There follows a summary of Bureau efforts to trace funds possibly involved in financing captioned matter. W

TRACING OF MONEY RECOVERED IN CONNECTION WITH ARRESTS: At the time of subjects' arrests on 6/17/72, and subsequent search of their hotel rooms, 44 new \$100 bills were found, 10 of which bore the prefix "C" and 34 the prefix "F". The 10 prefix "C" bills were disbursed by the Philadelphia Federal Reserve Bank to the Girard Bank and Trust Company, Philadelphia on 4/3/72. It was not possible to trace these prefix bills beyond this point because of the bank's practice of not recording the serial numbers of \$100 bills received or disbursed.W

The prefix "F" bills were determined to have been sent by the Miami Federal Reserve Branch to the Republic National Bank, Miami, on 4/18/72. Subject Bernard L. Barker maintains an account at this bank and while he is known to have received \$10,000 in \$100 bills on 5/8/72, from this bank, it could not be specifically established that the pertinent prefix "F" bills were part of the money Barker received on 5/8/72.4

BANK ACCOUNT OF BERNARD L. BARKER: Subject Barker as Barker Associates, a real estate firm, maintains an account at the Republic National Bank of Miami. A review of the records of this account shows that on 4/21/72, Barker presented a cashier's check dated 4/10/72, payable to Kenneth Dablberg, drawn on the First Bank and Trust Company of Boca Raton, Florida. Upon checking with the latter bank and determining from it that the cashier's check was "as good as gold \$25,000 in cash by the Republic National Bank." the cashier's check was "as good as gold" Barker was given

Barker on 4/21/PEC-Wiso presented to the Republic National Bank four checks dated 4/4/72, totaling \$89,000, drawn on the Banco Internacional, Mexico City, payable -Manuel Ogarrio. Since these checks were payable to a third party, Barker was told be would have to deposit these will wike

KENNETH DARLBERG - \$25,000 CASHIER'S CHECK: Kenneth Dahlberg Is a prominent industrialist and Regional Chairman of the Finance Committee to Reclect the President, who lives in Minucapolis and winters in Boca Raton, Florida. After several refusals to be interviewed, Dahlberg on 7/6/72, consented to be interviewed regarding the foregoing \$25,000 cashier's check cashed by subject Barker. Dahlberg stated this check represented cash contributions he had obtained while in Boca Raton and he furnished this check to Maurice H. Stans, Chairman, Finance Committee to Reelect the President on 4/11/72, in Washington, D. C. According to Dahlberg he has no knowledge of what happened to this check after he surrendered it to Stans. Dahlberg stated he was not acquainted with subject Barker or any of the other subjects involved in this matter. It is to be noted that during the period 6/23/72 to 6/26/72, when we were endeavoring to interview Dahlberg concerning this check, he made three telephone calls to the Committee to Reelect the President, including one to the office of Robert Mardian, former Assistant Attorney General, now working with this committee. U

INTERVIEW WITH MAURICE STANS

Kenneth Dahlberg \$25,000 Check

Maurice Stans, Chairman, Finance Committee to Reclect the President, was interviewed 7/14/72, at which time he advised that the \$25,000 cashier's check was given to him by Kenneth Dahlberg in Washington, D. C., 4/11/72. Stans in turn gave this check to Hugh Walter Sloan, Jr., who at the time was responsible for the supervision of funds received by the Finance Committee. According to Stans, Sloan then gave this check to George Gordon Liddy who was acting as legal counsel to the Finance Committee for a determination as to how this check should be handled since it was dated 4/10/72, but the funds which it represented had been contributed prior to 4/7/72, the effective date of the new Federal Disclosure Act. Sloan subsequently advised Stans the money from the check had been received by the committee. Stans can furnish no explanation as to how Barker came to be in possession of Dahlberg's \$25,000 cashier's check.

It is noted George Gordon Liddy, former FBI Agent, has been identified as the individual who traveled with Everette Howard Hunt in January, 1972, in attempts to recruit former CIA employees for a special security force to prevent political espionage to the Republican Party. W

Banco Internacional Bank Drafts

Stans advised that on 4/6/72, he learned from Sloan that the Committee to Reelect the President had received \$100,000 in the form of bank drafts on Mexican banks. These checks, according to Stans, were part of a \$300,000 deposit to the committee's account. Stans, when informed the Mexican drafts totaled \$89,000 and such was shown on the committee's records, replied that Sloan had told him \$100,000 in Mexican bank drafts

had been received and this is all he knew about the matter. Stans could offer no explanation as to how these bank drafts came into Barker's possession nor was he aware of the identity of the American firm which allegedly made this contribution.

When Stans was requested to make Sloan available for immediate interview he advised that Sloan had resigned two weeks ago. The committee's attorney at this point stated he would make Sloan available as soon as he could be located. Sloan was subsequently contacted on 7/17/72, and he declined to be interviewed until he had a chance to discuss this matter with his attorney. U

It is noted that Bernard L. Barker at the time of his release on \$40,000 bond on 7/14/72, said he received the four checks totaling \$89,000 from two men and turned the money over to them. He took the 5th Amendment when asked to identify these individuals.

BANK ACCOUNTS OF JAMES WALTER McCORD: McCord maintains a personal checking account and a business account in the name of McCord Associates at the Maryland National Bank, College Park, Maryland. The records of these accounts show he made a \$10,000 cash deposit to his personal account on 4/12; a \$10,000 cash deposit business account on 5/31/72; and a \$10,000 cash deposit to his business account on 6/12/72. U

In addition, McCord on behalf of the Committee to Reelec the President on 2/22/72, opened an account in the name of Dedicat Friends of a Better America, with McCord as Chairman, at the National Savings and Trust Company, Washington, D. C. This account was closed 4/17/72, and during the period it was opened over \$90,000 passed through this account.



FRANK ANTHONY STURGIS was born FRANK ANGELO FIGHTNI at Norfolk, Virginia, on Pecember 9, 1924. His father was ANGELO FIGRINI and his mother was MAKY FIGRINI, who later divorced ANGELO and became MARY STURGIS. Subject was raised in the Norfolk, Virginia, and Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, areas and attended Holy Rosary Elementery School in Pennsylvania (1931-1938); St. Mary's Academy, location unknown (1938-1940); Blair Junior High School, Norfolk, Virginia (1941); a high school in Germantown, Pennsylvania (1942). At various times, the subject has indicated having attended two and one-half or three years of college but this fact has not been verified.

STURGIS was a member of the United States Marine Corps (October 5, 1942 to October 23, 1945). He received an honorable discharge and held serial number 479341. He was a member of the United States Naval Reserve, inactive status (November 9, 1947 through August 30, 1948). He received an honorable discharge and held serial number 2536028. He was a member of the United States Army (August 31, 1948 through May 26, 1949), received an honorable discharge, and held serial number 13291561.

On September 23, 1952, FRANK ANGELD FIORINI legally changed his name to FRANK ANTHONY STURGIS, at Norfolk, Virginia.

While a resident of Norfolk, Virginia, STURGIS held employments as a tavern manager, Top Hat Night Club and Commercial Grille; insurance salesman, cab driver, clerk; and Norfolk city patrolman, from June 5, 1946, to September 7, 1946.

STURGIS has used the name FRANK ANGELO FLORINI since his entry into Cuban revolutionary activity in 1958. At that time, he joined Cuban rebels led by FIDEL CASTRO against the Cuban government of President FULGENCIO BATISTA.

Following the advent of CASTRO to power in January, 1959, subject became a captain in the Cuban Air Force, serving as a liaison officer between the Cuban and American Air Forces. He was also appointed Inspector of Gambling in Havana, Cuba, by CASTRO. In this capacity, he became acquainted with the leading gamblers in Cuba, including various American gamblers and hoodlums.

He was closely associated in 1959 with Major PEDRO DIAZ LANZ, then head of the Cuban Air Force, and as of June, 1959, he departed Cuba when Major LANZ became the first high official of the CASTRO regime to defect.

On March 31, 1959, the subject appeared voluntarily at the headquarters of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) in Washington, D. C., and advised that he wished to alert the Bureau to the communist learnings of FIDEL CASTRO. He also wished to volunteer his services to the Bureau as a source of information on Cuban matters and on efforts of Cuban revolutionaries to foment revolutions in other Latin American nations.

STURGIS gained notoriety when, on October 21, 1959, he co-piloted with Major LANZ a B-25 owned by him from the

United States to Cuba, where several thousand anti-CASTRO leaflets were dropped on the city of Havana. As a result of this incident, the Federal Aviation Agency, on May 26, 1960, revoked the subject's pilot certificate.

On April 26, 1960, United States Immigration and Naturalization Service handed down a decision expatriating STURGIS from the United States. He was held to have voluntarily expatriated himself through service in the armed forces of Cube subsequent to January 1, 1959.

Prior to this decision, subject stated to an Agent of the FBI on April 5, 1960, that a congressional investigation headed by Senator WAYNE MORSE was under way to clarify the facts involving deportation proceedings then pending against him by Immigration and Naturalization Service. He claimed that he had discussed his case with Senator GEORGE SMATHERS, who, according to STURGIS, inquired of Secretary of State CHRISTIAN HERTER concerning issuance by HERTER of a certificate of loss of citizenship. Subject claimed that HERTER had told SMATHERS that the certificate was inadvertently and mistakenly issued due to the large volume of documents which passed over HERTER's desk daily. The subject stated he felt that the interest shown by Senators SMATHERS and MORSE would quash any adverse action in his case.

On March 18, 1961, the Late Home Edition of the "Norfolk Ledger-Dispatch," the "Portsmouth Star," Norfolk, Portsmouth, South Norfolk, Virginia, contained an article which disclosed that the subject's citizenship had been restored based on an appeal to Washington, D.C., and the Immigration Board of Appeals there.

In 1961, the subject formed an organization called the International Anti-Communist Brigade (IACB), which was described as an anti-communist organization opposed to the CASTRO regime in Cuba and organized to fight communism in any area of the world.

On May 14, 1961, the "Miami Herald," a daily newspaper published at Miami, Florida, contained the Sunday supplement, "Parade Magazine," which carried a cover photograph of the subject and an article high-lighting his anti-CASTRO activities, written by syndicated columnist JACK ANDERSON. Here Fiorini reveals the inside story of the April landing, and what preceded them— and tells why he and his companious will be victorious, in spite of the ups and

snown knowns, the fight for Cuban freedom is continuing. My componers on that embattled island possess the indomitable will of men who know that one setback or one victory does not decide the cause of liberty. It is this fiery spirit that has enabled them to strike back, again and again, against the Castro tyranny.

Today it is popular to consider the April landings an attempted large-scale invasion which Castro crushed. In troth, they were only a small raid, not a landing in force, as Castro would have the world now believe.

Now I am free to reveal, for the first time, the truth of how the recent historic landings were plotted, and how, on April 17, they finally were carried out.

For a long time, we had been working in stealth to establish our underground. We came and went under cover of the dark. Sometimes we slipped through the Sugar-Cane Curtain by boat, playing a deadly game of hide-and-seek with Castro's gunboats among the offshore atolls and coral reefs. Sometimes we swooped over the treetops by plane and looked down upon Castro's bright orange patrol cars. We kept secret trysts with underground leaders, dumped supplies from the air into guerrilla hideouts. We returned to Florida for more arms.

Using a secret code taken from the Bible, we kept in daily radio contact with shopkeepers, students, workers, peosents, even militiamen. At night they blew up bridges, sabotaged factories, attacked small outposts.

Many of us once fought for Castro and the democracy he promised. Now we fight against him who turned our dream of democracy into a Communist nightmare.

A Fight for Freedom

Because I am an American, some call me a soldier of fortune. But my fight is for freedom. In my own way, I am fighting for my country, which cannot tolerate a Communist colony upon its back doorstep.

From the first our fight against Castro was complicated by his own revolutionary experience. He recognized the strategic importance of the mountains, which he used as a base to batter Batista. Whereas Butista's troops stuck to the roads, Castro's militainen swarmed over the mountains.

He also knew that a successful result must have the support of the people. To hold the loyalty of the competition, the dirty-necks who in that the country-side, Castro put shirts on their backs and food in their bellies.

Of no small help to Castro has been our own disunity. The Cuban excles have been divided into a hundred

movimientos preoccupied with their own rivalries. For over two years, they dissipated their funds and energies in internge inte quartels. Most have been mere debating societies whose members talked and dreamed hig but have hitter support inside Cuba. I finally became fed up with all of them and formed my own International Brigade, training in the Florida Everglades.

In helping to set up an anti Cestro force fishle Cuba, I collabor and with Victor I managed Panyue, the legendery "Prago" who directed the Havana (inderground for Cast.—Directs a short, enough directed who wears a cigar in his ratif as a parameter article of thess. He

fears nothing.

One of our most important moves in preparing for

the Abril landings was to open a guerrilla pocket inside Las Villas Province where Diogo had been raised. He prepared to activate his underground in Cuba, and I alerted my International Brigade. But first, we had to scout the scene in Las Villas.

Shortly before Christmas, we arranged to meet the underground chiefs at a secret spot on Cuba's northern coast. We communicated by radio, using the Bible code. We headed for a tiny atoll in the Bahamas.

Diago had carbed arms on the atoll with all the secrecy of the notorious pirate Captain Kidd, who, according to legend, used these same atolls for berying his treasure. We loaded a 45-foot cabin cruiser with arms, mounted a 20 mm cannon in the stern and plowed across the Caribbe in.

After dark we anchored in a cove off the north coast of Las Villas. The silence was con plete. Not a light, not a sound from shore: only the gentle, soothing lapping of the water against the cruiser's bull. But in Castro's Cuba by night, you never knew when machine guns would start to chatter and tracers cut their strange patterns like fireflies about your cars.

Short of Ammunition

We waited teasely. Then from the shore came the wink of a flashight. We returned the signal. After another wait, there was a faint drip drip of muffled oars.

As a rowbout with four men abourd pulled alongside, Diago and I cooked our Tommy guns. But our visitors speke the right pussword. Two were commanders in Castro's militar, the others were civilians. All were members of Dugo's underground.

We hid on an atoll for a few days while we transferred our lethal cargo to the mainland and received reports of what was happening in Cuba. The patriotic leaders who visited us, always by rowboat after dark, told of growing anger against Castro. His alliance with communism had disillusioned most thinking men. But even the masses were muttering over the hardships he produced by purchasing Communist arms instead of food and parting guns before butter.

The underground chiefs revealed a chink in Castro's armorthis militia bristled with weapons that were short of amountaion. By rationing anomalition, Castro to with lingly showed how little he trusted his own ment. Apparently he took no chances that they would defect and turn

their arms against him.

- This scarcity of ammunition was discovered by Diago's men. These daredevils would creep up behind Castro militiamen, prod them with daggers and order them to drop their guns and ammunition belts. It they would agree to walk straight ahead without looking back, their lives would be spared.

Diago's contacts also supplied us with a list of chevitos, Castro informers, in Las Villas. But our plan to open a new guerrilla front received an unexpected sethack. The Democratic Revolutionary Front launched a guerrilla attack in the very area we had chosen. Castru poured in his militia in tremendous numbers. Of 200 guerrillas,

only 40 escaped.

Dismayed, we abandoned our plan and pulled back to the Bahamas. We tried to deliver another boatload of weapons, but before our cabin cruiser could make contact, it was caught in the headlight of a jeep patrolling the coastal road. Then a Cuban frigate, apparently summoned by radio, bore down on us. We managed to give it the slip, however, by racing to the offshore atolls, where the water was too shallow and snagged with coral reefs for the bigger ship to follow.

Meanwhile, Costro's agents in Miami suspected what we were up to. They had orders upon our return never to let us out if their sight. But we turned the tables on them and began spying on them. I intercepted a telepain to one Castro agent, Rudy Fancitty, who was registered at Miami Beach's Surrey Hotel. The wire, obviously in code, was addressed to "I work nant" l'ancitty and was sign. I by Celio Samber. I remember Celio well from my service with Castro in the Sierra Maestro. She was probably closer to I idel than any other person.

Back at our base in the Bahamas, we rented a twin-engined plane, which we loaded with weapons and fitted with Cuban markings. We hoped these might discourage the militia from taking put shots at us as we flew low over Cuba.

It was 0:30 a.m. when we zoomed across the beach at tree-top level. The sun was up, and people were stirring. We spotted several bright orange patrol cars with cream-colored tops. Militianen waved at us; our masquerade was succeeding.

Back to the Boat

Diago assured me that we could land on the roadway near the rendezvous spot. But the roads were either too short, too curved or too narrow to set the plane down. We circled the area for 35 anxious minutes, then decided to dump the arms Fortunately we had prepared for this emergency. The weapens were wrapped in blankets of foam rubber to prevent damage.

The weapons were picked up and

safely hidden. On successive days, we made two more attempts to land. We circled in vain over sugar-cane fields and green hills. Each time we were forced to drop our supplies.

The best way to get ashore, we decided, was by boat. This time we pointed our cabia cruiser toward Oriente Province where I had once fought alongside Castro in the mountains. As we charmed across the sea, we amused ourselves by listening to Castro rage over Radio Havana about our flights. Castro screamed about "invasion planes," naming the areas over which we had flown. The phony markings, which had confused the militiamen, didn't fool him.

A United Front

For several days we tried to land on the Cuban shore, but Castro's gunboat patrels proved too vigilant and we had to give up the effort. Meanwhile, however, another group of men went ashore in Pinar Del Rio Province. Among them was Angus McNair, a fellow American. But five of the group, including McNair, somehow got separated from the others and were picked up by Castro's militia. Now McNair, a dedicated fighter for freedom, has been shot by Castro without trial. So have other valiant friends of our cause.

But McNair and the others did not die in vain. And it is important to remember that, whatever our situation now, Castro himself did not win his triumph for three long years. Despite all the ups and downs, victories and defeats, those of us who believe in Cubau freedom are in the battle to the end.

CONTING

FRANK ANTHONY STURGIS

In September, 1961, Dr. ORLANDO BOSCH, the leader of the Revolutionary Movement for Insurrectional Recovery (MIRR), stated to Special Agents of the FBI that he had permitted the subject to go on a raid sponsored by the MIRR against CASTRO forces in February, 1961. BOSCH stated that this raiding party had traveled by boat but had failed to rendezvous with other elements of the group and had never actually landed in Cuba. He stated that he was dissatisfied with the subject's performance, when he described as a soldier of fortune and publicity seeker.

The subject, by his own announcement, has participated in plans for several anti-CASTRO revolutionary adventures over the years.

In April, 1967, it was learned that the subject was involved with other individuals in a plan to blow up a Cubm ship in a Marican seaport, possibly Veracruz.

On April 21, 1967, RONALD EDWARD THOMPSON, born July 1, 1944, at Norfolk, Virginia, was interviewed by Agents of the PBI at Miami, Florida. He stated that he was the son of FRANK Florini and that his mother had died while FlORINE was overseas during World War II and that FIORINI had never assumed responsibility for him. He stated that he had contacted the subject as a result of his reading an article in "Parade Magazine" concerning the subject's Cuban revolutionary activities. THOMPSON related that he, the subject, and DONALD FRANCIS'ROCHE had, in fact, traveled to Mexico In the beginning of April, 1967, in the subject's 1958 Cadillac automobile. THOMPSON stated that prior to this trip, the subject was in close contact with Dr. ORLANDO BOSCH and other members of the MIRR. THOMPSON claimed to be present when explosives and detonators were hidden in the body of the subject's car at a Miami garage. He stated that Dr. BOSCH and other Cuban associates were present. THCMPSON stated that these explosives were to be placed on a ship at Tampico or Veracruz, Mexico. He stated that this sabotage was intended to be an anti-CASTRO action supported by the THOMPSON stated that circumstances prevented execution of this sabotage and that the explosives and related equipment were subsequently buried at a location in Mexico, which he described in detail.

When interviewed on May 1, 1967, the subject claimed his trip to Mexico in April, 1967, together with ROCHE and THOMPSON, was in the nature of a vacation trip. He denied that he carried any explosives to Mexico and denied the participation of Dr. ORLANDO BOSCH and himself in any scheme to blow up a ship in Mexico.

On September 25, 1967, the "Miami News," a Miami, Florida daily newspaper, contained an article captioned "Exile Ranson Try Seeks Swiss Aid." This article indicated that the subject's organization, IACB, was endeavoring to arrange ransom of five hundred Cuban political prisoners in exchange for five million dollars worth of medicine and foodstuffs. GERALDING SHAMMA, an American citizen and officer of IACB, previously imprisoned in Cuba, joined the subject in attempting to carry out the ransom plan.

During the summer of 1968, information was received from various persons in the Miami and Fort Lauderdale, Florida areas that the subject was attempting to organize a mercenary force to fight in Cuba. Volunteers for this force were solicited through advertisements placed in newspapers asking for "soldiers of fortune." Several persons answering these advertisements were interviewed and advised that they had been offered varying amounts of money to become the nucleus of a cadre to command an armed band for assaults against the CASTRO regime in Cuba. The organization was organized under the auspices of the IACB and volunteers were told that the overall operation was to be directed by a Colonel QUESADA.

According to the subject, the sum of fifteen million dollars had been placed in a Swiss bank for the pu pose of ransoming political prisoners in Cuba. These efforts had failed and the funds were to be diverted for military action which hopefully would be against prisoner stockades in Cuba.

All participants were interviewed at Miami upon their release from custody; most admitted knowledge of participating in a military operation against Cuba. Each claimed to be a member of a Florida-based anti-CASTRO organization known as "The Secret Army Organization," led by the subject. The subject indicated that Colonel FRANCISCO QUESADA and at least 25 other Cuban exiles participating in the plan were to rendezvous with the "Amigo" but that the rendezvous had failed when the boat ran aground through incompetence of the crewmen.

As recently as September, 1970, Miami-based sources having knowledge of activities of individuals and organizations engaged in anti-CASTRO activities could furnish no information concerning the subject's activities.

No specific alliance between syndicated columnist JACK ANDERSON and the subject is known, other than the fact that a few years ago, ANDERSON and the subject collaborated on a Sunday newspaper supplement magazine article. The subject is considered one of ANDERSON's Cuban sources of information. It has been alleged that ANDERSON or one of ANDERSON's aides gained access to the Washington, D. C. jail and interviewed the subject or one of his associates.

The subject had been involved in revolutionary activities of one sort or another since January, 1959. The subject has maintained continuous contact with all active Cuban groups in the Miami area and continues to claim that he represents a group of American patriots who wish to fight communism in Cuba and Latin America. The subject is considered by most Cuban exile groups as an opportunist, mercenary, adventurer, and government informant. A few groups feel that the subject is a partaine CIA operator. Others consider the subject a busybody and meddler. The subject is considered unreliable, dishonest, an opportunist, and motivated by profit and personal gain, rather than by any political ideology or personal morality.

The subject has the reputation of being a professional mercenary who would do anything for money and is regarded as a scoundrel.

It was reported that the subject had defrauded the CASTRO government out of large sums of money in 1959, which were intended for the purchase of aircraft and other equipment for the regime. During that time, the subject held a position with the Revolutionary Air Force (FAR) of Cuba. Miami-based anti-CASTRO Cuban groups are generally distrustful of the subject as many now know him by reputation to be an unsavory person who would do anything for money.

In the carly 1910s, Stargis organized the International Anti-Communist Brigade, which, at one point in 1963, he claimed had 5,000 members of which 700 were actively training to combat communism "wherever it exists."

His most recent revolutionary escapade of note came in 1968 when a dozen others were selved by British Honduras authorities and held for 11 days.

THE SEIZURE, Sturgis claimed, thwarted what was to have been a commando attack on Cuba.

One long-time acquaintance of Sturgis calls him "a nice person, a fine person but he never got over being up in the hills fighting in Cuba... that's what he wants to keep doing."

Others aren't so charitable, including one Cuban exile active in the local revolutionary movement who says that Sturgis "is distrusted by serious revolution-

ary groups."

For the past 18 months or so, Sturgis, in between whatever else he is involved in, has worked as a commission salesman for the Pan American Aleminum Corp.

William J. Keefe, in charge of the company's Miami sales, said that Fiorini had been in Friday morning, June 16, "and we went over some orders that he had taken."

Keele declined to discuss Sturgis personally but said that he was not "one of our better salesman."

HE COULD NOT, on what he sold for Pan American, make a decent living, said Keefe.

As a commission salesman, Sturgis could do as much or as little as he liked and his time was his own.

When he registered as a Democrat in 1960, after his citizenship was restored, he pave his address as 2015 NW 122nd Ave. in Miami, and Sturgis at d his family continue to live there, in the slightly run-down white house with its unkept yard at the edge of the Westview Golf Course and Country Club.

A trendye girl who answered when a reporter knocked on the door last week, acknowledged that it was the home of Frank Storgis "but we don't know anything about it . . . you'll have to talk to my morier."



On June 24, 1972, Supervisor CHARLES NEZUM, Accounting and Fraud Section, FBI Headquarters, advised that Bureau authority was granted to interview KENNETH H. DAHLBERG in the presence of his attorney. W

The Bureau has instructed that this matter be given immediate and expeditious attention and that all leads be given by telephone followed by teletype. In the event the Bureau is telephonically contacted, this case is being handled by Section Chief BOWLES, Accounting and Fraud Section. W

Minneapolis file 161-572 captioned KENNETH H. DAHLBERG, Special Inquiry, was reviewed and all information contained therein was laudatory except as follows: w

ROBERT S. HASSFLS TROM, Chief, Crystal, Minnesota, Police Department, furnished the following information: 4

HASSELSTROM has been with Crystal Police Department since 1951 and acquainted with DAHLBERG since about that time. After review of his records, he recalled his arrest of DAHLBERG on the evening of August 14, 1953, when DAHLBERG was charged with careless driving and driving without license in possession. At that time he, HASSELSTROM, was a patrolman. According to HASSELSTROM, this arrest was following a serious automobile accident, Highway 100 and 34th Avenue North, Crystal, Minnesota, involving four teen-age boys who were occupants of small stationwagon which was struck from the read by DAHLBERG. As a result, four teen-agers subsequently died. W

HASSELSTROM said several persons approached him at the scene of the accident stating DAHLBERG "was traveling at high rate of speed" and "driving in careless manner." HASSELSTROM recalls after observing DAHLBERG, he was convinced DAHLBERG was under influence of alcohol at the time of the accident. DAHLBERG agreed to blood tests to determine alcohol content; however, subsequently refused to participate in test for alcohol content. DAHLBERG issued ticket at the scene of the accident for careless driving and driving without license in possession. According to HASSELSTROM, there was considerable ill feeling in the area because of the circumstances surrounding the accident, and therefore, he and other police officers insisted Hennepin.

County prosecuting attorney charge DAHLBERG with criminal negligence in connection with the death of four young men and present the matter to the grand jury. Case presented to the grand jury, Hennepin County, and "no bill" returned. HASSELSTROM said he was never satisfied with the results in this matter because he, even though on the scene of the accident almost immediately, was not called as a witness. HASSELSTROM described investigation of this accident and resulting disposition as one of the most frustrating events of career, as accident the most serious he had observed to take place and he still feels DANG BROOM was at fault in causing the deaths of the four men for which he was never held accountable. HASSHISTROM reviewed records and determined DANLENG on September 11, 1953, appeared before the justice of the peace court, entered guilty plea to charges of careless driving and no driver's license in possession, for which fines were maximum \$100 first charge and maximum \$10 on the second charge. Fines were paid the same date. U

Detective BURTON C. HOLMES / Detective Division, Crystal, Minnesota, Police Department, advised he was both Justice of the Peace and a member of the Crystal, Minnesota, Fire Department, August 14, 1953, when the above-mentioned accident occurred in that city. He said he was one of the first witnesses on the scene and furnished substantially the same information as HASSUASTROM. He said he was listed as a witness for grand jury regarding accident; however, never called, and was told "We now have all the witnesses necessary." HOIMES said two individuals whom he cannot identify contacted him just prior to September 11, 1953, as representatives for Mr. DAHLBERG regarding the careless driving charge and driving without a license in his possession, which was scheduled for his court. He said they attempted to influence him to drop these charges; however, he refused to do so and suggested a change of venue. HOLMES said DAHLBERG subsequently pled guilty as reflected above. HOLMES concluded by stating he has felt very strongly about this case and although he felt helpless at the time, he personally felt DAMLBERG "took the lives of four fine young men because he was drinking and driving and will never have to answer to this act." u

Records of the Hennepin County, Minnesota, County Attorney's Office reflect Hennepin County Grand Jury return don September 3, 1953, a "no bill" in regard to indiciment of criminal negligence on August 14, 1953, in connection with the above mentioned accident. W

Records, State Highway Department, St. Paul, Minnesota, as reviewed by LORETTA HOUSE, reflect no information located regarding KENNETH H. DAHLBERG. It is noted no accident records are maintained, State of Minnesota, over five years. u

Pertinent information in this report has previously been furnished to the Bureau by telephone followed by teletype.u

Efforts to trace telephone calls made by DAHLBERG to the Minneapolis Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation were negative. Efforts to determine Northwestern flight prior to receiving DAHLBERG's call from Washington, D. C. were negative. w

MORTON BARROWS JACKBON, 9300 Beverly Crest Drive, was interviewed at his law office, 1901 Avenue of the Stars. He was advised of the official identities of Special Agents JOHN M. O'NEILL, JR., RICHARD H. PASHLEY, JOHNIE T. JOYCE, and RONALD D. ANDERSON. He was advised that four Agents were present because it had been anticipated that two separate interviews would be conducted simultaneously and separately with himself and his secretary, ESTHER KIRBY. on one occasion, HUNT wanted his advice regarding the technical aspects of the financing of a construction job in Central America involving one of HUNT's clients.

Several months ago, HUNT was in Los Angeles and he introduced Mr. JACKSON to GORBON LIDDY who was accompanying HUNT. He believes that LIDDY is an attorney employed by the Finance Committee to Re Elect the President. He does not know whether HUNT and LIDDY were in Los Angeles at the time of this meeting, but presumes that they were not in Los Angeles for social purposes. His meeting with HUNT and LIDDY was social in nature and not related to business or involving an attorney client relationship at that time. He was unable to recall the approximate date of this meeting.

Since June 17, 1972, he has been contacted by HUNT who has asked that Mr. JACKSON act as his attorney. He was advised that the telephone toll records of HUNT's business telephone actually had been obtained by subpoena and it was noted that the home telephone number of the mother of Mr. JACKSON's secretary, Mrs. ESTHER KIRBY, had been called from HUNT's business telephone. Mr. JACKSON explained that when he is out of town, people attempting to contact him are very often directed to his secretary, Mrs. KIRBY, and some of his regular clients may even have her home telephone number. He purposely avoids allowing his name to appear on letterheads of fund raising groups because he does not feel that it would be helpful in relation to his radio program which is aired Sunday nights on Los Angeles radio station, KMPC.

He advised that he is not personally connected in any way with the burglary of the National Democratic Headquarters in Washington, D. C., and he had no knowledge of the burglary until the fact of the burglary was disclosed by the news media.

He was asked whether he was acquainted with MORTON JACKSON and he advised that he had only met Mr. JACKSON and several other members of the Jackson law firm because his wife had been employed by the firm until about March of 1972. He has met some of the attorneys in that firm at parties, but has not otherwise had contact with them.

He was advised that the telephone toll records of the business telephone of EVERETT HOWARD HUNT had been subpoensed and one call had been made on March 20, 1972 to telephone number 573 4570, which was listed to him at his previous address in Inglewood, California. He explained that during the time that that call was made to his former residence, MARY was living with him. He and his wife, MARY NEITA WIGGENS HARRELL LENBURG, have been married since April of 1972. MARY Decembers, once Mary Wiggens, also known as Mary Harrell, 10:34 Holman, Apartment Three, was advised of the official identities of Special Agents JOHN M. O'NELLE, JR. and RICHARD H. PASHLEY. She was advised that she was being interviewed in connection with an investigation into the burglary of the National Democratic Headquarters in Washington, D. C., which took place on June 17, 1972.

She was asked whether she was acquainted with EVERETT HOWARD HUNT and GORDON LIDDY. She advised that she was, and that she knew the men by those names, although some people called HUNT, "HOWIE". lacksquare

She first met HUNT on September 3, 1971, when he was visiting MORTON JACKSON at Mr. JACKSON's law offices where she was employed as receptionist. She does not actually recall the meeting, but has since been told that it was on that date by Mr. HUNT. Mr. LIDDY was with Mr. HUNT on this occasion. W

Her next contact with him occurred when he was in Los Angeles in January 1972. Mr. JACKSON arranged for Mr. HUNT to take her to dinner. On January 9, 1972, they had dinner at a French restaurant called Chasen's, in Beverly Hills. The following evening, she and HUNT had dinner with GORDON LIDDY, and SHERRYASTEPHENS, a friend of hers who she asked to accorpany Mr. LADDY. SHERRY resides at 8/25 Blackburn, Apartment Number One, Los Angeles, During dinner, LIDDY and Miss STEPHENS were discussing how strong the human mind is, and what it is capable of doing. To demonstrate the power of his mind, LIDDY had SHERRY hold a lighted match under the palm of his hand. He held his hand over the match until his hand was badly burned. He showed his burned palm to her and to SHERRY, then wrapped it in a cloth napkin. During this exercise, LIDDY did not show any sign of pain. Based on his conduct generally, she considered him "quite intense and a little weird". She recalls that LIDDY had been or was going to go to San Diego

at HUMT's direction to check out the facilities for the Republican Convention which was planned to be held in San Diego.

recalls that this visit to Los Angeles had something to do with business with Hughes Tool Company and with TONY JACKSON, the name commonly used by MORTON JACKSON. HUNT indicated that he had to go out to the Hughes Tool Company regarding the trouble with CLIFFORD IRVING. During this visit, HUNT and LIDDY stayed in a suite at the Beverly Wilshire Hotel, Los Angeles. HUNT told her that he was a Republican, working with and for the President. He said that his trip to California was regarding the Republican Convention scheduled to be held in San Diego. w

Some time prior to February 4, 1972, she received a telephone call from HUNT in which he told her that he was planning to be in Los Angeles on February 4, 1972. She told him that she would not be able to see him at that time. On February 4, 1972, she called him and told him that she was engaged to BHRMARD DEMBURG. He accepted this news well and gave her his best wishes. On February 18, 1972, he and LTDD7 were again in Los Angeles. LIDDY came by the law office and brought her a bottle of champagne, which he was delivering for HUNT. On February 21, 1972, HUNT came by her apartment in Inglewood, and they had a short visit and drank the bottle of champagne.

After BERNARD DENEUEG had asked her to marry him, she requested that she be given three weeks off from work following her wedding. She believed that this was a reasonable request since she had been with the firm for two and one half years. She was told that she could not have three weeks off, and she then indicated that she would have to quit. After thinking over what she had said over the weekend, she advised the firm that she would like to remain with the firm. She was told that her services were no longer needed, and she knows that this decision was made by Mr. JACKSON since he made such decisions. She was somewhat surprised that HUNT did not attempt to persuade JACKSON to retain her. She left the firm on February 18, 1972.

Following her announcement to HUNT of her engagement, and after she had left the firm, she and HUNT did talk several times on the telephone, but did not meet again. Prior to the wedding, she borrowed \$200 from HUNT to pay bills she owed, and has not repaid this money to date. Several of HUNT's calls to her during this time were from Florida.

as Mr. Jackson's secretary, Mrs. KIRBY has stayed at the JACKSON home in Beverly Hills on two occasions when the JACKSON's have been traveling. She did this about two years ago at Mr. JACKSON's request, and on that occasion, her husband stayed at the JACKSON home with her. Recently, while Mr. and Mrs. JACKSON and Mrs. JACKSON's daughter were traveling, Mrs. KIRBY again stayed at the home at his request, but her husband did not stay with her this time. Mrs. KIRBY has never explained why Mr. JACKSON has her do this, but has indicated that she can not refuse to do this for him.

Mr. JACKSON and Mrs. JACKSON, who have been married eight to ten years, were introduced to each other by HUNT or a friend of HUNT's when Mr. JACKSON was in Venezuela. She was previously married to a man named DEHARRARA (phonetic), who is deceased, and was also married to a man named COOK who was a wealthy sugar man in Hawaii. Their present housekeeper was brought to the United States by Mrs. JACKSON from Venezuela. Mrs. JACKSON, whose name is NANCY, speaks fluent Spanish, and the housekeeper speaks little or no English.

She describes him as the most conservative man she has ever known. He practices Yoga, maintains a strict diet, usually eating lunch in his office. He is an extreme perfectionist, and imposes many rules and restrictions on everyone connected with his office. He rarely smiles, and seems to lack common human qualities. JACKSON makes calls all over the world. Beginning in January, he was in telephonic contact with HUNT several times a week, and sometimes several times a day. This to

she knows because one of her jobs was to note the party called, and the client to be billed for each call. He billed his calls to HUNT to SUSQUEHANNA versus a name she cannot recall, and sometimes to himself: He had additional telephonic contact with HUNT on his private unlisted telephone according to ESTHER. During some of his conversations with HUNT, he would have ESTHER leave the room. ESTHER has indicated that Mr. JACKSON and HUNT are engaged in some kind of government work. ESTHER once told her to forget that she had ever heard the name SUSQUEHANNA, because it was a code used by JACKSON and HUNT. ESTHER told her to never mention SUSQUEHANNA, especially to Mr. HODGES, the head of the law firm down the hall from the JACKSON firm, who used to be Mr. JACKSON's partner, because he had had something to do with SUSQUEHANNA. Mr. JACKSON would call HUNT at 202-293-2746, and two other numbers, one of which she believes may have been the White House. Mr. JACKSON has always been very secretive about his contacts with HUNT, and his many calls around the world.

Mrs. JACKSON travels around the world a great deal, often to India to meditate with a religious leader.

SHERRY STEPHENS, 8425 Blackburn, Los Angeles, was interviewed in a park near her place of employment, 118 S. Beverly Dr She was advised of the official identities of Special Agents JOHN M. O'NEILL, JR., and RICHARD H. PASHLEY, and that she was being interviewed in connection with an investigation into the burglary of the National Democratic Headquarters, Washington, D. C., which occurred on June 17, 1972.4

She advised that she met HOWARD HUNT and GORDON LIDDY through MARY DEMBURG, who she has known for several years. At the time MARY was not married, and explained that one of the attorneyes in the law firm where she was working had introduced her to HUNT, and she asked SHERRY to go to dinner with them and a friend of HUNT's, LIDDY. During dinner at a French restaurant in Beverly Hills, she determined from talking with GORDON LIDDY, that he was married. He explained to her that his wife was an alcoholic and abused him. She and GORDON got into a discussion about the strength of the human mind, and he told her that he could demonstrate the strength of his mind. He had her light a match and hold it under the palm of one of his hand. She did so, and held the match until it was almost burning her fingers. She saw the palm of his hand after this demonstration, and it was very seriously burned. She also smelled burning flesh during the demonstration, and noted that GORDON did not show any sign of pain.

LIDDY told her that he was a "defense or criminal attorney", and that he lived outside of Washington, D. C. He said that he had advised the President, and had recently been in San Diego trying to find space for the Secret Service Agents for the protection of President NIXON during the Republican Convention scheduled for San Diego. He never explained exactly what his job entailed.

He said that he was born in Germany, and remembered the war, but he did not speak with any accent. He wrote something in German on her checkbook later in the evening, when she told him that she hoped to travel to Europe. He told her that he had traveled to Europe in the recent past. Her first and lasting impression of LIDDY was that he would have made a good Nazi. She considered him to be very intense, and very strange. W

Sometime between this meeting with LTDDY in January 1972 and mid March 1972, she received a call from LIEDY who told her that he and HUNT were back in Los Angeles again, staying at the Beverly Wilshire Hotel. His call was "like on Thursday", asking her to have lunch with him sometime while he was in town, and on Saturday morning she called him at the hotel and told him she could not make it to lunch, giving the excuse that she had been involved in an accident. She had not been involved in an accident, but was involved in one shortly after that. During this time, MARY DENBURG was encouraging her to go out with LIDDY, and MARY indicated that another woman was asking her to ask SHERRY to go out with LIDDY. The reason behind this was never clear to SHERRY.
