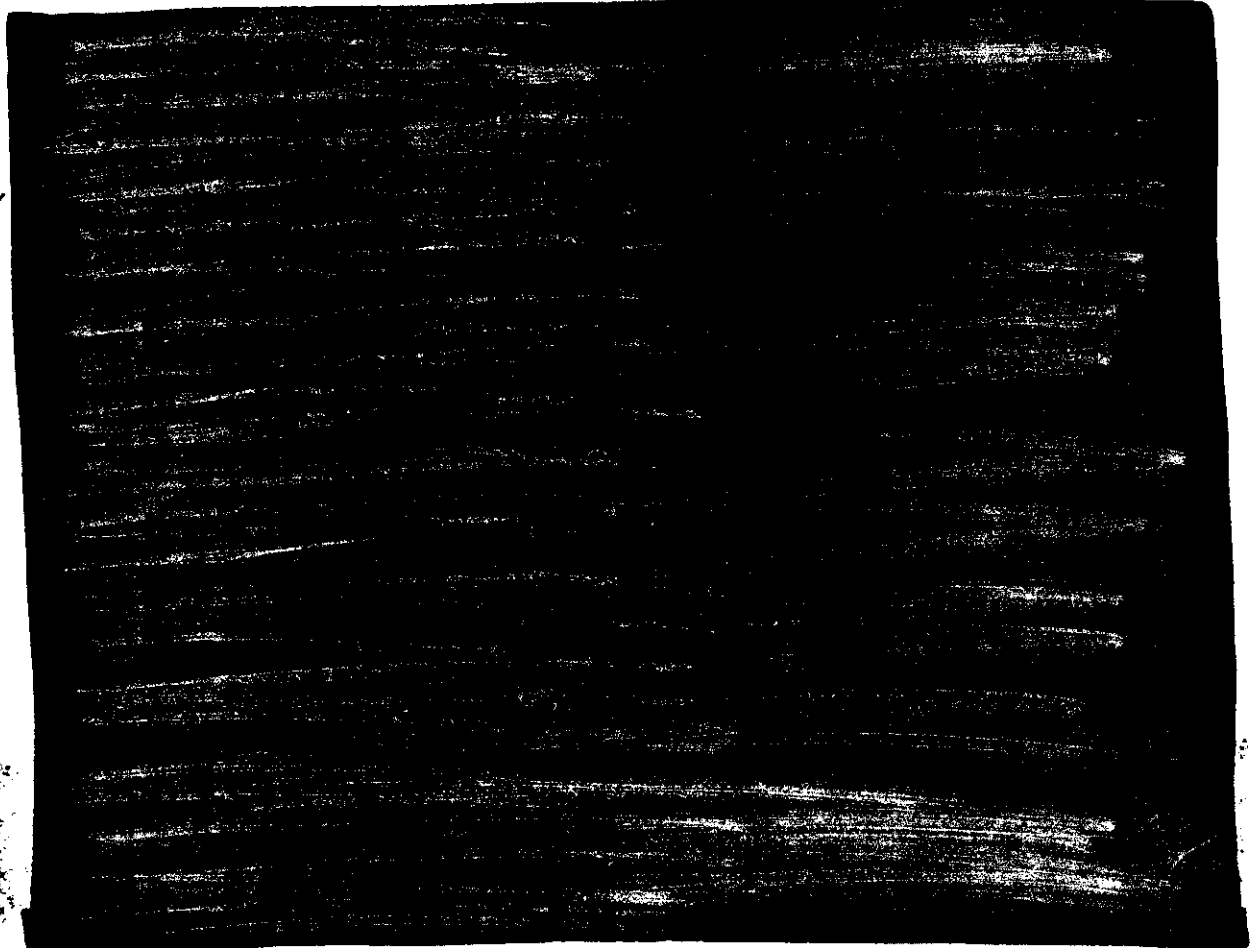

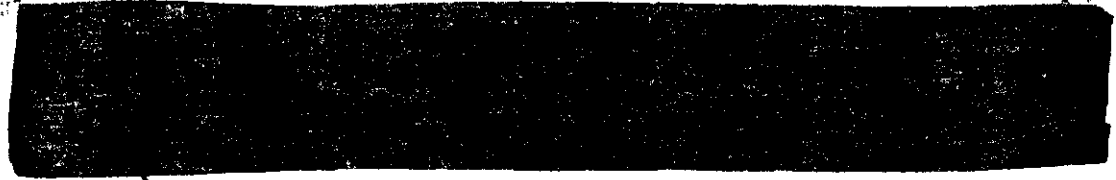

The interviews reported in the details of this report with SIDNEY SEMEL, subject's mother, MARY STURGIS, GEORGE ROHANNA, R. DRAKE DORMAN, Mrs. O. FOX, BENJAMIN E. KLEIN, JAMES WILLIAM ORE, JR., and GEORGE JERRY SENTER were conducted during the investigation regarding FRANK ANTHONY STURGIS, aka FRANK FIORINI, in Registration Act - Cuba, Norfolk file 97-13, Bureau file 2-1499.

Interview with H. MUNDIE was conducted during investigation entitled UNSUBS; MEYER HARRY JACOBSON - Victim, Norfolk file 92-156, Bureau file 95-108248.

Interviews with G. H. RUCKER, JR., and V. F. PATTERSON were conducted under investigation entitled Revolutionary Recuperation Movement of Cuba, MRRC, Internal Security - Cuba, Registration Act - Cuba, Norfolk file 105-612, Bureau file 100-429505.

No attempt being made at this time to locate and interview the individuals mentioned above who have known the subject in the past as investigation at Norfolk Division indicates that subject STURGIS has not been active in the Norfolk Division since 1957 at which time his wife indicated he deserted her and left for Cuba, UACB.

For the information of the Bureau and WFO, CARMELA FRANCES MOORE is apparently the stepsister of subject STURGIS who was born to STURGIS' mother while she was married a second time to a man known as HALSEY. According to subject's father, second wife, JUANITA, and according to the last newspaper account of JACK KESTNER, subject's stepsister was killed probably during 1971 when she fell down a flight of stairs and broke her neck. Attempts to confirm MOORE's death at Medical Examiner's Office, Norfolk, Virginia, and Bureau of Vital Statistics at both Portsmouth and Norfolk, negative.

of desertion, wife granted decree a vinculo matrimonii. Records at Norfolk Police Department indicate subject FIORINI employed there from 6/5/46 until 9/7/46. Education listed as Holy Rosary, Pennsylvania, St. Marys Academy, Norfolk, Blair Junior High School, Norfolk, and Germantown High School, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Records at St. Marys Academy negative re FIORINI. Records at Blair Junior High School, Norfolk, indicate attendance from 1/24/41 through 4/23/41. Records also indicate subject attended Ruffner Junior High School from 11/29/40 through 1/41. FIORINI attended William and Mary College at Norfolk, now known as Old Dominion University, Spring semester, 1954 and Fall semester, 1955, and was dropped for non-attendance, on 1/24/55. Subject employed as taxi cab driver for Yellow Cab Company, Norfolk, 10/12/46 through 4/15/47. Investigation indicates subject employed at various taverns on East Main Street, Norfolk. J. J. WHALEN, Inspector, Virginia ABC Board, Norfolk, interviewed and advised no records available indicating subject's employment. All taverns have been torn down. Investigation indicated subject possibly employed at Walker Realty, Norfolk, as salesman; however, this proved negative. Records, Civil Air Patrol, Norfolk, negative regarding FIORINI. Subject's father, ANGELO ANTHONY FIORINI, interviewed and supplied background information indicating subject born in Norfolk, Virginia, raised primarily in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, resided in Norfolk until approximately 1957, at which time he went to Cuba. Father indicated he has seen subject infrequently since 1957 on approximately three occasions in Norfolk and three or four occasions in Miami, Florida. Father had no knowledge re instant offense. Subject's second wife, now known as JUANITA NELSON, interviewed and supplied background information regarding subject. She advised she married subject in 1956, he left for Cuba in 1957, and she divorced him in 1961. She advised she had seen subject on only one occasion since their divorce, and she knows nothing of instant offense. Subject's uncle, FRANK A. FIORINI, JR., declined interview re subject. Numerous newspaper articles regarding subject under names STURGIS and FIORINI noted in Norfolk newspapers, primarily dealing with his involvement with CASTRO in Cuba and his loss and subsequent regaining of citizenship. One article noted re instant offense. During investigation

of related matters, friends of subject have been interviewed by Bureau Agents. These individuals include SIDNEY SEMEL, GEORGE ROHANNA, R. DRAKE DORMAN, BENJAMIN B. KLEIN, JAMES WILLIAM ORE, JR., GEORGE JERRY SENTER, and PEDRO LUIS DIAZ LANZ. During investigation of other matters, Bureau Agents also interviewed the following officials regarding FIORINI: G. H. RUCKER, JR., U. S. Coast Guard, Portsmouth, Virginia, and H. MUNDIE, Virginia State Police. Investigation indicates that subject's stepsister, CARMELA FRANCES MOORE, nee HALSEY, is deceased, however, unsubstantiated by records. Investigation negative regarding FIORINI having any children.

On July 6, 1972, JOSEPH RIPPLINGER, Clerk, Norfolk Police Department, Central Files, Section, was contacted and advised his files were negative regarding ANGELO ANTHONY FIORINI (White male) Date of birth, October 6, 1898.

ANGELO ANTHONY FIORINI was advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents and that the interview concerned his son, FRANK ANTHONY FIORINI, also known as FRANK ANGELO FIORINI, FRANK A. STURGIS, and FRANK ANTHONY FREENEY. FIORINI was interviewed at the Atlantic Hotel, 111 Granby Street, Room 311, Norfolk, Virginia, which is his residence. FIORINI advised that his date of birth is October 8, 1898. FIORINI indicated that he would cooperate with the FBI.

FIORINI stated that his son was born FRANK ANTHONY FIORINI at Norfolk, Virginia, in 1924. The subject's mother was MARY VONA and she and FIORINI were married in the City of Norfolk in 1920. FIORINI said that to the best of his knowledge, subject lived in Norfolk for approximately six years at which time he and the subject's mother separated. FIORINI said that there was one other child by this marriage and the subject's sister's name was FRANCES CARMELLA. FRANCES CARMELLA was approximately two years older than the subject and when she was about four years old, her clothing caught on fire and she died as a result of the burns. To the best of his recollection, the subject and the subject's mother moved from Norfolk, Virginia, to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, when the subject was about six years old. Just prior to moving to Philadelphia, FIORINI remembered that the subject attended St. Marys School in Norfolk, Virginia, on Fenchurch Street. FIORINI said that he had very little contact with his son during the ensuing years except on occasion when the subject and his mother returned to Norfolk, Virginia, for vacations. Other than this, FIORINI did correspond with the subject by mail.

FIORINI said that his son attended Germantown High School in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. FIORINI stated that following the subject's graduation from Germantown High School, he immediately joined the United States Marine Corps and spent some time in the South Pacific where he was shot, thereafter being discharged

from the Marine Corps sometime in 1946. Upon his discharge from the United States Marine Corps, the subject returned to Norfolk, Virginia, to live. Sometime after his return to Norfolk, Virginia, the subject joined the Norfolk, Virginia, Police Department for a short time and then, according to his father, resigned.

It should be noted at this time that the subject's father appeared to be accurate in most of the details regarding his son, however, he was unable to give accurate dates and a further hindrance in the interview was that FIORINI is very hard of hearing and wears a hearing aid. FIORINI attempted to be accurate regarding his son's activities but could not supply dates regarding the following information.

FIORINI said that the subject joined the United States Army sometime after his resignation from the Norfolk, Virginia, Police Department and was assigned to an honor guard for General CLAY in Germany. Also, FIORINI remembered that the subject was a member of the United States Naval Reserve and was also a Merchant Marine. However, he could not be sure when he actually was in these organizations. FIORINI said that after the subject returned from the United States Army, he again resided in Norfolk, Virginia, and for a time was a taxi cab driver for the Yellow Cab Company. However, the subject primarily worked as a tavern manager and a bar tender in various taverns on East Main Street in Norfolk, Virginia. To the best of his recollection, the subject worked in the Society Cafe, the White Hat, the Savoy Tavern, and the Commercial Tavern among other establishments. FIORINI said that he did not know any of the subject's employers nor the exact dates of employment in these various taverns. FIORINI said that at the time the subject worked in these taverns there were a large number of them catering to sailors. The subject used to move from one tavern to another depending on the pay he was going to receive at each of them.

FIORINI said that the subject married a girl he knew only as BETTY at about the time he enlisted in the United States Army. FIORINI did not know where this marriage had taken place. FIORINI said that he had heard that BETTY was shot and killed but he did not know the location of this incident nor did he know if it was murder or an accident.

FIORINI said that after the subject's first wife, BETTY, was killed, the subject then married a girl known to FIORINI only as JUANITA. The subject and JUANITA lived in Norfolk, Virginia, for a time and then the subject went to Cuba to fight with CASTRO. Sometime after the subject went to Cuba, his wife, JUANITA, divorced him at Norfolk, Virginia. FIORINI said that JUANITA is remarried and living somewhere in the Norfolk, Virginia, area. Also, he had heard that she was working in the restaurant at the Smith and Welton Department Store located on Granby Street in downtown Norfolk, Virginia.

FIORINI said that he was divorced from the subject's mother and he never remarried. However, the subject's mother remarried on at least two different occasions. One of these marriages was to an individual known to FIORINI only as (First Name Unknown) HALSEY. By this marriage, the subject's mother had a daughter who she called FRANCES CARMELLA, which was the same name as the child who had been burned to death. FIORINI said that HALSEY died and the subject's mother then married one RALPH STURGIS in Norfolk, Virginia. After this marriage, the subject legally had his name changed to STURGIS. FIORINI said that the subject's stepsister, FRANCES CARMELLA, resided in Norfolk, Virginia, and sometime in 1971, fell down a flight of stairs and broke her neck and died. FIORINI said that at the time of the subject's stepsister's death, the subject, who had been residing in Miami, Florida, came

to Norfolk with his mother. On that occasion, FIORINI saw the subject for a short time, however, the subject was then returning to Miami by train. FIORINI indicated the subject's stepsister's married name to be MOORE.

FIORINI said that the only other activities he knew of the subject engaging in while he resided in Norfolk was as an instructor and flier for the Civil Air Patrol. In approximately 1957, the subject left Norfolk and went to Cuba where he fought with FIDEL CASTRO and subsequently became an officer in CASTRO's army. On one occasion, while the subject was with CASTRO, FIORINI saw him in Washington, D. C. On this occasion, the subject was with CASTRO on official business and FIORINI spent approximately one week with him at a Washington, D. C., hotel. FIORINI said that the Cuban government paid all his expenses during the time he was in Washington, D. C. FIORINI said that the next time he saw his son in Norfolk was in approximately 1960. At that time, the subject, the subject's wife, JUANITA, and FIORINI went to the home of a newspaper man in Norfolk, one JACK KESTNER, who was doing an interview and a story on the subject. At that time, the subject had fled from Cuba and was no longer working for CASTRO. After this meeting, FIORINI saw his son on only one or two other occasions in Norfolk and on each occasion, the subject was passing through on his way to Washington, D. C., or New York City, New York.

On approximately four or five occasions, FIORINI traveled to Miami, Florida, on vacation and stayed with his son at his residence. FIORINI stated that during that time, his son was working as an installer of windows and doors. FIORINI showed the Agents a business card which indicated FRANK FIORINI and EDUARDO DIAZ LANZ owned a company called D & P Professional Installers in Miami, Florida. FIORINI said that he did not know anything about the subject's anti-CASTRO activities except what he read in the newspapers. To the best of FIORINI's knowledge, the subject was remarried in

Miami, Florida and living there with his new wife.

FIORINI stated that he did not know any of the individuals who were arrested with his son during the commission of a burglary of Democratic Party National Headquarters in Washington, D. C, on June 17, 1972. FIORINI said that the only knowledge he had of this incident was what he had read in newspaper articles on it. FIORINI said that he had never heard of the other individuals' names nor had his son ever talked to him regarding his activities in the last few years.

FIORINI said the last time he saw his son was in Norfolk when the subject had come to attend his stepsister's funeral.

SENTER advised that she did not know the subject. SENTER was advised that her son, JERRY SENTER, possibly knew the subject. REBECCA SENTER advised that her son, JERRY SENTER, is residing somewhere in Washington, D. C., however, she does not know his address. SENTER advised that her son formerly owned a tavern in Norfolk known as the Commercial, but she did not know if the subject ever worked for her son.

On July 10, 1972, JACQUELINE CAMDEN, Clerk, Norfolk Retail Merchants Association, reviewed the files of that agency with negative results regarding the subject.

On July 10, 1972, DEAN PATTY, Manager, Walker Realty, Little Creek Road at Military Highway, Norfolk, Virginia, advised that Walker Realty had no records which might indicate the subject had ever worked for them. JUANITA NELSON, also known as JUANITA STURGIS, nee JUANITA K. TERRELL, who was aware of the identities of the interviewing Agents, was contacted at her residence at 512 Jonathan Court, Virginia Beach, Virginia. NELSON was advised that the interview would concern her former husband, FRANK A. FIORINI, also known as FRANK A. STURGIS.

NELSON advised that she met the subject FIORINI while she was working at a restaurant on Little Creek Road in Norfolk in approximately 1954. At that time, the subject was employed as a tavern manager in one of the bars on East Main Street in downtown Norfolk. NELSON advised that she and the subject began to go together at that time.

NELSON stated that the subject had been married when she first met him to a woman she knew only as BETTY (last name unknown). NELSON said that from conversations, she learned that the subject and BETTY had been married somewhere in Virginia but she did not know the exact location. Also, she had learned through conversations with the subject that BETTY had been shot and killed by another woman, but, again, she did not know where this murder had taken place. NELSON stated that to the best of her knowledge, the subject did not have any children by BETTY. Further, BETTY had the reputation of being a prostitute.

NELSON stated that she had learned from the subject that he had been in the United States Marine Corps and the United States Army, and the United States Naval Reserve, however, all of these tours of duty in the service took place prior to the time she knew the subject.

NELSON stated that during the time she knew the subject, he had numerous jobs, mostly as the manager of taverns, in Norfolk, Virginia. She stated that the subject would move from job to job depending on who made

him an offer. Also, during the time she knew him, he was employed as a real estate salesman with Walker Realty in Norfolk, Virginia, and also as an insurance salesman at an unknown insurance company in Norfolk.

NELSON stated that she married the subject under the name STURGIS in May, 1956. During the early part of their marriage, she wrote numerous letters for the subject to unknown persons in Miami, Florida, and Cuba, and these letters offered the services of the subject as a mercenary primarily to the supporters of FIDEL CASTRO. NELSON stated that she used to write the letters as her handwriting and grammar were of better quality than the subject. NELSON said that she did not know any of the names of the people she used to write to as she had destroyed all papers she had from the subject at the time of her marriage to her present husband. NELSON stated that she was unable to give any dates as to the employments of the subject nor was she able to remember the dates when he left for Cuba, however, she thought the subject probably left in 1957.

NELSON stated that just prior to the subject's leaving Norfolk for Cuba, he engaged in a check-kiting scheme whereby he got enough money to pay for his passage from Norfolk to Cuba. While the subject was in Cuba, she heard from him infrequently by letter, however, these letters were also destroyed. NELSON stated that she saw the subject on only two or three occasions after he went to Cuba. On one of these occasions, she met him in Washington, D. C., while he was on official business for the CASTRO government. On another occasion, she remembered meeting him in New York City, New York, again while he was on official business for CASTRO. During this contact, she remembered that the subject had said that he was beginning to become disenchanted with CASTRO and was thinking of contacting the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) to offer his services as an informant. NELSON stated that there was one other meeting around 1960, however, she did not remember if this was in New York or Washington, D. C. NELSON remembered

that she met the subject one other time after he left the employee of CASTRO and this was in the early 1960's. At that time, she went to the home of JACK KESTNER who is a newspaper reported in Norfolk, Virginia. Besides the subject and KESTNER, the subject's father was also present at this meeting. The meeting took place as KESTNER was doing a newspaper article about the subject, who, at that time, had become disenchanted with CASTRO and had fled the country.

NELSON said that she divorced the subject sometime in early 1960 on grounds of desertion. NELSON said that the divorce actually took place under the name FIORINI in Norfolk, Virginia, and she could not explain why she was married under the name STURGIS and divorced under the name FIORINI. Since the divorce, NELSON could recall only one occasion on which she saw the subject. She stated that this was sometime in the mid-1960's but could not recall any details about this.

NELSON said that even during the time she was married to the subject, she did not know too much about his activities. She stated that besides his employment in the taverns and the other employments mentioned above, she did not know what he was doing. On one occasion, prior to their marriage, she took a trip with him to Miami, Florida, but she did not know what he had done there. Also, they took a trip to Miami after their marriage and at that time, the subject attended pro-CASTRO meetings in a coliseum on Flagler Street in downtown Miami.

NELSON stated that the only people she could remember who had employed the subject were one JERRY SENTER and one MAURICE COSTELLO. Both of these individuals had owned taverns in downtown Norfolk and NELSON did not know their present whereabouts. The last time she had heard about COSTELLO, he had moved to New York City.

NELSON stated that she was of the opinion that the subject was a soldier of fortune whose services could be sold to the highest bidder. She stated that during the crisis in the Suez Canal, he was very interested in going to that area as a mercenary, however, he did not actually go to that area. NELSON said that she was of the opinion that the subject engaged in gambling as a source of income while he lived in Norfolk, but did not know the exact nature of the gambling. She stated that the subject was friendly with one AL MIGDOL (phonetic) and one GEORGE ROHANA (phonetic) who she thought engaged in gambling activities. NELSON did not know if these two individuals were still in the Norfolk area and could give no descriptive data regarding them. The only other friend who she could think of was an individual by the name of BEN KLEIN who is employed at the Naval Air Station, Norfolk, Virginia.

NELSON stated that she has not seen the subject in at least seven or eight years and did not know anything regarding his present activities. She stated that she did not know anything regarding the burglary of the Democratic Party National Headquarters at Washington, DC., on June 17, 1972. She stated she had read accounts of the incident in the newspaper but did not know any of the other individuals involved. She thought that possibly the Spanish names were familiar, however, could not be sure if these were some of the people she had written to for her former husband.

The marriage license indicated that FRANK ANTHONY STURGIS was a white male, 31 years old, and widowed at the time of this marriage. His residence was listed as 326 Bank Street, Norfolk, and his employment was a tavern manager. His parents were listed as ANGELO ANTHONY FIORINI and MARY VONA.

The marriage license indicated that JUANITA K. TERRELL was a white female, 25 years old, born at Atlanta, Georgia. Her father was listed as BRONZEN TERRELL and her mother was EUNICE FLOURNEY. Her place of residence was 464 Stockton Road, Norfolk, Virginia.

On July 6, 1972, KOTTEN advised that the records of the Corporation Court, Norfolk, Virginia, did not reflect any marriage between FRANK ANGELO FIORINI, also known as FRANK A. STURGIS and FRANK ANTHONY FIORINI, and NORA ODELL THOMPSON, also known as BETTY FIORINI and BETTY LENDA REED.

Second Norfolk Man in Cuba

NORFOLK — Marine veteran Richard Sanderlin, 23, formerly of Norfolk, was reported in critical condition in Santiago de Cuba last night from a machinegun slug received while fighting with Fidel Castro's rebels.

The Associated Press reported that the young man, son of Calvin Sanderlin of the 4300 block of Colley Ave. and Mrs. Myrtle Sanderlin of Florida, was in the Los Angeles Clinic in Santiago.

The Korean war veteran had been struck in the right shoulder by the machinegun slug two weeks ago, the dispatch said.

Sanderlin's father said today that he had not heard from his son since last winter when he was working in Florida, and had no idea that he was fighting with Castro in Cuba. He said his son had been using the name Rex M. Sanderlin.

The ex-Marine has two sisters living in the area, Mrs. Geraldine

Deihl, of Hampton, and Mrs. Joyce Golden, of Cedric St., Riverside. A younger brother, Terry, is living with his mother in Florida.

The AP story which told of Sanderlin's injury also served as concrete proof that soldier-of-fortune Frank (Fiorini) Sturgis was still alive. Sturgis was a frequent visitor at the hospital, the story said.

Sturgis's wife, Juanita, had received three letters from him during the first four months of his stay in Cuba (he left Norfolk Feb. 7 last year).

But last summer she received a cable from Batista authorities in Havana stating that her husband had been killed. That was her last communication regarding her husband.

When the Ledger-Star telephoned her the news that her husband was still alive, she sobbed, "Thank God, thank God!"

Pair Helping Castro May Lose Citizenship

NORFOLK — Two Norfolkians who fought with Fidel Castro's victorious rebels in Cuba may have done so at the cost of their American citizenship.

The wife of one — who until Wednesday believed she was his widow — said she has been told her politically ambitious husband already has jeopardized his standing as a citizen.

Mrs. Juanita Sturgis, 26, quoted her ex-Marine husband, Frank Anthony (Fiorini) Sturgis, 34, as saying "if they (the rebels) overthrow the government, I'm going to live in Cuba."

An attorney has advised her that Sturgis forfeited his citizenship by fighting with Castro, Mrs. Sturgis said.

AP Dispatch

For months she had believed her husband dead until an Associated Press dispatch arrived Tuesday stating that Sturgis had visited Richard M. Sanderlin, 22, also of Norfolk, in a hospital at Santiago, Cuba.

Sanderlin, also a former Marine, was reported in critical condition from a machinegun bullet wound he received in the right shoulder two weeks ago.

The American adventurers' citizenship would be endangered by United States recognition of the Castro government, according to Byron C. McAdoo, federal na-

turalization examiner here. They could be expatriated by the United States if they remain with Castro, McAdoo said. The Castro government was officially recognized Wednesday.

High Ambitions

Sturgis went to Cuba in February 1958, after an abortive previous attempt to join the rebels "mainly to make something of himself," Mrs. Sturgis said.

She said her husband had high ambitions. "He wants to be in poli-

tics. He was always seeking adventure."

About six months ago, a telegram from Cuban authorities advised her her husband was dead, but no confirmation ever was made, Mrs. Sturgis said.

"When I learned he was alive this morning, you'll never know how glad I was."

She said she received three letters her husband smuggled out through Colombia, the last about seven months ago.

Training Job

Her husband, Mrs. Sturgis said, left for Cuba intending to train guerrilla fighters.

The experience, she added, was exciting "for him . . . but for me?"

Mrs. Sturgis, a waitress at the Thomas Nelson coffee shop, lives at the Fairfax Hotel. Sturgis' divorced parents, Mrs. Mary Sturgis and Angelo Fiorini, live in Norfolk.

Sanderlin joined the Marine Corps in August, 1953, and was transferred to inactive reserves in May, 1958.

Sturgis, who wrote of receiving a leg wound in the insurrection, had had a varied career. Just before he went to Cuba he was a Main street tavern manager, and a real estate and insurance salesman.

Former Policeman

In 1946 he served two months with the Norfolk Police Division, but resigned. He served with the Army in Germany as a merchant mariner and as a Civil Air Patrol flying instructor. He also attended the College of William and Mary for two years.

In January, 1954, Sturgis caused a stir by disappearing while hunting in Dismal Swamp near Elizabeth City, N.C. He turned up 12 days later in San Diego, Calif., and explained he lost his memory when three men struck and robbed him in Elizabeth City.

Knack for Keeping Friends Key to Sturgis Personality

(This is the second of two stories about Frank A. Sturgis, Norfolk man who helped train Fidel Castro's Cuban rebel army.)

NORFOLK — "He's not just a good guy. He's terrific. Terrific! And a born leader."

That's the answer given by a former employer of Frank (Florini) Sturgis when he was asked to describe the ex-Marine who has spent the past 10 months training Cubans for Fidel Castro's victorious rebel army.

It's an answer that you'll find seconders for wherever Frank Sturgis has been. And that includes a sizeable hunk of the world.

It would appear that the 6-foot, 200-pounder had unconsciously been in training during most of his 34 years for no other role than that of a professional revolutionary.

Courage, intelligence, personality, stamina, muscular coordination. All were his.

And he prodigiously funneled them into a "loser take nothing" gamble that Fidel Castro and a mere handful of men could tumble one of the shrewdest and toughest dictators in the western hemisphere.

Although born in Norfolk, Frank spent much of his childhood and youth in Philadelphia and Germantown, Pa., where his family had relatives.

He attended Holy Rosary School in Philadelphia (where he was president of the Altar Boys), Roosevelt Junior High and Germantown Senior High.

"And he never failed a grade," proudly says his mother, Mrs. Mary Sturgis, who lives in the 300 block of Bank St.

Frank excelled in sports — football, baseball, swimming, diving — and at an early age developed a fondness for hunting and fishing. He was at home in the woods.

This woodmanship served him well, for in September, 1942, at the ripe old age of 17, he joined the Marines and spent 30 months in the jungles of the South Pacific.

A decade and a half later he was back in the jungles again — but this time in the wilds of the Sierra Maestra in eastern Cuba.

"We all live like pigs, dirty, filthy, no proper food," Frank wrote his wife, Juanita, last summer. "I have had days when I did not eat at all . . . I have been walking for weeks."

He described Castro as "a very wonderful man," and it appears that the rebel leader returned the affection. According to Sturgis' friends, it would be strange if he hadn't.

"If you know the guy, you like him," says Phil Berger, owner of Phil's Arena Tavern which Sturgis managed for several years. "He's great, he really is. I never met anybody I liked any better."

I even offered him a partnership in my business."

Berger, a former professional fighter, says that Frank was also a hands-on lad with his fists. "I've seen him stack up a lot of these fellows over the years. I'd like to have managed him."

Jerry Senter, owner of the Commercial Grill on East Main street where Frank was working as manager when he left for Cuba, echoes the sentiment.

"He's the best manager as well as the best bouncer that I ever had," Senter says. "But the main thing about him was his personality. He was a human magnet. A born leader. Why he had half the guys in town ready to go fight for Castro."

James J. Baldwin, who worked for six months with Frank when both were agents for Walker Real-

ty Corp., agrees that Sturgis was a very personable man.

"If he had gotten out of that Main street element, he could have made a lot out of anything he tried," Baldwin says.

He adds that Frank continually thought of himself as a soldier of fortune. "He told me it had always been his ambition to take part in a revolution. That was his dream."

Well, the dream has been realized. Frank even managed to come out on the winning side which should pay off handsomely. In one of the letters to Juanita, he wrote:

"I know when this is over, if nothing happens to me, my future is made."

It might be, at that, until another revolution pops out somewhere.

Sturgis Seen In Wirephoto From Cuba

NORFOLK—The whereabouts in Cuba of Frank (Fiorini) Sturgis, former Norfolk tavern manager, was established today by an Associated Press wirephoto showing him standing at the mass grave of 75 executed followers of Fulgencio Batista.

The caption identified Sturgis as Cuban rebel Capt. Frank Fiorini, an American from Norfolk, Va.



Sturgis, a native of Norfolk, was born Frank Anthony Fiorini, but changed his name in 1952 after his mother married Ralph Sturgis. He reverted to his original name when he went to Cuba.

Sturgis, 34, left Norfolk last February to join the rebel forces of Fidel Castro. His wife, Juanita—who lives at the Fairfax Hotel and works as a waitress at the Thomas Nelson coffee shop—received three letters from him since his arrival there, but none later than mid-summer of last year.

In a recent attempt to locate him, she got in touch with another Norfolk man who has been fighting with Castro. He is Richard Sanderlin, 23, an ex-Marine veteran of Korea, who is currently recovering in a Havana hospital from three bullet wounds received Dec. 19.

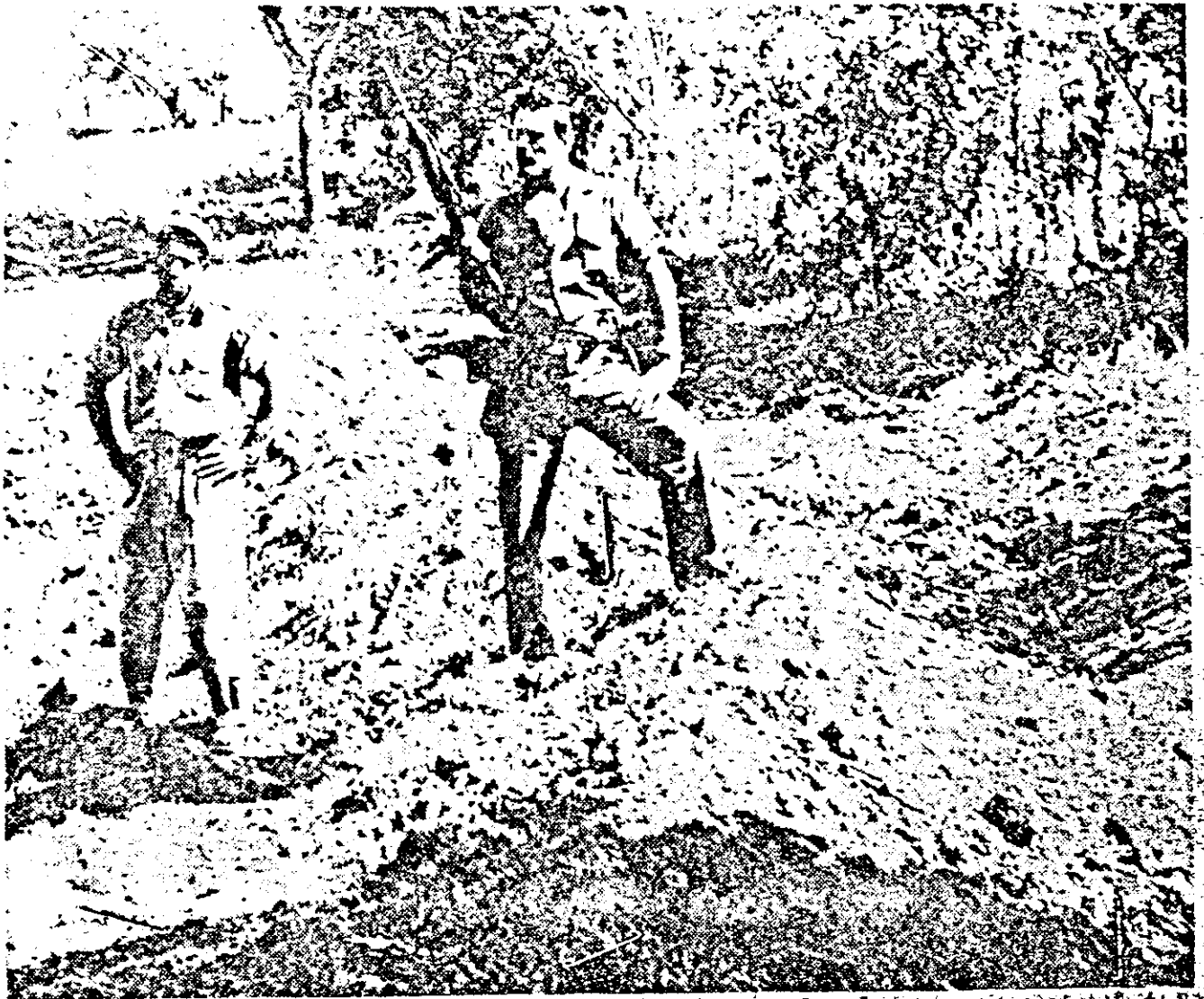
Sanderlin told Mrs. Sturgis that all he could say was that Frank had "gone to Santiago on an important mission for Raul." (Raul is the younger brother of Fidel Castro.)

In addition to managing three local taverns, Sturgis also was a licensed real estate agent, sold insurance, attended the College of William & Mary in Norfolk, and was a lieutenant and instructor in the Civil Air Patrol here.

Norfolk Adventurer Fought With Castro's Cuban Rebels

(This is the first of two stories on Frank A. Sturgis, Norfolk man who is a member of Fidel Castro's victorious rebel army. The second story will appear in Thursday's Ledger-Star.)

NORFOLK—The fall of Cuban Dictator Fulgencio Batista may have been due in no small part to the guerrilla know-how of a six-foot 200-pound ex-tavern manager who calls Norfolk his home.

His name is Frank Sturgis, or Frank Anthony Fiorini as he was born on Dec. 9, 1924, of Italian extraction, at 901 Faulkland St.

Sturgis' divorced parents—Angelo Fiorini and Mary Sturgis—live on separate floors of the same apartment house in the 300 block of Bank St. Sturgis' wife, Juanita, who is currently living at the Fairfax Hotel, works as a waitress in the Thomas Nelson coffee shop.

Sturgis won medals island-hopping with the Marines in the South Pacific. He served a peace-time hitch with the Army in Germany. He was ice-bound on a freighter off the coast of Newfoundland as an able bodied seaman. He was a lieutenant and flying instructor in the Norfolk Civil Air Patrol. He was a licensed Norfolk real estate agent. He was a student for two years at the College of William and Mary.

Most area residents will probably remember him as the man who, on Jan. 2, 1954, left for an afternoon of hunting in Dismal Swamp near Elizabeth City, N.C., and emerged 12 days later in San Diego, Calif.

Sturgis — who has been sought by three CAP squadrons, planes, military helicopters and state policemen — told reporters that a bump on the head (acquired Jan. 2 when three men robbed him in Elizabeth City) had left his memory of those 12 days a complete blank.

And for the past 10 months, if personal letters and scattered reports can be believed, he has been training Cuban rebels in the art of guerrilla warfare.

Preliminary background for his Cuban adventure began in May 1953 in Miami, Fla., where he was on a honeymoon with his second wife, a Cherokee Indian maiden

off a Georgia reservation who had come to Norfolk when her mother married a lieutenant commander stationed at the Naval Base about 15 years ago.

One night the couple attended a political rally at a Flieger St. theater where funds were being raised to support Fidel Castro's insurrection in eastern Cuba.

Sturgis, his wife recalls, was sold on the idea. Not only for its idealistic concept, but also because he recognized in it an opportunity to realize talents bloodily acquired during 30 months of in-fighting with the Japs.

"When he came back to Norfolk he couldn't sit still," the slender, attractive 26-year-old Juanita says. "He read everything he could find about Castro's activities. He even subscribed to a Miami paper and made up a scrap book of clippings."

After several months of establishing contacts (while he sold real estate and insurance, and worked in a Main street tavern), Sturgis left for Cuba. It was mid-July, 1957.

He made it. But he returned a couple of weeks later.

"He got in all right, but they were watching him too close," Mrs. Sturgis collects. "He said he'd have to try again."

He did. He left Norfolk last year on February 17.

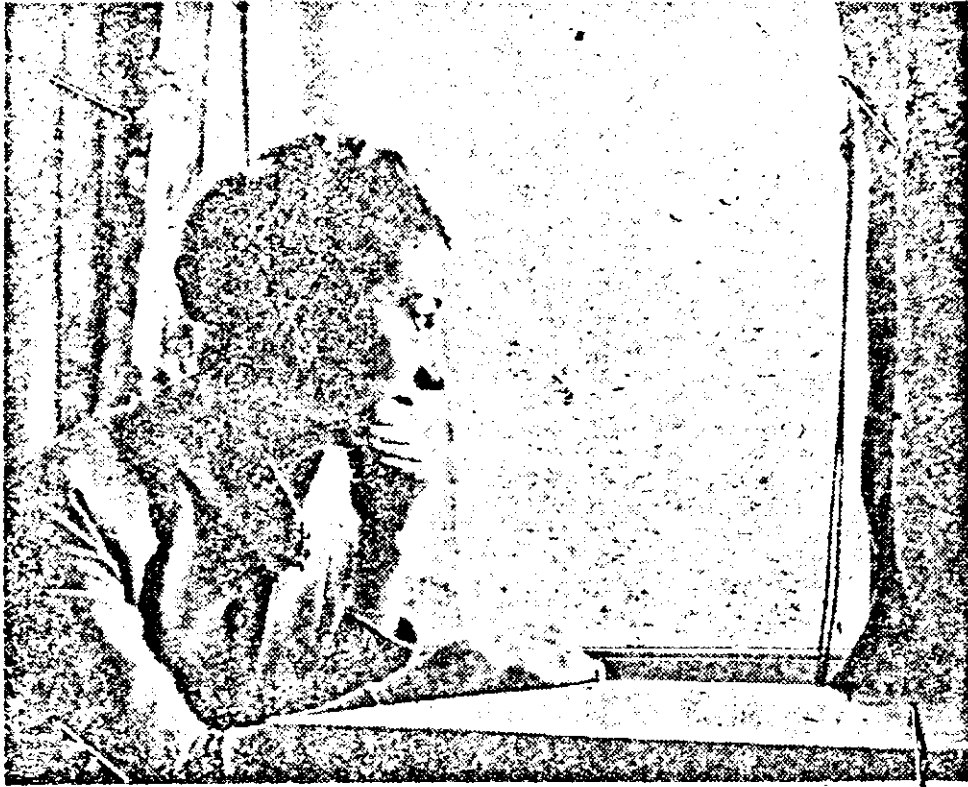

Juanita Sturgis Awaits Word From Husband in Cuba

It was over a month before Juanita heard from him. Then it was only a single sheet scrawled in pencil along the green lines of a torn-out notebook page.

"High In The Mountains, April 3," was its dateline a likely reference to Castro's Sierra Maestra headquarters), and its salutation was to "My Darling Wife."

"It breaks my heart to be away from you, but I cannot undo what I started," he wrote.

"I have gotten myself a very good reputation with Fidel, and believe it or not — he is a good friend of mine. I am trying very hard to help him. I have grown very near these people here in the mountains. They are dying every day.

"I hope this reporter (the letter was entrusted to a newspaperman from Colombia, South America) can send this letter to you if he gets out. It is very difficult to come and go.

It was over two months before Juanita received a second letter. It was written on a looseleaf binder given Sturgis by a physician who was treating a hole the size of a nickle in my left ankle.

Sturgis doesn't tell how he received the wound. He only relates that he has had "poison in my leg . . . terrible pains . . . fever for 3½ days.

'Guts' Enabled Rebels To Win, Sturgis Says

● Norfolk Man, Gun-Runner for Castro's Forces, Spent Time in Two Jails 97-13

SANTIAGO, Cuba (AP)—The Cuban rebels—"They had guts," says an American who has served Fidel Castro's revolutionary army for 15 months, most of it as a gun-runner.

Frank (Florini) Sturgis—a 34-year-old captain in the rebel forces from 1506 Winder Dr. Norfolk, Va., now is chief training officer at a rebel camp here.

His job is seeing that more than 1,000 Castro recruits get proper instruction in tactics and the use of arms. Sturgis, a dashing figure with a red scarf around his neck, admits that his Spanish is not so good. Most of his commands are transmitted through bilingual Cuban lieutenants.

Formerly in U.S. Army

Sturgis says his own military career includes hitches in the U.S. Army's 1st Division and Edson's Marine Raiders.

"I admire the Cuban people for wanting to be free," he said, adding that he got interested in the Castro movement through a Cuban aunt.

"They taught us in the United States to hate dictators," he

said. "I'm sorry the U.S. government didn't help Castro."

"The rebels were out-gunned, out-maneuvered, out-everything'ed. But they had guts. They did a remarkable job—they won."

Much of his 15 months with the rebels, Sturgis said, was spent in Mexico, Costa Rica, Venezuela and Miami arranging for arms shipments.

Twice Jailed

He said he was arrested twice on arms charges and spent 15 days in jail in Florida and 12 days in Mexico. He now is out on bond on the Florida charges.

"We tried to bring in one big plane a week (with arms) to Castro," he said.

Asked about his plans, Sturgis said he probably will remain in Cuba a while. He said his understanding is that he does not face loss of U.S. citizenship since he never swore an oath to the rebel government. He added he is receiving no pay for working with the rebels.

Sturgis' parents now are at home in Norfolk. He was raised in Pennsylvania and attended high school in Germantown.

Condone Cuban Bloodletting

Sturgis Tells Norfolkian Of 'Illegal Entry' to U.S.

By JACK KESTNER

NORFOLK — A Norfolk businessman was walking out of a Miami Beach theater recently when he bumped into a ghost.

"At least it startled me as much as bumping into a ghost," said Sidney Semel, vacationing president of the Office Supply Co. on Princess Anne road. "It was Frank Sturgis."

Semel had become acquainted with the Norfolk soldier of fortune (who has been a member of Fidel Castro's Cuban rebels for nearly a year) when his Office Supply Co. was located next door to Phil's Arena. Sturgis was manager there.

"It happened last night," Semel told the Ledger-Star via telephone late yesterday from Miami Beach. "I was coming out of 'Some Came Running' just as he was going in."

During the ensuing conversation, the current executions of Batista men were discussed.

"Frank said he'd been captured by Batista forces and thrown into prison," Semel related. "He said he still had scars from the whip they'd used on him. Four out of thirty were shot. They weren't even given any water—had to drink out of a toilet. Frank said he'd lost 27 pounds."

For this reason, Sturgis was not at all disturbed with the "swift justice" meted out to Batista men. (An Associated Press wirephoto was transmitted nationally last week showing "Frank Fiorini"—which is Sturgis' birth name—standing by the mass grave of 75 executed Batista men.)

Sturgis told the Norfolk businessman that he "had been all over" while working for Castro and had been in prison several times.

He added that he was even now

in the United States "illegally." No amplification of the statement was made, but an AP story several days ago mentioned that he had been engaged in smuggling arms from Mexico and other Latin American countries.

"He seemed quite proud of what he had been doing," Semel recalled. "He told me that an American writer by the name of Andrew St. George, I believe it was, is going to do a story on his activities for True or Life or some magazine."

Sturgis was evasive concerning plans for the future, but did say he was returning to Cuba to instruct troops at Columbia Barracks just outside of Havana.

The volunteer rebel said that he was in Miami on business for Castro. He was dressed in a suit, shirt and tie.

"He looked a bit out of character," Semel said.

Sturgis told Semel that Richard Sanderlin—23-year-old ex-Marine Norfolkian who has been training troops for Raul Castro—was still

in a Havana hospital as a result of bullet wounds received during a Dec. 17 clash with Batista forces.

During their conversation, Semel suggested a dinner meeting. Sturgis agreed and gave him the name of his Miami Beach Hotel.

But when Semel checked it yesterday he was told that no one was registered there under the name of either Sturgis or Fiorini.

Semel declined to speculate on whether this was due to an error or whether the ex-tavern manager, ex-real estate salesman, ex-CAP flying instructor, ex-seaman, ex-Marine, ex-GI, ex-college student was just playing it cagy.

Before Semel and Sturgis parted company, the former asked for an autograph for his eight-year-old son. Sturgis complied, and included several Cuban coins with it.

The autograph read: "Captain Frank Fiorini."

Sturgis May Lose U.S. Citizenship

NORFOLK — Frank (Fiorini) Sturgis, 34-year-old Norfolk soldier-of-fortune, may be faced with a loss of citizenship.

At last report the ex-tavern manager was still on the staff of Cuban Premier Fidel Castro after fighting through the successful revolution as a captain.

State Department sources in Washington said today that any American who may have remained with Cuba's revolutionary government armed forces since Jan. 2, 1959, are subject to loss of their citizenship.

Sturgis' wife, Mrs. Juanita Sturgis, and his mother and a half-sister live in Norfolk.

The sources noted, however, that the decision will be made

on the facts in individual cases, the Associated Press reported.

The comment came after Rep. Francis E. Walter (D-Pa), chairman of the House Committee on Un-American Activities, said Thursday he was informed by the department that "a certificate of loss of United States citizenship by William Morgan will be issued."

Walter said he had made an inquiry to the department after learning that Morgan—a former resident of Toledo, Ohio—was serving as a major in the Cuban army.

He said the department told him that any U.S. citizen who "entered into either the regular or the irregular forces of Cuba shall be considered to have lost United States citizenship."

After a certificate of loss of citizenship is issued by a U.S. embassy, it is sent to Washington for final approval or disapproval.

For the Americans who served with Castro, a critical factor is whether or not they remained with those forces after Jan. 2, 1959, when the units became Cuban government forces.

Flew Leaflet-Dropping Plane Over Havana

Norfolk Man Breaks With Castro

By TONY STERN

NORFOLK—Frank Fiorini, Norfolk man who fought for Fidel Castro in the Cuban Revolution, is turned against Castro.

In fact, he said he was a pilot of the plane that dropped 200,000 anti-Castro leaflets on Havana last week. With him in the craft was Pedro Luis Diaz Lanz, former chief of the Cuban Air Force and now leader of an anti-Castro movement.

Fiorini, known here as Frank Sturgis, said that until he left Cuba he served as civilian military advisor to Diaz Lanz. He said his post was that of security chief of the Cuban Air Force.

The break with the Castro government stemmed, Fiorini said, from alleged Communist infiltration in the Cuban government.

"Fidel Castro is a Communist," he charged. "He is bringing communism to Cuba. He will be a worse dictator than Batista, the man he overthrew. That's because Castro is a Communist dictator."

Fiorini credited Castro with full dictatorial powers in Cuba.

According to Fiorini, it was known that Castro was using Communists in the revolution. But Fiorini said, he and the other around Castro thought the Communists would be dropped when the revolution ended.

Early this year, Diaz Lanz began to argue with Castro over the Communist issue. Then Diaz Lanz left Cuba, Fiorini said, because he was afraid Castro would

"When I left Cuba," Fiorini said, "I made a choice between Diaz Lanz and Castro."

"I chose Diaz Lanz because I believed he was right about Communists in the government."

While Fiorini says he flew the leaflet plane—"they shot at us in Havana with everything they had"—he says neither he nor Diaz Lanz knew anything about incendiary bombing Castro said occurred in a Cuban province.

"Where'd you take off from?" Fiorini was asked.

"Just say Shangri-La," he said. "We might want to use it again." He charged that Castro is trying to ruin Cuba economically. He says Castro draws support mainly from the farming classes by making wild promises.

Fiorini is a 34-year-old Norfolk

native who has been a tavern manager, real estate salesman, CAP flying instructor, seaman, Marine, soldier and college student.

His mother's second marriage gave him the name Sturgis.

He was on his honeymoon in Miami, Fla., in 1967, when he and his wife attended a rally raising funds for the revolution.

He said he was impressed by the enthusiasm of the rally. "I didn't feel I was accomplishing anything in Norfolk," he says.

"I had a lot of military training and I thought by helping him I could eventually help myself. It was an opportunity to help both other people and myself."

Fiorini says that before he left Cuba he also had the post of chief inspector of gambling. It was a civilian government job and if he had stayed in Cuba, he says he would have registered with the United States government as an agent of a foreign government.

He says that as far as he

knows he still has his American citizenship, though it was in question when he was actively in the revolution. And he says that there is nothing illegal about leaflet-dropping.

"As long as we didn't hurt anyone or land in Cuba, there was nothing wrong."

He says he's not drawing salary but is getting "expenses." Funds for the anti-Castro group are coming from inside Cuba, he says.

Fiorini also said he was concerned about the reaction to a picture which appeared in the Ledger-Star in January. It showed him standing by the mass grave of 78 Batista men who had been

... of a working class area where the executions had been held. He said the photographer asked to be shown the execution ground and he — Fiorini — showed him. The photographer then asked him to pose by the grave. "But I had nothing to do with the executions," Fiorini declared.

Avoiding Castro Retaliation

Fiorini's Wife Believes He Is Fleeing for His Life

By JACK KESTNER

NORFOLK—Frank (Sturgis) Fiorini may be fleeing for his life. While stopping briefly here last Thursday, the 34-year-old Norfolk adventurer claimed that he piloted the plane that dropped anti-Castro leaflets on Havana.

Today, his wife said that she believes the main reason for his flight was to elude Castro faithfuls seeking retaliation for the leaflet drop.

Mrs. Juanita Sturgis, 32, weaved and wailed when her husband left Norfolk Feb. 17, 1958 to join Castro's revolutionary forces. Their meeting Thursday was the first time she had seen him since that date.

Sturgis (who assumed his earlier name of Fiorini when he joined Castro) told his wife that he and Duz Lase flew from Miami to Washington, together following the leaflet route. There-

by separated. Lase has not been heard from since.

Lase, former chief of Castro's Air Force, defected and fled to the United States after he became convinced of Communist infiltration in the Castro govern-

Apparently the seizure offered some relief for the embarrassed U.S. government which had until then searched in vain for a law to prevent repetition of such flights.

Over the weekend, U.S. Customs officials seized a converted B-21 bomber at Pompano Beach, about 30 miles north of Miami. The plane was registered in the name of Frank Fiorini. Customs agent Joseph A. Fortier said the plane was seized on the grounds that it did not have an export license for the leaflet drop.

The leaflet drop has placed the greatest strain on Cuban-United States relationship of any incident since Castro took control on New Years Day.

Before becoming a revolutionary, Sturgis served as manager

of several Norfolk taverns, was a student for a while at the College of William and Mary, was a licensed real estate agent, and

was a flying instructor in the Civil Air Patrol.

Mrs. Sturgis, a slender, attractive woman of Cherokee Indian

descent, is currently a waitress at the Thomas Nelson coffee shop.

Sturgis' divorced parents are both residents of Norfolk.

Leaflet Aircraft Seized

Norfolk Man Said He Piloted Plane In Cuban Venture

POMPANO BEACH, Fla. (AP)—U.S. Customs officials have seized the leaflet-dropping plane Norfolk-born Frank Fiorini claims he piloted to Cuba.

The plane, a converted B25, was seized because its owners failed to get an export license for the leaflets, according to Joseph A. Fortier, area director of the Customs Department.

Pompano Beach, about 40 miles north of Miami, apparently was the takeoff point for the leaflet flight to Cuba.

Fiorini, known in Norfolk as Frank Sturgis, said in an interview there Friday he piloted a plane which dropped 200,000 anti-Castro leaflets on Havana last week.

Once a member of Castro's forces, Fiorini said he turned against the Cuban leader because Castro is a Communist and is bringing Communism to Cuba. Until he left Cuba Fiorini served as civilian military advisor to Pedro Luiz Diaz Lanz, former chief of the Cuban Air Force, Fiorini said. Diaz Lanz, he said, was with him on the leaflet dropping flight.

"This is the plane that dropped the leaflets," Fortier said at Pompano Beach. "If we weren't sure, we would not have seized it."

In his Norfolk interview Fiorini declined to say where he took off from. "Just say Shangri-La; we might want to use it again," he quipped.

Fiorini, 34, has been a tavern manager, real estate salesman, CAP flying instructor, seaman, soldier and college student.

Diaz Lanz Proffers Apology for Raid

(This special release is written by Drew Pearson's associate, John Anderson, who is covering Washington while Mr. Pearson is on a western trip.)

WASHINGTON — Maj. Pedro Luis Diaz Lanz, former chief of the Cuban Air Force, has apologized to President Eisenhower for the Havana leaflet raid which, he explained, was the only means left to him for delivering a letter to the Cuban people that Cuban newspapers had refused to publish. The incident has stirred up a hornet's nest in the Caribbean and has caused the United States to dispatch 100 officers to Florida to prevent similar flights in the future.

Diaz Lanz was arrested Wednesday in Miami on Cuban warrants charging murder and attempted murder. Cuban authorities have declared that explosives as well as leaflets were dropped, and the charges apparently stem from that claim.

Diaz Lanz is being held pending a hearing in the case.

In an interview published in last week's *Ledger-Star*, former Norfolk man Frank Fiorini—also known as Frank Sturgis—said he helped pilot the plane. He denied the plane did anything but drop leaflets.

Fiorini, like Diaz Lanz, fought for Castro in the revolution but has since turned against the Cuban leader.

"If I have unintentionally caused you embarrassment, Mr. President," Diaz Lanz wrote, "let me say I am truly sorry." Major Lanz explained that he had written the letter "defending my name and the honor of my parents" from Castro's public charges.

"I sent copies of this letter to the principal Cuban newspapers with a request that they publish my answer to Fidel," wrote the major. "It caused me sadness that democracy had been so stifled in Cuba that not a single newspaper dared to print my letter."

"I found it necessary to have the letter delivered to the Cuban people myself. I printed several thousand copies and had them scattered over Havana from the air." He sent the President a copy of the leaflet which, he pointed out, does not call upon the Cuban people to revolt or to take any other action that would embarrass the country which has given me refuge. I plead guilty only to exercising freedom of speech to defend my reputation."

Lanz vigorously denied Castro's charges that he had also bombed and strafed Havana.

Explaining why he had organized the leaflet raid, the former air chief assured the President: "It was never my intention to violate the hospitality of the United States. On the contrary, your democratic ideals and tradi-

tions stirred me into taking this action.

"I would prefer to lead the quiet, free, peaceful life that your people are able to enjoy. But I cannot rest until the democracy I fought to bring to Cuba is attained. I realize this does not give me the right to involve the United States in our quarrel. Please let me assure you that all I ever did, or intend to do, is to exercise my rights as a Cuban without violating my sanctuary in this free land. If Fidel Castro chooses to create an international

incident out of this, I am indeed sorry.

"I broke with Fidel because he betrayed our revolution and exchanged one form of dictatorship for another. I watched and waited in vain for some sign that democracy would be re-established in Cuba. When I witnessed instead the government slipping into the clutches of the Communists, I resigned as chief of the Cuban Air Force."

Bail Offer Considered

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — Maj. Pedro Diaz Lanz, jailed by U. S. authorities on Cuban charges of murder and attempted murder, has conferred with friends who offered to bail him out.

Diaz Lanz will decide whether to accept the offer during talks with Carlos Echegoyan, one of the friends, it was reported today. Echegoyan was once intelligence chief of Cuba's air force and has played host to Diaz Lanz here.

Echegoyan said Diaz Lanz for reasons of his own may not want to be bailed out. Echegoyan did not say what the reasons were.

The former head of Fidel Castro's revolutionary air force was jailed in \$5,000 bond yesterday after a hearing before Federal Judge Joseph Lieb. An extradition warrant called Diaz Lanz a fugitive from Cuban justice.

The murder charges apparently stem from an Oct. 21 incident in which aircraft dropped anti-Castro leaflets on Havana.

Cuban government officials charged that explosives dropped

from the plane killed Joaquin Fernandez of Havana and injured 24 others. Some witnesses said the death and injuries resulted from Cubans trying to shoot down the planes.

Diaz Lanz, according to the FBI, admitted piloting one of the planes. Agents said the flight originated in Florida, about 50 miles from Cuba.

Frank Fiorini, former Norfolk man, said in an interview in Norfolk last week that he helped Diaz Lanz pilot the leaflet plane. Fiorini, known here as Frank Sturgis, denied the plane did anything but drop leaflets.

Though Fiorini fought for Castro in the revolution, he said he has broken with Castro and he accused the Cuban leader of being a Communist.

Diaz Lanz fled to Miami from Cuba in June after resigning as air force chief and calling Castro a Communist. Castro has called Diaz Lanz a traitor.

"I'm thankful to God," said Diaz Lanz, "I'm not in Cuba at this time. I am confident I will receive fair treatment."

Fiorini Faces Hearing

He May Lose Citizenship

By JACK KESTNER

NORFOLK — Soldier-of-fortune Frank Fiorini may lose his American citizenship.

The 35-year-old ex-Norfolkian who fought for two years with Cuban rebel Fidel Castro will be given a special Department of Immigration hearing Jan. 29 in Miami.

Fiorini, whose colorful career includes hitches in the Marines and Army plus stints as a Norfolk tavern manager, real estate salesman and college student, turned against Castro last Fall when he felt the new government was going communist.

After fleeing to the United States with former Cuban Air Force Chief Diaz Lantz he subsequently was credited with being pilot of a plane which dropped anti-Castro leaflets on Cuba.

Joseph Minton, deputy district director of the U. S. Department of Immigration in Miami, told the Ledger-Star by telephone that no charges had been lodged against the six-foot, 200-pound adventurer.

"This will be a hearing, a special inquiry," Minton said. "There has been an allegation that Fiorini may have jeopardized his citizen-

ship by service in a foreign army. We want to find out if this is true."

All members of Fiorini's immediate family live in Norfolk. His mother, Mrs. Mary Sturgis, and sister, Frances, live in the 900 block of Duke street.

His father, Angelo Fiorini, is an employee of the Giant Open Air market at Campostella Bridge, while his wife, Juanita, works as a waitress at the Thomas Nelson Coffee Shop.

The latter said that Immigration officials picked up her husband for questioning when he stepped off a plane in Miami earlier this week after a trip to Guatamala.

It has been reported that Fiorini is now one of a group working in the United States and South American countries who hope for the overthrow of the Castro regime.

Fiorini Battles To Retain His U.S. Citizenship

NORFOLK—Frank (Sturgis) Fiorini, 35, has begun a battle to retain his U.S. citizenship.

At a hearing which opened Tuesday behind closed doors in Miami, the Department of Immigration began taking testimony to determine whether or not his close association with the Castro rebellion in Cuba has placed his citizenship in jeopardy.

Fiorini, who was born in Norfolk, has contended that he never swore allegiance to the Cuban government, that his association was simply one of a knowledgeable guerilla fighter who was employed because of his availability and know-how.

Fiorini was an island-hopping Marine in World War II, and later served in the Army and Civil Air Patrol. He was also a student at the College of William and Mary in Norfolk, a licensed real estate salesman, and a tavern manager.

Fiorini broke with the Castro regime after he felt the government was going Communist. He was pilot of a plane last fall which dropped anti-Castro leaflets on Havana.

Some weeks ago, a friend of Fiorini's called at the home of his mother in the 900 block of Duke street in an attempt to secure birth certificate and armed services discharge papers to be used in the immigration hearing.

Luke E. White, special inquiry officer, recessed the hearing indefinitely after taking preliminary testimony.

Fiorini's father also lives in Norfolk, as does his wife, Juanita, who is a waitress at the Thomas Nelson coffee shop.

Fiorini Loses United States Citizenship

Cuban Army Connection Is Cause

NORFOLK—Frank Fiorini, 35, Norfolk - born ex-Marine who fought with Castro's rebels before turning against the Cuban premier, has lost his United States citizenship.

According to a special column by Drew Pearson, the citizenship of the six-foot, 200-pound soldier-of-fortune was signed away by Secretary of State Christian Herter on Jan. 21.

By telephone this morning, Ed Hickey—deputy director of the State Department's Passport Office—said that his records did not

reveal whether or not this was true.

But Hickey added that if Fiorini had been a member of Castro's armed forces on the date that they became the official armed forces of Cuba, his loss of citizenship would have been automatic.

In his column, Pearson says that "Herter signed away the citizenship of (Fiorini) who has been smuggling evidence to the American Air Attache in Havana regarding Castro and communism.

"Ironically, the charge against Fiorini was that he accepted an appointment by the Cuban Air Force as a liaison officer between the Cuban Air Force and the United States Air Force."

Pearson says that Florida Sen. George Smathers consulted with Herter on the matter, and subsequently with Sen. Wayne Morse, of Oregon, chairman of the Latin-American Affairs subcommittee, who promised a full hearing.

Actually, a hearing on the case by the Department of Immigration is now pending in Miami, where Fiorini is now living.

Edward P. Ahrens, district director of the Department in Miami, said by telephone today that the hearing (which opened Jan. 20) will be continued April 12, and until then Fiorini is free under his own cognizance without travel restrictions.

Fiorini was picked up by Miami Immigration officials early in January when he returned from a trip to Guatemala, on the grounds that his citizenship was in doubt.

Fiorini's wife is a waitress at the Thomas Nelson coffee shop in Norfolk. His mother and sister live in the 900 block of Duke St., while his father is a supermarket clerk here.

Fiorini To Learn Fate in 10 Days

MIAMI, Fla. P—Frank Fiorini, who first supported and then denounced the Cuban revolution, will learn in 10 days whether he will lose his U.S. citizenship.

The 34-year-old Norfolk, Va. native and World War II Marine was summoned to an exclusion hearing Tuesday after immigration officials challenged his entry here as a citizen.

Fiorini said he served as personal adviser to Maj. Pedro Diaz Lanz when the latter was head of Fidel Castro's air force. He de-

nied, however, that he signed up in Castro's or any other foreign forces, and said he has never sworn allegiance to any government but his own.

Diaz Lanz took political refuge in Miami last June after accusing the Castro regime of being Communist-dominated. In October, Fiorini and Diaz Lanz flew over Havana on what they called a leaflet dropping trip. Cuba claimed they dropped bombs.

A federal judge recently refused to extradite Diaz Lanz to face trial in Cuba. The judge said Cuba did not present adequate evidence that bombs were used. Fiorini's wife, parents and sister live in Norfolk now. He was in Norfolk on a brief visit late last year and told a reporter then he had turned against Castro.

Fiorini Decision Pends

Norfolk Man's Status Studied

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — Testimony was concluded Tuesday in a closed hearing into whether Frank Fiorini of Norfolk, Va., lost his U.S. citizenship through activity in Cuban revolutionary affairs.

A special inquiry officer who conducted the hearing said his decision will be made in about 10 days.

HEARING CLOSED

An official report of the testimony is not available because the law requires that exclusion hearings be conducted in closed session, in contrast with the public nature of court proceedings.

Fiorini's re-entry as a citizen into this country last December from a Guatemala trip was challenged by the Immigration Service, which contended the former U. S. Marine had forfeited citizenship by actions in Cuba.

Fiorini, 34, told newsmen he once was an ardent believer in the Cuban revolution as a Democratic influence but later became convinced that the government of revolutionary Prime Minister Fidel Castro is Communist-dominated.

ADVISED LANZ

He said that during the period when he was a Castro supporter, he served as a personal adviser to Maj. Pedro Diaz Lanz, head of the revolutionary air force.

But, said Fiorini, he never swore allegiance to any government other than that of the United States, nor enlisted in any foreign armed service.

After Diaz Lanz denounced Castro last June and took political sanctuary in Miami, Fiorini and Diaz Lanz made an airplane flight over Havana.

They said they scattered anti-Communist leaflets. The Castro government claimed they bombed the Cuban capital. A federal judge recently turned down Cuba's request for Diaz Lanz's extradition, saying insufficient evidence was submitted to back up the bombing claim.

'It's a Shame,' Wife Says

NORFOLK — Frank Fiorini's wife said Wednesday that she had no hope her husband would regain his American citizenship.

Fiorini was stripped of his citizenship Wednesday in Miami, Fla., and ordered to leave the city for fighting with Fidel Castro's Cuban rebels.

Mrs. Sturgis, an attractive, blond-haired Cherokee Indian, said Fiorini called her less than a month ago and told her he had no chance of keeping his citizenship.

She said he probably will go to Guatemala. "And his life won't be worth a nickel in Guatemala or any other South American country," she added. "Castro is bound to get him sooner or later."

She paused, then added, "I begged and pleaded with him from the beginning not to go. He wouldn't listen."

Sturgis was undecided about joining her husband in Cuba. "The immigration authorities told me I stand to lose my own citizenship if I do," she said.

Sturgis was sitting in a downtown coffee shop. Mrs. Sturgis said she was supporting herself since her husband left for Cuba.

"He tells me he didn't make any money in Castro's army,"

she said. "It's a shame to lose his citizenship. But he was going to make a fortune."

all he could talk about was joining a revolution. And I don't think it was adventure he was after — it was money.

"That's all he ever talked about — making money, and making money fast. And revolutions — that was the quickest way."

"And something else. He told me in Washington that Castro was definitely a Communist. But this was after he had gone over to the other side."

She said she did not believe Fiorini's attorney could win an appeal. "Every time they appeal the other side is going to get that much more evidence against him," she said.

Mrs. Sturgis, a Cherokee, N.C., native, said she met her husband in Norfolk when he was operating a Main Street tavern. "Ever since I've known him,"

Boot Given To Fiorini

MIAMI, Fla. (AP)—Frank Fiorini, an American born in Norfolk, Va., was stripped of his citizenship Wednesday and ordered to leave the country for aiding Fidel Castro's Cuban rebels.

Fiorini, a pilot, later became disillusioned with Castro and joined counter-revolutionary plotters.

Fiorini's attorney, Alan Kessler, described as amazing the action announced by Edward P. Ahrens, district director of immigration and naturalization.

Kessler said an appeal will be filed with the Immigration Service Board of Appeals in Washington.

"The government had not only a weak case but the weakest kind of a weak case," Kessler declared.

The lawyer said the prosecution failed to prove Fiorini ever served in any armed forces other than those of the United States. The pilot is a World War II veteran with a distinguished record, Kessler said.

He denied his client served with the Castro forces although he admitted Fiorini made several visits to Cuba after the revolution which overthrew dictator Fulgencio Batista.

Fiorini's Wife Would Join Husband Anywhere in Exile

By JACK KESTNER

NORFOLK—"If he still wants me, I'll go with him anywhere."

That's the answer that the wife of Frank (Sturgis) Fiorini gave this morning when asked whether or not she planned to follow her soldier-of-fortune husband into exile.

In a Department of Immigration "Exclusion Order" signed April 25, the citizenship of the 36-year-old Norfolk native was revoked.

For the past three years his activities have been intimately connected with those of Fidel Castro—first as a supporter of the revolution, then (since last fall) as a bitter opponent to a government he considers communist.

It was in May 1957 while in Spain on a honeymoon with Sturgis that the ex-Maine, ex-tavern manager first be-

came interested in the Castro rebellion.

A short time later he went to Cuba—and, except for a few visits during the past six months, that was the last time that his wife saw him. She has since been working as a waitress at the Thomas Nelson coffee shop.

"I don't have much hope for him winning an appeal," the attractive, dark-headed girl said today. "If he does have to leave the country, I'll go with him if he still wants me. After all, I still care for the guy."

Fiorini's mother, Mrs. Mary Sturgis, and a teen-age sister live in the 900 block of Duke street. His father Anthony Fiorini, also lives in Norfolk.

The mother said today that she has written a letter to Secretary of State Christian Herter begging him not to deprive her only son of his citizenship.

"Surely you have a mother, and know how I must feel," she said she wrote. "I raised a soldier for the United States. He was born here and went to school here and fought for this country. I beg you not to take away his citizenship."

Mrs. Sturgis has been confined to her bed for the past two months with a broken ankle. She says she received it when she fell on icy pavement while going to mail a letter to her son regarding information he had requested in the immigration proceedings.

A State Department spokesman said by telephone today that he had no idea how many Americans helped Castro and are still in Cuba.

"It doesn't require a passport to go there," said Edward J. Hickey, Deputy Director of the Passports Office, "so we don't have the faintest idea how many are there."

Asked if it would be possible for an American to have fought with Castro, to have been a part of his

government, and to return now without being caught, Hickey said:

"Under certain circumstances, that would be altogether possible—if he hadn't received any publicity, and didn't occupy a key position in the government."

Fiorini's attorney in Miami, Alan Kessler, said yesterday that an appeal would be filed with the Immigration Appeals Board in Washington.

He described himself as "amazed" at the exclusion order.

If Deported, Then Where?

Ex-Citizen Must Find New Country

NORFOLK—Norfolk-born Frank Fiorini is quite literally a man without a country.

And that fact may prove to be a painful headache for the State Department if he fails along the various avenues of his appeal.

Earlier this week in Miami, the Immigration Service, ruled there were grounds to exclude the color-

ful 35-year-old Norfolkian who fought with Castro before turning against him.

But (assuming that subsequent appeals are lost) where would he be deported to?

A U.S. Immigration official in Washington said by telephone this morning that the Fiorini case was the first of its kind resulting from involvement with the Castro regime, and that no others were pending.

The official said that if the ex-tavern manager were to lose his appeals, he would have one choice of a country to be deported to, but if that country were to refuse, a second choice would be left up to the Immigration Service.

He was returning last January from a trip to Guatemala when Miami Immigration officials questioned his right of entry.

But Fiorini has never lived there, nor has he any relatives or ties there.

It would mean almost certain death to send him to Cuba, even though his Cuban ties furnished the grounds for expatriation.

The State Department signed a certificate of expatriation of Jan. 29 on the grounds that Fiorini "... on March 23, 1959, expatriated himself by accepting an appointment by the Cuban Air Force as liaison officer between that Air Force and the U.S. Air Force as certified by an American consul in Havana."

However, there seems to be no immediate danger of his being deported anywhere.

If he fails in an appeal to the Immigration Service Board of Appeals in Washington, Fiorini can carry his fight up through federal courts.

And that is just what his Miami attorney, Alan Kessler, plans to do.

Kessler said by telephone today that he's pessimistic about an appeal to the Immigration Service, but that in federal courts, "I think we will prevail."

As a last resort, Kessler said, he is prepared to argue before the U.S. Supreme Court that the McCarran Act is unconstitutional.

"Many people are of the opinion that the government has no right to grant to an administrative authority the right to take away the citizenship of a person who was born here," Kessler said.

All of which could take months, possibly years.

Kessler believes that Fiorini has created an "aura of sympathy" by demonstrating his willingness

to fight against a dictator (Batista) and then turning away from the following regime when it appeared to be going communist.

Kessler says that Fiorini also has been cooperating with the FBI and State Department in supplying information on communist activity in Cuba.

As a last resort, Kessler thinks there is a possibility that Sen. George Smathers of Florida will go to bat for him and have his citizenship restored by a special act of Congress.

"He has shown a sympathy for Frank," Kessler said. "And he's the type of man who, when he sees something wrong, will try to do something about it."

Fiorini has another federal case pending in Miami in which the Federal Aviation Agency is seeking revocation of his private pilot's license for an unauthorized flight over Havana to distribute leaflets.

Fiorini Appeals Ruling

Seeks Lost Citizenship

MIAMI, Fla. — Frank Fiorini, ex-tavern keeper of Norfolk, Va., appealed Thursday for the restoration of the U.S. citizenship he lost for his alleged part in the Cuban revolution of Fidel Castro.

The appeal was filed with the immigration authorities who stripped him of his citizenship 10 days ago, after ruling he had expatriated himself by joining the Castro forces.

It will be considered by the Immigration Service Board of Appeals in Washington, D.C.

CHANGED MIND

Fiorini became disenchanted of the Castro regime after it took power. He allegedly joined a counter-revolutionary group.

He was picked up by U.S. authorities after allegedly flying an American-based plane on a leaflet-dropping mission over Cuba.

His present status is that of a stateless alien illegally in the United States without a passport or visa, his attorney Alan Kessler said in Miami Thursday.

BIG PROBLEM

Fiorini faces deportation and the problem of finding a country which will allow him to cross its borders.

Kessler maintained that Fiorini is entitled to stay in the United States because he is a citizen, and that he did not expatriate himself.

He is free on parole until his case is settled.

His wife, Mrs. Juanita Fiorini, works as a waitress in a Norfolk coffee shop.

She said recently that though his life "wouldn't be worth a nickel" if he elected to be deported to a South American country, she would join him in exile if he asked her to.

Phony Paper Caused His Grief, Frank Says

If He Loses Appeal on Citizenship He'll Ask To Be Deported to Cuba

By JACK KESTNER

NORFOLK — Frank Fiorini charged today that the State Department took away his U. S. citizenship on the basis of a "fraudulent document."

The Norfolk soldier-of-fortune said that, ironically, the document had been prepared to protect him from arrest while supplying information on Cuban communist activities to the U. S. government.

It has, he added, information that the Federal Bureau of Investigation had asked him to supply

Fiorini, speaking by telephone from Miami, said he was so incensed at this "unwarranted action" that if he loses his appeal against an exclusion verdict, he will choose Cuba as the country to be deported to.

"But won't you be shot if you go there?" he was asked.

"Just as soon as I land," he replied. "But public opinion is my last appeal. I don't think that the State Department can afford to send me to sure death when the basis of my loss of citizenship was supplying information to my own country."

Fiorini, 35, won medals as an island-hopping Marine in World War II. After the war, he served in the Army, Navy, and was a CAP flying instructor in Norfolk. For two years he attended the Norfolk Division of the College of William and Mary, was a licensed real estate salesman, and managed down-town taverns.

Fiorini's story of the events that led to his loss of citi-

zenship and his present status of "man without a country" faced with the threat of deportation:

He first met Fidel Castro in 1956 when the rebel leader was speaking in a Miami theater to raise money and support to oust dictator Fulgencia Batista.

Fiorini kept in touch, and joined him two years later in the Sierra Maestra mountain stronghold of the rebels. There he became a Castro aide, and went on missions for him to several Latin American countries.

He said that even then there were card-carrying Communists among Castro's rebels, but that

his military commanders confidently expected him to oust them if and when he came to power. Instead, once the revolution was successful, Castro began filling important civilian posts with known Communists. The worried commanders debated having a showdown with their leader, but majority opinion ruled that this would only result in their own arrests.

Pedro Diaz Lanz, commander-in-chief of the revolutionary air force and a friend of Fiorini's, sent him to Washington to give information to the FBI and ask advice on the "critical" situation.

Fiorini gave his information to two FBI agents in a four-hour session, naming known Communists in positions of responsibility.

The agents said they would be unable to give advice on the situation but that they appreciated the information and would like to have additional information whenever possible.

At that time, Castro was arresting men on the slightest suspicion of treason, so Lanz drew up a document naming Fiorini liaison officer between the Cuban Air Force and the U.S. Air Force.

With it, Fiorini could make frequent contact with U.S. authorities without arousing suspicions. The document was not legal for it was not signed by the Cuban commander of armed forces, but only by Lanz.

This document, Fiorini says, was the basis for his loss of citizenship and the subsequent Immigration exclusion proceedings against him.

At the closed hearing in Miami, Lanz (who had fled Cuba with Fiorini) testified that the document was false. But the special Immigration officer, Fiorini said, considered it genuine and ruled that he could be excluded from the United States.

An appeal has been filed in Washington.

Castro's Overthrow Sure, Ex-Aide Says

NORFOLK—Frank Fiorini, Norfolk-born "man without a country," says that the people of Cuba have "traded a Fascist dictator for a Communist dictator," and predicts that "Castro will make Batista look like a piker."

Fiorini left his native Norfolk early today for a 2 p.m. hearing before the Federal Aviation Agency in Washington during which he faces possible loss of his private pilot's license and a \$10,000 airplane.

The soldier-of-fortune, who fought with Castro for two years before turning against the bearded rebel leader, has been visiting family and friends here for the past two days.

He says that Castro has been heard to express a willingness "to kill 40,000 people if necessary" to accomplish his aims.

Castro's eventual overthrow is assured, Fiorini says.

"The action must come from within Cuba, but the leadership will probably come from outside the country. I believe that Pedro Diaz Lanz will be that leader."

Lanz is the former Cuban revolutionary air force commander, who denounced Castro's Communist activities the day before he fled the country last fall.

He was pilot on a plane which dropped 200,000 anti-Castro leaflets on Havana last Oct. 21. Fiorini was copilot.

It was that unauthorized flight which has resulted in to-

day's hearing before the FAA in Washington. The converted B-25 bomber used on the flight is registered in Fiorini's name.

The FAA claims that the plane was bought by Diaz Lanz in Phoenix, Ariz., with Cuban revolutionary air force money. Fiorini claims he bought it with money loaned him by Lanz.

But the 35-year-old soldier-of-fortune faces deeper troubles than those brought by the FAA. Earlier this year he lost his American citizenship, and recently was ordered deported.

The citizenship loss, ironically, resulted from his supplying information on Communist activities in Cuba to the American embassy in Havana.

To cover his contacts with the embassy, he had Marcos Diaz

Lanz (brother of Pedro, and former inspector general of the Cuban revolutionary air force) sign a paper naming him liaison officer between the Cuban and American Air Forces.

This paper, Fiorini says, was the basis of his expatriation and subsequent exclusion order from the United States.

During the closed Immigration hearing in Miami, he said that Diaz Lanz (who also turned against Castro and fled Cuba) testified that the document was fraudulent, but that the Immigration officer still ruled that he was deportable.

Fiorini has appealed the ruling.

The ex-marine, who also managed Norfolk taverns, sold real estate, and taught flying here, is currently living in Miami where he serves as advisor and

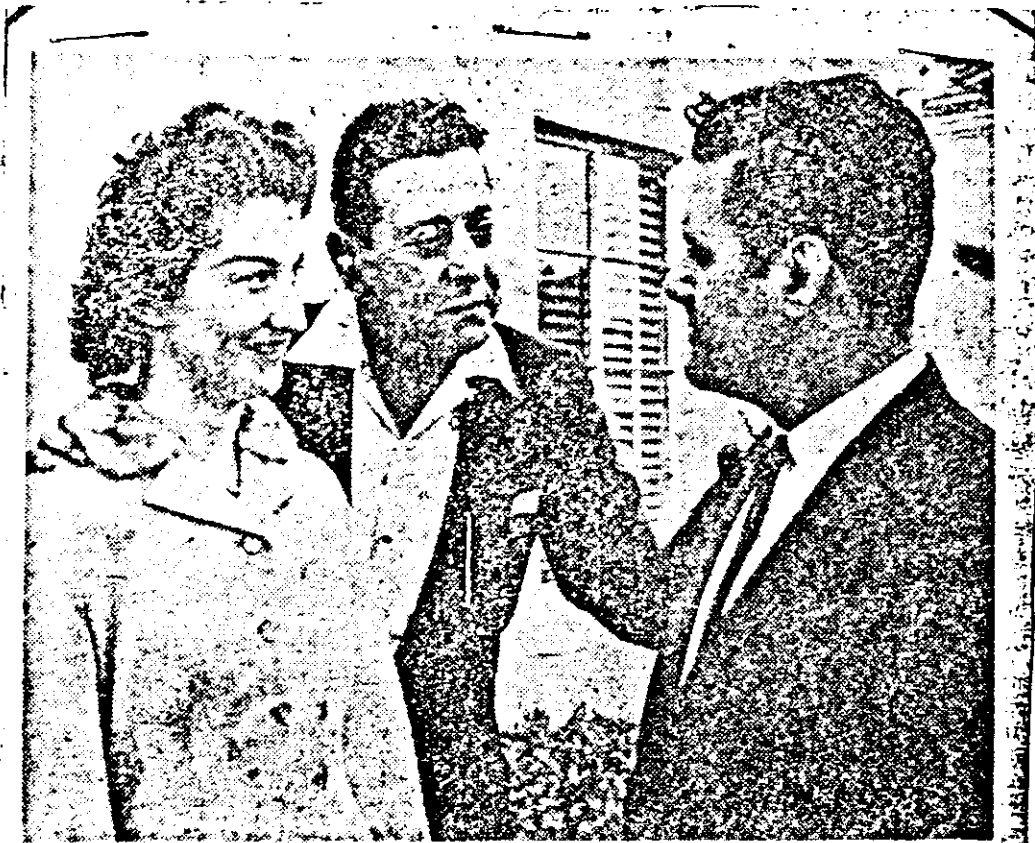
aid to Pedro Luis Diaz Lanz.

Fiorini says that Lanz "has the confidence of many people now living in exile, and many people—both civilian and military—still in Cuba."

He declined to speculate when an attempt would be made to overthrow Castro, but did say it was "only a matter of time."

Fiorini Defends Flight to Cuba

WASHINGTON (AP)— Frank Fiorini, a native of Norfolk, Va., offered a two-fold defense Friday against the proposed revocation of his pilot license because of a leaflet-dropping plane-flight over Cuba.

The Federal Aviation Agency ordered the hearing after Fiorini and Maj. Pedro Luis Diaz Lanz, former chief of the Cuban Revolutionary Air Force, made the flight from southern Florida.

The Agency contends that Fiorini permitted Diaz Lanz to pilot the plane on the flight last October when the Cuban had no

U.S. pilot's license. It contends also that Fiorini was not entitled to register the plane, a B25, because, the Agency said, it was bought by Diaz Lanz.

Warren Woods, attorney for Fiorini, said his client contended at the closed-door hearing that he permitted Diaz Lanz to pilot the plane because the Cuban had flown in the U.S. in April last year and he, Fiorini, thought the Cuban had a U.S. permit.

Woods said Fiorini stated the plane was a gift to him from Diaz Lanz.

Fiorini said he fought as a U.S. Marine during World War II, that he had made reports regularly to the FBI and that he had never sworn allegiance to Cuba.

Woods said the Agency agreed to permit the offering of additional testimony, but no date has been set.

Fiorina Stands To Lose His Pilot's Papers

NORFOLK—Norfolk-born Frank Fiorini has lost the first round in a fight to retain his private pilot's certificate.

The Federal Aviation Agency has reaffirmed its intent to revoke the certificate with a notice sent to Fiorini at his current Miami, Fla., address.

The revocation becomes effective June 13. He has 10 days in which to note an appeal to the Civil Aeronautics Board.

Fiorini is in worse trouble still. He is now marking time while awaiting an oral appeal of an exclusion order barring him from the United States.

His loss of citizenship occurred ironically enough, on the basis of a document prepared for the purpose of enabling him to supply information on Communist activity to the U. S. consulate in Havana.

The FAA notified Fiorini April 11 that it planned to revoke his airman's certificate. A hearing was held in Washington May 13.

The FAA said that after reviewing the evidence and the information available to it, the agency concluded that safety in air commerce and air transportation required revocation.

It based its decision on the fact that Fiorini had applied on May 12, 1959 for registration in his name of a modified B-25 aircraft when he was not the legal owner.

The plane, the FAA said, had been purchased by Maj. Pedro Luis Diaz Lanz, then chief of the Cuban Revolutionary Air Force, for use by himself and the air force.

Fiorini, the FAA said, also authorized the now famed "leaflet dropping raid" over Havana last October 21, and served as copilot on the flight.

(When Fiorini visited his native Norfolk last month, he said that it was "only a matter of time" until an attempt is made to overthrow Castro.)

Fiorini's Wife Asks Divorce

NORFOLK — The wife of Norfolk soldier of fortune Frank Fiorini has filed suit for divorce on grounds of desertion.

A bill of complaint was filed Friday in Circuit Court by attorney L. Charles Burlage on behalf of 23-year-old Juanita Fiorini, who is currently working as a waitress in the Virginian restaurant.

The complaint lists the address of Frank Anthony Fiorini, 38, as "Guatemala (address unknown)."

It states that the couple were married May 11, 1956, and last lived together in Lafayette Shores.

"For some months prior to March 1, 1967, the defendant had expressed the desire to leave for the country of Cuba and to join with the forces of Fidel Castro," the complaint says.

"Notwithstanding the entreaties and requests of your complainant herein, the defendant did, on the 1st day of March, 1967, leave your complainant and without cause or justification left for the island of Cuba and joined the armed forces of Fidel Castro."

He has "continued since that date as a soldier of fortune," the complaint says, "and has not returned to live with your com-

plainant as his wife."

The complainant asks for a divorce a vinculo matrimonii.

After serving with the victorious Castro, Fiorini broke with him some six months after his overthrow of the Batista regime.

He is credited with being co-pilot of a plane that created an international incident by dropping anti-Castro leaflets on Havana in October, 1959.

Since that time, he is known to have been working with anti-Castro forces in Miami preparing for an invasion of Cuba which he said during a visit here last May "is sure to come."

He Went Back Three

Times

NORFOLK — Norfolk-born Frank Fiorini slipped into Cuba three times last year on missions to rescue anti-Castro rebel forces. A national men's magazine says in its current issue.

Writer Alex Rorke Jr., in the lead article of the March issue of Argosy magazine, also says that Fiorini "is considered by all Cuban groups to (have been) the greatest soldier in the revolution against Batista."

The article "First Report from Inside the 'Anti-Castro Revolt'" is mainly concerned in tracing the development and current status of anti-Castro forces in and out of Cuba.

But in so doing it pictures the 35-year-old Fiorini as being the most redoubtable field man of the group.

Rorke, who claims he himself has made several forays into Cuba for the purpose of making TV films of anti-Castro operations, credits Victor Manuel Papeque—"Diego"—as being the

leader of operations in the Escambray of Las Villas province.

And Diego, Rorke says, thinks of Fiorini as "worth fifty men in battle."

Rorke describes Fiorini as a Marine hero—he had come to Cuba to fight for democracy there and had helped Castro. He left when he was unable to stem the Red takeover after the fall of Batista.

Rorke says the overall plan of the Cuban Freedom Fighters

(a group that includes many refugee Hungarian Freedom Fighters) is to establish an area they can hold against Castro forces and set up a provincial government that will be recognized by anti-communist countries.

Fiorini's mother, Mrs. Mary Sturgis, and a sister, Frances, live in the 900 block of Duke Street. His wife, Juanita, and father, Anthony Fiorini, are also living in Norfolk.

NORFOLK—Frank Fiorini's U.S. citizenship has been restored. The colorful ex-Norfolkian had been under a deportation order since Immigration officials lifted his passport in Jan. 21, 1960.

He was accused of serving

as an officer in the Air Force of Fidel Castro even though he had long since split with the bearded Cuban dictator and was actively opposing him.

Fiorini, 36, lost an appeal of the decision in Miami but carried it to Washington and the Immigration Board of Appeals there.

In Miami today, he said by telephone that his lawyer had received a letter which said that "the applicant (Fiorini) is not subject to exclusion."

The letter, he said, was dated March 14 and was signed by Milton V. Milich, special inquiry officer for the Department of Justice.

Fiorini quoted Milich as writing: "The government has failed to establish by clear, convincing and unequivocal evidence

that he has lost his U.S. citizenship acquired at birth.

Milich added that "this order is final unless an appeal is taken by the district director of this service within five days."

Fiorini said that he was "extremely pleased" with the news but that it didn't come as a surprise.

"The Cuban Air Force appointment they accused me of was a fake commission I was using in order to relay information on Communist activities to the U.S. consul," he said.

A current men's magazine describes Fiorini's activities as an anti-Castro leader, mentioning the fact that he had returned several times to Cuba on rebel rescue missions.

While declining for security reasons to discuss his activities in Cuba, Fiorini painted a grim picture of the Communist buildup.

"Castro has the strongest army in Central and South America," he said. "He's five times stronger than Batista ever was, and he's still building."

Fiorini thinks there's little chance of a coup d'etat or assassination from within Cuba since Castro has surrounded himself with a hard core of Communists.

He also is strongly supported by the Chinese Communists, who have between 4,000 and 5,000 "technicians" there now and are sending regular shipments of rice to Cuba despite a famine in their own country.

"Cuba to Red China is what Formosa is to us," he said. "Each is an off-coast bastion of opposite forces and neither side is about to give up."

Fiorini was asked about a story in a recent issue of the N.Y. Daily Mirror in which columnist John R. McBride says that "Various anti-Castro exile groups are bidding for his (Fiorini's) services. Each wants him to lead its invasion force."

Fiorini laughed and said that the report was "a bit overdone," but that the statement was a commentary on just what was wrong with the anti-Castro movement: too many groups working against each other.

Fiorini's mother, Mrs. Mary Sturgis, and a sister, Frances, live in the 900 block of Duke Street. His wife, Juanita, who is suing him for divorce, also lives here, as does his father.

NORFOLK — The first meeting took place in a Norfolk motel in May 1960. Sturgis cautioned me over the phone not to mention his name to anyone or where he was staying, that he would explain why when I got there.

Sturgis himself opened the motel door. A big man, around six feet and 200 pounds, he had been chatting with his father, Angelo Fiorini, at that time a produce man for Giant Open Air Market.

Sturgis apologized for his cloak-and-dagger warning over the phone, but explained that ever since the preceding October when he had served as copilot on a surplus B-25 bomber that dropped anti-Castro leaflets over Havana, there had been reports that Castro agents in the country had marked him for revenge.

It seemed strange meeting the man in person after having written so many stories about him, stories based on interviews with his father and mother and wife of that time, Juanita, who had described herself as a full-blooded Cherokee Indian (she filed for divorce the following year.)

It had been a fascinating story to follow: born on Faulkland Street in Norfolk on Dec. 9, 1924, at the age of 17 he had joined the Marines and spent 30 months fighting in the Pacific.

Returning home, still restless, he had served a peace-time hitch with the Army in Germany, was ice-bound on a freighter off the coast of Newfoundland as an able bodied seaman, was a lieutenant and flying instructor in the Norfolk Civil Air Patrol, attended college for two years, sold real estate and insurance, and was credited with being one of the best tavern managers and boun-

cers that old Main Street ever produced.

His interest in Fidel Castro dated back to 1957 when, during a honeymoon in Miami, he and Juanita attended a Flagler Street rally aimed at raising money to support the bearded revolution-

Juanita recalled that after returning to Norfolk, Castro was all Frank could talk about — "he even subscribed to a Miami newspaper and began putting together a Castro scrapbook."

Sturgis joined Castro in the Sierra Maestra mountain in Feb. 1958. In one letter to Juanita, smuggled out by a South American journalist, Sturgis told of the hardships of the struggle, of going without food for days, of having a hole in his ankle "the size of a quarter," and of his admiration for Castro — "believe it or not, he is a very good friend of mine," he wrote.

With Castro's victory in January 1959, it appeared that Sturgis had it made. He became, successively, head of training for Castro's militia, then advisor and liaison officer for the head of Castro's air force, Maj. Pedro Diaz Lanz.

When Castro visited the United States that summer, Sturgis' father was invited to Washington where he attended elaborate hotel dinners paid for by his son who signed the check "Capt. Frank Fiorini."

Then came the break when Sturgis realized that Castro was gradually building up a communist regime in Cuba. He and his boss, Diaz, fled to Miami.

"The people of Cuba have simply traded a fascist dictator for a communist dictator," Sturgis said bitterly.

On Oct. 21, 1959, Diaz and Sturgis climbed into B-25 that Sturgis had earlier bought for Castro's air force and took off from an abandoned Florida air strip.

Over Havana, with Diaz at the controls, Sturgis tossed out 200,000 anti-Castro leaflets. Castro subsequently fumed to the world that incendiary bombs had been dropped, killing one and wounding a score more.

"We didn't drop any bombs," Sturgis said during our meeting in the motel that May evening. "They were shooting at us with everything they had and maybe that would account for any injuries."

We talked late into the night—about his capture by Batista forces when he was gun-running for Castro, the days he spent in jail under torture without food or water, and broad hints that he was now in the gun-running business again, this time against Castro.

He was indignant over the loss of his citizenship two months earlier on the ground he had accepted a commission in the Cuban Air Force ("they're basing it on a forged document I used to deliver

information on communist activity to the American embassy.")

From that night on, Sturgis would call me during each of his infrequent visits to Norfolk. Quite frequently he would call from his residence in Miami to update his anti-Castro activities among Cuban refugees.

On March 18, 1961, he was jubilant over the phone after the Immigration Board of Appeals in Washington restored his citizenship.

During the same conversation he chuckled at published reports that various anti-Castro groups were bidding for his services to head an invasion force.

He described the reports as "a bit overdone," but said they were good commentaries on what was wrong with the anti-Castro movement: too many cooks spoiling the broth.

The calls dropped off until 1968 when in April he phoned to describe the formation of an air-mobile secret Army—not to invade Cuba but to have a force of highly-paid mercenaries ready to hop off to any part of Latin America where Castro agents have fomented an uprising.

As far as is known, the grandiose scheme never got off the ground.

Later that year, in November, he called to say he had just returned from a British Honduras jail where he had lost 20 pounds while living on fish heads and rice.

It seems that Sturgis and 12 other Americans were on their way from a Yucatan Peninsula camp to hit targets in Cuba when their 36-foot cabin cruiser ran aground on a reef. Seams were opened, so they had to limp into Belize—with a load of rifles, machineguns and medical supplies.

Officials promptly jailed them, fearing they were working for the government of Guatemala.

Sturgis' last call came a few months ago. He said his sister, Frances (a former Miss Ocean View beauty contest winner) had broken her neck in a freak accident.

He sounded discouraged about the possibility of ever overthrowing Castro. We made an appointment to update the story of "a tired revolutionary," but a more pressing assignment came up and it had to be broken.

The next word came indirectly—a TV broadcast that Sturgis was one of five men arrested in Democratic National Headquarters.

On January 23, 1959, an article appeared in the Norfolk Ledger-Dispatch entitled "STURGIS Tells Norfolkian of Illegal Entry to U. S." In this article by JACK KESTNER, one SIDNEY SEMEL, President of the Office Supply Company, Princess Anne Road, Norfolk, Virginia, reported that he had met FRANK STURGIS while vacationing in Miami Beach, Florida. The article reports that STURGIS told SEMEL that he had been captured by Batista forces in Cuba and thrown into prison. STURGIS told SEMEL that at that time he was in Miami on business for CASTRO.

On February 15, 1959, while conducting investigation on another matter Special Agent RALPH W. ENGELMEIER interviewed SIDNEY SEMEL in Norfolk, Virginia. SEMEL advised that he had met STURGIS in Miami, Florida, on January 21 or 22, 1959. At that time, STURGIS mentioned to SEMEL that he had been captured by Batista forces while fighting in Cuba for CASTRO. STURGIS told SEMEL that at that moment, he was in the United States illegally but made no further statements as to how he had entered the United States. SEMEL advised that he had set up a dinner meeting with STURGIS at a Miami Beach Hotel for the following day; however, he never met with STURGIS again. SEMEL stated that when he checked the Miami Beach Hotel where STURGIS said he was residing, there was no one there by that name.

On February 9, 1959, while conducting investigation on another matter, Special Agent RALPH W. ENGELMEIER interviewed the subject's mother MARY STURGIS at 326 Bank Street, Norfolk, Virginia. At that time Mrs. STURGIS stated that she had not seen her son for approximately one year. Mrs. STURGIS stated that to her knowledge, the subject was in Cuba with FIDEL CASTRO. Mrs. STURGIS stated that the subject had been brought up in both Norfolk, Virginia, and Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Mrs. STURGIS stated that at the time of the interview, the subject was married to JUANITA STURGIS; however this was his second wife. She stated that the subject had a divorce pending against his first wife BETTY JOHNSTON; however JOHNSTON had been shot and killed. Mrs. STURGIS said she did not know exactly what her son's activities were while in Cuba.

On March 30, 1959, while conducting investigation on another matter, Special Agents W. MARVIN BAKER and OSBORNE LEON DOBBS of the Norfolk Division interviewed GEORGE ROHANNA at 9432 Granby Street, Norfolk, Virginia. ROHANNA stated that he is a former Norfolk nightclub operator and advised that he is well acquainted with persons in the gambling profession. ROHANNA advised that he had recently returned to Norfolk, Virginia, from Cuba where he had been in contact with the subject. ROHANNA stated that he contacted the subject in Cuba in an attempt to enter the gambling profession in Cuba; however, the subject and ROHANNA could not work out a deal in this regard. ROHANNA did not furnish any information as to whether the subject was planning to return to the Norfolk, Virginia, area from Cuba.

On March 9, 1959, while conducting investigation on another matter, Special Agent RALPH W. ENGELMEIER interviewed R. DRAKE DORMAN at 402 Freemason Street, Norfolk, Virginia. DORMAN stated substantially that on January 29, 1959, he left Norfolk, Virginia, for Cuba on a business-pleasure trip. DORMAN advised that he carried with him seven or eight letters addressed to the subject as Captain FIORINI from FIORINI's wife JUANITA STURGIS. These letters were addressed to FIORINI in care of RICHARD SANDERLIN, Medical Hospital, Havana, Cuba. On February 3, 1959, DORMAN stated that he met with SANDERLIN in his hotel room in Havana, Cuba. SANDERLIN told DORMAN that FRANK FIORINI was not in town but was at Santa Clara with FIDEL CASTRO's brother. SANDERLIN told DORMAN that FIORINI was working with the underground in Mexico and the Dominican Republic and he was training some troops.

On January 18, 1960, while conducting investigation on another matter, Special Agent LEMUEL W. KERR contacted Mrs. O. FOX, Clerk, Bureau of Vital Statistics, Norfolk, Virginia, who made available birth certificate number 2832 which reflected that FRANK ANGELO FIORINI was born on December 9, 1924, in the City of Norfolk, to ANGELO FIORINI and MARY VONA.

KLEIN on May 9 or 10, 1960, while employed in the overhaul and repair section, Naval Air Station, Norfolk, Virginia, and asked by KLEIN if SNOWDEN wanted to go down to Cuba and kill FIDEL and RAOUL CASTRO. KLEIN subsequently advised SNOWDEN that one FRANK FIORINI and FIORINI's wife were recruiting personnel for a counter revolutionary movement to the CASTRO regime.

On July 25, 1960, while conducting investigation on another matter, Special Agents LEMUEL W. KERR and MARVIN E. STEFFEN interviewed BENJAMIN B. KLEIN at 416 Painter Street, Norfolk, Virginia. In a signed statement KLEIN related the following: "I have known FRANK STURGIS also known to me as FRANK FIORINI since about 1946. The last time I saw or heard from FRANK FIORINI was approximately five or six months ago when FRANK FIORINI came through Norfolk, Virginia, on his way to Washington, D. C., to attend hearings regarding FIORINI'S citizenship. During this visit by FRANK FIORINI I was in contact with FIORINI during this two-day visit. FIORINI came to my residence and I visited FRANK FIORINI at the Delmar Motel where he was staying during this visit. When I went to the Delmar Motel, JACK KESSNER, a reporter for the Norfolk newspapers, was present as well as my son HOWARD CHARLES KLEIN was there. FRANK FIORINI talked to KESSNER and myself about his experiences during the Cuban Revolution when FIORINI aided FIDEL CASTRO. I was never approached by FRANK FIORINI or anyone to join a force to fight CASTRO in Cuba or to engage in any hostilities in any foreign country. I have never recruited men for FIORINI or anyone. I have never approached anyone in an effort to recruit followers for DIAZ LANZ, FRANK FIORINI, or anyone. I know of no one attempting to recruit followers for FRANK FIORINI or any revolutionary group. I know nothing concerning FIORINI'S efforts or proposed efforts for a counter revolutionary movement against CASTRO."

On September 14, 1960, during an investigation on another matter, Special Agents LEMUEL W. KERR and MARVIN E. STEFFEN interviewed JAMES WILLIAM ORE, JR., at 125 Birmingham Avenue, Apartment 4, Norfolk, Virginia. At that time ORE stated substantially that he knew FRANK FIORINI for approximately three years. ORE said that FIORINI at that time was a bartender in Norfolk, Virginia. ORE said that FRANK FIORINI also known to him as FRANK STURGIS had never attempted to recruit him or anyone to his knowledge for the purpose of joining any group whose purpose was to participate in hostilities either in the United States or in a foreign country. ORE also stated that neither FIORINI nor anyone else had ever attempted to collect money or arms for a group whose purpose was to engage in hostilities either in this country or a foreign country.

On January 12, 1962, during the investigation of another matter, Special Agent LEMUEL W. KERR, Norfolk Division, interviewed G. H. RUCKER, JR., United States Coast Guard, 5th Coast Guard District Intelligence Office, Portsmouth, Virginia. RUCKER advised substantially that the Hampton Roads Salvage Company of Florida, 814 Seybold Building, Miami, Florida, purchased an 83-foot United States Coast Guard vessel and departed Portsmouth, Virginia, on December 29, 1961, with a crew of five Cuban Nationals. RUCKER stated that the vessel departed Norfolk, Virginia, and was traveling via the inland waterway to Miami, Florida. RUCKER said that the ship arrived at Morehead City, North Carolina, on January 5, 1962, and underwent necessary repairs there. At Morehead City, the original crew composed of JOSE BARIAS, ENIQUN DIAZ, JULIO TUR, PATRICIO ARTIGAES, and LOUIS MELIS deserted the ship. The master of the ship was reported to be SERGEL BRUELL, an American citizen. On January 18, 1962, Special Agent KERR interviewed V. F. PATTERSON, Office of Naval Intelligence, 5th Naval District, Norfolk, Virginia, who advised that during December 1961 the Hampton Roads Salvage Company of Florida had purchased ex-Coast Guard Cutter Number 83427. PATTERSON also related that Captain JORGE NAVAVO GUSTIN former Captain of the Cuban vessel "BAHIA DE NIPE" who defected at Norfolk, Virginia, indicated to a reliable source that the ex-Coast Guard Cutter Number 83427 would be used for raiding Cuban Merchant Vessels at sea and for raiding coastal targets. During an interview by Bureau Agents at Miami, Florida, on January 30, 1962, PEDRO LUIS DIAZ LANZ a former chief of the Cuban Revolutionary Air Force who defected in 1959 after denouncing the CASTRO Regime and a member of Movimiento Recuperacion Revolucionario De Cuba, an anti-CASTRO group, advised that FRANK STURGIS was known to him as FRANK FIORINI was an officer in the Hampton Roads Salvage Company, Incorporated, registered at Tallahassee, Florida.

On July 12, 1963, H. MUNDIE of the Virginia State Police advised Special Agent MARVIN E. STEFFEN of the Norfolk Division that FRANK ANGELO FIORINI had been cleared as a suspect in the murder of MEYER HARRY JACOBSON which had taken place at the Hunt Club, Nansmond County, Virginia, on February 8-9, 1963. MUNDIE advised

that the subject had been named as a suspect in the matter by a confidential source whose reliability could not be substantiated at that time.

On March 18, 1964, while conducting investigation on another matter, MARY STURGIS, mother of the subject, was interviewed at her residence, 932 Duke Street, Apartment 4, Norfolk, Virginia, by Special Agent LEMUEL W. KERR. STURGIS stated substantially that she was the mother of FRANK FIORINI and that he was presently residing at 2515 North West 122 Street, Miami, Florida. STURGIS said that her son had not been in Norfolk for the past few years.

On March 19, 1964, while investigating another matter, Special Agent LEMUEL W. KERR interviewed GEORGE JERRY SENTER at 529 Maryland Avenue, Norfolk, Virginia. SENTER stated substantially that he had known FRANK FIORINI for fifteen to twenty years and further advised that FIORINI used to work for SENTER at the Commercial Grill. SENTER said that FIORINI had worked for him at the time he left Norfolk, Virginia, to go to Cuba. SENTER advised that it had been over four years since he had last seen FIORINI and he had not heard from him during that time. SENTER said he knew nothing concerning FIORINI'S activities during this time.

ELLIS MARSHALL, Post Office Box 158, County Route 649, Browntown Road, advised that he is a close friend to JACK STEWART and is worried about STEWART's welfare, stating he and STEWART had planned to visit together at MARSHALL's residence in Front Royal, Virginia on the weekend of July 1, 1972. Mr. MARSHALL stated that he is a boyhood friend of forty years with JACK STEWART, and described STEWART as being reliable, dependable, considerate and honest, and stated he was concerned for STEWART's welfare and fears that possibly foul play has befallen STEWART or STEWART has disappeared under duress since he failed to visit or call on July 1, 1972. MARSHALL stated that he was basing his opinion on the past reliability of STEWART.

MARSHALL stated that in the past, he has been in almost daily contact with STEWART via ham radio with STEWART being in the St. Petersburg, Florida area and MARSHALL in Front Royal, Virginia. He stated his last contact with STEWART was on April 24, 1972.

Mr. MARSHALL advised that STEWART planned to stay at the residence of EARL and "BEVA" WILLIAMSON, Falls Church, Virginia, and they would proceed to Front Royal, Virginia around July 1, 1972. MARSHALL believes that STEWART was at the WILLIAMS' residence on June 25, 1972 because Mrs. BEVA WILLIAMSON telephonically contacted MARSHALL stating STEWART had left on the evening of June 24, 1972 without notice, which is very much out of character for STEWART, according to MARSHALL.

Mrs. ROBERTS stated that she has no information pertaining to a telephone call from the White House on the phone of EVERETT HOWARD HUNT and advised that she has never received a call from the White House and is not acquainted with HUNT.

Mrs. ROBERTS stated she is not familiar with the names of JAMES WALTER McCORD, JR., also known as EDWARD MARTIN; BERNARD L. BAKER; FRANK CARTER; VIRGIL R. GONZALES, also known as RAOUL GODOY, EUGENIO ROLANDO MARTINEZ Y GRAGA, also known as GENE VALDES; or FRANK ANTHONY FIORINI, also known as FRANK A. STURGIS.

By communication dated July 11, 1972, Norfolk Division requested a check with Bureau of Vital Statistics, Richmond, Virginia, to ascertain if a marriage certificate was on record for FRANK ANGELO FIORINI and NORA ODELL THOMPSON.

On July 12, 1972, Mrs. EVELYN MABIE, Clerk, Bureau of Vital Statistics, Richmond, Virginia, advised her Agency could not be checked for a marriage certificate for FRANK ANGELO FIORINI and NORA ODELL THOMPSON without a date of marriage.

Set forth below is a summary of efforts as of 8/1/72, to trace funds possibly used in financing captioned matter.

TRACING OF CASH RECOVERED IN CONNECTION WITH ARRESTS: At the time of subjects' arrests on 6/17/72, and subsequent search of their hotel rooms, 44 new \$100 bills were found, 10 of which bore the prefix "C" and 34 the prefix "F". The 10 prefix "C" bills were disbursed by the Philadelphia Federal Reserve Bank to the Girard Bank and Trust Company, Philadelphia, on 4/3/72. It was not possible to trace these prefix bills beyond this point because of the bank's practice of not recording the serial numbers of \$100 bills received or disbursed.

The prefix "F" bills were determined to have been sent by the Miami Federal Reserve Branch to the Republic National Bank, Miami, on 4/18/72. Subject Bernard L. Barker maintains an account at this bank and while he is known to have received \$10,000 in \$100 bills on 5/8/72, from this bank, it could not be specifically established that the pertinent prefix "F" bills were part of the money Barker received on 5/8/72.

KENNETH DAHLBERG - \$25,000 CASHIER'S CHECK: Dahlberg, prominent industrialist from Minneapolis and Regional Chairman of the Finance Committee to Reelect the President, has a winter home in Boca Raton, Florida. On 4/10/72, he purchased for cash a \$25,000 cashier's check at First Bank and Trust Company of Boca Raton, Florida. This check was deposited on 4/21/72, to the trust account of Barker Associates, Inc., at the Republic National Bank, Miami, Florida. Barker received cash for this check on that date. Dahlberg advised he had no idea how Barker came into possession of the check as Dahlberg gave the check on 4/11/72, to Maurice Stans, Chairman of the Finance Committee to Reelect the President, at a meeting in Washington, D. C. Stans confirmed that he received this check from Dahlberg and immediately turned it over to Hugh



Walter Sloan, Jr., then treasurer of the Finance Committee to Reelect the President. Sloan advised that since the check was dated after 4/7/72, effective date of the Federal Disclosure Act, he gave the check to George Gordon Liddy, counsel to the Finance Committee to Reelect the President, to determine the proper way to handle the receipt of the check. Sloan said Liddy subsequently returned \$25,000 in cash to Sloan. Apparently no accounting entry was made concerning this transaction and the cash lost its identity being co-mingled with other cash on hand at the Finance Committee.

\$89,000 BANCO INTERNACIONAL CHECKS: The review of the Barker Associates, Inc., bank account at the Republic National Bank, Miami, showed that in addition to the \$25,000 check of Kenneth Dahlberg,  **B1**

 Barker sought immediate cash for these 4 drafts but was told by the bank that since they were third party checks, Barker would have to wait for them to clear before he could receive the money. On 5/8/72, he was given \$89,000 in cash by the Republic National Bank for these 4 bank drafts. (c)

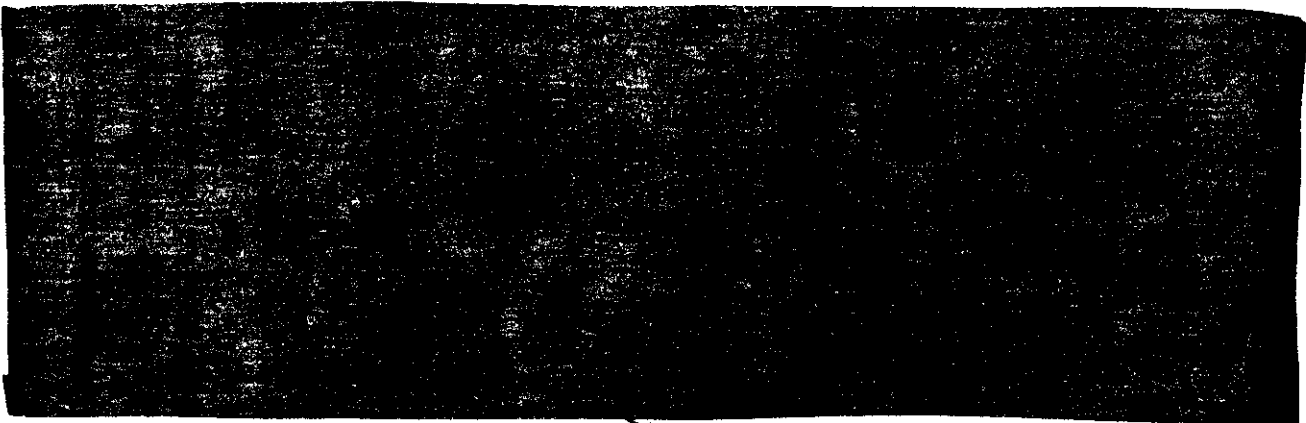

Hugh Walter Sloan, Jr., advised that he received about \$750,000 in the form of checks, about 4/7/72, from Roy Winchester, Co-chairman of the Southwestern Region of the Finance Committee to Reelect the President. Included in these checks were the 4 Mexican bank drafts. Sloan turned these bank drafts over to Liddy who subsequently gave Sloan about \$86,000 in cash. Liddy kept the remainder, which Sloan thought was about \$2,500 for himself, for "services rendered." This cash returned by Liddy was placed with other money in the cash account of the Finance Committee to Reelect the President and apparently no specific accounting entry relating to these 4 checks exists. Therefore,

no further tracing can be made of the 4 bank drafts. It is noted that on 7/14/72, Bernard L. Barker in testimony at a bond reduction hearing in U. S. District Court, Washington, D. C., said he received the 4 bank drafts totaling \$89,000 from 2 men and that he turned the cash over to them. He took the Fifth Amendment when asked to identify these individuals.

FINANCING INTELLIGENCE GATHERING OPERATION: Jeb Stuart Magruder, Deputy Campaign Director, Committee to Reelect the President, on 7/27/72, advised that in late January or early February, 1972, it was determined that an intelligence gathering service should be formed. He assigned Liddy, then counsel for the Committee to Reelect the President, the responsibility for gathering intelligence. Specifically, Liddy was to endeavor to obtain information concerning possible harassment or disruption at various rallies and public appearances throughout the nation and to assure that surrogate candidates and celebrities in attendance were not harassed. Liddy was also to determine information concerning possible disruption at the Republican National Convention. Magruder authorized Hugh Walter Sloan, Jr. to permit Liddy to spend up to \$250,000 to gather intelligence regarding the above.

On 7/26/72, Sloan advised he gave Liddy about \$199,000 over an approximate 5-month period with the largest sum paid at one time being \$81,000 in May, 1972. Sloan said he never asked Liddy what the money was used for.

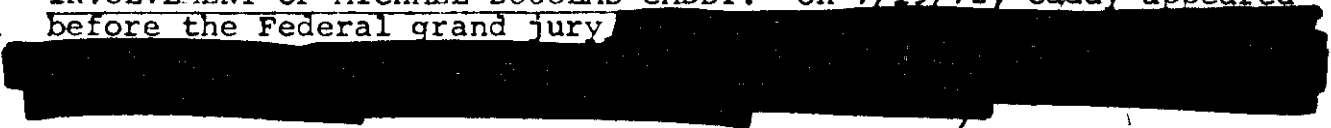

Set forth below is a summary of pertinent developments in captioned case bringing up to date investigation since submission of summary memorandum dated 7/21/72, a copy of which is attached for ready reference.

INVOLVEMENT OF EVERETTE HOWARD HUNT, JR.: Hunt has declined to discuss this case with Bureau Agents and on 7/19/72, took the Fifth Amendment in his appearance before the Federal grand jury, Washington, D. C. Alfred Carleton Baldwin, who monitored the electronic surveillance of the Democratic Party National Headquarters from the Howard Johnson Motel, advised Hunt called a lawyer from Baldwin's room shortly after the subjects were arrested. Michael Douglas Caddy was the attorney who gratuitously showed up at the police station to represent the 5 subjects after their arrests. He claimed he had been alerted by Barker's wife. Telephone toll records showed a call from Hunt's business phone at the Robert R. Mullen Company to Barker's residence on 6/17/72, as well as a call from Barker's residence to Caddy on the same date. Investigation at the Mullen Company revealed that at 3:20 a.m., 6/17/72, an individual using the nearly illegible signature "Wait" entered the building. He left at 3:30 a.m. Robert Wait advised he was out of town at this time and investigation verified his alibi. The FBI Laboratory could not determine whether Hunt was the individual who signed the register at the building.

INVOLVEMENT OF MICHAEL DOUGLAS CADDY: On 7/19/72, Caddy appeared before the Federal grand jury



INVOLVEMENT OF GEORGE GORDON LIDDY: On 7/26/72, Liddy appeared before the Federal grand jury and refused to answer questions about his relationship with Caddy and the Committee to Reelect

the President, invoking an alleged attorney-client privilege. This privilege was determined by the judge to be non-existent and Liddy was ordered to testify whereupon he invoked the Fifth Amendment. Investigation has developed that Liddy was given the responsibility in late January or early February, 1972, of developing an intelligence gathering service to endeavor to obtain information concerning possible harassment or disruption at various political rallies and possible disruption at the Republican National Convention. Liddy was authorized to spend up to \$250,000 in that endeavor by Jeb Stuart Magruder, Deputy Campaign Director of the Committee to Reelect the President, and Hugh Walter Sloan, Jr., former treasurer of the Committee advised on 7/26/72 that he gave Liddy about \$199,000 in cash over about a 5-month period. The records to account for these expenditures apparently have been destroyed according to Mrs. Judy Hoback, assistant to Sloan.

INVOLVEMENT OF ALFRED CARLETON BALDWIN, III: On 7/28/72, Baldwin testified before Federal grand jury concerning the lengthy statement he previously made to Bureau Agents. He has advised that he monitored the electronic surveillance of the Democratic Party National Headquarters and that he saw Liddy give James Walter McCord, Jr. \$16,000 to \$18,000 in cash on one occasion in the Howard Johnson Motel. He also saw Hunt and Liddy outside the Watergate Apartments after the burglary was discovered and Hunt instructed him shortly thereafter to remove the electronic gear from the motel and take same to McCord's home, which he did.

Investigation in the neighborhood of McCord's home was negative concerning efforts to confirm Baldwin's statement that he drove McCord's truck to the McCord residence. McCord's daughter did confirm that Baldwin dropped the truck at the McCord home in the early morning of 6/17/72.

TRACING OF FUNDS: Submitted with this memorandum is a separate memorandum, C. Bolz to Mr. Bates, 8/2/72, summarizing efforts to trace funds possibly used in financing captioned matter. Highlights are that it was not possible to trace the \$100 bills obtained from the subjects and their rooms after their arrests to a specific bank account. Part of the \$100 bills lost their identity after being traced to the Girard Bank and Trust Company, Philadelphia. The remainder were traced to the Republic National Bank, where Barker maintained an account, but the bank does not

make a record of the serial number of \$100 bills and the specific bills recovered from the subjects could not be pinpointed as to their source. The Republic National Bank records did show that Barker received \$10,000 in cash in \$100 bills on 5/8/72, from his bank. The \$25,000 cashier's check payable to Kenneth Dahlberg was deposited to Barker's account and on 4/21/72, he received cash for the check. Hugh Walter Sloan, Jr. advised that he had given that check to Liddy who cashed same and returned the \$25,000 to Sloan at the Committee to Reelect the President. The money lost its identity as the cash was co-mingled with other cash at the Committee. [REDACTED] **B1**

[REDACTED] similarly lost its identity as Sloan said he gave these drafts to Liddy who had them cashed. Liddy returned about \$86,000 in cash to Sloan at the Committee, keeping the remainder for "services." These funds lost their identity as the cash was co-mingled with other cash at the Committee. (u)

TRAVEL MIAMI-WASHINGTON, D. C., MAY 22-30, 1972: Investigation previously developed that 6 individuals traveled from Miami to Washington, D. C., on 5/22/72. They stayed at the Hamilton Hotel from 5/22-26/72, and at the Watergate Hotel from 5/26-30/72. These people have been identified as subjects Barker, Fiorini, Gonzales and Martinez, and Felipe De Diego and Reinaldo Pico. The 4 subjects declined to be interviewed and De Diego in appearing before the Federal grand jury, 8/1/72, took the Fifth Amendment. He is presently considering testifying and is consulting with his attorney with a possible return before the grand jury on 8/8/72. Pico has been determined to be on a business trip to Venezuela, South America, and is expected to return to Miami about 8/1/72. Efforts are being made to interview him when he does return.

INVESTIGATION AT THE COMMITTEE TO REELECT THE PRESIDENT: Maurice Stans, Chairman, Finance Committee to Reelect the President, advised he received the \$25,000 cashier's check from Kenneth Dahlberg and immediately turned same over to Hugh Walter Sloan, Jr., then treasurer of the Finance Committee. Stans indicated the funds for the Mexican bank drafts were previously received by Manuel Ogarrio from a third party but would not discuss the origin of these checks without first consulting counsel. Mr. Stans is scheduled to testify before the Federal grand jury on 8/2/72.

Hugh Walter Sloan, Jr., former treasurer of the Committee to Reelect the President, on 7/31/72, testified before the Federal grand jury [REDACTED]

it is expected that Magruder will be called before the Federal grand jury in the very near future.

INVESTIGATION IN TEXAS CONCERNING THE SOURCE OF THE FUNDS UTILIZED TO PURCHASE THE MEXICAN BANK DRAFTS: Hugh Walter Sloan, Jr. on 7/26/72, advised about 4/7/72, he received approximately \$750,000 in checks from Roy Winchester of the Texas Finance Committee. Investigation revealed that Robert H. Allen, Houston, Texas, is chairman of that committee. Allen advised that he is President, Gulf Resources and Chemical Corporation, Houston, and refused to furnish any specific information concerning the Mexican bank drafts. He did advise that Manual Ogarrio had handled business and labor affairs in Mexico for approximately 15 years for Gulf Resources and Chemical Corporation. Winchester, Vice-president in Charge of Public Affairs, Pennzoil, Houston, advised he is presently Co-chairman of the Southwestern Region of the Finance Committee to Reelect the President and on the night of 4/5/72 he delivered on behalf of the Finance Committee approximately \$750,000 in funds, checks and securities to Sloan in Washington, D. C. He said he did not know Manual Ogarrio and declined to discuss the 4 Mexican bank drafts in view of the fact that anonymity had been previously promised to all donors to the Committee.

INVESTIGATION REMAINING: Records of Liddy's bank account are being subpoenaed and will be reviewed as soon as they are received. Records of the Republican National Committee concerning the hiring of McCord and his duties have been subpoenaed and will be reviewed upon receipt. Interview of Reinaldo Pico by Miami will be conducted as soon as he returns to the United States. Houston is endeavoring to develop from bank records in Houston whether Gulf Resources and

Chemical Corporation can be shown to be the original source of the \$100,000 check used by Ogarrio to purchase the bank drafts. Decision of how far to pursue that phase will be reached by Assistant U. S. Attorney Earl Silbert in the event that Maurice Stans does not identify the source of the check during his Federal grand jury testimony. Leads may develop from testimony of the few remaining individuals expected to go before the grand jury. These include Stans, Magruder and De Diego.

Due to the fact that the 5 arrested subjects refused to be interviewed and Hunt and Liddy refused to discuss the matter either with our Agents or with the Federal grand jury, at this point it does not appear possible to show who gave the orders for the wiretapping and the precise motive therefor. It is observed that based upon investigation conducted to date and the Federal grand jury hearings conducted, the 5 arrested subjects, Hunt and Liddy appear likely to be indicted.

There follows a summary of pertinent investi-
gation conducted of the captioned matter through July 20,
1972:

Burglary and Arrest: At approximately 2:30 a.m., June 17,
1972, officers of the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD)
apprehended five individuals in an executive conference room
of the Democratic Party National Headquarters located on the
6th floor of the Watergate Apartments, 2600 Virginia Avenue,
N. W., Washington, D. C. At the time of arrest the subjects had
in their possession burglary tools, electronic and photographic
equipment and were wearing surgical-type plastic gloves.

Those arrested were identified as James Walter
McCord, Jr., using the alias Edward Warren; Bernard L. Barker,
using the alias Frank Carter; Eugenio Rolando Martinez y
Creaga, using the alias Gene Valdes; Frank Anthony Sturgis,
also known as Frank Anthony Fiorini, using the aliases
Joseph Di Alberto and Edward Hamilton; and Virgirlo Gonzales,
using the alias Raoul Godoy.

All subjects refused to be interviewed, refused to
state for whom they were working, from where they came or their
purpose for being in the building. They were all charged
with Burglary, Section 1801, Title 22, District of Columbia
Code, and were held on \$50,000 bond except for McCord, a
Rockville, Maryland, resident, whose bond was set at \$30,000.
All but Sturgis have since been released from District of
Columbia Jail on bond.

McCord, who appears to have been the leader of this group, retired from the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) on August 31, 1970, and at the time of his arrest he was Chief of Security for the Committee to Reelect the President.

Involvement of Everette Howard Hunt, Jr.: After the arrests of the subjects in the Democratic Party National Headquarters, pursuant to an authorized search warrant, a search was made of the rooms rented by the subjects, using aliases, at the Watergate Hotel. Among the items located was an envelope containing a check of E. Howard Hunt in the amount of \$6.39 in payment for a bill from Lakewood Country Club, Rockville, Maryland, to Hunt in care of a publications firm in New York City. Hunt, when contacted, admitted the check was his but refused to discuss the matter before consulting his attorney. Also located in the subjects' rooms were personal telephone directories which contained names, telephone numbers and addresses of numerous persons in Miami, New York and Washington, D. C. One of the names contained in the telephone book of subject Martinez is "Hunt (W. House)," together with the telephone number of Hunt's office at the White House.

b1 [REDACTED] On May 1, 1970, he became employed by Robert R. Mullen Company, 1700 Pennsylvania Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C., a public relations and fund raising organization. Beginning July 6, 1971, Hunt was employed on a consultant basis by the White House staff, working with Mr. David R. Young and Mr. Charles W. Colson. He is reported to have been used as a consultant on declassification of the Pentagon Papers. His services were last utilized in this capacity on March 29, 1972. Information was developed that on the recommendation of a member of Mr. Colson's staff, Hunt was terminated as a consultant effective April 1, 1972, and was to be hired immediately thereafter by "1701" (1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N. W., is the address of the Committee to Reelect the President).

Investigation developed that between January 1, 1972, and June 20, 1972, Hunt was in frequent and regular contact (4)

with the office and residence of Bernard L. Barker, Miami, Florida. Investigation further developed that Hunt, frequently utilizing the alias Ed J. Hamilton, together with George Gordon Liddy, who frequently used the alias George Leonard or G. Leonard, traveled extensively around the United States contacting former CIA employees for the purpose of setting up a security organization for the Republican Party dealing with "political espionage."

Involvement of Michael Douglas Caddy: Michael Douglas Caddy, also known as Douglas Caddy, is an Attorney at Law having offices at 1250 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., Washington, D. C., and is associated with the law firm Gall, Lane, Powell, and Kilcullen. Caddy gratuitously appeared at the Metropolitan Police Department where subjects were taken after being arrested and claimed to represent them. Prior to Caddy's arrival, none of the subjects made any phone calls which might have precipitated his appearance. Investigation disclosed telephone calls were made during the early morning hours of June 17, 1972, from the telephone of Everette Howard Hunt at the Robert R. Mullen and Company to the Barker residence in Miami, Florida, and from Barker's residence to the residence of Caddy.

Upon Caddy's appearance before the Federal grand jury at Washington, D. C., he was held in contempt of court for failing to answer questions on the basis he had an attorney - client relationship with Hunt. Contempt action was upheld by the U. S. Court of Appeals on July 19, 1972.

Involvement of George Gordon Liddy: As is set forth elsewhere in this memorandum, Everette Howard Hunt traveled extensively endeavoring to recruit former CIA employees for security work for the Republican Party in late 1971 and early 1972. Investigation has developed that Liddy accompanied Hunt on a number of these trips. Liddy, a former FBI Agent, was employed from April, 1969, to July, 1971, by the U. S. Treasury Department in the office of Law Enforcement. When he resigned from the Treasury Department, Liddy accepted a position on the White House staff and in December, 1971, resigned therefrom to work for the Committee for the Reelection of the President.

The telephone notebook of Martinez which was recovered when the rooms of the subjects were searched at the Watergate Hotel contained a notation "George" with the telephone number of 202-333-6575. The telephone notebook of Bernard L. Barker, located in the above mentioned search, contained a notation "George" with the telephone number WDC 333-0362. Investigation developed that both of these numbers were at the office of the Committee for the Reelection of the President, 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C.

It is noted that Mr. Maurice Stans, Chairman of the Finance Committee for the Committee to Reelect the President, advised that the \$25,000 cashier's check payable to Kenneth H. Dahlberg, dated April 10, 1972, was turned over to Liddy, counsel for the Finance Committee, for a legal opinion as to how it would be best to handle the receipt and recording of this check as the funds allegedly had been contributed prior to April 7, 1972, although the check was dated April 10, 1972, after the effective date of new disclosure and reporting law. The check was cashed by subject Bernard L. Barker at his bank in Miami, Florida, but Mr. Stans had no idea how Barker obtained the check. (See write-up elsewhere in this memorandum concerning the tracing of funds and the write-up concerning the Howard Johnson Motel wherein it is shown that Liddy was observed giving a large sum of money in cash to subject McCord.) Liddy is reported to have been discharged by the Committee to Reelect the President because Liddy declined to be interviewed by FBI Agents concerning this case.

Howard Johnson Motel Lookout: Investigation developed that James Walter McCord, Jr., rented Room 419 at the Howard Johnson Motel, 2601 Virginia Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C., from May 5, 1972, to May 28, 1972, and Room 723 from May 29, 1972, until June 17, 1972. Room 723 was found vacant by motel employees the evening of June 17, 1972. This motel is located directly across the street from the Watergate Apartments and Room 723 faces the suite occupied by the Democratic Party National Headquarters at the Watergate Apartments.

Alfred Carleton Baldwin, III, a former FBI Agent, has been identified as the individual who occupied Rooms 419 and 723 from about May 11, 1972, to June 17, 1972. Baldwin

advised that during a period of this time he monitored, through the use of electronic equipment set up by McCord, telephone conversations of Spencer Oliver, a Democratic Party official. McCord told Baldwin that four extensions of Oliver's telephone located at the Democratic Party National Headquarters, were being monitored.

Baldwin stated that while he was occupying Room 723 on one occasion, the specific date which he cannot determine, George Gordon Liddy and Everette Howard Hunt came to the room and had a conversation with McCord. On this occasion Liddy took an envelope from his suit jacket and counted out about \$16,000 to \$18,000 in \$100 bills, which he gave to McCord. McCord pocketed the money and all three individuals left the room.

On the evening of June 16, 1972, McCord came to Room 723 and requested Baldwin to purchase six batteries and some "speaker wire." Baldwin obtained the batteries but did not buy the wire and McCord subsequently departed to locate some wire. He returned about 11:00 p.m. to 11:30 p.m., carrying the wire and various other electronic components appearing to have come from Lafayette Radio.

About 12:00 a.m. to 12:30 a.m., June 17, 1972, McCord received a telephone call and told Baldwin that "we're going across the street," pointing to the Democratic Headquarters. McCord told Baldwin to watch and if anything unusual occurred to contact McCord by walkie-talkie.

About 2:15 a.m., June 17, 1972, Baldwin noticed lights going on in the Watergate Apartments and subsequently police beginning to arrive. He attempted to utilize the walkie-talkie to alert McCord and received a response in a whisper, "We hear you, they got us." About this time Baldwin noticed two men leaving the alley on the east side of the Watergate and identified them as Hunt and Liddy. Hunt came to Room 723 and used the phone to contact an attorney. Hunt told Baldwin to telephone Mrs. McCord and advise her that her husband had been arrested. He also told Baldwin to pack up the electronic gear and deliver it to Mrs. McCord in McCord's panel truck which was parked in the basement of the Howard Johnson Motel. He further told Baldwin to pack up his own belongings and go home. Baldwin

delivered the electronic equipment together with McCord's wallet which had been left in the room to Mrs. McCord at about 4:00 a.m., June 17, 1972. She drove him back to his own car and he thereupon drove to his home in Connecticut.

Travel Miami - Washington, D. C.:

Travel June 16, 1972

Investigation at Tamiami Tours, Miami, Florida, identified subjects Bernard L. Barker and Eugenio R. Martinez as individuals who on June 12, 1972, purchased four round trip tickets from Miami to Washington, D. C., on Eastern Airlines flight 190 for June 16, 1972. These tickets, which were found on the subjects at the time of their arrest, were purchased in the names of G. Valdes (alias of subject Eugenio Martinez), F. Carter (alias of subject Bernard L. Barker), J. Di Alberto (alias of subject Frank Fiorini) and R. Godoy (alias of subject Virgilio Gonzales).

At time of their arrest June 17, 1972, the subjects, except for McCord were determined to be registered at the Watergate Hotel, Washington, D. C., under the aliases shown on the foregoing airline tickets.

Travel May 22-30, 1972

Subject Eugene Martinez has been identified as the individual who on May 17, 1972, bought six one-way tickets at Tamiami Tours for travel from Miami to Washington, D. C., on National Airlines flight 100 departing May 22, 1972. These tickets were purchased by Martinez in the names of Frank Carter (alias of Barker), J. Granada (believed to be Reinaldo Pico, presently in South America on business), Joseph Di Alberti (alias of Fiorini), Raoul Godoy (alias of Gonzales), Jose Piedra (alias of Felipe De Diego) and G. Valdes (alias of Martinez).

Investigation has determined that the foregoing individuals under the aliases shown were registered at the Hamilton Hotel, Washington, D. C., from May 22, 1972, to May 26, 1972, at which time they moved to the Watergate Hotel, Washington, D. C., where they stayed until May 30, 1972.

Investigation further discloses these individuals were joined at the Watergate Hotel by two additional persons using the names of George Leonard (believed to be George Gordon Liddy) from Kansas City, Kansas, and Edward Warren (believed to be Everett Howard Hunt) from New York City. Warren paid the Watergate Hotel bill for these individuals, totaling a little over \$1,000 in cash.

Felipe De Diego, an employee of Barker's real estate firm, has been interviewed and admits being with the subjects during the period May 22-30, 1972, in Washington, D. C. According to De Diego, he was requested by Barker to make this trip but he does not know the purpose of the trip and during his stay in Washington, D. C., the group appeared to be waiting to hear from some unidentified individual.

It is noted that on May 28, 1972, there was a reported break-in of the Democratic Party National Headquarters, Watergate Apartments, Washington, D. C.

In addition to the foregoing the Security Guard at the Watergate Apartments reported that sometime over the Memorial Day week end (he cannot pin this down any closer) papers were found stuffed in the doorway of the 6th floor stairwell in an apparent attempt to keep the door from working. Democratic Party National Headquarters is located on the 6th floor of the Watergate Apartments.

Tracing of Funds: There follows a summary of investigation to trace funds that may have been used to finance the operation involving the burglary of the Democratic National Headquarters on June 17, 1972.

Bank Account of Bernard L. Barker: Barker as Barker Associates, a real estate firm, maintains an account at the Republic National Bank of Miami. A review of the records of this account shows that on April 21, 1972, Barker presented a cashier's check dated April 10, 1972, payable to Kenneth Dahlberg, drawn on the First Bank and Trust Company of Boca Raton, Florida, and endorsed by Dahlberg. Upon checking with the latter bank and determining that the cashier's check was "as good as gold" Barker was given \$25,000 in cash by the Republic National Bank.

Barker on April 21, 1972, also presented to the

Republic National Bank four checks dated April 4, 1972, totaling \$89,000, drawn on the Banco Internacional, Mexico City, payable to Manuel Ogarrio and endorsed by Ogarrio. Since these checks were payable to a third party, Barker was told he would have to deposit these checks and wait for them to clear before he could receive any money for them. On May 8, 1972, Barker was given \$89,000 in cash by the Republic National Bank for the foregoing checks.

Bernard L. Barker at the time of his release on \$40,000 bond on July 14, 1972, said he received the four checks totaling \$89,000 from two men and turned the money over to them. He took the 5th Amendment when asked to identify these individuals.

Kenneth Dahlberg - \$25,000 Cashier's Check: Kenneth Dahlberg is a prominent industrialist and Regional Chairman of the Finance Committee to Reelect the President, who lives in Minneapolis and winters in Boca Raton, Florida. After several refusals to be interviewed, Dahlberg on July 6, 1972, consented to be interviewed regarding the foregoing \$25,000 cashier's check cashed by subject Barker. Dahlberg stated this check represented cash contributions he had obtained while in Boca Raton and he furnished this check to Maurice H. Stans, Chairman, Finance Committee to Reelect the President on April 11, 1972, in Washington, D. C. According to Dahlberg he has no knowledge of what happened to this check after he surrendered it to Stans. Dahlberg stated he was not acquainted with subject Barker or any of the other subjects involved in this matter. It is to be noted that during the period June 23, 1972, to June 26, 1972, when we were endeavoring to interview Dahlberg concerning this check, he made three telephone calls to Washington, D. C., to the Committee to Reelect the President.

Bank Accounts of James Walter McCord: McCord maintained a personal checking account and a business account in the name of McCord Associates at the Maryland National Bank, College Park, Maryland. The records of these accounts show he made a \$10,000 cash deposit to his personal account on April 12, 1972; a \$10,000 cash deposit to his business account on May 31, 1972; and a \$10,000 cash deposit to his business account on June 12, 1972.

In addition, McCord on behalf of the Committee to Reelect the President on February 22, 1972, opened an account in the name of Dedicated Friends of a Better America, with McCord as Chairman, at the National Savings and Trust Company, Washington, D. C. This account was closed April 17, 1972, and during the period it was opened over \$90,000 passed through this account.

Interview With Maurice Stans: Maurice Stans, Chairman, Finance Committee to Reelect the President, was interviewed July 14, 1972, at which time he advised that a \$25,000 cashier's check was given to him by Kenneth Dahlberg in Washington, D. C., on April 11, 1972. Stans in turn gave this check to Hugh Walter Sloan, Jr., who at the time was responsible for the supervision of funds received by the Finance Committee. According to Stans, Sloan then gave this check to George Gordon Liddy who was acting as legal counsel to the Finance Committee for a determination as to how this check should be handled since it was dated April 10, 1972, but the funds which it represented had been contributed prior to April 7, 1972, the effective date of the new Federal Disclosure Act. Sloan subsequently advised Stans the money from the check had been received by the Committee. Stans could furnish no explanation as to how Barker could be in possession of Dahlberg's \$25,000 cashier's check.

Stans advised that on April 6, 1972, he learned from Sloan that the Committee to Reelect the President had received \$100,000 in the form of bank drafts on Mexican banks. Stans, when informed the Mexican drafts totaled \$89,000 replied that Sloan had told him \$100,000 in Mexican bank drafts had been received.

and this is all he knew about the matter. Stans could offer no explanation as to how these bank drafts came into Barker's possession nor was he aware of the identity of the American firm which allegedly made this contribution.

When Stans was requested to make Sloan available for immediate interview, he advised that Sloan had resigned two weeks ago. Sloan was subsequently contacted on July 17, 1972, and he declined to be interviewed until he had a chance to discuss this matter with his attorney.

Interviews at White House: Everette Howard Hunt and George Gordon Liddy were known to have been employed at the White House as consultants and White House telephone numbers used by these individuals were found in subjects' possession. Accordingly, various White House staff members acquainted with Hunt and Liddy during their White House assignment were interviewed.

At the request of Mr. John W. Dean, Legal Counsel to the President, he, Dean, sat in on all interviews conducted with White House personnel. Those interviewed included Charles W. Colson, David R. Young, Alfred Wong, Bruce Kehrli, Fred Fielding and Kathleen Chnow. All stated they were unable to furnish any information concerning Hunt's or Liddy's involvement in these matters involving the burglary of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters.

According to Mr. David R. Young, both Hunt and Liddy worked for him on a project to classify and declassify Government documents.

It was determined from Mr. John Dean that the personal effects of Everette Howard Hunt had been removed on June 20, 1972, from Hunt's office in the Executive Office Building and brought to his, Dean's, office. This material which was turned over to the FBI on June 27, 1972, included ancillary equipment for the transceivers and other equipment identical to items known to have been purchased by James Walter McCord, Jr.

Interviews at Committee to Reelect the President: Numerous interviews were conducted with personnel employed at the Committee to Reelect the President and in each interview at the Committee's

insistence an attorney of the Committee was present. Several persons subsequent to interviews conducted at the Committee contacted the FBI Washington Field Office and requested to be further interviewed away from Committee headquarters and without the knowledge of Committee officials. These persons advised that the presence of the attorney during the interview prevented them from being completely candid. These sources further advised that all Committee people subpoenaed before the Federal Grand Jury were subsequently debriefed by Committee attorneys as to what occurred at the Federal Grand Jury hearing.

One of the foregoing persons confidentially advised that Hugh Walter Sloan, Jr., who supervises Committee finances reportedly maintains a brief case full of money in his office safe. During the period February - April, 1972, according to this source Sloan allegedly disbursed large sums to various Committee officials for unknown reasons such as \$50,000 to Jeb Magruder, \$100,000 to Herbert L. Porter and \$89,000 to George Gordon Liddy.

Another cooperative source at the Committee advised confidentially that Committee officials during interviews were sending FBI Agents on fishing expeditions to keep them from getting to the truth. This source advised that Mrs. McCord following her husband's arrest on June 17, 1972, told Committee official Robert Odle words to the effect "Well, it looks like your project failed." This source identified Odle as one of the individuals who was less than candid in his interview with FBI Agents.

Photographs of Democratic Party Correspondence: On June 22, 1972, Michael Richardson, Rich Photos, 1600 W. Flagler Street, Miami, Florida, advised that about noon, Saturday, June 10, 1972, one white male whom he tentatively identified from a photograph as Bernard Barker, came to this store which is located in a heavily populated Cuban area. This individual presented two rolls of exposed Kodak tri-X black and white 35 millimeter film on which he said documents had been photographed. He requested immediate development and printing of 8 by 10 prints. Richardson did a rush job and determined there were four exposed document negatives on one roll and 34 document negatives on the other roll for a total of 38 exposed negatives. Richardson made one 7 by 10 print of each of the 38 negatives.

Richardson said most of the documents had an emblem and were headed "Chairman Democratic National Committee." The

documents photographed appeared to have been on onion skin paper and most were typed. A few consisted of handwritten notes. On at least one of the documents, there was the signature "Dick." Several letters had the handwritten name of Lawrence O'Brien. One or more of the documents concerned a resume of an unrecalled woman who headed a local campaign for Senator Hubert Humphrey. Richardson said all documents were photographed with a shag carpet background and hands covered with clear-type gloves held down each corner of each document.

Richardson made no written record of the transactions and maintained no copy of the negatives or prints. Richardson tentatively identified one of the two men who accompanied Barker as being Fiorini, but was unable to identify the third man.

Investigation at the Howard Johnson Motel, 2601 Virginia Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C., determined the carpet utilized by the motel is similar to that noticed in the photographs by Richardson.

Direction of Investigation: Investigation is being directed to developing evidence of an Interception of Communications violation against not only the subjects, but all those who may have assisted them such as who recruited them, who financed the operation, who planned the operation, etc. Section 2511, Title 18, U. S. Code, makes it a violation for anyone to willfully intercept, endeavor to intercept or procure any other person to intercept or endeavor to intercept any wire or oral communication. It is also a violation of that Section for anyone to willfully use, endeavor to use or procure any other person to use or endeavor to use any electronic, mechanical or other device to intercept any oral communication. The possession of any electronic, mechanical or other device which is primarily useful for surreptitious interception of wire or oral communications is a violation of Section 2512, Title 18, U. S. Code, provided the device or any component thereof has been sent through the mail or transported in interstate or foreign commerce. Section 371, Title 18, U. S. Code, the general Conspiracy Statute, makes it an offense if two or more persons conspire to commit any offense against the United States.

One) Sales Draft, dated June 22, 1972, at Beverly Wilshire, Beverly Hills, California, with notation "Room 288" set forth. Charge was for amount of \$45.29 and appears made for rental payment of room 288. Signature is illegible but appears different from signature of FRANCES LIDDY.

Two) Eastern Airlines ticket coupon 148768218-4, issued April 21, 1972, for flight between New York City/Newark to Washington, D.C. in amount of \$26. Date of flight and flight number are not specified on ticket coupon. No signature appears on photocopy of this coupon.

Three) Charge slip, dated January 24, 1972, in amount of \$18.06 for bill at Black Steer, Washington, D.C.. Signature is illegible but appears different from signature of FRANCES LIDDY.

Summary

Attached sets forth summary of investigation conducted 8/1/72, of burglary of Democratic National Committee Headquarters.

(1) Mrs. Judy Foback (protect identity) confidentially advised Kenneth Wells Parkinson, attorney hired to handle civil suit for Committee to Re-elect the President (CRP), involved in majority of Washington Field Office interviews at CRP, submitted \$25,000 bill to CRP for services rendered subsequent to burglary. Bill to be paid with CRP funds.

(2) Felipe De Diego, one of Cubans who traveled to Washington, D. C., twice in May, 1972, with Barker, appeared U. S. District Court, 8/1/72, to testify before Federal Grand Jury. He invoked Fifth Amendment and after lengthy discussion with his counsel, agreed to reconsider with his counsel all aspects of his testimony and return to Washington, D.C., on 8/8/72.

(3) Maurice Stans, Chairman of Finance Committee, scheduled to appear U. S. District Court, 8/2/72.

Intensive investigation continuing.

Summary

Attached summarizes investigation conducted 7/31/72, of burglary of Democratic National Committee Headquarters.

(1) Roy Winchester, Vice President in Charge of Public Affairs, Pennzoil, Houston, Texas, advised on night of 4/5/72, he delivered on behalf of Finance Committee a substantial amount of checks and securities to Hugh Walter Sloan, Jr., Washington, D.C. Winchester declined to state specific amount and when questioned about funds delivered, three quarters of a million dollars, stated "That's in the ball park." Winchester advised funds delivered at that time to make sure they were submitted to Finance Committee prior to effective date of New Disclosure Act and he denied knowing Manuel Ogarrio or about \$100,000 check to Ogarrio.

When questioned about four Mexican drafts which allegedly were part of money he delivered to Washington, D.C., Winchester stated he could not discuss such matters because he considered this confidential in view of fact anonymity previously promised to all donors.

(2) Hugh Walter Sloan, Jr., testified before Federal Grand Jury [REDACTED]

(3) Assistant U.S. Attorney Earl Silbert advised Bart Porter and Jeb Magruder will be called to testify before grand jury this week.

(4) Two bank accounts for George Gordon Liddy located in Washington, D.C., now under subpoena. Subpoena also being obtained for Republican National Committee to obtain all their records pertaining to subject McCord.
Intensive investigation continuing.

SUMMARY

Attached is summary of intensive investigation conducted 6/22/72, concerning burglary of Democratic Party Headquarters 6/17/72.

1. Investigation at Republic National Bank, Miami, Florida, revealed Barker Associates, Inc., deposited four checks totaling \$89,000. Barker subsequently received cash for these deposits on 5/8/72, part of which was approximately \$10,000 in new \$100 bills. Per Miami teletype 6/22 on 4/21/72 Barker deposited cashier's check payable to Kenneth H. Dahlberg. Dahlberg is wealthy winter resident of Boca Raton, Florida, who has returned to his Wayzata, Minnesota, residence. Efforts to contact him there on 6/22/72 negative; efforts continuing to locate and interview him regarding this check.

2. Maryland National Bank, College Park, Maryland, in response to subpoena 6/22/72, reproducing all records and accounts pertaining to James W. McCord and McCord Associates, Rockville, Maryland, which reproductions will be turned over to FBI.

3. Arrangements being made for FBI Laboratory to "sweep" Democratic and Republican National Headquarters as well as offices of Chairman of the National Democratic Credential Committee and the Committee to Re-elect the President.

4. Charles W. Colson, Special Assistant to the President, advised Everett Howard Hunt employed his staff as consultant whose services were terminated 3/29/72, and could not explain why Hunt still had office available in Executive Office Building as of 6/20/72.

5. Michael Richardson, Miami photographer, on 6/10/72 developed 84 prints on expedite basis for individual who looked like Barker. Prints were of documents headed "Chairman, Democratic National Committee." These prints picked up by three persons, possibly Barker, unidentified male, and a third person identified as Fiorini (true name Sturgis).

Sometime during the day, he had gone to his room only to discover two priests and two nuns there talking.

He had not invited them and he made a caustic remark that it was his room and did they mind if he sat down.

He then left the room and as he left he saw another priest who lives in the room next to his in the rectory, and he told him the situation. This priest was MICHAEL GALLAGHER.

GALLAGHER then asked the four individuals to leave and they did.

At this time he advised that he knows none of the people connected or involved in this matter.

He then advised that later in the day he was visited by KEVIN BRENDAN O'DOUGHERTY in his room at the rectory. The following is in response to inquiries made concerning certain phases of this investigation by the Acting Director. (See attached)

(1) At the time of interviewing Charles W. KENNETH HARRY DAHLBERG

The Miami office in reviewing the account maintained by Bernard L. Barker at the Republic National Bank, Miami, determined that on April 21, 1972, Barker presented a check in the amount of \$25,000 which was payable to Kenneth H. Dahlberg and requested cash. The banker contacted the First Bank and Trust Company of Boca Raton, Florida, on which the check was drawn and was advised that the check was "as good as gold" and there was no reason not to cash the check for Barker.

Mr. Dahlberg is a wealthy resident of Wayzata, Minnesota, who maintains a winter home in Boca Raton. He is Chairman of the Board of Directors, Dahlberg Electronics, Inc., Golden Valley, Minnesota, and is part owner of Bonner A. G. Company, Zurich, Switzerland. This firm, like Dahlberg Electronics, Inc., manufactures hearing aids.

In December 1969, at the request of the White House, the FBI conducted a full-field special inquiry investigation concerning Mr. Dahlberg. The results were generally favorable although information was obtained that on August 14, 1953, he was involved in a serious automobile accident in which his car struck from the rear a small station wagon containing four teenage boys, all of whom died as a result of the accident. The Chief of Police who investigated the accident stated he felt Mr. Dahlberg was at fault and should have been criminally charged in connection with the accident as he was driving while intoxicated. The local grand jury, however, returned a "no bill." On September 11, 1953, Mr. Dahlberg pled guilty to "careless driving and driving without a license in possession." He was fined a total of \$110.

As of January 2, 1970, Mr. Dahlberg, who has been active in the affairs of the Republican Party in the Mid-west for several years, was Chairman of the Central and Plains States Region of the Republican National Finance Committee.

On June 23, 1972, attempts were made by the Minneapolis FBI office to contact Mr. Dahlberg concerning the \$25,000 check. The Special Agents (SAs) were informed that Mr. Dahlberg was not available when the first efforts were made to contact him but that he would promptly contact the Minneapolis FBI office. He did not do so and later in the day the SAs were informed Mr. Dahlberg had left Minneapolis en route to Buffalo, New York, by way of Washington, D. C. On June 24, 1972, efforts were made by the Buffalo FBI office to interview Mr. Dahlberg but he declined to be interviewed stating he would contact the Minneapolis office with his attorney on June 26, 1972. On June 26, 1972, Mr. Dahlberg declined to be interviewed on the advice of his attorney but refused to identify the attorney who had given him this advice.

A source of absolute reliability volunteered the following information today:

On or about May 1, 1972, Miami FBI Agent Leman L. Stafford, who has an apartment at 455 N.E. 39th Street, Miami, asked the apartment house manager if she could rent apartment #8 to one James McCord for 3 1/2 months "during the conventions". The manager agreed to do so and on May 15, 1972 received a \$787.00 check from James McCord Associates.

Around the end of May, 1972, Special Agent Stafford asked the manager if she could also rent apartment #5 to McCord and the manager agreed to do so.

On or about June 7, 1972, Special Agent Stafford and a secretary in the Miami FBI Field Office, Mrs. Keating (who also has an apartment at 455 N.E. 39th Street), brought James McCord to see the manager. McCord gave the manager \$562.50 in cash for the rental of apartment #5 for a period of 2 1/2 months.

Result of examination:

The Q87 door bears pry marks which were produced by a flat-bladed tool or tools approximately 1/8" wide. These marks, although limited, may be of possible value for comparison purposes.

The lock bolt in the Q87 door and the Q89 striker plate bear some pry marks of very limited value for comparison purposes. These marks are not sufficiently characteristic to determine the type and/or size tool or tools used to produce them.

The lock cylinder core in the doorknob of the Q87 door was canted several degrees from the vertical when received in the Laboratory indicating that it had been "picked" open. An examination of the core and pins of the lock cylinder revealed marks of the type produced by picking tools. These marks are of no value for identifying the tool or tools used to produce them.

The Q88 lock cylinder bears no marks of value for identification purposes or marks to indicate whether or not it had been "picked."

HARTZ was shown six black and white photographs, one of which was of GEORGE GORDON LIDDY. HARTZ was asked to select any person familiar to her that was depicted in the six photographs. HARTZ looked over the photographs and stated none of the persons depicted in the photographs are known to her.
