I -- the news media, you know, twists and turns things. And the problem is, if 5 6 you guys were out, you could straighten a lot of that 7 out. It's hard to do from in there. JIM KAVANAUGH: -- and the Christians --6 7 they've changed a little now as you know, but the 8 Christians seem to be a little bit more accepting and 9 the Catholics seem to care about all the rules, you 10 know. 11 STEVE: Right. 12 JIM KAVANAUGH: But, you know, I mean, you got to believe, it's just the way it is. 13 14 Well, you know, we don't judge STEVE: 15 anybody whether they do or don't. I mean we love people and in honesty if they can't see things, you 16 17 know we give them that credit and believe according to 18 Romans 2 and 3 that (indiscernible--interfering noise) 19 much like came to them and what they did with their 20 opportunities. I believe one day, an honest seeker, if 21 he was agnostic, a buddhist, if he did the best he 22 could with the light he had, God will be merciful in 23 that manner. This is what we've always taught and 24 believe that now. We also believe that as in the days 25 of Noah, God was going to bring a judgement upon the world and the majority of the world said "no, you

won't," so he did. And, after the flood, God says I'll never destroy the world with a flood again, and he says, well yes you will. They built the Tower of Babel to and get away from a flood that would never come. So Christ matched twenty forces in the final days, he says, it wasn't in the days of Noah, that's when it will be the final days.

So in the last days, there's a message for people. There's to be an ark of safety, but where is it to be moved, what kind of an ark of safety. No wooden boat is going to help you and I in this generation of course. So this is what the Prophets all talk about. What God is going to offer for a way out. We're all sinners. I'm no better than anybody else in this world [gap] I've tried to be a Christian, I've tried this, tried that, but I've always loved truth. I've never said that I know Christ because my lifestyle doesn't show it even though I've tried for years.

JIM KAVANAUGH: Well, that's honesty Steve. Some people try to fool you and tell you, that they, that's why they don't see him, but that can't be.

STEVE: Well, I see a very high standard in Christianity when you look at the writings of Christ and you look at the writings of the Prophets and the Apostles. Like even John says those that are born again do not commit sin. So, that brings up a

question, well, if we sin are we born again? And then 1 2 you have a lot of Evangelicals running around saying, 3 hey, are you saved? Are you born again? They look at me and I say to them, "I'm not, I'd like to be, but God 4 5 requires something. He tells us in the final days how 6 you can become born again." It's found in Ezekiel 36 7 [gap] and the Apostles themselves for twelve years and 8 they ran, I mean for three years and they ran around 9 They were people that fought for with Christ. 10 position and they argued amongst themselves, but the time came when they all ran away when he died. But 11 12 then when they were gathered together they finally 13 obeved --

JIM KAVANAUGH (aside): Tell them to get ready. As soon as he stops rambling, I'm going to try to negotiate two more kids.

STEVE: (indiscernible) something that never happened to me -- tongues of fire lighting on the heads of these individuals. They went out and raised the dead, healed the sick, and you know, it's not happening anymore.

JIM KAVANAUGH: I know.

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STEVE: But the Prophets foresaw that it didn't work two thousand years ago. It did for awhile, but it says in the final days of Revelation 13, this time Satan is going to work the miracles, and will

1 cause fire to come down out of Heaven which Elijah did three thousand years ago, but this time it's not God 2 behind it. So the only way we'll know the truth from a 3 faulty is by what the Book says in its entirety and its 4 harmonization. So this is why we like to have people 5 have an opportunity. We don't claim to be able to do 6 any miracles. We're not Pentecostal. We try to be 7 very factual, not go by feelings. Everybody in all 8 9 religions have feelings, but you know, God is not 10 against that or anything. But, we look at the sure 11 word, what God says he's going to do. 12 JIM KAVANAUGH: Okay. 13 STEVE: It's going to be hard for the flesh, 14 of course, but we'll try to hang in there and try to do 15 the best we can with our fellow man. 16 JIM KAVANAUGH: I understand. 17 STEVE: So, all these years that I've been 18 with him and worked with him, you know, we've never 19 harmed anybody, never touched anyone and, we've had a 20 lot of threats. I was with him and went over to 21 England and there were theologians that got a hold of me and warned me about my, you know, my life would be 22 23 in danger and I--24 JIM KAVANAUGH: Just for what you believe in? 25 STEVE: Yes, because, you know, what was

happening, we were offering information to a lot of

theology students, those that were paying about \$10,000 a year to become ministers. And, we didn't charge anything. We raised questions that they could not answer. We said in honesty, if you really want to know the book called the Bible, you know, let us present something. You can ask any questions you want. If we can't show you the answer right in the Book, not give an opinion and a theory, well then you've lost nothing but an exercise of the mind and a little time. But if you see something there, you know, meditate on it, look at it, go back on your own and wrestle with the issues, and you know, it's between you and God. 

Even when I first met David, I was, I thought to myself, God, what is this, a Jim Jones, you know anything with a small group off in the middle of who knows where, you know you've got to wrestle with the issues. And for six months, I went back and forth with that Bible trying to prove him wrong.

JIM KAVANAUGH: I'm no theologian or religious scholar and I certain --

STEVE: Well, you're almost better off
because of that, Jim, because people like yourself that
have worldly experience, usually give a man more of
break. They do more listening than those in the
religious world. They already think they know God.
You can't do anything for them, so if there's a message

1 of impending doom and a way out, they won't take the time out what that way out might be. You know, this 2 3 has been what the testimony of the Prophets all the way through. You know, one law condemns us all. The Ten 4 Commandments, we don't keep it. It's a good law 5 6 (indiscernible--interfering noise) God's character. But there's another law, it's called the Law of the 7 8 Spirit of Life. It's from Romans 8, and in every generation God sends warnings by Prophets, but there 9 10 are always people that are picked that are everyday 11 people, Hosea and Micah, these guys were sheep herders, 12 and fig pickers. They didn't wear three piece suits. 13 They didn't have a lot of doctor degrees. Not to say 14 that's wrong, but God picked people that were humble, 15 that he could work with and every generation these kind 16 of men were rejected. 17 So, you know, the last days, we believe we're 18 in the last days as Christianity does at large, and the 19 word is very clear as to how it's all going to come to 20 an end. And we just want to make sure people have that 21 opportunity to take a look because it talks about in 22 all the Prophets about the Heavens departing as a 23 scroll. It's going to be a scary thing. If you ever 24 have the time, you know, write down Isaiah 24. God 25 says he's going to turn this globe, this planet upside

down and shake the inhabitants. Says it's going to

1 reel to and fro like a drunkard. People are going to be terrified. And, if they don't know information 2 3 ahead of time, it says if they run they'll fall into a 4 pit. And those that escape out of the pit will be 5 taken in a snare. See the thing is to if we're to stand still, but you can't without information, without 6 having an experience based upon trusting God's word, 7 8 not by your feelings, because we're all bad. I mean, 9 bad in that we have tendencies to do things that we don't even like ourselves, so this is what we've share 1.0 with people all over, and you know, to this time we 11 12 still are. 13 But, of course, we hold nothing against 14 anyone. We just want to make sure that people have 15 that opportunity to understand if they want. If they 16 don't, we respect that too. Its between them, God, and 17 the Judgement. 18 JIM KAVANAUGH: I understand. 19 STEVE: He probably wanted to talk to you 20 too, but he's still on with this guy. Do they notice her yet from your side? 7 JIM KAVANAUGH: Chuck, do they see Sita? 8 Sita's back inside, we think. Is she there? 9 STEVE: No, no. She should be outside. 10 JIM KAVANAUGH: Okay. 11 STEVE: Heading down the road. 12 JIM KAVANAUGH: Steve said she's outside he 13 thinks. 14 STEVE: Yeah, David just wanted to reassure, 15 just as soon as she gets back in the building, we're 16 sending two right away then. 17 JIM KAVANAUGH: Okay, as soon as Sita gets 18 back, we're going to do two more kids. Once we can 19 get, make sure that there's nobody there. 20 I'm really glad though that you told STEVE: 21 me that, it helps. 22 JIM KAVANAUGH: Yeah, we got to be straight. 23 I mean we can't play. Let's deal in honesty here. I 24 think these could be some folks that you know, I know you didn't tell them to go there, I believe that. But 25 I'm saying they could've went there on their own and

you didn't know it. They're trying to help. 1 2 STEVE: Right. JIM KAVANAUGH: All right. Sita's coming 3 out. Yeah. Sita's coming out now. 4 5 STEVE: Yeah, they see her? JIM KAVANAUGH: Sita, okay, she's coming out 6 7 to check around. [gap] I think they're in the guard 8 shack. I think there's two in the quard shack. 9 STEVE (aside): He thinks, he thinks there's 10 two in the guard shack. 11 JIM KAVANAUGH: A couple in some trees. 12 Trees I guess across the driveway, in the bushes. 13 STEVE (aside): And a couple of trees or 14 bushes across the drive. No, none of theirs. None of 15 theirs. David is saying again. They're none of ours. 16 JIM KAVANAUGH: Okay. We've got to find out 17 who's who, you know? 18 STEVE: Wow. 19 JIM KAVANAUGH: You know, since we've pulled 20 our people back, I mean we haven't sent nobody up 21 there, but that car to get the kids, I swear. 22 Okay. [gap] the car that came up to STEVE: pick up the last two or any of the four, was it noted 24 then? 25 JIM KAVANAUGH: Well, they didn't tell me. STEVE: Does anybody there know?

1 JIM KAVANAUGH: Sol? 2 STEVE: Spotted them even then? 3 JIM KAVANAUGH: Let me get through. Chuck, were those guys there when the car went to pick up the 4 5 kids the last time? Did they see them? Okay, the driver didn't see them. 6 7 STEVE: She didn't? 8 JIM KAVANAUGH: Okay, but the guys with the 9 night vision glasses, one in the back, they see them, 10 they're watching them. 11 STEVE: Wow, I tell you what. I'm sure 12 curious myself. I mean if they're people we know, I'd 13 sure like to know who they are. 14 JIM KAVANAUGH: Like I say, if it is, they 15 just don't know what's what. And, they may be scared. 16 And, you know, they don't know exactly what's going on 17 so, maybe Sita can, if she recognizes them, she can say 18 hey come on in, or you know whatever. 19 STEVE: Right. 20 JIM KAVANAUGH: Or they can walk out, you 21 know, whatever they want to do. [gap] How's David 22 doing? 23 How are you doing David? STEVE: 24 JIM KAVANAUGH (aside): He's asking David how he's doing, but --25 JIM KAVANAUGH: Is he getting weak Steve?

I can see him from where I'm at here 1 STEVE: 2 and I think he's listening to the radio. 3 JIM KAVANAUGH: Well, he sounded a lot 4 stronger to me and I felt good about that. I don't 5 think, David's off the radio. 6 STEVE: Pardon? 7 JIM KAVANAUGH: David was through with the 8 radio guy? 9 STEVE: Yes. Yes, he is. 10 JIM KAVANAUGH: Okay. The agent's passing me 11 a note. Well get him on the phone. I can't get off 12 this line, but you can get him on another line. [gap] 13 I wonder how Sita, Sita still out there? Oh, you can't 14 see her. 15 STEVE: They can. They've got night scopes. 16 But I'm not in communication with them right at the 17 moment. What's happening with Sita? Can somebody give me word? 18 JIM KAVANAUGH: I was just holding, just in 19 20 case he asked for me again. Just wait a little while. 21 She's just going? STEVE: 22 JIM KAVANAUGH: I don't know if he'll ask for 23 I'll try to talk him out of it. 24 Jim, Jim? STEVE: JIM KAVANAUGH: Yeah, go ahead Steve. 25 STEVE: They said she's just going now. I'm

1 disappointed. 2 JIM KAVANAUGH: That's okay. I understand. I was slow in getting that truck down there, I know 3 it's not your fault. You know, it's hard. We got a 4 lot of people. 5 6 STEVE: Playing again? Oh, I see, they're 7 playing the -- [gap] 8 JIM KAVANAUGH: Are they talking about David? 9 STEVE: Yeah. 10 JIM KAVANAUGH: That's good. (indiscernible) 11 I just don't want to hang up right now. She hopefully 12 can see with that flashlight. It's pretty dark out 13 You're not at a window where you can see them, 14 are you Steve? 15 STEVE: No. 16 JIM KAVANAUGH: These little children are beautiful and --17 18 They're all very well behaved. STEVE: 19 JIM KAVANAUGH: They were, they're just 20 gorgeous and they're just so polite and smiling. We 21 gave them a cold drink and they've got a lady with them 22 and they're fine. 23 STEVE: Okay, that's good. One of the worse 24 things that reports --25 JIM KAVANAUGH: Tell them to hold those kids, just a minute, I'm afraid that the mother of the second

bunch wants to talk to them. 2 STEVE: (indiscernible) we, David said, 3 there's no one in the shack. The van's not there. There's no one in the shack. Where else did she look? 4 5 They said across the street in bushes there were a 6 couple. 7 JIM KAVANAUGH: A couple. 8 STEVE: Right? 9 JIM KAVANAUGH: Hold on. 10 STEVE: Okay. Guys with night goggles 11 watching the road. 12 JIM KAVANAUGH: That's probably Sita, right? 13 With a flashlight? We seen a lady out from the 14 compound on the EE Road. Okay, he said that the team 15 sees people pulling back from EE Road. toward--STEVE: Hello? 16 17 JIM KAVANAUGH: Steve? 18 STEVE: Yeah. 19 OPERATOR: This is the operator. I have an 20 emergency for 863-5252 from A Current Affair, will 21 you--22 JIM KAVANAUGH: No, no. Operator, this is a 23 Federal Agent. 24 Jim, is there any way I could talk to them and call you back? Could I? 25 JIM KAVANAUGH: I'll allow that, but let me

1 get the operator first. 2 STEVE: Okav. 3 OPERATOR: I'm here, sir. 4 STEVE: Operator? JIM KAVANAUGH: Operator, wait, operator? 5 6 STEVE: This is the number that you want to 7 reach and I would like to talk to Current Affair. 8 JIM KAVANAUGH: Okay, operator, operator. 9 OPERATOR: Yes. 10 JIM KAVANAUGH: This is Jim Kavanaugh, I'm a 11 United States Treasury Agent, I'm talking--12 STEVE: Jim, can I call you right back? Let 13 me, I'll call you right back, or let me, I'll tell them 14 I'll call them back, is that okay? 15 JIM KAVANAUGH: Okay, yeah, okay. 16 STEVE: Okay. Operator, I'm going to call 17 Jim right back and I just want to get at least a 18 connection with you to talk to you and --19 JIM KAVANAUGH: Operator, okay, and do that 20 and I don't want you to break in on the line anymore. 21 OPERATOR: Sir, I cannot prevent that. 22 Okay, well operator, go ahead, thank STEVE: 23 you Jim, I'll get back with you. 24 JIM KAVANAUGH: The operator just cut in on 25 my line with Current Affair -- give it to him and she wouldn't not do it. (indiscernible voice in

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background) Well, they are but I don't know how many
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    -- get this set up--
 3
    (End of tape.)
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DAVID: -- just going to have to, you know, your job, you're going to have to bear with the responsibilities when, you know, you lost a lot of innocent lives, that's all I can say. You're going to have to, you know, you're going to have to take a look at some of the pictures of the little ones that ended up perishing, because, you know, you don't have that much jurisdiction, do you?

HENRY: Well--

DAVID: I mean, but the thing is this, you know, on the other hand, our God who sits on the throne is keeping better order of things than you guys are.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: I just wish you understood the reason why the Bible was written is because the Prophets were told to seal their Book till the end of time.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And how many times have all these churches been honking their heads saying that the end could come any day. You know, the longer, longer time takes, the less sin seems to be sinful. You know, today we have all these people doing all these terrible things in the name of theirself, you know?

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And it just seems to be normal routine life. I mean half the story is not even told.

1 HENRY: Well I think this whole incident is 2 very unfortunate and, I, you know, I sincerely wish 3 that it had never happened. 4 DAVID: Well, I wish Robert would have called me because, you know, I think, I think, what would have 5 been better, now this is hypothetical--6 7 HENRY: Uh-huh. 8 DAVID: --Just to make a point, maybe we 9 should have taken Robert as a hostage, huh? We could 10 have avoided a lot of bloodshed, couldn't we? 11 HENRY: Well, you know--12 DAVID: Don't you think? 13 **HENRY:** Well, I have no, it's difficult to 14 say--15 DAVID: -- then we'd be in trouble for taking 16 a hostage. 17 HENRY: -- if that had happened exactly. 18 Okay, you have a responsibility for the safety of the 19 people that are there with you, okay? DAVID: 20 Uh-huh. 21 And I think that you are leading your people in, in the fashion that you feel is the most 22 23 responsible way for you to do it. 24 That I know is to be done, right. DAVID: 25 Exactly, exactly, and I think that HENRY: you're doing the right thing in terms of, of saying

1 look, these children, that, you know, need to go out, 2 and then, and you're willing to, to show--3 DAVID: And give these people, give these 4 people--5 HENRY: Exactly, exactly--6 --time to look at what they're DAVID: 7 dealing with, to look at you big boys--8 HENRY: Exactly. 9 DAVID: --to watch your maneuvers, look at 10 all your show of might --11 HENRY: Well--12 DAVID: No, listen, let me, let me, let me--13 **HENRY:** Sure. 14 DAVID: --paint the picture, so we can watch 15 this exactly how this government and this world really 16 works. You know how this peaceful lamb-like beast 17 really under its breast, speaks as a dragon, you know. 18 HENRY: Uh huh. 19 This is one of the greatest soci--DAVID: 20 psychological formulas of man's division. I mean, it's 21 just like, you know, I realize, you know, the three, 22 the three men have talked with us thus far, are very 23 smooth, very calm, very understanding. But, what 24 really amazes me is how like with Jim, when I read to 25 him plainly from the Prophecies about an event, a Messiah, dealing in a situation with chariots that ran

1 like lightnings, that made thunders, that had flaming 2 torches--3 HENRY: Uh-huh. 4 -- that jostled in the streets, that 5 made the fir trees shake, I asked him, I said where in 6 the New Testament did you hear anything about Messiah 7 being involved with tank, with chariots with flaming torches. 8 9 Now mindful of the fact, we know that the Prophets 10 in their day could only understand the things of their 11 world. 12 HENRY: Right. 13 DAVID: I mean, you know, when it talks about 14 th--and their horses shall be as, you know, like the 15 evening wolves that are more terrible than the 16 leopards, and faster than leopards, you know, is the 17 Prophet really talking about real horses or is he only 18 trying to point out that he sees men which he can 19 identify men--20 HENRY: Uh-huh. 21 DAVID: -- and he sees vehicular transport 22 that's way beyond his comprehension and he's trying to 23 explain it with the things of his natural world. 24 Which he can understand. HENRY: 25 Which are the things that he's trying DAVID:

to relate.

1 HENRY: Uh-huh. 2 DAVID: You know, and if they roar like a 3 lion, does that mean that they're a lion or is a lion just the only reality that he knows in his life that is 4 fearful. 5 Uh-huh, right. 6 HENRY: 7 And so, you know, it's just like, 8 when Ezekiel says that God travels on this chariot, and 9 that there's these flames, and there's these torches, and it sounds like the thunders of the Heaven. 10 11 see, is he really talking about a cloud or is he 12 talking about some kind of vehicle with lights, and 13 some kind of vehicle with, you know, makes a noise of 14 thunder, because it's really a highly sophisticated, 15 you know, implement of the higher universes. 16 HENRY: Uh-huh. 17 DAVID: You've seen the documentary, Chariots 18 of the Gods? 19 Uh-huh. HENRY: 20 DAVID: It kind of develops a good scientific 21 question, doesn't it? 22 HENRY: It sure does. 23 Right. Well, do you actually think DAVID: 24 that man, mankind, as you know mankind, could have been 25 realistically a part of a universal society? Remember,

our ancient fathers have given us record--

1 HENRY: Uh-huh. 2 DAVID: -- that men from other worlds have 3 visited our world. 4 HENRY: Right. 5 Now this is not biblical. It's more DAVID: scientific. 6 7 HENRY: Uh-huh. 8 DAVID: You know, so all the, all nations, 9 the hieroglyphics, the technologies of the past 10 ancients, well, I wonder, I wonder why that the concept 11 of good and evil is such an important part of every social direction of man. Everyone has the question of 12 13 the right and wrong way of doing things. 14 HENRY: Uh-huh. 15 DAVID: But, you know, isn't it strange how 16 that God would wait to the latter days before he passes 17 judgement on the world? Because a lot of the 18 prophecies of the bible cannot really be understood--19 HENRY: Right. 20 DAVID: --until man's technology so advances 21 to a degree that he can understand the real meanings of 22 the prophecies. 23 HENRY: Uh-huh. 24 DAVID: Now we know the flaming, the chariots with flaming torches that make noise like thunder, you 25

know, we know what that really is, don't we?

1	HENRY: Sure.
2	DAVID: What is it?
3	HENRY: Well, the same thing that you're
4	talking about.
5	DAVID: Tanks.
6	HENRY: Right.
7	DAVID: Okay. Now, how would the Prophet be
8	justified of such an event saying that Messiah is being
9	confronted with a situation and yet we know clearly
10	from Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, no such thing
11	happened.
12	HENRY: What do you think?
13	DAVID: Well, it would make the Prophet
14	false, wouldn't it?
15	HENRY: Sure.
16	DAVID: But of course Christ says "think not
17	that I've come to destroy the law of the Prophets,"
18	that's what he told his disciples.
19	HENRY: Uh-huh.
20	DAVID: Some come not to destroy, but to
21	fulfill.
22	HENRY: Right.
23	DAVID: And, until Heaven and Earth pass, not
24	one jot or tittle shall pass from the law or the
25	prophets until all be fulfilled. Heaven and Earth
	shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away.

1 Now what are the words of Christ? Well, John, he 2 always keeps telling the Jews that this doctrine is not 3 his own, but the doctrine that he received from his father. 4 5 HENRY: Uh-huh. Revelation, what are those seven 6 DAVID: 7 seals, I wonder. It's probably a situation that when 8 Christ does come, he's going to get into a situation, 9 'cause remember he is a political leader, isn't he? 10 HENRY: Uh-huh. 11 DAVID: Would you consider Christ a political 12 leader? 13 HENRY: Leader of all, you know, political --14 DAVID: Well, I mean, I'm sure that if he was 15 to come today in the clouds of glory, I'm sure that 16 your, your national leaders and all of your great 17 empire directors and all that would no doubt have a 18 united, United Council, the Pontiff and all the leaders 19 of all churches and of all governments would come 20 together and sit down and talk about some things cause 21 naturally his armies of the universe is far greater 22 than the armies of this world. 23 HENRY: Uh-huh. 24 DAVID: Okay. Well that's going to happen. HENRY: 25 Sure.

DAVID:

But the thing of it is, it happens

after a catastrophe. Because, you know, I bet that the 1 2 gentiles of today are really no better than the Jews of 3 yesterday. What would you want to bet? 4 HENRY: I'm sure that that makes a lot of 5 sense. You know, Isaiah said that Israel 6 DAVID: 7 didn't believe the prophets, that's what he tells us in 8 Chapter 1 and that God's going to forsake his people 9 because they're like the Philistines. They're soothsayers and they have their own imaginations, but 10 11 they don't walk in God's word. 12 HENRY: Uh-huh. 13 DAVID: What Isaiah says in Chapter Two, 14 verse One, he says, "but in the last days, it shall 15 come to pass, but the mountain of the Lord's house," 16 that was Mt. Zion, Mt. Zion, --17 HENRY: Uh-huh. 18 DAVID: That's where the ancient throne of 19 David once sat, "shall be established in the top of all 20 mountains and shall be exalted of above all hills, and 21 all nations shall flow in to it." Excuse me here. 22 HENRY: Okay. 23 Now, if that's the case, then on the 24 last days we should be waiting for that to happen.

it spiritual, is it literal, well it says that he shall

sit upon the throne and rebute many nations of far off

25

1 and they shall beat their swords and their plowshares, 2 and their spears into pruning hooks. Nation will not 3 lift up sword against nation. Neither will they learn more anymore. That sounds good, don't it? 4 5 Well, I don't know, you know, if it's HENRY: 6 going to be good. 7 DAVID: Well, I mean if someone big enough, 8 bigger than the world intervened and told all these 9 brothers and sisters of this old world to put their 10 weapons down, it's kind of like -- have you ever had a 11 brother before? 12 HENRY: Sure. 13 DAVID: Did you ever like get into a fist 14 fight with your brother? 15 HENRY: Well, not since I was a kid. 16 DAVID: Okay, that's what I'm talking about. 17 But then dad kind of stepped around the corner of the 18 hallway? 19 Uh-huh. HENRY: 20 DAVID: Kind of brought peace, didn't it? 21 HENRY: Sure did. 22 Okay. Well, that's kind of like what DAVID: 23 has to happen because, the world, even though men may 24 grow to maturity, they're still really in a large way, 25 children.

HENRY: I think you're right.

1 DAVID: And, just a lot of these children 2 have this cover called refinement, eloquency, you know, they're good orators. It makes man seem a little more 3 on the outside than what really man is on the inside. 4 5 Now I'm sure even Pope John Paul likes to every once in awhile, I don't know, he might like to fly model 6 7 airplanes or something. 8 HENRY: Laughter. 9 DAVID: He might like to -- he might have a choo choo train, now come on, you see what I'm saying? 10 11 HENRY: Yeah. 12 DAVID: I'm sure he might have his favorite 13 fishing pole. 14 HENRY: Uh-huh. 15 DAVID: Because nobody likes to just sit all day long and read out of the Bible or read out of 16 17 catechism. 18 HENRY: That's true. 19 DAVID: And even Solomon, that Solomon says 20 much studiness, much study is a weariness to the mind. 21 HENRY: Uh-huh. 22 Okay, so Solomon did say though, that 23 in all of his wisdom as a great king, and you know, 24 some of the greatest wisdom in all of the world 25 literature wise, comes from the Bible, wouldn't you think?

HENRY: Absolutely.

DAVID: A lot of it's so deep a lot of people don't know the meanings of it but definitely it's an inspired book even if it's just poetic. You know, in high school you can learn bible as lit which is not a doctrinal thing, but just it kind of looks at the poetry and the connection of language, the flow of thought that the ancient writers had.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: Anyway, Solomon, he makes a lot of comments in Ecclesiastes about life and death, love, hatred, the meanings of man, oppression and power and weakness, and he finally says in the conclusion beginning in chapters 11 and 12 of Ecclesiastes, he says, "now young man," he says "go ahead and go in the way of your heart, do what is right in your own eyes."

He says, "but no, that for these things, God will bring you into the judgement." He said "now remove sorrow from your heart and tears from your eyes," he says "fear God now in the days of your youth before the evil days come when you will have no pleasure in them. Before the time when the time will come when the sun, moon and stars will be darkened."

Now, soon the stars will be darkened. Do you know of any event in the Book of Revelation about the sun, moon and stars being darkened? Do you remember that

last night? 1 2 HENRY: Uh-huh. 3 DAVID: The sixth seal? 4 HENRY: Right. 5 DAVID: Some of the stars were dark and the 6 stars fell due to the fig tree shaking? 7 HENRY: Uh-huh. 8 It says at the time when the clouds 9 will return after the rain, of course there's supposed 10 to be a rain, the prophecies teach that there will be a 11 rain according to the time when Messiah is trying to 12 warn the world. (indiscernible) Nahum and it says that the clouds will come, it will have a short rain, and 13 14 all of a sudden it will stop. 15 HENRY: Okay. 16 And clear up. But it talks about 17 this belligerent power that, you know, flaunts its 18 might, magnifies itself against the truth, the Lord, of 19 course it says in the Habakkuk, it says regard ve 20 amongst the heathen and wonder marvously. For I will 21 work will work in your day that you will not believe 22 what we told you. Of course that's just the way heathens are. You know, they don't take any real 23 24 warnings from God. They don't fear God. 25 HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: But anyway it says in Ecclesiastes

that you know, fear God before the sun, moon and stars 1 2 are darkened, before the clouds return after the rain. Because the next time the clouds return, oh boy. 3 4 prophets teach something about these latter clouds. 5 The gathering of these clouds in thick darkness. 6 like it was two thousand years ago when Messiah was 7 being killed--Uh-huh. 8 HENRY: 9 DAVID: -- the clouds came, the thunder in the heavens--10 11 HENRY: Uh-huh. 12 DAVID: --and darkness was over the earth--13 HENRY: Uh-huh. 14 DAVID: Yeah, well, that's going to be 15 repeated. But it says when He, God, shall rise up at 16 the voice of the bird. Now at the voice of the bird, 17 what bird? You know, Isaiah talks about Messiah and Isaiah calls him a ravenous bird from the east. Of 18 19 course we know in Revelation, the one who seals the one 20 hundred and forty four thousand are sins from the east. 21 Now, this is a very clear light. As lightning 22 (indiscernible) from the west. You know, when 23 lightning flashes, everybody sees it don't they. 24 HENRY: Uh-huh. 25 In Heaven there's lightnings, DAVID: thunders, and voices isn't there?

1 HENRY: Uh-huh. 2 DAVID: God likes a lot of rain showeres, doesn't he? 3 4 HENRY: Sure does. 5 DAVID: Okay, so you know, these seven 6 thunders no doubt emphasize a fact that God wants men to hear his word in thunder tones. Like in the Book of 7 Job, God is talking to Job and God says that wisdom 8 will be found at the end of the world in the secret 9 places of thunder. Have you ever heard of the seven 10 11 thunders yet, Henry? 12 HENRY: Seven? 13 DAVID: Seven thunders. Revelation 10, verse 14 7. 15 HENRY: Okay. 16 DAVID: (indiscernible) mystery of God the 17 seven thunders will be finished. 18 HENRY: Okay. 19 DAVID: The seven seals. 20 HENRY: Okay. That's what we talked about, 21 yes, okay. 22 Right. Now you know, a lot of people 23 are saying that I jump all over the Bible. The reason 24 why I do that is because all the prophets have talked about this event. 25 HENRY: Uh-huh.

1 DAVID: And Isaiah talks about, 2 (indiscernible) says, he says, "send ye the lamb." Now we know who the lamb is, don't we? 3 HENRY: Right. 4 5 DAVID: Send ye, now this is Isaiah 16, "send 6 ye the lamb to the rulers of the land from Sela for it 7 shall be in the wandering bird cast out of his nest. 8 Now who's a wandering bird? The lamb's a wandering 9 bird. 10 HENRY: Uh-huh. 11 DAVID: Cast out of his nest. And it goes on 12 and talks about this bird being amongst the heathen and 13 it says about the heathen, it says, "take counsel," 14 which is what we're doing now we're taking counsel. 15 says "execute judgement" We got to, we got to do some 16 judging now here. It says "bewray not him that 17 wander." You know what bewray means, don't you? When 18 you bewray someone? 19 HENRY: Yeah. 20 DAVID: It means you scare them, right? 21 HENRY: Right. 22 DAVID: It says "scare not him that 23 wandereth," okay? 24 Uh-huh. HENRY: 25 It says, "let my outcast dwell with DAVID: thee." Okay? Now, who is this wandering bird cast out

of its nest? Well, you know, right before the armies
of Israel were to destroy Jericho, God placed in
Jericho some spies, and these men were spies that were
sent from Israel to get inside the city and to watch
and to see the activities of the city.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: Well, the leaders there discovered this and they started searching for them. And these men made their way and finally came to a harlot's house and we know harlots don't have a good reputation in sociality, do they?

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And her name was Rayhab. Now these spies asked of Rayhab a very unique favor. They asked Rayhab to hide them. Now Rayhab had been raised with the Gods of the, you know, Philistines, the Gods of that time, Miradoc (phonetic), you know Bale (phonetic), different Gods, Ishtar and everything, and she pretty much concluded in her days of her youth that this all baloney.

HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And she entered into a profession that she knew what religion was. She knew that men didn't love her. Men loved it. So she wasn't going to be deceived by all this so called forms and regulations of worship. She was going to do what was natural and

1 what was carnal. But when she saw the power of the God 2 of Israel in dealing with the Gods of Egypt, -- now remember in the days of Egypt they had long forgotten 3 the miracles done in the days of Joseph. 4 5 HENRY: Uh-huh. 6 DAVID: For the Pharaoh rose up and knew not 7 Joseph, so Israel, Egypt was once blessed, just like 8 America is. But they moved far beyond the beginning 9 point of where those blessings came from, so they came 10 up to the point where they had to be judged and so God was going to use Egypt as an example to all other 11 12 nations. 13 HENRY: Uh-huh. 14 Okay. so now here, Rayhab, the harlot 15 witnesses this. Now she knows there's a living God in 16 Egypt. Well she says to these spies, you know, why 17 should I hide you? Your God is a true God. 18 You know, but she did, but she asked, she says, look, 19 if I show you this mercy, will you not have mercy upon 20 me and my house? 21 And so what happened was, is that they promised 22 her that not just her, but all the people of Jericho, 23 if they would come into her house, you know, that they 24 would be spared. 25 Uh-huh. HENRY:

DAVID: So this is the way Christ still shows

1 mercy in the face of a pending judgement. It's going to be their natural nature not to want to know truth. Cause the carnal man doesn't believe in the things of God. So the way that we have to really realize there's a God, is we have to stop and ask ourselves, now wait a minute, in the book of Nahum, are those chariots really two wheeled carts made of wood? Or are they really machinery that transport men that have actually flaming torches that shake the earth and

sound like thunder and causes the trees to shake. 1 2 HENRY: Uh-huh. 3 DAVID: I mean was the prophet really looking at a tank? 4 5 HENRY: He was looking with the experience 6 that he had at the time. 7 And he was trying to describe what he DAVID: 8 was seeing. 9 HENRY: Exactly. 10 DAVID: Do you know what, do you know what 11 they could have done in those days if they had a tank? 12 HENRY: (slight laughter) 13 DAVID: Do you know if we had a take in the 14 days in two hundred years ago, we had one of these 15 Brads what we could've done? There wouldn't have been no Indian problem, would there? But I tell you what, 16 17 these things are all a part of the gifts of creation. 18 HENRY: Uh-huh. 19 DAVID: When God said in the Book of Daniel 20 that in the last days much knowledge should be 21 increased, he means it. And the reason being is, is 22 that because of a lot of minds of men, in their own 23 reasoning, they, they create within themselves oh, an 24 infidel type spirit. Like people will say you know, oh 25 how can God write all my sins in a book? You know and it seems like it would take a lot pages wouldn't it?

1 HENRY: Sure would. 2 Well, you know, the God, God had to DAVID: 3 in the ancient times, he had to communicate with man 4 according to the light that they had in the world. And the form of communication was developed through the 5 hieroglyphics and finally became more short formed into 6 7 the structure of sounds, the syllables, the oratations 8 (Sic) of communication, the meaning of signs and 9 syllables, which became alphabets, numerologies. 10 you know, man, man, like I say has been able to 11 communicate, whereas in the days of Moses, God very 12 clearly required that the Hebrew inform men by the 13 structure of lettering, or reading, which Hebrew is 14 refined hieroglyphics, you know, and God so inspired it 15 by writing the, the dialogue, the Ten Commandments, and 16 you know, God had chosen this means of communication 17 for men to be able to transfer thought from one to 18 another. 19 HENRY: Uh-huh. 20 DAVID: Although we know that this means 21 sometimes falls short of actually, presenting the 22 actual mind of one man to another. 23 HENRY: Uh-huh.

DAVID: I mean you can read some--you can read your girlfriend's letter and really don't understand what she said. So you'd have to ask, you'd

Just about all of the 16 prophet writers are dead, aren't they? 17 HENRY: Absolutely. 18 DAVID: Yeah, you see, so it's kind of like, when someone translates their writings from Hebrew or 19 20 Aramaic into English, whatever, we're kind of left to 21 the mercies of the interpreters, aren't we? 22 HENRY: We sure are. 23 The translators and that kind of 24 makes the Bible a little more weak, doesn't it? 25 HENRY: Well. DAVID: Well, it does, because, like I say,

1 any fundamentalist will have a certain knowledge of 2 scripture, but if he got into higher ranks of theology, with the gentlemen up there that earned their 3 professors and doctor degrees and all that, right? 4 5 HENRY: Uh-huh. 6 He wouldn't be able to contend would DAVID: 7 he? Because like for instance when you talk about 8 wisdom in Proverbs 8 and 9, our person wouldn't say well wisdom in Proverbs 8 and 9 is talking about 9 10 knowledge of man. 11 HENRY: Uh-huh. 12 DAVID: But of course their Rabbi would say, 13 you know, he'd say not so, he'd say the word, hokoma 14 (phonetic) which means wise woman, which goes back to 15 the ancient concept of life. Whereas, you know, we procreate through a woman, made in the form and fashion 16 17 of dust as we are. But our Creator brought this woman 18 from our side which is a mystery of how God with His 19 wisdom, the Mother of all Creation, His word, His 20 spirit, that gives life unto man, can also be taken 21 from man to make a compatible image for man. In other 22 words, they twain are one, aren't they? 23 HENRY: Uh-huh. 24 DAVID: You're not complete unless you have a 25 man and a woman.

HENRY: Right.

1 DAVID: One is not complete without the 2 other. Uh-huh. 3 HENRY: 4 DAVID: Okay, so it takes two heads to make 5 one. 6 **HENRY:** Right. 7 DAVID: Okay, and that's fruitful then. 8 HENRY: Uh-huh. 9 Communication, you got to love the DAVID: 10 person you're talking to. You got to understand the 11 person you're talking to. You come together in this 12 communication. And the highest communication is is 13 that you all become two as one. 14 HENRY: Right. 15 Offspring. So it bears fruit. 16 every good conversation should bear fruit, shouldn't 17 it? 18 HENRY: Sure. 19 DAVID: Now, now Christ he doesn't, two 20 thousand years ago, he doesn't, he doesn't take women 21 and speak to them when and then come into their bodies, 22 does he? 23 HENRY: No. 24 Okay, so, so we know that out of 25 Adam, came this power to communicate, to reason, to become one with oneself in the nature of God, and she

1 was Eve, she was Eshia (phonetic). 2 HENRY: Uh-huh. He was Esh (phonetic) and she was 3 But when they sinned, they were naked and there 4 was a discommunication, wasn't there? 5 6 HENRY: Uh-huh. 7 Okay, but now, when Christ came, Paul DAVID: 8 says he was the fullness of the godhead bodily. And he 9 never had a woman, but on the cross, when they pierced 10 his side, a woman didn't come out, right? 11 **HENRY:** No. 12 DAVID: But blood and water came out. 13 water seems to be a symbol of the spirit. The 14 submersion in the spirit, pure and holy water of 15 cleansing. You know, just as we have a dirty body, we 16 wash our bodies with water, we become clean. 17 Uh-huh. HENRY: 18 DAVID: Well what if you have a dirty mind? 19 How can we wash our minds from filth? Now, that 8 floored her. Okav? 9 HENRY: Uh-huh. 10 DAVID: Now, those living waters was the 11 spirit of prophecy. The ability to know that to deal 12 with the very necessities and needs of a simple heart. She said "Sir, I perceive thou are a prophet." And 13 14 then she went into the subject of, we know the Messiah 15 is coming and when he cometh he will show us all 16 Then Christ tells her, I've been talking with 17 (indiscernible). So that when the 3 4 time comes and there's time no longer, when this 5 mystery of God has to be finished, this subject will 6 judge the greatest nation that's ever been, and a 7 nation that's been more blessed than any other nation 8 in the world. 9 HENRY: That's right. 10 DAVID: And the keynote is is that sad to 11 say, scripture forewarns that the heathen will not 12 understand. 13 HENRY: Uh-huh. 14 DAVID: It even goes to explain why they won't understand. You see Pharaoh believed he was God. 15 16 Now most people believe that whatever they think in their mind is of God. That's what I'm being accused of 17 18 right now. There saying, well, he thinks God's talking 19 to him, so he's just putting a kink, you know, in our 20 plan or he's scared and he's trying to buy time, or you 21 know, this is natural for the way men think. A natural 22 terrorist would do that. A natural, you know, person 23 that's into apparently a lot trouble would do that.

Mental sickness is a likewise a physical 25 sickness. They both go in hand in hand.

1 DAVID: Okay, so, so a psychologist begins at 2 the source of all evil, and the source of sickness by 3 allowing the person to let the wounded heart bleed a bit. 4 5 HENRY: Uh-huh.
