KATHRYN SCHROEDER: And --6 Do you know whether any of the -- do 7 you know anybody that's got any medical problems in 8 9 there that we should be aware of. 



wants to go, I am going to encourage them to do so. 1 JOHN DOLAN: Great. And I, I appreciate 2 that. And I will tell him personally about that. 3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: You know, like I, I -- of 4 5 course, I do go back and talk with David, let him know what's going on, or who might go and all that, and he б just -- he's just interested in these people. He 7 want's to make sure they're doing well and that they 8 will be, you know, treated well and so forth, so that's 9 -- I go back and forth now and then and he's at least 10 not so bad today where I can't talk to him. 11 JOHN DOLAN: Good. I will personally talk to 12 Mr. Swensen later in the day and --13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right. Good. 14 JOHN DOLAN: -- we will --15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And by the way, that wasn't 16 17 the Dick that I had been talking to --18 JOHN DOLAN: No. No, no, no, no. 19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Because I --20 JOHN DOLAN: No, no. STEVE SCHNEIDER: I didn't think so. 21 I think you could tell 22 JOHN DOLAN: No, no. 23 from the voices. I -- we were wondering why, you know, some 14 of these kind of answers when they were, they were 15 actually viewed --JOHN DOLAN: Sure. What I think happened on 16 that is the -- not -- the facts are not all clear, 17 because you got one agency breaking off and a new 18 19 agency starting. STEVE SCHNEIDER: But I mean this is the ATF 20 21 agent that answered that way --22 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, the ATF agent. STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yes. 23 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, okay. 24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Not, not Swensen. 25 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. I didn't think it was, I

didn't think it was Swensen, because --2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. No, he didn't --3 JOHN DOLAN: He wouldn't even have those 4 facts. 5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Exactly. б JOHN DOLAN: Yeah, yeah. 7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Let's see. What else did he say? Let's see here. He had two --3 one pre-teenage girl and one teenage girl. 4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. I realize that. 5 JOHN DOLAN: And so he was a single person. 6 There was another person with him by the name of Kevin 7 Harris and Harris had been --8 9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. JOHN DOLAN: -- at that point at least, 10 11 apparently mortally wounded. STEVE SCHNEIDER: But in this case though 12 like, John, for instance -- David believes as to 13 everybody here that very good intentions were shown 14 right from the time that the incident happened about 15 making sure that the wounded were -- came in, no one 16 was fired upon, no one wanted to do that. They wanted 17 to make sure they got off and got care right away. 18 know, right from the beginning we believe we've tried 19 to work the best way possible for, you know, the good 20 21 of all. No argument at all. 22 JOHN DOLAN: STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. 23 JOHN DOLAN: No argument at all. 24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So I might, you know, there 25

JOHN HAGMANN: Because you got real lucky 20 and that bullet missed the major bone there. 21 SCOTT: Probably missed a major artery too. 22 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Exactly. And especially 23 you say it went in very high and right in the front 24 very high is the --25 SCOTT: Yeah. DR. JOHN HAGMANN: -- major artery and nerve.

But with your lack of pain and your ability to move and 2 walk on it, the wound is just through the soft tissue. SCOTT: Uh-huh. 3 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: And since there's only the 4 5 entrance on the inside --6 SCOTT: Right. 7 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: -- you're doing pretty well on that one. 8 Uh-huh. 9 SCOTT: DR. JOHN HAGMANN: I'm a lot more concerned 10 about your wrist. As we were just talking about. 11 12 There is --Yeah. Because there's a lot less 13 SCOTT: 14 room for the bullet to go through, you know? I mean, 15 there's --16 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Right. All --SCOTT: -- hand's a lot thinner. 17 18 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Yeah. The only thing in 19 there are bones, so it's almost certain that you've 20 broken at least one, maybe a couple of bones in there. The, the concern I have is that if those bones heal, 21 22 they're real close together. If they heal when they're broken, they fuse together, so the wrist never works 23 24 after that. It's, it's a single bone rather than eight 25 little bones.

SCOTT: Um-hum.

DR. JOHN HAGMANN: What needs to be done is that -- it's absolutely imperative at this point, it's been two weeks, that that gets x-rayed.

SCOTT: Yeah.

DR. JOHN HAGMANN: And then that there's some, what we call medically, debridement. That where -- where you take away the dead -- remember I told you the, the bullet kills tissue and that's the tissue that eventually rots when the bacteria get into it.

SCOTT: Right.

DR. JOHN HAGMANN: That tissue has to be cleaned away and that's a process called debridement, where they obviously numb it up and it's done as a -- sort of a minor surgery procedure, but they have to clean away all the, the tissue that the bullet has destroyed to keep it from getting infected as time goes on.

SCOTT: Yeah. Like it's, it's not red at all or anything. It isn't even purple or nothing.

DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay. That's just -probably because you've been taking the antibiotics and
suppressing the infection. But as long as the tissue
is there, as long as the food is there, eventually a
bacteria that's resistant to the Doxycycline that
you're taking will find it's way in there.

SCOTT: Right. I see.

DR. JOHN HAGMANN: See, the key is that you 1 2 have to get rid of the food that the bacteria are on and that's what the debridement is. It, it, it will 3 prevent the infection that's eventually going to start. 4 5 SCOTT: Right. DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Sounds like you've done 6 7 pretty well so far. Amazing I would imagine. 8 SCOTT: DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Right. But -- actually it 9 10 At two weeks, though, now those bones are starting 11 to, to grow a sponge around them of bony tissue and that sponge will just fuse together and that wrist will 12 13 be permanently fused. That, that's the big concern. 14 So what we, we really need -- ultimately we need to get an x-ray of that. Then it needs to be -- after the x-15 16 ray, that will tell us which bones are broken. 17 No matter what, no matter which ones are broken, the tissue has to be debrided and, and taken 18 off. You know, the -- just the dead stuff that's 19 20 there. And then if the bones are broken, they can either be casted or even sometimes just wired together. 21 22 By wiring them together, then they heal as, as separate bones and that keeps the wrist working. 23 24

Oh, I see. SCOTT:

25

DR. JOHN HAGMANN: See, the whole goal is to make sure you have function on that hand.

SCOTT: Right. 1 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Otherwise you end up with 2 a stiff wrist and you're, you're basically like you 3 have an artificial hand. It doesn't work anymore. 4 SCOTT: Yeah. It felt like I had -- when I, 5 when I first got shot, it felt like I had somebody 6 7 else's hand strapped to my wrist. DR. JOHN HAGMANN: This is --8 -- like plastic-coated. 9 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Well, that's -- see, the 10 best outcome would be to -- so they can do that. Now, 11 if we don't do that, the worry I would have is that, 12 first of all, that it's going to fuse and you won't 13 have function. But even more serious, that eventually 14 a bacteria's going to get resistant to the Doxycycline 15 16 you're taking and then the infection will start pretty rapidly because this tissue's had a long time to get in 17 there and get all soft and be able to --18 SCOTT: Yeah. 19 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: -- be used by the, by the 20 21 bacteria. Another thing, too, is I don't have 22 SCOTT: too many of those pills left. 23 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Well, I say, as soon as 24 you, as soon as you run out, the infection's going to 25

start.

SCOTT: Yeah. 1 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: How many of them -- how 2 many of the Doxycycline do you have left? 3 SCOTT: Oh, I think about six. 4 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Six. Okay. Well, say 5 there's --6 About three more days left. 7 SCOTT: DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Right. You've been 8 suppressing it so far, but either you're going to run 9 out or even, even if you continued on that, bacteria's 10 going to find until we actually get the dead tissue out 11 of there, the food for it. So that's what needs to be 12 done, to, to really take care of that. Let us -- I was 13 just trying to think. There's not much that I can tell 14 15 you to do for yourself that you haven't already done, 16 see. Yeah, it's, it's been pretty good 17 SCOTT: I mean, it's out -- it's really 18 actually so far. 19 amazing to tell you the truth, you know? 20 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Well, I'm --I mean I never been shot before, but 21 SCOTT: I mean, even the, even that fact, I mean -- I know that 22 it could have been a lot worse. 23 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Well, we -- the medical 24 quys, we've been standing by ready to take care of you 25 guys if you ever -- you know, if you need anything and

if your -- say, if you're ready -- or whenever you are 1 ready, I'll be glad to go with you to the hospital and 2 get that taken care of. 3 SCOTT: Yeah. 4 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Ultimately, it's going to 5 need to get taken care of or you're going to lose -- I mean, your minimum, you're going to lose function more. 7 If you get infected, you could lose the whole hand, if it gets infected. 9 SCOTT: Yeah. 10 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: But that's, say, myself 11 and the other medical guys, we're just standing by and 12 ready to take care of you as soon as you're --13 SCOTT: Yeah. 14 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: But you know the sooner we 15 16 do that, the better. 17 SCOTT: Right. DR. JOHN HAGMANN: If the infection starts, 18 then we have to take off more and more tissue. 19 Excuse me. Hold on a second. 20 SCOTT: Right. 21 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Sure. SCOTT TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: What Judy --22 I'm waiting for her to come over here so she can --23 They're going to go check on 24 Yeah. I need 13 14 a hospital to do those things. 15 SCOTT: Right. DR. JOHN HAGMANN: I need an x-ray machine. 16 I need a, you know, the ability to do some minor 17 surgery to take off that tissue. 18 19 SCOTT: Yeah. DR. JOHN HAGMANN: So that doesn't --20 21 wouldn't help us unfortunately. And even changing antibiotics, again, we're just selecting out a 22 particular vicious bacteria. 23 SCOTT: Right. 24 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: I'm sure you've heard 25 about, you know, say people in the hospital who take an

antibiotic and eventually they find that the antibiotics don't work anymore. 2 SCOTT: Yeah. 3 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Because you -- because as 4 long as the bacteria has something to grow on, even one 5 or two of them will be resistant and those will grow 6 until they form an infection. 7 8 SCOTT: Right. DR. JOHN HAGMANN: So -- you just say -- I'll 9 be glad to answer your questions and I'll, say, I'll 10 try to tell you, you know, the good and the bad. 11 SCOTT: Oh, okay. I got one, one question. 12 I was curious about -- okay. This bullet is resting on 13 14 the inside of my skin. DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Um-hum. 15 SCOTT: If it stayed there, would it 16 eventually come out by itself? 17 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: What will happen to that 18 is that it would stay there -- say, eventually your 20 wound there would heal from what it sounds like, it would just heal, it'll scar over. 21 22 SCOTT: Yeah. 23 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: The bullet would stay under the skin and over time, and now I'm talking 24 about, you know, years, would get closer and closer to 25

the skin. Ultimately the skin would be real thin and

sort of bluish right over the top of the bullet and then you'd nick the -- it would be so thin that you'd 2 nick it, just scratching or something, and the bullet 3 would pop out. 4 SCOTT: Yeah. Because it's like -- there's a 5 lump on my leg where it's actually pushing out. 6 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Um-hum. Well, it would 7 take a while to gradually work its way right under the 8 skin and the skin gets pale and it just breaks the 9 skin's surface. 10 Oh, I see. Yeah. 11 SCOTT: DR. JOHN HAGMANN: And that's -- it can be 12 removed. Obviously we could go in and --13 14 SCOTT: Oh, yeah. Right. Just a small incision would take it out. 15 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Right. But if it -- well, 16 17 if you're asking what would happen if that didn't 18 happen --SCOTT: Yeah. 19 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: -- it just heals and scars 20 and eventually the -- bullet works its way to the 21 surface and comes out. 22 SCOTT: Uh-huh. Yeah. 23 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: That leg wound I'm not too 24 concerned about. You seem to have gotten real lucky 25 and done real well with that. You've done so -- pretty

JOHN HAGMANN: I'd be really concerned if the swelling con -- is continuing to get more. 12 13 JUDY: I wouldn't say it's more. I'm not 14 really sure if it's any less. 15 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Okay. 16 JUDY TO STEVE: Steve, since the video do you 17 think the swelling is more or less? More or less? 18 STEVE TO JUDY: I can't -- I never -- as 19 much, as much --20 JUDY: It's about the same or --21 JUDY TO STEVE: -- you think more even? 22 STEVE TO JUDY: Yes. 23 JUDY: Yeah, it's, it's real pus-y now. 24 I don't really see that it's healing like --25 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Now, you say -- wait a minute, you said there's pus coming out of the wound?

1 JUDY: Yeah. 2 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: Like a, a film on top of it or actually dripping out of it. 3 JUDY: It's not dripping out. It's like 4 coated, kind of whitish --5 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: You mean like mold growing 6 7 on it? JUDY: Not mold. I don't -- yeah, this don't 8 9 look good. DR. JOHN HAGMANN: That's -- yeah, that's 10 what --11 JUDY: -- so infected and, and the skin I 12 would say is kind of deteriorating --13 DR. JOHN HAGMANN: That's what I was worried 14 about with Scott, that there would be an infection 15 16 starting in there.
