. Is it

wrong to like someone that might be here for other 2 motives and suspicious of us? David tried every way possible to open up his home and ourselves to him and 3 we thought we were really getting somewhere with the 4 man. And 7 then the way his alarm went off with the car and someone happened to be looking out the window, by the way, and saw one of his roommates all of a sudden then 10 move from the water tower. And, so, all these 12 things -- and the main thing, God told David and David 13 told Robert before he left, what you have to do, go out 14 and do. MAX: Haven't seen Jim in I guess since two days is the last time he talked with him. He had another major assignment to go to. And, you know, the world still goes on out here for us. We have varying things to do and they're going to get moved around and in and out and -- so, he appreciates your patience in recognizing all of us as different individuals in, in dealing with us.

DAVID: Right.

MAX: But to restate, these last 12, 24 hours have been, been most encouraging. And we appreciate it. And I feel that the people in there appreciate it. You tell us, David, just in that line and I just had this inspired thought -- I was -- in closing, if you couldn't guess -- but like you a lot of times, I found another thought. The people in there that I talked to earlier seemed to be very concerned that we are going to come through the door with guns blazing or that we're going to run over that place with a tank.

DAVID: Well, they didn't get the report.

MAX: I, I don't, I don't believe you really believe that, and I wish you could, could calm them just for the sake of humanity that, that we are not going to lead a charge on that place that will cause destruction of innocent people.

DAVID: Well, Max, can I, can I interject a thing here?

MAX: You certainly may.

DAVID: I did everything that a mortal man can do to communicate with Robert Garcia -- Gonzales, excuse me. And that morning when the ATF agents were coming, I did everything I could do for him to be able to say, hey, wait a minute, let's back off. Those communications did not meet fruition as we desired but I did stand in the doorway there when they drove up. And I, I made, I made it very plain, you know. I couldn't hear anything they were saying. They all jumped out and they were all screaming at one time which makes, you know, definitely -- you've been to a football game and you hear a roar but you don't hear what anybody's saying, right?

MAX: Yeah.

DAVID: And, and it was -- and like I say, I was standing there and I did receive the, you know, the first shot was fired at us. Later on heard on the radio that one of the ATF agents admitted that his gun went off accidentally. Said the home study 3 process requires applicants to complete forms, 4 financial information, medical exam, and so on. 5 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: So --6 JOHN DOLAN: So there all with, there all 7 with your husband, to make a long story short. JOHN DOLAN: Well, I understand all the 10 children -- the ones we saw here when we came up and 11 called back were extremely polite and, and really well-12 behaved. I mean, super-well-behaved, so they were --13 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: That's good. That's the 14 way they were trained to be. 15 JOHN DOLAN: Well --16 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: It's just that if this 17 video does show them jumping around and hollering and 18 screaming, we're probably going to be a little upset 19 with them, but --20 JOHN DOLAN: Well, I can understand that, but 21 you got to understand a couple of things. I guess one 22 is that they're not exactly with their parents and they 23 -- they're being kids -- they're with --24 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah, I, I know.

JOHN DOLAN: -- children, so --

25

KATHRYN SCHROEDER: When my kids are not with 1 me, they are holy terrors too. 2 JOHN DOLAN: We all tend to -- they all tend 3 to deviate from the norm, you know --4 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah. The minute I leave 5 the room, I know. 6 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. Yeah. Well, it would be 7 nice if you could come out and, you know, be with Brian 8 and that would be quite wonderful I'm sure and that 9 would -- if you could be with the other three too. 10 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I, I hope that can be 11 worked out. I really do. 12 JOHN DOLAN: Well, I, I know David will let 13 you go anytime you want to so --14 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Well, that's not, that's 15 not, that's not it at all. It's the other end. 16 JOHN DOLAN: No, I know that. I know. I 17 know you -- but it would be wonderful if you could be 18 reunited and then it would be --19 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah. 20 JOHN DOLAN: -- very, very special and you 21 know be a nice thing. Be a real nice thing. 22 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: It would, it would be 23 good if, if, if the voice was heard, it would really be 24 good. 25

JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. Well, I think they're

waiting for you. And that's what I think, I think they're doing, you know, and nobody can replace mom. 2 It's just -- there, there is no substitute. Dad's 3 okay, but mom's special. You know how that goes. KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah. And these three, 5 these four have really been through a lot. I mean, 6 Brian's dad, as you know, has been killed. 7 JOHN DOLAN: I know. I know. 8 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: So --9 JOHN DOLAN: I'm very sorry about that. 10 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: It's, it's, you know, 11 They -- first they, they walk really rough on them. 12 away from their mother and then they, they find out 13 about their stepfather and -- I hope Brian doesn't 14 actually know, but --15 JOHN DOLAN: I don't think so. 16 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: And then to go into the 17 hands of, of, of a, of their real father, which they 18 really don't even know. 19 JOHN DOLAN: Well, here's the thing, you 20 They know you. They've been with you. 21 love you. They care about you. But the bottom line 22 is, they really, really need you. And, you know, I 23 don't know how much studies you've done, but I'm always 24 interested in some of these things. You know, the 25 early years are really, really formula -- formulative

1 years. KATHRYN SCHROEDER: That's why I'm more 2 worried about Brian than the other three. 3 4 JOHN DOLAN: Well, that's exactly right. you know, put, put it in the back of your mind and do a 5 little bit of thinking about it that maybe it would be 6 7 the right thing for them. Maybe coming out is not the right thing for you, and I can understand how you feel. 8 But sometimes when it comes to children, it's necessary 9 to put aside what you need for their needs. At 10 11 least --12 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Well, yeah, but you're not looking at what, what is necessary for their needs 13 as far as God is concerned too. 14 JOHN DOLAN: Well --15 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: He's already stated 16 17 what's necessary for them. Well, they're, they're on, JOHN DOLAN: 18 they're on the outside and they need somebody to 19 continue to reinforce their beliefs that they've been 20 given and you know at a young age that's important. 21 For -- to have their beliefs reinforced by somebody, so 22 that's, that's important and, and only you can do that. 23 Only you can reinforce their beliefs. 24

KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I mean, and I, I honestly do hope that that comes about, but it's going to have

to really take a lot of work to, you know, make that 2 come about the way that I will accept it. JOHN DOLAN: And how is that? 3 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: There's no sense in me 4 5 coming out there to be with my children and then not get to be with my children. JOHN DOLAN: No, no, no. You'll be with 7 your children. 8 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: That's -- you should --9 you don't know the system. 10 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah, I do, I do -- I know --11 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Has the system taken your 12 children away from you before? 13 JOHN DOLAN: No, but here's the thing. 14 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: See, you don't know. 15 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. Let, let, let, let's 16 let the worst case scenario and then we'll look at the 17 best case scenario. The worst case scenario is that 18 you got charged with some charge and that's going to be 19 awful hard at this time to show that you did anything 20 except were present. You know? And that's, that's a 21 real thin basis for a charge. Okay. 22 So let's say they say, okay, like the elderly 23 lady, you're a material witness. What's going to 24 happen? They're going to take your fingerprints, 25

they're going to take your photograph, which is

painless, and they're going to put you out on bond. And that can be done in a day. 2 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: But what -- okay, that 3 may happ -- that may be, but what's Child Protective 4 5 Services going to do? JOHN DOLAN: With a material witness? 6 7 There's nothing wrong -- there's been attorneys who've 8 been material witnesses -- held as material witnesses --9 10 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Have you heard about the 11 child that was taken from her mother because someone reported that she was sexually abusing her child? 12 13 went to court, she got the child back. Okay? She was breast feeding this child. JOHN DOLAN: Um-hum. 15 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: They called it sexu --16 sex abuse, okay? She got the child back in court and 17 do you know that the child welfare agency still went 18 back to take her child away from her again? 19 JOHN DOLAN: Well, let me tell you one thing. 20 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: There's a different 21 agency other than those that are going to fingerprint 22 That's different --23 me. JOHN DOLAN: Kathy --24

KATHRYN SCHROEDER: -- another agency.

JOHN DOLAN: Kathy, the eyes of the entire

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United States of America, the eyes of this entire state and all -- many foreign countries are on what is happening today. If you think that's going to happen 3 before the eyes of the United States of American with 4 400 newsmen here, newspapers from all over the world, 5 it's not going to happen. 6 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: They're not here, though. 7 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah, they are. 8 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: They're not seeing what's 9 10 going on. JOHN DOLAN: Oh, they will once, once you 11 come out to be with the children --12 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah, once I give them my 13 word against, you know, the FBI's word? 14 JOHN DOLAN: No, no, no. It's up -- no, no, 15 We don't have anything to say what happened. We 16 weren't there, we haven't done any investigation. 17 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: No. I'm talking about 18 the past ten days. 19 JOHN DOLAN: What are we going to say? 20 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: What's been going on for 21 the past ten days that the media has not been allowed 22 to see? 23 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, no, no. We don't have any 24 objection to you being with those children. 25 Absolutely none. And we will not interpose any

objection to you being with those children. We're, we're not in the sense of recommending anything to 2 happen here except everybody come out peacefully and 3 nobody be hurt on either side. 4 We're not going to make any recommendation to 5 anybody, to any court, to any judge, to any child 6 protective service, to anybody that those children or 7 Brian not be placed with anybody. That's not our That's not -- we're not judge and jury in position. that. Uh-uh. We, we'd be off base doing that, so no 10 way. Uh-uh. And you haven't been charged with 11 anything. So, please, don't, don't feel that way. 12 The fact that you could be united -- reunited 13 with Brian and the other children, give them their 14 religious instruction, you know, freedom of religion. 15 Hey, everybody has that right and responsibility and 16 when it comes to children, obligation too. So, please, 17 we will not make any recommendation to child per --18 protective services. 19 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: And, and I -- you are, 20 you are probably correct --21 JOHN DOLAN: No -- I mean I am correct. 22 -- I do not, I do not KATHRYN SCHROEDER: 23 disagree with that at all. It's --24

All right. 11 Last night Max was talking with one of the --12 some of the other kids that weren't on that video film. 13 JOHN: Uh-huh. 14 And she said that she wanted -- she 15 had a little message she wanted relayed on the film 16 'cause, see, what -- she told him that, that she would 17 go ahead and we'd continue another film today to where 18 some other kids could get on there. 19 20 JOHN: Uh-huh. DAVID: You know, I guess, I guess that way 21 you all get to take a look at them, see they're real 22 23 people. Sure, oh, yeah, that really portrays JOHN: 24 And, in fact, we have a tape with two 25 that very well. segments of, of the kids that are out, and we'd like to

send that in. 2 DAVID: Oh, yeah, the, the parents would love 3 that. 4 JOHN: Great. Great. And we'll double check it to make sure it's not erased. 5 6 DAVID: Okay. Yeah. Where's, where's, where's Jamie right now being kept, do you know? Is he 7 with Social Services or --8 9 JOHN: I believe --DAVID: That's the little -- that's the 10 little child that has the handicap. 11 12 Yeah. He, he is separate because of the handicap. 13 14 DAVID: Right. 15 JOHN: And I can double check the location. I honestly don't know this instant but I will find out. 16 17 DAVID: Oh, we know he's in good care because 18 19 Oh, yeah, absolutely, absolutely. was down there myself and the funny part of the 20 videotape is, I mean just for your own information, is 21 the brown carpeting came out pink but that's, that's 22 video when you don't have the light set right or 23 something like that. 24 25 DAVID: Oh, okay. But it's a, it's a very wholesome

atmosphere, you know. 2 Is Mrs. Cohen in it or anything or is DAVID: she the one taking care of these kids or just, just --3 we noticed that they were in a house when you sent, 4 sent the snapshots. 5 6 JOHN: No, no. It's, it's, it's a housing like thing. You walk in, you go through a kitchen and then into kind of like an entrance way/hallway, foyer you might call it and then this big living room and 9 it's Child Protective Service. And that's where 10 11 they're at. 12 DAVID: Okay. 13 JOHN: And they're all together. They really seem happy. 14 They're -- they interact as you probably can understand perfectly because --15 16 DAVID: Right. 17 JOHN: -- they've been together so long. I think it's a real healthy thing. 18 19 DAVID: Good. 20 JOHN: So, what do you think you and I can -how we can -- you and I can go forward today? 21 22 Well, I mean our, our only position DAVID: is is like I say, you know, it's -- people seem to 23 misunderstand my, my podium when it comes to my 24 religion. They don't understand what it is. And I've, 25 I've simply, I've simply offered two avenues whereby

this could be resolved without God answering me. 2 that is, first of all, if you could take away the foundation from these people, the foundation they stand 3 on being that no one can reveal the seals but the lamb. 5 Do you understand that? JOHN: 6 Yeah. 7 That's our first position. Scripture tells us very clearly that no one but the lamb can reveal these seals. 10 JOHN: I understand that. I understand that. 11 DAVID: Now, that becomes --12 JOHN: And, certainly, I don't know that's 13 possible for us to reveal except for the lamb who can 14 reveal the seals but --15 DAVID: Okay. So, what I've been doing with, with Dick and, and Henry and, and, you know, John Cox 16 17 and all that, all the way back -- I guess from Jim and 18 Gary, too, is that I've been offering them an 19 opportunity to, to get with their ministers and their, 20 and their priests and stuff who are supposed to be, you 21 know, ordained servants of God. 22 JOHN: Uh-uh. 23 DAVID: My God does talk with them, they And to be able to, to show this mystery of 24 25 God that is supposed to be for the servants to know.

And, of course, you know each time what's happened up

to the third seal is that they failed to be able to show from the prophecies where these subjects are given in detail. So, I have, in turn, showed them and not a one of them has disagreed that the seals contain the revelation, have not been, you know, shown forth in the prophetic voice of the prophets.

JOHN: I understand that and I'm sure that they haven't done too well in their research so far and probably, you know, to be quite candid, you're a heck of a lot heads up -- more heads up on that than they are. But I'm not saying that they're not working on it.

DAVID: Right. Well, --

JOHN: But on the same -- in the same thing, that being set aside for a moment, I think that as far as you and I go and you and I can move forward with some of the little problems that we have and that's aside from them working on, on the research which I know they are doing this very moment. helping these guys do their research but just the whole impetus of things moving forward. 2 3 DAVID: Oh, we understand what you're saying. 4 JOHN: Okay. 5 DAVID: So, when are you going to send this 6 tape? 7 JOHN: Okay. I've got it sitting in front of It's a, it's a, it's sitting in a Polaroid, 8 Polaroid brand container right here. 9 10 DAVID: Okay. Steve, --11 JOHN: Yeah. 12 DAVID: -- are you ready to go ahead and tape Audrey and Rachel, some of the kids? 13 14 JOHN: Sure. 15 DAVID: Okay. We're going to go ahead and start making this tape. 16 17 Okay. Let me make a proposal to you JOHN: and I think you know what it is. You're a very, very 18 bright man and a very charismatic man, I may -- might 19 20 I was extremely impressed with your, your 21 personal viewpoints last night. And you're, you're a very moving individual. I mean that's a straight fact. 22 Your, your ministry, to be quite candid, you know, has, 23 has a lot going for it in the sense of your charisma. 24 You're a very charismatic guy. But let me, let me say 25 this, let me suggest this to you. You know what I'm

going to say before I say it. I'm not going to let it
be any surprise. How about if when we send in the tape
you send in the tape with somebody from in there? That
would be a great boom for us to move forward.

DAVID: Well what you give fail to

DAVID: Well, what you guys fail to understand --

JOHN: I know. I know. Just help us out, to show that our side --

DAVID: I cannot subject another mind to you unless that mind is willing to go.

JOHN: I understand that. I understand that completely. I don't argue with that and I wouldn't go against your wishes. The only thing I was thinking is that --

DAVID: Well, why don't, why don't you talk to every individual here and, and you relate this desire to them. As I said before, see, their faith is locked in.

JOHN: Uh-huh.

DAVID: Let me, let me explain. When an individual or a person, free thinking individual, free moral agent desires to acknowledge the higher principles of God, they acknowledge the testaments of the prophets, they acknowledge, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, okay? Now, we're talking about a higher personage when we're talking about Christ, aren't we?

1 JOHN: Well, we --2 We're talking about a reality --3 JOHN: We're talking supreme being here, you 4 know. DAVID: Okay, supreme being. 5 6 JOHN: Okay. 7 All right. And the knowledge of that DAVID: supreme being is, is first and foremost in the hearts 8 of all those who desire redemption, who desire life 9 beyond this world, right? 10 11 JOHN: Uh-huh. Okay. So, so, that's the general 12 DAVID: acceptance of all religions under his name, under 13 Christ, be it the Catholic all the way down to what 14 other organization that believes in his name. So, you 15 16 know, naturally a person in the world is gonna be committed to serving Christ first and then the other 17 power secondarily, right? 18 19 JOHN: No question, no question about it. 20 DAVID: Okay. But by the same token, you know, maybe 21 -- I know that there was a person by the name of the 22 Julie in there the other day who, who felt that perhaps 23 her brother was right and that she wanted to hook up 24 with her brother at some time. If she could make the 25

sacrifice and, like you said, not everybody wants to

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DAVID: Now, John, let me explain something again. You are twisting her words and this is one of the main things she was telling me last night. You know, she always talks the way she talks every day.

JOHN: I see.

DAVID: You know, she used to be -- she used to be a drug addict.

JOHN: Uh-huh.

DAVID: Okay. She always talks like a, like a whining kind of slow, you know, she's a, she's a Mexican girl.

Now, she naturally has the slow slur empathetic type of speech. And what she was trying to tell you was is that she wanted to talk to her brother. You know, she loves her brother. And she kept referring back to the fact that from what

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she's seen thus far, she doesn't yet quite have enough trust in you, the system, just to hurl herself out of 2 here into your hands. 3 I understand. 4 JOHN: DAVID: Now, you see, but, but it seems like 5 a lot of connotations that are made is that you all 6 pick up on these and you develop this great big picture 7 which is really not there in the mind of the individual 8 that's talking to you. 9 JOHN: I appreciate that and that's --10 DAVID: It's --11 JOHN: -- that's probably what happened, 12 13 okay.
