Now, Luther knew point blank 6 that the Papacy taught celibacy, taught celibacy for 7 its priests. Well, we began, he began a search and 8 research and found other documents according to the new 9 covenant. So he married Katherine Van Voyn (Phonetic) This man, by being enlightened with the words 10 in 1525. 11 of God, the words of the prophets, he went ahead and he 12 took a step against his traditional faith as a Catholic 13 and began to stand more on the documents that the 14 Catholics said they believed, but yet they did not 15 teach, nor did they do. 16 You're right about that. JIM: 17 DAVID: Now --18 And I know you're right about that. 19 DAVID: So, in 1530, he developed enough 20 points from scripture to prove that the Papacy was not 21 founded on a scriptural foundation and that many of its 22 laws and many of its edicts were contrary to the 23 foundation established in the new testament. 24 JIM: Right. I understand. 25 DAVID: So, when he nailed his thesis up,

people began to read and then all hell broke out.

1 JIM: Um-hum. 2 DAVID: Do you know how many people died because of Martin Luther's doctrine? 3 4 JIM: I don't know. 5 DAVID: Millions. Millions were considered cultic, demonic, heretic; they were told they were 6 7 proscribed, they were told to recant by the -- Scott, no, no, don't do that. 8 9 JIM: You okay David? 10 DAVID: Yeah, I'm all right. Now, so you 11 see --12 JIM: I, I, --13 DAVID: The, the government of that day was the Roman Catholic Church and Martin Luther was the 14 15 cult leader. He was the devil. He was the demon. He 16 was the idiot and he was the fool, and he was told to 17 recant over and over at the risk of his life. But do 18 you know what happened? There were certain individuals that were lawyers, certain individuals that were kings 19 20 and they began to listen to this man, and they began to 21 think, for once, on their own. And so what happened 22 is, is that, as they began to think, Martin Luther's 23 life was preserved. 24 JIM: Um-hum. 25 DAVID: But he was at least allowed time to

really lay out his complete thesis. Okay. Nonetheless

though, there were people that were beginning to join the Lutheran Church, as I said before, the Jesuit priesthood was developed, which was the Roman Catholics military, and they went out and, like I said, the blood flowed. But the same as when John Knox came in and started the Presbyterian, or Wesley with the Methodist, or Campbell with the Baptist. Each of these reformers were men who asked an honest question in their day in regards to scripture that many organizations were not adhering to. So this is how we came out of the dark ages.

JIM: All right.

DAVID: This is how we came out of the covering of the minds of men from the Papacy.

JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: Now, but the dark ages was foretold by Christ already. The prophets had already been told of the abomination that would make desolate. When men are turned away from God, and his laws, and his precepts, that infidelity and immorality increase to such high levels men become worse than base beast of the field. Their passions, their pride, their arrogancies (sic), all these things overcome them and they do not know how to properly rationalize in the fear of God. Now, if you don't fear God, you cannot properly respect nor love man.

1 JIM: I agree with that. 2 Okay, now, here's the deal. DAVID: The 3 world has become ultimately corrupted in that when the churches are infiltrated by a spirit so contrary to the 4 5 spirit of Christ, that men will stand in pious position of religious leadership, and they know nothing about 6 the real spirit of sacred faith in God based upon 7 8 nothing but God's word, then they try themselves to become the oracle of God. They give their opinions 9 instead of doctrine. 10 11 JIM: You're talking about, David, like those ministers? 12 13 DAVID: I'm talking about, like, the minister 14 -- like the Pope, for instance. 15 JIM: Um-hum, um-hum. 16 DAVID: Claimed such a high piety with God, claims to be vicegerent of God --17 18 Um-hum. JIM: 19 DAVID: And yet, hey, where is the truth? 20 mean, you know, the church is not just a bunch of 21 prayers. 22 JIM: Oh, I agree with you. 23 You know, God wants --DAVID: 24 It's what's inside. JIM: 25 DAVID: -- us to listen to him. It's what's inside, I understand.

1 God also, yeah. 2 DAVID: God is a truth. God is a word. And --3 4 JIM: And God is as good as his word. 5 DAVID: Well, here's the thing. The hope of 10 11 Israel has been to be freed from amongst the gentile nations that God has allowed to rule over his people. 12 13 JIM: Um-hum. 14 DAVID: Because the truth of God and the laws 15 of men do not harmonize in every degree. So that when 16 the laws of men direct men to go contrary to the laws 17 of God, men must take their stand to either be with God 18 and God's law, or with man and man's law. That's why, in order to receive the seal of the living God, you've 19 20 got to know what God's will is. You've got to 21 understand his law, the nature of his law, and his 22 Okay, now, if a person would turn from that and will. 23 become roughly ignorant over these issues, then what will happen is, is that prophecy, which is God 24 foretelling of future events, how they shall come to 25 pass and what they shall involve, will be fulfilled

without these individuals. And that's why the bible 1 2 warns about the beast and its image. God has declared 3 that the nations of the earth that will rule over Israel are limited. The time for Israel's captivity 4 5 has been preordained and limited. That's why when you read Daniel 2, and Daniel 7, Christ talks about the 6 abomination of making desolate spoken by the Daniel, 7 Prophet Daniel --8 9 JIM: Um-hum, okav. 10 DAVID: Daniel tells you that the empires will consecutively as so: Babylon will first rule over 11 12 Judea, of which they have. 13 JIM: Um-hum. 14 DAVID: Then Nebuchadnezzer, that was the 15 King of Babylon. And then the Medes and Persians, Isaiah foretold, would overthrow Babylon and rule over 16 17 Judea. And then Grecia was to come in and overthrow Medes Persia, but it was just split up into four parts 18 19 because of the four generals. His fury is poured 19 out like fire and the rocks are thrown down by him. 20 So, you know, that's one aspect of God, isn't it? 21 22 JIM: Uh-huh. 23 DAVID: But it says that the Lord is good, a 24 strong hold in the day of trouble and he knows them 25 that trust in him. But with an over running flood, he will make an utter end of the place thereof and

darkness shall pursue his enemies. See, his enemies 1 2 won't know about this, will they? Right? The enemies 3 won't know the meaning of this prophecy, will they? No, I don't guess they will. 4 5 DAVID: No. So, God questions by saying, what do you imagine against the Lord? Now, what do you 6 7 guys think you're doing? He will make an utter end. Affliction shall not rise up the second time. Sure, 8 yeah, okay, come on, come on out, Dave. Let's go up 9 10 here to the, to the modern day, present day, you know, 11 politicians, right. Well, see, God's gathering the 12 people together, isn't he? There's some enemies in 13 this vision. For while they be folden together as 14 thorns and while they are drunken as drunkards -- these 15 people are out of their mind -- they shall be devoured 16 as stubble fully dry. 17 There is one come out of thee that imagineth 18 evil against the Lord, a wicked counsellor. Now, who are they imagining evil against? 19 20 The Lord? JIM: 21 The Lord. And what's their counsel? DAVID: 22 It's wicked, isn't it? 23 JIM: Uh-huh. 24 DAVID: Thus saith say the Lord, though they 25 be quiet and likewise many -- even though there's a bunch of these guys, right --

1 JIM: Right. 2 -- yet thus shall they be cut down when he shall pass through. God is going to knock them 3 out, isn't he? 4 5 JTM: Uh-huh. Though I have afflicted thee, I will 6 7 afflict thee no more. He's talking about God's people 8 now. 9 JIM: Uh-huh. 10 DAVID: For now will I break his yoke from 11 off thee and will burst thy bonds asunder. So, in this 12 vision, there's a people that trust in God and yet they 13 kind of have a yoke on their neck, don't they? 14 JIM: Uh-huh. 15 This belligerent power here, though 16 there's many of them, they have to be dealt with by 17 God, don't they? And the Lord hath given commandment 18 concerning thee, that no more thy name be sown out of 19 the house of thy gods will I cut off thy graven image and the molten image. I'll make thy grave for thou are 20 21 vile. 22 Now, here comes the prophecy of Messiah. 23 Behold upon the mountains the feet of him that bringeth good tidings, that publisheth peace. O Judah, keep thy 24

solemn feasts, perform thy vows, for the wicked shall

no more pass through the, he is utterly cut off.

25

1 So, the Gospel, the good news is to who, the 2 wicked or to the people that trust in God? Okay. 3 what about these people that trust in God? Chapter 2 4 begins to explain. 5 He that dasheth in pieces -- right? 6 JIM: Uh-huh. 7 DAVID: Which is the belligerent power, has 8 come up before thy face. What does God say for these 9 people to do, keep the what? 10 JIM: Munition. 11 What's munition? It's ammunition, DAVID: 12 isn't it? 13 JIM: I'm sure it is. Watch the way, make thy loins strong, 14 15 fortify thy power how? Mightily. The Lord hath turned 16 away the ecstacy of Jacob. You know, God's people, 17 they don't look too good, do they, as the excellency of Israel, for the emptiers have emptied them out, and 18 19 marred their vine branches. 20 The shield of the mighty men is made red. 21 You know, people use shields, don't they? 22 JIM: Uh-hum. 23 DAVID: And the valiant men are in scarlet. So, you know, people got hurt the other day, didn't 24 25 they? Uh-huh. Uh-huh. JIM:

1 JIM: I agree with that. 2 DAVID: Okay, now, here's the deal. The world has become ultimately corrupted in that when the 3 4 churches are infiltrated by a spirit so contrary to the spirit of Christ, that men will stand in pious position 5 of religious leadership, and they know nothing about 6 the real spirit of sacred faith in God based upon 7 8 nothing but God's word, then they try themselves to become the oracle of God. They give their opinions 9 instead of doctrine. 10 11 JIM: You're talking about, David, like those 12 ministers? I'm talking about, like, the minister 13 DAVID: 14 -- like the Pope, for instance. 15 JIM: Um-hum, um-hum. 16 DAVID: Claimed such a high piety with God, claims to be vicegerent of God --17 18 JIM: Um-hum. 19 And yet, hey, where is the truth? Ι 20 mean, you know, the church is not just a bunch of 21 prayers. 22 JIM: Oh, I agree with you. 23 DAVID: You know, God wants --24 It's what's inside. JIM: 25 DAVID: -- us to listen to him. It's what's inside, I understand. JIM:

1 God also, yeah. 2 DAVID: God is a truth. God is a word. And --3 And God is as good as his word. 4 JIM: 5 DAVID: Well, here's the thing. When we see 6 that Christ was taken back to heaven, a lot of the 7 prophecies and promises did not come to pass. That's 8 why in Acts Chapter 1, as his disciples walked with 9 him, they said, "Lord, is it now at this time that thou will restore the kingdom again to Israel?" The hope of 10 11 Israel has been to be freed from amongst the gentile nations that God has allowed to rule over his people. 12 13 JIM: Um-hum. 14 DAVID: Because the truth of God and the laws 15 of men do not harmonize in every degree. So that when 16 the laws of men direct men to go contrary to the laws 17 of God, men must take their stand to either be with God 18 and God's law, or with man and man's law. That's why, 19 in order to receive the seal of the living God, you've 20 got to know what God's will is. You've got to understand his law, the nature of his law, and his 21 will. Okay, now, if a person would turn from that and 22 become roughly ignorant over these issues, then what 23 24 will happen is, is that prophecy, which is God 25 foretelling of future events, how they shall come to pass and what they shall involve, will be fulfilled

1 without these individuals. And that's why the bible warns about the beast and its image. God has declared 2 that the nations of the earth that will rule over 3 4 Israel are limited. The time for Israel's captivity 5 has been preordained and limited. That's why when you read Daniel 2, and Daniel 7, Christ talks about the 6 abomination of making desolate spoken by the Daniel, 7 Prophet Daniel --8 9 JIM: Um-hum, okay. 10 DAVID: Daniel tells you that the empires 11 will consecutively as so: Babylon will first rule over Judea, of which they have. 12 13 JIM: Um-hum. 14 DAVID: Then Nebuchadnezzer, that was the 15 King of Babylon. And then the Medes and Persians, 16 Isaiah foretold, would overthrow Babylon and rule over 17 Judea. And then Grecia was to come in and overthrow Medes Persia, but it was just split up into four parts 18 19 because of the four generals. See, Alexander 20 originally had four generals and he died without an 21 heir. 22 JIM: Um-hum, I understand. 23 DAVID: So, what happens is, out of the northern region of this empire, there rised up another 24 25 empire which is to again, we established all of the

other ones back together, and we know what that one

was, it was Rome. 1 2 JIM: Um-hum. 3 DAVID: Now Rome is not suppose to actually fall in one aspect, because the Prophet Daniel says 4 5 that there will rise up a power in Rome that will speak 6 against the most high God and change God's times and God's laws and it will rule over the world. 7 8 JIM: Um-hum. 9 DAVID: Now, that's where you get your universal or Rome -- Catholic means universal, right? 10 11 JIM: Right. 12 DAVID: So Roman Catholicism becomes a 13 religion, doesn't it? 14 JIM: Um-hum. 15 DAVID: See, the nation was very in-depth in 16 regards to spiritualism such as Zeus and Neptune, 17 Saturn. They believe in the God's and they just simply 18 incorporated as Hezeus Christos (Phonetic), which is a 19 greek War God, Hezeus, and they changed the name of the 20 Biblical messiah, Joshua (Phonetic), to a greek War 21 God, Hezeus, which is a short -- long form of Zeus, 22 Christos means -- Zeus, --23 JIM: I understand. 24 DAVID: -- who is a War God. 25 David, I understand, and I appreciate JIM: what you're telling me.

1 DAVID: And you were an altar boy to this 2 system. Well --JIM: 3 DAVID: Being ignorant of what system you are 4 5 really under, not realizing what God has forewarned 6 about this power. You were ignorantly involved, which you cannot be condemned for. Why Christ died on the 7 Cross. 8 9 JIM: I was just a little boy. DAVID: Yeah, see, so Christ died on the 10 11 cross so that people are forgiven based upon what they 12 know or don't know, you see? 13 JIM: All right. 14 In other words, under the gospel of DAVID: 15 the new covenant, let's say a woman was a nun, okay, and that's all she knew. All she knew is the 16 17 catechism. All she knew is what she was taught and she never really had an opportunity or chance to understand 18 19 the scriptures. 20 JIM: Um-hum. 21 DAVID: Well, then she'd be judged based on 22 how good a nun she was. That's the way it's in the 23 Judgement of Christ. As you receive Christ therefore 24 walk ye in him, grounded and rooted, built up in love and to the full acknowledgement of the understanding of 25

JIM: 2 DAVID: They're the ones who dare challenge 3 him, right? 4 JIM: Uh-huh. 5 He reserveth wrath and reserves means DAVID: 6 he's holding it, right? 7 JIM: Uh-huh. 8 DAVID: For his what? 9 JIM: His enemies. 10 DAVID: His enemies, yeah. Now, you know, like I told you, I said the Lord told me to wait, 11 right? 12 13 JIM: Uh-huh. 14 The Lord is slow to anger and great in power and will not at all acquit the wicked. Just 15 16 like you, there's no way you would ever acquit me, 17 okay. So, likewise --18 JIM: Well, you --19 DAVID: Likewise. Those who do wickedly, God 20 is not acquitting them even though they're still allowed to be free as it seems. The Lord hath his way 21 22 in the whirldwind. In Jeremiah 31 it says the fierce 23 anger of the Lord shall not return until he's performed 24 the intents of his heart. That's Psalm 45, right, my 25 heart is inditing a good matter. Remember that? JIM: Uh-huh.

DAVID: So, in the latter days you shall 1 2 consider it perfectly. That's what you, you guys are 3 That's what everyone that heard the radio 4 program the other night were given a chance to do, they were given a chance to consider, to consider what I was 5 6 saying which is what God says in the book. Now, okay, and in the storm of the clouds of the dust of his feet, 7 he rebuketh the sea and maketh it dry, dried up all the 8 9 rivers. Bashan, languiseth, Carmel, the flower of 10 Lebanon languisheth. 11 The mountains quake at him and the hills 12 melt. The earth is burned at his presence. Yea, the 13 world and all that dwell therein. 14 So, it's a worldwide event, isn't it? Huh? 15 JIM: Yeah, I suppose. 16 DAVID: Pretty hot, right. So, the prophet 17 says who can stand before his indignation. Who can 18 abide in fierceness of his anger. His fury is poured 19 out like fire and the rocks are thrown down by him. 20 So, you know, that's one aspect of God, isn't it? 21 22 Uh-huh. JIM: 23 But it says that the Lord is good, a DAVID: 24 strong hold in the day of trouble and he knows them 25 that trust in him. But with an over running flood, he will make an utter end of the place thereof and

darkness shall pursue his enemies. See, his enemies 1 won't know about this, will they? Right? The enemies 2 won't know the meaning of this prophecy, will they? 3 4 No, I don't guess they will. 5 DAVID: No. So, God questions by saying, 6 what do you imagine against the Lord? Now, what do you 7 guys think you're doing? He will make an utter end. 8 Affliction shall not rise up the second time. Sure, yeah, okay, come on, come on out, Dave. Let's go up 9 10 here to the, to the modern day, present day, you know, politicians, right. Well, see, God's gathering the 11 12 people together, isn't he? There's some enemies in 13 this vision. For while they be folden together as 14 thorns and while they are drunken as drunkards -- these 15 people are out of their mind -- they shall be devoured 16 as stubble fully dry. 17 There is one come out of thee that imagineth 18 evil against the Lord, a wicked counsellor. Now, who 19 are they imagining evil against? 20 The Lord? JIM: 21 DAVID: The Lord. And what's their counsel? 22 It's wicked, isn't it? 23 JIM: Uh-huh. 24 Thus saith say the Lord, though they DAVID: be quiet and likewise many -- even though there's a 25 bunch of these guys, right --

1 Right. JIM: 2 DAVID: -- yet thus shall they be cut down 3 when he shall pass through. God is going to knock them out, isn't he? 4 5 JIM: Uh-huh. 6 Though I have afflicted thee, I will 7 afflict thee no more. He's talking about God's people 8 now. 9 JIM: Uh-huh. 10 For now will I break his yoke from 11 off thee and will burst thy bonds asunder. So, in this vision, there's a people that trust in God and yet they 12 13 kind of have a yoke on their neck, don't they? 14 Uh-huh. JIM: 15 DAVID: This belligerent power here, though 16 there's many of them, they have to be dealt with by God, don't they? And the Lord hath given commandment 17 18 concerning thee, that no more thy name be sown out of 19 the house of thy gods will I cut off thy graven image and the molten image. I'll make thy grave for thou are 20 21 vile. 22 Now, here comes the prophecy of Messiah. 23 Behold upon the mountains the feet of him that bringeth 24 good tidings, that publisheth peace. O Judah, keep thy

solemn feasts, perform thy vows, for the wicked shall

no more pass through the, he is utterly cut off.

25

So, the Gospel, the good news is to who, the 1 wicked or to the people that trust in God? 2 Okay. Now, what about these people that trust in God? Chapter 2 3 4 begins to explain. 5 He that dasheth in pieces -- right? 6 JIM: Uh-huh. 7 DAVID: Which is the belligerent power, has 8 come up before thy face. What does God say for these 9 people to do, keep the what? 10 JIM: Munition. 11 What's munition? DAVID: It's ammunition, 12 isn't it? 13 I'm sure it is. JIM: 14 DAVID: Watch the way, make thy loins strong, 15 fortify thy power how? Mightily. The Lord hath turned 16 away the ecstacy of Jacob. You know, God's people, 17 they don't look too good, do they, as the excellency of Israel, for the emptiers have emptied them out, and 18 19 marred their vine branches. 20 The shield of the mighty men is made red. You know, people use shields, don't they? 21 22 JIM: Uh-hum. 23 DAVID: And the valiant men are in scarlet. 24 So, you know, people got hurt the other day, didn't 25 they?

JIM: Uh-huh. Uh-huh.

1 DAVID: Now, it says something funny here 2 about these certain chariots that these men will be 3 riding in. 4 JIM: Uh-huh. 5 It says the chariots shall be with DAVID: flaming torches. Flaming torches? What's that? 6 7 JIM: Well, what is that? 8 Huh. In the day of his preparation, 9 the fir trees shall be terribly shaken. Hum. I quess, 10 I guess that's what their knocking over out here across 11 the property, there are fir trees, huh? 12 It says the chariots shall rage in the 13 streets, they shall justle one against another in the 14 broad ways, they shall seem like torches, they shall 15 run like the lightnings. These things can go pretty 16 fast, can't they? Huh? 17 I don't know, David, I've never been in 18 one. 19 DAVID: Well, the thing of it is is that 20 these flaming torches are guns, you know that? 21 JIM: Oh, I see. 22 The prophet is trying to explain to 23 you when these prophecies meet their fulfillment when 24 they fight against the Lord. Now, what happens is the 25 belligerent power kind of loses one round, a simple round, but then it says, he shall recount his worthies,

1 you know. They reorganize. 2 JIM: uh-huh. 3 But they shall stumble in their walk, they shall make haste to the wall thereof, and the 4 5 defence shall be prepared. And then it goes, the gates of the rivers 6 7 shall be opened, and the palace shall be dissolved. 8 And Huzzab shall be led away captive. Now, I 9 know you don't realize what this is talking about, but 10 Huzzab means that which is established. And she shall 11 be brought up, and her maids shall lead her with her 12 voice of doves, tabering upon their breasts. 13 But Ninevah is of old like a pool of water, 14 stale, stagnate. Yet they shall flee away. Stand, 15 stand, shall they cry, but none shall look back. 16 What happens? How come this power who seems to be so well outfitted with jostling chariots and 17 18 flaming torches and all that, that can make trees 19 shake, how come all of a sudden they end up having to 20 run for. 21 And then all of a sudden it says, take ye the 22 spoil of silver, take the spoil of gold. There is no 23 end to their store and the glory out of the pleasant furniture. 24 25 She is empty, and void, and waste, and the

heart melteth, and all knees smite together. Who's

1 scared now? Much pain is in all loins, and all faces 2 of them gather blackness. 3 I mean these guys must be really terrified. 4 What happens? 5 Where is the dwelling of the lions and the 6 feeding place of the young lions. You know, these, 7 these, these, people, wicked people, they thought 8 they're tough, didn't they? You know, how people have this lion character and all that? 10 JIM: Uh-huh. 11 DAVID: Where is the lion, even the old lion 12 that walked, and the lion's whelp, and none made them 13 afraid? 14 The lion did tear in pieces enough for his 15 whelps, and strangled for his lionesses. I mean isn't 16 that what most people do, is provide for their 17 families? 18 JIM: Uh-huh. 19 DAVID: Isn't it? 20 JIM: Uh-huh. 21 Filled his holes with prey, and his DAVID: 22 dens with ravin. Huh. See, God uses symbols sometimes 23 to reveal natures of men. What does God say about 24 these people with flaming torches? 25 Behold, I am against thee, saith the Lord of hosts. Remember the father in heaven?

1 JIM: Uh-huh. 2 DAVID: And I will burn her chariots in the 3 smoke, and the sword shall devour the young lions. You know, these big tough guys. And I will cut off thy 4 5 prey from off the earth, and the voice of my messenger 6 shall be heard -- no more be heard. 7 Woe to the bloody city. It is full of lies 8 and robbery and the prey departeth not. 9 Noise of a whip, and the noise of the 10 rattling of the wheels, prancing horses, and of the 11 jumping chariots. 12 The horseman lifteth up both the bright sword 13 and the glittering spear. You know, what, what, what is all this? You know, these prophecies don't make 14 15 much sense, do they? 16 JIM: Well, I'm trying to understand. Go 17 ahead. 18 DAVID: The great number of carcases. 19 is a number, a multitude of slain, and a great number 20 of carcases, and there is no end of their corpses, they 21 stumble upon their corpses. Why, why do these people 22 lose for? 23 Because of the multitude of the whoredoms of the well favoured harlot, the mistress of witchcrafts, 24 25 that sell nations through her whoredoms and families

through her witchcraft.

1 Have you ever heard of Babylon the Great? 2 Uh-huh. JIM: 3 Yeah, that's what this prophecy is 4 talking about. 5 Behold, I am against thee, saith the Lord of hosts, and I will discover thy skirts upon my face, and 6 7 I will show the nations thy nakedness and the kingdoms thy shame. 8 9 You know, there's no nation that's been given 10 greater privileges than the United States of America. 11 It's supposed to protect its people. It's supposed to 12 have an ear to listen and to learn. It's supposed to 13 have freedoms to be able to know the word of God and 14 what God states. You know, In God We Trust, it says on 15 the currency, doesn't it? 16 JIM: Yeah. 17 DAVID: But if they don't really know what 18 God states, they're going to misunderstand. 19 And I will cast abominable filth upon thee 20 and make thee vile, and I will set thee as a gazing 21 stock. 22 And it shall come to pass, that all they that 23 look upon thee shall flee from thee, and say, Nineveh is laid waste, who will bemoan her? Whence shall I 24 25 seek comforters for thee?

Art thou better than populous No. No was an

1 ancient city. 2 Uh-huh. JIM: 3 DAVID: Populous means it's just highly 4 populated. 5 JIM: Uh-huh. 6 This place was situated among the rivers, that had the waters round about it, whose 7 8 rampart was the sea, and her wall was from the sea. 9 You know, it was really highly fortified. 10 JIM: Uh-huh. 11 DAVID: Ethiopia and Egypt were her strength. They were their allies. And it was infinite. Put and 12 13 Lubim were thy helpers. But what happened? 14 Yet was she carried away and went into 15 captivity. Her young children were also dashed in 16 pieces at the top of all the streets and they cast lots 17 upon the honourable men and all her great men were bound in chains. 18 19 So, you know, a lot of empires think they're 20 really tough, don't they? 21 But it says here, by Nineveh, it says, thou 22 also shall be drunken. You know, they're out of their 23 minds. 24 JIM: Uh-huh. 25 DAVID: Thou shall be hid, thou also shall seek strength because of the enemy.

Do you know who the enemy is? God. 1 They 2 make God their enemy. 3 JIM: Huh. 4 DAVID: All thy strongholds shall be like fig 5 trees with the first ripe figs, if they be shaken, shall even fall into the mouth of the eater. 6 7 That's easy, isn't it, to knock all their 8 power out, huh? 9 Behold, thy people in the midst of thee are women, and the gates of thy land shall be set wide open 10 unto thine enemies, the fire shall devour thy bars. 11 12 You know who brings that fire, don't you? 13 God does. Remember in Psalms 18 where it talked about Messiah saying that his enemies were too strong for 14 15 him? 16 Uh-huh, yeah. JIM: 17 DAVID: They start -- they, they, they 18 destroy him. And it says that they prevented me the 19 day of my calamity. And it says, the heavens depart 20 and God comes down and hits them with fire and 21 brimestone. 22 JIM: Uh-huh. 23 But that's not the end of the world, 24 though. It takes place before the end of the world. 25 Draw thee waters for the siege, fortify thy

strongholds, go into the clay and tread the morter,

1 make strong thy brickklin. 2 There shall the fire devour thee, the sword shall cut thee off. It shall eat thee up like the 3 cankerworm, make thyself many as the cankerworm, make 4 thyself many as the locusts. 5 6 In other words, you know, it's kind of like, oh, they can multiply as much as they want to, right? 7 8 JIM: Uh-huh. 9 This, this harlot here, it says, thou hast multiplied thy merchants above the stars of 10 11 Hum. These, these people got so much -- don't 12 they? The cankerworm spoileth and fleeth away. 13 Thy crowned are as the locusts, and thy captains as the grasshoppers. There's too many people 14 15 in charge, isn't there? A lot of leaders in this 16 country, huh? 17 JIM: Uh-huh. 18 Called Ninevah in prophecy. Which 19 camp in the hedges in the cold day. I mean, you know, 20 they're, they're all out there in the fields and everything. They're all out there hiding and creeping 21 22 down behind the bushes, right, trying to stay warm. But when the sun ariseth. 23 24 You ever heard of the day spring, Jim? 25 JIM: Uh-huh. Peter says prophecy will be a light

that shines in a dark place until the day dawn and a 1 2 day spring arise in your heart. Not unless you know the mystery of the God, that God declared to service 3 the prophets, will you understand these mysteries. 4 5 Yet when the sun ariseth, they shall flee away and their place is not known where they are. 6 7 Thy shepherds slumber, O king of Assyria. 8 You think all these preachers and teachers of this 9 country can show you the Seven Seals? Uh-uh. They're 10 sleeping. 11 And thy nobles shall dwell in the dust, thy 12 people are scattered upon the mountains and no man gathereth them. 13 14 There is no healing for thy bruise, thy wound 15 is grievous. All that hear the bruit of thee shall 16 clap the hands over thee, for upon whom hath not thy wickedness passed continually? 17 18 You know, a person read a prophecy like this 19 and they say to me, they say, Dave, I don't understand 20 that prophecy. Well, naturally, because, first of all, 21 we have to figure out how this is good news. You know, 22 people always talk about the Gospel, Jesues' good news, 23 right? 24 JIM: Uh-huh. 25 And they emphasize and magnify one

But on the other hand, they deny that the good

point.

news is that if we are with God, God is the one that 1 2 finishes the battle. If we are not with the God that's 3 foretold this things, then we're the ones who end up being destroyed. All the prophets talk about an event 4 5 in latter days where someone is to bring good tidings to publish his peace. But that peace and those good 6 7 tidings are found in one book, the Revelation of Jesus 8 Christ -- of the time when Christ will return again. 9 Now, who are this heathen that rage? Who are the ones that bring the jostling chariots with flaming 10 11 torches? Who are they? Well, we know they're not 12 God's people, right? They're the people of the world, 13 the people that know not God. Okay. 14 That being the case, then, is there any hope 15 at all for maybe them to reconsider their position? 16 may be obvious, according to the judgment of the eye 17 that a person may be crazy or a person may be a cult 18 leader. We know what the world said about Christ for 19 the longest time, don't we? No one 2000 years ago 20 believed in Christ, did they? And the Book of Acts, 21 the Jew says to Paul, yeah, we've heard of this act, 22 for everywhere it is evil spoken of. But when the 23 truth or the -- truth is lost sight of, then after 24 awhile even the little simple controversies of old time become traditional. 25

Are you sure you're getting complete 14 communication with these guys? 15 I'll tell you what, I'll double check. 16 DAVID: Okay. 17 JIM: Okay. Go ahead. 18 DAVID: The chariots shall rage in the 19 streets, they shall jostle one against another in the 20 broad ways. That's what they sound like. You see, the 21 prophet can only tell you what he saw. He'd never seen 22 one of these things in his days. He can only explain 23 it, you know, from the way he saw it in his day. 24 seem like torches. They shall -- I mean they look like 25 -- I mean they're not really torches with fire but they have a fire that comes out of them, don't they?

Yeah, uh-huh. 1 JIM: 2 DAVID: They shall run like the -- they're fast. 3 4 JIM: Uh-huh. 5 DAVID: You know, like the prophet is trying to tell you, he said like this is what I saw in vision. 6 He shall recount his worthies. In other 7 8 words, you have to sometimes gather up your men. And 9 it says, they shall stumble in their walk. 10 happens? Generally, when people stumble in their walk, 11 it means they kind of fall, don't it? 12 JIM: Uh-huh. 13 DAVID: Oh, Jim. Like I say, I usually give 14 -- people say that don't want to hear me, they say I 15 brainwash, but I give, I give two weeks of study to most of my students, just to get them familiar with the 16 17 prophetic terminologies. 18 Uh-huh. JIM: 19 DAVID: And there are prophecies that are 20 very, very clear to understand which did not give as 21 thorough detail. There are prophecies that, that do 22 not give as much detail but, but the keynote of all of 23 this is that when there's time no longer, there's a 24 mystery of God, something God has hid, that's to be 25 finished. I mean there's something God's going to do, right?

1 JIM: Uh-huh. 2 DAVID: Right? 3 JIM: Uh-Huh. 4 DAVID: And he declared it to who? Well, you 5 know, the next book over there is Habakkuk, right? 6 Uh-huh. JIM: Then it says, it says right here, it 7 DAVID: 8 says the prophet sees, in Verse 2, he says, Lord, how long will I cry, and thou will not hear even crying to 9 thee of what? 10 11 JIM: Violence. 12 DAVID: And thou wilt not what? 13 JIM: Save. 14 DAVID: Why dost thou shew me iniquity, and 15 cause me to behold grievance? For spoiling and violence are before me. I mean this, this sounds --16 this is violence, you know. The prophet sees a 17 18 terrible event, don't he? 19 JIM: Uh-huh. 20 DAVID: For there are that rise up strife and 21 what? Contention. 22 JIM: Uh-huh. 23 DAVID: I mean there's some people involved 24 in this prophecy that are given some real hell, aren't 25 there?

JIM: Uh-huh.

1 Therefore the law is what? DAVID: 2 And judgment doth never go forth, for the wicked doth 3 compass about the what? 4 JIM: Righteous. 5 DAVID: So, the righteous are in one situation. Who's gathering around them? The wicked. 6 7 JIM: Uh-huh. 8 DAVID: Now, the people on the outside that 9 are watching this, they're being, you know, -- the good guys are on the inside. The bad guys are gathered 10 around them, and the people around them, which are the 11 12 -- of the world, they're judging this. And it says, 13 therefore wrong judgment proceedeth, right? 14 JIM: Uh-huh. 15 DAVID: Huh. It's kind of like we're on the 16 inside, you boys are on the outside, you know, and 17 everyone else is beyond you all. They're, they're 18 having to -- trying to figure out what's going on, 19 don't they? 20 Behold ye among the heathen and regard and 21 wonder marvelously. Yeah, see, you don't know what's 22 going on, Jim. You're wondering what this is all 23 about, aren't you? 24 For I will work a work in your days, which 25 you will not believe, though it be told you. Now, what's this all about?

1 For I raise up the Chaldeans, that bitter and 2 hasty nation. Hasty, oh, boy, they move quick. 3 are the Chaldeans? Ancient Babylon. Let me tell you 4 about the Chaldeans. It's the same spirit that was --5 remember that image, the well favoured harlot? 6 JIM: Uh-huh. 7 The world and the spirit thereof? 8 JIM: Uh-huh. DAVID: Huh. Well, you see, if God punishes 9 10 a man for being a certain way 5000 years ago, he'll 11 punish a man today for being the same way. So, you 12 just transfer the same spirit. 13 JIM: Hum. 14 DAVID: But in the days of the -- that's when 15 Babylon is going to fall -- revelation, Babylon the 16 Great, the real harlot. That's why the image is --17 see, it brings the fall of the real Babylon. 18 Anyway, it says, they shall march through the 19 breadth of the land, to possess the dwellings that are 20 not their's. 21 They are terrible and dreadful. 22 judgment and their dignity shall proceed of themselves. 23 You think these people fear God? Do you 24 think they judge after God's judgment? Do you think 25 they care about God's judgment, the Book? Do you think

they care about the one who brings that Book? Do you?

1 JIM: No. DAVID: No, they don't. They don't know 2 3 nothing about it, do they? JIM: Uh-huh. 4 5 They're supposed to wonder, aren't 6 they? Now, it says, their horses are swifter than 7 leopards. Now, these aren't real horses. Now, 8 remember, the prophet is trying to explain to you something, right? 9 10 JIM: Uh-huh. 11 DAVID: And he's never seen any of these 12 things before, has he? 13 JIM: Right. 14 DAVID: I mean he sees men -- he recognizes 15 He sees men traveling and things but I mean like 16 their moving with great speed. In the days of 17 Habakkuk, they were using horses, mules, things like 18 that, right? 19 JIM: Uh-huh. 20 DAVID: But he says, their horses are swifter 21 than leopards. I mean leopards are fast. And are more 22 fierce than the evening wolves. Now, horses aren't 23 fierce. 24 Uh-huh. JIM: 25 DAVID: But it depends on if we're talking about some kind of vehicle that's dangerous.

1 Uh-huh. JIM: 2. DAVID: And their horsemen shall spread 3 themselves and their horsemen shall come from far and 4 they shall fly as the eagle that hasteth to eat. 5 They all come for what reason? 6 JIM: Uh-huh. 7 DAVID: Violence. Their faces shall sup up 8 as the east wind, and they shall gather the captivity 9 as the sand. 10 They scoff at the kings. The princes are a scorning to them. They shall deride every strong hold. 11 12 They shall heap up dust and take it. 13 Then shall his mind change, and he shall pass over and offend. Who does he end up offending? 14 15 big tough person here offends God because he thinks 16 that his God has power to offend the God he's offended. 17 Imputing this his power unto his God. 18 Well, what happens, I wonder. Therefore, they rejoice and are glad. 12 He says the nature of men is kind of like 13 everyone's got like a hook for everybody else, right? 14 JIM: Right. Wait, show me where you are. I, 15 I lost --16 DAVID: The verse is 15. 17 JIM: Okay, yeah, I got it. 18 DAVID: He talks about, you know, about Verse 19 14 --20 JIM: Right. 21 DAVID: -- makes men as, you know, --22 JIM: Fishes of the sea. 23 DAVID: And everyone is out to get something 24 from somebody else, right? 25 JIM: Right, uh-huh. DAVID: And they're all with a fishing hook

1 and an angle. That's what an angler lure is, you know, 2 he's got a fishing hook and a drag is a net. JIM: Uh-huh. 3 4 DAVID: Therefore, they rejoice and they're 5 glad cause they get, they get gain from this. Therefore, they sacrifice unto their net and burn 6 7 incense unto their drag. Because by them, by these 8 tools, they're portion is fat. In other words, they 9 get rich, don't they? 10 JIM: Uh-huh. 11 DAVID: And their meat plenteous. 1 Christ would worship him? Promised him the kingdoms, 2 didn't he? 3 JIM: Uh-huh. 4 DAVID: Promised him authority. Promised him 5 power, right? Uh-huh. 6 JIM: 7 DAVID: And Satan does this to all men. 8 These people are considered in the scripture as drunk. 9 They're out of their minds. Because, you see, 10 transgressing God's law and denying God's offers of 11 mercy is worst than anything a man could ever do 12 because God's above Satan. 13 Shall not all these take up a parable against 14 him and a taunting proverb against him and say, woe to 15 him that increaseth that which is not his. How long and to him that ladeth himself with thick clay. 16 17 These people make themselves little idols, 18 don't they? 19 Shall they not rise up suddenly that shall 20 bite thee. 21 Now, on the front of our property out here, 22 there's a flag. Have you heard about it yet? 23 JIM: Yeah, uh-huh. 24 Okay. Now, on that flag, there's a 25 star of David and there's a silver serpent. There's Seven Seals there. There's a snake there.

1 It says here, shall they not rise up suddenly 2 that shall bite thee. 3 Remember when the children of Israel were doing wrong, how that serpents were sent throughout the 4 5 camp and bit them? JIM: Uh-huh. 6 7 DAVID: Remember that story? 8 Yeah, uh-huh. JIM: 9 DAVID: Okay. That Moses was told to raise 10 up our brazen serpent --11 JIM: Uh-huh. 12 DAVID: -- and he held him. Okay. Christ is that snake, isn't he? 13 14 JIM: Uh-huh. 15 DAVID: Well, in Isaiah 14, God says, for the 16 heathen not to rejoice because he's going to bring 17 forth a cockatrice, which is a snake. And his fruit 18 shall be a fire flying serpent, which talks about 19 little children. 20 Now, it says here that there are those that want to step on property that's not their's, right. 21 22 JIM: Uh-huh. 23 DAVID: They want to increase that which is not theirs. How long? And it says, shall they not 24 rise up suddenly that shall bite thee and awake that 25 shall vex thee, and thou shall become booties unto

Just like Nahum says. Nahum says that finally 1 them. 2 what happens is this belligerent power of the world 3 finally steps on somebody's toes that they shouldn't 4 step on. God's given them the whole world. He's given 5 them all the power and glory that man could afford unto 6 But, finally, there's one little group, one 7 little remnant, and all they do is talk about Seven 8 Seals, which is the knowledge of the authority of the 9 heavens, you know. 10 JIM: Right. 11 DAVID: And it says that the heathen will 12 regard and they'll wonder. They won't know what's 13 going on. The prophets say the heathen will not understand. Daniel foretold the same event in the 14 latter days. Daniel says, and there's a small remnant. 15 16 Daniel says, the wicked will be doing wickedly and none 17 of the wicked will understand but the righteous, they shall understand. 18 19 Now, it says here, thou shall become booties 20 unto them. In other words, everything in this great 21 22 empire becomes the possessions of somebody else. 23 It says here, because thou hast spoiled many 24 nations, all the remnant of the people shall spoil you 25 because of men's blood and for the violence of the

land, of the city, and of all that dwell therein.

So, anyway, the 9 way you understand or the first part to be able to 10 understand every detail of these prophecies, Jim, --11 JIM: Okay. 12 DAVID: -- is when you get over here to Verses 20, and it tells you, but the Lord is where? 13 14 JIM: In his holy temple. 15 DAVID: Where's that at? 16 That must be heaven. JIM: 17 DAVID: Yep. Let all the earth what? Keep 18 silence before him, right? 19 JIM: Right. 20 DAVID: So, you see, ignorance is something 21 highly considered in the judgment, highly considered in 22 the judiciary of heaven. 23 JIM: Uh-huh. 24 DAVID: And we do understand like Habakkuk 25 says. It says, you know, the God will work a work in the days of the heathen which they will not believe --

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1 -- Assyria, Nineveh, certain titles. 2 JIM: Uh-huh. 3 DAVID: But when you see the prophecies of Daniel, you see that Nebuchadnezzar is the first king 4 5 that had an empire, world empire. He saw an image and 6 this image was to depict every phase of human rulership 7 down to the end of time. That's why the head was the 8 head of -- Babylon, and the arms, which are part of the 9 head, right --10 JIM: Uh-huh. 11 DAVID: -- was made of Persia which meant 12 that, meant that Persia was still Babylon, wasn't it? 13 JIM: Uh-huh. 14 DAVID: And Gretia was still made of Persia 15 and Babylon, wasn't it? 16 Right. JIM: 17 DAVID: And Rome was still Greece, made of 18 Persia and -- you know, when one nation rises up, I 19 mean it incorporates all people, doesn't it? 20 JIM: Right. 21 DAVID: They're all mingled together, aren't 22 they? 23 JIM: Uh-huh. 24 DAVID: Well, that's what the whole image is 25 all about.

JIM: I see.

1 DAVID: It's about a nation or an empire of 2 all nations. 3 Uh-huh. JIM: 4 DAVID: Now, what nation do you know of in 5 the end of time, which will be a nation of nations? 6 JIM: Uh-huh. 7 DAVID: Do you know one? 8 JIM: A nation of nations? 9 DAVID: Yeah. Let me say a nation of nationalities. 10 11 JIM: Israel? 12 DAVID: Nope. 13 I don't know. JIM: 14 DAVID: Well, what nation has more nationalities than any other nation in one place? 15 16 JIM: America? 17 DAVID: Exactly. A nation that -- it comes 18 and it is built up from the nations. Daniel says, in a nation where they'll mingle the seeds of men. And from 19 20 there, it spreads to all nations. 21 So, we have, like we say, red, black and 22 white, all aspects of every form of ancient political 23 government commingled into one network called the United States of America. 24 25 JIM: Uh-huh.

DAVID: But the way Revelation 13 brings it

to view is that the prophet sees that although it's powerful and dreadful, it still portrays the image of a 2 3 lamb, though it speaks as a dragon. Uh-huh. 4 JIM: DAVID: And the Bible begins to explain to us 5 6 that there will come a time in the latter -- see, we 7 are subject to the laws of our nations. 8 JIM: Uh-huh. 9 DAVID: As God told Israel to Jeremiah that when you go in amongst the heathen nations, you shall, 10 11 you know, you shall keep their laws and you shall obey, 12 you shall pray for the blessings of the city where the Lord scatters you. Okay. So, you might have peace. 13 14 JIM: Uh-huh. 15 DAVID: Okay. But there comes a time when in 16 the finality of all the empires a truth comes into the 17 world that determines or demands us to either keep 18 alliance to God and truth or to the dictates and laws 19 of man. 20 So, Jim, if you had a situation to where you 21 had to obey the laws of God or laws or man, which laws 22 would you keep? 23 JIM: Well, I'd try to keep both of them. 24 DAVID: Well, yeah, exactly, if they were in

JIM: Uh-huh.

harmony.

1 DAVID: 'Cause remember laws are really good 2 for us. 3 JIM: Uh-huh. 4 DAVID: You know. 5 Right. I understand. JIM: 6 DAVID: Yeah, but what if, what if one law 7 said -- what if the law of the State said you can't 8 keep the law of God? 9 JIM: All right. I understand. 10 DAVID: Which one -- what one would you have 11 to do? 12 Well, you have to do what's right by JIM: 13 your conscience. 14 DAVID: Yeah, okay. So, you'd probably keep 15 the law of God, if you understand, right? 16 JIM: Yeah, I would. Yeah. 17 DAVID: Okay, but you don't understand it, 18 though. 19 JIM: Right. 20 DAVID: Not the way we do. 21 JIM: Right, exactly. 22 DAVID: Okay. So, yeah, that's considered in 23 the judgment but these prophets are not Old Testament. Remember, Revelation says that their messages will be 24 revealed when there's time no longer. Their truth they 25 were given are given for a time in the end.

1 See, we hear about chariots with flaming 2 torches. We hear about people that are small. We hear 3 about a person that has good tidings, you know. 4 JIM: Uh-huh. It's kind of like in Jeremiah 50 and 5 DAVID: 6 It seems like it -- the fall of Babylon takes 7 place, when in Jeremiah 50 God says, that I have laid a 8 snare for thee, Babylon, and you will be taken 9 unawares, for you will strive against the Lord. 10 That's just like Psalms 2 says. It says the 11 heathen rage -- and they got all these wild 12 imaginations, you know. Nahum says, why do you mad 13 against the Lord, oh wicked counsellor, you know. 14 JIM: Uh-huh. 15 DAVID: And it says that the heathen rage. Let us break his bands asunder and cast his cords away 16 17 from us. 18 I mean they don't want to know the field. 19 JIM: Right. 20 So, it, it comes down to the saddest DAVID: 21 thing in the world. It comes down to where people have 22 been privileged with literature and ability to read and 23 see but now they're so full, that they don't care to 24 learn. 25 So, he that sits in the heavens, sad to say,

he laughs.

'Cause, Jim, let me tell you something about 1 2 my father. JIM: Uh-huh. 3 4 DAVID: He wants your butt. 5 JIM: Uh-huh. DAVID: He wants, he wants to wipe this world 6 7 It's vanity, it's proud, it's arrogant, it's 8 corrupt, it's rotten. 9 Uh-huh. JIM: 10 DAVID: Well, let me tell you something about 11 Christ. He lived here 2000 years ago with humanity, 12 and he saw that there was hope. Now, the way it 13 appears to you is our situation here is heavy and tight 14 and you're concerned, which this is good, that you get all the people out that you can. And I appreciate 15 that. Especially the innocent and everything. 16 17 JIM: We want everyone, uh-huh. 18 DAVID: Okay, now here's the deal. 19 JIM: Uh-huh. 20 DAVID: I feel the same way for you and this 21 world. I'm in my position because I know what's going 22 on upstairs, you know. I've done everything in the 23 world to avoid this. I've done everything in the world 24 with Robert to avoid this. 25 JIM: Okay.

DAVID: Now, I'm just trying to do my best to

1 get the innocent out, too. 2 JIM: Right. 3 DAVID: When you played that recording on 4 the, the radio, there may not be very many but there's 5 going to be someone out there that's going to say, hey, wait a minute. He showed me point blank that Psalms 45 6 is the first Seal. 7 8 There's a whole lot of people. JIM: 9 DAVID: Yeah, I know. And they're going to say, but wait a minute. But he's a terrorist. 10 11 wait a minute, he's this and he's that. He's a child 12 molester. He's blah, blah, blah. 13 JIM: But I didn't tell you this, Craig Smith 14 from the Christian Broadcast Network --15 DAVID: Yeah. 16 JIM: -- exactly what you said, just there, 17 happened today. Exactly what you said there happened 18 today. He called us and said that the Christian 19 response in support of your message was overwhelming, 20 incredible. But, but the people were starting to worry 21 because you didn't come out. Other than that, I mean 22 he was getting calls -- he said, I can't handle the 23 calls. That's what he told me. 24 DAVID: Okay. But here's the thing. Did 25 they also inform them that I have a commander above me?
