2 JOHN: -- and it's going to happen pretty
3 soon.

4 MR. MALCOLM: And it's going to happen.

5 JOHN: And you all will be out of there.

6 MR. MALCOLM: I know.

7 JOHN: Okay?

8 MR. MALCOLM: (indiscernible)

9 JOHN: You all will be out of there and
10 there's not, there's not going to be --

11 MR. MALCOLM: How long -- Could you give me a
12 time period, the maximum time you're going to allow?
13 Two weeks, two months, one week?

14 JOHN: Do you, do you like to listen to
15 somebody?

16 MR. MALCOLM: Yes.

17 JOHN: I, I can't talk to you and try to
18 listen to you at the same time.

19 MR. MALCOLM: Okay. Finish what you're
20 saying, but I had another question. I wonder how long
21 you're going to let -- how long -- Can you give me
22 that?

23 JOHN: No.

24 MR. MALCOLM: Why not?

25 JOHN: I don't have it.

MR. MALCOLM: Two weeks? A month? Or within

1 a month?

2 JOHN: Are you kidding me? Do you think I'm
3 going to be here talking to you a month from now?

4 MR. MALCOLM: Oh, a week then.

5 JOHN: I don't intend to be talking to you a
6 week from now.

7 MR. MALCOLM: Oh, by the weekend. I'll be
8 told exactly.

9 MR. COX: See, you're trying to, you're
10 trying to get a specific response from me --

11 MR. MALCOLM: So are you --

12 MR. COX: -- as to --

13 MR. MALCOLM: -- response from me, too.

14 MR. COX: The only thing I'm trying to get
15 from you is if you want to come out, we're here to
16 welcome you with open arms.

17 MR. MALCOLM: Okay.

18 MR. COX: If you're not interested in coming
19 out, I've got nothing else to discuss with you.

20 MR. MALCOLM: I guess you'll just have to
21 take me out in a body bag.

22 MR. COX: Do what?

23 MR. MALCOLM: You'll have to take me out in a
24 body bag.

25 MR. COX: Hey, if you, if you have that kind
of a sick mindset, that's your prerogative.

1 MR. MALCOLM: Yeah, but the government --

2 MR. COX: We have, we have been very patient.
3 We've been sitting out here for 25 days. We have said
4 we are not going to do anything precipitous. We have
5 not done anything precipitous. We will not do anything
6 precipitous --

7 MR. MALCOLM: Well --

8 MR. COX: -- but this will be resolved
9 shortly.

10 MR. MALCOLM: Within a week?

11 MR. COX: I didn't tell you within a week.

12 MR. MALCOLM: No -- Okay.

13 MR. COX: But I, I am telling you that if you
14 want to come out, you come out. If you want to stay in
15 there, you stay in there. That's your business.

16 MR. MALCOLM: Okay.

17 MR. COX: But it will be resolved.

18 MR. MALCOLM: All right. God will be --

19 MR. COX: And it'll be resolved without
20 anybody being injured.

21 MR. MALCOLM: Okay --

22 MR. COX: Okay? Do you understand that?

23 MR. MALCOLM: Yes..

24 MR. COX: All right. Bye.

25 MR. MALCOLM: --

MR. COX: Bye. It's been nice talking to

1 | you.

2 | MR. MALCOLM: Same here.

3 | JAMIE: Yeah, John.

4 | MR. COX: Hey.

5 | JAMIE: This is Jamie.

6 | MR. COX: Jamie.

7 | JAMIE: Did you get my message through or
8 | what happened with that?

9 | MR. COX: I don't know. I passed your, your
10 | message on. I talked to you, what, two nights ago?

11 | JAMIE: Yeah.

12 | MR. COX: And I passed it on to have somebody
13 | make the contact.

14 | JAMIE: Uh-huh.

15 | MR. COX: The message is that I have right
16 | here, right here in front of me --

17 | JAMIE: Uh-huh.

18 | MR. COX: -- I don't think I've got a
19 | response to what I sent out. I Xeroxed a bunch of
20 | responses that came back --

21 | JAMIE: Yeah.

22 | MR. COX: -- but I don't recall seeing yours.
23 | I can look through some other things -- Pardon me. I
24 | can have some other folks look, look through some
25 | messages that may have come in today.

JAMIE: Sure.

1 MR. COX: But what I did is request that
2 someone make the contact that you asked me to do.

3 JAMIE: Oh, okay.

4 MR. COX: You know, so if there was a, a
5 reply --

6 JAMIE: Uh-huh.

7 MR. COX: -- I'm not privy to it.

8 JAMIE: Well, if -- replies, it's just, you
9 know --

10 MR. COX: Hey, if there was, I --

11 JAMIE: -- let, let somebody here know when
12 you talk to Steve or somebody.

13 MR. COX: If there was, I would, believe me.

14 JAMIE: Okay. No problem.

15 MR. COX: But let me ask you something.

16 JAMIE: Sure.

17 MR. COX: Do you intend to be one of those 10
18 people that are coming out tomorrow morning? If you
19 do, if you've got any questions, be happy to answer
20 them.

21 JAMIE: Yeah.

22 MR. COX: But we expect 10 people coming out
23 of there tomorrow morning and I'd love to, love to have
24 you be one of them.

25 JAMIE: Um-hum.

MR. COX: And if you have any questions about

1 | it, I'll be happy to answer them.

2 | JAMIE: Yeah. Well, I'm not really --

3 | MR. COX: You sound rather insecure.

4 | JAMIE: What do you mean?

5 | MR. COX: Like I'm stroking you or something
6 | like that. I'm just being -- I'm being honest with
7 | you.

8 | JAMIE: No, well, that's the first thing I've
9 | heard of it. I mean, I haven't been around here, so I
10 | don't know what's going on.

11 | MR. COX: Well, we have said that we expect
12 | to see 10 people out of there tomorrow morning and we
13 | expect to see 10 people out of there tomorrow morning.

14 | JAMIE: Well, if that's what you expect, then
15 | I guess --

16 | MR. COX: And we'd, we'd like to have you in
17 | that number.

18 | JAMIE: Yeah. Well, I'm not looking forward
19 | to going out and getting harangued by the, by the
20 | system, you know. Especially when you haven't done
21 | anything --

22 | MR. COX: What do you mean, harangued by the
23 | system?

24 | JAMIE: Yeah, well, you know, all the
25 | inconsistencies within the FBI's part and, you know,
 | people talking and statements being made that ain't

1 true.

2 MR. COX: Hey, hey, listen --

3 JAMIE: I mean, I'm not --

4 MR. COX: -- to me, listen to me. Somebody's
5 either telling you something or, or somebody's blowing
6 smoke in your ear about something. If you want, if you
7 want to come out and make a statement, that's your
8 prerogative.

9 JAMIE: No, I don't want to make a statement.

10 MR. COX: If you want to sit in there and,
11 and play this deaf, dumb and blind, that's your
12 prerogative also.

13 JAMIE: Yeah.

14 MR. COX: As long as you know you're staying
15 in there of your own free will and you have no desire
16 to leave, that's your business, okay?

17 JAMIE: Yeah, definitely.

18 MR. COX: It's your business. I know that
19 you're going to be leaving shortly.

20 JAMIE: Um-hum.

21 MR. COX: Because I know you will.

22 JAMIE: Yeah, sure.

23 MR. COX: I mean, we're not playing this game
24 of, of talking about other issues. We're not playing
25 games with people. We're basically saying 10 people
will be out of there tomorrow morning.

1 JAMIE: Yeah.

2 MR. COX: Or something will happen.

3 JAMIE: Okay.

4 MR. COX: We're not threatening you.

5 JAMIE: That sounds like a threat to me.

6 MR. COX: No, it's not a threat. It's

7 something will happen.

8 JAMIE: Well, I'm sure there will --

9 something will happen.

10 MR. COX: And nobody's, nobody's going to get

11 hurt.

12 JAMIE: Um-hum.

13 MR. COX: But if you want to live in that

14 squalor that you're living in instead of coming out

15 and, and facing something like a man, that's your

16 business.

17 JAMIE: Yeah.

18 MR. COX: You want to face the system like a

19 man, like you were raised and you were brought up, hey,

20 if you've done nothing wrong you've got nothing to

21 fear. If you've done something, if you've done

22 something wrong, you've got to pay the piper, right?

23 JAMIE: Right.

24 MR. COX: Hey, that's life.

25 JAMIE: That's the judicial system.

MR. COX: That's life, you know.

1 JAMIE: Yeah.

2 MR. COX: And that pertains to everybody.

3 JAMIE: Uh-huh.

4 MR. COX: Everybody. So, you know, your --
5 you've got your conscience. You're your own man, you
6 know, you make your decision.

7 JAMIE: Yeah.

8 MR. COX: Don't let somebody else make a
9 decision for you.

10 JAMIE: Yeah.

11 MR. COX: Don't let me make a decision for
12 you, don't let David, don't let anybody in there make a
13 decision for you. You're your own man.

14 JAMIE: Right.

15 MR. COX: Okay?

16 JAMIE: Yeah.

17 MR. COX: And I don't want to sit out here,
18 and I will not sit out here to beg you to do something.

19 JAMIE: Well, I understand your part and, you
20 know, you've got to do, you've got to do, and you've
21 got to, you know, say what you've got to say and --

22 MR. COX: Hey.

23 JAMIE: I'm not going to, I'm not going to
24 bombard you --

25 MR. COX: I'll tell you --

JAMIE: I'm not going to bombard you with my,

1 | you know, speeches or whatever, you know. I've got to
2 | do what I've got to do and you've got to do what you've
3 | got to do.

4 | MR. COX: That's it. That's it.

5 | JAMIE: So, I mean, we'll leave it at that.
6 | But, you know, I would, you know, I would appreciate a
7 | response if something does come through. Okay, John?

8 | MR. COX: You've got it.

9 | JAMIE: All right.

10 | MR. COX: You've got it.

11 | MR. LITTLE: John?

12 | MR. COX: Yes.

13 | MR. LITTLE: Hi. This is Jeff Little. Do
14 | you -- I think a few days ago you had a message for me?

15 | MR. COX: I do. Somebody keeps --

16 | MR. LITTLE: I think I talked to you once
17 | before, huh?

18 | MR. COX: Hang on. Hang on. I'll find it.
19 | Be patient with me.

20 | MR. LITTLE: No problem.

21 | MR. COX: I've got to go through a list, and
22 | I know where it is on the list. I've just got to find
23 | the right page. Okay. Now, Lonnie Little --

24 | MR. LITTLE: Uh-huh. Is this the second time
25 | he called?

MR. COX: No. I just have a list of people

1 that called and I thought I told you he called before.

2 MR. LITTLE: Yeah, I think you did, but then
3 somebody --

4 MR. COX: Kalamazoo, Michigan.

5 MR. LITTLE: Yeah.

6 MR. COX: Somebody may have been repetitive.

7 MR. LITTLE: Could be.

8 MR. COX: That's the message I had, was that,
9 that Lonnie had called, and somebody may have just not
10 scratched off that, that you'd been advised.

11 MR. LITTLE: Did anybody ever call him back?
12 Or no?

13 MR. COX: I presume they called him back and
14 told him you were healthy.

15 MR. LITTLE: Okay.

16 MR. COX: You know? I, I can't tell you, you
17 know, I can't promise that they did.

18 MR. LITTLE: All right. Okay, no problem.
19 Thanks.

20 MR. COX: Hey, hang on just a second.

21 MR. LITTLE: Yeah?

22 MR. COX: Give me -- I've got Lonnie Little.
23 All I have is Kalamazoo, Michigan.

24 MR. LITTLE: Um-hum.

25 MR. COX: Have you got an address for him?

MR. LITTLE: No, it's not -- I don't think

1 | it's even in Kalamazoo. He's --

2 | MR. COX: Well, I've got a phone number, 616-
3 | 665-9090.

4 | MR. LITTLE: Right.

5 | MR. COX: That should be a good number, huh?

6 | MR. LITTLE: Yeah, it is.

7 | MR. COX: Okay, 616-665-9090. Now, he's
8 | going to be your brother?

9 | MR. LITTLE: No, that's my dad.

10 | MR. COX: Your dad.

11 | MR. LITTLE: Yeah.

12 | MR. COX: Okay. Do you have an address for
13 | Lonnie at all?

14 | MR. LITTLE: Well, no, I don't remember it.
15 | It's been a long time. I ain't been home in ages and
16 | he's moved.

17 | MR. COX: What about your mom?

18 | MR. LITTLE: Lives with her -- I mean him.

19 | MR. COX: Have you got any brothers or
20 | sisters or anything that you'd want us to contact?

21 | MR. LITTLE: No.

22 | MR. COX: Okay. Well, listen, it's a simple
23 | solution. You know it, I know it.

24 | MR. LITTLE: Right.

25 | MR. COX: You want to talk to people --

MR. LITTLE: Right.

1 MR. COX: -- truck on down the road, huh?

2 MR. LITTLE: Okay.

3 MR. COX: As I told Steven, we expect 10
4 people out of there tomorrow morning and I'd like to
5 see you in that number.

6 MR. LITTLE: Okay. Thanks, John.

7 MR. COX: You're welcome.

8 MR. LITTLE: Okay, hold on a second.

9 MR. JONES: Hello?

10 MR. COX: Hello.

11 MR. JONES: This is David Jones.

12 MR. COX: David Jones? This is John.

13 MR. JONES: Hello, John.

14 MR. COX: How's, how's the buns healing up?

15 MR. JONES: Oh, it's okay.

16 MR. COX: Huh? Okay?

17 MR. JONES: Yeah.

18 MR. COX: Can you sit down now?

19 MR. JONES: Yes.

20 MR. COX: Got those three youngsters of yours
21 out here, huh?

22 MR. JONES: Yes, sir.

23 MR. COX: Kevin and Mark and I guess Heather
24 was the last of the, the, the children to come out,
25 huh?

MR. JONES: Something like that.

1 MR. COX: Yeah, I think she was. Think she
2 was. What can I do for you? Hmm?

3 MR. JONES: (No verbal response.)

4 MR. COX: David?

5 MR. JONES: Yes.

6 MR. COX: You there? You going to be one of
7 those 10 people coming out tomorrow morning? You want
8 to be reunited with your children?

9 MR. JONES: Reunited with my children?

10 MR. COX: Yeah. You sound like I just woke
11 you up or something.

12 MR. JONES: No.

13 MR. COX: Huh?

14 MR. JONES: It's just I've been through a lot
15 of situations in my lifetime.

16 MR. COX: Yeah. And this hasn't been a very
17 pleasant one, has it?

18 MR. JONES: That's right.

19 MR. COX: No, it hasn't been pleasant for
20 anyone, has it?

21 MR. JONES: That's right.

22 MR. COX: No. Do you want to come out and be
23 reunited with those kids? We can make the
24 arrangements. As I told -- I've told Steven and I've
25 told David, I've told everybody that I've talked to, as
has everybody else out here that's talked to people in

1 | there, all you've got to do is walk out the front door,
2 | come down the road, somebody'll meet you. I don't care
3 | if you want to do it at 2 in the morning, but we expect
4 | 10 people out of there tomorrow morning and I'd love to
5 | have you in the number.

6 | And if you want to be reunited with your
7 | children, we can make those arrangements. The first
8 | thing I'm going to do with you, I would, I would feel
9 | it's safe to say, and maybe you'd be reunited someplace
10 | else, is we're going to get you to a hospital. That's
11 | the first thing, first place you're going. And I'll be
12 | very frank with you. We treat you the same way we
13 | would treat Vicky when she came out, when she and
14 | what's her name, Annette, came out --

15 | MR. JONES: Yeah.

16 | MR. COX: -- that evening. Isn't Annette one
17 | of the nurses?

18 | MR. JONES: I don't know.

19 | MR. COX: Well, when they came out, Vicky had
20 | some medical problems. We had a doctor meet them in
21 | one of the Bradley vehicles. We have one that's set up
22 | like a, like an ambulance.

23 | MR. JONES: Yeah.

24 | MR. COX: Met them, she was taken to the
25 | hospital, and she's probably still in the hospital
because she had a, a pre-existing heart problem and she

1 | was dehydrated and she had some other problems. So
2 | because of the problem that you have, you'd be rendered
3 | the same service. You'd be taken for some medical
4 | treatment first. And whether you'd be reunited with
5 | your youngsters over at the hospital or you'd be
6 | reunited with them at, you know, at a later time, but I
7 | will assure you that you'll get to see them. Okay?

8 | MR. JONES: Yeah.

9 | MR. COX: Are there any assurances that I can
10 | give you or anything I can tell you to reassure you or
11 | any questions you might have? Anything else?

12 | MR. JONES: If I want to go, I'll go. If I
13 | want to stay, I'll stay. And any promise anybody makes
14 | me doesn't mean nothing to me, you know.

15 | MR. COX: Any what?

16 | MR. JONES: Any promise that anybody's going
17 | to make me isn't going to change what I want to do, you
18 | know?

19 | MR. COX: Well, what did you want to talk to
20 | me about then?

21 | MR. JONES: David or Steve was saying
22 | something about you wanted 10 people to talk to or
23 | something, so I just --

24 | MR. COX: I don't want to have 10 people to
25 | talk to. I just -- I told him that we expect 10 people
to be out of there tomorrow morning.

1 MR. JONES: Oh, okay.

2 MR. COX: Hey.

3 MR. JONES: All right.

4 MR. COX: Enjoyed talking to you, though.

5 MR. JONES: Yes, sir.

6 MR. COX: Hope things are healing up.

7 MR. JONES: Yeah.

8 MR. COX: And I hope to see you tomorrow.

9 MR. JONES: Yeah.

10 MR. COX: Think about it.

11 MR. JONES: Yeah.

12 MR. COX: Nobody's lying to you, nobody's
13 stroking you. Got no reason to do it, believe me, my
14 friend. I'd be just as happy if this is all over with
15 and everybody goes home.

16 MR. JONES: Yeah.

17 MR. COX: I think you would, too, huh?

18 MR. JONES: Yeah. Again --

19 MR. COX: Wish it'd be, wish it'd be over
20 with, too, don't you?

21 MR. JONES: I'd go through it, I'd go through
22 it again.

23 MR. COX: Well, it'll all work out. Give it,
24 give it a lot of thought, give it a lot of thought.
25 But we expect 10 people out of there in the morning.
Like to have you in that number.

1 MR. JONES: Yeah.

2 MR. COX: Okay?

3 MR. JONES: Yeah.

4 MR. COX: Anybody else there?

5 MR. JONES: I see, see a few people around in
6 the dark, yeah.

7 MR. COX: I'll talk to -- Well, I'll talk to
8 them in a little bit.

9 MR. JONES: In a little bit?

10 MR. COX: Is Steve there?

11 MR. JONES: I can hear his voice. I can't
12 see him.

13 MR. COX: Well, raise your voice a little bit
14 and say Steve.

15 MR. JONES: Steve. Phone.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello?

18 MR. COX: Hey.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, how, how'd it go?
20 Anything or --

21 MR. COX: Well, I don't know. I don't know.
22 I think that the last young fellow there was -- he's
23 just kind of wandering, I guess.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: You mean the last guy you
25 just talked to?

MR. COX: Dave, yeah.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. Well, what do you
2 think --

3 MR. COX: Just talks like he's very confused.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: So you think I should talk to
5 him, huh?

6 MR. COX: Yeah. He seems very confused.
7 Probably wouldn't hurt.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

9 MR. COX: Listen --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

11 MR. COX: -- let me call back there in about
12 15, 20 minutes, huh?

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right, sure.

14 MR. COX: Okay?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, bye.

16 MR. COX: You take care.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Bye.

18 * * * * *

19 TONY: Hello?

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: John?

21 TONY: This is Tony.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Tony. How you doing, Tony?

23 TONY: Good. How you doing, Steve?

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not too bad.

25 TONY: Good.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Not bad. The reason I was

1 calling back is that John said he was going to call me
2 in about 15, 20, and it's more than a half hour later,
3 so I thought I'd call to see what, what's happening.

4 TONY: He's over in a meeting now.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, he is?

6 TONY: Yeah.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Well, I was telling
8 Dick earlier in the day and John, I mean, I have
9 averaged about two hours of sleep a night and, boy, I
10 tell you, when I talked to Dick today, I laid down just
11 before I got on the phone with him and I was about
12 ready to pass out for quite a while. And I heard the
13 phone ring. It took me a while to get here. So --

14 TONY: So how's it going?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, I don't know. I'm -- I
16 was telling them I'm just so worn out. I'm just
17 mentally, physically, almost like broke down. I'm
18 totally worn out.

19 TONY: Well, you know, as we know -- you
20 know, as you know, what we're trying to do is just get
21 this resolved and, you know, Steve, it's real important
22 that, you know, looking at, at it the way we see it
23 here, I think it's very, very important that you talk
24 to these people who, who are ready to come out and get
25 them to come out.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Well --

1 TONY: You know, you talked to a number, you
2 know, you recruited a number of those people to go in
3 and, you know, in reality, there's a certain amount of
4 responsibility there.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's why I've stayed
6 here as long as I have.

7 TONY: Well --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Otherwise, for myself, I'd
9 have come out, but the responsibility is that, you
10 know, I'm the one that talked to them originally.

11 TONY: You know, I think we're at the point
12 now, Steve, that we want you to talk to them and get
13 them to come out.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, that's --

15 TONY: And if you, if you don't -- If they're
16 unresponsive to you, then so be it. That's the way it
17 is. There's only so much you can do, and if it gets to
18 that point, Steve, I think that maybe you're going to
19 have to look at yourself and say what can I do? If, if
20 maybe myself coming out will help show these people
21 that it's not that bad out there, that things are going
22 as we told them --

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I've been doing that.

24 TONY: -- then perhaps it's --

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: I've considered that.

 TONY: Well, you know, I think it's a real

1 possibility, a real good prospect, because if you come
2 out here and we can show you exactly what it is and you
3 can call back in there and tell them yes, it is true
4 what they are saying, because it's going to be true,
5 it's going to be true for all of them, and if that's
6 the case and you can show it, you can be very
7 instrumental in getting this thing resolved.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: See, the problem I'm working
9 with still is, you know, like with Judy and then her
10 connection and the way she's viewing this whole thing
11 with Mayanah and --

12 TONY: I, I understand.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: It's been a real problem.

14 TONY: What I would like you to do, of
15 course, is get Judy and Mayanah and come out. What
16 happens if you go to Judy and she says absolutely not?
17 What's your next step?

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, see, that's what's been
19 happening. That's why I'm having difficulty right now.
20 And the reason being is she's not trusting that --
21 She's seeing that the child's going to be taken away
22 and --

23 TONY: That's --

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Huh?

25 TONY: That's not a realistic probability,
Steve. The realistic, more realistic, probability is

1 | that when she comes out, things are going to be worked
2 | out here. Obviously, we have to take it one step at a
3 | time. I can't say --

4 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, maybe --

5 | TONY: You know, I can't come to you and say
6 | yes, you come out and --

7 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

8 | TONY: -- everything's -- you just walk out
9 | of here and you can walk about your way. No, that's
10 | not going to be true.

11 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, maybe, you know, like
12 | tomorrow when she's awake, maybe I could have her talk
13 | to one of you again and try to help her understand as
14 | best as possible.

15 | TONY: Well, I think it's important that you
16 | talk to her. We need -- I'll tell you what we need you
17 | to do. We need you to have David -- you and David get
18 | together and identify 10 people to come out tomorrow.

19 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, hopefully, hopefully --

20 | TONY: That's extremely important.

21 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I think hopefully
22 | tomorrow he's going to be okay because he's apparently
23 | passed out all this time.

24 | TONY: Well, you have to look at that, too,
25 | Steve.

 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

1 TONY: You know, you've been doing a lot of
2 work here and he's up there, you know, he's up there
3 sleeping or taking it easy. I'm sure you're as tired
4 as he is, but you've been doing everything here.
5 You've been doing -- the one that's doing the talking,
6 trying to get everybody out. And what I'm questioning
7 is who's really trying to get this resolved? You know,
8 I don't think that David's as interested in getting
9 this resolved as you are. I think you are wanting to
10 get this done.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, he's got a different
12 view, of course.

13 TONY: Well, God very well might have, and --

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: You know, God doesn't talk to
15 me. He says he talks to him, so, you know, I mean, and
16 the only proof for me is that he's showed the Bible.
17 But, on the other hand, you know, it was even going --
18 David himself wanted to get a number of individuals
19 out. I can't -- I'm losing track of time, but it
20 was --

21 TONY: Well, the point is he has not gotten
22 them out, though.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Livingston came out. What
24 day was it? Tuesday, wasn't it? Tuesday morning?

25 TONY: Yeah, something like that.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. And we had talked

1 | sometime with Yvette and his mother, and he was talking
2 | about a number of other individuals. Then, all of a
3 | sudden, he got mad because of this whole thing with
4 | Livingston.

5 | TONY: Well, that was Livingston's problem,
6 | that was not ours. We asked him if he would like to
7 | come in.

8 | MR. SCHNEIDER: That's weird. That's so
9 | weird.

10 | TONY: He refused to do it 'cause -- Well, it
11 | might be weird, but that was the way he was when he
12 | came out.

13 | MR. SCHNEIDER: It made it hard for me
14 | because --

15 | TONY: Well --

16 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I was actually going to
17 | play on his calling back.

18 | TONY: Well, okay, look at, look at this,
19 | Steve.

20 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

21 | TONY: Obviously, we can't rely on that
22 | because he's not going to cooperate. What's the next
23 | best step? How about you coming out?

24 | MR. SCHNEIDER: What did he, what did he want
25 | to do when you guys were talking to him?

 TONY: He didn't want to do anything. He

1 | didn't want to do anything. We can't control about
2 | what Livingston did, okay?

3 | MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I know. I just --

4 | TONY: He is -- Steve, you have to
5 | understand, we told you before that we are not going
6 | to, we are not going to make anybody do anything out
7 | here.

8 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, of course --

9 | TONY: And we're going to stand by that.

10 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I'd expect that. I never
11 | have asked you guys to ever force anybody to call.

12 | TONY: Good. And we wouldn't do that. You
13 | know, John told you here earlier that -- exactly what
14 | would happen. John told you that. John's going to
15 | stand by his word. I'm going to stand by my word.

16 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I've never --

17 | TONY: If --

18 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, I've never -- In the
19 | first place, you don't need to tell me that because I
20 | wouldn't -- This is America. I, I myself have the
21 | greatest respect for anybody's choices to do with
22 | anything when it comes to what they feel they need to
23 | do for life or death or whatever, you know, they need
24 | to do. I don't -- I respect you for your decisions in
25 | regards to whatever and --

 TONY: And we're going to stand by that.

1 | What I'm saying is here we need to get something going
2 | as far as getting 10 people out. We need some, some
3 | good faith from your side in there, and all we're
4 | asking at this point, we need at least a minimum of 10
5 | people, we need the names of 10 people who are going to
6 | come out tomorrow. And we want that done so that we
7 | can get them out tomorrow. We want them to clean up
8 | tonight, wash your hair, be ready to come out.

9 | So tomorrow, when we get back into this
10 | tomorrow morning, we have a number of people that are
11 | going to come out. Not tomorrow we call and say well,
12 | we're not sure. We need definitely some names, we need
13 | who's going to come out, and we want to get this going.
14 | Okay? If -- We need your help on this. I want you to
15 | work on this. There are people in there that would
16 | come out, I am absolutely certain, if you sit and talk
17 | to them.

18 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that was what I was
19 | trying to tell John. My credibility was extremely
20 | damaged with that.

21 | TONY: Look, look, Steve, you -- I remember
22 | you saying one time that you were tired of this and
23 | that you want to come out. You said if I could I would
24 | come out. There is no, nothing in the world stopping
25 | you from coming out.

 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, there is.

1 TONY: There's not.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: There's Judy and Mayanah and
3 there's --

4 TONY: There's not. It's your choice, Steve.
5 It is your choice whether you want to come out.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, but how are you going
7 to leave someone behind like --

8 TONY: Because you know how you're going to
9 leave them behind?

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- clearly.

11 TONY: You're not leaving behind. By you
12 coming out and you bringing some people with you and
13 showing them out here yourself --

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well --

15 TONY: Just a minute, let me finish. --
16 you're taking the lead on this and you're saying I will
17 go out and find out, I will see what it is out there.
18 I will be the, the goat that's going out there, to come
19 out and find out exactly what's going on out there and
20 I will let you know. When you come out here, I will
21 absolutely guarantee you that when you call back to
22 tell them about how you're being treated, about how the
23 process is going, those people who are reluctant will
24 come out.

25 You have to lead by example and you know
that. That's important. You have to lead. And you --

1 | I think you can lead these people out of there. You
2 | can walk out of there with them, you can bring some out
3 | with you if they're ready to go with you now, and, and
4 | I think it's very important that you show by your
5 | leadership yourself. I know you want to come out of
6 | there. You have said so. You are tired of this going
7 | on and you're the one that can make this happen. I
8 | think it's really important, Steve, that you take a
9 | leadership role to this effect. I don't think Dave's
10 | going to do this. David's not going to do that. He is
11 | upstairs sleeping and unconcerned, so to speak, at this
12 | point, where you're not.

13 | And I honestly think that you can do this.
14 | And I want you to do this. Everybody out here is, is
15 | hoping that you're going to take this leadership role
16 | and bring these people out.

17 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, if I came out, if I
18 | came out, Tony, it would be -- I know for a fact it'd
19 | be only me on my own, seriously. I know this for a
20 | fact because --

21 | TONY: That's fine. Steven.

22 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I went and talked to these
23 | people already.

24 | TONY: Steven.

25 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes?

 TONY: You said you wanted to end this thing

1 | and get them to come out. You -- It would be nice that
2 | if you could, if you could get Mayanah and Judy by the
3 | hand and say let's go, we are --

4 | MR. SCHNEIDER: --

5 | TONY: Let me finish. I'm saying it would be
6 | nice if that could happen. And you walked out of there
7 | and several people followed you. If it didn't work
8 | that way, the next best way that you can get these
9 | people out of there, which I think you know is the
10 | right solution, is for you to walk out of there and say
11 | I will be the one that will find out what's going on
12 | there and I will let you know. And when you come out,
13 | I absolutely guarantee you're going to have access to
14 | anything you want out here to help get this resolved.
15 | You have our guarantee on this.

16 | MR. SCHNEIDER: So with Judy, what do you
17 | think it is about -- what do you think, on average,
18 | from your experience, what do you think might happen?

19 | TONY: With what?

20 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Myself with Judy, I mean,
21 | being -- using her as a material witness. How long
22 | would she be held? I mean, how long would it be before
23 | she gets Mayanah? You know, any ideas?

24 | TONY: She, she wouldn't -- As far as the --
25 | I'm sure, like in anybody else's case, you're going to
go through the procedures, which are, you know, they

1 | would come out, they would go to the Bradley. We would
2 | take them in, make certain that everybody's okay. If
3 | they need medical treatment, we would take them and get
4 | them the medical treatment. We would then take them
5 | down to the facility, just to process them through,
6 | which is normal procedure. They would have -- In
7 | Judy's case -- she would definitely go to the hospital
8 | first of all.

9 | MR. SCHNEIDER: What about Mayanah?

10 | TONY: Definitely, because of her --

11 | MR. SCHNEIDER: She'd probably take Mayanah
12 | with her when she --

13 | TONY: Absolutely. She would be allowed to
14 | take Mayanah with her to the hospital and she would be
15 | able to keep her there while she's getting treated.
16 | And then she'll go through the -- When that's all taken
17 | care of, when she's allowed to leave the hospital,
18 | because they may keep her there for a little bit. I
19 | don't know if infection's set in or not, but that's
20 | very important.

21 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

22 | TONY: You know, as long as it's been,
23 | there's a real possibility of infection. So, of
24 | course, she might have to spend more time in the
25 | hospital there. If, in fact, she has to spend some
time in the hospital, the magistrate himself would come

1 up to the hospital.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Really? Gee.

3 TONY: They're not going to wait for all
4 this, and they can get at least the process going --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

6 TONY: -- and have the process going to get
7 her through, through it and set a bond, so that she
8 doesn't have to go to the hospital and then go through
9 a long period of time thereafter and then hope for a
10 bond to get set. Once they set up a bond on her, you
11 know, she can make that bond or get out. That's,
12 that's entirely up to the system. I can't, I can't
13 tell you at that point because I don't know. We have
14 to wait till that time comes. But we are going to do
15 everything that's in our possibility to see that that
16 happens, because our concern is for everybody's well
17 being right now.

18 And we want this -- everything to take the,
19 the proper perspective. We want everything to go down
20 as it's supposed to happen, okay? We're not going to
21 treat anybody any different. We're going to give them
22 the medical assistance that they need, we're going to
23 take and get them proper legal counseling that they
24 need and take them through the legal process. And
25 we're going to be there for that. But it's important
that we get this going because we can't continue going

1 | on like this. The longer it goes, the longer it goes,
2 | the, the harder it takes. I mean, this thing could
3 | have been done with a week, two weeks ago, and some of
4 | them could have been through the system and already out
5 | on bond. Okay?

6 | We want and the state wants to keep the
7 | children with the natural parents. That's really
8 | important. I think that's something that, that Judy
9 | should be aware of. And when they're talking about the
10 | parents per se, especially the mother. The mother is
11 | probably most influential on the child and we want to
12 | keep it -- They don't want to break up the child from
13 | the mother. The state doesn't want to do that, the
14 | federal government doesn't want to do that.

15 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, of course, that's a
16 | major concern because Judy and I have raised -- Judy
17 | especially has spent so much time --

18 | TONY: Absolutely.

19 | MR. SCHNEIDER: The way she can communicate
20 | is -- I mean, it's awesome, her level of
21 | intelligence --

22 | TONY: Sure.

23 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and her ability to
24 | communicate, and she has spent a lot of time with her
25 | in teaching her. And it's, you know, it's her life,
 | for sure.

1 TONY: Right. And I think, you know, that's
2 important to you. It's very important to you.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, it is. But, you know,
4 of course, I'm -- but I'm looking at, you know, I mean,
5 all the issues, I'm looking at other people involved in
6 this. And, of course --

7 TONY: Steve, I will tell you --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- that's immediate, of
9 course. That's immediate.

10 TONY: I will tell you more than that. Those
11 people are looking for some leadership. Those people
12 in there are looking for something. I am certain that
13 those people in there are not happy with what's
14 happening here. You know, they may not say it
15 outwardly, but it -- deep inside they probably wished
16 it was not -- this was not happening.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that I'm sure of.

18 TONY: Absolutely.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Sure, that's --

20 TONY: And they, they need, they are looking
21 up to somebody for some leadership here. They are
22 looking for that --

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes, David.

24 TONY: Pardon me?

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: David. It's David.

TONY: The leadership -- David's not doing

1 anything to resolve this, Steve.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, the whole thing,
3 though -- But, see, what I'm trying to tell you, Tony,
4 is they came here not for me, but because they met him,
5 they heard what he had to say. And that's why I asked
6 a number of them just lately what about this, what
7 about that.

8 TONY: Okay. Let me back -- take a step back
9 here.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right. All right.

11 TONY: What about the people that you
12 recruited to bring in there? Okay?

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's the ones I've
14 been -- I told John I was trying to talk with.

15 TONY: Sure.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: And that's why --

17 TONY: Well --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I thought maybe --

19 TONY: But, but what I'm saying is they
20 look -- they may look to David for guidance, but in, in
21 reality, too, are they not looking towards you for some
22 guidance, because --

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not at all, no. No.

24 TONY: Well, I -- Well, I don't, I don't buy
25 that because I think you're important in this, Steven.

MR. SCHNEIDER: It's -- Well, it's not a

1 normal situation, Tony. It really isn't. It's one of
2 these things where there's a man that is so out of my
3 league when it comes to his ability to articulate
4 what's in that book, lay together a picture. I mean, I
5 went with him to Jerusalem where he --

6 TONY: Well, that's fine. You know, I can't
7 go into those issues.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, no, I just wanted to say
9 meaning -- Okay, just to give you an example -- I'm not
10 going to get into the religious aspect.

11 TONY: Okay, good.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: I just wanted to say this,
13 though. When I went with him to Israel, to Jerusalem,
14 he took on some rabbis. I'm not talking about the
15 religious aspect, but in -- The topic was logic and the
16 way he blew them away, I mean, I was sitting there
17 being entertained. So --

18 TONY: Okay.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- meaning this now. So when
20 he came back here, of course, and these people have
21 gotten to hear him and they've seen what he's done,
22 they walk -- they look at their Bibles. Is it still
23 there? See, that's what I'm dealing with, too, Tony.
24 That's what I'm trying to say.

25 TONY: Yes, but we were aware of the fact --
we're aware of the fact of what -- that he can discuss

1 | what's in the book. There's no question in our mind
2 | that he is very knowledgeable about what's in the book.
3 | What we are concerned about is how is he going to
4 | continue to do this under these conditions? He has no
5 | access -- You have maybe how many people left in there?
6 | You said we have 30 some out, you've got twice as many
7 | in there. You say you've got maybe 60 or three times?

8 | MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I said about -- No, no, I
9 | said about three times.

10 | TONY: Three times. Let's say 90 other
11 | people or so, okay?

12 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Probably about --

13 | TONY: So he's in there --

14 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I think there might even be
15 | 120, maybe 30.

16 | TONY: Okay. So what he's doing basically is
17 | getting his message to 120, 130 people. If he is
18 | concerned about the -- what he's talking about, he is
19 | not going to get the message to anybody else 'cause he
20 | has no contact with anybody else. But coming out he
21 | has that contact because he has been offered the
22 | opportunity to go on CBN. That's been given to him.
23 | He has the opportunity to have media contact. The
24 | people who have come out already have already had
25 | contact with the media. Okay?

 They are getting their story out. And

1 anybody else come out has -- will have that
2 opportunity. You will have that opportunity. David
3 will have that opportunity.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, see, the only thing I'm
5 really interested in, Tony, is, you know, is, of
6 course, justice and, and it works out --

7 TONY: Justice will prevail, Steven.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, I mean,
9 through the legal process --

10 TONY: Yes.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- that one is definitely
12 being able -- be able to be heard in regards to what
13 all happened.

14 TONY: Steven, the only way, the only way two
15 sides of any story can be brought out is if both sides
16 talk. Okay? Right now one side has spoken.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Tony --

18 TONY: You have, you have that opportunity
19 and you will be given that opportunity to present your
20 side of the story.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'll tell you what I wish.
22 I'll, I'll tell you what I wish. I wish you would have
23 been here with me that Sunday when it happened. Then
24 I'd be very --

25 TONY: No, I'm not going to go -- I
understand, but I'm not going to go back into the past.

1 I can't do that.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: I know.

3 TONY: What I, what I want to concentrate on,
4 Steve, is what is happening tomorrow --

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes, yes.

6 TONY: -- and in the future.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Tony, but you don't
8 understand one of the biggest fears --

9 TONY: I do.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: One of the biggest fears is
11 that spokesperson always getting on there, having the
12 ability to say what he does and with no repercussions
13 from anybody.

14 TONY: Then come out and you can have that
15 opportunity.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm not going to -- They're
17 going to incarcerate me, not him, Tony. Come on.

18 TONY: Steve, I --

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: How did --

20 TONY: -- I can't go into -- I know what
21 you're saying, Steve.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Don't you understand, though,
23 Tony? Don't you understand?

24 TONY: Let's, let's get --

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Help me out with that. What
would you -- I mean, seriously.

1 TONY: No, I'm not going to go into that
2 issue because that is a dead issue right now. There
3 is, there is nothing that I can discuss on that.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: You as a human -- No, but you
5 as a human -- Then put somebody on the phone that might
6 have some understanding.

7 TONY: Well, it's -- No one's going to
8 discuss that issue. We're not going to discuss that
9 issue. We, we can't. What we need to discuss from
10 this, this, Steve, from this point on is where we're
11 going from here. Okay?

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: See, it's like --

13 TONY: It's not that we're not trying to be
14 understanding.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I know, but it's
16 something like a Catch-22 because, you know, the very
17 ones -- If it wasn't for them being out there, let's
18 say --

19 TONY: I can't -- You're right, but I can't
20 go back into that.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: There'd be no problem
22 people -- I mean there would be none. One of the
23 biggest things --

24 TONY: What, what is your reluctance right
25 now, Steve, of coming out? What is your reluctance?
Not, not for anybody else in there --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I'll tell you the
2 truth.

3 TONY: -- strictly your reluctance.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: There's, there's two of them.
5 Number one, I am -- I came here myself because I was
6 convicted by what David shown and I've never been able
7 to gainsay what he has. And I've gone to scholars
8 world-wide. Number two, the next thing is what
9 happened that Sunday, and I'm not getting into it
10 because --

11 TONY: Okay.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Just the point being
13 for me I'm reluctant because I don't trust those guys
14 because what I'm hearing them saying on the --

15 TONY: You are not going to be dealing with
16 those guys. You're going to be dealing with the Texas
17 Rangers, with the FBI, with the federal government,
18 along those lines. Okay?

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: But John and Byron told me
20 that the ATF will be in on the investigation of the
21 buildings, they're involved with the transportation.

22 TONY: No.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: With asking questions.
24 They're going to be involved all the way through.

25 TONY: They will not. They will not.
Steven, do you know how the judicial process --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that'll help because if
2 you --

3 TONY: Steven, if I was involved in
4 something, in some type of activity, and I am a
5 participant in it, okay? Right, wrong, or indifferent,
6 if I was a participant, I could not be involved in the
7 investigation. Okay?

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I like -- That makes
9 sense to me, Tony. I want to guarantee that that'll be
10 true if I come out --

11 TONY: You have that guarantee.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- with this ATF, that
13 they're not going to be.

14 TONY: They are not going to be involved in
15 that investigation. We've, we've stressed that time
16 and time.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: You're the first one -- I can
18 honestly say you're the first one that's ever told me
19 that.

20 TONY: They are not being -- You've been told
21 that before.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, no, no. Because I --

23 TONY: John explained that.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, he hasn't.

25 TONY: Steven, I was here and John explained
that, that they would not.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: One of the guys said that the
2 ATF would be involved, and it even came out in either
3 the press release. I'm positive it did, seriously. We
4 took notes. Seriously, Tony.

5 TONY: And what did he say?

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: It was spoken of that they
7 would be involved in that investigation, along with the
8 Texas Rangers.

9 TONY: No. Steven, the judicial process
10 doesn't work that way.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I'm glad to hear that.

12 TONY: Well, I'm telling you that.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

14 TONY: Now, does that ease your mind there?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, it helps a lot.

16 TONY: Well, good. Now, now we can get on to
17 coming out, because now you are convinced. I hope
18 you're convinced.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, not totally, but I
20 might --

21 TONY: Steve --

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- want to push you as far as
23 to get a written statement that I can have in my hand.

24 TONY: Well, we gave a written statement the
25 other day, Steven, and that, that was discarded.

MR. SCHNEIDER: That was in regards to the

1 ATF, though, not in --

2 TONY: Pardon me?

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: My, my greatest, my greatest
4 concern has been their involvement in any aspect of
5 this judicial system, unless it comes to giving their
6 story, that's fine, in a courtroom. But when it comes
7 to the investigation, it bothers me that the men are
8 out there making -- I mean, they called the people that
9 were here as eyewitnesses liars and that they were
10 fabricating stories and so forth.

11 TONY: Okay. Well, Steven --

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: And who's to say --

13 TONY: -- all I can tell you, all I can tell
14 you right now, forgetting everything, what you've heard
15 before, if there was confusion to it, I can tell you
16 right now from this point on that the Texas Rangers is
17 the main investigative agency --

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: I know they're the main.

19 TONY: -- that's going to be --

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: I heard that.

21 TONY: That's what I'm saying. What I'm
22 saying, that they are the investigating agency.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, but that's the point.
24 When I asked -- it was John or one of these guys --
25 they said main, also.

TONY: Well, when they said main is because

1 | they've requested assistance from us, for, for example,
2 | from laboratories, things along this line.

3 | MR. SCHNEIDER: That's fine. I don't mind
4 | that.

5 | TONY: That, that's what I'm saying. What
6 | I'm saying main, they are the primary investigative
7 | agency. That's, that's terms that we use to show what
8 | agency is heading up the investigation.

9 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I just don't like the idea
10 | that the ATF would even have a slim --

11 | TONY: They're not going to. They are out of
12 | it. I don't know how I can say it anymore, Steve. The
13 | ATF cannot --

14 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's the first time
15 | I've heard that.

16 | TONY: -- be involved in the investigation
17 | because of the fact that they were involved in the
18 | operation. They can't be involved in the
19 | investigation.

20 | MR. SCHNEIDER: That makes sense to me. That
21 | makes sense.

22 | TONY: Okay. And that's the way it's going
23 | to be. John explained -- Steven, I was here when John
24 | explained that. Maybe -- Forgetting that, maybe you
25 | just didn't understand that. I'm explaining that to
 | you now.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, it seemed a little
2 ambiguous because --

3 TONY: Okay.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- he did say, like you did
5 say yourself, that a main, like a --

6 TONY: Okay. Well, let's say -- That's our
7 terminology, okay? When we say --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: I know, I know that.

9 TONY: It is a primary agency.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: I understand.

11 TONY: What they're doing, the Texas Rangers
12 are heading up the investigation.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: I understand that. And --

14 TONY: Okay. Then they're getting assistance
15 from us.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: I told them it didn't, didn't
17 bother me that the FBI would be involved.

18 TONY: And, and we will be. We're going to
19 be. We're going to be to some degree, but we are not
20 going to head the investigation up. The main
21 investigators will be the Texas Rangers. When I say
22 the main, they're just heading it up. That's just
23 terminology meanings.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, no. I know, I
25 understand.

TONY: Okay.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: No problem.

2 TONY: Well, just so we understand where
3 we're coming, ATF is not involved in the investigation.
4 I assure you of that. Okay?

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

6 TONY: Okay. Now, now that I've gotten you
7 through the reluctance of coming out, will you come out
8 now?

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I've still got to --
10 I've got to spend some time with Judy. I want to talk
11 to her for sure. It's a main thing, you know, I mean,
12 we --

13 TONY: Okay.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- we came here together.
15 It's been 22 years now, so it's been a long time. I
16 want to make sure that --

17 TONY: I want you, I want you to get back
18 with Judy, Mayanah, and I want you to get seven other
19 people that you can convince to come out. We need to
20 have at least a minimum of 10 people to come out
21 tomorrow.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't know how I'm going
23 to -- I'll tell you --

24 TONY: Listen, listen. If --

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Tony, I don't know -- I don't
have that ability anymore.

1 TONY: If --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't. I never did, in the
3 first place.

4 TONY: If you can't get 10 people, I want
5 you, Judy and Mayanah to come out.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's the first thing
7 I'll do is talk to her in the morning --

8 TONY: That's what I want you to do.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- sometime.

10 TONY: And --

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: It'll be after --

12 TONY: No, no, no, no, no. No, no, Steve.
13 You've got to get to Judy tonight and get prepared.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Tony, because of her face,
15 she's, she's not been feeling good all day long.

16 TONY: I understand. That doesn't -- We, we
17 will get her to -- If, if she's not been feeling good
18 all, all day today, you keep her up for one more night
19 and explain this. You bring her out tomorrow. She
20 will be going to a hospital tomorrow for treatment. We
21 will take care of her. We will take care of her for
22 you.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: I think she's been pretty
24 adamant up until this point in time.

25 TONY: I understand that. I understand that.
And what I would like you to do is go see her tonight

1 and talk to her tonight and get her to come out with
2 you. And you, you can explain to her just what I told
3 you. You can explain to her that her child will be
4 with her. You can explain the judicial process. You
5 can explain to her who's conducting the investigation
6 and everything's going up front. And you can convince
7 her that, that you and her and Mayanah coming out, and
8 that you can call back in to the people inside and tell
9 them everything's up front out here.

10 This is the way to go. Let us get this and
11 let's get our word out and let's get the story out to
12 the public, 'cause this -- that's going to be the only
13 way it can happen from here on. We need that to
14 happen. It is important and it's just something you're
15 going to have to do. You need to lead those people
16 out, Steve. You've got to lead them out.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Tony, they would never come
18 out with me, I guarantee it.

19 TONY: They may not walk out with you
20 tomorrow, Steven, they may not do that because -- But I
21 am firmly convinced from the time just listening to you
22 that -- Since I've been here, I am absolutely firmly
23 convinced that you have that power within yourself to
24 bring those people out. And if I'm saying bring them
25 out, if they don't walk out with you tomorrow, then you
have sufficient that you can sufficiently justify to

1 | them once you get out that they will be able to follow
2 | you out, maybe tomorrow night or the next day or
3 | whatever.

4 | MR. SCHNEIDER: But, see --

5 | TONY: But they will come out because you can
6 | tell them exactly what the process is.

7 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Tony, honestly, that's what
8 | Livingston Fagan was all about.

9 | TONY: But he did not. He -- I can't, I
10 | can't discuss him because he refused to do it.

11 | MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, but what I'm
12 | saying -- No, but what I'm saying is what's made it
13 | harder for me, I was really counting on him because of
14 | his ability to communicate.

15 | TONY: Fine. Fine. But he didn't do it. I
16 | can't control that. I'm not going to force him,
17 | Steven. I'm not going to go to him and say --

18 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I know, I know that.

19 | TONY: I'm not going to go to him and say
20 | Steve was --

21 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, I was blown away by
22 | that because that was my ace and my one opportunity to
23 | really go and, and say well, look, he's over there. I
24 | want to tell -- Can I say something about -- I was
25 | hoping he would actually be able to speak in behalf
 | of -- Instead of having someone like Kevin and Brad

1 | talking to all these different talk shows --

2 | TONY: Well, that's, that's --

3 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Like Brad doesn't even
4 | understand his messages, and he understands it for
5 | himself --

6 | TONY: Well, then come out and explain it to
7 | him, Steve. Come out here and explain it to him.

8 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's what Livingston
9 | went to do.

10 | TONY: Well, it's a moot point, Steven.
11 | It's -- What the point is, the only way you're going to
12 | be convinced is for you to hear it from their mouths
13 | themselves and for you to explain it to them yourself,
14 | okay? It's very important that you do this.

15 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, there's a few things --

16 | TONY: Because I'm convinced you can have
17 | this thing resolved, Steve. You can do this.

18 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Don't give me credit I
19 | don't -- I mean, seriously, it doesn't --

20 | TONY: Okay, let me ask you this.

21 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm serious.

22 | TONY: Well, what I'm getting at is you
23 | mentioned on a number of occasions that you are tired
24 | of this going on and you would just rather walk out of
25 | there. You said you were willing to walk out of there,
 | okay?

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm just --

2 TONY: I want you -- If you, if you, if you
3 have that conviction of walking out of there, if you
4 have that conviction, then do it.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, my --

6 TONY: Or, or you really don't mean what
7 you're saying.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: No. Here's what it is. My
9 concern is once I get -- I'm in a jail cell that I'll
10 be able to do absolutely nothing --

11 TONY: You're wrong.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- for these people at all.

13 TONY: You're wrong. You know what I think
14 your fear is?

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: What's that?

16 TONY: I think your fear is that, that if you
17 leave that David fears other people will follow you.
18 And I think that's your fear.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not at all, not at -- I
20 know -- that's not it.

21 TONY: Are you telling me that, are you
22 telling me that, that you can't leave on your own?

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: You know I can. I can do
24 anything.

25 TONY: Then why don't you? You know, I, I
firmly believe -- I want to believe the fact, I want to

1 | believe the fact that you can walk out of there and get
2 | these people. And if you don't get --

3 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Tony --

4 | TONY: If what I just got through saying is
5 | inaccurate, then you can help David by bringing these
6 | people out.

7 | MR. SCHNEIDER: This is the point. The
8 | religious conviction is so deep, how do you go against
9 | that?

10 | TONY: Then you don't really care -- What I'm
11 | saying is you don't really believe the fact that you're
12 | getting out of there. That you're saying, you're
13 | saying I wish this is over, I just want to walk out of
14 | here.

15 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, it's true. Look, you
16 | and I are both spiritual beings and fleshly. And, I
17 | mean, of course, we've got to feed our face and all the
18 | rest, but you yourself are a spiritual person and you
19 | can perceive things --

20 | TONY: Okay.

21 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- okay that way. Okay, so
22 | for me, I'm in the same kind of a dilemma in that
23 | there's these -- the strong convictions. I see things
24 | there, Tony, that's the point. On one hand, yeah, I'm
25 | tired. The body's tired.

 TONY: The body's tired.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Of course it is.

2 TONY: And how many other people are tired in
3 there that, that are looking for direction, Steve?
4 Those people are looking for direction.

5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, not from me they
6 aren't.

7 TONY: I believe they are, because they're
8 not getting it from David.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: I was trying to tell you,
10 he's so beyond me that what they've heard, they want --
11 they go --

12 TONY: Steve, I think you're just giving me
13 excuses. I mean, we've been hearing this for, for 25
14 days, Steve.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: No. Livingston himself has a
16 master's degree. He was a minister over in England.

17 TONY: I'm not going to discuss Livingston
18 because he's --

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, but -- No, but I'm
20 just --

21 TONY: It doesn't --

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Look, here's how it works.
23 Now, seriously, Tony, seriously, even with his ability
24 and his master's degree, his being a minister, all
25 that, it didn't matter to them what he did or didn't
do. When it came right down to it, because they came

1 | here to hear David because of his ability to open that
2 | book.

3 | TONY: Okay.

4 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Tony, so don't give me -- I
5 | don't deserve it.

6 | TONY: Well, okay, if you, if you don't want
7 | me to give you the credit, I won't give you the credit.
8 | But what I want you to do --

9 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't have that influence.

10 | TONY: Fine.

11 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't have it.

12 | TONY: Fine. But what I think you do have is
13 | the ability to take those people out of there in the
14 | sense that if David is looking for some type of word
15 | from the outside here that everything is okay, and if
16 | that's true, 'cause it appears you're unconvinced that
17 | everything's okay out here, if somebody needs to find
18 | that out, the first one he would believe would be you.
19 | And if you were to come out here and see the system and
20 | how it's going and you can honestly call in and tell
21 | him exactly the process of what's happening, that will
22 | hopefully be enough influence right there to get these
23 | people to come out so that we can get this resolved and
24 | that we can get the investigation finished up and we
25 | can let the legal process take its -- the role it's
going so that the people then can have access to the

1 | press, the talk shows can go on on CBN. Everything can
2 | be done.

3 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Tony, personally, I don't
4 | even care about the CBN --

5 | TONY: Okay. All right, then let's drop that
6 | issue. That's fine.

7 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and the press.

8 | TONY: That was just something -- Well, the
9 | reason I bring that up is because this was, this was
10 | something that was brought up before.

11 | MR. SCHNEIDER: To tell you the truth, after
12 | hearing this guy Craig Smith, I'd never in this world
13 | have anything to do --

14 | TONY: Okay.

15 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- with him or his --

16 | TONY: Well, then let's, let's just drop that
17 | issue. That's a nonissue, there's no problem.

18 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

19 | TONY: We don't have to discuss that. But
20 | you --

21 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I heard --

22 | TONY: -- have that ability to bring these
23 | people out.

24 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- even had the audacity to
25 | call --

 TONY: Okay. You know, you know what I want

1 | you to do now? You know what I want you to do?

2 | MR. SCHNEIDER: What's that?

3 | TONY: Think very carefully what I told you
4 | about the process out here. I want you to go talk to
5 | Judy now. I want you to go and talk to her and then I
6 | want you to -- We'll get back to you later or you call
7 | back to me, one or the other, and line her up and
8 | convince her, Steve.

9 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I'll talk to you in the
10 | morning, but I'm so -- I can't even --

11 | TONY: I want to talk to you tonight, Steve.
12 | It's --

13 | MR. SCHNEIDER: In fact, I'm --

14 | TONY: No. Steve, one more night's not going
15 | to matter.

16 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I, I purposely stayed up to
17 | show courtesy and decency, to show that I'm trying to
18 | work with you guys.

19 | TONY: Okay.

20 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, I was going to --

21 | TONY: I understand.

22 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I was going to go to bed
23 | about two, three hours ago, after talking to Dick.

24 | TONY: Well, I think, I think --

25 | MR. SCHNEIDER: And then John, he got on the
phone. Then he said well, Steve, let me call you back.

1 TONY: Something as important as this, Steve,
2 right now, something as important as right now --

14 STEVE TO OTHERS: Oh, mercy. Okay, do me a
15 favor, because he's going to want to call back in maybe
16 10, 15 minutes. I'm just so -- My voice is gone and
17 I've got a headache and I'm shot. Maybe if you could
18 just answer the phone when he calls back -- Tony?

19 TONY: Yeah.

20 STEVE: Yeah, she's -- I've got somebody here
21 that's going to go try to find them --

22 TONY: Okay.

23 STEVE: -- and bring them to the phone. But
24 I, I --

25 TONY: That's fine.

STEVE: Oh, I tell you, I've got one of those

1 | kind of -- it's not a migraine, but it's a pounder and
2 | everytime you move, you know what I mean.

3 | TONY: Well, in fact, I've got one, too, that

 TONY: Steven, we can't do that. We've got

1 to get this going.

2 STEVE: I am -- Tony, I am --

5 TONY: And, Steven, and so are we. And
6 that's why --

7 STEVE: Well, no, no. Come on, Tony.

8 TONY: But you know what, Steve?

9 STEVE: I've talked to you guys morning,
10 noon, and night.

11 TONY: And you know what, Steven?

12 STEVE: I don't get any shift breaks.

13 TONY: If you go talk to her tonight and you
14 can tell her we're going to do this in the morning --

15 STEVE: Tony.

16 TONY: -- and we do this, you're going to get
17 all the sleep you want tomorrow.

18 STEVE: Who are you going to talk to when I'm
19 gone from here? Who are you guys going to talk to

21 TONY: I'm going to talk to David. But you
22 know what, Steven? What's going to happen is you're
23 going to come out here and you're going to be able to
24 call back in there and tell them exactly what we're
25 saying is true. And through you being out here, you're
going to be able to see --

1 STEVE: What are you talking about? You're
2 saying that I'm going to be able to call from there day
3 by day or something?

4 TONY: Yes, we'll make arrangements for you
5 to call in as you want so that you can tell them this
6 is the right way, we're going to get it resolved. We
7 want you to do that. We -- you said you wanted to help
8 bring this to a conclusion. This is one good way to do
9 it, and I firmly believe that and I believe you can do
10 that. And through that, you're going to lead those
11 people out of there, Steven. You're going to bring
12 this --

13 STEVE: You're almost making me sound like
14 some kind of a modern day --

15 TONY: No, I'm not -- well, I'm not trying --
16 that -- maybe I just didn't get the interpretation.
17 I'm not trying to do that.

18 STEVE: No, I know. I know.

19 TONY: I'm just trying to say that, that this
20 is the way to do it and I think you can be very
21 instrumental in doing this, because it's going nowhere
22 the way it's gone. Okay? We've gone -- gotten
23 absolutely nowhere, but I think that you can honestly

25 Judy now and talk her -- and I'm going to call you back

18 STEVE: I'm going to talk to you in the
19 morning, 'cause I can't even --

20 TONY: No, I can't do that. I need to have
21 an answer tonight.

22 STEVE: I can't do it, Tony, because my head
23 is pounding. I don't even want to talk to her. I
24 can't even -- right now, it's getting so much worse
25 than five minutes ago.

TONY: You can -- you need to go do that, you

1 need to do that now. And we're going to call you back
2 in a couple hours. We're going to need an answer,
3 Steven. Will you just do that?

4 STEVE: I was asking some of these --

5 TONY: Come up with an answer?

6 STEVE: Let me put you on with some of these
7 people, and when my headache's gone and I've had a good
8 night's rest --

9 TONY: Hey, all I'm going, I'm going to
10 want --

11 STEVE: -- I'll talk to you.

12 TONY: Steven, all I'm going to want an
13 answer from you is yes or no. That's what I'm going to
14 need from you. Okay?

15 STEVE: I'll call --

16 TONY: That's important.

17 STEVE: I'll tell you what I'll do. I'll
18 tell you what I'll do. I'll pass it on to someone
19 else. I'll try to make the attempt, but once I go, I
20 mean, I don't want to be getting up and walking around.
21 I'm, I'm telling you, I am hurting. I really am.

22 TONY: Then you go -- I'll tell you what.
23 You go talk to her now and before you lay down and,
24 and --

25 STEVE: I'll be --

TONY: -- you come back to me and talk to me

1 again.

2 STEVE: I'll send a message with someone.

3 TONY: No, no, I want to, I want to talk to
4 you. I need it from you.

5 STEVE: Right now, I'm sitting back with my
6 head back. I'm trying to right now even --

7 TONY: I know.

8 STEVE: -- do what I can from having it
9 pound.

10 TONY: I know. I understand that, and it's,
11 it's very tiring. But we're at such an important point
12 right here.

13 STEVE: Okay.

14 TONY: It's something we need to do.

15 STEVE: By the way, Tony --

16 TONY: Yes?

17 STEVE: -- right now we have -- Julie
18 Martinez is here. We have --

19 TONY: Good.

20 STEVE: So she can talk to you. Is the other
21 person here or do you want, do you want to --

22 TONY: Julie -- get started with Julie here,
23 and if they can get Lisa or Sherry, then when Julie's
24 done then we can go from there. Okay?

25 STEVE: Okay.

TONY: Okay. But then when they're done

1 | there -- if you can get the answer from Judy, then you
2 | can come back when they're done and I can talk to you.
3 | That way you can go to bed right after that. So go
4 | talk to her. We'll, we'll want either a yes or no on
5 | that.

6 | STEVE: You have the other negotiator there,
7 | too?

8 | TONY: Yeah.

9 | STEVE: You do? Okay.

10 | TONY: Yeah, sure.

11 | STEVE: Well, let me pass the phone on.

12 | TONY: Okay. And I'll pass it over to ours
13 | here, okay?

14 | STEVE: Okay. We'll talk to you a little --

15 | TONY: Okay. You go get an answer and I'll
16 | be getting back to you here shortly.

17 | STEVE: I'll pass the answer on
18 | with --

19 | TONY: No, no. I want to talk to you,
20 | Steven. I want to talk to you before you go to bed,
21 | Steve. All right?

22 | STEVE: I'm going to probably pass out here.

23 | TONY: Steve. Steve.

24 | STEVE: Here's Julie.

25 | TONY: Okay, I'll, I'll talk to you pretty
soon.

1 JULIE: Hello? Hello?

2 LINDA: Yes.

3 JULIE: Hello?

4 LINDA: Yes, this is Linda Barry.

5 JULIE: Hi.

6 LINDA: Hi. How are you?

7 JULIE: Okay.

8 LINDA: Did they have to wake you up or were
9 you already up?

10 JULIE: No, I was up. I was putting, you
11 know, the kids to bed.

12 LINDA: Oh, you have kids?

13 JULIE: Yeah.

14 LINDA: How many?

15 JULIE: Five.

16 LINDA: You have five children?

17 JULIE: Uh-huh.

18 LINDA: Okay, that's why I wanted to -- I
19 asked the guys to let me talk to some of the females
20 because I, I believe that we would be able to talk as
21 woman to woman, mother to mother.

22 JULIE: Uh-huh.

23 LINDA: How are your children doing?

24 JULIE: Oh, they're fine.

25 LINDA: They -- You don't see any change in
them?

1 JULIE: No.

2 LINDA: Not at all? What about schooling?

3 JULIE: Oh, I -- well, I teach them. You
4 know, we, you know, we have books here and I've been,
5 you know, they've been reading and, and they, they
6 really enjoy reading the Bible a lot. So --

7 LINDA: Well, Julie, what I really wanted to
8 talk to you about is getting your kids out of that
9 situation. As a mother, I know you know that it's
10 important that we get them out of that situation. It's
11 got to be very stressful for them.

12 JULIE: Oh, well, they don't, you know, they
13 don't want to go.

14 LINDA: Well, you're their mother and -- how
15 old are they?

16 JULIE: From 13 to 3.

17 LINDA: Okay. What are their names?

18 JULIE: Audrey, Abby --

19 LINDA: Could you give me the names and the
20 ages?

21 JULIE: Audrey is 13.

22 LINDA: Okay.

23 JULIE: And Abby is 11. She'll be 12 in May.

24 LINDA: Okay.

25 JULIE: And Joseph, he's 8 or 9. Okay,

and --

1 LINDA: Okay. It is kind of hard to
2 remember.

3 JULIE: Yeah.

4 LINDA: When you have five.

5 JULIE: Well, I have, I have six. My husband
6 has one of them in California.

7 LINDA: Oh, okay.

8 JULIE: And then it's Isaiah. He's five.

9 LINDA: Okay.

10 JULIE: And Crystal, she's three.

11 LINDA: Okay. Well, that's why I'm here. I
12 want to talk to you about getting you out of there
13 tomorrow and getting your five kids out of there.

14 JULIE: Well, I want to know what happened to
15 my mom. She went out, you know, and she never called
16 back.

17 LINDA: Your mom? What's your mother's name?

18 JULIE: Ophelia Santorio.

19 LINDA: Ophelia Santorio. Let me write one
20 of the guys a note and see if they can't find out
21 exactly. I know two women were let out on bond today
22 and I believe it might have been her, but let me get a
23 confirmation on that.

24 JULIE: I'm sorry, I couldn't hear what you
25 said. The loud speaker came on and I kind of -- it --
I didn't hear what you said.

1 LINDA: Okay. Let me speak a little slower.
2 A little louder maybe.

3 JULIE: Okay.

4 LINDA: Can you hear me now?

5 JULIE: Yes.

6 LINDA: Okay. There were two women who were
7 let out on bond today and they went to a halfway house.

8 JULIE: Uh-huh.

9 LINDA: I'm not exactly sure about the names.
10 I'm going to have one of the guys here confirm if one
11 of those was your mother. Okay?

12 JULIE: Well, I think on the radio it said
13 that Rita Little and, and -- that -- but they let them
14 out, but my mom never called and I, you know --

15 LINDA: Well, I'm having a guy -- I'm having
16 somebody check that for you. Okay?

17 JULIE: Okay.

18 LINDA: But what I want to talk to you about
19 is getting you and your kids out of there, because I
20 don't know how much information you've been given over
21 the last few weeks and I just wanted to make sure that
22 you, you know, that, you know, nobody's going to hurt
23 you. You're going to be taken care of. Your kids are
24 going to be taken care of. We just want you out of
25 that situation with those five kids. And as a mother,
I mean, I can't imagine that you would want your kids

1 | in that situation for this long. I can hear in your
2 | voice that you're a little bit concerned.

3 | JULIE: Well, I'm more concerned as to what
4 | happened to my mother.

5 | LINDA: Well, I'm finding that out. I'm
6 | going to -- I'm finding that out now. And as soon as
7 | they find that out, they will let me know and I'll tell
8 | you that.

9 | JULIE: Uh-huh.

10 | LINDA: But what about your children?

11 | JULIE: Well, they're fine, you know.
12 | They're, they're okay.

13 | LINDA: Okay. You know, one of the
14 | ways -- while they're checking that, one of the ways
15 | that you can find out about your mother is to come out.

16 | JULIE: Ahhh. I mean, I don't know what they
17 | did to my mother and I don't know what they'll do to
18 | me. I know they'll take my children away and, you
19 | know, I just -- I mean, I don't really trust them, with
20 | all the things they do and they say, you know. I
21 | just -- I, I can't trust them. You know, they say that
22 | they, that they --

23 | LINDA: I can promise you that nothing is
24 | going to happen to your kids. They're not going to be
25 | taken away from you.

JULIE: Look, see, before I came here, I was,

1 | you know, I got involved with the wrong people.

2 | LINDA: I can understand that.

3 | JULIE: And, and, you know, I, I, I ended,
4 | you know, -- my, my ex was, you know, got involved in
5 | drugs and then I started, you know, -- he started
6 | getting me into it, introducing me into it and
7 | everything. And I did not like, you know, like what
8 | was happening.

9 | LINDA: You know, I can understand how your
10 | life was involved then.

11 | JULIE: Yeah. So, you know, my mother went
12 | and she got me -- and she brought me over here and
13 | these people have helped me. You know, they helped me
14 | straighten, you know, get out of, you know --

15 | LINDA: I understand that.

16 | JULIE: -- the drug problem.

17 | LINDA: I understand that, Julie.

18 | JULIE: And they, they've helped me. You
19 | know, they're like --

20 | LINDA: But the situation there can't get any
21 | better. We want you to come out with your five kids.
22 | Is the father of your children there?

23 | JULIE: No.

24 | LINDA: Okay. Who is the father?

25 | JULIE: Well, the -- one of them --

 LINDA: Audrey?

1 JULIE: To Audrey?
2 LINDA: Uh-huh.
3 JULIE: He lives in California.
4 LINDA: Okay. What's his name?
5 JULIE: His name is Daniel.
6 LINDA: Daniel --
7 JULIE: Martinez.
8 LINDA: -- Martinez? Okay.
9 JULIE: Uh-huh.
10 LINDA: And Abby?
11 JULIE: That is the same. The first four
12 were his.
13 LINDA: Okay. Is that Joseph and --
14 JULIE: No.
15 LINDA: -- Isaac?
16 JULIE: That's Audrey, Abby, Daniel, and
17 Joseph.
18 LINDA: Daniel?
19 JULIE: Daniel is with him.
20 LINDA: Oh, I see. Okay. How old is Daniel?
21 JULIE: He's 10, I think. Yeah.
22 LINDA: So he's in California with his
23 father?
24 JULIE: Yeah, he's in California.
25 LINDA: Okay. And what about the last two,
Isaiah and Crystal?

1 JULIE: They belong to Thomas.
2 LINDA: Thomas?
3 JULIE: Thomas Barrios. He lives in El Paso.
4 LINDA: What was the last name?
5 JULIE: Barrios.
6 LINDA: Could you spell that?
7 JULIE: B-A-R-R-I-O-S.
8 LINDA: Do you have a address for him?
9 JULIE: Not really, no.
10 LINDA: Or any way he could be contacted?
11 JULIE: No, no.
12 LINDA: You haven't had any contact with him?
13 JULIE: No, I haven't.
14 LINDA: What about the children? Doesn't --
15 does he contact them?
16 JULIE: No. He's just a junkie.
17 LINDA: Okay. And he lives in El Paso?
18 JULIE: Yeah.
19 LINDA: Well, I think it's important that you
20 think about coming out tomorrow with your kids.
21 JULIE: I, you know, there's no way -- see --
22 LINDA: There's no way?
23 JULIE: I mean, the kids, I can't -- I mean,
24 I wouldn't -- I don't want the kids to end up with
25 their father.
LINDA: You don't want the kids -- what we

1 found out is they're trying to keep the children with
2 their parents, which would be you. You've had custody
3 of them all this time, right?

4 JULIE: Yes. And, and there's no -- you
5 know, they can't go with their father. Their father's
6 no good.

7 LINDA: Okay.

8 JULIE: You know, that's why I've been, you
9 know, trying to protect them. I changed my ways, you
10 know, I tried to straighten up my life, you know, and,
11 and now --

12 LINDA: But I've heard no one say that anyone
13 there hasn't been a good mother to their children. But
14 I think the situation, as it is now, it's not going to
15 get better, it can only get worse. And I would think -
16 - as a mother, I would think you'd want to get your
17 kids out of that situation. I mean, what are your
18 other reasons that you -- you already mentioned that
19 one but your five kids, what are some of the other
20 reasons? What can I say that could reassure you that
21 no one's going to hurt you, they're going to be taken
22 care of?

23 JULIE: This is our home.

24 LINDA: I beg your pardon?

25 JULIE: This is our home. You know, why do
they want to take us out of our home?

1 LINDA: Well, it's important that you leave
2 there. That, that can't be your home now. We have to
3 get you out of that situation.

4 JULIE: Why did they do this to us?

5 LINDA: I can't talk to you about, you know,
6 the events of the past. The only thing we can talk
7 about is getting those kids and yourself out of that
8 situation tomorrow.

9 JULIE: Oh, boy. Well, my daughters don't
10 want to leave.

11 LINDA: Well, you're their mother.

12 JULIE: And I can't, I can't leave them
13 behind.

14 LINDA: Well, you're their mother. Surely,
15 you can --

16 JULIE: I always gave them the freedom --

17 LINDA: -- convince them.

18 JULIE: -- of choice.

19 LINDA: You're their mother. I would think
20 that you would be the one who's responsible, that would
21 make the decision for your children, what you feel is
22 best for them.

23 JULIE: I always gave my daughters -- my
24 daughters are old enough to have a choice.

25 LINDA: In this kind of situation, they
cannot have a choice. Everyone is coming out and you

1 | have to be a strong mother and say the best thing for
2 | you to do is to come out with me. Just prepare them.
3 | Sit down with them tonight and discuss the reasons that
4 | you're going to be leaving. Set an example for them as
5 | a strong parent. Prepare them, you know, in whatever
6 | way you feel that they need to be prepared to come to
7 | the outside world. And, you know, set a time that
8 | they're going to get up in the morning, set the routine
9 | for their morning.

10 | JULIE: I've talked to them.

11 | LINDA: Well, I need you to talk to them
12 | again tonight. As a matter of fact, now. To talk to
13 | them before you put them to bed.

14 | JULIE: I can try, you know. I don't know.

15 | LINDA: But you're their mother. You said
16 | the oldest one is 13?

17 | JULIE: Yeah. She's grown up, you know, she
18 | -- I always gave them a freedom of choice.

19 | LINDA: Well, you know, I'm a mother, too,
20 | and to me 13 is not an adult.

21 | JULIE: Well, no, she's not an adult.

22 | LINDA: Okay. And 13 is not --

23 | JULIE: But she has a choice.

24 | LINDA: -- an age where a child can make a
25 | decision that's this big about their future. That's
something that the mother has to do. You said you made

1 a decision once to change your life around.

2 JULIE: Yes, my life.

3 LINDA: Right.

4 JULIE: For them.

5 LINDA: Well, you've got to think about them
6 now, their future. That's what's important right now,
7 your five children. I mean, what about them? They
8 probably miss their grandmother.

9 JULIE: Well, they want --

10 LINDA: Were they close with their
11 grandmother?

12 JULIE: Yeah. Well, you know --

13 LINDA: Well, I'm sure they want to see their
14 grandmother. I'm sure they're wondering --

15 JULIE: We are, we're wondering what
16 happened. Why, why she didn't call.

17 LINDA: As far as I know, she's going to be
18 held as a material witness and she's fine.

19 JULIE: She's going to be held as a material
20 witness?

21 LINDA: Material witness. And she is fine.

22 JULIE: Why is, why is the other people been
23 released and why aren't they releasing her?

24 LINDA: I really can't say what the judge's
25 decision has been. I'm not, you know, I haven't been
in court and I really can't say about that. The only

1 | thing I can say is that your mother is being held as a
2 | material witness. She's fine. If you come out, you'll
3 | have the opportunity to talk to her. Your kids will
4 | have an opportunity to see her. Is there anything else
5 | that I could probably say to you, Julie, to reassure
6 | you that we are really interested in your children and,
7 | and their safety and, more importantly, their future?
8 | What, what other, other problems do you have?

9 | JULIE: What other problems do I have?

10 | LINDA: Yeah, that would keep you from
11 | talking to your children tonight before you put them to
12 | bed about preparing them, to get them ready to leave
13 | tomorrow?

14 | JULIE: Well, we were ready to go out, but --

15 | LINDA: You were ready when?

16 | JULIE: We were ready, but then, you know,
17 | they come over here and they start destroying
18 | everything here and terrorizing --

19 | LINDA: Well, the thing about it is --

20 | JULIE: Well, you know, how could you -- I
21 | mean, I can't trust you guys. You know, you say one
22 | thing and you do another.

23 | LINDA: Well, you can trust me. And I can
24 | assure you that nothing bad is going to happen to your
25 | kids. I can't change what happened in the past.

There's nothing I can do about that. There's nothing

1 | you can do about that. We're talking about tomorrow
2 | and the future. I mean, I've got -- I have to imagine
3 | that it's got to be miserable that your kids can't go
4 | outside and play. I don't know what the situation with
5 | the food is, but --

6 | JULIE: Oh, you know --

7 | LINDA: -- don't you want your kids to be out
8 | in the real world? I can't -- I just can't imagine,
9 | you know, how you're existing there. And your mother
10 | will probably be, sooner or later, out on bond.

11 | JULIE: You know what the kids say?

12 | LINDA: No, what?

13 | JULIE: They, they ask why did these people
14 | come and mess up our life? We were so happy here.

15 | LINDA: Well, you know what, Julie? I can't
16 | really talk to you about what happened in the past.
17 | And as the mother of those kids, I think it's your
18 | responsibility to sit them down tonight before you put
19 | them to bed, prepare them in whatever way you feel is
20 | necessary for tomorrow, for them to come out, for you
21 | to come out. I can assure you --

22 | JULIE: I'll talk to my daughters.

23 | LINDA: I can assure you --

24 | JULIE: I mean, but like I say, you know --

25 | LINDA: But what about the youngest ones, the
ones that you would make the ultimate decision?

1 JULIE: I can't, I can't let them out on
2 their own.

3 LINDA: But would you come out with
4 those -- the smaller --

5 JULIE: I can't leave my, my daughters here.

6 LINDA: So you're going to allow the 13-year-
7 old to make a decision that --

8 JULIE: Hey, you know, I'm not going to force
9 her to do anything she doesn't want to do.

10 LINDA: I -- you know, as a mother, I can't
11 understand how you could say that.

12 JULIE: I always gave her free choice.

13 LINDA: In a situation like this, she's a
14 child. She's not an adult. It's up to you as an
15 adult. I mean, let me just say, me, as a mother, you
16 know, I would say darling, tonight -- tomorrow we're
17 going to be doing this. I need you to prepare
18 yourself. This is why I want you to leave, this is why
19 we are leaving.

20 JULIE: Yeah, I could say that, but for her
21 to agree with me is something else. This is their
22 home. You're asking them to leave their home.

23 LINDA: But it can't be their home anymore.
24 You know, this has been going on for a long time and at
25 some point the situation is going to change, and it's
not going to be a place that you're going to be able to

1 live any longer. We're trying to get you to come
2 tomorrow --

3 JULIE: You're saying that, that we won't be
4 able to live here any longer and, you know --

5 LINDA: Right, you won't be -- at some point
6 in time --

7 JULIE: -- we could come back.

8 LINDA: At some point in time very soon you
9 will not be able to live there. I'm trying to get you
10 to do this tomorrow, to set an example with your
11 children. Stop acting, you know, like your children
12 can tell you what to do. Be strong and make the
13 preparations that are necessary and come out tomorrow.
14 Now, you know, what can happen in the future, whether
15 you can return there, you know, I don't know, but it's
16 a possibility. But as of the time right now, for
17 tomorrow, we want you to leave, to walk out with your
18 children tomorrow. I can assure you that you all are
19 going to be taken care of, you're going to be treated
20 humanely.

21 Nobody's going to hurt you. No one's going
22 to hurt your kids. No one is going to take your kids
23 away from you. But I can't tell you what's going to
24 happen in the future. You may be able to return there,
25 but as of now you can't -- that can't be your home.
You know, after everything is settled, people will be

1 | able to return there, but right at the present time,
2 | that's not a possibility. Julie?

3 | JULIE: Yeah.

4 | LINDA: Are you still there?

5 | JULIE: Yeah, I'm here.

6 | LINDA: I hope, I hope you're thinking,
7 | especially about your kids. I mean --

8 | JULIE: I love my kids.

9 | LINDA: I know you do. I know, I know that
10 | feeling. You know, you know, I wish you could really
11 | be around this place and see how these guys feel. They
12 | haven't even met your kids, but most of them have kids.
13 | This whole situation is like it is because of those
14 | kids.

15 | JULIE: I see them everyday --

16 | LINDA: These guys are --

17 | JULIE: -- going around here --

18 | LINDA: They're like everything --

19 | JULIE: -- mocking us through the loud
20 | speaker and, you know, flipping us off and mooning us
21 | and, and, you know --

22 | LINDA: Because we want you to come out.

23 | JULIE: They do that because they want us to
24 | come out?

25 | LINDA: We want you to come out and end this
situation for the kids' sake.

1 JULIE: They flip us off and moon us and, and
2 all that because they want us to come out?

3 LINDA: Well, you know, I wouldn't even
4 concern myself with that. What you need to be
5 concerned with is your five children and yourself. You
6 know, you need to set an example with your daughters
7 and your sons. This is -- it would be the same as if
8 they wanted to go on drugs or take drugs.

9 JULIE: Yeah, well --

10 LINDA: You wouldn't want them to do that.
11 You would be very strong against that. So tomorrow --
12 tonight you must be -- you should be very strong in
13 telling them what you're going to do tomorrow.

14 JULIE: Well, it's like this is where they
15 were safe from all that.

16 LINDA: No, you're not.

17 JULIE: There's no drugs here.

18 LINDA: This is -- you know what, Julie? If
19 at anytime in your life you've ever been strong for
20 your kids, if you've ever been a real mother to your
21 kids, this is the time to do it. This is the time for
22 you to be strong. This is the time for you to stand up
23 for your children. This is it. This is it. I mean, I
24 can't think of many mothers who face something like
25 this. This is where your strength is going to show.
This is it. Do you see what I'm saying?

1 JULIE: Yeah.

2 LINDA: I know I have never been tested like
3 this. But for my children, hey, I would prepare them
4 tonight. I can assure you -- I assure you that nothing
5 bad is going to happen to your children.

6 JULIE: No, just end up in a foster home
7 somewhere and they get abused and slapped around.

8 LINDA: Let me assure you that
9 everybody --

10 JULIE: Giving them junk food and, and pork
11 and all that.

12 LINDA: Is that a -- that should not be a
13 concern 'cause that's not true. They always want to
14 keep the children with their parents.

15 JULIE: Hey, that's what they've been saying
16 on the radio, that, you know, they're going to be put
17 in foster homes. They weren't even being sent, you
18 know, they weren't even going to allow them to be sent
19 to their relatives.

20 LINDA: They are being sent to their
21 relatives. If you -- you know, the kids that came out,
22 if there's nobody out there, if their parents didn't
23 come out with them, we can't -- what do we do with
24 them? We have to give them to a relative. And the way
25 the relative is determined, it's determined by the
judge. He has an independent study done of the home

1 | that they would go to and he makes the decision of
2 | which relative he believes is capable of taking care of
3 | that child.

4 | They don't just give these kids to any
5 | relative that shows up. It has to be someone who is
6 | responsible, who has the love for that child, and also
7 | has the financial capabilities of taking care of the
8 | child.

9 | JULIE: I, I need time to think about it.

10 | LINDA: Julie, let me, let me tell you
11 | something. You know this as well as I do. This has
12 | been going on almost for a month. It's not going to
13 | get better. Do you think so?

14 | JULIE: If God does something, yeah.

15 | LINDA: It's not going to get better.

16 | JULIE: Do you believe in God?

17 | LINDA: It's not going to get better. It's
18 | only going --

19 | JULIE: Do you believe in God up in heaven?

20 | LINDA: I'm not going to discuss religion
21 | with you, okay?

22 | JULIE: Well --

23 | LINDA: The only thing we want to
24 | discuss -- that I want to discuss with you is your
25 | safety and the well-being of your children, out of that
place. This is a real test for you. I know that, I

1 understand that.

2 JULIE: Yeah, in many ways.

3 LINDA: You know, what you can do is to talk
4 to your kids about coming out tomorrow and prepare them
5 for that. As a mother, you need to be strong and tell
6 them that we are going to leave here tomorrow, and you
7 need to prepare them to leave. And I want you to let
8 Steve know that you're ready to come out.

9 JULIE: Well --

10 LINDA: He, he's, he's been looking around
11 for people who want to come out with him tomorrow. And
12 before you go talk to your children, find him and let
13 him know that you want to be, along with your five
14 children, one of the people who comes out tomorrow.
15 This -- I know this is a test for you, but you have to
16 be strong for your kids. What about your other son,
17 Daniel? You also -- I mean, you have -- you're the
18 mother of six children.

19 JULIE: His father don't -- yeah, I have
20 visitation rights and nobody has ever been able to help
21 me get to see him.

22 LINDA: Do you have a brother by the name of
23 Joe?

24 JULIE: Yeah.

25 LINDA: Would he be able to help care for
your children for a while?

1 JULIE: I hope, I hope they'll let him.

2 LINDA: Okay. Okay. You know, we'll try and

3 --

4 JULIE: If I do end up going out, I hope they
5 would let him.

6 LINDA: I've just been told that he's already
7 said that he'd be willing to take care of your children
8 for a while.

9 JULIE: Um-hum.

10 LINDA: They have a message in here from him.

11 JULIE: Yeah.

12 LINDA: Does that reassure you just a little
13 bit?

14 JULIE: Yeah. Well --

15 LINDA: Okay.

16 JULIE: -- I've been thinking about that.

17 LINDA: Okay.

18 JULIE: And --

19 LINDA: Now's the time, Julie.

20 JULIE: -- I, you know, I just have my doubts
21 that you guys will let him take care of them, you know,
22 with what I heard on the, on the radio about --

23 LINDA: Is, is he a responsible relative?

24 JULIE: Oh, yes.

25 LINDA: Okay. Then the judge would make that
decision, but if he's the most responsible relative

1 | that you have, you know, we would urge him to do that.

2 | JULIE: He's the only one I have.

3 | LINDA: Okay. Then, you know, if that's what
4 | your decision is, if you would want your brother Joe to
5 | take care of the kids, you know, we would urge the
6 | judge. I mean, we would say, you know, this is what
7 | she wants, this is what she feels is the best -- is in
8 | the best interest for her children.

9 | JULIE: I don't think they really care what I
10 | want or what I, you know --

11 | LINDA: You don't think I really care what
12 | you want?

13 | JULIE: I don't think they -- no.

14 | LINDA: That's the reason that we're here
15 | talking to you. That's the reason that I'm talking to
16 | you. I mean, I asked to talk to some of the mothers
17 | who had children because I thought you might feel a
18 | little bit more comfortable talking to me rather than
19 | talking to some of the men. You know, I wanted to make
20 | sure that the things that you feel and the things that
21 | are important to you, that you get to say that to
22 | another female. And I may be able to understand a
23 | little bit better than some of these guys, which may
24 | not be necessarily true, but --

25 | JULIE: Well, they're saying that, you know,
that, that David is being -- is, is using the kids as a

1 shield and that, you know, like that Craig guy, you
2 know, Craig Smith, you know, saying that --

3 LINDA: I don't know --

4 JULIE: -- this guy comes in and, and, and is
5 going to shoot you, you know, 'cause your kid is a
6 shield.

7 LINDA: Julie --

8 JULIE: That is so --

9 LINDA: -- Craig doesn't work --

10 JULIE: -- ridiculous.

11 LINDA: He doesn't work for us, so I can't
12 really, you know, say anything about what he says.

13 Those are his views and those are his opinions. What
14 we have to be concerned -- what I'm concerned with, and
15 I know what you are most concerned with, is your
16 children. And I wanted to talk to you because I wanted
17 to make sure you got the truth and that it wasn't
18 filtered to you through somebody else that, you know,
19 we had a chance to talk, one on one.

20 JULIE: I really -- the only reason why I
21 came to the phone was because I wanted to know how my
22 mother is.

23 LINDA: Okay. The things that we've talked
24 about, you know, I've already assured you that your
25 mother's fine. If you come out, you'll be able
to --

1 JULIE: And she never called.

2 LINDA: -- you'll have a chance to talk to
3 your mother. You'll have a chance to see your mother.
4 You can't do that in there.

5 JULIE: Yeah. Well, that's what you could
6 say right now. What, what --

7 LINDA: What's the problem --

8 JULIE: -- guarantee do I have?

9 LINDA: What guarantee do you have?

10 JULIE: Yeah.

11 LINDA: You want me personally?

12 JULIE: What guarantee do I have that --

13 LINDA: My name is Linda Barry.

14 JULIE: Huh?

15 LINDA: You have my personal guarantee that
16 nothing bad is going to happen to you or your kids.

17 JULIE: I don't know.

18 LINDA: Is that the guarantee that you want?
19 What guarantee --

20 JULIE: Yeah, because, I mean, then you
21 guys -- you know what happens is you say well, my
22 commanders say, you know, and, and, and it's like, you
23 know --

24 LINDA: What guarantees do you need from us?

25 JULIE: I don't know. I guess -- about that.

LINDA: The reason I'm talking to you is

1 | because I'm interested in you and your children.

2 | JULIE: That's why I need some more time to
3 | think about it. I don't -- I'm not -- I don't know.
4 | I'm trying to think what --

5 | LINDA: You know, the reason that I'm here is
6 | because, Julie, we're running out of time. That's the
7 | problem. What, what do I need to do? Do I need to
8 | give you a little bit of time to convince you that I'm
9 | coming from the heart with you on this?

10 | JULIE: Well, no. Well --

11 | LINDA: Well, you know, you need to prepare
12 | tonight.

13 | JULIE: Well, like, like I said, you know, we
14 | were going to -- we were all going to come out.

15 | LINDA: Okay. But today, today -- I don't
16 | know what happened in the past. We're talking about
17 | today. Okay, you need to make that decision now and
18 | prepare yourself to come out tomorrow. You know, what
19 | you need to do is go and talk to your children before
20 | you put them to bed and let them know exactly --

21 | JULIE: They're already in bed.

22 | LINDA: Well, you know, it's important enough
23 | that you wake them up. It's important enough that you
24 | wake them up and prepare them for coming out tomorrow.
25 | It's very important. I mean, I can't think of any more
 | important decision that you have to make as a mother.

1 You need to wake them up, you need to wash their hair,
2 prepare them by telling them exactly what to expect
3 tomorrow. And you need to prepare them. Are you, you
4 know, what are you feeling, a little bit confused? You
5 sound a little bit confused and kind of weak and kind
6 of done, tired.

7 JULIE: Well, you know, I think we're all a
8 little tired, but --

9 LINDA: It's not going to get better. I can
10 really guarantee and assure you that. Have you seen
11 Steve around there? 'Cause you need to tell him that
12 you're going to prepare your kids and yourself to come
13 out tomorrow. That's the other thing.

14 JULIE: Well, I can't really -- I can't tell
15 him that 'cause I still need to go talk to, you know,
16 my daughter and see what she says.

17 LINDA: Okay. Well, why don't you do that
18 first? Go and talk to your daughter. Get them up,
19 talk to them, tell them that tomorrow --

20 JULIE: No, I need to talk to my daughter
21 because, see, I don't have my, you know, I don't -- I
22 don't have my husband, you know, to talk to or
23 anything. So she is the one I talk to and we make
24 decisions together and --

25 LINDA: You know your brother wants you out.

JULIE: Yeah.

1 LINDA: Your brother Joe is really wanting
2 you out of there and he wants his nieces and nephews
3 out of there.

4 JULIE: Well --

5 LINDA: That's, you know, that's a real
6 positive thing, that you have someone in your family
7 that loves you enough that they, they're concerned
8 about you, your welfare. And not only yours, but your
9 kids'. I mean, there's got to be a lot of love between
10 you and your brother.

11 JULIE: Well, you know, all I'm going out --
12 I'd be going out there is to go to jail. I mean, so
13 really, what is the difference?

14 LINDA: You know, we can get that resolved.
15 That's, that's tomorrow. But I'm sure the judge would
16 work with you so that Joe can get your kids.

17 JULIE: Yeah, and I go to jail. Well, I
18 mean, no --

19 LINDA: I really don't know what's going to
20 happen. You would go before a judge and he would make
21 that decision.

22 JULIE: Yeah, well --

23 LINDA: You know, I -- at this point, I
24 really just don't know. And, you know, it's only a
25 temporary thing. You know, your most important thing
right now is your children. Isn't that the most

1 | important thing?

2 | JULIE: Yeah, they are.

3 | LINDA: Aren't your kids the most important
4 | thing right now?

5 | JULIE: To me they always are.

6 | LINDA: Right.

7 | JULIE: I don't know. I, I need time to
8 | think about it.

9 | LINDA: And you should do this -- this is
10 | something you need to do for your children, Julie.

11 | JULIE: What?

12 | LINDA: This is something that you need to do
13 | for the future of your children.

14 | JULIE: The future. I don't know if
15 | there's --

16 | LINDA: You know, you're not going to be
17 | allowed -- nobody's going to be allowed to stay there.

18 | JULIE: Yeah.

19 | LINDA: You need to come out tomorrow, bring
20 | your children out tomorrow so you can get on with your
21 | life.

22 | JULIE: What life?

23 | LINDA: You're stuck. Exactly. Exactly.
24 | You have no -- exactly.

25 | JULIE: They'll throw me in prison, in jail
and throw away the key.

1 LINDA: You know, I just -- I don't know
2 about that. I can't really say.

3 JULIE: Yeah. Well --

4 LINDA: You want to go talk to your children
5 and get back to me?

6 JULIE: Yeah. I need, I need to think about
7 it.

8 LINDA: Okay. Why don't I call you in about
9 half an hour?

10 JULIE: Oh, half an hour?

11 LINDA: Um-hum.

12 JULIE: No.

13 LINDA: Fifteen minutes, or how long do you
14 think it'll take?

15 JULIE: I don't know.

16 LINDA: Okay. Well, you want to call me
17 back?

18 JULIE: I don't know. Did you want to talk
19 to somebody else?

20 LINDA: Yes, I do. Either Lisa Ferris or
21 Sherry Doyle.

22 JULIE: Lisa Ferris?

23 LINDA: Uh-huh.

24 JULIE: All right.

25 LINDA: Is she there?

JULIE: Yeah. I think she's around here.

1 LINDA: Okay.

2 JULIE: Okay, let me go get her for you.

3 LINDA: Are you going to call me back?

4 JULIE: Well, I've got to, I've got to --

5 LINDA: I know you have to talk to your
6 children.

7 JULIE: Yeah.

8 LINDA: After you talk to your children, call
9 me back.

10 JULIE: I'm not going to force them to do
11 anything they don't want to do.

12 LINDA: Julie, you have to be their mother.
13 You have to be the adult. You are the adult in the
14 family. Your children are going to follow your
15 example. You have to set the example.

16 JULIE: See, you know, I, I made this, you
17 know, this thing that I was going to -- that my -- that
18 I wasn't going to -- I wanted to be more of a friend to
19 my daughter than a --

20 LINDA: Well, this is the best thing a friend
21 could do for another friend.

22 JULIE: Yeah. Well, yeah.

23 LINDA: This is the best.

24 JULIE: Yeah, not force her.

25 LINDA: Julie, your daughter's 13.

JULIE: Yeah.

1 LINDA: You're her mother.

2 JULIE: She's my -- She --

3 LINDA: She can't be all wise and all
4 knowing. She can't have had as much experience in, in
5 life as you have. You have to accept that
6 responsibility, to make this decision. This is the
7 most important decision you're probably going to make
8 in a long time. And you need to be the one, you need
9 to take the responsibility.

10 JULIE: And it'll probably be the -- my --
11 the last decision that this government would ever let
12 me make.

13 LINDA: Julie, you have to think about your
14 children.

15 JULIE: Yeah. Okay, let me go talk to --

16 LINDA: Okay, go talk to her and I want you
17 to call me back, okay?

18 JULIE: Okay. When I get Lisa --

19 LINDA: Are you going to call me back?

20 JULIE: Yeah.

21 LINDA: Okay. And if you could get Lisa or
22 Sherry.

23 JULIE: Okay.

24 LINDA: Okay, thanks.

10 LISA: Yeah, yeah, that's all right.

11 MS. BARRY: Okay. I just wanted to talk to
12 you to make sure that, you know, you're getting all the
13 information that I have. Do you have any children
14 there?

15 LISA: No, uh-uh.

16 MS. BARRY: Are you there by yourself?

18 MS. BARRY: Okay. I want you to come out

9 motorcycles.

10 MS. BARRY: Right.

11 LISA: And --

12 MS. BARRY: We want you to come out and
13 that's why they're doing that.

14 LISA: I mean --

15 MS. BARRY: They want -- because you can't
16 stay there. You have to come out, and at some later
17 time --

18 LISA: The big bad wolf's going to huff and
19 puff and blow the house down or something?

20 MS. BARRY: I'm sorry?

21 LISA: It's like the big bad wolf blowing our
22 house down.

23 MS. BARRY: Well, Lisa --

24 LISA: Trying to get the, you know --

25 MS. BARRY: Lisa, you can't stay there. You

 MS. BARRY: -- to me better than you would

1 | some of the guys that are here.

2 | LISA: He was one of the ones that asked me
3 | when he was talking to Dick, and I told Dick hey, I
4 | want to tell you some of the reasons why I'm not coming
5 | out. And he said basically he didn't want to talk to
6 | me, which was fine, you know. But --

7 | MS. BARRY: If Steve will come out
8 | tomorrow --

7 promised --

8 MS. BARRY: No, no, no, no, no. No, no.
9 What I'm saying, at that moment that didn't happen.
10 You're trying to confuse something that's happened
11 later with that particular moment. I'm talking about
12 after that was done, he promised that you all would
13 come out. Am I not right?

14 LISA: Okay, well, that --

15 MS. BARRY: No, wait. First of all, let's
16 get that point down, okay, so there's no confusion
17 between you and I. Is that not what he promised?

18 LISA: Well --

19 MS. BARRY: No, no, no.

20 LISA: -- not to my recollection.

21 MS. BARRY: That's not to your recollection?

22 LISA: No, it isn't. Because I know that you
23 guys have made a lot of statements.

24 MS. BARRY: Okay, well, what, what, what is
25 your recollection of what David promised when he read
that message over, over the radio?

1 LISA: That's not -- I, I -- that's not the
2 point. The point is --

3 MS. BARRY: But, no, but it is the point --

4 LISA: The point is --

5 MS. BARRY: -- because the point you're
6 trying to make with me is that --

7 LISA: -- these guys totally have
8 been --

9 MS. BARRY: -- we've broken promises.

10 LISA: -- they're making us all these rude
11 statements about us. Da, da, da, he's going on --

12 MS. BARRY: Lisa --

13 LISA: -- come up and he's going to say well
14 --

15 MS. BARRY: -- you've got it up. You're the
16 one that says that we're breaking our promise, and I am
17 going to defend my organization.

18 LISA: Okay, fine.

19 MS. BARRY: I am not going to let you sit
20 here and put the FBI down and tell lies about the FBI,
21 because they simply are not true. And you, you know
22 that as a fact. It's not true.

23 LISA: Well, like I said, that's my
24 recollection that I, I recall.

25 MS. BARRY: Well, let's go back and see if we
can't --

1 LISA: That's -- but that's not the point.
2 The point I'm trying to make --

3 MS. BARRY: Yeah -- but, no, but it is the
4 point because --

5 LISA: -- you guys stepped on our toes by
6 saying all these rude statements. Well, I'll let them
7 talk because I already --

8 MS. BARRY: Lisa.

9 LISA: -- promised them that I would.

10 MS. BARRY: Lisa, you know what?

11 LISA: Look, we don't care. We don't want to
12 --

13 MS. BARRY: That is exactly the point,
14 because everything is getting blurred here and the
15 truth, you're not -- you don't -- obviously don't have
16 the truth. The truth is that David said --

17 LISA: No, the thing is that you guys don't
18 have the truth. You don't even know what the truth is.

19 MS. BARRY: Okay, so, you know, he's not a
20 man of his word. That's what the world sees. Because
21 he said once that statement was read that you all would
22 come out. It was played. You all did not come out.
23 He did not keep his promise. Now, we can go from that
24 into the future. You know what I just said is true.
25 David lost his credibility right there. Now, what,
what promises --

1 LISA: You guys lost your credibility before
2 you even guys came in. The ATF, you know, blew it --

3 MS. BARRY: No, you're not -- I can't -- I'm
4 not talking -- we're not going to discuss the ATF.
5 This is the FBI. I'm Linda Barry, I'm with the FBI,
6 not ATF. Okay?

7 LISA: Uh-huh.

8 MS. BARRY: A different day, different
9 ballgame, new beginning. We're talking about today and
10 tomorrow morning. You coming out, preparing yourself
11 tonight and coming out tomorrow. That's what we want
12 to discuss right now.

13 LISA: Okay, well.

14 MS. BARRY: Because, you know, that's,
15 that's, that's what's up. That's the agenda right now.

16 LISA: Um-hum. Are you one of the woman
17 negotiators or something?

18 MS. BARRY: Yes.

19 LISA: Okay.

20 MS. BARRY: If Steve would come out tomorrow
21 would you?

22 MS. FERRIS TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Where's
23 Steve at, you guys?

24 UNIDENTIFIED PERSONS: (Indiscernible)

25 MS. BARRY: He's looking for people that want
to come out tomorrow.

1 LISA: Yeah, I know. He already talked to
2 me.

3 MS. BARRY: I beg your pardon?

4 LISA: He already talked to me. Like I said,
5 he -- I was here when, when he was talking to Dick and
6 --

7 MS. BARRY: Well, you know, I wanted to talk
8 to as many of the women there as I could, because I
9 thought we would --

10 LISA: Okay. Well, do you want to talk to
11 somebody else?

12 MS. BARRY: Well, I'm not finished talking
13 with you yet, because I want to, you know, get down and
14 make one final point with you. The point is that
15 everybody's going to be coming out of there in the very
16 near future. Okay? Lisa? Hello? Hello?

17 LISA: Hello.

18 MS. BARRY: Is this Lisa?

19 LISA: Yeah.

20 MS. BARRY: Okay. Did you leave the phone
21 for a few minutes?

22 LISA: No, uh-uh.

23 MS. BARRY: Okay. Did you hear what I said?

24 LISA: Um-hum.

25 MS. BARRY: Okay. Do you have any reaction
to that?

1 LISA: Well, I mean --

2 MS. BARRY: Or what is your reaction to that?

3 LISA: I basically told you guys my reaction.

4 MS. BARRY: You -- but you didn't tell -- I'm
5 not one of the guys, I'm --

6 LISA: Well, you know, everybody's listening,
7 so --

8 MS. BARRY: I'm sorry?

9 LISA: Everybody's -- it's recorded, so
10 everybody's listening.

11 MS. BARRY: But I'm asking you now, not what
12 somebody else said or -- last year, last week, but now.
13 What's your reaction to that?

14 LISA: Well, I mean, I can't understand why

14 LISA: What do you want to do? Kill me? You
15 want to shoot me? I mean --

16 MS. BARRY: Lisa, this is the FBI.

17 LISA: -- maybe you don't even want me to
18 come out.

19 MS. BARRY: This is a complete different
20 ballgame we're playing today, okay? I had, I had
21 nothing to do with what happened in the past or
22 yesterday. This is the FBI, okay?

23 LISA: See, you guys fail to realize --

24 MS. BARRY: Not -- it's not you guys. This
25 is the FBI.

LISA: Yeah, and that's what --

1 MS. BARRY: Do you understand the difference?

2 LISA: Yeah.

3 MS. BARRY: Okay, there is a difference.

4 LISA: Yeah, but it's all basically

5 one --

6 MS. BARRY: No, it's not.

7 LISA: -- one --

8 MS. BARRY: It's not basically one anything.

9 LISA: Okay. Well, what about one world
10 government? Inter-police, and all these things.

11 MS. BARRY: You know, that's not really
12 important. Let's get back --

13 LISA: Isn't that all one thing? You guys
14 are all in one organization.

15 MS. BARRY: Well, that's not really
16 important. Let's get back to what needs to happen
17 tomorrow. Okay? And I'm asking you woman to woman
18 what assurances do you need from me and what, what are
19 some of the reasons that you're --

20 LISA: I don't need any assurance from you.
21 I got assurance from God. He's the only one that
22 matters in this situation.

23 MS. BARRY: No, I'm here trying to help you.

24 LISA: I mean, God, I've got all the help I
25 need from God.

MS. BARRY: I'm here trying to help you,

1 Lisa. I'm trying to make you understand the situation
2 as it exists. You need to make an adult decision.
3 These are the kind of decisions that adults make. You
4 need to make that decision within the next few hours
5 and prepare yourself to come out tomorrow.

6 LISA: Well --

7 MS. BARRY: You know, this is something that
8 you need to do for yourself. Somebody -- you know, you
9 don't need to listen to anybody telling you anything.

10 LISA: I'm not listening to anybody. I
11 already made my decision.

12 MS. BARRY: What about the people, what about
13 the people out here? Your family, your relatives that
14 love you? They're worried. What about them?

15 LISA: The only family that cares about me is
16 God. That's it.

17 MS. BARRY: Well, he's out here, too.

18 LISA: No, he's right here with me.

19 MS. BARRY: He's not -- but I'm telling you
20 that within the next, you know, very short period of
21 time, you know, everybody's going to have to come out
22 of there, and I'd like for you to make that decision,
23 as an adult, for yourself, tomorrow. So that you can
24 put this behind you and get on with your life. There's
25 no life there now. When's the last time you were out
in the sunshine?

1 LISA: You don't know my God or what God's
2 doing. You don't even know what the scriptures teach,
3 basically.

4 MS. BARRY: Lisa, I'm really not going to
5 discuss anything about the scriptures or the Bible
6 because that's not what we're trying to work on right
7 now. What we're trying to do is to have you make an
8 adult decision for yourself, for your life, your
9 future, for you to prepare yourself to come out
10 tomorrow. That's all. It's real simple.

11 LISA: Um-hum, I believe that.

12 MS. BARRY: Okay. Do you think it's real
13 simple? It's as simple as that. Nobody --

14 LISA: It's simple if that's what you want to
15 do, yeah.

16 MS. BARRY: If that's what I want to do?

17 LISA: Yeah. If the person's thinking about
18 that --

19 MS. BARRY: That's what I want you to do. I
20 want you to make an adult decision to come out.

21 LISA: Okay. Well, let me think about it,
22 okay?

23 MS. BARRY: Would you call me back?

24 LISA: Well, no, 'cause I'm going to -- no.
25 I'll just talk to Steve about it. Steve's -- if I mean
-- if Steve decides, that, that, you know --

1 MS. BARRY: Okay, you'll talk to Steve?

2 LISA: Yeah.

3 MS. BARRY: Okay. Then I'll have a chance to
4 talk to him. I hope you make the right decision for
5 your future, I really do, Lisa, because I really care
6 about you.

7 LISA: Okay.

8 MS. BARRY: Okay?

9 LISA: Yeah. I'll talk to you later.

10 MS. BARRY: All right. All right.

11 LISA: Bye.

12 MS. BARRY: Bye. Hold on a second.

13 * * * * *

14 (Telephone ringing.)

15 GREG: Hello?

16 TONY: Who's this? Hello?

17 GREG: Who's this?

18 TONY: Yeah, this is Tony.

19 GREG: Hey, Tony, how you doing? This is
20 Greg.

21 TONY: Hi, Greg. How you doing?

22 GREG: I'm trying.

23 TONY: Good. Hey, can you get David?

24 GREG: No, not at the minute.

25 TONY: Why not?

GREG: He's not available.

1 TONY: What's he doing?

2 GREG: I don't know. I don't keep track of
3 him.

4 TONY: Oh. Can't go get him, huh?

5 GREG: No. You want to talk to Judy?

6 TONY: Well, I'd like to talk to David.

7 GREG: Well, he's not available.

8 TONY: Okay, I'll talk to Judy.

9 GREG: Okay, hold on.

10 [gap]

11 GREG: You there?

12 TONY: Yeah, I'm still here.

13 GREG: Hold on.

14 [gap]

15 TONY: Hello?

16 JUDY: Hello.

17 TONY: Hello, Judy?

18 JUDY: Hi.

19 TONY: Hi. How you doing tonight?

20 JUDY: Fine. I hope you don't mind going on
21 a helicopter ride. It's the only station we can get in
22 right now.

23 TONY: Oh, is that right?

24 JUDY: Yeah.

25 TONY: That's the only one, huh?

JUDY: Yeah.

1 TONY: Did Steven talk to you tonight?

2 JUDY: Well, I talked to him, yeah.

3 TONY: Yeah. What do you think?

4 JUDY: Well, I didn't talk about -- I didn't
5 talk to him about anything in specific.

6 TONY: Oh. Well, Steven said he was going to
7 talk to you about tomorrow.

8 JUDY: Oh.

9 TONY: At least that's what he told me he was
10 going to go do.

11 JUDY: Yeah. Well, he knows I'm not going
12 nowhere.

13 TONY: You're not, huh?

14 JUDY: No. I believe David opens the Seven
15 Seals and I'm waiting on him right now. Waiting on
16 him, waiting on his God.

17 TONY: What did Steve say to you?

18 JUDY: My God. Huh?

19 TONY: What did you and Steve talk about?

20 JUDY: Well, like I said, I haven't, I
21 haven't talked about him anything in specific. I just
22 woke up.

23 TONY: Oh, you did? Well, but you did talk
24 to him?

25 JUDY: I haven't talked to him since I woke
up. I just woke up right now.

1 TONY: You haven't talked to him tonight?

2 JUDY: I think someone came to my room about
3 10 or a little later, and I just woke up right now.
4 They said somebody wanted to talk to me, but I was
5 sleeping.

6 TONY: You were sleeping, huh?

7 JUDY: Uh-huh.

8 TONY: Yeah. Well, David was supposed to
9 come and talk to you tonight. At least that's what he
10 told me he was. I assumed he was going to keep his
11 word.

12 JUDY: Well, I told him I was sleeping.

13 TONY: You told him you were sleeping?

14 JUDY: Yeah.

15 TONY: How could you tell him you were
16 sleeping if you were sleeping?

17 JUDY: I woke up and I said well, I'm
18 sleeping.

19 TONY: Oh.

20 JUDY: I'd talk to him later.

21 TONY: And what did he say?

22 JUDY: All right.

23 TONY: Where is he at?

24 JUDY: I don't know. I just woke up.

25 TONY: Oh, you just woke up, huh?

JUDY: Yeah.

1 TONY: Well, I wanted him to talk to you. Is
2 he there?

3 JUDY: It doesn't matter. I'm not going
4 anywhere.

5 TONY: I know, but I wanted to talk to him.
6 How's your hand?

7 JUDY: It's all right.

8 TONY: Is it? Is it hurting or is it getting
9 better?

10 JUDY: Actually, it hurts more now because,
11 you know, like when it heals the skin tightens.

12 TONY: Yeah, that usually happens, too.

13 JUDY: But it's all right.

14 TONY: Is it infected at all?

15 JUDY: No.

16 TONY: No? Okay. Well, that's good. We
17 don't want it to get worse.

18 JUDY: No, it's not getting worse.

19 TONY: Okay. Listen, is Steve there?

20 JUDY: No. He went to town for -- to get
21 some ice cream.

22 TONY: I mean, is he right standing there by
23 you? I know that, I know he's there at the complex.
24 I'm asking is he there available?

25 JUDY: He's not right here, no.

TONY: He's not there, huh?

1 JUDY: Uh-uh.

2 TONY: Can you get David?

3 JUDY: I don't know what they're doing right
4 now. I can go check.

5 TONY: Could you check for me? I would
6 appreciate it.

7 JUDY: You want to talk to him about what?

8 TONY: I just want to talk to him.

9 JUDY: Okay. Hold on, let me see if I can
10 find him.

11 TONY: Okay. Thank you.

12 JUDY: Um-hum.

13 [gap]

14 JUDY: David's outside and I talked to
15 Steven. He said David's got a splitting headache, that
16 I shouldn't wake him up.

17 TONY: Well, we need to talk to him.

18 JUDY: Yeah. I think Steve said you were
19 supposed to talk to him in the morning.

20 TONY: Well, no, I told -- first of all, I
21 told Steven I wanted to talk to him tonight and I told
22 him I would be calling back for him.

23 JUDY: You wanted to talk to Steve tonight?

24 TONY: Yes, I David -- I told him I wanted to
25 talk to David tonight, but I also wanted to talk to
Steve tonight, too.

1 JUDY: Well, how come he thinks you want --
2 you were going to talk to him in the morning?

3 TONY: Well, I, I have no idea why he thinks
4 that. That's not what I told him. Would you go back
5 and tell him I'd like to talk to him?

6 JUDY: Yeah, I'll tell him.

7 TONY: Okay.

8 [gap]

9 JUDY: When did you come on?

10 TONY: When did I come on?

11 JUDY: Tonight, yeah.

12 TONY: Oh, I've been here since about five.

13 JUDY: Five?

14 TONY: Yeah.

15 JUDY: And you're staying there till when?

16 TONY: Probably till six, seven in the
17 morning, so --

18 JUDY: Oh, really?

19 TONY: Why?

20 JUDY: Well, because, I mean, you guys always
21 have fresh guys come on, but there, there's only two of
22 them, you know.

23 TONY: Oh, I know that.

24 JUDY: And so Steve has a splitting headache,
25 too. I didn't know that. And he wants to talk to
people in the morning. And if he's up all night, he's

1 not going to --

2 TONY: Yeah, but I have a question I need to
3 ask Steven.

4 JUDY: Well, tell me what it is. I'll ask
5 him.

6 TONY: Well, I need to ask him, because I
7 talked to him earlier this evening and when I talked to
8 him I told him certain things I wanted him to do, and
9 he said he was going to do that. And I said we'll be
10 getting back to you tonight and he said okay.

11 JUDY: Yeah. The thing is, like I said, he
12 has a splitting headache. He's planning on talking to
13 people tomorrow and --

14 TONY: Does, does he have any answers for us?
15 Will you ask him that?

16 JUDY: If he has, if he has any answers?

17 TONY: Yeah. Would you just go ask him does
18 he have any answers for us right now?

19 JUDY: Yeah. Okay. And then I --

20 TONY: And it appears that, you know, that
21 David has been avoiding any contact with us.

22 JUDY: I thought you told me you just talked
23 to him?

24 TONY: I didn't talk to David, I talked to
25 Steven.

JUDY: Oh, you --

1 TONY: No, I have not talked to David. I've
2 been trying to talk to David and nothing --

3 JUDY: Our phone, our phone conversation is
4 taped and if you'll listen to it, you'll see that you
5 told me you talked to David.

6 TONY: Perhaps. Maybe I did. If I did, I
7 didn't mean that. What I'm saying is --

8 JUDY: Okay. I thought you meant --

9 TONY: No. I've been trying to get hold of
10 David and I can't. But what I did do, I did talk to
11 Steven and -- earlier this evening and I told Steven
12 that I'd be getting back to him. Maybe I did say
13 David. If I did, I was mistaken.

14 JUDY: Yeah.

15 TONY: I have been trying to get David and he
16 obviously is avoiding contact with me. But what I --

17 JUDY: I don't know about that.

18 TONY: Well, that's what it appears to me
19 anyway. But what I do -- I need to talk to David,
20 obviously, but I did talk to Steve tonight and I told
21 him that I would be getting back with him tonight. And
22 would you go ask Steven to tell me --

23 JUDY: Yeah.

24 TONY: -- tell me if he has any answers for
25 me tonight. I need the answers tonight.

 JUDY: Okay. All right, hold on.

1 [gap]
2 JUDY: Yeah, I can't --
3 TONY: What did you do, go to sleep?
4 JUDY: No. I was trying to get Steve up.
5 He's snoring and --
6 TONY: He's snoring, huh?
7 JUDY: Yeah. I can't get him --
8 TONY: Can't get him up, huh?
9 JUDY: No.
10 TONY: Okay. Well, I'm going to be calling
11 him first thing in the morning.
12 JUDY: Yeah. That'd be better.
13 TONY: And let me ask you a question, two
14 questions I need answered.
15 JUDY: Um-hum.
16 TONY: Is David basically just trying to
17 avoid me? Is he in hiding or does he have a no -- do
18 not disturb sign on his door?
19 JUDY: That's funny. I don't think he's
20 trying to avoid you. I can't speak for him. He
21 doesn't have a do not disturb sign on his door, no.
22 TONY: But no one will get him up, though,
23 huh?
24 JUDY: Huh?
25 TONY: But no one will get him up?
JUDY: Well, the first time when I went and

1 talked to Steve he told me he had a -- that David had a
2 headache and, and that he had tried to get him up
3 already and he told him he didn't feel good. So --

4 TONY: Well, I know. Well, I understand that
5 he might not feel good, but I need to talk to him.

6 JUDY: Yeah. Maybe tomorrow.

7 TONY: Well, you're, you're not going to go
8 ask for him or go ask him?

9 JUDY: I already did.

10 TONY: Oh, you did?

11 JUDY: His light's off and I'm not --

12 TONY: So, basically, we're not going to get
13 him tonight is what you're saying?

14 JUDY: I wouldn't -- I can't say that. I
15 don't know. You know, you can try.

16 TONY: Well, that's what I've been trying to
17 do.

18 JUDY: Uh-huh. I don't know, you know, I'm
19 not a prophet.

20 TONY: Well, I understand that. But, like I
21 say, I needed to talk to David and I needed to talk to
22 Steve.

23 JUDY: Yeah. I'll just give him the message
24 when I see him.

25 TONY: I need one, one question answered from
you.

1 JUDY: Um-hum.

2 TONY: I want you to think this over real
3 carefully.

4 JUDY: Yeah.

5 TONY: Okay? Before you answer me.

6 JUDY: Okay.

7 TONY: Are you telling me that you're not
8 going to come out in the morning? Now, just think on
9 that real carefully.

10 JUDY: That was pretty obvious, wasn't it?

11 TONY: Yeah. But I want you to think of that
12 very carefully before you give me a direct answer now.

13 JUDY: Yeah, I already gave you a direct
14 answer.

15 TONY: Which is?

16 JUDY: Okay, if God says I'm coming out, I'm
17 coming out. If he doesn't, I'm not.

18 TONY: Are you going to come out in the
19 morning?

20 JUDY: Pardon me?

21 TONY: Are you going to come out in the
22 morning?

23 JUDY: You don't understand that, huh?

24 TONY: No, I understand it.

25 JUDY: Okay. So I can't say if I am or I'm
not because if God says I am, I am. And so I'm not

1 going to say --

2 TONY: Well, see, that's, that's not a direct
3 answer.

4 JUDY: Okay. Well --

5 TONY: That's what I was trying to get from
6 you is -- that's why I said to answer -- to think about
7 it very carefully before you answer it.

8 JUDY: To me, that's a direct answer --

9 TONY: Well --

10 JUDY: -- because I believe in God.

11 TONY: But that's not a direct answer to the
12 question. That's maybe, maybe not.

13 JUDY: Yeah.

14 TONY: Does God speak to you?

15 JUDY: No, not directly.

16 TONY: So how will you know then?

17 JUDY: How will I know? Because if God talks
18 to David, then maybe we'll all go out.

19 TONY: Well, do you think David is God?

20 JUDY: I said if God talks to him.

21 TONY: Well --

22 JUDY: I know he opens the Seven Seals, so
23 that says an awful lot right there, more than you could
24 dream.

25 TONY: Okay. Well, so what you're saying is
you don't have an answer, is what you're telling me.

1 JUDY: I've been here for seven years and
2 I've learned a lot.

3 TONY: So what you're saying is you don't
4 have an answer for me.

5 JUDY: Pardon me?

6 TONY: So what you're saying is you do not
7 have an answer for me.

8 JUDY: I gave you an answer.

9 TONY: Well, that's not an answer to the
10 question, it's an evasion of the question.

11 JUDY: Yeah.

12 TONY: Is Steve asleep or, or awake with a
13 headache?

14 JUDY: Well, he was awake the first time I
15 went and talked to him, then I went back and he was
16 snoring.

17 TONY: So he didn't just -- he just didn't
18 want to come to the phone then?

19 JUDY: In his sleep? I didn't --

20 TONY: No. He was awake, you said, when you
21 first went to him.

22 JUDY: The first time, and -- well, he told
23 me he had a headache and that -- he said he already
24 told you that he was going to talk to you in the
25 morning.

TONY: No. Steve told me he was going to

1 | talk to me this evening, because when I first earlier

2 | --

3 | JUDY: -- to him.

4 | TONY: -- when I talked to him earlier, I
5 | told him I needed some questions answered and he said
6 | he would get the answers, and I said I will call you
7 | back tonight. I said I will get the answers, I'll let
8 | you get a couple hours of rest and then I'll call you
9 | back, and I lived up to my word on that. I gave him a
10 | couple hours of rest.

11 | JUDY: Well, he told me that the last time he
12 | talked to you he, he wasn't even thinking straight.

13 | TONY: Oh, he wasn't thinking straight. He
14 | told you that?

15 | JUDY: Not really. He didn't say those
16 | words, he just said he was so tired he was just like
17 | sitting there, you know.

18 | TONY: What time is he getting up?

19 | JUDY: I guess when you call.

20 | TONY: So if I call at -- let's see, what is
21 | it, one now? If I call at three, he'll be up?

22 | JUDY: Three o'clock?

23 | TONY: Well you said when I call.

24 | JUDY: (Laughs) Well call in 10 minutes, you
25 | know. I mean, you said you were going to call him in
the morning. Three -- I mean it's morning right now,

1 but, I mean, I'm talking about the dawning of the
2 morning, you know?

3 TONY: Okay, you won't wake David up, right?

4 JUDY: Not right now, because Steve already
5 told me earlier that he had a headache. So, I mean,
6 the guy is, you know, has bullet wounds, so I'm not
7 going to go wake him up.

8 TONY: Well --

9 JUDY: I mean, you haven't really told me
10 what you want to talk to him about.

11 TONY: No. I know -- I think we all know
12 what we want to talk about. We want to talk about
13 resolving this, and that's what I want to talk to him
14 about.

15 JUDY: You already know -- I'll let you talk
16 to Steve now.

17 TONY: Pardon me?

18 JUDY: I mean, you, you've already been told
19 a lot.

20 TONY: I know. And it's not done anything.
21 Nothing has happened.

22 JUDY: Oh, yeah, lots has happened.

23 TONY: Well, not to my satisfaction.

24 JUDY: Oh, I wanted to know, too, about
25 Livingston Fagin.

TONY: What about him?

1 JUDY: I wanted to know anything about him.
2 Where is he? How is he?

3 TONY: He's, he's --

4 JUDY: He hasn't called us.

5 TONY: Well, and that's -- I told David that
6 and I -- excuse me, I told Steven. I told Steven that
7 we told Livingston to call in and he said he's not
8 going to be a pawn for the government. And that's what
9 he said and he refused to do it, and we're not going to
10 -- right now he -- once --

11 JUDY: He refused to call in?

12 TONY: He refused to call in. He refused to
13 call in. And as soon as he was, was brought in here,
14 he was given an attorney and he was asked to call in
15 prior to be given an attorney. He said he will not do
16 that, he's not a pawn for a government. He was given
17 an attorney. Once he's given an attorney, we cannot
18 approach him without his attorney's consent.

19 JUDY: Oh.

20 TONY: That's by law and we're going to
21 respect -- you know, that's under the Constitution.
22 We're not going to abide by that.

23 JUDY: Well, what happened to him? I, I
24 heard that he got roughed up.

25 TONY: He did not get roughed up, I assure
you. He did not get roughed up.

1 JUDY: What happened to him then?

2 TONY: Nothing. He was taken into custody.
3 That was it. When he came out, he was searched, like
4 everybody would be searched.

5 JUDY: But he didn't get mud on him or
6 anything?

7 TONY: Well, he might've got some mud on him,
8 on his pants, because it's muddy out there, and on the
9 shoes. I mean, you can't do that. We weren't going to
10 carry him out.

11 JUDY: Oh, I respect that, yeah.

12 TONY: No, he, he got some mud on his shoes
13 and on his pants, but that's the extent of it. I mean,
14 you can't help that. Our guys had mud on -- all over
15 their shoes and --

16 JUDY: Oh, yeah.

17 TONY: So, I mean, you know, that's not
18 roughing anybody up, just to get mud on it.

19 JUDY: No.

20 TONY: And, but that was his choice. And we
21 wanted, we wanted him to call in there because
22 obviously we want to do one thing, and that's to get
23 this resolved. And if it felt that we could have him
24 call in there it would do that, fine. He did not want
25 to do it. We can't -- We're not going to force anybody
to do it. We're not going to, you know, if somebody

1 | says I'm not going to do it, then, you know, that's
2 | their option. And now he has an attorney and we're
3 | going to abide by that. We're going to respect that
4 | because he has an attorney. We're going to abide by
5 | that, as we would anybody's.

6 | JUDY: Oh, I also wanted to know about the
7 | Wendell kids. Where are they now?

8 | TONY: Pardon me?

9 | JUDY: The Wendell kids.

10 | TONY: The Wendell kids?

11 | JUDY: Um-hum.

12 | TONY: I couldn't answer that right now.

13 | They're -- you know, I, I have no idea. I'd have to go
14 | through each and every one of these. I just, you know
15 | --

16 | JUDY: It was horrible when they were at the
17 | house.

18 | TONY: Well, you know, why do you ask that?

19 | JUDY: I'm just curious. They're my friends.

20 | TONY: Oh. Well, they're fine, I'll assure
21 | you of that. I mean, everybody's going to be fine out
22 | here, and I think you know that, Judy.

23 | JUDY: Are they still there or -- what,
24 | what's that?

25 | TONY: Pardon? No, they're not here. Why
don't you come out and we'll let you visit with them?

1 JUDY: Why is the phone doing that right now?

2 TONY: It's the phone? The phone's not doing
3 that. Pardon?

4 JUDY: That's your entertainment system --

5 TONY: I guess, yeah. But, Judy, you know --

6 JUDY: Who's in charge of that, you?

7 TONY: Pardon me?

8 JUDY: Who's in charge of that?

9 TONY: I have no idea. Not me.

10 JUDY: Okay. Yeah, I wanted to know where
11 they were, if they were still at the house or --

12 TONY: They're, they're fine. I have no idea
13 where they're at right at this moment, I really don't.

14 JUDY: But you know they're fine. Oh, that's
15 a joke.

16 TONY: You know they're going to be fine.
17 You know that as well as I do, Judy.

18 JUDY: Well, how do I, how do I know that?

19 TONY: No one's going to, no one's going to
20 be mistreated out here.

21 JUDY: They may have been released and been
22 in a car wreck. I mean, you know, they could be there.
23 I don't know where they are.

24 TONY: Well, if, if they were in a car wreck
25 and somebody was injured and we would be notified of
that. But on a routine -- if everything's fine, we're

1 not going to be --

2 JUDY: Hold on just a minute. I've got to
3 get something.

4 [gap]

5 JUDY: Talk in the morning then, all right?

6 TONY: Who, who said that?

7 JUDY: This is Judy.

8 TONY: Oh, I know that, but, I mean, did
9 somebody tell you to say that?

10 JUDY: No, I mean, I'm just telling you that
11 from before. I had to go get something myself right
12 now.

13 TONY: You have to go. So you're not going
14 to come out, though?

15 JUDY: Hey, I said, you know, I mean --

16 TONY: I know what you said.

17 JUDY: David's waiting on God and who knows?
18 God may say let's go tomorrow, you know. I don't know.
19 If he does, I'm out of here.

20 TONY: Well, then why don't you pray during
21 the night to get an answer?

22 JUDY: I pray every day.

23 TONY: Okay, why don't you pray for an answer
24 tonight? We need an answer in the morning.

25 JUDY: All right, you've got it. I'll pray
right now.

1 TONY: Okay.

2 JUDY: Okay.

3 TONY: All right.

4 JUDY: All right. Goodnight.
