2 DICK: -- at 10:30.

3 STEVE: Okay.

4 DICK: And I want you to make sure -- you and  
5 Dave watch that to make sure that -- and if you've got  
6 points that you dispute, please give them to me and,  
7 again, we'll pass them on.

8 STEVE: Okay.

9 DICK: And I'll try to clarify them.

10 STEVE: You know, it has been asked by the  
11 press about, you know, communication to us.

12 DICK: Uh-huh.

13 STEVE: I would like at least let it be known  
14 that it's not our choice that we're cut off or that we  
15 don't at least have one line to at least one news  
16 agency, where they can at least monitor us, see if  
17 we're okay, or whatever else.

18 DICK: You know what, when we were -- when we  
19 were apart from one another, I, I had a thought here.  
20 One of your big concerns is that you don't believe that  
21 anybody will listen or that you will have the  
22 opportunity to present your case. I know you're  
23 concerned about that. So, what I've asked is to make  
24 that known to the press --

25 STEVE: All right.

DICK: -- that you're concerned that you

1 won't get the opportunity --

2 STEVE: I appreciate that.

3 DICK: -- and, and that --

4 STEVE: I'm sure that helps.

5 DICK: Sure. That will put that right to  
6 them that, hey, you said that you're concerned, and I  
7 want to go to them and tell them of your concern,  
8 directly to them, so that they will know and you will  
9 know that we're not trying to cover up or hide any of  
10 the -- any of these comments that you eventually would  
11 like to make. So, how's that? I mean that, that --  
12 that's (Indiscernible) isn't it?

13 STEVE: It's, it's a small, small, small part  
14 --

15 DICK: But it's, it's a step.

16 STEVE: -- of it in the right direction.

17 DICK: Sure, it's a step and you guys -- it  
18 will show you that, in fact, we're not opposed to that  
19 at all. In fact, we demand that you do that. I mean  
20 we, as citizens, secondarily, I mean --

21 STEVE: (Indiscernible)

22 DICK: -- we demand that you do that.

23 STEVE: That's good to hear.

24 DICK: Because I don't want that to happen  
25 again.

STEVE: Okay. I'll, I'll call you as the

1 soon as the -- I'm going to start preparing that we can  
2 watch this on T.V.

3 DICK: Okay.

4 STEVE: That gives us about 10 minutes to get  
5 the thing going here.

6 DICK: All right. And then you guys -- you  
7 working on some of the folks that you, you --

8 STEVE: Yes.

9 DICK: Okay.

10 STEVE: Most definitely.

11 DICK: And then tell David, if you would,  
12 that I've done this for him and I'd like to get an  
13 opportunity to talk to him when I get back, too.

14 STEVE: All right.

15 DICK: So, between us, between all three of  
16 us, perhaps we can, we can get some of these issues  
17 past, you know, past center line here.

18 STEVE: Okay.

19 DICK: And, and we'll work, we'll work  
20 together on it and we'll get it done.

21 STEVE: Okay.

22 DICK: All right. We'll be back -- we'll be  
23 back in touch after, after the press conference then.

24 STEVE: Okay. Thank you.

25 DICK: All right.

STEVE: Bye.

1           DICK: Bye-bye.  
2           RACHEL: Hello.  
3           DICK: Hello. Dick. Who's this?  
4           RACHEL: Rachel.  
5           DICK: Rachel, how are you today?  
6           RACHEL: Fine. Just a minute, I'll get  
7 Steve.  
8           DICK: How about David?  
9           (No response)  
10          (Pause)  
11          STEVE: Hello.  
12          DICK: Steve?  
13          STEVE: Hello, Dick.  
14          DICK: Yes.  
15          STEVE: Okay.  
16          DICK: I thought you were going to try to get  
17 Dave up here so we could go over some of these issues  
18 you guys were concerned about.  
19          STEVE: Well, I was going to try is right but  
20 he's totally out right now. I didn't realize. I just  
21 found out. In the middle of the night, I guess, he was  
22 trying to see just how -- excuse me, someone's got the  
23 -- just a moment here.  
24          DICK: Did you get a chance to see that press  
25 conference?  
            STEVE: Yeah. Apparently, that last night he



1 | was trying to see how well his limbs and everything  
2 | were working and it took a lot out of him.

3 |           DICK: You mean tired?

4 |           STEVE: Oh, yeah, real tired. I didn't  
5 | realize. I thought I heard him moan or groan. So --

6 |           DICK: Well, I need a -- I need a chance to  
7 | talk to him here in a few minutes. So, why don't you  
8 | go ahead and send somebody in there, if you will, and  
9 | ask him to --

10 |           STEVE: I'll try to but --

11 |           DICK: -- come out.

12 |           STEVE: -- I'm telling you, you know, when  
13 | the guy, you know, it's not as easy as you make it  
14 | sound because if the -- you know, if the guy has been  
15 | injured like he was --

16 |           DICK: Oh, I understand.

17 |           STEVE: You know, I mean if he was in the  
18 | hospital, quite obviously the guy would be in and out  
19 | all the time, which he is all the more so here because  
20 | he doesn't have quite the --

21 |           DICK: Sure.

22 |           STEVE: -- attention as in the hospital.

23 |           DICK: Sure, sure.

24 |           STEVE: But, no, I will do. I'm serious. I  
25 | mean --

          DICK: Can you get that phone maybe over to

1 him rather than trying to get him up?

2           STEVE: Well, that's what I'm saying. In  
3 fact, I've got -- right now I have pulled the phone  
4 over by him. He's out totally right now. I'm looking  
5 right at him. And I mean if he's awake or if I can get  
6 him awake --

7           DICK: Well, we'll give it a couple of  
8 minutes and why don't you go ahead and shake him up.  
9 But did you see that -- did you see the press  
10 conference?

11           STEVE: Yes, I did.

12           DICK: What --

13           STEVE: He, he didn't, though, because he was  
14 even out -- in fact, I told them to wake him up so he  
15 could see it. Apparently, he wouldn't wake up.

16           DICK: Well, I wish he had seen it. I think  
17 he'd have been -- I think he'd have been happy with --I  
18 don't think they're trying to --

19           STEVE: I don't think he would be.

20           DICK: Really?

21           STEVE: No, I really don't because there was  
22 a number of things that were brought out. I listened  
23 very carefully myself.

24           DICK: Okay. With what, what -- do you have  
25 some --

          STEVE: Well, number one, you know, it was

1 implied by I believe his name is Bob Ricks?

2 DICK: Right.

3 STEVE: It was implied that, that you people  
4 are under the impression that these people are not free  
5 to go and well, you can make that assumption. I've  
6 told you over and over again --

7 DICK: No, those were questions asked of us.

8 STEVE: Right, but I'm talking about the  
9 response to those questions.

10 DICK: Uh-huh.

11 STEVE: And it was not made clear -- these  
12 people are -- they can leave anytime they want, from  
13 day one. They still can. But like I told you, they  
14 choose to see -- they believe in his God. That's the  
15 point (Indiscernible).

16 DICK: No, I know. I passed that on that --

17 STEVE: All right.

18 DICK: -- that you've all said that but -

19 STEVE: Okay.

20 DICK: -- I guess we continue to get calls  
21 from like some of these people -- remember John talked  
22 with you last night about, these people are making  
23 inquiry about --

24 STEVE: That, that's fine, whatever --

25 DICK: People (Indiscernible)?

STEVE: Yeah, that's fine.

1           DICK: Okay. What was the other issue that  
2 you were concerned --

3           STEVE: Okay. Let me look down here and see.  
4 Okay. Now, the latest thing was that the man, I think  
5 his name was Dan Hartnet --

6           DICK: Right --

7           STEVE: -- said that --

8           DICK: -- the ATF representative.

9           STEVE: -- they did have a felony charge, a  
10 felony charge warrant for D.K. Okay, that's -- and  
11 then it went on -- they asked about -- I can hardly see  
12 or I have very little light here. Just a moment. Let  
13 me -- do you have a flashlight there? I'm sitting in a  
14 spot here. It's kind of dark. See, I don't want to  
15 turn the lights on here because he's sleeping. So,  
16 I'll just --

17           DICK: True. Do you know what we -- while  
18 you're going through your notes there, I just want to  
19 make -- bring you up a comment here. You know, we  
20 talked about a list of, of people that you guys might  
21 be interested in having to talk with but aren't you and  
22 David going to have to get together to -- on that?

23           STEVE: No. He's already said that anybody  
24 that wants can come to the phone and talk. I just now  
25 even went to a lot of people, just right now, --

          DICK: Uh-huh.

1           STEVE:  -- and said to them, there's a man on  
2 the phone and his name is Dick.  He's an F.B.I. agent.  
3 he's a negotiator.  He's a very decent guy.  If you'd  
4 like to talk to him about anything, about leaving,  
5 about your children, about relatives, about speaking  
6 with someone on the outside, about any of your needs or  
7 wants --

8           DICK:  Uh-huh.

9           STEVE:  I talked to at least 20 people in one  
10 place at one time.  Then I walked down and talked to a  
11 few more here and there.  And they all said to me, you  
12 talk, you know what we want.  And I says, well, what do  
13 you want?  That's what I asked them, what do you want?  
14 And they says, well, make it known that before a lot of  
15 us were afraid to make a step forward.  They can say  
16 what they want but we don't have that line to the  
17 outside world.  We want somebody without -- the press  
18 to be nearby, to see, to be able to video, to be in  
19 part of this negotiation process.

20           DICK:  Okay.

21           STEVE:  That's what, that's what they told  
22 me.

23           DICK:  Remember --

24           STEVE:  And then they said to me, well, you  
25 speak for us.  And I says, --

          DICK:  Okay.

1 STEVE: -- I will.

2 DICK: All right.

3 STEVE: I will.

4 DICK: All right. Well, you know, we'll go  
5 with that but I guess I was making reference to more  
6 is, is, is the, the people that you had suggested you  
7 might want to later to talk with, that you were going  
8 to give me names of those people, remember? I, I'm not  
9 talking about the people inside to talk with me but  
10 those people that you might want --

11 STEVE: Right.

12 DICK: -- to give us --

13 STEVE: Right.

14 DICK: -- as a possible --

15 STEVE: I, I did ask them. This is what  
16 their -- I'll give you some of those names, if you'd  
17 like. This is what they mentioned to me. They  
18 mentioned Larry King, Paul Harvey. I never heard of  
19 this man, a David Gold, a Rush Limbo I think the name  
20 was.

21 DICK: Rush Limbaugh?

22 STEVE: Limbaugh, is that it?

23 DICK: Yeah. I think there's a fellow by the  
24 name of that.

25 STEVE: Apparently, he's in a lot of  
controversial issues or something, I don't know. Paul

1 Harvey, many people are --

2 DICK: Yeah, I know Paul Harvey.

3 STEVE: Exactly. Oprah Winfrey, I guess.

4 DICK: Well, I'm sure -- I'll guarantee you  
5 that when this thing -- when you come out, there will  
6 be a lot of invitations to go on Oprah Winfrey's show.

7 STEVE: Well, you and I -- you and I are --  
8 well, I'm not -- we're not interested in that kind of  
9 thing.

10 DICK: No, I know, but to get the word out  
11 I'm saying.

12 STEVE: Yeah, right. Well, okay, but right  
13 now what the thing is, these people are afraid to make  
14 the move without him --

15 DICK: Okay. Sure.

16 STEVE: -- and an involvement there.

17 DICK: And, remember, I told you moments ago  
18 when I spoke to you then --

19 STEVE: Right, you, you did.

20 DICK: -- your concern about not being able  
21 to get to the press. And we're going to -- we're going  
22 to make sure the press is aware of that so that if  
23 you're concerned --

24 STEVE: I was hoping that that would have  
25 happened during that conference even.

DICK: Well, you know that came up. This --

1 obviously, they're gone from here --

2 STEVE: I see okay.

3 DICK: -- when they get this conference

4 together.

5 STEVE: All right.

6 DICK: So, that, that should come up on the

7 next one.

8 STEVE: Is there going to be another one

9 today?

10 DICK: No, not today.

11 STEVE: All right.

12 DICK: But that will be -- we've asked that

13 that be included in the next one because I --

14 STEVE: I see.

15 DICK: -- I -- that's a good point. And I

16 know you're concerned about that and I will -- I'm in

17 total agreement, as is everyone else here, that your,

18 your story needs to get out. I know you're concerned

19 that you don't think we will allow it, too. So, this

20 maybe will, will give you that sign that it will get -

21 STEVE: Right.

22 DICK: You will get that opportunity. So,

23 that's good. We'll work with that.

24 STEVE: You know, of course, you know, when I

25 listen to a conference like that, you observe, you

know, all these different things that are taking place

.



1 and what's being said. It really bothers me that it's  
2 us that are being spoken of of having felony charges  
3 and all the rest. What --

4 DICK: Uh-huh.

5 STEVE: The insanity of the whole thing. I  
6 mean when you really sit down and look at it from  
7 beginning to end, the insanity of it all --

8 DICK: Right. Did you hear Mr. Hartnet say  
9 that the ATF --

10 STEVE: Yeah, I mean but --

11 DICK: -- has to be responsible for what they  
12 did?

13 STEVE: Well, yes, I did, but many times in  
14 the past these different bureaucracies have slapped the  
15 hands of individuals. You never hear of them going up  
16 on charges of murder and so forth. I mean the total  
17 disregard of human life here was -- it was awesome. I  
18 mean I've talked to a lot of people. I got to see the  
19 firsthand witnesses, the approach of the vehicles. You  
20 weren't there, I don't believe, were you?

21 DICK: Absolutely not.

22 STEVE: Okay. But they were. They saw what  
23 was happening and --

24 DICK: No --

25 STEVE: -- when they fell to the floor, there  
were bullets that went -- I'm talking about missing

1 | them by an -- you will be able to come into this  
2 | premises ultimately and look it over yourself, where  
3 | the different people resided, in what rooms and so  
4 | forth. You're going to be -- it's a miracle that there  
5 | aren't at least 20 more people dead here. I'm telling  
6 | you the truth.

7 |           DICK: I know you are.

8 |           STEVE: So, when it --

9 |           DICK: I know you are, Steve.

10 |           STEVE: -- comes down to federal charges  
11 | being filed, felony charges against people here, I mean  
12 | what are we talk -- we're talking about defense. There  
13 | was an offense that was committed and there was a  
14 | defense here taking place.

15 |           DICK: I know that's your position and that's  
16 | what you need to make known to people.

17 |           STEVE: None of these people -- you know that  
18 | 99% of these people have never even held a gun before  
19 | that day or touched one or seen one, hardly seen one?

20 |           DICK: I have no doubts that that's true.

21 |           STEVE: So, I mean it's just -- it bothers me  
22 | to hear that, you know, there's going to be felony  
23 | charges on one side, plural. But on the other hand,  
24 | I'd like to hear the same kind of language employed on  
25 | the other, also.

          DICK: Well, if that's what this, what this

1 inquiry determines, then there will be but they have to  
2 be -- the evidence has to be looked at first, Steve.

3 STEVE: But, obviously, Dick, you and I know  
4 that through the years -- it's -- when has that ever  
5 taken place with federal agents, especially federal  
6 agents, someone at that level, let alone like police  
7 officers and so forth? It's a rare, rare, rarity. I  
8 can't even think of an instance where it's happened.

9 DICK: Well, how about the Rodney King  
10 incident, for instance?

11 STEVE: Well, I don't know, it's ongoing and  
12 I --

13 DICK: Well, it is, but it has to be  
14 resolved.

15 STEVE: Yes, but I haven't been -- I haven't  
16 been --

17 DICK: They've been charged, haven't they?

18 STEVE: -- (Indiscernible) with that.

19 DICK: I know, but they've been charged.

20 STEVE: I guess. I haven't been following it  
21 so I don't know what's -- you can fill me in and let me  
22 know what's happening.

23 DICK: Well, they have been charged. And,  
24 and you know that because there was an earlier trial.  
25 So, they -- you know they were charged.

STEVE: Well, you know, the greatest thing

1 that would help get this process going and people come  
2 out -- these women, especially, that I was talking to  
3 just before you called me back to the phone here --

4 DICK: Uh-huh.

5 STEVE: I was saying, well, what do you want?  
6 They says, Dick will talk to you. You let him -- if  
7 you want to go, tell him that. I mean Dave was not  
8 even around when you're talking to these people.

9 DICK: Sure.

10 STEVE: He don't, he don't care who talks to  
11 or says -- he's laying down sleeping right now.

12 DICK: Okay.

13 STEVE: It's quiet around him. It's -- he's  
14 in a dark spot here. He's trying to get some rest.  
15 And he, he, he told me, while I was talking to you, he  
16 interrupted my speech with you earlier --

17 DICK: Uh-huh.

18 STEVE: -- and said to me, let anybody talk  
19 to him. Let the women talk to him. He went like that  
20 to me. So, I mean -- and they --

21 DICK: Well, --

22 STEVE: -- and then when I said, I said,  
23 look, he's going to be calling me back. Instead of me  
24 getting on the phone with Dick, why don't some of you  
25 take your turns. You can talk to him. He wants -- he  
does want -- I told them --

1           DICK: Did you tell them about the personal  
2 messages I had for some of them?

3           STEVE: Yeah, yeah, I did. I said there's a  
4 lot of relatives, there's parents involved that want to  
5 see if you're okay, and who's here. I said, the  
6 F.B.I., themselves, want to know names and numbers  
7 here, obviously.

8           DICK: Uh-huh.

9           STEVE: So, you know, and even David doesn't  
10 seem like he's holding back with that. It seems like  
11 he was willing to even get into that more.

12           DICK: No, I appreciate that and you have,  
13 you have let these folks come forward. And I know that  
14 they're all interested in hearing about the concerns  
15 that have been expressed by relatives and friends, and  
16 I've got a list of people here.

17           STEVE: Right.

18           DICK: Is Barbara Reed or Leane and David  
19 Joseph in --

20           STEVE: Let me start writing some of those  
21 names down --

22           DICK: Okay.

23           STEVE: -- because, you know, I'm not --  
24 honesty, that's the first time I've ever heard that  
25 name. Okay. The first name, again, was?

          DICK: Barbara Reed, R-E-E-D.

1           STEVE: Okay. Now my pen quit. Let me see  
2 -- okay, here it goes. Barbara Reed.

3           DICK: Right.

4           STEVE: Here it quits again. Let me try a  
5 different pen. Could someone get -- well, here, I've  
6 got another pad. Just one minute. See if I can't find  
7 something else to write with.

8           DICK: You know, while you're listening and  
9 trying to find a pen there --

10          STEVE: Yeah.

11          DICK: -- a case came to mind. There was a  
12 federal jury down the Southern District of Florida that  
13 --

14          STEVE: Uh-huh.

15          DICK: -- that dismissed cases against a  
16 fellow down there who's a pilot for a family down  
17 there. And they, they just -- they ruled that the ATF  
18 had entrapped the man and the jury acquitted him on, on  
19 three charges in, in just a couple of days.

20          STEVE: Is that right?

21          DICK: Oh, yeah. It's called the Scott case.

22          STEVE: Okay.

23          DICK: The ATF entrapped him and, and  
24 remember the Delorean trial years ago, remember that,  
25 John Delorean?

          STEVE: Yeah.

1 DICK: Involved in a big drug thing.

2 STEVE: Yes, I do.

3 DICK: And he got, he got an acquittal by a  
4 jury of his peers.

5 STEVE: Okay.

6 DICK: And that's the way the system works.  
7 You go into court --

8 STEVE: I know it does happen.

9 DICK: Sure, it does.

10 STEVE: That man was very powerful with a lot  
11 of connections at the same time.

12 DICK: Well, here's a fellow -- one of the  
13 guys told me about a case that he was involved in -- a  
14 guy up in Coleville, Washington, which is a very, very  
15 small town, was another ATF case. And, apparently,  
16 there was some, some SWAT team, ATF SWAT team used.  
17 And, and the charges were dismissed.

18 STEVE: Well, I'm sure --

19 DICK: So, I mean it happens. It happens.

20 STEVE: -- it happens.

21 DICK: You know, it, it does happen because  
22 sometimes people are a little over zealous in doing  
23 their job. I mean -- in some of these other cases --

24 STEVE: I know -- I would believe that you  
25 would be a person that would try to be quite informed  
day by day on a day by -- especially because of the,

1 the job that you have. Have you ever viewed that video  
2 on BAPF, Breaking the Law or Above the Law or something  
3 like that. I can't remember exactly the wording but  
4 someone once said to me they had -- someone had passed  
5 the tape to them and they says, I want you to see this.  
6 And I said, I told him I didn't really have the time,  
7 it didn't concern me because I was not into guns and  
8 all the rest. But he says, Steve, it's the principle.  
9 So, I sat down to watch and I was astounded to see what  
10 was taking place, you know, and especially even against  
11 police officers by the ATF. And that's not to say that  
12 all these guys are aware of what's taking place but  
13 there's definitely -- they're taking privileges that  
14 are not or to me that are very unlawful, that are  
15 unconstitutional, that should not be.

16 DICK: Steve, it, it sounds a little trite  
17 but I'm going to tell you, none of us are perfect. We  
18 in the F.B.I., the ATF, the police departments, we're  
19 not perfect and we certainly do make errors and have  
20 made and unfortunately will probably continue to make  
21 errors. But we don't -- we want to make sure -- all of  
22 us that are involved in this particular incident want  
23 to make sure that nothing like this happens again.

24 STEVE: Right.

25 DICK: And, and, certainly, I'm, I'm going to  
concede that we make errors. I guess if we were



1 perfect, we wouldn't be doing what we're doing, will  
2 we? I mean, you know --

3 STEVE: Dick, what were some of those names  
4 then? I'll get you back to that then. I've got a pen  
5 here.

6 DICK: Okay. You got the pen ready to go  
7 again?

8 STEVE: Yeah.

9 DICK: Okay. And let me just give you one -

10 STEVE: Barbara --

11 DICK: -- one more point that I want --

12 STEVE: Okay.

13 DICK: -- to make before we --

14 STEVE: All right.

15 DICK: -- go to that list. You were  
16 concerned earlier in the conversation that the film  
17 taken during this Sunday incident would be altered to  
18 some degree. We also are going to make sure that  
19 people know you're concerned about that. And so that,  
20 you know, it's known that, that continues to concern  
21 you.

22 STEVE: Can I ask you, what do you know about  
23 that film 'cause, obviously, we have not seen it? Was  
24 that done by a number of news crews from that distance  
25 that they were allowed to be at or were they inside an  
area where the ATF would have not chosen to have them?

1           DICK: My belief and, again, I would have to  
2 confirm this --

3           STEVE: Yeah.

4           DICK: -- but it's my understanding that a  
5 news crew -- there was one news crew that, that did not  
6 go with ATF but followed ATF based on this -- perhaps  
7 on this article that appeared in the paper. They may  
8 have been --

9           STEVE: Right.

10          DICK: -- may have been watching ATF offices  
11 or something in preparation for what they felt might  
12 have been some attempt to serve a warrant and, and --

13          STEVE: Okay.

14          DICK: -- did, in fact, film it. And that --  
15 we have taken that film. They've been kind enough to  
16 give us a copy of that film. While they keep the film,  
17 mind you, we didn't confiscate it, they gave us,  
18 meaning law enforcement, a copy of it. And it was  
19 shown nationwide. I didn't see the whole thing 'cause  
20 I only caught excerpts of --

21          STEVE: Well, could we see it?

22          DICK: Sure, you'll be able to see it,  
23 absolutely.

24          STEVE: No, no, no, I'm talking about what,  
25 what's the problem -- you tell me what the problem  
would be with now to view it.

1           DICK: To do now?

2           STEVE: Yes.

3           DICK: To --

4           STEVE: So we can see just exactly what's  
5 going on from outside inside. Maybe that would be one  
6 of the things that help some of these people here make  
7 a decision about walking out.

8           DICK: That's, hey, you know, that's a  
9 thought.

10          STEVE: 'Cause I'm telling you, they do have  
11 fears.

12          DICK: That's a thought.

13          STEVE: You, you, guy got to keep on  
14 reminding you it's not so easy to tell this group,  
15 well, hey, it's okay because they do not think so  
16 because they're -- ever since we were cut off from the  
17 press, that's when the greatest fears start taking  
18 place with these people. Every time I go around saying  
19 that there's a man, Dick, on the telephone, he's  
20 willing to talk with you, they're telling me that they  
21 don't trust you because of not having nearby or someone  
22 either recording or someone that's unbiased like say  
23 news media or they want to get -- that -- it would make  
24 all the difference. So, there are those people that --  
25 this is what they're telling me anyway.

          DICK: Okay. Well, --

1           STEVE: So, keep it in mind with whatever  
2 kinds of --  
3           DICK: I will.  
4           STEVE: -- thing you've got in mind --  
5           DICK: I will.  
6           STEVE: -- for negotiation.  
7           DICK: Okay.  
8           STEVE: Uh --  
9           DICK: Well, let's go. You got your pencil  
10 there, your pen?  
11           STEVE: Yeah, I do, I do.  
12           DICK: Okay. There's a Leane Josephson and a  
13 William Josephson.  
14           STEVE: Joseph -- let's see, my pen quit  
15 again. Josephson. Okay. And a which?  
16           DICK: A William or a Bill Josephson.  
17           STEVE: Okay.  
18           DICK: A Jeff Little.  
19           STEVE: Okay.  
20           DICK: Margarita or it's spelled M-A-R-G-A-R  
21 --  
22           STEVE: Oh, yeah, we went -- last night I  
23 think it was, was that John and I that --  
24           DICK: Yeah, yeah.  
25           STEVE: Jeff Little is someone that is here?  
            DICK: Right.

1           STEVE: And his family, again, his father  
2 called or something or is there with --  
3           DICK: Yeah, exactly. Lonnie Little --  
4           STEVE: Lonnie Little, okay, I'll write that  
5 down.  
6           DICK: -- called.  
7           STEVE: Lonnie Little. Okay.  
8           DICK: Well, you think -- you don't -- you  
9 want to take this list down or do you want to talk  
10 directly to them? Well, what do you want to do?  
11          STEVE: Well, I'll, I'll ask them. I --  
12          DICK: Okay. All right.  
13          STEVE: -- I'll say to them, do you want to  
14 talk to these people, what do you want to do?  
15          DICK: Okay.  
16          STEVE: I'll go around. So, --  
17          DICK: The next one is a Catherine --  
18          STEVE: But you mentioned a Barbara Rush or  
19 something?  
20          DICK: No Barbara Rush. Barbara Reed, R-E-E-  
21 D. Barbara Reed was one of the names I gave.  
22          STEVE: Oh, Barbara Reed. Who is she with or  
23 asking for?  
24          DICK: Apparently, she's one of the folks  
25 that's thought to be inside there with you.  
            STEVE: A Barbara Reed?

1 DICK: That's what -- that's what we --

2 STEVE: We've never heard of the person.

3 DICK: Okay. Well, you get inquiry from  
4 these folks. Maybe that's the child of the Josephsons  
5 or some such thing. I--

6 STEVE: Who are Josephsons? Who are they  
7 connected to or who are they --

8 DICK: A Lynn Josephson --

9 STEVE: Okay.

10 DICK: -- has made inquiry about, about three  
11 people, Reed and Leane and William Josephson.

12 STEVE: We know none of those three. And the  
13 --

14 DICK: Okay.

15 STEVE: -- person inquiring was, again, who?

16 DICK: Lynn Josephson.

17 STEVE: Lynn, yeah -- no one to do with us.  
18 Must be some other thing totally.

19 DICK: Okay. Now, you mentioned to me before  
20 you really hadn't had contact with everybody. Are you,  
21 are you quite sure that this is accurate?

22 STEVE: Oh, yeah, no question about it.

23 DICK: All right.

24 STEVE: I'll go to make sure, of course.  
25 I'll ask a lot of people --

DICK: Okay.

1               STEVE:  -- anybody here ever hear of a Lynn  
2 Josephson or a Barbara Reed, a Leane Josephson, a Bill  
3 Josephson?  Yeah, no one -- they're all shaking their  
4 head.  They've never heard of such persons.

5               DICK:  Okay.

6               STEVE:  Okay.  And then the next person you  
7 mentioned was Lonnie Little in relation to Jeff Little?

8               DICK:  Jeff Little is supposed to be inside  
9 with you, yeah.

10              STEVE:  Right.

11              DICK:  And you said he's okay, is that  
12 correct?

13              STEVE:  Yes, that's -- this is correct.

14              DICK:  Okay.

15              STEVE:  Who else?

16              DICK:  And Margarita Vega.  She's all right I  
17 understand.

18              STEVE:  Right.  I had mentioned that also  
19 last night.

20              DICK:  Okay.  Sherry Jewel.

21              STEVE:  Okay.  And she is also.

22              DICK:  She's okay?

23              STEVE:  Yeah.

24              DICK:  Okay.  A --

25              STEVE:  Who was asking for Margarita?  I  
believe it was her daughter, Gessler or something.

1 DICK: Ursula.  
2 STEVE: Ursula, that's what it was.  
3 DICK: Ursula. Gerdman, I think it's  
4 pronounced?  
5 STEVE: That's correct.  
6 DICK: Okay. Sherry Jewel?  
7 STEVE: Okay. And it was Mosers --  
8 DICK: Moser.  
9 STEVE: -- the mother, yeah.  
10 DICK: Right. She, she's fine, right?  
11 STEVE: Yes.  
12 DICK: Okay. A Mary Jean Borst.  
13 STEVE: Mary Jean Borst. Okay.  
14 DICK: And that inquiry comes from Darrin  
15 Borst.  
16 STEVE: From Dan?  
17 DICK: From Darrin.  
18 STEVE: Oh, Darrin, okay.  
19 DICK: Yeah. The next one --  
20 STEVE: It must be a son.  
21 DICK: It is. The next one is the -- and I  
22 understand she might be okay, is that correct?  
23 STEVE: Yeah, she is.  
24 DICK: Okay. A fellow -- geez, I'm not  
25 familiar with this name, G-R-A-E-M -- I think it's a  
Graem Cradock.



1 STEVE: Oh, Graem Cradock.  
2 DICK: Graem, okay, that's what that is.  
3 STEVE: Yeah. Yeah.  
4 DICK: Okay. I guess that's what this says.  
5 Graem Cradock, fine?  
6 STEVE: Yes.  
7 DICK: Okay. A Douglas --  
8 STEVE: Is that from his mother, maybe?  
9 DICK: Yes.  
10 STEVE: Okay.  
11 DICK: No, I'm sorry, Barry Cradock.  
12 STEVE: Okay, Barry.  
13 DICK: Yeah. From -- these folks are from  
14 Australia.  
15 STEVE: Right, they are.  
16 DICK: Okay. A Douglas Martin.  
17 STEVE: Okay, Douglas Martin.  
18 DICK: Okay. From Anthony Greenwood. Is  
19 Douglas all right?  
20 STEVE: Yes, he is.  
21 DICK: How about Sheila? She's all right,  
22 also?  
23 STEVE: Yes.  
24 DICK: Both of them are there --  
25 STEVE: Right.  
DICK: -- and they're both fine. Okay. How

1 about Paul Fanta, Fatta, F-A-T-T-A?  
2 STEVE: He seems to be okay, also.  
3 DICK: And --  
4 STEVE: Who's, who's been asking for Paul?  
5 DICK: Irma.  
6 DICK: Okay. Paul is -- it's Irma. See, I  
7 better write some of these -- must be a grandparent.  
8 DICK: Yeah, I don't know. There's no, no  
9 indication here.  
10 STEVE: Okay. (Indiscernible)  
11 DICK: And --  
12 STEVE: Anyway, I got it down. Don't worry.  
13 DICK: Kalani Fatta.  
14 STEVE: Okay.  
15 DICK: Both these folks are okay? There was  
16 some --  
17 STEVE: Yes.  
18 DICK: Apparently, you mentioned last night  
19 you weren't sure about that. That's one of the names,  
20 I think, that David asked me about yesterday.  
21 STEVE: Right.  
22 DICK: So, Paul Fatta and Kalani are, are  
23 both fine?  
24 STEVE: Yes, from what I'm hearing anyway.  
25 This is what I've been told.  
DICK: Okay. But you -- okay.

1 STEVE: Okay. And who else do you have?  
2 DICK: All right. Then we have some inquiry  
3 from the British Consulate.  
4 STEVE: Okay, British -- okay.  
5 DICK: Making inquiry on a Winston Blake.  
6 STEVE: Winston Blake.  
7 DICK: Is he okay?  
8 STEVE: I believe he is (Indiscernible).  
9 DICK: Well, now don't tell me that if you  
10 don't know.  
11 STEVE: No, no, I'm -- that's why --  
12 DICK: Because --  
13 STEVE: -- I say, I'm going to -- let me  
14 check on him, okay?  
15 DICK: Okay.  
16 STEVE: All right.  
17 DICK: Because, you know, these, these folks  
18 are --  
19 STEVE: Right.  
20 DICK: People are concerned about them and --  
21 STEVE: Right.  
22 DICK: -- and we just don't want to tell them  
23 that --  
24 STEVE: Okay. Do you have a name for Winston  
25 that --  
DICK: No, I don't have --

1 STEVE: Okay.

2 DICK: I don't have --

3 STEVE: These are just ones that are being  
4 raised, huh, as names or something?

5 DICK: Right.

6 STEVE: Okay. Who else?

7 DICK: A Beverly Elliott.

8 STEVE: Beverly Elliott, okay. Okay.

9 DICK: Okay. Susan Benta, B-E-N-T-A.

10 STEVE: Okay. Yes.

11 DICK: Are you telling me she's -- these,  
12 these other two folks, Beverly and Susan, are both  
13 fine?

14 STEVE: Yes, they are.

15 DICK: Okay. Cliff Sellers.

16 (Someone playing with telephone buttons)

17 STEVE: Oh, someone just hit --

18 DICK: Okay. It's all right. I'm still  
19 here.

20 STEVE: Okay. Okay.

21 DICK: Cliff Sellers.

22 STEVE: Yes, fine.

23 DICK: Okay. Marjorie Powell.

24 STEVE: Fine.

25 DICK: Okay. Now, again, when you're saying  
fine, they're all there and doing well?

1 STEVE: That's right.

2 DICK: Okay. Yvette Fagan, F-A-G-A-N.

3 STEVE: Fine.

4 DICK: Okay. Livingston Fagan.

5 STEVE: Fine.

6 DICK: Mike Malcolm.

7 STEVE: Let's see, Mike Malcolm, Mike

8 Malcolm. I don't know any Mike Malcolm. Could it be a

9 Livingston Malcolm? It must be 'cause --

10 DICK: Yeah, I suppose that it's possible.

11 There's a Livingston Fagan.

12 STEVE: Right.

13 DICK: You mean you've got a Livingston

14 Malcolm, also?

15 STEVE: That's correct. That's correct.

16 DICK: Okay.

17 STEVE: If he's got a nickname, Mike, or

18 something, then --

19 DICK: Well, that's possible. That's

20 certainly possible. A Natalie, last name is N-O-R-B-R-

21 E-G-A.

22 STEVE: You have her.

23 DICK: Okay. Bernadette Mombelly, Mombelly,

24 is that how it's pronounced?

25 STEVE: Yeah, she's here.

DICK: Okay. Okay. Ramos, Ramos, last name

1 is A-V-R-R-M.

2 STEVE: What's the first name?

3 DICK: Renos or Ramos.

4 STEVE: Or Renos, okay, yes.

5 DICK: Okay?

6 STEVE: Uh-huh.

7 DICK: All righty. An Alrick Benette, B-E-N-

8 E-T-T-E.

9 STEVE: Benette. What's the first name?

10 DICK: Alrick, A-L-R-I-C-K, Alrick.

11 STEVE: Alrick.

12 DICK: Might -- they might call him George.

13 STEVE: Oh, I see. Yes.

14 DICK: Middle name is apparently George.

15 STEVE: Okay.

16 DICK: All righty.

17 STEVE: All right.

18 DICK: A Derrick Lovelock.

19 STEVE: Yes.

20 DICK: Okay. And a Sonja Murray?

21 STEVE: Yes.

22 DICK: Okay. Let me see if I have any other

23 names here. Those are folks that people made inquiry

24 on. I think I had some other names here but it may

25 have been included on this list here.

STEVE: Okay.

1           DICK: Okay. All right. Well, I'm sure --  
2 you know, we'll pass this on to these folks and I'm  
3 sure they'll appreciate your confirming that they're,  
4 that they're fine.

5           STEVE: All right.

6           DICK: Now, how about -- some of these folks,  
7 they want me to pass directly on to them the concerns  
8 of these other people, the people that have called in?

9           STEVE: Like?

10          DICK: Well, I'm just saying, if you have  
11 some of these folks here that --

12          STEVE: Here's what I'll do.

13          DICK: -- whose names I just gave you.

14          STEVE: Can you give me about an hour or two  
15 and --

16          DICK: Well, we'll give you some time.

17          STEVE: Well, here's what I'm going to do.  
18 Well, of course you are. But anyway, we're -- I'll go  
19 around with especially this list and even with others  
20 who, who have not been inquired about.

21          DICK: Okay.

22          STEVE: I'll ask them if they want to make  
23 known to their parents, to other relatives, to friends,  
24 anything through or by yourself. This list here, I'm  
25 going to even pass it on to them and --

          DICK: Okay.

1           STEVE: -- ask them if they want to talk to  
2 you to let them know their condition or whatever else.

3           DICK: Okay. You know, while your --

4           STEVE: So far I haven't really talked to a  
5 lot of those that are from Britain as much as like I  
6 told you just --

7           DICK: Okay.

8           STEVE: -- a little while ago, I was talking  
9 to a group of people and, and a few others which they  
10 said they wanted me to be their spokes person, trying  
11 to get a line open for someone else other than the very  
12 agency that would be arresting them. So, that's what  
13 you and I are were talking about, which didn't seem  
14 unreasonable to yourself, having an in betweener go  
15 between --

16          DICK: Sure.

17          STEVE: -- and you and I will continue to  
18 work on that.

19          DICK: All right. Let me see. I have one  
20 other thought concerning those folks -- there are,  
21 obviously, a lot of other people in there we've not  
22 talked to.

23          STEVE: Uh-huh.

24          DICK: If you could get me a list of their  
25 names and a list of, of the person that they want us to  
pass on some -- a message to, we will certainly



1 entertain that.

2 STEVE: Right.

3 DICK: We would -- you give us a telephone  
4 number, a name, an address and --

5 STEVE: You know, I'll -- you would, of  
6 course, know that I'd want to do that except for the  
7 very reason of logistics. I mean the whole problem  
8 being that, you know, we don't want you to know exactly  
9 who is here totally, do we?

10 DICK: Well, that may well be and that's --  
11 if that's your choice, that's fine. I just wanted --

12 STEVE: Yeah, but, but you would know that,  
13 of course.

14 DICK: Well, I understand that might be a  
15 concern of yours but I thought maybe because all of  
16 those people are in there voluntarily, they might want  
17 to just let people know that they're fine, that they're  
18 okay.

19 STEVE: That's why we're still trying to, you  
20 know, we're trying to go to the nth degree to try to  
21 work something out. When I tell you that if these  
22 people want to go, believe me, they'll be out there  
23 with assistance.

24 DICK: Sure. Oh, I understand what you're  
25 saying. I just thought if they don't want to go. You  
cannot believe the deluge of telephone calls that we've

1 --

2 STEVE: Oh, I can believe, for sure.

3 DICK: -- received here from people  
4 wondering, one, are their, are their loved ones in  
5 there? And, two, are they okay if they're in there.  
6 So, what we're trying to do is just --

7 STEVE: I'm --

8 DICK: -- get a message to those folks.

9 STEVE: -- I'm shocked that there haven't  
10 been more phone calls and more requests, in fact, than  
11 what you've given me here.

12 DICK: Oh, there are. We're just trying to  
13 get them to you when we can but, unfortunately, some of  
14 those folks that are in there are unknown, and we're  
15 going to have to work backwards from your end there  
16 with the name and telephone numbers for those people  
17 that we can contact.

18 STEVE: I can imagine for sure.

19 DICK: And we'll be happy to do that for you  
20 and for them.

21 STEVE: Okay.

22 DICK: So, you know, you get together a list  
23 of those folks for me and then, and then a list of, you  
24 know, people that you might have some interest in in  
25 talking to later.

STEVE: Right. Well, I'll be doing that in

1 the next few hours then.

2 DICK: Well, yeah, you know what you could  
3 do, Steve?

4 STEVE: What's that?

5 DICK: Have -- assign that -- delegate to  
6 someone and have them -- several people go out.

7 STEVE: Well, that's what I would -- that's  
8 what I would be doing, of course.

9 DICK: Okay. Good. Good.

10 STEVE: When I say that, I'm just saying now  
11 get the process started.

12 DICK: Yeah, don't do it yourself, send out  
13 somebody to get it done for you.

14 And David's still, still down?

15 STEVE: He's still out. I'm looking -- in  
16 fact, I'm looking at him now.

17 DICK: You know, one thing that concerns me,  
18 if he's sleeping so much, that might be an indication  
19 that his health is not as good as it might be.

20 STEVE: Well, I don't know 'cause aren't  
21 usually -- the best thing for sickness for someone's  
22 that sick no matter what the problem is, I think the  
23 body recovers the fastest when it does get the rest.

24 DICK: Well, that's true to a degree but too  
25 much rest might mean that there's something wrong.

STEVE: Well, well, you know yourself,

1 | though, Dick, that he's healed -- I think he -- didn't  
2 | he talk for six hours the other night? Who was it, was  
3 | it -- was it your -- no, it wasn't you. I think it was  
4 | with Henry, for about six hours I think it was.

5 |           DICK: Yeah, I think he did. I think he did.

6 |           STEVE: And then, in fact, even John told me  
7 | last night even how he -- of course, he had been  
8 | listening and, and to some of the subject matter of  
9 | what was being spoken about and his reaction to that.

10 |           DICK: Sure.

11 |           STEVE: So, I mean the truth is -- I mean he  
12 | expends a lot of energy in the condition he is to talk  
13 | on the phone for that length of time, pouring out that  
14 | much of his soul into what he's trying to say and reach  
15 | out to people like yourselves. So, then, the next  
16 | thing you know, he's back sleeping again. So, that,  
17 | you know, this is the way it's been.

18 |           DICK: Sure, I understand that. The only  
19 | thing is my -- I guess our concern is is that a  
20 | sickness is one thing, a wound is another.

21 |           STEVE: Right.

22 |           DICK: There's a chance for infection and  
23 | peritonitis and gangrene and those kinds of things.  
24 | So, you know, sleeping, while it, it's a recuperative  
25 | thing that we all want to do when we're sick, it's a  
   | little different when you have a gunshot wound.

1           STEVE: Yeah, I know, but we're keeping an  
2 eye on him.

3           DICK: Okay.

4           STEVE: He seems to be doing okay so far.  
5 Every now and then, of course, he'll be talking or if  
6 he makes a movement or even if he does make a movement,  
7 he'll get a lot of pain in, of course, that area.

8           Yeah, someone's just showing me a message  
9 here. Let me see what it says here.

10          DICK: Okay.

11          STEVE: (Indiscernible) regards to news  
12 briefings mentioned. Our needs are being made since  
13 there's still children in there. Okay. They -- one of  
14 the women just came with a note saying, where's the  
15 milk, you know, I mean -- what's his name again, the  
16 agent, --

17          DICK: Hartnet?

18          STEVE: -- Bob Ricks?

19          DICK: No, that was Mr. Hartnet, I believe.

20          STEVE: Anyway, they made the statement that,  
21 you know, a lot of this is being met, which is not so.

22          DICK: Well, I think --

23          STEVE: Bob -- okay, let me go through this  
24 list here. You asked --

25          DICK: Okay. Okay, go ahead. In fact, I'll  
jot them down while you're doing it.

1           STEVE: Okay. Let me take a look here. One  
2 of the statements that were made was D.K. or David  
3 hasn't said anything about any -- or anymore about the  
4 bodies that are inside.

5           Well, you know, we've been harping since I  
6 believe it was yesterday on the one that is -- that we  
7 do have very clearly. We know who he is. And we've  
8 been trying to do something about that but it came  
9 across contrary to that. And, of course, you guys hid  
10 the fact that we do, in fact, want to get that body  
11 out. Okay?

12           DICK: Okay. What's the next item?

13           STEVE: Let me take a look here. And this  
14 statement is given again in regards to that body. They  
15 could give no predictions if and when the body will be  
16 removed.

17           Well, that's -- he didn't go on to say it was  
18 because it was your choice. I wish you would have told  
19 them that.

20           DICK: You know what? I felt a little  
21 uncomfortable with that answer, too. I wish you -- I  
22 wish you would have added because we're primarily  
23 concerned right now with the living and we want to get  
24 aid to the living and we'll deal with, with, with the  
25 dead when we, when we can.

          STEVE: Right.

1           DICK: I wish you had gone on to say that  
2 because, obviously, all are emphasis here is --

3           STEVE: I like honesty, you know. I mean  
4 this is the thing that will get a lot of these people,  
5 if you would want them to come walking out, those are  
6 the things they're looking for. They're really are.  
7 You know, I can't move anybody here. They're not going  
8 to listen -- when it comes right down to it, they came  
9 here because they heard David opened the book. So,  
10 that, you know, that's the bottom line. But for them  
11 to make a choice contrary to that, they might, but it  
12 would have to be based upon a trust relationship that's  
13 been developed by what they're hearing and seeing. And  
14 this is what they're telling me. This is why they keep  
15 on asking me to be a spokes person for them and not to  
16 let them down. They want to have some kind of an  
17 outside line, of course, to the press and so forth.  
18 They want that kind of assurance.

19           Anyway, another statement was made after that  
20 again about bodies and the decomposition question. And  
21 the agent would like to get all out of the compound.  
22 Well, you know, why not the one that we already have  
23 even.

24           What other questions do you have here you put  
25 before me? Someone just handed me a statement that  
they -- well, anyway, a couple of these women, they

1 | just dropped that note to me about the milk, that it --  
2 | this has been now like what two days, I believe, at  
3 | least. So, I mean before -- I mean it's -- you've got  
4 | to remember, like I told you and I think I said it to  
5 | John Cox, that if need be, they'll forego milk.  
6 | They'll give the baby water, whatever else.

7 |           DICK: No, I know you said that.

8 |           STEVE: Yeah.

9 |           DICK: I know you said that and --

10 |           STEVE: Okay. I mean I'm just telling you as  
11 | it is with their mind, the way they're thinking and the  
12 | way they're looking at it.

13 |           DICK: Yeah, I understand that and I told --

14 |           STEVE: Okay.

15 |           DICK: -- and I told you, and please pass on  
16 | to them --

17 |           STEVE: All right.

18 |           DICK: -- I'd be happy to drive down the lane  
19 | with those -- with that milk --

20 |           STEVE: I believe that.

21 |           DICK: -- and the response I'm getting in  
22 | answer to that question is that, we're, we're prepared  
23 | to, to provide all the necessary and desirable aid to  
24 | those children. And it's up to the parents to insure  
25 | that that happens and -- by coming out and bringing the  
   | kids out with them.



1           STEVE: Okay. So, we'll just forget the  
2 milk, then, and -- I'll tell you what, well, you can --  
3 we'll be talking in a couple of hours then.

4           DICK: All right. Well, let's, let's don't  
5 make it that long because --

6           STEVE: Well, it's going to take me a little  
7 while 'cause these --

8           DICK: I know.

9           STEVE: -- people are all over the place.

10          DICK: Well, we'll have some of those folks  
11 and you and I -- I know, I know you have some more  
12 questions for me.

13          STEVE: I'll try to get those questions down.

14          DICK: Concerning, you know, the procedures  
15 when you come out. I know those things are of an issue  
16 with you and with others --

17          STEVE: Well, sure they are.

18          DICK: -- in there, and I'm prepared to  
19 answer those questions for you and --

20          STEVE: All right.

21          DAVID: -- to make you feel more comfortable  
22 about that process and that procedure because I know it  
23 scares people. I've been doing this job for a long  
24 time and it's very concerning to people because they're  
25 not sure, it's the unknown, it's the fear of the  
unknown. You're comfortable there. You're fearful

1 | that when you come out, what is going to be done. I  
2 | can answer those questions for you. I'm prepared to do  
3 | that. And we will do that. And I think you'll feel  
4 | very comfortable with the -- with what we're trying to  
5 | do to make sure that you're handled both under lawfully  
6 | and comfortably and, and in a way that, that you'll  
7 | feel safe.

8 |               STEVE: Uh-huh.

9 |               DICK: And, and we're doing that. And that's  
10 | all we want, is your safety and the safety of everyone  
11 | here. The kids especially, all of us want to insure  
12 | the kids' safety first and foremost but things have  
13 | been done here to insure that when you come out, that  
14 | you're, that you're going to be handled very, very  
15 | quickly, very compassionately, and so that you can get  
16 | your folks back to your families as soon as possible.

17 |               And, certainly, I'm not going to lie to you,  
18 | there are going to be some charges with, with some  
19 | folks but the majority of the folks are going to be --  
20 | are going to be interviewed and, and they're going to  
21 | get an opportunity to, to tell us what happened. And  
22 | then they're going to be reunited with, with family  
23 | members, with the kids and that sort of thing.

24 |               So, please pass that on to the folks in  
25 | there.

              STEVE: All right.

1           DICK: And then, and then I know they're  
2 going to have questions. You gather those questions  
3 and we'll go through that procedure, how it's done, why  
4 it's done and the accommodation we're making to you  
5 folks in there to insure that you're not, you're not  
6 concerned and your concerns are needless as -- in terms  
7 of what's going to be done because it will be done in,  
8 in an appropriate fashion right here with a magistrate  
9 right here. You're not going to have to go, you know,  
10 any distance, and you'll be bused over here and --  
11 together.

12           STEVE: Uh-huh.

13           DICK: And we'll deal with those issues. All  
14 right?

15           STEVE: All right.

16           DICK: All right. I'll get back to you,  
17 then, not too distant future. Get, get some of those  
18 questions and you and I can discuss those questions  
19 while somebody else is getting the names of those other  
20 folks and the people that they might want to contact.

21           STEVE: All right.

22           DICK: All right.

23           STEVE: Talk to you in a little bit.

24           DICK: All right.

25           STEVE: Good bye.

2 DICK: -- you're going to have to entertain.

3 STEVE: I mean because, you know, this is the  
4 same kind of a -- I just want to say in regards to that  
5 reaction, it's a reaction to what's happening on the  
6 premises still.

7 DICK: Uh-huh.

8 STEVE: So, if you make your movements wrong,  
9 you don't talk to us, the same will be so. You want to  
10 take one of our people out, well, it will begin again.

11 DICK: Well, we're not going to do that. We  
12 have a -- we have a --

13 STEVE: Okay. Well, that's --

14 DICK: -- proposal to, to, to talk with you  
15 about.

16 STEVE: Okay. I'll -- I'm open for that but  
17 --

18 DICK: Let's --

19 STEVE: -- but let me say he wants to get the  
20 cassette tape out of his car. It's part of our worship  
21 service.

22 DICK: Hold on. Let me, let me -- give me a  
23 minute, okay?

24 STEVE: All right.

25 DICK: What time -- let me get back to you in  
just a minute. Okay?

1 STEVE: Okay.

2 DICK: You, you hold on --

3 STEVE: No problem. We'll be unarmed, of

4 course.

5 DICK: Well, listen, don't send anybody out

6 until I talk to people about it, okay?

7 STEVE: All right.

8 DICK: I'll get back to you in just a couple

9 of minutes.

10 STEVE: Okay. I'll be back. Okay, thanks,

11 Dick.

12 DICK: Bye-bye.

22 periods of time, sometimes there's some, some fatigue

23 and that sort of thing. So, we don't want to do

24 anything without talking to one another.

25 Now, where, where is this tape now?

STEVE: Where is the which? The tape -- it's

1 | in the black Camero which is sitting right in the front  
2 | of the building, just a little off -- I think it's just  
3 | left of the front door.

4 |           DICK: All right, right out front with the  
5 | vehicles in front?

6 |           STEVE: Exactly, very clear in the open and  
7 | everything.

8 |           DICK: All right. That -- you know, that's  
9 | fine but, again, the reason I was concerned about you  
10 | doing it before I cleared is 'cause I just wanted to  
11 | make sure that your fellow comes out safely and that  
12 | our people knows he's coming out and that sort of  
13 | thing.

14 |           STEVE: Well, you know, like I said, you  
15 | know, I mean it almost seems funny at times because,  
16 | number one, they're all in armored tanks and so forth  
17 | and so --

18 |           DICK: Let's -- you know, we don't, we don't  
19 | need to quarrel about that. We know that. I just want  
20 | to make sure that he isn't --

21 |           STEVE: I know.

22 |           DICK: And no weapons.

23 |           STEVE: You know, it has bothered me, though,  
24 | that you expect that from me and then on the other  
25 | hand, these guys are digging on our property, moving  
around, things that they shouldn't be touching.

1           DICK: Well, that's one of the things we want  
2 to discuss.

3           STEVE: All right.

4           DICK: I want to discuss directly with David.

5           STEVE: All right.

6           DICK: Now, you're talking about a prayer  
7 service from --

8           STEVE: Yes.

9           DAVID: -- from what period?

10          STEVE: Right -- well, right now we're still  
11 in it and --

12          DICK: Okay.

13          STEVE: -- let me see. Let me look down at  
14 my watch here. So, it will probably be another 45  
15 minutes.

16          DICK: Let's make it -- it's 3:19 now. Let's

18          STEVE: Okay.

19          DICK: -- let's make it at a quarter to -- a  
20 quarter to four. I'll call you back. I need to talk  
21 to David because I have --

22          STEVE: Well, let's make it at 4:00 or just a

          DICK: High -- 4:00 straight up, and I need



1 | to talk to David because I have, I have some -- what I  
2 | think he'll find to be very important and interesting  
3 | development.

4 |           STEVE: Okay.

5 |           DICK: All right.

6 |           STEVE: Very good. I'll talk to you then.

7 |           DICK: All right. Very well.

8 |           STEVE: Okay. Bye.

9 |           DICK: Bye.

14          DAVID: So, what are we trying to develop

16          DICK: Okay. Well, are you going to send  
17 your fellow out to pick up the tape?

18          DAVID: Yes.

19          DICK: I want to go ahead and relay that if  
20 you're going to do that.

21          DAVID: Go ahead, go ahead and send the guy  
22 out to get the tape.

23          DICK: Okay. Listen, --

24          DAVID: Well, let me -- it's probably on the  
25 dash or right there near the console.

          DICK: Okay.

1           DAVID: Right, it's the demo tape.

2           (Unidentified people talking in the  
3           background).

4           DAVID: Well, it's amazing none of those  
5 tanks blew up, you know it? Yeah.

6           DICK: Okay. Are you going to start him out,  
7 David?

8           DAVID: Are they starting off yet? Go ahead.  
9           (Pause)

10          DAVID: It just, it just takes one person for  
11 the tape. It's just one tape.

12          DICK: Yeah. Just ask them to go ahead and,  
13 you know, send one out to pick it up.

14          DAVID: What, they want to get that gas tank?  
15 Where's it at? No, where at? Oh, just right there at  
16 the door?

17          (Unidentified persons talking in the

19          DAVID: Well, he, he can just grab that when  
20 he comes in. Anyway, he wants, he wants to grab a  
21 propane tank on the, on the way back. It's just right  
22 there at the door.

23          DICK: That's okay.

24          DAVID: Says it's all right. It's amazing  
25 those tanks didn't get, didn't get hit.

          DICK: Well, I guess so. I guess so.

1           DAVID: I've never seen one of them blow but  
2 I hear they're pretty potent.

3           DICK: Yeah.

4           DAVID: They just filled up some propane  
5 tanks and, and they're what -- they're like what, ten  
6 gallons, five gallons --

7           DICK: Yeah, I think the normal one, with the  
8 barbecue, is, is 10 pounds, 20 pounds.

9           DAVID: They're right there by the door.

10          DICK: So, you're going to send your fellow  
11 out?

12          DAVID: Yeah, he's coming out now.

13          DICK: Okay.

14          DAVID: No. One guy to get the tape and when  
15 he comes around, just grab the ear of the tank and he  
16 can drag it in. Yeah. Unless they want to get shot.

17          DICK: I think that probably got their  
18 attention.

19          DAVID: Oh, you know, these guys don't care.  
20 They've, they've learned every prophecy all the way  
21 from, from Deuteronomy 32, the Song of Moses, all the  
22 way through the prophetic writings. They -- they're,  
23 they're awesome young men and awesome young women.

24          DICK: Oh, is he, is he on his way out now?

25          DAVID: Yeah, as far as I know. I'm -- you  
know, I can't see where they're at right where I'm at

1 --

2 DICK: Okay.

3 DAVID: -- but they should be coming out.

4 DICK: All right.

5 DAVID: I sure wish you guys knew, knew the  
6 reasons for the Bible.

7 DICK: Well, you know, Dave, over the last  
8 few, you know, few days that we've had an occasion to  
9 talk here and especially yesterday and today, I've been  
10 hearing a lot of sincere concern in your mind. And, of  
11 course, I've got those same concerns, and I want to  
12 work with you, and I think I've shown you we're trying  
13 to work with you. And for the last couple of hours  
14 when I haven't been here and I know we haven't had a  
15 lot of conversation today --

16 DAVID: Well, I've been sleeping off and on.

17 DICK: Sure. And I spoke --

18 DAVID: I've been trying to walk now.

19 DICK: Well, that's good.

20 DAVID: And --

21 DICK: Get up and do a little walking and try  
22 to get some of the muscle tone back.

23 DAVID: Well, I get up and then my head goes  
24 real light. They say it's just a loss of blood.

25 DICK: Yeah.

DAVID: So, we're trying to get some iron and

1 | some spinach and stuff but --

2 |           DICK: Sure. Well, you know, again, I've  
3 | been hearing this concern and we've, we've reached a  
4 | point now where we're not making a lot of headway and  
5 | things haven't been working out really well for, for  
6 | the last half of yesterday and part of today. So, what  
7 | I've done and, again, why we've not been out there  
8 | speaking with you today is because I've gone up to the  
9 | bosses and I've taken upon myself to, to take this up  
10 | to them and suggest to them that, listen, I'm trying to  
11 | deal with David. He's trying to deal with me. And it  
12 | looks like our position is that he doesn't fully trust  
13 | me and I haven't been able to fully trust him. And  
14 | we've got to do something to show good faith on both  
15 | sides. And we've kicked this back and forth at some --  
16 | for some time. And I've really gone out on a limb to  
17 | represent you guys out there in an effort to get this  
18 | done. And a couple of things we've done -- we  
19 | mentioned that -- Steve yesterday was indicating that  
20 | they're concerned or you're concerned that you haven't  
21 | been able to get the word out. So, I -- what I've done  
22 | is gone to the bosses and said, listen, please, in one  
23 | of these next press conferences, if you can, mention  
24 | that the folks inside are concerned that they're not  
25 | going to be able to get their word out for fear that  
the government, the F.B.I is going to try to suppress



1 the thoughts of those inside. So, they -- they're  
2 aware that, that you're concerned about that. And  
3 they've, you know, responded very favorably. That  
4 isn't going to be the case. So, I've asked them to  
5 make reference to that so that the media knows that at  
6 some point in time there's going to be a full  
7 accounting from you folks as to your perspective in  
8 there.

9 In addition to that, I know you're, you're  
10 very concerned about the Bradleys, and I know that --

11 DAVID: No, we're not worried about the Brad  
12 -- that's why we haven't done nothing to them yet. You  
13 know --

14 DICK: No, I'm talking about the property  
15 line.

16 DAVID: Yeah. Well, the thing of it is is  
17 like I say, we've allowed, we've allowed you all to  
18 infringe upon your statements and but, honestly, one  
19 thing -- our main problem is, and I understand it very  
20 clearly, is that it's naturally, it's naturally the  
21 skeptics point of view to believe that a person doesn't  
22 -- a God doesn't talk to man but --

23 DICK: But, Dave, let me, let me finish my  
24 thought here because, you know, again, --

25 DAVID: Okay.

DICK: -- I've, I've really put out some

1 effort to get this done for you and the commanders here  
2 have, have really listened at length to this, and we've  
3 tried to work together here to come up with a proposal  
4 for you. And we think that you're going to be happy  
5 with it and it will get us off of this impasse. And,  
6 of course, to get this, this incident resolved, it's,  
7 it's going to -- it's going to require that the two of  
8 us work together. So, what I'd like you to do here,  
9 I'd like you to commit to the release of, of all the  
10 folks in there and we will agree to withdraw all the  
11 Bradley vehicles from your property line. And in, in  
12 doing this, I know you would be reluctant and I would  
13 be reluctant to do one thing without the other person  
14 agreeing, so we need to work out this mutual trust.  
15 And what would I -- what I would propose is that you  
16 send out four people, children, women, if you like. At  
17 the same time as they're walking up the road, we'll  
18 withdraw all the Bradley vehicles from your property.  
19 And then following those developments, that is the kids  
20 leaving and the vehicles withdrawing, to be followed by  
21 the rest of the folks inside.

22               DAVID: Okay. One second.

23               DICK: And we can talk about, you know, --  
24 the way that we need to do this is just the way we  
25 talked about it the first day when you folks were going  
to leave in that fashion.

1           STEVE: Okay. This is, this is Steve. Go  
2 ahead.

3           DICK: What happened to David?

4           STEVE: He handed the phone to me. He wanted  
5 me to hear what you had to say.

6           DICK: Okay. Well, as I proposed to him,  
7 we've had some problems over the last day or so working  
8 out a way we can get past this point where we seem to  
9 be hanging up. There's obviously a reluctance on your  
10 part to accept that we're trying to do everything we  
11 can on your behalf. So, as I was telling David, the  
12 reason I haven't called in today is because I've gone  
13 to the commanders up here and made some requests of  
14 them and we've been talking at length, trying to,  
15 trying to resolve this impasse. And, so, we're, we're  
16 offering this proposal that if you folks in there will  
17 commit to coming out of, of the compound, we'll  
18 withdraw the Bradleys from the property, back across  
19 from the property lines. And as we're withdrawing the  
20 Bradleys, you send four kids or four adults up the, up  
21 the path there as we're moving. So that way we know  
22 that you're going to be committed to your part of the  
23 agreement and you know that we're committed to our part  
24 of the agreement. And then once those Bradleys are off  
25 the property, then the rest of you folks go ahead and  
follow the kids out or those first four individuals out

1 | in the same fashion as --

2 |           STEVE: Well, I should actually -- I should  
3 | have you save your breath because right now you and I  
4 | are so far apart, Dick, that there's no sense in even  
5 | talking.

6 |           DICK: Okay. Well, offer me a suggestion.

7 |           STEVE: You need to go back -- you need to go  
8 | back to the commanders --

9 |           DICK: Okay.

10 |           STEVE: -- and start talking sensibly and  
11 | then you can call me when you've got something  
12 | worthwhile to talk about.

13 |           DICK: Well, let's, let's don't -- let's  
14 | discuss this, then.

15 |           STEVE: Okay.

16 |           DICK: What, what --

17 |           STEVE: Dick, David would like to talk to you  
18 | again. He'd like to give you a little study. One  
19 | thing is for sure, is what he's saying, you don't  
20 | believe what he's telling you. But you would -- here,  
21 | here he is. He wants to talk to you again. Okay?

22 |           DICK: All right. I'll be happy to.

23 |           STEVE: Here he is.

24 |           DICK: We'll work this out.

25 |           DAVID: Say, Dick, I, I appreciate your offer  
and from your perspective I understand that, that, you

1 know, your offer is a good offer and everything and I  
2 would love to do it.

3 DICK: Okay.

4 DAVID: I would just love to adhere to it  
5 but, remember, you have to negotiate with your bosses  
6 and I have only one boss.

7 DICK: I understand. What would you offer in  
8 return? I mean what, what is your position there? I  
9 mean give me, give me a reason to go back to my boss.  
10 You said that was a good proposal. What, what is your  
11 opposition to it?

12 DAVID: You see, I have already agreed to  
13 come out and everybody else with us.

14 DICK: Okay.

15 DAVID: You see, what we're failing to  
16 understand is that the Gospel of Christ, the one God,  
17 the one church, all the New Testament writers point to  
18 a place in heaven. And through the mediation of the  
19 prophets, the apostles, there will be inscriptured a  
20 record of truth that in the latter days --

21 DICK: David, excuse me for a second.  
22 Listen, please, listen to me for a minute. I spent a  
23 lot of hours this morning, as did the commanders here,  
24 going over this. And you suggested you felt it was a  
25 reasonable proposal but you, obviously, have some  
opposition to parts of it. So, can we work out -- work

1 | this thing out? And then I'm perfectly willing to  
2 | listen to, to you, as I have in the past, and I think  
3 | I've shown you that but let me go in with, with an  
4 | alternate plan to the commanders and --

5 |           DAVID: Well, Dick --

6 |           DICK: -- so that we can get it worked out.

7 |           DAVID: Dick, let me, please, for -- you  
8 | know, bear with this fool just a moment, you know,  
9 | just, just bear with this fool just a moment.

10 |           DICK: Okay. Can we, can we -- can I make  
11 | you a counter proposal here? Can, can I give you some  
12 | time? Let's, let's work back and forth here. I'm  
13 | perfectly willing to listen and I appreciate your  
14 | taking the time to talk to me in this fashion.

15 |           DAVID: Well, we love you.

16 |           DICK: Well, I understand that.

17 |           DAVID: We, we love you -- every one of you  
18 | guys. We love the commanders. We have no grievances  
19 | against you.

20 |           DICK: Isn't this a significant offer, David?

21 |           DAVID: Well, look, it's, it's as good as the  
22 | original offer, you know, before the Bradleys -- your  
23 | show of might does not scare us at all.

24 |           DICK: This is not a show of might at all,  
25 | not at all.

          DAVID: No, what I'm saying is is that, you

1 | see, the very show of -- look, you, you've been working  
2 | a lot, right?

3 |           DICK: Uh-huh.

4 |           DAVID: I've been working since 1985. I was  
5 | shown at that time --

6 |           DICK: David, David, offer me, please -- this  
7 | is very important that we -- this is a very significant  
8 | development that we need to talk about. And let's,  
9 | let's spend some time talking about this. And then,  
10 | then, please, I'll be happy to listen to you because  
11 | it's worth listening to. I, I'm certainly in agreement  
12 | with that but let us work out this -- some details here  
13 | so that others that I can pass this on and it will be  
14 | considered and we can work on this. This is, this is a  
15 | very important time. This is, this is Saturday. We've  
16 | been here seven days.

17 |           DAVID: It's the Shabbat Sabbath, right?

18 |           DICK: It is, it is. And it's an important  
19 | date for you and for us.

20 |           DAVID: It's the day -- it's the day that,  
21 | that the nations in the world, they, they have profaned  
22 | the Sabbath. They don't know the meaning.

23 |           DICK: Absolutely, and we're trying to  
24 | demonstrate our goodwill to you, David, and I think we  
25 | have. I'm working hard on this.

          DAVID: What if God was trying to offer you a

1 way out of a, of a, of a present oncoming disaster of  
2 this nation, what if God has a witness to this nation  
3 because God is ready to deliverate his people from the,  
4 from the bands and the rulerships of all nations, and  
5 what if God is really going to set up his kingdom like  
6 they did in ancient times.

7 DICK: Well, --

8 DAVID: And what if the prophet Daniel and  
9 the prophets who foretold the rise and fall of empires,  
10 what if God is not ready to, to show his mercy to the  
11 last generation of men on earth and what if God is  
12 ready to, to judge the nations of these -- as foretold  
13 by these prophets.

14 DICK: Then we'll have to be prepared.  
15 David, we'll have to be prepared.

16 DAVID: And how can you prepare it if you  
17 deny his word by ignorance, willful ignorance to his  
18 word?

19 DICK: I don't mean to be ignorant at all and  
20 I'm willing to work with you but this --

21 DAVID: But you --

22 DICK: -- but this is a genuine effort on our  
23 part to try to work this out, David, and, please, work  
24 with me.

25 DAVID: I -- hey, look, I am working with  
you. I'm listening to you. But understand this is



1 | also a political matter. We are to serve God first and  
2 | then --

3 |           DICK: David, I'm serving God also.

4 |           DAVID: No, the God that you serve is not my  
5 | God.

6 |           DICK: Well, --

7 |           DAVID: Your God has not given to you a  
8 | knowledge of his will. Your God is not the God of the  
9 | prophets.

10 |           DICK: David, offer me a -- what -- offer me  
11 | a counter, offer me a counter proposal that you can  
12 | deal with that we can deal with. Offer me one right  
13 | now. I know you, --

14 |           DAVID: Okay.

15 |           DICK: -- you said that this was an earnest  
16 | agreement. Offer me something that I can take into my  
17 | bosses and let's, let's face it, David, we have to work  
18 | together, a little give, a little take. It's a classic  
19 | example of we have to work together and work with one  
20 | another and make, you know, some lateral movements and  
21 | forward movement.

22 |           DAVID: Sure.

23 |           DICK: And we're willing to do that. Help us  
24 | resolve this.

25 |           DAVID: Your -- I would love to. Your  
considerations are acknowledged of God. That's one

1 | thing I can tell you. But the little tape that I sent  
2 | out, the basic little tape that people are trying to  
3 | tear apart, I am not having the liberties or the  
4 | freedoms to be able to be countered on what I have  
5 | taught.

6 |           DICK: Uh-huh.

7 |           DAVID: Now, it's like this. If a man, any  
8 | man, is able to make a statement, it's natural amongst  
9 | the sons of men for people to perceive that statement  
10 | in different areas of perception. Now, that's why in  
11 | a, in a, in a meeting or in a encounter, even with the  
12 | ATF agents in front of their little news media there,  
13 | when a man makes a statement, someone else says, now,  
14 | can you explain that to me more thoroughly or can --  
15 | about what you just said, did you mean that -- and, of  
16 | course, a person is allowed to clear himself. I used  
17 | additional words. That's not the position we have. I  
18 | gave a, I gave a little study on the radio. I was told  
19 | to make it as short as possible. It took 58 minutes to  
20 | get the one point out. Now, the question --

21 |           DICK: That's because we wanted to make sure  
22 | that you had the opportunity to get the whole message  
23 | on, on the air, David.

24 |           DAVID: Right.

25 |           DICK: Our experience has been -- and when  
have you ever heard on television -- I don't -- you

1 know -- on any network or on the Christian Broadcast  
2 Network, anybody make a, a, a, you know, a plea that  
3 you were able to do for 58 minutes. It's unheard of in  
4 history, in the history of the broadcast industry. You  
5 were given a golden opportunity there and you took it.  
6 And you did -- you made the best of it. You did a  
7 terrific job. The impact from the, from the public  
8 was, was unbelievable. It was overwhelmingly  
9 favorable. We just -- we fell short of the original  
10 agreement but we're willing to go on from there.

11           DAVID: No, we didn't fall short of that.  
12 It's just what took place was is that the one that I  
13 communicate with, my God, stated to wait 'cause things  
14 are happening right now, things that you cannot see  
15 with your eyes. But if you knew the time of which we  
16 were in, if you understood the prophetic rise of the  
17 prophets, if you believed the words of the prophets and  
18 the words of Christ and if you realize that God in  
19 heaven that sits on the throne has these words  
20 contained in seven seals, then you would be shaking and  
21 trembling in your shoes right now. All of you would  
22 be. If, if these young men knew the events that are to  
23 take place here shortly, they, they would, they would  
24 be so far away from here they wouldn't even want to  
25 come around this place.

          DICK: David, listen, listen to me for a

1 second. I'm willing to go a step further, you know.  
2 I'm putting my job on the line for you here, okay. I'm  
3 willing to go into the bosses and tell them the women  
4 and children are coming out. Now, that, that is --  
5 certainly should be acceptable to you, is it not?

6 DAVID: Well, if they wish to, they may. I  
7 mean I am not holding anybody --

8 DICK: No, but I mean it's going to be up to  
9 you to go ahead and send those folks out and we'll move  
10 the Bradleys off the property.

11 DAVID: Well, do, do you mean to tell me that  
12 you want me to lose my job with God by making a -- an  
13 order or something that I don't have the right to make?

14 DICK: No, it's -- you know, I'm not asking  
15 you -- I --

16 DAVID: You just do not believe that -- and  
17 God speaks to me.

18 DICK: No, David, what I'm suggesting is that  
19 these folks have a lot of confidence in you. If you go  
20 to them --

21 DAVID: Well, why do they have a lot of  
22 confidence in me?

23 DICK: Because of, of your gifts and your  
24 abilities.

25 DAVID: I have never lied to them. I've  
always shown them the biblical truth unlike what this

1 nation and other nations have offered through their  
2 ministries.

3 DICK: But earlier on you were willing to do  
4 this, David. And we're not asking you to come with  
5 these folks.

6 DAVID: And I'm sure we're willing to do  
7 this.

8 DICK: We're asking you to send the women and  
9 children so that women can care for the children that  
10 have already come out and that the rest of the children  
11 will come out. And, and we'll move those Bradleys.  
12 David, help me out. I've been trying to represent you.

13 DAVID: Dick, I would love to. I would love  
14 to but you're not representing me. God's going to  
15 represent me.

16 DICK: I know but you can help me out, okay,  
17 as a personal favor to me.

18 DAVID: Dick, I -- okay, look.

19 DICK: As a personal favor to me.

20 DAVID: Here's how I could help you out.  
21 Would you like to know the seven seals?

22 DICK: Certainly. I'll be happy to learn  
23 about the seven seals, but I need to go to my bosses --

24 DAVID: You got -- do you got your Bible?

25 DICK: I'll be happy to go with it but,  
please, let's do this first. And I will sit here and I

1 | will listen to the seven seals. I want to understand  
2 | about the seven seals but I have to go to my bosses and  
3 | represent a proposal to them. So, work with me on  
4 | this, David. Please, work with me, and I will work  
5 | with you. I, I've, I've shown you that. I, I made a  
6 | sincere effort. The bosses have made a sincere effort,  
7 | but I believe I can go into them and convince them that  
8 | this is the thing to do. And I will be happy to do  
9 | that. And as soon as I return from that, the two of  
10 | you or the two of us, we'll, we'll, we'll get -- I want  
11 | to learn about the seven seals but --

12 |           DAVID: Don't --

13 |           DICK: -- but --

14 |           DAVID: -- tell them that I said that I'm  
15 | going to send the women and children out.

16 |           DICK: Well, I'm certainly not going to tell  
17 | them --

18 |           DAVID: What I said, it still goes along with  
19 | Jim, you know. I am ready and willing and so is  
20 | everybody else to, to leave this place. We're witness  
21 | in this generation. This organization is a witness  
22 | unto God. Now, when our God who has shown me these  
23 | mysteries tells me to wait, then I must wait. But  
24 | everybody else here makes their own decisions.

25 |           DICK: I understand.

          DAVID: God does not speak to them like God

1 | speaks to me, you see. That is, that is obvious. That  
2 | is a reality. But there is a young lady here who's  
3 | already stated that she does want to leave. And, so,  
4 | you know, I'm not hindering her at all, you know, but  
5 | she does want to leave. But the thing of it is is  
6 | that, you know, evidently, Steve -- who was talking to  
7 | last night Steve? No. Well, who was you talking to  
8 | last night that -- the last guy. John. I've never  
9 | talked to him, did I?

10 |           DICK: David, did you see -- did you see Bob  
11 | Ricks on television today?

12 |           DAVID: I didn't see much of anything today.

13 |           DICK: All right. Well, Mr. Ricks is a very  
14 | devout Christian and he prays to God, as we all do.  
15 | And it took him a lot to make these concessions. And I  
16 | believe the reason he did that is because he prayed, he  
17 | prayed at length and he came back and he said, Dick,  
18 | this is, this reasonable. I've given a lot of thought.  
19 | I've prayed about it. And this is reasonable. And  
20 | we're, we're willing to concede, we're willing to work  
21 | because we know that he's sincere in his belief. We  
22 | want to show him we're equally sincere. And this is --  
23 | this is what it's going to take, this kind of effort,  
24 | prayer, and those kinds of things. And Mr. Ricks did  
25 | that and --

          DAVID: Well, did God talk to him?

1           DICK: He told me that he prayed to God and  
2 he came back with this, with this answer.

3           DAVID: Okay. So, God spoke to him, then.

4           DICK: That's, that's correct.

5           DAVID: Well, why would God tell him one  
6 thing and me another?

7           DICK: I have no idea but what, what he's  
8 telling you --

9           DAVID: Maybe God's trying to get us to fight  
10 or something, you know.

11          DICK: No, that's not it at all.

12          DAVID: You've got to watch this God.

13          DICK: What he's trying to do is to, to  
14 resolve this with no further injury. And we've made  
15 great strides toward that. There has not been any  
16 further injury. We've talked together reasonably for  
17 days. We will continue. Let's work together on this.  
18 Help me out, personally. I went in there. Help me.  
19 Help me and help yourself at the same time.

20          DAVID: Oh, you've got a one track mind, I  
21 mean.

22          DICK: It is. It's safety, safety for  
23 everybody and the safe release of your people and the  
24 -- and given you a chance to use your gifts --

25          DAVID: The safety aspect is over. I'm the  
one that did everything to achieve safety, not you, not



1 | your organization, not your bureaucracy. I'm the one  
2 | that made an alliance with Robert Gonzales.

3 |           DICK: Work with me. Work with me. Forget  
4 | Robert Gonzales. Work with me.

5 |           DAVID: No, let's do not forget a reality  
6 | that has brought us to this point. You see, I'm the  
7 | one that first sent young men over to talk with these  
8 | friends across the street. I'm the one that told  
9 | Robert that everything that he wants to know about me  
10 | or this organization, I would show him. No, but see,  
11 | these individuals, the way their system works, set a  
12 | time schedule, you know. They wanted to come in here  
13 | and bust us up. They wanted glory. They wanted to be  
14 | great. They wanted to have something to talk about,  
15 | something to brag about, you know, and it didn't turn  
16 | out that way.

17 |           DICK: They certainly got none of those  
18 | things.

19 |           DAVID: All of, of the system's fault --  
20 | Robert and his pride and arrogance, he hasn't even  
21 | tried -- he hasn't even called me yet, you know. I  
22 | asked, I asked Jim to, to get him to contact me. You  
23 | know, I want, I want to be able to talk to him and ask  
24 | him --

25 |           DICK: That may well be arranged.

          DAVID: -- and ask him --

1           DICK: That may well be arranged in the  
2 future but you know what, I was telling Steve this  
3 morning --

4           DAVID: Do you know --

5           DICK: -- those fellows that were out there  
6 are no longer working because they're being -- there's,  
7 there's an inquiry. And you know that Robert, he did  
8 what he was supposed to do. He was given an  
9 assignment.

10          DAVID: He could have stopped. Yeah, but he  
11 was also given something else, too, the best friendship  
12 he could have ever gotten from anybody.

13          DICK: You understand that he is a D.E.A  
14 agent, do you not?

15          DAVID: Oh, I know that Robert --

16          DICK: I mean an ATF agent, I'm sorry.

17          DAVID: Yeah. I know what Robert was. I  
18 knew what he was when he first came over.

19          DICK: Well, then, he's doing -- you know,  
20 I'm sure that he had a great deal of difficulty dealing  
21 with those issues.

22          DAVID: I kept telling him I knew who he was.

23          DICK: Once he got inside, it's my  
24 understanding that, that he really had to struggle with  
25 his continuing employment with the ATF because of the  
things that you taught him. And it was very, very

1 | difficult for him. It still continues to be difficult  
2 | for him.

3 |           DAVID: I know, and that's why I want to talk  
4 | to him so I can tell him something that's very  
5 | important.

6 |           DICK: We -- we're not saying you can't talk  
7 | to him.

8 |           DAVID: Well, then put him on the phone.

9 |           DICK: Well, he's not here, like I tell you  
10 | --

11 |           DAVID: When you put him on the phone and I  
12 | talk to him, then Melissa's going to come out, okay?

13 |           DICK: We, we don't even have availability to  
14 | him.

15 |           DAVID: Yes, you do.

16 |           DICK: Is Melissa the gal that you said wants  
17 | to come out?

18 |           DAVID: Right.

19 |           DICK: Well, let's send her out and we'll --

20 |           DAVID: No, let's --

21 |           DICK: -- see what we can work with.

22 |           DAVID: Well, wait a second. Tell Melissa to  
23 | come here. I want to ask her something. I mean,  
24 | Robert, you know -- a lot of the guys that are in law  
25 | enforcement, you know, they have a -- they have a sense  
   | of right and a sense of wrong and --

1 DICK: Uh-huh.

2 DAVID: And, you know, they hate drugs and  
3 stuff like that, and I hate drugs. I've always hated  
4 drugs. And no one here takes drugs. You know, and the  
5 thing of it is is that, you know, we, we have one -- we  
6 have one -- that's one thing about a Christian. Paul  
7 says, be all things to all men. And we've got to find  
8 a bridge to all types. And there's nothing that I ever  
9 wanted more than to have, you know, law enforcement  
10 agencies and stuff to realize the real, really deep  
11 principles of our convictions and our beliefs.

12 DICK: David, I'll tell you what I'm going to  
13 do. Now, Robert is nowhere around the Waco area. You  
14 know, he's struggling with this whole thing. He's --

15 DAVID: Well, tell him to come on back.

16 DICK: The grief that this man is, is  
17 undergoing is much like the grief that you're  
18 undergoing. He, he just can't deal with it now.

19 DAVID: Well, --

20 DICK: It's a mandatory thing. His agency  
21 mandatorily sent him out. Now, I will deliver a  
22 message, if I can find somebody that can give him --  
23 those guys are, are sent home. Anytime a law  
24 enforcement officer is involved in a critical incident,  
25 there is absolutely no deviation, they are sent packing  
with their family so that they can get away and, and

1 | forget the -- all the agony that was suffered on both  
2 | sides. And he'll return to duty at some time in the  
3 | future but this man has told his friends that it was  
4 | horribly, horribly difficult for him because of, of, of  
5 | what has happened here due to your teaching. He's even  
6 | going to have to see a doctor about this because he's  
7 | having a difficult time with this.

8 |           DAVID: Well, Melissa, Melissa will come out  
9 | --

10 |           DICK: Okay.

11 |           DAVID: -- once we get to talk to Robert,  
12 | okay?

13 |           DICK: Well, let me talk to Melissa now. Let  
14 | me see if we can work out this thing. But let's go  
15 | back to the original, original talk that we had here.  
16 | Give me something. Let me go into the boss here.

17 |           DAVID: I just did.

18 |           DICK: Offer me --

19 |           DAVID: I just did. Jim and all them kept  
20 | telling me that, that they would get in contact with  
21 | Robert, that he was around there. Now, you're telling  
22 | me opposite.

23 |           DICK: Well, give me a message and I'll try  
24 | to run Robert down but in the meantime, let's take  
25 | Melissa out of there if she wants to go.

          DAVID: Here, here's, here's the message.

1 | Wait a second.

2 |           DICK: David?

3 |           STEVE: She's -- he's asking a question, do

4 | you want to go? And she's saying, no. And then he

5 | asked her the question, would you go if it allow us to

6 | talk to Robert Gonzales? And she shook her head yes.

7 | Hello?

8 |           DICK: I'm still here.

9 |           STEVE: Okay. Do you want to talk to the man

10 | on the telephone a little bit? Are you sure?

11 |           DICK: Put her on.

12 |           STEVE: Okay.

13 |           DICK: Put her on, Steve, let me talk with

14 | her.

15 |           STEVE: Okay, Dick, hang on just a second.

16 | She's shaking -- shaking her head no but I'm trying --

17 | are you sure you don't want to? Say, hello. He's a

18 | real nice guy. Here -- Dick?

19 |           DICK: Yes.

20 |           STEVE: Okay, here she is.

21 |           MELISSA: Hi.

22 |           DICK: Hello, Melissa, how are you?

23 |           MELISSA: Okay.

24 |           DICK: Okay. How old are you?

25 |           MELISSA: Six.

          DICK: You're six years old. Good. How --

1 | why don't you come out and we'll get together with --  
2 | and sit down and talk for a while. David has indicated  
3 | that you, you can go, you can leave the house. Will  
4 | you do that for me?

5 |           MELISSA: Yeah.

6 |           DICK: Okay. You tell David you want to come  
7 | out and talk to Dick, okay? You get your coat on and  
8 | you come out and you and I will sit down and talk  
9 | together. Can we do that?

10 |           MELISSA: Yeah.

11 |           DICK: We'll take good --

12 |           MELISSA: Bye.

13 |           DICK: -- we'll take -- Melissa?

14 |           MELISSA: Huh?

15 |           DICK: We'll take good care of you and we'll  
16 | put you together with all the other kids that came out  
17 | and --

18 |           MELISSA: Yeah.

19 |           DICK: -- you'll, and you'll get to play with  
20 | your friends. And what's your last name, Melissa?

21 |           MELISSA: Morrison.

22 |           DICK: I'm sorry, honey, what is it?

23 |           MELISSA: Morrison.

24 |           DICK: Lar -- Morrison, Melissa Morrison?

25 |           MELISSA: Yeah.

          DICK: Good. Well, you -- we'll get you

1 together with all the other kids and you can talk to  
2 your friends. Do you, do you have your brother or  
3 sister?

4 MELISSA: No.

5 DICK: Okay. Well, you tell David that you  
6 want to come out now and talk to Dick.

7 MELISSA: Okay.

8 DICK: Will you do that?

9 MELISSA: Yeah.

10 DICK: Okay. Promise me?

11 MELISSA: Yeah.

12 DICK: Okay. You tell David right now that  
13 you want to get your coat and leave.

14 MELISSA: Bye.

15 DICK: You there, Melissa?

16 MELISSA: Yeah.

17 DICK: Okay. Will you tell him that?

18 MELISSA: Yeah.

19 DICK: You go over to him right now and, and  
20 tell him that you'd like to leave and you talk -- you  
21 want to go out and talk with Dick, okay?

22 MELISSA: Okay.

23 DICK: And we'll give you -- we'll give you a  
24 ride, okay?

25 MELISSA: Okay.

DICK: Okay. Let me talk to David.



1 ROSE: Hello, Dick?

2 DICK: Yes.

3 ROSE: Hi, I'm Melissa's mother.

4 DICK: Hi, how are you? What's your name?

5 ROSE: Rose.

6 DICK: I'm sorry?

7 ROSE: Rose.

8 DICK: Nice to meet you. I understand you're  
9 going to send Melissa out now?

10 ROSE: Can I just ask you something before I  
11 send her out?

12 DICK: Certainly.

13 ROSE: Where are the children being sent to  
14 and we've got conflicting information over here. We've  
15 been told once they're being sent -- well, they're  
16 being held together.

17 DICK: That's true.

18 ROSE: And then they're being fostered out.

19 DICK: No, that's not true.

20 ROSE: That's not true?

21 DICK: No, the kids, the kids are together.

22 ROSE: Okay. Can you tell me what's going to  
23 happen to the children?

24 DICK: At some point in time, we're going to  
25 reunite them with you. As soon as you folks come out,  
we're going to reunite, reunite you kids -- with your

1 children and you're going to be giving them the care.  
2 These kids want to get back with their parents.  
3 There's no question about that. We want to get them  
4 back with their parents. And until we can do that, the  
5 kids will be well cared for by caring people. The kids  
6 are all together. We -- did you get a chance to look  
7 at those pictures we sent in to you the other day?

8 ROSE: Well, you sent the tape as well,  
9 right?

10 DICK: Well, we sent, we sent hard copy  
11 photos in also. You didn't get a chance to see those?

12 ROSE: I saw the photos but the tape was  
13 blank.

14 DICK: That's what I understand. I've been  
15 assured that that went in there with something on it.  
16 It must be your equipment in there. But the -- yes,  
17 the kids, the kids are all together. They will remain  
18 together. And we want to reunite you with your kids as  
19 soon as you can. Now, my understanding is is that  
20 David has absolutely no objection to you leaving with  
21 your daughter.

22 ROSE: That's true.

23 DICK: Why don't you come on out with her and  
24 then you can insure that these kids are together and  
25 being cared for properly?

ROSE: Well, that's not my choice.

1           DICK:  It's not your choice?

2           ROSE:  I mean that's not what I want to do.

3           DICK:  All right.

4           ROSE:  But at the same time, we've also  
5 gotten information coming in that once we come out,  
6 okay, we're going to -- you know, go through the  
7 judicial system and whatever.  So, the children might  
8 not be able to be reunited with us.  So, then, what  
9 will happen to the children?  I mean most of the  
10 children taken out of here have been taken out with  
11 their names and --

12           DICK:  They have.

13           ROSE:  -- their relatives and whose the  
14 contact.

15           DICK:  Well, as I've indicated before, the  
16 kids are being cared for and they're all together.  At  
17 some point in time, we're going to reunite them with  
18 you and the other parents in there.  And, obviously,  
19 some folks when they come out are going to be detained  
20 temporarily, some maybe even longer than that.

21           ROSE:  Okay.

22           DICK:  However, the kids are going to be well  
23 cared for.  And we understand that they came out with  
24 addresses and that's what we want you to do also is to  
25 send, send out an address and a telephone number of a  
  contact person --

1 ROSE: Okay.

2 DICK: -- for us.

3 ROSE: The parents that's being detained,  
4 well, then what will happen to our children?

5 DICK: You talking about individually? I  
6 mean, in other words, parents of those -- parents that  
7 --

8 ROSE: Yes.

9 DICK: -- might be detained, what's going to  
10 happen to the kids?

11 ROSE: Yeah.

12 DICK: Well, temporarily, they're going to be  
13 housed together. And, obviously, at some point in time  
14 a decision has to be made in terms of placement but  
15 that's what we're talking about relatives.

16 ROSE: Some parents will be detained longer  
17 than others, okay.

18 DICK: Well, that's what the next of kin are  
19 for. In other words, if you send out a message, a  
20 telephone number, an address of grandparents, brothers,  
21 sisters or someone, immediate family member, then every  
22 effort will be made to contact those people and put --  
23 and make them aware of the situation here. And we'll  
24 place the kids with them when --

25 ROSE: The kids will be placed with their  
relatives, right?

1           DICK: Absolutely.

2           ROSE: Okay.

3           DICK: Absolutely. That -- we wouldn't have  
4 it any other way.

5           ROSE: And I'm supposed to take your word for  
6 that, right?

7           DICK: Well, you are. That's exactly -- you  
8 know, if you don't take my word for it, then, then we  
9 can't work this out. I am here to insure your safety  
10 and that of your children. And you have to work me.  
11 As I told David and Steven, we've made every effort to  
12 try to get this thing worked out for the safety of  
13 everyone inside. We've given you the opportunity to  
14 send your children out. We want your children out, and  
15 we want you folks out.

16          ROSE: Okay. Well, look, I'm going to send  
17 my daughter out, okay?

18          DICK: All right. And, please --

19          ROSE: But not because of your word.

20          DICK: Please. And, also, put -- give us a  
21 message as to who should be contacted relative to your  
22 child and tell the others in there that I'll be happy  
23 to talk to each and every one of them. We care for the  
24 kids. I'm a father. You think that I would allow  
25 something to happen to your children?

          ROSE: No.

1 DICK: I just won't do it.

2 ROSE: Okay, then. Okay. Well, she'll --

3 DICK: Would you pass that message on to the  
4 rest of the kids?

5 ROSE: Sure, I'll do that.

6 DICK: Now, hold, hold on for just a second  
7 here. I, I've got just one more thought I want to pass  
8 to you.

9 ROSE: You've got what?

10 DICK: I've got one more comment.

11 ROSE: Okay.

12 DICK: You know, your family -- are, are you  
13 from Australia or from England? From England?

14 ROSE: Am I from where?

15 DICK: Are you from the United Kingdom?

16 ROSE: England, yeah.

17 DICK: Okay. We have inquiries about you  
18 from your family.

19 ROSE: You do have inquiry?

20 DICK: Yes, we have.

21 ROSE: Okay. Can you -- go on.

22 DICK: And, you know, obviously, everybody's  
23 worried about your safety, your family members. And  
24 I'll be happy to give them a message. I'd like --  
25 frankly, I'd like to have you give the message to them  
yourself but if, if you won't or can't come out, then I

1 | will do that for you.

2 |           ROSE: You'll do that for me.

3 |           DICK: But, please, please, consider coming  
4 | out yourself.

5 |           ROSE: Okay. Well, you can pass a message on  
6 | for me then.

7 |           DICK: Okay. Give me, give me the message.

8 |           ROSE: You can tell my family I'm fine. I'm  
9 | well.

10 |           DICK: You're well.

11 |           ROSE: And to keep the faith, the truth of  
12 | the Bible.

13 |           DICK: Keep the faith and the truth of the  
14 | Bible.

15 |           ROSE: Yeah. Tell them --

16 |           DICK: Okay.

17 |           ROSE: -- I stick by the Bible and they  
18 | should do the same.

19 |           DICK: Well, --

20 |           ROSE: That's my message.

21 |           DICK: That's, that's, that's it. Okay. And  
22 | the telephone number you're going to send out with the  
23 | child?

24 |           ROSE: It will be on -- it will be sent out  
25 | with her.

          DICK: Okay. Have you got a coat there for

1 her?

2 ROSE: Pardon? Have I got coat?

3 DICK: Why don't you -- I'll tell you what,

4 give me the telephone number, if you have it in your

5 head now, and the address. Then we'll have it covered

6 both ways.

7 ROSE: Okay.

8 DICK: Okay. What are your parents' names?

9 ROSE: Morrison.

10 DICK: Yeah, but I'm talking about your first

11 name -- their first names. Both your, your mother and

12 father?

13 ROSE: No.

14 DICK: Okay. Your mother?

15 ROSE: Yeah.

16 DICK: Okay. What is her name?

17 ROSE: Millie.

18 DICK: Millie Morrison?

19 ROSE: Yeah.

20 DICK: Okay. And what is her telephone

21 number?

22 ROSE: It's 061 --

23 DICK: Oh, six one --

24 ROSE: -- 225 --

25 DICK: Two, two five.

ROSE: -- 1205.



1 DICK: Twelve zero five.  
2 ROSE: That's right.  
3 DICK: And their address?  
4 ROSE: Five Talbott Road.  
5 DICK: Five -- I'm sorry, I didn't  
6 understand, five, what road?  
7 ROSE: Talbott.  
8 DICK: Talbott Road, okay.  
9 ROSE: That's right. That's Ladybond.  
10 DICK: Lake --  
11 ROSE: Ladybond, L-A-D- --  
12 DICK: Ladybond?  
13 ROSE: Yeah.  
14 DICK: Okay. And that's in -- is that in  
15 London or England?  
16 ROSE: That's Manchester, England, yeah.  
17 DICK: Manchester, England?  
18 ROSE: Uh-huh.  
19 DICK: Okay. And what is -- is there a zip  
20 that goes with that or some sort of a code?  
21 ROSE: No. No.  
22 DICK: Okay.  
23 ROSE: Manchester 14, if you want that.  
24 DICK: Manford 14?  
25 ROSE: Manchester --  
DICK: Okay. Manchester --

1 ROSE: Fourteen.  
2 DICK: Fourteen.  
3 ROSE: In England, yeah.  
4 DICK: England. All right.  
5 ROSE: So, you're going to get that out to  
6 them?  
7 DICK: We will -- we'll be in touch with  
8 them, yes. We will --  
9 ROSE: Okay.  
10 DICK: -- we will most definitely be in touch  
11 with them.  
12 ROSE: When will that be?  
13 DICK: As soon as we're able, as soon as  
14 we're able. We will, we will get to them and then  
15 we'll call you back as soon as we're able to reach  
16 them.  
17 ROSE: Okay.  
18 DICK: Now, is Melissa -- you got Melissa  
19 ready to go here?  
20 ROSE: Well, I'm going to get her ready now.  
21 DICK: Okay.  
22 ROSE: Okay. But she'll come out as soon as  
23 we speak with Robert.  
24 DICK: As soon as you get her together, okay.  
25 ROSE: As soon as we have spoken to Robert.  
DICK: Pardon me?

1 ROSE: Pardon?

2 DICK: I'm sorry?

3 ROSE: As soon as we've spoken to Robert.

4 DICK: Well, no, that, that can't -- and the  
5 reason we can't do that is because we can't find Robert  
6 right now. Robert, as I told both David and Steven,  
7 Robert is, is not here because Robert -- when the law  
8 enforcements are involved -- law enforcement officers  
9 are involved in these kinds of things, they're given  
10 mandatory time off. They are sent away so they can get  
11 away from, from this incident.

12 ROSE: They have?

13 DICK: And so that they can sit down and  
14 write reports and that kind of thing. Now, at some  
15 point in time, we'll be happy to deliver a message to  
16 Robert and, and David will have an opportunity at a  
17 point to confront him. There's absolutely no question  
18 about that. We guarantee that. But that shouldn't  
19 impact on Melissa coming out because I know you want --

20 ROSE: Well, --

21 DICK: -- you're concerned about the safety  
22 and care of your daughter.

23 ROSE: Well, at the moment -- Anyway, there's  
24 someone here, there's a small child that wants to speak  
25 to you.

DICK: A small child?

1 ROSE: Yeah.

2 DICK: Get Melissa out and we'll, we'll work  
3 on the other thing. Why don't you -- get her coat on  
4 and we're ready to receive her up there at the road  
5 now. So, tell, tell David that you want to go ahead  
6 and send her out and then we'll contact the parents,  
7 your parents, your mother, and let her know.

8 ROSE: Well, we'll see how things go, okay?  
9 Good bye. Nice to speak with you.

10 DICK: Bye-bye.

11 STAR: Huh?

12 DICK: Who's this?

13 STAR: Star.

14 DICK: Star, how are you?

15 STAR: Fine.

16 DICK: Good. How's your brother and sister?

17 STAR: Fine.

18 DICK: Good. How's your mom and your dad?

19 STAR: Fine.

20 DICK: How old are you, Star? How old are  
21 you?

22 STAR: Five.

23 DICK: You're five years old?

24 STAR: Yes.

25 DICK: What -- what's your favorite toy?  
STAR: Barbies.

1 DICK: Barbies. Have you got lots of  
2 Barbies?

3 STAR: Only two.

4 DICK: Just two Barbies?

5 STAR: I mean I have three 'cause I have one  
6 little -- well, it's not really a Barbie, it's a little  
7 doll.

8 DICK: A little doll. And my daughter liked  
9 Barbie dolls, too. What's your doll's name?

10 STAR: I don't know.

11 DICK: You don't give them a name yet? You  
12 didn't give your doll a name yet?

13 STAR: My two big Barbies.

14 DICK: Two big Barbies.

15 STAR: They're both-- their names are both  
16 Barbie.

17 DICK: Both Barbie. Okay. They're both  
18 blondes, too, I'll bet, aren't they? They have blonde  
19 hair?

20 STAR: I don't know.

21 DICK: White hair?

22 STAR: Yeah.

23 DICK: How are your brothers and sisters  
24 doing?

25 STAR: Fine.

DICK: Good. How about mamma?

1 STAR: Fine.

2 DICK: Is David there?

3 STAR: Yes.

4 DICK: Could you put David back on the phone  
5 to me? Listen, you be a good girl, okay?

6 STAR: Yes.

7 DICK: Okay. You be a real good girl.

8 STAR: Dick?

9 DICK: Yeah. Are you still there? Hello.

10 STAR: Hello.

11 DICK: Are you still there? Can you --

12 STAR: Yes.

13 DICK: -- get David for me?

14 STAR: Huh?

15 DICK: Can you get David for me, your dad?  
16 Can you get your dad for me?

17 STAR: Yeah.

18 DICK: Okay. You have a -- you have a nice  
19 day and you be a good girl. Will you do that? You do  
20 what your mom and dad tell you, okay?

21 DAVID: Oh, that hurts so much.

22 DICK: What does?

23 DAVID: I have two Barbies and both their  
24 names is Barbie.

25 DICK: I know -- I heard that. Did she get  
them both at the same time or what?

1           DAVID: Well, I bought all the kids here, the  
2 girls, a little Barbie doll.

3           DICK: Oh, did you?

4           DAVID: Yeah. And some of them had Barbies  
5 that were old.

6           DICK: Uh-huh.

7           DAVID: So, I bought some extra ones and  
8 somehow she ended up with two of them and then they had  
9 --

10          DICK: She had two of them, huh?

11          DAVID: -- they had a little Skipper or  
12 something and a little, little dolls.

13          DICK: Well, they can be twins.

14          DAVID: Yeah, but I -- you know, our kids  
15 save things and it's so serious yet --

16          DICK: Sure.

17          DAVID: -- it's so --

18          DICK: Well, they sound -- she sounds like a  
19 great little girl.

20          DAVID: Oh, they're beautiful kids.

21          DICK: You know, kids are the most fantastic  
22 things in the world.

23          DAVID: I know that more than --

24          DICK: My kids are growing up and I --  
25 especially when they're small like that.

          DAVID: Oh, yeah.

1           DICK: My kids have grown a little, little  
2 older now and, and those kinds of things that she just  
3 said are gone and they're gone very quickly.

4           DAVID: Oh, yeah.

5           DICK: They grow so quickly. And a part of  
6 your life leaves when they leave. That, that's for  
7 sure.

8           DAVID: That's true.

9           DICK: The -- my wife and I, we elected to  
10 have two children. I wish we would have had more.

11           DAVID: Yeah, I've got -- let's see, I've got  
12 one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine,  
13 ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, fifteen,  
14 sixteen, seventeen -- I've got about 18 kids.

15           DICK: You've got 18 kids?

16           DAVID: Eighteen -- yeah, 19. Oh, yeah, 19.

17           DICK: Boy, they keep you busy, don't they?

18           DAVID: Yeah, it's, it's --

19           DICK: You've got 19 kids in there with you?

20           DAVID: Right, 19.

21           DICK: Those are your kids, all 19 of them?

22           DAVID: Yeah. Well, what happens is is that  
23 we've got -- we've got two of them, two of them in  
24 Hawaii right now. And they're with their mother.

25           DICK: Uh-huh.

          DAVID: And one is in California. So --



1           DICK: Well, David, you've got a lot of  
2 memories -- you'll have a lot of memories of those kids  
3 and a lot of good times.

4           DAVID: Oh, yeah. Well, it's -- you know --

5           DICK: A lot of hard work, though.

6           DAVID: Well, yeah, to a degree but, no, not  
7 so much. It's -- you know, it's like, it's like when  
8 Isaiah talks, when he talks about Messiah, Paul quotes  
9 in Hebrew, he says, the sign -- he says, referring to  
10 Christ, he says (Indiscernible) wonders from the Lord  
11 of Hosts and that's where the Messianic prophesy, they  
12 talk about Messiah and all of his children. It never  
13 was fulfilled 2000 years ago. But the promise is is  
14 not one jot or tiddle, not one jot or tiddle shall pass  
15 from the law or the prophets. They'll all be  
16 fulfilled. So, we have to repeat this, you know. The  
17 truth has to come back around again and the prophecies

20           DICK: Uh-huh.

21           DAVID: Of course, today we're not in a world  
22 of swords and chariots, you know, as per se. But, of  
23 course, when we have swords that, that are as thunder  
24 and make lightning as fire, then, of course, we're  
25 talking about guns then, aren't we? So, you know, the  
scriptures, like I say, the ancient prophets could only

1 | illustrate the means of weaponry and the means of  
2 | tactics in their day based upon what they themselves  
3 | had. But, anyway --

4 |           DICK: David, --

5 |           DAVID: Sure.

6 |           DICK: -- are we agree or do we agree then  
7 | that we're going to send Melissa out then?

8 |           DAVID: Oh, yeah.

9 |           DICK: Okay. Can you get her ready then?

10 |          DAVID: Well, you get Robert ready.

11 |          DICK: Well, David, listen, --

12 |          DAVID: That's what, that's what they said.

13 |          DICK: -- listen to me, please.

14 |          DAVID: They said, now, let's talk to Robert.  
15 | Ever since I negotiated with Jim, this was supposed to  
16 | have been arranged. And Robert was there for the  
17 | longest time.

18 |           DICK: I know that. I know that. Melissa  
19 | said that she wanted to come out. And I'll tell you, I  
20 | will, I will get a -- I will get a message. Send, send  
21 | Melissa out and then I'll tell you what. Send Melissa  
22 | out and you write a message in your own words to --

23 |           DAVID: No, I need to talk to the boy --

24 |           DICK: -- to Robert.

25 |           DAVID: I need to talk to the boy --

          DICK: Pardon me?

1           DAVID:  -- word to word.  I need to talk to  
2  --

3           DICK:  But let's give him that choice.  Let's  
4 give him that choice, much like you're giving the  
5 choice to those folks inside.  I will get the message  
6 to Robert.  You send Melissa out.  You pen a, a  
7 message, and you send it out tomorrow with another  
8 child --

9           DAVID:  Rose?

10          DICK:  -- and I will get the message to  
11 Robert.  And then let him make the choice.

12          DAVID:  It's your decision.  He's saying,  
13 send Melissa out first and pen a message to Robert and  
14 then leave it up to Robert to whether he calls us or  
15 not.  Now, what do you say?  Okay.  Well, just wait a  
16 second.

17          ROSE:  Dick?

18          DICK:  Yes.

19          ROSE:  I'm not going to do that, okay?

20          DICK:  Why?

21          ROSE:  Why?

22          DICK:  Listen, you have to work together with  
23 me, okay.  I'm making every effort to get this out --

24          ROSE:  Look, you guys have been lying about,  
25 you know, from the beginning.  And you're saying we  
have to cooperate with you.  Yeah, we'll -- we've been

1 cooperating. You guys have been doing all the lying.

2 DICK: That, that's not true. Please --

3 ROSE: That's not true?

4 DICK: -- please, that's not true at all.

5 ROSE: That is true.

6 DICK: That's not all true.

7 ROSE: Well, look --

8 DICK: I just made a proposal to, to David  
9 and to Steve as to how we can -- how we can work things  
10 out. And I just offered him an opportunity -- you  
11 know, David is telling us that all you folks have the  
12 freedom to make the choice that you do. And my, my  
13 suggestion to him is that I will be very, very happy to  
14 deliver a message to Robert and then let Robert make a  
15 choice, must like the choice that you're able to make.  
16 Right now your daughter has made a choice that she  
17 wants to leave and I know you want her to leave.

18 ROSE: My daughter -- she said she wants to  
19 leave? She said that she would leave once they've  
20 contacted Robert.

21 DICK: That's not what she said.

22 ROSE: She said she did not -- hold on a  
23 minute here. Hold on. I'll put her back on the phone,  
24 okay? Melissa, you tell him whether you want to leave  
25 or not. Do you want to leave?

DICK: That's not --

1                   MELISSA: (Indiscernible).

2                   DICK: Hi, Melissa. You want to come out and  
3 talk to me, don't you?

4                   MELISSA: Huh?

5                   DICK: You want to come out and talk to me --

6 (End of Tape 68.)

2 DICK: Don't you? Tell your Mamma that you  
3 want to go out and talk to Dick and you want to go talk  
4 to the other kids.

5 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Well?

6 DICK: Do you want to come and talk to Dick  
7 and your friends?

8 MELISSA MORRISON: No.

9 DICK: Oh, come on now. That's not what you  
10 told me. Tell Mamma that's not fair. Tell Mamma you  
11 want to come out. That's, that's not fair.

12 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Hey. What you mean tell  
13 her to tell Mamma it's not fair?

14 DICK: Well, that's what I'm saying.

15 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Don't speak to her like  
16 that. You asked her the question. She answered you.

22 never spoke a word, thank you.

25 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Well, look. She's made  
her decision. I've made my mine. Okay?



1 DICK: Listen. It's up to you.

2 MELISSA'S MOTHER: That's final.

3 DICK: It's up to you. If you want to keep  
4 your child there, that's certainly you're choice and  
5 we're not trying to force anybody to do anything,  
6 but --

7 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Well, look. You get  
8 Robert on the phone and then we can --

9 DICK: I -- listen --

10 MELISSA'S MOTHER: -- talk to him --

11 DICK: -- I can't get Robert on the phone  
12 right now. I told David I would take a message and  
13 make sure the message was delivered to him, and then  
14 Robert can make his choice. We can't force Robert to  
15 do anything, just like we can't force you to do  
16 anything. We will give him the opportunity. We will  
17 pass the message to him, and we will let him make that  
18 call. Just like you said you'd let your daughter make  
19 the call.

20 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Look. He can do whatever.  
21 He's a law enforcement agent, right? So can you. You  
22 can get Robert to speak to us. That's the decision.  
23 Once Robert has spoken, then she'll come out. She's  
24 told you that and I've told you that. Okay? I have to  
25 take your word for how our children's group is looked  
after. You take my word that that will be -- DICK:

1 I'll tell you what. If you, as the mother, want to  
2 work that way concerning your child's welfare, then you  
3 do that and you make that decision. That's your  
4 choice. That's your responsibility as a parent to do  
5 that. And if you feel that's the way you want to treat  
6 your daughter, then you treat your daughter that way.  
7 That's fine. I can live with that. You're the one  
8 that's going to have to live with it. Okay?

9 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Yeah.

10 DICK: You told me and David told me before  
11 we ever talked to you that Melissa wanted to leave.  
12 And then all of a sudden Melissa will only go --

13 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Hold on a minute.

14 DICK: -- if Robert talks to you.

15 MELISSA'S MOTHER: I never told you that  
16 Melissa wanted to leave.

17 DICK: David told me that.

18 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Melissa -- David did not  
19 tell you that.

20 DICK: David --

21 MELISSA'S MOTHER: David said --

22 DICK: -- told me very s--

23 MELISSA'S MOTHER: -- Melissa, do you want to  
24 leave? She said no. He said, will you leave if we  
25 speak to Robert? And she said okay, yeah.

DICK: But David told me that before he even

1 spoke to Melissa. He said, we have Melissa. Melissa  
2 wants to leave. And, and you, as the parent, if that's  
3 your choice then that's your choice. I'm not going to  
4 try to convince you otherwise. I'm only telling you  
5 that you are responsible for the welfare of that child  
6 --

7 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Look --

8 DICK: -- which you know --

9 MELISSA'S MOTHER: Look, I --

10 DICK: -- which you know --

11 MELISSA'S MOTHER: -- know I'm responsible.  
12 She's my daughter. And, hey, you don't need to speak  
13 (not discernible). I'm being responsible. Okay?  
14 Look.

23 they concur on this that when we were raided by the ATF  
24 agents, when they hit us like they did, four women have  
25 told me they heard these agents saying to some of the  
people in the building and so forth -- they called us

1 Mother F'ers --

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: And  
3 what else?

4 UNIDENTIFIED PERSON TO STEVE SCHNEIDER: (Not  
5 discernible.)

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- S-- Sons of -- and, and,  
7 you know, all that -- (Unidentified voice in background  
8 not discernible.) -- foul, foul language.

9 DICK: That also --

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Cocksuckers. I didn't  
11 really want to say it, but --

12 DICK: Steve, that's --

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yes?

14 DICK: -- horribly unprofessional. I know  
15 it. You know it. Everyone else that, that might be  
16 involved in that kind of language, it, it's totally  
17 unacceptable.

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I --

19 DICK: Totally unacceptable.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I'll, I'll tell you the  
21 truth. I mean, it -- is it, is it not a shock to you  
22 to hear that professionals or people that are to be  
23 protectors are, are pulling their pants down and  
24 showing their bare butts?

25 DICK: Take, take note of that. I want you  
to copy that down. I demand --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

2 DICK: -- that you copy that down --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right. I --

4 DICK: -- and that --

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- will do that.

6 DICK: -- you convey that message to, to the

7 people that make the inquiry into this case.

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. We'll do so.

9 DICK: Note that.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I've, I've never heard of

12 DICK: Absolutely not.

about I was sitting right here. I'm sitting right



1 here --

2 DICK: Listen.

4 DICK: She was speaking to me. David was

7 DICK: -- absolutely no hearing problem. And

6 DICK: No.  
7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Melissa's a little girl, in  
8 the first place, not a woman, as he stated. So, you're  
9 getting that confused, Dick. You really are.  
10 DICK: Okay. Well, let's, let's move on.  
11 Okay?  
12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.  
13 DICK: I'm not --  
14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. No --  
15 DICK: -- even going to argue --  
16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- no, I just --  
17 DICK: -- that point.  
18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I just wanted to clear  
19 the air. I wanted to clear -- I know you don't --  
20 there's no need to.  
21 DICK: No. There's a, there's a -- no  
22 reason.  
23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: But here's, here's the  
24 condition though. It's -- it was late. We can go  
25 round and around, but the condition is this. The  
mother is willing to send the daughter out on condition

1 that Robert Gonzalez call us and talk to David.

2 That's, that's plainly what it is.

3 DICK: All right. Steve, listen.

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yes.

5 DICK: Why is it that you always preface this  
6 with, when we do something you will do something?  
7 When --

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I -- I'm just -- no, look  
9 it. I just -- he -- the phone was handed to me.

10 DICK: Okay.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I, I don't even know what  
12 is being planned here. I'm sitting here listening and  
13 it's handed to me just to make it as plain and to the  
14 point as possible. That's the only thing. Have --  
15 Okay? Understand that, because --

16 DICK: Let's don't even discuss it any  
17 further, all right?

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

19 DICK: I --

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'm just trying to say --

21 DICK: That's your --

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- look at it --

23 DICK: -- position. Take that --

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no, no. Listen to me.  
25 Listen to me. It's not my decision. Didn't you pick  
up on that? It has --

1 DICK: I, I know.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- nothing to --

3 DICK: I know that.

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- nothing to do with me.

5 DICK: I know. And, and I'm not arguing with  
6 you.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

8 DICK: It's, it's her mother's child, and if  
9 her mother doesn't want her to come out --

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That's what it is.

11 DICK: Fine. Fine.

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I -- they're right --

13 DICK: Okay.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- here standing --

15 DICK: So, let me --

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- the both of them.

17 DICK: -- let me tell you something about  
18 Robert Gonzalez --

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

20 DICK: -- so that you know it all so -- I, I  
21 hope --

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

23 DICK: -- Dave understood it. You folks all  
24 represent the fact that you are free to leave at any  
25 time. Okay? We also represent to you that Robert  
Gonzalez will be given your message and he will have a

1 choice at that time. We can't get a hold of Mr.  
2 Gonzalez now. Like I told David, when there's a  
3 critical incident, and that's what we call it in, in  
4 law enforcement, when there has been a critical  
5 incident, the agents involved in that, that incident  
6 are taken off of duty until an investigation is  
7 handled. In this instance --

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

9 DICK: -- there's going to be a long,  
10 involved, detailed investigation. Robert Gonzalez was  
11 sent to his family with the -- a, a message to --  
12 Listen, please --

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I am.

14 DICK: Get away --

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I am.

16 DICK: No, I'm not talking -- I'm talking  
17 about --

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh, I see.

19 DICK: -- to him.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I see. I see. Okay.

21 Gotch ya.

22 DICK: Leave. Because sometimes agents don't  
23 understand. It's necessary --

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

25 DICK: -- to get back, to cool off --

STEVE SCHNEIDER: That, that makes sense --

1 DICK: -- to rethink the --  
2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- to me. I, I don't  
3 have --  
4 DICK: Sure.  
5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- doubts --  
6 DICK: Sure.  
7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- of what you're saying.  
8 DICK: So, Mr. Gonzalez is gone and we can't  
9 get to him. When, when we're able to, I'll be happy to  
10 send a, a message. In fact, you can write a message  
11 out which we will have delivered to him when we're able  
12 to get to him. I -- well, certainly. We have no  
13 objection to that --  
14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Can I say --  
15 DICK: -- at all.  
16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- something and respond to  
17 that? See, it's not, it's not something that I desire  
18 in the first place --  
19 DICK: Well, David --  
20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- there, there was --  
21 okay. Just --  
22 DICK: I know. It's David.  
23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Just so you understand that  
24 it's --  
25 DICK: Certainly.  
STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- not my request and --

1 DICK: I know. It's David.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: See, a lot of what I'm  
3 telling you, when I come across like I do in the  
4 manner, there is a number of people that's said Steve,  
5 would you be our spokesperson.

6 DICK: Um-hum.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I said okay, I will. What  
8 do you want me to --

9 DICK: Sure.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- say on your behalf? So,  
11 many of the times that I'm speaking, it's not always my  
12 opinion, my decision, but I'm speaking in behalf of  
13 certain --

14 DICK: I know.

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- people. I don't want  
16 to. I'm -- on one hand, they're showing a willingness  
17 to leave. On the other hand, those that have, like I  
18 told you earlier in the day, what they told me their  
19 desire is to have some kind of a connection to a news  
20 service or something to do with a negotiation, maybe  
21 that part, or a telephone line being opened. This is  
22 what they've been relaying to me.

23 DICK: Well, and we asked you this morning to  
24 furnish us with a list of people --

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, remember? I ga-- I  
did give you some names.



1 DICK: Oh, I know. But those are, those are  
2 celebrities. My gosh, they're, they're not --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. What kind of names  
4 are --

5 DICK: Well, that's your --

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- you --

7 DICK: -- choice, not our choice.

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: But, well, give me an  
9 example then. If you're saying those --

10 DICK: Well, somebody --

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- are celebrities --

12 DICK: -- that David, and David obviously is  
13 going to have to make the -- David --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Is Paul Harvey considered  
15 to be a celebrity?

16 DICK: Well, certainly he is. A cel-- we're  
17 talking about someone that you feel comfortable with.  
18 Now, let, let me ask you once.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

20 DICK: Dav-- you were originally concerned  
21 that a warrant should be served by the sheriff. Does  
22 David have faith in the local sheriff here? Is that a  
23 person that he would feel comfortable --

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, he's -- he was, he --  
25 see, I really don't know too much --

DICK: Okay.

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- about them --

2 DICK: Well, I need --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- personally.

4 DICK: -- to talk to David. If you let me  
5 talk to David and then I'll --

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, he just, he just  
7 moved off to try to go to the bathroom.

8 DICK: Well, that won't take long. That  
9 won't take long.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

11 DICK: But, listen. Let, let me explain to  
12 you why --

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

14 DICK: -- why, why I need to talk to David  
15 about that. David must have a list -- or at least have  
16 some folks that he is comfortable with that he can deal  
17 with and that he can represent his wishes to. And  
18 those are the folks we're talking about. We're not  
19 talking about bringing in somebody from Oprah Winfrey  
20 or one of these other shows that, that, you know, some  
21 people consider, you know, trash TV, is what I think  
22 I've heard that, that -- the term called. That's just  
23 -- Sally Jesse --

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no.

25 DICK: -- Raphael or --

STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, I understand. Dick, I

1 understand what you're saying. When you -- I only --  
2 you know, there was a few people standing here. You,  
3 you gave me -- you know, you asked me a question about  
4 names.

5 DICK: No, but I was talking about --

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So --

7 DICK: -- what we all would consider --

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, I understand that.

9 DICK: Okay.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I understand that.

11 DICK: Okay. So --

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: So --

13 DICK: -- they just threw those out --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I was --

15 DICK: -- to you?

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Exactly. Exactly. It's  
17 not like, you know --

18 DICK: Okay.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- this is what we want or

20 DICK: Well, you --

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- anything or --

22 DICK: Then you need to get back to work on  
23 that then --

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well --

25 DICK: -- when you get an opportunity.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- this is true. See, I

1 | did that just as a response to find out just what you  
2 | had in mind or what, what direction you're going with  
3 | that.

4 |           DICK: Okay. Now, what about this -- Steve,  
5 | let's, let's get back to this original proposal that I  
6 | offered when -- which I felt, frankly, was, was, was a  
7 | real breakthrough. And, and I put a lot of effort into  
8 | this, into this thing. And, and, and just -- you guys  
9 | just kind of dismissed it out of hand.

10 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Which proposal was that  
11 | again?

12 |           DICK: That, that is the one that I, that I  
13 | brought to David's attention that he immediately put  
14 | you on in, in connection with the movement of the  
15 | Bradley vehicles. And I said, David -- and, and David  
16 | said that seems --

17 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, can you refresh my  
18 | memory here?

19 |           DICK: Okay. I, I suggested to him that if  
20 | he will commit to the release -- or to the exodus of  
21 | all you folks out of that house, we'll withdraw the  
22 | Bradleys. And he said well, that's, that's not  
23 | unreasonable. But I, I said, David, if that's not  
24 | acceptable to you, offer me, offer me a proposal that I  
25 | can take --

          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, see --

1 DICK: -- and sell to them.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And here's what, what I  
3 understand clearly the reason for that. It's not --

4 DICK: Okay.

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- it's not that it  
6 wouldn't be under the kind of circumstances you and I  
7 have been talking about.

8 DICK: Okay.

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: It always gets back to why  
10 he starts getting into the spiritual mode with you when  
11 he says his God told him to wait, and you apparently do  
12 not believe that God can speak to a human being --

13 DICK: Now, hold it, please --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no, no.

15 DICK: -- don't put --

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no.

17 DICK: -- words in my mouth. All right?

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no, no, no, no. But  
19 I'm telling -- when I say you, it's generic. It's  
20 overall. Don't --

21 DICK: Okay.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- don't be so literal.

23 It's --

24 DICK: All right.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- not --

DICK: All right.

1               STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- it's nothing -- you  
2 know, it's no -- no, I'm not saying you even said such  
3 a thing. But I'm just saying, you know, basically  
4 that's what it is. That's the concept.

5               DICK: Okay.

6               STEVE SCHNEIDER: So, it's not that your  
7 offer is, is foolish, off-the-wall, anything like that.  
8 He --

9               DICK: Well, offer me a counter proposal.

10              STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, this is what --

11              DICK: That's what I've asked.

12              STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I'm saying. To me, it,  
13 it is, it is something that is reasonable.

14              (Unidentified whispering voice in background  
15 not discernible.)

16              STEVE SCHNEIDER: What did he say to say or  
17 what?

18              DICK: He -- what I, what I suggested to him  
19 was that --

20              STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

21              DICK: -- he offered me something that I can  
22 take back in to the bosses, and say, listen now, but he  
23 appreciates, he appreciates, you know, your, your  
24 consideration, but this is something that, that he  
25 would be more, be more comfortable with. And then I  
can take that and go in and, and make a case for that.

1 And that's -- you know, during these last couple of  
2 days we, we seemed to get to a point where we can talk  
3 to one another. But then we talk about trying to get  
4 off of dead center, we're having a difficult time.  
5 And, and it's, it's like, you know, you show me yours,  
6 I'll show you mine. And what --

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, I understand that.

8 DICK: -- we need to do is reason together  
9 and then we have to put some faith in one another. And  
10 I suggested that, that, you know, you send the kids up  
11 the road, four kids up the road, and at the same time  
12 you're doing that I'll have the Bradleys withdrawn.

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, see, number one, in,  
14 in all honesty --

15 DICK: Off your property. Off your property.

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. But, number one, in  
17 all honesty, the Bradleys don't even bother us --

18 DICK: Okay.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- at all. It's just that,  
20 that whole thing to do with the word, you know, keeping  
21 one's word and following through. That's why --

22 DICK: Absolutely.

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- that's why we were --

24 DICK: That's the crux of this whole thing.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, see, that was the  
reason for that. But, like I told you earlier, these

1 people don't fear things like Bradleys and men and --

2 DICK: Nor should they. We're not --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

4 DICK: Well, they're not there --

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. You know, just to --

6 DICK: to put fear in to --

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- reiterate that. At the  
8 same time, so that -- to that -- see, what they're  
9 really waiting on, the adults and, and some of the  
10 children are, they're still waiting -- well, when God  
11 told them to wait, why? They're wanting to know why  
12 are we to wait. What is the reason for this? Is  
13 something going to be shown to us from the Word of God?  
14 We realize -- we believe we're in the last days. The  
15 Book of Name is something that is rapidly taking place  
16 as I even speak with you.

17 DICK: Um-hum.

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And, like we've talked  
19 about, the chariots of the flaming torches -- I mean,  
20 we see that to be those tanks right around us. But,  
21 anyway, that's why the majority of these people -- it's  
22 not because they're trying to be unreasonable, that  
23 they, they don't want to come out or be there. I  
24 myself want to, Dick. I'd like to come out, get this  
25 thing taken care of once and for all, sit down, and  
talk, speak with you, and, and go through whatever has



1 to and, and be done with it. But at the same time, the  
2 reason I came here first of all, like the rest, was to  
3 hear this book opened, and, and we've not been  
4 dissatisfied.

5 DICK: Is that someplace you have to remain  
6 to hear that? I mean, David certainly --

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Was -- well, we're --

8 DICK: -- can put his message down to --

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, well, well, let me  
10 tell you this -- or -- in the past, when I first met  
11 the man, I was in Hawaii, and I would speak to him  
12 long-distance by telephone and it cost a humongous  
13 amount monthly in, in phone bills, along with we tried  
14 the tape thing, but he's a man that is given  
15 revelations on a day-by-day basis, which he never  
16 repeats the same thing twice. He has the ability to  
17 open up deeper and deeper the mysteries of God as they  
18 are in that book. So, this is what, what people are  
19 here for, to hear, to know, and we don't -- I really  
20 don't see in this world that there are that many  
21 honest-hearted people that have a deep love for truth,  
22 whatever truth might be.

23 DICK: Steve?

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

25 DICK: Listen. Please, listen to --

STEVE SCHNEIDER: I --

1 DICK: -- me for a second.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Go ahead. Go ahead.

3 DICK: I think -- let, let's agree point-by-  
4 point. Have we not reached a point where we're having  
5 a difficult time moving from?

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: We have.

7 DICK: Well -- you apparently have some  
8 concern about the things that I'm telling you. I  
9 haven't seen you follow through on some of the things  
10 I've heard you talk about. So --

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well --

12 DICK: -- how, how --

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- for ex-- like what, for  
14 example?

15 DICK: How would -- well, the first -- I keep  
16 getting back to the first day when we were -- when  
17 everyone was coming out. But let's forget that.  
18 That's in the past. That's in the past.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, that has nothing to  
20 do with me, though. I mean, I can --

21 DICK: Fine.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I told you I tried to talk  
23 to as many people as -- Well, not to --

24 DICK: I know.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- you, but to -- I think  
it was Henry I told that, and Jim.

1 DICK: I understand that.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: And I can't coerce or  
3 force --

4 DICK: I'm not asking you --

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- anybody --

6 DICK: -- to.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. But just understand  
8 that. I mean, I --

9 DICK: But I do understand.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I, I can try to talk to  
11 people. I can lay out the reasons, the pluses, the  
12 minuses, but, you know, I mean, that's as far as I can  
13 go. But, remember, that the main things for -- that  
14 are bothering these people, like the young lady you  
15 talked to -- I mean, no one talked to her when she was  
16 called to the phone. I, I could detect a little  
17 animosity there. She was annoyed because, number one,  
18 they see that, you know, there -- that from day one the  
19 Bradleys have entrenched further and further on our  
20 property and these men have done more and more of those  
21 kind of things. A \$1,000 were, were given. The phone  
22 didn't come for much longer than when we gave the money  
23 out for it, and the cord. Along with the six gallons  
24 of milk. That looked bad. Along with a body that's  
25 still on the property whose parents are here right now.  
And -- I mean, you, you've got a spokesman on TV saying

1 one thing. And I've got the list, by the way, of all  
2 those statements right here. We wrote them down. If I  
3 -- you yourself would agree with me that what was  
4 stated on television to those reporters is not in fact  
5 the way you guys have responded to us for those  
6 requests. It is not true at all. I'll read back his  
7 very statements to you.

8 DICK: Yeah, I know, I know what he said,  
9 Steve.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I do too. Do you want me  
11 to go up there? I'll go read them and then I'll tell  
12 you what you told me. I mean --

13 DICK: Well, I under--

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Six gallons of milk aren't  
15 here. The dead body, contrary to what he said, is on  
16 the property and you ha-- there have not been a  
17 willingness to take these things off.

18 (Ringing sound.)

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That would show one's good  
20 faith. But these are the -- some of the things that  
21 people come to me about and lay on me, and I'm to relay  
22 that to yourself.

23 DICK: All right. Which brings us back to my  
24 original question.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

DICK: We have to work with one another and

1 we have to understand that -- you know, yesterday you  
2 mentioned this term "bargain." All right. You --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, I, I picked that up  
4 from the, the news press, the --

5 DICK: Okay.

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- press release  
7 conference.

8 DICK: Well, in, in a sense it is a bargain.  
9 In any sort of negotiation or bargain, much the same  
10 way they do with union activities --

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I understand.

12 DICK: -- you present some points that are  
13 of, of interest to you, I do the same. Obviously,  
14 we're not going to agree with one another in each  
15 instance, but we, we do need to agree that we have to  
16 work to resolve and it takes some concession on both  
17 our part. After I left you last night, I, I was going  
18 over and over and over this in my mind. When I came in  
19 today, the reason I was not on the phone for you --  
20 with you for some time is because I went in to my, to  
21 my bosses here and, and suggested, listen, they have  
22 what I feel are some reasonable, legitimate concerns,  
23 and obviously why we --

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Which are? Can you give me  
25 some --

DICK: Well, this --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- examples of what --

2 DICK: -- concern about --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- they might be?

4 DICK: -- Bradleys on the property. The  
5 concern about feeling that the evidence -- you feel  
6 that the evidence will not get to court and that the --  
7 new-- the news account that was filmed might be  
8 doctored, and all those things. So, I've said to him,  
9 please, put that out over to the media so they know  
10 that you're concerned about it, and it -- and, and that  
11 we will comply with all the rules of evidence, and in  
12 good faith we will make all those things available. We  
13 are not going to tamper with those. We're not going to  
14 do any of those things that you suggested. But I will  
15 -- I know that and everyone else knows that, but I want  
16 to make sure that you understand that. So, I went to  
17 him and I said, please, make this clear, that these  
18 folks will have the ability to talk to whomever they  
19 want as soon as they come out of there. And,  
20 additionally, they're concerned about the Bradleys on  
21 the property. And if we can move those Bradleys off,  
22 which is one of the, the points that, that you appear  
23 to be concerned about, then maybe we can get together  
24 and start working once together to resolve this  
25 impasse, to resolve this incident and get on with it so  
that you can make all the information that you're

1 writing down, all those thoughts and emotions that you  
2 have, available for scrutiny by anyone that cares to  
3 look at them, all the news media worldwide, all the law  
4 enforcement agencies, Congressional inquiries, the  
5 Senate, the Congress and all those kinds of things.  
6 It's important you do that and it's, it's, it's, it's  
7 your --

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Ah --

9 DICK: -- responsibility to do that. So,  
10 what did I do? I went into my boss and said please --

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Can I stop you there and  
12 ask you something? But who are your bosses? How many  
13 are there?

14 DICK: Oh, my gosh.

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Are you talking about the  
16 FBI or are you talking about more agencies --

17 DICK: Well, this is a, this is a cooperative  
18 effort between --

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Too, how many men  
20 are you speaking with?

21 DICK: I --

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: When I talk with you,  
23 you're going back to how many people that are making  
24 decisions here?

25 DICK: There are a number of different pe--  
decision-makers. Obviously, we can't work 24 hours a

1 day and we're in the seventh day now, so there's a  
2 group effort here. There's no one person in charge.  
3 It's an effort, a cooperative effort with ATF and the  
4 FBI and, and, of course, obviously there are the county  
5 sheriffs that are here.

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Someone has to be able to  
7 have the authority to finally say yea or nay.

8 DICK: Absolutely. And that's what I'm  
9 talking about. These folks --

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Is there a person right  
11 there -- is a person that is finally given that  
12 decision?

13 DICK: There is a, is a group -- it's a, a --  
14 several people that represent the --

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: It's a little democracy you  
16 have there that --

17 DICK: We, we always work in that fashion,  
18 democracy. We don't want anybody to make an arbitrary  
19 decision.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no. That, that's not  
21 what I mean. I'm just saying, you know, you're, you're  
22 -- you know, every time I speak with you you've got to  
23 go back to, as you say, bosses.

24 DICK: Well, certainly. Much like you go to  
25 David.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Bosses. Well, what -- so,



1 | what's the agency -- I mean, who's all involved in  
2 | these bosses? Can you just --  
3 |           DICK: Well, we have --  
4 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- give me a little idea  
5 | about it?  
6 |           DICK: Okay. I'll, I'll --  
7 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: What, what --  
8 |           DICK: -- tell you. You got a pen there?  
9 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Sure.  
10 |           DICK: Sure. We got ATF. And you saw the,  
11 | the local -- the ATF man that's representing their  
12 | agency here who -- by the way, this morning I think you  
13 | saw on television he said, we take full responsibility.  
14 | We, in ATF, take full --  
15 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, but --  
16 |           DICK: -- responsibility.  
17 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- what does that really  
18 | mean, though, Dick? I mean, I appre--  
19 |           DICK: That means that that --  
20 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I appreciate the  
21 | statement, but I've seen others --  
22 |           DICK: That means he'll do it.  
23 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- say that in the past  
24 | too --  
25 |           DICK: You know what?  
          STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- and they got their

1 | hands --

2 |           DICK: You know what the --

3 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- slapped or something.

4 |           DICK: He will take full responsibility and  
5 | it will be worked out. There is the FBI, the Texas  
6 | Rangers, folks from other agencies, the Austin Police  
7 | Department, the local sheriff's department here. It's  
8 | just a, a whole -- DPS, the National Guard. I mean, I  
9 | mean, these kinds of incidents, as tragic as they are,  
10 | we all have to work together in the cooperative effort  
11 | because it, it takes a lot of resources. It takes a  
12 | lot of -- a, a, a lot of people, and those kinds of  
13 | things. So, ultimately, the decisions that are made  
14 | are made by the agencies themselves and we -- that is, I  
15 | and, and perhaps --

16 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Are you telling me --

17 |           DICK: -- John Cox --

18 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- are you telling me  
19 | you're going back to a representative of each of these  
20 | agents? Or what are you telling me?

21 |           DICK: Well, there -- we have periodic  
22 | meetings with the heads of agencies here and we explain  
23 | to them --

24 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, who carries the clout  
25 | mainly, though, as to --

          DICK: Well --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- what's going on?

2 DICK: -- there -- it's a cooperative effort.

3 I mean, there, there is no, you know, head man, so to  
4 speak. They are commanders of respective agencies.

5 And Mr. Ricks is one of those people here. Again, we  
6 have, we have to work in shifts, much like you do. All  
7 of us have to sleep. And, and, so, there are a number  
8 of people. And that's why we take this responsibility  
9 very seriously. We don't make arbitrary decisions.

10 And that's why you say well, we move so slowly. The  
11 reason is because we want to ensure --

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: What are, what are the  
13 possibilities of me speaking with Bob Ricks?

14 DICK: The -- there are no possibilities.  
15 That would have -- Mr. Ricks has so many  
16 responsibilities that he's coordinating this gigantic  
17 effort, as are the other folks here, and it's just  
18 absolutely impossible. The man just is, is  
19 coordinating --

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Is he in the same --

21 DICK: -- the effort --

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- is he in the same area,  
23 the same building as yourself?

24 DICK: No. No. We have to get back to him  
25 and, and deal with him as often as we can. But, again,  
you know, they're, they're having to stand by. The

1 | heads of agencies have to conduct these press  
2 | conferences. They have to make policy divisions -- or  
3 | decisions. And they have to talk with the people back  
4 | in Washington, the President. You know, all these  
5 | kinds of people, from the President on down, they're  
6 | all concerned about your safety. And, and, so, there  
7 | are continually decisions that have to be made. And,  
8 | and that's why I'm here to talk with you, so I can  
9 | represent you. That's why I've chosen to be a street  
10 | agent, as we call it, instead of an administrator,  
11 | because -- you know, I, I think it's my responsibility  
12 | to try to work with people and I enjoy working with  
13 | people trying to, trying to resolve some of these kinds  
14 | of, of, of incidents safely. And, so, I pass that on,  
15 | as does John Cox, as does Jim and Henry, and many  
16 | others. Well, you have to have trust and faith in me  
17 | to represent what you said, and I have. I've gone to  
18 | these people and we've gotten concessions, and we're  
19 | willing to do those kinds of things, but we've got to  
20 | work together. We both have to do it. It can't be a  
21 | one-way street. It just doesn't work. It can't work  
22 | that way. When have you ever seen a, a decision made  
23 | wherein one person always makes the decision? You're,  
24 | you're married. Do you always make the decision or, or  
25 | does your wife at times have some input into the --

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Getting back to what

1 we need to accomplish here, what is it you suggest?

2 DICK: I want a counter for you -- from you  
3 as to how we can resolve this concerning the Bradleys  
4 and, and releasing folks.

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

6 DICK: And, and I'll be glad to, to send that  
7 in to, to the bosses and we'll mull it over and, you  
8 know, you can't --

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, let me -- if you  
10 remember -- remember what the issues were when we last  
11 -- over the last day or two that we've been speaking  
12 have been the encroachment.

13 DICK: Absolutely.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, we call, we call  
15 that, I guess, generically Bradleys then. I guess  
16 that's --

17 DICK: Absolutely.

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- the key word. Okay.  
19 Secondly, it was -- we were speaking about the six  
20 gallons of milk. And money was paid out from here for  
21 whatever our needs might be that way, and it seemed  
22 like you people did want to help. Of course --

23 DICK: Let me address that issue. Can we do  
24 this one-by-one, perhaps, at least?

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, I just want to --  
these are the issues that they --

1           DICK: Okay. You, you go ahead and read  
2 them. You go ahead and read them. Okay?

3           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. That's why. They're  
4 going to get back to me with all of this again, so --  
5 and then the body, of course, Peter Gent.

6           DICK: Um-hum.

7           STEVE SCHNEIDER: And his parents being here.  
8 Those are the things, along with -- apparently, the  
9 most recent one would be Robert Gonzalez, but that,  
10 like you say, has to do with his own decision, whatever  
11 he chooses to do if you contact him.

12          DICK: Um-hum.

13          STEVE SCHNEIDER: That -- you know, a lot of  
14 these things do not matter to me per se personally, but  
15 at the same time people are asking me to be a  
16 spokesperson, make it plain and clear what exactly --  
17 where they're coming from and what they're hoping to  
18 accomplish.

19          DICK: I know that.

20          STEVE SCHNEIDER: But, I mean, what -- the  
21 biggest thing of all, the biggest thing of all with the  
22 majority of these people -- now, this is what it is --  
23 has to do with the press, having a line to the press.  
24 They do fear you people. They do. They're saying if I  
25 go out I want my story to be heard. I want the safety  
to know that they're -- we're being viewed and watched

1 and that they're there, that they know ahead of time  
2 what I think, that I might make some statements. This  
3 is what they're asking me --

4 DICK: Okay.

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- and telling me.

6 DICK: And what -- you know, yesterday, on  
7 that last issue, we asked you who would you like to  
8 have here --

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right. But --

10 DICK: -- when you come out --

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I just wanted to go one  
12 last time again.

13 DICK: Okay.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: When I get off the phone,  
15 and you asked me to come back with a counter. I mean,  
16 again, this is where we were at -- or this is where the  
17 majority of these people have come to me and this is  
18 what they have requested.

19 DICK: Okay.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay?

21 DICK: Okay. Now, listen. We have to deal  
22 with these issues one a time. It seems as though when  
23 I try to deal with them, you always come up with one  
24 more issue from someone else. And, and I'm, I'm doing  
25 my best to resolve these issues.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, this

1 happens when you, when --

2 DICK: Okay.

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- you're talking to these  
4 people, you know, and right away --

5 DICK: Yeah.

6 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- they say, well, I --  
7 I'll, I'll say to them, well, you go talk to the man.  
8 He's okay. His name is Dick. No, I don't want to.  
9 You talk for me. And I say well, wait now. It's not  
10 so bad. You know, this is what one goes through.

11 DICK: If you're concerned, please go back to  
12 those people that are concerned that when they come out  
13 they might be hurt or something, that the individuals  
14 that are scared --

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, therefore --

16 DICK: We'll have --

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- you know --

18 DICK: -- anybody here -- we'll ha-- within  
19 reason, we'll have people here to ensure that that  
20 doesn't happen. How better able to, to make them feel  
21 comfortable with that? We'll have that person here.  
22 You, you tell me -- you give me the name of someone;  
23 we'll have them right here. We'll have them right  
24 here. And we'll film it if you want on a, on a  
25 videotape --

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, see, now --



1 DICK: -- if you like.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- you're getting clo--  
3 you're getting closer to what they're hoping for.

4 DICK: Well, I'll be happy to do that. We  
5 told you that yesterday, but apparently it hasn't been  
6 communicated --

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, it has --

8 DICK: -- to the folks that --

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- but that's not --

10 DICK: -- are concerned.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- you know -- we're  
12 getting close I said. Because they were talking about  
13 an open line to the press and so forth.

14 DICK: Well, the open line to the press will  
15 be done when you come out. Okay. You'll have that --  
16 you'll have the accessibility to the press, and we'll  
17 tell you that on television tomorrow.

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'll pass that on again,  
19 but I -- you know, I, I don't know for sure. I'll pass  
20 it all on, what you told me --

21 DICK: Pass it on, please.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- and we'll --

23 DICK: Please do that to --

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- see what --

25 DICK: -- those people that are concerned.  
Because I know, like I told you, yesterday, that not

1 | having been in this situation before there are a lot of  
2 | concerns. And, and I understand that and, and I'm  
3 | trying to help you --

4 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: Exactly.

5 |               DICK: -- resolve those --

6 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: You are right about that.  
7 | You hit it on the head.

8 |               DICK: Sure. And that's understandable.

9 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Well, let me -- it's  
10 | going to take awhile for me to get around here.  
11 | There's -- some of them are starting to eat here, so  
12 | what I'll do is --

13 |               DICK: Okay.

14 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- just try to talk as much  
15 | as I can, make a list or --

16 |               DICK: Well, let me --

17 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- see if --

18 |               DICK: You, you get those people that are  
19 | concerned about those specific issues, and myself or  
20 | John Cox will talk to them directly and we'll discuss  
21 | those issues. But you've got to communicate what we  
22 | say to those people --

23 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah. Oh, yeah.

24 |               DICK: -- in order to resolve it.

25 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: I have. I have. Very  
clearly.

1           DICK: Because, I mean, that's -- that seems  
2 to me to be a very simple issue. If they're concerned  
3 that when they come out they will be -- not be well-  
4 treated, then we'll have --

5           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, it's not --

6           DICK: -- people here --

7           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- even so much as --

8           DICK: -- as witnesses.

9           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- well-treated. They're  
10 talking about the final outcome of what's going to come  
11 of this. They all want to be clearly heard that --

12          DICK: Okay.

13          STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- when, when questions are  
14 asked by the press, the world, the, the, the country  
15 we're living in, that if they really want to know, they  
16 want to have the opportunity to answer those questions.

17          DICK: Not only will I answer those  
18 questions, you will be -- certainly have an attorney in  
19 there that can give them the information concerning  
20 court procedures and hearings and those kinds of  
21 things.

22          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Their -- they want their  
23 voice to be heard.

24          DICK: I couldn't agree more. And I -- you  
25 know, how can I make you understand that we believe  
that you must be heard ourselves? We're not trying to

1 suppress that. We're -- in fact, we're going to  
2 ensure --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Let me pass --

4 DICK: -- that that happens.

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- that -- well, I, I  
6 realize, I hear what you're saying. It's now to be  
7 able to convince these people here.

8 DICK: Well, I'll be happy to convince them.  
9 You put those folks on the, on the line and I'll talk  
10 to them and, and I'll convince them, because that is  
11 the truth. Now, you -- you know, you're not the only  
12 people that have integrity and truth. I consider  
13 myself a very truthful individual. I've never had my  
14 truth --

15 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I wouldn't --

16 DICK: -- or honesty --

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- deny that. I would --

18 DICK: -- questioned.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I would never --

20 DICK: Never.

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- say that you were. I  
22 mean, I could not judge you --

23 DICK: Never.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- Dick.

25 DICK: Well, I'm telling you.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: I -- you know, I'm not

1 | dealing with you as a character or a personality.

2 | When --

3 |           DICK: I understand that.

4 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- when, when I'm talking  
5 | about the concept of truth, it's not in relation to  
6 | what -- how you and I live from day to day.

7 |           DICK: Other honorable -- you know -- okay.  
8 | Let's put it this way, Steve. You --

9 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

10 |           DICK: -- and I are not the only honorable  
11 | people, okay?

12 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: I don't even consider  
13 | myself --

14 |           DICK: I work with honorable people. In --

15 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

16 |           DICK: -- fact, I would not work for --

17 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Probably more s--

18 |           DICK: -- them if they weren't honorable.

19 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Probably more so than  
20 | myself even, because I don't claim to be anything but  
21 | as one that tr-- only but tries to be and have the best  
22 | motives and so forth, and virtues. But like when you  
23 | say -- you may be a much more truthful man than I am.  
24 | But the one thing is I want the truth in relation to  
25 | issues. I want the truth in relation to the issues of  
   | eternal life and death. So, that when I --

1 DICK: Well --

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- speak of truth --

3 DICK: -- I can't give you the --

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I'm, I'm even --

5 DICK: -- truth about those issues, life and  
6 death.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, see, that's what I --  
8 so, when I use the word like that, you know, I'm, I'm  
9 not --

10 DICK: Sure.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- talking about it in, in  
12 regards to your own character --

13 DICK: I know it.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- or who you are as a  
15 person. You come across as being one that is as  
16 believable, and, and so far I do believe you. And I  
17 think you are doing as much as you possibly can, and it  
18 does come across, that I know you have to deal with  
19 others that may not sympathize to the degree you do  
20 from talking with us in regards to Bradleys or whatever  
21 else we might be talking about. But we'll, we'll keep  
22 on working on this. I'll, I'll do as you requested.  
23 I'll go to these people and see if they won't come to  
24 the phone, and you can talk with them. You can  
25 alleviate any of their fears in regards to how they  
might be taken out of here, treated, whatever else.

1           DICK: Well, I hope your attorney in there is  
2 also talking to them, because he's the first one that  
3 should be, and, and obviously you should, should have  
4 some belief in what he tells you. That the prosecution  
5 in this thing is, is such that it's going to be  
6 horribly difficult to straighten this out. I gave you  
7 cl-- examples today of --

8           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

9           DICK: -- people that --

10          STEVE SCHNEIDER: I believe that.

11          DICK: -- that beat the cases, if that's the  
12 way you want to term it, because, because juries  
13 believed the folks that were charged. I gave you --

14          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

15          DICK: -- I cited you examples, and, and it  
16 happens.

17          STEVE SCHNEIDER: I do --

18          DICK: It happens.

19          STEVE SCHNEIDER: You, you, you are doing  
20 your best and you will see one day how much I have  
21 appreciated it as a person --

22          DICK: Well, you know what?

23          STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- and the part you --

24          DICK: I feel --

25          STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- have played.

          DICK: You know, I'm --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'm serious --

2 DICK: -- concerned that you --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- about that.

4 DICK: I am very concerned that you and David  
5 have not tried to meet me -- you know, I, I busted my  
6 butt for you --

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: You, you don't realize --

8 DICK: -- and you haven't tried to help me.

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'm, I'm trying to make it  
10 so plain that I'm more than anything else a  
11 spokesperson, trying to gauge the spirit and the --

12 DICK: Well --

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- attitude and, and what  
14 they want. When --

15 DICK: Then take it back --

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- when I go around --

17 DICK: -- to them. Take it back to them --

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. That's --

19 DICK: -- what I said.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- what I'm saying. But  
21 when I have gotten strong, it's because they say well,  
22 wait a minute, we don't want it because we don't trust  
23 them. They say, go relay that for us. This is what's  
24 happened. It -- do you understand? But if it --

25 DICK: Well --

STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- were, if it were you and



1 me, if it was only myself in concern, I'd w-- come  
2 walking out. I'd say okay, here I am, Dick. Let's do  
3 what we've got to do, be done, and let's go on.

4 DICK: Steve, you represent -- obviously,  
5 they've asked you to speak for them. That must mean  
6 they have a lot of faith in your ability to do that.  
7 So, along with that faith in you comes a responsibility  
8 from you --

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I agree --

10 DICK: -- to, to do --

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- with you.

12 DICK: -- to do the right thing.

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I agree with you. And  
14 that's what I've been trying --

15 DICK: And I'm trying to --

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- to do from day one.

17 DICK: -- tell you, and I'm trying to tell  
18 you what I can do for you and will do for you --

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

20 DICK: -- and that is the right thing. Now,  
21 you have to go back and ensure that they know that.

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I haven't disagreed. I  
23 haven't disagreed. In fact, I --

24 DICK: It's a big responsibility.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- I, like yourself, have  
wanted to move everybody out smoothly, clearly, safely

1 | to the place where this is all finally resolved and it  
2 | can be finally put to rest.

3 |           DICK: All right. Well, listen, go back to  
4 | those folks and tell David that, that I again would  
5 | like to speak with him and we'll work on this proposal.  
6 | I mean, we, we got this concession from, from the, from  
7 | the commanders and I, I don't --

8 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: What concession was --

9 |           DICK: -- want to dismiss --

10 |          STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- that again?

11 |          DICK: Well, that is to move the Bradleys.  
12 | And, you know, I certainly could --

13 |          STEVE SCHNEIDER: And then everybody comes  
14 | out?

15 |          DICK: Well, listen.

16 |          STEVE SCHNEIDER: By --

17 |          DICK: Offer me something in turn.

18 |          STEVE SCHNEIDER: By the way, that -- okay.  
19 | To them that's -- that isn't --

20 |          DICK: Unacceptable.

21 |          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Just to be clear with you.  
22 | I, I don't want to even say that to them because --

23 |          DICK: Okay.

24 |          STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- it will be an insult to  
25 | them --

          DICK: Okay. Let's go with --

1           STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- because it's not a  
2 concession. It's --  
3           DICK:  Well, that's --  
4           STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- nothing.  
5           DICK:  You know, offer--  
6           STEVE SCHNEIDER:  It's nothing at all.  
7           DICK:  Listen.  Offer me something.  Women --  
8           STEVE SCHNEIDER:  All right.  
9           DICK:  -- and children.  Let's go with the  
10 women and children.  
11          STEVE SCHNEIDER:  Okay.  Well --  
12          DICK:  Now, that's agreeable.  
13          STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- I'll go back, I'll go --  
14          DICK:  That's acceptable.  
15          STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- back to talking to them.  
16          DICK:  All right.  
17          STEVE SCHNEIDER:  They'll probably bring up  
18 some of the things I mentioned to you though.  
19          DICK:  All right.  
20          STEVE SCHNEIDER:  And I'll -- it'll just be a  
21 repetition.  
22          DICK:  Well, you know, sometimes people don't  
23 understand things the first time around.  So, I know  
24 you do.  
25          STEVE SCHNEIDER:  Okay.  
          DICK:  I know you do.  But sometimes the

1 other folks maybe do not understand it. So, it's up to  
2 you. It's your responsibility to, to --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

4 DICK: -- pass this on to them, just as it's  
5 my responsibility to try to work with you to try to  
6 clear these issues up.

7 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Well, let's go back  
8 and I'll make the rounds --

9 DICK: All right.

10 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- again and --

11 DICK: We'll be back to --

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- see what --

13 DICK: -- we'll be back to --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- we can do.

15 DICK: -- you a little later then.

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

17 DICK: All right.

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Talk to you later, Dick.

19 DICK: Bye now.

20 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Good-bye.

21 \* \* \* \* \*

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Hello?

23 JOHN: Steve?

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yes.

25 JOHN: John.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: John. How are you doing?

1               JOHN: Fine. How about yourself?

2               STEVE SCHNEIDER: Not too bad.

3               JOHN: How's David doing?

4               STEVE SCHNEIDER: He seems to be doing a  
5 little bit better.

6               JOHN: He sounded terrible last night.

7               STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, he did. I was kind  
8 of falling asleep myself when he was talking to you  
9 there. I stayed by just to see how he was doing to  
10 make sure that, you know, he was somewhat stable yet.

11              JOHN: Both you guys got a pretty good  
12 night's, night's rest last night, huh? I didn't --

13              STEVE SCHNEIDER: It was one of the --

14              JOHN: -- didn't have you called too early in  
15 the morning.

16              STEVE SCHNEIDER: Exactly. It was one of the  
17 better nights I've had.

18              JOHN: It -- did, did it help him at all?

19              STEVE SCHNEIDER: It did. It actually did.  
20 He was awake a lot of the day. He, he, as usual, you  
21 know, of course, went in and out a few times. He's  
22 still recovering.

23              JOHN: Um-hum.

24              STEVE SCHNEIDER: So -- but he's looking  
25 better today than I've seen him look yet. I think I'm  
-- I'm sure he's going to pull out of it.

1           JOHN: Did he try getting up and moving  
2 around at all?

3           STEVE SCHNEIDER: He -- yeah. In fact, he  
4 had -- he got up. He kind of sat up and he even tried  
5 to stand up a little bit, but, you know, still, it's  
6 quite dizzying yet. Gets very lightheaded and it kind  
7 of takes all his energy.

8           JOHN: Anything about his -- does he look  
9 like he's -- as far as his vital signs and --

10          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Vital --

11          JOHN: -- temperature -- you don't think he's  
12 got any infection set in or anything like that?

13          STEVE SCHNEIDER: It, it doesn't appear like  
14 it. It, it looks like he's okay, even the facial  
15 coloring.

16          JOHN: Hey, I want to see him up and about --

17          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

18          JOHN: -- walking out of there.

19          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Sure.

20          JOHN: You know?

21          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Sure.

22          JOHN: And that's what I'm, I'm hoping that  
23 he will stay healthy, you know --

24          STEVE SCHNEIDER: John, so --

25          JOHN: -- and, and just --

          STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

1 JOHN: -- get better.

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: When did you come into the  
3 complex there? I mean, at -- Did --

4 JOHN: I'm sorry?

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- you just come in? Did  
6 you just come in now or have you been there for a  
7 little while or --

8 JOHN: Oh, this evening?

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

10 JOHN: Yeah. I've been here for a couple of  
11 hours.

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. So, Dick has  
13 probably filled you in then, of course.

14 JOHN: Yeah. Well, you were kind of hard on  
15 him, weren't you?

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, I don't know. See,  
17 being the middleman, you know, it's --

18 JOHN: I know.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- a frustration when --

20 JOHN: We both are middlemen, aren't we?

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, this is true. I  
22 mean, between yourself and -- like I told him, it would  
23 be no problem if it was myself only dealing --

24 JOHN: Sure.

25 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- with you people. I'd be  
out the door and it'd be over. But these people are

1 coming up to me saying, well, you know, we want to work  
2 things out right, but at the same time we're -- we want  
3 to be cautious. We're -- and then they're asking me to  
4 be a spokesman and, you know, you get all these  
5 different things at one time there and --

6 JOHN: Well, one of the, one of the things  
7 that I was kind of concerned about is when Dick  
8 mentioned that he was just talking for, for a very  
9 brief period of time with, with David, and then he put  
10 -- David just gave the phone right to you, and that's  
11 why I was concerned. Is David having --

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah, he did.

13 JOHN: -- some problems, you know.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: He did.

15 JOHN: Is, is he having some physical --

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, he --

17 JOHN: -- problems?

18 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- with himself didn't, no,  
19 no. He --

20 JOHN: Oh, okay.

21 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- did that because he was  
22 insulted by what he claimed to be an offer, you know.

23 JOHN: Okay.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: We'll back --

25 JOHN: Okay.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- off the Bradleys and



1 | you'all will come out. Well -- now, what does that  
2 | mean? What --

3 |           JOHN: Well, I thought there was a physical  
4 | reason that it may have been.

5 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no, no. You see, it's  
6 | a thing of trust. It's a thing of a wor-- you know,  
7 | both of us look at each other somewhat with a little  
8 | suspicion trying to --

9 |           JOHN: Sure.

10 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- to make sure that we're  
11 | going to follow through on what we say. And, well, you  
12 | know, like I reiterated to him toward the end of the  
13 | last conversation, we started off with square one.

14 |           JOHN: Yeah.

15 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: It was agreed with Jim, and  
16 | very clearly so, that they would be pulling up three  
17 | Bradleys to the perimeter of the property but not on  
18 | the property.

19 |           JOHN: Yeah.

20 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: And, of course, after that  
21 | time they've dug in at the back place. They've even  
22 | just, in the past hour, they're in the front yard, back  
23 | toward the gate, but still they're there.

24 |           JOHN: Yeah.

25 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: And the worst thing  
about --

1 JOHN: Out by the tower?

2 STEVE SCHNEIDER: I'll, I'll tell --

3 JOHN: Where the tower used to be?

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- you something. They've  
5 committed a maj-- they've committed a violation,  
6 because they just ran over the top of the cemetery  
7 there, which is against --

8 JOHN: Where is it?

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- the statutes and laws of  
10 the State of Texas.

11 JOHN: Where --

12 STEVE SCHNEIDER: It's right out front where  
13 the old church used to be. There's a -- an old --  
14 there's a large furnace unit that is still standing.  
15 It's blue. And of course --

16 JOHN: I'm making some --

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- be--

18 JOHN: -- notes. Just a second.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Between that and the  
20 fence is a cemetery.

21 JOHN: If you went down the road past the  
22 bus? Is that what, is that what you're talking about?

23 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay. Do you remember  
24 where the guard gate was --

25 JOHN: Yes. Yes.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- as you drive in? And

1 | then you take a right onto our dirt road that winds to  
2 | the building itself. On the right-hand side is a  
3 | cemetery.

4 |               JOHN: Okay.

5 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: And the attorney even came  
6 | to me, reminded me of what is a very strict violation  
7 | in the State of Texas for mutilating or purposely --  
8 | going over the top of a cemetery. He took the Bradley  
9 | on there about an hour ago, ran through over the top of  
10 | it, twisted and turned around on it. I mean, I keep on  
11 | asking the question to Dick. You know, if these are  
12 | full-grown men in these toys --

13 |               JOHN: Yeah.

14 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- you know, what are they  
15 | doing? I mean, it, it doesn't impress us. It doesn't  
16 | intimidate us. It just slows the process down.

17 |               JOHN: Yeah.

18 |               STEVE SCHNEIDER: You know, which I, like  
19 | yourself, I, I, I really respect yourself and someone  
20 | like Dick when you -- I really believe you guys are  
21 | trying, that it's, it's revoltive (sic) to him. And  
22 | then I was -- also passed on to him that one of our  
23 | guys happened to be looking down the road at some of  
24 | the sheriff's department. I, I --

25 |               JOHN: Uh-huh.

              STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- believe maybe that's

1 | them. I don't know who it would be. But one of them  
2 | showed the finger to him. And a little later one of  
3 | the guys, I think an officer, pulled his pants down and  
4 | stuck his butt in the air.

5 |           JOHN: That tells you something, doesn't it?

6 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yeah. I mean, what are we  
7 | dealing with here? What are we dealing with?

8 |           JOHN: Well, I, I -- in my own mind, and I  
9 | can't talk for other people, I --

10 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, he said, you know --

11 |           JOHN: -- I would say --

12 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- if they were --

13 |           JOHN: -- we're dealing with somebody that's  
14 | frustrated and juvenile and, you know, you can go on  
15 | and throw all the expletive --

16 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, I know. But I --

17 |           JOHN: -- deleted out there.

18 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- think if you guys are in  
19 | a position where, you know, you have some authority,  
20 | I'd pull off that kind of foolishness, that juvenile  
21 | attitude.

22 |           JOHN: Well, I'm making notes about it, I'll  
23 | tell you that. The cemetery itself --

24 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

25 |           JOHN: -- is that just an old cemetery that's  
been there for years --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, in --

2 JOHN: -- and years?

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- fact, it, it's gotten to  
4 become a little bit known because of this George Roden,  
5 back about six years ago, dug up a body of a woman that  
6 had been buried there something like 20 years ago.

7 JOHN: Oh, that's where that was?

8 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Yes. Exactly. And she was  
9 reburied and it, it got back from the paper --

10 JOHN: Yeah.

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- because, I mean, how  
12 many times does a person need to be buried?

13 JOHN: Yeah.

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: But --

15 JOHN: But there are several other people  
16 buried out there --

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah. There's --

18 JOHN: -- as well, huh?

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- quite a number in that  
20 cemetery, isn't there? Like, what --

21 JOHN: I, I'm sorry?

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Probably about eight, maybe  
23 ten or so.

24 JOHN: Well, I'll let somebody know about it.  
25 Let me, let me pass a couple of things by that I  
talked --

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right.

2 JOHN: -- to Dick and I talked to some other  
3 people and --

4 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

5 JOHN: -- obviously there are some issues  
6 that came up during the day and, and some that were  
7 kind of touchy, but I'm not going to bring them up to  
8 make them sensitive or anything else. But I --

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No. See --

10 JOHN: -- I just --

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- that wouldn't be  
12 sensitive. It was just that one --

13 JOHN: I just want to clarify --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

15 JOHN: -- some things.

16 STEVE SCHNEIDER: All right. Go ahead. Go  
17 ahead.

18 JOHN: That earlier in the day they talked  
19 about those considerations that, that David said were  
20 totally unacceptable, and, and that's fine. I  
21 appreciate his posture on that. And it was my  
22 understanding they wanted -- you know, everybody come  
23 out, we'll remove the Bradley vehicles, and that's  
24 basically what the, the statement was, from my  
25 understanding.

STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

1 JOHN: Is that the way you understand it  
2 as --

3 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That's correct.

4 JOHN: -- well?

5 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That's basically what it  
6 was.

7 JOHN: Okay. And then there were five items  
8 discussed; the removal of the vehicles, the six gallons  
9 of milk for the youngsters, Peter, a direct line to the  
10 media, and a conversation with Robert. Those --

11 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That is correct.

12 JOHN: -- those, those five items.

13 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That is correct.

14 JOHN: And, also, I guess there was a little  
15 girl in there, Melissa Morrison, that they had, they  
16 had some discussion about her leaving and then just --

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

18 JOHN: -- put an end to that.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Right.

20 JOHN: And, and that's about where we stand  
21 from, from today, huh?

22 STEVE SCHNEIDER: That's correct.

23 JOHN: I, I, I told Dick, I said, geez, we,  
24 we kind of left things in a pretty good vein early this  
25 morning, and what, what's, what's happened out there,  
huh?

1 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

2 JOHN: So, let, let me throw a couple of  
3 things to you that I have, that I have found out, not I  
4 have determined, but I -- in conversation with people  
5 here. First of all, Robert's not here. Robert's gone.  
6 He's been taken someplace. He's having some  
7 difficulties. And I think you understand what that is  
8 -- that's all about. It's --

9 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

10 JOHN: -- just some, some trauma. And --  
11 however, if either yourself or David wanted to put a, a  
12 statement together or something on tape, I'll guarantee  
13 you it'll get to Robert. If, if, if we can --

14 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, see --

15 JOHN: -- we could work out any arrangements  
16 you want to work out to get the tape --

17 STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, in --

18 JOHN: -- through to him.

19 STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- response to that, I  
20 mean, David -- it's not that he wants to make a  
21 statement so much to Robert, it's just that we have --

22 JOHN: Well, I don't mean a -- you know, a, a  
23 official statement.

24 STEVE SCHNEIDER: No, no. I, I --

25 JOHN: I'm sure he has --

STEVE SCHNEIDER: I --



1                   JOHN:  -- something he wants to discuss with  
2 Robert.

3                   STEVE SCHNEIDER:  See, David allowed him into  
4 his home and had an open communion --

5                   JOHN:  Sure.

6                   STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- and communication with  
7 him --

8                   JOHN:  Sure.

9                   STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- and there would be --  
10 knowing David, there would be no threats, no veiled  
11 threats.

12                  JOHN:  Oh, yeah.

13                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  He loves, loves this man  
14 so --

15                  JOHN:  Disappointment probably more than  
16 anything else, huh?

17                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  Yeah.  So, I mean --

18                  JOHN:  But if wants to put a tape together  
19 and express his feelings --

20                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  I'll --

21                  JOHN:  -- to Robert --

22                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- I'll pass that on --

23                  JOHN:  -- let him know that --

24                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- if he wants --

25                  JOHN:  -- that certainly --

                  STEVE SCHNEIDER:  -- to make a tape and pass

1 | it on to Robert.

2 |           JOHN: Sure. Maybe it'll do something for  
3 | Robert, you know.

4 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: It might. It might.

5 |           JOHN: You know, and maybe it'll make David  
6 | feel better too --

7 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Okay.

8 |           JOHN: -- by, by making this statement.

9 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: Well, see, as you recall,  
10 | from what Steve -- I mean, not Steve, but I mean what  
11 | you were updated with there by Dick --

12 |           JOHN: Yeah.

13 |           STEVE SCHNEIDER: -- was, of course --
