Statement of ALFRED CARLETON BALDWIN, III set forth. MAURICE STANS, Chairman of Finance Committee for Committee to Re-Elect the President, (CTRP), acknowledged receipt of KENNETH DAHLBERG \$25,000 cashier's check and turned some checks over to HUGH W. SLOAN, Treasurer. Check dated after 4/7/72, therefore, SLOAN turned check over to GEORGE GORDON LIDDY for legal opinion to how best handle receipt and reporting said check. Could not explain how this check was deposited in account of BERNARD L. BARKER, Miami, Florida. Further stated SLOAN told him, \$100,000 had been received from Mexico on 4/6/72 and accounted for as "cash on hand". STANS could not emplain how only \$89,000 was received or how the \$89,000 also ended up in BARKER's account. Info re travel of HUNT and LIDDY by American Airlines on 9/4/71 set forth. 7/11/72 - LIDDY refused to discuss case with agents. Receiver purchased by MC CORD; and used at Howard Johnson Motel to "Monitor calls" purchased. on 5/10/72; MC CORD paid for reciever with 35 \$100.00 bills. Additional toll calls and FBI Lab reports set forth.



ALFRED CARLETON BALDWIN, 90 Mountain View Terrace, Hamden, Connecticut, home telephone number 203-248-5764, appeared at the United States Attorney's Office, Washington, D.C., and volunteered the following information in the presence of his Attorney, ROBERT MIRTO, Assistant United States Attorneys EARL J. SILBERT and DONALD E. CAMPBELL, and Special Agents ANGELO J. LANO and DANIEL C. MAHAN:

On the evening of May 1, 1972, he received a telephone call at his home in Hamden, Connecticut, from an individual who identified himself as JAMES MG CORD, Security Coordinator for the Committee to Re-Elect the President, Washington, D.C. Mr. MC CORD advised Mr. BALDWIN that he received Mr. BALDWIN's name and address from the Ex-FBI Agent Society in New York City, and asked Mr. BALDWIN if he was interested in employment with the aforementioned Cormittee. The discussion regarding employment was very general, but Mr. MC CORD stated that it was in the security area, that he had an immediate need, that the possibility of employment might only be temporary but that possibly permanent employment could be secured after the November, 1972 Presidential election. Mr. MC CORD discussed the salary for BALDWIN as approximately \$16,000 to \$20,000 per annum and requested BALDWIN to determine if he could make airline arrangements to travel to the District of Columbia that evening, at which time Mr. MC CORD provided BALDWIN the telephone number, area code 202-333-6120 or 6121. and advised BALDWIN to call him collect at either of those numbers if the aforementioned airline connections could be made.

Mr. BALDWIN stated that he made arrangements with Allegheny Airlines that evening on a flight leaving New Haven, Connecticut at 8:18 p.m., and scheduled to arrive in the District of Columbia at 10:30 p.m. Mr. BALDWIN pointed out that this flight required one stop in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Upon making reservations on this flight, BALDWIN contacted MC CORD at the above-mentioned telephone numbers and gave him the time of arrival in Washington,

D.C. However, during this flight to Washington, D.C., the airplane suffered problems with the baggage compartment door in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, necessitating the airplane to return to Philadelphia three times. As a result of the airplane problem BALDWIN arrived in Washington, D.C., shortly after 1:00 a.m. Mr. BALDWIN traveled from the Washington National Airport to the Roger Smith Hotel located at 18th Street and Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C., by taxi.

On the morning of May 2, 1972, at approximately 8:00 a.m., Mr. BALDWIN telephonically contacted Mr. MC CORD at the Committee to Re-Elect the President, explained his airline problem, and arranged to meet Mr. MC CORD for breakfast at the Roger Smith Hotel.

During this breakfast meeting with Mr. MC CORD, Mr. BALDWIN's duties with the Committee to Re-Elect the President were discussed and he was advised by Mr. MC CORD that he would be employed as a Security Officer for Mrs. MARTHAMMITCHELL. MC CORD stated that they were having problems with other security men memployed in this capacity due to some peculiarities of Mrs. MITCHELL. Mr. MC CORD and Mr. BALDWIN then traveled to the Committee to Re-Elect the President where BALDWIN was introduced to BOB HOUSTON, MC CORD's assistant. BALDWIN described HOUSTON as a former Master Sergeant in the United States Army, retired. He was also introduced to an individual by the name of TOM (last name unknown), who was a Security Officer for Mrs. MITCHELL in the Washington, D.C. area only. Mr. BALDWIN was also introduced to a CHRIS FROSBERG (phonetic), private secretary to Mrs. MITCHELL.

Mr. BALDWIN pointed out that on this date JOHN EDGAR HOOVER, Director of the FBI, had passed away and that a planned trip for Mrs. MITCHELL commencing that afternoon was in doubt, as it was not known at that time if she would embark on this trip or remain in the Washington, D.C. area to attend funeral services for Mr. HOOVER. During this time Mr. BALDWIN waited in order to meet with a Mr. FREDNLA RUE. That day he traveled with Mr. MC CORD to the fourth floor of the building housing the Committee to Re-Elect the President and met Mr. LA RUE in his office. Mr. MC CORD furnished Mr. LA RUE with BALDWIN's resume. Mr. LA RUE

directed a few questions to Mr. BALDWIN and advised him, BALDWIN, that it was not decided at that time if the trip for Mrs. MITCHELL was defenite. BALDWIN advised that this meeting with Mr. LA RUE was quite brief and that he and Mr. MC CORD left Mr. LA RUE's office together. However, upon leaving Mr. LA RUE's office, Mr. MC CORD and Mr. LA RUE exchanged some conversation which was inaudible to BALDWIN. Upon leaving the office Mr. MC CORD advised Mr. BALDWIN that everything looked good.

Mr. BALDWIN and Mr. MC CORD returned to the Security Office on the third floor of that building where he again met with TOM (last name unknown), chauffeur and security officer for Mrs. MITCHELL in Washington, D.C., at which time TOM filled in BALDWIN on Mrs. MITCHELL's personal tastes. BALDWIN described TOM as a light complected Negro male. During this time BALDWIN inquired of MC CORD as to Mr. LA RUE's position with the Committee and was told by MC CORD that LA RUE came over from the White House and that he was like a number two man to Mr. JOHN MITCHELL, but that he never received direct information as to Mr. LA RUE's position with the Committee.

Mr. BALDWIN was then introduced to an individual by the name of "CORKY" or "SNOOPY," another driver for Mrs. MITCHELL, and was given a tour of the third floor of the Committee to Re-Elect the President, where the security aspects of the floor were pointed out to him. During this time MC CORD advised BALDWIN that while he was traveling with Mrs. MITCHELL he would receive \$70 per day salary and unlimited expenses regarding this trip.

Shortly thereafter, CHRIS FROSBERG, Mrs. MITCHELL's secretary, advised him and MC CORD that the trip was definitely on.

MC CORD then gave BALDWIN \$800 in cash, all in \$100 bills, and was advised that Mr. LA RUE would be traveling with Mrs. MITCHELL. In regard to the money received from MC CORD, BALDWIN was required to sign a piece of paper of a yellow legal-size pad indicating that he had received this money. Upon signing this paper MC CORD placed it in his wallet. Mr. MC CORD also provided





BALDWIN with a Smith and Wesson Chief Special, 2 inch barrel, .38 caliber revolver in a holster, and Mr. MC CORD's identification indicating employment with the Committee to Re-Elect the President. BALDWIN stated that he questioned the legality of his carrying this weapon. MC CORD stated that if he was challenged by anyone that he should advise them to contact the Committee and that the matter would be taken care of. BALDWIN stated that he was satisfied with this exploration as the former Attorney General JOHN MITCHELL was head of that Committee.

Mr. BALDWIN then traveled to the Watergate Apartments, Mrs. MITCHELL's apartment in particular, and was driven to the Union Station of Washington, D.C., where they were to take an AMTRAK train to Chicago, Illinois. At this point Mr. BALDWIN stated that he had checked out of the Roger Smith Hotel earlier that day and had previously seen an itinerary of travel in MC CORD's possession and was given brief instructions based on this itinerary, such as the accounting of all Mrs. MITCHELL's luggage and in particular the protection of her jewelry. Mrs. MITCHELL's trip was to last eight or nine days.

During this period of time Mr. BALDWIN accompanied Mrs. MITCHELL to Chicago, Illinois; Detroit, Michigan; Bloomfield Hills, Michigan; Clinton, Michigan; Grosse Pointe, Michigan; Bronxville, New York; New York City, New York; Tarrytown, New York; Brooklyn, New York; and on to Washington, D.C.

While Mrs. MITCHELL was staying at the Kingsley Inn in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan, Mr. FRED LA RUE flew into that area from Washington, D.C., and stayed at the Inn with Mrs. MITCHELL's party for approximately two days, and while there engaged in discussion with Mr. BALDWIN and eventually their conversation evolved around the weapon, previously described, being carried by BALDWIN. At this point Mr. LA RUE made the comment that this particular weapon belonged to him, LA RUE.

Mr. BALDWIN advised that Mrs. MITCHELL's party eventually returned to Washington, D.C., on Monday, May 8, 1972, on a Metroliner train, arriving in Washington, D.C., at approximately 7:00 p.m., where TOM (last name unknown), previously mentioned,





and "CORKY" or "SNOOPY" met them at the Union Station in Washington, D.C., where they traveled to Mrs. MITCHELL's apartment at the Watergate Apartments on Virginia Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. After unloading Mrs. MITCHELL's luggage, Mr. BALDWIN then checked into the Roger Smith Hotel on 18th Street and Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C.

On Tuesday, May 9, 1972, Mr. BALDWIN stated MC CORD returned to the Committee to Re-Elect the President where he was provided an employment application for that Committee by BOB HOUSTON. Mr. BALDWIN completed this application and returned it to Mr. HOUSTON and he, HOUSTON, placed it in a drawer of Mr. MC CORD's desk located in the Security Office of the Committee to Re-Elect the President. Mr. BALDWIN stated that this application consisted of two pages on one sheet of paper, front and back. Mr. BALDWIN further stated that he was required to fill out additional papers regarding his trip with Mrs. MITCHELL, including an itinerary of expenses, which he furnished to Mr. MC CORD. BALDWIN also prepared a thank you letter to a police officer of the Chicago, Illinois Police Department in that he was particularly helpful in a train station located in that city during their recent trip. BALDWIN stated that he submitted detailed expenses amounting to a total of \$429.84 for expenses incurred on the aforementioned trip. Mr. MC CORD advised him that he was to keep the remainder of the money previously advanced as BALDWIN was scheduled to travel again with Mrs. MITCHELL on another trip in a few days. MC CORD advanced Mr. BALDWIN an additional \$500 in cash, all in \$100 bills.

On the afternoon of May 9, 1972, Mr. BALDWIN traveled to his home in New Haven, Connecticut, as he previously explained to Mr. MC CORD that he was low on summer suits and other clothing items and it was necessary for him to obtain these additional items. MC CORD stated that he should use some of the advanced funds furnished BALDWIN in order to buy the necessary clothing. BALDWIN returned to New Haven on Allegheny Airlines on a 3:30 p.m. flight leaving Washington National Airport. Prior to boarding this aircraft he explained to the Allegheny representative that he had a small suitcase containing a .38 caliber revolver, previously mentioned, and that the bullets to this weapon were in his pocket. This representative questioned the validity of his possession of

this weapon and Mr. BALDWIN produced the identification previously-provided him by Mr. MC CORD, and stated this identification is still in possession of Allegheny Airlines and that this representative did telephonically contact the Committee to Re-Elect the President and BALDWIN's employment was verified. The Allegheny representative told BALDWIN to explain to the stewardess on this flight that he was in possession of a firearm.

On boarding the plane BALDWIN explained to the stewardess his possession of a firearm, who in turn advised the Captain of the aircraft. The Captain requested that the firearm and rounds be placed in his cabin. BALDWIN complied with his request.

While in New Haven, Connecticut, Mr. BALDWIN purchased two summer suits and other clothing items amounting to the sum of \$200 which was fully accounted for to Mr. MC CORD at a later date.

On May 10, 1972, BALDWIN returned to Washington by Allegheny Airlines and again mentioned the fact that he was in possession of a firearm. The pilot of this aircraft was the same individual who piloted the aircraft on May 9, 1972. The pilot commented that he recognized BALDWIN and that it was permissible for BALDWIN to keep the weapon with him. Upon returning to Washington, D.C., BALDWIN again registered at the Roger Smith Hotel.

On May 11, 1972, Mr. MC CORD advised Mr. BALDWIN at a breakfast reeting at the Roger Smith Hotel that the trip with Mrs. MITCHELL was off but that MC CORD had additional work scheduled for BALDWIN. MC CORD explained that BALDWIN would be paid \$900 per month for this work and felt that this work would continue at the Republican Mational Convention in Miami, Florida. MC CORD explained the work would entail BALDWIN monitoring demonstrations planned for the Washington, D.C. area. BALDWIN would be required to dress in casual clothes, cover the demonstrations, and pay particular interest to any threats of demonstrations to the Republican Headquarters or to the President. BALDWIN was told to ascertain what activities were being planned by demonstrators.

BALDWIN stated that he covered several demonstrations for MC CORD for the period of Mangh through May 22, 1972. He



submitted daily reports and covered three basic areas, LaFayette Park, Dupont Circle, and a church located at 22nd and P Streets, N.W., all of Washington, D.C. BALDWIN stated that he was able to associate with the Vietnam Veterans Against the War and on one occasion sat in on a news conference given by RENNIE DAVIS at the Ambassador Notel on the second floor during the aforementioned period. BALDWIN was required to report any significant developments to MC CORD by telephone. This he did and after approximately two occasions of using his correct name, MC CORD advised him to call there and use an alias. On subsequent telephone calls, BALDWIN telephonically contacted MC CORD at the Committee to Re-Elect the President headquarters using the alias BILL JOHNSON.

BALDWIN advised that on May 13 and 14, 1972, he traveled to Connecticut by air in order to pick up additional clothes and returned to Washington, D.C., on the fourteenth where he continued to monitor the demonstrations.

BALDWIN advised that sometime during May 11-15, 1972, in a meeting with MC CORD at the Roger Smith Hotel, MC CORD advised BALDWIN that the hotel bill at the Roger Smith was heavy in the expense area and stated that he, MC CORD, had a room at the Howard Johnson's Motel, in the vicinity of the Watergate Apartments, under the name of McCord Associates and wished BALDWIN to reside there. After this meeting BALDWIN traveled to the Howard Johnson's Motel, picked up the key to Room 419 at the desk, and moved in. BALDWIN could not recall if MC CORD accompanied him to the Howard Johnson's Motel.


On May 22 and 23, 1972, BALDWIN again traveled to his home in New Haven, Connecticut, and returned in his own personally owned vehicle at the request of MC CORD as he, BALDWIN, included his plane fares to New Haven in the expenses billed to MC CORD and the Committee to Re-Elect the President. BALDWIN parked his vehicle in the basement of the Howard Johnson's Motel. BALDWIN stated that he returned to Washington, D.C., on May 25, 1972, and remained at the Howard Johnson's Motel the day of the twenty-sixth. On the evening of May 26, 1972, MC CORD came to Room 419 of the Howard Johnson's Motel and stated that they had another





operation going somewhere else in the District of Columbia and described it as similar to BALDWIN's monitoring the demonstrations, in particular visual observation. At this time Mr. MC CORD had in his possession a small walkie-talkie. Later that evening two additional individuals came to Room 419, whom Mr. BALDWIN previously identified as E. HOWARD HUNT and GRORGE GORDON LIDDY. MC CORD and these two individuals traveled from the Howard Johnson's Motel, across Virginia Avanue, up an alleyway by the Watergate Apartments in the direction of the Watergate Restaurant. BALDWIN stated that he observed this activity from the balcony of Room 419 of the Howard Johnson's Motel. Later that evening MC CORD returned to the room and began watching television with BALDWIN. At approximately 12:00 midnight, MC CORD received a telephone call. Upon the termination of the telephone call MC CORD and BALDWIN left the room and traveled to MC CORD's car. Upon leaving the area, in MC CORD's vehicle, MC CORD was attempting to raise someone else on the walkie-talkie but with no results. They then traveled to an all-night Peoples Drug Store on 14th Street where BALDWIN went inside on MC CORD's instructions to purchase six alkaline batteries. BALDWIN stated that these batteries cost \$6 and some change. He returned to MC CORD's car and they traveled toward the Capitol Hill area, passing the Forrestal Building, where MC CORD continued to use the walkie-talkie. MC CORD was using the walkie-talkie in a manner wherein he had the antenna of this instrument out the car In the vicinity of the Capitol Hill area MC CORD stated that he had a man up there, referring to the Capitol Hill area, in a Volkswagen and BALDWIN stated that this individual of whom MC CORD was speaking was young and new on the job. After numerous passes and driving around the area, MC CORD was able to contact another walkie-talkie unit in a fashion as "unit one to unit two, how do you read." MC CORD said over the walkie-talkie "I can't see our man. We had better meet." While driving the other unit said "You just passed us." Then MC CORD pulled alongside a recent model Plymouth described as a 1970 to 1972 model, brown in color, bearing District of Columbia tags and possibly having four doors. Upon stopping the car the individual, previously identified as GEORGE GORDON LIDDY, left this Plymouth from the passenger side. When the door was opened and the vanity light on, BALDWIN looked into the vehicle and observed the individual previously identified as E. HOWARD HUNT sitting in the front seat.





LIDDY entered MC CORD's car, sitting in the front seat with BALDWIN between him and MC CORD. MC CORD then traveled to an alley directly beside Senator MC GOVERN's campaign headquarters, paused in the alley, and LIDDY pointed to some spotlights on the side of the building and inquired "What about those?" MC CORD responded that they were no problem. BALDWIN stated that there was some discussion about the second floor of that building. The vehicle then left the alley and upon doing so MC CORD mentioned to BALDWIN, "that we are going to try and relocate you in an apartment over there," pointing across the street from Senator MC GOVERN's headquarters, "so you may have visual observation of the people coming and going." The car proceeded to travel in the area attempting to locate the previously mentioned Volkswagen and eventually MC CORD said on the walkie-talkie that "there is no go tonight, we can't find our man." MC CORD's vehicle then traveled to the same spot where the Plymouth had been parked, at approximately 3:00 a.m.

BALDWIN advised that LIDDY got out of MC CORD's car and MC CORD and BALDWIN returned to the Howard Johnson's Motel. MC CORD dropped BALDWIN off. BALDWIN stated that when he first saw the Plymouth he observed that there were additional people in the back seat of the car and during the time the third individual was in MC CORD's vehicle there was no discussion of his name and BALDWIN was never introduced to him. During the conversation between MC CORD and this individual MC CORD always addressed the third individual as his superior. BALDWIN pointed out that it was the third individual's decision to call whatever they had planned off for that evening.

LITON

On May 27, 1972, BALDWIN stated that he slept the majority of the day and pointed out that when he returned to the Howard Johnson's Motel on May 25, 1972, that there was a number of items he described as electronic equipment in Room 419 and that on either the evening of May 25 or 27, 1972, MC CORD was "fiddling" with one of these instruments. BALDWIN described it as a C.E.I.-Communication, Electronics Incorporated, Rockville, Maryland, Receiving System Type R.S.-111-1B-12,30-1000MC, and that during his tuning of this instrument it went to 118.9 megacycles and picked up a conversation to which BALDWIN listened. This conversation was in regard to a man talking with a woman and discussing their marital problem. MC CORD then tuned this receiving unit to



135 megacycles, apparently attempting to pick up an additional conversation but all that could be heard by him or BALPWIN was a radio station. BALDWIN stated that there was another receiving system, manufactured by the Mason Engineering Company of Connecticut, in a brown attache case. MC CORD described this unit as a debugging unit as well as a receiver. At this time there was also one tape recorder in Room 419 but the recorder could not be adapted to the C.E.I. receiving system. During this time MC CORD made the comment that "We'll have to move to a higher level."

BALDWIN stated that sometime that weekend he traveled to the Registration Desk of the Howard Johnson's Motel putting in a request for a room on the seventh floor of the Howard Johnson's Motel and that either on the afternoon of May 29 or on the morning of May 30, 1972, he moved to Room 723, taking the previously described electronic equipment with him. The C.E.I. receiving system was maintained in a blue suitcase, apparently manufactured to fit the receiving system.

BALDWIN advised that he began monitoring the receiving system through an earphone on May 29 or 30, 1972, and he did so per Mr. MC CORD's instructions from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. every day and was told by MC CORD that if he was in the room after hours, he should continue to monitor. BALDWIN was to keep daily logs of the conversations on this line, described as having the date, time and conversational activity. BALDWIN stated that he began keeping these logs on accounting paper and then began using legal-size yellow pads.

BALDWIN advised the only conversations he could overhear were telephone conversations and that in discussion with MC CORD determined that four extensions on one phone at some office of the Democratic National Headquarters, located in the Watergate, across from the Howard Johnson's Motel, were being monitored. MC CORD told BALDWIN to ascertain the identity of the individual whose telephone lines were being monitored. BALDWIN stated that the identity of this individual was ascertained in the first one or two days of listening. He described this individual by name as SPENCER OLIVER, who apparently was the head of the American Young Political Leaders Conference.

BALDWIN stated that conversations monitored by him had to do with OLIVER's discussions with his father, an apparent influer ial lobbyist in Washington, D.C., and an individual by the name of JOHN RICHARDSON at the Department of State, Washington, Discussions by OLIVER and RICHARDSON were relative to the American Young Political Leaders Conference and the Atlantic Chapter of the American Young Political Leaders Conference. was discussion of the exchange of young political leaders from the Soviet Union and in the United States. Apparently Congress had limited the funds for this purpose and in particular limited the funds for a British delegation coming to the United States. discussion with his father OLIVER was attempting to have him lobby for more funds and BALDWIN advised there apparently became a question of the legality of OLIVER's participation in these discussions, attempting to secure additional funds. As the American Young Political Leaders Conference was a tax exempt organization and if OLIVER's connections in soliciting funds were uncovered by members of Congress, OLIVER stated "the shit would hit the fan."

In other discussions OLIVER indicated he was traveling to Texas in order to back a man by the name of TERRY SAMFORD for President. BALDWIN stated that in view of OLIVER's position he was suppose to remain impartial in any political dealings, but was traveling to Texas in apparent violation of his own Texas delegation. In one discussion a Texas Attorney by the name of BOB STRAUS was mentioned and that OLIVER became worried about the possibility of STRAUS becoming aware of his back-door politics.

All political conversations monitored were related to the policy of getting rid of MC GOVERN and it was discussed that if MC GOVERN became the Presidential nominee the Democrats were afraid of losing a number of Congressional seats. OLIVER was in contact with WILBER MILLS regarding his support of SANFORD. OLIVER received \$200 in cash for expenses in relation to his trip to Texas in support of SANFORD. OLIVER specifically mentioned he wanted this money in cash rather than by check.

BALDWIN stated that he was also able to monitor phone calls from OLIVER's secretary, MAXIE (last name unknown), an individual by the name of BOB ALLEN, a



secretary by the name of BARBARA KENNEDY, and an individual by the name of AL BRACKEN, who was an union official supporting Senator NUMPHREY.

Upon ascertaining OLIVER's identity, MC CORD prepared background material about him and at one point told BALDWIN that OLIVER was a graduate of T.C.U.. had been employed by the Capitol Police Department, Washington, D.C., received a law degree from George Washington University, Washington, D.C., that he had been born in the State of New Jersey and later moved to the State of Texas. In conversation between MC CORD and BALDWIN, MC CORD mentioned that BARBARA KENNEDY was giving a picnic for Senator MC GOVERN.

BALDWIN advised that he prepared daily logs of the aforementioned conversations and that MC CCRD would pick them up on a daily basis, either at night or the following morning.

BALDWIN stated that Mr. MC CORD traveled to Miami, Florida, during the period of June 6 to 8, 1972. MC CORD stated to BALDWIN that he wanted him, BALDWIN, down in Miami and that he had a suite somewhere in that city. MC CORD telephonically contacted BALDWIN at the Howard Johnson's Motel the night before he left and advised BALDWIN to take the daily logs to the Committee to Re-Elect the President. MC CORD provided BALDWIN with a name, told him to place the logs in an envelope, seal the envelope, and furnish it to the guard upon entering the building, giving the guard specific instructions to deliver the envelope to the individual furnished BALDWIN by MC CORD and whose name appeared on the outside of the envelope. Mr. BALDWIN stated that he was unable to recall this individual's Mr. BALDWIN stated that he believed he followed these instructions on the evening of June 8, 1972, as his records reflected MC CORD was in Miami June 7 and 8, 1972. As previously mentioned, BALDWIN stated that SPENCER OLIVER was traveling to the State Convention in Texas and left Washington, D.C., on June 8, 1972, and was scheduled to return or June 13, 1972. BALDWIN advised that he returned to his home in New Haven, Connecticut, on June 9, 1972, and returned to the District of Columbia on June 11, 1972.

On June 12, 1972, Mr. MC CORD provided BALDWIN with a \$100 bill and stated to him that 'you can eat and drink and spend some time at the Watergate this week." BALDWIN and MC CORD had lunch at the Watergate on June 12, 1972, and MC CORD produced a glossy photograph of Mr. LARRYYO'BRIEN and inquired of BALDWIN if he had ever observed O"BRIEN in a corner office of the Democratic National Committee headquarters. BALDWIN pointed out that this office could be observed from the balcony of Room 723 of the Howard Johnson's Motel. BALDWIN had not observed O'BRIEN. MC CORD stated to BALDWIN "We've got to get you into the Democratic National Committee headquarters for a tour." Before continuing BALDWIN advised that upon returning from New Haven he had brought with him his personal camera and equipment and during that morning MC CORD saw this equipment in the hotel room at Howard Johnson's. In this equipment was included a telephoto lense. MC CORD had BALDWIN take three photographs of the office space of the Democratic National Committee headquarters which could be seen from the balcony of their room. BALDWIN stated the photographs came out but were of poor quality. Returning to the luncheon meeting BALDWIN advised MC CORD instructed him to go up to the Democratic National Committee headquarters and obtain pamphlets and literature and to try to obtain a tour of the office space. BALDWIN traveled to the Democratic National Committee headquarters, asked if SEENCER OLIVER was in, knowing he was in the State of Texas, and was advised that OLIVER was not in the office by OLIVER's secretary MAXIE (last name unknown). BALDWIN, having some knowledge of the political situation in the State of Connecticut, then told this female that he was the nephew of JOHN BAILEY, a prominent Connecticut DALDWIN subsequently determined that BAILEY was then Connecticut State Committee Chairman for the Democratic Party. BALDWIN purchased a book for \$7.50 and as a result of his impersonation as BAILEY's nephew, got the "royal tour." He stated that he saw everything, including Mr. O'BRIEN's office and was told that Mr. O'BRIEN had not been there for approximately two months and that it might be possible for O'BRIEN to return on June 13, 1972. BALDWIN observed a Mr. GREGG O'BRIEN, second in charge, and was eventually taken to the Democratic Party private club in the basement of the Watergate for a drink.

BALDWIN then returned to the room of the Howard Johnson's Motel where MC CORD showed him a sketch of the office space.





BALDWIN pointed out O'BRIEN's office as MC CORD did not know where it was in the Democratic National Committee headquarters. BALDWIN pointed out an office of the Democratic National Committee headquarters from the balcony of the room to MC CORD as belonging to a Mr. STEWART. When BALDWIN told MC CORD that Mr. O'BRIEN was in Miami, MC CORD instructed BALDWIN to go back to the Democratic National Committee headquarters and ascertain O'BRIEN's exact whereabouts in that city.

BALDWIN returned to the Democratic National Committee headquarters and to Mr. OLIVER's secretary, MAXIE (last name unknown), and they traveled to Mr. O'BRIEN's secretary where BALDWIN thanked her for her kindness. He inquired as to Mr. O'BRIEN's whereabouts as he, BALDWIN, was traveling to Miami and wished to contact him in that city. BALDWIN then stated that it appeared to him that O'BRIEN's secretary became suspicious and asked for his name. He responded BILL JOHNSON. O'BRIEN's secretary then went into Mr. O'BRIEN's office and BALDWIN then asked MAXIE the whereabouts of the men's room. He left the office and traveled to the lobby and called back upstairs to MAXIE and stated that it was necessary for him to leave and thanked her again. He was then provided Mr. O'BRIEN's private telephone number in Miami, Florida, by Mr. O'BRIEN's secretary. BALDWIN then traveled to the Howard Johnson's Motel where he gave that number to Mr. MC CORD.

On the evening of June 12, 1972, BALDWIN traveled to the Congressional Hotel in the vicinity of the Rayburn Building, Washington, D.C., and attempted to obtain a Congressional register there containing the photographs of various Congressmen, however, upon arriving at the hotel determined that it was closed.

On June 13, 1972, Mr. OLIVER returned from the State Convention in Texas and BALDWIN began monitoring once again.

BALDWIN then stated that sometime between May 30 and June 6, 1972, he received a telephone call while he was in Room 723 of the Howard Johnson's Motel from MC CORD. MC CORD inquired as to if there was an additional briefcase in the room. BALDWIN looked about the room and saw one additional attache case which was unfamiliar to him. He told IIC CORD there was an extra one there and MC CORD terminated the conversation. BALDWIN then moved this briefcase to a location in the room where the other equipment was stored, and upon doing so he opened it. Upon opening it he noticed

a white towel. He felt the towel, noticing a hard object wrapped within it. Upon opening the towel he observed what appeared to him to © a pellet pistol. BALDWIN then immediately rewrapped it and closed the briefcase. He stated there was nothing else in the briefcase at that time.

At another time during this period BALDWIN stated that he attended a dinner at an Emerson Steak House in the vicinity of Rockville, Maryland, with MC CORD for the purpose of honoring an associate of MC CORD's who taught criminal science at a college located in Rockville, Maryland. Prior to this dinner MC CORD suggested to BALDWIN that if he received subsequent inquiries from the students regarding his position, BALDWIN was to emphasize that he was going to travel to Miami regarding the Republican National Convention.

BALDWIN advised that during the period of June 12 to June 14, 1972, he again traveled to the Congressional Hotel, in the vicinity of the Rayburn Building, where he did obtain a Congressional register which he provided to Mr. MC CORD. Also during this time on one evening when Mr. MC CORD was in the room the two individuals, previously identified as GEORGE GORDON LIDDY and E. HOWARD HUNT, came to Room 723 of the Howard Johnson's Motel. MC CORD took these individuals out on the balcony of Room 723 and pointed out the various offices of the Democratic National Committee headquarters. Again MC CORD failed to introduce these individuals to BALDWIN. However, at one point in his meeting these two individuals. BALDWIN recollects that LIDDY was referred to as GEORGE and on one occasion he was referred to as AL and on another occasion as BILL JOHNSON. MC CORD stated to BALDWIN in regard to this discrepancy that you know that they are using aliases and they know you are using aliases but don't worry about it. all his contacts with Mr. LIDDY, BALDWIN advised that LIDDY was always dressed in a dark blue suit. On this occasion, after the individuals came back into the room, he noticed Mr. LIDDY take an envelope out of his suit jacket and counted out \$100 bills to MC CORD. BALDWIN stated that LIDDY gave MC CORD approximately \$16,000 to \$18,000 and that he estimated there was approximately \$5,000 to \$6,000 in this envelope, all in \$100 bills. MC CORD then counted the money, placed it in his wallet, and all three individuals left the room.





At this point Mr. BALDWIN pointed out that he received \$900 in cash for salary prior to June 6, 1972. BALDWIN stated that on each occasion that he was paid money either for expenses with Mrs. MARTHA MITCHELL or for salary, he was always given \$100 bills.

On the following days BALDWIN advised that he continued to monitor the receiver and on the evening of June 15, 1972, he had dinner at the Watergate Restaurant, noting activity on the receiver. On June 16, 1972, BALDWIN traveled to 1015 18th Street, N.W., at approximately 8:00 a.m., in an attempt to meet a young lady he had previously observed, while she was going to work that day. BALDWIN stated he had lunch at the Watergate Restaurant, and at approximately 5:00 or 6:00 p.m. MC CORD came to his room at the Howard Johnson's Motel and the daily log for monitoring that day was empty as there was no activity.

On the evening of June 16, 1972, MC CORD came to Room 723 at the Howard Johnson Motel and inquired of BALDWIN "how did it go today?". BALDWIN responded "nothing". MC CORD then asked BALDWIN if he had a sheet or a bedspread, as he, MC CORD, had two electric typewriters in the back of a truck parked in the basement of the Howard Johnson Motel. BALDWIN took a towel out of the bathroom of the motel room and MC CORD gave him the keys to the truck and he traveled to the basement and covered the typewriters in the panel truck. BALDWIN d described this truck as white in color with side doors. BALDWIN returned to the room and MC CORD said that he needed some batteries and requested BALDWIN to go to a store on Pennsylvania Avenue approximately three blocks from the Committee to Re-elect the President. While he was out. MC CORD requested that he go to Georgetown to purchase some "speaker wire" and furnished BALD/IN with a similar piece approximately four inches to five and one half inches long. BALDWIN left the motel, traveled to Georgetown, a people's drug store and at The Spy Shop in an effort to get the items requested by MC CORD. BALDWIN advised that he was only able to obtain the six batteries requested by NC CORD, and he described them as Everyready type and that he was unable to obtain the wire requested. BALDVIN returned to the motel room at approximately 9:30 p.m. that evening.

Upon his return to the Howard Johnson Motel, he gave 10 CORD change to the money 10 CORD had provided and MC CORD was lying on the bed looking at some type of electrical unit. There was an attache case lying on the bed with a rounded front end and locks on each side. The brief case was opened, there were papers, old monitoring logs and a small amount of money consisting of 20s, tens and ones. There was another attache case on the bed, brown in color containing electrical equipment.

BALDWIN informed MC CORD that he could not obtain the wire and MC CORD responded that it was necessary for him (MC CORD) to get it. He indicated that he would travel to an all night Lafayette radio store in order to obtain same.

However, prior to his leaving, MC CORD taped six batteries together and gave BALDWIN instructions on how to solder the wires to each battery. MC CORD then left the room. While he was gone, BALDWIN noticed in the room a white plastic box similar to one that contained a bell tone door chime and he completed soldaring and connecting wires to the battery. However, he must have done it wrong as the batteries heated up and melted the table.

MC CORD returned approximately 11:00 p.m. to 11:30 pm. carrying with him a different bell chime box and some components appearing to come from Lafayette radio. Upon MC CORD's return-BALLMIN was given a similar electrical component and was instructed to solder on a black wire by MC CORD. MC CORD then sent BALDWIN to the Howard Johnson Restaurant in order to obtain two hot fudge sundaes. Upon RALDHIN's return to the room, MC CCRD made a telephone call and BALDWIN overheard MC CORD state "somebody's working over there". A little later on, MC CORD received a telephone call and was overheard to say "I'll be there". Upon leaving, MC CORD furnished BALLWIN with a small walkie-talkie that he put by the television set and told BALDAIN "we're going across the street", pointing to the Democratic National Committee Headquarters. 'We're going over there and if you observe anything unusual, contact us on this", indicating the walkie-talkie. MC CORD then left the room. BALDWIN went to the balcony and saw MC CORD cross Virginia Avenue and enter the alley of the Watergate Complex * in the direction of the Watergate Restaurant. The time was approximately 12:00 A.m. to 12:30 A.m. BALDWIN indicated someone had been working in the Democratic National Committee Headquarters.

BALDWIN began watching television and immanently watching the Watergate Complex. About approximately 2:15 a.m. June 17, 1972, BALDWIN observed the lights go on on the seventh floor of the Watergate. BALDWIN picked up the walkie-talkie and said, "bass or unit one, the lights are on on the seventh

floor". Someone else said "read that", and another unit said "that's the 2 o'clock guard check". BALDWIN then observed the lights go on on the sixth floor and stated as such to the walkie-talkie but there was no reply. BALDWIN then went to the balcony and saw two guards in front of the Watergate Complex. One then disappeared into the building. He then observed a car pull up in front of the building of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters and saw three men run into the building from that vehicle. These individuals were wearing casual clothes and a few minutes later, BALDWIN observed a man with a gun on the sixth floor and said through the walkie-talkie "unit one to anybody". Someone said "go ahead". BALDWIN asked if your men had suits on or casual clothes. The response was "suits". BALDWIN then responded "you got trouble, because there are guys in there with casual clothes and they have guns". The other unit responded "they don't have their unit on, we know what's going on". The second unit continued "any unit" and then a whisper came over the walkie-talkie stating "we hear you, they got us". BALDWIN then said "are you guys District of Columbia Policemen? What's that over there", and there was no more conversation.

At this point, several scooter policemen arrived as well as a Metropolitan Police Department Wagen. The individuals occupying these vehicles entered the front door of the Watergate. BALDWIN then noticed two men leaving an alley way on the east side of the Watergate. One of these two men whom he previously identified was E. HOWARD HUNT. The second man, based on his dress and physical appearance, he felt was the man now identified as GEORGE GORDON LIDDY. LIDDY was in a dark suit, HUNT was wearing a yachtsman type windbreaker. Both men were carrying suitcases and as they were leaving, HUNT looked up towards BALDWIN's motel room. The two men proceeded to a tan Plymouth, extremely similar to the one he observed on May 26, 1972. One of the men opened the door to the vehicle. BALDWIN then heard over the walkie-talkie "are you in the room". BALDWIN responded in the affirmative and the other voice stated "I'll be right out". BALDWIN thenobserved activities in the Democratic National Head-





quarters. He observed a number of men being paraded by a window. One of these individuals he identified as JAMES MC CORD.

BALDWIN responded to a knock on his door, and opening it he observed HUNT. HUNT was very nervous when he came into the room. BALDWIN said to HUNT, "They're in trouble". BALDWIN tried to get HUNT to lock out the window toward the Watergate. Finally, he and HUNT knelt down behind a table and peered through the window in the direction of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters. The watched until the people were brought outside the building. HUNT then got up and went to the bathroom.

When he returned, HUNT said, "I have to call a lawyer. You pack up this stuff". BALDWIN said HUNT picked up the telephone and dialed someone's number without looking in the telephone book. Although he was busy with the things in the room, BALDWIN said he heard HUNT state, "Well, I've got \$5,000 in cash now for bond. OK - OK." BALDWIN said HUNT was on the telephone less than two minutes.

After he hung up, HUNT said, "I've got to get out of here. Do you know where Mrs. MC CORD lives? If so, call her and tell her what's happening and get this stuff out to her." At this point BALDWIN said, "Are they being arrested?" HUNT replied, "I don't know. I've got things to do". As he went to the door, HUNT took a unit out of his jacket and threw it inside a suitcase that was open on the bed. (This was a walkie-talkie according to BALDWIN.) HUNT then left telling BALDWIN to "get out and go home."

BALDWIN then contacted Mrs. MC CORD at her home about 3:00 a.m. and explained to her that he did not know what is happening to her husband but that the police had arrived and that the lawyer had been called and he told her that he felt MC CORD would be home in the morning. He then told her that he had some things of her husband's that he wished to deliver to her and that he would be out at 4:00 a.m. if she could drive him back into town.





BALDWIN then packed his own personal items and placed them into his own personal car parked in the basement of the Howard Johnson's Motel. He then began packing MC CORD's items, placing MC CORD's wallet containing 100 dollar bills and some papers in MC CORD's personal brief case. He then noticed NC CORD's keys on the bed. BALDWIN then took all of MC CORD's items down to the truck parked in the basement of Howard Johnson's garage and locked it. BALDWIN then saw two men in uniform crossing Virginia Avenue. He got into his car. drove it out of the garage and parked it on the next street east of the Howard Johnson's Motel. He walked back to the Howard Johnson's garage and drove MC CORD's truck to his home in Rockville, Maryland, arriving there exactly at 4:00 a.m. Mrs. MC CORD was awake as well as her two daughters. BALDWIN carried the two suitcases containing the receiving unit and carried MC CORD's personal suitcase into his home. Mrs. MC CORD then drove BALDWIN back to his vehicle in Washington, D.C., in her small English make car. The conversation back into town was mostly his reassuring Mrs. MC CORD and her two daughters that everything will be straightened out and MC CORD will be home shortly.

After returning to Washington, D.C., BALDWIN drove his own car to his home in New Haven, Connecticut.

BALDWIN further related that during his stay at the Howard Johnson's Motel, MC CORD would type up summaries of the monitoring log in memorandum form. He also observed memorandums typed to Mr. ROB ODLE, an individual by the name FNU TINNENS but could not state that this was related to his monitoring activities. In regard to these activities, MC CORD would always type up his memorandum by beginning with, "a reliable source."

BALDWIN provided a yellow sheet of paper with the initials ACB captioned Personal Expenses indicated dates of June 10, 1972 - June 11, 1972 and May 26, 1972. He also provided an address yellow slip of paper captioned Accounting for \$100 Expense Money Advance, June 12, 1972. This paper



indicates expenses from June 12, 1972, to June 16, 1972. BALDWIN also provided a yearbook, 1972, white in color from the A. C. Hershatten Company, Incorporated, Insurance-Real Estate, New Haven, Connecticut, 06502, phone 562-4165, from which he refreshed his memory. It was noted that a section of Monday, June 19 was torn off and dates of May 20-24 were missing.

Finally, Mr. BALDWIN provided a small lapel pin, red and white in color with a silver eagle emblem. He advised he received this pin from Mr. HOUSTON of the Committee to Re-Elect the President for identification purposes after his return from his trip as security officer of MARTHA MITCHELL and prior to moving into the Howard Johnson's Motel.

After Mr. BALDWIN furnished the above information, all persons present traveled to the vicinity of the Rayburn building where BALDWIN pointed out an area located on North Carolina Avenue, S.E., Washington, D.C., approximately 25 yards East of First Street, S.E., where he observed the previously described tan Plymouth on May 26, 1972, and an alley on the South side of a building located at 410 First Street, S.E., housing a MC GOVERN Campaign Office.

It is pointed out that during the entire time Mr. BALDWIN was volunteering information, he continuously denied knowing that his monitoring of telephone calls was illegal. He stated his belief that everything being done was legal was based on the fact that, number one, he observed correspondence from MC CORD to the Federal Communications Commission, requesting permission to broadcast and receive communications on certain frequencies. He recalled one of those frequencies was somewhere close to the one or was the one which he monitored. Secondly, knowing that MC CORD was Chief of Security and that part of his, BALDWIN's work was surveillance, he felt this also was in some way connected. With that assignment.

He emphasized that when he first met LIDDY and HUNT, they impressed him as being possibly "White House Aides" and since they were in the motel room where the monitoring was taking place, he re-assured himself that everything was on the level.

He stated sometime after the arrest of the five suspects in this case, he read in the newspaper that the Supreme Court said the Government could no longer eavesdrop without a court order. Upon reading this, he felt that what MC CORD had him doing was now illegal.

He also stated MC CORD had mentioned to him the great deal of problems he, NC CORD, was having in securing licensing for the closed circuit television. This television was to be used for security purposes at the Committee to Re-Elect the President.

Mr. ALPHED CARLETON BALDWIN, 90 Mountainview Terrace, Handen, Connecticut, Volunteered the following information in the presence of his attorney, ROBERT MIRTO, Assistant United States Attorneys for the District of Columbia, EARL SILBERT and DONALD E. CAMPBELL as well as Special Agents DANIEL C. MAHAN and ANGELO J. LANO of the Federal Bureau of Investigation:

On the morning of June 17, 1972, after he had been returned to his own vehicle, Mr. BALDWIN immediately left the District of Columbia in order to return to his home in Hamden. Connecticut. He stated that on Sunday, June 18, 1972, he telephonically contacted Mrs. JAMES MC CORD at her reidence in Rockville, Maryland, and determined from her that her husband had not yet been released from the District of Columbia Jail. Mr. BALDWIN subsequently contacted his attorney, Mr. MIRTO, and on June 22, 1972, he contacted Mr. ARER LARUE at the Committee to Re-elect the President in Washington, D. C., by telephone. He stated that the conversation with Mr. LARUE was very guarded and that at no time did he furnish his name to Nr. LARUE. However, he related to Mr. LARUE that he was the individual that worked for MARTHA KITCHELL as a Security Officer and inquired as to why he had not heard from anybody in Washington, D. C. Mr. LARUE stated that he remembered Mr. BALDWIN but had no idea why he was calling. BALDWIN related to Mr. LARUE that he was working in Washington, and Mr. LARUE responded working on what. BALDWIN explained that he was working the other night when an incident occurred regarding the Democratic National Committee Headquarters and felt that Mr. LARUE should know about that incident. Mr. LARUE responded by inquiring where he could get a hold of Mr. BALDWIN. furnished Mr. LARUE his attorney's telephone number in West Haven, Connecticut.

Friday of that week. However, subsequent to that tentative meeting, Mr. O'BRIEN did not travel to West Haven, Connecticut, until the following Tuesday, June 27, 1972.

On June 25, 1972, Mp. JAMES MC CORD of Washington, D. telephonically contacted Mr. BALDWIN from a pay telephone in Washington, D. C., and BALDWIN provided Mr. MC CORD with a telephone number to a public telephone a short distance from his home at which point that conversation was terminated. Mr. BALDWIN then traveled to the aforementioned public telephone booth and answered a telephone call from Mr. MC CORD. Mr. BALDWIN explained to Mr. MC CORD that things were going rough for him in Connecticut as the Federal Bureau of Investigation had already been making inquiries about him. Mr. MC CORD stated to Mr. BALDWIN that he should bear with it and do not say anything. Mr. BALDWIN explained to Mr. MC CORD that it was necessary for him to retain an attorney and thus incur some personal expense. MC CORD stated that he did not wish to discuss it with BALDWIN right at this moment, but told him that the position that he wanted BALDWIN to take was that he worked for MC CORD. Mc Cord Associates and that he never worked for anyone else. Mr. BALDWIN stated that he would pass Mr. MC CORD's position on to his, BALDWIN's, attorneys. MC CORD then stated that he wanted Mr. BALDWIN to understand that everything is working out all right at which point Mr. BALDWIN furnished Mr. MC CORD his attorney's telephone number.

Mr. CREEL identified the photograph of JAMES W. MC CORD as identical to a person he had seen numerous times come in and out of the building.

Mr. CREEL selected a picture of ALFRED C. BALDWIN as a person he may have seen in the building but was not positive if he was identical.

Mr. CREEL said that numerous messengers and mail run personnel come in and out of the building at hight for the Committee to Re-elect the President (CTKP) and other businesses in the building.

Mr. CREEL stated that when a messenger came to the building with a delivery for the CTRP he would direct them to the third floor. Mr. CREEL stated that he has never been approached to deliver any package or envelopes to the CTRP and would not deliver these items because he would become a messenger rather than a guard.

Mr. CREEL restated that he had not delivered any mail or packages to the CTRP and always referred such requests to the third floor.

Mr. HCWARD stated that Mr. MC CORD was his Instructor in a course entitled Industrial and Retail Security. NUMN thereby supplied the following information:

He advised that he vaguely recalled asking Mr. ROBERT HOUSTON, Security Officer, Committee to Re-Elect the President, to travel to National Airport in late March or early April, 1972, and pick up a package that was due to arrive by private plane from North Carolina. He stated that he cannot recall any details concerning arrangements made for the package to be picked up or the names of any individuals involved in the transactiom, except Mr. FOUSTON who simply acted as a messenger.

NURN advised that he did not see this envelope personally as it was evidently turned over to Mr. HUGH SLOAN, his Assistant. NURN stated that it was his impression that the envelope no doubt contained campaign contributions in the form of checks, as during this particular period in late March and early April, the Finance Committee was extremely busy as large quantities of contributions were coming in so as to beat the April 7 deadline whereafter contributions would have to be declared by law.

NUNN stated that his primary responsibility at the Committee was coordinating the Finance Chairman throughout the United States and usually does not handle any funds personally.

He further advised that Mr. HUGH SLOAN is currently traveling with Mr. MAURICI STAMS and will be back in the Washington, D.C., area on July 14, 1972.

During late Narch or early April, 1972, HOUSTON traveled to Page Airlines, located at National Airport, Arlington, Virginia. HOUSTON stated he was to pick up an envelope from a private plane that was arriving from Raleigh, North Carolina. HOUSTON described the plane as being a two-engine prop with a capacity of seating three to five people. HOUSTON advised he met the plane and was handed a brown legal sized envelope by a white female approximately five feet six inches tall, black hair and in her 20's. HOUSTON could not identify this girl further nor did he have any conversation with her, except to identify himself as a security officer from the Committee to Re-Elect the President.

HOUSTON stated that he returned to the Committee Headquarters and turned the envelope over to YOLANDA DORMINY, Secretary to Mr. NUNN.

HOUSTON stated that he has related everything that he can recall about this transaction and he has absolutely no idea what was contained in the envelope, but just assumed it had something to to with finances, as Mr. NUNN was on the Finance Committee.

Mr. MAURICE STANS, was reinterviewed and again advised of the interviewing agents identities and advised that clarification was desired concerning the resignation of Mr. HUCH SLOAN, from the Finance Committee for the Committee to Re-Elect the President (CTRP).

The interview was conducted in the presence of KENNETH .WELLS PARKINSON, Counsel for the CTRP.

It was pointed out to Mr. STANS that during the previous interview that morning, Mr. STANS had advised HUGH SLOAN had resigned two weeks previously. He was also advised that other committee members had told the FBI on July 13, 1972, that Mr. SLOAN was then on a trip to various Western States in company with Mr. STANS and would not be available for interview until Friday, July 14, 1972.

Mr. STANS replied that SLOAN had resigned orally about two weeks ago with his last day on the payroll being Friday, July 14, 1972. He said SLOAN had gone out to the Westcoast and he (STANS) had met up with him at a meeting in Los Angeles, California, a week or so ago. Mr. STANS then said SLOAN accompanied him on the rest of the trip to Oregon, Washington, Iowa and Ohio. Mr. STANS said he hoped to persuade SLOAN to reconsider his resignation and to stay on with the committee.

Mr. SLOAN had told Mr. STANS that he wanted to get out.

Mr. MAURICE STANS, Chairman of the Finance Committee for the Committee To Re-Elect the President (CTRP), 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, Northwest, was advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents and was interviewed in the presence of Mr. KEINETH WELLS PARKINSON, Counsel for the CTRP.

Mr. STANS was questioned concerning the receipt of a \$25,000 Cashiers Check on April 11, 1972, purchased on April 10, 1972, made payable to, and endorsed by a Mr. KENNETH H. DAHLBERG.

Mr. STANS stated he had received such a check from Ir. DAHLBERG on April 11, 1972, at a meeting of campaign finance chairmen which was held at the Washington-Hilton Hotel in Washington, D.C. (WDC), on April 11, 1972. He advised the check represented an accumulation of funds which had been collected by Mr. DAHLBERG prior to April 7, 1972, the date the new disclosure and reporting law went into effect. He stated that the funds were held by DAHLEERG in a safety deposit box prior to drawing the aforementioned cashiers check.

The \$25,000 cashiers check was displayed to Mr. STANS and he identified it as being the one he received. He stated that upon receiving the check, he turned it over to HUGH SLOAN who was in charge of all moneys received by the Finance Committee. Mr. STANS said SLOAN was in attendance at the meeting with him.

Because the cashiers check was purchased on April 10, 1972, and dated the same date, a problem existed since it represented funds collected prior to April 7, Mr. STANS explained, the check was then turned over to GORDON LIEDY, Counsel for the Finance Committee, for a legal opinion as to how best handle the receipt of and reporting of the transaction.

The interviewing agents explained to Mr. STANS that the \$25,000 cashiers check had been presented and cashed at a

bank in Miami, Florida, by a BERNARD L. BARKER on April 19, 1972. He was also advised that BARKER was one of the five persons arrested at the break-in of the Democratic Headquarters at the Watergate Office Building the morning of June 17, 1972. Mr. STANS was unable to explain how this occurred, and was of the opinion that Mr. LIDDY had cashed the check and that the committee was in actual receipt of the funds. He further stated that he believed the \$25,000 was included in a deposit to the committee account on May 30 or 31.

Mr. STANS was then questioned concerning his knowledge of a \$100,000 contribution to the committee which had been deposited with a Mr. MANUEL OGARRIO in Mexico City in April or late March, 1972.

Mr. STANS was advised that Mr. OGARRIO would not divulge the source of the \$100,000, and he was also told that on April 4, 1972, Mr. OGARRIO purchased four bank drafts from the Banko International in Mexico, in the amounts of \$18,000, \$32,000, \$15,000, and \$24,000. The total of these drafts was \$89,000. Mr. STANS stated that he did not know Mr. OGARRIO or the source of the \$100,000.

Mr. STANS said he had been advised by Mr. HUGH SLOAN of the receipt of \$100,000 from Mexico on April 6, 1972, and that the amount was accounted for as "cash on hand" as of April 7, 1972. He believed the aforementioned \$100,000 had been received by SLOAN and given to GORDON LIDDY to be cashed and deposited to the committee.

It was pointed out by the interviewing Agents that the \$89,000 total from the Banko International drafts as well as the \$25,000 cashiers check from KENNETH DAHLBERG had also been cashed in Miami, Florida, by BERNARD L. BARKER. Mr. STANS replied, "I am as surprised as you are." He stated that BERNARD L. BARKER was in no way employed by or connected with the Finance Committee or the Committee to Re-Elect the President. It was again brought to Mr. STANS's attention that BARKER was one of the five defendants in the previously mentioned break-in.

When asked whether or not any written records existed concerning the receipt of the \$25,00 or the \$89,000 from Mr. OGGARIO, Mr. STANS replied he had seen none, but had been advised the committee had received the cash by HUGH SLOAN.

Mr. STANS explained that all information pertaining to the contribution funds was furnished him orally by Mr. SLOAN, and he (STANS) had received no receipt or memo from SLOAN documenting either the \$25,000 or the \$89,000. When asked who Mr. SLOAN had to account to for the funds, Mr. STANS replied SLOAN accounted to no one.

The interviewing Agents advised Mr. STANS the FBI desired an immediate interview of HUGH SLOAN. Mr. STANS replied that Mr. SLOAN had resigned two weeks ago and he believed his desk had already been cleaned out. When asked as to the reason for SLOAN's resignation, Mr. STANS said SLOAN had taken the position with the committee with the intention of leaving about this time.

The fact that the \$25,000 and the \$89,000 was all cashed in Miami by BERNARD BARKER was again mentioned to Mr. STANS, however, he again stated he believed the money had been accounted for in the deposit made at the end of May, 1972, which totalled about \$300,000 and this deposit was listed in the first disclosure report filed with the Comptroller General.

When asked again as to the reason why the \$25,000 cashiers check of Mr. DAHLBERG was turned over to GORDON LIDDY, he reiterated that it was for the sole purpose of resolving how best to handle the matter stating that although the check

was dated April 10, 1972, the funds had been collected by Mr. DAHLZERG prior to disclosure date of April 7.

Mr. LIDDY was employed as a legal counsel whose duties included legal determination based on tracing postal dates and dates of checks received and to make legal interpretations regarding the disclosure of funds act. He pointed out that GORDON LIDDY was not an officer of either the Finance Committee or the Committee To Re-Elect the President. Mr. STANS said LIDDY's employment with the committee was terminated when LIDDY refused to answer questions presented to him by the FBI. To Mr. STANS knowledge, LIDDY had not traveled to Florida for the committee.

Mr. STANS was asked who Mr. SLOAN's assistant was and he replied a Mr. PETER HOLMES acted as assistant, however, he was not employed until April 24, 1972, after the aforementioned events had taken place, therefore he would have no knowledge of them.

Mr. HUGH W. SLOAN, JR., 7022 Allicent Court, was contacted at his residence and made aware of the identities of the interviewing agents and the nature of the inquiry.

SLOAN stated that he has retained an attorney and was instructed by his attorney not to make any statements until such time as legal counsel could be present. He stated he would immediately contact his attorney to set a definite time and place when he would make himself available for interview.

SLOAN stated that he was the Treasurer for the Finance Committee, Committee to Re-Elect the President, until July 14, 1972, at which time he resigned for personal reasons.

He stated that he did relatively little traveling while he was with the Committee, except that he traveled to New York City on several occasions during February and March, 1972. He stated he recently returned from the West Coast where he met his immediate superior, Mr. MAURICE STANS, in San Francisco, California, on July 9, 1972. He advised that he and STANS then traveled to Seattle, Washington, Portland, Oregon, and Des Moines, Iowa, on Committee business. After the departure from Des Moines, he returned to Washington, D.C. (WDC), on July 13, 1972. He advised that the only other trip he took was between June 25 and July 3, 1972, when he went on vacation to Bermuda.

SLOAN further stated any vouchers he submitted for travel would be in the possession of Mr. PAUL BARRICK, Finance Committee, Committee to Re-Elect the President. SLOAN added that he was extremely anxious to get this matter cleared up as it was causing him much personal anguish and he would be available for further interview as soon as an appropriate time could be arranged with his attorney.

Mrs. DOROTHY L. HUNT, 11120 River Road, Potomac, Maryland, was contacted at her residence and immediately apprised of the identities of the interviewing agents. She was subsequently displayed a small piece of luggage, brown in color, which is normally referred to as a "cosmetic case". This piece of luggage bears a gold seal from the "Castellana Hilton, Madrid, Spain". On one side of the luggage is printed the wording "HUNT LISA".

After viewing the above-described piece of luggage, Mrs. HUNT stated that the cosmetic case was very similar to a piece of her own luggage, which she purchased a number of years ago. She was unable to identify the described piece of luggage as her own. However, she noted that her own luggage had a similar seal from the Hilton Hotel in Madrid Spain. She stated that she and her husband had stayed in that hotel in about 1965 while on Government assignment in Spain.

Mrs. HUNT advised that her eldest daughter is LISA HUNT. In about 1966, LISA HUNT suffered injuries in an automobile accident and was subsequently hospitalized for both physical and mental examination. During that stay in the hospital LISA had utilized some of the family luggage. Mrs. HUNT noted that the writing "HUNT LISA" which appears on the above-described luggage may have been placed on her ownlluggage at that time.

Subsequent to LISA HUNT's return from the hospital, Mrs. HUNT stated that her cosmetic case had been stored at the family residence. She indicated that she had later taken this piece of luggage with her husband and family to Nicaragua in late 1970. At that time she believed she had left the cosmetic case behind in a motel room in Florida.



He advised that he has known LIDDY for approximately two years. He advised that LIDDY is connected with the Committee to Re-Elect the President. He knows that LIDDY is an attorney and could be counsel for the Committee. PECK does not know LIDDY's exact position with the Committee. He stated that LIDDY travels frequently and has travelled more than usual during the last few months. PECK recalled that LIDDY told him that he had been to the West Coast recently, but PECK could not say when LIDDY took the trip to the West Coast.

PECK advised that LIDDY was a good neighbor and has well mannered children. LIDDY is an enthusiastic supporter of President NIXON. PECK does not know who LIDDY works for or what he does. LIDDY gets home late in the evening from work. PECK stated that LIDDY does not have much company. Relatives and friends from New York are the only visitors PECK has noticed at the LIDDY home.

PECK stated that LIDDY was a former lawyer in New York state and is proud of the time he spent as an FBI agent. He stated that his relationship with LIDDY is that of a neighbor and they have only socialized on several occasions. PECK has noticed that LIDDY has travelled more since he began work at the Committee, six or seven months ago. He knows of no derogatory information concerning LIDDY.

He advised that he has known GEORGE GORDON LIDDY for approximately one and one half years. He stated that they know each other as neighbors and have only socialized on a couple of occasions. He advised that most of what he knows regarding LIDDY is what GOETZE's wife tells him. Mrs. COETZE and Mrs. LIDDY are good friends and converse frequently.

COETZE advised that he does not know LIDDY well and has not talked with LIDDY too much. He knows LIDDY's children well because they play with his children. He stated that both he and LIDDY are Catholic and their children belong to some of the same organizations.

GOETZE advised that LIDDY worked previously on the hijacking program for the Department of the Treasury and was a former FBI Agent. He recalled that LIDDY had been working for EHR ICHMAN and one other member of the White House staff whose name he could not recall. LIDDY's latest employment is with the Committee to Re-Elect the President. He stated that LIDDY travels frequently, but has not noticed any increase in LIDDY's travel in the last coupee of months.

~ GOETZE advised that LIDDY is very ambitious in his work and is really not a family man. He stated that he knows of nothing of a derogatory nature concerning LIDDY. LIDDY seems to be a person of good character and is a good neighbor.

GEORGE GORDON LIDDY was brought into the Treasury Department by EUGEDE T. POSYMES, Assistant Secretary of Law Enforcement for the Treasury Department in April, 1969. He was also recommended for his position, Special Assistant to the Secretary of the Treasury (Organized Crime), by a congressman from New York State.

POLIZER stated that he did not become Director of the Office of Law Enforcement until June, 1970, and has only been personally acquainted with LTDDY since this time.

In April, 1971, LIDDY was promoted to Enforcement Legislative Counsel of the Treasury and served in that capacity until July, 1971, when he resigned his position with the Treasury Department to accept a position on the White House Staff. At the White House, LIDDY worked directly under EMIL (DUD) TOCCH, Deputy Assistant to the President and JURN D. Final ICHAIN, Assistant to the President. He was employed as Domestic Counsel and worked on numerous "projects."

In December, 1971, LIDDY left the White House Staff to work on the Committee for the Re-election of the President.

POLLNER described LIDDY as an aggressive, hard-working, dedicated individual who is very concerned with improving his personal economic status. He is a staunch Republican, strongly supports President NIXON and is a conservative. He is a gun enthusiast active in the National Rifle Association (NRA) and a licensed pilot.

JOHN BUSSLER, Salesman, Watkins-Johnson Company, Communications Electronics, Incorporated (CEI) Division, 6006 Executive Boulevard, Rockville, Maryland, furnished the following information:

On approximately April 1, 1972, an individual who identified himself as JAMES MC CORD of Mc Cord Associates, Rockville, Maryland, telephonically contacted him and engaged him in a conversation concerning surveillance receivers. MC CORD requested information regarding the cost and availability of such receivers and stated that he wanted either to rent a receiver or purchase a used receiver. BUSSLER told MC CORD that he thought CEI had one model that would suit MC CORD, but that it would have to be refurbished before it could be sold because it had been used as a sales demonstrator. He told MC CORD to call back in a couple of weeks.

BUSSLER stated that MC CORD did not mention for what purpose he wanted a receiver nor did he mention for whom he was purchasing it.

MC CORD called back several Weeks later and talked to ROY SCHERRER, another salesman who dealt with MC CORD from that time on.

He never had any personal contact with MC CORD or anyone representing Mc Cord Associates.

ROY SCHERRER, Salesman, Watkins-Johnson Company, Communications Electronics, Incorporated (CEI) Division, 6006 Executive Boulevard, Rockville, Maryland, furnished the following information:

Having refreshed his memory by checking his appointment calendar, he recalls speaking telephonically to an individual who identified himself as JAMES AND CORD on May 1, 1972. This individual had called previously and spoken to another salesman at CEI regarding the availability of surveillance receivers. SCHERRER explained that CEI had located a unit of the type that MC CORD had expressed an interest in at one of their installations on the West Coast. He advised that the unit would cost \$3,500. MC CORD stated he would purchase the unit and SCHERRER arranged to have it transported to CEI, Rockville, Maryland.

MC CORD was supposed to pick the unit up at CEI on May 8, 1972, but telephonically contacted SCHERRER that date and said he would not be able to keep the appointment. MC CORD stated he would pick up the unit at 2:00 p.m. on May 10, 1972.

On May 10, 1972, MC CORD again contacted SCHERRER telephonically and said he would not arrive at CEI until after 4:00 p.m. At 7:00 p.m. an individual who introduced himself as JAMES MC CORD arrived at CEI. He furnished a business card of the Committee For The Re-Election of the President, 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. (WDC), 20006, telephone (202) 333-0920. bearing the printed name JAMES W. MC CORD, JR. SCHERRER and MC CORD walked over to another building at the CEI complex where the receiving system had been hooked up to an antenna so that MC CORD could test it. MC CORD examined the unit and being satisfied, inquired as to payment for the system. SCHERRER had received previous instructions from THOMAS MANCUSO, Controller, CEI, to accept only cash or a cashiers check from MC CORD.

MC CORD stated that he did not have a cashiers check, but he did have cash. He then removed a brown manila envelope from the inside breast pocket of his suitcoat and removed 36 one hundred dollar bills from the envelope. He counted out 35 of the bills and handed them to SCHERRER who also counted them. SCHERRER gave MC CORD one of his turiness cards on which he wrote a receipt for the cash. When the subject of sales tax was mentioned, MC CORD claimed a sales tax exemption and stated that he would have his accountant telephone the exemption number to CEI on May 11, 1972. However, such a call was never received by CEI and no attempt was made to recontact MC CORD concerning the tax.

The unit purchased by MC CORD was a receiving system. Type RS-111, 18-12, serial number 132 and the invoice was made out to Mc Cord Associates, 414 Hungerford Plaza. Suite 220, Rockville, Maryland, 20850. The original of the invoice and an instruction book were mailed to Mc Cord Associates at the above address on May 15, 1972.

SCHERRER continued that MC CORD was alone at the time of the above transaction and that he was driving a blue Ford or Chevrolet at the time.

MC CORD did not state for whom he was purchasing the system nor did he mention for what purpose it was being purchased.

SCHERRER viewed six black and white photographs of white males, which are identified as follows:





CAREY M. BITTENBENDER, Plainclothesman, Metropolitan Police Department (MPD), Washington, D.C. (WDC), was contacted at the MPD Headquarters, 300 Indiana Avenue, N.H., WDC, and advised of the identity of the interviewing agents. BITTENBENDER was interviewed in the presence of Captain GEORGE SUTER and Lieutenant JACK ACREE of the MPD Intelligence Division.

He advised that he was acquainted with JAPKSMC CORD, Security Director of the Committee to Reelect the President, 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., WDC. He stated that he initially met MC CORD during a demonstration concerning the Children's March organized by the National Welfare Rights Organization, held as best he could recall during March, 1972. The purpose of this meeting which took place at MC CORD's office, 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W. was to advise MC CORD that a demonstration was to take place in front of his office. At that time he did not know MC CORD as the Security Director and was introduced to him for the first time.

Subsequently which BITTENBENDER recalls as being approximately one week, MC CORD contacted BITTENBENDER regarding establishing liaison between the Committee to Reelect the President and MPD Intelligence Division. At that time he and MC CORD arranged a luncheon for either April 6 or 7, 1972.

On either April 6 or 7, 1972, BITTENBENDER, on his day off, met with MC CORD at the Black Saddle Restaurant, 18th Street, N.W., WDC. They lunched for approximately two hours. The check was paid by MC CORD and was for \$14.00.

The following day, MC CORD contacted BITTENBENDER and again talked about liaison between the MPD and the Committee. BITTENBENDER reported this call and also advised Inspector THOMAS I. HERLINY of the contacts with MC CORD. BITTENBENDER did not, however, advise HERLIHY that he had lunched on his day off with MC CORD.



Sometime during early June, based on a previous phone call, BITTENBENDER met with MC CORD in his office at the Committee headquarters to discuss an individual that was being hired by the Committee and had been formerly investigated by the MPD. BITTENBENDER furnished a picture of the subject and told MC CORD that the subject had previously been arrested for assault with a deadly weapon.

During that meeting MC CORD showed BITTENBENDER around the headquarters and specifically pointed out a close circuit television operation used for security. Additionally, he displayed several Bell and Howell transceivers similar to those used by the MPD. He also displayed what BITTENBENDER described as Mason equipment valued at approximately \$6,000 which is used to determine if any eavesdropping devices are being used in a building. MC CORD also displayed to BITTENBENDER a Regency scanner which is used to monitor several radio networks at the same time. BITTENBENDER was asked by MC CORD to speak to a group comprised of members of the Committee to Reelect the President regarding security, particularly involving demonstrations. BITTENBENDER replied that he would be unable to do this except as an official representative of the MPD and this would take approval by MPD officials. With this MC CORD stated they would discuss it again at a later date. During this meeting MC CORD and BITTENBENDER arranged for a luncheon date to be held on either Tuesday, June 20, 1972 or Wednesday, June 21, 1972, which would be his day off.

On June 17, 1972, BITTENBENDER was working in connection with an investigation taking place at the Democratic National Committee Headquarters, Watergate, Virginia Avenue, WDC. During that investigation, BITTENBENDER was asked by his supervisor to obtain arrest records that were taken in connection with the investigation at the MPD Identification Division. Upon entering the Identification Division for these records he observed Jein MC CORD being processed by the MPD. At this time BITTENBENDER James

called his supervisor and reported that he had seen MC CORD in the Identification Division being processed as one of the subjects in the investigation concerning Democratic (National: Committed Headquarters.

On the same afternoon, BITTENBENDER spoke to MC CORD at the MPD cell block and substance of this conversation has been reported to MPD Intelligence Division. During the conversation MC CORD said he was sorry. BITTENBENDER replied he had no need to apologize to him and MC CORD asked that BITTENBENDER apprise MC CORD's wife of the arrest and that he was okay.

BITTENBENDER felt that it would be improper for him to directly contact MC CORD's wife. Consequently, he proceeded to the Committee to Reelect the President headquarters, 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W. where he told another Security Officer PENNY, whose last name he could not recall, to advise MC CORD's wife. PENNY was extremely upset and stated that she looked to MC CORD as being her father. BITTENBENDER had met PENNY on at least one other occasion but that was the extent of his involvement with her.

He has had no further contact with MC CORD or PENNY except for one telephone call from PENNY indicating that she had related the message from MC CORD to his wife.

Theronly associates known to BITTENBENDER of MC CORD's are AL WONG, U.S. Secret Service who is a personal friend, BOB HOUSTON, involved in security for the Committee to Reelect the President, TOM WINTZ (ph) and STEVE KING, both involved with the Committee, the latter he was told is currently the Director of security for the Committee.

BITTENBENDER stated that all of his contacts with MC CORD were for the purpose of effecting liaison between the Committee and the Intelligence Division, MPD and official in nature even though one of these meetings was held on his day off.

On July 13, 1972, Chief Judge JOHN SIRICA, United States District Court (USDC), Washington, D.C. (WDC), based on previous refusals to discuss matters before the Federal Grand Jury, found MICHAEL DOUGLAS CADDY in contempt of court.

On the same date Judge SIRICA ordered CADDY to be remanded to the custody of the United States Attorney General until such time as he purges himself of the contempt or until the duration of the life of this Grand Jury. The attorneys for CADDY immediately filed an appeal and the United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia heard the arguments on July 18, 1972.

On the afternoon of July 18, 1972, the USDC of Appeals upheld the conviction of CADDY by the lower court and ordered him to testify before the Grand Jury.

DAMNENHAUER advised that she had accompanied SLOAN to the luncheon-cocktail party at the Washington Hilton Hotel on April 11, 1972, which party Mr. MAURICE STANS also attended.

DAMNAUER explained that she did not sit in during the meeting which occurred, but had simply attended to assist another girl in the distribution of material to those attending the meeting. She was unaware of the receipt of any funds by Mr. SLOAN during that meeting, although she understood the normal course of business would have been for Mr. SLOAN to have received any contributions that were made at that meeting.

DANNENHAUER indicated that she did know KENNETH DAHLBERG, Chairman of the Minnesota Finance Committee to Re-Elect the President, by name and face, but that she was not a personal friend of his and had absolutely no knowledge of a \$25,000 contribution received from DAHLBERG at the meeting on April 11, 1972, or any other time.

Had Mr. SLOAN received a check or cash contribution, DANNENHAUER indicated that SLOAN would have given the check to PETER HOLMES, his assistant, and it would have then gone to the bookkeeping department, handled by PAUL BARRICK or Miss JUDY HOBACK.

DANNENHAUER advised that to her knowledge SLOAN never transferred funds to dummy accounts or accounts maintained by anyone other than the Finance Committee to Re-Elect the President maintained at the First National Bank of Washington, 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C.

DANNENHAUER specifically advised that with regard to the April 11, 1972, meeting at the Washington Hilton Hotel that she was not asked to prepare any memos afterwards concerning any contributions received.

With regard to the delivery on April 6, 1972, of a brown unaddressed envelope from YOLANDA DORMINY, DANNENHAUER indicated that she had no knowledge of such a delivery. Furthermore, DANNENHAUER advised that she could not recall any previous such deliveries of cash or checks in unaddressed brown envelopes.

Mrs. HORACK, a registered Democrat, provided the following information:

Re-Elect the President (TMTP), 1701 Fernsylvania Avenue, N.W., is Assistant to the Treasurer. This title was conferred on her on July 17, 1972, and she had previously been employed at the FCTRP as an Accountant. She began her employment at the FCTRP on November 1, 1971, and worked climetry for Mr. HUGH SLOAM. Her general duties were to reverse the books in order to set up a more efficient computer system. Mrs. HCBACK redrifted all checks from the inception of the FCTLP, which was in Natch, 1971. She classified all checks into the new computer accounting system. Her general duties further included payment of all bills approved for payment by Mr. ROBEKT OBLE and Mr. HUGH SLOAM. Mrs. HOBACK wrote all disbursement checks.

The Cormittee to Re-Riest the President (CTRP) is a political entity and is solely for political propaganda and has no banking powers nor fund powers nor does it disburse any monies for bills and/or salaries. The FCTEP is a separate legal entity which has barking powers plus fund raising powers and which pays all bills and salaries of the CTRP.

All monies that came to the FCTRP came to Mr. HUGH SLOAN. These monies were directed to "Dummy Conmittees" or to the general Finance Committee and these monies were handled by Mr. SLOAN and his secretary, JAME DAMMENHAUER, who typed all

Mrs. HOBACK believed that all contributors lists were destroyed prior to April 7, 1972. She further believes that no persons have a list of contributors.

Prior to April 7, 1972, cash in the form of currency came down from CTRP to Mr. SLOAN from various individuals at CTRP. This currency was turned over to Mr. SLOAN to be put into his safe in his office for safe keeping. Mr. SLOAN was the custodian of this cash, but Mrs. HORACK does not know the identity or identities of the person or persons who gave the cash to Mr. SLOAN. Mr. SLOAN separated this cash from the "Dummy Committees" and from the FCTRP and put the cash into his safe. Mrs. HOBACK believed that Mr. SLOAN kept a written record of which individuals gave him cash, as well as how much cash was given him. Mrs. HOBACK continued that the reason for this was because Mr. SLOAN would have to account to whom ever gave him the cash for the disbursement of same. Mrs. HOBACK believed Mr. JEB STHART MAGNUER instructed Mr. SLOAN to hand out various amounts of cash to certain persons from the CTRP. ments were made at various times prior to April 7, 1972. Mrs. HOEACK believed Mr. MAGRUDER was the only person who instructed Mr. SLCAN on disbursement procedures regarding the aforementioned cash for which Mr. SLCAN was custodian.

From February, 1972, until April 7, 1972, a record existed of disbursements of cash from Mr. SLOAN to various individuals and the amount which was received by those individuals. Mrs. HOBACK had occasion to verify the addition of figures handwritten by Mr. SLOAN on yellow legal sized sheets of work paper on approximately six occasions between the beginning of February, 1972, and approximately April 6, 1972. On or about April 6, 1972, Mrs. HOBACK recalls being handed one such tally sheet of handwritten figures by Mr. SLOAN. On this tally sheet were Mr. SLOAN's handwritten notations which indicated the following cash disbursements to the below noted individuals:

GEORGE GORDON LIDDY, either \$81,000 or \$89,000.

Mr. BART FORTER, over \$100,000.

Mr. JEB MAGRUDGR, cannot recall exact amount but believes it to be approximately \$50,000.

Mrs. HCBACK stated that she believes the aforementioned figures represent a final tally on the indicated date of the cash disbursements made by Mr. HUGH SLOAN to the indicated individuals.

The cash as mentioned above was located in Mr. SLOAN's safe in his office. The safe was described as gray with two shelves. Mr. HOBACK received the combination for the safe on April 11, 1972, but she had occasion to go into the safe many times between February, 1972, and the present, inasmuch as her financial ledgers were kept therein. She observed on many occasions an attache case, tan in color, located in the safe and observed green currency inside of the attache case, and is certain that the attache case was full of cash. JANE DANNENHAUER, Mr. SLOAN's Secretary, had the combination for the safe from the




start of her employment, but Mrs. HOBACK is certain that DANNENHAUER knows absolutely nothing regarding the contents in the safe and the items described in transmittal letters she typed for the banks. Mrs. HOBACK explained that Mr. SLOAN protected DANNENHAUER and DANNENHAUER did not know what she was typing. Mrs. HOBACK observed Mr. PCRTER, Mr. LIDDY and Mr. MAGRUDER in Mr. SLOAN's office on many occasions. On some of these occasions, the door to Mr. SLOAN's office was closed and when Mrs. HOBACK would buzz his office to enter, Mr. SLOAN would reply that he did not want to be disturbed.

Mr. SLOAN appeared at the Finance Committee on July 18, 1972, at about 3:30 p.m. and told Mrs. HOBACK that if he did not get an attorney that evening he was ready to talk with the FBI. Mr. SLOAN stated that technically, he was not the Treasurer for the above funds and was merely a custodian of same. He further stated to Mrs. HOBACK that he was not really responsible for the above-mentioned cash since he was only responsible for FCTRP funds. Mrs. HOBACK recalled that Mr. SLOAN had stated to her during the week after the Democratic National Committee Headquarters (DNCH) office burglary that the best thing NIMON could do "was to get rid of the whole CTRP". He further remarked to Mrs. HOBACK "I cannot believe that the FBI will not trace the \$100 bills to us. They are too professional." The latter was in reference to press articles which had appeared in which it was disclosed that those arrested for the burglary had in their possession numerous \$100 bills. Mr. SLOAN further told Mrs. HOBACK that he had disbursed brand new \$100 bills and that the FBI would find his fingerprints on same.

The Security Guards at the CTRP were all hired by Mr. JAMES MC CORD, who brought them to Mrs. HOBACK in order to fill out various salary forms. The Security Guards were paid by the Finance Committee, but Mr. MC CORD paid the salaries of two guards (identities not recalled) and would then bill the Finance Committee for their salaries.

Mrs. HOBACK did not recall ever observing any foreign check all of the period she has been employed by the Finance Committee, especially a check drawn on a Mexican bank.

Mr. MAURICE STANS, on returning to the Finance Committee from trips throughout the country, would bring in checks. Fund raisers would also bring in checks and contributers would come into the office and give checks and checks would also arrive by Lail. Whenever a large check comes into the Dimarce Committee, it is sound or disbursed to various other Committees, such as Radio Committee to Re-Elect the President. Lidia Committee to Re-Alect the President, Television Committee to Re-Elect the President or the FCTRP. The latter is done for gift tax purposes. There are very few large checks that come into the Committee and Mrs. HOBACK would have recalled observing any large check.

Mr. Shoan accounts to no one else for the funds. Mr. STANS is very insistent on record keeping of said funds and insists on each contributor receiving a "thank-you" note within 48 hours after receipt of donation.

Mrs. HORACK scated that Mr. BLOAN resigned from the Committee of his own volition. He stated to Mrs. HORACK that his resignation was the best thing for the Committee and for President NIKON. Mr. GLOAN said it would be better for all conceined if he became a private citizen. Mrs. HORACK has knowledge that Mr. SLOAN had received pressure from Mrs. SLOAN to resign because his eating and sleeping habits have been very erratic since the Matergate burglary. Mr. SLOAN has also been constantly worrying. Mr. SLOAN was also advised by his attorney (name unrecalled) to resign.

In recent conversation with Mrs. HOBACK, Mr. SLOAN said that he was approached by an unnamed individual in the CTRP and the suggestion was made to Mr. SLOAN that "He take a dive or a fall". Whereupon, Mr. SLOAN replied to that individual, "You've got the wrong pigeon". Mr. SLOAN was approached with the above suggestion on more than one coession and Mrs. HOBACK believes he was approached on three coessions. Mr. SLOAN was shocked by what was proposed and stated that the entire incident was unbelievable. Mrs. HOBACK is convinced that Mr. SLOAN did not take a "dive or fall".

Fund Raiser for the FCTRP prior to April 7, 1972, was contacted by Mr. SLCAN regarding the Watergate burglary, but Mr. KALMMACH did not want to be apprised of the burglary or of any circumstances pertaining thereto. Mr. KALMMACH also indicated that he did not want to be apprised by Mr. SLOAN of what was happening at the Committee. Mr. SLOAN recentacted Mr. KALMMACH on July 18, 1972, regarding Mr. SLOAN's possible defense and Mr. KALMMACH was supposed to fly into Washington, D.C. (WDC), the evening of July 18, 1972, for purposes of defending Mr. SLOAN.

She then told the attorneys about the cash disbursements made by Mr. SLOAN from the cash on hand kept within the attache case located in the safe in Mr. SLOAN's office. She detailed to the attorneys present specific knowledge concerning cash disbursements made from those monies to specific individuals. namely, Mr. GEORGE GORDON LIDDY, in the amount of \$81,000 or \$89,000; Mr. BAKT PORTER, in the amount of over \$100,000; and to Mr. JEB MAGRUDER, in the amount of what she thought was over Immediately following these disclosures, Attorney O'BRIEN remarked, "JESUS CHRIST!" SLOAN immediately stated to the attorneys present "Wait until you hear what I have to say". Mr. SLOAN then instructed Mrs. HOBACK to depart the meeting and to drive Mrs. SLOAN to Mr. SLOAN's residence, inasmuch as Mr. SLOAN wanted to protect Mrs. HOBACK from what he was about to disclose to Attorneys PARKINSON and O'BRIEN.

Mr. SLOAN arrived at his residence about two hours later and told Mrs. HOBACK that he wanted to have some private words with Mrs. SLOAN for a few minutes. At dinner with Mrs.

SLOAN and Mrs. HOBACK, Mr. SLOAN said that he was instructed by Attorneys PARKINSON and O'BRIEN to go to California on the following day, July 7, 1972, because they did not want him to be subpoensed before the Federal Grand Jury then impaneled at WDC and investigating the Watergate burglary. The attorneys wanted a week or two in order to plan things out.

While eating dinner, Mr. SLOAN received a telephone call, the duration of which was a few seconds. Upon returning to the dinner table, Mr. SLOAN stated to Mrs. SLOAN and Mrs. MOBACK that Mr. FREDILA RUE had instructed him to depart for California on the following day, July 7, 1972, in order to be in on the State Committeemen meetings in California with Mr. MAURICE STANS. Mr. SLOAN remarked that "LA RUE does not leave anything to chance. He is very technical." On the following Monday or Tuesday, Mrs. HOBACK received a telephone call from Mrs. SLOAN from California and Mr. SLOAN inquired of her personal safety and welfare.

Mr. SLOAN departed for California on July 7, 1972, and the official reason given was that he went to meet with Mr. STANS so that both could talk to State Committeemen. Mrs. HOBACK is of the opinion Mr. SLOAN went to California to tell Mr. STANS that he was going to resign.

Mr. SLOAN arrived at the Firance Committee office on July 14, 1972, about 1:00 p.m., went straight into Mr. STANS' office and remained therein for approximately 40 minutes. He then came out of the office and dictated a letter of resignation to J. DANNENHAUER. Mrs. HOBACK did not observe Mr. SLOAN clean out his desk at this time and Mr. SLOAN departed this office shortly thereafter. Mrs. HOBACK did not observe anyone clean out Mr. SLOAN's desk on Friday, July 14, 1972. Some time during the afternoon of July 14, 1972, Mr. STANS related to Mrs. HOBACK that he had spent the entire week attempting to convince Mr. SLOAN not to resign from his position as Treasurer.





Mrs. HOBACK stated that Mr. SLOAN had never mentioned to her that he took the position with the Finance Committee with the intention that he would resign the position at about this time.

Mrs. HOBACK was asked the following question:

Do you recall recording a total of \$U4,000 or two checks for \$9,000 and one for \$25,000 into a "Dummy Committee" in the name of Barker and Associates? Mrs. HOBACK replied in the negative.

PORTUR advised that he is officially designated as the Director of Scheduling under the Committee to Re-Elect the President (CRP). He has held this position since his employment by the Committee on May 1, 1971. Prior to his employment by the CPP, he worked as Staff Assistant at the White House under HERGERT G. KLIND, Director of Communications; and his immediate supervisor at that time was JEB MAGRUCER, Deputy Director of Communications.

He advised that his present duties entail the scheduling and coordination of surrogate candidates for the President.

PCRIER indicated that he prepared budgets regarding the employees on his staff re their salaries and to a limited degree, budgets concerning the appearance of celebrities at particular political functions. In neither instance did these disbursements involve any physical handling of funds by him.

In 1971 the Cormittee contemplated holding a number of rallies around the country at which various celebrities or surrogate candidates would appear. In addition surrogate candidates would also be appearing on behalf of the President at various banquets and meeting halls under the contemplated campaign schedule. cash, usually in one hundred dollar bills, count the money and take it back to his office. LTDDY would then come to PORTER's office, count the money, furnish PCRTER with a receipt and leave with the money.

PORTER advised that he did not know why JEB MAGRUDER requested him to serve as a conduit for these funds. He stated that he was not a distinsing officer for the Colmittee and that subsequently he destroyed all receipts which had been signed by GEORGE GORDON LIDDY. He explained that he did so because he could see no reason to retain these receipts.

PORTER advised that on each occasion, when he obtained the money from HUGH SLOAM, it had been placed in an envelope, which he noticed on at least one occasion bore HUGH SLOAM's full name and the address, 1701 Pransylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. (WDC). The envelope did not bear the name of the Committee. He further advised that he was not sure that all of the envelopes bore any such notation.

PORTER advised that between the meeting held in mid 12 to late January, 1972, and April 1, 1972, LIDDY made between eight to ten requests for money. Some of the requests were made in person and some by telephone. Usually the amounts were between one and five thousand dollars. PORTER advised that LTDDY requested, during the above mentioned period, roughly thirty-five thousand dollars, give or take two to four thousand dollars. PORTER furnished to LTDDY the total amount requested. None of the money furnished during that period was returned by LTDDY to PORTER. In all instances PORTER followed the procedures of notifying SLOAN, who furnished the money to him, and then took it back to his office where he personally gave the money to LIDDY. Invariably the money consisted of one hundred dollar bills.

Prior to a March 3, 1972, rally in New Hampshire, at which various celebrities were to speak, LIDDY stated that fliers were being circulated supporting an "anti-war" demonstration against the rally. LIDDY estimated some 200 demonstrators would be present. LIDDY advised prior to a March 9, 1972, rally at Miami, Florida, at which

Governor REAGAN was to speak, that there would be a Right Wing demonstration at the rally on behalf of the supporters of the ASBROOK candidacy. LIDDY also advised PORTER, and presumably others, that if the convention were held in San Diego, California, there might be as many as 250 thousand demonstrators present.

Subsequent to April 1, 1972, LIDDY made only one request of PORTER for funds. Just prior to May 10, 1972, LIDDY requested fifty-three hundred dollars in order to cover a demonstration scheduled at the Capitol around May 10, 1972. PORTER obtained the funds from SLOAN and furnished them to LIDDY, who subsequently returned two thousand dollars to PORTER.

PORTER indicated that he did not instruct GEORGE GORDON LIDDY regarding the intelligence information needed by the Committee, nor did he place any limitations on how LIDDY was to acquire this intelligence. He advised that he did not consider it his responsibility as LIDDY was an employee for JEB MAGRUDER, not PORTER. PORTER advised that he does not know what instructions MAGRUDER gave LIDDY.

PORTER advised that he had never heard of E. HOWARD HUNT prior to the newspaper stories mentioning HUNT, nor was he familiar with anyone using the name EDWARD HAMILTON. PORTER advised that prior to the employment by the Committee of GEORGE GORDON LIDDY, he had never heard LIDDY's name and knew nothing about him. He had never heard of JAMES W. MC CORD prior to MC CORD's employment by the CRP. He further advised that he was unaware of LIDDY's use of MC CORD or anyone else to gather the intelligence requested. PORTER indicated that he did not know any of the other principles arrested in the burglary of the Democratic National Headquarters on June 17-18, 1972.

PORTER never asked, nor did he want to know what methods LIDDY intended to use to obtain the intelligence requested. He advised that this was not because he felt that any illegal methods might be used, but simply because it was not his responsibility. He advised that LIDDY never furnished any memorandums, vouchers or expenditure records indicating how the funds which PORTER furnished to LIDDY were spent.

He explained that his responsibilities were to maintain contact between the State Treasurers of the various affiliated State FCTRFs, and the National FCTRP, located at 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., NLC. Furthermore, as Assistant to the Treasurer, HOLYES did handle checks and cash contributions received by the Committee and was responsible for distursements to State Committees, but not to individuals or businesses submitting bills re non-political expenditures.

HOLMES advised that he initiated a record keeping system which he maintains in his office re all contributions and disbursaments which he has handled since his employment. Prior to this period, he advised that he was not familiar with the record keeping procedure used by HUGH W. SLOAN, JR., or others handling similar functions.

HOLMES advised that he has a transmittal letter prepared for his file identifying the amount, name and address of each contributor or the amount, name and address of each Committee to whom disbursements are made. After this transmittal letter is prepared, HOLMES has the contributors check delivered to CHARLOTTE LYETH, employed in the Comptroller's

Office, and she prepares a "transmittal slip", which becomes a back-up record for the deposit of the contributor's check into the Committee account.

HOLMES advised that this preparation of a "transmittal slip" was apparently a standard procedure prior to his employment on April 24, 1972.

HOLMES was asked if he had personally assisted in the preparation of a report concerning receipt and disbursements of the FCTRP required under the new Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971. He replied in the negative, indicating that he assumed that all necessary data was obtained from records maintained by the Comptroller's Office.

HOLMES was asked, if in view of his responsibilities under this law, he had made any inquiries of HUGH W. SLOAN, JR., concerning receipts and disbursements between the period April 7, and April 24, 1972. He advised that he had and that although Mr. SLOAN had made him aware of various funds received during that period, no mention had been made of a \$25,000 contribution by KENNETH DAHLLERG, Chairman of the Minnesota FCTRP. Furtherwore, HOLMES could not recall any details re records or other procedures for handling contributions received during the period April 7, through April 24, 1972.

HOLMES was asked if he would examine his records and any records which he received from HUGH W. SLOAN, JR., to determine if he could locate any notation concerning a contribution made by KENNETH DAHLBERG on April 11, 1972, in the amount of \$25,000. After checking with his superiors, HOLMES advised that he made a thorough search of all his records and those of Mr. HUGH W. SLOAN, JR., and could locate no records pertaining to any such contribution by KENNETH DAHLBERG. HOLMES made it clear that he was referring to the period of time from April 7, 1972, to the present.

Present during this interview was KENNETH WELLS PARENTON. Absorbey-at-Law, business address 1328 L Street, N. I., phone 455-6850.

Represently holds the title, Deputy Campaign Director, Counities To Re-Elect the President, (CRP), 1701 Fennsylvania Avenue, N.W. He has been with this Committee since its inception, May 1, 1971, and until March 1, 1972, he was the Director of the Committee. He explained that prior to March 1, 1972, there were no titles for various members of the Committee, however he functioned as the Committee's chief policy maker.


On March 1, 1972, JOHN MITCHELL was formally appointed as the Carraina Director of the CRP, however due to other presting problems involving JCHN MITCHELL, for all practical pulposes MAGHUSER continued as the CRP's chief policy maker. And although CLARK McGRECOR has replaced Mr. MITCHELL, MAGRUSER continues in his role as chief policy maker.

His duties include direction of all divisions within the CRP relating to advertising, polling, direct mail program, telephone program, public relations and press releases, spokenman resource, tour office, general and specific research (opposition candidates) and liaison with the White House and the Republican National Committee. Furthermore, his authorization is necessary for disbursement of funds.

At the inception of the campaign to re-elect the President, in May of 1971, six or seven individuals formed the nucleus of the CPP and the Finance Committee to Re-Elect the President (FCTRF). Of those individuals all but one formed the core group for the CRP including MAGRUDER. The other individual was MUSH W. SLOAN, JR., who initiated the development of the FCTRP.

MAGRIDER explained that the GTP personnel had absolutely no responsibilities recarding fund raining or banking and that they in no way handled contributions. He did qualify this resark by sinting that some of the CRP members may have received small contributions from friends which they simply forwarded to the FOTAP.

MAGRUDER has on only one occasion made a coch disbursement since his employment by the CRP. This dispursement is involved his employment by the CRP. not to have published. Payment was directed by the White House and personally made by MAGRUDER in late February or early March, 1972. The funds for this cash disbursement were obtained from HUGH W. SLOAN, JR., Treasurer, FCTRP.

In December of 1971, it became apparent to MAGRUDER that the CRF would need laral counsel concerning electoral slates and election law requirements. After conference with two White House staff personnel, JOHN DEANE and BUD KECGH, GECAGE GORDON LIDDY was hired as a counsel for the CRP. DEAN and KRCGH had explained to MAGRUDER that LIDDY was an attorized and also an ex-FBI Agent with expertise re gathering intelligence, should that service be needed.

In late January or early February, MAGRUETR assigned LIDDY the responsibility of gathering intelligence concerning two specific problems which the CRP could foresee. The first of these problems concerned the appearance of surrogate candidates or celebrities at various rallies and other public appearances throughout the nation. Specifically, the CRP felt that it was responsible for insuring that the surrogate candidates and celebrities were not harracsed, and were at least aware when demonstrators or dissidents were likely to be present at such rallies and/or attempt to disrupt them. The other security problem which concerned the CRP was possible disruption at the convention site itself.

HERBERT LLOYD PORTUR, Director of Scheduling, CRP, had previously conversed with MAGRUDDR concerning the security problem connected with surrogate cardidates and celebrity appearances. PORTER had advised MAGRUDER that he (PORTER) had estimated the cost of intelligence for the surrogate-celebrity appearances to run approximately \$100,000, and in view of the concern MAGRUDER had re disruption at the convention site itself, MAGRUPER authorized HUGH W. SLOAN, JR. to permit GEORGE GORDON LIDDY to expend up to \$250,000 to gather intelligence re both concerns.

MAGRUDER recalled that he did hold a meeting in his office in mid or late January, 1972, with HERBERT LLOYD PORTER and GEORGE GORDON LIDDY. At this meeting,

He advised PORTER that GEORGE CORDON LIDDY would gather intelligence re the surrogate-celebrity appearances. He further explained that LIDDY would periodically come to PORTER, request the funds needed and that PORTER was to then notify HUCH W. SLOAN, JR., Treasurer, FCTRP, who would furnish the funds in cash to PORTER and PORTER would then give the funds to LIDDY. MAGRUDER advised that he understood that PORTER had given LIDDY roughly \$35,000 for this purpose.

MAGRUDER did not know why he had set up the LIDDY-PORTER-SLOAN-PORTER-LIDDY procedure regarding the request and payment of these funds. He explained that with regard to intelligence concerning the convention site itself, LIDDY was authorized to request and receive directly from HUGH W. SLOAN, JR. the necessary funds. MAGRUDER advised that he understood the transactions were in cash and admitted that he had no idea what the total amount of money was which GEORGE GORDON LIDDY had received.

MAGRUDER was asked if he believed the \$5300 transaction from HERBERT LLOYD PORTER to GEORGE GORDON LIDDY on or about May 10, 1972, and which was not reported by the CRP under the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, was in violation of the law. MAGRUDER explained that as the cash for this transaction came from HUGH W. SLOAN, JR. to PORTER, but actually for LIDDY, that the matter was subject to legal interpretation. He advised that it was his understanding that such expenditures had to be reported by the FCTRP and not the CRP.

MAGRUDER advised that neither he nor anyone else on the CRP asked for a budget, any type of voucher or the identification of personnel hired by LIDDY to assist in the gathering of the requested intelligence. He stated he was interested in results and not details of how they were obtained.

Results regarding the surrogate-celebrity intelligence efforts were furnished to HERBERT LLOYD PORTER. With regard to the convention site intelligence problem, LIDDY advised MAGRUDER that if the convention were held in San Diego, California, there might be as many as 250,000 demonstrators. And further, that the physical location of the






convention hall in San Diego would allow the demonstrators to easily disrupt the convention.

MAGRUDER could not recall precisely when he originally broached the subject to LIDDY concerning intelligence gathering. However he did explain that the CRP was concerned about demonstrators disrupting the appearance of surrogate candidates or celebrities and this concern had been heightened by bombings which had occurred in Chicago and at the Tower's Headquarters. Also he had mentioned with regard to the San Diego convention site that demonstrators had opened an office in San Diego and that both the regular and underground press had published articles quoting the radical leadership as an intending to disrupt the convention. By radicals MAGRUDER explained that he meant the Yippies, Zippies, SDS and Weatherman groups.

MAGRUDER advised that he never mentioned or suggested to LIDD that he suspected officials of the Democratic Party or their leading candidates would in any way encourage finance or direct disruptive tactics at either the convention site or any appearance of a surrogate candidate. He explained that he simply felt that the radicals would concentrate their efforts against the party in office this year the Republicans, much as they concentrated their efforts against the Democrats in 1968.

Furthermore MAGRUDER made perfectly clear that he had advised LIDDY that he was involved in a Presidential campaign and that he would tolerate no embarrassing activities on LIDDY's part and he specifically advised LIDDY to conduct his intelligence gathering activities within the law.

Around the middle of March, 1972, MAGRUDER concluded that LIDDY was not adequately handling the legal work of the CRP. Furthermore MAGRUDER advised LIDDY did not perform his work in the manner to which MAGRUDER was accustomed. He explained that LIDDY frequently furnished his advise orally as opposed to a written presentation, and that which was prepared in writing appeared to MAGRUDER as a sketchy, last minute report.

MAGRUDER was asked if any of this \$30,000 was expended to individuals who were to descentingte at the appearances of any Democratic conditates for the presidency. He apswered in the nagative, and adviced that the above example was the limit to any harrassment efforts.

NACRUDER was asked if he had personally been in the officer of FUGG M. CLOAN, JR., Treesurer, FOURK. And he advised that though hr. SLOAN was not a personal friend, he had previously worked with him in the 1950 campaign and as a result been in his office on several occasions for conversation.

MARKINE adviced he accommanied JONN MITCHNID to a mosting on April 11, 1972, at the Mashington Multon Hotel and that this meeting consisted of a gathering of the





the State Finance Committee Chairmen. He indicated that Mr. MITCHELL gave a brief talk at this meeting and that he (MAGRUDER) had spoken momentarily to KENNETH DAHLEERG, Chairman of the Minnesota Finance Committee to Re-Elect the President. MAGRUDER observed no check or contribution made by DAHLEERG to MAURICE STANS or anyone else at that meeting. Subsequently, MAGRUDER did not receive any call from DAHLBERG regarding a contribution made at that meeting.

MAGRUDER advised that JAMES W. McCORD was hired by ROBERT ODLE, that he (MAGRUDER) knew McCORD, thought he was a competent person and was very surprised to learn of his involvement in a burglary on June 17-18, 1972. MAGRUDER did not know that JAMES W. McCORD in any way worked for or with GEORGE GORDON LIDDY in the gathering of intelligence.

MAGRUDER was asked why McCORD and his associates would burglarize the Democratic Party Headquarters or attempt an electronic surveillance thereof. He advised that he felt McCORD was acting as a "soldier of fortune" and further added that real information of value would come from a candidate's headquarters and not the party's headquarters.

MAGRUDER identified YOUNG, COLSON, and BUTTERFIELD as individuals he knew and had met during his White House employment. He advised that approximately two and one half years ago he had interviewed EVERETTE HOWARD HUNT for a job, but had not hired him as HUNT's qualifications did not fit the needs, and for this reason he recognized HUNT.

MAGRUDER identified photographs of JAMES W. McCORD and BERNARD BARKER, Explaining that he recognized BARKER's picture from newspaper photos.

MAGRUDER explained that the \$250,000 authorization which he had made for intelligence gathering was justified since the Committee to Re-Elect the President was an independent, private group, which did not have access to government intelligence reports. And though he could not account for how GEORTE GORDON LIDDY had spent any of the funds, the information which LIDDY had furnished regarding the San Diego convention site was (in his opinion) sufficient to justify the expenditure. He stated that this information had been the primary basis for which the convention site had been changed from San Diego, California to Miami Beach, Florida.

President.

Miss FREDERICK advised that she has been the personal secretary of Mr. FRED C. LA RUE since she came to Washington in the Summer or Fall of 1969. At that time she resided at 1213 29th Street, N.W., and the office in which she was employed was in the Executive Office Building.

cylinder or through the butt of the weapon. She advised that this weapon was maintained beside her bed in a nightstand and remained there until she discovered it missing after she moved to a new residence.

Miss FREDERICK stated that she moved in March, 1971 and that on the day of the move she had personally observed the weapon in the nightstand beside her bed and when she retired for the evening at her new residence of 3250 N Street, N.W., which is her present address, she noted that the weapon was missing.

She stated that the following morning she discussed the fact that the weapon was missing with Mr. LA RUE and he reported the weapon missing to the White House Police as well as the Netropolitan Police. She advised that she was later interviewed by both White House Police and the Netropolitan Police but could not recall either of the interviewing officers names. She stated that the Metropolitan Police Department report should contain the name of the moving company, which at this time has slipped her memory. She stated that to the best of her knowledge she was moved by four or five Negro males from her old address into her present address and that possibly one of these individuals had taken the weapon.

Miss FREDERICK advised that she would review several old checks in an effort to determine the company name and if it was located or she could recall it would notify the interviewing agents of the moving company. In the same regard, she advised that in the event she learned of any information concerning this weapon, that she would also notify this office. She advised that to her knowledge that this weapon has not been recovered and she could furnish no additional information concerning the weapon.

KENTETH WALLS PARKINSON, Attornsy at Law, business address 1823 L Street, N.W., phone 466-8850, was advised as to the identities of the interviewing agents as Special Agents of the FBI and the purpose of the interview was explained to him.

Present during the interview with PARKINSON was PAUL L. O'ERIFN, an Attorney, whose offices are located at 888 17th Street, N.W., Wachington, D.C. (IDC), business phone number 298-6131.

At the outcat of the interview, Mr. PAPKINSON noted that he had not personally retained Mr. O'BRIEN to act as his personal legal counsel, but rather stated that Mr. O'ERIEN was present as a representative of the Committee to Re-Elect the President (CRP) at the request of the CRP.

Mr. PARKINSON was asked to relate the circumstances surrounding his retention by the CRP. He indicated that he had been approached by individuals, when he would not identify, to undertake representation of the CRP in litigation resulting from a civil suit filed in United States District Court, WDC, by the Democratic National Committee with regard to the burglary of that Committee's National Headquarters. On June 22, 1972, Mr. PARKINSON indicated that he was retained by the CRP as a special consultant and as a legal counsel in connection with the above described givil suit.

Mr. PARKINSON advised that as special consultant to the CRP and as a legal counsel for the CRP, he represented the CRP in its entirety, that is, to include the Committee itself, the Finance Committee to Ra-Elect the President (FCRP), and all of the CRP's subordinate Committees; e.g., the Radio Committee to Re-Elect the President and the Television Committee to Re-Elect the President. He stated that

his representation was not confined to representation of the Committee as a whole, but rather extended to include all employees of any of the above stated Committees of which he noted therewere some 250 employees.

Mr. PARKINGON was asked to identify the individual (s) who, as representatives of the GRP, had retained him as a legal councel and special consultant. Iir. PARKINSON refused to divulge that information and stated that he considered it privileged information resulting from an attorney-client relationship. Mr. PARKINSON also refused to identify any individual at the GRP to whom he was responsible for performance of duties as legal counsel. He indicated that he had submitted a letter to the "hierarchy" of the GRP prior to his acceptance of the position of legal counsel for the Cormittee in the named civil suit. In this letter, Mr. FARKINSON stated that he set forth the terms on which he would accept that position. He refused to identify the addressee of that letter, again claiming that it was privileged information as the result of an attorney-client relationship.

Mr. PARKINSON advised that he did not represent any of the following individuals in the criminal case currently under investigation in connection with the burglary of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters (DNCH), WDC:

JAMES WALTER MC CORD, JR.
EUGENTO ROLANDO MARTINEZ Y. CHEAGA
VIRGILIO GONZALES
FRAIK ANTHONY STURGIS
BERNARD L. BARKER
ALFRED CARLETON BALDWIN, III
GEORGE GORDON LIDDY
HUGH WALTER SLOAM, JR.

The interviewing agents noted that Mr. PARKINSON had been present as a representative of the CRP during an interview of Mr. MAURICE STANS, Chairman, FCRP, held on July 14,



1972, at approximately 10:00 a.m. At the completion of that interview, the interviewing agents had made an attempt to ascertain the whereabouts of HUGH WALTER SLOAN, JR., then Treasurer, FCRP. At that time, no information could be obtained relative to SLOAN's whereabouts. Subsequently, approximately 1:00 p.m. on the same date, Mr. SLOAN personally submitted his resignation at the CAP offices. About 2:00 p.m., on the same date, FBI Agents again conducted an interview of Mr. MAURICE STANS. During the course of that interview, attempts were again made with negative results to ascertain the whereabouts of Mr. SLOAN.

The interviewing agents noted that one of the purposes of this interview was to attempt clarification of the fact that Mr. SLOAN's whereabouts had been unknown at the time of the initial interview noted above and at the second interview, when in fact Mr. SLOAN had appeared at the Committee offices and submitted his resignation during the time that clasped between the two interviews on that date. Mr. PARKINSON advised that he had voluntarily accepted the responsibility to arrange interviews for the FBI with members of the CRP and that even though he had undertaken this responsibility, he was not at all times aware of the whereabouts of the individuals with whom interviews had been requested. Consequently, he often experienced problems He advised that scheduling in the coordination of interviews. of interviews had been hampered by the fact that either he or Mr. O'BRIEN, who had to be present at an interview, often had other commitments. He noted that questions with regard to Mr. SIOAN's whereabouts on the day mantioned above, should be probably be directed to Mr. STANS rather than to himself.

When asked of his personal knowledge of the unavailation bility of SLOAN on that date, he indicated that he could furnish no information as such knowledge fell within his attorney-client relationship with Mr. STANS.

It should be noted that Mr. PARKINSON previously stated that he does not represent GEORGE GORDON LIDDY. It was noted by the interviewing agents that Mr. PARKINSON and Mr. O'BRIEN had

met with GEORGE GORDON LIDDY and his attorney subsequent to Mr. LIDDY's termination of employment with the CRP. PARKINSON did not represent LIDDY, he was requested to advise the interviewing agents of the substance of his conversation with LIDDY and LIDDY's attorney. In this regard he stated he could not comply with furnishing information as he felt it was "work products" developed as a result of his attorney-client relationship with the CRP. He emphatically noted that if he was compelled to make available to the FBI or local police, information which had come to his attention as a result of any of the interviews and investigations which he conducted in furtherance of his defense of the CRP's position in the civil suit, such action would severely hamper and in fact might mullify any efforts which he might undertake as counsel for the CRP. Therefore, he refused to furnish any information relative to his meeting with GEORGE GORDON LIDDY and LIDDY's attorney.

Mr. PARKINSON noted that it had been his personal position to do everything in his power to direct and encourage all members of the CRP to extend their fullest cooperation to the FBI in its investigation of the burglary of the DNCH.

LEWIS CEREL, Security Officer, First Mational Bank Building, 1701 Fernsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. (VIC), 4903 Shelby Drive, Oxon Hill, Maryland, talephone 248-1270, was interviewed at the office of the Building Manager, HOMARD O. SLTE, and provided the following information:

According to his work schedule, he is on duty at the dock in the lobby of the First National Bank Building, Monday shrough Priday, 4:00 p.m., to midnight. His job is to insure that people entering the building during those hours sign in and out on the register maintained on the desk in the boby.

Occasionally, a person will ask him to bring envelopes or packages to various offices in the building, but he very rarely complies with their request. He usually asks these individuals to deliver the packages themselves. In line with this procedure, he was unable to recall anyone asking him to deliver an envelope or package to the Finance Cormittee to De-Elect the President (FCRP) or Committee to De-Elect the President (CRP) for several months. He definitely does not recall such a request on or about June 8, 1972.

A group of color photographs of white males were exhibited to him, including those of EVERETTE HOWARD HUNG, CTERLES COLSON and ALEX BUTTERFIELD, but he was unable to identify any of the individuals depicted.

A group of black and white photographs of white males were exhibited to him, including those of VIRGILIO R. GONZALEZ, EUGENIO R. MARTINEZ, FRANK STURGIS, JAMES W. MC CORD and BERNARD BYRNER. From this group he recognized only the photograph of JAMES WALTER MC CORD. He explained that he knew MC CORD as Director of Security for the CRP. In that capacity, just after the Committee was formed, MC CORD asked him to notify him (MC CORD)

when he found any confidential files left out in the various offices of the Committee after working hours. However, after MC CORD increased his own staff, he was notified this was no longer necessary.

Finally, a group of block and white photographs of white maker, including that of GLORGI COLLUN LIPDY, were exhibited to him, but he was unable to identify any of these individuals.

Mr. TRIMAN JACOLALANTR was located at his residence, 4125 Horseshoe Drive, Annadale, Virginia, telephone number CL6-5098, and advised of the identity of FAUL P. MAGALLANDS as a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Mr. WEAVER was advised of the nature of the inquiry and provided the following information:

Mr. MAVER departed the building at 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., where he is employed as a Security Guard, at 8:00 a.m. on June 16, 1972. He had worked the 12:00 mid night to 8:00 a.m. shift on that day. Mr. WEAVER did not return again to the building until June 18, 1972, when he worked the 12:00 mid night to 8:00 a.m. shift. Mr. WEAVER did not recall anything unusual during his guard shift on the evening of June 18, 1972, except that there were more persons entering the building during the evening hours than is usual. He stated he paid no particular attention to who entered the building and that the persons who entered same went upstairs, floors unrecalled.
