SCHNEIDER: I, I've never heard anything 12 really bad to be honest with you. 13 DICK: Well, we take pride in that. 14 what we're here to do. We're here to, to certainly 15 enforce the, the violations of, of law, but, but we're 16 here to do things within the parameters of the 17 constitution. 18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I like to hear that. 19 That's great. 20 DICK: And that's, that's -- I've been in the 21 Bureau 20-some years now, 22 years, and I've always, 22 I've always done that and, and the agents I deal with 23 act in the same fashion. And I don't think that you'll 24 have anybody inside there that would quarrel with, with 25 that at all.

It's going to 13 be argued. All those things will be done. And you're 14 going to be part of that operation. You're going to be 15 listened to. You're going to get the opportunity. 16 But, you know, what has to be done is you have to come 17 out to be able to do that. How, how else would you do 18 it? How else would you do that? 19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Very easy. The communication 20 line is going to be open right now where there can be a 21 dialogue, there can be a given a response -- a lot of 22 things can be opened up, many of the issues right from here before one even does that. I've seen too many 23 24 times in the past through others that have been 25 arrested and so forth that they're taken away never to be heard from again until they're in a court of law and

they never really do because of their circumstances or 1 2 the environment have an opportunity to really open up as to what really took place. 3 DICK: Is Greg, is Greg back, Steve? 4 5 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, he isn't. DICK: Okay. Well, let me know when he comes 6 back in, will you? 7 8 MR. SCHNEIDER: I will, I will. 9 Okay. Now listen, a case in point was 10 those two ladies the other day. 11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. You heard that they'd been charged 12 DICK: 13 with this and that. We went --14 MR. SCHNEIDER: By the way, who was behind making such a quick move to do such a thing as that in 15 16 the first place? 17 DICK: Well, you know, it's not us, I'll 18 guarantee you. And again, I told you I'd never lie to 19 you and I'm telling you I don't know but we got it taken care of didn't we? We went to them and said, 20 21 listen, these are elderly ladies, you think they're in 22 there shooting out the doors? Absolutely not. 23 what we did, we went to the appropriate people and said 24 this is, this is not right, this is just not 25 acceptable. And they took care of it.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. Isn't it funny how in

different countries or societies or situations 1 2 something can either be murder, it can be war, it can 3 be killing? Isn't it something? Like -- a country, someone's in their home and someone else is trying to 4 5 blow apart their house. What do they do? Depends upon what country at what time apparently you live doesn't 6 Like I'll tell you the truth, what I've seen and 7 8 noticed from a lot of people for a long time, where 9 were the FBI and the agencies when the L.A. riots were 10 taking place? Where was the protection for those 11 people? If they didn't have some of their own firearms 12 and so forth what would have they done? See, even at 13 this very -- what about the billions of dollars that 14 are being moved around because of drugs and so forth? 15 Where are all the agencies there getting all these big 16 guys constantly? 17 DICK: You know what? You know what? I'll, 18 I'll address that issue with you very clearly. 19 to work narcotics years ago. 20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Uh-huh. 21 You know, resources are unbelievably 22 short in this country to deal with an issue like that. 23 You think that I do not have the same opposition to 24 those kinds of activities that you do? 25 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm sure you do.

100 percent. I've got children in the

DICK:

school system, we all do. That is not acceptable to us 1 2 in any fashion. 3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, can I, can I give you an example of the way I've seen it through the 4 5 years? DICK: 6 Sure, sure. 7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Like for instance I'm living 8 in Hawaii where one Saturday night there was a church 9 group of us playing a game of volley ball. 10 DICK: Uh-huh. 11 MR. SCHNEIDER: And we came back to the cars. 12 One of the cars had been broken in, hundreds of dollars stolen and some different items had been also taken out 13 14 of the car. We contacted the police. They came an 15 hour and a half later. Never heard from them again. 16 had a car stolen back in the seventies. Called the department up, also never heard from them again. But 17 18 one day I'm driving down the street with my wife and a 19 female police officer came off of a, a ramp and hit is 20 broadside. I saw her coming. I tried to get away, 21 swerved in the oncoming lane to give her room --22 Um-hum. DICK: 23 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- but she still got me. 24 within minutes, within minutes there's like six squad cars there at her help. And what is going on?

DICK: Well --

SCHNEIDER: You always find police 4 officers if you're two, two miles an hour over the law 5 going down the road but when I've ever called them 6 because of theft or because of other problems, 7 seriously, I don't know what's happened. 8 DICK: Okay. Well, let me ask you --9 MR. SCHNEIDER: I really don't know what's 10 happened. 11 DICK: -- you mean you've only gotten one ticket in your life? 12 13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, no, of course not. 14 Okay. Well, how many times? 15 this is obviously a very minor point. But --16 MR. SCHNEIDER: But, you know, you understand 17 what I'm saying. DICK: -- many of the times that you've 18 19 done -- broken the law -- I mean, let me say this. We 20 all speed. But how many times we've been picked up for 21 speeding because there's nobody there? KATHY: And at the time I didn't even know if 4 he was with Scott and Krissy. 5 6 DICK: Okay, well, the kids are all together. 7 I think you -- I hope you feel more comfortable about 8 that. 9 KATHY: And I wanted to check on Brian 10 because he did have a fever Sunday, and he was throwing up Monday night before he left and I wanted to check on 11 12 his health right now. 13 DICK: Okay. Well, I'll make note of that 14 and -- in other words one child I know that was taken 15 to the doctor that may have had pneumonia. KATHY: But you don't know who it was? 16 17 DICK: No, that, that is, that is him. 18 That's he and he was given antibiotics. 19 KATHY: Okay. 20 DICK: Yeah. His fever is down, gone, and 21 those antibiotics I think took care of it. Of course, 22 they usually do pretty quickly if it doesn't get too 23 far along. So, yeah. 24 KATHY: He was real bad Sunday and Monday. 25

I know he was very concerned about you

not being there, and obviously you've got the four kids

DICK:

1 there. You want to get to them as soon as you can. 2 KATHY: He was, he is very young, so, I mean 3 4 DICK: Sure he is. 5 KATHY: He'll be three Sunday and he just --Those kids grow up quickly too, don't 6 DICK: 7 they? 8 KATHY: -- hasn't been away from me very 9 often so it's hard on him. 10 DICK: Sure it is. It's hard on you too. 11 KATHY: But --12 DICK: As a father, you know, I understand 13 those kinds of things. 14 KATHY: Yeah. DICK: Well, he'll be fine, but do you know 15 16 what? You know how we can get -- you need to -- care 17 yourself. Now, were you one of those people that had 18 specific instructions to give the kids about where they 19 wanted to stay? 20 KATHY: Yes. 21 Okay, and the kids had that. DICK: 22 told the, Steve and David, the kids are all together 23 now, and --24 I know they're going to be going to 25 the Child Protective Agency, but I --DICK: Well let's hope you -- let's hope that

that doesn't happen, okay? 1 2 KATHY: Yeah --I'm certainly not going to tell you 3 4 it's not going to happen at some point in time. 5 But if it were to happen, I just, I KATHY: 6 just, I just know it's going to be a real hassle for the kids to have to go through a lot of, you know, 7 different homes and different places if they're not 8 placed immediately with their father. 10 DICK: Well, I know that and you know that 11 and, and we're going to try to deal with those issues 12 as best we can. 13 KATHY: I mean, I would have them here with me if it were up to me. 14 15 DICK: Well, I'm sure the kids want to be 16 with you too. 17 KATHY: But for their own safety is why 18 they're out there. 19 DICK: Well --20 KATHY: Because there's no telling what these 21 people are going to do to us. 22 DICK: Well, now, what people are you talking 23 about? 24 Oh, I know what's out there. 25 Well, but I mean, when you say, "these DICK: people" you are including me because I'm one of these

people out here and I'm telling you --1 2 But you may not have the, the same KATHY: mind frame as some of the others that are out there 3 just doing their jobs. 4 5 Well, no, I can answer that for you 6 and, you know, I've tried to communicate this as -have the other fellows that have talked to some of the 7 8 folks out there and that isn't going to be done. Look, 9 how far along are we? It was Sunday? This is Friday. No one has been hurt. No one is going to be hurt and 10 11 we're going to reunite you, reunite you and your kids 12 and all the other folks in there with their kids. 13 Well then why are they still here? KATHY: 14 You know? I don't understand it. We don't want to 15 come out there. 16 DICK: Uh-huh. We have no -- no law says we have to 17 18 come out there, so --19 DICK: Well, listen. Obviously there's, 20 there's a problem here that's got to be straightened 21 You know, we can't walk away, that or just deny 22 that it didn't happen, right? 23 I'm sure there's, there's, you know, KATHY: 24 lot's of stuff that you have to do, but, myself, you know, I have a home here --25

DICK:

Sure.

1 KATHY: -- and I do not want to leave my 2 home.

DICK: I can understand that but we, all you folks are going to have to be interviewed just as all the participants from the ATF are going to have to be interviewed, and the way to do that is just be interviewed, get your interview done and get back with your life, get back to your life. That's the answer to that.

I'm not going to be -- I hope you're not naive to believe that we're just going to walk away from there.

KATHY: And I hope you're not under the -thinking that we don't know, I mean, as close as the
people have come to our building itself, that, you
know, we don't think they're just going to stand there
and wait forever.

DICK: Well, listen. I'm going to tell you that nobody is going to make any moves out there at all. Okay. We went over, I don't know if they instructed you folks, but yesterday we went over the safety rules and -- We're you made aware of those rules? Those safety rules? We call them safety rules. They for both of our mutual protections. Are you aware of those?

KATHY: I, I'm not sure exactly what you're talking about.

1 DICK: Okay, well, yesterday we discussed 2 some of the things that we're concerned about for safety issues. Which is, as long as no one inside 3 there makes any offensive moves at any of the folks 4 that are outside there, in return we're not going to do 5 anything either. I think we have to look at the 6 positive side of this. Since Sunday --7 8 KATHY: What do you mean by anything though? 9 I mean --10 In other words, we don't want anybody 11 carrying around weapons. We don't want anybody 12 standing at the windows sighting through scopes and 13 those kinds of things. 14 KATHY: But, what I'm saying is, we haven't 15 made any of the those types of --16 DICK: No, and I appreciate that. 17 KATHY: But we have things on our property 18 making all kinds of moves which, you know, offensive 19 moves can be made and not even known about by the -- by 20 anyone else. 21 DICK: Okay, but again we discussed these 22 rules yesterday for safety, and there -- it's not going 23 to happen, I mean, nobody's going to be hurt. There's 24 not going to be any further injury and we're all 25 concerned about that. It's just not going to happen. KATHY: If it doesn't happen, praise the

1 Lord, but that, I mean, I can't, I can't say what your 2 men out there feel, what, you know --3 DICK: Well, but, I'll tell you how they're feel, how they feel, and that is, you know, obviously 4 5 with the passage of time, people get a little impatient 6 and, like I was telling the fellows today, some, 7 sometimes, you know, somebody runs up and down the road in a vehicle, it doesn't impact on you or us. 8 It's, 9 it's not, it just isn't going to, you know, in terms of 10 our discussion, it isn't going to mean a thing. Nobody is going to come in there, nobody is going to do 11 12 anything to harm you or any of the other folks in 13 there, your kids --14 What do you mean by in there? KATHY: 15 DICK: I'm talking about in the compound 16 there. 17 KATHY: You mean in the building? 18 DICK: In all the buildings. Yes. We're, 19 we're not going to do that. 20 But they are in some buildings and KATHY: 21 they are on the property. 22 DICK: Well, now, I don't know what you're 23 referring to. What are you referring to? In what 24 buildings? You're suggesting that we have people 25 inside the building? The property? KATHY: Not in the main building that we are

1	in, but there are, you do have people on our property,
2	yes.
3	DICK: Where are you talking about? You're
4	talking about in those, in those vehicles out there?
5	KATHY: Yes.
6	DICK: Oh, yes, we do have, certainly.
7	KATHY: And I'm sure they have been out of
8	their vehicles and in other places on our property.
9	DICK: I have been assured that that is not
10	the case. Now, have you person
11	KATHY: I'm assuring you that it is.
12	DICK: Have you personally seen or heard
13	somebody?
14	KATHY: All right, let me tell you, let me
15	tell you exactly.
16	DICK: Okay.
17	KATHY: We have a white barn, dairy barn.
18	DICK: Okay, a white dairy barn.
19	KATHY: Down at the back of the property.
20	DICK: Okay.
21	KATHY: And there is at least one, if not
22	more, tanks stationed at that barn.
23	DICK: Okay, that might be. I mean, I don't,
24	I'm not going to argue with you.
25	KATHY: Three days, three days ago the light
	was on in the barn. Yesterday it was turned off. It

has been off. That means that someone had to go in the 1 2 barn. Is that not true? 3 DICK: If someone went in and turned it off, 4 yes, and I certainly wouldn't argue that point with 5 you. 6 KATHY: That's the only way, there's the only 7 way of turning it off. 8 DICK: Okay. 9 KATHY: So someone has definitely gone out of 10 the vehicle and gone inside. 11 DICK: Again, I don't want to argue that 12 point because --13 KATHY: Okay, well that's why I'm saying --14 DICK: -- it's, it's kind of a minor point, 15 but I'm saying that there are other ways for lights to 16 go out that we all know about. 17 KATHY: And it's not, that's not the only 18 thing I've seen. That's just one. 19 DICK: Okay. Well in addition to that, 20 sometimes things are done that we believe to be prudent 21 for the safety of, of our people as well as, as you 22 folks, okay? 23 KATHY: Let me get back to the, your safety 24 rules. 25 DICK: Okay.

KATHY: You said, if we make no offensive

moves then you make no offensive moves, and I'm telling 1 2 you we've not made any offensive moves --3 DICK: And we're not either. 4 KATHY: But you have. 5 Listen. We haven't come in the DICK: б compound at all, have we? 7 KATHY: You haven't come into the building --8 DICK: Yes, we're on the property, yes. 9 is true. 10 If you were to try to come into the 11 building, we wouldn't let you. We don't --12 DICK: We're not going to so that's not a 13 point, a debatable point. We're not coming in. 14 KATHY: Okay, not openly you won't. 15 DICK: We're not, you know, I tried to 16 indicate this to others but maybe they haven't passed 17 it on to you. We are not going to harm any woman, any 18 child or any man in that compound. Okay? 19 KATHY: I myself, I don't know what 20 everybody's minds are. Everybody has an individual 21 mind. 22 DICK: Um-hum. 23 And I, myself, do not trust humanity 24 enough to say, Okay, I believe you, and, you know, I'm That's why my kids are out there. 25 safe.

DICK: Okay.

1 KATHY: I sent my kids out there not because 2 I don't love them --3 DICK: And the children are safe. 4 KATHY: I love them very much, and I want them here with me, not me out there --5 DICK: Okay, well I can understand that. 6 7 KATHY: But, because I don't trust humanity, that's why they're out there. 8 9 DICK: Okay. Well they, they've been well taken care of. They will continue to be well taken 10 care of. 11 12 KATHY: And I very, I very much appreciate 13 that. I did see the photos. 14 DICK: Okay. 15 KATHY: I don't know what happened with the video, but --16 17 DICK: Well, the video, from what I understand in talking to, to Steve and a couple others, 18 19 that video doesn't work properly --20 KATHY: Yeah. 21 DICK: -- and we are, we're taking steps 22 necessary to correct that. 23 KATHY: Okay. I really appreciate what 24 you've done. 25 DICK: Okay, well --

KATHY: And I thank you for taking care of

Brian's illness. 1 2 DICK: Okay, but listen, you give this some consideration. We want to reunite you and the kids, 3 4 and we're not going to do anything to keep that from 5 happening. It's your mind that needs to make that decision. You have the ability to make that decision. 6 It's within your power to do that and you're going to 7 8 have to decide yourself how soon you want to get together with the kids. I can't make that decision for 9 There's no one that can make that decision for 10 11 you except for yourself. And the kids will be here and 12 they will be well cared for and they miss you. They 13 want to see you and I know you feel the same way. KATHY: Well, like you say. You're giving me 14 15 an ultimatum. I mean, the only way I can see kids 16 again, you know. 17 DICK: Well, that's not true. I didn't give 18 you an ultimatum. What, what are you saying? What 19 ultimatum? 20 KATHY: You said it's up to me to decide 21 whether I want to see my kids again. 22

DICK: Well, as long as you're in there, it's 23 a difficult, you know, how are you going to see your 24 kids? You have, you have to come out to be with the 25 kids. That's not an ultimatum, I'm just telling you

what, what the fact is.

That's, that's what I'm saying. 1 KATHY: 2 DICK: And it may be a temporary thing. You 3 know, we're not suggesting --4 KATHY: It may, it may not be either, okay, 5 I'm not naive. It may also be just, any way, I don't 6 want to get into that. 7 Well. I'll be happy to answer your DICK: 8 question. You're not --9 KATHY: I don't have a question. Okay. 10 DICK: 11 I just, I want to thank you for KATHY: 12 taking care of Brian and getting him to the doctor 13 because --14 DICK: Well you kick this around in your own 15 mind in there and think about it and I'll be happy to 16 talk to you once again, but you folks discuss this 17 amongst yourself and hopefully you'll come to the 18 realization that we're here to just ensure that no one 19 is hurt and that we will get this resolved, you will be 20 back with your kids and you'll be reunited as a family. 21 How -- what can I do to convince you that that's accurate? I mean, you don't seem to want to believe 22 23 what I'm telling you? 24 KATHY: It would be real simple, just --25 DICK: Okay. KATHY: But it's not going to happen that

1 way. 2 Well, what, what simple answer do you DICK: 3 have for us? I mean, I'm happy to listen to it. 4 KATHY: I mean, the original reason that people came here --5 DICK: 6 Um-hum. 7 KATHY: -- was --8 You know, that, that event of Sunday 9 has unfortunately happened and we have to go on from 10 here to try to rectify that, ensure that it doesn't 11 happen again, to ensure that no one else is hurt, to 12 ensure that you're, that ultimately you're reunited 13 with your family. It will happen, okay? 14 KATHY: On my, on my property, --15 DICK: On your property. 16 KATHY: -- on my home. 17 I'm, we're talking about a temporary, 18 a temporary situation for a good number of people 19 there. 20 That's what you are saying right now KATHY: 21 to me on the phone. 22 DICK: Okay. Well talk to your lawyer. 23 He'll tell you the same thing. Don't you have a lawyer 24 in there? Isn't Wayne, isn't Wayne in a position to 25 advise you to some degree about the possibilities that might exist after you leave there? I mean certainly he

I'll indicate it to you and perhaps you can pass it on 1 2 to others that I might not get an opportunity to talk 3 to, but, it's, the kids are together and there's, efforts are being made to place them, or will be in the 4 5 future. We hope that you'll be out of there and the 6 kids will be with you, but we're just not in a position to take the kids out at this point and they have to be, 7 you know, their health has to be assured and there are, 8 you know, some formalities that have to be handled and 9 10 this is not something that can be done overnight. 11 much, you know, if I can draw an analogy here, it's 12 like giving birth to a child. It's not done over night. We can't resolve these issues overnight. 13 14 child welfare agencies cannot do it either overnight, 15 but you have a number of people working on it and 16 trying to do the best they can to ensure that the kids 17 are taken care of properly, that their health is good, they're receiving good care, the food and they're 18 19 getting rest and they're playing with one another and 20 they're being cared for properly, and --21 SITA: Well --22 DICK: We're not parents, I mean, we're not 23 their parents, but we're doing the best we can. 24 SITA: When I talked to Jim, --25 DICK: Okay.

SITA: He said he'd make sure what we wrote

1 in the letter, Tasheem (Phonetic) wrote that they go to 2 their grandparents. 3 DICK: Uh-huh. SITA: He gave the phone numbers. 4 5 DICK: Okay. The name, and addresses, and --6 SITA: 7 Well, see, that will be done, but DICK: 8 again, it can't be done overnight. The, the child care 9 services are aware of that. You know, the letters that 10 went with the kids remained with the kids and those 11 things are being worked on, but it's like, you know, 12 we've been here since Sunday, and you know how, you 13 know how long it's taken to try to work some of these 14 problems out, and, you know, this can't be done overnight. People, people that work in these areas, 15 16 why you may quarrel with some of their own, their 17 procedures, they have the best interest of the kid at 18 heart. Now, you may not agree with what, what that 19 might be --20 SITA: I agree what you're saving, but it 21 wouldn't have happened if you guys didn't come in just 22 attacking us. 23 DICK: Well, listen, that is horribly 24 unfortunate. It's also horribly unfortunate that law 25 enforcement officers were injured. We're all trying to

get past that and we're, that's, that's something that

happened and now we are going to have to go forward and 1 2 try to resolve that. You're going to have the 3 opportunity, as soon as you come out, you and the others, to testify to what happened here, to, to give a 4 5 message --6 SITA: Testify? 7 Well, I'm talking about to give, give DICK: 8 information to, to newspapers, to television stations. 9 to Congress --. 10 SITA: Then can you guys open, open news 11 casts for us to talk to them? 12 DICK: Certainly. When you, when you come 13 out of there you're going to have the opportunity to do 14 that. Sure. The press is very interested in hearing 15 your side of the incident. Absolutely. They're going 16 to be very interested in hearing that. 17 I was telling some of the folks I talked to earlier that, this morning in the Waco paper, there was 18 19 an article concerning Congressional inquiry into this 20 whole matter. It's being scrutinized. This has never 21 happened in law enforcement before. 22 SITA: Well, it's never happened to me 23 before. 24 No, and, and it will never happen DICK: 25 again. But that's, that's what you need to tell people

there are only bits and pieces of what happened that 1 2 will only be known to you, okay? If you, if you were inside there and you saw certain -- made certain 3 observations, there are going to be people that are, 4 are interested in talking with you, and you'll be able 5 to give your side of the story, and we'll make that 6 7 available to anyone that has an interest in it; Congress, the press, the courts, the directors of the 8 9 ATF, the directors of the FBI, all those folks have an 10 ongoing interest in this. 11 We all have a, you know, we all have concerns 12 about what happened the other day. I've been in law 13 enforcement for a long, long time, as have many of the other fellows that are involved here and we all want to 14 15 know what happened too. You know, we just don't arbitrarily watch something like this happen without 16 17 responding in our, in our own fashion. 18 You know, the best thing, and we've talked about 19 it to some degree, is that you get your, you know, you get your case in front of the public. You know, you 20 21 guys, all you guys inside can tell the public what 22 happened from your perspective. Such as in Noah's day if anybody will admit that they're a transgressor, that they need help, then God is preparing an ark.

You see, now, now God wants me to realize that sin is a disease. And then, you know, at first it seems fun. It seems kind of fun at first. But as a man progresses through life, he finds out this disease is not quite so easy to get rid of. And it actually decays his physical and spiritual being. So then men begin to receive the wages of sin which is the disease and death. And then they need God, they need help from God. Well, well God's always trying to bring men around to this knowledge.

But then that's where the key of knowledge comes. You know, we have to look to Christ who on the, who on the cross the gospels tell us that Christ says Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do. That's the first -- let's call that, let's call Christ

1 the Ten Commandments in the flesh, okay? 2 DICK: Okay. 3 So, so let's say that if you look at 4 the Ten Commandments as a rule for you to be righteous, 5 forget it, buddy. Okay? DICK: 6 Um-hum. But let's say that now with, with the 7 8 Ten Commandments being a revelation of Christ's divine 9 nature, let's see that every time we're around Christ 10 and we don't act like him let's say we get embarrassed. He kind of turns around, looks at us, and we, and we 11 feel kind of embarrassed because we made another 12 13 mistake, right? 14 But yet we love this man, you know. 15 this man doesn't condemn us, you know. This man we 16 want to follow him, because he's a living law. 17 know, and he's a living God. And we want to be around 18 him, but we're just like a bunch of children making 19 mistakes. Okay now, now that's the picture of the law 20 in Christ. 21 Now the Jews don't want this kind of personage, and so they've got him, they've got this law 22 23 lifted up by crucifying him on the cross, okay? 24 DICK: Okay. 25 That's where they like their law.

They like their law broken and dead, okay? Now on the

cross let's say there's, there's another commandment added. Let's make this complete now. Let's say the lith commandment is, is the very words which on the cross says Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do.

Now that commandment is not directed to man. That commandment is by the law, Christ being the law, is directed to God. Okay? So the law which is righteous that's being crucified, rejected by Israel, right, is the law that by rejecting it is the law that is actually justified now by saying to God, God, here's your law. You've got to forgive them, because they are ignorant of what they're doing, right?

DICK: I, I agree with you. I mean that's -DAVID: Okay. So now here's the point. This
is what establishes the new covenant. All, all the
way, Caiaphas, you know, everyone of that generation
was freely forgiven.

Now but here is the problem. Just like in Noah's day nobody, God had no intention of destroying anybody. But in the communication that we're given through Noah, Noah clearly stated that all those who realized that sin was a mystery and evil were to avail themselves by getting into the ark as a witness against the sin, against the evil, and that God would preserve them from the evil. Okay. But of course, that

1 | generation did not wise up to these things.

But now on the cross, Christ being on the cross, the covenant begins with the Father's forgiveness based on the people's ignorance, okay? So God had this already planned. Now the -- that's the 11th commandment. Now the 12th commandment is while on the cross Christ finally cried it is finished. stated into thy hand I commit my spirit. And Christ gave up the ghost and died. Okay?

DICK: Okay.

DAVID: Now what, what are we looking at then? Well, we're looking at a mystery about the connection between God the creator and the word of God made flesh. A message was in the life and in the teachings of Christ. A secret communication that the proud and the arrogant, the self-determined and self-willed, the self-supportive. The Bible calls them islands. You know, the independents would not perceive.

Well, in the Book of Revelation again, remember, the holy spirit, the angel of Christ, is talking to John, the revelator. And after counseling the Seven Churches of Asia, specific direct counsels, the spirit addresses John in the fourth chapter by saying come up hither. Come on up hither, and I will show you that which must be hereafter.

1 Now Revelation says blessed are those who 2 hear the words of this prophecy and those who keep the 3 things written therein. Now you cannot keep what you don't understand. Okay? But the blessing is based 4 5 upon reading the words of this prophecy. A prophecy is a forecast of the future of which God who made heaven 6 7 and earth by his word no doubt by the same word can 8 create the future to bring about the events he foretells shall come to pass. That's in the providence 9 of God, isn't it? Okay. 10 11 Now John witnesses in that event. He ascends 12 to heaven. He's in the spirit and he has sins. And he 13 sees a throne set in heaven. So a judiciary is 14 established. That, that thing is taking place right 15 now while we talk. And this is where people may be 16 laughing for lack of understanding. 17 And this is what I'm presenting to the 18 Fathers that, that, you know, people today -- I've been 19 here 33 years now. And I know about all the high 20 sophistications of television, you know, cartoons. 21 There's just so many things to engross the human mind that, that the attention span and the perceptions of 22 23 mankind in this generation are so perverted unlike any 24 other generation that men, they don't --25 DICK: You still there, Dave? DAVID: Yeah, I'm still here.

1 DICK: Can you hear me? 2 DAVID: I'm here. Men --3 DICK: I'm hearing a lot of noise on your end. 4 5 Men don't properly know how to learn in an absorbent form. Men want to learn things quick. 6 7 You know, Jack-in-the-Box, you know, Taco Bell. 8 want it now, we want it quick, don't we? 9 DICK: Absolutely. 10 DAVID: Okay. This is our world. 11 Get it and get on your way. DICK: 12 DAVID: Exactly. And so, you know, I'm 13 trying to present to, to my source or, or let's say to 14 my boss that, you know, sufficient time has to be 15 administered because the thing that I gave is, is 16 something which is, has to be looked at and absorbed. 17 And a lot of people don't have a mind to do that. 18 But here's the thing. In this judiciary, the 19 time comes and this, this must be the faith of the 20 Christian remember, is that what must be hereafter the 21 spirit says I will show you that which must be. Okay. 22 So I always teach this like in a question. 23 John says he saw a throne in heaven and one sat on the throne. And he had a rainbow around about him. 24 25 to look upon like a, jasper stone, sardine stone. Like a -- he was a rock. This guy is solid. The reason

1 | being is he's mad.

And what happens is there's these 24 elders in the midst of this throne which is a jury. these, these people are, have been saints that have been translated from the beginning of time. We'll go into this later. But anyway, these are men who have lived in this world before who were -- well, like I say I was telling, I was telling Henry last night about, you know, the chariots of the Gods, you know -- we're not talking about religious, we're talking about documentations.

DICK: Um-hum.

DAVID: From all nations, from different, from different beliefs and faiths how that there has been communication and actual transportation of, of beings from other worlds into our world. And even so much that agree that, that ancient empires have actually built landing strips and things like that for such large capacity vehicles.

You know, the, the prophets of old living in the natural realities of their world, you know, could only identify the things that they saw out of their world by things in their world. So when a prophet talks about a chariot with flaming torches, you know, that sounds like the thunder and things like that, you know, what are we really looking at?

1 Well, the prophecies could not have been 2 understood in their day, because God who gave the 3 prophets the vision or showed them the experience that 4 they were shown were told that their books would be 5 sealed until the end of time. Now in the end of time, after the 6,000 years 6 of probation which God has allotted to man, and we're 7 8 coming to this time now, after the end of time, there's 9 to be a message which is proposing to be able to unlock 10 these mysteries of the ancient worlds and begin to 11 explain to us that well, what these prophets saw we can 12 see today, because God has given to man certain technologies to help him comprehend chariots with 13 14 flaming torches that when they run sounds like the 15 thunders, okay? 16 DICK: Well, David, when I hear you talk about these things it makes some sense to me. However, 17 18 how, you know, how can we use this ability that, that 19 God gave you in a positive way? 20 Well, not by, not by trespassing over DAVID: 21 our perimeter and --2.2 DICK: But Dave, David, David --23 DAVID: -- and shooting me. 24 DICK: How, how can we --25 DAVID: Because that's --DICK: -- how can we take this, this

predicament that we're both involved in now and put it 1 2 to a positive use? Well, now this is what we're --3 DAVID: 4 DICK: How can we do that? -- this, this is what God at the 5 6 present time, this is where my headquarters is coming 7 from is, is telling me to wait because of what has been 8 taking place on your side in regards to actual literal 9 conversations between certain of the leaders as which 10 you call bosses and certain of their proper plans and 11 all that. Now let, now hear me out for a second. 12 DICK: Okay. Sure. I'm willing to. 13 This, this is where, you know, the -okay. Of all the technologies of man, the high 14 15 disciplines of science, the breakdown of, of, you know, 16 where we, where we break away from hypothesis and come into the realm of fact. When, when theory becomes, you 17 18 know, a working fact, then we build upon facts, you 19 But we, we search upon, you know, we search upon 20 theory. But we build upon facts. Now our facts become 21 our concrete foundation. 22 DICK: Um-hum. 23 And from that point we, we look up a 24 little bit further based upon what we are standing on 25 solidly, and we, we kind of say well, if this has worked by this means and that means then possibly my

hypothesis is that it's, if I do this then it's going 1 to come out like this. Well, of course, as we begin to 2 work it and see if it holds together, if it falls apart 3 then, then we realize we've made a mistake. Okay. 4 5 But man has become so proficient in the 6 knowledge of so many things that expertise and 7 specialty becomes very important. Like say in the 8 building of the space shuttle I mean, you know, there 9 are so many professionals and experts extremist in such 10 minute degrees. Like in the medical field. First you 11 have a general practitioner who knows basically about, 12 you know, head, nose, ears, eyes --13 DICK: Sure. Sure. 14 DAVID: -- you know. That where it hurts in 15 your elbow. 16 DICK: Some general, some general things, 17 right. 18 DAVID: Yeah. But then, but then there --19 but then because the, the vast of humanity and the, and 20 the promises of God based to the prophet, Daniel and 21 the prophets about how he promises that though man will 22 be unperceptive of it he will develop in man knowledge 23 and wisdom in the latter days to bring them to the point of judgment. In other words, he'll give them 24 25 keys and knowledge that their whole existence in the form of humanity will all of a sudden abruptly change

It's just 17 humanity has been punished or let's say he's been kept 18 from being able to communicate with this supernatural. 19 Okay, for instance, to make it plain if I 20 might. Christ was a natural being in the flesh, wasn't 21 he? 22 DICK: He was. 23 But on the other hand, he was a DAVID: 24 supernatural being too, wasn't he? 25 DICK: Absolutely true.

1 ability to command the elements, right, caused him to 2 be considered a miracle worker. Now being a miracle worker just simply meant that he was doing works that 3 were not known and not common amongst the normal or 4 natural man of his day. Of course, a flavor is the chemical reaction in the body, we understand this, that's picked up by the brain. You know, and so many parts of this and so many parts of that formed together and compiled together in the proper, you know, numerical value. And all of a sudden it tells our brain, our brain picks it up as being a certain identity. We call it a flavor, you know.

But yet we have artificial flavors. We get the, we get the stimulation. We get the reality of, of enjoying this flavor. But, but all we are doing is, is putting a chemical, a counterfeit chemical into our body. In other words, we're hallucinating cherry.

We're hallucinating banana. You see?

DICK: Um-hum.

DAVID: And it's also known that, that some of the ways that, that men are achieving to develop these flavors is actually cancerous. It has a, has a negative effect in the biochemical part of our body. So you know, a lot of flavors and stuff over the years they've found out, you know, needed to be banned and stuff.

DICK: Yeah. Wasn't, wasn't good for anyone.

DAVID: Yeah. But nonetheless, so we're

1 seeing that there's more to life and humanity than just 2 the good old country living. I mean there is a sophisticated and very complex reality of our being 3 4 that we need to discern. Because when it comes down to 5 the final days, when men are witnessing technology and 6 science, possibility and eternal research, when men are 7 beginning to realize that God didn't really write down 8 all their sins in a book, did he? 9 Not all of them. DICK: No. 10 No, what I'm saying is I'm saying that, that with man's ability in the computer spectrum, 11 12 you know, remember that a computer is really just a 13 very basic, basic, basic, highly basic form of the 14 first steps of creating mankind. Okay, now remember a 15 computer is taken from the same substances of the earth 16 of which man himself likewise is made. True or false? 17 DICK: That's true. 18 Now when a computer system is highly 19 sophisticated it takes up rooms, doesn't it? 20 DICK: It can. 21 DAVID: We used to, we used to build the 22 elevator floors for high-tech computer systems. And --23 DICK: Where was that? 24 DAVID: This was down in Dallas years ago. Just a construction company. I used to -- you know, 25 I'm a carpenter and stuff, you know?

25	who has developed this on-board computer system has
	limited it because of an oracle of something called

perceptive judgment. In other words, man is to experience in this realm of existence under probation two opposites of existence, good and evil.

And that, that is found in everything we
perceive. The degree of good and the degree of evil of
the thing we perceive. No matter what it is. Banana
flavor is good, and yet banana flavor can be evil.
Natural banana flavor chemically developed through the
sciences of God's creation through the chromosome of
the seed.

You know, God places this genetic in every seed of every thing. It's already been encoded in everything that's of the seed, right? And God mandates that this process once being applied to the soil of the earth, bring the proper nutrients and minerals from the earth and develop the plant, the stem, the water system, the photosynthesis system and, and develop this flavor through natural chemical reaction. And man's supposed to enjoy this flavor banana. That's good.

But of course, when man tries to construct it without the full process, he frustrates the process and causes a deadly chemical which is evil. So we can be enjoying banana flavor which is good and banana flavor which is evil. And one has two different opposite effects.

Okay, so, so now that we've come to this time

in the world's history, we finally have to come and make things very simple. Okay, simplicity. Let's go back to simplicity.

Now in the Bible in the Book of Revelation, you know, we love the Lord Jesus. He, he committed his spirit, and he knew he was going to die. He knew that his mind was going to be rejected of the world in his days. And I so -- and so our good Lord Jesus, you know, all the knowledge he had and, and all the light he had within his soul, everything he could have done for man was being rejected. And so he just asked his Father to forgive them all because they were so ignorant. And he asked him, Father, he says, into your hand I commit my spirit.

So in, in the Book of Revelation we find that John writes that in the right hand of God there is a book. And this book has been sealed. Now why is this book sealed? Well, it's because the contents are being kept from somebody.

And in this final judgment which must be sometime after John's day, John said so, we find a large number of personages found in heaven, ten thousands time ten thousands and thousands of thousands of angels. And we find a jury of 24 elders. And we find a mighty angel questioning all that humongous host of beings of an empire far greater and far powerful

than anything of the universe. Because it is
constructed of the universes of universes.

And this one question in this judiciary is who amongst heaven and all of the authority thereof, who is worthy to open this book in the right hand of God, something that Christ committed there, something to do with the word there, something to do with the life there, the spirit there. Who is worthy to open this book and to loose the seals thereof so that these seals might be known?

Well, now, our, our visitor from, from earth, the one of the disciples of Christ says that he witnessed that no man in heaven neither on earth, neither under the earth, that's buried, was able to open, neither look thereon. And he himself, that great apostle, wept much. Because no man was found worthy.

Revelation 4 and 5 is something that should put us all on our toes. Because in rejecting the Lord Jesus Christ he did commit his spirit to the hand of God. And there is something about Christ that nobody knows because nobody wanted to know. There's things about Christ that nobody will know until the time comes in the future, sometime after John's day. It's of the good pleasure of the Lord for men to know it.

Now as John weeps much, one of the elders

says to John, weep not, John. Behold the Lion of the 1 2 tribe of Juda. Now the Lion we know is a symbol of 3 power and authority. And he's of the tribe of Juda. We know that of Juda God chose anciently King David to 4 5 rule over his people. And that this nation, it's 6 purpose was to destroy any and all that rise up and 7 oppose against the good principles of the Lord. is the law of God which we know is the divine nature of 8 9 Christ. 10 Now we see this Lion of the tribe of Juda. 11 And John says that when he beheld in the midst of the 12 throne instead of seeing a Lion he saw a Lamb. 13 DICK: Okay. 14 DAVID: As it had been slain. Now he's a 15 But the thing John says when he looked he saw a Lion. 16 Lamb. 17 DICK: Are you getting hoarse? Something in 18 your voice --19 DAVID: (Clearing throat.) 20 DICK: You've got a catch. 21 DAVID: No, I've got it now. 22 You want, you want to get something to DICK: 23 drink? 24 DAVID: No, I want you to listen. 25 Okay. I just wanted to make sure DICK: that, you know, you were comfortable.

And he took the book from the right hand of the Father. And when he had taken 12 13 the book, all of heaven fell down and bowed before him. All of heaven saying thou art worthy to take the book 14 and to loose the seals thereof. For thou was slain and 15 16 has redeemed us to our God by your blood. Out of every 17 kindred nation people in tongue. And has made us to 18 our God kings and priests. And we shall reign on the 19 earth. And then all the heavens says worthy is the 20 Lamb to receive power, glory, riches, wisdom, honour, 21 might, strength, glory. You know? 22 And so it's such an awesome, magnificent, 23 powerful display of one who was a nice guy, one who was 24 a Lamb, one who could have done great damage. But 25 instead he said Father, forgive them. But not at Gethsemane it has to be Christ. Because when Peter

rose up and cut off the Centurion's ear, Christ told him to put his sword up. Because if he needed to, he could call legions of his angels down.

So you know, the earth was just about at the point of extinction 2,000 years ago, but nonetheless through the mercies of one man, one son of man, one son of God, two blended together as one. There was negotiations made out of one heart, and the request was forgiveness based upon men not knowing what they're doing.

And the knowledge which is to yet return someday is going to be contained in a simple format. Well, Jesus saves, Jesus loves. And so therefore, one is committed to the Christian church. But the example to love your neighbor as yourself.

But in the end of time, this Lamb in heaven receives this book. And again, there is to be brought to view in the front of all nations a witness that if it be rejected, if it be not adhered to, if it be overlooked, if heaven is insulted by proud and arrogant humanity who has made so much prosperity and so much blessing because of it's incorporated In God We Trust.

Prophecy talks about an empire that will be Lamb-like. Revelation 13 tells us that there will be a nation that will be Lamb-like, but it will speak as a dragon. Now that doesn't sound too good.

1 Well, what happens is, is that in the midst 2 of all of this reality and situation, according to the 3 purposes of God, God designs for a truth to be known. And if that truth does not bring about the fear of God 4 in the hearts of men, then what will take place is, is 5 б that God will instill his judgments and destroy that 7 nation which he has formerly so blessed. 8 Because in stepping over the boundaries of 9 truth and conscience when the nation after being told 10 honestly what is at stake, when they are brought to the 11 attention of God on a throne which nobody can deny 12 that. 13 DICK: I don't think anyone can deny that. 14 DAVID: And God having a book with seven 15 seals. Nobody can deny that. 16 DICK: Okay. 17 And when the subject is clear, only 18 the Lamb can reveal that. Nobody can deny that, right? 19 DICK: No, I'm certainly not going to deny 20 it. 21 DAVID: Okay. So then the subject returns 22 with chapter 10 by saying this little book comes to 23 earth and seven thunders are uttered. Which nobody 24 denies the seven thunders are the seven seals. 25 the Lamb opened the first seal, there was the sound of thunder. When there's time no longer, this mystery of
