Let me, 7 8 let me ask you something, and, just to reinforce something here, to make sure that you're, you're 9 10 totally aware of it. In talking with David and talking 11 with, with Steve, they both said that everybody in 12 there, you know, men, women, children, are all free to 13 leave any time they want, it's up to them. There's no 14 pressure, there's no coercion, there's, you know, 15 nothing that would preclude them to leave if they want 16 to leave. 17 GRAEME: That's correct, yes. 18 JOHN: And that's the impression that you 19 have? 20 GRAEME: Yeah. 21 JOHN: That's true? 22 Yeah. Well, he's made the statement GRAEME: 23 numerous times at least in past months that anyone who wants to leave can leave. 24 25 Okay. What about in the past week? JOHN: Since the incident last Sunday?

Well, I, I can only, only assume 1 GRAEME: 2 that he's never -- put it this way, he's never, I've never had any caution to stay, for me to stay here. 3 4 JOHN: Okay. Okay. So you're in there, you 5 know, as a result of your own volition, your own free will. 6 7 This is my free will. GRAEME: Good. Good. Well, that, I just want 8 9 to make it clear that should you want to leave, should 10 you, you know, have that opportunity and the desire, 11 whatever it might be, all you have to do is walk down 12 the road and, and you'll be greeted with open arms. 13 And, and I pointed out to Mary Jean Borst who I just 14 spoke to and Rachel and all the others that I've talked to this evening, Jeff Little and David Thibodeau that 15 16 hey, we have, we have a lot of patience. We, we are 17 not going to come, come charging up there. We are 18 going to sit out here and wait and wait as 19 long as it takes, Because we're going to resolve this 20 through reason and we're going to resolve this through 21 communications, through talking. So that it's a very peaceful resolution and nobody gets hurt, because too 22 23 many people have been hurt already, you know. Are you 24 there? 25

GRAEME: Yes, sir, someone just -
JOHN: Somebody stepped on a wire, huh.

1 GRAEME: Yeah. 2 I know they said if you look at that JOHN: phone it'll click sometimes, I think. 3 GRAEME: 4 Yeah. 5 But I, but I hope you understand that. There are a lot of media people out 12 there and we have the responsibility to ensure that 1.3 nothing happens to these people, you know. Is there, 14 is there anything I could tell your brother? 15 GRAEME: Oh, you can just, well, the only 16 thing I, I can possibly tell him is, is that I'm doing 17 fine. 18 JOHN: Okay. 19 GRAEME: I managed to get through the 20 incident last Sunday totally unscathed, so. 21 JOHN: Weren't hurt at all, huh? 22 Not, not at all. GRAEME: 23 Good. Now, I understand they're going 24 to have a, a burial service tomorrow morning for Peter 25 Ghent. I, I didn't know if you're aware of it or not, but either David or -- no, I guess Steven told me that

And, I mean, one prophet after another. So, I 8 mean, the question is what's in that book? Why does 9 the last book of the Old Testament, Malachi, say 10 remember ye the law of Moses before the great and 11 dreadful day of the Lord come? Well, what was the law 12 of Moses about? Well, Exodus 20 and 21 lays out 13 something that Christians fall over when they see it. 14 I must admit I did. I had to wrestle with it hard and 15 long.

And I hope, you know, as we were talking a little bit earlier about the -- putting the news report and the media in proper perspective, that, you know, a lot of people viewing that are going to have to stop and study it and try to, to use -- be a little bit flexible in their perspective in order to understand, you know, where he's coming from and all the relationships there that we might have seen in the tape.

1 MAX: So it is going to -- And while it is 2 very touching -- And we all agreed out here that, you know, that this kind of redoubled our efforts to, to 3 4 see a peaceful conclusion to this thing. 5 Um-hum. Well, I'm hoping, you know, STEVE: 6 like to get him back -- get him on the phone with you 7 and you can work and see what happens, you know. 8 MAX: Well, I was very encouraged by so many 9 of the things that, that I heard him say. 10 STEVE: Yeah. 11 And it means so much to be able to look at somebody when they're saying something and see the 12 13 sincerity that --14 Well, he knows a lot of you guys, like yourself and Harwell, are putting forth an effort 15 16 and, from your understanding, especially in a -- I know 17 it's hard. It seems like you can do more at times, but 18 it's -- To me the greatest, I guess the hang up right 19 now for any movement -- I mean, really, and it's 20 difficult, there's no question. And that's with him 21 and his experience with his God, when the God says to 22 him, you know, wait. And we're all sitting here 23 wondering what's going on, how long, and -- And even today I had some pretty -- I had a lot of questions for 24 25 him, okay, what's going on, what now, and how come, and it came back to he says well, the same one that showed

1 | me the information that I gave to you.

And he says, you know, you can leave any time 2 you want. He says, but the same one that showed the 3 information that you think is there in the Bible that 4 5 you haven't been able to controvert or any of the people that you've connected with, and said is the same 6 7 one that now tells me to wait. I mean, I've -- You know, it's, it's a unique thing in this generation and 8 9 in the world that someone can go so deeply into sciences. Well, he's not done that with the press or 10 11 anybody, but he gets into astronomy, physics, matter, 12 antimatter, breaks down molecules, gets into the 13 constellations, gets into sciences I've never heard 14 before, and I, I'm a person that's been schooled and 15 have pursued knowledge and information most of my life. 16 And when the guy gets into gemstones and, and their laminations, passing laser and the power that 17 comes through the laser beam through these gems and why 18 19 and how, it's a mind blower. It's -- it is literally a 20 mind blower. Or when he gets into how the pyramids got 21 there and why they sit on sand, such a soft foundation, 22 when each block is made -- It's so heavy and so much 23 tonnage and, of course, they fit so perfectly well. 24 Well, what were they there for in the first place? 25 Why'd they make them?

And we had a couple engineers around once and

1 he opened that up and, I tell you what, I'd never heard 2 anything like it in my life. But the sense, the logic 3 to it, and it's the same source of information that tells him to wait, same source of information that when 4 I tried to rip him apart from every angle when I first 5 met him, as I'd done with almost every denomination, I 6 7 was not able to do it. In fact, it actually frustrated 8 me and annoyed me when I couldn't nail him to the wall. 9 And, on the other hand, when I'd hit him with so many questions, what about this, what about that, he'd go 10 11 back and show me an answer, not give me an opinion or 12 theory. 13 Like you were saying, many interpretations, 14 but let's see a human being, let's see anybody with 15 asking a question go back in such a volume of chapters 16 and relate them and harmonize them. But, see, this is 17 the reason why I'm here. If it wasn't for that, I 18 would be long ago back in Hawaii, living my life, going to the beach once or twice a week with my exercise 19 20 program and probably teaching. I mean, that's where 21 I'd be. I really loved Hawaii, I loved the people 22 there. 23 That sounds good to me right now. 24

STEVE: Well, it, it does. The truth of the matter is every day I've got to go through that kind of a battle, you know, the kernel, the fleshly versus the

25

1 spiritual. Every day you get the urge to go back and, 2 and live that life. But it comes to an end. I mean, for all of us. I mean, you might live -- be able to 3 live out your X number of years, I might myself, but 4 death comes to every man, every living creature on this 5 This is a cemetery here. Why? What's going on 6 earth. here? How do we get here? Is it evolution? Is it 7 creationism? How'd we get here? Where we going? 8 We're so complex. We hear in stereo, we see in stereo. 9 So is there an author of life? Is there someone out 10 11 there saying have you human beings had enough, do you 12 agree with me that it doesn't work down there? 13 Man's cried for peace for 6,000 years and all 14 the prophets say when man cries for peace in the final 15 days, sudden destruction comes. So are these 16 guys -- were they drunk? Were they eating pizza late 17 at night and had bad dreams and wrote them down, or is 18 there some reality to the words they speak? So, see, 19 these are the issues I've been wrestling with in the 20 past, especially six, seven years since meeting him. 21 And, you know, of course, you know, the lifestyle out 22 here, as you would hear, is not the most -- one of the most delectable or desirable one would ever want. 23 24 MAX: Well, just like anything else is subject to different interpretations. Everybody has 25 their own heaven and hell, you know. It's the same way

with the assignments, the places that, that people are 1 2 asked to work during their life. 3 STEVE: This is true. There are -- You know, many people 4 would dread being in downtown New York and many others 5 6 would dread being in downtown Waco. 7 But, Max, is there a --STEVE: 8 MAX: And many would feel the opposite, so --9 Right, but is there --STEVE: 10 MAX: -- I think we're up to different styles 11 here. 12 STEVE: True. 13 MAX: But there's something that's got to 14 hold us all together. There's something that's got to 15 give us a -- towards -- to march towards. 16 STEVE: Well, this is true, but some have --17 In this world there's -- In my lifetime even I met very 18 few human beings that really care where they came from 19 or where they're going or the possibilities of an 20 eternal life. In other words, very few have a love for 21 truth, whether it's in the spiritual realm, whether 22 it's political, whether it's health, anatomy of the 23 body, what makes you tick. I've been one of those kind 24 of people that -- I'm interested in how come disease 25 happens, where does cancer come from, what you eat you are, I've heard.

1 And I have found through a lot of studying that when one eats a very wholesome diet and so forth, 2 you're free of a lot of the diseases that others get, 3 4 and that's logical to me. You can't just put anything you want in the carburetor of an automobile and expect 5 6 it to perform. Well, the human body's the same. Well, 7 in the political sphere all my life I've wondered well, why is it the way it is and how come no matter who gets 8 9 into office it basically progressively degenerates, it 10 seems, the society. 11 You look at the spiritual realm, there's a 12 lot of people making money off of a book called the 13 Bible, but yet they can't answer the most stringent or 14 the most simple questions in relation to all these 15 prophets, or even the apostles. 16 MAX: On the questions, that reminds me --17 And pardon me for interrupting. 18 STEVE: Oh, no, no problem. 19 But it's getting a little bit late MAX: 20 and --21 STEVE: Yeah. 22 MAX: -- I know that you all want to watch 2.3 some TV later. 24 STEVE: Right. 25 And we have had a request in here, I MAX: believe it was Dick --

with your children, where you know it's going to be

safe. You don't know what -- how safe it's going to be in there.

I was moved by the emotion and the, the pain and the concern I heard in Joe's voice, and I know that, that you being his brother -- or his sister -- were certainly moved by it. I don't know what more you need to hear, Julie. Come out. Bring the children to safety now. You're the one that's ultimately going to be responsible for yourself and for those children. Why wait until the situation may get worse? Come out now while you still can walk directly into full safety.

JULIE: How can I believe anything you say? Everything that's on the radio is lies, too.

MAX: I didn't say everything was. I said some -- As Steve and I were talking earlier, you have to put those things in perspective and you have to use good common sense and look around and, and hear different points of view and then make your own evaluation about it.

JULIE: You know, all they're doing is getting ready to, you know, getting the public ready to come and, and, and do away with us. They're telling us that -- saying that we're provoking you.

MAX: Do you trust your brother?

JULIE: I'm telling you what I heard on the radio, what I'm hearing on the radio all day.
