TAPE 182

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(tape 182) 1 DAVID: -- you're flexing your arm. 2 GEORGE: No. We're trying, we're trying to 3 convince you to --4 DAVID: You're trying to --5 6 GEORGE: -- to come out --DAVID: -- convince me to come out so you can 7 finish your work. I know that. And like I said, I 8 have no problem with that. 9 GEORGE: Our work is, is just to get you out 10 and into the system. 11 DAVID: Um-hum. 12 GEORGE: And, and then you're entitled to the 13 lawyer, and you can tell your story, and you can go on 14 preaching. And, and we'll go back to what we do. 15 DAVID: Are you going to bring back to life 16 those people that lost their lives? Is your system 17 going to pay and buy me a new boat and buy me a new car 18 and new motorcycle and come and --19 GEORGE: I don't know what --20 DAVID: -- replant the grass? 21 GEORGE: -- I don't know what the system is 22 23 going to do. Now let me, let me tell you what your DAVID: 24 system does. Let me, let me tell you from experience. 25 In 1987 there was a man on this property named George

Roden. And he had originally kicked old people off 2 this property back when it was in the hands of the Branch Davidians. And these people were good 3 Christians, and they complied with Mrs. Roden because 4 George was her son. She wanted time to work with him. 5 Because he, he had, he had like -- what was the disease 6 he had, Steve? (Steve's voice in background not 7 discernible.) He was epileptic. 8 9 GEORGE: Um-hum. DAVID: And this epilepsy affected his way of 10 11 thinking sometimes. You know, you'd be standing there 12 talking to him, and he'd all of a sudden twitch and spit in your face. Not that he meant it. 13 GEORGE: Um-hum. 14 DAVID: Just couldn't control it. He would 15 be sitting there and all of a sudden slam his hand down 16 on the table and he'd, the soup would go everywhere. 17 18 And your, your plate would fly off, you know. And he couldn't help it. But he had this wild idea that he 19 was God's man of the hour and, you know, and he was 20 going to do things. 21 22 Well, he started digging up the cemetery. What did I do about it? Me and my brother-in-law, Dave 23

Jones, went down to the Sheriff's Department, the right

GEORGE: Um-hum.

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thing to do.

DAVID: We went and spoke to Sheriff
Dickerson. And we told him what was happening. And he says well, he could not do anything about it until he had proof. I says what do you need? You know, pictures or something? He says well, that would be a start. So I hired a young man that was kind of friends out here with George still because he did work for George and stuff. And he came, and he took pictures in the church of this casket that had been resumed out of the cemetery.

GEORGE: Um-hum.

DAVID: Now George was going to resurrect this person he thought. So we took these pictures down to the Sheriff's Department, and the Sheriff looked at them, and he began to commence to tell us that well, there's no bones, you know, pictures of the bones. It's not against the law to have a casket in the church.

And I -- so that blew me away. And I says, you know, Sheriff Dickerson, that casket's been dug up. You can tell. It's rusty. You know, had the outer case taken off. And he says boys, he says I can't do nothing about it. I got to have more evidence. I just can't go out there and, you know, the restraining order on George had been violated by allowing him to come back here.

So I said look, I'll get some pictures. And he could see that I was kind of disturbed. And as me and Dave was walking out of his office he said now boys, he said be careful. And we looked back at him, and he had this real concerned look on his face. See, he knew something we didn't know. He says there's some dangerous customers out there.

Ah. What does that mean? So we had to get a plan. So we went out and me and some of the friends of mine, you know, Dave Jones the U.S. Postal Service man, Greg Sommers (phonetic sp.) the insurance salesman, Paul Fatta (phonetic sp.) the millionaire. You know, none of us ever had a record in our lives, you know. Very few speeding tickets, you know. I may have had one. You know, never been in trouble.

And we went down, we talked about what does this mean? We said look, we better get a diversion plan going. So we went down to K-Mart, and we bought some shotguns.

And then we went over to Cogdals (phonetic sp.), and we talked to old man Cogdals over there and, and I, I asked him about different kinds of rifles.

And he, he showed us a Ruger 10 -- no, a Ruger mini 14.

And he told us it was a varmint rifle and had a, you know, a high report, you know. Was real loud.

So we went down to Braco (phonetic sp.) Pawn

Shop, and they had this sale on this 2-2-3 ammo, you know. It was supposed to be a .22 caliber, you know.

And me and Dave went off out in the field one day, and we shot that mini 14, and boy was it loud. Was loud.

You know, our ears were ringing. We thought well, this will be good.

And I was raised with firearms, but they were -- all belonged to my dad. You know, I -- my, my gun was an old Marlin .22, and I had a 410 shotgun, single shot. That's what we used to hunt quail with. But after that I didn't really have nothing.

So anyway, we bought these guns, and we made the plan and around after 1 or 2 in the morning we dropped some guys off at one side of the property, and we dropped some guys off at the back side of the property because they went around. And me and Dave and Mark went, and we climbed up to the church. And you know, two guys went outside because we had to watch.

And the, the plan was if anything happened, then the guys out near the junkyard and the guys back down by the, the tank were supposed to fire into the ground and cause a diversion so we could get out of there.

Anyway, went to the church, and there was no casket. It had been moved. So what happened was a dog started barking and George, he was in a trailer house

back behind the church at this time. And the lights came on. And he stood up in the window in his T-shirt and underwear. And he had a big old belly. And he had a spotlight he was shining everywhere. We crawled through the grass, and we crawled out through this ditch near the front of the property where the road is.

GEORGE: Um-hum.

DAVID: We crawled on our hands and bellies all the way down to where that barn is down halfway between the two water tanks and where the entrance of this place is. And we walked through the back of the fields and rendezvous with the other guys back there. And finally it was morning. This took quite a while.

Anyway, the next day we stayed out in that field in the back over there and we -- what we going to do? We got to find this casket. So we waited back there, and we saw people leave the property. And so we started down where the barn is where these boys down here are now, you know, where the motorcycles are.

And, and this property boy, it was a mess.

All the houses had junk in them. I mean the -- George

Newman tore this place up bad. And we went from house
to house. And people, people we could tell certain

people had stayed in them. But like, like, I don't

know, trash stayed in them, you know? They were dirty.

It was nasty. The animals lived in them. It was --

people had like mattresses on the floor, you know. And it was terrible, you know.

And finally we came up to one, and there was a girl inside of it. And she cussed a couple of the guys out, you know. And she went down the road and got George. And George came down. And oh, no, what we going to do? So George came out and he had this Uzi. Semi-automatic, you know. Because we didn't know that at first, and later on we found that out.

And an old friend of his, two of the guys that was with us one -- they were in their fifties. They had been raised with George a long way back. One guy's name was Stan Silman (phonetic sp.), and one guy's name was Floyd Haupman (phonetic sp.).

And George comes up, and he's right in the middle of the road. And these guys are behind these old houses that used to be here. And George says who are you? You know. Stan says to him, you know, put down your gun, George. We don't want no trouble. Where did you put the casket, you know?

And George fired at him. The bullet ricocheted and, and hit him in the, in the pants leg.

And I had given him a knife. And it hit that knife and just twisted it right in two. Didn't hurt him, it just bruised him. But it didn't, you know.

And Stan had a Ruger 1022. And this, this

Uzi was a .45. And Stan goes, you know, put your gun down, George. We got guns too. And all of a sudden Stan fired in the air, you know, pop, pop, pop. Sounded like a air-gun, you know, in comparison to that Uzi .45.

And about that time all of a sudden all these guys, all eight of us -- well, I didn't, I didn't fire yet, you know. But all of the guys, they just, they put their guns to the ground and started -- it sounded like World War III, you know. Boom, boom, boom. George's eyes got bigger than watermelons and he -- this fat boy started back-pedaling like you never seen anybody back-pedal. You know, if he ever could have messed his britches, he, he did it then.

But he ran back towards the cars and back around Mrs. Roden's house. And you know, everyone's -- they aren't even looking. They're just firing in the ground, you know. Just like what the original plan was.

Now you know, if anybody had wanted George dead, he'd have been deader than a doornail. Because he was right out in the middle of the road, right out in clear open. But that was not what we were there to do.

I ran off towards the, the side to go around the other side of the house which was about 75 to 100

yards away to see where George was going. And low and behold, as I'm out in the open, all of a sudden I stopped dead because George re-emerged on the back side of the house, and he had me in clear sight, and he fired a couple, three rounds off.

And I actually, I actually heard these bullets whistling through the air as they went by me.

And something happens to you when that happens. All of a sudden your mind gets real clear.

GEORGE: Um-hum.

DAVID: And everything goes in slow motion.

I mean you're not scared anymore. You just get real clear and it's like, you know, you -- and then I, and I kind of like got a headache like am I dead? Am I hit? You know. You just don't know.

So I, I saw this car that was out in the back side of the field there. And I jumped behind it. And then I see George running back to this tree which was near the garage over here where the boat's at. And you all boys got a lot of gear over there in this tree. I mean behind this that, near that tree in, in this garage over here. And George got behind this tree. And next thing I, I see him aiming and firing. And I start hearing Stan and Floyd screaming.

Now Stan and Floyd were, had gotten out into the open, and they had gotten down on the ground behind

where this old building was. And it was like the form was still like up about, you know, anywhere from 8 inches to 10 inches high, the concrete form. And the place had burned, and so there was like ashes that were still -- these ashes were -- George was aiming at these guys to try to kill them. And I just couldn't believe it.

So it dawned on me the only way to deal with this is to, just to cause a diversion. So I started firing in the air which I realize now that, that was kind of stupid. Because you know, 2-2-3s in a mini 14 can travel pretty far.

GEORGE: Um-hum.

DAVID: Of course that was kind of at a 45 degree angle, you know, they'd be going up. I don't know. But like I say, you know, things like that it's, it's hard to explain. And he still kept firing. And he had these big old long banana clips, you know. And so I finally, I had a decision to make. And so I started firing at the top of the tree.

Now when I started hitting that tree, it's a big tree, you know. You can see that over here. Then George ducked back behind it. And as long as I kept firing at that tree, he stayed behind it. When his arm would come around, you know, and he had his Uzi like a pistol. And he kept firing over there at Stan and

Floyd, and they were like trying to crawl around on their bellies to get over to some cover.

And about that time I started leveling up right to the dead center of the tree. And I wanted him to hear -- I wanted to hear him -- I wanted him to hear the rounds hit that tree so he'd stay behind it. And he put his hand out, and all of a sudden he jerked his hand back real quick, and he didn't fire no more.

Well, he stopped firing. I stopped firing. Everybody stopped firing.

And we sat there, and we heard way off in the distance, you know (making siren noises), you know.

You know, praise the Lord. Here comes, here comes our help. You know, here comes the Sheriff's Department.

Then all I, I don't know, 10, 8, 10, 12 cars came in the front gate.

And you know, for a second there I was just as happy as could be, you know. Nobody was hurt. You know, we didn't find no casket yet, but nonetheless, you know, they came in, you know, and all that.

And they drove up and towards the front there, and guys started hollering out, you know, drop your weapons. Drop your -- well, that was good. I'd already, I'd already stood up and started walking over towards them. And I'd already had -- my, my gun was already -- I was holding it by the strap. I mean it

was, it was like dragging the ground, you know. 1 I had 2 it by the strap. And this officer, you know, he hollers at me 3 and, you know, he says drop your weapon. And I looked 4 5 over and he, he was aimed right in on me. You know, ooh. Kind made me get the heebie geebies. And you know, I dropped it. Put your hands up, you know. Okay. No problem. And they gathered us all together, 8 you know. We all got around and everything. 9 And, and I saw Sheriff Thorn over there, you 10 know. God bless him, I've always liked Mr. Thorn. 11 And, and I said hello to him. He looked at me kind of 12 like, you know, like oh, my God, you know. He kind of 13 shook his head and Dave saw him. Dave knows him real well. And you know, and how you doing, Bill? You know 15 that's his name, Bill Thorn. And, and he looked at 16 Dave, you know, and he said, he says David. 17 (Laughing.) What are you doing out here? 18 19 And so they got us together and everything. 20 And you know, they said one guy was there talking. You know, he says now boys, is this everybody? You know, 21 we got some good sheriff guys out here. I mean you 22 know. They, they talk good at least. You know, 23 country boys. And he goes now is this all of you now? Now come on, gentlemen. Let's get over there. We need 25 to talk about this, you know.

And so we all gathered around, you know, all eight of us. They called it the Waco Eight afterwards, you know. And they wanted to make sure there's nobody else around which there wasn't. You know, we got a head count.

And we had already, we had already sent somebody back before, you know, to make sure that there was communication between, you know, the trailer and the Sheriff's Department so they'd know we was out there, you know. We'd already done that.

And anyway, as soon as they confirmed that we was all there, all of a sudden this guy tells us he said, he says get on the goddamned ground. And he started I'm talking about talking like a -- they made us get on the ground. This is summertime. We got red ants out here that just bite fire into you.

GEORGE: Um-hum.

DAVID: And they made us lay our faces down on the ground. The ants were crawling up. They were biting our legs. They were biting our arms. They were getting into our private parts. And this guy comes driving up. I don't know who he was. And he goes, and he's what in the goddamn hell is this, that -- this is America. This kind of shit don't happen in America. And you know, you know the good old boy talk had stopped.

GEORGE: Um-hum.

DAVID: I was sitting there. I couldn't believe it. And Paul, he had these earplugs in his ears. Because you know, the guys had earplugs, you know, so, so they didn't have to listen to all that banging. And this guy walks over to, to Paul, and he reaches down and he grabs his plug out of his ear and, and screams right in his ear. He goes did you hear me? He says you move 1 inch I'll blow your blank blank heads off, you know.

So we're like oh, you know. We can't, we can't believe this. So anyway, they finally come and these cars come. And they handcuff us behind our backs. And you know, I got ants in my rear-end. And they're just eating us to pieces. And, and they put us in these cars.

And we're sitting in the car, me and, me and Dave and Greg. And this, this young officer is driving us downtown, right? Other guys were in other cars.

And he says, he says boy, he says you all guys really had a day, didn't you? Talking real, real nice, you know. And I says yeah, I can't believe this. He says you all don't worry about it. He says we knew you all were out here. He says you'll be out before dark.

You know, of course, well that's encouraging.

I says well, why, why were -- why did they do this to

us for? He goes oh, I don't know. He says it's just procedure. You know, don't worry about it.

So they drove us downtown and put us down there in the county and, and we drove in, and they like opened up this big door. We went down --

GEORGE: Um-hum.

DAVID: -- to like this, I don't know, like a garage, you know. They took us out and made us line up again on this like little tape thing against the wall. They were taking our pictures and stuff.

GEORGE: Um-hum.

DAVID: And I saw Sheriff Thorn -- I mean I saw Sheriff Dickerson over there. You know, he came out. And I thought oh, boy, good, you know. And I, I called out to him. I says, I says Mr. Dickerson. And all of a sudden that guy punched me, not really like with his fist. You know, kind of like, you know, nudged me real hard. Says shut up. You know. And what is this?

So they took us in and they, they put us in this room, you know. We stayed the night in this room. And they, they gave us some -- they took us out the next day or something and took us into this other room and made us give up, you know, know we already gave up all our stuff, you know. Watches.

GEORGE: Um-hum.

Wallets. Coins. And I'm a quitar DAVID: 1 I got, I got like little sissy fingers, you 2 know. I'm, I'm fast on a guitar. But you know, guitar 3 players have sissy hands, you know. And, and this guy took me in the back, younger guy, and they 5 fingerprinted me. And talking about smashing my fingers into the ink and then -- I says, I says friend, 7 I said you know, can you be a little more gentle? And he looked at me like huh? You know. So anyway they, they put us, they put us in 10 these pajama type things, you know, and gave us sandals 11 to wear and gave us these little bunks and took us all 12 down and put us in these jail cells, you know. But the 13 point I'm trying to make is that, you know, it cost us 14 eighty something thousand dollars. Eighty something 15 thousand dollars. 16 GEORGE: For a defense? 17 For the defense. For taxes. People 18 lost their jobs. And we got this prosecuting attorney 19 named Shabaz (phonetic sp.). Vic Fisell (phonetic sp.) 20 was working on another case. And I'm telling you, 21 George, for 2 weeks that trial took place. And the 22 jury told -- after the trial was over. 23 Um-hum. GEORGE: 24 DAVID: You know, we got acquitted and all 25

that.

GEORGE: Um-hum. 1 This is something I'll be honest with 2 DAVID: This is something you can check up on too. They 3 did not acquit me. They dropped, they dropped the charges. But here's what happened. 5 GEORGE: Before, before it went to the jury? 6 DAVID: No, no, no, no. It's after the jury. 7 But this is what happened. Even the judge got teed off 8 because the jury -- we had a party after this where all 9 the jury members came to the party. 10 GEORGE: With you? 11 DAVID: Yeah. Yeah, well after, after they 12 acquitted everybody then we had a party. 13 GEORGE: Um-hum. 14 15 DAVID: And the jury members all came, you know. They liked us, you know. And what happened was 16 is they explained to me, the guy that -- there's one 17 man they, they elected to be a spokesperson. You know, 18 like to say well, we find them not guilty or whatever, 19 20 right? GEORGE: Um-hum. Foreman. 21 And, and he came to me, and he says, 22 he says David. He says -- actually my name was Vernon 23 then. He says Vernon, he says I'm sorry. He says but 24 something was, is wrong. He says we have, we have 25

three black people, you know, in the jury. And they're

just not going by the weight of evidence. He says we, we had to, we had to trick them. We had to get with some of the other jury members, and we had to trick 3 them. Because they always kept saying that every one 4 of you guys were guilty. He says what we had to do 5 was, is we had to work it out to where we would let the 6 seven guys be acquitted, you know, innocent. 7 GEORGE: Um-hum. 8 DAVID: And then we told them that it would 9 be a hung jury on you and that we would vote you guilty. And they agreed to it. But when they went 11 back in for the final vote, they still made it a hung 12 jury. Now according to law --13 GEORGE: Um-hum. 14 DAVID: -- when a jury is picked, there is to 15 be no member on that jury that is to be associated in 16 friendship or relationship to either defense or 17 prosecuting attorneys. Is that not true? 18 Should be that way. GEORGE: 19 DAVID: Yeah. Well, one of the black men on 20 the jury go, went, was the same club member with 21 Shabaz. 22 GEORGE: Um-hum. 23

DAVID: Okay? Now Shabaz you'll find out later is a, is a black activist. I mean, you know, a

lot of people here in Waco don't even like him, you

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1 | know. But that wasn't supposed to have been.

GEORGE: Um-hum. That's grounds for appeal too. Even if they had come back with a guilty verdict, that's another grounds to appeal.

DAVID: Yeah, but see Waco is funny. Now let me explain the next thing. Months later after this, I was down the road here in from if you go out to where the water tanks are and go up towards 2491 up to where our shop is, as you're traveling down this road on the left there's a little paint and body shop. A guy works out of his garage.

And I stopped there one time because Peter Hitsman (phonetic sp.), you know, he does paint and body work. And of course he's, he's gone now. But Pete, Pete used to go there and talk to him all the time, you know, and get tips. Because the guy is really good. And I was there one day talking with him. And this black guy drove up in this car. And I was talking with him, and we were talking and he says, he says by the way, he says would your name -- is your name Vernon? Is your name Vernon Howell? And I go well, it's -- it was Vernon Howell.

GEORGE: Um-hum.

DAVID: And he goes say, man, he says you know, I knew I recognized you. He says do you remember me? And I go no. He goes remember the, the trial you

1 had in '88? He says I was one of the jurors. And I, I
2 says well, I says, oh well, I said you didn't come to
3 the party.

He goes man, he says let me tell you something man. They were after you. He says you know, he says I feel sorry about it now. He -- and he named this other guy. He says you know, they told me that you was into drugs and that they knew as a fact that you were out there, it was a drug deal and that, that you was fighting with George because they were out there making drugs. And, and they were counseling me.

And remember the other lady that was on that, the other black lady? And they were telling us that, you know, to, to go ahead and hang you because, you know, you were into all of this drug stuff like that and you was just a Christian as a cover-up. He says you know, he says I shouldn't have let that got to me. He says but I didn't know. He says and the jury, they said that they was going to go ahead and agree and hang you if we went ahead and let everybody else go.

So this guy, we talked about it for a while. And, and that kind of stuff, you know, is unbelievable but it happens. It really happened. And it did happen.

Anyway, the whole point of the matter was, is that when we got on the property out here before the

1 | trial?

GEORGE: Um-hum.

DAVID: We found, we found syringes. We found drugs. And we found just pages and pages of pornography. You know, and we found this big like notebook, notebook files and subject, subjectized (sic). And the subject was methamphetamines, how to make methamphetamines. And we turned all of that stuff over to the Sheriff's Department. Every last bit of it. And they did not mention that one time.

GEORGE: In the trial?

DAVID: In the trial.

GEORGE: Did your defense attorney mention

it?

DAVID: No. Because see I did something I shouldn't have done. I started -- I turned all this stuff over to the Sheriff's Department without, without him, you know, consulting with him in the first place.

GEORGE: Um-hum.

DAVID: Another thing is that they said on the radio and all that and on the news that, that we didn't even have any cameras. And then they say we had a camera, but it had no film in it. This is the stuff that went out to the media.

GEORGE: Well, that doesn't count.

DAVID: I know. But it does count in the

respect that this black lady on the trial was going and listening to all the news. And that's how she was 2 making her decisions plus what the other guy was 3 telling this other black guy. And he was a friend of Shabaz's you see. 5 GEORGE: That's, that's why they got --6 7 that's why they need unanimous verdicts, to take care of those kind of people. DAVID: Well, so anyway, what the whole raw 9 deal was is see when Vic Fisell was district attorney 10 here, the people that George -- oh, wait a minute. 11 (Moaning.) The people that George had out here, check 12 these names out. You might want to write them down. 13 Was a guy --14 GEORGE: You mean back, back in, in '85 or 15 187? 16 . 3 DAVID: Right. Donnie Joe Harvey. Donnie 17 Joe Harvey. And Roy Boy Wells. And they were out here 18 making methamphetamines. And the reason why the 19 Sheriff's Department wasn't coming out here is because 20 they knew it. 21 And after the trial, you know, Vic Fisell's 22 got his day before the Lord too. But Vic Fisell was 23 getting a lot of payoffs from a lot of labs and stuff 24 all around this county. And that's why they weren't 25

coming out here and busting up on these people because

1 they were in the process of doing all this drug stuff. 2 GEORGE: Um-hum. 3 DAVID: And then Vic Fisell had gotten nailed at one time over some coke, some cocaine. And I'm sure 4 you heard about all that, didn't you? 5 GEORGE: No. No. 6 DAVID: Yeah. 7 8 GEORGE: That's, that's a long time ago. 9 Yeah, well, like I say, you know. DAVID: He, he got that what \$58 million or something like 10 that. And he's down in Austin now living like a king I 11 guess. I don't know. 13 But of all the people after that trial that came up to me that told us the reason why we got the 14 15 raw deal on all that, because they had been coming out here, some of these people, and knew of people that 16 was, you know, buying this crap. You know. And they 17 knew that Fisell had had dealings going with other 18 people to where he was leaving them alone and stuff and 19 20 letting them manufacture. And of course there was 21 payoffs involved. 22 GEORGE: Um-hum. 23 DAVID: So you know, you know, Sheriff Harwell (phonetic sp.) and all those guys I love them, 24 25 you know. Like I told them before, not all of them are bad. But some of them, they know what they're doing.

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And you know if they, if they had, if they had come out here and, and then served the warrant and stuff like 2 that it --3 GEORGE: Might have been different. 4 5 DAVID: -- it would have been totally different. 6 7 GEORGE: Okay. DAVID: But you know, everybody around knows 8 9 that we do gun shows. And then the ATF agent says well, they don't, they don't do this for a profit. 10 11 See, we sold parts. 12 GEORGE: Um-hum. DAVID: You cannot, you cannot legally 13 sell -- you can sell only a few amount of fully 14 15 assembled firearms without a, without a FFL. Okay? 16 GEORGE: I'm, I'm not sure you, you even want to talk about this, David. It really doesn't make any 17 18 difference. DAVID: Well, maybe I'm just running. 19 20 just telling you that I don't believe you guys. GEORGE: What --21 22 And when I'm, when I come --DAVID: GEORGE: About what? 23 24 DAVID: You're just all full of air. make thousands of promises. You know, you say a bunch 25 of good things. But you got to understand. When I

come out here and I put my hands -- and I put my life 1 into your hands, my life is over. I know that. 2 you know, I'm making things right with my God. And 3 everybody else here is making things right with their 4 God. You know. And --5 GEORGE: Well, how we, how we going to --6 7 -- I'm looking at my babies every day. Well, I haven't been lately. But you know, you 8 know, I am sorry that, that people had to come here and 9 huff and puff and try to shoot guns around and stuff 10 like that. Now my life is ruined, my friend. 11 ruined. It's over. 12 You know, I'm not, I'm not a coward. You 13 know, if God in heaven is allowing me to have a rough 14 shake, then I can do nothing about it. I believe in 15 I believe in the Constitution. And like I 16 say, it's in God's hands. 17 18 But you know, these are my babies in here. 19 And I look at them every day. 20 GEORGE: Well, what's going to happen to 21 them? 22 DAVID: Well, that's going to be up to you folks I guess, isn't it? You know to the --23 GEORGE: No, no I --24 25 DAVID: -- to the jerk, to the jerk who's ever going to end up having to raise them or something

like that. Is going to probably feed them junk food 2 and probably let them run around and really --3 GEORGE: What do you want, what do you want to happen to them? What would you like to happen to 4 5 them? DAVID: My friend, what I want doesn't make 6 7 any difference now. What I -- if I, if I had a wish --8 GEORGE: Well, can you influence -- you may be able to influence that. So, so think about it. 9 10 DAVID: Are you going to, are you going to build me a little house somewhere in a, in a prison 11 facility where I can have my wives and my little babies 12 and raise them --13 GEORGE: No. No, I don't think --14 DAVID: -- and teach them --15 16 GEORGE: -- I think you know that's not realistic. 17 DAVID: I don't think so. 18 19 GEORGE: But that's, but --Okay. I just told you it was a wish. 20 DAVID: 21 GEORGE: Well --You know, you guys go ahead and you, 22 23 you can, you can tear up everything around here and --24 GEORGE: Come on now. Let's, let's talk 25 about the children. What, what would you like to happen to them? What --

DAVID: Well, I mean what do you think I want 1 2 to happen to them? GEORGE: I'm, I'm listening. I want to hear 3 4 it. DAVID: What -- have you seen, have you --5 people have come from all over the world to, to learn 6 what I teach and what I live. Do you see those 7 children that have been sent to you already? 8 GEORGE: Yeah. 9 DAVID: They are good kids. They weren't 10 like that when they first came here. You know. I 11 12 teach my students --13 GEORGE: But we can't leave them in there, 14 David. DAVID: Well, I understand that. Let me, let 15 me finish now. I teach my students that discipline 16 17 begins in the heart of the parents. It doesn't begin at the end of a board on somebody's butt. You know? I 18 teach discipline begins in the heart of the mother and 19 20 the father. It starts in the womb. It starts on 21 conception. If the parents are not subdued with knowledge 22 and understanding, if they don't know where they're 23 going and how to walk in light, they can't expect the 24 child. You can't end up whipping your baby because you 25 made the mistake, you know?

GEORGE: Okay. I understand.

DAVID: And so what happens is, is that the parents that I have permitted to stay with me and learn the secrets that I've unfolded to them in regards to God's will, they learn first of all how to be able to take their children and apologize to them. Children learn about God, and they get to see the parents make the change first.

And it's easier to, it's easy to go back into the world. I mean you know, it's, it's something that it takes, it takes three steps forward to do good and one step backwards --

GEORGE: Um-hum.

DAVID: -- and you lose more ground but --

GEORGE: Um-hum.

DAVID: -- but the thing of it is is that when you see my babies, my babies outshine all of them. Because like I say, they were disciplined in the, in the womb. Their mothers, their mothers knew how to carry them. Their mothers knew how to think when they were carrying them. You know, this is no fake game. This is reality.

And when you see this tape, you're going to see that though they're little and though they're small yet they're responsive. They speak at a very early age. They can communicate.

Because like I say, from the time of the 1 inception -- the time of the conception, you know, there is communication between the heart of the mother, her nervous, her nervous system, everything. all -- that's the, that's the universe of that child 5 for 9 months. And it needs to come out feeling welcomed. Needs to come out feeling loved. And this 7 is a principle that very few people understand. 8 these children are loved and they know it. You know. 9 And now you're out on the outside, and you've 10 got me all pictured a certain way, and I can't help 11 that. But --12 GEORGE: It --13 DAVID: -- every day, every day, you know, 14 it's in the hands of God now. My children when they 15 end up on the outside and they end up wherever I end 16 up, you know, may God be the judge. 17 GEORGE: Well --18 I don't even want my mother to, I DAVID: 19 don't even want my mother to have my children. You 20 see, I have children from a lot of wives. You 21 22 understand that? Um-hum. GEORGE: 23 DAVID: And in today's world, you got to be 24 smarter than the average man to pull that one off. 25

Especially when the women love each other. You know?

And I don't even believe -- I don't know. It's up to you. It's up to the system. That you're even going to 2 allow these babies to even be had of their own mothers, 3 you know. Because it's weird, it's bizarre to you. But there's one thing that's not weird to us. 5 And that is the faction of love and discipline, 6 soberness and principle that we have instituted and we 7 have followed in regards to, to our lives, our 8 deportment, our citizenship. You know, the Big Brother out there they, 10 they knocked out a good thing. I admit it's not 11 according to your laws. And if I've broken any laws 12 it's, it's, you know, you believe, you believe, you 13 know, you're not, you're not into polygamy. 14 that. But the thing of it is is that in the sight of 15 God most of you guys are. Because God says when you 16 lay with a woman she's your wife. You know. You got 17 to pay the fiddler, remember? 18 But the laws of God, that's what we follow. 19 And we follow all the laws of men that are coherent to 20 21 that. But anyway, there's little -- you want to say 22 hello, Dayland? Okay. Dayland wants to talk to you. 23 24 [gap] DAVID: Talk clear. Talk nice. Say hello, 25 George.
