STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, he's the kind of a -- he's a very independent, as you already 5 have figured out, a very independent person that -- I 7 mean, he will do what he wants to do and -- I could 8 talk till I'm blue in the face, but he, he feels he's 9 responsible for certain things and he's going to stay to his responsibilities. I know you wouldn't 10 11 understand. It'd take time for me to share and develop 12 something for you, but -- and I know you wouldn't be 13 interested, so we'll leave that go. 14 LINDA BARRY: Are, are you allowed to make 15 any decisions? 16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: For myself. 17 LINDA BARRY: You could make decisions for 18 yourself? 19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh, most cer-- everybody 20 here can do that. Anybody can leave that they want to. 21 They can walk right out that door, morning, noon, and 22 In fact, he has actually removed people from 23 this group many times. If they, if they don't want to go along with the program, why be here? 24 25 LINDA BARRY: Um-hum. STEVE SCHNEIDER: They can go do and --

1 LINDA BARRY: I just --2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- believe how they want. 3 But, you know, he -- if -- this is his home and he's been here the longest and, and people, they've heard 5 what he's had to say. He's not been controverted by any scholar or layperson, so they, they in honesty 6 acknowledge that. 7 8 LINDA BARRY: So, are, are you a type of 9 leader there? I, I am trying to get a --10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No. 11 LINDA BARRY: -- picture of --STEVE SCHNEIDER: What I was before I ever 12 13 came here, I had -- through the -- I -- how -- what I -- I never really was into religion. And I was raised 14 15 with religion like a lot of young people are, and I saw hypocrisy in it. And I got into hanging around with 16 17 movie stars in Hawaii in my early 20s, and I got kind 18 of tired of that scene, and ran into a guy that was going to be a quarterback for the Rams. He gave that 19 20 up for eastern religion. 21 LINDA BARRY: Um-hum. 22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And I started pursuing all 23 of that, comparing it. And little by little, I got into the Bible. And, and even then, I always thought I 24 had a fairly good knowledge and understanding of the 25 book just by comparing notes with other denominations,

but then I wondered, well, what am I to do with all this information. So, I -- a lot of times I thought about maybe teaching or I had invitations to be a minister, an evangelist. But it -- I knew that if I started speaking hard like I believed, then I knew I wouldn't last long in any denomination.

LINDA BARRY: But you must be in some kind of leadership role there.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, no. I really am not. It's like we're all a lot of individuals. There's -- there might be -- they, they respect me as a friend and they know that I have a deep desire to know the very things they do. And I haven't been disappointed like they have, but we're all, you know, we're all equal.

LINDA BARRY: You live there on a daily basis with those -- these people and you, your people, and you don't think they see you as some type of leader?

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Positively don't.

Honestly. They see that I'm a person that has a deep interest in the Bible and maybe have spent more time than they have with it, but that's, honestly, that's what I've been trying to tell Dek and many of these negotiators. That's as far as it goes. I mean, God's no respecter of persons. If someone has divine inspiration where somehow or other they can unlock mysteries that even in the world of science have to

Where exactly is the wound? 2 3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: As you -- from his perspective, it would be on the left side, down about -- I think it's adjacent to, say, about his naval, to 5 the left of that. Probably from his side, from the outside from the side, it would probably be inward 7 maybe, I don't know, two or three inches, I would 8 9 imagine, three inches --10 LINDA BARRY: Uh-huh. 11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- and then it exited out 12 the back. 13 LINDA BARRY: Oh, uh-huh. 14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And I think that it probably -- in, in the beginning, it looked really bad, 15 I mean, real bad. I mean, he lost three pints of 16 blood, no question about it. 17 18 LINDA BARRY: How do you know that? STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, just by 19 what was on the rug and on the floor where he moved, 20 where he was finally laying down. He thought he was 21 going to go the first day. Everybody really did. And 22 as he hung on the next two or three days, I mean, it 23 was expected that it could happen any moment. 24 25 LINDA BARRY: It -- so, what's happening --STEVE SCHNEIDER: Even by, even --

.

1 LINDA BARRY: -- with it now? Is --2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- by the weakness in the 3 voice and everything. And then about the fourth day --I think it was about the third day, they -- we were checking his vital signs and the blood pressure came up 5 6 and seemed to be very normal. I think it was about the 7 third or fourth day. 8 LINDA BARRY: Um-hum. 9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And then, after that, it 10 seems like he's been improving. But every time he is 11 gotten up, you know, anxious to get up and do things, is when he, he seems to have had some degree of a 12 13 relapse. 14 LINDA BARRY: Is there swelling, any pus --15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: It doesn't -- no, no, it 16 doesn't appear -- well, yeah, there's only -- you know, 17 it runs and sometimes it does seem to be like pus, both 18 in the wrist wound and where -- and also his thumb is 19 still numb from where the bullet took quite a chunk of 20 flesh out near his -- the bone of the wrist. 21 LINDA BARRY: Sounds like, you know, I'd be 22 real concerned about that. 23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: In fact, the scab that has actually formed on the wrist is huge -- I mean, thick. 24

I mean, it's like a quarter of an inch or more thick.

And it does constantly drain and seems to have pus

25

also, so, I mean, I don't know if that would be causing him sickness or causing the headaches or -- but he 2 definitely is not, you know, feeling like he normally 3 4 would be. 5 LINDA BARRY: Is there any way you can get a 6 phone near him? 7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, I asked him --8 LINDA BARRY: We have a message that --9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, most of the times --10 LINDA BARRY: -- we need to give him. 11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- he didn't mind, but it seems like the last time he was in the -- kind of an 12 upbeat mood is when he was talking with John Cox. And 13 since then -- I mean, he tried to get on the phone the 14 other night with -- I can't -- I'm, I'm losing track of 15 time, but, two nights ago, I think it was? Or was it 16 three? He was talking with Louis when he had come in 17 that night, Wednesday night, and I believe he spoke 18 with -- maybe it was -- yeah, John Cox. 19 LINDA BARRY: All right. Well, there's a 20 message that we need to get to him. Is he in his 21 22 bedroom or --23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: He is -- yeah, the door is closed. About an hour or so ago when I first got on 24 25 the phone --

LINDA BARRY: Uh-huh.

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I had a couple of people 2 go knock at the door. There wasn't even an answer. 3 So, he's definitely out. And usually when he sleeps --LINDA BARRY: He's out? 5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, meaning sleeping, I'm 6 sure. 7 LINDA BARRY: Oh, out, asleep. STEVE SCHNEIDER: 8 Yeah. 9 LINDA BARRY: Okay. STEVE SCHNEIDER: Especially now that the 10 11 music quit -- or not the music, the different weird sounds out here. 12 13 LINDA BARRY: I'd be real concerned about him. 14 15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, he -- he hasn't had the greatest appreciation for -- he has not been able 16 17 to sleep, by the way, and so that's made him weaker 18 because of all the different crazy sounds --19 LINDA BARRY: No, I mean with that --20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- that they're --21 LINDA BARRY: -- with that wound, it doesn't -- it sounds like you think it's getting better, but it 22 doesn't sound like that's really the case. 23 24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, I don't know, see. 25 Like yourself, not being a doctor, not having -- I mean, of course, having classes in anatomy years ago,
