Opportunity from who, from you guys, from -- from who? 8 9 JOHN-5: No, no, us. No, our guys outside --10 JUDY: (Indiscernible) your guys have given 11 me the --12 JOHN-5: -- the guys around there want you to 13 come out. 14 JUDY: I know. You, you want me to come out 15 so they can .--16 JOHN-5: No, but would you come out, Judy? 17 JUDY: -- frisk me to see if I'm carry a 18 weapon, what? 19 JOHN-5: No, no, you're not going to be 20 carrying a weapon. You not going to do anything like 21 that. Judy, what we'd like you to do is you get together a few of these mothers that are very concerned 22 about milk, about their kids. And this is, apparently, 23 24 some more underlying reasons. 25 JUDY: Yeah. JOHN-5: Pick them all up and come on down.

1 JUDY: Come on down. 2 JOHN-5: Absolutely, because the situation as 3 it is now, it's not going to get any better for them inside there. It's not going to get any better for 5 you. 6 JUDY: Well, I don't (Indiscernible) I 7 believe in the Bible and just --8 JOHN-5: Oh, Judy, Judy. 9 JUDY: No, no, I have to wait. JOHN-5: You have to wait? 10 11 JUDY: God said wait. I'm waiting. 12 JOHN-5: Are you going to get a higher place in heaven or something like that? In the meantime the 13 14 kids get beat up and you're -- emotionally and --15 JUDY: I'd love to tell you. JOHN-5: You realize these --16 17 JUDY: I do know the answer to that question 18 but I won't tell you. 19 JOHN-5: Oh, mercifully, huh? No. Judy, on a situation like this, it's, it's not going to do any 20 21 good for you to hang around in there. It's not for 22 your, shall we say, your taste. 23 JUDY: Well, you know what, I, I really don't like it either but I'm waiting because I believe in 24 25 God.

Well, come out. If you don't like

it -- hey, you can wait outside. You know, there's, 2 there's --JUDY: Oh, I (Indiscernible). 3 JOHN-5: Did God tell you you have to wait in 4 there, in a cesspool? No, you can come on out. 5 JUDY: I'd like to come out and walk around 6 in handcuffs and shackles on my legs. 7 JOHN-5: The guys at the gate are willing to 8 help you out. Say again? 9 JUDY: I can come out in handcuffs and 10 11 shackles on my legs. JOHN-5: Uh-huh. 12 JUDY: I mean what do they think, Kathy 13 Schroeder's going to beat up somebody, you know? 14 JOHN-5: No. I don't think so. 15 JUDY: I don't think so either. 16 JOHN-5: We think that you're using your head 17 and all that sort of business. 18 JUDY: Oh. 19 JOHN-5: And that you need to -- I think 20 what's happening, you sort of lost sight of what 21 22 exactly's going on out there or in there, I should say.
