2 JOHN: --it's handled. Go ahead.

3 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Hang on just a second.

4 JOHN: Go ahead.

5 KATHRYN SCHROEDER TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON:

6 Oh, really. A couple more gallons of milk.

7 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I have a request for you.

8 JOHN: (Laughter.) I think I just heard it.

9 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: A couple more gallons of
10 milk?

11 JOHN: Uh-huh.

12 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: You know the
13 electricity's been going off and --

14 JOHN: Hey. The -- ours has been going off
15 too.

16 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah --

17 JOHN: We were sitting in the dark here.

18 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah. It has -- it
19 doesn't stay off long actually, but, but --

20 JOHN: Hey, the electricity was on all night
21 last night wasn't it?

22 KATHRYN SCHROEDER TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON:
23 No, it went off -- yeah.

24 JOHN: Hey, Kathy.

25 KATHRYN SCHROEDER TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: We
were sitting in the dark for a few minutes. Yeah,

1 tonight.

2 JOHN: Kathy.

3 KATHRYN SCHROEDER TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON:

4 From the, from the storm.

5 UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Oh, I see.

6 JOHN: Kathy.

7 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah.

8 JOHN: The electricity did not go off last
9 night, did it?

10 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: No. I don't think so.

11 JOHN: It did not because we had a very --

12 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Well, I --

13 JOHN: We had a very good dialogue last
14 night. The electricity will not go off tonight,
15 because we've had a very good dialogue this evening.

16 But --

17 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Well, that's good. Well,
18 not --

19 JOHN: -- I'm sure we, I'm sure we can
20 probably work something out for the milk when you come
21 out in the morning.

22 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I, I'm not even saying
23 that the electricity going off has affected the milk,
24 okay? I'm just saying that if we could possibly get a
25 couple more gallons --

JOHN: Well, you're in short supply, right.

1 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: -- of milk it would be
2 appreciated by the babies greatly.

3 JOHN: I bet they would. And, and I'm sure
4 that when you come out in the morning the milk will go
5 in in the morning.

6 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay. Also, two more
7 things. If you can bring --

8 JOHN: You're throwing a lot of things at me
9 now, aren't you?

10 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Please, I just found out
11 David --

12 JOHN: Boy, Steve's, Steve's putting a list
13 together there, isn't he.

14 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I just found out David's
15 on the front cover --

16 JOHN: Of?

17 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Newsweek and Time.

18 JOHN: David's on the front cover of Newsweek
19 and Time.

20 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Maybe it's not the front
21 cover, but there's an article in there.

22 JOHN: Um-hum.

23 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: So if you can drop those
24 off when I come out as well. John already knows, I'm
25 going to call at nine.

JOHN: Who? Who?

1 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: John 1 -- 2.

2 JOHN: Oh, oh, okay. Okay.

3 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I'm going to call at nine
4 in the morning so probably shortly thereafter, as soon
5 as he can get Brian over there basically after that.

6 JOHN: Okay.

7 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Because I have already
8 got myself a little bit packed up --

9 JOHN: Good, good.

10 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Got a couple -- in the
11 wash.

12 JOHN: Let me ask you something. Let me ask
13 you something. Do you have any medical problems that
14 we should be aware of?

15 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: No.

16 JOHN: Okay.

17 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I'm in perfect health.

18 JOHN: Boy, you're one of the few people I've
19 ever heard ever say that.

20 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Hey. I don't even catch
21 colds.

22 JOHN: You don't?

23 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: No. Come on, I've got
24 four kids.

25 JOHN: You don't have time to catch a cold.

KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Are you allowed to get

1 sick when you have four kids?

2 JOHN: You don't have time for it, do you?

3 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: No.

4 JOHN: But -- well, I wanted to make sure.

5 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Brian was pretty sick
6 when he came out.

7 JOHN: Yeah, he was. Yeah, he was. I saw, I
8 saw a lot of the youngsters that came out.

9 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah. He was throwing
10 up --

11 JOHN: Little Jamie --

12 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: -- he was throwing up
13 Monday night that he -- before he went out.

14 JOHN: Yeah. Saw little Jamie when he came
15 out. Cute little guy, huh?

16 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Poor Jamie.

17 JOHN: Yeah.

18 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: He's the same age as my
19 oldest son.

20 JOHN: You got to squeeze them and love them,
21 don't you?

22 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah.

23 JOHN: Yeah. They need a lot of loving.

24 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I like to smile at Jamie.
25 I saw him once in the grocery store. I happened to be
in town in the grocery store and Jamie goes to school,

1 right? And I just, just glanced up and I see Jamie in
2 his wheelchair and I'm like going, wow, I saw Jamie in
3 town. And this lady's wheeling him by and a bunch of
4 other kids and I just couldn't help but smile, you
5 know --

6 JOHN: Sure.

7 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: -- these kids are just
8 out to adventure and see the world and it's really
9 exciting for him. Just to hear the noise, you know, is
10 so exciting for him.

11 JOHN: Well, hopefully Jamie will be reunited
12 with Sheila before long too, huh? That'd be nice. His
13 mom.

14 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: That, that'd be nice.
15 He's, he's -- she's been worried about him because he's
16 not in the pictures of the other kids. I'm sure he's
17 being taken care of --

18 JOHN: Well, they have to get him some --

19 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Right.

20 JOHN: -- some special help, huh?

21 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah.

22 JOHN: Some special love. I know. I've got
23 a little god-daughter that has some similar problems
24 and they need a lot of love.

25 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: It's just amazing that
he's so small --

1 JOHN: Yeah, for his age.

2 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: And he's -- yeah, he's
3 eleven. He's the same age as my oldest son.

4 JOHN: How does, how does he comprehend?

5 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I think he's eleven.

6 JOHN: Mentally?

7 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: As far as I -- I don't
8 know too much about him, but I do know that he -- that
9 sounds will either soothe him or frighten him.

10 JOHN: Yeah, yeah.

11 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: He, I mean, if I get up
12 close to him and just -- if he's crying or something,
13 if I just get up close to him and talk to him or, you
14 know, just show him my face, it soothes him greatly.
15 Just to see that somebody's around.

16 JOHN: Oh, you bet. You bet.

17 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: But, I mean --

18 JOHN: Well, I saw him when they brought him
19 in here and he was with the, with the ladies from
20 Health and Human Services.

21 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: He's real good with the
22 ladies that --

23 JOHN: Hey, yeah, he is.

24 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: -- take him to school and
25 stuff.

JOHN: He breaks your heart, doesn't he?

1 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah. But I -- it's hard
2 to understand --

3 JOHN: Are there are any other questions I
4 could answer for you? You know? Because I want you
5 to, you know, I want it to be perfectly clear in your
6 mind and of course, talk to Wayne and if there, if
7 there are other questions, I'd certainly be happy --

8 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Well, will I be, will I
9 be able to -- that's probably going to be difficult.
10 See, what I'm trying to do is -- I, I'm a real picky
11 person. I mean, I know anybody that's got a degree is
12 going to be a good lawyer, okay? I realize that.

13 JOHN: Anybody that has a degree is going --
14 every lawyer has got a degree.

15 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Right.

16 JOHN: A couple of degrees.

17 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I want a lawyer that's
18 going to really understand where I'm coming from.

19 JOHN: Well --

20 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Being a mother, know my
21 sit -- I want somebody that's, that's got heart, too.

22 JOHN: Believe me --

23 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Besides two degrees.

24 JOHN: There are, there are a lot of them out
25 here --

KATHRYN SCHROEDER: So --

1 JOHN: -- that are, that are interested in
2 handling that.

3 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: So what I'm saying is, me
4 not knowing them and me not knowing their backgrounds,
5 I wouldn't know who would be best for my situation and
6 whereas Wayne or Steve might.

7 JOHN: Well, how much education do you have?

8 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I have two years of
9 college.

10 JOHN: Well, you, you can assess people
11 pretty well when they're sitting down talking to you,
12 can't you?

13 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Do I have to, like,
14 interview each of them?

15 JOHN: Oh, no, no. But I mean you can see if
16 some guy's a used car salesman or somebody's looking
17 out for your --

18 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Right.

19 JOHN: -- best interest, right.

20 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Right.

21 JOHN: And that's the key --

22 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: But I can also --

23 JOHN: -- that's the key issue. Whether
24 somebody is looking out for your best interest. And
25 Wayne may be able to give you the name of an attorney
to contact in town. Not necessarily a criminal lawyer,

1 | but an attorney to contact in town that he has trust
2 | and faith and confidence in who will recommend one to
3 | you.

4 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah. I can probably do
5 | that.

6 | JOHN: You know, he, he is going to have his
7 | friends in town that he has practiced law with that
8 | would give you some good advice --

9 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: That's a good idea.

10 | JOHN: -- and that may be the best thing to
11 | do.

12 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: All right. That's a good
13 | idea. I'll do that.

14 | JOHN: You know, and -- because you've got to
15 | be comfortable with your lawyer, huh?

16 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah. I, I've never had
17 | a lawyer. I've never been to court before. Well,
18 | actually I did have a lawyer in my divorce, but --

19 | JOHN: But just to handle the paperwork.

20 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah. That was -- it was
21 | a woman and it was just totally all, you know, by the
22 | book stuff.

23 | JOHN: Wow. I look forward to seeing you and
24 | I, and I know you look forward to seeing Brian and,
25 | and gettin back together.

 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah. You tell them to

1 have some cameras there waiting and you can send the
2 pictures back here to these people to see how happy
3 Brian was.

4 JOHN: Well, I'm sure the media will be there
5 and I'm sure they'll be showing it on TV.

6 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Oh, no. You mean I've
7 got to comb my hair?

8 JOHN: Might be a good idea.

9 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Well --

10 JOHN: You've got plenty of time to get
11 gussied up.

12 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Don't worry. I already
13 took --

14 JOHN: Between --

15 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: -- I already cleaned up.

16 JOHN: Between now and the morning.

17 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah. I did that. I
18 cleaned up.

19 JOHN: Let me, let me --

20 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I even washed my hair.

21 JOHN: Let me mention something to you and,
22 and -- we've had a lot of people call in here from all
23 over about friends and relatives that are inside there.

24 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Um-hum.

25 JOHN: And about their welfare and how
they're doing and they're healthy and this, that, and

1 the other thing. And, and if you know of anybody in
2 there -- I, I've talked to Steve and given him the
3 names of several that have called in and I -- and he's
4 making arrangements. We've talked to a bunch of them
5 already and he's making arrangements to talk to others,
6 but if you know of someone that's in there that would
7 like to get any message passed to a loved one, you just
8 tell them to either get a hold of Steve or go pick up
9 that phone that you're talking on because --

10 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Every, everybody has --
11 yeah, pretty much that word's been passed around
12 several days now.

13 JOHN: Good. Good. As long as they're aware
14 of it, that somebody's at the end of the phone.

15 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: See, there's a lot of
16 people here, though, John, that don't want to get on --

17 JOHN: Are confused

18 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: -- the phone. No.

19 JOHN: I know.

20 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Because, because they
21 hear reports and it just, it just upsets you so much.
22 You just don't want to even deal with the people out
23 there.

24 JOHN: Well, see one of the problems is you,
25 you look at TV in there. I'm sure you've seen the, the
TV broadcasts and all of that stuff, right?

1 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah.

2 JOHN: And so much of what the media is
3 saying is conjecture, speculation. They don't know.

4 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: No, they don't.

5 JOHN: They don't know. I mean, they'll know
6 when everyone comes out and they hear some stories
7 they'll know. But it's pure speculation on their part,
8 you know, as to what's going on and the living
9 conditions in there and this, that, and the other
10 thing, so --

11 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: It --

12 JOHN: Take some of it with a grain of salt,
13 huh?

14 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: It, it's just a shame
15 that the world doesn't know anything.

16 JOHN: Well, you can tell anybody you want
17 how you were talked to by myself, by the other John,
18 and you make up your mind whether you think we were
19 being fair and reasonable and answered your questions
20 or whatever --

21 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Believe you me, John, in
22 my prayers you are in my highest regard. And God's
23 going to have --

24 JOHN: Well, thank you.

25 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: -- God's going to have
mercy on you. I know it.

1 JOHN: I hope He, I hope He does.
2 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I know He will.
3 JOHN: Well --
4 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: He knows --
5 JOHN: -- believe me, John, this John's --
6 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: -- he knows your heart.
7 JOHN: -- not alone. There's a lot of people
8 out here that all have the same contention that there's
9 no animosity. We're trying to get this thing resolved
10 as peacefully as possible because everybody will have
11 their day in court. And, and it's -- you know, a lot
12 of people may not like our judicial system, but it's
13 the best one in the world and it's fair. So, we'll
14 see. I look forward to seeing you in the morning, huh?
15 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah. I'll be ready.
16 I'll call you about nine.
17 JOHN: Is Steve there? Or you got him out
18 scurrying around?
19 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I don't really know where
20 he is right now.
21 JOHN: Well, anybody else there?
22 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: There's nobody here now.
23 There's nobody here next to me.
24 JOHN: They left you alone?
25 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Sherri's asleep.
JOHN: You mean the Happy Birthday girl?

1 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Sherri had a birthday?
2 JOHN: Yesterday.
3 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Really?
4 JOHN: Yeah. She didn't tell you?
5 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: No, nobody -- we don't
6 talk about things like that.
7 JOHN: You don't?
8 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Nah.
9 JOHN: Well, she was -- no, no, no. I'm
10 trying to think how old she was. Forty-three? That's
11 why she didn't want to discuss it.
12 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: That's just about right.
13 JOHN: That's why she didn't want to discuss
14 it.
15 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: That's probably right.
16 JOHN: They stop counting at 39.
17 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Hey, you know they told
18 Steve -- Steve's age on the, on the --
19 JOHN: What, 48, huh?
20 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Steve's not 48.
21 JOHN: Well, that's what I heard on TV.
22 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: That's what I heard on TV
23 too, but he don't look 48. He can't be 48.
24 JOHN: He sure is.
25 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: There's no way.
JOHN: Born in 1944.

1 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Just no way the man is
2 48. You got to, you got to see him. I mean, I don't
3 know personally, but, I mean, his wife has some gray
4 hair --

5 JOHN: Hey, people would tell me there's no
6 way I'm my age either. You're only as old as you feel.

7 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I guess.

8 JOHN: Huh?

9 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I guess. He, he says
10 he's 24.

11 JOHN: Has he ever been known to lie?

12 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah.

13 JOHN: Well, that's a clue isn't it?

14 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah.

15 JOHN: You bet.

16 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I think though the nose
17 gets a little bit longer when he makes that
18 statement --

19 JOHN: Just like Pinocchio.

20 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah.

21 JOHN: You're right. Well, listen. Nobody's
22 there with you?

23 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: No. Everybody's gone --
24 Sherri's asleep.

25 JOHN: Well, if you, if you can find that
rascal, he was supposed to get back on the phone when

1 | you were done.

2 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Oh, you got my, my
3 | request, right?

4 | JOHN: I do. Milk, Newsweek --

5 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Newsweek and Time.

6 | JOHN: -- and Time.

7 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: That's it. And Brian.

8 | JOHN: You've got it.

9 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay. All right.

10 | JOHN: So probably --

11 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I'll see if I can find
12 | him and have him call you back. How's that?

13 | JOHN: Do that and probably the other John
14 | will be here in the morning.

15 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay.

16 | JOHN: Okay? You have a good night's sleep.

17 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Thank you.

18 | JOHN: Okay.

19 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: You too.

20 | JOHN: Bye-bye.

21 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Bye-bye.

22 | (Connection broken.)

23 | * * * * *

24 | (Phone ringing.)

25 | JOHN TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Here. You can
hang onto this. I got the --

1 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: -- routine.

2 JOHN TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: -- We are
3 working on -- hey, I've got it here. I know David's
4 going to holler, somebody answer the phone --

5 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: They never
6 explained why they didn't answer that whole series
7 of --

8 (Connection never made.)

9 * * * * *

10 JOHN: Hello.

11 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: John?

12 JOHN: Yes.

13 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: This is Kathy again.

14 JOHN: How are you?

15 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Just thought I'd call you
16 back and let you know that Steve is crashed.

17 JOHN: He has?

18 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah. He's been up a
19 lot. He was talking to somebody about something and he
20 just passed out. He's been snoring. So, David asked
21 me to ask you to change the number of gallons of milk
22 to six instead of two and make sure it's whole milk and
23 I will definitely call you right after worship in the
24 morning. Worship's from eight to nine.

25 JOHN: Uh-huh.

KATHRYN SCHROEDER: And, and I'll call you

1 right after worship and start setting things up.

2 JOHN: Okay. The -- let me ask you
3 something. We -- it's our impression that Oliver and
4 Brad and Kevin are probably going to be coming out
5 right after you come out.

6 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Um-hum.

7 JOHN: Is that your impression also?

8 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I'm not sure if right
9 after, but yeah. They're coming out.

10 JOHN: Okay. Okay.

11 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: They --

12 JOHN: They may want to see how you're
13 received and, and something like that.

14 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Right. We are, we are
15 hoping that if I come back to you after I go through
16 the system you might let me use your phone there or
17 whatever and call the camp back and let them know that
18 everything went well with me, you know, for them to --
19 you know what I'm saying? To know -- to, to use for
20 good rapport for further negotiations for more people
21 to come out. You know what I'm saying?

22 JOHN: Uh-huh.

23 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: So, I know that's totally
24 up to y'all, but I'll talk to you about that when I
25 come out.

JOHN: Well, we look forward to it.

1 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah.

2 JOHN: We really do.

3 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I'm getting, I'm
4 getting --

5 JOHN: And I can't tell you that we have the
6 Newsweek article or the Times article, but we're
7 sending out for it.

8 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay.

9 JOHN: Because we haven't seen it.

10 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay. Well --

11 JOHN: And it may have just hit the stands.

12 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay. I have no idea.
13 Steve had told me that earlier and he may have heard it
14 over the phone or somebody -- radio or somebody said
15 something. I don't know.

16 JOHN: Okay.

17 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: If you can't get it first
18 thing in the morning, well then maybe you can get it
19 when the next person comes out or whatever, but --

20 JOHN: Hey, and we understand the, the
21 interest of the milk.

22 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah. If you can't get
23 the six for me, he said a few. He didn't give a
24 number. Steve said, oh, well I guess he means two. He
25 meant six.

JOHN: Well, there's pessimists and there's

1 | optimists, aren't there?

2 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah. Well, there's a
3 | lot of babies here and they can go through six gallons
4 | of milk pretty quick.

5 | JOHN: Yeah.

6 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: And --

7 | JOHN: Do you know whether any of the -- do
8 | you know anybody that's got any medical problems in
9 | there that we should be aware of. You know, and I
10 | know --

11 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: There are in here --

12 | JOHN: -- I know Judy's got the problem --

13 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Right.

14 | JOHN: -- because I've seen it on the video.

15 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Right.

16 | JOHN: You know, I've seen that and it didn't
17 | look good.

18 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Right.

19 | JOHN: And, as a matter of fact, it looked
20 | like it was getting gangrenous.

21 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: It's getting pretty bad.

22 | JOHN: And that's why -- if you have any way
23 | of talking to that woman at all, you don't want blood
24 | poisoning setting in on something like that and she'll
25 | not only lose her hand, she'll lose her arm, she can
 | lose her life. If, if you know any woman that's got

1 | any influence over her -- and I'm sincere. It's not,
2 | it's not a number to me. It's not a body to me. It's
3 | somebody's life. If you can --

4 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I'll talk to her myself
5 | and --

6 | JOHN: I know she's --

7 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: -- because she is worried
8 | about it. She told me tonight that it's getting
9 | bigger. She is a little bit worried about it.

10 | JOHN: Hey, it's not going to get any better
11 | is it? Not there. Because Steve, Steve has told me
12 | that -- I, I asked David tonight if he was taking any
13 | medication because there's a real problem that he can
14 | be confronted with known as septicemia and it's blood
15 | poisoning and it's what killed Jim Henson, the muppets?

16 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Uh-huh.

17 | JOHN: It killed him in 24 hours when the --
18 | once the blood poisoning set in, so it's, it's a
19 | serious thing, but we don't need those problems and if
20 | anybody in there has any medical problems, hey, the
21 | hospitals are here.

22 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Right.

23 | JOHN: And, and they'll get the best, best
24 | care available.

25 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Well, I'm sure that once
everybody sees how it goes with me, you know, they'll

1 | be more apt to --

2 | JOHN: That's good.

3 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: -- make up their mind

4 | that the system is -- can be used.

5 | JOHN: And if you, if you think there's

6 | anybody out there that wants to talk to us this

7 | evening --

8 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I'll let them know.

9 | JOHN: Can you hold on just one second?

10 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I -- John --

11 | JOHN: Can you hold on? Somebody's asking me

12 | a question.

13 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay. Go ahead.

14 | JOHN: Hold on.

15 | (Pause.)

16 | JOHN: When you come out tomorrow --

17 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah.

18 | JOHN: -- what we would like to do, instead

19 | of just taking some flash pictures, we'd like to get a

20 | video tape of you and Brian that we can send back

21 | inside.

22 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: That's, that's great.

23 | JOHN: How would that be?

24 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: That's wonderful.

25 | JOHN: Would you have any objection to that?

 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: That'd be wonderful.

1 JOHN: Okay. Okay.

2 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I'm sure that my loved
3 ones in here would love to see that.

4 JOHN: That's good. That's good. Well,
5 listen if there are anybody -- anyone else you can
6 think of that would like to talk to us, all they've got
7 to do is go pick up that phone where you are --

8 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay. And I'll --

9 JOHN: -- and they can talk to us and talk
10 to, talk to Judy.

11 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I'm going to talk to
12 Judy. Yeah. I'll talk to her tonight.

13 JOHN: Will you? Because I'm serious about
14 it. It did not look good. You got a -- you're a
15 better judge of it than I am. You're there with her.

16 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: She knows it doesn't look
17 good, so I'll talk to her and see what she thinks.

18 JOHN: Hey, she'd like to be in a position to
19 raise her kids and care for her kids too, wouldn't she?

20 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Probably.

21 JOHN: Well --

22 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Hey --

23 JOHN: You don't want to do it with --

24 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: -- we're mothers, you
25 know?

JOHN: You don't want to do it the hard way,

1 without a hand, without an arm. Something like that.

2 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: True. Okay.

3 JOHN: Look out, look out for their best
4 interest, huh?

5 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay. I'll talk to her
6 and I'll see if there's anybody else that wants to talk
7 to you. I'll tell them where the phone is.

8 JOHN: Just got to pick it up.

9 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I tell them what the
10 phone number is and everything.

11 JOHN: Okay.

12 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay. Thank you, John.

13 JOHN: See you.

14 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: All right. Bye-bye.

15 JOHN: Bye.

16 (Connection broken.)

17 * * * * *

18 (Phone ringing.)

19 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: They may have
20 started early.

21 JOHN: Let's disconnect -- give it a second.

22 (Disconnected.)

23 (Dialing.)

24 (Phone ringing.)

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: They may have
started early because she's leaving early, which is a

1 good sign. It's a good sign.

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #2: We've had to
3 wake Steve up every morning.

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: Yeah.

5 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #2: So he's not
6 there.

7 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: No answer.

8 (Phone still ringing.)

9 JOHN: I don't have any dial tone.

10 (Disconnected.)

11 (Phone ringing.)

12 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: Could be
13 prayers. Yeah.

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #2: Is this the
15 wake-up call for Steve?

16 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: Night shift
17 had the same problem last night.

18 JOHN: Okay.

19 (Phone still ringing.)

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: Day shift,
21 right? We've never had this on day shift? I don't
22 know. No answer -- usually it's answered by the third
23 ring.

24 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #2: We have had
25 phone problems, though, but it's not a phone problem.
There's nobody there or -- one or the other.

1 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Hello, this is Kathy.

2 JOHN DOLAN: Good morning, Kathy. Let me
3 transfer you to the other phone here.

4 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay.

5 JOHN DOLAN: How are you this morning?

6 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Oh, I'm cold.

7 JOHN DOLAN: Cold and damp in there, I know.

8 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: It's very cold.

9 JOHN DOLAN: I know.

10 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: My fingers are freezing.
11 I've got to put my gloves back on now.

12 JOHN DOLAN: Are you all packed?

13 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yes, I am.

14 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. Okay. You ready to go
15 out now?

16 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Well, I wanted to find
17 out, you know, what you can set up with Brian? What
18 time you want that out?

19 JOHN DOLAN: We're arranging to have him
20 picked up this very, very instant as we speak.

21 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay.

22 JOHN DOLAN: So he'll be here when you get
23 here.

24 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay.

25 JOHN DOLAN: Because it takes about, I guess,
more than a few minutes to get from that location by

1 | van or -- to our location here at the hangar.

2 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Right.

3 | JOHN DOLAN: But he'll be here when you're
4 | here.

5 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay.

6 | JOHN DOLAN: So it's all set.

7 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I talked to you yesterday
8 | a little about this and I'd like to stress it one more
9 | time, because I think it's really important that we try
10 | as hard as possible to get a good rapport going so that
11 | others are confident.

12 | JOHN DOLAN: We want that.

13 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I know you do.

14 | JOHN DOLAN: Very, very much.

15 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: My request, therefore, is
16 | that once I'm through the system, which -- I mean, it
17 | could happen all today.

18 | JOHN DOLAN: Um-hum.

19 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: It, it could be next
20 | week, but once I'm through which -- I mean, I don't
21 | think they're going to charge me or anything, I didn't
22 | do anything, but --

23 | JOHN DOLAN: I know that.

24 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: If they hold me as a
25 | material witness or whatever and keep me in custody,
then well that changes the matter, but if I get through

1 and I'm out on bond or whatever, if I can set it up
2 with Child Protective Services to see the rest of the
3 kids and give them hugs from their parents and
4 basically be able to then come back to where you are, I
5 know that's probably a touchy situation, but if that's
6 at all possible, to call back in here once again and
7 tell the people here, look. The system wasn't so bad,
8 you know, give them confidence.

9 JOHN DOLAN: The system works, in other
10 words.

11 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Right.

12 JOHN DOLAN: Yes.

13 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Give them confidence in
14 the system that this is what happened to me. I have an
15 arraignment date and I'm out on bond or whatever. If,
16 of course, that does happen.

17 JOHN DOLAN: Yes.

18 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: And, and also to have
19 already seen the children so that I can say to the
20 mothers, you know, your kids are fine, you know. The
21 court's working on getting them placed or whatever and
22 I told them that you loved them. You know, basically
23 just a call back, you know.

24 JOHN DOLAN: Well, hopefully the others will
25 be out sooner, but I see absolutely no problem with
doing that.

1 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay. That would be,
2 that would be really great.

3 JOHN DOLAN: Great. Great. I'm looking
4 forward to seeing you also.

5 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: That's, that's a lot of
6 the reason that some of the people are feeling the way
7 they do. I mean, you know, David aside, you know.

8 JOHN DOLAN: I know what you're saying.

9 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I mean we all love David,
10 but --

11 JOHN DOLAN: I know what you're saying.

12 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: -- this is our home, so
13 it was, it was a really -- all those matters are taken
14 into consideration.

15 JOHN DOLAN: I understand completely. Well,
16 we're ready to run the vehicle up and, and pick you up
17 and as we discussed yesterday with Steve, it'll be the
18 same as the children's pickup, if that's okay with you?

19 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay. I don't think
20 David's up yet and I wanted to ask him one question
21 before I go.

22 JOHN DOLAN: He slept real late yesterday.
23 He was really zonked out. He was --

24 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: He was up last night
25 giving --

JOHN DOLAN: Was he?

1 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: -- Bible study pretty
2 late.

3 JOHN DOLAN: Was he? Uh-huh.

4 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah. So I'm going to
5 ask Steve if, if it would be all right to, to bother
6 him or not and if he --

7 JOHN DOLAN: Well --

8 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: -- maybe Steve can ask my
9 question. I mean --

10 JOHN DOLAN: Maybe Steve could do it for you
11 or -- is it urgent that, that you ask him now or I was
12 going to say maybe you could ask him when you called
13 in.

14 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Well, you know, I mean me
15 going out there, I'm also leaving David -- you know.

16 JOHN DOLAN: I understand.

17 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I would like to say good-
18 bye.

19 JOHN DOLAN: I understand completely.

20 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Oh, you do have the six
21 gallons of whole milk, right?

22 JOHN DOLAN: Whole milk. No two percent this
23 time.

24 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Right.

25 JOHN DOLAN: No two percent. Whole milk.

KATHRYN SCHROEDER: And did you happen, did

1 | you happen to get Newsweek or Time?

2 | JOHN DOLAN: We're working on that right now.
3 | What happened here is, is -- you're not going to
4 | believe this, but they're all sold out. But we'll get
5 | them today. If, if we have to, we'll have them faxed
6 | in, you know what I mean? By Fax machine.

7 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay. And the other
8 | thing that probably we need to be asking for pretty
9 | soon is toilet paper.

10 | JOHN DOLAN: I can understand that. Yes,
11 | we'll start working on that too.

12 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: If you can start working
13 | on that one.

14 | JOHN DOLAN: That's, that's no problem. I
15 | know the stores aren't sold out of that.

16 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay.

17 | JOHN DOLAN: We can get that working. How do
18 | you -- okay. Is, is the pickup place then -- we'll use
19 | the same pickup place as the children.

20 | KATHRYN SCHROEDER TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON:
21 | They didn't know. All of them were sold out but
22 | they're working on getting copies -- even if they have
23 | to fax them in.

24 | JOHN DOLAN TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: It's
25 | working. She's talking to someone.

 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: What now?

1 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. The question I was going
2 to ask -- do you have a suitcase or, or carry bag or --

3 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah. I've got a
4 suitcase -- I mean, a little overnight bag.

5 JOHN DOLAN: A little overnight bag, okay.

6 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: And two of my children's
7 bookbags.

8 JOHN DOLAN: That's fine.

9 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I've got some things to
10 give the kids --

11 JOHN DOLAN: Sure. Sure.

12 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I heard -- somebody said
13 on the radio -- somebody said they heard on the radio
14 this morning that my kids are in South Dakota, or at
15 least on their way back to South Dakota.

16 JOHN DOLAN: I didn't hear that report, but
17 you know it's so --

18 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Somebody just told me a
19 little while ago.

20 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, okay. It's amazing. We've
21 been hearing radio reports of all things, I mean, that
22 are just totally not true. Some are partially true.
23 It's, it's incredible. We get calls in from all over
24 the country on what's going on. So --

25 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah.

JOHN DOLAN: -- you know, you could -- and

1 CPS, Child Protective Service, is doing home studies
2 now. I know that for a fact, so -- why -- one of the
3 fellows just asked what was in the suitcase. So I
4 guess besides the books there's just personal clothing
5 and that stuff?

6 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Personal clothing. I
7 have a few cassette tapes for my children --

8 JOHN DOLAN: Fine.

9 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: -- of, you know, stories
10 and stuff.

11 JOHN DOLAN: Sure.

12 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: And, you know, personal
13 articles, you know. Shampoo and stuff.

14 JOHN DOLAN: Fine, fine.

15 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Clothing, the, the two
16 bookbags carry basically school books, because I was
17 home schooling my children.

18 JOHN DOLAN: Right. Right.

19 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: So I -- I don't know why
20 I can't. I just want to get them, at least if they, if
21 they're not -- well, whatever. Anyway, that's beside
22 the point.

23 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. Okay. Great.

24 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Basically that's it, you
25 know. A couple of toys that I threw in for the kids.

JOHN DOLAN: Okay. I'd like to get the, the

1 vehicle started up there if you're ready to go. I know
2 you need to say good-bye --

3 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Am I, am I supposed to
4 walk down or can somebody take -- drive me down? Or
5 what?

6 JOHN DOLAN: The -- you mean somebody drive
7 down -- I'd just prefer that you'd walk out and just
8 walk down the road and to where the kids were picked
9 up, if that's okay with you. I know it's a little
10 rainy, but --

11 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Is it raining?

12 JOHN DOLAN: It was before. I don't have a
13 window here. I can't see anything. I can't see
14 anything. Well, let me, let me -- one, one -- they
15 have a question here so let me find out --

16 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay.

17 JOHN DOLAN: -- if I can get the question for
18 you.

19 KATHRYN SCHROEDER TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: He
20 wants me to walk down to the gate.

21 (Pause.)

22 JOHN DOLAN: Are you able to carry everything
23 yourself?

24 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I think so.

25 JOHN DOLAN: You can, okay.

KATHRYN SCHROEDER: That's, that's why I

1 asked.

2 JOHN DOLAN: Fine.

3 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: But, I mean, I could put
4 one of the bookbags on my back and --

5 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. I think that would be --
6 might be better.

7 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: -- and the overnight bag
8 on my shoulder and then I can carry the other bookbag.

9 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. Okay. I think that might
10 be better.

11 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Like I said. I'm a
12 healthy person.

13 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. Then we can get --
14 whenever you want to start walking down the road, just
15 if you want to do it now, we can do it now. If you
16 need --

17 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: What time is it now?

18 JOHN DOLAN: It's a little bit -- it's 9:40.
19 It's coming up to 10:00, so --

20 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Why don't we say I'm, I'm
21 going to walk out -- hang on before I make the
22 decision.

23 JOHN DOLAN: Sure. Sure.

24 (Pause.)

25 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay. Why don't we say
I'm going to walk out the door 10:00.

1 JOHN DOLAN: At 10:00 a.m. sharp.

2 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yeah. Give me 20 minutes
3 to --

4 JOHN DOLAN: Sure.

5 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: -- at least pass on a
6 message to David if I can't actually talk to him --

7 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. Now, just as an insight,
8 the agents are going to be very gentle, so you know,
9 please be assured that there's nothing, you know, along
10 those lines that's, that's going to happen. They're
11 going to be extremely gentle and just follow their
12 directions and they'll be very explicit what they want
13 you to do.

14 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: And Brian's going to be
15 waiting and you got a video tape to, to tape it, right?

16 JOHN DOLAN: Yes, we do. In fact, it's set
17 up on a tripod. I saw it myself.

18 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay.

19 JOHN DOLAN: It's in the corner of the room.

20 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay.

21 JOHN DOLAN: And yes, it's all ready to go.

22 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: All right. Great.

23 JOHN DOLAN: So, great. Great.

24 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I shall see you probably
25 then in a half an hour or so.

JOHN DOLAN: Okay. We'll leave it this way,

1 that you'll depart at exactly at 10:00 a.m.

2 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: 10:00 a.m.

3 JOHN DOLAN: How's that.

4 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Yep.

5 JOHN DOLAN: And what -- I've got about 9:40

6 now.

7 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I --

8 JOHN DOLAN: Now, would it be possible to put

9 Steve on the phone when you're leaving?

10 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Hang, hang on a second.

11 JOHN DOLAN: Sure.

12 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: I have -- shoot, I have

13 9:45 now.

14 JOHN DOLAN: 9:45? Okay. That's fine.

15 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Is, is this John Cox?

16 JOHN DOLAN: No. This is John Dolan.

17 KATHRYN SCHROEDER TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON:

18 No. Dolan. I -- he wants to talk to you when I'm

19 done.

20 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay. Steve said fine

21 and I'm going to go see if I can get a last word into

22 David.

23 JOHN DOLAN: Sounds great and we'll look for

24 you to depart at 10:00 a.m.

25 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: And I got 15 minutes.

JOHN DOLAN: Right.

1 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Thank you.
2 JOHN DOLAN: Look forward to seeing you.
3 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay. Bye-bye.
4 JOHN DOLAN: Bye-bye.
5 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: -- bull.
6 JOHN DOLAN: Good morning, Steve. Let me
7 switch over. One second.
8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.
9 JOHN DOLAN: How are you this morning?
10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Very cold.
11 JOHN DOLAN: Boy, that rain was unbelievable
12 last night.
13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: It's definitely not Hawaii
14 over here.
15 JOHN DOLAN: (Laughter.)
16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. So I guess we've got
17 it pretty much worked out for Kathy and we're, we're
18 trying to get the others worked out here too now.
19 JOHN DOLAN: That's great. That's really
20 great. Who else is intending to come out?
21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: There's going to be another
22 four for sure.
23 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. Those are the folks we
24 spoke about yesterday?
25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. I don't know if we
-- if I mentioned there's going to be Rita Riddle also.

1 JOHN DOLAN: Rita Riddle.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That would be another one
3 that is going that I don't think I mentioned.

4 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. Excellent. So that would
5 be Oliver, Brad, Kevin, and Rita?

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yes.

7 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. Wonderful. Wonderful.

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And of course I will be
9 talking with quite a few yet today, so let's see. I
10 guess that's -- let's see, what else is there? Yeah --
11 any, anything there that you wanted to say or --

12 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. Yeah.

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

14 JOHN DOLAN: Definitely we -- if you -- the
15 power's working okay, isn't it?

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

17 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. The place -- my hotel
18 actually flickered last night. I said, holy cow. I
19 mean, I thought the lights were going out in my place.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

21 JOHN DOLAN: But, we'd like to, like to have
22 the people watch the press conference tonight. I
23 really think it's going to be interesting today.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

25 JOHN DOLAN: Because with the exception of a
few individuals and I stress few individuals against

1 | whom serious charges, you know, are going to be
2 | pending, all other adults are going to be treated as
3 | material witnesses.

4 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

5 | JOHN DOLAN: So that's a really -- a big
6 | plus. And then follow --

7 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: It is.

8 | JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. And then following the
9 | crime scene investigation at the compound, all
10 | individuals who are not held for trial will be allowed
11 | to return to the compound.

12 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

13 | JOHN DOLAN: So I think that's a big factor,
14 | because I'm sure there's a lot of people who don't have
15 | any other place to go.

16 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, that's true.

17 | JOHN DOLAN: So they'll be allowed to return.

18 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

19 | JOHN DOLAN: And you know whatever the
20 | modifications they want, you know, get some windows or,
21 | or -- on the windows.

22 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: That's great.

23 | JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. Well --

24 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: It really is.

25 | JOHN DOLAN: You know, we've -- we started
something, you and I a few days ago and this is just --

1 the momentum is continuing, so --

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Good.

3 JOHN DOLAN: -- that's good. It's really
4 good.

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Good.

6 JOHN DOLAN: And I appreciate all your
7 efforts in there. It's been, it's been tough. I know
8 that.

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Let's see. So what, what
10 time do you have there, John?

11 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. My watch may be a little
12 bit, little bit fast --

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

14 JOHN DOLAN: -- or a little bit slow, rather,
15 but I'm looking around 9:46, 47. I think Kathy was
16 going to come out some, some -- exactly at 10:00 a.m.
17 according to her watch.

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. Right.

19 JOHN DOLAN: So we're probably looking at ten
20 minutes. And then when she comes out and then, then
21 we'll, you know, we'll work on all the other stuff and
22 get that done.

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. Actually what I'm
24 going to do is try to work out who's going next now
25 and --

JOHN DOLAN: That'll be fine.

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Apparently they want to go
2 one by one. At first I was going, I was going to try
3 to get them all to go at the same time, but I guess
4 they wanted to see how she did and, I mean, not that
5 they aren't -- I mean, they're coming for sure by the
6 way.

7 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. Who, who is -- who do we
8 think will be next?

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I think the next one -- I
10 think it's going to be Oliver.

11 JOHN DOLAN: Oliver?

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

13 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. Very good.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: He's the one that expressed
15 -- when I was talking with them, one of the first ones
16 that I, I talked to that I thought might want to be
17 going and so I think, yeah, he'll be coming next.

18 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. Great. Great. And I
19 think the fact that, you know, some people do not have
20 a place, or for that matter, a lot of funds. The fact
21 that they can return there afterward and have a place
22 to stay and so on, you know, might be, might be a good
23 thing.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

25 JOHN DOLAN: And it's, you know, I think it's
a humanitarian thing too. That they have some place --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, it definitely would
2 be.

3 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. Yeah. So that's all
4 arranged, that's been cleared, and that's a guarantee
5 and so on and so forth. So --

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Apparently somebody had
7 been watching the news or something last night and it
8 was spoken of that, I guess, David was on -- was in
9 Time and Newsweek. Do you know anything --

10 JOHN DOLAN: Yes, yes. You know, this is
11 amazing, but we sent, we sent a couple of fellows out
12 this morning to the -- one of these like --

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: They're all sold out.

14 JOHN DOLAN: It's all sold out already. So
15 what we're going to do is we're going to call back east
16 and have them facsimile copies out.

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I see.

18 JOHN DOLAN: Facsimile copies. So it won't
19 be as clear. You know how those Fax copies are, but
20 the -- but you can read the whole thing.

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

22 JOHN DOLAN: So we're working on doing that
23 right now.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I see. Okay.

25 JOHN DOLAN: So, yeah. We'll definitely --
those will be definitely here today. They'll be in

1 | this morning, so that'll be -- we'll get that done.

2 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: I mean it's more -- in
3 | fact, David, he don't even care, but it's a couple of
4 | people are curious and they -- there's no question it
5 | won't be good. In the first place, I don't -- he has
6 | no interest in it, it doesn't seem at all.

7 | JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. Well, you know, yeah.
8 | You know the press. I don't think it's going to be
9 | praiseworthy

10 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh yeah. Well, no, of
11 | course not. Okay.

12 | JOHN DOLAN: Great.

13 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Is there anything else that
14 | we can do right now?

15 | JOHN DOLAN: Nope. We got -- everything is,
16 | is just, is just great and I'm looking forward to
17 | seeing Kathy and then we're going to have Kathy and
18 | Brian together here at the hangar.

19 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Good.

20 | JOHN DOLAN: And then we're going to have
21 | Kathy call you back.

22 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Good job.

23 | JOHN DOLAN: Great. Great.

24 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right now, I'll be battling
25 | the cold along with trying to do some more talking,
but --

1 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- this place definitely is
3 miserably cold.

4 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. Now, probably if it's
5 okay, if you could come on the phone when she's going
6 out.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh, okay.

8 JOHN DOLAN: That might be a good
9 coordination. You and I could keep --

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. I'll do that for
11 sure then.

12 JOHN DOLAN: Great.

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON:
14 Yeah.

15 JOHN DOLAN: I'll talk --

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Just a minute.

17 JOHN DOLAN: Sure.

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON:
19 Yeah, right. They're going to go faxing it -- right.

8 down, we'll get the originals driven down from
9 somewhere.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

11 JOHN DOLAN: But we'll, we'll get that.

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

13 JOHN DOLAN: Absolutely.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Thanks.

15 JOHN DOLAN: Well, let's work on -- what
16 we'll work on doing is we'll get the faxes in first and
17 then we'll get the originals following that, if, if
18 that's a start.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

20 JOHN DOLAN: But, yeah, we'll absolutely get
21 the originals.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

23 JOHN DOLAN: Definitely.

25 as soon as she's ready. I'll go see if she's got
everything together here and make sure she's out at

1 ten.

17 KATHRYN SCHROEDER: Okay.

18 JOHN DOLAN: Hi.

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Nothing -- we didn't even
22 know such a thing at first.

23 JOHN DOLAN: I know that. Like you said,
24 there's, there's all this --

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: But, but can we -- when she
gets out, can she make at least one phone call and you

1 stay right there. All she needs to do is call that man
2 and say we have no -- we don't know who that person
3 was. We disavow what the person had to say. Can you
4 allow her to do that?

5 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. Who, who do you want to
6 call? Just, just give me --

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, Kathy Schroeder, when
8 she gets out there. Just have her call, I think it's,
9 it's 1190 --

10 JOHN DOLAN: Uh-huh.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- and it's this Ron
12 whatever his name is. I don't know.

13 JOHN DOLAN: On 1190?

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yes. And she -- he's got
15 some woman on there that is acting like she's in here,
16 she's crying. I mean, it's incredible. It's almost
17 believable.

18 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. We'll, we'll check, but
19 yeah, let's get Kathy out. We'll check on that.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, no. I mean, no. But

7 JOHN DOLAN: Thank you. Bye.

8 (Connection broken.)

9 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: He wants to go
10 watch the press conference.

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #2: They want to
12 watch -- they're watching this.

13 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: Is she coming
14 down now?

15 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #2: Okay. We need
16 a -- rep that somebody's got to call that guy and say
17 that the compound is disavowing --

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: Let's,
19 let's --

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #2: Recommend
21 press, press officer call station and say --

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Hi. Yeah --

5 JOHN DOLAN: Let me switch over here, sir.

7 JOHN DOLAN: Gotcha!

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

9 JOHN DOLAN: Okey doke.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I was just talking with
11 David for a minute and he, he had listened. We, we
12 taped the, the conversation off that radio station.
13 He's not too happy about it.

14 JOHN DOLAN: I can understand that.

16 yourself or Kathy would call the man and just say to
17 him that this is through Steve Schneider --

1 JOHN DOLAN: What's her, what's her name?

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I guess her name was Susan
3 and she claimed that -- she used words like Armageddon,
4 which we don't use. She used Je-- the Lord Jesus
5 Christ, you know, these old, evangelical cliches. She
6 said something about \$180,000 being given to David.
7 That is nonsense, total nonsense. She said a lot of
8 things that, that sound like -- almost like a maybe a
9 white supremacist group. She said she had a daughter
10 in here that was --

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Yes.
12 Yes. Just a minute.

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: She said she had a daughter
14 in here eight years old. We have none -- no children
15 in here that I'm aware of that are eight years old,
16 especially a daughter.

17 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. So she's saying that
18 number one, she gave \$180,00 --

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yes.

20 JOHN DOLAN: -- number two that she has a
21 daughter in that's eight years old.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

23 JOHN DOLAN: And -- do you remember her name
24 at all?

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I, I believe she said her
name is --

1 JOHN DOLAN: Susan?

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- Susan. Yeah.

3 JOHN DOLAN: And her last name?

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And she said something
7 about being connected to Paul Fatta, which is nonsense
8 again.

12 a gun show Friday or something like that -- it's all

16 David Koresh --

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

18 JOHN DOLAN: -- there -- I'm speaking on

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Hello, John.

3 JOHN DOLAN: Steve, good to hear from you.

4 Hold on a sec.

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

6 JOHN DOLAN: Okay.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I tried to spend a little

8 time with David. He's still, of course, bedridden and

9 everything.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

1 JOHN DOLAN: -- so I left the phone, which I
2 should not have done, but --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

4 JOHN DOLAN: -- I went directly to the, to
5 the head guy here and said, hey, you know, he --
6 there's not just one guy as you know, but --

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

8 JOHN DOLAN: -- I went to them directly.

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

10 JOHN DOLAN: I got everybody together and I
11 said this is a personal request from David through
12 Steve to me and I said I personally would handle it for

25 hold of his media guy who at that time was moving from
the convention center, said come directly to my office.

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Uh-huh.

2 JOHN DOLAN: Came directly to the office and
3 he ordered him to call that station. So it's going to
4 be done. And I just spoke to the media guy and I said,
5 please give me the time that you called in there
6 because I want, I want to relay that to Steve.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. Good, good.

8 JOHN DOLAN: I will get that -- it's being
9 done and we will do it.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, see, because this guy
11 is going to be off the program in about another 15
12 minutes.

13 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. I'll pass that on and
14 make sure he expedites. My, my, my feeling was that he
15 was going to do it within the next five minutes, but
16 I'll make sure that --

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, that sounds good.

18 JOHN DOLAN: -- he expedites it.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: They're listening, yeah. I
20 mean it was a very off-the-wall kind of phone call. If
21 we aren't already off-the-wall, John, if you know what
22 I mean.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

JOHN DOLAN: That's 100 percent covered.

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. And they asked me
2 also about the Time, Newsweek?

3 JOHN DOLAN: Yes. We're working on that. As
4 a matter of fact, we can dig up some, some faxes for
5 you, but I don't know if you'd be too pleased with
6 those, but I'll get the originals --

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. He -- yeah, he
8 definitely wants the originals. Sherri Jewell's in
9 here and apparently her daughter was on national TV
10 with her ex-husband --

11 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, is that right?

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- on the Donahue program
13 yesterday --

14 JOHN DOLAN: Um-hum.

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- and is there any way you
16 can get a transcript of that, because she's obviously
17 curious as to what her daughter had to say about
18 herself and others here. It was heard that some things
19 she said were definitely untrue and she knows that
20 would be the prompting from the father who is, is
21 spoiling the child, giving her anything she wants. So

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. I mean, he's using
11 words like re -- we're not releasing. These people are
12 choosing. You know, we can encourage, but it sounds
13 like he's got con -- he does not. They did go to him
14 and say, do you have anything from the Bible you could
15 share to us. They requested that from him, but when it
16 came to this idea of his releasing them, there's
17 nothing to that.

18 JOHN DOLAN: I understand.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And it actually bothered
20 him because they do have the freedom of choice and they
21 are choosing to leave and that's more than being both
22 respected and encouraged.

23 JOHN DOLAN: Absolutely. Absolutely.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And if they, if they could
25 make it a little more clear, because they aren't being
held and I am talking to a lot of people and if anybody

1 wants to go, I am going to encourage them to do so.

2 JOHN DOLAN: Great. And I, I appreciate
3 that. And I will tell him personally about that.

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: You know, like I, I -- of
5 course, I do go back and talk with David, let him know
6 what's going on, or who might go and all that, and he
7 just -- he's just interested in these people. He
8 want's to make sure they're doing well and that they
9 will be, you know, treated well and so forth, so that's
10 -- I go back and forth now and then and he's at least
11 not so bad today where I can't talk to him.

12 JOHN DOLAN: Good. I will personally talk to
13 Mr. Swensen later in the day and --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right. Good.

15 JOHN DOLAN: -- we will --

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And by the way, that wasn't
17 the Dick that I had been talking to --

18 JOHN DOLAN: No. No, no, no, no.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Because I --

20 JOHN DOLAN: No, no.

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I didn't think so.

22 JOHN DOLAN: No, no. I think you could tell
23 from the voices.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. I think you're right
25 about that, but someone said, is that the same one. I
said, I'm sure it's not, but --

1 JOHN DOLAN: I'm sure it's not, too.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Don't even pass that on any
3 further.

4 JOHN DOLAN: I won't pass that. That's
5 between you and me.

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

7 JOHN DOLAN: Okay.

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: But anyways --

9 JOHN DOLAN: If it would be possible to have
10 somebody near the phone it might expedite
11 communications in case something came up and in case we
12 needed to do something. If you, if you could have
13 somebody hang by the phone. I know you're busy. But
14 maybe somebody --

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. I, I -- well, most
16 of the time I will be here. The only time I will go
17 away is they're having a few others that before maybe
18 they make a move they want to first have me video them,
19 so I'm going to try to do that today for sure --

20 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, I know. I know you got a
21 lot going and, and I appreciate your efforts and I know
22 that.

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

24 JOHN DOLAN: It's just that sometimes like we
25 have some stuff going which we may have number one the
call from Kathy and we want to arrange the milk

1 delivery too.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

3 JOHN DOLAN: So, it's, it's good to have the,
4 the communication lines --

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I was going to say too,
6 David did comment in regards to that press release this
7 morning. He said that like for instance, they, they
8 made the point that they were not able to come into the
9 compound or into the building to take out their men.
10 But no, in fact, they did. I'm positive -- David said
11 he was sure that they came into the one place and, and
12 took them out right from the building even and he said
13 no to that. I -- we were wondering why, you know, some
14 of these kind of answers when they were, they were
15 actually viewed --

16 JOHN DOLAN: Sure. What I think happened on
17 that is the -- not -- the facts are not all clear,
18 because you got one agency breaking off and a new
19 agency starting.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: But I mean this is the ATF
21 agent that answered that way --

22 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, the ATF agent.

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yes.

24 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, okay.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Not, not Swensen.

JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. I didn't think it was, I

1 | didn't think it was Swensen, because --

2 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. No, he didn't --

3 | JOHN DOLAN: He wouldn't even have those
4 | facts.

5 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Exactly.

6 | JOHN DOLAN: Yeah, yeah.

7 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Let's see. What else did
8 | he say? Let's see here. Press has told -- okay --
9 | well, again, in -- and in regards to that --

10 | JOHN DOLAN: Oh, I was just handed --

11 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

12 | JOHN DOLAN: -- handed a note.

13 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

14 | JOHN DOLAN: Okay. He was just advised on
15 | the air and he will pass the message out over the
16 | air --

17 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

18 | JOHN DOLAN: -- in approximately ten minutes.

19 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. What --

20 | JOHN DOLAN: Hold on, hold on a second.

21 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

22 | JOHN DOLAN: I misread this message here.

23 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

24 | JOHN DOLAN: Oh, okay. Okay. He said, they
25 | won't get the message to him for about ten minutes, but
they will pass -- they can't interrupt him. He's, he's

1 on the air. But they have contacted the station --

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

3 JOHN DOLAN: -- and they will advise him of
4 that.

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Good.

6 JOHN DOLAN: It's been done.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right. Very good.
8 Very good.

9 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. So I just wanted you to
10 make --

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And what about the que --
12 we had a question about so the -- there was -- has been
13 a judge that has denied that attorneys come in and talk
14 with us or, or help out?

15 You know, you know, David did mention one of
16 the strongest points he thinks that there would be a
17 lot more people coming out. Now, he himself -- now,
18 remember, he's waiting on God himself. And there are
19 people like I've told you many times that they're
20 waiting to see what's happening there.

21 JOHN DOLAN: Right.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: But I wouldn't be surprised
23 if I or if we couldn't get this going to where a lot
24 more -- a very good-sized group of these people would
25 come out. And he mentioned like this Ron Engleman has
mentioned about coming in and maybe getting something

1 going or being able to talk to the people. They might
2 even go out with him. But, you know, it, it's
3 something -- we've talked about maybe an intermediary
4 or someone that, that is between us or something.

5 JOHN DOLAN: Um-hum.

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That it might make a
7 difference -- and a lot of these people have told me
8 that.

9 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. The --

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So, it's something for you
11 to, you know, think about anyway.

12 JOHN DOLAN: Well, let me run it by -- let me
13 run this by, you know --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

15 JOHN DOLAN: You know, you know, I'm -- as
16 you know, I'm straight from the shoulder --

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right, right.

18 JOHN DOLAN: And you and I've got that going
19 and I'm not going to let anything destroy that. I can
20 tell you this. The tactical commanders will not let
21 another person, an outsider, in there. The --

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, what, what happened
23 in the past like with -- and some like was mentioned,
24 which is true, you know, the Weaver case of course they
25 have and I know there's been other instances and it's,
you know, it's a case-by-case thing.

1 JOHN DOLAN: It's a case-by-case thing and,
2 you know, they've elected due to the large number --
3 see, Randy Weaver was a single person. He had two --
4 one pre-teenage girl and one teenage girl.

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. I realize that.

6 JOHN DOLAN: And so he was a single person.
7 There was another person with him by the name of Kevin
8 Harris and Harris had been --

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

10 JOHN DOLAN: -- at that point at least,
11 apparently mortally wounded.

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: But in this case though
13 like, John, for instance -- David believes as to
14 everybody here that very good intentions were shown
15 right from the time that the incident happened about
16 making sure that the wounded were -- came in, no one
17 was fired upon, no one wanted to do that. They wanted
18 to make sure they got off and got care right away. You
19 know, right from the beginning we believe we've tried
20 to work the best way possible for, you know, the good
21 of all.

22 JOHN DOLAN: No argument at all.

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

24 JOHN DOLAN: No argument at all.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So I might, you know, there
may be a pretty strong request from David. I, I mean,

1 | that's why I'm already starting to bring it up, because
2 | when I was just in there he, himself, is the one that
3 | mentioned this about Ron Engleman, so I --

4 | JOHN DOLAN: Okay. As far as Mr. Engleman
5 | goes, what does he -- what's his attitude?

6 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Apparently he must be a
7 | talk, a talk show host or something like that on that
8 | radio station and he, he seems to be, in the eyes of
9 | David, to be a fair man who is very patriotic, meaning
10 | he, he's into the Constitution and I guess the man
11 | himself has even offered to do something like that. So
12 | David, knowing that the man is not, you know, of
13 | course, he would be promised safety or whatever else,
14 | but anyway just by what the man said, David thinks that
15 | the man is sincere.

16 | JOHN DOLAN: Um-hum.

17 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: So, but that's why he
18 | mentioned him. I mean -- and by contrary, someone said
19 | on that radio station that David has been a listener of
20 | this guy. He's never heard of the man before and
21 | neither have I.

22 | JOHN DOLAN: Oh, I see.

23 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'm not a -- we're -- I'm
24 | not one that's really much into the radio in the first
25 | place. This is the first time, really, in years that
I've taken any time to listen once in a great while.

1 JOHN DOLAN: No, me either. I'm mostly that,
2 that -- we use the radio in the car somewhat, but
3 that's, you know --

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, like -- yes, same
5 here. Once in a while I'll turn it on in an automobile
6 when I'm going --

7 JOHN DOLAN: Right.

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- to and fro, but --

9 JOHN DOLAN: It, it kind of fills the time
10 when you're driving.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Exactly. Exactly.

12 JOHN DOLAN: I, you know, I think that if we,
13 we approach Mr. -- this gentleman, Ron --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

15 JOHN DOLAN: -- that -- you know, there would
16 be no problem. We talked about a pool camera, but if,
17 if this is the guy that he'd rather have or in
18 conjunction with a pool camera outside something like
19 that --

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Uh-huh.

21 JOHN DOLAN: -- I think we could work that
22 out. How's that sound?

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay, we'll -- let's keep
24 on -- we'll -- you and I will keep on dialoguing --

25 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah, we'll dialogue that.
Yeah.

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- like that, you know, you
2 can probably start talking to some of the commanders
3 there about it or whatever you think it needs to be --

4 JOHN DOLAN: Sure, sure.

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And I think it maybe would
6 go a long way though -- it would help me even, you
7 know --

8 JOHN DOLAN: Okay.

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- to get this thing taken
10 care of.

11 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. Let's get this resolved.

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'm going to be -- in the
13 next little bit here, I'm going to be talking to Ollie
14 to see when now he's going to be ready to make the next
15 move to, to be going out himself.

16 JOHN DOLAN: All right. Excellent. Was --
17 did, did he have any concerns after seeing the
18 situation with Kathy? Was he --

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, I guess, apparently
20 what he's doing right now -- I didn't get -- and I
21 haven't really even gotten to talk to him yet today.
22 I, I --

23 JOHN DOLAN: Right.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- haven't even seen Oliver
25 yet. But when I talked to him last night it sounded
like he'd be ready to go and he was going to wait to

1 | hear from Kathy and everything and then he -- I guess
2 | he's going to be about ready to go out the door
3 | himself.

4 | JOHN DOLAN: Oh, okay. Excellent.

5 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

6 | JOHN DOLAN: One of the, one of the, one of
7 | the people here just mentioned that they could save
8 | them a run with, with -- drop off the milk and then
9 | possibly Oliver could get in with them. Just --

10 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: That, that'd probably be
11 | all right.

12 | JOHN DOLAN: -- coordinate that.

13 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. What about the
14 | facsimiles of the Time, Newsweek thing or the actual
15 | article, you know, meaning the, the -- the magazines
16 | themselves?

17 | JOHN DOLAN: Oh. Would a facsimile be okay
18 | to send in?

19 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, he actually -- David
20 | did -- he said, no, he wanted the actual --

21 | JOHN DOLAN: Wanted the originals of what we
22 | were working on?

23 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, okay.

24 | JOHN DOLAN: Yeah.

25 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: So you haven't been able to
 | obtain that yet.

1 JOHN DOLAN: I can send in facsimiles. We've
2 got them of only one --

3 JOHN DOLAN TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Excuse
4 me. What is that that we --

5 JOHN DOLAN: Newsweek. Okay. We do have a
6 facsimile of Newsweek. How about if I send that in?
7 It's up to you.

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, that'd be helpful.

9 JOHN DOLAN: All right. Yeah.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: But if you can, I mean, I
11 mean --

12 JOHN DOLAN: Sure.

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- what he really wants, of
14 course, is the two magazines, so.

15 JOHN DOLAN: Is that -- say again. Is the
16 actual hard copy.

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. The Time and the
18 Newsweek --

19 JOHN DOLAN: The Time and the Newsweek.
20 We're absolutely, definitely working on those --

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

22 JOHN DOLAN: -- and we will eventually get,
23 but I will send you a --

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I appreciate that.

25 JOHN DOLAN: I'll put that -- how about if we
put that in a brown envelope and then --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Sounds good.

2 JOHN DOLAN: -- on one of the runs, but -- on
3 one of the runs that we make?

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

5 JOHN DOLAN: Okay? So I'll tell you what --

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Would it be okay -- well,
7 how would, how would you like to do that then? If
8 Oliver comes out then they leave it out there maybe
9 after he's taken away, then maybe Greg comes out to
10 pick it up? Or should we just wait till he gets out
11 there and then we'll make a call or you and I'll be
12 talking or whatever you'd like to do.

13 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. What I, what I was
14 thinking of doing is that we were going -- would make
15 the milk run --

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

17 JOHN DOLAN: -- and then when we come up, at
18 the same time, Oliver would come up and go in with the
19 gentlemen there and then the unit would leave and then
20 whoever wants to can come out and --

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Then Greg can --
22 after the unit leaves then he can go walk out there and
23 pick it up. All right.

24 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. Greg can go out and pick
25 up --

STEVE SCHNEIDER: That's fine.

1 JOHN DOLAN: Sure. When do you want to do
2 that?

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'm going to be talking to
4 Oliver here pretty quick and --

5 JOHN DOLAN: Okay.

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I guess he's just
7 waiting to hear from Kathy. I -- he might want to get
8 on the phone with her just for a minute, so --

9 JOHN DOLAN: That's -- sure. That's
10 absolutely fine.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

12 JOHN DOLAN: So we'll, we'll hook up Oliver
13 and Kathy if you want --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. That's sounds good.

15 JOHN DOLAN: -- if you want to -- is that
16 what you want to do or --

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

18 JOHN DOLAN: Okay.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And then we'll, we'll start
20 going right from there.

21 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. Hold on one second.
22 We've got the milk ready, though.

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

24 JOHN DOLAN TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Is -- the
25 milk is ready?

JOHN DOLAN: The milk is ready --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

2 JOHN DOLAN: -- is what everybody's nodding
3 their heads here. We've got six gallons of whole
4 milk --

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Good, good.

6 JOHN DOLAN: -- to go and so we could -- if
7 Ol -- can you -- you think you can get Oliver ready?

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yes. Most definitely.

9 JOHN DOLAN: All right. Why don't I have in
10 say approximately -- just, you know, in the next 15-20
11 minutes or so, have the unit come up -- okay, guy says
12 to me we can, we can get it faster -- have the unit
13 come up with the six gallons of whole milk --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Uh-huh.

15 JOHN DOLAN: -- Oliver will come out, he'll
16 go with the gentlemen --

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, remember now, it's --
18 he's waiting for Kathy to call first, so I can't --

19 JOHN DOLAN: Oh.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I can't rush him out
21 just yet until he speaks to her.

22 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, he wants to speak to Kathy,
23 huh?

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. Right.

25 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. How about the other
gentlemen?

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I got to go talk -- I
2 haven't even seen them yet today, because I got up and
3 I, I've spent -- most of that time I was behind a TV
4 screen and then talking with David about that and I
5 just came out from there to talk to you now.

6 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, I see.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So I haven't talked to
8 Kevin yet or to Brad.

9 JOHN DOLAN: Okay.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And I mentioned, I think,
11 to you this morning that there might be another woman
12 that --

13 JOHN DOLAN: Rita. Yeah.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yes.

15 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. In fact if Rit --

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So, I've got to -- I've
17 still got to start talking with her yet because I just
18 -- last night is when I was first -- I went around
19 again talking to as many people as I could and then
20 when I talked to her, she started to show signs that
21 she was willing -- or wanted to go also. So I got to
22 -- I have to -- I wanted to mention her name at least.

23 JOHN DOLAN: Okay.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So I got to still spend a
25 little more time with her so --

 JOHN DOLAN: She needs a little bit more time

1 | perhaps than --

2 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. Right.

3 | JOHN DOLAN: -- to feel --

4 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: So, but I'm sure she's
5 | going to be going, from what I can tell and from what
6 | I've, what I've talked to her already about.

7 | JOHN DOLAN: Just, just as a thought, you
8 | know, sometimes -- and I, I, you know, have seen this
9 | before -- where people like a little physical support
10 | to be with them. Perhaps Rita would like to, you know,
11 | come out with Oliver or somebody like that?

12 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: It's possible. I, I
13 | mentioned that to them, by the way. I did. And that,
14 | that may be. She might go with one of the guys that
15 | like either Brad or Kevin maybe.

16 | JOHN DOLAN: Okay.

17 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: But I think Oliver -- he's
18 | going -- he's waiting -- after talking with Kathy, I
19 | think he's going to be about ready to go right away,
20 | so --

21 | JOHN DOLAN: Oh, Oliver you mean?

22 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

23 | JOHN DOLAN: Okay. How about Brad?

24 | STEVE SCHNEIDER: I haven't -- I got to go
25 | talk to him again today. I mean he's, he's going.

 JOHN DOLAN: He's going.

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: But what time, I don't
2 know. I got to see what he's up to, if he's got
3 something packed or just what he, what he needs to do
4 yet or whatever.

5 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. If that, if that packing
6 is a problem, you know, we can always get his things on
7 a subsequent run, so --

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

9 JOHN DOLAN: -- it's not like it's --

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That's, that's good.

11 JOHN DOLAN: It's, you know, and we'll get
12 the stuff to him.

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. Right. If they get
14 out there and they need anything, just pass it back to
15 me -- yeah, we can do that.

16 JOHN DOLAN: Oh yeah, sure. In fact, in fact
17 that remains open for anybody.

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

19 JOHN DOLAN: The children or, or Kathy, if
20 she left anything behind.

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. Right.

22 JOHN DOLAN: We'll just, we'll just pick it
23 up on, on one of the runs and just --

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So I'll be waiting to hear
25 from you and Kathy in, in a little bit then.

 JOHN DOLAN: In just --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: In the meanwhile, I'm going
2 to -- I'm going to go talk --

3 JOHN DOLAN: It'll be just a few minutes.

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Good. Then I'm
5 going to go talk to some of the others right now and
6 I'm going to get that camera ready to -- because Pablo
7 Cohen wants to be filmed first, I guess.

8 JOHN DOLAN: Pablo wants to be filmed, huh?

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

10 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. If you could --

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And then he'll pass that on
12 to you and I'll probably film maybe a -- maybe quite a
13 few others, because there's a lot of names we haven't
14 given you yet, so if they want to I told them -- I
15 encouraged them to get behind the camera.

16 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. Don't worry -- we'll get
17 the filming done, but you know we'd like to -- we got
18 such great things going, we'd like to make sure that
19 the things are kind of prioritized.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. I understand.

21 JOHN DOLAN: So if you would be kind enough
22 to leave somebody by the telephone, Kathy will be
23 calling in shortly. In fact --

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Someone will be
25 here.

 JOHN DOLAN: In fact, if you want to -- just

1 momentarily, if you want to leave Oliver there, that'd
2 be --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I don't know where he is.

4 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, okay.

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I've got to go find him.

6 JOHN DOLAN: Okay.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So that's what I was going
8 to do right now. I haven't even talked to him yet, so
9 I'll go to, to find him or see what he's doing. If
10 he's ready or whatever.

11 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. If he's ready you can
12 check on Oliver and if you'd --

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

14 JOHN DOLAN: -- have somebody by the phone
15 we'll have, we'll have --

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Good. We'll, we'll do
17 that.

18 JOHN DOLAN: Great.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. I'll talk to you in
20 a bit.

21 JOHN DOLAN: Talk to you.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Bye.

23 JOHN DOLAN: Bye-bye.

24 (Connection broken.)

JOHN DOLAN: I screwed it up -- screwed the

20 JOHN: Is this our phone or Wayne's phone?

21 STEVE: This is a new phone that we had, that

JOHN: Good.

1 STEVE: Ollie, he's just down, he's just a
2 few feet away from me here. He's talking to someone.

3 JOHN: Okay.

4 STEVE: I was just talking with David. He's
5 real concerned because of that woman that called this
6 morning, saying she's lived here, knew us --

7 JOHN: Oh, we handled that, --

8 STEVE: And I was, I'm happy, but --

9 JOHN: Yeah.

10 STEVE: I think, it sounds like it's gonna
11 start happening a lot. Some other, some other person,
12 a radio station says they were a wife, it's nonsense,
13 you know, he'll come right out and tell you who and
14 what, you know, he's involved with, --

15 JOHN: I know that.

16 STEVE: He really will, I mean, you know that
17 just by the video that he sent to you, right?

18 JOHN: Let me tell, let me tell you what we,

18 | a press conference because, he, he, because of that,

23 | STEVE: I think that was the motive. I was
24 | trying to figure out, why would this woman say she
25 | knows us, she was here Friday, and we're all scratching
our heads. What's the motive here? Well, then I

1 remembered about the 75,000 that was mentioned on the
2 news that, that the mother made and there's a number of
3 other producers that wanted to do a movie on this,
4 well, then, it makes sense, of course.

5 JOHN: I know that.

6 STEVE: Everybody wants some notoriety --

7 JOHN: Excuse me.

8 STEVE: -- and maybe some finances gained out
9 of this, and, so he said that --

10 JOHN: Excuse me one second. Oh, she's ready
11 now, she's ready now. Oh, good, good. She's ready
12 now.

13 STEVE: Okay.

14 JOHN: She wants to talk to you, so --

15 STEVE: Oh, great, great.

16 JOHN: Okay, you ready? She wants to talk to
17 you too.

18 STEVE: Oh, that's super.

19 JOHN: Okay. I'm going to be on this, go
20 ahead. Go ahead.

21 KATHY: Hello.

22 STEVE: Kathy?

23 KATHY: Hi, Steve.

24 STEVE: How are you doing?

25 KATHY: Okay.

STEVE: Great.

1 KATHY: It has been so long of a day.

2 STEVE: I'll bet it has.

3 KATHY: How come you didn't call to check on
4 me?

5 STEVE: We thought that something had
6 happened. We were waiting every minute, I thought I'd
7 just give him a few more minutes, few more minutes --

8 KATHY: Huh-huh. Thank you, Steve, those few
9 more minutes, I mean, has wasted my day now. I can't
10 go through the system.

11 STEVE: You can't?

12 KATHY: It's, look what time it is. They're
13 not gonna process me on until I got a hold of you.

14 STEVE: Oh.

15 KATHY: So we've been sitting here all day.

16 STEVE: We had a problem with the telephone
17 that they did.

18 KATHY: Water logged.

19 STEVE: Pardon?

20 KATHY: The lines were water logged.

21 STEVE: That's what it was, because --

22 KATHY: Yeah.

23 STEVE: Strange, I couldn't figure out,
24 everything we did.

25 KATHY: You need, you need to set up
something with the negotiators that if you, if you

1 haven't heard from each other that you do, like, twice
2 a day, have a certain time that --

3 STEVE: Right.

4 KATHY: -- you call anyway.

5 STEVE: Well, this is, this is it. I thought
6 something had happened. We were trying to call out,
7 nothing. There seemed to be a, an open phone line --

8 KATHY: Yeah, you were able to call --

9 STEVE: -- but nothing was going on.

10 KATHY: You weren't able to call here either?

11 STEVE: Well, I opened, I pulled up the phone
12 a couple times, I dialed a few numbers and nothing
13 happened the one time, so I just thought well, he'll be
14 calling me anyway.

15 KATHY: Yeah, well see, they tried calling
16 you about 25 times.

17 STEVE: That's what he was telling me.
18 That's what he was telling me.

19 KATHY: And it just kept ringing.

20 STEVE: So everything's okay then though
21 other, I mean, other than that though, are you fine?

22 KATHY: Yeah, I got to see Brian as soon as I
23 got here, we videotaped it, we're gonna send that in to
24 you.

25 STEVE: Okay, that's good.

KATHY: I had taped a message to send you,

1 oh, I also, you need to find out about Wayne's recorded
2 message phone, because they've been trying to call you
3 on that. They've been leaving messages, I even left a
4 message on Wayne's recording.

5 STEVE: Really?

6 KATHY: Yes.

7 STEVE: It's got to be the weather. It has
8 to be.

9 KATHY: So, so I, you know, I taped a message
10 to send you but we don't need to do that now.

11 STEVE: I, well, did his phone work, is the
12 question. Were you able, so --

13 KATHY: His, his recording came on.

14 STEVE: Oh, it did, okay.

15 KATHY: Yeah. His message --

16 STEVE: I'll go check with that then.

17 KATHY: And, and I left a message on the
18 recorder so, um, I had been questioned by, so far, you
19 know, the negotiators, we've been talking about the
20 well being of the people inside of course.

21 STEVE: Right.

22 KATHY: I did mention Judy's finger, and --

23 STEVE: Good.

24 KATHY: -- that if they could possibly get,
25 maybe a doctor to call her.

STEVE: Good, she was hoping for that.

1 KATHY: And, and talk to her, you know, maybe
2 they can talk her into coming out --

3 STEVE: Sure.

4 KATHY: -- or they can just give her some
5 advice, you know, --

6 STEVE: Well, that's --

7 KATHY: -- as to what to do.

8 STEVE: That's fair.

9 KATHY: I mean, I can't say Judy's gonna come
10 out, you know, --

11 STEVE: Right.

12 KATHY: -- all I can say is, maybe she'll
13 listen.

14 STEVE: Exactly.

15 KATHY: So, maybe they'll work on getting a
16 doctor to call Judy, because it is getting worse, I
17 mean, --

18 STEVE: Right --

19 KATHY: -- I saw it yesterday.

20 STEVE: -- it definitely is. I was hoping
21 they would do that, have a doctor call her, talk to her
22 and --

23 KATHY: Yeah, it is getting worse.

24 STEVE: -- maybe see what happens from there.

25 KATHY: But, you know, they've been asking me
about the well being of everybody else. I told them

1 everybody else is fine. Right now --

2 STEVE: They, they told me they dropped a
3 cooler off with milk in it up at the gate. I wonder if
4 they have --

5 KATHY: Oh, yeah, I was going to ask you
6 about that. Did you --

7 STEVE: -- a copy of Newsweek or Time, if
8 they're up there even.

9 KATHY: Did you, you haven't gone to get the
10 milk yet?

11 STEVE: No.

12 KATHY: It's been sitting there for hours.

13 STEVE: Oh, it has been. Well, I'll send
14 Greg out to get it then. Tell him, unless --

15 KATHY: I don't know if the Newsweek and Time
16 is there. If it is, I hope they put it in something
17 waterproof.

18 STEVE: I do myself.

19 KATHY: But I know the milk's there. I was
20 told that hours ago. They brought the milk there so
21 that maybe you'd see that so you'd call us.

22 STEVE: Right, well, that's what did cause me
23 to call, in fact, but, see --

24 KATHY: Okay.

25 STEVE: -- I was downstairs busy with Pablo,
trying to film him.

1 KATHY: Oh, that's what they said, last --
2 Byron talked to you this morning you were gonna go do
3 some filming. So, that's what they said maybe you were
4 doing. But there still should have been somebody else
5 by the -- anyway, I know, you're the only one that
6 cares, huh?

7 STEVE: Well, anyway.

8 KATHY: Anyway, I'm doing fine.

16 | STEVE: Well, true.

17 | KATHY: If you, if you think back about it.

18 | STEVE: Well, sure, sure.

19 | KATHY: We've always had that problem.

20 | STEVE: I, it's so cold here, you kind of
21 | forget about everything but the cold I guess.

22 | KATHY: Oh, I wanted to tell you --

23 | STEVE: Yeah.

24 | KATHY: The Texas Rangers and another FBI
25 | agent has been questioning me and they are not asking
me any questions about the incident.

1 STEVE: Huh-huh.

2 KATHY: They're only asking about our
3 situation now.

4 STEVE: Okay.

5 KATHY: Okay? Which is basically the same
6 thing. The negotiators have been asking --

7 STEVE: Right.

8 KATHY: -- about everybody's welfare, and of
9 course they, of course the FBI also wants to make sure
10 that it's safe for their people too, okay?

11 STEVE: Uh-huh.

12 KATHY: So they're trying to clarify that it
13 is safe for their people and, you know --

14 STEVE: What do you meant that it's safe for
15 their people?

16 KATHY: You know, that were not pointing guns
17 out the windows or something, you know? You remember
18 the binocular situation --

19 STEVE: Oh, yeah.

20 KATHY: -- when they thought it was a gun?

21 STEVE: Oh, yeah.

22 KATHY: You know, things like that and I
23 said, no, definitely, it's nothing like that.

24 STEVE: I would have thought that with the
25 sophistication of devices they have they, that's, even
in the process when that happened, those days ago, --

1 KATHY: They, they --

2 STEVE: -- it surprised me --

3 KATHY: Yeah.

4 STEVE: -- that they, how they thought a
5 binocular was --

6 KATHY: They would have took, they should
7 have totally been able see that was a binocular.

8 STEVE: I would have thought so. But anyway,
9 well, that's good, well.

10 So, I guess Ollie, he'll be getting ready to go
11 and where are you going to be then?

12 KATHY: I'm still staying here for a little
13 bit while the Texas Rangers finish asking me some
14 questions, and, like I told them already, I would not
15 waive my rights, I wouldn't sign the thing that I
16 didn't want a lawyer. I don't have a lawyer yet, but
17 I'm not answering any questions that I don't want to,
18 you know, based on the fact that I don't have a lawyer
19 yet. And then, they are trying to work it out with the
20 court that even though tomorrow is Saturday, that I can
21 still have an appearance tomorrow in the court.

22 STEVE: I see.

23 KATHY: So, they're working on that. Tell
24 Sita --

25 STEVE: Yeah.

KATHY: -- and Margarita --

1 STEVE: Sita and Margarita.
2 KATHY: -- and Lisa --
3 STEVE: And Lisa.
4 KATHY: -- that, oh, and Julie.
5 STEVE: And Julie.
6 KATHY: 'Cause Julie calls Brian, Charlie
7 Brown.
8 STEVE: That what?
9 KATHY: Julie calls Brian, Charlie Brown.
10 STEVE: Okay, Charlie Brown.
11 KATHY: Tell them all that Charlie Brown is
12 wonderful. He is --
13 STEVE: Charlie Brown's wonderful. Is he
14 with you now?
15 KATHY: No. He went back to the house. It's
16 getting late.
17 STEVE: Okay.
18 KATHY: And there's really no place for him
19 to rest here.
20 STEVE: Oh, I see, okay.
21 KATHY: Oh, in the video that we taped?
22 STEVE: Right.
23 KATHY: I had him do the warface for you.
24 STEVE: Okay, good.
25 KATHY: And, and Mark Young, here, called
Brian, Charlie Brown.

1 STEVE: Oh, really?

2 KATHY: Yeah, before I even ever said it.

3 STEVE: No kidding. It's funny, isn't it?

4 KATHY: Tell Julie and Lisa and Margarita and

5 Sita that Brian is --

6 STEVE: Charlie Brown's okay.

7 KATHY: Charlie Brown is wonderful.

8 STEVE: He's wonderful.

9 KATHY: And as soon as I get through the

10 system, I will go and check on the other kids.

11 STEVE: All right, good, good.

12 KATHY: Definitely.

13 STEVE: Okay.

14 KATHY: Okay?

15 STEVE: Yeah.

16 KATHY: Do you want me to talk to Ollie?

17 STEVE: Hang on.

18 KATHY: Okay.

19 GREG: Hey, Kathy.

20 KATHY: Hi, Greg.

21 GREG: How are you doing?

22 KATHY: Okay.

23 GREG: That's good. They're listening in on

24 this I'm sure.

25 KATHY: Yeah. How're ya doing?

GREG: Oh, I'm doing all right, how about

1 | yourself?

2 | KATHY: You're probably gonna go out there
3 | and get the milk, aren't ya?

4 | GREG: Yeah.

5 | KATHY: Yeah. I don't know if the Newsweek
6 | and Time is there. If it is I hope they put it in
7 | something waterproof.

8 | GREG: Yeah, really. It's pretty cold out
9 | there. It's probably all crinkled up by now.

10 | KATHY: It's probably wet. It's been out
11 | there for hours.

12 | GREG: Really?

13 | KATHY: Yeah.

14 | GREG: I just noticed it about 45 minutes
15 | ago, or so.

16 | KATHY: You didn't even see the tank come in
17 | and bring it?

18 | GREG: No, I didn't.

19 | KATHY: Man, you guys aren't watching.
20 | Nobody's watching.

21 | GREG: Yeah, well somebody was watching and
22 | they told us but they didn't --

23 | KATHY: They didn't think anything of it.

24 | GREG: Yeah.

25 | KATHY: Well, there's been so much movement
on the property, you know?

1 GREG: Yeah.

2 KATHY: They wouldn't think anything of it.

3 GREG: Right.

4 KATHY: But, no, I'm fine. I got to see
5 Brian, everything's fine. They are asking about the
6 well being of, and the, you know, medical status of the
7 people inside.

8 GREG: Yeah?

9 KATHY: And basically, you know, the overall,
10 they're concerned for everybody's, everybody's safe
11 removal.

12 GREG: Right. So, how's everybody out there?
13 Have you seen anybody else?

14 KATHY: No, not yet. I, I heard that my
15 mother is here.

16 GREG: Really?

17 KATHY: Yeah. Possibly my mother-in-law
18 also. I don't know. Vying for, you know, temporary
19 custody of Brian.

20 GREG: So what are they holding for? Are
21 they still holding you?

22 KATHY: They're, they're not. They're still
23 questioning me right now, you know, before I even get
24 my initial appearance. Okay? They just want to get
25 the background information --

GREG: Initial --

1 KATHY: -- on --
2 GREG: -- appearance of what?
3 KATHY: Before the U.S. Magistrate.
4 GREG: Are they gonna charge you with
5 something?
6 KATHY: No, he's --
7 GREG: I wouldn't think so.
8 KATHY: No, the magistrate, the judge will
9 make that decision. If he charges me with anything.
10 Which I'll probably just mean is be a material witness,
11 which is, you know, what Katherine and Margaret did.
12 GREG: Oh, really?
13 KATHY: Yeah.
14 GREG: They weren't charged with anything?
15 KATHY: Well, they were originally, but the
16 --
17 GREG: Oh, and they dropped it.
18 KATHY: But the FBI got involved and dropped
19 it, had it dropped because there was nothing
20 substantial against them.
21 GREG: Oh, that's cool. So, really, nobody
22 really has done anything wrong so, --
23 KATHY: Right.
24 GREG: Other than, you know, what they're
25 accusing --
KATHY: Other than not wanting to leave their

1 homes?

2 GREG: Exactly.

3 KATHY: Is there anything wrong with that?

4 GREG: No. You can't blame anybody.

5 KATHY: I know.

6 GREG: Nobody wants to hurt anybody let alone

7 kill anybody.

8 KATHY: Right.

9 GREG: I mean, jeez.

10 KATHY: And I straightened up a couple of

11 things with statements being said that we weren't

12 sorrowful about the deaths of the four agents.

13 GREG: Who said that we weren't sorrowful?

14 KATHY: A news, a news briefing did.

15 GREG: Oh, it figures.

16 KATHY: But these guys, these guys here never

17 said that, never told them that.

18 GREG: That's a terrible statement to say

19 about anybody.

20 KATHY: Yeah.

21 GREG: But God sees everything, like I said,

22 back in 1988, and he will, you know, deal with that

23 individual in a day of judgement.

24 KATHY: When I do get out on bond, I'm going

25 to contact Ron Ingleman --

GREG: On bond?

1 KATHY: Yeah, I'm sure I'll have to have a
2 bond.
3 GREG: Oh, really?
4 KATHY: Yeah.
5 GREG: Yeah, tell Ron I said hi. He's a
6 great guy.
7 KATHY: I'm gonna call, did you hear about
8 that woman that called this morning?
9 GREG: Yeah, yeah, he, he found out that it
10 was a bogus call.
11 KATHY: Oh, he did find that out?
12 GREG: Yeah.
13 KATHY: How did he find that out?
14 GREG: So we called up these guys and they
15 told, they called them up apparently, but Ron
16 apologized later on.
17 KATHY: Oh, really, the FBI called him?
18 GREG: Apparently so. But here's Steve.
19 KATHY: Wow. Pretty good.
20 STEVE: Kathy?
21 KATHY: Yeah.
22 STEVE: Here's Ollie.
23 KATHY: Okay.
24 OLIVER: Hi, Kathy.
25 KATHY: Ollie?
OLIVER: Yeah.

1 KATHY: Hi.

2 OLIVER: So, how was it?

3 KATHY: It was a little bumpy, no, it wasn't.
4 Everybody says, oh, the tank ride's gonna be bumpy. It
5 wasn't. It's, you just got to hang on when they turn
6 around.

7 OLIVER: Huh?

8 KATHY: You just got to hang on when the tank
9 turns around. That's all.

10 OLIVER: Oh, I see.

11 KATHY: 'Cause it, you know, they have to
12 really rev up the engine to turn around.

13 OLIVER: So where did they take you first?

14 KATHY: To the end of the road.

15 OLIVER: Um-hum.

16 KATHY: And they were going to put me in a
17 van, --

18 OLIVER: Uh-huh.

19 KATHY: -- and take me down to the other
20 intersection, but they decided to put me back in the
21 tank and take me down to the other intersection. You
22 know how bureau, bureaucrats are. So, when I got down
23 to the Y intersection, which is where all the cars and
24 stuff are?

25 OLIVER: Yeah.

KATHY: They put me in the sheriff's car,

1 | Sheriff Lynch?

2 | OLIVER: Um-hum.

3 | KATHY: And brought me to TSTI, which is
4 | where I sit. I've been here all day waiting to talk to
5 | you.

6 | OLIVER: Um-hum.

7 | KATHY: I got to see Brian. He was here all
8 | day with me.

9 | OLIVER: Um-hum.

10 | KATHY: I just sent him home at four.

11 | OLIVER: Um-hum.

12 | KATHY: To the house, you know, where all the
13 | kids are?

14 | OLIVER: Um-hum.

15 | KATHY: So he can get some rest 'cause
16 | there's really no place to sit down here.

17 | OLIVER: Did they ask you any questions?

18 | KATHY: Yes. They've asked about the well
19 | being and the medical interest of the people inside.
20 | And, he's trying to get me to do his job. He's trying
21 | to get me to get you guys to come out. And I was like,
22 | you know, I don't know your mind.

23 | OLIVER: Um-hum.

24 | KATHY: You know? I can give you all the
25 | courage if you decide to come out, and I can be the
example here to show you that I'm being treated fairly,

1 | you know? I was, I was, very gently treated when the
2 | guys, you know when I first left and the tank sat in
3 | the, in the road for so long?

4 | OLIVER: Yeah.

5 | KATHY: It's because he was going through my
6 | bags and the lady frisked me, searched me, but she was
7 | real gentle and the guy that searched my bags, he did
8 | it right in front of me, I mean, they were just all
9 | real nice and real, um, willing to --

10 | OLIVER: Help?

11 | KATHY: Yeah, willing to give me a good
12 | attitude, you know --

13 | OLIVER: That's great.

14 | KATHY: -- show that they cared.

15 | OLIVER: Okay.

16 | KATHY: So --

17 | OLIVER: I guess that's all I really need to
18 | know.

19 | KATHY: Yeah, well, that's what I'm, that's
20 | what I'm trying to impart to you. I can impart to you
21 | the relationship and the rapport that I have with them
22 | and then that helps you make that decision for
23 | yourself.

24 | OLIVER: Okay.

25 | KATHY: And if anybody else wants to make
that decision, you and I can be, you know, the sign.

1 OLIVER: No worries.

2 KATHY: Yeah, for them to know that, hey, we
3 can do this. We're all still the body whether we're in
4 there or out here. We're all one body.

5 OLIVER: Okay.

6 KATHY: Okay? We all have, we all have the
7 same God.

8 OLIVER: I mean that, Kathy.

9 KATHY: And these people out here, God's
10 gonna be merciful with them. You know that, don't you?

11 OLIVER: Oh, yeah.

12 KATHY: Because they're really trying their
13 hardest.

14 OLIVER: Okay.

15 KATHY: I mean, you know, they got kids, they
16 got families to go home to too.

17 OLIVER: Um-hum.

18 KATHY: But, I'm hoping that they want to
19 learn the seals. I'm hoping that they want to make an
20 effort now to make a change in their own lives too, and
21 I'm hoping that this effects them because this is a
22 case like they've never had before.

23 You know, but they've all got other things to go
24 to.

25 OLIVER: Okay, yeah, no worries. Um, yeah,
I'm, you know --

1 KATHY: I told them, I told them you would
2 have done been out of here today if we had had this
3 phone hook up, hooked up.

4 OLIVER: Yeah.

5 KATHY: But --

6 OLIVER: Well, I'm, you know, I'm ready and
7 --

8 KATHY: -- not knowing what to do --

9 OLIVER: I'm waiting and, you know --

10 KATHY: Yeah.

11 OLIVER: -- I know what I need to do and, --

12 KATHY: I'm sure you need to, you know, find
13 out, you know, how do I do this? You know? You don't
14 want to walk out there and get shot.

15 OLIVER: No.

16 KATHY: You know, you got to, you got to have
17 that communication line open, so, we've really got to
18 keep this phone line up.

19 OLIVER: Yeah.

20 KATHY: It's so important.

21 OLIVER: Okay.

22 KATHY: Good luck, Ollie.

23 OLIVER: No worries. Did you want to speak
24 to Steve?

25 KATHY: Um.

OLIVER: Does anyone want to speak to Steve?

1 KATHY: Yeah, I want to talk to Steve.

2 OLIVER: Okay.

3 KATHY: Thank you.

4 OLIVER: Okay.

5 STEVE: Hello.

6 KATHY: Wait a second.

7 STEVE: Okay.

8 JOHN, IN BACKGROUND: Don't hang up until, we
9 got to -- use the phone -- we'll tell you when to hang
10 up.

11 KATHY: (to John) Okay.

12 JOHN, IN BACKGROUND: Are they gonna get
13 somebody else on?

14 KATHY: (to John) Do you want, I'm talking to
15 Steve now. Do you want me to set up a time with him
16 for you?

17 STEVE: It doesn't matter, yeah, Ollie's
18 ready to come out, you know.

19 JOHN, IN BACKGROUND: -- since they aparently
20 have contact --

21 KATHY: (to John) Yeah, Ollie's ready to come
22 out, you know. Ollie's ready to come out, you know.

23 STEVE: Ask John, do they, did they drop off
24 a Newsweek and Time magazine, do you know?

25 KATHY: (to John) Are you talking upstairs?
Did they drop off the Newsweek and Time with the milk?

1 JOHN, IN BACKGROUND: Hold on, I'm sorry, I
2 can't listen -- at the same time now. Do what now --?

3 KATHY: Hang on.

4 STEVE: All right.

5 KATHY: He's talking to somebody upstairs,
6 and he's gonna ask that question.

7 STEVE: I was hoping they would send some
8 pictures of themselves.

9 JOHN, IN BACKGROUND: -- and you'll talk to
10 them up there on other things, because they still got,
11 they still have to eat, right?

12 KATHY: (to John) I think they still have --

13 JOHN, IN BACKGROUND: Okay, go ahead and tell
14 Ollie good-bye and then, and then you hang it up so you
15 won't lose Steve up on the other end.

16 KATHY: (to John) Okay, they've got that line
17 open.

18 JOHN, IN BACKGROUND: But tell Ollie not to
19 hold, hang up the phone. Tell Ollie not to hang up the
20 phone.

21 KATHY: (to John) Steve's on the phone now.

22 JOHN, IN BACKGROUND: Okay, tell him not to
23 hang it up.

24 KATHY: Okay, when I say good-bye to you,
25 Steve, --

STEVE: Yeah.

1 KATHY: -- you don't hang up the phone.
2 STEVE: No, I'll be on.
3 KATHY: Because they're gonna pick up the
4 phone upstairs.
5 STEVE: All right.
6 KATHY: And they'll talk about the Newsweek
7 and Time because I know they dropped the milk off, but
8 I don't know --
9 STEVE: Okay, yeah, I know they did. It's
10 sitting out there right now, that's why we need to send
11 Greg out there.
12 KATHY: Yeah, I just talked to Greg, --
13 STEVE: Okay.
14 KATHY: -- and I told him he needs to go out
15 there.
16 STEVE: Well, Kathy, take care and you know,
17 you know, that --
18 KATHY: You tell the ladies about Brian yet?
19 STEVE: Not yet. I haven't been able to
20 leave the phone.
21 KATHY: Okay. You make sure you do that.
22 STEVE: I will.
23 KATHY: Okay.
24 STEVE: Okay.
25 KATHY: And Dick and John says hello.
STEVE: Okay, great.

1 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: One second. I'm
2 sorry.

3 KATHY: And I'm gonna call and talk to you
4 back after I get through the system.

5 STEVE: Oh, great, good.

6 KATHY: Okay?

7 STEVE: It's all the better.

8 KATHY: And, and, see, they want to use me as
9 a negotiator to help bring more people out. So you
10 know I'm gonna contact you back.

11 STEVE: All right.

12 KATHY: Okay?

13 STEVE: Sure.

14 JOHN: Kathy, Kathy?

15 KATHY: Yes.

16 JOHN: John.

17 KATHY: Yes, Hi, John.

18 JOHN: I'm sorry I didn't get to meet you
19 personally, but, you know, it was a little hectic up
20 here too.

21 KATHY: Yeah.

22 JOHN: But I'm glad everything worked out
23 great.

24 KATHY: Thank you.

25 JOHN: Thank you.

KATHY: Okay, you talk to Steve.

1 STEVE: Sounds good.
2 JOHN: I wish you the best.
3 KATHY: Thank you.
4 JOHN: Bye-bye.
5 KATHY: Bye Steve.
6 STEVE: Okay, bye, Kathy.
7 JOHN: Hang on, Steve.
8 STEVE: Okay. John.
9 JOHN: How are you doing?
10 STEVE: Okay, real good.
11 JOHN: Good.
12 STEVE: Well, it sounds like it worked out
13 very well.
14 JOHN: Sounds that --
15 STEVE: Ollie has a better look on his face
16 even.
17 JOHN: He does?
18 STEVE: Yeah, much better.
19 JOHN: Okay.
20 STEVE: After hearing her and yourself and
21 what she's had to say about yourselves.
22 JOHN: Okay, is he all packed and ready to
23 go?
24 STEVE: Yeah, he's ready to go.
25 JOHN: Okay. Why don't we do this?
STEVE: Okay.

1 JOHN: How about this. We don't want to
2 waste daylight hours.

3 STEVE: Right.

4 JOHN: Obviously and, so, why don't we send
5 out Oliver to the pick-up spot, have him picked up and
6 then as soon as he departs we'll send Greg or whoever
7 you want to send out for the milk.

8 STEVE: Sounds good.

9 JOHN: Sounds good?

10 STEVE: Sounds okay to me.

11 JOHN: Okey-doke.

12 STEVE: Okay.

13 JOHN: Is he, is there anyone else coming out
14 with Oliver?

15 STEVE: I guess not right now. I went and
16 talked to the other two guys, they're all ready, they
17 got cleaned up, they're ready to go and they're a
18 little concerned 'cause how late it got.

19 JOHN: Okay, is that --

20 STEVE: They're talking to me about going,
21 they want to go, and for sure, I think they're going to
22 go now, tomorrow morning.

23 JOHN: That's fine.

24 STEVE: Yeah.

25 JOHN: That's fine.

 STEVE: They said they're definitely coming,

1 | they made up their mind, I talked to them again. They
2 | haven't, they're all, in fact, all this time they took
3 | getting ready and everything, so, they want to come.

4 | JOHN: Okay, that's fine. Okay, did you,
5 | have you the new phone on now or the old phone?

6 | STEVE: Not yet because I've stayed right on
7 | with you and I didn't want to --

8 | JOHN: Let's, --

9 | STEVE: Yeah.

10 | JOHN: Let's not lose this connection.

11 | STEVE: Exactly.

12 | JOHN: Okay. Why don't you send out Oliver,
13 | and I'll start the pick-up vehicle on the way.

14 | STEVE: Okay, real, sounds good. (to
15 | background) Let Ollie know he can start heading out.
16 | And then, and then, Greg, when he, once he goes, and
17 | they, they move him away, then you can go out and pick
18 | up the milk and whatever is there.

19 | JOHN: Right. Let me just make sure they're
20 | ready to roll, --

21 | STEVE: (to the background) I don't know where
22 | he's at. I think he's downstairs.

23 | Apparently he went, he went over to David's room,
24 | I guess, --

25 | JOHN: He went over to David's room to say
 | good-bye.

1 STEVE: -- just now to say good-bye or
2 something like that.

3 JOHN: Okay, I'm checking now to make sure
4 the pick-up vehicle --

5 STEVE: All right.

6 JOHN: -- is, will be ready to roll so I'm
7 not standing out there all day, you know.

8 STEVE: Okay. What happened with the Time,
9 Newsweek magazine?

10 JOHN: We have the original copies.

11 STEVE: All right.

12 JOHN: All right.

13 STEVE: Okay.

14 JOHN: Mint condition, I might add.

15 STEVE: All right.

16 JOHN: Okay. We scoured the country to
17 find four of them. It was not an easy chore.

18 STEVE: I believe it, I honestly do.

19 JOHN: We'll get those out there.

20 STEVE: Okay. I just found out Ollie was
21 just finishing eating. I didn't realize that he had
22 food there in his hands. He was just finishing what
23 he's, his meal there, I guess. He's still biting down.

24 JOHN: Now, needless to say, you can call me
25 at any time, and also the night shift, any time.

STEVE: All right.

1 JOHN: So that's absolutely --

2 STEVE: Okay.

3 JOHN: -- no problem. But why we do have
4 this technical problem, so to speak --

5 STEVE: I'm going to be working on that as,
6 in fact, as soon as I put the phone down with you, the
7 first thing I'm doing is going to put on this phone,
8 try it and see that it's working.

9 JOHN: Do you want us to send you another
10 phone?

11 STEVE: I think this, this is a pretty nice
12 phone. It's a really decent one, it is brand new,
13 yeah, and so I think that is going to take care of it
14 once and for all.

15 JOHN: Okay.

16 STEVE: This one, I think what might have
17 happened, it's either the water, you know, or the rain
18 or what it is is this phone was dropped last night.

19 JOHN: I think it was the ringer because --

20 STEVE: I think, I think you could, but what
21 I don't understand though, is why would it have worked
22 this morning, right up till noon, though.

23 JOHN: Yeah, that's really strange.

24 STEVE: It is, it is.

25 JOHN: But --

STEVE: And no one's even been around here at

1 all.

2 JOHN: But in any case, while we have this
3 problem, before we get the new one installed and
4 working properly, --

5 STEVE: Okay.

6 JOHN: -- why don't you call us every hour on
7 the hour till we get the --

8 STEVE: the new -- hooked up.

9 JOHN: -- communications firmly established.

10 STEVE: Right. Sounds good to me.

11 JOHN: Sounds good to me too.

12 STEVE: Okay.

13 JOHN: Okay, great, and then we'll work out
14 on, we'll have Oliver come out now and --

15 STEVE: Right.

16 JOHN: -- and when he departs then Greg, or
17 whoever you want, go get the milk. It's, it's, I'm
18 glad it's cool out so it's not going bad.

19 STEVE: Right.

20 JOHN: Okay.

21 STEVE: Okay.

22 JOHN: That sound's great. Have you located
23 Oliver?

24 STEVE: Yeah, he, I guess he's right over,
25 he's right down the hall from me right now. I guess
he's finishing up eating. I didn't realize that he had

1 put his food down to talk with Kathy and I guess he's
2 just finishing up the last few bites here.

3 JOHN: Okay. The pick-up vehicle is, is
4 ready to go, so --

5 STEVE: Oh, they are. So he can walk out any
6 time then?

7 JOHN: Yeah, but I want to maintain an open
8 line so you and I can --

9 STEVE: Right. Okay, I'm gonna pass you to
10 Scott for just one minute until I --

11 JOHN: Sure.

12 STEVE: -- I'm going to go find and see how
13 close he is to walking out here. Here's Scott.

14 JOHN: Thanks.

15 SCOTT: Hello?

16 JOHN: Hi, Scott, how are you doing?

17 SCOTT: Oh, fine. Who's this?

18 JOHN: John.

19 SCOTT: John?

20 JOHN: Yeah.

21 SCOTT: Is this John #1 or #2?

22 JOHN: This is John 2.

23 SCOTT: Oh, okay.

24 JOHN: How're you feeling?

25 SCOTT: I haven't talked to you yet.

JOHN: How are you feeling?

1 SCOTT: Me?
2 JOHN: Yeah.
3 SCOTT: A little cold.
4 JOHN: A little cold, huh? It's gonna, it's
5 suppose to drop down a little chilly tonight too, a
6 little chillier.
7 SCOTT: Yeah.
8 JOHN: It's going down to around 10 or 15
9 degrees.
10 SCOTT: Yeah.
11 JOHN: So, are you feeling okay?
12 SCOTT: Oh, yeah.
13 JOHN: No bad scratches or anything?
14 SCOTT: Scratches?
15 JOHN: Yeah.
16 SCOTT: A couple holes.
17 JOHN: A couple of little holes, I know,
18 how's it doing?
19 SCOTT: Other than that --
20 JOHN: How's it doing?
21 SCOTT: Huh?
22 JOHN: How's it doing?
23 SCOTT: Fine, just my hands are a little numb
24 from being, 'cause I can't stick it in a pocket or a
25 glove or something.
JOHN: Yeah, yeah, but otherwise it's okay?

1 SCOTT: Yeah.
2 JOHN: Good, good, good, glad to hear it.
3 SCOTT: Yeah, the swelling's going down and
4 --
5 JOHN: Have you soaked it in epsom salt or
6 something?
7 SCOTT: Yeah.
8 JOHN: Okay, has that brought the swelling
9 down?
10 SCOTT: Yeah.
11 JOHN: Good, good, good.
12 SCOTT: Epsom salts, you know, peroxide.
13 JOHN: Good.
14 SCOTT: You name it, I put it on here.
15 JOHN: You put it on? How about, do you have
16 any antibiotics you can take?
17 SCOTT: Oh, yeah, I've been taking this pill
18 twice a day or something.
19 JOHN: Like penicillin or something?
20 SCOTT: I never heard of it before. It's
21 Doxycycline or something.
22 JOHN: Doxycycline, okay. That's good.
23 Well, that's good.
24 SCOTT: It just says for infections, so I
25 don't know exactly what it --
JOHN: Well, I was going to say, let's hope

1 | it, you know, that should keep it from getting infected
2 | hope, well, I'll have to look it up but one's for pain
3 | and one's for antibiotics so --

4 | SCOTT: Yeah.

5 | JOHN: We'll try to get a doctor to talk to,
6 | talk to you guys and make sure that you're not getting
7 | any infection or anything.

8 | SCOTT: Yeah.

9 | JOHN: So are you thinking about coming out
10 | possibly in the near future some time?

11 | SCOTT: Well, I don't know.

12 | JOHN: Okay.

13 | SCOTT: It depends, you know.

14 | JOHN: Okay. What, what are you basing your
15 | judgement on so to speak? On coming out?

16 | SCOTT: Well, you know, like, it's my free
17 | will, right?

18 | JOHN: Absolutely, totally.

19 | SCOTT: Okay. I'm glad you guys realize that
20 | now.

21 | JOHN: Absolutely, totally. Your free will,
22 | completely.

23 | SCOTT: My free will is if he goes out, then
24 | I'll go out.

25 | JOHN: Okay, so if David goes out you'll go
out.

1 SCOTT: Yeah.
2 JOHN: Okay.
3 SCOTT: I got no problem with that.
4 JOHN: Hey, that's no problem with us either,
5 you know? No problem whatsoever. I respect your
6 opinions.
7 SCOTT: Yeah.
8 JOHN: I'm glad you're okay, though, as far
9 as your wound is, it's getting better.
10 SCOTT: Yeah.
11 JOHN: It sounds like it's good. Have you
12 seen, have you seen Judy at all?
13 SCOTT: Yeah, Judy's doing better too.
14 They're putting garlic, raw garlic on it.
15 JOHN: Raw garlic?
16 SCOTT: And it, like draw the poison out.
17 JOHN: Okay.
18 SCOTT: And her finger's gone down
19 considerably. It's about a third smaller than it was
20 before.
21 JOHN: I guess it was really puffed up at one
22 point.
23 SCOTT: Oh, yeah, it looked like about two
24 thumbs worth.
25 JOHN: Aw, jeez.
SCOTT: I mean, like, you know, it looked like

1 | somebody stuck a balloon in her finger.

2 | JOHN: Aw, jeez.. Holy cow. That's pretty
3 | scary, you know?

4 | SCOTT: I was ready to get the butter knife
5 | out and cut it off, you know?

6 | JOHN: You were gonna be Dr. Scott for a
7 | minute?

8 | SCOTT: Yeah.

9 | JOHN: I'm glad you didn't have to do that.

10 | SCOTT: Yeah.

11 | JOHN: Well, in all seriousness, we can kid
12 | around a little bit, but we all do look forward to
13 | everyone coming out safely, you know, and yourself,
14 | obviously yourself.

15 | SCOTT: Yeah. I realize that, you know, and
16 | like Greg, I think Greg and Steve were saying, you
17 | know, the media saying that we, you know, want another
18 | shoot-out and that's a bunch of baloney, you know,
19 | 'cause --

20 | JOHN: Aw, please.

21 | SCOTT: -- we never wanted it in the first
22 | place, you know, and it's unfortunate that it happened
23 | that way, but, you know, we don't want to see anybody
24 | hurt, you know?

25 | JOHN: And that's exactly the same way we
 | feel. That's exactly the same way that we feel.

1 SCOTT: You know, we never had nothing
2 against anybody, you know, nothing personal, you know,
3 it's just too bad.

4 JOHN: I know, I know, so, that's exactly the
5 same way we feel, and the bottom line is, is to prevent
6 anyone from getting hurt in the slightest way and I'm
7 talking about --

8 SCOTT: Yeah.

9 JOHN: -- anything, sprained ankle, anything
10 at all.

11 SCOTT: You know, and it's like, they said
12 we, you know, didn't express any remorse or something,
13 it's like, that's a bunch of crap, you know?

14 JOHN: I know that.

15 SCOTT: I was pretty upset. You know those
16 media guys, and I tell you what --

17 JOHN: Go ahead, --

18 SCOTT: They can only report what, you know,
19 what they hear, --

20 JOHN: Um-hum.

21 SCOTT: -- which is mostly rumors, but it
22 sure doesn't sound too good sometimes.

23 JOHN: I know what you're saying, I know what
24 you're saying, and, and you only have one end where you
25 can only, you know, you don't get to answer their
charges or you're only there, you know, sitting,

1 | listening to what they say.

2 | SCOTT: Yeah.

3 | JOHN: It's got to make you want to stand up
4 | and shout, you know, and say hey, wait a minute, you
5 | know?

6 | SCOTT: At least that guy, Ingleman,
7 | apologized for putting that, what's the name, the lady
8 | on that said she --

9 | JOHN: Oh, he did.

10 | SCOTT: Yeah.

11 | JOHN: He did apologize?

12 | SCOTT: Yeah.

13 | JOHN: Did he do it today?

14 | SCOTT: He said, you know, she sounded
15 | convincing and I chose to put her on and it turned out
16 | that she had nothing to do with them and it's my
17 | responsibility, full responsibility and I apologize.

18 | JOHN: Well, I went to the boss on that, and
19 | actually the group of bosses here, and I spoke to them,
20 | personally, and I said, there's something I want to do
21 | myself for Steve and David, and they said, what's that,
22 | and I explained to him about that Ingleman thing and
23 | they said, well, you know, generally that's not our
24 | policy, we're not suppose to do that and so on I said
25 | well let me, let me go through with, with you what
Steve said about this guy Ingleman making these

1 | outrageous statements about an eight year old child in
2 | there and about \$180,000 in --

3 | SCOTT: Yeah, yeah, that -- girl or whatever.

4 | JOHN: -- that he, that he's connected --
5 | yeah, yeah, so the bosses well, looked at me and said,
6 | you know, you personally want to do this for Steve and
7 | I said, yes, I do, and they said, well, generally
8 | speaking we don't, we don't go in that direction in
9 | dealing with the media they said, but in this case, in
10 | this case we're gonna have our head media guy call up.
11 | So the head media guy called the station directly and
12 | he spoke to a Julie Van Deeden (Phonetic) who's
13 | actually at the station, and apparently the guy said he
14 | apologized or something like that and he's gonna re-air
15 | it again that he was wrong, that he should, that this
16 | lady was wrong.

17 | SCOTT: Yeah.

18 | JOHN: So, I'm glad we're able to get that
19 | straight, but by the same time, you got to understand
20 | that there's people from all over the country doing
21 | stuff like this, calling in --

22 | SCOTT: Yeah, they want to, they want to get
23 | famous, you know?

24 | JOHN: Oh, yeah, yeah, of course, you know?

25 | SCOTT: We've seen some of the t-shirts and
stuff, I mean, it's ridiculous, you know?

1 JOHN: Anybody to make money, you know?
2 SCOTT: You seen that score card shirt?
3 JOHN: No, I didn't see the score card.
4 SCOTT: That was sickening.
5 JOHN: No.
6 SCOTT: Us and you.
7 JOHN: NO.
8 SCOTT: It was a score card, you know, like,
9 how many, you know --
10 JOHN: Aw, please. No, that's, that's
11 disgusting.
12 SCOTT: It's pretty bad.
13 JOHN: No, I haven't seen that, no. You
14 know, you just, but that's gonna bring out people who
15 are going to lie, take advantage of the situation, try
16 to make money, say outrageous things. You can
17 understand that.
18 SCOTT: In Newsweek or some-- one time they
19 showed that iced tea?
20 JOHN: Iced tea, yeah.
21 SCOTT: And they had that L.A.P.D. shirt, it
22 says L.A.P.D., we treat you like a King.
23 JOHN: Oh, no, I didn't see that.
24 SCOTT: That was --
25 JOHN: You know, that's incredible. Every,
every event that you can think of, of any disaster,

1 somebody's gonna take economic advantage of it or try
2 to take economic advantage of it --

3 SCOTT: Yeah.

4 JOHN: -- you know, and the one part that we
5 were talking to Steve about the other day is that
6 yourself or somebody in there, when they come out,
7 they're gonna have opportunity to rebut all these crazy
8 charges --

9 SCOTT: Yeah.

10 JOHN: That's the really, you know, thing
11 that's gonna happen, and be able to rebut all these
12 things, you know, so, we're looking forward to that
13 happening because we don't like misinformation any more
14 than you do because it puts a black eye on everybody,
15 you know, I mean, it's ridiculous.

16 SCOTT: Yeah.

17 JOHN: And I just, it just is discusting,
18 but, to answer your question I did not see that score,
19 score card shirt and I'm really glad that --

20 SCOTT: It's a good thing you didn't.

21 JOHN: Yeah, yeah.

22 SCOTT: I bet it would have made you pretty
23 upset too.

24 JOHN: You're darn right, you're darn right.
25 So, anyway. Have you talked to David at all today?

SCOTT: No. I talked to him last night.

1 JOHN: How's he doing?

2 SCOTT: He seems like he's doing okay. His
3 wound is still draining, you know, out the back.

4 JOHN: The exit wound?

5 SCOTT: Yeah.

6 JOHN: Is he getting blood out of that or is
7 it just fluid or what's coming out of there?

8 SCOTT: It's like a pinkish, it's not so much
9 blood, it's like a pinkish liquid.

10 JOHN: Pinkish liquid.

11 SCOTT: Yeah, it's not blood.

12 JOHN: It has a pink color to it?

13 SCOTT: Yeah.

14 JOHN: Yeah. Is he getting a lot of drainage
15 or a little drainage?

16 SCOTT: It's not really a lot, you know,
17 just, I think it's continual.

18 JOHN: It's continual. Yeah. How about
19 antibiotics? Can he get some antibiotics like --

20 SCOTT: Well, he doesn't believe in taking
21 that kind of stuff, you know?

22 JOHN: Oh, that's right, yeah, that's right,
23 yeah.

24 SCOTT: I mean, shoot, for somebody that's
25 wounded the way he is, it's like, you know, like that
guy said, it's miraculous.

1 JOHN: Did you see the entry wound?

2 SCOTT: It doesn't, it doesn't look infected
3 at all.

4 JOHN: Oh, the entry wound doesn't look
5 infected at all?

6 SCOTT: No. There's no redness or swelling.

7 JOHN: Well, that's good.

8 SCOTT: Just the hole.

9 JOHN: Just a hole, huh?

10 SCOTT: Yes.

11 JOHN: Yeah, we saw it on the videotape, and
12 in the front it just looked like a hole, but on the,
13 the rear --

14 SCOTT: The back, it's a little bit bigger.
15 The hole is a little bit bigger.

16 JOHN: Um-hum.

17 SCOTT: And it's, you know, it's still open.

18 JOHN: Open?

19 SCOTT: It's not sealing or anything but it's
20 like dripping a little bit.

21 JOHN: Is he putting gauze on that to absorb
22 it?

23 SCOTT: Yeah.

24 JOHN: Good. You want to keep the bacteria
25 out of that, you know, so that it does not get
infected, you know, that's the thing, --

1 SCOTT: Yeah.

2 JOHN: -- so. I can -- a familiar voice in
3 the background there.

4 SCOTT: Huh?

5 JOHN: There's a familiar voice in the
6 background.

7 SCOTT: Yeah. It's Greg.

8 JOHN: Oh, it's Greg, huh?

9 GREG, IN BACKGROUND: Aloha, John.

10 JOHN: What did he say?

11 SCOTT: Yeah, me and Greg are from Hawaii so
12 he said Aloha.

13 JOHN: Oh, Aloha, Aloha to him. We're about

2 JOHN-2: Oh, okay.

3 SCOTT: I got all my relatives in Hawaii.
4 They're probably watching this and, you know, probably
5 upset.

6 JOHN-2: Saying what's this guy doing in
7 there?

8 SCOTT: Yeah.

9 JOHN-2: We want to get him out.

10 SCOTT: Yeah.

11 JOHN-2: Yeah. Did you surf over there?

12 SCOTT: Huh?

13 JOHN-2: Did you surf?

14 SCOTT: Yeah. In fact, I had 80 days absence
15 in my junior year and they told me if I had one more
16 day absent I'd be a junior again the next year, so I
17 said, oh no.

13 SCOTT: Yeah. They got them at Waimea, Old

16 board. I mean, you didn't do, you didn't do boogie
17 boards or anything --

18 SCOTT: Oh, I did everything.

22 JOHN-2: Um-hum.

23 SCOTT: And a diamond just kind of goes out
24 in the middle. And it's like straight edges on --
25 angled edges on the back.

JOHN-2: Oh, I got you. Okay. Okay.

1 SCOTT: They call it a diamond tail and they
2 got swallow tails and, you know --

3 JOHN-2: And then you use the leash for your
4 ankle to --

5 SCOTT: Yeah.

6 JOHN-2: Yeah, yeah.

7 SCOTT: Of course, you don't want to use the
8 leash when it's too big, because you know, the board --
9 you can't get away from your board then.

10 JOHN-2: Now, that board will come back --

11 SCOTT: Yeah.

6 like, they could talk to each other and stuff.

23 saying well, how we're going to talk to each other.
24 How we going to find each other, you know.
25 SCOTT: Yeah.
JOHN-2: So, good.

1 STEVE TO OLLIE: Okay, Ollie. Take care.
2 JOHN-2: I hear Steve there.
3 STEVE TO OLLIE: See you soon.
4 SCOTT TO OLLIE: Take it easy, Ollie.
5 SCOTT: Yeah. He's going downstairs now.
6 JOHN-2: He's on his way down?
7 SCOTT: Yeah.
8 JOHN-2: Okay. So you guys are on the second
9 floor?
10 SCOTT: Yeah.
11 JOHN-2: Okay. So he's going to head out the
12 front door?
13 SCOTT: Yeah.
14 JOHN-2: Okay. So apparently the pickup
15 vehicle's waiting for him.
16 SCOTT: Yeah. They said the, the tank's out
17 there. So I guess that's it.
18 JOHN-2: Okay. That's the pickup vehicle.
19 SCOTT: Yeah.
20 JOHN-2: Tell them it's -- well, he knows.
21 It's a little bumpy, but --
22 SCOTT: Yeah.
23 JOHN-2: So, he'll enjoy the ride. Good.
24 Good. Well, I'm glad you're feeling well. And I will
25 take care of this request for you.
SCOTT: I appreciate that and --

1 JOHN-2: And, and any time you want to talk
2 to me, please don't hesitate to ask.

3 SCOTT: Okay. What, what's your last name,
4 John?

5 JOHN-2: John Dolan.

6 SCOTT: John Dolan?

7 JOHN-2: Yeah.

8 SCOTT: Okay.

9 JOHN-2: So, don't hesitate to ask. That's
10 no problem. They, they sometimes re -- mostly refer to
11 me as John-2 because I'm the second John to come in --

12 SCOTT: Oh, okay.

13 JOHN-2: -- but that's, that's okay. So it
14 doesn't matter.

15 SCOTT: So how's Jim doing?

16 JOHN-2: Jim?

17 SCOTT: Yeah.

18 JOHN-2: Jim departed. He's doing well,
19 though, from what I hear.

20 SCOTT: Yeah? We wore him out, huh?

21 JOHN-2: You, you wore -- you wore him out.
22 Poor guy was, was asleep when they, when they -- had to
23 wake him up to get him out of the chair to leave, you
24 know.

25 SCOTT: Oh.

JOHN-2: So he was -- he's a nice guy,

1 | though.

2 | SCOTT: Yeah.

3 | JOHN-2: Real nice. Did you talk to him

4 | much?

5 | SCOTT: Yeah. I talked to Jim and Henry.

6 | JOHN-2: Henry? Yeah.

7 | SCOTT: Yeah.

8 | JOHN-2: Both really good guys.

9 | SCOTT: Yeah.

10 | JOHN-2: Henry's still around. He said --

11 | he's on the night shift.

12 | SCOTT: Oh, he's on the night shift, huh?

13 | JOHN-2: Yeah, yeah. So he's, he's on the

14 | night shift -- so anyway. But the -- so -- do you know

15 | if he's out the door yet?

16 | SCOTT: Hold on a second. I'll see.

17 | JOHN-2: Okay.

18 | SCOTT TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Is he out the

19 | door yet? Greg?

20 | UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: He's walking out

21 | -- he's walking out right now.

22 | SCOTT: Okay. They say he's walking out

23 | right now.

24 | JOHN-2: He's walking out right now. Okay.

25 | Very good. And then, as you probably know, we have, we

have the cooler down there with the milk in it. So

1 | Greg, I believe, is --

2 | SCOTT: After Ollie leaves --

3 | JOHN-2: Yeah. After Ollie leaves in the

4 | vehicle, then Greg or whoever want go down and pick up

5 | the milk for the babies and stuff and we'll get --

6 | SCOTT: Okay. Are those magazines in there

7 | too?

8 | JOHN-2: No, no. We're going to make that on

9 | a separate run.

10 | SCOTT: Oh, okay.

11 | JOHN-2: We're going to make that -- we had

12 | -- you can't believe all those magazines are sold out

13 | in this area.

14 | SCOTT: Right.

15 | JOHN-2: So we first started out by having

16 | some faxed down to us by facsimile machine. And then

17 | they, they scoured the area and they went up either to

18 | Dallas, right to Dallas, and drove them down or

19 | something.

20 | SCOTT: Oh, okay.

21 | JOHN-2: But they had an incredible time

22 | finding them. It was really --

23 | SCOTT: Yeah. Another thing, too, is, you

24 | know, our mail?

25 | JOHN-2: Yeah.

 SCOTT: I don't know what's happened to our

1 mail, but there's two people that subscribe to those.

2 JOHN-2: Oh, is that right?

3 SCOTT: Yeah. So I don't know if they
4 have --

5 JOHN-2: They'll probably --

6 SCOTT: -- will the mail thing or --

7 JOHN-2: Generally speaking -- and, you know,
8 I don't know this without checking with a U.S. Post
9 Office, but generally speaking what they do is like a
10 vacation thing. They just hold it and when, when they
11 can get through they, they make the delivery. It just
12 kind of stacks up.

13 SCOTT: Yeah.

14 JOHN-2: So, yeah. So --

15 SCOTT: Too bad they don't have a pony
16 express, you know, rain or shine or bullets or
17 whatever.

18 JOHN-2: Neither, neither rain nor shine,
19 right. I mean, the mailman always comes through,
20 right?

21 SCOTT: Yeah.

22 JOHN-2: But you got one of the mailmen
23 there, right?

24 SCOTT: Huh?

25 JOHN-2: One of the mailmen is with you
there.

1 SCOTT: Yeah.

2 JOHN-2: Well, you can check with him.

3 SCOTT: But --

4 JOHN-2: See.

5 SCOTT: -- he hasn't been able to get out to
6 check it.

7 JOHN-2: You can ask him how you get the --
8 how you get the mail to you.

9 SCOTT: Oh, I see what you're saying. Just
10 ask him what the situation --

11 JOHN-2: What the, what the procedures are,
12 you know?

13 SCOTT: Yeah.

14 JOHN-2: But I will, I will have your -- I
15 will have Kenneth contacted for you, Scott.

16 SCOTT: Okay, thanks. And just tell him not
17 to worry, you know,

18 JOHN-2: Yeah, I will. And like I said, any
19 time you want to, you know, kick something around,
20 Steve is more than willing to let you talk to us.
21 That's not a problem.

22 SCOTT: Yeah. The reason why, you know, I
23 let you know about the mail is because that way, you
24 know, if you had to, you could get that and that's
25 addressed to us and then you could just give it to us,
because I think that -- they would have copies of it --

1 JOHN-2: Right. Right.
2 SCOTT: That way you wouldn't have to search
3 so far, you know.
4 JOHN-2: Do you know if Judy's around?
5 SCOTT: Judy?
6 JOHN-2: Yeah.
7 SCOTT: Oh, hold on. I'll see.
8 JOHN-2: Okay.
9 SCOTT TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Judy. Is Judy
10 available. Judy.
11 SCOTT: I think she's feeding her little
12 girl.
13 JOHN-2: Oh, she's feeding the little girl.
14 Okay.
15 SCOTT: As a matter fact, they all left me.
16 JOHN-2: Oh, they all left you, huh.
17 SCOTT: Yeah. There's nobody around now
18 except me.
19 JOHN-2: You talk to John, right?
20 SCOTT: Yeah.
21 JOHN-2: Well, the reason -- you might, might
22 convey the message to Judy that we have a physician who
23 was willing to certainly talk to her and see if he can
24 help her out with her, with her wounds.
25 SCOTT: Oh, okay.
JOHN-2: So, you know, he may be able to give

1 her some indication of, of, of what's going on with the
2 wound and so on.

3 SCOTT: Yeah.

4 JOHN-2: So, we can, we can, you know, if you
5 can get her to the phone, we can do that. Is Steve
6 around or did he disappear too?

7 SCOTT: Oh, yeah. They all disappeared.

8 JOHN-2: They all disappeared, huh?

9 SCOTT: Yeah.

10 JOHN-2: Okay. Very good.

11 SCOTT: I think they should be coming up here
12 one of these days.

13 JOHN-2: Okay. Well, you can have Steve,
14 Steve give me a call.

15 SCOTT: Call you back? Oh, okay.

16 JOHN-2: And there's -- like we said, we've
17 got pretty much everything, you know, in hand and
18 because of the technical problems with the phone, you
19 can remind Steve that we agreed to call -- he agreed to
20 call us on the hour, because apparently when we call
21 him, the ringer isn't ringing.

22 SCOTT: Oh, I see. Okay.

23 JOHN-2: So, that's why we had problems
24 getting to him. More moisture in the line or
25 something, but it, it seems like -- more likely that
it's his ringer.

1 SCOTT: Oh, okay.

2 JOHN-2: So just remind him that we've got
3 that hourly setup.

4 SCOTT: Okay.

5 JOHN-2: And I look forward to seeing you one
6 of these times.

7 SCOTT: Yeah, okay.

8 JOHN-2: Okay, Scott.

9 SCOTT: Yeah, you take care.

10 JOHN-2: It's good talking -- you take care
11 too.

12 SCOTT: Okay, bye-bye.

13 JOHN-2: Bye-bye.

14 * * * * *

15 STEVE: Hello, John.

16 JOHN-2: Yeah, Steve, one second.

17 STEVE: Okay.

18 JOHN-2: Go ahead.

19 STEVE: Okay. Yeah, Greg just apparently
20 went out there to -- because the, the one Bradley
21 apparently drove off.

22 JOHN-2: Right.

23 STEVE: And he went out there and maybe the
24 other one started coming toward him and he was
25 wondering what was meant by that. So he came back and
wanted to check with you.

1 JOHN-2: Okay. Let me coordinate it. Don't
2 -- just maybe it's a breakdown in communication.

3 STEVE: All right, no problem. Okay.

4 JOHN-2: But I've got -- hold on one second.

5 STEVE: All right.

6 JOHN-2: We'll do it right now.

7 STEVE: Okay.

8 JOHN-2: There is no problem. It's just -- I
9 think it's maybe a breakdown -- a little, tiny
10 breakdown in communication.

11 STEVE: Probably so. Maybe they thought he
12 wanted to come and join or something.

13 JOHN-2: That's -- that could have been it.
14 That could have been it. But -- okay. Just, just tell
15 him to hold his position for one second.

16 STEVE: Right.

17 JOHN-2: We'll get it squared away. No
18 problem at all.

19 STEVE: Okay.

20 JOHN-2: Hey, it was really nice talking to
21 Scott.

22 STEVE: Good, good.

23 JOHN-2: Yeah, yeah. And I just wanted to
24 say personally, you know, I want to thank you for
25 everything today. It was a, was a good day.

STEVE: Well, I was hoping it was, was going

1 | to be more and it's -- I'm really disappointed about
2 | this whole phone thing --

3 | JOHN-2: Me too, me too. But I want you to
4 | know at anytime, you know --

5 | STEVE: Yeah.

6 | JOHN-2: -- day or night, 24 hours a day --

7 | STEVE: Okay.

8 | JOHN-2: -- 7 days, we're here, we're here.

9 | STEVE: Right. Okay.

10 | JOHN-2: So, and --

11 | STEVE: And David, he was real adamant about
12 | me getting that to you about people, you know, calling
13 | and saying they're part of us and know us and --

14 | JOHN-2: Yeah.

15 | STEVE: He, he's concerned about that because
16 | in the first place --

17 | JOHN-2: Oh, yeah.

18 | STEVE: -- we're, we're -- ourselves aren't
19 | out to make money off of this kind of foolishness, you
20 | know, and --

21 | JOHN-2: Oh, yeah. And, and, you know,
22 | there's going to be -- the, the night crew on and John-
23 | 1 is coming on --

24 | STEVE: Okay.

25 | JOHN-2: And John Cox will be here and so,
 | you know, please, we can, we can even do more, so

1 | we'll --

2 | STEVE: All right.

3 | JOHN-2: -- continue the momentum, so --

4 | STEVE: So when -- you said something about

5 | the magazines are not with the cooler then right now.

6 | JOHN-2: No, we didn't make a separate run

7 | yet.

8 | STEVE: Okay.

9 | JOHN-2: But, but you can talk to --

10 | STEVE: Let me know then.

11 | JOHN-2: Sure, we'll talk to the night shift

12 | and he can go out now and there's no problem at all.

13 | There's just a little --

14 | STEVE: Okay. And I, and I also mentioned

15 | was there anyway to get a video on that Donahue program

16 | where they had Curie (phonetic sp.), which is Sherry's

17 | daughter, on there?

18 | JOHN-2: Yeah. Let me see what I can do.

19 | I'm not --

20 | STEVE: Okay.

21 | JOHN-2: I'm not sure if they can get it,

22 | it's too late, or, or whatever.

23 | STEVE: Right, right.

24 | JOHN-2: But, but let me find out about that

25 | anyway.

 STEVE: Okay. Oh, by -- see, the reason I'm

1 even requesting the magazines is because actually they
2 get them here at the place --

3 JOHN-2: I understand, I understand. That's
4 what's got --

5 STEVE: And of course when all the mail was
6 cut off, so --

7 JOHN-2: Sure. That's what Scott said to --

8 STEVE: And, oh yeah, the other request, that
9 I think it was to John Cox, was that -- the possibility
10 of getting the rest of our newspapers from that series
11 that was done on David and this place. The last one we
12 got was by Robert Gonzalez. It was that Sunday morning
13 so we never got the rest of the series of that -- those
14 articles.

15 JOHN-2: Well, I'll tell you what. I'll let
16 you run that by John tonight --

17 STEVE: Okay.

18 JOHN-2: -- because then you can, can talk
19 about that.

20 STEVE: Okay. Okay, because it's probably
21 getting near the end of your day there.

22 JOHN-2: Oh, that's okay. I don't mind, I
23 don't mind that at all but, you know, if you guys want
24 to talk about it a little bit --

25 STEVE: Right, okay.

JOHN-2: -- I don't want, you know -- now,

1 | did -- he's on his way out, right?
2 | STEVE: Is he ready?
3 | JOHN-2: Yeah.
4 | STEVE: Okay.
5 | JOHN-2: Send him out.
6 | STEVE TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Tell Greg to
7 | go for it. Okay? Okay. What'd you want to ask him?
8 | Oh, I see. Yeah, he is now, he is now. Well, I know
9 | that. I make sure of that every time. Okay. Okay.
10 | Oh, no, not with me. Uh-uh, not at all.
11 | STEVE: Okay.
12 | JOHN-2: Good. He's all, he's all on his
13 | way?
14 | STEVE: Yeah. Yeah.
15 | JOHN-2: Okay. Great. Well, don't forget.
16 | Let's do that hour on the hour to call in until we get
17 | the new phone hooked up so there's no breakdown.
18 | STEVE: Right. And I still don't have it
19 | hooked up yet either.
20 | JOHN-2: Okay.
21 | STEVE: I was trying to get them on that.
22 | JOHN-2: Sounds good.
23 | STEVE: Okay, John, if I don't talk to you
24 | again --
25 | JOHN-2: It was a pleasure.
 STEVE: -- I'll be talking to you in the

1 morning.

2 JOHN-2: Talk to you in the morning, Steve.

3 STEVE: Okay. Take care.

4 JOHN-2: Take care.

5 STEVE: Okay. Good night.

6 JOHN-2: Good night.

7 * * * * *

8 JOHN-2: Hello.

9 STEVE: Hello, John.

10 JOHN-2: Steve, one second.

11 STEVE: Okay.

12 JOHN-2: Go ahead.

13 STEVE: Okay. Here's Judy. She want -- do

14 you have a -- did you ever -- were you able to talk to

15 a surgeon about her finger or a doctor --

16 JOHN-2: Yeah, we had him, we had him up

17 here. Hold on, let me see --

18 STEVE: And he's gone.

19 JOHN-2: I think he's gone right now. We had

20 him here for a while. Then he went to --

21 JOHN-2 TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Do we know

22 where the surgeon is?

23 STEVE: Hold it.

24 JOHN-2: Okay. We'll, we'll -- I'll tell you

25 what. We'll set up -- why don't you set up a time and

then we'll work out a time to, to make sure he's here,

1 | like an appointment, and then the doctor can go
2 | through, you know, what's -- what he can --

3 | STEVE: When would be the soonest?

4 | JOHN-2: The soonest. Okay. I'll, I'll let
5 | you work with that with John.

6 | STEVE: Okay.

7 | JOHN-2: Well, hold on. Henry's here.

8 | STEVE: Okay.

9 | UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: He's not exited
10 | yet.

11 | JOHN-2: Okay. As I -- I understand that,
12 | that Greg has not exited yet.

13 | UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Okay, he's coming
14 | out now.

15 | JOHN-2 TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Okay, he's
16 | coming out now? Okay. Good.

17 | JOHN-2: Okay. We got that squared away for
18 | the milk.

19 | STEVE: All right. Good, good.

20 | JOHN-2: Okay. And I'll -- we'll try to work
21 | on getting the physician in tonight to speak to Judy
22 | as, as far as getting, getting the physician on the
23 | phone.

24 | STEVE: Great, great. I'll be calling in in
25 | about an hour then.

 JOHN-2: Okay. Hold on -- you want me --

1 seven o'clock. And I'll have the night shift -- I'll
2 tell the night shift now --

3 STEVE: Okay.

4 JOHN-2: That -- in fact, John Cox just
5 walked in.

6 STEVE: Okay.

7 JOHN-2: So, I can hand him over to you and
8 you can work on --

9 STEVE: Well, let me -- right now what I'm
10 going to do is -- let me try to get this phone taken
11 care of right away, because I don't want any more
12 problems with this thing --

13 JOHN-2: Okay, and then you'll --

14 STEVE: In case you want to call me or
15 whatever.

16 JOHN-2: You'll call back -- call us back and
17 tell us the repair is complete and then this -- we'll
18 test the communications with John.

19 STEVE: Right. Exactly.

20 JOHN-2: Very good.

21 STEVE: Okay, thanks, John.

22 JOHN-2: Good night.

23 STEVE: Okay. Bye.

24 JOHN-2: Thanks, Steve.

25 * * * * *

JOHN: Hello.

1 STEVE: Hello, John.
2 JOHN: Hey, how are you?
3 STEVE: How's it going there?
4 JOHN: Good, good.
5 STEVE: Is your voice getting lower or is my
6 ears --
7 JOHN: No, how's that. I can bring it up for
8 you.
9 STEVE: No, you aren't tired, are you?
10 JOHN: Heck no.
11 STEVE: Hey, this --
12 JOHN: I got six and half hours sleep last
13 night. That was great.
14 STEVE: Whoa. Well, you're doing well.
15 Yeah, this cold weather is wearing me out, tiring me
16 out.
17 JOHN: I understand we had a little downtime
18 today.
19 STEVE: Oh, a little -- oh, yeah. You mean
20 the telephone.
21 JOHN: Yeah.
22 STEVE: Yeah. I was waiting and waiting --
23 he said he was going to call me back in a few minutes
24 and so I waited and waited and I said, well what is
25 going on.
JOHN: Well, you know, we tried calling in

1 | there last night after -- at several opportunities and
2 | got no answer. And we --

3 | STEVE: Really?

4 | JOHN: We did it at least five times.

5 | STEVE: You're kidding.

6 | JOHN: And we just felt that you were, you
7 | know, out wandering around because you --

8 | STEVE: Not at all.

9 | JOHN: -- had said that you were going -- you
10 | had in the past talked to people and gone different
11 | places and we figured that's just what you were doing
12 | was out bouncing around.

13 | STEVE: I was actually -- see, the phone is
14 | right where -- I've got it over by my -- where I'm
15 | sleeping.

16 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

17 | STEVE: And this morning it seemed to work
18 | because he called, I talked with him, and then after
19 | that, like say about noon or so, all of a sudden
20 | nothing. I haven't switched the phone yet, because the
21 | guy that's going to do that for me is here right now,
22 | but I wanted to call you first.

23 | JOHN: Okay.

24 | STEVE: John, they need to feed the chickens.
25 | Can you clear that? There's a guy out back, he's going
 | to go throw some seed and all that out there and

1 | whatever else.

2 | JOHN: Okay. Let me ask you. Did you get
3 | the milk?

4 | STEVE: Yes. Tell them --

5 | JOHN: Okay.

6 | STEVE: -- thank you very much.

7 | JOHN: All right.

8 | STEVE: We appreciate that enormously.

9 | JOHN: And let me, let me cover a couple of
10 | points with you.

11 | STEVE: All right.

12 | JOHN: Then we'll make arrangements and we'll
13 | test to see if I can call you back.

14 | STEVE: All right.

15 | JOHN: And, and if it doesn't work, you can
16 | call me, me right back.

17 | STEVE: That's -- yeah.

18 | JOHN: We have a doctor here who's in a
19 | position to talk to Judy.

20 | STEVE: Okay. All right.

21 | JOHN: I want to let you know that.

22 | STEVE: All right.

23 | JOHN: And also he's in a position if Scott
24 | or anybody else had an injury and you want to describe
25 | it --

 STEVE: Right.

1 JOHN: -- maybe we can --
2 STEVE: Okay. We'll, we'll, we'll do that,
3 John.
4 JOHN: -- we can help you there. We've got
5 two tapes --
6 STEVE: What I'll do -- okay.
7 JOHN: -- right now --
8 STEVE: You've got what? Two tapes?
9 JOHN: We have two tapes and, and an envelope
10 up forward in a position to be brought to you. Now,
11 one of the tapes is of Kathy and Brian.
12 STEVE: Okay.
13 JOHN: Okay? And the other is a tape of the
14 people who've been talking to you.
15 STEVE: Oh, great.
16 JOHN: Okay?
17 STEVE: I really -- I'll enjoy that for sure.
18 JOHN: That ought to brighten your day, huh?
19 STEVE: Sure it will.
20 JOHN: Either that or give you a good, good
21 laugh. I don't know. But anyhow, you know, it's a
22 serious tape. The -- and also in this -- I guess it's
23 a nylon carrying case or something --
24 STEVE: Okay.
25 JOHN: -- there's a manila envelope with
letters from some of the youngsters who have come out

1 earlier to their parents.

2 STEVE: Well, that's good.

3 JOHN: Okay.

4 STEVE: And what about the Time magazines?

5 JOHN: Okay. We have those where I am.

6 STEVE: Okay.

7 JOHN: We have the original Time, the
8 original Newsweek. We do not have them up forward yet.

9 STEVE: Okay. Why don't we --

10 JOHN: But we'll, you know --

11 STEVE: You want to deliver them all at once
12 maybe? I can wait a little longer if that's -- that'd
13 be fine with me.

14 JOHN: Okay. Okay. Because it's going to
15 take us, you know, a little bit to get those up there.

16 STEVE: That's, that's all right.

17 JOHN: But what I would like to do is --

18 STEVE: What about -- I was asking John 2
19 about that, again about --

20 JOHN: The newspaper article.

21 STEVE: Well, the -- there was a Donahue
22 program with Curie, that's Sherry's daughter, and she's
23 very curious to know, you know, what the ex-husband
24 pumped into her mind and what she had to say and is
25 there any way to get --

JOHN: We're aware of it --

1 STEVE: Yeah.

2 JOHN: -- and what we're going to have to do,
3 I'm sure, is get with the local station --

4 STEVE: Okay. And maybe we can --

5 JOHN: -- that puts it out and, and dub a
6 copy or something.

7 STEVE: Okay. That'd be superb.

8 JOHN: But we're certainly going to try and
9 do it.

10 STEVE: All right.

11 JOHN: I think the most important thing we'd
12 like to do is have Judy talk to the doctor.

13 STEVE: Right. Well, she wants to, by the
14 way, right --

15 JOHN: And anybody else that wants to.

16 STEVE: Okay.

17 JOHN: Do you want to --

18 STEVE: Do I need to call back first with
19 this new phone -- he wants -- he's right here, ready to
20 change the phone for me.

21 JOHN: Do what you want to do.

22 STEVE: Yeah, okay. Why don't we do that.
23 Could you clear it for him, feeding the, the --

24 JOHN: After we've handled this telephone
25 thing.

STEVE: It's getting cold and dark. That's

1 -- I guess it's almost dark now, isn't it?

2 JOHN: Okay. Hold -- can you hang on the
3 phone?

4 STEVE: All right. Sure.

5 JOHN: Hold on.

6 STEVE: Okay.

7 STEVE TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Hello. Hi.
8 My hands are warm too and so are yours. It's going to
9 disappear. It'll get smaller and disappear. Let's
10 see. Oh, it's not much at all. Uh-uh. It's no big
11 deal, especially with a little time. I got to ask them
12 what the -- I'll be they do. I wonder what happened to
13 John now. Put me on hold or something here.

14 JOHN: -- o. Hello.

15 STEVE: Yeah, John.

16 JOHN: Yeah. We're trying to talk to
17 somebody up forward --

18 STEVE: Okay.

19 JOHN: -- to get some okay on the --

20 STEVE: Right.

21 JOHN: -- on the chickens, but it doesn't
22 look good. They don't want anymore people wandering
23 around outside than is absolutely --

24 STEVE: Well, yeah --

25 JOHN: -- possible at nighttime and they just
want to know if you can feed them at first light in the

1 morning.

2 STEVE: Well, I -- well --

3 JOHN: We just don't want a lot of movement.

4 STEVE: I think he's already down -- well,
5 you guys have allowed it, you know, in the last number
6 of nights.

7 JOHN: Hey, we had a guy sneak out there and
8 do it and nobody told us either, right?

9 STEVE: When was this?

10 JOHN: Remember when we sent the fellow to
11 the gymnasium to turn out the lights and you sent one
12 kind of slow on the uptake the first time and then --

13 STEVE: I think what happened -- remember
14 what happened? He went to the wrong location and there
15 was a -- he went to -- there was a light in the back
16 and apparently there was a south side that they were
17 speaking about from what I understand.

18 JOHN: I don't know -- we're, we're just,
19 we're just getting -- the boss is just -- he doesn't
20 want a lot of moving around out there at nighttime and
21 if you can feed the chickens in the morning, feed the
22 chickens in the morning and we'll handle the tapes and
23 the magazine articles and all of that stuff this
24 evening.

25 STEVE: To tell you the truth, to tell you
the truth, I'm kind of surprised by it. It's not that

1 | it's a big deal. It isn't to me, it's just the, the
2 | idea because, you know, I mean --

3 | JOHN: The system.

4 | STEVE: Anyway.

5 | JOHN: Do you want to try that phone? And,
6 | and try and work it out?

7 | STEVE: Yeah. I'll get back to you then.

8 | JOHN: Okay.

9 | STEVE TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Was there
10 | anything else? Did you say you were -- had --

11 | UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Will there be
12 | another pickup or not?

13 | STEVE: -- yeah, there'll be another pickup.
14 | I'll be talking to them in a little while though.

15 | STEVE: Okay. I'll call you, John.

16 | JOHN: Hey, do you, do you want to talk --
17 | have her talk to the doctor now or you want to give me
18 | a call back?

19 | STEVE: Just let me change the phone. I'll
20 | be calling you right back, probably within like ten
21 | minutes even.

22 | JOHN: Okay.

23 | STEVE: Okay. That way I can even get them.

24 | JOHN: Fine.

25 | STEVE: Okay, bye.

 JOHN: Thanks.

3 STEVE: John, can you call me back? I want
4 to try this phone out.

5 JOHN: You bet.

6 STEVE: Okay. Thanks.

7 JOHN: Sound loud and clear right now.

8 STEVE: Good.

10 STEVE: Okay.

13 (Dial tone.)

14 (Telephone being dialed.)

15 (Telephone ringing. Three rings.)

16 JOHN TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: It's ringing.

17 STEVE: Hello.

18 JOHN: Hey.

19 STEVE: Did it ring right -- is it right
20 away?

21 JOHN: That was about the third ring when you
22 picked it up.

23 STEVE: No way.

24 JOHN: After the third ring.

25 STEVE: Well, then it's got a touchy -- I
don't -- some of these phones like have like two, three

1 wires to them. I don't like that and I think that's
2 the problem again.

3 JOHN: Did it ring at your end at all?

4 STEVE: Just one time. That's why I wanted
5 to know. I think what it is is there's a -- some kind
6 of a special plug on the back. I think what we're
7 going to have to do is tape it up just so it doesn't
8 ever move, because I think that could be a problem.

9 JOHN: Yeah. Well, it did ring, though.

10 STEVE: Okay. Now, David -- he, he overheard
11 my conversation about the chickens and I guess it's to
12 get down to 23 degrees.

13 JOHN: Um-hum.

14 STEVE: And he's concerned about them because
15 they don't -- from what I understand, they don't have
16 any shelter and they wanted to throw some plas -- throw
17 some seed in there and some plastic over a part of it
18 or something. They don't know what to do for them.

19 JOHN: Well, that's something I'll have to
20 discuss --

21 STEVE: Well, do that because, you know, he
22 doesn't want --

23 JOHN: -- with command.

24 STEVE: You know, so far they've been doing
25 well, but he's concerned about them.

JOHN: Yeah. Well, we'll work on that.

1 STEVE: Okay.

2 JOHN: We sure will. And I know it's, it's
3 going to be cold and there's going to be a breeze.

4 STEVE: Oh, you bet it is. And Scott's here
5 and Judy's soaking her finger, but she's -- as soon as
6 Scott's off she'll be coming to the phone.

7 JOHN: Okay.

8 STEVE: Do you have the doctor or --

9 JOHN: You bet I do. And it's Dr. John
10 Hagmann, H-A-G-M-A-N-N.

11 STEVE: Okay. Dr. John Hagmann.

12 JOHN: Okay?

13 STEVE: All right.

14 JOHN: And when, when he's done talking to
15 Scott --

16 STEVE: Okay.

17 JOHN: Scott can describe his wound and
18 everything to him.

19 STEVE: Right, right.

20 JOHN: Then you're going to put Judy on with
21 him?

22 STEVE: Right.

23 JOHN: And then you and I'll get back on.

24 STEVE: Sounds good.

25 JOHN-2: Okay?

STEVE: Talk to you then, John.

1 JOHN: All right. Thank you.
2 STEVE: Okay. Sure.
3 JOHN: Uh-huh.
4 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Hi, Scott?
5 STEVE: Hello, this is Steve. This -- here's
6 Scott.
7 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: All right.
8 SCOTT: Hello, is this John?
9 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Yeah, hi.
10 SCOTT: Who?
11 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: I'm John Hagmann. I'm a
12 doctor.
13 SCOTT: Oh, okay. Yes, what can I help you
14 with? Or what can you help me with?
15 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Right. Well, why don't
16 you tell -- I don't know -- I understand that you were
17 injured, but could you tell me a little bit about your
18 injury. I don't know what, what's happened.
19 SCOTT: Okay. A bullet went through my hand,
20 my left hand, between the thumb and the first index
21 finger and it came out on my wrist, the back of my
22 wrist. And it went in my leg, the same bullet I would
23 imagine, went in my leg --
24 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Which leg? The right or
25 the left?
SCOTT: My right leg. And it stopped right

1 | at the skin -- below the skin surface on my right side.

2 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay. Now, step back and
3 | tell me. Where did it enter your right leg?

4 | SCOTT: Right in the inner thigh.

5 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: About the middle of the
6 | thigh?

7 | SCOTT: No. Right in the -- just missed my,
8 | you know.

9 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay. So, pretty high up
10 | on your thigh.

11 | SCOTT: Yeah, pretty high up on my thigh.

12 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: And then it -- you say you
13 | feel the bullet on the other side?

14 | SCOTT: Yeah. I can feel it. I can even
15 | tell which direction the bullet's facing.

16 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay. Where is the bullet
17 | on the other side?

18 | SCOTT: About maybe six, six inches below my
19 | hip.

20 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay. So it's still
21 | pretty high on your thigh on that side?

22 | SCOTT: Yeah.

23 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Is it -- if you look at
24 | your thigh from front to back, is it up toward the
25 | front of your thigh?

 SCOTT: Right in the middle.

1 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Middle, okay.

2 SCOTT: Toward, toward the front a little

3 bit. It's -- I guess it missed the bone, so it's in

4 the front --

5 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: That's what I --

6 SCOTT: -- around the front of the bone.

7 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: All right. Okay. Now,

8 have you been walking around on that?

9 SCOTT: Yeah.

10 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay.

11 SCOTT: It doesn't cause me any pain

12 whatsoever.

13 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: To walk -- it doesn't

14 cause any pain to walk on it?

15 SCOTT: No.

16 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: All right. What do the --

17 one -- I just want to clarify on your hand wound. You

18 said that it -- a bullet went in between your thumb and

19 index finger?

20 SCOTT: Yes.

21 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: On the palm side or the

22 back side of your hand?

23 SCOTT: The back side.

24 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: All right. And then it

25 came out of your wrist on the palm side of the wrist?

SCOTT: It came out on the back -- on the

1 back edge of my wrist.

2 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay. So where your thumb
3 sort of connects to your wrist?

4 SCOTT: No. Where -- you know my little
5 finger?

6 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Um-hum.

7 SCOTT: Okay. Follow that down to my wrist
8 bone and it came out just below the wrist joint.

9 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay. Are you using --

10 SCOTT: So, it's kind of just like it went
11 around in a cir -- went around in an arc and then went
12 just under the skin and it came out on the -- by the
13 bone.

14 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay. That's your left
15 hand and then it went into your right leg?

16 SCOTT: Yeah.

17 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay. Are you using that
18 left hand?

19 SCOTT: I can move my fingers. I can move my
20 arm, but every -- like if I twist my arm a certain way,
21 then I can -- it hurts.

22 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay.

23 SCOTT: But I can move my fingers and
24 everything

25 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Can you pick something up
with that hand?

1 SCOTT: No. Only like light stuff, like
2 maybe a piece of paper or something.

3 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: All right. Do the, do the
4 wounds that you have there -- I would be worried if
5 they were sort of covered with a film. If they were,
6 you know, whitish or had stuff on top.

7 SCOTT: Oh, no. They're very clean. In
8 fact, they're healing pretty good.

9 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: What are you doing for
10 them?

11 SCOTT: Well, I change it every day, put
12 peroxide and put Betadine around the outside of it, you
13 know?

14 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Um-hum.

15 SCOTT: And I'm taking Doxycycline -- that's
16 what it says, I don't know. It says for infection.

17 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay. How much of that
18 are you taking?

19 SCOTT: It says twice a day.

20 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay.

21 SCOTT TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Careful,
22 you're making the phone --

23 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: And are you right-handed
24 or left-handed.

25 SCOTT: I'm right-handed.

DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay. So it's you're

1 | other hand that you --

2 | SCOTT: Yeah.

3 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: All right. And you're
4 | able to, you're able to, to use the wrist, move the
5 | wrist?

6 | SCOTT: Only, only like right -- like if I
7 | hold my hand like -- if I bend my elbow and my hand's
8 | like, like I'm going to shake your hand?

9 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Um-hum.

10 | SCOTT: I can move it right to left, but I
11 | can't move it the other way.

12 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay.

13 | SCOTT: Up and down.

14 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: All right. I'd be worried
15 | that -- there are a whole bunch of bones in your
16 | wrist --

17 | SCOTT: Yeah.

18 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: -- that make your wrist,
19 | and with the path of that bullet through there, you're
20 | almost certain to have a break in there.

21 | SCOTT: Yeah, probably.

22 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: And that's, that's what I
23 | was worried about. The other thing we worry about is,
24 | of course, anytime a bullet wound kills a lot of tissue
25 | and the risk is of it getting infected.

 SCOTT: Oh, really.

1 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Right -- using -- can you
2 still hear me?

3 SCOTT: Hello?

4 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Yeah. Can you still hear
5 me.

6 SCOTT: Yeah. They keep stepping around the
7 cord and everything and --

8 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay.

9 SCOTT: -- it's messing --

10 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: The, the risk of infection
11 is just because there's dead tissue in there the
12 bacteria can, can eat. Now, taking the antibiotic like
13 Doxycycline will slow that down, but there's still dead
14 tissue in there and just like any dead tissue, it
15 ultimately rots. It --

16 (Connection broken.)

17 (Telephone being dialed.)

18 (Telephone ringing -- eight rings.)

19 DR. JOHN HAGMANN TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON:

20 Let's end with the bad news. If they try to call in --

21 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Hi, Scott?

22 STEVE: Is this Dr. Hagmann?

23 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Yes, it is.

24 STEVE: We're having phone -- terrible phone
25 problems here. Here's Scott again.

DR. JOHN HAGMANN: All right. Thanks, Steve.

1 SCOTT: Hello.

2 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Hi, Scott.

3 SCOTT: Sorry --

4 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Yeah, John Hagmann. No
5 problem.

6 SCOTT: -- a click and you weren't there.

7 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Right. We tried to call
8 you back and it didn't seem to work so I guess you'll
9 have to try to call us back.

10 SCOTT: Okay.

11 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay. What I was -- I was
12 just thinking about and there's another medical person
13 here. We were just trying to piece together everything
14 you told us so far.

15 SCOTT: Right.

16 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: The good news is it looks
17 like the wound on your leg is not serious.

18 SCOTT: Yeah.

19 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Because you got real lucky
20 and that bullet missed the major bone there.

21 SCOTT: Probably missed a major artery too.

22 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Exactly. And especially
23 you say it went in very high and right in the front
24 very high is the --

25 SCOTT: Yeah.

DR. JOHN HAGMANN: -- major artery and nerve.

1 But with your lack of pain and your ability to move and
2 walk on it, the wound is just through the soft tissue.

3 SCOTT: Uh-huh.

4 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: And since there's only the
5 entrance on the inside --

6 SCOTT: Right.

7 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: -- you're doing pretty
8 well on that one.

9 SCOTT: Uh-huh.

10 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: I'm a lot more concerned
11 about your wrist. As we were just talking about.
12 There is --

13 SCOTT: Yeah. Because there's a lot less
14 room for the bullet to go through, you know? I mean,
15 there's --

16 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Right. All --

17 SCOTT: -- hand's a lot thinner.

18 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Yeah. The only thing in
19 there are bones, so it's almost certain that you've
20 broken at least one, maybe a couple of bones in there.
21 The, the concern I have is that if those bones heal,
22 they're real close together. If they heal when they're
23 broken, they fuse together, so the wrist never works
24 after that. It's, it's a single bone rather than eight
25 little bones.

SCOTT: Um-hum.

1 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: What needs to be done is
2 that -- it's absolutely imperative at this point, it's
3 been two weeks, that that gets x-rayed.

4 SCOTT: Yeah.

5 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: And then that there's
6 some, what we call medically, debridement. That where
7 -- where you take away the dead -- remember I told you
8 the, the bullet kills tissue and that's the tissue that
9 eventually rots when the bacteria get into it.

10 SCOTT: Right.

11 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: That tissue has to be
12 cleaned away and that's a process called debridement,
13 where they obviously numb it up and it's done as a --
14 sort of a minor surgery procedure, but they have to
15 clean away all the, the tissue that the bullet has
16 destroyed to keep it from getting infected as time goes
17 on.

18 SCOTT: Yeah. Like it's, it's not red at all
19 or anything. It isn't even purple or nothing.

20 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay. That's just --
21 probably because you've been taking the antibiotics and
22 suppressing the infection. But as long as the tissue
23 is there, as long as the food is there, eventually a
24 bacteria that's resistant to the Doxycycline that
25 you're taking will find it's way in there.

SCOTT: Right. I see.

1 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: See, the key is that you
2 have to get rid of the food that the bacteria are on
3 and that's what the debridement is. It, it, it will
4 prevent the infection that's eventually going to start.

5 SCOTT: Right.

6 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Sounds like you've done
7 pretty well so far.

8 SCOTT: Amazing I would imagine.

9 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Right. But -- actually it
10 is. At two weeks, though, now those bones are starting
11 to, to grow a sponge around them of bony tissue and
12 that sponge will just fuse together and that wrist will
13 be permanently fused. That, that's the big concern.
14 So what we, we really need -- ultimately we need to get
15 an x-ray of that. Then it needs to be -- after the x-
16 ray, that will tell us which bones are broken.

17 No matter what, no matter which ones are
18 broken, the tissue has to be debrided and, and taken
19 off. You know, the -- just the dead stuff that's
20 there. And then if the bones are broken, they can
21 either be casted or even sometimes just wired together.
22 By wiring them together, then they heal as, as separate
23 bones and that keeps the wrist working.

24 SCOTT: Oh, I see.

25 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: See, the whole goal is to
make sure you have function on that hand.

1 SCOTT: Right.

2 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Otherwise you end up with
3 a stiff wrist and you're, you're basically like you
4 have an artificial hand. It doesn't work anymore.

5 SCOTT: Yeah. It felt like I had -- when I,
6 when I first got shot, it felt like I had somebody
7 else's hand strapped to my wrist.

8 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: This is --

9 SCOTT: -- like plastic-coated.

10 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Well, that's -- see, the
11 best outcome would be to -- so they can do that. Now,
12 if we don't do that, the worry I would have is that,
13 first of all, that it's going to fuse and you won't
14 have function. But even more serious, that eventually
15 a bacteria's going to get resistant to the Doxycycline
16 you're taking and then the infection will start pretty
17 rapidly because this tissue's had a long time to get in
18 there and get all soft and be able to --

19 SCOTT: Yeah.

20 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: -- be used by the, by the
21 bacteria.

22 SCOTT: Another thing, too, is I don't have
23 too many of those pills left.

24 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Well, I say, as soon as
25 you, as soon as you run out, the infection's going to
start.

1 SCOTT: Yeah.

2 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: How many of them -- how
3 many of the Doxycycline do you have left?

4 SCOTT: Oh, I think about six.

5 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Six. Okay. Well, say
6 there's --

7 SCOTT: About three more days left.

8 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Right. You've been
9 suppressing it so far, but either you're going to run
10 out or even, even if you continued on that, bacteria's
11 going to find until we actually get the dead tissue out
12 of there, the food for it. So that's what needs to be
13 done, to, to really take care of that. Let us -- I was
14 just trying to think. There's not much that I can tell
15 you to do for yourself that you haven't already done,
16 see.

17 SCOTT: Yeah, it's, it's been pretty good
18 actually so far. I mean, it's out -- it's really
19 amazing to tell you the truth, you know?

20 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Well, I'm --

21 SCOTT: I mean I never been shot before, but
22 I mean, even the, even that fact, I mean -- I know that
23 it could have been a lot worse.

24 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Well, we -- the medical
25 guys, we've been standing by ready to take care of you
guys if you ever -- you know, if you need anything and

1 | if your -- say, if you're ready -- or whenever you are
2 | ready, I'll be glad to go with you to the hospital and
3 | get that taken care of.

4 | SCOTT: Yeah.

5 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Ultimately, it's going to
6 | need to get taken care of or you're going to lose -- I
7 | mean, your minimum, you're going to lose function more.
8 | If you get infected, you could lose the whole hand, if
9 | it gets infected.

10 | SCOTT: Yeah.

11 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: But that's, say, myself
12 | and the other medical guys, we're just standing by and
13 | ready to take care of you as soon as you're --

14 | SCOTT: Yeah.

15 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: But you know the sooner we
16 | do that, the better.

17 | SCOTT: Right.

18 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: If the infection starts,
19 | then we have to take off more and more tissue.

20 | SCOTT: Right. Excuse me. Hold on a second.

21 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Sure.

22 | SCOTT TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: What Judy --
23 | I'm waiting for her to come over here so she can --

24 | SCOTT: Yeah. They're going to go check on
25 | Judy.

 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay, Scott. What do you

1 | want me to do right now for you?

2 | SCOTT: Gee. Maybe send me a different type
3 | of antibiotic?

4 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Well, that's, that's --
5 | see, that's not the, not the secret. That's --

6 | SCOTT: I, I don't know what else you can do
7 | for me unless you want to come in here. I mean, you
8 | know.

9 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Well -- even if I did that
10 | I couldn't --

11 | SCOTT: We're not going to shoot you or
12 | anything. You know what I mean?

13 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: I still couldn't. I need
14 | a hospital to do those things.

15 | SCOTT: Right.

16 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: I need an x-ray machine.
17 | I need a, you know, the ability to do some minor
18 | surgery to take off that tissue.

19 | SCOTT: Yeah.

20 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: So that doesn't --
21 | wouldn't help us unfortunately. And even changing
22 | antibiotics, again, we're just selecting out a
23 | particular vicious bacteria.

24 | SCOTT: Right.

25 | DR. JOHN HAGMANN: I'm sure you've heard
about, you know, say people in the hospital who take an

1 antibiotic and eventually they find that the
2 antibiotics don't work anymore.

3 SCOTT: Yeah.

4 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Because you -- because as
5 long as the bacteria has something to grow on, even one
6 or two of them will be resistant and those will grow
7 until they form an infection.

8 SCOTT: Right.

9 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: So -- you just say -- I'll
10 be glad to answer your questions and I'll, say, I'll
11 try to tell you, you know, the good and the bad.

12 SCOTT: Oh, okay. I got one, one question.
13 I was curious about -- okay. This bullet is resting on
14 the inside of my skin.

15 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Um-hum.

16 SCOTT: If it stayed there, would it
17 eventually come out by itself?

18 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: What will happen to that
19 is that it would stay there -- say, eventually your
20 wound there would heal from what it sounds like, it
21 would just heal, it'll scar over.

22 SCOTT: Yeah.

23 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: The bullet would stay
24 under the skin and over time, and now I'm talking
25 about, you know, years, would get closer and closer to
the skin. Ultimately the skin would be real thin and

1 sort of bluish right over the top of the bullet and
2 then you'd nick the -- it would be so thin that you'd
3 nick it, just scratching or something, and the bullet
4 would pop out.

5 SCOTT: Yeah. Because it's like -- there's a
6 lump on my leg where it's actually pushing out.

7 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Um-hum. Well, it would
8 take a while to gradually work its way right under the
9 skin and the skin gets pale and it just breaks the
10 skin's surface.

11 SCOTT: Oh, I see. Yeah.

12 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: And that's -- it can be
13 removed. Obviously we could go in and --

14 SCOTT: Oh, yeah. Right. Just a small
15 incision would take it out.

16 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Right. But if it -- well,
17 if you're asking what would happen if that didn't
18 happen --

19 SCOTT: Yeah.

20 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: -- it just heals and scars
21 and eventually the -- bullet works its way to the
22 surface and comes out.

23 SCOTT: Uh-huh. Yeah.

24 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: That leg wound I'm not too
25 concerned about. You seem to have gotten real lucky
and done real well with that. You've done so -- pretty

1 well so far with the wrist wound, but I'm, I'm much,
2 much more worried about that one.

3 SCOTT: Yeah. Yeah, that's the only one that
4 causes me pain like if I move it a certain way it'll
5 hurt, but 90 percent of the time I'm fine, you know.
6 It doesn't bother me.

7 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Those are the, the -- say
8 the broken bones that are in there that hurt when you
9 try to move them.

10 SCOTT: Yeah, because that thing -- it looks
11 like it went in my hand and it went around the wrist
12 bone and came out through the skin.

13 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: It probably went through
14 one of those bones.

15 SCOTT: Huh?

16 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: I bet you it went through
17 one of those bones.

18 SCOTT: Probably something like that.
19 Because yeah, it hurts a little bit every once in a
20 while when I move it.

21 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay. Well, we'll -- I
22 say, we're -- got myself and the whole team always
23 standing by. You know, whenever there's any questions
24 or problems, we --

25 SCOTT: Okay.

DR. JOHN HAGMANN: We say, we were there when

1 Kathy came out earlier today --

2 SCOTT: Yeah.

3 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: -- and she didn't have any
4 problems. She didn't really want, didn't need to see
5 us, so --

6 SCOTT: Yeah.

7 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: -- we didn't do much for
8 her, but we were standing right there when she came
9 out, if she had anything to do. So we're always there.

10 SCOTT: Uh-huh. Okay. Hey, thanks a lot.
11 You want to talk to Judy now?

12 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Yeah, if I could.

13 SCOTT: Okay. Hold on.

14 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Thanks, Scott.

15 SCOTT TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Judy -- yeah.
16 Where'd she go? She was right here.

17 SCOTT: She was standing right here and then
18 she disappeared again.

19 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay. I'll just hold on.

20 SCOTT: Okay.

21 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: It's easier that way.

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Judy. Is Judy
23 with you?

24 JUDY: Hello.

25 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Hi, Judy?

JUDY: Hi.

1 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Hi. This is John Hagmann.
2 I'm one of the doctors that have been standing by here.

3 JUDY: With the BATF? Or FBI or --

4 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: No, I'm just a -- doctor
5 they asked to come in and, and help out in case there
6 were any medical problems.

7 JUDY: Oh, okay.

8 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Now, I did get -- they
9 showed me when we were getting ready for this they
10 showed me a video tape that you made earlier.

11 JUDY: Okay.

12 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Of your, your finger
13 there.

14 JUDY: Right.

15 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: It looks, looks pretty
16 bad.

17 JUDY: Yeah.

18 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Now, I was -- from what I
19 could see there, I have a pretty good idea of what you
20 had as opposed to Scott. I didn't get to see that.

21 JUDY: You had what?

22 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: I have a pretty good idea
23 of what happened -- or what, what wounds you have --

24 JUDY: Uh-huh.

25 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: -- on your finger there,
but I have some questions that, that -- that video --

1 JUDY: What happened is I got hit with a
2 bullet.

3 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: No, well, say as far as
4 what the wounds were. But they tell me that video tape
5 is several days old.

6 JUDY: Right.

7 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: And I'd be worried -- it
8 was really swollen that -- on that video tape, and it's
9 been a couple of days.

10 JUDY: Right, right.

11 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: I'd be really concerned if
12 the swelling con -- is continuing to get more.

13 JUDY: I wouldn't say it's more. I'm not
14 really sure if it's any less.

15 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay.

16 JUDY TO STEVE: Steve, since the video do you
17 think the swelling is more or less? More or less?

18 STEVE TO JUDY: I can't -- I never -- as
19 much, as much --

20 JUDY: It's about the same or --

21 JUDY TO STEVE: -- you think more even?

22 STEVE TO JUDY: Yes.

23 JUDY: Yeah, it's, it's real pus-y now. And
24 I don't really see that it's healing like --

25 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Now, you say -- wait a
minute, you said there's pus coming out of the wound?

1 JUDY: Yeah.

2 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Like a, a film on top of
3 it or actually dripping out of it.

4 JUDY: It's not dripping out. It's like
5 coated, kind of whitish --

6 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: You mean like mold growing
7 on it?

8 JUDY: Not mold. I don't -- yeah, this don't
9 look good.

10 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: That's -- yeah, that's
11 what --

12 JUDY: -- so infected and, and the skin I
13 would say is kind of deteriorating --

14 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: That's what I was worried
15 about with Scott, that there would be an infection
16 starting in there.

17 JUDY: I don't know about Scott -- well, he's
18 not here right --
