Now, like I said, who has the key of David? In the book of Revelation to the Church of Philadelphia, you know, these things they get holy. He had had the key of David. He had opened that no one can shut. And when I shut, no one can open. Now, that's Christ talking and that's why in the latter days in Psalms 18 when the key begins to open all the Psalms you can hear Christ talk, not just out of his mouth in the flesh, but out of a book declaring the end from the beginning and from ancient times things not yet done saying, "My council which shall stand and I'll perform all my

1 pleasure, calling a ravenous person the east, the -- in far country." You know, prophecy, what is this stuff, 2 3 the testimony of Jesus Christ? What is this spirit that forewarns us of soon coming events? The testimony 4 5 of Jesus Christ is the spirit, a prophecy. Well, didn't Christ say, "Let there be light," and wasn't 6 7 there light in creation? Didn't Christ say, "Let us 8 make men in our image after our likeness?" The world was made flesh and whatever the word said came to pass, 9 didn't it? 10 11 HENRY: Um-hum. 12 DAVID KORESH: Now, here we say in Psalms 18, 13 "I will love thee, O Lord, my strength." 14 "The Lord is my rock and my fortress. He is 15 my deliverer, my God, my strength, in whom I will 16 trust; my buckler, and the horn is my salvation." 17 Hebrew or in the ancient concept when man referred to a 18 horn, referred to his father's ability to procreate, 19 the strength of a man's loins. So you could say if man 20 was the horn of, of your salvation, you can say that 21 the person was your father. And my high tower, being able to see far off in the distance is what a tower is 22 23 for, isn't it? 24 Um-hum. HENRY: 25 DAVID KORESH: Just like I knew you all were coming before you all even was coming, you know?

1 HENRY: Right. 2 DAVID KORESH: That's what I was trying to 3 tell, you know, Robert. 4 HENRY: Um-hum. 5 "I will call upon the Lord who DAVID KORESH: 6 is worthy to be praised; so shall I be saved from mine 7 enemies." 8 "The sorrows of death compassed me, and the 9 floods of ungodly men made me afraid. They stated, and this 4 5 should be something they should have brought back into 6 investigation, that in 1985 they saw seven angels 7 flying towards earth with the wings of the size of 8 jumbo jet. Now, if these things are true, you know, we 9 should take heed especially to the fact that in the book of Revelations it's recorded that there are seven 10 11 angels who have a message. 12 HENRY: Um-hum. 13 DAVID KORESH: Now --14 HENRY: Everybody believes that the message 15 that you delivered was very powerful and very strong, 16 but --17 DAVID KORESH: But it's going to get more 18 powerful.
