2 KORESH: -- but in Christ they're only  
3 commercial, right?

4 JOHN: Uh-huh.

5 KORESH: The -- walks a lonely mile in  
6 Reeboks, you know? Instead of sandals on his feet.

7 JOHN: Hey, you know I missed talking to  
8 Steven tonight.

9 KORESH: Yeah, well, they -- like they say,  
10 you all like talking to them better than me.

11 JOHN: Not me.

12 KORESH: Because I always tell him. I say,  
13 Steve, don't talk religion with them.

14 JOHN: Not me. I don't get, I don't get to  
15 go through any of these study periods with Steven.

16 KORESH: Well, I told him not --

17 JOHN: We, we nipped those in the bud.

18 KORESH: I said let me be, let me be the guy  
19 you hate.

20 JOHN: Hey, like I said, didn't want to  
21 listen to it, it'd be over. And Sherry's not around  
22 either?

23 KORESH TO RACHEL: Where is Sherry, Rach?

24 JOHN: You probably woke, wake Rachel up.

25 KORESH: No, she's -- Rachel, Rachel's here  
in the room with me. She's, she knows I got to be, you

1 know, accessible for --

2 JOHN: She got to get you up and moving  
3 about.

4 KORESH: She's a good girl, you know?

5 JOHN: I'm sure she is.

6 KORESH: She hated my guts when she first met  
7 me. She thought I was too religious.

8 JOHN: I find that hard to believe.

9 KORESH: Oh, it's true, you know. You know  
10 how kids are and religion.

11 JOHN: What am I going to do? Say goodnight  
12 to you without getting to talk to anybody else?

13 KORESH: Well, you want to talk to Rach or  
14 what?

15 JOHN: Huh?

16 KORESH: You know, Rachel asked you for some  
17 milk and you said no, so you -- you know, she knows  
18 you've got your tail tucked there and, you know.

19 JOHN: Sure.

20 KORESH: The -- Bobby, Bobby has been  
21 drinking a lot of it there supposedly.

22 KORESH TO RACHEL: How much is left, Rach?  
23 Three-quarters of a gallon?

24 JOHN: Quart?

25 KORESH: There's three-quarters of a gallon  
left.

1 JOHN: Uh-huh. Well --

2 KORESH: You should --

3 JOHN: -- it's something we might be able to  
4 work on.

5 KORESH: You should, you should, you know, no  
6 negotiations attached. Let that -- we're going to work  
7 on that.

8 JOHN: I just said that's something we might  
9 be able to work on though.

10 KORESH: Yeah.

11 JOHN: -- All we can do is throw somebody a, a  
12 pitch and see where it goes.

13 KORESH: You know, you still got about 800  
14 and some bucks there, you know. I, I thought I gave  
15 you plenty of money. I mean I knew I wouldn't be able  
16 -- I wasn't going to be able to get out to the store,  
17 you know, and buy this stuff, so --

18 JOHN: You planned that in advance, huh?

19 KORESH: Yeah.

20 JOHN: Sure.

21 KORESH: I mean I gave you \$1,000 and I  
22 explained to, to Jim --

23 JOHN: Uh-huh.

24 KORESH: I said, now Jim, you know we're --  
25 you said was going to work this out from here to the  
end and, and, you know, when it comes to my babies and,

1 | and the children and all that, you know, then they're,  
2 | they're not, they're not victims involved. I says  
3 | let's, let's not, you know -- I said if we need  
4 | something, you know, take it out of that. If you need  
5 | more money, I'll send more money, more money to you,  
6 | you know? So he said no problem.

7 |                 JOHN: Yeah.

8 |                 KORESH: Of course, you know, people say a  
9 | lot of things sometimes, but --

10 |                JOHN: Well, listen. If Steven trips on  
11 | through there or Sherry trips on through, or Scott, you  
12 | know, any of the other ones --

13 |                KORESH TO RACHEL: Hey, Rach.

14 |                JOHN: Tell them I'm on the end of the horn  
15 | tonight.

16 |                KORESH TO RACHEL: Knock, knock --

17 |                JOHN: Not that horn either.

18 |                KORESH: No, I, I understand. Not, not the  
19 | one that's going to be chopped off if you're  
20 | unrighteous.

21 |                JOHN: Maybe you better not put Sherry on  
22 | tonight.

23 |                KORESH: That's just been the continuation of  
24 | Psalms 18, where it says I wound them and unable to  
25 | rise.

                  JOHN: I don't want to, I don't want to get

1 | into that either.

2 |           KORESH: Well, David did that of old, you  
3 | know. The Philistines and, and the prophecy --

4 |           JOHN: No, no, no, no.

5 |           KORESH: He said she's going to cut off the  
6 | pride of the Philistines.

7 |           JOHN: Oh, maybe that was their index finger.

8 |           KORESH: No.

9 |           JOHN: You're sure?

10 |           KORESH: Positive, because the next verse  
11 | tells you what it was.

12 |           JOHN: Uh-oh.

13 |           KORESH: Anyway, you read Ezekiel --

14 |           JOHN: You're terrible, you know that, don't  
15 | you?

16 |           KORESH: Well, I'm just saying the sinners --  
17 | it says -- it says thy righteous -- you terrible  
18 | things.

19 |           JOHN: Yeah. Well, if you're not a sinner,  
20 | it shouldn't be any problem.

21 |           KORESH: Well, you know, sin has to be  
22 | defined. Anytime --

23 |           JOHN: Right.

24 |           KORESH: -- anytime, anytime --

25 |           JOHN: But if somebody feels that they're not  
a sinner, what can you say?

1           KORESH: Well, you're not a sinner, right?  
2 Is that what you're saying?

3           JOHN: I didn't say that.

4           KORESH: Hey, did I ever say I wasn't a  
5 sinner?

6           JOHN: No. Are you going to tell me that?

7           KORESH: I will simply say --

8           JOHN: In the eyes of whom?

9           KORESH: In -- well, in the sight -- in the  
10 eyes of God, like I say, we have to redefine what in  
11 the New Covenant and Testament is a sin, you know.  
12 This obedience to the -- and the law is a sin, yeah,  
13 but, but there's also something called the commandment  
14 being extremely broad. I mean, you know, in Psalms 118  
15 it says --

16           JOHN: Oh, it's just like some people accept  
17 the Ten Commandments as they are and others may accept,  
18 well, I'll accept number one and I'll accept number  
19 two, but I don't want to accept all the others. You  
20 know, it's their interpretation and --

21           KORESH: Well, you know, that's, that's what,  
22 that's what Catholicism did and they tell you point  
23 blank, you know?

24           JOHN: Um-hum.

25           KORESH: But, you know, like I say, I -- you  
know, most Catholics understand to a large degree that

1 they are not obligated to accept everything that  
2 Catechism teaches them.

3 JOHN: That's true.

4 KORESH: They accept that.

5 JOHN: But they must accept the Ten  
6 Commandments.

7 KORESH: It's what -- they accept the  
8 Commandments and they accept what they perceive to be  
9 right.

10 JOHN: Um-hum.

11 KORESH: I mean, there's a lot of nuns and  
12 stuff who had a lot of babies, you know, during the  
13 Dark Ages, you know. But they, but they, they --

14 JOHN: Whatever you say. I mean, I don't  
15 know. But I'm sure, you know --

16 KORESH: Well, don't --

17 JOHN: -- you, you wouldn't lie to me, would  
18 you?

19 KORESH: You don't know that.

20 JOHN: Well --

21 KORESH: You know, I mean I could be the  
22 Devil himself, you know what I mean?

23 JOHN: That's true.

24 KORESH: Instead of being the Lamb, I could  
25 be the Devil here getting read -- getting ready to put  
people in Hell.

1 JOHN: That's true.

2 KORESH: Seven seals.

3 JOHN: Probably some people have thought  
4 that, too.

5 KORESH: Oh, yeah. More so than the other  
6 way.

7 JOHN: You find that hard to believe, huh?

8 KORESH: Here I am trying to reveal Christ,  
9 trying to reveal the Seven Seals --

10 JOHN: Uh-huh.

11 KORESH: -- and they call me Antichrist.

12 JOHN: Uh-huh.

13 KORESH: -- what's the matter with you, you  
14 know? Here I am trying to show you the Seals. Then  
15 why are you playing rock and roll music. I don't play  
16 rock and roll music. I play my music. I don't call my  
17 music rock and roll music. I play music and it's  
18 compatible to today's reality of humanity.

19 Everything's fast, everything is let's go, everything  
20 is, you know, the world doesn't even know how to slow  
21 down right now and take a breath. Young kids --

22 JOHN: Oh, yeah, it does. It probably  
23 depends what part of the world you're in.

24 KORESH: Hey, I'm 33 years old and I got --

25 JOHN: You go from New York City or Los  
Angeles or San Francisco and it's flying and zipping

1 around and then you get into some other areas, some  
2 other cultures. It's very slow, very slow.

3 KORESH: Yeah, but I'm saying when it comes  
4 to --

5 JOHN: Waco. That's slow.

6 KORESH: Well, not really.

7 JOHN: Oh, yes, it is.

8 KORESH: Look. When you, when you, when you  
9 go, when you're making two bucks and two fifty and  
10 three fifty an hour and you're a kid in Waco, it goes  
11 fast. So you go out for fast fun, you know? There's  
12 things about the world, there's things about people.  
13 You know Waco has one of the lowest economies in the  
14 nation. You're familiar with that, aren't you? You've  
15 heard that, right?

16 JOHN: Um-hum.

17 KORESH: It's also one of the biggest drug  
18 places, believe it or not.

19 JOHN: I know. That's what somebody told me.  
20 I found that hard to believe.

21 KORESH: Yeah. Methamphetamine. Everywhere.  
22 You know, so I go and I, I go into these towns and  
23 stuff, you know, and I, I meet people right and left  
24 and I try to share the seals with them and all that,  
25 but the majority of young people today, you know,  
they'll look at it from the perspective, hey that's

1 cool, you know? But they're, they're a device.  
2 They've got, they've got that dummy they got to hold  
3 onto. They got that perspective sensation of, of well-  
4 being that's false.

5 JOHN: Yeah. Well, a lot of, lot of people  
6 experiment I guess. You know, you and I may have  
7 experimented in our, in our days and, and, and then  
8 realized what we were doing --

9 KORESH: You probably think I burned my mind  
10 out on something, huh?

11 JOHN: No, uh-uh.

12 KORESH: No, I mean -- let me tell you. I  
13 used to be very, very athletic, you know. I started  
14 working out at 11 years old. You know, very  
15 aerobically. By the time I was --

16 JOHN: -- to run track.

17 KORESH: Yeah, by the time I was 13 and 14 I  
18 was, you know, I was a superkid, you know? But the  
19 thing of it was is that you -- I found, I found such a  
20 complete well sense of being in physical activity that,  
21 you know, when the stages came of life to try to, to go  
22 into those things, it's just, it's just -- it's  
23 nothing. It's not worth it. And I find that's one of  
24 the problems with a lot of young people today is that  
25 they don't know the potentials of their own natural  
resources, you know. They don't, they don't learn how

1 to work when they're young. They don't learn how to  
2 get out and do physical work. They don't know, they  
3 don't know the good things a body can produce, you  
4 know, naturally. So they like to be confined and  
5 restricted.

6 JOHN: You didn't, you didn't send Rachel out  
7 looking for any of those other people, did you?

8 KORESH TO RACHEL: Rach --

9 JOHN: Don't worry about doing it.

10 KORESH: Sherry's right here by the door now.

11 JOHN: Oh, is she?

12 KORESH TO RACHEL: Can you get Sherry?

13 JOHN: Hey. Before you sign off with me --

14 KORESH: Yeah.

15 JOHN: -- and she gets Sherry, do you have  
16 any idea after Rita, if you have some other --

17 KORESH: Well, this is something we're going  
18 to resolve tomorrow.

19 JOHN: Okay.

20 KORESH: Like I said, you know --

21 JOHN: Well, you indicated that you had some  
22 other problems.

23 KORESH: There's a, there's a judicial system  
24 here too, you know? There's a --

25 JOHN: Okay.

KORESH: -- you know, people, like you say,

1 they have to, they have to look at -- man, I wish I  
2 could give you some real Bible studies.

3 JOHN: Well, I'm looking for -- I bet you do.  
4 I bet you do.

5 KORESH: -- some really open the book, let's  
6 take a look, let's compare, let's analyze, you know --

7 JOHN: Well, maybe you'll get a chance  
8 someday.

9 KORESH: Yeah, but I don't want to have to do  
10 it when you're standing before the Judgment Seat and  
11 what it says in Isaiah 28 --

12 JOHN: Why not?

13 KORESH: Well, it says at that time when He  
14 shall make you to understand doctrine.

15 JOHN: Well, well, maybe you -- we'll spend  
16 some time together when you leave there.

17 KORESH: -- and you'll be burning in it if  
18 that's the case coming.

19 JOHN: Maybe we'll spend a little time  
20 together when you lead the flock out of there.

21 KORESH: Lead the flock.

22 JOHN: Huh?

23 KORESH: Lead the flock.

24 JOHN: Your children. When you lead your  
25 children out of there.

KORESH: My children are, are, are carried by

1 their mothers.

2 JOHN: Well --

3 KORESH: Steve Schneider's not --

4 JOHN: I didn't say who they're being carried  
5 by. I said when you lead them out.

6 KORESH: Hey, have you ever seen any films of  
7 me acting like some kind of evangelical freak? You  
8 notice every film that you've seen of me or everything  
9 that they try to show on these TV programs are slowed  
10 down or sped up.

11 JOHN: Well, that's kind of dodging the  
12 question that I asked you. Whether --

13 KORESH: No, I was saying --

14 JOHN: -- or not you had any idea that after  
15 Rita comes out -- any idea whether we're talking a  
16 couple of people or what? That, that you perceive  
17 as --

18 KORESH: It's going to be quite a few.

19 JOHN: -- as a potential.

20 KORESH: Yeah. I'm telling you yes.

21 JOHN: Okay.

22 KORESH: Just watch.

23 JOHN: Now --

24 KORESH: -- fighting -- this is what'll  
25 happen, John. No, no kidding.

JOHN: Okay.

1           KORESH: This is serious. Right across the  
2 table. If I, if I start telling you, yeah, this person  
3 and this person and all of a sudden you're going to get  
4 on the command, you're going to say there's going to be  
5 three, four people coming out Saturday night and all of  
6 a sudden the Commission go all right. And all of a  
7 sudden that's not what we said.

8           JOHN: Okay.

9           KORESH: They get a miscommunication all the  
10 next day --

11          JOHN: Well, I'm not going to miscommunicate  
12 anything.

13          KORESH: -- next thing the tank is right up  
14 here in our door and guys are saying, I'm going to  
15 blast them and we're saying, no, don't -- you don't do  
16 that. You got to get your mind back in your head, you  
17 know. You're, you're, you're messing up worse again,  
18 you know.

19          JOHN: Um-hum.

20          KORESH: These people are -- they don't know  
21 where you're coming from so we have to take --

22          JOHN: Well, you know.

23          KORESH: You don't know.

24          JOHN: You know where I'm coming from.

25          KORESH: Yeah. Well, I'm saying but you  
don't know where I'm coming from.

1 JOHN: And I'm not telling anybody anything  
2 other than what you tell me. And if you tell me  
3 others, that's fine. That's others. Right?

4 KORESH: That'll work. That'll keep the --

5 JOHN: And, and that's the way it is.

6 KORESH: That'll keep enough slack in the  
7 rope so no one gets their neck busted.

8 JOHN: You got it. And, and do me, do me  
9 another favor. If anybody is going to be going out of  
10 there, which I -- Steve's been pretty good about it.  
11 He's called if somebody wanted to go out and feed  
12 chickens or somebody wanted to go out and do something,  
13 but please be sure that he does call and, and lets,  
14 lets me know if some -- or whoever's on the end of the  
15 phone, if somebody intends to come out of there before  
16 they go bouncing around out there.

17 KORESH: Yeah. Well, that -- you know --

18 JOHN: Because I, I don't want any  
19 difficulties no more that you do.

20 KORESH: Right. See, what happened was is  
21 that when that started raining, they just stepped out  
22 in the little court section --

23 JOHN: Oh, I know, I know.

24 KORESH: -- part of the building there.

25 JOHN: Hey, I don't have a problem with that  
and the people that are on the end of this phone don't

1 | have a problem with that, but you have some people up  
2 | there that have a problem with it, so --

3 |           KORESH: Don't you know.

4 |           JOHN: -- one phone call could have  
5 | alleviated it all. You know what I mean?

6 |           KORESH: Yeah, well, it -- you know, I think  
7 | -- what happened?

8 |           KORESH TO RACHEL: We -- did we call or did  
9 | they call us, Rach?

10 |           JOHN: Well, probably somebody called from  
11 | here to there in a panic.

12 |           KORESH: In a panic.

13 |           JOHN: Well, wait, wait --

14 |           JOHN: The guy's got a bucket, the guy's got  
15 | a bucket. He's catching water.

16 |           JOHN: What can I tell you.

17 |           KORESH: He's going to melt us. He's going  
18 | to pour it on us, we're going to melt.

19 |           JOHN: Some things are more important to some  
20 | people than others.

21 |           KORESH: Yeah. Well, I understand it. Like  
22 | I say, they -- just like when Steve was talking up  
23 | there with the, with the other John.

24 |           JOHN: Yeah.

25 |           KORESH: -- you know.

          JOHN: Yeah.

1           KORESH: And Steve, Steve smiled to the two  
2 guys there that had the, the guns, and the -- finally  
3 one guy finally smiled because Steve says, well, we're  
4 -- we know that you're going to be here protecting us,  
5 you know, through the night. But the other guy kept  
6 his frown all the way through and I says, well, that's  
7 that Jim. He's got to look that Marine tough, you  
8 know.

9           JOHN: Yeah.

10          KORESH: He just -- he doesn't understand.

11          JOHN: Hey, fellow just takes his job  
12 seriously, huh?

13          KORESH: Yeah.

14          JOHN: We all do and you do. You know, it's  
15 just some of us can try and communicate in different  
16 methods. Listen, if you can't, if you can't kick Steve  
17 around someplace to get him to the phone and Sherry's  
18 around, I'll, I'll pass on the message that her mother  
19 had for her if you want me to.

20          KORESH: Okay.

21          KORESH TO RACHEL: Rachel, can you see, can  
22 you see --

23          JOHN: She's not there anymore?

24          KORESH TO RACHEL: Rachel, please look out  
25 the door and just -- and, and ask her because it's a  
message from her mom.

1 JOHN: Hey, if she's asleep or something we  
2 can talk to her tomorrow.

3 KORESH TO RACHEL: All right. Just -- is she  
4 asleep.

5 JOHN: I hate to see Steve going to bed so  
6 early though.

7 KORESH TO RACHEL: Where is Steve, Rach?

8 JOHN: I'm just pulling your leg.

9 KORESH FOR RACHEL: How about for Scott?  
10 Scott's not asleep. Now, go get Scott.

11 KORESH: Scott will be here. You got a  
12 message for him, right?

13 JOHN: Yep. Just got to find the right one.  
14 You sure he's up?

15 KORESH: Yeah.

16 JOHN: Okay.

17 KORESH: He's just stepping down the hallway  
18 there to -- I tell you this -- these, these things and  
19 they weep. Just like -- it's just like they just --  
20 still this fluid, you know, leaking down you.

21 JOHN: Hey --

22 KORESH: Supposed to be a good sign.

23 JOHN: I hope it is. I hope it is.

24 KORESH: Makes you wonder about beef jerky,  
25 you know, when you eat beef jerky? And you look at,  
you look at yourself when you got a big old scab on

1 | you. It looks just like beef jerky.

2 |           JOHN: Make you stop eating beef jerky,

3 | wouldn't it?

4 |           KORESH: Makes you wonder about it.

5 |           JOHN: Well, every -- everybody hit the hay?

6 |           KORESH: No, she -- he'll be back in a

7 | second.

8 |           JOHN: Okay. I don't want somebody stumbling

9 | around in there and getting hurt.

10 |           KORESH: No.

11 |           JOHN: How are the little ones doing? Okay?

12 |           KORESH: Oh, yeah.

13 |           JOHN: Good. Hey, we'll talk to somebody

14 | about that other, that other matter. See if there's

15 | something we can do. Can't make you any promises, but

16 | all I can say is we can make a pitch.

17 |           KORESH: The mommas -- you know, the mommas

18 | they -- you know, you know how it is when, you know,

19 | with, with natural stuff, you know, when they get under

20 | stress and all that they lose their milk.

21 |           JOHN: Yep.

22 |           KORESH TO RACHEL: You don't know where he's

23 | at?

24 |           KORESH: I'll have, I'll have him call you.

25 |           JOHN: Don't worry about it. Don't worry

about it. I mean I'll be here, but --

1                   KORESH: What are you going to do? Sit  
2 around and drink coffee or what?

3                   JOHN: I can tell you -- oh, I'm going to do  
4 or what first.

5                   KORESH: What's or what? Okay, I got it.  
6 Okay. Go ahead and do -- go do your or what and --

7                   JOHN: Hey, if you find him fine but, you  
8 know, have him, have him wait about 15 minutes anyhow.  
9 Okay?

10                  KORESH: Okey doke.

11                  JOHN: We'll talk to you tomorrow? You're,  
12 you're going to get a good night's sleep?

13                  KORESH: Yeah. Well, like I say it's -- this  
14 is the time that, you know, I, I try to work things out  
15 for everybody.

16                  JOHN: Hey. It's your Sabbath. Work hard at  
17 it.

18                  KORESH: Shabbat.

19                  JOHN: Work hard at it.

20                  KORESH: You know what the original Sabbath  
21 was all about, don't you?

22                  JOHN: The what?

23                  KORESH: The original Sabbath was all about?

24                  JOHN: It was a day of prayer.

25                  KORESH: No. It was a day of making love.

                  JOHN: Oh, really?

1 KORESH: Shabbat.

2 JOHN: You mean I'm cutting into your time?

3 KORESH: Abba -- no, no.

4 JOHN: Okay.

5 KORESH: I'm a wounded man.

6 JOHN: Gee, I'm sorry to hear about that.

7 KORESH: It's all right. It's not -- it's --  
8 like I say, if you really knew me as a person, I'm not  
9 half as wild as they make me out to be, but the thing  
10 of it is is the day is the glory of God. That's why  
11 it's a memorial of God. It's the day that God  
12 completed his work and it was all done for -- mankind,  
13 that they might be one, male and female. God's image.  
14 And that's why when the, when the Papacy changes  
15 Sabbath it makes God mad. You know, it makes Him mad.  
16 But that's what they do.

17 JOHN: Yeah.

18 KORESH: What can you do? You have to deal

5 (Telephone ringing -- 4 rings.)

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: This could be a  
7 good sign. Major meeting -- they're going to have to  
8 day.

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Hello.

10 JOHN: Good morning.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Good morning.

12 JOHN: How are you doing?

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Not too bad.

14 JOHN: Great. Sleep okay.

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. How, how about  
16 yourself.

17 JOHN: Great, great, great.

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So now where are we at this  
19 morning?

20 JOHN: Well, I want to tell you what I did  
21 last night.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

23 JOHN: I went down to see Kevin.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Great.

25 JOHN: He's a very polite gentleman. Very,

10 | the sense of Kevin's condition. Kevin was taken to the  
11 | hospital. He's got bad varicose veins and possibly  
12 | blood poisoning. So --

13 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Really?

14 |           JOHN: Yes. So he's in the, in the hospital  
15 | today as we speak.

16 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

17 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON:  
18 | Kevin's in the hospital right now -- bad varicose veins  
19 | and blood poisoning.

20 |           JOHN: Okay. Now, he looked -- yeah, yeah.  
21 | So we were, you know, the Sheriff's Department was very  
22 | concerned about him and they, they got him to the  
23 | hospital right away after they spoke to him --

24 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

25 |           JOHN: -- or, or within, you know, within a  
short time thereafter. So he's in the hospital being

1 | treated, but it is, it is a very good thing that, that  
2 | he came out and got down to the hospital for treatment,  
3 | because they said it was -- so --

4 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. Well, what do you  
5 | make of that? I mean the blood poisoning?

6 |           JOHN: I'm not really sure about the blood  
7 | poisoning.

8 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: He never mentioned  
9 | anything --

10 |           JOHN: No, not 100 percent, but they said the  
11 | varicose veins were very, very, very bad.

12 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: I thought they were bad,  
13 | for sure.

14 |           JOHN: Yeah, yeah.

15 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: He had complained about  
16 | that for --

17 |           JOHN: I'll double check exactly on the  
18 | condition from, from the Sheriff's Department --

19 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

20 |           JOHN: -- through the hospital and we'll find  
21 | out. I'm not 100 percent sure on the blood poisoning,  
22 | but definitely they felt that the condition was severe  
23 | enough to bring him to the hospital so they did that.

24 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

25 |           JOHN: But, but I spoke to him and, and I  
mean he looked fine. You know, in the sense of his

1 | face as far as like he didn't appear to be in pain.  
2 | But apparently when, I guess, the doctor looked at his  
3 | legs or whatever they said we got to get him into the  
4 | hospital. So that's where he is.

5 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I've never had -- I think I  
6 | had seen his legs once and I'd never seen anything so  
7 | bad in my life.

8 |                 JOHN: Exactly. So that's the way the  
9 | physician felt too. And they just said, hey, let's get  
10 | him to the hospital, make sure that he's treated well  
11 | and that's what they're doing today.

12 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I see.

13 |                 JOHN: So, I'm, I'm -- it's really kind of a  
14 | very, very good thing that he, he came out.

15 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

16 |                 JOHN: Yeah. Yeah.

17 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

18 |                 JOHN: How's David doing?

19 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: He's doing okay.

20 |                 JOHN: Good. Is he up and about?

21 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, he's -- not since that  
22 | one day that he came down and spoke with Byron.

23 |                 JOHN: Um-hum. So he's, he's still taking it  
24 | kind of easy as far as moving around.

25 |                 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. I, I believe he  
started bleeding that -- when he had done that. You

1 | know, he had -- he's been in bed for a long time, but I  
2 | think he wanted to see what kind of strength he might  
3 | have, but right away the bleeding started again.

4 |           JOHN: When, when was that?

5 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: That was -- I think it was  
6 | about maybe Wednesday? I think it was Wednesday.

7 |           JOHN: From the exit wound, huh?

8 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yes.

9 |           JOHN: Yeah. That takes a lot of strength,  
10 | you know. You just -- you lose blood and you don't  
11 | make it, make it as fast back as fast as you lose it,  
12 | you know.

13 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. Exactly.

14 |           JOHN: So, yeah -- how's everybody in there?

15 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: So far pretty good.

16 |           JOHN: Good.

17 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

18 |           JOHN: Good, good. Very good.

19 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: And -- so, what -- I  
20 | wasn't, you know, really clear as to the details of  
21 | what was going to happen today. David was going to  
22 | open up Micah to the guys or -- and I, I -- at what  
23 | time, I wasn't certain?

24 |           JOHN: Okay. Well, did -- does -- you have  
25 | any idea or anything as far as talking to him yet --  
   | last night?

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Just a minute. Let, let me  
2 try to find out. Hang on.

3 JOHN: Sure.

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. I, I was just kind  
5 of mentioning something to David and he says let's wait  
6 and see what the development is.

7 JOHN: How do you mean now?

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I, I think what he means  
9 later in the day, maybe?

10 JOHN: Oh, sure. Sure.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

12 JOHN: That's fine.

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Meaning -- yeah, I think  
14 he's pretty worn out.

15 JOHN: Okay. Would you do me a favor and --

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Sure.

17 JOHN: -- just pass a message to him, even  
18 though he's not feeling well. I went into, I went into  
19 see the boss this morning.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

21 JOHN: And things are going so well I felt  
22 that well, hey, I wanted to do something on my own, you  
23 know, without being asked.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

25 JOHN: And I, I just went in and I said look,  
I said today is the Sabbath and I want to ask a favor

1 and he said, what's that. And then I told him what I  
2 want and he said, okay. He said, look, you, you -- he  
3 said, you guys have something going, he said, I  
4 appreciate that, and he said -- my request for him, to  
5 be quite candid with you, was that there would be no  
6 loudspeakers whatsoever on the Sabbath.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That would be great.

8 JOHN: And he said that he agreed to that.  
9 So if you'll pass that along to David --

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

11 JOHN: --- that I got that done this morning.

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So David will probably want  
13 to communicate, you know, in a little while when he  
14 regains some strength.

15 JOHN: Sure. That's fine.

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

17 JOHN: And we'll, we'll set that up. It's  
18 pretty much ready to be done when he's feeling better.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. And that, that will  
20 be, you know, in a while.

21 JOHN: Okay. Okay.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So I'll stay in touch with  
23 you then.

24 JOHN: Yeah, yeah. Great. How's  
25 everything --

STEVE SCHNEIDER: It sound, sounds good then.

1 JOHN: Okay.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Sounds real good.

3 JOHN: Great.

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'll probably be giving you  
5 a call in a little while just to touch base --

6 JOHN: All right. Yeah. Would you hold on  
7 one second?

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Sure.

9 JOHN: Okay. One of, one of the guys in here  
10 who's trying to set up the connection -- they do  
11 basically what's called a phone patch.

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

13 JOHN: And as a matter of fact, the phone  
14 just rang. That's probably about the phone patch right  
15 now. You probably heard the bell.

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Right.

17 JOHN: But that's -- we have an extra phone  
18 in this room so we can do the phone patch with, with  
19 Brad. So do you have any idea when he's going to be  
20 available to, to --

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I think it'll be a little  
22 while yet, because I, I know he's not -- he seems --

23 JOHN: Not feeling too good.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, exactly.

25 JOHN: Yeah. Maybe an hour or so? Somewhere  
-- hour or two.

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Probably, probably a lot --  
2 a little longer than that.

3 JOHN: Okay. Early --

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I think that he never was  
5 able to really sleep through the night or anything.

6 JOHN: Oh, sure. That's fine. And then --

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Two hours --

8 JOHN: Yeah, that's absolutely fine. But  
9 just understand it's going to take a little bit of lead  
10 time.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. I'll -- sure.  
12 That's not a problem.

13 JOHN: Okay, great. Good, good. Well, I'll  
14 be talking to you later then.

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. I'll, I'll call you  
16 in a while.

17 JOHN: Good. Thanks, Steve.

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Thank you.

19 JOHN: Bye-bye.

20 Connection broken.)

21 \* \* \* \* \*

22 (Telephone being dialed.)

23 (Telephone ringing -- 2 rings.)

24 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Hello.

25 JOHN: Hello. Is Steve or David there?

UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Yes. Just a

1 minute.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Hello.

3 JOHN: Steve.

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

5 JOHN: John. How you doing?

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. I'm kind of waiting  
7 on David yet. I kind of --

8 JOHN: Okay.

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I knocked at the door  
10 there. Apparently he's still out.

11 JOHN: Okay.

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I wanted to get something  
13 going here soon myself.

14 JOHN: Yeah, yeah. I wanted to get something  
15 going too.

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. How is, how is, how  
17 is Kevin doing?

18 JOHN: Oh, I got that -- in fact it's -- I  
19 tell you, we must think along the same lines. I just  
20 checked with the downtown and he's back. He's back and  
21 it's -- he's been treated and he's out of the hospital  
22 so it's a good sign. So it's not blood poisoning.

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: It wasn't, huh?

24 JOHN: No. No. They wouldn't have let him  
25 go. But anyway --

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

1 JOHN: -- he's been treated and as far as I  
2 know, he's feeling better, so that's very good.

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

4 JOHN: Good. So that's basically what I  
5 called --

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I've, I've got some  
7 questions. In coming out, even like myself, you know.  
8 I'm trying to get a lot of these people going first --

9 JOHN: Yes.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- but what -- so you --  
11 ultimately you go into a county jail, is that it?

12 JOHN: Yeah. Let me run it by you --

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

14 JOHN: -- basically how it works. You just  
15 walk down the driveway like everybody else. Like Greg  
16 does when he picks up the, you know, makes the pickups.

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

18 JOHN: And down at the end of the driveway we  
19 have the Bradley vehicle that the kids were in that  
20 bounced all around, you know --

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

22 JOHN: -- that they were saying bouncing?  
23 That's the toughest part of that ride is the bouncing  
24 around. Then it goes down further to an area -- I  
25 guess it's about a half a mile or three-quarters of a  
mile in distance and then get out of the, the Bradley

1 | vehicle and into the van or like a four-wheel drive  
2 | vehicle. And they have vans and they have like a Jeep  
3 | Cherokee. Last night Kevin I think was in a red one.

4 |           In any case, they rode down in a Jeep  
5 | Cherokee and then they went down to the Sheriff's  
6 | Department and the sheriff came out himself, and in  
7 | fact Kevin can tell you this, the sheriff personally,  
8 | Jack Harwell came out, introduced himself. And they  
9 | have like a little -- it's a nice size room with chairs  
10 | and tables and we, we got everybody Dr. Peppers and  
11 | whatever they wanted to drink and so on and they, they  
12 | talked to them for a while and it's basically that  
13 | simple.

14 |           And I was down personally to meet Kevin. We  
15 | had a little chat and that was basically how the whole  
16 | process went.

17 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: I know, but then where did  
18 | they go? Did they go into a cell or something?

19 |           JOHN: Oh, they'll be in the, in the -- at  
20 | the -- that particular location is a -- it's a kind of  
21 | a cell. Yeah, it is a cell as a matter of fact. It  
22 | has -- the one that Kathy was in had TV, showers,  
23 | bathroom, and so on. It's at the Sheriff's facility  
24 | and it had -- she had complete access to a telephone.  
25 | She could call --

          STEVE SCHNEIDER: But say, say all these

1 | people come out at one time. What, what happens  
2 | with --

3 |           JOHN: Oh, okay, yeah. When the people come  
4 | out at all one time, the way we're going to work it is  
5 | we're going to have buses down there and they'll  
6 | actually just board the buses and like, you know,  
7 | that'll be it.

8 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, but I mean what happens  
9 | to all the people then. I mean, when it comes to jail  
10 | cells, a room, all that kind of business.

11 |           JOHN: Yeah. They're basically -- that's a  
12 | municipal jail. It's not like a country jail. You  
13 | know what I mean? It's a new facility.

14 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: I -- yeah, I mean, I don't  
15 | know anything about it.

16 |           JOHN: Yeah. But I mean it's not like one of  
17 | the old time, old time places where you only see three  
18 | little rooms. It has a, it has a whole, you know,  
19 | whole area of, of cells where they've got televisions,  
20 | access to phones, and so on. As far as large groups,  
21 | the large groups will stay together and be processed  
22 | together at a hangar right where I'm standing, right  
23 | downstairs.

24 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

25 |           JOHN: So that everybody will be together.  
And so they'll all --

1                   STEVE SCHNEIDER: See, ultimately, I mean, it  
2 would seem like to us like well, I don't know, I guess  
3 -- so, one -- when one goes into a place like that,  
4 then, when it comes to clothes, I, I guess they take  
5 your clothes from you or something like that and issue  
6 you something else?

7                   JOHN: Yeah. Actually they're going to give  
8 you like a -- I haven't seen the one that they use, but  
9 it's like a jumpsuit thing, a clear suit down here is,  
10 is what the fellows tell me. Clean and like a jumpsuit  
11 thing as I understand, then they return your clothes to  
12 you later, is my understanding.

13                   STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

14                   JOHN: And when they clean --

15                   STEVE SCHNEIDER: What do you do --

16                   JOHN: Oh, okay. He said -- I misread his  
17 note. My, my -- losing my eyesight here. He didn't  
18 write clear. It's clean. They clean the clothes and  
19 the clothes they return to you are clean and laundered.  
20 So, but you get those -- those eventually will be  
21 returned to you.

22                   STEVE SCHNEIDER: What about now if one is  
23 charged with something and you end up going to court or  
24 whatever --

25                   JOHN: Okay. Yeah, let me go through the  
rest, let me go through the rest --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Do you bring a suit  
2 along. There's -- I've got a lot of clothes here, so.

3 JOHN: Yeah. I think -- that's a very good  
4 idea. I want you to do that. I want you to bring a  
5 suit and do you have a tie or shirt or --

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Sure, sure.

7 JOHN: Yeah. Tuck the tie in one of the  
8 pockets and -- of the suit, a matching tie and a shirt,  
9 and bring that along or you're welcome to wear it, but  
10 I would bring it along. Do you have like a sack, one  
11 of these paper sacks or, or a -- yeah. And also you  
12 can, if you don't want to, you know, you -- the  
13 attorneys can get that for you later. Either way you  
14 want to do it, it's not a big problem.

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

16 JOHN: But, let me just run the rest of it.  
17 Then what would happen is the following day you would  
18 appear before a United States Magistrate and he, you  
19 know, says, you know, who you are and so on and you say  
20 yes, I'm that person.

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

22 JOHN: And then he tells you okay, you're,  
23 you're held on whatever it is. In this case is I think  
24 everybody was material witnesses and you would be held  
25 on a material witness and then he would set the bond  
and then --

1           STEVE SCHNEIDER: You say a bond. An amount  
2 that your -- that might be against you or something?

3           JOHN: Okay. In other words, yeah. That's,  
4 that's up to, that's up to him. In other words, when  
5 you appear before him he'll, you know, say who you are  
6 and you say yes, I'm --

7           STEVE SCHNEIDER: So, do you, do you find out  
8 about any charges at that time or --

9           JOHN: Yes, yes. Oh, yes. Abs -- yes,  
10 Steve, abso --

11           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Do you have any more later?

12           JOHN: No. Absolutely. He'll tell you  
13 exactly what it is, which in this case will be material  
14 witness. Okay. He'll say you're, you are a material  
15 witness in this case and then your attorney will say,  
16 Your Honor, this person has been very cooperative in  
17 helping the agents of the FBI and, you know, I think  
18 he's, he's contributed successfully to successful  
19 resolution and he'll, he'll make kind of like a -- they  
20 call it an argument, but it's actually like a  
21 presentation.

22                   And this man has a wife and a child and he's,  
23 he's been extremely helpful and so, and then the  
24 Magistrate will take that into consideration and then,  
25 in setting the bond, and then he'll set the bond, the  
attorney arranges for the posting of the bond, post the

1 | bond, and then they are -- do -- have what they call  
2 | travel restrictions. So he might say, okay, you can  
3 | only go between Hawaii and Waco, Texas, in your case  
4 | maybe or Hawaii, Texas, and maybe California, depending  
5 | on where you want to go.

6 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Probably wouldn't even much  
7 | matter to me.

8 |           JOHN: Well, yeah, but the attorney will  
9 | advise you and assist you, so --

10 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, okay.

11 |           JOHN: -- that's basically how it goes. It's  
12 | relative, you know, people look at the outside process  
13 | and think that it's extremely complex, but it's really  
14 | relatively simple and it goes very well.

15 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

16 |           JOHN: And, of course, he will -- of course  
17 | your counsel's going to be there and he's going to  
18 | afford you the counsel right away.

19 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, what about a counsel  
20 | -- like, say, an attorney. Now, I heard my sister  
21 | retained one. What if I'm not happy or I --

22 |           JOHN: That's what -- she -- oh, yeah, yeah.  
23 | She's hired one for you, okay? And he's already been  
24 | retained.

25 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

          JOHN: And I think you got that letter in

1 | there.

2 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

3 |           JOHN: Now, he's going to be down there for  
4 | what's called the initial appearance. Now, let's say  
5 | that for the sake of argument you don't like this guy.  
6 | Say that you and he don't hit it off or you don't like  
7 | him or you feel that you could do better. You know,  
8 | any one of a million reasons now.

9 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right, okay.

10 |           JOHN: And I, I'm not referring to your man  
11 | specifically.

12 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right, right.

13 |           JOHN: I'm just taking a hypothetical case.

14 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Exactly.

15 |           JOHN: Okay. So then you say, I would -- it  
16 | was very nice meeting you and so on, but I, you know, I  
17 | appreciate your assistance, but I would rather have  
18 | another attorney. So if you don't mind -- then you  
19 | just, you know, contact your sister, whoever, and get  
20 | another attorney. So you're not in a sense tied  
21 | through the whole system to this one man or one woman  
22 | -- this one attorney.

23 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

24 |           JOHN: You can go through -- once you just  
25 | get your initial appearance, you can say, you know, I,  
I'd prefer to have Mr. X instead of Mr. Y. The judge,

1 the United States Magistrate, will say, oh, that's  
2 fine. You know, they're, they're very, very --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: John, would you know if --  
4 my, my sister's name, her name is Sue Johnson.

5 JOHN: Yes.

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Would you know, did she  
7 stay -- I know that Tibido's (phonetic sp.) mother  
8 stayed in the vicinity. Still is in the Waco area from  
9 what I understand. Was she ever down here or is she  
10 still down here?

11 JOHN: That's a good question. I will check  
12 on that. We've got a folder on that. I do, I do  
13 remember seeing that letter from, you know, your  
14 attorney that we sent in.

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, right.

16 JOHN: That, that Sue had hired. That one of  
17 the fellows -- I've sent one of the fellows to check on  
18 that now and he's going to check on that.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

20 JOHN: You know, so, yeah. You're not tied  
21 to one particular attorney. Okay. Would you like to  
22 have her down here?

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, I don't know right at  
24 the moment.

25 JOHN: Okay.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Not necessarily.

1 JOHN: Sure.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Just -- I was just thinking  
3 in regards to the legal --

4 JOHN: Yeah.

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- aspects. Like, say,  
6 what attorney and how she came by him. How does -- I  
7 mean, who is he. I mean, you know, I mean, I'm just  
8 curious as to why she chose someone from Houston.

9 JOHN: Yeah. I was going -- what, what might  
10 be a good idea is you might, when you get out and get  
11 down to that phone, give her a call and say, look,  
12 because, you know, we're going to make sure you have a  
13 phone there --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So we actually, John, can  
15 call anywhere in, in the, the world collect or  
16 whatever?

17 JOHN: Okay. The only condition on it is  
18 this. It must be collect. You can't expect the  
19 Sheriff's Department to --

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, I --

21 JOHN: -- for calls to pay to Hawaii.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. So it's all right to  
23 call anybody?

24 JOHN: Yeah.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So -- wow, that's --

JOHN: Anybody you want. The only condition

1 is that it must not be charged to the Sheriff's --

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

3 JOHN: Right.

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: What about now me walking  
5 in with money. I'm sure they take ev -- all your  
6 valuables, watches, everything and hold it for you.

7 JOHN: Yes, that's correct. And it's put in  
8 an envelope and it's signed for and you're issued a  
9 receipt for it.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: What if you need to make  
11 payments or anything like that? How would that ever  
12 work from -- if one was waiting --

13 JOHN: Yeah.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- inside for even a day or  
15 two --

16 JOHN: Oh, sure. Your attorney would handle  
17 that. Just go down and --

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I see.

19 JOHN: -- and request that you get that --  
20 no, I -- Sue Johnson is not in town, but she asked her  
21 -- she asked the agent to call -- the agent's a woman,  
22 she asked the agent to call her if, if you needed  
23 anything.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I see.

25 JOHN: So, I just had that checked for you.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Any particular agent

1 | or --

2 |           JOHN: No, no. She just can call in here,  
3 | we'll put her right through to command post.

4 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: So, once this starts coming  
5 | to an end and we're all out and so what part are you  
6 | going to play -- how long will you be around still  
7 | yourself?

8 |           JOHN: As long as it is necessary. I,  
9 | particularly, am going to come down to see you. So --

10 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, I hope so.

11 |           JOHN: --- probably as far as time schedule,  
12 | we're -- what, what they're looking at for me -- we  
13 | have what they call a rotation system.

14 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

15 |           JOHN: I don't know if you heard that on the  
16 | press conference. So, my, my time is growing short,  
17 | but we're on the rotational system. I think you heard  
18 | that --

19 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Would they bring you back  
20 | if we request it though?

21 |           JOHN: I don't think so at this point, but  
22 | how long you talking about roughly?

23 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: I don't know, because you  
24 | know like I've said, personally, you know, I have been  
25 | anxious from the beginning.

          JOHN: I know that.

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That's just the way I am.

2 JOHN: I know that.

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: But I -- you know, you feel  
4 like you have a responsibility for all these other  
5 people that don't see it clearly and you want to make  
6 sure everybody -- because, you know, in honesty they  
7 came here in, in a sense to learn the Bible like  
8 myself. The only desire I've ever had in the last 10  
9 years of my life, 20 years, has been to know for sure  
10 what there is and what opportunity there is to live  
11 eternally, if it, if it's possible, you know. So, I  
12 mean, that's why I came here and I realize that is  
13 their only motive and reason also, so to just abandon  
14 people that, you know, have a harder time expressing  
15 themselves or communicating -- that's why I just felt,  
16 you know, very responsible, so.

17 JOHN: Yeah. They --

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: But, but, you know, if I, I  
19 -- there were many times I asked them all if I went out  
20 would you want to, well, they didn't. So, you know,  
21 that's why I kept on saying I don't, you know, I, I  
22 been trying to tell the guys down there that I don't  
23 have the kind of influence that they think I do. I  
24 don't. I mean, they've come here to hear David,  
25 they're -- that's why they've stayed as long as they  
have is because they have heard something they believe

1 in. So, you know, that's basically what it is.

2 JOHN: Yeah. I would like to see you come  
3 out yourself, Steve. You, personally, Steve, come out.

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

5 JOHN: And I'm very serious, because of a  
6 certain personal feeling and that's just something that  
7 develops over time. I can't --

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, from the  
9 beginning --

10 JOHN: I can't help that.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I, I think I have showed  
12 or told that I've wanted to and that's the truth. You  
13 know, if it, if it were just me, if I only had to  
14 answer for myself --

15 JOHN: Yeah.

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- but I do feel  
17 responsible for these people.

18 JOHN: Yeah. And I, and I will meet you.  
19 And I will -- I'd like to meet you and I will meet you,  
20 you know, assuming it's --

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Like, you know, like the  
22 older lady that came out. Her name was Margaret  
23 Lawson.

24 JOHN: Right.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: You know, her and I were  
very -- we were friends in Hawaii and there -- and even

1 | how we got to be friends over there was because we  
2 | heard about David, that he was opening up the Bible.  
3 | So, ultimately we both moved -- left our homes in  
4 | Hawaii, came to see him and hear what he had to show  
5 | and so forth and that's why like herself and others --  
6 | there are still other people here that are from Hawaii.  
7 | Very good friends of mine from long time ago, of  
8 | course.

9 |           JOHN: Yeah. Yeah.

10 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: So, until I can make sure  
11 | that they're moving out okay and they're safe, you  
12 | know, I, you know, I -- that's why, you know, I would  
13 | like to just, you know, get this thing going and be  
14 | done with it, so.

15 |           JOHN: Yeah. We all would and I personally  
16 | would and I will meet you personally, as I said, as  
17 | long as I'm within --

18 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Great.

19 |           JOHN: -- my rotation, which is just a, just  
20 | a, just a very short time left.

21 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, maybe, maybe I can  
22 | request anyway -- maybe somehow they'd work it out.

23 |           JOHN: Well, if it's too long, see, they'd  
24 | incur -- what happens is they incur my travel expenses  
25 | back and they incur --

          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh, I see, I see. So,

1 | actually when, when your time comes to an end here,  
2 | then you go back home --

3 |           JOHN: You're rotated out -- what they call  
4 | rotation.

5 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: I see.

6 |           JOHN: Yeah. So, hopefully we can -- you and  
7 | I can get this resolved, you know, as soon as possible,  
8 | you know. The sooner --

9 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, how long are you  
10 | going to be around --

11 |           JOHN: -- the sooner the better. I've got to  
12 | check my rotational. It's posted in the -- but I think  
13 | what one of the guys said here, we're looking at like a  
14 | day or two, you know, real soon.

15 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, right.

16 |           JOHN: So, that's why I, I do personally,  
17 | Steve, want you to come out.

18 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Where, where was your home  
19 | again?

20 |           JOHN: California -- Southern California.

21 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Really?

22 |           JOHN: Yeah.

23 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Southern Cal -- wow.  
24 | That's where I've been living. Actually --

25 |           JOHN: Where, where?

          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, I was in -- well, you

1 know, you -- now it'd be the infamous Laverne  
2 property --

3 JOHN: Oh, Laverne, yeah. Up near Pomona.

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

5 JOHN: Sure. Pomona -- yeah, Harvey Mudd  
6 College?

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah.

8 JOHN: Yeah.

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh, for sure.

10 JOHN: Sure.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: You mean, you're in that  
12 area yourself?

13 JOHN: I know the area well.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Wow!

15 JOHN: Yeah, yeah. I know the area well.  
16 What -- I'm trying to think in that, that motel over  
17 there. It's kind of the old --

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh, the Griswold?

19 JOHN: Griswold's, Griswold's, Griswold's.  
20 Yeah, yeah, yeah.

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Griswold's. I've been  
22 there a lot of times.

23 JOHN: Yeah, they got that, that little gift  
24 shop --

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Exactly.

JOHN: -- and that bakery in the front, and

1 | the restaurant's in the back.

2 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

3 |           JOHN: I've been in there. Yeah.

4 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Interesting. That's not  
5 | far from me at all. You're only talking a couple miles  
6 | at the, at the most.

7 |           JOHN: Oh, sure. I know the place well.  
8 | Yeah. And then, of course, Pomona College and the --

9 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. See, that's where  
10 | I've spent almost all --

11 |           JOHN: -- Yeah.

12 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: See, coming from Hawaii,  
13 | that's where the majority of my time has been spent. I  
14 | come out here -- the longest I've been here was about a  
15 | year ago. I came out here for a while, but even  
16 | recently I've been traveling back and forth, but --

17 |           JOHN: Yeah. Steve, we want to get this  
18 | resolved. I want you --

19 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. No, I understand. I  
20 | know, I know.

21 |           JOHN: -- to get this resolved for --

22 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Just like myself.

23 |           JOHN: Yeah, yes. So, hey --

24 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: I mean, I'm try -- believe  
25 | me. That's why I was so glad when finally that, that  
-- the guys came around, your bosses, and said, you

1 know, dropped that off. It made a lot of difference.

2 That's what I've been asking for since the beginning.

3 JOHN: I know that.

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Just to show the good will  
5 and the magazines were no big deal. I mean, if they  
6 have a press conference and they wanted to know what  
7 the reaction was, I was right there with David. It --  
8 that story, he knew that long ago.

9 JOHN: Yeah.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: You know, we, we -- like  
11 what's his name, the ATF agent Robert Gonzalez.

12 JOHN: Yeah.

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: He brought over Sunday's  
14 paper that morning even and we all looked at it, so he,  
15 he saw the reaction. I mean -- and, and it was the  
16 same kind of material in those magazines of course as  
17 from that newspaper so --

18 JOHN: Sure.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- it was not a big deal.

20 JOHN: Yeah. Did I, you know, the thought  
21 occurred to me. Did I answer all the thoughts that you  
22 had --

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: In regards to the procedure  
24 and all that?

25 JOHN: Yeah, about -- because I know it so  
well sometimes I --

1                   STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'll probably, I'll  
2 probably have more, but you know, it's -- I know one  
3 becomes -- when you come out of here, I'm sure you  
4 become a number and just basically --

5                   JOHN: No, I don't think that's going to be  
6 true at all. In fact, I know it's (sic) going to be  
7 true and I know it's not going to be true for you.

8                   STEVE SCHNEIDER: One sees themselves, you  
9 know, somehow or other I, I'm sure that the ATF want  
10 blood. I mean, this is my feeling about that.

11                  JOHN: No.

12                  STEVE SCHNEIDER: I can see a number of  
13 individuals languishing away in prison.

14                  JOHN: No, no. That's can -- well, that  
15 can't happen because of the legal system. Everybody's  
16 going to have an attorney. If they don't have a  
17 personal attorney --

18                  STEVE SCHNEIDER: I know, but say a person is  
19 convicted of some, something -- I don't know what, but  
20 they end up in prison. Tell me, also, with -- do you  
21 know anything -- I mean, I heard there's a difference  
22 with crimes, with state, and with federal --

23                  JOHN: Sure.

24                  STEVE SCHNEIDER: I mean, with what possibly  
25 might happen here, apparently that would be something  
to do with the federal then.

1 JOHN: Yeah, that's --

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Instead of the agents.

3 JOHN: Right. It would be probably the  
4 federal system and, you know, it's going to be  
5 different -- I'm sure there'll be different, different  
6 ranges, but by the same token, you know, you got to  
7 stop and look at individual cases and --

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

9 JOHN: -- not everybody's going to be charged  
10 in this. Don't forget that, you know.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

12 JOHN: And, and I got to be honest, you know.  
13 In your particular case, I think you've contributed to,  
14 to people inside being released or, or at least  
15 convincing them that perhaps it would be in their own  
16 benefit to go and I think that's a very positive thing  
17 you've done. I mean, you know, let's face it. It's  
18 positive.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, in honesty I don't  
20 see that that would go very far, but anyway --

21 JOHN: Well, I disagree with you.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I actually believe in God  
23 and it's up to God what He wants --

24 JOHN: Sure. How, how do the others feel  
25 about coming out. Is -- are there problems as far as  
their concerns?

1           STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, because in honesty, you  
2 know, between you and I, everybody's now talking about  
3 it. Everybody here and that's why, like with David, he  
4 says just give me a few days. I think he's actually  
5 planning -- he hasn't said, but everybody just coming  
6 out.

7           JOHN: Yeah.

8           STEVE SCHNEIDER: And I know God's opened up  
9 -- you know, you wouldn't -- I mean, I don't expect you  
10 to buy this, but in our language we believe that God's  
11 showing him something to do with some of the  
12 prophecies, like he, he today wants to still connect  
13 with Kevin and Brad, of course.

14          JOHN: Yes.

15          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Open up Micah.

16          JOHN: Yes.

17          STEVE SCHNEIDER: If you're nearby and you  
18 want to overhear, you know, you can throw it out or,  
19 or --

20          JOHN: Okay. Yeah, probably I'll just stay  
21 on the line and work it that way.

22          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay, yeah, yeah.

23          JOHN: Like we usually do. And then --

24          STEVE SCHNEIDER: I, I want to tell you  
25 something. You know, no matter how bizarre we might  
seem or off the wall or whatever else, I am telling you

1 | by my own experience, I've always seen myself as a  
2 | person that is highly into common sense and into logic  
3 | and it's -- and plus, you know, I've been a person  
4 | that's always been very skeptical of people that have  
5 | religious experiences. So when I met David I couldn't,  
6 | you know, I, I don't buy that sort of thing.

7 |           JOHN: Um-hum.

8 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: It took me six months of  
9 | going back to the Bible and trying to rip him apart  
10 | long distance on the telephone.

11 |           JOHN: I know.

12 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Then I took his information  
13 | to at least 20 ministers in my locale in Hawaii. They  
14 | could not controvert, nor could they answer the  
15 | questions I would raise, but he showed the answer.  
16 | Ultimately, I'm traveling around the world taking on  
17 | scholars, so I got the test to try it. That's why the  
18 | challenge is, is a strong challenge to the Christian  
19 | world. If you know Christ, show the seven seals,  
20 | because the last book is a revelation of Him.

21 |           JOHN: Right.

22 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: So, you know, so I mean,  
23 | that's really what it's been about from the beginning.

24 |           JOHN: Yeah.

25 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: But all these prophets that  
   | talk about a time when the world comes to an end.

1 | Ultimately it has to happen sometime if the Book's  
2 | true, otherwise it's just another fairy tale.

3 |           JOHN: Yeah. Is, is --

4 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, go ahead.

5 |           JOHN: Is David talking about everyone coming  
6 | out together at the same time? Is that basically what  
7 | he's thinking?

8 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, yeah. Either that or  
9 | maybe what we've been -- I was talking to him  
10 | yesterday, even before we actually, you know, before  
11 | the guys went out --

12 |           JOHN: Yeah.

13 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- and he mentioned quite a  
14 | good size group coming out anyhow.

15 |           JOHN: You're talking -- when are we talking  
16 | about?

17 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'm not sure. Anywhere  
18 | between like today, tomorrow, or within the week.  
19 | Because I remember him saying the word week. See, he,  
20 | he's not pulling anything on the people, you know, on  
21 | anybody out there. You people or anything.

22 |           JOHN: Right.

23 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Because God is showing him  
24 | something. He -- this is why he up and showed me the  
25 | night before the Book of Micah in a --

          JOHN: Right.

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- way I had never seen it  
2 before.

3 JOHN: Yeah.

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And, you know, in one hand  
5 you go take off at a time, you go look at it yourself  
6 and say well, is this true? Is it false? Is it  
7 possible? Is it being twisted? Is this an  
8 interpretation? You know, all these things go through  
9 your mind --

10 JOHN: Oh, of course.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- always, and it does with  
12 everybody here, so this is why he's always -- everybody  
13 has a right to leave here.

14 JOHN: Very true.

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And they, and they do, but  
16 they, they just want to make sure they're not doing  
17 something against God or what they understand, you  
18 know, the program to be.

19 JOHN: Of course.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So that's why it's -- I'm  
21 sure for you guys it's a very difficult [gap] if this  
22 was a normal thing where no religion was involved,  
23 everybody would have been out there that Sunday.

24 JOHN: That's true. I believe that.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So --

JOHN: I do.

1           STEVE SCHNEIDER: I mean, in fact, the whole  
2 thing was such a -- on one hand we, we -- there were  
3 those that had an awareness to some small degree what  
4 might be happening. We were never sure. We were never  
5 sure. But when it did happen and so forth, I mean,  
6 most people hit the deck and they were just hoping for  
7 their lives that some -- man, like myself, where I was  
8 and Wayne, I didn't, I didn't know how long -- I  
9 thought they were going to keep on shooting till  
10 everybody was dead. I'll tell you the truth. That  
11 went through my mind... That was -- I was almost  
12 positive of that.

13           JOHN: Yeah, I'm sure. I tell you, right now  
14 I think everybody both inside and both outside is ready  
15 to move forward with this now, you know.

16           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. Well, you know,  
17 that's, that's definitely the attitude.

18           JOHN: Yeah.

19           STEVE SCHNEIDER: That's definitely the  
20 attitude. So when David was asking for time it wasn't  
21 for any other reason but the religious, spiritual  
22 aspect of it all, because if people have to go off to  
23 jail or if this or that happens. If the groups broke  
24 up and -- they've got to be able to look at the Bible,  
25 ask the questions. A lot of --

4 weeks of this kind of pressure and, you know, it's --

5 JOHN DOLAN: It's got to be getting old for  
6 you, you know?

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, hey, it was -- I'll  
8 tell you what. When those bullets started coming in  
9 that Sunday, it's, it's been hardly changed from that  
10 time. I mean, even from then, I mean, my knees were  
11 weak when those bullets were flying through the walls.

12 JOHN DOLAN: Steve, you know, this afternoon  
13 is as good a time as anytime in all candor.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

15 JOHN DOLAN: You know, it really is. So,  
16 just, just put it in the back of your mind, you know.

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, you know --

18 JOHN DOLAN: I really want to meet you.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- the only reason --

20 JOHN DOLAN: I'll be here, I'll be here,

21 so --

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: The only reason -- and  
23 today's a big day. It's the Sabbath.

24 JOHN DOLAN: Exactly.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So, that's the reason why  
Rita going out at the time, otherwise question it would

1 | have been morning, noon, or something like that.

2 | Seriously.

3 |           JOHN DOLAN: Sure.

4 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Tomorrow's Sunday. Now,  
5 | this is a different story for us.

6 |           JOHN DOLAN: Different story?

7 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, completely. So  
8 | that's why I'm anxious to talk with David now and, and  
9 | to see just what, what's happening.

10 |           JOHN DOLAN: Do you think tomorrow could be a  
11 | big day?

12 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: It could be. It's, it's a  
13 | possib -- in my mind, but you know, again, I, I'm --  
14 | he's, like, constantly -- you open -- when I do go in  
15 | there, he's got the Bible in his lap and --

16 |           JOHN DOLAN: Um-hum.

17 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- and he's opening up  
18 | things very clearly. You know, he'll -- that's why,  
19 | you know, like today when he does call in you can  
20 | listen to the kind of thing that, that he's shown or  
21 | what he --

22 |           JOHN DOLAN: Sure.

23 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- and then, then you can  
24 | gauge as to how these people are judging or what  
25 | they're going by. That'll give you an inclina --

          JOHN DOLAN: Right. It is my hope --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- inclination.

2 JOHN DOLAN: It is my hope, Steve, this will  
3 all happen tomorrow.

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, you never know.

5 JOHN DOLAN: You never know, huh?

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. You know, I'm always  
7 -- like yourself, I'm anxious also, so --

8 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. Well, I really want to  
9 see this come -- the way it's coming and I want to meet  
10 you personally and, and I really want to see you and  
11 just get together and we'll shake hands --

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

13 JOHN DOLAN: -- and have a few words before  
14 my rotational comes up.

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. So if --

16 JOHN DOLAN: I really want that very much.

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: If your rotational comes  
18 up, you would be gone for how many days?

19 JOHN DOLAN: It's a 30-day rotational, which,  
20 you know, that's the way they work it.

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: A 30-day?

22 JOHN DOLAN: Rotational, yeah. You're away  
23 from your per diem post, what they call per diem, for  
24 30 days.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

JOHN DOLAN: So -- then you, you know, that's

1 | just -- it's a rotational system.

2 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: So if you left, like, in  
3 | two days, you wouldn't be back then?

4 |           JOHN DOLAN: For 30. Yeah, that's they way  
5 | they do it. But --

6 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Whoa!

7 |           JOHN DOLAN: But hopefully I'll be here to  
8 | greet you before the, before my rotational comes up,  
9 | you know.

10 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

11 |           JOHN DOLAN: Let's, let's do that. And I  
12 | personally want to see --

13 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: So, in your, in your line  
14 | of work --

15 |           JOHN DOLAN: -- you out there.

16 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: So, what, do you move all  
17 | over American then?

18 |           JOHN DOLAN: No, the way it works, we're  
19 | transferred to an office and we stay in that office  
20 | depending, you know, on the needs -- what they call the  
21 | needs of the Government, however that works.

22 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

23 |           JOHN DOLAN: And usually -- right now, you  
24 | know, the reason they don't frequently now is they  
25 | actually -- it sounds ridiculous, but the Government is  
tightening strings on dollars.

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh, sure, sure.

2 JOHN DOLAN: And money -- transfers cost a  
3 lot of money, so --

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

5 JOHN DOLAN: You stay in an office for a  
6 relatively long period of time.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

8 JOHN DOLAN: And, you know, some of the  
9 Southern California offices, they've had people in  
10 there who, who just came out of training school and  
11 they're in there for like --

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Are a lot of these guys who  
13 get into like ATF, FBI, and all these things, are they  
14 out of the military?

15 JOHN DOLAN: No, no. There's all kinds of  
16 different programs out there, you know. There's all  
17 the people who've been teachers and -- but it's not all  
18 military.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh, really?

20 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, yeah. That's called the  
21 modified program.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh.

23 JOHN DOLAN: I'll be, I'll be into the  
24 recruiting section here in a second. That's called,  
25 that's called modified program, it's -- requires three  
years of like any experience, like teaching or anything

1 | like that plus your Bachelor's degree, you know.

2 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

3 |           JOHN DOLAN: So, yeah.

4 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh, you do have to have a  
5 | Bachelor's degree then.

6 |           JOHN DOLAN: Yeah, yeah.

7 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

8 |           JOHN DOLAN: Yeah, yeah, definitely. So --

9 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Interesting.

10 |           JOHN DOLAN: But anyway -- so what --

11 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

12 |           JOHN DOLAN: Okay. How do we want to work  
13 | this now?

14 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, I guess what I'm  
15 | going to do is call you back. I'm waiting any moment  
16 | now to talk with him --

17 |           JOHN DOLAN: Okay.

18 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- and as soon as I go in  
19 | to talk with him I'll probably call you right from  
20 | where he is, so if you want to talk to him or  
21 | anybody --

22 |           JOHN DOLAN: That'd be -- yeah, that'd be  
23 | fine.

24 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

25 |           JOHN DOLAN: And I'm going to tell Mr. Jamar  
that based on what, what you and I just spoke about

1 | that you certainly -- that Rita -- we will see Rita  
2 | this afternoon.

3 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

4 |           JOHN DOLAN: I, I think he'd like --

5 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: That's what I understand  
6 | isn't it. You worked that out --

7 |           JOHN DOLAN: Yeah, that was worked out last  
8 | night.

9 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- a moment last night --

10 |           JOHN DOLAN: Yeah.

11 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: And I think you guys worked  
12 | that out.

13 |           JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. And, and David did use  
14 | the term others and I don't know what he had in mind.

15 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: I don't either. I wondered  
16 | that too. I remember him saying a few days and a week  
17 | and it sounded like I didn't know if he meant the whole  
18 | group by then or in that time or how it was to be, but,  
19 | but I know --

20 |           JOHN DOLAN: Yeah.

21 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- you know, that's the way  
22 | the talk is now all over the place, so.

23 |           JOHN DOLAN: Right. I don't want to create  
24 | any false hopes with Mr. Jamar because --

25 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, exactly.

          JOHN DOLAN: -- it's real important --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I don't like making, you  
2 know, I mean, we're moving there. No question.

3 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. Can I, can I say that to  
4 him about Rita, though, that's not a problem?

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, whatever the -- they  
6 said --

7 JOHN DOLAN: That was all worked out.

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, whatever, you know --  
9 I wish I would have been there. I wasn't actually. I  
10 went down -- I went down to another location and I came  
11 back and when I got back then --

12 JOHN DOLAN: Sure.

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- apparently you had  
14 worked it out even with Kevin --

15 JOHN DOLAN: Well, I don't want to create --

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And Brad coming out last.

17 JOHN DOLAN: Sure. Yeah, Rita was, was  
18 definite and then as far as the term others, I'll go  
19 and wait till, till David and I speak later on.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

21 JOHN DOLAN: Great. And we've got that  
22 patch. We can do that. So whenever --

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So, now, I guess you guys  
24 have -- what -- tell me now. Here's another thing  
25 that's a real concern of mine. If one did end up in  
jail or whatever else, are there any ways -- do they

1 | ever allow you, I mean, can it be a guarantee to bring  
2 | in a number -- a few books or something like that?

3 |           JOHN DOLAN: Oh, yeah. Absolutely.  
4 | Absolutely. That's, that's no problem at all.

5 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh, okay.

6 |           JOHN DOLAN: That's no problem at all. In  
7 | fact, let me tell you what I did. Last night, when --  
8 | I'm trying to think who was -- Kevin or --

9 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: And Brad.

10 |          JOHN DOLAN: When Kevin came down.

11 |          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

12 |          JOHN DOLAN: I noticed that his Bible was not  
13 | there. And as it turned out that the sedan that  
14 | brought him in, the four-door sedan, they had left his  
15 | Bible purely by accident in the back seat of the, of  
16 | the sedan or the front seat, whatever.

17 |          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

18 |          JOHN DOLAN: So, I said to one of the  
19 | gentlemen, I said, I have made a personal  
20 | representation that this is, is, is my personal  
21 | representation. And I sent one of the deputies out and  
22 | he brought in the Bible --

23 |          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

24 |          JOHN DOLAN: -- so, you know, if I say  
25 | something, I'm going to do it. But, yeah, books of any  
   | type, whether it's religious or, or it doesn't matter

1 the topic.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'd have, like myself, two  
3 Bibles and a Concordance most likely.

4 JOHN DOLAN: I -- well, you not only can have  
5 them in there, you can bring them with you if you want  
6 or we'll get them for you.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

8 JOHN DOLAN: Either way you want to do it.  
9 And that's, that's --

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That is -- I'll tell you  
11 what, I mean, you know, this is very extremely, as you  
12 would know, unusual to me, but --

13 JOHN DOLAN: Of course. But --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: It's definitely a new  
15 experience.

16 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. It's a new experience and  
17 it's not a harsh experience as unusual as it may sound  
18 and --

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

20 JOHN DOLAN: And, you know, I'm going to tell  
21 you something. If it's, if it's before my rotational,  
22 I will be there to help you through it.

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

24 JOHN DOLAN: And it's not going to be a tough  
25 one. I mean --

STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

1 JOHN DOLAN: -- as, as unusual as it sounds,  
2 there's thousands of people that go through this every  
3 single day of the year, you know, and so, you know, it  
4 just goes on and on and on and, and, you know, the,  
5 the, the federal system as well as the state systems  
6 now are extremely oriented towards people's rights,  
7 towards being with their attorney, towards seeing their  
8 attorney, you know, so --

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: How would that work with a  
10 guy that's so far away, like say, in Houston all the  
11 way up here to Waco, though?

12 JOHN DOLAN: Say that again now?

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: You know, like the attorney  
14 that was apparently --

15 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, oh, that he's in, that he's  
16 in Houston?

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

18 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, sure. No, he just comes up  
19 for the appearances. He comes up to meet with you.  
20 You call him on the phone.

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I would think that would be  
22 extremely expensive, wouldn't it?

23 JOHN DOLAN: Well, I don't know. How many  
24 miles is it? We're looking at 100 --

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: We're looking at over --  
well over 100.

1           JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. Another way they do it,  
2 they call it local counsel. So let's just say that  
3 there was a minor matter. It was just some type of  
4 appearance where you wanted something relatively minor,  
5 say, to be done. You wanted to maybe have your bond  
6 extended to travel to some place you didn't list.  
7 Okay? So when they, when they issue the bond  
8 initially, what they do is they list the travel points.  
9 Okay? So let's say that it's a pretty much what they  
10 call perfunctory thing.

11           You just wanted to, in law what they call,  
12 enlarge the bond to make it an additional state. Okay,  
13 so that's pretty simple. I mean, the guy just goes in,  
14 asks it, and it's yours. A rubber stamp the thing in  
15 many cases. So he would then just have a local  
16 counsel, a guy in, in Waco go across the street or up a  
17 few blocks, go into court, make the motion, and that's  
18 it.

19           But for, for the actual representation, then,  
20 then he would come down, he would come down for the  
21 hearing or, you know, any significant part of it.

22           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. Okay.

23           JOHN DOLAN: That's how that's works.

24           STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'm sure I'll have more  
25 questions as time goes on.

          JOHN DOLAN: Oh, sure. But please ask them

1 and, you know --

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

3 JOHN DOLAN: -- and if I can't answer them,  
4 which I, I probably can answer most all questions, I'll  
5 find out the answer and like I said before, I'd like to  
6 be a part in coordinating this for you and for  
7 everybody.

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, I'd appreciate it. I  
9 really would.

10 JOHN DOLAN: Good. Well --

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay, I'm going to be --  
12 I'm going to call you back then here --

13 JOHN DOLAN: Fine.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- as soon as I can, which  
15 I'm hoping, you know, will be fairly soon here.

16 JOHN DOLAN: Great.

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay?

18 JOHN DOLAN: Great. Thanks a lot, Steve.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Sure. I'll talk to you in  
20 a bit.

21 JOHN DOLAN: Good-bye.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Bye.

23 (Connection broken.)

24 \* \* \* \* \*

25 (Telephone being dialed.)

(Telephone ringing -- 4 rings.)

1 RACHEL: Hello.

2 JOHN DOLAN: Hi, Rachel?

3 RACHEL: Hi.

4 JOHN DOLAN: Hi, this is John. How're you  
5 doing?

6 RACHEL: Fine.

7 JOHN DOLAN: Great, great. How's Bobbi?

8 RACHEL: Oh, she's doing pretty good.

9 JOHN DOLAN: She was cute the other night.

10 RACHEL: Yeah.

11 JOHN DOLAN: Is David around or Steve around?

12 RACHEL: Yeah. Preferably which one?

13 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, they're both around, huh?

14 RACHEL: Well, no --

15 JOHN DOLAN: Well, I have a message for Steve  
16 so -- yeah, I have a message for Steve.

17 RACHEL: Okay. Here Steve comes --

18 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. I'll talk to Steve first  
19 and --

20 RACHEL TO STEVE: Oh, okay.

21 RACHEL: He told me to talk to you for a  
22 minute because he's going to try to see if David's  
23 around.

24 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, okay. Okay. That's fine.  
25 I always enjoy talking to you. You have a very nice  
voice.

1 RACHEL: Oh, thank you.

2 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah, yeah. How's mine sound?

3 RACHEL: I enjoy talking to you. Sorry?

4 JOHN DOLAN: -- enjoys talking to me?

5 RACHEL: No, I said I enjoy talking to you  
6 too.

7 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, well, this is good to hear.  
8 That's good to hear. It was fun with Bobbi last night.  
9 It really kind of -- I looked at, I looked -- went back  
10 to the video.

11 RACHEL: Oh, yeah.

12 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah.

13 RACHEL: She was very quiet though. That's  
14 not her usual self.

15 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, what's she like usually?

16 RACHEL: She's very talkative. You know, she  
17 talks a lot.

18 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, is that right?

19 RACHEL: And she -- in the video she was very  
20 quiet.

21 JOHN DOLAN: Very. Yeah.

22 RACHEL: She wouldn't say anything.

23 JOHN DOLAN: Uh-uh.

24 RACHEL: Yeah.

25 JOHN DOLAN: No, I went back. I wanted to  
see what she looked like again, you know? It's, it's

1 | been a while since I went over the video and I really  
2 | -- it was just kind of fun. I just kind of enjoyed it.

3 | RACHEL: Do you have children yourself?

4 | JOHN DOLAN: No, no, no.

5 | RACHEL: No?

6 | JOHN DOLAN: Just one of those things, you  
7 | know?

8 | RACHEL: Oh.

9 | JOHN DOLAN: So -- but you, you certainly do.

10 | RACHEL: Yeah. Yeah, I do.

11 | JOHN DOLAN: Oh, geez. So, anyway, what else  
12 | is going on?

13 | RACHEL: Oh, not much. I was just reading my  
14 | Bible.

15 | JOHN DOLAN: Just reading the Bible?

16 | RACHEL: Yeah.

17 | JOHN DOLAN: Kind of a quiet afternoon.

18 | RACHEL: Yeah --

19 | JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. What I -- I don't know if  
20 | you had a chance to talk to David, but what I did this  
21 | morning -- I mentioned this to Steve. I hadn't, hadn't  
22 | -- didn't mention it to David, but I went into see the  
23 | boss here and I said, look, you know, today's the  
24 | Sabbath. I just -- I really would appreciate it  
25 | personally if you could just, could just leave the  
loudspeakers silent today.

1 RACHEL: Oh, yeah. Well, I appreciate that.

2 JOHN DOLAN: Well, you know, it was a little  
3 thing but I hope, I hope the Sabbath was --

4 RACHEL: Yeah, well that's a big thing for  
5 us.

6 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah, I know. I, I know, but  
7 it's on -- in a sense a little thing, but --

8 RACHEL: Yeah.

9 JOHN DOLAN: -- it's always, you know, if you  
10 can get something done for somebody I enjoy that.

11 RACHEL: Yeah, well, that's great.

12 JOHN DOLAN: I'm really, I'm really looking  
13 forward to meeting you and Bobbi and --

14 RACHEL: Yeah, same here.

15 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. I hope it won't be too,  
16 too distant away, you know.

17 RACHEL: Well, I don't think so.

18 JOHN DOLAN: Good, good, good.

19 RACHEL: I don't think it will be too far.

20 So, how's Kevin and Brad?

21 KORESH: Kevin and Brad, okay. Let me tell  
22 you something about that. It was very, very, very  
23 fortunate that Kevin came out, because he had to be  
24 treated by physicians. I'm not sure what they did --

25 RACHEL: How did he get blood poisoning?

JOHN DOLAN: Well, I don't think it was blood

1 poisoning. We thought it might have been and it  
2 apparently didn't turn out to be blood poisoning. It's  
3 called phlebitis.

4 RACHEL: What's that?

5 JOHN DOLAN: Well, it's an inflammation of --  
6 I guess of the veins and -- basically varicose veins to  
7 put it in layman's terms.

8 RACHEL: Uh-huh. Yeah.

9 JOHN DOLAN: But he had really bad varicose  
10 veins. So they took him down to the hospital. I  
11 believe they took him last night or very early this  
12 morning. I guess, early this morning now they took him  
13 and checked him over and I guess treated him or  
14 whatever they did, but they were concerned about him,  
15 but now he's okay. And he's been released from the  
16 hospital.

17 RACHEL: Oh, great.

18 JOHN DOLAN: So, we -- I went down, as you  
19 know -- I don't know if you do know, but --

20 RACHEL: Yes.

21 JOHN DOLAN: -- I promised.

22 RACHEL: I heard that you were going to see  
23 them last night or something when they left here.

24 JOHN DOLAN: Yes, I did. I went down to see  
25 them and I said, well, you know, how was everybody  
treated and every -- how were you both treated and

1 Kevin said everybody was very professional, very  
2 professional.

3 RACHEL: Okay.

4 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah, that's what he -- those  
5 are pretty much his exact words, and I shook his hand a  
6 couple of times and the sheriff himself, Jack Harwell  
7 came in.

8 RACHEL: Oh, good.

9 JOHN DOLAN: And he -- I mean personally.

10 RACHEL: Yes.

11 JOHN DOLAN: This -- and, you know, he's  
12 quite a guy. He came in personally, introduced  
13 himself, and he said I want you to know that you'll get  
14 the best of treatment here and he was very, very  
15 cordial. And I think --

16 RACHEL: Well, I've never met him before, but  
17 I know David speaks very highly of him.

18 JOHN DOLAN: I'll tell you, I'll tell you, I,  
19 I've been around doing this job for a while and I have  
20 never, ever, ever been better treated than last night  
21 by everybody at that facility.

22 RACHEL: Oh, really?

23 JOHN DOLAN: And, and the sheriff has told me  
24 personally that everybody will be treated the same way.

25 RACHEL: Oh, that's good.

JOHN DOLAN: He's fantas--

1 RACHEL: How long has he been sheriff of this  
2 county?

3 JOHN DOLAN: Four terms, five terms --

4 RACHEL: Really?

5 JOHN DOLAN: So, it's about 20, 21 years or  
6 22 years.

7 RACHEL: Wow!

8 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah.

9 RACHEL: That's a long time.

10 JOHN DOLAN: A long, long time. And he's,  
11 he's truly one of these man -- one of these men that my  
12 bond -- my word is my bond.

13 RACHEL: Um-hum.

14 JOHN DOLAN: And he came down there last  
15 night. I, I've -- to be honest with you, I've never  
16 seen it done. And he's that type of guy, though.

17 RACHEL: Well, that's good that he can, you  
18 know, keep a good reputation with the people for so  
19 many years.

20 JOHN DOLAN: I tell you, all -- he just comes  
21 in and he's got a Texas, I call him cowboy hats, but  
22 western hat --

23 RACHEL: Yeah.

24 JOHN DOLAN: And he's got a western hat and  
25 doesn't wear a badge. I mean, he's just got a jacket  
on, boots, and that's, you know --

1 RACHEL: Texas -- kind of country, huh?

2 JOHN DOLAN: He's a country person.

3 RACHEL: Yeah.

4 JOHN DOLAN: He's a genuine human being and  
5 I, I tell you, it was -- well, I'm sure Kevin will  
6 relate it also, but he just came in, I introduced  
7 myself and who I am, you will be treated well and  
8 everyone -- and he's told me, he said, I'll tell you  
9 something, John. Everyone will be treated this exact  
10 way that I did this. It was -- I tell you.

11 RACHEL: He had control over that or --

12 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, he's --

13 RACHEL: I, I don't know the system.

14 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, okay. Well, he's the  
15 elected official so he's in charge. He's the number  
16 one man in the county, in the sheriff's department, in  
17 the jail. It's his, it's his jail.

18 RACHEL: Oh.

19 JOHN DOLAN: What he says, goes. And I mean,  
20 you couldn't meet a nicer guy, I mean, for him to come  
21 down and just go in and introduce himself to --

22 RACHEL: Is it, is it the jail in Bellmead or  
23 the one over off of Highway 6, I believe, or somewhere  
24 around there?

25 JOHN DOLAN: It's, it's Columbus, Columbus  
Street. I think it's 501 or 510 Columbus Street, right

1 | in Waco. It's right downtown Waco, right off  
2 | Interstate 35 and it's a really nice facility. It's a  
3 | really nice facility.

4 |           RACHEL: I don't remember seeing a jail over  
5 | there.

6 |           JOHN DOLAN: It's --

7 |           RACHEL: I mean I know where the courthouse  
8 | is and everything.

9 |           JOHN DOLAN: Um-hum.

10 |           RACHEL: Where is it from there?

11 |           JOHN DOLAN: It's very near the courthouse,  
12 | very near the courthouse. It's on, on Columbus. And  
13 | he came in himself and we -- of course, we got Kevin a  
14 | Dr. Pepper and we got Dr. Pepper sodas for Brad and --  
15 | but Brad, Brad switched to water. He wasn't big on Dr.  
16 | Pepper, so he wanted to drink water instead of Dr.  
17 | Pepper. But we got all that stuff for them and I just,  
18 | basically, wanted to meet them both and I guess in  
19 | actuality Kevin and I chatted a little bit more,  
20 | whereas I just said hello to Brad, because I think he  
21 | was just kind of gathering himself, you know?

22 |           RACHEL: Yeah.

23 |           JOHN DOLAN: And I did one other thing that I  
24 | wanted to tell you about and I told Steve about this  
25 | morning. One of the representations, the promises,  
   | that I had made was -- and we, we cleared it with the

1 | sheriff, was that they could have their Bibles.

2 |           RACHEL: Oh, good.

3 |           JOHN DOLAN: Yeah, yeah. Well, one of the  
4 | things that happened in the -- I don't want to call it  
5 | excitement, but just the movement, the Bible was left  
6 | in the car and I checked on it myself to make sure that  
7 | it was there and it wasn't. It was in the car, the  
8 | Chevrolet or whatever it was, that, that brought them  
9 | there.

10 |           RACHEL: Um-hum.

11 |           JOHN DOLAN: And so we had one of the  
12 | deputies go out and actually bring back the Bible for  
13 | them.

14 |           RACHEL: Oh, that's good.

15 |           JOHN DOLAN: Well, you know, it's important  
16 | to do these things, I think.

17 |           RACHEL: Yeah. Well, I tell you what, this  
18 | is definitely going to be -- I mean, it has been an  
19 | experience for me, but it's going to be more so an  
20 | experience to me. I've never been through this before,  
21 | you know.

22 |           JOHN DOLAN: It's, it's really nothing to it.  
23 | It's nothing to it at all. It's, it's all explained to  
24 | you really well -- how simple it is. First of all, you  
25 | know, just like the little kids, you come out and walk  
   | down the driveway, just to the end of the driveway.

1 RACHEL: Um-hum.

2 JOHN DOLAN: And then we'll have one of those  
3 vehicles where all the kids have been going in. The  
4 ones that always complain about bouncing around?

5 RACHEL: Bradleys?

6 JOHN DOLAN: The Bradleys, yeah. And we'll  
7 put you in a Bradley, or actually, we might use the  
8 bus. We may use a bus, too. And if there's more than  
9 a couple, we use a bus. And we'll just go down to the  
10 next section of the road and if it's a bus, we'll just  
11 keep on going. If it's a Bradley, we'll switch to like  
12 a --

13 RACHEL: Does it go past all the media and  
14 all that or does it go a different direction?

15 JOHN DOLAN: There is some media on the way.  
16 Yes, there is some media on the way, but what they're  
17 going to do is the Depart -- the DPS is going to move  
18 them is my understanding --

19 RACHEL: I'm not interested in having my  
20 picture taken or anything.

21 JOHN DOLAN: No, I can understand that. So  
22 we'll have DPS move them back. Department of -- you  
23 know. Some public service for the State of Texas,  
24 they'll move them back. They've got all the uniformed  
25 troopers here. And they'll just move them back and  
they'll be able to keep everybody out of the way. And

1 | then just -- if it's a large group, like I said in the  
2 | bus, they'll be just processed and then they're brought  
3 | down to Sheriff Harwell's place. It's real simple  
4 | processing. It's all set up in hangars out here and  
5 | it's -- it'll go real smoothly.

6 |           RACHEL: Uh-huh.

7 |           JOHN DOLAN: Real smoothly.

8 |           RACHEL: That's good.

9 |           JOHN DOLAN: Good, good. I also wanted to  
10 | make one other point besides mentioning to Kevin and  
11 | also getting his Bible for him, anybody else who wants  
12 | to keep their Bible or books will be allowed to do so.

13 |           RACHEL: Okay.

14 |           JOHN DOLAN: So, that might be -- so how do  
15 | you feel about all these things now that I've mentioned  
16 | them to you?

17 |           RACHEL: Well, it makes me feel a little bit  
18 | better, you know. I -- most people here don't know  
19 | that much about the system I don't think. I mean I,  
20 | myself, don't. I -- you know, this has never happened  
21 | to me before.

22 |           JOHN DOLAN: Of course not.

23 |           RACHEL: So, you know --

24 |           JOHN DOLAN: Of course not.

25 |           RACHEL: -- it helps to know what you're  
saying.

1 JOHN DOLAN: Yes. And if you have anymore  
2 questions or anybody has anymore questions about the  
3 system or the processing, it's a relatively simple  
4 procedure even though I know it's unknown to you.  
5 There will be attorneys appointed for you and they will  
6 be with you, you know, for any court appearances, bond  
7 hearings, and so on.

8 RACHEL: Yeah.

9 JOHN DOLAN: I hope I've made you feel better  
10 about this. Rachel?

11 RACHEL: Yeah, I'm here.

12 JOHN DOLAN: I hope I've made you feel better  
13 about this.

14 RACHEL: Just a minute.

15 JOHN DOLAN: Sure.

16 (Out-of-hearing discussion.)

17 RACHEL TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: -- explained  
18 to me about the Bible and --

19 (Continued out-of-hearing discussion.)

20 RACHEL: John.

21 JOHN DOLAN: Hi, Rachel.

22 RACHEL: I'm here.

23 JOHN DOLAN: Sure.

24 RACHEL: Well, I guess Steve is making his  
25 way to the phone.

JOHN DOLAN: Okay. I've got a message for

1 him.

2 RACHEL: Okay.

3 JOHN DOLAN: Great. It was very nice talking  
4 with you.

5 RACHEL: Okay.

6 JOHN DOLAN: And if there's anything else I  
7 can answer, don't hesitate to call.

8 RACHEL: All right.

9 JOHN DOLAN: Okay.

10 RACHEL: Well, maybe we can, you know, talk  
11 more about it after the Sabbath, because --

12 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah.

13 RACHEL: -- I really prefer not to talk about  
14 it --

15 JOHN DOLAN: I understand, sure.

16 RACHEL: -- you know --

17 JOHN DOLAN: I understand completely. Sure,  
18 that's not the reason I called at all. I just have a  
19 message for Steve.

20 RACHEL: All right. Steve will be here in a  
21 minute.

22 JOHN DOLAN: Thanks. Nice talking with you.

23 RACHEL: Okay.

24 JOHN DOLAN: Bye-bye.

25 RACHEL: Bye.

RACHEL: Sorry.

1 JOHN DOLAN: That's okay.

2 (Long pause.)

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: John.

4 JOHN DOLAN: Steve.

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. Can I call you in  
6 like five minutes?

7 JOHN DOLAN: Okay.

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. I'll call -- I'll  
9 call you right back.

10 JOHN DOLAN: The only reason I called, I've  
11 got a message for you, so call me back in five minutes.

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I will for sure.

13 JOHN DOLAN: Right.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Thanks, John.

15 JOHN DOLAN: Right.

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Bye-bye.

17 (Connection broken.)

18 \* \* \* \* \*

19 (Telephone ringing -- 1 ring.)

20 JOHN DOLAN: Hello.

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Hello, John?

22 JOHN DOLAN: Steve, how you doing?

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. What did you have  
24 for me there?

25 JOHN DOLAN: All right. It's -- I spoke to a  
woman who sounds exactly like you do.

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: It must be my sister.

2 JOHN DOLAN: It is, it is. Yeah, she's very  
3 nice. I knew you were concerned about the attorneys --

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Uh-huh.

5 JOHN DOLAN: -- and --

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: You know what? I really  
7 hadn't forgot my time here, but well, the Sabbath --

8 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah.

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: They're almost over --

10 JOHN DOLAN: Okay.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. I'm going to call  
12 you back and I'm going to talk to you about that, so if  
13 you can hold that message for me.

14 JOHN DOLAN: Okay.

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: We're, we're talking to  
16 someone else right now also and I'll give you that name  
17 as soon as we talk to a little further.

18 JOHN DOLAN: Okay, sundown.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. Or -- and he -- I  
20 might even call you before, because right now he's just  
21 starting to talk with another individual so as soon as  
22 he has a few more words with the person, I'll, I'll be  
23 giving you a call as soon as possible, but we'll be  
24 calling you, you know, pretty quick here.

25 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. I'll wait for your call.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Good.

1 JOHN DOLAN: Talk to you.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay, bye.

3 JOHN DOLAN: Bye-bye.

4 (Connection broken.)

5 \* \* \* \* \*

6 JOHN DOLAN: Hello.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Hello, John.

8 JOHN DOLAN: Steve.

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Hey, can -- is -- I was  
10 just talking with David. Is it possible to get Brad  
11 and Kevin on the phone?

12 JOHN DOLAN: We were -- yeah, we can, we can  
13 do that.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Do you need -- do you want  
15 me to call back? Do you need some time or should I  
16 just hang on right now?

17 JOHN DOLAN: No, no. We're going to need  
18 some time to get -- to do it.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. How much -- just  
20 tell me when you want me to call back.

21 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. We can -- we'll call into  
22 you as soon as we've got them.

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

24 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. What's, what's, what's --  
25 oh, did I give you the message? That's, that's the  
only basic reason I called.

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: A moment ago about my  
2 sister.

3 JOHN DOLAN: Yeah. Okay. I spoke --

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: But you didn't finish it  
5 yet, but I told you I'd call you just after the  
6 Sabbath. I was -- when the sun goes down, then I'll  
7 talk to you --

8 JOHN DOLAN: Oh, okay. Okay.

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I want -- I've been  
10 here so long I forget sometimes where I am, when --

11 JOHN DOLAN: I know.

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- what time of the day it  
13 is here.

14 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. So, David would like to  
15 talk to, to --

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Brad and Kevin.

17 JOHN DOLAN: -- Brad and Kevin.

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

19 JOHN DOLAN: Okay. We'll, we'll start  
20 working on that.

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

22 JOHN DOLAN: He's going to be there, then, it  
23 shouldn't be -- take within maybe by the phone for  
24 maybe 20 minutes, half hour, somewhere in there?

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Sounds good.

JOHN DOLAN: So we can --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'll listen for the phone.

2 JOHN DOLAN: All right. I'll -- it's going  
3 to take a few minutes, because, you know, it's -- we  
4 got to call down there, they got to call back and all  
5 kinds of little --

20 JOHN COX: How you doing?

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Not too bad.

22 JOHN COX: Good, good. Listen, we -- we're  
23 ready to put this patch together --

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

25 JOHN COX: -- with Kevin and Brad.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

1 JOHN COX: And, and David I guess, huh?

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, that sounds right.

3 JOHN COX: Is he, is he available?

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: He sure is.

5 JOHN COX: Great.

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So, John, your last name is

7 Right?

8 JOHN COX: No, no.

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: This is John Cox.

10 JOHN COX: John-1, yeah.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Gotcha.

12 JOHN COX: Okay.

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: You sound a little bit

14 different there.

15 JOHN COX: We're not throwing you John-4 yet.

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: (Laughter.) Not yet, huh?

17 JOHN COX: No, no.

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So you're, you're about

19 ready then?

20 JOHN COX: Yeah, we are.

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So, John Dolan, he's left,

22 has he?

23 JOHN COX: Yep.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

25 JOHN COX: Yep, for the evening.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

1 JOHN COX: You're stuck with me, pal.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No problem.

3 JOHN COX: Okay.

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: It's all right.

5 JOHN COX: Let me get David on and then we'll  
6 patch them through.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Here he is. Just a minute.

8 JOHN COX: Okay.

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER TO KORESH: It's John Cox.

10 KORESH: Mr. Cox, John.

11 JOHN COX: Yeah -- Mr. Cox is my dad. You  
12 know that.

13 KORESH: Yeah, I forgot all about that.

14 JOHN COX: How you been?

15 KORESH: We're doing, we're doing pretty  
16 good.

17 JOHN COX: Good. I didn't wear you out last  
18 night?

19 KORESH: No. I thought you'd, I thought  
20 you'd be on your knees all last night, repenting for  
21 all the wisdom you received.

22 JOHN COX: I don't know. That water burger  
23 (phonetic sp.) story was pretty heavy.

24 KORESH: Yeah. That, that's the truth  
25 though.

JOHN COX: That was tough. Listen, how much

1 | time do you need do you think?

2 |           KORESH: Well, like I say. They're going to,  
3 | they're going to have some questions and like I said I  
4 | gotta finish up where I left off last night.

5 |           JOHN COX: Okay. You got any idea?

6 |           KORESH: Oh, it could be 30 minutes to an  
7 | hour or so.

8 |           JOHN COX: Okay. Because we been told that  
9 | sometime around seven o'clock other people have to come  
10 | in where they are and clean up some area and other  
11 | things, so think that would be all right? Till around  
12 | seven o'clock?

13 |           KORESH: What time is it now?

14 |           JOHN COX: It's about 6:19, something like  
15 | that. You know, 7:00, 7:15? Something like that?

16 |           KORESH: Okay. Let's, let's work it. We'll  
17 | see what we can do.

18 |           JOHN COX: Okay? And then I'll talk to you  
19 | if -- a little while after they get off. Make sure  
20 | everything's okay.

21 |           KORESH: Okey doke.

22 |           JOHN COX: All right. Hang on. We're going  
23 | to patch you through. And I'll be here if you need  
24 | something.

25 |           KORESH: Okay.

          JOHN COX: All right.

1 (Patch connected, but indiscernible.)

2 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Hello.

3 KORESH: Hi.

4 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: David.

5 KORESH: Yeah.

6 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I'm Dick

7 (indiscernible). I'm here with, with (indiscernible).

8 Can you hear me all right?

9 KORESH: Yeah, pretty good.

10 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Okay. We're, we're on  
11 the speaker system here, so if you can't hear, just --

12 (Clear connection restored.)

13 JOHN COX: Are you there?

14 KORESH: We're here.

15 JOHN COX: Can you hear everybody?

16 KORESH: Like -- I heard Dick.

17 JOHN COX: You heard Dick all right?

18 KORESH: Yeah. I heard Dick.

19 JOHN COX: All right. Hold on just a second,  
20 will you. This thing's all screwed up. Be patient  
21 with me, David.

22 KORESH: We will.

23 (Pause.)

24 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: It's okay.

25 (Pause.)

JOHN COX: Hello.

1 KORESH: Hello.

2 JOHN COX: Hello.

3 KORESH: Hello.

4 JOHN COX: Yeah, David. We're still working  
5 at it, pal.

6 KORESH: Okay.

7 JOHN COX: We're, we're having some technical  
8 difficulties. You find that hard to believe, don't  
9 you? Be patient with me --

10 (Pause.)

11 JOHN COX: Can I call you back in just a  
12 second?

13 KORESH: Sure.

14 JOHN COX: Okay. I appreciate it. Thank  
15 you, David.

16 KORESH: Okey doke.

17 JOHN COX: Bye-bye.

18 (Connection broken.)

19 \* \* \* \* \*

20 (Wrong number tone.)

21 (Telephone ringing -- 1 ring.)

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Hello.

23 JOHN COX: Hey, Steve.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, John.

25 JOHN COX: Can we try again?

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Sure can.

1 JOHN COX: Thank you.  
2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Just a minute.  
3 JOHN COX: Thank you.  
4 KORESH: We be back.  
5 JOHN COX: Okay. Are you on now? Hello.  
6 Dick.  
7 DICK: Yes.  
8 JOHN COX: Okay. Are you there, David?  
9 KORESH: Yeah, I'm here.  
10 JOHN COX: Okay. You should have them on the  
11 other end of the phone now.  
12 KORESH: Are you guys there?  
13 DICK: Can you hear everything, David?  
14 KORESH: I heard -- is that you, Dick?  
15 DICK: Yeah. Can you hear Kevin and Brad?  
16 KORESH: Kevin? Brad?  
17 KEVIN AND BRAD: Hey, David. Hey, David.  
18 KORESH: Y'all gotta speak up.  
19 DICK: All right. I'm going to let them get  
20 over here a little bit closer to the phone. You can  
21 hear me well, can't you?  
22 KORESH: Yeah, I can hear you.  
23 DICK: All right. Well, I'm going to move  
24 them closer to the phone, David.  
25 KORESH: All right.  
DICK: And if we lose you, it's due to

1 technical problems and we'll get you right back. All  
2 right?

3 KORESH: Okay.

4 DICK: So, hey, nice talking to you.

5 KORESH: Same here.

6 DICK TO KEVIN AND BRAD: -- you want to slide  
7 this chair over there or -- go ahead and sit over  
8 there.

9 DAVID TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: What, did it  
10 rain last night?

11 DICK TO KEVIN AND BRAD: Okay. Give it a  
12 shot now, guys. Can you -- so he can -- see if he can  
13 hear you a little bit better.

14 KORESH: Kev?

15 KEVIN: Yeah. How you doing, Dave?

16 KORESH: Okay. Gotcha. Brad, you there?

17 BRAD: Right here, Dave.

18 KORESH: Huh?

19 BRAD: I'm right here.

20 KORESH: Okay. So can you all hear me clear?

21 BRAD: Sure.

22 KEVIN: Sure can.

23 KORESH: Okay. I thought they was going to  
24 have a better system than this, but anyway. Lots of  
25 surprises in life.

KEVIN: We can hear you really good, Dave.

1 KORESH: Okay. Good. You can hear me then,  
2 right?

3 KEVIN: Just very good.

4 KORESH: All right. Okay. Do you all -- did  
5 you all have any questions last night from where we  
6 left off? Either one of you?

7 KEVIN: Yeah, I did, but I can't think of  
8 them right now.

9 KORESH: Why -- you're under all the  
10 excitement there, huh?

11 KEVIN: Very much.

12 KORESH: Okay. Well, remember, remember as  
13 we were talking about, you know, you got your -- both  
14 got your Bibles there?

15 KEVIN: Yeah, we got them open to Maca --  
16 Micah.

17 KORESH: Okay. Now, remember, Micah whatever  
18 -- when you review whatever Micah, Habakkuk, Nahum,  
19 Zephaniah, all of those books, remember, are  
20 contemporary with Isaiah. Okay? You remember that  
21 now, right? Can you hear me?

22 BRAD: Yeah --

23 KORESH: Okay. Now, you remember what  
24 Zephaniah states? The just Lord's in the midst  
25 thereof, he will not do iniquity?

BRAD: Uh-huh.

1 KORESH: Okay. Now, you know, remember in  
2 Zephaniah we're talking about Assyria. The books  
3 consistently revolve around Assyria and remember that.  
4 Do you? Yes or no.

5 KEVIN: Yes.

6 BRAD: Yes.

7 KORESH: Okay. So, one thing to keep you  
8 from being flooded out from the process you're going  
9 through is always remember and never forget this, who  
10 sits on the throne?

11 KEVIN: God.

12 BRAD: The Rock.

13 KORESH: Okay. And all that's been written  
14 aforetime, since the beginning of the kingdom of  
15 Israel. Remember the first king was Saul, remember the  
16 -- Israel wanted to be as the Gentiles who had men to  
17 lord over them?

18 BRAD: Um-hum.

19 KORESH: Okay. Now, that's the whole  
20 controversial subject, just like everything we've  
21 taught you from the beginning. All the way through  
22 Isaiah, all the way through the Davidian kingdom,  
23 everything revolves around the fact that as long as man  
24 controls man, the difficulties and problems of the  
25 world as it is now witnessed and in past generations is  
going to remain. And not until Israel comes to the

1 birth -- you remember about the -- you know what about  
2 the birth is, don't you?

3 KEVIN: Right.

4 KORESH: Okay. All of Micah and Isaiah, you  
5 know, before she travailed she brought forth the whole  
6 scenario of the human probation remember is in the hand  
7 of the Father.

8 KEVIN: Right.

9 KORESH: And that's why God allows all the  
10 nations to develop as far as they developed to this  
11 present time. Pride, arrogance, the judicial system,  
12 the powers that be, mankind, all that we've learned  
13 about all these past years. Now, Brad, you haven't had  
14 the studies like Kevin's had.

15 BRAD: I know.

16 KORESH: Right? But you've had enough to  
17 know what the faith is at this present time, right?

18 BRAD: Yeah.

19 KORESH: And remember the faith is nothing  
20 more than the testament. And where's our testament  
21 found?

22 KEVIN: The --

23 KORESH: I didn't hear you.

24 KEVIN: Prophecies.

25 KORESH: Well, it's in the right hand of --

BRAD: Of God.

1           KORESH: Okay. Exactly. Okay, now. So, I'm  
2 going to give you a brief picture so you all can keep  
3 this. Now, burn this into your mind. And I realize  
4 after 6,000 years men don't have the capacity of mind  
5 that they had 2,000 years ago. But remember it's a  
6 gift. The Father gives the Book to the Lamb. That's  
7 his reward, isn't it?

8           KEVIN: Right.

9           KORESH: Lock, stock, and barrel. It's not  
10 by the working of the law, you know. The steps of a  
11 good man are ordered by the Lord, the Psalmist says, he  
12 delights in his ways. Though he fall, though he fall,  
13 he should not be cast down for the Lord upholdeth him  
14 with his what?

15          KEVIN: Hand.

16          KORESH: Hand. Now, God the Creator, God  
17 your Father, the one you've never seen or known yet,  
18 but the one that you have been confirmed to, my father,  
19 which is your father, who sits on the throne.  
20 Remember, the whole conclusion of all the prophetic  
21 voice, all that's been written and inspired by the  
22 prophets from the foundation of the world is contained  
23 in that sealed book. Men cannot of their own minds  
24 unlock its mysteries, and this is where the final  
25 confrontation's going to come into play between this  
world that we now know and the world that we're going

1 to know. The world of God, the universe of God. Okay.  
2 So, now, the Father gave the Book to the Lamb as a  
3 gift, right?

4 KEVIN: Right.

5 BRAD: Right.

6 KORESH: Because he only is righteous to  
7 receive it and the Lamb having seven eyes, who really  
8 only knows the mind of God?

9 BRAD: The Lamb.

10 KORESH: Yeah. Because God's made a little  
11 game, hasn't he?

12 KEVIN: Right.

13 KORESH: You know, like with King David of  
14 old and Goliath, there was a little game. Goliath came  
15 with all of his big swords and all that. David met him  
16 with a rock, right? A little stone. You know, God  
17 likes to play around with mankind, doesn't he.

18 KEVIN: Right.

19 KORESH: Okay. Now, so you got to always  
20 remember that what I've shown you, it's been free  
21 hasn't it?

22 KEVIN: That's right.

23 KORESH: It's been a free gift, right? No  
24 charge. Just -- I've shown it to you. Right, Brad?

25 BRAD: Yeah.

KORESH: And you've got -- you take this as a

1 | promise not from me, because you all never knew me when  
2 | you first met me in the flesh. You only knew me as you  
3 | began to sit and listen and learn my knowledge in  
4 | regards to these seals, right?

5 |                   KEVIN: Right.

6 |                   KORESH: So no matter whether you're here or  
7 | whether you're there or whether you're any place in the  
8 | world, God --

2 DAVID: -- Okay. Now, so, I come, my reward  
3 was with me, wasn't it?

4 BRAD: Yes.

5 DAVID: Remember, Brad, in that bar you first  
6 tried to teach me about God?

7 BRAD: Yes.

8 DAVID: Remember, you was trying to convert  
9 me? You didn't know who I was, did you? You, you just  
10 heard us talking about God, me and Randall at the, at  
11 the bar there, and you came up and you was going to  
12 tell me everything, remember?

13 BRAD: Yeah.

14 DAVID: Okay. And I listened, didn't I?

15 BRAD: Yes, you did.

16 DAVID: And then when I asked you questions,  
17 then you began to learn to listen, didn't you? And you  
18 found out something, didn't you?

19 BRAD: Yes.

20 DAVID: Okay. Now, here we go again. Now,  
21 in the overall picture you remember the first seal is  
22 found where?

23 BRAD AND KEVIN: Psalms.

24 DAVID: Okay. The 45th Psalm, right? And  
25 the heart of God has been revealed to you, hasn't it?

BRAD AND KEVIN: Yes.

1           DAVID: That's God talking throughout the  
2 prophetic language, isn't it? God wrote the Bible,  
3 right? You know that now. Now, in God's heart God  
4 speaks of the outcome in regards to our present  
5 situation. The Son's going to win, isn't he?

6           KEVIN: Right.

7           DAVID: I mean, who in their right mind wants  
8 to fight against Christ, right? But that doesn't mean  
9 that everybody's in their right mind, does it?

10          KEVIN: Right.

11          DAVID: Okay. And according to the 45th  
12 Psalm, when we are made aware of that daughter who  
13 stands at his right hand, the question, Hearken, O  
14 daughter, and consider, the question is what girl in  
15 her right mind would not want to marry the Lamb, right?

16          BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

17          DAVID: This is the overall questions in  
18 regards to the seals that are brought to our attention.  
19 And, of course, we know that the bride is the Spirit of  
20 God. I mean, people don't understand that in the  
21 world. You already know that. I mean, the Spirit that  
22 made heaven and earth was the very Spirit that was  
23 breathed into the nostrils of Adam, remember?

24          BRAD AND KEVIN: Um-hum. Right.

25          DAVID: And out of that Spirit, which is life  
the Eloheim took from Adam's side and made a what? A

1 woman. So you see, men don't understand the things  
2 that I've show you all, because they don't understand  
3 the unlimited resources and powers of the Father. They  
4 don't understand. So, for every man that's given life,  
5 God's perfect image is that that man with life may have  
6 a wife, right? And that the wife and the man together  
7 shall be as one. Because you all guys through  
8 experience know that in the flesh it's kind of a hard  
9 thing to deal with, isn't it? All right. Now, the  
10 prophecies according to the 45th Psalm, the first seal,  
11 the man on the white horse, you know that Psalms 1,  
12 Psalms 2, Psalms 3, Psalms 4, the 150 Psalms, all  
13 decode the very mind and spirit of the one who brings  
14 that truth. Correct?

15 BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

16 DAVID: I haven't just told you my thoughts.  
17 I've showed you my thoughts, haven't I?

18 BRAD AND KEVIN: Right. Right.

19 DAVID: I mean, have I been fair?

20 BRAD AND KEVIN: Yeah.

21 DAVID: I mean, now, knowing now what my  
22 thoughts have been and knowing what my doctrine is, it  
23 is not really mine. It's my father's, right?

24 BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

25 DAVID: You have something above and beyond  
anybody that you may be in subjection to right now.

1 | Although they might not want to hear you and although  
2 | they might not want to know your mind. You might not  
3 | be eloquent orators. Remember Psalms 1. After  
4 | receiving the 45th Psalm, the key of David, we know  
5 | that in Psalms 1 you meditate on this day and night and  
6 | you shall bring forth your fruit in due season and the  
7 | fruit is that salvation, the promise that you've been  
8 | given in the 45th Psalm, to be in the marriage,  
9 | Revelation 19. Right? We want to make that event,  
10 | don't we.

11 |           KEVIN: That's right.

12 |           DAVID: You know, the world is going to pass  
13 | away and the fullness thereof, but the promise stands  
14 | for sure. God speaks of things that are not to  
15 | overthrow the things that are. This is the whole New  
16 | Testament knowledge. God is true -- he cannot lie,  
17 | he's not a liar, and the promises are sure. So in  
18 | Psalms 2, when the heathen rage and imagine a vain  
19 | thing, which you all guys know what that's all about,  
20 | right? Their thoughts not being in harmony with the  
21 | mind of God, they're the ones who say, let us break  
22 | their bands asunder and cast their cords away from us.  
23 | They don't understand our doctrine, do they?

24 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: No.

25 |           DAVID: And they don't want me to bind them  
  | unto myself, unto God, by opening the seals, do they?

1 BRAD AND KEVIN: No.

2 DAVID: They don't want to hear about these  
3 seals, do they?

4 BRAD AND KEVIN: No.

5 DAVID: Because every man with mind and  
6 conscious knows that Scripture clearly teaches that no  
7 man can reveal the seals but who?

8 BRAD AND KEVIN: The Lamb.

9 DAVID: So that's why they're going to be  
10 judged and condemned because they, in their own  
11 carnality, don't even want to know. But, on the other  
12 hand, there are some who do, and that's where our  
13 position is. Okay. Now, Psalms 3 -- you know they're  
14 increased, Psalms 4 they turn the glory into shame,  
15 Psalms 5 -- not stand in the judgment, Psalms 6, you  
16 understand that when you're reading the Psalms, always  
17 read them in the light of what?

18 BRAD AND KEVIN: The seven seals.

19 DAVID: The judgment.

20 BRAD AND KEVIN: Yeah.

21 DAVID: Now, that's where you get your first  
22 seal and that, that is your strength. Now, there's a  
23 lot of things in the Psalms like I haven't showed you  
24 as of yet, but hey, you know, Psalms 40, I come in the  
25 volume of the book. You all got that, you all got that  
down solid, don't you.

1 BRAD AND KEVIN: Um-hum.

2 DAVID: So according to the key of David, I  
3 have not lied to you. I've opened and now no one can  
4 shut it.

5 BRAD AND KEVIN: That's right, David.

6 DAVID: I mean, it's -- your -- that's the  
7 seal. No one can take that crown from you. You know  
8 something they don't know, so don't let their  
9 sophistries and sophistications and psychologies and  
10 all that because it's vanity. The doctrine, what is  
11 written aforetime is there that all men might judge and  
12 be judged by that work. Okay. Now, in the second  
13 seal, remember, according to Zechariah's testimony the  
14 Psalms incorporate around Isaiah, Micah, Hosea,  
15 Obadiah, Zephaniah, all that's been spoken about the  
16 Assyrian also is the same as the Babylonian. Right?  
17 Isaiah 13, the fall of Babylon, is the same as Isaiah  
18 14, the fall of Assyria. Remember those prophecies. I  
19 will break the Assyrian in my land and tread him  
20 underfoot. Remember?

21 BRAD AND KEVIN: Yeah.

22 DAVID: Okay. Now, that's where we're going  
23 to pick up now. The problem with the controversy is  
24 that we know that when God rose up Israel out of Egypt,  
25 the higher intelligences, that which governs the stars  
and the governments of all universes, in mercy and in

1 truth according to the promise of Abraham -- you  
2 remember Abraham was called out of Babylon wasn't he?

3 BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

4 DAVID: The land of Chaldea, Ur of Chaldea.  
5 And Babylon had become, you know, the land of Shinar  
6 had been made so because after the flood, when God  
7 commanded men to behold the rainbow, man was to be  
8 shown, not the written word, but by the elements of  
9 creation that every time a cloud would pass over the  
10 earth and rain would come, that by looking to the  
11 rainbow God promised he would never again bring a  
12 flood. That's the promise. Anytime you see a rainbow,  
13 it's a memorial of God's word, right?

14 BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

15 DAVID: But, mankind at large, having the  
16 element of rebellion, turned away from that reality and  
17 man began to build a tower that would cause them to  
18 escape from the next pending doom, right? God says,  
19 I'll bring a flood and Noah, in his day, said to the  
20 world, God will bring a flood and the world says what?

21 BRAD AND KEVIN: -- he wouldn't bring a  
22 flood.

23 DAVID: Yeah. In other words, no you won't.  
24 They said it was impossible, didn't they? But did a  
25 flood come?

BRAD AND KEVIN: Yeah.

1           DAVID: Okay. So then God says to Noah and  
2 his descendants, I will not bring a flood again and  
3 what did the world say?

4           BRAD AND KEVIN: He would.

5           DAVID: He said, yeah, you will. And they  
6 began to work together in perfect harmony to build a  
7 structure to protect themselves from something that God  
8 said would not happen. So God had to intervene because  
9 the world in its rebellion going contrary to God has no  
10 salvation with God. So God scattered the nations and  
11 brought down the tower and God chose one man, Abraham,  
12 to come out away from Babylon and gave him the promises  
13 and now this is where we see that 400 years later,  
14 according to the promise to Abraham, God came and  
15 brought his people by Moses out of Egypt, which was at  
16 that time the world's greatest empire. This is our  
17 faith, isn't it? God can deliver his people at will  
18 from any nation or empire that he desires. Right?

19           BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

20           DAVID: And he did so that he might use  
21 Israel as an example for all nations to know that the  
22 laws and commandments of God are above and beyond the  
23 laws and commandments of man, but Israel break the  
24 commandments and Israel break the laws. And so,  
25 therefore, God scattered them amongst the nations  
because the whole lesson is, is that if Israel does not

1 | want the simple laws of God, based in love, one towards  
2 | his neighbor, then God will cast him amongst the  
3 | heathens who have no laws of love, but yet they have to  
4 | have tons and tons and tons of laws because there --  
5 | these are so evil. You know, you know, Kevin, working  
6 | in the, in the system you worked in, that you know how  
7 | many laws there are, don't you?

8 |           KEVIN: Plenty.

9 |           DAVID: I mean, there's so many -- there's  
10 | more -- look, the Bible's got ten commandments. But  
11 | the, but the world -- the nations of men, they have  
12 | thousands of commandments, don't they?

13 |           KEVIN: Right.

14 |           DAVID: Because everybody's out to get  
15 | everybody else, aren't they? That's what Habakkuk  
16 | says, right? Okay, now. Let's get back into the  
17 | details now. So, Israel and Judah were finally given a  
18 | king. They wanted a king and God gave them Saul,  
19 | right?

20 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Um-hum.

21 |           DAVID: Now, Saul at the beginning was a good  
22 | king until he became arrogant and proud. So then he  
23 | became oppressive, didn't he? He began to gather up  
24 | the men of Israel for his wars, he began to take the  
25 | daughters of Judah, he began to build up his own riches  
and all that and build up his own palace and he became

1 arrogant and he got to where he wouldn't listen to God  
2 through Samuel. So God destroyed him. And this is an  
3 example for all men and all nations. God knows to  
4 abase the proud. Now, we know that Saul first caused  
5 Israel to fall into sin and that when a king or any  
6 person is given power over others -- provide an example  
7 of evil, then all of a sudden people want to be like  
8 that king. For instance, when Israel was in Egypt,  
9 their ideal of freedom was to be like the Egyptians,  
10 correct?

11 BRAD AND KEVIN: Um-hum.

12 DAVID: Poor man wants to be like the rich  
13 man, right?

14 KEVIN: That's right.

15 DAVID: Although the poor man will complain  
16 that the rich man oppresses him.

17 KEVIN: That's right.

18 DAVID: And we don't want to make the mistake  
19 to think that God's going to remove the wicked of the  
20 earth so that we can be put in their place to be wicked  
21 like them. If that's the way it's going to be, if  
22 Israel wants to be like the Gentiles, why remove the  
23 Gentiles? Why remove the heathen for if Israel wants  
24 to be like them. Why put heathen back in the place of  
25 the heathen? That's bad, isn't it?

BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

1           DAVID: Okay. So, we, we don't want to do  
2 that. So, now, how are we going to be able to stop,  
3 knowing that we ourselves are heathen at heart?  
4 Knowing that we ourselves are no better than they?  
5 That's the whole New Testament, Jew and Gentile -- I  
6 mean, the Jews are just as bad as the Gentiles  
7 according to nature. We have the same hunger, the same  
8 thirst, the same desires, we make up the same stories,  
9 we all have the same bad attitudes, everyone's cranky  
10 in the morning just like everybody else.

11           BRAD AND KEVIN: Um-hum.

12           DAVID: When, when, when a Jew who professes  
13 godliness sees a woman that's beautiful, he has the  
14 same thoughts go through his mind as the Playboy  
15 Gentile has, correct?

16           BRAD AND KEVIN: Um-hum.

17           DAVID: And there's no cover-up, there's no  
18 tradition, there's no ritual that can deny that. And  
19 that's what the New Testament is trying to tell us.  
20 Okay, now King Saul in his day was arrogant, proud,  
21 nasty, just like the nations around him, so God finally  
22 destroyed him and rose up David. Now, David himself  
23 even had troubles, but David was inspired of God and  
24 David made the prophecies. He wrote the Psalms that  
25 God had told him to write, and the prophecies and the  
Psalms all talk of a time when a righteousness one

1 | would be revealed. When a, when a king will be  
2 | immersed in Israel who will be ultimately righteous,  
3 | which we know is Christ.

4 |           And that we know that this Christ is the  
5 | prime subject of the New Covenant, which totally  
6 | reveals men should fight against their natural  
7 | tendencies, their flesh, their lust. Men should fight  
8 | against this natural evil that's within their hearts.  
9 | But on their own they can't do it. They can only do it  
10 | by a knowledge of God through who?

11 |           KEVIN: Christ.

12 |           DAVID: Exactly. So, the final knowledge to  
13 | be given to men being the seven seals, which is the  
14 | continuum in my doctrine ye shall know the truth and  
15 | the truth shall set you free. See, people want to be  
16 | free by keeping laws, but hey, those who profess to  
17 | keep laws break the laws so they find themselves in  
18 | bondage. But the free gift is that by truth, the law  
19 | came by Moses, grace and truth comes by Christ, the  
20 | truth of this time is to set us free, and that's what  
21 | we was looking at last night. How will we, in this  
22 | situation being under the mandate and of commandments  
23 | of the laws of men, how will we be made free? Okay.  
24 | Now, let's go back to Micah, Micah 1, let's review real  
25 | quick.

          BRAD AND KEVIN: Okay.

1           DAVID: Micah, being contemporary with  
2   Isaiah, you already know what Isaiah teaches,  
3   especially 1 to 6 -- he/she from man and all that.

4           BRAD AND KEVIN: Um-hum.

5           DAVID: Micah had foretold, and this is in  
6   verse 2, Micah's message -- remember, hear all ye  
7   people, hearken O earth and all that is therein.  
8   Remember, his message is not just for the Jews, is it?

9           BRAD AND KEVIN: No.

10          DAVID: No, his message, his message is to be  
11   herald, he claims, to all that's in the earth and his  
12   message is, let the Lord God be witness against you,  
13   the Lord from his holy what?

14          BRAD AND KEVIN: Temple.

15          DAVID: Now, that temple is where?

16          BRAD AND KEVIN: Heaven.

17          DAVID: In heaven. See, the prophets that  
18   were -- that spoke of these days illuminated their  
19   message because if God's going to punish his people,  
20   Israel, he's going to likewise punish the Gentiles,  
21   isn't he?

22          BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

23          DAVID: Now, the prophecy shows, for, behold,  
24   the Lord cometh forth out of his place, and will come  
25   down and tread upon the high places of the earth. And  
   the mountains shall be molten under him and the valleys

1 | shall be cleft, as wax before the fire, and as the  
2 | waters that are poured down a steep place. You know  
3 | what Zephaniah teaches and Isaiah teaches. You already  
4 | know all this, over and over, the sixth seal. Right?  
5 | And we're coming to that pretty soon, aren't we?

6 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Yeah.

7 |           DAVID: Okay. You already know about this,  
8 | but the part that we had trouble with is that when this  
9 | all started, guys, you know, I've been teaching you all  
10 | these months, you know, you know, there's a lot of  
11 | people made some mistakes, didn't they?

12 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Yes. Right.

13 |           DAVID: And God is, God is not going to  
14 | vindicate us if we make the same carnal, selfish  
15 | mistakes that the world daily flaunts themselves in. I  
16 | mean we're looking for higher things. We're looking  
17 | for things that, that are complete in God. We want out  
18 | of here. We want to get off this little ball, don't  
19 | we?

20 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Right, David.

21 |           DAVID: With God. We want to go from here to  
22 | a place of freedom where we're no longer in bondage to  
23 | the flesh, our stupidity, our good looks. We want to  
24 | get away from the guy in the mirror, don't we? Okay  
25 | now. Now, pay attention. Why does the prophet  
   | proclaim that God's going to come down and God's going

1 | to do a lot of stamping and a lot of burning and a lot  
2 | of anger's going to be administered? Why is it? Well,  
3 | for the transgression of what?

4 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Jacob.

5 |           DAVID: Is all this and for the sins of the  
6 | house of Israel. Well, now, it doesn't say for the  
7 | sins of the Gentiles, does it?

8 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: No.

9 |           DAVID: It doesn't say for the sins of the,  
10 | of the heathen. This is for the sins of God's people.  
11 | Now, remember, Micah saw this vision -- the period of  
12 | the four kings, Josiah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah.  
13 | Now, what is the transgression of Jacob? Is it not  
14 | Samaria? Now, Samaria was the capital of the ten  
15 | tribes. Now, remember, you've learned that the only  
16 | reason why the ten tribes separated from the two tribes  
17 | of Judah and Benjamin is because in the days of  
18 | Solomon, Solomon overtaxed the people, didn't he?

19 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

20 |           DAVID: I mean, he basically was bankrupting  
21 | his nation to fill his treasure chest, wasn't he?

22 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

23 |           DAVID: And to build all those nice buildings  
24 | for his pagan wives. Okay? So God punished Solomon so  
25 | that in the time of Rehoboam, his son, God foretold  
that because of this crime and overtaxing the people of

1 | Israel, that God would allow the ten tribes to be  
2 | separated from the two tribes and so Judah -- well,  
3 | Jacob was another name for Judah, Judah had brought it  
4 | upon himself, because God had allowed the kingship to  
5 | be from Judah and they overtaxed the people. And what  
6 | are the high places of Judah? Are they not Jerusalem.

7 |           I mean Solomon in his day and all the kings  
8 | of Judea tried to really make Jerusalem a metropolis,  
9 | didn't they? Adorning it with riches and glory and  
10 | honor, but their heart was lacking the knowledge of God  
11 | and instead of trying show God and God's truth and  
12 | benevolence to the world, they were trying to build up  
13 | and exalt their own little empire, weren't they?  
14 | Therefore, will I make Samaria as a heap of a field,  
15 | and as plantings of a vineyard and I will pour down the  
16 | stones thereof into the valley and I will discover the  
17 | foundations thereof. Didn't God destroy the ten  
18 | tribes?

19 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Yes.

20 |           DAVID: With the Assyrian, right? Took them  
21 | into -- captivity. Scattered the ten tribes amongst  
22 | the nations and all the graven images, which were their  
23 | idols, thereof shall be beaten to pieces and all the  
24 | hires thereof shall be burned with a fire and all idols  
25 | thereof will I lay desolate, for she gathered it of the  
    | hire of a harlot and they shall return to the hire of a

1 harlot. Man cannot go by his carnal senses and serve  
2 God, can he? The laws of God will always teach men  
3 what is right to do and it will always be against our  
4 feelings, right?

5 BRAD AND KEVIN: Yep.

6 DAVID: Remember, guys, when we used to go  
7 out to the restaurant?

8 BRAD AND KEVIN: Um-hum.

9 DAVID: All you can eat?

10 BRAD AND KEVIN: Yep.

11 DAVID: Remember we learned in Scripture that  
12 drunkenness is more than just alcohol. Anything we do  
13 in excess is drunkenness, isn't it?

14 BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

15 DAVID: So, before we came to the knowledge  
16 of the truth, we'd go out and eat all we could eat,  
17 till we'd eat till where we'd bust, right?

18 BRAD AND KEVIN: Uh-huh.

19 DAVID: The Scripture condemns that, doesn't  
20 it?

21 BRAD AND KEVIN: It sure does.

22 DAVID: It overtaxes the stomach, which  
23 overtaxes the mind. It takes blood from the brain.  
24 You know, people eat too much, they get real tired and  
25 sluggish and, and sleepy. All right. These things are  
wrong. It's called drunkenness by Scripture. Esau was

1 a drunkard. It's all he cared about was eating and  
2 drinking. Okay. So the thing of it is is that a  
3 harlot makes her hire by giving something sensual as a  
4 merchandise, selling herself through lust and God's  
5 people can't do that.

6 Okay. This is a part of idolatry. People  
7 that are of the flesh strictly move by their feelings  
8 and we can't do this. We got to go by what God tells  
9 us. Now, here's the thing. Micah says, therefore I  
10 will wail and howl. I will go stripped and naked, I  
11 will make a wailing like the dragons, and a mourning  
12 like as the doves (sic). He, he's, he's, he's upset,  
13 isn't he. For her wound, Israel's wound, is incurable,  
14 for it is come unto Judah. What is this wound? He is  
15 come to the gate of my people, even to Jerusalem. Now,  
16 the people of God are just like the heathen, aren't  
17 they?

18 BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

19 DAVID: They're sensual, they're devilish,  
20 they want to do their own thing. So who does God send  
21 to the gates of Judah? The king of who?

22 BRAD AND KEVIN: Assyria?

23 DAVID: The king of Assyria. As long as  
24 God's people want to be like the heathen, who will God  
25 allow to rule over them?

BRAD AND KEVIN: The --

1                   DAVID: The heathen. Okay. Declare ye if  
2 not at Gath, weep ye not at all at the house of Aphrah,  
3 roll thyself in the dust. I mean, all these cities  
4 that we're talking about here were overthrown by the  
5 Assyrians. Pass ye away thou inhabitants of Saphir,  
6 having thy shame naked; the inhabitant of Zaanan came  
7 not forth into the mourning of Bethazel. He shall  
8 receive you of his standing. In other words, the  
9 prophets sees that these cities are being overthrown by  
10 the Assyrian, you know, Sennacherib and, and all these  
11 kings of Assyria, and when the king would overthrow an  
12 empire, they would have to give him taxes. They would  
13 have to give him gifts, receive you his standing.

14                   For the inhabitant of Maroth waited carefully  
15 for good, but evil came down from the Lord into the  
16 gate of Jerusalem. So, really, who sent the Assyrian  
17 to overthrow Jerusalem?

18                   BRAD AND KEVIN: God.

19                   DAVID: God did. O thou inhabitant of  
20 Lachish, bind the chariot to the swift beast; she is  
21 the beginning of the sin of the daughter of Zion, for  
22 the transgressions of Israel were found in thee. So  
23 the idolatry of the heathen becomes the idolatry of  
24 Israel, and therefore defeats the purpose of God, of  
25 even having an Israel.

                  Therefore, shall thou give presents to

1 | Moresethgath, the houses of Achzib shall be a lie to  
2 | the kings of Israel. In other words, this is one of  
3 | the kings of Assyria. Yet I will bring an heir unto  
4 | thee O inhabitant of Mareshah. He shall come to  
5 | Adullam the glory of Israel. Now, wait a minute. The  
6 | Assyrian, being able to overthrow Judah, it's a crime.  
7 | But God says that an heir is to be raised up and he  
8 | comes where? To Adullam. Well, what was Adullam? Do  
9 | you all guys remember?

10 |               BRAD AND KEVIN: It was a place where David  
11 | hid in the caves?

12 |               DAVID: Exactly. Exactly. David of old,  
13 | when God had anointed him to take the kingdom there was  
14 | a crisis. Saul had taken the kingdom and would not  
15 | listen to God any longer, nor would listen to Samuel.  
16 | Now, when Saul realized that God had raised up another  
17 | king, Saul was fighting against David and David had to  
18 | hide out for a while, didn't he?

19 |               BRAD AND KEVIN: Uh-huh.

20 |               DAVID: Okay. Just like in the latter days  
21 | we're fixing to find that this prophecy progresses.  
22 | But everyone who has a knowledge to see and eyes to see  
23 | and ears to hear. Everyone who knows that God sits on  
24 | a throne in heaven, everyone who knows that God has a  
25 | book in his right hand, knows that the one who receives  
that book is called by Scripture the Prince of the

1 Kings of the Earth. Right? A prince is the one who's  
2 next in line to the kingdom, isn't he? Okay. Now,  
3 this heir is going to be the glory of Israel. Right?

4           Make thee bald and poll thee for thy delicate  
5 children, enlarge thy baldness as the eagle, for they  
6 are gone into captivity from thee. Now, Israel and  
7 Judah, going into captivity, as well as the heathen  
8 nations are all going to be overthrown by Assyria and  
9 we find out that God begins to explain certain woes  
10 that we should not do. It says, woe to them that  
11 devise iniquity and work evil upon their beds; when the  
12 morning is light, they practice it because it is in the  
13 power of their hand.

14           There are men who have authority who if they  
15 want something, they have power to get it. It says,  
16 they covet fields, and take them by violence. I mean,  
17 isn't that what war is all about? When one nation  
18 wants a property from another nation, how do they get  
19 it?

20           BRAD AND KEVIN: Take it by violence.

21           DAVID: By violence. And they take houses  
22 and take them away so they oppress a man and his house,  
23 even a man and his heritage. This is how the nations  
24 of Babylon overthrew Judah and Israel and all the other  
25 nations. It's the way Medo-Persians overthrew Babylon.  
It's the way the Greeks overthrew Medo-Persia. It's

1 | the way the Romans overthrew Grecia. It's the way the  
2 | nations split up in the days of Europe and war has been  
3 | amongst them ever since. It's even the way that  
4 | America overthrew the American Indian and took this  
5 | land, isn't it?

6 |           God says, woe to them. Now, people that  
7 | enter the war trying to get gain don't realize that  
8 | God's pronounced a woe, but nonetheless Micah says that  
9 | the lesson is for all the earth and all that dwell  
10 | therein. Like Revelation 13 tells us that even though  
11 | man does not acknowledge it, it says he that liveth by  
12 | the sword must die by the sword, right? Okay.

13 |           Now, in that day shall one take up a parable  
14 | against you, okay? It says here, therefore, thus saith  
15 | the Lord, behold, against this family do I devise an  
16 | evil from which ye shall not remove your necks, neither  
17 | shall ye go haughty, for this time is evil. What kind  
18 | of family are we talking about here? Guys?

19 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: I give up.

20 |           DAVID: Well, who are they who covet fields  
21 | and take them by violence?

22 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: The Babylonians, Assyrians.

23 |           DAVID: Well, okay. But how far does that go  
24 | all the way back. You heard the mark of the beast,  
25 | remember?

          BRAD AND KEVIN: Uh-huh.

1           DAVID: -- in Daniel 7 that these empires who  
2 shall rise and fall are like unto the beast of the  
3 field. It's nature, isn't it? Who was the first  
4 murderer?

5           BRAD AND KEVIN: Cain.

6           DAVID: Cain. Cain. Cain coveted something,  
7 didn't he?

8           BRAD AND KEVIN: Yep.

9           DAVID: Cain wanted a blessing but he didn't  
10 get it. Why?

11          BRAD AND KEVIN: He wouldn't listen to God.

12          DAVID: But who did listen.

13          BRAD AND KEVIN: Abel.

14          DAVID: Abel got the blessing, didn't he?  
15 Made Cain mad. So, Cain wanted it so what did Cain do  
16 to Abel?

17          BRAD AND KEVIN: Killed him.

18          DAVID: By violence, right? And so God  
19 placed a mark upon Cain and that -- remember, the  
20 simple stories of Scripture, the stories of individuals  
21 become the stories of the nature of whole nations.  
22 It's like Germans that in Germany, I mean, they wanted  
23 to be a superior race. They wanted to conquer the  
24 world. They wanted to, to, to take away lives of men  
25 and they wanted to take away lives of women and  
children. All because they wanted to be a superior

1 | race and have dominion. But it came, it came to  
2 | naught, didn't it? Okay.

3 |           Now, watch. So this evil family is, is the  
4 | family which all the way back to the Book of Genesis  
5 | states the enmity between the dragon's seed and the  
6 | woman's seed. We know that those who obey God, those  
7 | who hear God's counsel from his temple, are of the seed  
8 | of the woman. Right? The spirit. And those who know  
9 | not the will of God or of the seed, of the devil. Now,  
10 | you guys know we were here minding our own business,  
11 | doing our own thing. Right?

12 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

13 |           DAVID: And you all know we've always sought  
14 | after peace, but you also already know what Nahum  
15 | teaches and all that.

16 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

17 |           DAVID: You know, you know that God has not  
18 | left us with our behinds uncovered, right? But like I  
19 | told you all these months and all these years, the day  
20 | will come. Remember when I showed you that film?

21 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

22 |           DAVID: Remember it said on -- they showed on  
23 | that badge of the ATF, it just said 666.

24 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Yep.

25 |           DAVID: Now, remember that number -- well,  
anyway we won't -- I don't want to give that

1 information over the phone, but remember in all the  
2 things that you were shown, hey, did I lie to you? Did  
3 it happen or not?

4 BRAD AND KEVIN: Yes, it did.

5 DAVID: Right? See, everything is on stage,  
6 but even though everything that I've shown you over  
7 these months is come to pass to the very letter,  
8 nonetheless, we made a mistake.

9 BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

10 DAVID: Now, now, you don't have to worry  
11 about man and man's judgment. We got to make it right  
12 with the Father, don't we? God is not a respecter of  
13 persons. Right? It's an individual thing. Now, so we  
14 know that this nature of man who covets fields and  
15 takes them by violence and houses and take them away,  
16 they oppress a man, even a man and his heritage,  
17 therefore, they said, Lord, against this family did I  
18 devise an evil from which ye shall not remove your  
19 necks.

20 Neither shall ye go haughty for this time is  
21 evil. It's an evil time. In that day shall one take  
22 up a parable against you and lament with a doleful  
23 lamentation, and say, we be utterly spoiled. He has  
24 changed the portion of my people. How hath he removed  
25 it from me. Turning aside, he's divided our fields.  
In other words, somebody gets their land taken away,

1 don't they?

2 BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

3 DAVID: By somebody who thinks they have the  
4 power to do it, right?

5 BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

6 DAVID: Therefore, shalt thou have none that  
7 shall cast a cord by lot in the congregation of the  
8 Lord. For those who take away this property, those who  
9 take away by violence and take away a man -- from a man  
10 his heritage, God says they're going where? To heaven?

11 BRAD AND KEVIN: No.

12 DAVID: Going where?

13 BRAD AND KEVIN: To hell.

14 DAVID: To hell. Now, we know that Micah's  
15 prophecy is one of the one's that sealed till the time  
16 of the end. Now, we know that the tactics being used  
17 against us was definitely like Nahum says in all the  
18 prophets we've been showing you. The tactic of  
19 violence. I mean, you know, properties being destroyed  
20 and all this. But you know that the individuals that  
21 we're now to deal with do not want us to try to open to  
22 their understanding the prophecies, do they?

23 BRAD AND KEVIN: No.

24 DAVID: So, naturally the one who takes up  
25 the parable we already know from other testaments is  
the heir. The heir who comes to Adullam, the glory of

1 | Israel, which was -- David is the same one who through  
2 | the heirship of David, Christ, is found in bringing the  
3 | seven seals of which -- from the temple of God here in  
4 | Micah in the latter days, this mystery of God shall be  
5 | finished as he has declared to his servants the what?

6 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Prophecies.

7 |           DAVID: You see, the man of today doesn't  
8 | think these prophecies still mean anything. They call  
9 | the prophets Old Testament, but they fail to understand  
10 | that what has been done in the past will be required of  
11 | men in every generation until the time of the end. Man  
12 | who's given authority who does not exercise authority  
13 | in justice and in truth will be dealt severely with by  
14 | God. Now, it says here, prophesy ye not say they to  
15 | them that prophesy. I mean, we would like to prophesy  
16 | to these people, wouldn't we?

17 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

18 |           DAVID: We'd like to let them know what the  
19 | prophecies teach, wouldn't we?

20 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Well, we're trying.

21 |           DAVID: They shall not prophesy to them that  
22 | they shall not take shame. These people have no shame  
23 | in what they're doing. It's just standard procedure.  
24 | But, remember, it's not their fault; it's our fault,  
25 | isn't it?

          BRAD AND KEVIN: Right. Yeah.

1           DAVID: Oh, thou that are named the house of  
2 Jacob is the spirit of the Lord straightened? I mean,  
3 do they got God tied up in a chair somewhere?

4           BRAD AND KEVIN: No.

5           DAVID: No. Are these his doings?

6           BRAD AND KEVIN: Yes.

7           DAVID: Yeah. I mean, God allows the heathen  
8 to rule over his people when his people do things like  
9 the what?

10          BRAD AND KEVIN: Heathens.

11          DAVID: Like the heathen. Do not my words do  
12 good to him that walketh uprightly? I mean, you know,  
13 we got to realize something here. If we're going to be  
14 like them, then it's going to be a dog-eat-dog world.  
15 Even of late my people is risen up as an enemy. Ye  
16 pull off the robe with the garment from them that pass  
17 by securely as men averse from war. The women of my  
18 people have ye cast out of their pleasant houses, from  
19 their children have ye taken away my glory forever.  
20 Now, we know what the, we know what the glory is, don't  
21 we?

22          BRAD AND KEVIN: Yes.

23          DAVID: The one who comes to Adullam, which  
24 is the seed of David, right? Psalms 45? Arise ye and  
25 depart for this is not your rest because it is  
polluted. It will destroy you with a sore destruction.

1 If a man walking inn the spirit and falsehood do lie,  
2 saying I will prophesy unto thee of wine and strong  
3 drink -- I mean, remember what we were saying the other  
4 night? Brad?

5 BRAD: Yeah?

6 DAVID: Liquor does not make you bulletproof,  
7 does it? Does it?

8 BRAD: No.

9 KEVIN: No.

10 DAVID: It doesn't, does it? But in a time  
11 of war a lot of people like to swig the old bottle,  
12 don't they? Is that, is that, is that what God wants  
13 us to have? Is liquid courage?

14 BRAD AND KEVIN: No.

15 DAVID: No. That's an abomination, you know,  
16 2000 years ago they tried to give vinegar, you know, it  
17 was tasted and it was refused. When God wants us to  
18 have pain, he wants us to have pain. He wants us to  
19 feel it, don't he?

20 BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

21 DAVID: Now, even though the crisis brought  
22 to view in Micah deals with the king of Assyria coming  
23 to Judah and Israel. God brings an Assyrian like  
24 Isaiah says, I will bring the rod of the Assyrian  
25 against the hypocritical people, so that these people  
can have a chance to realize that they are not to

1 | receive any good thing from God until they start being  
2 | good. We don't want to be like the heathen. And when  
3 | we decide that we're going to be separate and distinct  
4 | from the heathen, then God will restore to us the  
5 | promises that I've been showing you all these months  
6 | and years.

7 |           Now, it says, I will surely assemble, O  
8 | Jacob, all of thee. I will surely gather the remnant  
9 | of Israel, I will put them together as the sheep of  
10 | Bozrah, as the flock in the midst of their fold, they  
11 | shall be great -- make a great noise by reason of the  
12 | multitude of men. Now, the breaker is come up before  
13 | them. Who is it come up before Judah?

14 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: The Assyrian.

15 |           DAVID: The Assyrian. Now, what beast  
16 | according to Daniel is called the one who breaks in  
17 | pieces?

18 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Bear?

19 |           DAVID: Nope. The fourth beast, break in  
20 | pieces and devoured.

21 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Dragon.

22 |           DAVID: Right. Okay? They have broken up,  
23 | they've passed through the gate. They're gone out by  
24 | it and their king shall pass before them and the Lord  
25 | on the head of them. Now, remember the prophet is  
   | talking about an event that all the earth should know

1 about. We know in the days of Hezekiah, when the  
2 Assyrian came, the Assyrian was not allowed to enter  
3 into the gates of Jerusalem, were they? The Angel of  
4 the Lord destroyed 185,000 of them, right? But we know  
5 in the time of Christ, that Christ by Rome was allowed  
6 to be taken outside the gate of the city and crucified  
7 on Golgotha, right? Remember that? Are you guys with  
8 me?

9 BRAD AND KEVIN: Yes.

10 DAVID: Okay. And I said, hear, I pray you,  
11 O heads of Jacob and ye princes of the house of Israel.  
12 Is it not for you to know judgment? I mean, is Israel  
13 supposed to know the prophecies? Are they supposed to  
14 be ignorant like the heathen, or are they supposed to  
15 know aforetime what God's will is?

16 BRAD AND KEVIN: They're supposed to know.

17 DAVID: They're supposed to know. Israel,  
18 who is in idolatry, cannot know. Micah is sent to  
19 proclaim to the people of God that the Assyrian comes  
20 only because of their own sins and that the evil of, of  
21 desiring, the covetness, of wanting to take away land  
22 by violence, and wanting to take away a man's heritage  
23 by means of force, God condemns it. Okay. The  
24 statement is, is that Micah wants to know if Israel is  
25 not supposed to know judgment.

Who hate the good and love the evil, who

1 pluck off their skin from off them and their flesh from  
2 off their bones. Who also eat the flesh of my people  
3 and flay their skin from off them and break their bones  
4 and chop them in pieces, as for the pot, as flesh for  
5 the caldron. Well, we'd already learned earlier that  
6 the sin of Jacob was Samaria. In other words, one  
7 thing that the Judean kingdom did to its people was it  
8 overtaxed them, wasn't it.

9           You know, it's, it's funny like in every  
10 nation this happens is that the nations, the political  
11 powers end up taxing the people so much to where  
12 actually the people end up doing nothing but for  
13 working for their governments. Right? So, you know,  
14 America, America doesn't just do it. It's been done  
15 since the beginning of time. So, then shall they cry  
16 unto the Lord, but he will not hear them for he will  
17 even hide his face from them at that time, as they have  
18 behaved themselves ill in their doings.

19           Thus saith the Lord concerning the prophets  
20 that make my people err, that bite with their teeth and  
21 cry, peace, and he hath put not in their mouth, even  
22 they prepare war against him. So you know how a lot of  
23 people even today are all saying the peace, peace,  
24 peace. God's going to come. Peace, peace. Right?

25           BRAD AND KEVIN: Uh-huh.

          DAVID: But you guys know in the seal that

1 I've shown you. There's only peace for those who what?

2 BRAD AND KEVIN: Know --

3 DAVID: Know the truth, right? Therefore,  
4 night shall be unto you that ye shall not have a vision  
5 and it shall be dark to you and you shall not divine.  
6 The sun shall go down over the prophets and the day  
7 shall be dark over them. Then shall the seers be  
8 ashamed and the diviners confounded. Yea, they shall  
9 even cover their lips for there is no answer of God.

10 But truly I am full of power by the spirit of the Lord  
11 and of judgment and of might to declare unto Jacob, his  
12 transgression and to Israel his sin. Hear this, I  
13 pray, ye heads of the house of Jacob, and princes of  
14 the house of Israel that abhor judgment and pervert all  
15 equity. They build up Zion with blood and Jerusalem  
16 with iniquity. The heads thereof judge for what?

17 BRAD AND KEVIN: Reward.

18 DAVID: In other words, hey. Were the judges  
19 of Israel supposed to make big money off the judgments?

20 BRAD AND KEVIN: No.

21 DAVID: No, but that's what they were doing.  
22 Like the heathen do that, don't they?

23 JOHN: Hey, David.

24 DAVID: The priests -- teach for hire.

25 JOHN: David.

DAVID: Yes.

1 JOHN: This is John. Can you hear me?

2 DAVID: Yeah.

3 JOHN: Do you know how much longer you'll  
4 need for the lesson? The, the reason I ask is we've  
5 got a call on another line and -- from the Sheriff's  
6 Office and they've got to use that facility for  
7 something else. Much longer?

8 DAVID: Well, probably about, probably about  
9 30 minutes or so.

10 JOHN: Well, I think that's going to present  
11 a problem, you know, because you --

12 DAVID: Well, can, can they call me back?

13 DICK: Hey, David?

14 DAVID: Yes.

15 DICK: This is Dick. Frankly, we're using  
16 Sheriff Harwell's office and their renovation up here  
17 and they've got some folks that need to do some work in  
18 here and the sheriff was kind enough to let us use his  
19 office in his absence and we kind of tried to make an  
20 agreement with him that we would try to get, get out of  
21 here by about, by about 7:30, 7:35.

22 DAVID: What time is it now there, Dick?

23 DICK: I've got about 7:20.

24 DAVID: Okay. Just let me have a few more  
25 minutes with these guys.

DICK: Okay. That's good.

1 DAVID: Okay.

2 JOHN: Okay. Thanks, David.

3 DAVID: Okay, guys, look.

4 JOHN: Thank you.

5 DAVID: Are you there?

6 BRAD AND KEVIN: Yes, we are.

7 DAVID: Are you there?

8 BRAD AND KEVIN: Yes. We are, David.

9 DAVID: Okay. Look, we know in verse 12,  
10 Zion is plowed for your sake. We know God's punished  
11 the Jews and the -- by the Assyrians, by the  
12 Babylonians, Medo-Persians, Greeks, Romans. In the  
13 days of Christ, Matthew 23, Matthew 23, Christ says, O  
14 Jerusalem, that which stoneth the prophets. We already  
15 know all that, right? How often I would have gathered  
16 you and you would not. The problem's with Israel,  
17 isn't it?

18 BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

19 DAVID: Chapter 4, what's going to happen in  
20 the last days, though. What's the promise there?

21 BRAD AND KEVIN: God is going to set up his  
22 kingdom.

23 DAVID: The kingdom's going to be set up. We  
24 know according to Daniel 4, in the days of defeat,  
25 we're already here. The rock -- the Father is coming  
now, right? He's going to get rid of all these leaders

1 | and all these empires, right? And we know that in  
2 | verse 5 of 4 all people who walk, everyone in the name  
3 | of what? His god. And we, we who've been learning in  
4 | Micah and the prophecies, right? Will walk in the name  
5 | of our god for how long?

6 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Ever and ever.

7 |           DAVID: Okay. So in verse 7, those who halt  
8 | are made a remnant, aren't they? They're going to make  
9 | a strong nation. Now, we're at the part here in verses  
10 | 10, be in pain and labor to bring forth, O daughter of  
11 | Zion. Right? For now thou shalt go forth in the city  
12 | and thou shalt dwell in the field and go even to  
13 | Babylon. The church went into Babylon, didn't it?

14 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Yes.

15 |           DAVID: Now, remember, always remember, in  
16 | Daniel that Babylon is not just the nation of  
17 | Nebuchadnezzar. Babylon is the whole overall image,  
18 | the head of gold, the arms of silver, the legs of brass  
19 | -- I mean, excuse me, the belly of brass, the legs of  
20 | iron, the feet part of iron, part of clay. These are  
21 | the only dominions that my Father in heaven is going to  
22 | allow to rule over Israel. So you've got to remember  
23 | that. We have the preeminence, not them. Now, let me  
24 | finish this real quick over here. Okay. In chapter 5,  
25 | when it says to gather in troop O daughter of troops.  
He has laid seeds against us.

1           Now, this prophecy, this prophecy is for the  
2 latter days, from Chapter 4 all the way out to the last  
3 days. Now, this is where we're at. I mean, we're,  
4 we're under siege, aren't we?

5           BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

6           DAVID: Now, they shall smite the judge of  
7 Israel with a rod upon the cheek. Now, we know the  
8 Father judges no men, but gave all judgment to who?

9           BRAD AND KEVIN: The Lamb.

10          DAVID: And the Lamb's going to judge the  
11 world, not by their deeds, but by whether they want  
12 truth or not, right? But thou, Bethlehem Ephratah,  
13 thou be little under the thousands of Judah, yet out of  
14 thee shall he come forth unto me that is to be ruler in  
15 Israel.

16          Now, we know that from Bethlehem comes  
17 Mashiach, came Christ, right? And that Christ went to  
18 heaven, didn't he? And that same Christ, the Father  
19 gave him a what?

20          BRAD AND KEVIN: Book.

21          DAVID: And they don't know that yet, do  
22 they? They -- can reveal the seals? Okay. Right?  
23 Okay. Therefore will he give them up until the time  
24 which she travaileth and brought forth. Now, this is  
25 the period of time we're in right now. So when you  
continue to read, always keep your eyes on the seventh

1 chapter of Micah. That seventh chapter, that's where  
2 -- the period we're in now is the -- as it was in  
3 Moses' day coming out of the land of Egypt, you know,  
4 always remember. In, in Micah 7, the best of them,  
5 verse 4, is as a brier, and the most upright sharper  
6 than a thorn hedge, right? Do you see what we're  
7 saying? See verse 7 there?

8 BRAD AND KEVIN: Yeah.

9 DAVID: Therefore will I look unto the what?

10 BRAD AND KEVIN: Lord.

11 DAVID: I will wait for the god of my what?

12 BRAD AND KEVIN: My god will hear me.

13 DAVID: Okay. And that, that Father is the  
14 one who's been showing you all of these things, right?

15 BRAD AND KEVIN: Right.

16 DAVID: Okay. It says, when I fall, I shall  
17 arise, when I sit in darkness, the Lords shall be a  
18 light unto me. I will bear the indignation of the Lord  
19 because I've sinned against who? Now, you guys know  
20 what you've done.

21 BRAD AND KEVIN: Yep.

22 DAVID: Now, these guys on the outside, they  
23 don't know nothing of what you all have learned and  
24 they'll look at you and you're just simple people and  
25 you can't oratate (sic) like me or Steve, but the thing  
of it is, we know who she is in verse 10. It's our

1 | enemy, don't we. That image in Daniel, that woman, the  
2 | mystery, the wine cup of the world, the spirit of  
3 | adultery, those who know not the Lord. In verse 12, in  
4 | that day he comes to thee from Assyria, from the  
5 | fortified cities. Okay. Keep these things in your  
6 | mind. Do you have any questions real quick before I  
7 | have to go?

8 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: No, you said about it.

9 |           DAVID: Huh?

10 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: I can't think of any right  
11 | off-hand, David.

12 |           DAVID: Okay. That seventh chapter and when  
13 | you read Zephaniah and Nahum and all that, remember  
14 | this final controversy over those seals. Now, you know  
15 | the seals. Don't share that with anybody. Keep that  
16 | to yourself. Just keep your eyes looking to the seals  
17 | and realize, you know, like I say, this is for your  
18 | benefit. This is your faith towards God and the star's  
19 | coming. You know that.

20 |           BRAD AND KEVIN: Yeah.

21 |           DAVID: And at the proper time it'll speed up  
22 | a lot faster than what science will tell you. So  
23 | anyway, so just, just hold onto that and we'll let you  
24 | go for now, okay? We got to get, we got to get some  
25 | more people here straightened out because we're going  
   | to be sending some more people out.
