JOSEPH EARL ROY HILLS, 1494 Barger Street, Southeast, Washington, D.C., telephone 678-0949, was interviewed at the Washington Technical Institute where he is employed in the Office of the President, telephone 966-8210, and he provided the following information:

He was hired as a Security Guard for the Committee to Re-Elect the President (CRP) by JAMES WALTER MC CORD on March 13, 1972, and still works for the CRP in this capacity, Saturdays from 9:00 A.M., to 1:00 A.M. Sunday mornings. Previously he was employed by the Pinkerton Detective Agency and was recommended for his present job when the CRP began hiring in May, 1972.

Since he worked Saturdays he saw very little of Mr. MC CORD or any other officials at the CRP. He considered Mr. MC CORD a good supervisor and a fine person, and he was shocked to hear of MC CORD's involvement in the Watergate burglary. He heard about the burglary on the morning of June 17, 1972, while on duty, from several employees of the CRP, coming through the lobby, but did not learn of MC CORD's involvement until he read it in the newspaper that evening.

He had little contact with MC CORD and never performed any duties or jobs for MC CORD outside of his regular job. In particular, he never went to MC CORD's house and definitely never handled any equipment for MC CORD.

Mr. JAMES E. CAUDILL, Security Man for the Republican National Committee (RNC), located at 310 First Street, S.E., Washington, D.C. (WDC), furnished the following information:

He was employed by Mr. JAMES MC CORD as a Security Man for the RNC on January 24, 1972, and has remained in that position. Mr. CAUDILL has never worked at the Committee to Re-Elect the President (CRP).

Mr. CAUDILL stated that after Mr. MC CORD left as Security Man, he (CAUDILL) was kept on.

The first knowledge he had of the Watergate break-in was on the morning after the arrests. He was not working that day and only works Monday through Friday at the RNC. Mr. CAUDILL said that he was very surprised to see that Mr. MC CORD was involved in the break-in and did not think that he (MC CORD) was that kind of person.

He has never been out to MC CORD's house and the only vehicle he knows to belong to MC CORD is a four-door Ford. He was not contacted by any one from the CRP on the morning after the break-in nor has he ever picked up or made any deliveries for MC CORD.

ROBERT A. MERCHANT, Assistant to Director of Law Enforcement (Intelligence), Department of the Treasury, United States Treasury Building, Room 1134, advised that GORDON LIDDY was already employed by the Treasury Department when he started in May, 1970. He advised that LIDDY handled matters dealing with organized crime, general law enforcement, intelligence, gun legislation, Department of the Treasury input to Cabinet Committee For Narcotics Control. LIDDY also handled cases involving electronic surveillance, dealing mainly with transcripts of conversations. MERCHANT did not know of any ability LIDDY might have with electronic equipment. LIDDY then worked for the General Counsel's Office of the Treasury Department for a few months before going to the White House.

LIDDY went to the White House Staff during the Summer of 1971. He handled International Narcotics matters. MERCHANT stated that he believed LIDDY worked for HALDEMAN while at the White House. LIDDY then became the General Counsel for the Financial Committee for the Committee to Re-Elect the President.

LIDDY enjoys a good professional reputation. MERCHANT advised that he has a very high opinion of LIDDY. He knows nothing regarding LIDDY's duties at the Committee.

MERCHANT advised that LIDDY had ties with the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) while at Treasury. LIDDY and MARTIN POLLNER, Director of Law Enforcement, Department of the Treasury, did not get along well. LIDDY indicated that he did not want to work for POLLNER. This is the reason that LIDDY transferred from his position dealing with Organized Crime to the position in the General Counsel's Office. MERCHANT stated that when the position of Director of Law Enforcement was created, LIDDY thought he should have been appointed to the position. LIDDY apparently resented the fact that POLLNER got the position and

indicated that he would not work under POLLNER. MERCHANT advised that he has not seen much of LIDDY since LIDDY left Treasury. POLLNER had told the Staff that he would prefer that they not associate with LIDDY.

When LIDDY left Treasury, he wanted to take a number of Treasury files with him. LIDDY made a request for this, but the request was denied. There was no incident over this matter and LIDDY accepted the decision.



Mr. JOHN EHRlichman, Assistant to RICHARD M. NIXON, President of the United States for Domestic Affairs, 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. (WDC), was interviewed in the presence of Mr. JOHN DEAN, Legal Counsel to the President, and furnished the following information:

That he is in possession of no information relative to the break-in of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters on June 17, 1972, other than what he has read in the way of newspaper accounts of that incident. Mr. EHRlichman stated that he has sought no information in this regard either from the Republican National Committee or from the Committee to Re-elect the President of the United States. He also advised that he has received no information in regard to that incident, and in fact, did not wish to receive any due to a pending suit filed by the Democratic Party against the Republicans.

Mr. EHRlichman advised that he has been involved in the campaign to Re-elect Mr. NIXON as President, only in a limited way. Essentially, his involvement was in regard to the Republican National Committee's Platform Committee preparing that Party's position on domestic issues. He also stated that he has appeared as a speaker for the Republican National Committee, and that his type of involvement was based upon his knowledge of the issues as compared to planning political strategy and securing financial assistance for the Republican Party.

Mr. EHRlichman advised that he has never received any intelligence information from the Committee to Re-elect the President of the United States, and that it was absolutely not true that the Republican Party changed their Convention site from San Diego, California to Miami, Florida, based on such information. is involved in a routing system wherein he receives intelligence information from the various agencies, including the Federal Bureau of Investigation, affiliated with the Department of Justice. And it would not be necessary for him to rely on intelligence information from the Committee to Re-elect the President. Mr. EHRLICHMAN advised that the primary factors in moving the Convention site from San Diego to Miami were based on problems encountered with the owner of the Convention Hall in San Diego, California. The Republican's had difficulty in dealing with this individual, a Canadian, as costs of utilizing this Convention site in San Diego had skyrocketed. That particular problem, coupled with the embarrassment of the ITT Affair, resulted in the moving of the Convention site. Mr. EHRLICHMAN advised that he knows this was the case, as he was involved in the decision to move the site. Mr. EHRLICHMAN stated that the demonstrations planned for the San Diego site played only a minor role in the decision to move the Convention.

Mr. EHRLICHMAN stated that he believed that he had met Mr. EVERETT HOWARD HUNT on the occasion, and that was during Mr. HUNT's period of employment with the White House. He also stated that he knew GEORGE GORDON LIDDY and Mr. DAVID YOUNG in the same capacity. All three of these individuals were working under a Mr. BUD KROUCH regarding a leak of information from the Executive Branch of the Government.

Mr. EHRLICHMAN stated that he also knew Mr. HUGH SLOAN, while Mr. SLOAN was employed at the White House, in the Scheduling Section under the supervision of a Mr. DWIGHT SCHAPIN (phonetic). Mr. EHRLICHMAN is also acquainted with Mr. JES MAGRUDER, as Mr. MAGRUDER was employed in the White House's Office of Communication under the supervision of Mr. HERB KLEIN. Mr. EHRLICHMAN advised that he was also acquainted with Mr. FRED LARUE, during the 1968 Presidential Campaign, and did not know Mr. LARUE's employment capacity.

Mr. EHRLICHMAN also has knowledge of Mr. MAURICE STANS, and Mr. STANS' affiliation with the Executive Branch of the Government in the capacity of Secretary of

Advisor to the President of Domestic Affairs, he worked closely with all the Cabinet members connected with the domestic aspect of policy decisions.

Mr. EHRLICHMAN stated that he could provide no information of any possible involvement the aforementioned individuals could have had with the break-in at the Democratic National Committee Headquarters on June 17, 1972.

CARLTON MORGAN, Switchboard Operator, Georgetown House, 2121 P Street, N.W., advised that he normally works the hours 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m., and worked those hours on June 16-17, 1972. His position at the Georgetown House is Switchboard Operator, as well as insuring that no one enters the building that is not allowed to be there.

MORGAN advised that the entrances to the building are secured at the time the Eagle's Nest closes, which is 2:00 a.m. He advised that he is certain that the doors to the building were secured at least by 2:30 a.m., which would be the normal time the employees of the Eagle's Nest departed.

He stated that entrance to the building is then obtained by his pressing a buzzer, releasing the lock and allowing persons to enter.

MORGAN advised that he cannot recall any unusual circumstances occurring during the tour of duty.

MORGAN advised that he, up to the time of the closing and locking of the door at approximately 2:00 a.m., is extremely busy and would not recall anyone entering the building or telephone calls received through the switchboard for any particular party. He stated that after that, he feels certain he would be able to recall any telephone calls for residents of the building or persons requesting to visit persons of the building at that particular hour. MORGAN pointed out that all the phone calls do not come through the switchboard unless the tenant, before he retires for the evening, turns the switch on the telephone allowing it to come through the switchboard.

MORGAN advised that to his knowledge no one entered the building requesting to see a Mr. CADDY, or were there any

Mr. ROBERT C. MARDIAN, Special Assistant to the Campaign Manager for the Committee to Re-elect the President located at 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agents and furnished the following information:

It is noted that Mr. MARDIAN was interviewed in the presence of KENNETH WELLS PARKINSON, attorney for the Committee to Re-elect the President.

Mr. MARDIAN advised that he was not personally acquainted with Mr. KENNETH DALBERG but that sometime ago Mr. DALBERG had called his office looking for someone he believed in his office, however, it turned out that this person was not, in fact, a member of Mr. MARDIAN's staff. Mr. MARDIAN said that he believed the person whom Mr. DALBERG was trying to contact may have been Mr. SLOAN.

Mr. MARDIAN advised that he had hired Mr. PARKINSON and Mr. O'BRIEN as counsel for the Committee to Re-elect the President in relation to the pending civil suit involving the Committee.

Mr. MARDIAN advised that he had in the capacity of an attorney rather than an employer spoken to the following people: Mr. GORDON LIDDY, Mr. MAURICE STANS, and Mr. HUGHES, and as such, he could not divulge either the nature or substance of those conversations.

He did not recall having talked to Mr. MC CORD (former security man for the Committee to Re-elect the President) but may have spoken to him on the telephone regarding the hiring of a driver from the Department of Justice with whom he had gotten along very well with while he was there and he had attempted to obtain employment for him on the Committee to Re-elect the President.

Mr. MARDIAN said that he is not positive he spoke to MC CORD about this employment for a driver, however, advised that, this would have been his only contact with MC CORD if, in fact, he had.

Mr. MARDIAN stated that his job as Special Assistant to the Campaign Manager entails the responsibility for 17 Western states some of which are considered "critical" and that this is the only place his responsibilities lie in relation to the Committee. He has no responsibility whatsoever for funds and no knowledge of any other Committee activities outside his responsibility.

Mr. MARDIAN mentioned that he had seen DADMEERS before and talked to him the aforementioned time on the telephone but has had no personal contact with him.

The last time Mr. MARDIAN spoke to Mr. LIDDY was the date that he was terminated by the Committee to Re-elect the President and at that time he spoke to him in the capacity of an attorney.

Mr. MARDIAN said that he had absolutely no knowledge of the situation the FBI is presently investigating at the Committee to Re-elect the President prior to June 17, 1972. The only other contact he had had with Mr. LIDDY was when Mr. LIDDY was with the United States Treasury Department and involved in the jurisdictional negotiation between the FBI and Treasury involving the disputes over who had responsibilities for investigating bombings.

He stated that while he was serving with the Committee he had no occasion to receive any type of security information regarding demonstrations or reports regarding the opposition (Democratic Party) operations and that he would not have received such information in his position.

Mr. LINDA C. LA RUE, Special Assistant to the Campaign Manager, Committee to Re-elect the President, 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D. C., was interviewed in the presence of Mr. PAUL O'BRIEN, Attorney, and furnished the following information.

That he has held his position as Special Assistant to the Campaign Manager since January 1, 1972. Prior to this employment Mr. LA RUE was employed as a Consultant to RICHARD M. NIXON, President of the United States at the Executive Office Building, Washington, D. C. Mr. LA RUE advised that his principal duties concern campaign strategies and other political decisions relating to the campaign for the re-election of President RICHARD M. NIXON. Mr. LA RUE also advised in that he has a personal relationship with Mrs. JOHN MITCHELL that he screens employment applications for the position of Security Officer to Mrs. MITCHELL and in this capacity met and conducted an interview of one ALLEN BALDWIN in the spring of 1972. This interview occurred just prior to a trip Mrs. MITCHELL was making to the Michigan and New York State areas. Mr. LA RUE could not recall if he spoke with Mr. BALDWIN alone or in the presence of Mr. JAMES MC CORD, the former Security Officer for the Committee to Re-elect the President. He did state that it was normal procedure for Mr. MC CORD to refer applicants for the position of Security Officer to Mrs. MITCHELL, to his office for screening and usually he was present. On each of these interviews Mr. LA RUE would always point out to the prospective applicant that the mortality rate was extremely high due to some personal peculiarities of Mrs. MITCHELL.

Mr. LA RUE stated that the next meeting with Mr. BALDWIN was in Flint, Michigan, while Mr. BALDWIN was accompanying Mrs. MITCHELL on the aforementioned tour. At that meeting Mrs. MITCHELL was extremely

satisfied with the performance of BALDWIN and everything appeared to be going well. However, after her return to Washington, D. C., from New York City, Mrs. MITCHELL was no longer satisfied and Mr. LA RUE advised Mr. MC CORD as such. According to Mr. LA RUE if these individuals, including Mr. BALDWIN, did not meet Mrs. MITCHELL's approval, their services were no longer necessary. He stated that he did not know if other arrangements for employment were made for these individuals with the committee and pointed out that this particular problem was mentioned to the perspective applicants as stated above. Mr. LA RUE did not know of what salary arrangements were made with any of these individuals including Mr. BALDWIN, but stated that he knew all of their personal expenses were paid while they were attending Mrs. MITCHELL on any tours she might take.

Mr. LA RUE stated that the last time he heard from Mr. BALDWIN was in the middle of June, 1972, after the breakin of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters in Washington, D. C. Mr. LA RUE stated that he received a telephone call from Mr. BALDWIN but during that telephone call Mr. BALDWIN never referred to himself by name. BALDWIN advised Mr. LA RUE that he was a former Security Officer for Mrs. MITCHELL and was very apprehensive regarding a proposed interview by the FBI. Mr. BALDWIN also related that the committee owed him certain funds in connection with his trip with Mrs. MITCHELL in the spring of 1972. BALDWIN provided Mr. LA RUE with the name of his attorney and the attorney's address in Connecticut. Mr. LA RUE then furnished that information to Mr. PAUL O'BRIEN, representative of the Committee to Re-elect the President in a civil matter. Mr. LA RUE stated that he had no idea why Mr. BALDWIN was calling him and at no time during the conversation with Mr. BALDWIN did he, BALDWIN, implicate himself in the breakin at the Democratic National Committee Headquarters.

Mr. LA RUE stated that it was not normal procedure for his secretary to accept all incoming phone calls, that on occasion he would answer the phone himself.

Mr. LA RUE also advised that he knew nothing about the financial aspects of the Committee to Re-elect the President.

Mr. LA RUE stated that he knew Mr. GEORGE GORDON LIDDY as General Council for the Committee to Re-elect the President. He stated Mr. LIDDY then moved down to the Financial Committee for the Committee to Re-elect

the President in the Spring of 1972. Mr. LA RUE stated that he also knew Mr. JAMES WALTER MC CORD as Security Officer for the Committee to Re-elect the President. Mr. LA RUE also stated that he knew the photograph of Mr. ALFRED CARLTON BALDWIN, III, as described previously. Mr. LA RUE also identified the photograph of Mr. KENNETH DAHLBERG.

In regard to Mr. DAHLBERG, Mr. LA RUE stated that he has known him for over one year and knew him in his capacity as a successful businessman and a fund raiser for the Republican National Committee.

Mr. LA RUE stated the last time he heard from Mr. DAHLBERG is approximately two weeks ago when he received a phone call from him regarding a certain check in the amount of \$25,000 which DAHLBERG submitted to Mr. MAURICE STANS of the Committee to Re-elect the President and some problem concerning it. Mr. LA RUE related that Mr. STANS was not in the office at that time and arranged to contact Mr. STANS and have him return Mr. DAHLBERG's call.

Mr. LA RUE advised that he is the owner of approximately 20 shotguns and a .22 caliber target pistol. When asked about his ownership of a .38 caliber revolver Mr. LA RUE stated that in 1969 or 1970 he provided his Secretary with a .38 caliber snub-nosed revolver per her request, and advised that approximately one year ago this same revolver was stolen from her apartment and this incident was subsequently reported to the White House Police Department. Mr. LA RUE stated that he had purchased this weapon approximately six or seven years prior to his giving it to his secretary. Mr. LA RUE advised that this theft of this revolver was not reported to any other law enforcement agency.

Mr. LA RUE stated that he was acquainted with Mr. HUGH SLOAN of the Committee to Reelect the President in his capacity as Treasurer in the current campaign as well as the 1968 campaign. Mr. LA RUE stated that he learned of Mr. SLOAN's resigning from the committee on July 17 or 18, 1972, and could provide no information regarding his possible involvement in the breakin of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters.

Mr. FRED C. LARUE, Special Consultant to the Campaign Manager, Committee to Re-Elect the President (CRP), Washington, D. C. (WDC), was interviewed in his office at the CRP, 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., WDC, in the presence of attorneys PAUL L. O'BRIEN and KENNETH WELLS PARKINSON. Mr. O'BRIEN and Mr. PARKINSON are currently representing the CRP in a civil suit filed against the CRP in U. S. District Court (USDC), WDC, relative to the burglary of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters on June 17, 1972, at WDC.

At the outset of the interview, Mr. LARUE indicated that he had not personally retained either Mr. O'BRIEN or Mr. PARKINSON to represent himself in the interview, but rather noted that both attorneys were present as representatives of the CRP and at the request of the CRP.

Mr. PARKINSON then interjected that both he and Mr. O'BRIEN had been retained by the CRP to represent the CRP. He indicated that CRP policy required their presence during any interview conducted of CRP personnel in regard to the noted burglary and incidents which related to that burglary.

SA SHAW observed at that time an attache case, with what appeared to be a wire protruding from one side of the case, which case was located in one corner of Mr. LARUE's office. In response to an inquiry by SA SHAW, Mr. PARKINSON, Mr. O'BRIEN and Mr. LARUE indicated that the interview was indeed not being recorded by any listening device. They indicated the only record which they were making of the interview consisted of rough draft notes which would be compiled by Mr. O'BRIEN and Mr. PARKINSON. The interviewing Agents subsequently advised them that they did not possess any recording devices on their person.

Mr. LARUE subsequently supplied the following information:

About six or seven years ago, Mr. LARUE personally purchased a .33 caliber revolver from the Hunt and Whittaker (phonetic) Sporting Goods Store, which is located in Jackson, Mississippi. Sometime during the period from 1969 through 1970, Miss LARUE's secretary, LAURA FREDERICK, indicated to Mr. LARUE a desire to obtain a gun to keep in her residence for her personal protection. Mr. LARUE subsequently furnished the above described weapon to Miss FREDERICK. During the Spring of 1971, Miss FREDERICK advised Mr. LARUE that the weapon had been stolen from her residence. Mr. LARUE subsequently reported the theft to both the White House Police and the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD), WDC. The incident was reported to the White House Police Department as Mr. LARUE was employed at that time as a Special Consultant to the President of the United States, RONALD REAGAN.

Mr. LARUE furnished the following information in regard to GEORGE GORDON LIDDY, former General Counsel, CRP, and Legal Counsel, Finance Committee to Re-Elect the President (FCRP), WDC:

Mr. LARUE indicated that his last personal contact with GEORGE GORDON LIDDY occurred on the day on which LIDDY's employment was terminated by the CRP. On that date, Mr. LARUE was informed by ROBERT MARDIAN, Special Assistant to the Campaign Manager, CRP, that he, MARDIAN, had drafted a memorandum for Mr. JEROME STANS, Chairman, FCRP, which memorandum requested Mr. STANS to terminate LIDDY's employment with the CRP. In the noted memorandum, Mr. MARDIAN noted that LIDDY had refused to cooperate with the FBI in their investigation of the burglary of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters (DNC). Mr. LARUE noted that Committee policy required the termination of any employee, who refused cooperation with authorities involved in the investigation of that incident.

After speaking with Mr. MARDIAN, Mr. LARUE personally advised GEORGE GORDON LIDDY of the Committee's policy in regard to cooperation with authorities conducting investigation of that incident. Mr. LARUE then told LIDDY that as a result of his failure to cooperate with those authorities, the CRP was obliged to terminate his employment.

Mr. LARUE indicated that he offered LIBBY the opportunity to resign rather than be terminated, however, LIBBY declined that offer. Mr. LARUE stated that he subsequently had personally terminated LIBBY's employment.

Mr. LARUE was advised that the CRP was engaged in gathering intelligence information. LARUE was an anti-communist activist of the CRP in 1962. He was asked to relate his personal knowledge of these activities to the interviewing Agents.

Mr. LARUE indicated that he could not recall the exact time that he had become aware that the CRP was engaging in an "intelligence gathering operation". He noted that because of potential problems which had arisen with the CRP in the collection of intelligence information, the CRP had decided to hold the convention site for the 1972 Republican National Convention; and the possibility that difficulties might be encountered by certain officials, Republican leaders, members and surrogate speakers, in their activities connected to the Republican Presidential Campaign; it was felt that it would be necessary to obtain intelligence information relative to the possible activities of individuals and/or radical factions which might disrupt Republican campaign activities.

In that regard, JIM SMITH, Chairman, Deputy Campaign Director, CRP, discussed the need for such intelligence information with General Counsel, CRP, and the CRP's General Counsel, CRP. Mr. SMITH authorized General Counsel LIBBY to undertake the operation of gathering intelligence information for the CRP. As a result of the operation headed by LIBBY, intelligence was obtained which enabled the CRP to make preparations required by the CRP in their selection of Miami as the site of the 1972 Republican National Convention. Intelligence information also obtained by LIBBY's operation enabled the institution of preventive measures in New Hampshire and Miami prior to the occurrence of incidents which would have affected Republican campaign activities. In both instances this information enabled the use of surrogate speakers to preclude disturbances.

Mr. LARUE advised that General Counsel LIBBY had "worn three hats" during his employment with the CRP:

- 1) General Counsel, CRP;
- 2) Legal Counsel, FCRP;
- 3) Responsibility for CRP intelligence gathering activities.

Mr. LARUE indicated that GEORGE GORDON LIDDY had initially served as General Counsel, CRP. He had then been appointed Legal Counsel, FCRP. Sometime during LIDDY's period of employment, he headed the CRP's intelligence operation. However, Mr. LARUE was unable to recall the period during which LIDDY had performed that function, and whether he had performed that function in conjunction with any other assigned duty.

Mr. LARUE furnished the following information relative to RICH WALKER, JR., former Treasurer, FCRP:

Mr. LARUE indicated that he had last seen SLOAN on the day of SLOAN's resignation from the CRP. He stated that resignation had taken place subsequent to his initial interview by the FBI in connection with their investigation of the noted burglary. Mr. LARUE stated that he had visited SLOAN in SLOAN's office on that occasion to say good-bye to SLOAN. Mr. LARUE advised that he had learned of SLOAN's resignation on the day of his resignation through office gossip. He indicated that he believed the resignation had been due to "personal reasons" which he, LARUE, believed had been connected with the pregnancy of SLOAN's wife. Mr. LARUE indicated that he had had no idea that SLOAN had been contemplating resignation from the CRP prior to that date. He also indicated that he had not participated in any meetings and had not been aware that any meeting had been held by any member of the CRP in regard to SLOAN's termination of employment or resignation from the CRP, prior to SLOAN's own announcement. To his knowledge, no pressure had been exerted on SLOAN by any member of the CRP to encourage his resignation.

Mr. LARUE was asked if he had made a telephone call to SLOAN's residence on July 6, 1972, and, if so, to relate the substance of the conversation which had taken place in that telephone call. He related the following information:

Mr. LARUE, WDC, had experienced problems recently, in the coordination of the activities and efforts of the State Finance Committee and State Committee to Re-Elect the President in California. Mr. LARUE advised that one of his roles with the CRP is to deal with problems the CRP encounters and to insure that these problems are expeditiously solved in the best interest of the CRP. After becoming aware of problems being experienced by the CRP state organizations in California, Mr. LARUE discussed the situation with ROBERT HADJIAN, Special Assistant to the Campaign Manager, CRP. He subsequently made a personal decision to send SLOAN, Treasurer of the PCRP, to California to handle the problem. On July 6, 1972, Mr. LARUE called SLOAN at SLOAN's residence and instructed him to go to California to meet with State Committee heads in regard to their problems. At that time, Mr. LARUE indicated he had had no indication that SLOAN might be called to testify before a Federal Grand Jury at WDC in regard to burglary of the DNCH. Mr. LARUE stated that a meeting had been scheduled for Sunday night, July 9, 1972, in California between Mr. SLOAN and State Committeemen. He advised that he had not directed SLOAN to accomplish any other task while in California. He also indicated that he had had no idea how long SLOAN would remain in California. Mr. LARUE knew of no reason for SLOAN to visit any state other than California in connection with the instructions which he, LARUE, had given SLOAN on July 6, 1972. Mr. LARUE advised that he was unaware of any attempt to have SLOAN made unavailable for testimony before the Federal Grand Jury, WDC, through scheduling of SLOAN's duties and/or assignments with the CRP.

Mr. LARUE was asked if he had any knowledge of the testimony given by any member of the CRP before the Federal Grand Jury, WDC, which is currently conducting an investigation of the burglary of DNCH, WDC. Mr. LARUE was also asked to relate the source from whom he had obtained any such knowledge.

He replied that he had been present at meetings held at the CRP, WDC, in which the testimony of ROBERT COLE and JIM SEWART MACRODER of the CRP had been discussed. Mr. MACRODER is Deputy Campaign Director, CRP. Mr. LARUE was unable to identify other participants in those meetings.

He also stated that he had no knowledge whatsoever of the testimony given by any other CRP member before the noted Grand Jury.

Mr. LARUE was asked to relate the substance of his association with JAMES WALTER McCORD, JR., former Security Chief, CRP, WDC. He supplied the following information:

Mr. John Mitchell
Mr. LARUE advised that as a result of his personal connection to former Attorney General JOHN MITCHELL and Mrs. MARGARET MITCHELL, he had undertaken the responsibility for screening applicants to act as a security guard for Mrs. MITCHELL. He indicated that it had been necessary for him to secure security guards for Mrs. MITCHELL on three or four occasions. Mr. LARUE advised that he had contacted JAMES WALTER McCORD, JR., then Security Chief, CRP, in attempts to identify individuals who could be considered for the position of Mrs. MITCHELL's security guard. When it had been necessary to obtain such an individual, Mr. LARUE advised that he had requested McCORD to submit to him the names of individuals who might be qualified for and interested in such a position. McCORD subsequently supplied him with a list of several individuals. Subsequently, McCORD made such individuals available to LARUE for interview in connection with that position. On each occasion of such an interview, McCORD arranged for the applicant to submit a resume to LARUE. Mr. LARUE advised that he had, after interviewing several individuals, selected security guards for Mrs. MITCHELL on three or four occasions. He noted that subsequent to each interview he had returned that individual's resume to McCORD. He stated that he had not secured any application from any of the individuals whom he had interviewed. He also noted that he had with one exception, not discussed job salary in any of these interviews.

Mr. LARUE advised that he had interviewed ALFRED CARLETON BALDWIN, III, as a potential security guard for Mrs. MARGARET MITCHELL. BALDWIN, at McCORD's instructions, had submitted a resume to Mr. LARUE at the time of his interview. Mr. LARUE advised that he had subsequently hired BALDWIN as a security guard for Mrs. MITCHELL. However, he noted that he had returned BALDWIN's resume to McCORD. Although Mr. LARUE advised that he had been responsible

for hiring BALDWIN, he emphatically indicated that for all intents and purposes, BALDWIN's activities as Mrs. MITCHELL's security guard had been directed by Mrs. MITCHELL's personal secretary. He stated that he had made no arrangements with regard to the payment of any of Mrs. MITCHELL's security guards. He also advised that he had not supplied any of those individuals with any type of equipment.

Mr. LARUE advised that he had received a telephone call from BENJAMIN H. DAHLBERG, a Republican fund raiser from Minnesota during the latter part of June, 1972. On that occasion, Mr. DAHLBERG advised Mr. LARUE that he was attempting to contact Mr. MAURICE STANS, Chairman, FORP, in regard to a problem which he had encountered with a check. Mr. LARUE emphatically stated that his conversation with DAHLBERG at that time had been restricted to taking a message for Mr. STANS and subsequently advising Mr. DAHLBERG that he would ask Mr. STANS to recontact DAHLBERG.



Mrs. ~~HELEN~~ HODGES, nee PROSSER, 4071 Mandarin, Ft. Myers, Florida, Telephone 694-3325 was contacted relative to a long-distance telephone call to her residence from the Playboy Plaza Hotel, Miami Beach, Florida, on December 26, 1971. *N.Y.*

By way of background, Mrs. HODGES explained that her father, GEORGE PROSSER is the brother of JENNIE TOTTERDALE who is HOWARD HUNT'S grandmother. HOWARD HUNT and Mrs. HODGES have no brothers or sisters. From about 1920 to 1932, Mrs. HODGES spent her summers at JENNIE TOTTERDALE'S in New York, and at that time HOWARD HUNT lived across the street from the TOTTERDALE'S residence and Mrs. HODGES and HOWARD HUNT played and grew up together. Mrs. HODGES has known HUNT all his life and they have almost a brother - sister relationship. While the last time she saw HOWARD HUNT in person was in Florida during 1964, they send one another cards or notes periodically. She recalls receiving a note from him about July, 1971 in which he indicated he was then working on the White House Staff. She said that HUNT'S father was an attorney in the Ft. Lauderdale, Florida area years ago, and that HUNT had served in the U.S. Navy and had spent many years with the State Department.

Mrs. HODGES said she had seen in the newspaper where a part of a "bug" and a map of Democratic Headquarters had been found in HOWARD HUNT'S desk. It is Mrs. HODGES' opinion that someone must be trying to set him up because he is too smart to leave such things around.

Concerning the phone call to her home December 28, 1971, Mrs. HODGES said she could not specifically recall receiving such a call from HUNT during Christmas week. She may have but can't be sure. She does recall receiving a telephone call from him during the winter months but believed that it may have been in October or November rather than December.

Mrs. POULOS advised that she knows no one named FRANK STENGIS or FRANK ANTHONY FIORINI. POULOS has lived in Clearwater, Florida, area until approximately April 1971, at which time she moved to her current address 1404 1/2 Avenue North St. Petersburg, Florida, where she is living with her boyfriend, WILLIAM PIZ. POULOS stated while living in Clearwater, Florida, her telephone number was either 443-1495 or 447-1495. She was not sure which number was correct, but feels that the 443 exchange is the correct exchange.

POULOS was advised that her telephone number, 443-1495 had been located by Bureau Agents during the course of an official Bureau investigation. She explained that she has been divorced for approximately two years and that since her divorce she has frequented the local bars and has met many men. She further advised that she has given her telephone number to many men that she has met at these bars and that is the only explanation that she can give regarding her telephone number being located by the Bureau Agents.

MR. JACK (NO MIDDLE NAME) STEWART, voluntarily appeared at the St. Petersburg Resident Agency of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) on July 13, 1972. STEWART was advised of the identity of the interviewing agents and provided with a "Voluntary appearance; Advice of Rights" form, which he read and thereafter completed in the presence of interviewing agents. STEWART was advised that the purpose of the interview pertained to the activities which took place at the Democratic National Convention on June 17, 1972, in which JAMES V. MC GORD, HAROLD BARKER and others were arrested. STEWART was advised that more specifically, he was being interviewed regarding contacts he has had with Mr. EVERETT HOWARD MONT or Mr. CLYDE L. BARKER, and information he has pertaining to past and present activities.

STEWART had not heard from MONT again all late February or early March, 1972, when MONT telephoned a long distance inquiring as to whether he (STEWART) wanted to. STEWART advised MONT that he was interested and MONT thereafter gave him a telephone number in Miami, Florida, of CLYDE BARKER. (c)

STEWART advised that he never contacted BARKER and during the conversation, BARKER invited (c)

him to come to Miami in order that they might talk business. BARKER purchased air transportation for STEWART and made arrangements for STEWART to pick up his airline tickets at Tampa International Airport on a willcall basis. STEWART stated that he is not certain whether he called BARKER or BARKER had contacted him on the initial telephone call. (C)

In late February or early March, shortly after the telephone conversation that BARKER had with STEWART, STEWART flew to Miami where he was contacted by BARKER. BARKER took him to lunch and they later toured the area surrounding the convention center in Miami. Afterwards, BARKER took STEWART to his real estate office where he was introduced to three other men, whose names he does not recall. BARKER explained to STEWART that they were concerned about the upcoming National Democratic Convention to be held later in the year at Miami and therefore, wanted to take necessary steps to collect information pertaining to the activities of the Democratic Convention. BARKER asked STEWART if he would help by setting up, coordinating and supervising communications of their group during the convention. STEWART advised he was not clear as to what he was to do, but assumed he was to receive intelligence data from other individuals and disseminate, through proper channels, to other members of the group who could use it for propaganda purposes. The preliminary plans as told to STEWART were that the command post would be set up in a houseboat off the Miami shore line.

STEWART did not know where the funds were coming from to support the activities but got the impression that BERNIE BARKER felt they were coming from HOWARD HUNT.

While at the office of BARKER, STEWART observed reports concerning proposed action to be taken during the Democratic Convention. These reports pertained to proposals of "Goon Squads" to confront the "Hippie Element" at the Democratic Convention. The reports also pertained to intelligence data concerning availability of living quarters in the Miami area. STEWART stated that other reports were present, but that he could not recall the substance of the reports.

STEWART advised that he left BARKER and the Miami, Florida, area on the same day he arrived, and shortly after returning to St. Petersburg, he telephonically contacted HUNT and advised him that he was not interested in the job. HUNT advised STEWART that he was sorry that STEWART was not going in with them and made further comments that he would have to find a key man. STEWART feels that the key man pertained to someone that was an expert on locks.

STEWART stated that at no time in any of the conversation was there any mention of electronic surveillance or "bugs" nor was there any mention of the Democratic National Headquarters in Washington, D.C. He stated that he was completely surprised when he heard of the arrest of MC CORD, BARKER, and others at the Democratic Headquarters in Washington, D.C.

STEWART also advised that he has made only two telephone calls to MUNT and BARKER.

STEWART advised that on June 20, 1972, he left the St. Petersburg, Florida, area en route to the Washington, D.C. area, where he intended to assist EARL WILLIAMSON, who was in the process of liquidating his household goods and moving to Puerto Rico. [REDACTED] B1

[REDACTED] STEWART drove his van type automobile to Washington, D.C., where he resided with the WILLIAMSONS while he was assisting them in packing their household goods and repairing woodwork in the WILLIAMSON's house. STEWART advised that they closed WILLIAMSON's house around the end of June and that they stayed at another friend's house until July 3, 1972, at which time they proceeded along the east coast in a southerly direction to Miami, Florida. STEWART advised they arrived in Miami, Florida, on July 6, 1972, and remained there until July 11, 1972, at which time WILLIAMSONS departed for Dominican Republic and he, (STEWART), returned to his home in St. Petersburg. At 4:00 p.m. on 6/21/72, Mr. Felt, SAC Kunkel of WFO and I met with Mr. Gray on this case. We brought him up to date on all aspects. It was agreed that this was most important, that the FBI's reputation was at stake, and that the investigation should be completely impartial, thorough and complete. Several points were discussed and these have already been furnished to the field for handling, such as reinterview with McCuin to identify the Secret Service official, further details regarding the \$100 bills.

In answer to our question, Mr. Gray instructed as follows:
Hold up any dissemination of this information to Department or White House. Hold up electronic sweep. Hold any interviews of White House personnel.

SAC Kunkel broached the theory that this was in furtherance of the White House efforts to locate and identify "leaks." It was admitted this was a theory. Mr. Gray said we should, of course, consider this but not let it influence our complete investigation. I assured him the investigation was going full speed and that I would keep him briefed on any developments.

At Mr. Gray's request, SAC Kunkel and I met with him at 9:30 a.m., 6/22/72. He was brought up to date on developments overnight and was informed that all points he raised yesterday were being thoroughly explored. At this meeting he again instructed that the dissemination be held up and that the electronic sweeps be held. I told him that both the CIA and the Metropolitan Police had inquired of WFO about briefings in this matter and that I felt we should brief no one. He agreed.

At 10:25 a. m. , Mr. Gray called me and authorized our making an offer to the Democratic National Committee, the Credentials Committee, and the Republican National Committee for electronic sweep of their facilities. He also authorized a contact with Mr. John Dean of the White House regarding interviews and information needed there. *Hunt to call.*
This is being immediately handled by WFO.

While on the phone with him, I advised him of a new development: Subject Barker had tried to cash a cashier's check with the Republic National Bank, Miami, on 4/24/72. This check was drawn on the Boca Raton Bank and was for \$25,000. The Republic Bank checked with the Boca Raton Bank and they were advised the check was good and had been obtained by Mr. Kenneth Harry Dahlberg. Our files show Dahlberg was investigated at the request of the White House in December, 1969. He is an industrialist from Minnesota, is a millionaire, and has been active in the Republican Party in the Midwest for a number of years. The White House records disclosed he was not presently connected with the White House.

I talked to Mr. Gray again at 5 p. m. on 6/22/72 after his return to the office. I again went over the latest developments.

At 3:15 pm on 6/23/72 Mr. Gray called me. He said he had just talked to the Deputy Director of CIA in his office and he briefed me in detail regarding the conversation. I again told him I felt the FBI had no choice but to continue our full investigation and obtain all the details. He agreed.

At 6:00 p. m. on 6/23/72 Mr. Gray called me. He said he had just talked with Sandy Smith, a reporter for TIME magazine. Smith told him that TIME had adverse information affecting Mr. Gray but not affecting the FBI; that Gray had refused to permit Agents to check Colson's telephone toll calls and to interview him and that Gray had instructed this investigation be wrapped up in 24-48 hours, the inference being it would be a whitewash by the FBI on Gray's instructions. Mr. Gray told me he told Smith that the question had not arisen regarding Colson's toll calls; that we had checked with Colson to get toll calls made by Hunt; that he had not instructed the case be wrapped up in 48 hours but had instructed that it receive immediate priority attention and that he had indicated he had held up the electronic sweep of the Democratic and Republican headquarters until he had all necessary facts and that the sweep had now been ordered. Mr. Gray instructed that I have all Agents in

WFO who had worked on this case in his office at 11 a. m. 6/24/72 (Saturday). I so instructed Supervisor John Ruhl of WFO and later passed these instructions on to SAC Kunkel.

On Saturday morning, 6/24/72, at 8:58 a. m., Sandy Smith called for me. I was away from my office and he asked that I call him at area 1 code 301 757-4835. I contacted Mr. Gray at home and told him if he had no objection I would call Smith back and see what he wanted. At 10:16 a. m. 6/24/72 I called Sandy Smith. He told me he was working as a reporter for TIME magazine and that his present assignment was to dig into the burglary at Democratic National Headquarters. He commented that the editors of TIME and some reporters do not like the FBI. He said he was not one of these. His editors have received information in this case about Mr. Gray's performance. The source is Democratic and probably a member of Larry O'Brien's staff. The information TIME has is as follows:

- (1) Mr. Gray met with Mr. Mitchell last weekend in California and discussed this case.
- (2) Mr. Gray told Agents to wrap this case up in 24 hours.
- (3) Mr. Gray prevented Agents from checking Colson's phone calls.

Smith said his editors wanted him to check this out and they wanted to quote someone in the magazine. Smith then related his telephone call to Mr. Gray and Mr. Gray's answers to the above:

- (1) No. Both were in California but they did not meet.
- (2) He did not instruct that the case be wrapped up in 48 hours but did hold up the sweep until we could get all of our ducks in a row. This has now been authorized.
- (3) The question of Colson's telephone calls never came up - we were checking out Hunt. This has been done and no records are maintained at the White House as to Hunt's calls.

Smith said he gave all of this to his editors in New York; that TIME called him back and wanted him to find out why Colson's calls were not checked. He called Mr. Gray back. Mr. Gray told him that he did not intend to go in to details as to our investigation and had no comment on this. Mr. Gray told Smith that this was obviously an effort to malign the FBI. Smith told Mr. Gray he would certainly do nothing in this regard as he had only the highest admiration for the FBI.

Smith told me he merely wanted to let me know what had happened and was asking for no information. None was given. He pointed out that he does not write this story he merely furnishes the information to New York where it is written. Smith is reasonably certain TIME will not comment regarding the alleged Mitchell-Gray meeting. They will not comment on the 48-hour matter. Insofar as Colson is concerned, he does not know. He will find out later today what will be written on this and will call me.

Smith said there was a rumor around town which was being spread by Larry O'Brien that they can't trust the FBI; that the MPD inventory of equipment found and FBI's inventory do not jive. Some of the equipment is Government property. I told Smith this was absolutely false and had no basis in truth whatsoever. Smith said O'Brien wants to show that President Nixon is behind this and that the FBI will whitewash it and get out of the case quickly.

I immediately called Mr. Gray and relayed to him Smith's conversation with me.

At 11:00 a.m. I met with Mr. Gray, SAC Kunkel, and 27 WFO Agents. Mr. Gray pointed out the seriousness of this leak to the news media concerning our investigation. He said he would not put up with this, that there was no excuse for it, and he wanted it stopped. He said there was no place in the FBI for loose-lipped Agents. Mr. Gray was very forceful about this, and rightly so. After he dismissed the Agents he conferred with me and SAC Kunkel. We again went over leads in this case. After Kunkel left Mr. Gray instructed that I furnish to him all of the current information we have and I gave him all of my ticklers. He said he wanted to review these himself.

Mr. Gray called me at home Saturday afternoon, 6/24/72. He said he wanted to have delivered to him at his apartment by noon Sunday, 6/25/72, all of the information in whatever form available known to WFO. SAC Kunkel was so instructed and at noon 6/25/72 delivered to Mr. Gray several volumes of teletypes, inserts and other material.

At 5:50 p.m. on 6/24/72 Sandy Smith called me. Said he had learned that the TIME article would be reduced to a minimum. No mention will be made of the FBI-MPD inventory. No mention will be made of the 48-hr. matter. The article would read as follows:

"It is inevitable that some were watching the FBI to see that there was no whitewash based on White House instructions. Mr. Mitchell and Mr. Gray were in California at the same time. Both have denied meeting. Mr. Colson was interviewed re telephone calls made by Mr. Hunt but no records are kept of these."

Smith said he tried to get deleted completely the Mitchell-Gray thing but his editors would not budge. I immediately relayed this information to Mr. Gray. He told me he had talked with Larry O'Brien on the telephone concerning the above information I gave to Mr. Gray from Sandy Smith. He said O'Brien commented that he had the highest regard for the FBI and wanted Mr. Gray to know that the investigation so far had been conducted in an excellent, thorough manner so far as he was concerned, that all he wanted was a full, thorough and complete investigation. Mr. Gray told him this was being done.

At 9:15 a.m. 6/27/72 Mr. Felt and I met with Mr. Gray on this matter. I furnished him at his request up-to-date copies of teletypes from WFO and a list of witnesses to appear before the Federal Grand Jury. I also discussed with Mr. Gray the attached items: (Attachment No. 1) *John Dean*

While in Mr. Gray's office Mr. John Dean of the White House called him. Mr. Gray inquired of him regarding Item No. 1 on attachment. Mr. Dean said that on June 19, Mr. Fred Fielding of the White House took everything from Hunt's office, put it in boxes, and it has been under guard since. All of this was delivered yesterday (6/26/72) to WFO. The question of custody and chain of evidence can be obtained from Mr. Fielding. Mr. Dean said that he would be happy to furnish any photographs WFO desired in connection with the matter on No. 3 of attachment.

Mr. Gray also discussed with Mr. Dean the Dahlberg matter and pointed out to him that if Dahlberg continued to refuse to talk to us he would obviously be called before the grand jury. After leaving Mr. Gray's office I passed the above information to SAC Kunkel so that it could be immediately handled.

Mr. Gray said that after his detailed review of all the information in this matter he was convinced that it was a CIA or a political operation or both. Both Mr. Felt and I pointed out it was extremely important that the FBI continue its aggressive, thorough investigation until we determine the motive, reasons and identity of all persons concerned. We pointed out that Mr. Gray may possibly be called to testify at some later date before a congressional committee and we could not afford to have the FBI accused of not pursuing this matter to the end. Mr. Gray agreed completely. As a matter of fact he indicated this position to Mr. Dean on the telephone.

Mr. Gray asked that I brief Mr. Felt completely on prior developments in this matter which I have done.

At 11:40 a. m. 6/27/72, Mr. Felt called me and advised that I was to attend a meeting in Mr. Gray's office at 2:30 p. m. Wednesday, 6/28/72. At the meeting would be Mr. Gray, Mr. Felt, CIA Director Helms, his deputy, and I.

On morning of 6/28/72 Mr. Felt advised me that a meeting with CIA representatives had been cancelled. Mr. Gray would see Mr. Felt and I at 2:30 p. m. At that time Mr. Gray was brought up to date on all developments in this case. He said he did not feel it was the appropriate time to sit down with CIA; that we needed to get our "ducks in a row." Mr. Gray opined this operation was either a CIA covert activity or political in nature or both. I pointed out that under no circumstances should we back off of any investigation at the request of CIA without forcing them to reveal completely their interest in this matter. Mr. Felt and I both pointed out that the FBI's reputation was at stake as well as Mr. Gray's position; that we did not feel we should hold back under any circumstances unless the reasons therefore were publicly expressed. Mr. Gray made it plain that he would not hold back the FBI in this investigation at anyone's request, including the President of the U. S., and if he were ordered to do so he would resign.

We discussed with him a list of 8 leads that should be covered at the Committee to Reelect the President. He told Felt to check with John Dean at the White House on this. As a followup, Felt advised me at 3:45 p. m. 6/29/72 that he had called John Dean regarding these leads. Dean said he would check and call him back. Felt instructed that if we had received no word by cob 6/29/72 that WFO should go ahead the first thing the morning of 6/30/72. SAC Kunkel was so advised.

On 6/28/72 Mr. Felt instructed me not to interview [REDACTED] His instructions had come from Mr. Gray who received a call from Helms that these 2 men [REDACTED] and he requested we not interview or investigate them at this stage. I relayed these instructions to SAC Kunkel, WFO, and SAC McDermott, Alexandria. McDermott advised that Caswell had been interviewed on the evening of 6/27/72 but that he would call the Agent off of the [REDACTED] b1

Also on 6/28/72 Mr. Felt instructed that we discontinue a lead to interview and investigate Kathleen Chenow. This was done.

9 Mr. John Dean of the White House has informed the WFO that he has obtained material belonging to Hunt, including photographs and letters which he would turn over to Agents Monday morning. Agents were there but the matter seemed to be up in the air. As of 3:30 the Agents were still at Mr. Dean's office but the material had not been furnished.

10 General Redman, White House Communications Agency, has informed WFO that he can furnish to them all of Hunt's toll calls from the White House with approval from somebody at the White House.

[REDACTED] Bouman says that Hunt had offered him a position in the "security field" and indicated an association with the Republican Party. Bouman subsequently met with Hunt at the Playboy Club in Miami on 12/28/71. Present with Hunt was an individual whom Hunt did not identify. He was described as a white male, 33-42 years old; 5' 8" to 5' 10"; 160 lbs.; black hair - receding. Hunt discussed the need for a security program for the Republican Party. This unidentified man did not participate in the conversation. (c) **B1**

At Hunt's request Bouman flew to Washington in January of 1972. He called Hunt at the White House. Hunt and the same unidentified man came to the Hay-Adams Hotel. Bouman was again offered the same security job. He noted that the unidentified man had initialed cufflinks which did not correspond to the first name used by Hunt.

Mr. Kunkel, SAC - WFO, would like to obtain photographs of Dave Young, Wilson and Butterfield so that Bouman may review them in an attempt to identify this third individual.

Mr. Kenneth H. Dahlberg was again contacted at his residence the morning of June 26. On advice of his Washington attorney he would not be interviewed, he would not furnish name of attorney without attorney's OK, he was unable to contact attorney but left word at attorney's office and will contact our Minneapolis Office after he hears from attorney. It appears to me that Dahlberg is under wraps not to talk to us.

- (2) What were McCord's duties and who did he report to, or was responsible to?
- (3) How did McCord's job as Chief of Security tie-in, or did it, with his duties regarding recruiting individuals for the security squad assigned to guard the Mitchell family? Also, did the Committee pay the salaries of persons on the Mitchell family security guard? (Note: Alfred C. Baldwin, former FBI Agent, identified as being in the Howard Johnson Motel during the period 5/5/72 - 6/17/72. This motel is located across from the Watergate location of the Democratic Party headquarters. Baldwin is also known to have been assigned to guarding of Martha Mitchell in April, 1972.)
- (4) Determine the Committee's knowledge of a bank account opened by McCord at National Savings and Trust, Washington, D. C., in the name of "Dedicated Friends For a Better America" showing McCord as Chairman. This account was opened in February, 1972 and closed in April, 1972 and \$90,000 passed through it during this period.
- (5) To whom did McCord report concerning transactions in the foregoing account and what was use made of such funds, namely, were they for McCord's use in connection with his security responsibilities.
- (6) Determine identity of any similar accounts which McCord may have opened.
- (7) Who did McCord recruit to assist him in the work of the Committee.
- (8) Determine the Committee's knowledge of and/or contacts made with the Committee by Alfred C. Baldwin (known to have telephonically contacted the Committee from Connecticut on 6/19/72, following 6/17/72, arrest of subjects); Everette Howard Hunt; Kenneth Dahlberg; and Michael Douglas Caddy.

(Note Hunt's White House file has notation 3/29/72, Hunt could be more effective at "1701." Committee's address is 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N. W., and according to Charles Colson 3/29/72, is last date Hunt employed by White House.)

On the morning of 6/29/72 Mr. Felt, after talking with Mr. Gray, instructed that to hold up any interviews or investigation of George Munroe, CIA, Mexico City, and Ogarrio of Mexico City and Kenneth Dahlberg. I told him this would be done. I pointed out that I had no objection to temporarily holding up these leads but I strongly felt that they should eventually be covered - regardless.

Mr. Gray confidentially advised at the meeting on the afternoon of 6/28/72 that he had an appointment at the White House at 6:30 p. m. that day. Mr. Felt and I both reiterated the absolute necessity that nothing deter the FBI from a complete and thorough investigation.

At 10:15 a. m. 6/30/72 SAC Kunkel advised me that AUSA Silbert had told him that he and USA Titus felt there was some delay on the part of the FBI in certain aspects of this investigation. He referred to the interviews of Dave Young, Chenow, Ogarrio and the receipt of copies of the reports. Silbert said they wanted to move rapidly, that AAG Petersen had so instructed them. I discussed this with Mr. Felt.

At 12:50 p. m. 6/30/72 Mr. Felt told me that John Dean of the White House had said to hold off interview of Young until Dean talks with Mr. Gray.

At 1:25 p. m. Felt told me it was all right to interview Young, that he would be made available at the White House Monday morning (7/3/72). Chenow is returning from England and will be available next week for interview. Dean will let us know specifically. Dean will sit in on these interviews. SAC Kunkel advised.

At 12:30 p. m. 6/30/72 Mr. Felt stated it was OK for Agents to interview John Mitchell and to reinterview Dahlberg. WFO was advised on the interview of Mitchell and SAC Minneapolis was advised re Dahlberg.

At 1:25 p. m. Mr. Felt advised that Dean had talked to Mr. Gray and we were not to interview Dahlberg at this time. SAC Minneapolis so informed.

A phone call was received from AAG Petersen asking for an informal summary of information on Dahlberg. This was prepared and hand delivered to him at 2:00 p. m. Also on Mr. Felt's instructions copies of our reports have been delivered to Petersen and to the U. S. Attorney.

At 2:30 p. m. on 7/3/72 SAC Kunkel and I met with Mr. Gray. He was brought up to date on all developments. Mr. Gray commented that he was not going to hold off on any phase of this investigation at the request of anyone. He made the comment that he did not feel that John Dean or Charles Colson were involved in any way but had the feeling that Ehrlichman "was caught up in something." He requested that we investigate the complete background of Fiorini (true name Sturgis) and all of his activities and associates. Such investigation was ordered in Miami. He also instructed that we check out thoroughly and completely Felipe De Diego. This was also ordered.

On the morning of 7/5/72 I delivered to Mr. Felt and to Mr. Gray the interview of Miss Gleason. At 9:45 on 7/5/72 SAC Kunkel called. He said that Attorney Bittman will let AUSA Silbert know by noon as to when he will make Hunt available for an interview by the FBI. Mr. Felt was immediately advised. It later turned out that Bittman did not call Silbert back on 7/5/72.

At 12:05 p. m. 7/5/72 Mr. Felt called and instructed that I tell SAC Kunkel that if they have a good prospect at the Committee to Reelect the President they should attempt to make a contact with them at home or away from the office and see if they would be willing to talk with the FBI without an attorney present. Kunkel said this would be considered.

At 2:45 p. m. 7/5/72 SAC Kunkel advised that Baldwin was thinking about taking the fifth amendment before the Grand Jury. He also said that Jerry Alch, an attorney in the F. Lee Bailey firm, was representing McCord. Ten people at the Committee to Reelect the President are to be served with subpoenas on the morning of 7/6/72 to appear before the Grand Jury. They will go immediately to the U. S. Attorney's office and there will be given an opportunity of talking to the FBI before appearing at the Grand Jury. Mr. Gray was advised of this at 2:50 p. m.

At 4:30 p. m. 7/5/72 SAC Kunkel advised that Baldwin had agreed to talk to the FBI and that Agents were on the way to see him. At 4:50 p. m. Mr. Gray called and said he had finished reading the Gleason interview. Mr. Gray said that Agents should go after Odle on the night of 7/5/72 and see if he would talk to the FBI. I immediately relayed this to SAC Kunkel. Kunkel felt that if we hit Odle and he refused to talk it would give him an opportunity to get his story straight before being subpoenaed before the Grand Jury on the morning of 7/6/72. I relayed this to Mr. Gray and told him I

agreed with Kunkel. He said he also agreed and we should hold up on this.

At 10:30 a.m. on 7/6/72, Mr. Gray advised me he had talked with General Walters of CIA. He told Walters that he must have a communication from CIA in writing explaining why and requesting that we hold up any interview or investigation of Ogarric and Dahlberg. General Walters said he would have a communication to Mr. Gray by 11 a.m. on 7/6/72. Mr. Gray said if this was not forthcoming at that time we should proceed. As a follow up to this Mr. Gray advised me at 10:30 a.m. on 7/6/72 that he had received the CIA letter, that it was not pertinent, and that we should immediately interview Ogarric and Dahlberg. Instructions were given to have this done.

At 10:30 a.m. on 7/6/72 I gave Mr. Gray the WFO teletype reflecting the interview with Baldwin. SAC Kunkel and Mr. Felt were with me. It was agreed we would hold up any search warrant of McCord's home because of the necessity of identifying Baldwin as the source and in view of the elapsed time since McCord's arrest we will consider this later.

WHITE HOUSE INTERVIEWS

At 11:30 A.M. this morning, WFO Agents arranged for interview with Charles Colson, Special Counsel to the President in the presence of John Deane. Agents had definite impression Colson had been previously interviewed by Deane. Colson denied any knowledge of Hunt's involvement in this matter and stated Hunt's assignment with White House terminated 3/29/72. Colson stated Hunt's assignment would not to his knowledge have required contacts with individuals such as subjects of this matter.

Mr. Deane is arranging for Bureau to receive all toll calls made from Hunt's office since March, 1972.

ELECTRONIC SWEEPS

Arrangements have been made with Mr. Lawrence O'Brien, Chairman, Democratic Party, for an electronic sweep of his office. According to the Lab the initial contact with the Democratic Party, National Committee Office, will be tomorrow morning (Friday).

Contact was also made of Mr. Robert Dole to arrange similar sweep of Republican Party Headquarters. Call was placed to former Attorney General Mitchell by SAC, WFO, and for Assistant Attorney General Mardian returned this call and concurred in the agreement that the Republican Party Headquarters should also be electronically swept. This will be done following the sweep of the Democratic Party Headquarters.

MIAMI PHOTOGRAPHS

Miami office has advised that a Cuban photographer has been identified to them by a private detective as having developed two rolls of 35 mm film on or about 6/10/72, with three individuals one of whom he weakly identified as subject Barker, another of whom he positively identifies as subject Fiorini and the third he cannot identify. Foregoing is based upon Agents interview of the photographer who stated that he was contacted as indicated above on 6/10 by these individuals who wanted a rush job done in developing two rolls of 35 mm film. According to the photographer he made 40 7 x 10 prints for them which the individuals paid \$75 plus a \$20 deposit which they forgot about in their hurry to leave his shop upon completion of the developing. According to the photographer many of these pictures as he recalls were onion skin copies of letterhead paper of the Chairman of the Democratic National Party. He specifically recalls seeing Larry O'Brien's name signed to some of this correspondence. According to the photographer visible in the picture is a shag rug on which the document being photographed was placed and visible on each of the corners are hands wearing what appeared to be rubber gloves.

\$25,000 CASHIERS CHECK

Miami has determined from records of ~~Republic~~ Republican National Bank that subject Bernard L. Barker on 4/24/72, cashed a cashiers check from Kenneth Harry Dahlberg on whom we did White House inquiry in December of 1969 to January, 1970. Dahlberg has closed his winter home at Boca Raton, Florida, and reportedly is in Minneapolis. Minneapolis instructed to interview Dahlberg concerning this check.

MC CORD'S BANK ACCOUNT

Subpoena has been served on McCord's bank, Rockville, Maryland, for production of all bank records concerning McCord's account. These records are expected to be produced shortly.
