2 DICK: -- don't understand what it is I'm  
3 telling you. Is there another question -- a  
4 substantive question that we can discuss? I'll be  
5 happy to do that. (Pause) Did that thought come back  
6 to you, the thought that you had moments ago?

7 WAYNE: No, it did not and --

8 DICK: Okay. Do you have other questions for  
9 me, Wayne?

10 WAYNE: No. I, I just keep telling you I'm,  
11 I'm, I'm operating under a handicap here. I don't  
12 think anyone would expect a lawyer to practice law  
13 under these conditions.

14 DICK: Come on out, practice it in the  
15 fashion in which you think is appropriate.

16 WAYNE: But you're asking me to be counsel to  
17 the people in this, in this building.

18 DICK: I'm not asking you to be counsel to  
19 anybody, that's your choice and their choice.

20 WAYNE: Okay. Well, I thought you had said  
21 that, so --

22 DICK: No, I, I said while you're in there  
23 obviously they may well come to you for answers to  
24 certain legal questions. Now, whether you're capable  
25 of giving them only you know. I certainly don't know  
that because I don't know your background. So if there

1 are areas that you cannot address, maybe we can do that  
2 together maybe if you some additional questions about  
3 perhaps this -- the process once you leave there and I  
4 can address those questions for you. If there are  
5 questions that I can't answer I can certainly get the  
6 answers for you.

7 WAYNE: I don't think they trust you enough  
8 to put any stock in, in any answers that you give them.

9 DICK: Um-hum. Well, that's unfortunate  
10 because I'm in a position to help them and I'm willing  
11 to help them and we need to go on.

12 WAYNE: I think if they have legal questions  
13 they're going to want it answered by somebody that has  
14 taken an oath --

15 DICK: Fine.

16 WAYNE: -- to be accountable for the answers  
17 they give them.

18 DICK: Absolutely, absolutely, and we're  
19 willing to do that. As soon as they come out the  
20 guarantees are there, Wayne.

21 WAYNE: Okay. As soon as they come out?

22 DICK: Exactly.

23 WAYNE: Okay.

24 DICK: Are you -- is there some question --

25 WAYNE: Okay --

DICK: -- about that? I mean, in your own



1 mind is there some question there?

2 WAYNE: No. I thought for a while you were  
3 talking about before they came out.

4 DICK: No, no, I certainly wasn't.

5 WAYNE: Well, okay. Let's get back to that  
6 thought I lost.

7 DICK: Okay.

8 WAYNE: It came back to me now.

9 DICK: Great.

10 WAYNE: Lawyers do not reach agreements with  
11 police officers, law-enforcement, detectives, FBI, ATF,  
12 and the reason for it is that it's not binding on, on  
13 the prosecutor once you go to court.

14 DICK: I'm 100 percent aware of that.

15 WAYNE: So, what I'm asking you is how can I  
16 practice law for myself or for anyone else in this  
17 building if I do not have access to the U.S. Attorney?

18 DICK: Well, you can't until you do get  
19 access to a U.S. Attorney and that will be given to you  
20 immediately upon leaving the compound.

21 WAYNE: So there, we agree. I can't practice  
22 law, can I?

23 DICK: I didn't say that you were to practice  
24 law. I said perhaps people might ask you for some  
25 advice. If you don't feel that you can give them  
advice appropriately then don't do it. I certainly

1 | wouldn't, wouldn't expect you to do that.

2 |           WAYNE: Well, why would you expect me to give  
3 | advice to anyone in this building if they're not  
4 | protected by an attorney/client privilege?

5 |           DICK: Well, my understanding was --

6 |           WAYNE: And if I'm not practicing law then  
7 | they don't have that privilege.

8 |           DICK: Well, my understanding was that when  
9 | Steve suggested early on that you were advising some  
10 | folks in there, and if I got that information in error  
11 | I apologize to you, because I certainly wouldn't want  
12 | to do anything that was illegal in there.

13 |           WAYNE: Oh no, I didn't say it would be  
14 | illegal to do that.

15 |           DICK: Well, you said you didn't think that  
16 | you had the ability to do that and, you know, frankly,  
17 | Wayne, talking --

18 |           WAYNE: I (indiscernible)

19 |           DICK: -- to you at times I wonder about  
20 | that.

21 |           WAYNE: So, there you go, you're getting  
22 | personal again.

23 |           DICK: No, I didn't say that. I said your  
24 | ability to practice law in there because I know you  
25 | don't have the law books available to you and those  
   | kinds of things.

1           WAYNE: Oh, I thought you were talking about  
2 my ability.

3           DICK: No, not at all.

4           WAYNE: Okay.

5           DICK: I'm just saying you don't have the  
6 access to the documents and the books that you need.  
7 So I know it's difficult from in there to provide case  
8 law and that sort of stuff because you don't have  
9 access to it.

10          WAYNE: That's right. So, I just want you to  
11 understand my problem, and that, that's why I, I have  
12 been asking to talk to the U.S. Attorney --

13          DICK: Okay.

14          WAYNE: -- by telephone before I come out,  
15 and I think it would help to resolve this situation.  
16 Now, think it over before you answer and talk it over  
17 with the other negotiators and see if you would be  
18 interested to have -- certainly the U.S. Attorney must  
19 be part of your team. You don't view that person as an  
20 outside negotiator, so you know --

21          DICK: The United States Attorney is dealing  
22 with the legal issues, certainly, and --

23          WAYNE: So, what's the problem?

24          DICK: -- represents the government. Well,  
25 what problem?

          WAYNE: And so do you.

1 DICK: What problem are we talking about?

2 WAYNE: It would not be an outside  
3 negotiator. Certainly it could be suggested and then  
4 you could report back to us as to whether or not the  
5 U.S. Attorney is --

6 DICK: Well, I can answer that question right  
7 here and now. They are available --

8 WAYNE: You mean it's already been verified?

9 DICK: No. They're available to talk with  
10 you immediately upon your exit from the compound.

11 WAYNE: Oh, so the FBI's going to block us  
12 from talking to the U.S. Attorney?

13 DICK: No, that's not, that's not a block,  
14 that's an agreement that the United States Attorney has  
15 already had with us. He's available and obviously will  
16 be involved in every aspect of whatever happens from  
17 here on once you folks leave the compound.

18 WAYNE: Is that in writing?

19 DICK: Wayne --

20 WAYNE: Perhaps you should share it with us.  
21 You're, you're quoting the U.S. Attorney now.

22 DICK: I'm not quoting anybody. I'm quoting  
23 -- I've been an FBI agent for 22 years. I, I know that  
24 in, in those instances when they're federal prosecution  
25 the prosecution is handled by the United States  
Attorney's office as well you know.

1           WAYNE: Yes, but I'm asking for negotiations  
2 with the U.S. Attorney to help facilitate the arrests  
3 that you want to make.

4           DICK: Wayne, hear me again, okay? I'm  
5 telling you --

6           WAYNE: You're telling me no.

7           DICK: I'm telling you that the United States  
8 Attorney is willing to meet with your, your attorneys  
9 and whomever as soon as you exit that and soon as we  
10 move through the process. You obviously know that  
11 you'll get a hearing at the earliest opportunity as  
12 soon as you leave the compound. You will be  
13 represented by counsel, you will have -- that counsel  
14 will have the ability to speak with you and to the  
15 United States Attorney. I am sure given the fact that  
16 you are an attorney you may well want to represent  
17 yourself and in, in that instance you certainly will  
18 have access to the United States Attorney early on.  
19 You know that.

20           WAYNE: But Dick, it's, it's a waste of time  
21 to tell me that because at -- temporarily I am not  
22 willing to exit the building and I think if you were in  
23 my shoes you'd say the same thing because it's not safe  
24 out there.

25           DICK: Wayne, listen. I'm going to leave you  
with this offer and this agreement: as soon as you exit

1 the compound you will have all the access to those  
2 things you've all talked about, the press, legal  
3 representation, the media, those kinds of things. Now,  
4 let's it with you at that point. All right. You know  
5 you have that, you have my guarantee. Will you please  
6 put Steve back on, please, or David? I would really  
7 like to speak to David but if he's afraid to talk with  
8 me then, then maybe we'll have to go with Steve. I  
9 thought David was -- you know, he was the man in there  
10 and, and obviously he, he feels ill at ease to talking  
11 with anybody.

12 WAYNE: Well, I never used that, that term.  
13 I've said that I'm willing to let David Koresh  
14 negotiate for me.

15 DICK: You're, you're willing, you're willing  
16 to let us do that? Well, I'm asking you if David is  
17 willing to do that, okay? And let's put him on unless  
18 he's scared that, you know, he doesn't have the answers  
19 that we need, that we need to -- we need to go on if  
20 he's the fellow that makes those decisions. Obviously  
21 you're not in a position to make those kinds of  
22 decisions so let me talk to the person that is, please.

23 WAYNE: Well, Dick, I am going to hang up the  
24 phone, find out if there is somebody that wants to get  
25 on and, and talk with you.

DICK: Well, I'm sure there are probably a

1 lot of people in there, but David is the one that I  
2 primarily want to talk to. But if he doesn't feel that  
3 he has the wherewithal to, to, to talk about these  
4 issues in a serious vein then I guess I'll have to talk  
5 to someone else. I mean, he's been ducking us for days  
6 now.

7 WAYNE: Well, I, I, I really --

8 DICK: And people are starting to --

9 WAYNE: -- don't know anything about that.

10 DICK: People are starting to concern  
11 themselves with his ability even to, to be able to  
12 resolve this issue. You know, is he hiding behind the  
13 children and, and his Bible? I mean, that's some of  
14 the questions that people have asked of us and I'd like  
15 to find that out myself.

16 WAYNE: (Laughter)

17 DICK: You know, here's the man that's  
18 supposed to have the answers but yet he, he doesn't  
19 want to give any of those, those answers to us. Our,  
20 our question of him is how do we resolve this issue.  
21 You know, he continues to, to be in, in -- remain in  
22 hiding in there and we can't, we can't follow-up on.  
23 this if he's not willing to, to come to some agreement  
24 with us. .

25 WAYNE: I think he's, he's already indicated  
the way to resolve this issue peacefully, and I think

1 | you've already indicated that you're not interested.

2 |           DICK: Well, you know what? If you can give  
3 | me that -- you know, sum that up in a, in a few short  
4 | words I'd be happy to speak to you. We've never  
5 | understood what David Koresh wants. It's never been  
6 | clear to us. It's never -- he's never told us what  
7 | would, what would be the answer for you folks coming  
8 | out. I've never heard that. The only, the only time  
9 | that we know is when, when he said I guarantee you, I'm  
10 | giving my word as a man, as a follower of God and his  
11 | personal word that he would come out once that tape was  
12 | played. And what did he do? We played the tape, we  
13 | had it played nationwide. We went to the Christian  
14 | Broadcast Network and said listen, this man has  
15 | guaranteed to us that the folks will come out as soon  
16 | as he is able to do this. We then made a tape of  
17 | David's available to the media which was played in its  
18 | entirety across this nation. What does David do then?  
19 | He goes back and hides behind the children in there.  
20 | He says my God told me that this wasn't the time.  
21 | Well, his God must have told him in the first instance  
22 | to come out when, when the tape was played and all of a  
23 | sudden he has this, he has this message from God not to  
24 | come out. So let's get on with this thing. His word  
25 | and my word and the words of the other agents that are  
   | doing this thing are what we have to work out and work



1 with --

2 WAYNE: I've always --

3 DICK: -- and if he breaks his word then, you  
4 know, how can we, we talk to him in good faith?

5 WAYNE: I've always taken the position  
6 professionally --

7 DICK: What is it that will make -- what is  
8 it, Wayne, that will -- to get this thing going? What  
9 is the thing that will make this thing move along?  
10 What is it that will bring this to a safe resolution  
11 for all people involved? You tell me. What is it?

12 WAYNE: Well, I think if the government  
13 respected the religious freedom --

14 DICK: Wayne, don't go into that esoteric  
15 stuff. Just tell me what, how, how, now. Tell me now  
16 what it is. You, you said that David has told what it  
17 is. Refresh my memory. What is it?

18 WAYNE: Okay. I think you have to start from  
19 the point where David has told you that God told --

20 DICK: Hold, listen, hold it. We're not  
21 going to discuss God, okay? I'm not going to discuss  
22 God with you and I would ask you not to discuss God  
23 either. That is not moving -- that, that issue does  
24 not move this along. All right. There are plenty of  
25 people that will discuss that with you at the  
appropriate time. The appropriate thing to discuss now

1 is how do we get this moving. That's the issue. That  
2 is the central issue here in this whole matter, how do  
3 we get this done.

4 WAYNE: Well, sometimes you just can't make a  
5 frontal assault on the central issue. Sometimes you do  
6 have to kind of up-link it, you know what I mean? So  
7 let's deal with another issue for a second.

8 DICK: No, no, no, let's answer this one  
9 first. You brought it up. I didn't bring it up. You  
10 said that the question -- that you have the answer as  
11 to what will bring this thing to a successful, safe  
12 resolution. What is your question?

13 WAYNE: You know --

14 DICK: What is your answer, I mean?

15 WAYNE: Well, I'm not going to say.

16 DICK: That's because you don't have any  
17 idea, Wayne, what it is that you're talking about.  
18 That's the problem. You guys in there -- you know,  
19 this is not Psychology 101. I've been through  
20 Psychology 101 and a lot more classes afterward, okay?

21 WAYNE: Are you a psychologist?

22 DICK: Did I say that?

23 WAYNE: No, I'm just curious.

24 DICK: The, the point is that we've got to  
25 move along and --

WAYNE: I didn't mean that in a -- to be

1 offensive. I, I meant, you know, if --

2 DICK: What is the answer?

3 WAYNE: -- if, if you have a --

4 DICK: What is, what is the answer to my  
5 question?

6 WAYNE: (Indiscernible)

7 DICK: What will move this along? Very  
8 simple, very simple. It's not deep.

9 WAYNE: Talking about some of the issues that  
10 are in the way would move it along.

11 DICK: We talked about that for 26 days.  
12 I've been here every one of those 26 days, okay? I  
13 have heard these matters brought to, to our attention  
14 in the fashion that you've chosen to do so all of the  
15 while.

16 WAYNE: Well (indiscernible).

17 DICK: What is the answer --

18 WAYNE: The way I chose to --

19 DICK: -- to my question? What will move it  
20 along?

21 WAYNE: I don't think --

22 DICK: What will move it along?

23 WAYNE: -- that you and I have talked very  
24 much about anything.

25 DICK: Wayne, I'm not where to talk about  
these other issues if we can talk about the central

1 issue.

2 WAYNE: We (indiscernible).

3 DICK: What is the answer to moving this  
4 matter along and bringing it to a safe resolution?  
5 That is the question. It's not a difficult question.  
6 It's a very clear --

7 WAYNE: I have not agreed to talk about the  
8 central issue.

9 DICK: Well, then get off the phone and put  
10 somebody else on there that is willing to talk, okay?  
11 Put David on. I'll be happy to talk with David about  
12 the central issue. That's what we've been trying to  
13 talk about for ages, my friend.

14 WAYNE: What happens if I don't get off the  
15 phone, Dick?

16 DICK: What happens if you don't get off the  
17 phone?

18 WAYNE: Whose phone is this anyway?

19 DICK: Pardon me?

20 WAYNE: Whose phone is this? It's in my  
21 home.

22 DICK: Wayne --

23 WAYNE: All the phone lines were in my home.

24 DICK: -- don't evade the point. The point  
25 is what will bring this to a safe resolution? You  
told, you told --

1 WAYNE: I'll tell you what (indiscernible).

2 DICK: -- me that David told us what that  
3 was.

4 WAYNE: (Indiscernible)

5 DICK: Refresh my memory.

6 WAYNE: It'll take --

7 DICK: Tell me what it is.

8 WAYNE: It'll take some give and take on both  
9 sides.

10 DICK: Oh, you've finally come to that  
11 realization?

12 WAYNE: Um-hum.

13 DICK: Now, that, that's an interesting  
14 point. What is it we need to do to get this moved  
15 along?

16 WAYNE: Okay. Now, that letter that was  
17 rejected.

18 DICK: I'm listening.

19 WAYNE: Those promises, you know those  
20 promises weren't worth the paper they're printed on.

21 DICK: You know what, Wayne? I think that  
22 you have some sort of a block up there, some sort of a  
23 mental block. You're not hearing me. We guaranteed  
24 that 100 percent. You can't get any more than 100  
25 percent. We didn't say 98. We said 100 percent.

WAYNE: Yeah, but who has control over the

1 | judicial process?

2 |           DICK: Well now, who -- it's guaranteed. The  
3 | sheriff guaranteed it and SAC Jeff Jamar guaranteed it,  
4 | okay?

5 |           WAYNE: There are not enough guarantees on  
6 | there.

7 |           DICK: Really?

8 |           WAYNE: Really. I didn't see the U.S.  
9 | prosecutor down there, I didn't see a judge down there.

10 |          DICK: You know what, Wayne?

11 |          WAYNE: Who controls where a person is  
12 | jailed?

13 |          UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: (In background)  
14 | The sheriff.

15 |          DICK: Wayne, in this county the sheriff is  
16 | in charge of the county jail. You know that. You've  
17 | been --

18 |          WAYNE: How big --

19 |          DICK: -- how many years have you lived her?

20 |          WAYNE: How big is the federal district?

21 |          DICK: How big is the federal district? You  
22 | know, Wayne --

23 |          WAYNE: It's bigger than Waco.

24 |          DICK: -- listen, obviously, obviously you're  
25 | not interested in getting on to the central issues,  
that is, how do we resolve this matter. You know, you

1 can talk around the issue for days and we've heard you  
2 talk around the issue for days and we've been very  
3 patient with you.

4 WAYNE: No, no, no, no, no. I'm showing you  
5 why your promises were empty.

6 DICK: Don't tell me why our promises were  
7 empty because they are not and you don't even -- you  
8 have absolutely no ability to address that issue in  
9 that fashion, okay?

10 WAYNE: I do, I do (indiscernible).

11 DICK: No, you don't? You don't. We have  
12 you a written guarantee, all right?

13 WAYNE: I'm showing you where the holes are.

14 DICK: All is you have to do is go to the  
15 court with that, you go the press with it, you got to  
16 the TV with it.

17 WAYNE: We can't go to any of those places.

18 DICK: Wayne --

19 WAYNE: We can only talk to you.

20 DICK: -- you're not hearing me. You know,  
21 you're just not hearing me. You know --

22 WAYNE: I'm saying how does it help --

23 DICK: -- listen, you can sit in there and  
24 stall --

25 WAYNE: -- to give us letters --

DICK: -- as long as you want, all right?

1 WAYNE: -- that don't mean anything?

2 DICK: You think that we don't understand  
3 that? I mean, do you think we're stupid?

4 WAYNE: No, no.

5 DICK: Good. Well, let's start from there  
6 then, okay?

7 WAYNE: That's why I'm asking you to reason  
8 with me and I'm telling you --

9 DICK: Hey, about 26 days of reason?

10 WAYNE: I'm saying to you --

11 DICK: Twenty-six days.

12 WAYNE: -- if I come out that door --

13 DICK: Okay.

14 WAYNE: -- I'm a federal prisoner and if I'm  
15 a federal prisoner I can be put in Marlin, Temple,  
16 Austin, San Anton, El Paso, Fort Worth, Midland,  
17 Odessa, Abilene.

18 DICK: We're telling you that you're going to  
19 be in this jail in this county and Jack Harwell will  
20 have whatever control is exercised in that jail and you  
21 will have the judicial hearings guaranteed to you by  
22 U.S. constitution. You know that, you'll --

23 WAYNE: Mr. Jamar cannot make that promise.

24 DICK: What? That you, that you're  
25 guaranteed your rights under the constitution? He  
can't, he can't make that guarantee?



1                   WAYNE: No, no, no, no, no, no. He can't  
2 guarantee that the U.S. prosecutor will put me here or  
3 there.

4                   DICK: Wayne, you're going to come out of  
5 there, go into the McLennan County Jail and you're  
6 going to be given a hearing in U.S. District Court.

7                   WAYNE: And then I can be moved.

8                   UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: (In background)  
9 Or you can be released.

10                  DICK: Or you can be released on bond. You  
11 can do any number of things.

12                  WAYNE: No, no, no, no.

13                  DICK: No, no, no, no, no.

14                  WAYNE: No, I'm not, I'm not talking about  
15 the possibility of being released on bond. What I'm  
16 saying to you is if I am not released on bond --

17                  DICK: Um-hum.

18                  WAYNE: -- I can be imprisoned outside  
19 McLennan County and then none of those promises are  
20 going to mean anything.

21                  DICK: The promise was that when you go into  
22 the McLennan County Jail you will be guaranteed this in  
23 this fashion, the fashion that's set out in that letter  
24 that David will, will communicate with you, that your  
25 religious service will continue and those kinds of  
things.

1 WAYNE: But all in McLennan County?

2 DICK: Well, do you think we're going to put  
3 David on a circuit riding the state of Texas or what?

4 WAYNE: Yes, I --

5 DICK: We're telling you you're going to be  
6 in the McLennan County Jail. That's clear.

7 WAYNE: Yes, anything possible is, is what we  
8 have to negotiate.

9 DICK: (Laughter)

10 WAYNE: Anything possible.

11 DICK: Wayne, I'll tell you what. Why don't  
12 you put David on and let, let me negotiate with David?  
13 You know, to negotiate implies that we're going to have  
14 some give and some take.

15 WAYNE: I think Steve wants to talk to you.  
16 Would you like to talk to Steve?

17 DICK: Well, you and I aren't get any place.  
18 Put Steve back on for a minute.

19 WAYNE: No, we did. We made a lot of  
20 progress here.

21 DICK: Okay. Well, I'm happy that you're  
22 happy. Please.

23 WAYNE: Well, I, I didn't mean to make you  
24 unhappy.

25 DICK: Obviously you can't, you can't make  
any --

1 WAYNE: You know what I'm thinking now.

2 DICK: -- you can't make any, you know,  
3 actual decisions in there. I need to get, I need to  
4 get to, to Mr. David, Mr. David Koresh. He's obviously  
5 the person to make the final decisions.

6 WAYNE: Oh, there's one other thing.

7 DICK: Go ahead.

8 WAYNE: I heard this tape that was played  
9 over and over and over again and Byron kept saying it  
10 was hours before he got involved after the raid  
11 started --

12 DICK: Okay.

13 WAYNE: -- February 28th.

14 DICK: All right.

15 WAYNE: That wasn't true.

16 DICK: What wasn't true?

17 WAYNE: That it was several hours before he  
18 got involved.

19 DICK: It wasn't true?

20 WAYNE: No.

21 DICK: Okay. You tell me how it was not  
22 true.

23 WAYNE: I made contact with Sheriff Larry  
24 Lynch.

25 DICK: I understand. I'm aware of that. 911  
call (indiscernible).

1           WAYNE: And he got in contact with the  
2 command post.

3           DICK: Okay.

4           WAYNE: And we talked for a little bit and  
5 Steve made another -- he reached another phone call and  
6 he made contact with Byron. You know, we hadn't even  
7 arranged the cease-fire at that point. So, why is  
8 Byron trying to give us that, that nonsense?

9           DICK: Listen. Let me tell you where Byron  
10 Sage is stationed, okay? He's in Austin, Texas.  
11 That's where, that's where his office is located, okay?  
12 Now, do you suppose -- how long do you suppose it takes  
13 to get here from Austin, Texas?

14          WAYNE: I know.

15          DICK: Okay, and it also takes some time for,  
16 for him to be contacted regarding those events, okay?  
17 So it took him quite a little time before he got here.  
18 What is your suggestion? That he was here hiding  
19 outside the door or something? I mean, what is your,  
20 what is your, what is your, your statement here? I  
21 don't understand it. What are you suggesting? That  
22 Byron's lying to you?

23          WAYNE: No, that's what you're suggesting.  
24 That's --

25          DICK: Okay. Well, what is your question?

          WAYNE: You're suggesting that he was in

1 Austin.

2 DICK: I'm not only suggesting that, I'm  
3 telling you 100 percent that he was in Austin. What is  
4 your question there?

5 WAYNE: How do you know that?

6 DICK: Because he tells me. I know where the  
7 man works. He is not in Waco, Texas. His office -- he  
8 is a senior resident agent in charge of the FBI office  
9 in Austin, Texas.

10 WAYNE: Okay. Well, it's like this. Can you  
11 prove it?

12 DICK: Wayne --

13 WAYNE: Do you have any written documents?

14 DICK: You know, Wayne? I can't prove that  
15 the sun's coming up in the morning but I think that it  
16 will, you know what I mean?

17 WAYNE: You mean you don't have credentials?

18 DICK: Pardon me?

19 WAYNE: You don't have credentials? David  
20 Koresh proves his credentials to every person.

21 DICK: Wayne, hey, listen --

22 WAYNE: (Indiscernible)

23 DICK: -- get off that soap box, will you?

24 Get off that soap box.

25 WAYNE: I'm just asking for --

DICK: Let's move on to substantive issues,

1 | okay? You know, if you want to talk about those kinds  
2 | of issues talk about it with somebody that wants to  
3 | talk to you about -- I'm here to do one thing: to move  
4 | this on so that we can safety -- safely resolve this  
5 | issue. You can talk about all those other side issues  
6 | as long as you want and you can sit in there and you  
7 | can stall and you can do those kinds of things. I  
8 | understand that. You can do those things.

9 |           WAYNE: Well, if, if Byron was in Austin --

10 |           DICK: Okay. I'm -- listen. I'm making a  
11 | legitimate attempt in trying to resolve this safely.  
12 | You can play your games in there and you can do those  
13 | things. Certainly I'm not going to say that you can't.  
14 | But if you want to make an actual good-faith effort to  
15 | resolve this issue we can do it. Obviously, you want  
16 | to play games and I don't have time for that, all  
17 | right? You move on to somebody else and put somebody  
18 | on there that is willing to discuss these issues in  
19 | good faith. Byron Sage was in Austin, Texas and you  
20 | have my word on that and that's my guarantee. Now,  
21 | give me the phone, or give the phone to somebody else  
22 | that can make some sense, Wayne, because you're not  
23 | making sense.

24 |           WAYNE: I did make sense.

25 |           DICK: No, you don't make sense, okay?

          WAYNE: Dick, when, when I tell you a federal

1 | prisoner can be put in any county, that's making sense.

2 |           DICK: Wayne, that's not an issue, that's not  
3 | an issue.

4 |           WAYNE: But it's a fact, it's a fact.

5 |           DICK: All right. If that's of some concern  
6 | to you then you go ahead and, and keep that thought,  
7 | okay? We're telling you you're going to be in the  
8 | county jail here and give me -- give the phone to  
9 | someone else that can make some, some issues using some  
10 | judgment because I'm frankly having a difficult time  
11 | thinking that you have that --

12 |           WAYNE: I do not --

13 |           DICK: -- ability to make decent decisions  
14 | because you're not showing that to me at all.

15 |           WAYNE: (Indiscernible) said that before,  
16 | said no (indiscernible).

17 |           DICK: Byron Sage is not from Austin, Texas.

18 |           WAYNE: No, no.

19 |           DICK: Now, that is a, that is a substantive  
20 | issue, isn't it?

21 |           WAYNE: No (indiscernible) said something  
22 | about me --

23 |           DICK: Huh?

24 |           WAYNE: -- personally before, now I've  
25 | confirmed it because you repeated it and we're on a  
different topic and it's, it's not about the specific

1 issue. You're just trying to say something negative  
2 about me personally.

3 DICK: Wayne, hand the phone to somebody  
4 else, all right? If -- you know, if, if the biggest  
5 concern if your life is where, where Byron Sage lives,  
6 I have just told where he lives or where he works.  
7 Austin, Texas is where he works. He works in Austin --

8 WAYNE: We're not even talking --

9 DICK: -- Texas.

10 WAYNE: -- about that, Dick.

11 DICK: Okay? That was your question.

12 WAYNE: We're not talking about that.

13 DICK: That was your question. I answered  
14 it. Move on. What else do you have? Do you have  
15 something substantive there?

16 WAYNE: Yeah, you just said --

17 DICK: What is the answer?

18 WAYNE: -- something substantive and I've got  
19 a comment. You just said that you, meaning Jake Lamar  
20 and Sheriff Harwell are assuring me that I'm going to  
21 be in the McLennan County Jail.

22 DICK: You're going to be in the McLennan  
23 County Jail when you leave that compound, absolutely --

24 WAYNE: Okay.

25 DICK: -- one-hundred percent guaranteed.

WAYNE: But I'm saying that neither of those



1 | two people have control over that decision.

2 |           DICK: Okay. What's your point?

3 |           WAYNE: I'm saying that the federal judge  
4 | decides which county jail --

5 |           DICK: If you're ultimately convicted of a  
6 | crime that is certainly true. We are not talking about  
7 | that issue now. We're talking about one of processing,  
8 | one of appearances, one of judicial processing. You  
9 | know that. We're talking about the county, this  
10 | particular county. That's where the crimes, if there  
11 | were crimes, are committed.

12 |           WAYNE: Yeah, but a prosecutor and the judge  
13 | do not have to put --

14 |           DICK: Wayne, listen.

15 |           WAYNE: -- anybody (indiscernible).

16 |           DICK: Don't beat a dead horse. Don't beat a  
17 | dead horse, okay? Put Steve on the line. I want to  
18 | talk to David but obviously David doesn't have the  
19 | ability to get on the phone and to talk with us about  
20 | reasonable issues in resolving this impasse, okay?  
21 | He's the one that I need to talk to. Put him on the  
22 | phone.

23 |           WAYNE: I can't (indiscernible).

24 |           DICK: Well, put Steve on the phone. Why  
25 | don't you take a rest? You need to revisit some of  
these issues, you know?

1 WAYNE: (Laughter) Dick, you're getting  
2 personal.

3 DICK: I'm not getting personal at all.

4 WAYNE: Well, I'm just notifying you of the  
5 fact. I, I didn't say I objected to it did I? I'm  
6 just saying that --

7 DICK: Wayne, listen. I can sit here and  
8 jerk your chain, you can jerk my chain, it does -- it  
9 gets nothing accomplished. The games you're playing  
10 are pretty --

11 WAYNE: But I haven't --

12 DICK: -- elementary, okay?

13 WAYNE: -- I haven't done that, Dick.

14 DICK: Not beyond -- you know, it's pretty  
15 elementary what you're trying to do. You're trying to  
16 stall and you're trying to, you're trying to evade the  
17 central point. What --

18 WAYNE: I am not trying to stall, Dick --

19 DICK: -- listen to me. Listen to me.

20 WAYNE: -- because I haven't talked to you  
21 that long --

22 DICK: Okay. Why did you --

23 WAYNE: -- for you to call it stalling.

24 DICK: Why did your wife and children leave  
25 the compound? And they -- when they did leave they  
found that boy, these people have been very nice to us.

1 They've, they've reunited me with my children, both  
2 kids were on -- they're -- both kids were, you know,  
3 were very cheerful kids, nice kids. You've got very  
4 nice kids. You want to sit in there or do you want to  
5 come out here and get together with your kids and your  
6 family?

7 WAYNE: I want my kids brought -- well, I  
8 don't want to --

9 DICK: Oh, would you like me to deliver your  
10 kids to the compound?

11 WAYNE: No.

12 DICK: Is that what you're going to ask me?

13 WAYNE: No, I'm not going to ask --

14 DICK: Okay. Well, let's don't, let's don't  
15 talk about those kinds of things.

16 WAYNE: Okay.

17 DICK: All right. You come out of there,  
18 we'll get on with this process, and answer my question:  
19 why will it take? How do we get this issue resolved  
20 safely? Very plain, very simple. You want to write it  
21 down?

22 WAYNE: No.

23 DICK: I'll repeat it.

24 WAYNE: I don't want to write it down because  
25 it's a very simple question.

DICK: It's a very simple question. I think

1 I asked you the question. It's a very simple answer.

2 Is that what you meant to say?

3 WAYNE: No.

4 DICK: Oh, okay.

5 WAYNE: (Indiscernible)

6 DICK: Let me ask the question once more.

7 What will it take to move this issue along? We want to  
8 safely resolve this matter. Very simple.

9 WAYNE: I can't answer a question like that.

10 DICK: Good. Then if you can't answer it I'm  
11 wasting my time talking to you. Give me to Steve,  
12 please.

13 WAYNE: He's not here.

14 DICK: Well then, give me to David. Those  
15 two are the only two that I'm willing to talk to at  
16 this point in time unless somebody else wants to leave.  
17 Now, I asked to talk to, Mr. Louis Anthony Alaniz. We  
18 want him to leave that compound. He is not part of  
19 this issue. His mother is terribly concerned about  
20 him. You have suggested that all the other people are  
21 in there voluntarily. Put Louis on the phone and we'll  
22 get Lewis out of there, okay?

23 WAYNE: Well --

24 DICK: No, not well, Wayne. I didn't say  
25 well, I said put Louis on the telephone and we'll get  
this issue resolved, all right? We're waiting to pick

1 | him up as we speak.

2 |         WAYNE: I (indiscernible).

3 |         DICK: It's not that tough a question, Wayne.

4 |         WAYNE: I can't handle the question.

5 |         DICK: Obviously you can't handle it. You  
6 | can't handle the answer either. I'm going to tell you,  
7 | please, go get David or Steve and I'll -- when they're  
8 | willing to, to discuss this matter in a, in a  
9 | reasonable, good-faith effort then you tell them to  
10 | give me a call, okay? In the mean time, I think I'm  
11 | going to get something for lunch and, and just take a  
12 | couple of minutes to sit back and, and consider some of  
13 | these thing that you've talked to me about. And --

14 |         WAYNE: I appreciate that.

15 |         DICK: And you know what I'm going to do?  
16 | I'm going to find out if --

17 |         WAYNE: Because (indiscernible) for the first  
18 | time.

19 |         DICK: -- Byron Sage is actually in Austin,  
20 | Texas. Because you know what? That's a perplexing  
21 | question that you asked of me. I'm going to find out  
22 | the answer to that question.

23 |         WAYNE: Yes.

24 |         DICK: And I'm going to report back to you at  
25 | the earliest opportunity after I talk to David or  
   | Steven and to ensure that Mr. Sage lives in Austin,

1 Texas. Now, that's, that's one of the questions that  
2 I'm going to do my best to resolve for you.

3 WAYNE: Oh, I believe he lives in Austin.

4 DICK: I didn't say live. I said he works in  
5 Austin, Texas. That's where his, where his office is.  
6 He is assigned to Austin, Texas. He is the number one,  
7 number uno, the first, the boss, all those kinds of  
8 things. He is number one in Austin, Texas for the FBI.  
9 He works for Jeff Jamar who is in San Antonio. He's  
10 similar to David. He heads up the office. David heads  
11 your office up, Byron Sage heads the Austin office up.  
12 Byron Sage arrived here after he was told about the  
13 conflict. He came down here to try to resolve this  
14 issue with you folks. He's been here ever since, okay?

15 WAYNE: Okay. Well, Jamar is not a  
16 negotiator is he?

17 DICK: True.

18 WAYNE: Okay, and in Austin then Byron Sage  
19 is not a negotiator either.

20 DICK: Really? Now, what do you think --

21 WAYNE: I mean, if they're similar in, in  
22 their -- if they have similar positions in their --

23 DICK: Wayne -- hey, Wayne, whatever you're  
24 doing go back to doing it, will you? I've got to do  
25 some other things, okay? I'll talk to you later.

(Phone hung up.)

2 STEVE: Hello.

3 DICK: Steve?

4 STEVE: Yes.

5 DICK: This is Dick once more.

6 STEVE: Okay.

7 DICK: Is David ready to talk to me for a  
8 moment?

9 STEVE: I should have somebody go and check  
10 and see 'cause I, I haven't actually seen him in about  
11 the last two hours.

12 DICK: Well, I've got something I'd to pass  
13 on to David and it's important I speak to him. Will  
14 you please --

15 STEVE: Yeah.

16 DICK: -- make sure that that's done?

17 STEVE: Okay. Just a minute.

18 DICK: Thank you.

19 (pause)

20 STEVE: Hello, Dick?

21 DICK: Yes.

22 STEVE: Yeah, I just talked to him and he's,  
23 he's got a splitting headache, he's sick, he says he  
24 has, I didn't know it, but he hasn't slept for about  
25 two days he said, but he said, give him a couple hours,  
he's gonna lay down and see if the headache won't go

1 away.

2 DICK: Well, I don't have a couple hours to  
3 give him. I'd like to speak directly to him, however,  
4 if he's not willing to speak with me then I'm going to  
5 speak with you.

6 STEVE: Honestly, he is sick. Just give him  
7 about two hours, I mean, I'll speak to you now, --

8 DICK: Okay.

9 STEVE: -- but, I mean, you know, he said  
10 tell Dick, he says I want to talk to him, he says, but  
11 I'm feeling really sick, apparently his stomach and, I  
12 don't know why. I got a feeling it's because he came,  
13 he came walking out here and, without, every time he  
14 does that the guy gets sick again.

15 DICK: All right, listen.

16 STEVE: Yeah.

17 DICK: Listen, Steve.

18 STEVE: Okay.

19 DICK: Let me pass this on to you, --

20 STEVE: All right.

21 DICK: -- and it's very, it is very important  
22 that I do this, --

23 STEVE: Okay.

24 DICK: -- and it's very important that you  
25 understand that I say. So please, give me the  
opportunity --

1                   STEVE: Okay, I'm listening.

2                   DICK: -- to pass this on to you and then I  
3 will answer any questions that you might have.

4                   STEVE: Okay, go ahead.

5                   DICK: Okay. Are you and David and the  
6 other's in there ready to demonstrate any significant  
7 effort to resolve this matter?

8                   STEVE: Well, I thought that's what we've  
9 been doing.

10                  DICK: Okay, it appears, based on my  
11 conversation with you today, and other conversations  
12 we've had, that you're unwilling to attempt a good  
13 faith, safe resolution of this matter. The commander  
14 tells me that a minimum of ten to twenty individuals  
15 must leave the compound by 4 p.m. today for safety  
16 reasons. If they are not out of that compound by 4  
17 p.m., a minimum of ten people, certain actions will be  
18 taken.

19                  Steve, we continue to want to resolve this matter  
20 safely. This is not to be construed as any threat, but  
21 we must move on. We're here to talk with you at any  
22 time, all you have to do is pick up that telephone.

23                  Again, this is not a threat, Steve, this is a  
24 promise.

25                  Now, I want to recite some rules for your safety.  
Let's go over this once more between us, then I will

1 ask -- answer any questions that you might have.

2       No one will be allowed to exit the building with a  
3 weapon. We tell you this for your own protection, for  
4 if our agents perceive that their lives or the life of  
5 someone else is at risk, they will take appropriate  
6 action to ensure their own safety. No one will be  
7 allowed to aim a weapon from a window, as this may also  
8 be perceived by our agents as a threat to their lives  
9 or the life of others and compel them to act  
10 accordingly.

11       Any time you exit the building and are approached  
12 by our agents, you must fully comply with any verbal  
13 instructions to avoid exposing yourself to potential  
14 risk.

15       Now, again, this is very important that you  
16 understand this, and that's why I wanted to talk  
17 directly to David, so, it is my belief that this is  
18 something that David will want to hear for himself, and  
19 I'm asking you once again, to go to David and tell  
20 David that I have a very important issue to discuss  
21 with him.

22       STEVE: I can pass, I've got it, you know, I  
23 mean, I didn't misunderstand anything you said. I'll  
24 pass it along.

25       DICK: So you do understand the substance of

--

1 STEVE: Sure.

2 DICK: -- of what I told you?

3 STEVE: Sure I do.

4 DICK: Okay. Now, would you like to go talk  
5 to David once more. I'm willing to wait on the phone.

6 STEVE: I'll, I'll pass it on, I'll pass it  
7 on.

8 DICK: I will wait your return.

9 STEVE: I do have a request though for,  
10 someone just came to me, I didn't realize. We, we have  
11 a man here that has heart problems and right out in  
12 front of the building he has a vehicle of which that  
13 medicine is in his vehicle. He will come out unarmed,  
14 he's an older man, he has nothing on him, you can watch  
15 him or whatever else you'd like to do, but he wants --

16 DICK: He can be one of those ten, Steve,  
17 that can leave, that leaves the compound.

18 STEVE: Okay, or, like he said, the guy came  
19 to me and says, irregardless, he'll go out there and if  
20 you want to shoot him you can do that.

21 DICK: No, we're not going to do --

22 STEVE: No, no, listen to me.

23 DICK: We're not going to do that, Steve.

24 STEVE: I'm telling you what he said. You  
25 know, I can't stop the guy if he does.

DICK: No, I understand what you're saying.

1 STEVE: Okay, just so, --

2 DICK: Okay.

3 STEVE: You know, I have no control over the  
4 man. He said, he says, I need my medicine, I says,  
5 well, let me ask him before, he wanted to go right out  
6 the door two days ago already and I said, well, let me  
7 ask. Then we got cut off yesterday and then, of  
8 course, the other thing happened, so, that's -- Now  
9 he's after me, about an hour ago again, he said he  
10 needs to go out there.

11 DICK: Well, Steve, please --

12 STEVE: Yeah.

13 DICK: Ensure that nothing is done  
14 irrationally, okay? We're, you understand exactly what  
15 I told you. He can be one of those ten individuals,  
16 but understand that this is important matter that I  
17 need to discuss with David. Will you please get David  
18 for me so I can communicate directly with David  
19 concerning this. I'm not going to tie him up on the  
20 phone, I just want to communicate the same information  
21 that I gave to you. That is it has to be ten to twenty  
22 individuals, and I mean ten to twenty. That doesn't  
23 mean one, that doesn't mean two, that doesn't mean  
24 three or four, it means a minimum of ten. A minimum of  
25 ten. We understand one another, do we not?

STEVE: Oh, yes, I understand.

1 DICK: Would you please go get David then,  
2 so I can communicate directly to David?

3 STEVE: I will try one more time --

4 DICK: Thank you.

5 STEVE: -- just to show you I'll do  
6 everything possible.

7 DICK: Thank you.

8 (pause)

9 STEVE: Hello.

10 DICK: Yes, Steve.

11 STEVE: Yeah, I just told him in exact  
12 detail, what you just told me in detail, same thing.

13 DICK: Did he understand it?

14 STEVE: Yes, I says, do you understand, he  
15 says, yes, I do.

16 DICK: And you're clear in your mind?

17 STEVE: Yes.

18 DICK: We have transportation waiting. We're  
19 willing and able to take those folks. You understand  
20 --

21 STEVE: Yes.

22 DICK: -- exactly what I have said?

23 STEVE: I do understand.

24 DICK: Do you have a question for me?

25 STEVE: I don't have.

DICK: All right. Fair enough. We are at



1 the end of this phone, all you have to do is ring us, I  
2 will be here to speak with you and what, the next thing  
3 that happens is your responsibility here. You have a  
4 responsibility out there to those people, as does  
5 David, and it's necessary for us to get this moving.

6 Now, the things we just went over are very clear.  
7 I don't think there's any room for any misunderstanding  
8 there, and we will be here and we are awaiting the exit  
9 of a minimum of ten people from the compound, and we  
10 will go on from there. I assure you, we will deal with  
11 you fairly, sincerely, and we're willing to do that at  
12 any time. All right, Steve?

13 STEVE: I heard you, yeah.

14 DICK: Very well, thank you.

15 STEVE: Okay, sure. Bye.

16 DICK: Bye.

17 \* \* \* \* \*

18 STEVE: Hello.

19 DICK: Steve?

20 STEVE: Dick?

21 DICK: Folks coming out?

22 STEVE: Is this Dick?

23 DICK: It is.

24 STEVE: Oh, okay.

25 DICK: You folks coming out?

STEVE: I've been talking to a number of

1 people here and I'm trying to get something going here  
2 right now.

3 DICK: No, we told you, 4 o'clock.

4 STEVE: Okay.

5 DICK: 4 o'clock.

6 STEVE: I haven't talked to anybody that's  
7 willing to come out.

8 DICK: Well, we've got to have ten by 4  
9 o'clock.

10 STEVE: Well, how much time do I have here  
11 yet?

12 DICK: Well, you got about three minutes.

13 STEVE: Okay.

14 DICK: Three minutes, 10 o'clock -- ten  
15 people, out the door. We understood? We talked about

22 DICK: All right? You understand what I'm  
23 telling you?

4 DICK: All right. I just wanted to make sure

7 DICK: All right.

8 STEVE: Okay, bye.

12 DICK: Steve?

13 STEVE: Yeah.

14 DICK: Dick.

16 DICK: Once more, I want to go over the rules  
17 for safety with you.

18 STEVE: Okay.

19 DICK: No one will be allowed to exit the  
20 building with a weapon. We tell you this for your own  
21 protection, for if our agents perceive that their lives

23 appropriate action to ensure their own safety. No one

3 our agents, are approached by our agents or are  
4 approaching our agents, you must fully comply with any

7 STEVE: Yes, I do.

8 DICK: We've gone over there, gone over them  
9 at some length, have we not?

10 STEVE: I do remember you repeated them  
11 earlier.

12 DICK: Okay, you're fully aware of that?

13 STEVE: I am.

14 DICK: All right, very well.

15 STEVE: Okay.

16 DICK: Everybody else is aware of it too?  
17 You passed that on, I know that you have.

18 STEVE: Right.

19 DICK: And David's aware of it, and you've  
20 communicated with David, these things that we discussed  
21 over the last several hours, have you not?

22 STEVE: That is correct.

23 DICK: What is his response?

24 STEVE: Well, just as myself. He says talk  
25 to anybody, see if they want to go out. If they want  
to come to me and talk about it, but he also said to

1 me, what happened with Livingston? I said, I asked  
2 them, and they don't want to talk about it. He says,  
3 okay.

4 DICK: All right, very well. I just want to  
5 ensure that you're aware of the safety rules and that  
6 we're in --

7 STEVE: Well, let me just tell you this  
8 though, now, remember, there's a lot of people here and  
9 they're itchy, so if you're going to do anything that's  
10 intimidating or that you're going to threaten their  
11 life in any manner, shape or form, I have no control  
12 over that.

13 DICK: Listen, are intention is avoid  
14 violence -- (tone) You there Steven?

15 STEVE: Yeah.

16 DICK: All right, our intention, obviously,  
17 is to avoid any violence. We're doing this for safety  
18 purposes. You understand the safety rules, we want to  
19 resolve this issue without any injury to anyone. You  
20 understand that, do you not?

21 STEVE: I do.

22 DICK: We've communicated that back to you  
23 many, many times. And you have also said the same  
24 thing.

25 STEVE: I have, and I'm right with you in  
that all the way through.

1 DICK: Well, let's ensure then, --

2 STEVE: Okay.

3 DICK: -- that we understand one another.

4 All right? You're aware --

5 STEVE: I'm trying to read, you know, exactly  
6 what you're saying --

7 DICK: When you're ready to come out, you  
8 call me back. When you're ready to send your people  
9 out, you call me back. I'm at this number.

10 STEVE: All right.

11 DICK: Thank you.

12 STEVE: Bye.

14 STEVE: Hello, it's Steve here?

15 DICK: Steve?

16 STEVE: Is this Dick?

22 DICK: Are you guys ready to make some, some

3 STEVE: I was gonna lay on my back and just,  
4 I was listening to the tape or, I think it's, is that  
5 live with Byron right now? It sounds like it is. I  
6 was actually listening to all that he was having to  
7 say.

8 DICK: Steve, it's time to get, get moving  
9 toward to clearing up this issue.

10 STEVE: Well, I was listening to what he was  
11 having to say. He's been making some points. Some of  
12 them sound okay, you know, I was trying to listen to  
13 everything he had there.

14 DICK: Is anyone ready to come out now?

15 STEVE: I haven't even, you know, I was, I'm  
16 so tired and bushed, you know, I should probably --

17 DICK: Well, we're not, I'm not asking you,  
18 I'm asking you if there are others ready to come out to  
19 include Louis.

20 STEVE: I don't know. I'm so, I could give  
21 the phone to all these people, you know, you could talk  
22 to them.

23 DICK: No, I don't want to do that. We've  
24 gone beyond that. Let's make some decisions in there.  
25 it's time to go. You know, you control what happens in  
there. If you want a continuation of what just

1 happened, then, we can do that. But let's not, let's  
2 not do that. Let's get it, let's get it resolved,  
3 let's come out, let's get this thing off, off the mark  
4 and get in gear here.

5 STEVE: Yeah, the motorcycle that they got  
6 actually happened to be mine. I thought they did a  
7 pretty good job on it. Man, they planted it good.

8 DICK: Well that's, that's up to you.

9 STEVE: No, that's fine, I don't mind, you  
10 know, it's only a material thing.

11 DICK: Oh, that's right. You're not in to  
12 material things, are you?

13 STEVE: I really am not anymore, I'll be  
14 honest with you. A person wouldn't be living in a  
15 place like this if they were. Believe me, they  
16 wouldn't be.

17 DICK: Well, that's our concern, one of  
18 safety for the children. With the kind of conditions  
19 under which you're living in there now.

20 STEVE: Well, if you'd only ever let me  
21 explain about those children, but I don't think you'd  
22 believe it anyway, so it's only a loss and a waste of  
23 time.

24 DICK: We're concerned about the children.  
25 Let's get this going, okay? Now this --

STEVE: I want to tell you, I, Dick, I'm



1 | telling you, I tried so hard, all the way through and  
2 | the last thing that I really tried to do was talk to  
3 | Livingston's, the last two that I really talked to, and  
4 | I'm not going to make anything up, was Doris, her name  
5 | is and Yvette. That was the last two, and I thought  
6 | for positive they were coming out, I thought I could  
7 | maybe get a good grasp at things and things would be  
8 | going again, I really did, and then, of course, when he  
9 | never called back then they start on me, the both of  
10 | them did. They said, see, there you have it, they said  
11 | to me like that, and I says, well, wait a minute, just  
12 | wait. I says maybe there is a breakdown or maybe this  
13 | or maybe that and, and since then, I mean, I've talked  
14 | to a couple of people, but not serious because I can  
15 | tell by the way they're acting to me now that they're  
16 | not, it's like they don't want to hear me.

17 |           DICK: Steve, let me ask you something.

18 |           STEVE: Yeah.

19 |           DICK: Was that a good feeling around 4  
20 | o'clock? Did you feel good about that?

21 |           STEVE: I haven't felt good about anything --

22 |           DICK: Okay.

23 |           STEVE: -- since this all came about.

24 |           DICK: Well, --

25 |           STEVE: I'll, that's my, I'll tell you the  
truth, my stomach, my head, I'm worn, I'm worn, my

1 | throat, my head --.

2 |           DICK: It isn't gonna get any better. It  
3 | isn't gonna get any better.

4 |           STEVE: I'm so tired. I'm exasperated.

5 |           DICK: David has the ability to send people  
6 | out, all right, we need a significant showing, okay?  
7 | Minimums we're talking about. A minimum of ten. All  
8 | right? We need to get this going. You can do that,  
9 | David can do that. It's time. This is the 26th day,  
10 | it is time.

11 |           STEVE: I almost think you guys could do  
12 | better talking to these people than me because I'm,  
13 | they're not bothering with me much anymore.

14 |           DICK: The ball's in your court, Steve.  
15 | It's, it's your responsibility.

16 |           STEVE: How is it my responsibility? The  
17 | reason I stayed on all this time is to try to make a  
18 | difference.

19 |           DICK: As a collective, I'm, I'm talking  
20 | about you, meaning collective.

21 |           STEVE: I know, I mean, but the reason I  
22 | stayed on here, Dick, in the first place was to make  
23 | sure that people would be exiting safely and all the  
24 | rest and, but I, the truth is I never dreamed that it  
25 | would be going like a roller coaster ride, though,  
   | either.

1               DICK: Why don't you get a hold of Judy,  
2 yourself, your, your daughter, that's three out of ten,  
3 and pick up another seven and start on out of there.

4               STEVE: Even if we did, I know, first of all,  
5 Judy --

6               DICK: It's a start. It's a start.

7               STEVE: I already, I talked to her. She's  
8 told me she don't want to, she said. She said she's  
9 concerned that she'll never see Mayanah again. I mean,  
10 she's adamant about that. She says, watch, I'll never  
11 see her, that's gonna be it.

12              DICK: Not true. Get Judy, Mayanah,  
13 yourself, free and seven more. Get the fella you  
14 mentioned earlier today --

15              STEVE: I haven't been able to convince Judy.  
16 She's so, I mean, when it comes to the child,  
17 seriously, --

18              DICK: Well, what is her, what is she waiting  
19 for? I mean, she's obviously got some --

20              STEVE: I don't know. It's almost like one  
21 of those things, I don't know, what is the human  
22 problem there? I don't know. You tell me because she  
23 just doesn't want to leave her baby go.

24              DICK: Bring the baby with her.

25              STEVE: She knows she's gonna be taken from  
her and she doesn't think she'll see her again. She,

1 | in fact, they already told her that.

2 |           DICK: Well, that's not accurate. That's not  
3 | accurate. But that, you know, Steve, once again, we're  
4 | into these delaying tactics. We've got to move. Okay?

5 |           STEVE: I have been talking, I've tried my  
6 | best, I don't know what else to do.

7 |           DICK: Is David, is David upstairs  
8 | surrounding himself with kids about 4 o'clock or is he  
9 | going to come out and talk to us?

10 |           STEVE: I haven't, to tell you the truth, you  
11 | know what? I was way out, I don't even know where he  
12 | is. I was at the other end of the building, I just  
13 | went back to --

14 |           DICK: Was that a feeling you enjoyed? The  
15 | stress out there at 4 o'clock? Did you enjoy that?

16 |           STEVE: I haven't enjoyed anything since I've  
17 | been here, I'll be honest.

18 |           DICK: Well then let's, let's go ahead and  
19 | get that done. If David's hiding up there somewhere,  
20 | direct him to the telephone. We'd be happy to speak  
21 | with him.

22 |           STEVE: I don't think, I don't think he is  
23 | because when you, before when you said what you did to  
24 | me, I went up there twice, and it was a long distance  
25 | from where I'm at, I went to where he was twice, I said  
   | what I did to him. He's laying there like he's, he

1 | looks white as a sheet, he doesn't good at all.

2 |           DICK: Well then he may not be in a position  
3 | to make these decisions that need to be made. Perhaps  
4 | it's time for you to do those things.

5 |           STEVE: Even -- do that, these people out,  
6 | they're involved with him, not, I'm telling you, they  
7 | are.

8 |           DICK: Steve, take a stance for once in your  
9 | life. Stand up and be counted.

10 |           STEVE: I have already told them that. I've  
11 | already told them.

12 |           DICK: No, I'm not talking him, I'm talking  
13 | about you. It's time for you to stand up and be  
14 | counted. Make the decision. Do it. Be the leader  
15 | that those folks need. Get them together, --

16 |           STEVE: I have tried to.

17 |           DICK: -- yourself, Judy and Mayanah, and get  
18 | Louis and get the fellow that you mentioned earlier  
19 | that might have some problem, medical problems, that is  
20 | a total of five, --

21 |           STEVE: I, you know --

22 |           DICK: -- all you need is five more.

23 |           STEVE: I've asked them, I even, the person  
24 | you're talking about is Scott, and I've talked to him a  
25 | number of times and he says he's not choosing to go  
just yet, and I even asked these people, what are you

1 waiting for? What do you want to do? How long do you  
2 want to sit here? I've asked them and I says, if I  
3 make a move would you go? And they says, no, and I  
4 even talked to Judy, she keeps getting back on the  
5 issue of her, of Mayanah. She says I don't want  
6 Mayanah taken and I know they're gonna take her, they  
7 told me that already and she says --

8 DICK: Nobody told you that. Nobody told you  
9 that. Please, don't, don't start those kinds of  
10 things. We're beyond that.

11 STEVE: Well, I don't know. She, Dick, I  
12 haven't been on the phone. I don't know what they've  
13 told her. Honest. She told me that, I don't know.

14 DICK: What is the future for you and your  
15 family in there or anybody else?

16 STEVE: It doesn't look good, does it?

17 DICK: There is no future inside that  
18 building. You've got to come out and get moving. Life  
19 goes on, Steve, and you can overcome this but you've  
20 got to get moving. What kind of father are you, I  
21 mean, are you interested in the welfare of your child?  
22 I would hope you are.

23 STEVE: I always have been.

24 DICK: All right, then, let's get her, pick  
25 her up, get Judy and leave that place. You know, --

STEVE: Have you ever --

1                   DICK: Listen, Steve, hold it. Let me  
2 mention something to you.

3                   STEVE: What?

4                   DICK: You don't need David Koresh to run  
5 your life for you.

6                   STEVE: He hasn't run my life.

7                   DICK: Well, he, it appears to me that he is.

8                   STEVE: Well, what's happened, Dick, is he's  
9 showed something that I can't help but be in convicted  
10 about.

11                  DICK: That's fine.

12                  STEVE: What does one do about that?

13                  DICK: That's fine. You have the ability to  
14 look into that Bible yourself. Let's get away from  
15 that --

16                  STEVE: I do and I haven't, I've honestly  
17 given my best shot to try to controvert what he has,  
18 try to rip him apart --

19                  DICK: He's a negative influence on you and  
20 your family.

21                  STEVE: I've had a lot of friends that are  
22 scholars, associates that are, that are, that are  
23 Ph.d.s, D.D.s, all the rest, they weren't able to  
24 handle him.

25                  DICK: Steve, it's my understanding that you  
and Judy had a terrific life before you met that man.

1 Am I right?

2 STEVE: We still do. That hasn't gone down.

3 DICK: Really. Okay, well, maybe your, your  
4 understanding of a good marriage and mine are perhaps  
5 something different.

6 STEVE: At the same time you're listening to  
7 all sorts of nonsense out there and I've always said  
8 I'll sit down and talk to you about anything, that, the  
9 rumors that Marc Breault started and some of these  
10 people from Australia, that's where it all came from.  
11 And he, of course, poisoned David Jewell up in  
12 Michigan, about a year ago and on and on it goes.

13 DICK: You're responsible for your family,  
14 Steve, not David.

15 STEVE: No, but I'm also responsible for a  
16 lot of these people that were good friends of mine --

17 DICK: I understand. Let's bring them out.

18 STEVE: -- over in the Hawaiian islands.

19 DICK: Okay, then let's take, let's take the  
20 opportunity now --

21 STEVE: Well, I've talked to them. I could  
22 even go right down the list with you what I've said to  
23 different ones, some I've spent more time with than  
24 others and --

25 DICK: Steve, I'm gonna tell you something  
you're probably aware of. David is concerned about



1 | himself. He's got his own agenda, all right? That is  
2 | the kind of personality that he is, --

3 |         STEVE: Normally --

4 |         DICK: You know it and I know it, all right?

5 |         STEVE: Not so. I mean, I don't believe  
6 | that --

7 |         DICK: You, listen, Steve, --

8 |         STEVE: I really don't.

9 |         DICK: -- you do know that. It's, it's very  
10 | clear to you, you know it, we know it.

11 |         STEVE: The problem is, if you could show to  
12 | me that that Bible was worthless, if it wasn't true, I  
13 | would be out of here because if that book isn't true,  
14 | there's no sense in me being here at all.

15 |         DICK: You don't have, you don't have to  
16 | argue with that point with us. The Bible is accurate.

17 |         STEVE: If it's accurate, --

18 |         DICK: It's David's understanding --

19 |         STEVE: If it's accurate --

20 |         DICK: It's David's understanding that is at  
21 | issue here.

22 |         STEVE: No, it isn't, 'cause the guy doesn't  
23 | deal in the realms of opinion and theory, I mean, you  
24 | know, if you look at a testimony like Nahum, there's  
25 | only three chapters there --

       DICK: Steve, Steve, let's don't get into

1 | that.

2 |           STEVE: No, no, I'm just, I'm, I'm, you know,  
3 | I'm responding to what you're saying.

4 |           DICK: You make your own interpretation.  
5 | Your interpretation is good for you. I will interpret  
6 | in my fashion, however, that does not, that does not  
7 | resolve where we are.

8 |           STEVE: I would sure like to listen to what  
9 | you do have on some of those things 'cause I'm an open  
10 | minded person.

11 |           DICK: Well, maybe you and I will get  
12 | together at some point in time. Right now, we're going  
13 | to deal with this issue here.

14 |           STEVE: Well, I've always been open minded.  
15 | I've always listened; if you've got something to share  
16 | that's better or whatever, believe me, I would look at  
17 | it, if it had a ring of truth to it that was better  
18 | than was here, I'm with it.

19 |           DICK: Steve, this is, this is an, an  
20 | exhibition of what we're going to have to do if this  
21 | continues, okay? If you care about your family and the  
22 | other folks inside there that you're responsible for  
23 | recruiting from the Hawaii area, let's move on this  
24 | issue.

25 |           Now, if you're gonna continue to listen to people  
   | like Wayne, then you, I'm afraid, my friend, that you

1 | could do much better. You could do much better. Let's  
2 | get this thing moving. Take it upon yourself to do  
3 | some moving.

4 |           STEVE: (indiscernible) There's a couple of  
5 | guys, there's a couple of guys right here, would you  
6 | want, there's one guy here that I don't think you have  
7 | ever talked to before, would you want to talk to him?

8 |           DICK: No.

9 |           STEVE: Are you sure?

10 |           DICK: You send him out and I'll talk to him,  
11 | but right now I'd prefer to get this thing moving.

12 |           STEVE: Well, no one, no one there, I don't  
13 | think anyone there has ever talked to him and I don't  
14 | know, I mean, I don't know, you know, I'm saying maybe  
15 | you could say something, I'm not certain.

16 |           DICK: Listen, I want Louis to be sent out,  
17 | okay? Your friend from last night, send him out the  
18 | door.

19 |           STEVE: I can't force the guy, Dick. How  
20 | would I get the guy out the door? I could say get out  
21 | of here and all that, and I mean, and even as the  
22 | Christian principles, how can you do something like  
23 | that? I can't. It's not in me to do that. If I look  
24 | at Matthew 25, that's basically what Christianity's  
25 | been for 2,000 years, Matthew 25.

          DICK: Steve, do you have any fortitude? I

1 | hear you talk, but I don't hear you say anything.

2 |         STEVE: I don't doubt it anymore --

3 |         DICK: What I want --

4 |         STEVE: I'm worn out.

5 |         DICK: Well, come on out of there. All  
6 | right, you need to show some courage.

7 |         STEVE: Is that a --

8 |         DICK: And common sense is another leadership  
9 | trait.

10 |         STEVE: I use to have a little bit of that.

11 |         DICK: Well, let's get it back. You can  
12 | recover from that. Let's do it. You know, you're  
13 | gonna have to show --

14 |         STEVE: Are you sure you don't want to talk  
15 | with the man from England here? He's a super nice guy,  
16 | you haven't talked with him yet. I think you'd like  
17 | him, I do.

18 |         DICK: What's his name, Donohue?

19 |         STEVE: Donohue?

20 |         DICK: What did you say his name was?

21 |         STEVE: No, no, his name is Cliff.

22 |         DICK: I'm sorry, I misunderstood you. Cliff  
23 | what?

24 |         STEVE: Sellers.

25 |         DICK: Cliff Sellers. Is Cliff willing to  
come out now?

1 STEVE: I don't know, I've never, you know  
2 I've never asked him.  
3 DICK: Listen, listen, I'm not interested in  
4 sitting here and stalling for time, all right?  
5 STEVE: I'm not stalling. I don't know what  
6 to do anymore, I mean with these, I don't.  
7 DICK: Steve, you absolutely know what you  
8 need to do.  
9 STEVE: Which is?  
10 DICK: You need to get this movement started.  
11 STEVE: That's what I've been working on and  
12 the most difficult thing that has happened, the latest,  
13 was that Livingston problem. That's what kind of  
14 halted for me.  
15 DICK: Listen, I dealt with that issue, I  
16 know what that problem is and it can't be overcome at  
17 this time, all right?  
18 STEVE: When can it be?  
19 DICK: Use your common sense and your  
20 intellect --  
21 STEVE: Is there any way, though, that any  
22 way possible, because that's where it left off with me  
23 working with those two people and then everybody else  
24 is watching what happened to them and that's where I  
25 kind of lost it totally.  
DICK: We'll hook you up with Livingston.

1 I'm telling you that the problem, you know what the  
2 problem was, I've explained it to you in depth.

3 STEVE: I heard, I heard, but it didn't help  
4 me in dealing with the mother and the wife and --

5 DICK: Well, forget the mother and wife, all  
6 right?

7 STEVE: How --

8 DICK: Let's move on to something else.

9 STEVE: There was about five people watching  
10 those two. After those two went out there was another  
11 five that were talking about going. And now all of a  
12 sudden that happened, now they don't talk to me. Now  
13 what? Now what do I tell them? I can tell them to  
14 leave, they won't do it no more than I can talk into  
15 anybody else into doing anything here.

16 DICK: Steve, I think the 4 o'clock event was  
17 a clear indication to you what the commander's wish.  
18 That was very clear to you. I know you were upstairs  
19 or you were concerned about what was to happen, were  
20 you not?

21 STEVE: No, I was actually downstairs looking  
22 out a window watching my motorcycle being run over.

23 DICK: Okay, well, at any rate, the  
24 commander's have indicated --

25 STEVE: I even waved at one of the guys.

DICK: -- that we, this is no longer

1 acceptable, all right? We need --

2 STEVE: Life isn't acceptable.

3 DICK: We need some significant movement,  
4 minimum of ten and for you and I to talk, it is not  
5 going to accomplish anything. You need to move,  
6 period. There's no question about that any longer.  
7 We're not going to continue to talk about events that  
8 happened in the past. We're going to talk about what  
9 we are going to do to resolve this issue.

10 STEVE: Well, the way these people feel these  
11 days, they wouldn't really care if you did take us all  
12 out.

13 DICK: We're not, we're just telling you to  
14 come out.

15 STEVE: I mean take us out for good.

16 DICK: Steve, listen, if you're gonna talk  
17 nonsense, --

18 STEVE: I'm not talking nonsense.

19 DICK: -- there's no use in us talking.

20 STEVE: I'm tired. I'm literally, physically  
21 worn out.

22 DICK: Then walk out the door --

23 STEVE: After being up four or five days, --

24 DICK: -- and up the street.

25 STEVE: I mean, you know, you got that music  
and all sorts of weird sounds going on, it doesn't

1 | really bother me, it's just keeping me from sleeping  
2 | and doing, working with anybody actually, so, a lot of  
3 | people here are starting to act funny. Maybe, if you  
4 | keep on going they'll start getting itchy fingers and  
5 | we can get it over quicker, I mean, 'cause I'm losing  
6 | control with people around here. They're not listening  
7 | to me, I'm telling you the truth, they're not listening  
8 | to me.

9 |           DICK: That's your choice and it's the  
10 | responsibility to the folks out there.

11 |           STEVE: Ever since, I knew you didn't want to  
12 | hear about it, but every since the Livingston Fagan  
13 | thing, I have had --

14 |           DICK: Listen, I have heard, you know,  
15 | proceeding that was any number of other events, okay?  
16 | Please, let's don't get into that. Livingston Fagan is  
17 | a small item that we can resolved here, all right?

18 |           STEVE: He wasn't to the people here though,  
19 | nor was he to me. Honestly. That was a big deal to me  
20 | with him.

21 |           DICK: You know, you've supplied different  
22 | reasons for days, up to 26 days for not doing much of  
23 | anything, frankly. Much of anything.

24 |           STEVE: How many people, how many people are  
25 | out there already, though, Dick?

          DICK: There are 35 people, okay? How many



1 are in there?

2 STEVE: There's, there's more than that.

3 DICK: How many are in there?

4 STEVE: There's more than that on the  
5 outside.

6 DICK: How many of them are in there?

7 STEVE: About, oh, three times that.

8 DICK: Well, let's get moving then. Let's  
9 reduce that number by a significant event. That'll  
10 show good faith on your part, it will appease the  
11 commander's here, and we'll get this thing off dead  
12 center.

13 STEVE: Byron, I mean, with Byron, you know,  
14 remember that day when I was talking with him, I said  
15 it goes so far with these other people here, if all he  
16 had to do was make a call back, let him see his kids,  
17 and man, we're, we're, ask him that. Ask Byron that.  
18 I talked to him about that and he got unhappy because,  
19 you know, we were not, like, sending 30, 40 people out  
20 right then, and he says, well, you know, let the guy  
21 call back and that kind of thing can't happen, but  
22 don't always stop it when we start doing that kind of  
23 thing, I mean, that's what I don't get.

24 DICK: Steve, listen, I have heard the 30 to  
25 40, --

STEVE: No, but I --

1 DICK: -- I have heard all of you --

2 STEVE: Listen, are not these people afraid  
3 of the things you guys do if you don't build this trust  
4 thing and you say one thing and then you do, I don't  
5 know why you ever had to do some of that stuff. It was  
6 already moving on three different occasions.

7 DICK: I'm telling you that the commander's  
8 will not tolerate this kind of conversation and it's  
9 just not worth us going through this. We need  
10 significant movement. That's exactly what we're  
11 telling you. We want --

12 STEVE: I have, I can't use physical force on  
13 these people.

14 DICK: I understand. You are in a position  
15 to direct those folks out or to encourage them to leave  
16 and you certainly can leave yourself, and you have  
17 indicated, on more than one occasion, that you are  
18 ready to leave, but yet, you keep stalling and you  
19 won't make the move. Why is it that you have that  
20 difficulty?

21 STEVE: Probably because I got a lot of these  
22 people involved in here, that's why.

23 DICK: Well then bring those folks out --

24 STEVE: I've been trying.

25 DICK: -- along with yourself.

STEVE: I have been trying to do that.

1               DICK: No, you're not trying. You're not  
2 trying at all.

3               STEVE: Oh, man, you can't tell how I'm worn  
4 out, my throat, my mouth, everything, I mean, I'm just  
5 totally worn out from talking. I am. I mean, one day  
6 you'll get to see if I was telling the truth or not,  
7 seriously.

8               DICK: Listen, you need to start working on  
9 these ten people, all right, you know, talking to me in  
10 this fashion isn't accomplishing anything.

11              STEVE: I know 'cause I'm shot, I'm literally  
12 shot.

13              DICK: Well, then, --

14              STEVE: I can't hardly think straight.

15              DICK: -- put David on the phone then for  
16 occasion. You know, what is he going to do, lay on his  
17 back and take, you know, have a good time most of the  
18 day or what?

19              STEVE: Well, he sure hasn't had any good  
20 time since he's been shot.

21              DICK: Well then get him up and get him  
22 moving. You know, if this guy continues to sit in  
23 there and hide from a responsibility --

24              STEVE: He's laying, he actually lays out on  
25 his back. He honestly is. I looked in there and he's  
got a hand on his forehead and he has a terrible, the

1 | guy's never had headaches in his life.

2 |           DICK: Listen, if you want to play some soft,  
3 | sad songs for me, --

4 |           STEVE: I don't know what to do. The guy up  
5 | there --

6 |           DICK: -- do it in another fashion, will you?  
7 | I hear that every night on the radio on my way out of  
8 | here.

9 |           STEVE: How many guys have ever been wounded?  
10 | How fast do they, I don't even know anything about  
11 | recovery.

12 |           DICK: Listen, I hear on the country and  
13 | western channels on the radio as I leave here, all  
14 | those kinds of things. Listen, I don't want to listen  
15 | to that, okay?

16 |           STEVE: That's kind of funny because I agree  
17 | with you on that. I never have liked country western.

18 |           DICK: Well, I've heard David's song many  
19 | times since I've been hear in 26 days, you know?

20 |           STEVE: Dick, you're funny.

21 |           DICK: Well, thank you, I appreciate that.  
22 | Let's get moving. Let's get moving. All right? Get  
23 | David up off his back.

24 |           STEVE: How do you do that?

25 |           DICK: You know, this guy, this guy is really  
| showing you some leadership there, isn't he? He's got

1 | it all together, doesn't he? He's the kind of guy you  
2 | want to stay there and perhaps put, your, the jeopardy  
3 | of all those folks in, you know, it's crazy. It is  
4 | absolute crazy to do that.

5 |         STEVE: Dick, have you got, do you really  
6 | think that --

7 |         DICK: What is your benefit for staying out  
8 | there?

9 |         STEVE: Eternal life.

10 |         DICK: Eternal life, you can, you can work  
11 | with that once you get out of there. You think that's  
12 | the place to deal with it?

13 |         STEVE: Have you, did you ever get to hear  
14 | any of what he said to like, what he said to say, John  
15 | Cox?

16 |         DICK: Listen, I have heard enough of David  
17 | Koresh to last me the rest of my life. The rest of my  
18 | life.

19 |         STEVE: Do you know the theological  
20 | progression with what he's been sharing?

21 |         DICK: I hear what he's sharing and, you  
22 | know, you're welcome to listen to it. Frankly, he's  
23 | not going to convert me and I'm not listed -- I'm not  
24 | interested in David's message, okay? I'm not  
25 | interested in David's message at all. And if you'll  
   | listen to some of the public in connection with some of

1 | those tapes we sent in, you'll find out the rest of the  
2 | folks are getting a little concerned, a little upset  
3 | with David too. You know what they're upset with? The  
4 | money that's being spent trying to talk some sense into  
5 | this, into this fellow.

6 |           STEVE: Oh, Dick, after what this stupid  
7 | government waste, squanders money, they create the  
8 | deficit and we're concerned about that?

9 |           DICK: You know, the people are interested in  
10 | the rest of you folks in there, not David Koresh.

11 |           STEVE: You got the president overspending,  
12 | year after year, the congressmen and their nice homes  
13 | and their luxury and who knows what else, how many are  
14 | on the take and --

15 |           DICK: Steve, let me tell you something,  
16 | between you and me, okay?

17 |           STEVE: Okay.

18 |           DICK: Between you and me. I'm concerned  
19 | about the safety of you and others, to include your  
20 | daughter and Judy in there. David Koresh, if he wants  
21 | to choose to stay, he can stay and wait for whatever  
22 | he's waiting for, waiting for the sign in any fashion  
23 | that he may want to. All right? You're not waiting  
24 | for that. Get it together, get out of there, all  
25 | right?

          STEVE: Well, I talked to Judy two days ago

1 and she said she didn't want to leave.

2 DICK: Well, how about talking to her right  
3 now and let's get on out of there.

4 STEVE: She just walked by. She just went to  
5 another portion of the building. I could have called,  
6 if she comes back again I'll call her to the phone.

7 DICK: You know, Steve, I thought you had  
8 some strength of character, but the longer I talk to  
9 you I think I've made a mistake.

10 STEVE: You probably have.

11 DICK: I think I have made a mistake.

12 STEVE: I wouldn't doubt it.

13 DICK: Because listening to you, you're just  
14 not getting the job done.

15 STEVE: I know it.

16 DICK: You're not getting the job done.

17 STEVE: I agree with you.

18 DICK: Get that man up off his back and get  
19 him up here to the telephone and let's work the issue  
20 out. You take it upon yourself to come on out of there  
21 with the folks that you recruited --

22 STEVE: If I come out, I'll be on my own, I  
23 guarantee it because I've already talked to them, I've  
24 already said, hey, I'm ready to go out, if I go out,  
25 are you guys coming, and they said, no, they told me  
now. I'm telling you the truth, they said no.

1 DICK: You know, you know what your mother  
2 said or your relative told me?

3 STEVE: No, what's that?

4 DICK: They said you have absolutely, no love  
5 for David Koresh at all. In fact, not only that, but  
6 you don't even care for him as a person. Now, is that  
7 accurate or not?

8 STEVE: Oh, that's not accurate. I don't  
9 know why or where they would get that from.

10 DICK: Oh, okay. Well, let's face it, this  
11 man's message is not getting out, all right?

12 STEVE: Oh, it is, but not in the manner of  
13 where it comes to human devises, that's the thing.

14 DICK: How is he acting in your best interest  
15 or anybody else --

16 STEVE: Because he, number one, in every  
17 generation, God has worked contrary to the human --

18 DICK: Whoa, whoa, whoa, let's not get into  
19 that. I told you, I'm not going to discuss that with  
20 you.

21 STEVE: Well, see, everything that I'm into  
22 resolves around the Bible and God's plan for the final  
23 days of our history.

24 DICK: Well, listen, you work on God's plan  
25 after you come out.

STEVE: But it's not God's plan to do that



1 | though.

2 |           DICK: You can listen to God's plan. Do you  
3 | think, God talks to me and some of these others too,  
4 | you guys don't have a monopoly on that do you?

5 |           STEVE: No, no, he doesn't talk to me. I've  
6 | never heard voices. It's not my problem. I've never  
7 | --

8 |           DICK: Well, you're going to hear some voices  
9 | soon if you don't get out of there.

10 |           STEVE: What do you mean by that?

11 |           DICK: Well, I'll let you draw your own  
12 | conclusions.

13 |           STEVE: Are you talking about the speakers  
14 | there?

15 |           DICK: I'll let you draw your own  
16 | conclusions.

17 |           STEVE: Dick, I'll tell you the truth, I  
18 | really, I really do like you, I do. I do. If there  
19 | was some way that I could see you saved, I'd make sure  
20 | you would be.

21 |           DICK: Well, I tell you what, I'm doing my  
22 | best to ensure your safety. Why don't you come out of  
23 | there now?

24 |           STEVE: Oh, promise everybody here a nice  
25 | Holiday Inn room and, and guaranteed freedoms like the  
ATF, and I'll be right out there with everybody. I

1 | know I can convince them then. I'm serious. If I  
2 | could see those ATF, even one or two locked up or at  
3 | least investigated or looked at, I mean, man, that  
4 | would do it. I know that people would come out.

5 |           DICK: You know what?

6 |           STEVE: What?

7 |           DICK: I don't want to hear that kind of  
8 | stuff.

9 |           STEVE: Why is that --

10 |           DICK: Get serious. Is this a serious thing  
11 | we're trying to resolve?

12 |           STEVE: Dick, Dick, no, I am serious. Why,  
13 | why not? This is still America isn't it? Honestly,  
14 | why not? Can I say something about that press  
15 | conference this morning? I mean, that bothered me.  
16 | That, who was the spokesperson, can I ask you, 'cause I  
17 | didn't hear the name.

18 |           DICK: Frankly, I don't know who the  
19 | spokesman was today. Conroy was not there. I don't  
20 | know what his name was.

21 |           STEVE: I know. I could tell it wasn't  
22 | Conroy, but what the man said, I mean, I was  
23 | flabbergasted, I mean, outright lies. Outright lies.  
24 | I mean, the way he, here he can view his opinions and  
25 | his mouth and it's taken as fact before all the press,  
   | but where am I as a representative? If I came out

1 | there, would I be able to stand on that podium for  
2 | weeks and weeks like he has? Would I be able to be out  
3 | on bail and so forth until the trial?

4 |           DICK: Well, that's a question that will have  
5 | to be resolved by the Judge.

6 |           STEVE: Well, I mean, you're asking me to  
7 | take a chance with you people and you have not shown me  
8 | good faith and that those that have gone out there are  
9 | all locked up.

10 |           DICK: They're going to be, --

11 |           STEVE: Seriously.

12 |           DICK: -- they're going to be there until the  
13 | judge makes the determination that they're eligible for  
14 | bond.

15 |           STEVE: I don't trust the judge.

16 |           DICK: You know what? You don't trust  
17 | anybody.

18 |           STEVE: That's not true.

19 |           DICK: That's the point.

20 |           STEVE: I know there are, I know there are  
21 | good men out there, --

22 |           DICK: Really?

23 |           STEVE: But there seems to be fewer and  
24 | fewer.

25 |           DICK: Well, well, give me a couple of names  
that you might be referring to.

1 STEVE: Well, I'm not familiar with Texas,  
2 though, in the first place, so I've not spent that much  
3 time here, I really haven't. This is not my home, I've  
4 never cared for the place.

5 DICK: Well, it appears to me that you must  
6 care for the place.

7 STEVE: Well, I care for the concept of what  
8 truth is and what God expects of me and requires of me.

9 DICK: Well, as far as I know, truth is not  
10 available only at the, at the Branch Davidian compound.

11 STEVE: Well, there's more here --

12 DICK: It's available in certain other areas,  
13 I believe.

14 STEVE: Yeah, but the quantity and the  
15 ability to show a very clear picture has not been  
16 contended or controverted by anyone.

17 DICK: You know what, if you've got the, if  
18 you've got the truth out there, you ought to bottle it  
19 and sell it, okay?

20 STEVE: Oh, it'll go out. Dick, it will go  
21 out, but not in any way that you and I would ever  
22 dream.

23 DICK: It'll come out with you, Steve. If  
24 you're concerned about the truth -- You know, I hear  
25 this, quote, concern about the truth, but I don't hear,  
I don't hear it said with any, with any real

1 conviction, because if, if that were the case, you  
2 would get yourself out of there and get on, get up  
3 before the public and make your thoughts known.

4 The court of public opinion is where you need to  
5 talk.

6 STEVE: You and I know the public doesn't  
7 want to hear me. God's gonna have to use another  
8 avenue, truly, these people are already saying how  
9 we're looking for press coverage. The only reason why  
10 we ever mentioned press was for the safety of the  
11 progression of moving out and along --

12 DICK: You know, the press is like many other  
13 things you mentioned. It means nothing to you because  
14 it's a method for you to sit in there and complain and  
15 bitch about things.

16 STEVE: Not, not at all. I don't really, the  
17 press, from what I've seen, those that were moved back  
18 two and a half, three miles, and what they haven't  
19 shown and brought out in the news and so forth, not in  
20 regards to religion. The only thing they every had to  
21 say on our behalf, when it comes to spiritual things  
22 and religion, is that the only thing this man really  
23 claims that is here, the only thing, is that if a  
24 person really says they believe in the Bible and  
25 Christianity and --

DICK: Hold it. I told you, I'm not going to

1 speak about the Bible and Christianity.

2 STEVE: No, no, no, I just, no, no, wait,  
3 wait. The only thing I was going to say about it, the  
4 only thing that he really has ever said, you know,  
5 that, in the way they responded it had nothing to do  
6 with what his main statement was and that's that he can  
7 open up and show from anybody's Bible, not an  
8 interpretation, but where the seven seals are located,  
9 right into the Bible.

10 DICK: Hold it, listen, I don't want to hear  
11 you say the seven seals one more time. I'm not gonna  
12 talk about the seven seals again.

13 STEVE: I'm not talking about them, I'm just  
14 talking about why and what he was up to, not to do it,  
15 getting on some broadcast and, what did you call it,  
16 CBN or whatever it is?

17 DICK; You know, at one point in time you  
18 suggest, give us the CBN, let's get on the Christian  
19 broadcast network. We allowed to do it, now --

20 STEVE: That was never my --

21 DICK: No, listen to me, listen to me.

22 STEVE: -- interest Dick.

23 DICK: Okay.

24 STEVE: Dick, that --

25 DICK: It was David's interest.

STEVE: It was, it was. Never mine.

1 DICK: Okay, David's interest, all right?  
2 Now, because Craig Smith, with his talk show, has been  
3 able to refute to some of those things --

4 STEVE: No, he hasn't.

5 DICK: -- in terms, well, I'm talking about  
6 the --

7 STEVE: I'd take him on any day of the week.

8 DICK: Well, good, come on out, we'll set it  
9 up for you.

10 STEVE: The guy doesn't know his head from a  
11 hole in the ground.

12 DICK: Well, public opinion, I think, as you  
13 will hear or have heard, --

14 STEVE: The rudeness of that man to cut  
15 callers off that are positive. I listen carefully and  
16 when someone would call in with even a little bit  
17 difference of his opinion, he'd cut them off so quick,  
18 he's in control.

19 DICK: He'd be glad to talk to you.

20 STEVE: I, oh, sure he would.

21 DICK: He'd be glad to talk to you.

22 STEVE: I'm not even interested in the man.  
23 He'd better get right with his God and hope that he's  
24 doing everything he can in this world. That is one man  
25 that's right for --

DICK: Listen, you know what? I took a

1 survey yesterday --

2 STEVE: -- burning.

3 DICK: -- to see how many of us were ready to  
4 get right with God, and we're all ready for the day  
5 when it comes, all right? It's not here today. If  
6 it's here tomorrow we'll deal with it. Let's deal with  
7 these issues today.

8 STEVE: Remember how it was the days with  
9 Noah? Noah was ready in that day. That's the way it's  
10 gonna be in the final days. We're here. We're here  
11 Dick. But I know you don't believe that and I won't  
12 talk to you about it. I'll respect that you don't want  
13 to hear about it, but that's my whole life has been  
14 that. That's the problem. You don't want to talk  
15 about it, but what else can I, see, my folks used to  
16 say that too. Once I got involved in this, I'd go to  
17 see them and they didn't want to hear about it. I  
18 said, well, we have nothing in common then.

19 DICK: You know, I'm looking at a picture of  
20 you as we speak, a picture of you and Judy, and she  
21 looks like a nice looking lady, --

22 STEVE: Oh, she is.

23 DICK: -- and my understanding was the two of  
24 you had something going good for one another and with  
25 one another at one time.

STEVE: Positively, positively.



1               DICK: Now you've got David in between the  
2 two of you.

3               STEVE: No, we've always had the same  
4 interest, and that's making sure that we've got the  
5 will to live forever.

6               DICK: You mean you've got the same interest  
7 in David that she has now?

8               STEVE: My interest has always been giving  
9 information that's true, like the people like yourself,  
10 anybody, it doesn't matter who it is. I've always  
11 liked people. I don't hold any malice. I don't have  
12 one enemy in this world. They may think I'm their  
13 enemy, but I'm not.

14              DICK: You know, we in law enforcement, like  
15 to talk about stand-up guys. You know what that term  
16 means, stand-up guys?

17              STEVE: No, I have no idea.

18              DICK: Well, then, I guess it's no use in me  
19 mentioning it to you. It's a person of courage and  
20 conviction, okay? I'm not hearing that in your voice.  
21 I'm not hearing it at all. You've got a daughter in  
22 there and you continue to allow her to live in that, in  
23 that place under those conditions --

24              STEVE: She looks happy. She has a happy  
25 smile on her face.

              DICK: Oh, I'll bet she does.

1                   STEVE: She does.

2                   DICK: Yeah, I bet she has a happy face,  
3 doesn't she?

4                   STEVE: She is. She's got her little toys.  
5 She's very smart. She's only a little over two years  
6 old. You ought to hear her --

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Save some for me.

12 DICK: I may go to the movie.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: What's playing?

14 DICK: Well, I'm, I'm not sure. I'll have a  
15 little -- maybe a little popcorn. And then, and then  
16 I'll get some rest tonight and I'll be ready to, ready  
17 to go again a little later. Wish you could do the  
18 sane.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, I do, too.

20 DICK: We'll be back to you.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't think it'll be like  
22 that for a while, but okay, you'll --

23 DICK: We'll be back to you.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

25 DICK: Goodnight.

MR. SCHNEIDER: I'll talk to you later.

1  
2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Hello?

3 JENNIFER: Good evening. I'm Jennifer. I'm  
4 with the Waco Citizens' Newspaper. How you doing this  
5 evening?

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: I think you've  
7 got the wrong number, Jennifer.

8 JENNIFER: Oh, okay then. Excuse the call.

9 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Bye.

10 \* \* \* \* \*

11 (Telephone ringing.)

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello?

13 JOHN: Steven?

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: John?

15 JOHN: You've got it.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: How is it?

17 JOHN: Great. Great.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's what we say in Hawaii,  
19 how is it?

20 JOHN: Aloha.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's right.

22 JOHN: I'm looking for some good things  
23 happening.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, hey, I'm, I'm with you on  
25 that.

JOHN: Great.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: I was asking Dick if, if he  
2 couldn't get a room at the Holiday Inn for me.

3 JOHN: You don't want the Hilton, huh?

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: No.

5 JOHN: Settle for the Holiday Inn?

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm not that --

7 JOHN: Okay. Let's get on some issues here.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, what, what have you  
9 got?

10 JOHN: You've had a busy day. I want to --

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well --

12 JOHN: -- get you into a busier evening.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: I didn't really have too busy  
14 of a day. I was actually -- I probably should have --  
15 I ought to try to go to sleep, but --

16 JOHN: No, you don't want to do that. You  
17 can sleep tonight after we get done talking.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, what have you got now?

19 JOHN: Okay. You know that you recruited  
20 some people to come in there and, and some of the folks  
21 that you talked to and encouraged to go in. Why don't  
22 you talk to some of these people that you recruited?  
23 And these are going to be the ones that you're probably  
24 closer to to any -- than anyone else. And talk to  
25 them, discuss with them about coming out tomorrow  
morning, because what we're looking for and what we

1 want is 10 people out tomorrow morning. Which means  
2 these people are going to have to wash their hair  
3 tonight and you can be the person to lead them out  
4 tomorrow morning. And you can bring your daughter out  
5 with you. You'll be given specific instructions in the  
6 morning.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: If she's promised to be with  
8 me the whole time.

9 JOHN: Pardon me?

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Only if the promise is made  
11 where she'll be with me always.

12 JOHN: Twenty-four hours a day?

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: That sounds good.

14 JOHN: No, I'm saying that's what you want,  
15 is 24 hours a day?

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't know. Well --

17 JOHN: You know, I can't make you a  
18 ridiculous promise --

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: I know.

20 JOHN: -- but I can make you --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: I know.

22 JOHN: -- a reasonable promise that you will  
23 spend time together. Don't, don't ask me to do the  
24 impossible, my friend. You've been working hard in  
25 there --

MR. SCHNEIDER: Pardon?



1           JOHN: -- you've been working hard in there.  
2 I told you a long time ago that we appreciate your  
3 cooperation. We're going to try to do whatever we can  
4 to live up to our side of the bargains. We're not  
5 lying to you. I'm telling you that you have the  
6 ability to, to really accomplish something. If you  
7 lead that daughter out of there, and you lead 10 people  
8 out of there tomorrow, a lot of other people are going  
9 to follow. I know it's going to happen, you know it's  
10 going to happen. And these people, we know they want  
11 to clean up, we know they want to get their affairs in  
12 order, and we want them to have the ability to do that  
13 tonight. But --

14           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I, I talked to -- like  
15 I don't know if I ever told you, but it has, you know,  
16 right from the beginning when it happened -- not, not  
17 really so much in the beginning. I'd say about  
18 probably 10 days after I started talking to those that  
19 like were from Hawaii with me and --

20           JOHN: Um-hum.

21           MR. SCHNEIDER: -- some of those that I met  
22 from abroad and so forth. And, and no matter what I  
23 said, like I was telling Dick earlier, that I actually  
24 went through the assumption like well, if I go out the  
25 door and so forth, I said will you come? And I'm, I'm  
telling you that's what I said to Dick. I'd rather

1 have you -- I said Dick, at this point of time, talk to  
2 them. And he says he didn't want to, and he says wait  
3 till John comes around. And I says I actually put  
4 together a couple scenarios and they wouldn't do it.  
5 They actually told me they wouldn't do it.

6 JOHN: Well, of the 10 names that you gave  
7 to --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Dick.

9 JOHN: -- Dick, you gave him Lisa Ferris,  
10 Julia Martinez or Martinez, Cliff Sellars. Was it  
11 Clive Doyle?

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, let, let me see them  
13 again, so there's -- there's two people here.

14 JOHN: I don't want to interrupt. I don't, I  
15 don't --

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, no, I want to say them  
17 out loud so they can come back again --

18 JOHN: Okay.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- 'cause I don't remember  
20 them all.

21 JOHN: Are any of these the people that you  
22 recruited?

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Some of them, but not all of  
24 them.

25 JOHN: Good. Okay, that's fine. That's  
fine.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: So, let's see, Jeff, Clive.  
2 Here's the names that said they wanted to talk to John  
3 that were standing here when I was talking to Dick.  
4 There was Lisa. Can you remember that, Lisa? (Talking  
5 to someone else.) Who else now, let's go down the  
6 list.

7 JOHN: Hey, now, I just, I just don't want  
8 people to talk to people for the sake of talking to  
9 them. I'm interested in people that are concerned  
10 about coming out here tomorrow and may have some issues  
11 they want to discuss with me.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, John, that's what I'm  
13 not sure about. That's what I was trying to tell Dick.  
14 I said after the -- I don't want to bring it up again  
15 because I --

16 JOHN: Sure.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I don't want to make  
18 anybody mad or bothered.

19 JOHN: Okay, okay.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: But I was telling him these  
21 people keep on badgering me now, ever since that thing  
22 with Livingston never calling.

23 JOHN: But there was never any promise that  
24 he was. And I know, and I'm not going to lie to you, I  
25 haven't lied to you before, this guy was belligerent  
and he --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that --

2 JOHN: -- he said I'm not a pawn of the  
3 government and you can't make me call back if I don't  
4 want to --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: He said he was a pawn of the  
6 government?

7 JOHN: I mean, this is crazy. We figured  
8 most of the people that came out would want to call  
9 back in. We're not going to force them to call back  
10 in. It's just like if you bring 10 people out, well,  
11 we're probably not going to have 10 people call in, but  
12 we're certainly going to let you call in.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah. We've, we've never  
14 requested that, have we?

15 JOHN: No, but this guy --

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Only periodically we've done  
17 that, just to show the people inside --

18 JOHN: Sure.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- you know, just keep on  
20 going with the program. That's --

21 JOHN: He was taking the attitude that we  
22 were trying to manipulate him. Not at all.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: The reason, the reason I  
24 worked it out with Livingston that morning was because  
25 I was already talking with Yvette, his wife, and his  
mother. And by the time he --

1 JOHN: But there was no deal cut with us.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, no, not with you. No.

3 In fact, I -- rarely have I done that. What I did

4 was --

5 JOHN: Yeah, but we've, we've stood up with  
6 it when you've asked for it.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, I know.

8 JOHN: Kevin called, Brad called, you know,  
9 these people.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I know it. But, okay,  
11 when Byron called, I mentioned that I was talking with  
12 Yvette. She was getting ready to go out.

13 JOHN: Sure. Sure.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: And I mentioned the mother  
15 and he acted like those are small potatoes.

16 JOHN: Sure.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: He didn't want to talk about  
18 that.

19 JOHN: Sure.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: And --

21 JOHN: That's no problem.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, but I was --

23 JOHN: We can work it out in the future.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I know, but we were  
25 going to --

JOHN: The past we're not going to worry

1 about.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, no. No, but here's  
3 what I'm trying to get to, though.

4 JOHN: Go ahead, go ahead.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. I was trying to work  
6 with them, along with a few others, and what they told  
7 me -- this is what they told me, was they wanted to see  
8 and hear from him, and then they were getting ready to  
9 do whatever they needed to do to go out. That's what  
10 she said.

11 JOHN: Well, fine.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: And then, and then when that  
13 didn't happen -- now, I was telling Dick --

14 JOHN: Okay.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- they aren't even bothering  
16 with me. And --

17 JOHN: Well, that's fine. Don't worry about  
18 them then.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

20 JOHN: Don't even worry about them. If  
21 that's the attitude they want to take --

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, as it happened, John --

23 JOHN: -- that's fine.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: It's the attitude they've  
25 been showing.

JOHN: That's fine. We'll cross that bridge

1 at a later date, because you can come out and say I've  
2 seen Livingston, I've seen these other people, they're  
3 being cared for. I know that two women were released  
4 on bond today, they're out, they're free. You know,  
5 you can do this.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Which two, which two are out  
7 free?

8 JOHN: I wish I could tell you their names,  
9 but I heard it on the news, and I can probably find  
10 out.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: How come --

12 JOHN: Which one is Ophelia? Ophelia?

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Can I ask you something? Oh,  
14 she's -- yeah -- (indiscernible) or whatever.

15 JOHN: A black female?

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm not sure --

17 JOHN: Black female? Is that correct?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, that must be -- I think I  
19 heard -- someone told me something about the two  
20 Canadians, which would be Annetta and, what's her name?  
21 Gladys Ottman?

22 JOHN: What woman would be a elderly black  
23 female?

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Probably 'Netta.

25 JOHN: Manetta?

MR. SCHNEIDER: Netta, yeah.

1                   JOHN: Okay. (Voice in background not  
2 discernible.) Annetta Richards.

3                   MR. SCHNEIDER: That's her.

4                   JOHN: And --

5                   MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, is she free totally or  
6 does she need --

7                   JOHN: Yeah.

8                   MR. SCHNEIDER: She is? I mean, she can go  
9 back to Canada and not even bother with all this, or is  
10 she a material witness or what is it with her then?

11                  JOHN: I don't know, but I know she's free.  
12 I know she's free. There were two of them. The only  
13 reason I say that is I can picture her face.

14                  MR. SCHNEIDER: They're free. I mean, are  
15 they -- they don't -- they're not being charged or  
16 they're not a material witness?

17                  JOHN: They're material witnesses, but  
18 they're, they're free on bond.

19                  MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Where are they going  
20 to be going? Oh, someone said something about a  
21 halfway house or something.

22                  JOHN: Yeah. Something to take -- someplace  
23 to take care of them for the time being, until, you  
24 know, whatever arrangements are going to be made,  
25 whether family members are going to take care of them,  
the consulate. But they're not locked up.



1 MR. SCHNEIDER: What about --

2 JOHN: They're not locked up.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- Kathy Shroeder? Why --

4 JOHN: The only, the only --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: What's happened to her?

6 JOHN: I can't tell you the other person's

7 name that was released because I don't know. But I

8 remember her face, you know, Annetta. I remember her

9 face. I saw it on TV. Kathy Shroeder, what about her?

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: What's happened with her? I

11 heard that she had a \$10,000 bond on her or something.

12 JOHN: It may be. It may be. But she has

13 not been released on bond.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Why not?

15 JOHN: You're asking the wrong person, aren't

16 you? I'm not the judge.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I know, but we have no

18 information here and I'm sure that you guys are privy

19 or --

20 JOHN: Hey, hey.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: No?

22 JOHN: Steven. These aren't the --

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: These things can help me.

24 JOHN: These aren't the issues that I can

25 answer for you tonight because a judge has to answer

those issues.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: That would help, though.

2 JOHN: You know that.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: I know, but these people,  
4 those are things they ask you and now if I can't tell  
5 them --

6 JOHN: Well, let me tell you something.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Go ahead.

8 JOHN: I'll make it as clear as I can make  
9 it.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

11 JOHN: You explain the system to them. I've  
12 explained it to you 100 times, you know. You know, you  
13 know what to tell them. They come out the front door,  
14 they walk down, they're met by people at the Bradley.  
15 You know how we treat the women, and --

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: How do you treat men?

17 JOHN: Well, you know how we treat the men?  
18 They're probably going to prone them out, pat them  
19 down, put them in the Bradley, and off they go. You  
20 know that, right?

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I really don't.

22 JOHN: That there's, there's not a lot of  
23 cursing and kicking and all. They --

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that sounds good.

25 JOHN: Well, you, you know that. And you've  
seen how we treat the women.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Why would there be anyway,  
2 though, John? I mean --

3 JOHN: I'm sorry?

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Why would there be, like you  
5 say, cursing and kicking or, I mean --

6 JOHN: Well, I'm just telling you we, we hear  
7 all of these things thrown in our face about how we  
8 treat people. You're not seeing it happen here and  
9 it's not going to happen here, and it hasn't happened  
10 here.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Sounds good.

12 JOHN: We respect people. And when they get  
13 in the Bradley, we want to know in advance if people  
14 have medical problems. Just like we wanted to know  
15 Vicky had problems. We were in a position to take care  
16 of her right away. We had a doctor in that Bradley,  
17 not just a medic or someone. We had a doctor in the  
18 Bradley. We took her to the hospital. She was cared  
19 for right away. So if somebody's coming out tomorrow  
20 morning that has a medical problem, we want to know  
21 about it, okay?

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: John, I don't want to mislead  
23 you because --

24 JOHN: I don't want you to mislead me.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Meaning this. I've been  
extremely -- now don't take it being redundant or

1 anything.

2 JOHN: Okay.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: I've been extremely  
4 ineffective with everybody since that (indiscernible)  
5 --

6 JOHN: But you've tried.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: I have.

8 JOHN: You've tried and I'll give you a lot  
9 of credit for that, all right?

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: For a day-and-a-half after  
11 that I tried, and they keep on coming back with the  
12 same thing. Now they're all skeptical, they're all  
13 giving me a hard time. They're saying Steve, we've  
14 listened to you, we've seen you work, we've seen you be  
15 on the phone, you've talked to us.

16 JOHN: Hey, I know that, I know that.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I know, but now the whole  
18 thing is, like when I was talking to Dick, he's asking  
19 for 10 people --

20 JOHN: Hey.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and the reason I gave  
22 those names is because there happened to be six of them  
23 standing nearby.

24 JOHN: That's all right. Maybe it's going to  
25 be a totally different 10, but I'm telling you that you  
know something's going to happen if 10 don't come out

1 tomorrow morning.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: I -- Well --

3 JOHN: You know that, I know that.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: John --

5 JOHN: I can't tell you what --

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Should I tell you the truth?

7 I really don't mind about that part of it.

8 JOHN: I've heard that many times, haven't I?

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes.

10 JOHN: Do what you've got to do.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I'm --

12 JOHN: -- what you've got to do.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: You know, the body's

14 (indiscernible) the mind's --

15 JOHN: But I want you to be on the outside  
16 looking at it. I don't want you to be on the inside  
17 looking at it, okay? And that's your decision to make.  
18 That's not my decision to make, that's your decision to  
19 make. What I want you to do is to explain to these  
20 people that you've recruited, you know, or the -- you  
21 make the judge of the people. You know them, I don't  
22 know them. So that's, that's, that's your decision to  
23 make. You talk to them.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Once they met David, they --  
25 (indiscernible) me.

JOHN: Hey, if they decide, if they decide

1 | the hell with you, that's their business. Then you  
2 | have to make a decision for you and your daughter.

3 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's --

4 |           JOHN: And then you can come out here and you  
5 | can call back inside, and you'll have your daughter  
6 | with you when you call back inside.

7 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: But there's a major problem  
8 | there because Judy is extremely attached to her. I'm  
9 | talking about, you know --

10 |           JOHN: You walk up, pick up your daughter,  
11 | walk out that door, people are going to follow you. I  
12 | know damn well they are. But that's your decision to  
13 | make, okay?

14 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I would, I would honestly let  
15 | you talk to everybody in this entire building, I really  
16 | would, just to prove a point that that's -- I mean, you  
17 | could ask --

18 |           JOHN: Hey.

19 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I wouldn't even be nearby.  
20 | You could ask them anything you wanted to.

21 |           JOHN: It could be the same old story I get  
22 | all the time, isn't it?

23 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: But it's true, John.

24 |           JOHN: I don't, I don't argue that.

25 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: It's true. What -- can --  
let --

1 JOHN: I don't argue that. But let me tell  
2 you what I want you to discuss with these people. And  
3 then when you get off the phone --

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: But then let me ask you  
5 something else.

6 JOHN: When you get off the -- you will.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: You might have a better  
8 vantage point --

9 JOHN: Okay.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- or something. Okay, now,  
11 the Livingstons, this is the thing they bring up, how  
12 can I react with something that's more positive or  
13 something --

14 JOHN: That you, that you can make a phone  
15 call when you come out and tell them exactly what  
16 you've seen. How's that? Do they believe you? Do it.  
17 But let me tell you what I want you to tell them.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Go ahead.

19 JOHN: Fagan's not calling 'cause he's -- I  
20 mean, the bottom line is if he wanted to call, he could  
21 call. Okay? He's refused to do it. I am not going to  
22 be put in the position, nor is any other FBI agent  
23 going to be put in the position, where we force  
24 somebody to do something if they don't want to do it.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: But you heard --

JOHN: Do you understand that?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Wayne laid it out very clear,  
2 though, from the beginning when he was talking with  
3 Dick about --

4 JOHN: Wayne is walking to a different  
5 drumbeat than the rest of us. Whether you want to  
6 accept that or whether I like it or anything else,  
7 Wayne gets on these spaced-out ideas about different  
8 things and it's like talking to a brick. So I have  
9 nothing to discuss with Wayne, whether it's today,  
10 tomorrow -- he can sit in there and rot as far as I'm  
11 concerned. I mean, everytime he gets on the phone, he  
12 goes off on these tangents. We are not talking  
13 religion, we are not talking anything but substantive  
14 issues. A new moon came up and that's all we're  
15 talking about from now on out, period, end of story.  
16 You know that, I know that, right?

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Uh-huh.

18 JOHN: Okay.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: You know, there's a couple  
20 people waiting to talk with you. I don't --

21 JOHN: Okay. Listen, listen, let me finish  
22 something up with you.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, sure.

24 JOHN: I want you to talk to these people  
25 that, that you feel you can talk to. I don't want you  
to get off the phone after talking to me and say screw



1 John Cox, I'm going to do what the hell I want to do.

2 I don't think you --

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: John --

4 JOHN: I don't think you've done it in the  
5 past.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: I haven't, I haven't done  
7 that.

8 JOHN: I don't think you have.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: One of the guys --

10 JOHN: But I'll tell you what, David  
11 irritated me to no end the other night. It was like  
12 spitting in my face.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: But I told Dick, and I think  
14 it could have been even Byron -- I think -- I know for  
15 sure Dick -- there was nothing like that -- I was right  
16 there. He -- if you knew how much he likes you and re  
17 -- he -- I'm telling you he does. Everytime he hears  
18 your (indiscernible) John Cox, I want to talk to him  
19 he's always --

20 JOHN: Well, I was trying to be serious.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: He's the guy that always  
22 wants to talk to you, always does, always.

23 JOHN: Well, I was trying to be serious and  
24 he's singing songs about the FBI and ATF and all.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, he, he didn't mean that.  
I mean, you should know better than that. He was

1 | trying to lift up his own spirits and he -- in talking  
2 | with you, he didn't --

3 |         JOHN: Well --

4 |         MR. SCHNEIDER: -- have any insults.

5 |         JOHN: Well, maybe then after I get done  
6 | talking to you and talking to some of these people,  
7 | maybe David and I'll have a heart to heart, if he's up  
8 | to it.

9 |         MR. SCHNEIDER: You know he's always liked  
10 | talking to you. He's always requested --

11 |         JOHN: Well, maybe we can do this.

12 |         MR. SCHNEIDER: He's been your favorite.

13 |         JOHN: That's scary. No, I'm just kidding  
14 | you, I'm just kidding.

15 |         MR. SCHNEIDER: I should have said you've  
16 | been his favorite, I meant to say.

17 |         JOHN: I'm just -- hey, get punchy after a  
18 | while, huh?

19 |         MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, John.

20 |         JOHN: Listen, what I'd like you to do is  
21 | tell these people what they can expect coming out that  
22 | door.

23 |         MR. SCHNEIDER: But they know.

24 |         JOHN: They know that when they come out how  
25 | they're going to be met. Those that need medical  
   | treatment are going to get the medical treatment.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Could I say something before  
2 (indiscernible) --

3 JOHN: Go ahead, go ahead.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. There's a Jeff Little  
5 standing by me right now.

6 JOHN: Okay.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: And I haven't talked to him  
8 in some time, but he's one of the guys that I've known  
9 since 1980.

10 JOHN: Okay.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: And we were in Hawaii  
12 together and so forth and I was the one that got to  
13 share with him in the beginning.

14 JOHN: Okay.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: And Dave Jones is here,  
16 who's --

17 JOHN: Okay.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Heather and Mark and Kevin  
19 who're his three children.

20 JOHN: Okay.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: And on that list, we can get  
22 Lisa back here. But I can't -- what I said to Dick,  
23 Dick, you try with your psychology or show them what  
24 you need, because maybe it would be -- I even mentioned  
25 to him I really thought, and Dick took it wrong, I said  
I really thought that hearing someone like this

1 Jennifer who called me yesterday --

2 JOHN: Well --

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: And I'd have liked to have  
4 continued -- wait, well, just let me --

5 JOHN: Go ahead, go ahead.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. I would have liked to  
7 have continued to talk with her, but I said just wait  
8 until the Sabbath hours are over. I says I, I really  
9 would. She had some information for me that really did  
10 interest me.

11 JOHN: Well, she's gone.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, but I thought --

13 JOHN: So there's nothing we can do about  
14 that.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: I thought -- well, why'd she  
16 even call me in the first place for then?

17 JOHN: Why not?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: If it works, and I'm telling  
19 you I think it would work to hear a female voice or a  
20 different perspective. I think it would. I don't --  
21 why is she gone for?

22 JOHN: You don't like to listen to my voice?

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not at all.

24 JOHN: I can't believe this.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, who knows? Maybe  
she's got -- you know, she was starting to tell me that

1 she'd been in communication with my sister about every  
2 day for a number of days.

3 JOHN: Uh-huh.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: She wanted to tell me about  
5 it. I was interested in hearing what she had to say.

6 JOHN: Guess, guess what? You can be in  
7 communication with your sister every day if you want to  
8 come out. You know that, don't you?

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: How, how many times --

10 JOHN: How many times have I told you that?  
11 Maybe I don't have that sweet voice that Jennifer's  
12 got. She's a cute-looking little girl, too. But you  
13 can be in communications with Sue anytime you want to  
14 come out of there. You know that and I know it. Now,  
15 do these people know the system they're going to go  
16 through, the probation, parole, and all of these  
17 things?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, I doubt it, I really  
19 doubt it.

20 JOHN: But you do, right?

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, not, not --

22 JOHN: Well, you do. You know what's going  
23 to happen to Steven when he comes out. I've marched  
24 through that with you several times, haven't I?

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I'm not real sure. I  
mean, I've heard what you've said, but, I mean --

1                   JOHN: Well, you also have my assurances that  
2 you will be allowed to make a call back in. And if you  
3 want your daughter in your arms when you make that call  
4 back in, that'll be handled, too. Do you understand  
5 that?

6                   MR. SCHNEIDER: Yep.

7                   JOHN: Is there any question -- can I make  
8 that any clearer?

9                   MR. SCHNEIDER: For me, no. I already pretty  
10 much --

11                  JOHN: Okay.

12                  MR. SCHNEIDER: -- understand what's going to  
13 happen.

14                  JOHN: I'm not going to lie to you, pal. I'm  
15 going to tell you the truth.

16                  MR. SCHNEIDER: You guys probably hear what I  
17 said --

18                  JOHN: You've got my word on it.

19                  MR. SCHNEIDER: You probably got to hear what  
20 I said to Dick. I mean, I really like Dick. I was  
21 talking to him --

22                  JOHN: Well, I, I didn't get in, I didn't get  
23 in till about six o'clock.

24                  MR. SCHNEIDER: I was talking with him for  
25 some time and he got mad at me and wanted to put the  
phone down because he thought I wasn't serious. And I

1 | says well, that's not it at all. I says I'm extremely  
2 | tired.

3 |               JOHN: Yeah.

4 |               MR. SCHNEIDER: And I listened to him very  
5 | careful, but I said I really, I really would like to  
6 | see -- and he says well, Steve, come on, it's not going  
7 | to happen.

8 |               JOHN: What's that?

9 |               MR. SCHNEIDER: With the ATF, having a couple  
10 | of those guys --

11 |               JOHN: I'm not even going to discuss it with  
12 | you.

13 |               MR. SCHNEIDER: And going through what I'm  
14 | going to go through, because they attacked me, I never  
15 | attacked them.

16 |               JOHN: Steve, I'm not going to dis -- there  
17 | are three things I'm not going to discuss with anyone  
18 | on the phone. None of us will discuss -- the people on  
19 | this end of the phone will not discuss February 28th,  
20 | we will not discuss ATF --

21 |               MR. SCHNEIDER: Why is --

22 |               JOHN: Listen to me.

23 |               MR. SCHNEIDER: Can I ask you a question?

24 |               JOHN: We will not discuss February 28th.

25 |               MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, can I -- let me ask a  
question.

1 JOHN: We will not discuss --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Why --

3 JOHN: Let me give you the three things, then  
4 you can talk.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, go ahead.

6 JOHN: Okay? We will not discuss February  
7 28th. That, that's over with, it's done.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: The next one?

9 JOHN: We are not going to discuss ATF. That  
10 is over with, that is done. We are not going to  
11 discuss religious matters. They are over with, they  
12 are done. The only thing we are going to discuss is  
13 people coming out of there, when they're coming out of  
14 there, and what they can expect when they come out.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't think you're going to  
16 get any of them out then.

17 JOHN: Then that's what we're going to  
18 discuss.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Because those are the  
20 issues --

21 JOHN: We've made it very clear --  
22 substantive issues. If they have any question about  
23 what will happen to them when they come out, be happy  
24 to answer those questions.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: You're not -- I doubt that  
you're going to get them out then, because the first



1 issue is in reverse from what you said. The first  
2 issue that brought him here was the religious aspect.

3 JOHN: That's fine.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's the --

5 JOHN: They can discuss all the religion they  
6 want with David. They can discuss all the religion  
7 they want with themselves, with you. They can bring  
8 their Bibles. They can have their preachings and their  
9 prayer periods when they're on the outside here, but  
10 they're not going to discuss it with me. They are not  
11 going to convert me and they're not going to try.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: You know, you know what  
13 bothered me today was? I happened to turn on the news  
14 conference --

15 JOHN: Uh-huh.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and here this ATF agent is  
17 putting down these people for what they saw as  
18 eyewitnesses here, but he gets the -- or has the  
19 opportunity and privilege to tell America --

20 JOHN: That he does.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: He called them liars.

22 JOHN: That he does.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: He called them liars.

24 JOHN: He can say anything he wants, 'cause  
25 he's on the outside here.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, because -- oh, no,

1 | because he's an authoritative government --

2 |           JOHN: No.

3 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: The government has given him  
4 | a power beyond anything that he should have.

5 |           JOHN: Hey. You can come out here and you  
6 | can meet with the, the media and you can be --

7 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I'll be very brief.

8 |           JOHN: Listen to me, listen to me.

9 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: He's not incarcerated. I  
10 | will be.

11 |           JOHN: You can meet with your lawyer. The  
12 | media has talked to people. The media has talked to  
13 | Brett, the media has talked to Kevin.

14 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't, I don't --

15 |           JOHN: I've seen them, I've seen them talk  
16 | to --

17 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't want to talk to the  
18 | media.

19 |           JOHN: The media's talked to Livingston.

20 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I just want to live my life  
21 | as it was. I don't want to talk to anybody.

22 |           JOHN: Then tell these people not to worry  
23 | about it.

24 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I just want --

25 |           JOHN: All they have to do is come out.

          MR. SCHNEIDER: If anybody wants to talk to

1 me about what I'm interested in life, I'll be happy to  
2 share with them.

3 JOHN: Hey.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: But I'm not going to -- I  
5 don't need to have --

6 JOHN: Then tell them not to worry about it  
7 then.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: I need no kind of news  
9 exposure and sensationalism, all of that.

10 JOHN: Hey, most people don't, do they? Most  
11 people don't. They just like to live quiet lives,  
12 don't they?

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's the way I've been all  
14 my life.

15 JOHN: Hey.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: By the way --

17 JOHN: So don't let these issues become big  
18 issues.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: See, I am not a respecter of  
20 persons, number one. When I was a young man, I got to  
21 know a number of movie stars in Hawaii. I was invited  
22 to party after party. After time, it --

23 JOHN: What you mean, you're not a respecter  
24 of persons?

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's what I mean. I  
don't --

1           JOHN: Well, you respect your mother and your  
2 father and --

3           MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, no. I'm talking  
4 about it doesn't matter if I've met the President, it  
5 doesn't matter if I knew this movie star or this rock  
6 star. That's -- people.

7           JOHN: Hey, they come and they go.

8           MR. SCHNEIDER: That's exactly right.

9           JOHN: What are you driving at then?

10          MR. SCHNEIDER: So what I'm driving at is all  
11 the statements by the FBI spokesperson about David --

12          JOHN: Then don't let it bother you.

13          MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and other people, about  
14 how we're news media hounds and we want coverage. It's  
15 a bunch of --

16          JOHN: Don't, don't let it bother you.

17          MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I haven't.

18          JOHN: Do you think I have --

19          MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm telling you --

20          JOHN: Do you think I have let David's  
21 preachings to me for 25 days bother me?

22          MR. SCHNEIDER: I hope so.

23          JOHN: Bother me?

24          MR. SCHNEIDER: I hope it's touched a chord  
25 within that soul of yours.

          JOHN: But do you think I've let him bother

1 me? It's, it's been something new for me, it's been a  
2 learning experience for me, but it doesn't bother me,  
3 and I don't necessarily have to accept it or agree with  
4 it.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Of course you don't. Of  
6 course you don't.

7 JOHN: But it's -- I don't let it bother me.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: I would --

9 JOHN: It's totally opposed to things I have  
10 been taught.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: I would back you --

12 JOHN: But I don't let it bother me.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: I would back you 100 percent  
14 for your right to be a total atheist, agnostic,  
15 anything you want to be.

16 JOHN: Sure. That's right.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm for that, I'm for that.  
18 That's why my great concerns about what's happening to  
19 the country, and I won't get into that either today.

20 JOHN: Don't, don't try.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: But I am concerned. I'm  
22 concerned because I don't like --

23 JOHN: Well, that's everybody's right.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- anybody's right --

25 JOHN: But don't let it bother you. Things  
that you hear on the media and other things, don't let

1 | it bother you. Everybody's going to have their share.  
2 | If they want to come out and talk to somebody, they can  
3 | come out and talk to them. That's not my concern  
4 | tonight. My concern is --

5 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Well --

6 |           JOHN: My concern is if people want to talk  
7 | to me about coming out and what they can expect or  
8 | about their loved ones or anything else, be happy to  
9 | talk to them. There are three issues, as you have  
10 | heard, that I'm not going to discuss with them.

11 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

12 |           JOHN: We expect 10 people out tomorrow  
13 | morning. I expect you --

14 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: John, John.

15 |           JOHN: -- to be leading them out tomorrow  
16 | morning.

17 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Listen.

18 |           JOHN: Go ahead.

19 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Did Sellars have any  
20 | relatives call for him or leave a message or anything?  
21 | I think you might have said that he had a brother or  
22 | something of that nature that did. I'm --

23 |           JOHN: I've got a whole list here that I'll  
24 | have to go through, but I, I'll go through it, okay?

25 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: (Talking to someone else.)  
What was your brother's name again? Chris, Chris

1 Sellars. It seemed like -- I can't recall, but --  
2 there's, there's also Livingston Malcolm like standing  
3 here and I --

4 JOHN: Got him right here, Livingston  
5 Malcolm.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yep. And you said that I  
7 guess his brother, which is Solomon --

8 JOHN: Yeah.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- called and left a message  
10 for him?

11 JOHN: I've got that one. We'll look for the  
12 other ones.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right. Well, I'm going  
14 to pass you -- if you -- do you want to start talking  
15 with these people? I, I -- look at everything --

16 JOHN: Can you do what I asked you to do?

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm going to try to do  
18 whatever I can, but ever since that Livingston thing  
19 they're not -- I'm ineffective. That's what I was  
20 trying to tell Dick. So that's why I says Dick, let  
21 yourself or John try to talk with them or see where  
22 they're coming from. You might have something more  
23 clear you can state to them than I can, because I don't  
24 know that you've talked to all these people yet or what  
25 you've shared with them yet, so --

JOHN: I'm looking for some names, I'm not

1 | ignoring you.

2 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I know it, I know it. I  
3 | can tell.

4 |           JOHN: I saw something on a back sheet of  
5 | something, maybe on Sellars. If I told you I saw it, I  
6 | saw it.

7 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: You would like this guy, man.  
8 | What an -- if there was ever a Christian

9 |           JOHN: Good.

10 |          MR. SCHNEIDER: -- in the world, it's this  
11 | guy. I mean, the guy has got this sup -- what an  
12 | awesome spirit he has, and he's an artist. But his  
13 | artwork, I think, is going to get him into a lot of hot  
14 | water.

15 |          JOHN: Hang on, hang on. I'm trying to go  
16 | through as, as many as I can see here.

17 |          MR. SCHNEIDER: Dave Jones is here waiting,  
18 | too. I think he's going to want to talk to you --

19 |          JOHN: Sure.

20 |          MR. SCHNEIDER: -- about his children and --  
21 | (Talking to someone else.) Who else is there?  
22 | Rachel says hi to you, John.

23 |          JOHN: Tell her God bless her.

24 |          MR. SCHNEIDER: He says --

25 |          JOHN: Tell her I said hello.

          MR. SCHNEIDER: (Talking to Rachel.) He said



1 hello. What now, Greg? Oh, Greg wants -- wanted you  
2 to get back to him a few days ago, I guess, about his  
3 father, Michael Sommers?

4 JOHN: Yeah, I sent that out for somebody to  
5 get a hold of him.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, you did? Okay.

7 JOHN: Yeah, yeah.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: You want to --

9 JOHN: What we're doing is when we talk to  
10 people we ask -- I mean, we don't sit here and make the  
11 calls from here.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

13 JOHN: We have other people. I don't see  
14 anything --

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: I think you honestly have a  
16 better opportunity and a chance than I do right now, to  
17 tell you the truth, John --

18 JOHN: Well, do, do me a favor.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: What's that?

20 JOHN: I don't have the opportunity to, to  
21 deal with you and to deal with your own personal  
22 feelings or anything else. You, you have that  
23 opportunity, okay?

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Mine is more unique because  
25 of my involvement with bringing these people here.

JOHN: Well --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: It's unique because of Judy  
2 and Myna.

3 JOHN: Whatever, whatever. Like I told you,  
4 the magic figure tomorrow morning is 10 or you know  
5 something else is going to happen.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, you know, for  
7 poor me, for me, John.

8 JOHN: I'm not saying that as a threat --

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: I know. Okay, John --

10 JOHN: -- or anything else. I'm just telling  
11 you that things are moving.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Between you and me, look it,  
13 just between you and me --

14 JOHN: Uh-huh.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- that doesn't matter to me.  
16 Not that they don't or whatever, but, I mean, I like  
17 you as a person --

18 JOHN: Well, you think about all those other  
19 people, too.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I am, but I'm just  
21 saying, you know, that for me is not a major factor.  
22 That doesn't come into play. I'm more concerned about  
23 the persons seeing it straight and clear and, and so  
24 forth. And if --

25 JOHN: Do what you've got to do, huh?

MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's what I mean.

1 That's -- but I think it'd be advantageous, though, for  
2 you to be able to put in a pitch or something. I mean,  
3 definitely, 'cause --

4 JOHN: For what?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: For, you know, talking to  
6 them and letting them know kind of -- not all of them  
7 have been really -- it's --

8 JOHN: I'll talk to anybody that wants to  
9 talk to me. I'll talk to anybody that wants to talk to  
10 me.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, there's a number of  
12 people waiting right here now.

13 JOHN: You know I've told you that before,  
14 haven't I?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Greg, are you going?

16 JOHN: Hey, don't run off on me now.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I'm right here. I just  
18 wanted Greg to talk.

19 JOHN: I said I, I'll talk to anybody that  
20 wants to talk. I will not talk about those three  
21 issues, but I'll talk about anything else.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Let me tell him that.  
23 (Talking to someone else.) He doesn't want to talk  
24 about the ATF, he doesn't want to talk about February  
25 28th, and he doesn't want to talk about religion.

JOHN: Now, anything -- any concerns they

1 | have about coming out, any concerns they have about  
2 | relatives, et cetera, be happy to talk to them.

3 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: John, will you talk to them  
4 | about the Holiday Inn?

5 |           JOHN: Anything. You bet, pal.

6 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

7 |           JOHN: Hey, you go --

8 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: John, you're all right.

9 |           JOHN: You go do some soul searching.

10 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

11 |           JOHN: And remember --

12 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

13 |           JOHN: -- all you've got to do is dial  
14 | 799-0545 and I'll be here till tomorrow morning.

15 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, I'm --

16 |           JOHN: Okay?

17 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I tell you what, I'm so  
18 | burned again, but --

19 |           JOHN: No, no, no, no, no.

20 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm going to be staying up,  
21 | don't worry. I'm tired --

22 |           JOHN: I will probably talk to you again  
23 | before the evening's over.

24 |           MR. SCHNEIDER: I've probably aged 10 years  
25 | since this last three weeks.

          JOHN: Well, you're only as old as you feel.

1 You probably feel like you're --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's --

3 JOHN: -- a young fellow. I know that.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: I feel like about 90 then.

5 JOHN: Hey, we've got to deal with the  
6 issues. You know that and --

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Which one do you want to talk  
8 to first? We've got Livingston Malcolm here, we've  
9 got --

10 JOHN: Put him on because I've got a message  
11 for him.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

13 JOHN: Okay?

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Later, okay?

15 JOHN: Yes, sir.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER TO MR. MALCOLM: Here. He's  
17 got a message from your father.

18 MR. MALCOLM: Hello?

19 JOHN: Livingston?

20 MR. MALCOLM: Yes, speaking.

21 JOHN: John Cox.

22 MR. MALCOLM: Nice to meet you. Heard a lot  
23 about you.

24 JOHN: They, they call you Mike?

25 MR. MALCOLM: One of my many names. Stone  
is --

1                   JOHN: We have a message from Solomon  
2 Malcolm, Jr.

3                   MR. MALCOLM: Okay. Can I be able to speak  
4 to him one on one? I would like to speak to --

5                   JOHN: No, you cannot.

6                   MR. MALCOLM: Why?

7                   JOHN: Because I've got a message to read to  
8 you, that's why.

9                   MR. MALCOLM: Oh.

10                  JOHN: It says are you o -- the following  
11 message he asked through the British Consulate, if the  
12 following message could be passed to you.

13                  MR. MALCOLM: Yes.

14                  JOHN: It says are you okay?

15                  MR. MALCOLM: Yes.

16                  JOHN: We are worried about your health.  
17 Have you been injured? Love, Lorrelle and Solomon.  
18 L-O-R-E-L-L-E.

19                  MR. MALCOLM: Yeah, I know, I know.

20                  JOHN: And Solomon. And we got that message  
21 in from the British Consulate in Houston. Now, if you  
22 have a message that you would like to be relayed to  
23 him, we'll be happy to do it.

24                  MR. MALCOLM: Okay.

25                  JOHN: If you care to leave there and come  
out, you can make your own message to him.

1 MR. MALCOLM: I would just -- I don't know, I  
2 don't know if I can trust you people after what --

3 JOHN: Well, if you can't trust us, there's  
4 nobody you can trust.

5 MR. MALCOLM: Well, I think I can trust God  
6 and his word. That's more important. But can you --

7 JOHN: Well, I'm talking about earthly thing.

8 MR. MALCOLM: I'm talking about earthly  
9 things, too. You know, that's why I mention God  
10 because he's in control of the earth.

11 JOHN: Okay, fine.

12 MR. MALCOLM: But can I leave this message  
13 for my brother?

14 JOHN: You certainly can.

15 MR. MALCOLM: Tell him I'm okay, I'm fine.  
16 I'm learning the Seven Seals. Wish they were here  
17 learning it with me. And please say to them --

18 JOHN: Wait.

19 MR. MALCOLM: Hello?

20 JOHN: Wait a minute. I can't write that  
21 fast.

22 MR. MALCOLM: Oh, yeah, I speak too fast.

23 JOHN: I can't write that fast.

24 MR. MALCOLM: I'll slow down or back track.

25 JOHN: First of all, first of all --

MR. MALCOLM: I'm --

1                   JOHN: Slow down, slow down. Your brother is  
2 Solomon Malcolm, Jr.?  
3                   MR. MALCOLM: Yes.  
4                   JOHN: Do you have an address or a phone  
5 number?  
6                   MR. MALCOLM: Oh.  
7                   JOHN: Because I don't. All I have is that  
8 he contacted the British Consulate in Houston.  
9                   MR. MALCOLM: Okay, I'll give you his  
10 address. Is that okay?  
11                   JOHN: Okay.  
12                   MR. MALCOLM: Sixty-five -- well, contact the  
13 consulate and they can mark forward it back home to him  
14 -- I don't know. 65 Leslie, 65 --  
15                   JOHN: L-E-S-L-I-E?  
16                   MR. MALCOLM: Yes.  
17                   JOHN: Okay.  
18                   MR. MALCOLM: Leslie Road.  
19                   JOHN: Okay.  
20                   MR. MALCOLM: Leytonstone, L-E-Y-T-O-N --  
21                   JOHN: Okay.  
22                   MR. MALCOLM: -- S-T-O-N-E.  
23                   JOHN: One word?  
24                   MR. MALCOLM: Yeah, Leytonstone.  
25                   JOHN: Okay.  
                  MR. MALCOLM: London.



1 JOHN: Yep.  
2 MR. MALCOLM: E11.  
3 JOHN: Okay.  
4 MR. MALCOLM: 4HF.  
5 JOHN: 4H --  
6 MR. MALCOLM: F.  
7 JOHN: F as in Frank?  
8 MR. MALCOLM: Yes.  
9 JOHN: Do you have a phone number?  
10 MR. MALCOLM: Yes. In London, you know the  
11 area code, 011.  
12 JOHN: 011.  
13 MR. MALCOLM: You know, to dial England, I  
14 don't know the eight one --  
15 JOHN: That's okay.  
16 MR. MALCOLM: You know, the number is England  
17 is --  
18 JOHN: Yes, sir?  
19 MR. MALCOLM: -- 081 --  
20 JOHN: Yes.  
21 MR. MALCOLM: -- 556 --  
22 JOHN: Uh-huh.  
23 MR. MALCOLM: -- 9554.  
24 JOHN: Okay.  
25 MR. MALCOLM: And my message is I'm safe and  
sound, I'm unhurt.

1 JOHN: Fine.

2 MR. MALCOLM: Don't worry about me.

3 JOHN: Okay.

4 MR. MALCOLM: And I'm having a great time  
5 learning the Seven Seals of Revelation --

6 JOHN: Okay.

7 MR. MALCOLM: -- as you well know, Mr. Cox.

8 JOHN: Okay.

9 MR. MALCOLM: And tell him that I've got to  
10 pray to the Lord asking to forgive him for not ever  
11 being able to learn the Seven Seals when he had the  
12 opportunity.

13 JOHN: Okay.

14 MR. MALCOLM: Can you write that down to him?  
15 I've got to forgive you for not having learned the  
16 Seven Seals when you had the opportunity to. Read  
17 Revelation 4, 5 -- 4 and 5.

18 JOHN: We're not getting into a whole bunch  
19 of religious dialogue with your brother, okay?

20 MR. MALCOLM: You know --

21 JOHN: We are going to tell your brother that  
22 you're healthy, you're well, you're in there on your  
23 own volition, nobody's keeping you in there.

24 MR. MALCOLM: Yes.

25 JOHN: You're free to leave anytime you want  
and you don't desire to leave, right?

1 MR. MALCOLM: Yeah, but tell him, you know,  
2 I'm learning --

3 JOHN: When should we tell your brother that  
4 you're coming out?

5 MR. MALCOLM: That's a very good question.

6 JOHN: That's why I asked it.

7 MR. MALCOLM: I can't really say when I'll be  
8 coming out. When, you know, when God says we can or  
9 whenever, you know, you people back off and, you know,  
10 whatever. I mean, you know, I'm scared to go, go  
11 outside --

12 JOHN: Let me explain something to you,  
13 Malcolm, okay?

14 MR. MALCOLM: Yes.

15 JOHN: Let me explain something to you.

16 MR. MALCOLM: Call me Stone.

17 JOHN: I'm sorry.

18 MR. MALCOLM: You can call me Stone. That's  
19 what my --

20 JOHN: Stone.

21 MR. MALCOLM: Yes.

22 JOHN: We have knocked on the door since the  
23 first of March.

24 MR. MALCOLM: Knocked on the door?

25 JOHN: Listen to me.

MR. MALCOLM: Go on.

1           JOHN: We have knocked on the door since the  
2 first of March. We haven't kicked in the door. We  
3 have knocked on the door and we've, and we've welcomed  
4 people with open arms. All it takes is for someone to  
5 walk out the front door, walk down the road. You'll be  
6 met. You will then be given any medical attention  
7 that, that you have to be given, whether you're on  
8 medication or any other problems like that. Then you  
9 will be met with the U.S. Probation Officer who is an  
10 arm of the court. Following that, you have an  
11 appearance before a judge. That's the way it works.

12           MR. MALCOLM: Yes.

13           JOHN: That's our system.

14           MR. MALCOLM: And how long --

15           JOHN: And it's the best system in the world.

16           MR. MALCOLM: How long would I be in prison  
17 for, more than likely? I won't be able to go --

18           JOHN: I don't know. If you didn't do  
19 anything wrong, you're not going to be imprisoned.

20           MR. MALCOLM: Yeah, but I doubt that. How  
21 come Livingston can't bring us back --

22           JOHN: Hey, two people have -- two of the  
23 girls are already out. They're out, they're on the  
24 street, they're free, they're gone.

25           MR. MALCOLM: Yeah, but they're going to be  
calling back for the witnesses.

1 JOHN: Well, sure they are.

2 MR. MALCOLM: Well, I mean, they couldn't  
3 still be tried?

4 JOHN: Do what?

5 MR. MALCOLM: They can still be tried, I  
6 guess.

7 JOHN: You're not tried as a material  
8 witness, you're a witness as a material witness.

9 MR. MALCOLM: Oh.

10 JOHN: That means that you testify as a  
11 material witness.

12 MR. MALCOLM: Um-hum.

13 JOHN: It doesn't mean you're tried as a  
14 material witness. I'm not, I'm not going to sit out  
15 here and play games with you. I'm going to tell you  
16 the way the, the way the truth is. If you're charged  
17 with something, you'll be incarcerated.

18 MR. MALCOLM: Um-hum. Well, you know --

19 JOHN: I'm not going to lie to you.

20 MR. MALCOLM: Well, Mr. Livingston, how come  
21 he can't ring back? I mean, I don't know the reason  
22 behind his not being able to --

23 JOHN: Let me explain that to you as clearly  
24 as we've explained it to David and to Steven.  
25 Livingston came out. There was no request for him to  
call back when he came out. None, zero, not.

1 MR. MALCOLM: It was agreed before.

2 JOHN: Okay? There was no agreement, there  
3 was no request, period.

4 MR. MALCOLM: Well, before he left --

5 JOHN: There was no agreement for him to call  
6 back inside there when he left. We went to him after  
7 he left and we said we would like you to make a tape  
8 recording to go back inside. Anything that you want to  
9 put on tape, put it on tape.

10 MR. MALCOLM: (indiscernible) phone call --

11 JOHN: We asked -- are you listening to me?

12 MR. MALCOLM: I'm listening.

13 JOHN: We said would you like to make a tape  
14 recording? Anything you want to say, and we'll send it  
15 back inside. He said I'm not going to be any  
16 messenger, I'm not going to do this. We said that's  
17 fine. If you don't want to do that, that's fine.  
18 We're not going to twist somebody's arm.

19 MR. MALCOLM: Yeah, but why --

20 JOHN: We are not going to try and force  
21 somebody to do something they don't want to do.

22 MR. MALCOLM: Did you, did you make -- did  
23 you offer him the chance to make a telephone call, not  
24 a tape?

25 JOHN: But nobody asked to do that. There  
was no agreement to do that.

1 MR. MALCOLM: Well, did you offer --

2 JOHN: If you want to come out and you want  
3 to make a phone call back inside, that could be agreed  
4 upon.

5 MR. MALCOLM: Well, I'm not --

6 JOHN: Do you want to come out?

7 MR. MALCOLM: I think I'll stay here. I feel  
8 more safe here.

9 JOHN: Then that's your, that, that's your  
10 privilege.

11 MR. MALCOLM: One more -- one question can I  
12 ask you, please.

13 JOHN: Sure.

14 MR. MALCOLM: You made an ultimatum, if we  
15 weren't out by today --

16 JOHN: I didn't say about you.

17 MR. MALCOLM: Well, you mentioned before 10  
18 or 20 people out today.

19 JOHN: Let me, let me make this as clear, as  
20 clear as I can make it to you.

21 MR. MALCOLM: Yes.

22 JOHN: If 10 people aren't out of there  
23 tomorrow morning --

24 MR. MALCOLM: Yes.

25 JOHN: -- something will happen.

MR. MALCOLM: Like what?

1 JOHN: I'm not going to tell you like what.

2 MR. MALCOLM: Bullets flying through the wall  
3 again?

4 JOHN: Of course not. Don't be foolish.

5 MR. MALCOLM: Send in the armored tanks  
6 through the wall --

7 JOHN: I'm not going to tell you what's going  
8 to happen.

9 MR. MALCOLM: Tell me what may --

10 JOHN: I'm just going to tell you something's  
11 going to happen.

12 MR. MALCOLM: Oh, to make us want to, want to  
13 change our minds pretty quickly. That means our health  
14 is going to be in jeopardy.

15 JOHN: That's your, your decision to make.  
16 You can walk out of there right now, Stone --

17 MR. MALCOLM: Yes, okay.

18 JOHN: -- and I'll welcome you with open  
19 arms.

20 MR. MALCOLM: -- then if --

21 JOHN: If you decide to stay in there --

22 MR. MALCOLM: -- might be in danger, that  
23 meaning --

24 JOHN: Do what?

25 MR. MALCOLM: I don't mind personally, dying,  
I mean, you know, you know -- whatever, but --



1 JOHN: That's your business.

2 MR. MALCOLM: Fine. May God bless you --

3 Read Joel 2. (Indiscernible) he was coming back down,  
4 the sixth seal.

5 JOHN: Do what?

6 MR. MALCOLM: You know, Job 2, the Book of  
7 Job?

8 JOHN: What did I tell you I wouldn't  
9 discuss?

10 MR. MALCOLM: Well, I like talking about God.

11 JOHN: Well, that's fine. Talk to him about  
12 somebody -- with somebody else.

13 MR. MALCOLM: Okay. Well, sir, I mean --

14 JOHN: If you want to come out, we'll welcome  
15 you with open arms.

16 MR. MALCOLM: Not under, not under the threat  
17 of death. Here's my friend (indiscernible) --

18 JOHN: I think you're smoking something  
19 funny, Stone, because nobody has threatened to harm  
20 anyone in there.

21 MR. MALCOLM: I don't, I don't know, I don't  
22 know what you speak of. I don't think you smell that  
23 in the tellyphone or what, but I don't smoke that crap,  
24 I never have.

25 JOHN: Hey, has anybody made any threat to  
harm you?

1 MR. MALCOLM: Well, you just said --

2 JOHN: Has anybody made a threat to harm you?

3 MR. MALCOLM: Well, I've heard it  
4 inadvertently and implied that --

5 JOHN: Answer, answer the question. Have I  
6 made a threat to harm you?

7 MR. MALCOLM: Well, you said --

8 JOHN: Yes or no?

9 MR. MALCOLM: You said inadvertently you're  
10 going to do it.

11 JOHN: No, I didn't. I said something will  
12 happen.

13 MR. MALCOLM: Well, it's not going to be a  
14 pleasant thing.

15 JOHN: It might rain. Something will happen.

16 MR. MALCOLM: I doubt it --

17 JOHN: Hey --

18 MR. MALCOLM: Okay. Here's --

19 JOHN: -- you answer the question yes or no  
20 or put somebody else on the phone.

21 MR. MALCOLM: Well, I think you're being -- I  
22 think actually you're a little hard --

23 JOHN: Well, I think you want to talk in  
24 riddles. I want to talk in facts, you want to talk in  
25 riddles.

MR. MALCOLM: I'll wait till tomorrow and see

1 | what happens.

2 |           JOHN: You go listen to David and let him  
3 | play with your mind a little longer.

4 |           MR. MALCOLM: Well, you can say whatever you  
5 | want. You listen to your bosses, too, and they play  
6 | with your mind.

7 |           JOHN: No.

8 |           MR. MALCOLM: 'Cause, you know, you just said  
9 | the same --

10 |           JOHN: You don't have anything to fear about  
11 | coming out of there.

12 |           MR. MALCOLM: But if I stay here, the whole  
13 | world --

14 |           JOHN: Do what?

15 |           MR. MALCOLM: If I stay in here, a lot of  
16 | people --

17 |           JOHN: Well, the bottom line is, Stone, you  
18 | won't be able to stay in there too much longer. You  
19 | know that and I know that.

20 |           MR. MALCOLM: That's a --

21 |           JOHN: Isn't that true?

22 |           MR. MALCOLM: We can stay as long as we want  
23 | 'cause God can send manna from heaven down --

24 |           JOHN: Stone, Stone, listen to me.

25 |           MR. MALCOLM: Um-hum.

          JOHN: Rather than rambling, just listen to

1 me for a second.

2 MR. MALCOLM: Okay.

3 JOHN: You and I know that this has been  
4 going on for 26 days.

5 MR. MALCOLM: Want another 26.

6 JOHN: I said don't be rambling. Listen to  
7 me.

8 MR. MALCOLM: Um-hum.

9 JOHN: It will not go on much longer. We are  
10 talking -- (End of Tape #163.)

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
