KRISTIM FORSURES, personal secretary and advance agent for Mrs. JCHI N. MITCHTEL, was interviewed at the Cormittee to Re-Dicet the President, 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D. C., in the presence of H. DOWALD KISTLER, Attorney, 1828 L Street, N.W. She provided the following information:

She resides at 2100 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., telephone number 234-9369, when she is not traveling with life. INTOINELL. It was in this capacity she first met ALFRED BALDWIN, III, on the afternoon of May 2, 1972, in the company of JAMES WALTER McCORD, JR. They met in one of the offices at the Committee just before leaving with Mrs. MITCHELL on a train trip to the midwest.

That evening while on the train, she stopped at BACDWIN's compartment to chat over a drink. He told her he was a former Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Agent, had a law degree and taught a course to policemen in New Mayon, Connecticut prior to taking the job as body guard for Mrs. MITCHGLL

When asked how he acquired his present job, he replied he had left his name with the Society of Ex-FBI Agents in New York City as being available for a security type job on all wit notice. As it happened, he was hired and came to Washington, D. C. to work for Mrs. MITCHELL with only 24 hours notice.

She had hardly any other contact with PALDWIN during the rest of the trip, and he was alone with Mrs. MITCHELL on the return from Michigan to New York City. On that leg of the journey her train hit a man and killed him, which deeply concerned

BALDWIN. She learned of the accident and BALDWIN's extreme concern from Mrs. MITCHELL in New York City after they arrived. Mrs. MITCHELL mentioned that BALDWIN kept bringing up the subject of the accident repeatedly en route to New York City.

While in New York, BALDWIN accompanied Mrs. MITCHELL to several parties and carried her jewelry in his pocket. She (FORSDERS) joined Mrs. MITCHELL and BALDWIN at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel. BALDWIN accompanied Mrs. MITCHELL to a luncheon at the Waldorf, a press conference and the return trip to Washington, D. C. Immediately after they returned to Washington, D. C., Mrs. MITCHELL told her she considered BALDWIN pushy, vocal and someone who would not stay in the background, especially while in New York City. She explained her dislike for BALDWIN and stated "That's it, I'm not taking any more recommendations from McCORD".

She saw BALDWIN again on May 12, 1972, when he came to her office and personally submitted a handwritten expense voucher. A week or two later he called her to inquire about the voucher and said he was infiltrating hippy groups, but he would very much like to get his job back with Mrs. MITCHELL.

The last time she saw BALDWIN was on the afternoon of June 2, 1972, at the bookstore in the Watergate Complex. She saw him entering the store wearing a yellow shirt and shorts while she was in the store with MARTY MITCHULL. She asked BALDWIN what he was doing and he replied, "Oh, nothing" and walked away.

A group of color photographs of white males, including those of EVERETTE HOWARD HUNT, CHARLES W. COLSON, and DAVID REGINALD YOUNG was exhibited to her and she failed to recognize any of the individuals depicted in these photographs.

A second group of black and white photographs of white males, including those of the subjects, JAMES WALTER McGOSD, JR., BERNARD L. DARKER, VIRGILIO R. GONZALES, EUGENIO R. MARTINEZ and FRANK A. STURGIS along with GEORGE GORDON LIDDY and AFFROD EALDWIN, III, were exhibited to her. She recognized



only the photographs of McCCRD, LIDDY and BALDWIN as employees of the Committee to Re-Elect the President and Mrs. MITCHELL's bodyguard respectively.

She was unable to provide any information relating to the burglary of the Democratic National Committee.

Miss DEVLIN was shown photographs of the following persons and asked if she had ever seen any of them on the premises:

ALFRED C. BALDWIN, HOMARD HUNT, DAVID COLSON, DAVID YOUNG, ALEX BUTTERFIELD, VIRGILIO GONZALES, BERNARD L. BARKER, JAMES W. MC CORD, EUGENIO R. MARTINEZ, AMGELO F. FIORINI, with seven other elimination photographs.

Miss DEVLIN advised that she recognized JAMES MC CORD, as he was in charge of Security at the Committee to Re-Elect the President. She also recognized DAVID COLSON and DAVID YOUNG, who she said she has met and seen at functions outside the premises of the offices of the Committee to Re-Elect the President. She stated that she recognized no other photographs.

She advised she has worked at the Committee to Re-Elect the President as Receptionist since February 22, 1972.

She has been employed by the Committee to Re-Elect the President since the end of May, 1971, first as secretary for the Spokesman, Research Division, and presently as Office Manager. She advised as Office Manager, she handles equipment and supplies and issuance of space for personnel.

She advised that she was previously employed at the White House as secretary for HELB KLINE, PETER FLANIGAN, HARRY FLEIGHING and CHARLES COLSON. She advised that to her imoveled, none of these individuals was at the time of her employment by them in any way connected with the National Security Council.

and that in late January or early February, 1972, ODLE hired JAMUS W. McCCAD as Chief Security Officer for the Committee. She edvised that he is the Administrative Director for the Committee to Re-Alect the President and that he is responsible for hiring and/or firing all personnel connected with the Committee.

She advised that ODLE frequently "bragged" about McCORD's abilities and had told her that McCORD was "highly recommended" by unknown persons.

McCORD shared an office with ROBERT HOUSTON and other security guards on a phone with extension 334. She advised that she understood McCCRD had been hired for \$525.00 per month and that his function was to handle any security problems connected with the committee. She cited as an example, the tracing of

lost mail, handling of all keys and getting rid of any trouble makers who might enter the Committee's office. She further stated that after his employment began, some television camera surveillance equipment was obtained by the Committee, and McGORD was responsible for its installation. She advised that McGORD was not present at the office on a daily basis and that some weeks he would not be in the office at all. At other times McGORD would come in two or three times a week or work two or three hours a week. She advised that she would check with ROBERT HOUSTON when she needed to speak with McGORD and that HOUSTON would advise her that McGORD was out of town.

DUNCAN described McCORD as a reserved, quiet individual who never mentioned his travels, although he did admit to his former employment with the Central Intelligence Agency.

DUNCAN advised that McCCRD had a filing cabinet in his office, but she did not know if he had prepared any memorandums or other reports regarding his employment.

DUNCAN recalled that the last time she had seen McCORD was at 2:00 p.m. on Thursday, June 15, 1972, or Friday, June 16, 1972, at which time she, RODERT C. ODIE, ANDY ANNUALS and JAMAS W. McCORD held a meeting concerning the opening of new offices for the Committee at 1730 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D. C.

stated she was unaware that his first name was GEORGE. She advised that LIDDY was first employed by the Committee to Re-Elect the President in January, 1972. His job was as Counsel to the Finance Division of the Committee to Re-Elect the President. DUMCAN stated that she assumed that ROBERT C. ODLE also hired LIDDY. She indicated that MAURICE STANS was LIDDY's superior. She further advised that she believed that LIDDY had formerly worked for the White House Consultant JOHN MIRLICHMAN.

DUNCAN advised that she last saw G. GORDON LIDDY at the Office of the Committee to Re-Elect the President on Friday, June 30, 1972. She advised that to her knowledge McCORD and LIDDY were not friends and she had never seen them in conversation together.

DUNCAN advised that she learned of the June 18, 1972 burglary of the Democratic National Headquarters from the newspaper. She advised that when she came into the office of the Committee to Re-Elect the President on the following Monday, the atmosphere was like that of a "morgue".

DUNCAN examined photographs of subjects ANGELO FRANK FIORINI, EUGENIO MARTINEZ, JAMES W. McCORD, BERNARD L. BARKER and GONZALES VIRGILIC. She stated that she had never seen any of these individuals in the office of the Committee to Re-Elect the President, except JAMES W. McCORD. She explained that she recognized the photograph of JAMES W. McCORD as the individual who had been employed as Security Officer for the Committee and that from newspaper articles she also recognized photographs of BERNARD L. BARKER and GONZALES VIRGILIO.

DUNCAN observed photographs of DONALD F. BLEDSOE, Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Headquarters, E. HOWARD HUNT, BOBBIE D. BLACKBURN, FBI Headquarters, GEONGE LECHARD, ALFRED CARLETON BALDWIN, III, DAVID W. BOWERS, FBI Headquarters and JAMES F. ELAND, FBI Headquarters. She did not recognize photographs of any of these individuals.

DUNCAN advised that she was not aware of any information that would be of value to the FBI in this investigation.

SYLVIA PARABETES—was interviewed at her place of employment, The Committee For Re-election of the President, 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., suite 372, telephone 333-0920. She advised that until one week ago she was secretary for ROBERT ODLE and BOB REISNER. She is now secretary for EDWARD FAILOR. She has been employed by the Committee since December 22, 1971, and her working hours are generally 8:15 am until 6:00 pm. She was interviewed in the presence of GLENN SADAM - General Counsel for the Committee and H. DONALD KISTLER - Counsel for the Committee.

PAMARITES advised that on Friday, June 16, 1972. she had an ordinary workday and went home from work around 7:00 pm. She stated that she went to bed around 11:00 pm because she knew she had to work on Saturday. She stated that on Saturday, June 17, 1972, she arrived at work at approximately 8:00 am. She stated that a Convention Planning Meeting was scheduled and she had general work to do, xeroxing, etastera. She stated that she did not leave work until around 4:00 am, June 18, 1972. She advised that the Convention Planning Maeting lasted until mid-afternoon. She had work to do and she stayed around to do it. The only people at the Committee office were MARILYN JOHNSON, ROBERT ODLE, MARTHA DUNCAN, ED COMMING and several Security Guards. They were watching the news on television at 6:30 pm and this is where she first learned of the break-in at the Democratic Party Headquarters. She remembered that the name IC CCAD was mentioned, but she thought the first name was ED. She stated that they learned that the MC CORD mentioned in the television news was JAMES W. MC CORD, who is the Security Officer for The Committee For Re-election of the President. She stated that she is acquainted with NC CORD because they are both employed by the Committee. She stated that there was complete shock and surprise among all parties present when it was determined that MC CORD was

arrested during the break-in. She stated that MC CORD's duties usually consisted of issuing identification cards, making sure desks were locked and the office was secure.

PANARITES advised she and MARTHA DUNCAN and ROBERT ODLE and ED CCWLING, the tour desk manager, stayed at the office. She stated that they tried all night to reach JOHN INTCHELL and JEB MAGRUDER who were in California. They had difficulty in reaching MITCHELL and MAGRUDER because of an unlisted telephone number. ODLE was the first to talk to MITCHELL and MAGRUDER and then she talked to them. The reaction of MITCHELL and MAGRUDER was one of complete surprise. She remained at work keeping the switchboard open and buying newspapers and xeroxing copies of articles. She stated that they all had several drinks, but no one was drunk. She had no knowledge of anyone who knew of the plans for the breakin beforehand. She said that everyone was shocked by the news. She stated that she does not believe that NC CORD's activities were a part of his job.

PANARITES advised that MC CORD is the only one of the persons arrested that she knows. She was shown a group of photographs containing the photos of the following individuals: JAMES W. MC CORD, C. W. COLSON, D. R. YOUNG, A. BUTTERFIELD, ELWARD J. HAMILTON, BERNARD L. BARKER, GONZALES VIRGILIO, EUGENIO R. MARTINEZ and ALFRED CARLETON BALLWIN, III. She stated that she did not know any of the individuals except MC CORD. She was also shown a list of names and aliases of the above individuals and stated that MC CORD's name was the only one known to her.

She advised that ROBERT ODLE left between 1:00 am and 4:00 am, Sunday, June 18, 1972. She and MARTHA DUNCAN left at approximately 4:00 am. She stated that they kept the switchboard open, but few calls were received. She stated that she received only one inquiry regarding the break-in, and it was from the Federal Eureau of Investigation. She

stated that the switchboard is usually closed at this time and it is not unusual for no calls to be received. She stated that no calls were received for MC CORD.

PANARITES came back to work Sunday, June 18, 1972, at approximately 10:45 am to telecopy newspaper articles to send to California. She stated she received several inquiries regarding the break-in but only took messages. No calls were put through to any party at the Committee. She stayed Sunday until about 2:00 pm reading the office AP-UPI newspaper ticker.

PANARITES advised that MC CORD was Chief of Security but believes NC CORD's responsibility was limited to the Committee's office space. NC CORD was well liked and well respected. STEVE KING is the Security Officer for JOHN MITCHPAL and was hired by the Committee. KING is the only one assigned directly to MITCHELL to the best of her knowledge. She did not know of any interaction between KING and MC CORD. MC CORD's responsibility was supervision of the guards and security of the office. BOB HOUSTON is probably Chief of the guards in NC CORD's absence. She could not remember seeing NO CORD with any persons except the guards. never saw NO CORD carrying a suitcase or attache case and most of the time he was empty handed. She stated that ROB ODLE would be the one to authorize any expenditure made by MC CORD. She knows nothing regarding MC CORD's work habits or hours of work. MC CORD did not have a secretary.

She advised that she has no knowledge of the breakin and knows of no one who knows anything about it.

JOHN N. MITCHILL, former Attorney General, United States, was interviewed at the law offices of Mudge, Rose, Guthrie and Alexander, 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. (WDC), and furnished the following information:

At the outset of the interview Mr. MITCHELL stated that he would answer all of the interviewing Agents questions in a frank and candid manner.

Mr. MITCHELL advised that he became associated with the Committee to Re-Elect the President on March 1, 1972, after submitting his resignation as the Attorney General of the United States. The first Mr. MITCHELL heard of the break-in at the Watergate Apartments and in particular the Democratic National Committee Headquarters was on Saturday, June 17, 1972, when he was advised of such by Nr. ROLERY MRDI AN in Los Angelas, California, as himself, MARDI AN, JEBRARY AND AND IN INC. Where in California, at a political meeting from June 15, 1972, through June 20, 1972. Mr. MITCHELL advised that he believed Nr. MARDI AN received the initial information about this particular break-in from the radio media and that either Mr. MARDI AN or Mr. MAGRUDER contacted the Committee to Re-Elect the President in WDC to ascertain the extent of Nr. JAPES W. MC CORDS participation.

Mr. MITCHTLL stated that he met Mr. MC CORD only on one occasion in early March, 1972, at which time MC CORD advised him of the security aspects at the office building located at 1701 Ponnsylvania Avenue, N.W. Mr. MITCHELL denies any knowledge of E. HOLARD VINT but added he has known Mr. GLORGE GORDON-LIDDY since LIDDY's association with the U.S. Department of Treasury, WDC. Mr. LIDDY then went to work at the White House and eventually came over to work on the finance committee of the Committee to Re-Elect the President. However, Mr. MITCHELL pointed out he knows Mr. LIDDY on a professional basis only and in particular Mr. LIDDY's work regarding gun control legislation. Mr. MITCHELL stated he

is acquainted with Mr. DAVID YOUNG. He knew Mr. YOUNG as an Aide to Dr. KISSINGER and his position as Domestic Counsel at the White House.

Mr. MITCHELL further stated that approximately three to four weeks ago he had a high level meeting in his office regarding certain aspects of Senator MC GOVERN's campaign and that the following day much of this discussion appeared in a Washington daily newspaper. In this regard Mr. MITCHELL stated that there were also certain documents missing from the Committee Office at that time. Upon reading the newspaper accounts of what transpired at that maeting he raised "hell" with MAGRUDER and CLIFE MILLER of the committee about the leak of such information. It was Mr. MITCHELL's opinion that this matter generated some concern within the committee and felt that Mra MC CORD would assume responsibility for the leak of this information. If. MITCHELL stated that attending the aforementioned meeting there were approximately twenty senior staff people including ROBERT ODLE / Hr. MITCHELL stated that the committee is conducting an investigation regarding the aforementioned incident as well as other minor incidents but with no results.

Mr. MITCHELL advised that the Committee to Re-Elect the President has conducted an independent investigation at the committee regarding the alleged break-in of the Democratic Mational Committee Headquarters due to Mr. MC CORD's alleged involvement and again with no results.

Mr. MITCHELL stated that he has nothing to do with the financial aspect on the Committee to Re-Elect the President and that aspect is handled completely by Mr. MAURICE STANS, former Secretary of Commerce. In describing the recent change in the election law Mr. MITCHELL advised prior to April 7, 1972, political parties were only required to show the source of received funds but were not required to show how those funds were spent, and after April 7, 1972, the most significant change in these laws was that the political parties had to account for all expenditures.

Mr. MITCHELL advised that he has never met ALIZED EMINUMED but that he has heard of him by name as BALDWIN was apparently employed as a body guard for his wife and accompanied her on a recent trip. Mr. MITCHELL stated that his wife was dissatisfied with RALDWIN and lodged several complaints about him with Mr. MITCHELL.

Mr. MITCHELL stated that he believed it was common practice for political parties to infiltrate one another by attempting to place their own people in positions of the opposition party in order to monitor the activities of that party. On Senator MC GOVERN's recent campaign in the state of California an individual was sent to that state attempting to monitor Mr. MC GOVERN's campaign methods such as the use of different forms of media.

Mr. MITCHELL stated that he had no knowledge of the break-in of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters other than what he has read in newspaper accounts of that incident.

Mr. MITCHELL concluded the interview with the comment that he hoped for the completion of this investigation so that "we could get some work done".

Mr. ODLE was again shown a photograph of BERNARD L. BARKER and stated that BARKER was unknown to him. He was positive that if a FRANK CARTER or a BERNARD L. BARKER were employed by the CTRP he, in his position would have known it. Mr. ODLE then telephonically contacted Mr. PARUL BARRICK, Comptroller for the CTRP and had him review his records for past or present employees named FRANK CARTER or BERNARD L. BARKER. Mr. ODLE advised that BARRICK told him he checked the records back to approximately the period of December or January and had no employment listed for CARTER or BARKER in any capacity with the CTRP.

United States Government records, reviewed by SA KENNETH J. HASER on July 7, 1972, disclose that GEORGE GORDON LIDDY was issued Official Passport Number Y-877092 at Machington, D.C. (WDC), on January 8, 1970, for proposed travel to Switzerland for ten days to represent the United States at the United Nations Commission on Narcotic Drugs. In his application dated January 8, 1970, at WDC, he stated his intention to depart by air about January 10, 1970. He expected to take another trip abroad within the year. This passport was valid for five years' travel to all countries except Cuba, mainland China, North Korea and North Vietnam.

This individual stated that he was born on November 30, 1930, at New York, New York. The files reflect that his original Certificate of Presidential Appointment showing him as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Army and dated June 12, 1952, has been seen by passport authorities. He identified himself with a United States Treasury Department Identification Card which showed his date of birth. This passport application was supported by a letter dated January 8, 1970, from Assistant Secretary of the Treasury for Administration A. E. WEATHERSEE to the Passport Office stating that LIDDY was proceeding to Switzerland to attend as the Treasury representative for the special meeting of the United Nations Commission on Narcotic Drugs which would discuss a draft protocol on psychotropic substances. He did not list a permanent residence and arranged to have the passport picked up in Washington. U

He listed his father as SYLVESTER J. LIDDY, born at New York City on December 27, 1899, and his mother as MARIA LOUISE ADBATICOMIO, born at Fairmont, West Virginia, on April 21, 1909. He stated that he was last married on November 9, 1957, to FRANCES ANN PURCELL, born on December 2, 1932, at Poughkeepsie, New York, marriage not terminated. Records of the United States Department of the Treasury, Office of Personnel (Personnel Security), reviewed by SA MAURICE F. DONEGAN, JR., on July 5, 1972, disclosed that' GEOIGE GORDON LIDDY, born November 30, 1930, at Brooklyn, New York, was granted a Top Secret clearance by the Department of the Treasury on June 10, 1969, based on a United States Secret Service full field report of May 28, 1969 (supplemental report June 12, 1959), and FBI investigation of July, 1957. Clearance was for the position of Special Assistant to the Secretary (organized crime) and was canceled by his resignation July 19, 1971, to accept appointment on the White House Staff (the Domestic Council). He was interviewed by Treasury Security concerning security violations of leaving his safe unlocked June 14, 1971, and June 17, 1971, and he stated that these were due to the fact that his secretary, who was away, normally locked the safe.

He was interviewed June 10, 1969, by Treasury Security and requested to submit a letter setting forth all of his delinquent credit accounts. He stated that he went into debt in 1968 in running unsuccessfully in the Congressional Frimary lection in the 28th District of New York and serving without compensation as Chairman of the presidential campaign for Dutchess County, New York. He planned to sell his house in Poughkeepsie, New York, and the receipts of this and receivables would easily cover all his debts.

He was subject of New York State Commission of Investigation hearing at 270 Broadway, New York City, on September 8, 1967, in regard to allegations by CARLTON W. SCULES, Noxon Road, Poukeepsie, New York to the Commission Chairman August 10, 1967, that he knowingly allowed and encouraged a police informant to participate in a number of Laglaces and failed to notify other law enforcement agencies having jurisdiction over the territories where some of the burglaries were committed. He denied the allegations and the



Commission of Investigations determined that no further action by it was deemed necessary.

g. References

Representative Hamilton Fish, Jr., 28th District of New York, Room 1230, House Office Building, Washington, D.C., was interviewed in his office on May 15, 1969.

Representative Fish stated that he has known the applicant for approximately three or four years on a professional, political and social basis. He said that in the 1968 Congressional District race, the applicant ran against him in the primaries, was defeated and then supported him in the national elections. He said that the applicant enjoys a very good professional reputation, is hard working without regard to the amount of time he spends on a particular job. The applicant is considered a very able trial attorney, is very straight forward in his approach and does not have the reputation of going behind peoples back. The Congressman said that the applicant "calls it the way he sees it".

The Congressman knows of no difficulty the subject has had in any job and has no knowledge of his association with persons who have a questionable reputation or association. In the Congressman's opinion, the applicant is ambitious in the true sense of the word, intelligent, and is a forceful person, extremely dedicated to what he is working for. The Congressman considers the applicant well qualified for the position he is being considered for, due to his experience in the FBI and the Dutchess County District Attorney's Office. The Congressman said that the subject, during the last Congressman race, took a very strong position against organized crime. The Congressman had no knowledge of the applicant's association with known members of the criminal element. He had no knowledge of any personal or mental problem such as drinking or gaubling.

The Congressman said that he would recommend the applicant for this position without reservation and feels that he is professionally qualified for this job.

Congressman Gerald R. Ford, House Minority Leader, Room H230, U.S. Capitol Building, Washington, D.C., was personally interviewed in his office on May 15, 1969.

He advised that he did not know the applicant well, but based on his knowledge of the applicant and recommendations of close associates who he had great faith in, he would recommend the applicant for the position he is being considered for. He considers the applicant to be well suited for this position and has no reason to question his integrity or honesty. He said that he is not an intimate friend of the applicant and only knows him in a political association.

Soules, Noxon Road, Poughkeepsie, New York, to Mr. Myles Lane, Chairman of the Commission of Investigation dated August 10, 1967. The letter was lengthy and made a variety of allegations against the applicant and a Poughkeepsie Police Detective. The allegations were basically that:

- 1. That the applicant, while Assistant District Attorney of Dutchess County, and the detective knowingly allowed and encouraged a police informant to participate in a number of burglaries with two other men with the purpose of obtaining information from the informant, on the other two men, concerning their narcotic activities.
- 2. That the applicant tried to coerce a Poughkeepsie Police Officer to testify that Soules had told the officer that he, "would get Beatty at any cost." (It should be noted that Beatty is the informant previously mentioned and he also was the driver of the car in which Mr. Soules' son was killed in an accident in January 1967).
- 3. That the applicant and the detective, having knowledge of the series of burgharies cormitted by the informant and the other two men, failed to notify other haw enforcement agencies having jurisdiction over the territories where some of the burgharies were consisted, of what was taking place and who the perpetrators were.

An investigation was conducted by the Commission of Investigation and the applicant appeared at a hearing at Commission of Investigation Headquarters, 270 Broadway, New York City, on September 8, 1967. In regard to the three

basic allegations the applicant replied to them in the following manner:

I. The applicant stated to the hearing board that, "Beatty operated as an informant and his assignment was to accept invitations to operate as a 'wheel man' for Anderson and Mulcahey, when they want out to commit burglaries and when they want to dispose of loot and get narcotics therefor."

According to testimony in Commission of Investigation files, Beatty participated in 13 burglaries during the 3 weeks he operated as an informant.

The applicant denied the allegation. He stated that the police officer was a very close friend of the complainant (Soules) and that the officer refused to testify against him even when told he would be subpossed.

In regard to this allegation it should be noted that the applicant's wife, through an inheritance, held the mortgage on this particular police officer's house. Apparently during a period when the applicant had a need for cash, the mortgage was sold which forced the officer to refinance the home. There was evidently some ill feeling on the part of the officer over this.

3. The applicant denied the allegation. He stated that all interested agencies were advised when he and the detective determined exactly where and in whose territory each burglary was committed.

Following the investigation and hearing, a letter was sent to the complainant, Mr. Soules, by the Commission of Investigation, stating that the allegations had been investigated and no further action by the Commission of Investigation was desmed necessary. The letter was dated April 10, 1968.



On June 10, 1969, Mr. Dennis E. Southern of your office requested that the following information be submitted in the captioned matter.

- Approximate total delinquent debt: \$2,890. (see schedule "A")
- Approximate total current debt (non-delinquent):\$2,600. (see schedule "B")
- 3. Manner in which delinquency occurred: The writer was a candidate in the June, 1968, Congressional primary election for the 28th district of New York. The campaign ran from December, 1967 through June 18, 1968. The bulk of the writer's income during the campaign, plus his savings, were expended in his effort to win the election. Following the election, the writer returned to the practice of law, but was then asked to be Chairman of the Presidential campaign for Dutchess County, N.Y. in the November, 1968, general election. The writer did so, without compensation, and refraining from the practice of law to do so effectively. As a result, substantial debts accumulated. From June, 1968 to June, 1969, said debts have been reduced by approximately \$4000.
- 4. Period within which all debts will be discharged: In connection with the writer's present position, his family shall move to Washington, D.C. and his Poughkeepsie, N.Y., home will be sold. The fair retail value thereof is \$50,000. The mortgage thereon is \$23,000 leaving a cash balance of \$27,000. In addition, the writer has receivables of \$2,600. within the next 90 days (exclusive of salary) for a total of \$29,600 with which to discharge a total indebtedness of \$5490. It is anticipated that this will be accomplished this September.

Mrs. EARL (ARLENE) GOETZE, 9306 Ivanhoe Road, Oxon Hill, Maryland, advised that she is acquainted with the LIDDY Family, who reside at 9310 Ivanhoe Road. Mrs. GOETZE stated that she has lived at her residence for two and one half years, and has known the LIDDY Family since they moved in approximately two years ago. Mrs. GOETZE stated that she is acquainted with GEORGE GORDON LIDDY, his life FRANCES, and their five children. She advised that she knows the LIDDY Family only as neighbors and have socialized very few times with them. She stated, however, that she probably knows FRANCES LIDDY better than any of the other neighbors. Mrs. GOETZE stated that her children and the LIDDY children play together and she and FRANCES LIDDY often talk and drink coffee together.

Mrs. COFTZE advised that GEOFGE GORDON LIDDY is employed as an Attorney for the Committee to Re-Elect the President. She stated that she knows little regarding LIDDY's employment except that he gets home late, from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., and travels frequently. She had no information regarding LIDDY's travel. She stated that she has seen Mr. LIDDY at home more the last couple of weeks than usual and thought he was on leave. Mrs. LIDDY told Mrs. GOEFTZE that Mr. LIDDY was at the White House most of last month (June, 1972) orking for EMPLICHMAN.

Mrs. GOMTZE stated that the LIDDYs did very little entertaining. She stated that she has never noticed any men visiting the LIDDY home. She has never noticed any unfamiliar automobiles at the LIDDY home. She stated that Mr. LIDDY drives a blue Jeep and also has a new white and black Cadillac. Another family stayed at the LIDDY home for several weeks during the Summer of 1971, however, she does not know their names. The LIDDYs also have a home in Poughkeepsie, New York, where they occasionally spend some time. Mrs. LIDDY is a

Mrs. I DOROTHY L. HUNT, 11120 River Road, Potomac, Maryland, was contacted at her residence and immediately apprised of the identities of the interviewing agents. She was subsequently displayed a small piece of luggage, brown in color, which is normally referred to as a "cosmetic case". This piece of luggage bears a gold seal from the "Castellana Hilton, Madrid, Spain". On one side of the luggage is printed the wording "HUNT LISA".

After viewing the above-described piece of luggage, Mrs. HUNT stated that the cosmetic case was very similar to a piece of her own luggage, which she purchased a number of years ago. She was unable to identify the described piece of luggage as her own. However, she noted that her cwn luggage had a similar seal from the Hilton Hotel in Madrid Spain. She stated that she and her husband had stayed in that hotel in about 1965 while on Government assignment in Spain.

Mrs. HUNT advised that her eldest daughter is LISA HUNT. In about 1966, LISA HUNT suffered injuries in an automobile accident and was subsequently hospitalized for both physical and mental examination. During that stay in the hospital LISA had utilized some of the family luggage. Mrs. HINT noted that the writing "HUNT LISA" which appears on the above-described luggage may have been placed on her own luggage at that time.

Subsequent to LISA HUNT's return from the hospital, Mrs. HUNT stated that her cosmetic case had been stored at the family residence. She indicated that she had lafer taken this piece of luggage with her husband and family to Nicaragua in late 1970. At that time she believed she had left the cosmetic case behind in a motel room in Florida.

Mr. DONALD E. SANTARELLI, Deputy Associate Attorney General, U.S. Department of Justice, Washington, D.C. (WDC), advised as follows:

On June 17, 1972, Mr. SANTARELLI was at the beach with his wife staying with friends for the weekend. He received no calls from the Committee to Re-Elect the President that weekend; however, his wife had read in the paper or heard on the radio about the Democratic National Committee break-in and called ROBERT OBLE of the Committee to determine the meaning of this event if any.

Mr. SANTARELLI stated Mr. ODLE is his wife's immediate supervisor and ODLE asked to speak to SANTARELLI, during the call, to request aid in locating a replacement for Security Office MC CORD who had been arrested, in connection with the break-in. This was on Sunday Forming, and ODLE discussed no other facet of the break-in with SANTARELLI.

Mr. SANTARELLI said that Mr. ODLE often had sought his advice in the past in such matters as screening trustworthy potential employees.

Mr. SANTARELLI reiterated that he has seen Mr. ODLE since the aforementioned incident at the Democratic National Committee and that ODLE has never spoken of the incident in his presence.

SUAREZ, treasurer as HECTOR DE LARA, and secretary as ALBEPTO CARRICARTE. The directors named on this certificate were ALEXANDER, DE LARA, and CARRICARTE. Mrs. JANET L. MURCEY, 1110 Elm Street, S.W., Vienna, Virginia, home telephone number 938-8267, was contacted by SAs DONALD E. STUKEY, II, and SA MICHAEL J. KING at her place of employment, the Chesapeake and Potomac (C&P) Telephone Company, 917 13th Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. (WDC), where Mrs. MARCEY is employed as Administrative Assistant to the District Traffic Manager, C&P Telephone Company. SAs STUKEY and KING identified themselves as representatives of the FBI and advised Mrs. MARCEY that they were conducting an investigation related to the burglary of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters (DNCH), Watergate Office Building, WDC, on June 17, 1972.

SA STUKEY advised Mrs. MARCEY that among evidence collected in the effects of five men arrested in the office space of the Democratic National Committee (DNC) was a page from the Washington Metropolitan Telephone Directory, which bore a handwritten telephone number at the top of the page, which was telephone number 392-5544. Mrs. MARCEY was advised that an investigation had determined that this was her individual line at her office at the C&P Telephone Company. SA STUKEY asked Mrs. MARCEY if she was in possession of any information concerning the aforementioned burglary at the DNCH.

Mrs. MARCEY stated that she cannont understand why anyone would have her telephone number as she does not deal directly with the public. Mrs. MARCEY explained that the Traffic Department is responsible for installation and training of PBX teletype equipment and that her particular division dispatches telephone company personnel to train—operators for the PBX system. Mrs. MARCEY stated that the only reason anyone would contact her at her telephone extension would be if they had forgotten the name of their counselor-trainer and would call her to determine the name of ther counselor-trainer.
