1 JOHN COX: -- well, I'll pass it on because I
2 know what David said, that he wanted to --

3 STEVE: David said --

4 JOHN COX: -- have a prayer session this
5 evening with people that were going to be coming out
6 and if, if this makes it difficult for the prayer
7 session, it won't be held so I hear where you're coming
8 from.

9 STEVE: Okay, listen, David just said to me,
10 you know, after talking to John Dolan yesterday, you
11 last night, you know exactly what we're about. We're
12 trying to give people an opportunity -- he's letting
13 them ask their questions, finalizing that with them,
14 that they might be sure in their own mind and confident
15 in why they even came here, that they go out. This of
16 course is creating the opposite effect.

17 JOHN COX: Okay.

18 STEVE: So, I mean it's up to them. You
19 know, you give it to them. They can continue with
20 this. It's fine. You know, it's their choice, of
21 course. (Koresh in background not discernible.) Every
22 time -- is John, John --

23 JOHN COX: I'm sorry. Yeah.

24 STEVE: Like David said, every time we've
25 complied with you people and we've worked and every
time it starts becoming a snowball effect where we're

1 working harder and harder, something like this comes up
2 and if it's not turning off the electricity and
3 reneging on like the Newsweek and all that sort of
4 thing and like happened a week ago Friday, almost 10
5 days ago. Now here we go again. Anytime we start
6 trying to do and facilitate the very things that Byron
7 is talking about, maybe not 40, 50 or 150 people in the
8 day, but we're working with these people. But this is
9 the sort of thing that is -- (Koresh in background not
10 discernible) -- no, in fact, he told you that last
11 night. He can't even get that many people in his room.
12 And like I made it very clear that day that he came
13 down and took a chance of moving around, he started
14 bleeding all over again. But you know, it's up to them
15 --

16 JOHN COX: Well, let me talk to some people
17 and see what we can do.

18 STEVE: Sure. No problem, you know. But
19 like I'm saying for myself,
20 I --

21 JOHN COX: We're all -- all the people that
22 you're talking to out here are trying to resolve it
23 successfully.

24 STEVE: Well, I have a hard time buying that
25 after our third --

JOHN COX: Well, don't. Don't have a hard

1 | time because we really are.

2 | STEVE: I talked to John. Well, John, today
3 | I talked to John-3 all day and the man may mean well.
4 | It might be your psychology games you have between you
5 | all. I know when a person goes to buy an automobile,
6 | there are dealerships set up where one guy comes on real
7 | hard and then you get a softie who finally the person
8 | turns to that person, almost --

9 | JOHN COX: Well, we're, none of us are
10 | softies and none of us are hardies. We're all, we're
11 | all -- we may have a little different personalities but
12 | we're all striving for the same thing.

13 | STEVE: Byron and John-3 today -- the way
14 | Byron came on in the evening. I mean, well, you know,
15 | here we are working with you and Dolan and thinking
16 | we're getting somewhere and bingo, I mean, you know --
17 | (Kor'esh in background not discernible) -- it is, that's
18 | what I told him. It happened 10 days ago on that
19 | Friday night. We were on a roll. Things were starting
20 | to pick up and bang. So you know --

21 | JOHN COX: Let me go talk to some people.

22 | STEVE: Okay.

23 | JOHN COX: That's the best option I have.

24 | STEVE: All right.

25 | JOHN COX: Okay.

 STEVE: David is here strumming on the guitar

1 | so he'll be awake.

2 | JOHN COX: Uh-oh. Don't let him strum too
3 | long.

4 | STEVE: No, okay.

5 | JOHN COX: I'll be back in touch with you.

6 | STEVE: All right.

7 | JOHN COX: Bye.

8 | STEVE: Okay. Bye.

12 | STEVE: David wanted to know if that's the
13 | best your choir can do.

14 | JOHN COX: It's that bad. I don't know.

15 | STEVE: He doesn't know, he said. Just a
16 | minute.

17 | DAVID: You've not been privileged to hear
18 | this fine selection of music?

19 | JOHN COX: No. No. What is it?

20 | DAVID: It goes like this -- it goes [makes
21 | noise]. It's Latin but it's like turned down real low
22 | and it's got weird sound [makes noise] --

23 | JOHN COX: If it sped up a little would it
24 | make any sense do you think?

25 | DAVID: I believe so.

 JOHN COX: Oh, Lord. I don't know.

1 DAVID: It might be bat masking but --

2 JOHN COX: I don't know. I don't know.

3 Listen, I passed on --

4 STEVE: Let them guys know what we're doing.

5 JOHN COX: -- what you said and actually
6 before I could get a response, Steve called about the
7 other music. You know, I thought -- you were talking
8 about Byron, Byron's --

9 DAVID: Here it comes again. Here it comes
10 again. Hear it?

11 JOHN COX: I can't, I can't hear it.

12 DAVID: Put this phone to the window there --

13 JOHN COX: I can hear it.

14 (music)

15 STEVE: Could you hear it?

16 JOHN COX: Marvelous, marvelous.

17 STEVE: John, John --

18 JOHN COX: I could hear it. Let me tell you.

19 I --

20 STEVE: Can I say something?

21 JOHN COX: Go ahead.

22 STEVE: I mean, this is an experience for me.
23 Living in America all these years, to think our
24 founding -- you know, mature men -- this is 1993.
25 We're going into the Dark Ages, aren't we. I mean, you
know, you know what the Dark Ages were about --

1 JOHN COX: When David, called --

2 STEVE: -- the persecution of millions of
3 people because they had convictions of conscience and
4 so forth. You know that the prophecies talk about us
5 going back into such a state.

6 JOHN COX: Listen, when I got the first call
7 to try and --

8 STEVE: What kind of mindset -- I want to
9 discuss this with you guys --

10 JOHN COX: Listen. Listen to me Steve. When
11 I got the first call about the monotonous dialogue that
12 was coming over the recorder, I went back to try and
13 find somebody that could resolve that situation.

14 STEVE: Leave it on because, you know, like
15 David said --

16 JOHN COX: Listen to me. I tried to find
17 somebody that could resolve this thing. So, I talked
18 to somebody and the response was that the person that
19 ordered this done will not be back until the morning --

20 STEVE: The person that ordered it done won't
21 be back until the morning, he said.

22 JOHN COX: And they made the decision for it.

23 STEVE: And they made the decision for it.

24 JOHN COX: Now, when you called me back and
25 you said this owakanobe music or whatever it is is
going on. That's what it sounds like, owakanobe, or

1 something.

2 STEVE: Owakanobe music?

3 JOHN COX: I don't know what it is.

4 STEVE: He calls it owakanobe music.

5 JOHN COX: Well, that's what it sounds like
6 doesn't it? Ow-kan-obe, or something. Anyhow, when you
7 called and said that was going on, I went back and
8 said, well, what can we do. And, the response was, and
9 this was after you told me, hey, nobody is coming out
10 with this, you can play it as loud as you want, ba-ba
11 ba-ba ba-ba, every time we try to comply with
12 something, something goes wrong. So I said, well, what
13 can we do about it? And, the response was, if you tell
14 us, give us a commitment how many people are coming
15 out, maybe we can do something about it.

16 STEVE: Yeah. He says, if we make a
17 commitment as to how many people are coming out, then
18 they'll turn it off. (Koresh in background not
19 discernible). He said, you know, he's being really
20 cool and decent about this, with a smile. He says all
21 of us eventually --

22 JOHN COX: I know that and you know that --

23 STEVE: You and I both know this is slowing
24 the process down. No question --

25 JOHN COX: I know what you're telling me. I
understand what you're telling me. The question that

1 | was posed to me that I'm posing to you, all right. I'm
2 | the facilitator; I'm the middleman. I'm posing it to
3 | you. How many people are coming out after David has
4 | the opportunity to --

5 | STEVE: You're not --

6 | JOHN COX: Let me, let me just pass on what I
7 | was asked.

8 | STEVE: I know. Go ahead.

9 | JOHN COX: Let me just pass on what I asked
10 | because I already know what your answer is. All right.
11 | But let me pass on --

12 | STEVE: What, that this county is ripe for --

13 | JOHN COX: Let me pass on -- come on Steve.
14 | All right. I was asked, after David gets done praying
15 | with his people and after they go over Micah and after
16 | they go over Nam, if the music is turned off, how many
17 | people will come out tomorrow. That's the only
18 | question I was asked to ask you, or ask David, either
19 | one.

20 | STEVE: Well, I just mentioned it to him, so
21 | he's not saying anything about it.

22 | JOHN COX: That's what I was asked to check.

23 | (Koresh in background not discernible.)

24 | STEVE: How many were sent out today, in the
25 | 24-hour period between last night, later than this
 | period of time right now and --

1 JOHN COX: Seven.

2 STEVE: That's correct. Seven.

3 JOHN COX: The two ladies came out about
4 12:15 and then five came out during the day.

5 STEVE: That's right. So that's what David
6 asked.

7 JOHN COX: Huh? Well, I know that. But all
8 I was asked was to have the music turned off to give
9 David the opportunity to spend time with these people,
10 what commitment would he make as far as numbers of
11 people that are coming out tomorrow.

12 STEVE: David says that he doesn't understand
13 it because instead of speeding things up, it seems like
14 they're trying to hinder it. I mean, honestly --

15 JOHN COX: I'm not going to argue that with
16 you. All I, all I was asked is to ask a question and
17 to get an answer to that so that we can try to work
18 with this.

19 STEVE: All I can say is whoever God is or
20 isn't, all these years, I'm kind of glad for an
21 experience like this. I really am. I mean, I never --
22 can I just talk for a little while?

23 JOHN COX: Just give me an idea and then talk
24 and talk and talk. Give me an idea.

25 STEVE: I don't -- he's not -- I asked him.
He's not --

1 JOHN COX: Yeah, what did he say?

2 STEVE: Nothing. He said what I just told
3 you he said.

4 JOHN COX: Well, try and help me --

5 STEVE: Let me just say -- you helped me
6 once --

7 JOHN COX: All right.

8 STEVE: I was raised in this country just
9 like you were. I was born here. I went through all
10 the system and everything. I learned about the
11 Constitution. What a great country we have. I always
12 knew that ultimately it would come to this. I saw it
13 eroding years ago.

14 JOHN COX: Where did you see it eroding?

15 STEVE: By certain powerful men in certain
16 positions. Tyranny is what the word has been ever
17 since for 6,000 years from this person Cain, there was
18 Cain and Abel. But here, I don't know, it's still a
19 hard thing to believe that in this country that there
20 are men that do things like this. People sitting in
21 their homes are attacked and ransacked just like the
22 examples given to me about the ATF, the mistakes
23 they've made. They don't get out over the airwaves.
24 There ought to be TV programs about things like that.
25 It's hard to believe that this was the country that was
founded by people trying to get away to practice their

1 | religious beliefs and not force them on others. It's
2 | not happening any more, is it? Are you there?

3 | JOHN COX: I'm listening to you, Steve. Go
4 | ahead.

5 | STEVE: What do you think about this America,
6 | what's happening now? I mean --

7 | JOHN COX: I think it's still the best --

8 | STEVE: -- this isn't Russia or Siberia.
9 | We're not talking about some African nation or some
10 | Hindu gurus or something.

11 | JOHN COX: Steve, when I've talked to you and
12 | when anyone else has talked to you, or to David or to
13 | anyone else in there, we want to communicate. We want
14 | to get a dialogue going, we want to get a rapport build
15 | up --

16 | STEVE: Well, I'm actually, no --

17 | JOHN COX: -- and we want to resolve this
18 | thing.

19 | STEVE: Listen, John. Can you give me an
20 | answer what you think of this kind of thing and
21 | America, you know, the way -- America is over 200 years
22 | old now.

23 | JOHN COX: Well, I'll tell you about this
24 | thing. Some people's patience wear thin and their
25 | patience wears thin and they say, look, if somebody
wants to not move along fast enough, we going to try

1 | and assist them in moving. That's why I said, what
2 | kind of a figure can I give to somebody -- and if --
3 | whatever you want to tell me --

4 | STEVE: Round and round the merry-go-round we
5 | go.

6 | JOHN COX: Anything that you want to tell me.

7 | STEVE: How do you relate this to someone
8 | like George Washington, Abraham Lincoln, Jefferson. Is
9 | this what you think they had in mind for this country
10 | and the peoples of this country and their guaranteed
11 | freedom and rights and consciousness and all the rest?
12 | Is that what you think? I was sitting here three weeks
13 | ago minding my own business and doing nothing illegal
14 | nor did I before that day nor since that time. And all
15 | of a sudden, I'm to come out, go through prison,
16 | probably, who knows what you kind of people are up to.
17 | I -- I'll tell you the truth. I have no idea. I don't
18 | know.

19 | JOHN COX: You know, you know how everyone
20 | has been treated that's come out of there.

21 | STEVE: I'll tell you the honest truth. The
22 | bottom line is, I don't trust the system, period,
23 | anymore. Listening to this tells me how far this
24 | country has really deteriorated with the men that are
25 | in control. No matter what you guys do to me, what
happens to me the day I stop breathing, I believe in a

1 God. And all these kinds of things, everything is
2 going to be answered for. Oh, I'm going to stand in
3 the Judgement, John Cox, I am.

4 JOHN COX: Aren't we all.

5 STEVE: You bet.

6 JOHN COX: Sure we are.

7 STEVE: But I don't believe that 99 percent
8 of the people in control believe it. I don't think
9 that they believe in this book call the Bible. I
10 really don't think so. It's been around a long time.
11 There's a lot of people --

12 JOHN COX: Well, I hope they do.

13 STEVE: -- that need a crutch --

14 JOHN COX: I hope you're wrong and I hope
15 they do. I really --

16 STEVE: If there's -- I wouldn't care to live
17 any longer if there isn't justice beyond what we find
18 in America.

19 JOHN COX: Well, Steve, you and I know that
20 the people that have come out of there so far have been
21 treated extremely well --

22 STEVE: John, you --

23 JOHN COX: And the justice system in this
24 country -- we're talking the justice system, is the
25 best in the world and everybody is innocent until
proven guilty. We've kicked this around and kicked

1 | this around. The only reason I called back in there
2 | and I wanted to talk to you is to see if you can give
3 | me a figure. Give me an idea.

4 | STEVE: I have been working with you all --
5 | John Dolan -- last night --

6 | JOHN COX: I'm not arguing that.

7 | STEVE: I'm not getting -- John, you guys get
8 | to take a break and all that. I haven't, man, I was up
9 | all night. You knew --

10 | JOHN COX: I'm not arguing that with you.

11 | STEVE: I had 2 hours of sleep. I got up and
12 | start dealing with John-3, man, the push. It's hard to
13 | even think when you're not getting enough rest. How am
14 | I going to talk people into leaving here when this is
15 | going on out here.

16 | JOHN COX: Steve, Steven, I'm not arguing
17 | with you, pal. I think you've been doing a remarkable
18 | job in there. And, I think you've been very patient,
19 | you've been working hard and you've got the right thing
20 | in mind. All I'm saying is, I've got to deal with
21 | somebody and that person said, can you give me a figure
22 | to consider to turn it off.

23 | STEVE: No --

24 | JOHN COX: And that's all I'm looking for.

25 | STEVE: I don't have one, John.

 JOHN COX: I'm not here to argue with you

1 | because --

2 | STEVE: I don't have one. I know for sure
3 | David's not going to call somebody in tonight and try
4 | to compete with all this. I know he's not.

5 | JOHN COX: Well, then let me go pass it on.
6 | Okay. Let me go pass it on.

7 | STEVE: I'm waiting.

8 | JOHN COX: Okay. I'll call you back.

9 | STEVE: Okay.

10 | JOHN COX: Thank you.

11 |

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14 | UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Hello.

15 | JOHN: Hello, is Steve there?

16 | UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Yes, here he
17 | is.

18 | STEVE: Hello.

19 | JOHN: Steve, this is John.

20 | STEVE: John, how's it going?

21 | JOHN: Good. How are you doing?

22 | STEVE: Tired. I've about lost my voice
23 | here.

24 | JOHN: Yeah. You lost your voice?

25 | STEVE: Oh, yeah, from all the talking. Yes,
I was up quite late.

1 JOHN: Steve, there was some mention of the
2 music. We got that turned off last night.

3 STEVE: Oh, did they? I didn't even realize
4 it. I must have fallen asleep when it was going.

5 JOHN: Yeah. Okay. Have you been talking to
6 anybody today, Steve?

7 STEVE: No. In fact, I just woke up about a
8 few minutes ago.

9 JOHN: Okay. Do you plan on speaking to
10 anybody?

11 STEVE: First I've got to get my head
12 together here.

13 JOHN: Okay.

14 STEVE: Oh, man.

15 JOHN: Okay. I know you were working hard
16 yesterday.

17 STEVE: I was quite surprised about that
18 music, if you want to call it music.

19 JOHN: That was one of the --

20 STEVE: Did you get to hear it yourself?

21 JOHN: No, I didn't. What was it?

22 STEVE: Are you sure you haven't heard it?

23 JOHN: I'm telling you, I haven't heard it.
24 I wasn't here last night. Gongs? Somebody said it was
25 gongs?

STEVE: It was what?

1 JOHN: Gongs or chanting or something?

2 STEVE: What do you call it, gones?

3 JOHN: G-O-N-G-S.

4 STEVE: G-O -- oh, gongs. No, it sounded
5 like a slowed-down version of Gregorian chanting or
6 something like that, or something from a monastery.

7 JOHN: We got that turned off, right?

8 STEVE: I don't know, I guess. As I was
9 sleeping, it was going, so I don't know.

10 JOHN: About 1 o'clock. Do you have anybody
11 that's interested in listening to what you have to say
12 today, Steve?

13 STEVE: What I need to do is go and see what
14 David is doing and --

15 JOHN: What's David doing now?

16 STEVE: I don't know. He's probably
17 sleeping. I don't know. So I'm going to probably get
18 up here in about a second and start moving around and
19 see what we can get going.

20 JOHN: Okay, Steve, was there a Schider that
21 you mentioned?

22 STEVE: It was a David Scheidler. I guess he
23 had called from what I'm told.

24 JOHN: We're trying to run that down and find
25 out what the conversation was or what the contact was.

STEVE: I see. Okay.

1 JOHN: So what's the attitude in there?

2 STEVE: Well, you know, with last night, I
3 talked with just a couple of people because of whatever
4 that was and everybody was like, This is America? This
5 is the United States? Who's in control here? You
6 know, everybody starts, like me, like I talked to John
7 Cox. I said, John, I don't mind. They can turn it up
8 loud and play it morning, noon and night, but is that
9 what this country has degenerated into. A couple of
10 hundred -- here we have a couple centuries that have
11 gone by. You think of people like Madison and
12 Jefferson, and founding forefathers, Abraham Lincoln
13 and I think they'd roll over in their grave, to tell
14 you the truth. I really would -- John, I'm shocked. I
15 really am. This is my country, the country I grew up
16 in? So proud and happy over the Constitution and the
17 way this country has always been. I don't know. I
18 really -- I tell you the truth. You know, the reason
19 why I'm here, and I'm not going to get into some long
20 spiel. I'll just tell you real quick, because of the
21 Bible. It's the only thing that's consistent for
22 answers for me. It is. I really believe that this
23 country, this world is ripe for judgement. I really
24 do. All these years, man's filled up his cup with
25 iniquity. We've all done our own thing. We're proud
and arrogant. Everybody is. Even though all we are is

1 | dust. Even though we're all subject to death every
2 | moment of every day. I tell you what, I can't wait
3 | until it's all over. I'm talking about everything.
4 | There's got to be a better way than this. Mankind
5 | doing what he does to one another. I came here to
6 | study the Bible, not to be murdered Sunday, February
7 | 28.

8 | JOHN: Yeah. Steve. That -- I just wanted
9 | to clarify something. That music was the idea of one
10 | of the tactical guys and I didn't agree with it because
11 | you know that if I wanted to talk to you and get some
12 | things going, I'm here. You know that. Right?

13 | STEVE: Yeah.

14 | JOHN: Okay. We appreciate your efforts
15 | anyhow. I know you were trying hard yesterday and I'd
16 | like you to continue if you would then maybe we can
17 | move forward from here. Okay?

18 | STEVE: Sure. All right. So I mean, has
19 | that been used on others also? Is that a common thing
20 | that the FBI does?

21 | JOHN: I haven't heard of it and I don't
22 | think it is.

23 | STEVE: I'll tell you the truth. I never in
24 | my life, I mean I could understand if it was the KGB or
25 | something in Russia, it makes sense to me.

 JOHN: Steve, you know, I'm negotiating with

1 | you. You know that?

2 | STEVE: Um-hum.

3 | JOHN: As has John Cox and John Dolan.

4 | STEVE: Right.

5 | JOHN: All right. And we're all friends.

6 | And Byron. Okay. And we all feel that we can work
7 | this out successfully but you know, as well as I do,
8 | that there are two factions here. Do you know what I
9 | mean?

10 | STEVE: You bet I do.

11 | JOHN: And you working with us gives up more
12 | input to the bosses. They don't tell us everything
13 | that they've got planned and that they've got in mind.
14 | Now, yesterday, they told us about the music -- or the
15 | moving of the stuff and I told you that. I wanted to
16 | be up front with you --

17 | STEVE: I don't remember you telling me about
18 | any music.

19 | JOHN: No, I mean the moving of the vehicles.

20 | STEVE: I thought what you said was they were
21 | going to move things from the front and not the go-
22 | carts and so forth. They crushed three go-carts and
23 | there is an Airstream trailer that belongs to an older
24 | woman that's not even here right now -- it's about a
25 | \$30,000 trailer and they -- I mean, it looks not even
 | like an accordion now.

1 JOHN: Steve, you know that the civil courts
2 and civil process can handle that and you'll have every
3 opportunity.

4 STEVE: Is that true?

5 JOHN: Yes, it is. You know, Wayne would be
6 able to advise you on that. You can bring civil suits
7 against the government for all of that damage.

8 STEVE: I guess I'm just lacking in
9 understanding about those kind of things.

10 JOHN: Well, Steve, if you came out and
11 brought up those questions and got an attorney. You've
12 got two attorneys that have been retained by your
13 sister to represent you, Zimmerman and Levine, who have
14 a great reputation and they could help you with that
15 stuff and help the other people in there too.

16 STEVE: Well, like you and I know, I've been
17 definitely taking about everybody there is here and
18 working on it. I don't -- I really didn't understand
19 the tactics yesterday and --

20 JOHN: As I don't either.

21 STEVE: All the way through, I mean,
22 especially when I thought it was the best day. There
23 was seven people in less than 24 hours and I never
24 quit. I never quit.

25 JOHN: Steve, I appreciate your efforts.

 STEVE: When they wanted everybody, like I

1 | told you, even yesterday, I was willing. What should I
2 | do, grab somebody by the neck or the collar, or
3 | something and try to pull them out? I mean, I wouldn't
4 | have gotten very far.

5 | JOHN: Do you remember yesterday when we
6 | first started talking and I mentioned the word
7 | imperative and critical? Okay. Those weren't my
8 | words. Those were the words that I was told to tell
9 | you. Those weren't my words and they don't tell me
10 | everything that they have going but they said it was
11 | imperative and critical that a substantial progress be
12 | made yesterday and then when it wasn't, it's out of my
13 | hands. So, you know, the best deal for you is dealing
14 | with us and showing us some good faith.

15 | STEVE: Well, I thought that's what I've
16 | done.

17 | JOHN: I know, you've been working and I
18 | appreciate that but if you would continue to do that,
19 | we can get forward from here and resolve this. Nobody,
20 | nobody likes it.

21 | STEVE: Whether it seems like it or not, I
22 | mean, we're all fallible as human beings, but my
23 | intentions -- I've always wanted to be straightforward
24 | and honest and so forth, and what's happened here since
25 | that Sunday on through. I mean, like I said, I'm
 | coming out and I know it's all going to work where

1 everybody does come out but I really believe that
2 there's going to be charges manufactured beyond
3 anything of my control or belief that such a thing
4 could happen. I really do. But I mean, it's not going
5 to -- I'll still come out. Whatever this government
6 wants to do with me, I mean, it's fine. It's going to
7 have to be.

8 JOHN: Steve, you've got good attorneys to
9 represent you.

10 STEVE: I'll tell you the honest truth, John.
11 I don't trust too much in anything anymore. I mean,
12 that -- right up until that Sunday I did. I had, you
13 know, I've heard things through the last number of
14 years by being in contact with different professors at
15 universities, from their connections and awareness of
16 what goes on behind the scenes and you know, you always
17 kind of keep -- well, you kind of wonder about those
18 things. So that's why since being in conversation with
19 many of the negotiators, you're in a position where you
20 can know a lot and so that's why I raised a number of
21 questions about different things I've heard about to
22 hear some kind of a response to really see what you
23 guys think about it all.

24 JOHN: Steve, I wouldn't be here talking to
25 you if I didn't want to resolve this peacefully and
have everybody come out of there and go through the

1 system and be represented in court and --

2 STEVE: Can I ask you a question again. What
3 kind of a system do those -- somebody made some
4 mistakes in the ATF. Someone really did and if they
5 don't come to the conclusion that they fired first and
6 what they did by shooting at David's room from the
7 chopper, if that doesn't come out and it's suppressed
8 and that wouldn't surprise me if it was. But what's
9 going to happen to some of those individuals if by
10 chance that is a total honest organization and they
11 find the facts as they are and they are brought out.
12 What's going to happen to some of those? Those that
13 fired first? If it was a mistake or whatever else. I
14 mean, it would be a mistake in the first place. A
15 chopper -- three of them coming in flying toward the
16 building and you'll find out again. I'm going to tell
17 you. At least you people will know that bullets came
18 from a high diagonal through the water tanks and they
19 were drained immediately. You're going to find
20 something else out when you come and check this place
21 out, if it's left standing or whatever else. If
22 there's someone that's unbiased that comes in, like the
23 Rangers, if they are. I mean, I don't know anything
24 for sure anymore, but I'm hoping that the truth will
25 come out. I really am.

JOHN: Steve --

1 STEVE: And if we're at fault or whatever
2 else, well, I mean, then, that's the way it's got to
3 be. But so far, there were too many witnesses from
4 what I've talked to and so forth. I don't know. I
5 just don't see any agent from the ATF though that's
6 going to be in trouble.

7 JOHN: Steve, can I tell you something?

8 STEVE: Sure.

9 JOHN: The laws of this land are for innocent
10 citizens --

11 STEVE: Well, you and I know we're guilty
12 until proven innocent. We know that for a fact.

13 JOHN: Listen to me. Let me just tell you
14 that the laws apply to everybody. Okay. They apply to
15 the citizens and police as well. Okay. All right.
16 And these lawsuits and inquiries and things that are
17 going on in this investigation is being looked at by
18 the world and it will be gone through with a fine-tooth
19 comb.

20 STEVE: Aren't you kind of bothered by that
21 Rodney King incident?

22 JOHN: Yes, I am.

23 STEVE: Man, I tell you what.

24 JOHN: I saw that video tape.

25 STEVE: It amazes me. It really does.

But --

1 JOHN: Who is prosecuting those people?

2 STEVE: But --

3 JOHN: Steve. Let me back up to Rodney King.
4 Who is prosecuting those people right now?

5 STEVE: I really don't know. I haven't
6 really followed it too close in honesty.

7 JOHN: The Federal Government is processing
8 those people. The policemen.

9 STEVE: Can you tell me something. I don't
10 have much access to information any more. What is
11 Interpol? I've heard that name used and I wondered
12 what it was.

13 JOHN: It's an information exchange system
14 among international police agencies.

15 STEVE: What -- I mean, international police
16 agencies. What is, I mean, what -- like the CIA or
17 something?

18 JOHN: Scotland Yard, FBI, Germany, you know.
19 And all they do is exchange information.

20 STEVE: I see. I just heard that word used a
21 few times and I wasn't aware of it.

22 JOHN: Steve, it's 9 o'clock now, 9:15. Okay.

23 STEVE: Uh-huh.

24 JOHN: Why don't you talk to some of the
25 folks there and see if we can get working and we'll go
forward from today. I'm here. I'm trying to work with

1 | you and if I can show them something that will keep the
2 | -- the people on the outside are frustrated. Okay.
3 | And if you can work with me --

4 | STEVE: I can't understand why.

5 | JOHN: And if you can work with me, then, you
6 | know, I can keep things that disrupt this from
7 | happening.

8 | STEVE: I'm working. I'm working.

9 | JOHN: It's been 22 days and we appreciate
10 | your efforts. Believe me. I know we may have some
11 | differences and maybe you doubt my sincerity but I can
12 | tell you, I wouldn't be here if I wasn't interested in
13 | trying to help the situation out. And I mean that.

14 | STEVE: Hey, I do believe that. I do.

15 | JOHN: I mentioned yesterday, I've got a 6
16 | year old that said he hasn't seen me for a while. He
17 | said he forgot what I look like. But -- and that goes
18 | for a lot of the people that are here and in there.
19 | Okay.

20 | STEVE: Yeah.

21 | JOHN: Okay, so, want to give you some time
22 | to get going and we'll --

23 | STEVE: John, do you mind if I ask you a
24 | couple of personal questions? You might not want to.
25 | If you don't want to, it's fine.

 JOHN: Hey, if I don't want to, I'll tell you

1 I don't want to.

2 STEVE: All right. Religiously, what kind of
3 a background have you had? Have you had any?

4 JOHN: I'm Catholic.

5 STEVE: Okay, so do you think there is a God?

6 JOHN: I sure do.

7 STEVE: You do?

8 JOHN: I spent 13 months in Viet Nam, Steve,
9 and it made a believer out of me.

10 STEVE: Really. Okay. I just wondered
11 because a lot of people out there are atheists and
12 agnostics and all the rest but, you know, but I mean,
13 with a Catholic background not many were encouraged
14 from the time they were small to look at the Bible or
15 to study it or anything, but, it's a lot of traditions
16 of men and opinions about God.

17 JOHN: Steve, let me just tell you that I'm
18 not here to be converted but I'm here to help you.
19 Okay.

20 STEVE: No. No. I'm not -- I know that.
21 Listen, you don't understand also that what my work has
22 been up until that Sunday is, I talk to people from all
23 walks of life, from everywhere. I've been -- I might
24 not seem like it, but I've been quite a listener. If
25 someone has something to say that pertains to my well-
being, my safety, my advancement, fulfillment in this

1 | life and want to come, I think there is something to
2 | come. I really do. I mean, we're just too complex of
3 | beings to have got here through a process of evolution.
4 | I don't have that kind of faith to buy evolution. But,
5 | my major concern is that --

6 | JOHN: I agree with you.

7 | STEVE: -- I really see that these prophets
8 | and dying and leaving a testimony, many of them
9 | persecuted and so forth for what they had to say in
10 | their day and their testimony has been brought down to
11 | this final, this generation. You and I know every
12 | generation people think they're living in the last days
13 | and that's been going on as long as mankind has been
14 | wondering what death is all about. But finally the
15 | book talks about a man that comes that can't work
16 | miracles but he can open up what the testimonies are
17 | and make it clear. Like a lot of pieces of a puzzle,
18 | one big clear picture. And I believe that's here. I've
19 | seen and watched people trying to convert-- controvert
20 | the man. It's not happened but I'm concerned about you
21 | as a person. I've talked to you eleven of you people.
22 | I like you all. I really do. And I know that even
23 | though with your physical eyesight and so forth you
24 | look at this world and its makings and what's happening
25 | and your job and your family and all the rest. I look
 | further, beyond that, all the time because I know that

1 any day I can answer before God. I believe there is a
2 God of mine, a Supreme Being and I believe there will
3 be a judgement. The whole system of the world, of
4 America that the judgement that we have, the attorneys,
5 the mediation, all that. That's something that's based
6 upon the Judaic-Christian thing that goes back about
7 4,000 years but it goes back further because that's
8 what God is all about. And you and I will stand there
9 -- I want to live forever. I'd like to see you live
10 forever. If you ever have the time and you read in
11 Isaiah 49, you'll find out if you make it, John, do you
12 know that your son is guaranteed eternal life? If you
13 read those last ten, fifteen verses of Chapter 49 of
14 Isaiah, Isaiah 49, you'll find that if you make it, you
15 do it right, your son is guaranteed, or your children.
16 I like those kind of promises. God knows and sees the
17 innocence of children.

18 JOHN: Steve. Steve, I've got my faith and
19 you know what, I've got faith that we're going to work
20 this out and we can start today and if you start
21 working, we'll do it.

22 STEVE: Well, -- John, I'm going -- I'll be
23 coming out. There is no question about that, but the
24 truth of the matter is I don't think -- I mean, I'll
25 come out. I don't think I'll be getting a fair shake.
I'll tell the world, hey, I'm innocent. I was here to

1 study the Bible. I was in a room from the time I heard
2 bullets riddling the front door area. I mean, that's
3 all I can be saying. I never say anybody, the truth is.
4 But immediately, I'm on the phone saying stop. Whoever
5 it is, stop. Let's talk. There's women and children.
6 Wayne and I both -- you know, you have all the tapes.
7 But I still believe that they'll manufacture probably a
8 hundred things for me --

9 JOHN: Steve --

10 STEVE: Seriously, I mean, I'm talking to you
11 straight right now.

12 JOHN: I know you are. I know you are.
13 You're concerned.

14 STEVE: And the only thing that my innocence
15 one day will only be shown in the light of the
16 judgement of God. I'm serious. I believe that. I
17 don't think this agency, this federal agency that came
18 here for whatever purpose and intention, nothing is
19 going to happen to them. I know they want blood. I've
20 seen it in the eyes. I've seen it in the demeanor and
21 in the statements of the spokesperson for them. And
22 I'm afraid because you're a sister agency that somehow
23 or other, you're going to be involved more -- producing
24 evidence. Maybe even suppressing it, I don't know. I
25 hope not. I can't imagine that would happen but when I
heard the music last night. If you want to call it

1 | music or whatever it is. And --

2 | JOHN: Steve, let me just stop you one second
3 | on that point. Okay.

4 | STEVE: I hope this is being taped and I hope
5 | you don't destroy any of the tapes. One day I'd like
6 | to hear it all again myself.

7 | JOHN: Steve. This is evidence. Okay. And
8 | I want to impress something else on you. Yesterday,
9 | you worked and talked to people and got seven people
10 | out of there. All right. Don't you think that would
11 | give you some credit?

12 | STEVE: I don't --

13 | JOHN: I know how hard you've been working in
14 | there.

15 | STEVE: I think that that all will be passed
16 | off and it's not a big deal anyway. I'm serious. I
17 | don't think that's going to be any big deal.

18 | JOHN: Steve, you know, you don't trust the
19 | system but it does work and --

20 | STEVE: Well, I did but as time goes on --
21 | I'm glad I told John Cox last night -- I was glad for
22 | living in this century at this time and experiencing
23 | even like last night. I mean, I've been a person like
24 | yourself, well, not like yourself. I don't know what
25 | you've done. You've been involved in a lot of things
 | that I haven't but I've sat in a nice home and so forth

1 | and only looked at the TV what the news has. Is the
2 | press going to have access? Will they have been able
3 | to have heard the sounds that were played last night?
4 | I wonder if Americans sitting in their nice cozy homes
5 | know what's all going on.

6 | JOHN: The press probably heard those sounds.

7 | STEVE: Probably. I hope they have but maybe
8 | not. I do know that you people, John, you people have
9 | so controlled them beyond anything that I thought was
10 | ever possible in America. That scares the heck out of
11 | me for America at large. It does. I've always been
12 | concerned because of Abraham Lincoln saying that this
13 | country never would be taken from the outside but the
14 | inside. Man, in his selfishness, in his innate
15 | selfishness. You can look at the fall of the Roman
16 | Republic, which was once a republic, became a democracy
17 | -- did you know that this country when it was founded
18 | was really a republic? And now it has moved to a
19 | democracy, ultimately socialism, tyranny. That's the
20 | direction we're going, John. I'm sure --

21 | JOHN: Steve, listen --

22 | STEVE: John, do you mind if I just talk for
23 | a little bit, unless you don't -- I mean, I'm going to
24 | get off the phone, of course. But, this is my
25 | concerns, you know, I'm for your freedoms. I'm for you
being able to express yourself or worship or not

1 | worship. Or believe that there is no God or whatever
2 | else you might be into, I mean, I'm not a person that
3 | wants my will enforced upon another. I never have been
4 | that way. But, I'll tell you the truth, like you and I
5 | are talking here and I don't have any -- not too much
6 | faith anymore in this system, in this society we have
7 | here. It was warned by God in the writings of the
8 | Bible and by great men like Abraham Lincoln and
9 | Jefferson, Madison, what could come of this country if
10 | the men and women of this country weren't vigilant for
11 | freedom. You know, government has taken control and
12 | it's taking greater control, more freedoms are being
13 | taken from us, you and I. Let me say, I'll probably be
14 | in trouble for it but I believe ATF has been brought
15 | about as an agency to take away those freedoms slowly
16 | but surely, insidiously. And I see that's what
17 | happening, John. I believe that, unless somebody --
18 | I've got open ears. You can show me something else.
19 | But I feel over time it's going to be to the place
20 | where they're going to push for gun control. No one
21 | will have any guns. I think that the founding
22 | forefathers wanted individuals to be allowed to have
23 | guns against the tyranny and the possible tyranny of
24 | their own government. Just like what happened in
25 | Europe for centuries and centuries. Well, what do you
think about that, John, what I just stated? Do you see

1 | that as a possibility or no or what?

2 | JOHN: Steve, we aren't far apart on that all
3 | but what I wanted to mention to you is that you're
4 | going to have every opportunity to make all your
5 | statements --

6 | STEVE: What do you think about -- no, I
7 | know. I don't believe that's true John. I'll tell you
8 | right now I don't believe I will be able to, but, you
9 | know, that's irrelevant. I told you, I'm coming out.
10 | You know, I am. And, you know, but the things I just
11 | said --

12 | JOHN: When are you thinking of coming out,
13 | Steve?

14 | STEVE: Well, you know, after getting to work
15 | with these people and getting at least a good majority
16 | or a large number of them moving, that's what I'll do,
17 | so --

18 | JOHN: Will you continue to work on it with
19 | me today and we can resolve it?

20 | STEVE: Yeah, I will be but I'd sure like,
21 | you know, I've made some statements, I've asked you
22 | some questions and, you know, some time throughout the
23 | conversations of the day, if you would, or if you -- I
24 | mean, I'd like to have you to react to some of the
25 | things I've said. Even if it's your own opinion.

 JOHN: Steve, but my personal feelings aren't

1 | the issue here, okay. I'd tell --

2 | STEVE: That's what I'm telling you though,
3 | John, neither or mine. This only helps me take just
4 | kind of a little breather or a break because, you can
5 | tell my mouth is already dry. I'll be, I mean, I'm
6 | telling you, you'll see in the judgement one day, I
7 | mean, I really did talk to these people. And, for a
8 | long, long, periods of time. And I told you again, I'm
9 | going to be doing my work, but in honesty, I'm just
10 | curious --

11 | JOHN: And I'll be here.

12 | STEVE: -- about this government of mine.
13 | That I thought was mine, I was a part of this system,
14 | of American freedom and the greatest nation that the
15 | world has ever seen. But it's being brought down. I'm
16 | concerned about that too, John. I mean, I believe my
17 | eyes are open. I think I've seen enough through life
18 | to see a direction of this country that I really don't
19 | like and I'm convinced that I can't do anything about
20 | it anyway. If Revelation 18 says in the final days of
21 | the earth's history that the merchants were the great
22 | men of this earth and by their sorceries, they deceived
23 | all of the earth, I believe that is a very solid
24 | statement. I think that the evidence is there to show
25 | that and I don't think one has to look very long and
 | hard to find it. I really don't. Even though yourself,

1 | you're in an agency that seems very honorable and I
2 | always though it was, but to tell you the truth, I
3 | mean, last night, it shows you something. I don't
4 | know, it just makes you wonder. Definitely makes you
5 | wonder.

6 | JOHN: Steve, Steve, if I wasn't concerned
7 | about all of you in there, I wouldn't be talking to
8 | you. You know it and I know it. Okay. Can we start
9 | today?

10 | STEVE: You know, like it -- I'll tell you
11 | the truth. You know what I was concerned about
12 | yesterday, from the time the seven people did come out,
13 | I mean, I told you I worked hard --

14 | JOHN: I know, I could hear you.

15 | STEVE: -- and then all of a sudden -- still
16 | whether they forced you to do it or whether it was your
17 | choice, or the way you use psychology or whatever --

18 | JOHN: Steve.

19 | STEVE: Wait, wait. Let me just say John
20 | that, you know, there was such a, I mean, I could
21 | hardly talk to those people very long at all and you'd
22 | be back on the phone. And like I told you, because I
23 | was drawn away so frequently, they were gone. I got
24 | back and the 30 to 40 people, half of them were gone
25 | and the rest -- you know, they don't -- they get to the
 | place they don't want to hear me and hear what I've got

1 to say. David can open up physics and sciences and
2 sociology, education, all these topics out of a book
3 called the Bible. They're interested in that. They're
4 interested in being guaranteed eternal life because
5 whatever you people do to them and they know they're
6 going into the hands of a dragon. They do know that.
7 Revelations 13 says John sees the time of this earth's
8 history when all the world wonders after the beast and
9 worships the dragon. Everybody has got their feelings
10 and their opinions and -- but they don't know the mind
11 of God, the will of God. They don't know his will.
12 They don't know that in Chapter 50 of Jeremiah that
13 God's got a snare for Babylon and this world is going
14 to be taken unawares. It's going to be like in the
15 days of the flood. Everybody's eating and drinking,
16 giving in marriage and we're all concerned about what
17 we see with our physical eyesight, the carnality --

18 JOHN: Steve, hold on. Somebody just walked
19 in with a note here.

20 STEVE: All right.

21 JOHN: Brad and Kevin are on a radio talk
22 show from their cells as we are talking right now.

23 STEVE (aside): Brad and Kevin are on a radio
24 talk show from their cells right now.

25 STEVE: Thanks. I'll talk to you in a
moment.

1 JOHN: Steve. 1190.
2 STEVE: Thank you. Bye.
3 JOHN: Okay. Bye.

2 anything like that. So and then of course Byron
3 accused that these people didn't have freedom of choice
4 so -- and before that came about of -- you've heard it
5 many times listening to the tapes, but the issue came
6 up that I was telling him how he speaks minimum three-
7 quarters of the time when I'm on the phone with him and
8 I -- it's very difficult to react to. And so I mean I
9 told him and Dick that I know he means well and so
10 forth but it's not helping the situation and even
11 though they want a million people out a year ago, I
12 mean --

13 JOHN: Um-hum.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I mean, it's still -- it's
15 hard because it's a spiritual thing, for you people
16 it's, it's something else totally different. And, you
17 know, the -- the issue always gets back to the same
18 thing.

19 JOHN: Well, did David have the opportunity
20 to pray with a lot of folks today?

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: No. In fact, he got so mad
22 that because of the reaction of everything he just
23 basically -- I haven't even talked to him. Hours and
24 hours have gone by since I've -- I saw him this morning
25 about the time Fagan was going out.

 JOHN: Um-hum.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: I talked to him after that.
2 Yvette was going to follow right after.

3 JOHN: Um-hum.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: In fact, three times I talked
5 to her. She was going to be on her way out almost
6 immediately and the mother and then the, the problem
7 developed with, with Byron and the communication with
8 Fagan. And, you know, first she let me know that we
9 could probably do it, it seemed like it was going to
10 happen and then when he was out there and then
11 something about his muddy shoes and that he said he
12 didn't want to do a damn tape, and he used that word
13 damn --

14 JOHN: Um-hum.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and acted like he had --
16 you know, that one word, all the profanity and the
17 attitude. But if that -- I told him I wanted to really
18 hear what -- somebody take notes, I said --

19 JOHN: Um-hum.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- tape it and play it to me
21 because I've never seen him like that. I don't -- I
22 personally can't understand that something like that
23 would happen with (indiscernible) Fagan.

24 JOHN: Well, I can't tell you anything from
25 first-hand knowledge because --

MR. SCHNEIDER: You weren't around there.

1 JOHN: No. I left probably, I don't know,
2 9 o'clock, something like that --

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: You know --

4 JOHN: -- 9:30 --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- Byron --

6 JOHN: -- but I heard that that's what
7 happened. I was talking to someone on the phone here
8 and, and they said the, the guy was just really upset,
9 was really, you know, almost belligerent would have
10 been a word for it.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: It's hard to believe because
12 I've never -- honestly, the guy's not a guy given to
13 emotions. He's a very deep thinker. I, I -- you will
14 find that out, very deep thinker.

15 JOHN: Well, you know, normally when we ask
16 somebody to make a tape it's merely to make a tape so
17 that the people on the inside know that --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well -- he --

19 JOHN: -- everything's, everything's fine or
20 a message for his wife or a message for his mother,
21 that kind of thing.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, John, the reason being
23 is there was about four or five issues there --
