JOHN: Yeah, but that, that's the same issue, I guess, and he, you know, I don't know how concerned he is about the people in there, Steve, you know?

steve: Well, he, well, see, what you don't understand, John, I mean, I know we're totally at two ends, you know, we're at odds because the only reason these people came here, and I know that's hard for you people to understand, is for eternal life, for things dealing with the Bible, and, and that's why they've been so adamant about staying. It's not because, you know, they don't want to cooperate with you, they're fellow man, and get along to do what they can for you, just like myself, it's just that we've got to put God first. We've got to fear God. If there's a plan, if there's a will that he's made manifest, we want to, we want to do it.

JOHN: Steve, Steve, let me just mention

| this.

STEVE: All right.

JOHN: You are responsible for yourself and you're responsible for Judy and your daughter, and I know you feel a responsibility for those other people in there. Do you not?

STEVE: Yes, but first, you know, it's the eternal things. It's the things that are not of this world. That's, it has been number one in my life, for since about '72, 1972, and, you know, I never diversed from that path, if anything, I've tried to progress and keep on listening to anybody anywhere. I mean, if you had something you wanted to share with me, you, I'm telling you, I would listen. I'm talking about those things that will be. I've always wanted to know the Bible thoroughly inside and out and that's what caught my attention in the first place with David Koresh.

JOHN: Steve, let me just, just --

STEVE: I mean, would it make sense to you?

That's why, I made a statement once that I'd never
leave Hawaii. I said I love the place, that's where we
were gonna live. I had found twenty acres of land on
the island Kauai, Judy and I did, and we were gonna
build a place and we were gonna live there, but my
whole world, my life got turned upside down when
information came along that I couldn't controvert.

That's basically what happened. Judy looked at it herself and there were, we went back and forth over a period of six months. What are we gonna do, is it there or isn't it there? And finally we made a decision. I mean, there's no reason, right, John, that anybody had ever moved from Hawaii to Waco, Texas, is there?

JOHN: Steve?

STEVE: Yeah.

JOHN: You know, here's the thing. You're responsible for those people in there and we've said from the start, you know, weeks ago, that we respect your religion, okay? And nothing is gonna change that. You know, you can walk out of there and we will still respect your religion and you can still study the Bible and believe in what you believe, but, you know, the commanders here have given us pressure to get some more people out of there and that's the issue.

STEVE: Well, see, there are greater issues, though. That's what you guys don't see. In fact, not everybody here was totally aware of even what was going on, like myself, I heard something but was never sure until I heard all the bullets riddling the door. That's when I became quickly aware. But not everybody here knew anything what was happening, all, David had said something. When he came to the door and he backed off, quickly closed the door and backed off, that's when all, the whole thing broke loose and it was a madhouse here for a while, I mean I was on that, John, if you listen to those tapes, I was on that phone, Wayne and I, as quick as poss-- as soon as we heard the sound. I mean, we were crying out for help and asking, we were the one's calling for the FBI and whoever else we could get a hold of and trying to find out what was going on. I mean, I was not even sure who it was out there. I just had an idea. Never knew for sure who was across the street. I knew that he was some kind, into something to do with the law, but, you know, and in fact, I even asked him a couple of questions, Robert Gonzales, I asked him what his life work was, what he had done for a job and he always avoided that so of course that'd tell you something. JOHN: Steve, you know, the thing of it is, we're not attempting to change your religious beliefs. We just want to end this standoff and that's what we're trying to do and that's why we've been here all this

Can you tell me that? 16 STEVE: Jesus and God? 17 JOHN: Yeah. When did either one of them --18 STEVE: That's the strangest question I've 19 ever heard in my life. Jesus, himself, never married, 20 wasn't into any, hardly anything of mankind. He wasn't into food --21 22 That's right. JOHN: 23 -- wasn't into marriage, wasn't into STEVE: 24 anything. 25 JOHN: Okay. STEVE: What was he into? He was into

disseminating information --1 | JOHN: Now what is David into? 2 STEVE: -- truth. 3 What is the lamb into, David? JOHN: 4 STEVE: David is into opening up the seven 5 seals and showing a way out for you and me and 6 everybody in this world that'll listen and then judge what they're hearing. But you can't judge something without hearing it through can you? If you go by all these rumors and all his enemies like Marc Breault and 10 11 the Gents and the Jewell's, and all these people, this is where all this began from long before you even knew 12 about him or ever heard about me, John. Guys like Marc 13 Breault, he was a student with David before I ever met 14 That's the guy that introduced me to him. And 15 David. why did he walk away? Well, you'll have to ask him that. But for six months after he walked away and went 17 18 to Australia to marry this girl, then he's still 19 calling me back and he's write, well, mainly writing to me saying how he still believed and all this and 20 that... 21 JOHN: Steve, the key word here is noon, and 22 the key word is to come out and to get this resolved. 23 You come out. 24 The key word though is God's word, 25 STEVE:

his will, the seven seals. For me and for everybody,

John, come on, that's what it's always been. 1 2 before the ATF came to murder us, that's what we were 3 doing. Seriously. Long before they came to do their dirty work and what they were going to do as they're still going to do to other Americans, whatever happens to me in the future when I come out and whatever takes place, if you guys fry me or whatever, I don't even, I 7 want, all I want to do is be right with God. That's 8 all I want to do. I want to make sure I'm walking in 9 10 his light and doing his will. I want to live forever. 11 This world is not my home. I must like, in Hebrew's 12 11, I'm a sojourner here. I don't have any stakes in 13 this world. People, people can build their kingdoms 14 and their palaces on this earth. It isn't for me, 15 It's not for me. These people here are the same 16 way. And when I'm talking to them, I'm trying to give them everything you're saying, make sure that they can 17 18 look at, if they want safety in this world or whatever 19 else, you know, here's the thing you need to do. I've 20 been telling them that. I've been trying to do everything, anything you've asked me to do, I try to 21 22 lay out in the most palatable way possible. 23 JOHN: Steve, you're an intelligent guy, do 24 the right thing, bring those people out of there. STEVE: Well, I'm telling you from my --

1 STEVE: For my conscious sake, I've got to do 2 3 JOHN: The time for talk is over. to have some people out of there by ncon. Then come out. Bring 11 them out. Your statement is just like an Isaiah 12 STEVE: 13 36 --14 Bring the children out. Let them go. JOHN: 15 STEVE: King Sennacherib, way back and scoffed and laughed at those that were in Jerusalem and 16 kept; on making similar statements not knowing what 17 18 you're talking about. 19 JOHN: You're insulating yourself with little kids. You know? 20 21 STEVE: You're gonna see what you're saying is going to go against you, John. The very words are 22 23 gonna judge you that you're speaking. You look at 24 Psalm's 8. What's gonna still the enemy and the avenger is, out of the mouth of babes and sucklings, as 25 God ordained strength, if you read the second book of

Ezra, you're gonna find out that children, three months 1 old, are going to be speaking. They're gonna have 2 something to say. 3 JOHN: Vernon Howell is a coward and a con-4 5 man. And you don't know it yet. STEVE: Oh, you will learn differently. I've 6 been around the world with him when his life has been, 7 8 he's not, he doesn't fear you or anybody. JOHN: Let me tell a story, Steve. 9 STEVE: He'll go up against anybody in this 10 You can do with him what you want. I've seen 11 world. him threatened, I've seen a mob form already. I've 12 been in that kind of situation, John. The only kind of 13 14 big threats in my entire life have been by so called 15 religious people when I, all I want to do is take the 16 book they say they believe in and open it up and show 17 it to them. That's the only kind of --The last time I was in Europe, in England, I 18 19 actually got literal threats to my life, John. So this is not anything new to him or me. 20 21 Steve, Steve --JOHN: 22 STEVE: I love people. I like you, John. I 23 wish you had had the time and sense yourself, I don't 24 know what your religion is or what it's based on, but I'd like to tell you what I believe in. I think it's more than logical and I think if you actually gave an

open ear, you might see something there. But you never 1 could without hearing. 2 Steve, let me tell you a story if I JOHN: 3 4 can, --STEVE: Okay. 5 JOHN: -- and it's not a story, it's true, 6 7 okay? STEVE: Go ahead. 8 JOHN: Back in 1985, two people, Keith Hagler 9 (phonetic) and Kate Hagler, have you ever heard their 10 names before? 11 STEVE: No, I haven't. 12 JOHN: Okay. Personally, to me, I think you guys 1 RACHEL: 2 have done something, you know? HENRY: I think --3 RACHEL: Because --5 **HENRY:** I think what has happened -- oh, no, 6 I mean, if I tell you that I'm gonna try to get you 7 the, the tape of CNN, what has happened? RACHEL: Yeah, but still, you know, that 8 9 would be good to get that, but we still don't have any 10 communication as far as talking back and forth with 11 him, you know, asking him questions, how things went, 12 you know. 13 **HENRY:** Um-hum. 14 RACHEL: Communication back and forth. just like, it can be on a telephone. 15 16 HENRY: Well, that's true. We could, you 17 know, what we could do is we could send some, some 18 other people out and I'm sure that because the lines 19 are working fine right now, we don't have any problem. 20 If we would have some people that would come out, you know, we could ensure that you could get a, you know, 21 22 get a call back. 23 I mean, everything that I've ever told you I've 24 done. As a matter of fact, I've even gone further than some of the requests that you've made. For example, 25 when David requested that we get him time on, on WKR,

KRLD, not only did I get him that, but we also got him 1 2 But Jim was, to my understanding, 3 RACHEL: correct me if I'm wrong, Jim was the one that offered 4 it to begin with. 5 6 HENRY: What now? 7 RACHEL: Jim was the one that offered it to begin with. 8 9 HENRY: Offered what? RACHEL: What him and David had going, you 10 11 know, with the, with the tape and so forth. 12 HENRY: Yes, but we, but we got him the time on the Christian, National Christian Network. 13 RACHEL: But it didn't go nationwide. 14 15 **HENRY:** Absolutely.
