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HAROLD C. ARLSTEAD, 2245 Evans. Flossmoor.

Illinois, was interviewed at his office Suite E, 202nd and Ashland Avenue, Chicago Heights, Illinois. Mr. CARLSTEAD advised that his home telephone number is area code 312-798-2453.

He advised that his wife and DOROTHY HUNT, wife of EVERETT HOWARD HUNT, JR. are first cousins, their mothers having been sisters.

Mr. CARLSTEAD stated that the names GEORGE GORDON LIDDY and MORTON BARROWS JACKSON, mean absolutely nothing to him and he is absolutely positive he does not know nor has he ever met either of these individuals.

Regarding EVERETT HOWARD HUNT Mr. CARLSTEAD related the following information:

On or about June 1, 1972, DOROTHY HUNT, mentioned above went to Europe. She returned from Europe to her Washington, D.C. home somewhere in the area of June 25, 1972. Over the weekend of Thursday, June 29, 1972, to Monday, July 3, 1972, the HUNTs visited himself and his wife at his Flossmoor, Illinois, home. Mrs. HUNT arrived on Friday, June 30, 1972, from Washington, D.C. and Mr. HUNT arrived on Thursday, June 29, 1972. Mr. CARLSTEAD believes that Mr. HUNT came to Flossmoor, Illinois, from California. Mrs. HUNT left Chicago on Sunday, July 2, 1972, by way of Midway Airport, for her home in Washington, D.C., Mr. CARLSTEAD taking her to the airport. Mr. HUNT left Chicago on Monday, July 3, 1972, from O'Hare International Airport, Mr. CARLSTEAD taking him to the airport also.

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By way of background Mr. CARLSTEAD explained that while he has seen the HUNTs in both May and June. 1972, he has probably seen them only seven or eight times over the last 15 years or so. Regarding EVERETT HOWARD HUNT he characterized him as a "very bright guy" stating that HUNT graduated from Brown University with high honors having majored in either English or Literature. He also stated that EVERETT HOWARD HUNT has authored several books some of which according to CARLSTEAD border on the pornographic. By way of further background he related that during World War II, HUNT served in the Navy, the Air Corps, and also OSS. CARLSTEAD has always suspected that HUNT has had an enduring connection with Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) but HUNT has never told him this directly.

While the HUNTs were visiting the CARLSTEAD's in Flossmoor, Illinois, from June 29 to July 3, 1972, Mr. HUNT received what CARLSTEAD believes was a long distance telephone call. Mr. CARLSTEAD stated that he believed this call was received on the evening of either Friday, June 30, 1972, or Saturday, July 1, 1972, and if he had to make "his best guess" he would say the call was received on Saturday evening July 1, 1972. CARLSTEAD stated that the caller did not identify himself and asked for Mr. HUNT by name, the implication to CARLSTEAD being that the caller obviously knew where to contact HUNT. Mr. CARLSTEAD stated that he could not recall the length of this conversation, did not recognize the caller by voice, and the caller to the best of his recollection did not identify himself by name. Mr. CARLSTEAD further stated that he did not overhear the conversation and therefore has no idea of the context of the conversation.

Mr. CARLSTEAD stated that he has no personal information or knowledge regarding the apparent attempted burglary at the Democratic National Committee Headquarters in Washington, D.C. on June 17, 1972, and added that he is not now and never has been connected with the CIA.





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He did relate, however, that during World War II he was a member of the Office of Naval Intelligence.

He concluded by stating that he is a certified public accountant who operates his own business from the address indicated above and further that he is a Republican Township Committeeman of Bloom Township, County of Cook, State of Illinois.

Mrs. ROBERT L. MEYERS, residence Church Hill Road, Washington Depot, Connecticut, advised that this is a summer residence and that she and her husband maintain residence in New York City. She advised in this connection that her husband had been already questioned in this matter by agents of the New York Office, FBI, but that he was unable to furnish any pertinent information since the call from the Committee for Re-election of the President, Washington, D.C. was for her and not her husband. Mrs. MEYERS furnished the following information:

Mrs. MEYERS received a phone call from the office of the aforementioned committee on January 7, 1972, as well as on several other occasions. In each instance these calls were made by Miss ANNXDORE, who is employed by the Committee in a public relations capacity. Mrs. MEYERS advised that in each instance these calls related to the publishing of a cookbook, on which both she and Miss DORE have been collaborating over the past three years. Mrs. MEYERS explained that in the past, she has written articles on gournet cooking for various magazines, and the book in question is due to be published in October of this year.

Mrs. MEYERS first became acquainted with Miss DORE through a New York City public relations firm about three years ago after she (Mrs. MEYERS) had written an article for the Heublein, Incorporated, firm, wine and liquor merchants, which appeared in the "New York Times". Mrs. MEYERS stated that she has no connection whatsoever with the Committee for Re-election of the President, and knows nothing about the activities of this Committee nor of any of the individuals involved in the break at Democratic Party National Headquarters, Washington, D.C., on June 17, 1972.

Dr. SMITH's occupation is listed as Director, Bureau of Medical Services, Iowa State Department of Social Services, Lucas State Office Building, Des Moines, Iowa. His wife is listed as MARY L. SMITH.

The Des Moines Credit Bureau has maintained a file on Dr. ELMER M. and MARY LOUISE SMITH since 1960. This file disclosed that he has been Director of the Bureau of Medical Services of the Iowa State Department of Social Services since 1963. This file also indicated that Mrs. MARY LOUISE SMITH was Republican National Committee Woman for the State of Iowa in 1966 and in that same year had been named to a Republican Committee on convention reform.

Des Moines Credit Bureau files contained no unfavorable information on Dr. ELMER SMITH or his wife MARY LOUISE SMITH.

On August 9, 1972, Dr. ELMER SMITH was contacted and advised that his wife, MARY LOUISE SMITH, is currently Republican National Committee Woman for the State of Iowa and is also Co-chairman of the "Iowa Committee to Re-Elect the President".

Dr. SMITH confirmed that the above Des Moines telephone number is his residence telephone number and further indicated that his wife has made numerous calls to and received numerous calls from the Committee to Re-Elect the President in Washington, D.C., in connection with her job as Co-chairman, Iowa Committee to Re-Elect the President.



PAUL E. BARRICK, Treasurer, Finance Committee to Ro-elect the Fresident (PCTRP), 1701 Pennsylvenia Avenue, M.W., Washington, B.C. (WDC), was interviewed at his office in the presence of PAUL L. O'BRIEN, Attorney, 888-17th Street, M.W., WDC, and provided the following information:

He assumed the position of Treasurer from HUGH SLOAN on July 17, 1972, and from March, 1972, until that date his position was Controller of the FCTRP. In the capacity of Controller he reported to MAURICE STANS and spent considerable time drawing up procedures regarding payroll, invoices, travel, check requests, bookkeeping, etceters. He had no knowledge of any \$25,000 check received from KERMETH DAHLBERG or \$89,000 in checks received from MEMBETH DAHLBERG or \$89,000 in checks received from Mexico or any other contribution.

He consulted with GEORGE GORDON LIDET concerning the GAO report and steps necessary to conform to the regulations of the federal election compaign act, but had no other dealings with LIBOT. His only contact with JAMES WALTER McCORD was to authorise payment of a bill submitted by McCORD occasionally.

He was unable to provide any additional information.

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but he cannot recall what he did with it, nor its contents. He stated he may have placed it in a file jacket, but after consulting with his secretary, he stated he could not locate the memorandum. He stated he felt that he still had it in his office and would it continue to search for it.

SHUMWAY stated he was not aware of any Intelligence group operating in the Committee.


When asked about his knowledge of or association with GEORGE GORDON LIDDY & HUGH WALTER SLOAN, Jr., SHUMWAY replied that he knew LIDDY as the Attorney for the Finance Committee and SLOAN as its Treasurer. He stated he had never received any cash disbursements from SLOAN or LIDDY.

When questioned about a recent news article appearing in the Washington Post about LIDDY'S firing at the committee, SHUNMAY stated that press release was made as a result of two telephone calls received at his office. One call, Friday evening was from ROBERT WOODWARD of the Washington Post. The second call he first said he received on Saturday, but later said it was after the WOODWARD Call, was from SANDY SMITH of the Times. SMITH allegedly said, "I have heard that GORDON LIDDY has been fired? Can you comment on that?" SHUNMAY states he took the prepared press release and read it to SMITH. Later he read it to WOODWARD. He stated the release itself was very short and read as follows:

"The employment of GEORGE LIDDY with the Committee to Re-Elect the President was terminated because he elected not to respond to certain questions asked by Agents of the FBI in relation to the investigation of the Incident at the Democratic National Committee Headquaters.

It is the policy of this Committee that all of its employee fully co operate with appropriate law enforcement officers in their conduct of this matter."

When asked to explain his remarks that the FBI must have informed a higher person at the Committee about LIDDY's refusal to answer questions, SHUNWAY said it was a "presumption on his part" that this is what transpired. When told that the FBI does not reveal the results of its interviews to one's employer, Mr. 5100 MAY stated again. "It was a presumption, or my part, and obviously an errorneous one at that."





SHUMNAY went on to say that he was not in Washington, D.C. when LIDDY was terminated and therefore never knew about the prepared statement for the press. He stated he had been in the California attending to his sick daughter. When he returned, promise handed him the statement and said he was to release it only if the press made inquiry about LIDDY.

When asked if he had released it on his own, without the press actually calling, SHUNWAY said, "No, I did not."

SHUMWAY went on to say that it was his understanding that someone other than MOORE had prepared that statement because when he released the statement, the press began making and asked specific questions about LIDDY's background and he had to call JUDY HOBACK in the Finance Committee to obtain all this data.

SHUDWAY concluded by stating that he could offer not information of value pretaining to this investigation and had no knowledge of anyons in the Committee who might have been working for or with JAMES MC CORD, in an Intelligence gathering operation.

DE VAN L. CHRIMAY, Director of Public Affairs, Committee to Re-Diect the President, 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, NV furnished the following information:

He has held this position since February, 1972. Prior to this position, he was Assistant Director of Communications for the Executive Branch at the White House and worked for HERBERT KLEIN. Prior to that time he had worked for the campaign committee to elect GEORGE MURPHY from California and prior to that he had been a reported for United Press International for about twenty years.

While at the White House, he also worked with present staff committee members, JEB MAGRUDER, ROBERT ODLE and HERBERT PORTER.

Her SHUDMAN was asked what information if any, he possessed, first hand, regarding the Burglary of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters. He responded by stating that he had no first hand information whatsoever about the affair.

When asked about his working hours, SHUMWAY replied that his normal hours at the Committee begin around 8:00em and end about 9:00 pm. He stated there are exceptions to that rule meaning he could start earlier and end earlier.

SHUNMAY was asked as to whether or not he had received any packages or large envelopes from a building guard during the first part of June 1972, and replied in the negative. When asked about receiving any confidential memos from either ROBERT ODLE or JAMES MC CORD, Jr. he again replied in the negative. He stated he had never received any information from MC CORD which would have come as the result of a "bugging device." When told that he was not asked any such question, he replied that he thought the Agants means that the type of information MC CORD had, would have come from such a thing.

SHUMMAY then stated he did recall receiving a "kind of note" from MC CORD which referred to a matter at the Democratic Headquarters,

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POWELL A. MOORE, Director of Press and Information, Committee to Re-elect the President (CRP), 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Mashington, D.C., was interviewed at his office in the presence of PAUL L. O'BRIEN, Attorney, 888-17th Street, N.W., and provided the following information:

He assumed his position with the CRP on May 15, 1972, having left the Department of Public Information, United States Department of Justice. His job is to handle press inquiries and release information to the press, and he is one of four assistants to EEVAN SARREAY.

He received information that GEORGE GORDON LIBDY was fired by the CRP from ROBERT MARVIAN. MARVIAN called him on June 28, 1972, and told him he had a problem for the Public Information office. He told him Mr. LIBDY was being fired because he had refused to answer questions by the FBI. According to MARDIAN, LIBBY requested private counsel before answering any questions even though counsel had been provided him by the CRP at the interview. Under those circumstances MARDIAN felt LIBBY should have answered any and all questions, and when he refused he was terminated.

MARDIAN indicated that he (MOCRE) should handle drawing up a statement for release to the press. MOCRE replied he would handle this but first he would consult with CLIFF MILLER, a private consultant on public relations retained by the CRP. They got together and both agreed not to announce that LIDUT had been fired but not to cover it up if inquiries were made by the press. Therefore, they wrote up a statement which MOCRE showed either to MARDIAN or FRED LARUE and carried it in his pocket for several days. Before leaving for Miami in July he gave the statement to Mr. SHUMMAY.

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On Friday, July 21, 1972, Mr. SHUMWAY told him Newsday and Time Magazine were in possession of this information and thought it would appear in the press that coming weekend. This information did, in fact, appear in the July 23, 1972, Sunday edition of the Washington Post but the wording of the article distorted the original statement drafted by CLIFF MILLER and himself.

Mr. GLENN J. SEDAM, JR., General Counsel to the Committee for the Re-election of the President was interviewed at his office at 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N. W., and was advised of the identities of the interviewing agents. Present during interview was DONALD H. KISTLER, attorney at law.

Mr. SEDAM stated in October or November, 1971, he was employed as an "advance man" for Mrs. MARTHA MITCHELL. His duties consisted of arranging her trips, schedules, appearances on television shows, and various speeches. In late January or early February, 1972, he was then appointed Assistant General Counsel to the Committee for the Re-election of the President (CTRP). In this capacity, SEDAM was assistant to G. GORDON LIDDY who was then General Counsel for the CTRP, however, he did no work for LIDDY.

During this period of time, although he was Assistant General Counsel, Mr. SEDAM worked in arranging for political rallies in New Hampshire and Florida. He returned to Washington, around the middle of March.

On March 27, 1972, Mr. LIDDY was transferred from the CTRP to the Finance Committee to the Committee to Re-elect the President. LIDDY moved his office from the fourth floor to the second floor where other members of the Finance Committee were officed. SEDAM stated he was appointed General Counsel for the CTRP at the same time. While assistant General Counsel, Mr. SEDAM's office was next to that of LIDDY, and at that time they used a telephone with a rotary telephone number. The number for the phone was 333-6575, and if that number was busy, telephone number 333-6576 would ring. This telephone was a direct dial line without going through the switchboard.

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By referring to an office directory, Mr. SEDAM said number 333-6572 was for the Finance Committee. He did not know whose number 333-0362 had been assigned to.

. Mr. SEDAM stated emphatically that he had never received any telephone calls from anyone by the name of BERNARD BARKER, nor from anyone connected with the break-in of the Water-gate Democratic Committee offices in May.

Mr. SEDAM said he had been interviewed by New York Times reporter WALTER RUGABER and a BOB SMITH, however, he did not furnish them with any information concerning long distance phone calls from BARKER in Miami to GORDON LIDDY.

SEDAM stated he had never discussed anything with LIDDY concerning BARKER or any of the other persons subsequently identified as having been involved in the aforementioned break-in. SEDAM never discussed anything concerning financial matters of the Committee or disbursements made by LIDDY.

Concerning the mention of a diary made in the newspaper article written by WALTER RUGABER, Mr. SEDAM said he maintains a "lawyers diary or record book" which covers his day-to-day activities, stating he furnishes a written weekly report to Chairman MC GREGGOR of the CTRP.

SEDAM explained, all attorneys maintain such a written record which enables them to bill clients for their legal time expended. Inasmuch as he is on a salary, he bills no clients, however, his work record is necessary for his report.

Mr. SEDAM furnished the diary to the interviewing agents for inspection stating there is nothing of pertinence to the matter under investigation, however, he preferred not to release the diary out of his office. SEDAM reaffirmed he had no knowledge of the activities of anyone connected with the break-in, nor did he ever make any notations concerning anyone or anything related to the matter.

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Mr. MAURICE STANS, Chairman of the Pinance Committee for the Committee to Re-Elect the President (CTRP), 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., was contacted at his office, advised of the identity of the interviewing agents, and the purpose of the interview at which time Mr. STANS supplied the following information:

Present during the duration of the interview was Mr. KENNETH WELLS PARKINSON, Council for the Committee to Re-Elect the President.

STANS advised that he came on board with the Committee to Re-Elect the President of February 15, 1972, and that his sole job from that date to the present time was strictly to raise funds. STANS stated that he never handled any cash himself except on rare occasions when he was speaking at various fund raising functions throughout the country someone may hand a check to him. STANS stated that he would always turn over any checks that he received, which was rarely, to the Treasurer for the Committee to Re-Elect the President, Mr. HUGH W. SLOAN.

STANS reiterated that he had absolutely no hand in the political policy making decisions and that he would receive instructions from Mr. JEB MAGRUDER that certain funds would have to be paid out for various expenses at which time he would notify Mr. SLOAN to make these funds available so normal operating expenses could be paid for.

STANS stated that several weeks after he came on duty with the Committee to Re-Elect the President, it became apparent to both himself and Mr. SLOAN that they were in need of a full-time legal counsel at which time Mr. GORDON LIDDY was transferred from the Political Section of the Committee to Re-Elect the President to the Finance Section thus filling their need for legal counsel.

STANS stated he bacame aware from general conversations in the office that LIDDY was assigned a Security Gathering job

and that certain cash disbursements would have to be made available to him. STANS stated that LIDDY's program was already into effect prior to his arrival on duty with the Committee to Re-Elect the President and he was not aware of any details concerning LIDDY's "program". STANS stated that at no time did he authorize Mr. HUGH SLOAN to make any cash disbursements to anyone and the only time SLOAN ever mentioned cash disbursements to him was when SLOAN told him that LIDDY wanted to make a large cash withdrawal at which time STANS told him to check with MAGRUDER and do as MAGRUDER instructed.

STANS stated that he was aware that there was a considerable amount of cash on hand maintained in the office, but he never had an occasion to draw from this cash, but as he stated, Mr. SLOAN was in full charge of the cash on hand. STANS estimated that the amount of cash varied from approximately \$200,000 to \$350,000. He stated that at one time the cash was in his (STANS) safe and he and Mr. SLOAN were the only ones who knew the combination. STANS stated that this cash was ultimately deposited on or about May 30, 1972, and he believes the deposit was for approximately \$350,000.

Mr. STANS stated that SLOAN told him around July 1, 1972, that he was thinking about leaving the Committee to Re-Elect the President as the pressure was too much for him. STANS stated they discussed this generally. STANS stated that he met SLOAN on the west coast around July 10, 1972 where SLOAN was advising the California State Finance Committee Chairman concerning the new April 7th reporting law. STANS stated that he talked SLOAN into traveling with him throughout the country during the week of July 10th as STANS wanted SLOAN to meet various important contributors, so as SLOAN may reconsider his intention to resign. STANS advised that SLOAN officially resigned from the Committee to Re-Elect the President on July 14, 1972.

Mr. STANS was then asked if he knew any details concerning the Mexican checks which the Committee to Re-Elect the President received at which time STANS replied that he first knew of the checks some 2 weeks after they were received by the Committee to Re-Elect the President from Mr. SLOAN and that SLOAN only mentioned it to him in passing. STANS stated that he had absolutely no information where the checks came from or where the original funds came from that purchased the cashiers checks in Mexico. STANS then stated that he was

checks definitely did not come from the Finance Committee at the Committee to Re-Elect the President. At this point Mr. STANS was advised that the FBI, at this point, did not want to know the name of the contributor of the original \$100,000.00 that went to purchase the Mexican checks, but was interested in how the money got to Mexico. At this point STANS stated that he was aware of how the money got to Mexico for the purchase of the Mexican checks, but stated that he did not want to divulge this information at this time until he conferred with counsel as he felt that in divulging this information, he may also have to divulge the name of the contributor which he did not want to do.

STANS stated that he has conferred with other attorneys in this case besides Mr. PARKINSON, those being Mr. THOMAS P. JACKSON, Mr. ROBERT MARDIAN, and Mr. GLENN SEDAM.

At this point, Mr. STANS was served a subpoena by SA KING to appear before the United States Federal Grand Jury, United States District Court House, on August 1, 1972.

GEORGE WILLIAM DABROWSKI, 370 West Deer Park Road, Gaithersburg, Maryland, telephone 926-1886, was interviewed at the offices of the Republican Mational Committee (RMC), 310 First Street, S.E., Washington, D.C. (WDC).

Present during the interview was THOMAS JACKSON, Attorney at Law of the firm Jackson, Gray and Laskey, 1828 L Street, N.W., WDC.

DABROWSKI attends Montgomery Junior College in Maryland and in May, 1972, he heard from a fellow student, RON HOWARD, that JAMES MC CORD was hiring security guards for his firm Mc Cord Associates. He approached MC CORD regarding employment and MC CORD told him he needed security guards to work nights and weekends at the Committee to Re-Elect the President, 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., WDC. He did not want to work at night or on the weekend and told MC CORD he was not interested in the job. MC CORD later contacted him and offered him a job as a security guard at the RMC on the day shift. He began work on June 12, 1972.

He was employed by Mg Cond Associates from June 12, 1972, to June 21, 1972. He received only one pay check from MC CORD and since July 1, 1972, has been paid by RNC.

MC CORD maver approached him regarding any other employment and he mover worked with MC CORD directly. His only contact with MC CORD, except for when he was hired, was when MC CORD instructed him in a course in Retail and Industrial Security at Montgomery Junior College in the fall semester of 1971.

He could furnish no information regarding the activities of MC CORD or any of MC CORD's employees the weekend of June 16-17, 1972.

Miss DOMINGA REINOSO Martinez, address 11120 River Road, Potomac, Maryland, was located at heremployment and residence at the above address and was immediately advised of the identities of PAUL P. MAGALLANES and JAMES D. HUBBARD as Special Agents of the FBI. She was informed of the nature of the interview and the interview was conducted solely in the Spanish language by SA PAUL P. MAGALLANES.

Prior to interviewing Miss REINOSO, who speaks little English, the interviewing agents were informed by Mr. and Mrs. E. HOWARD HUNT that either one of them wanted to sit in on the interview inasmuch as they thought it only fair that Miss REINOSO have a witness who understood and spoke Spanish at the interview besides SA MAGALLANES. Mrs. HUNT further stated that the latter request was at the insistence of Miss REINOSO. stated that inasmuch as SA MAGALLANES would have a witness, SA HUBBARD, present during the interview, it was felt that Miss REINOSO also needed a witness in order to prevent SA MAGALLANES from incorrectly translating Miss REINOSO's answers into English. SA MAGALLANES advised Mr. and Mrs. HUNT and Miss REINOSO that Miss REINOSO had a right to have present with her at the interview any person she wished, including an attorney; however, he further stated that he would not interview Miss REINOSO under those conditions and would conduct an interview of Miss REINOSO only in the presence of SA HUBBARD. SA MAGALLANES further advised Mr. and Mrs. HUNT and Miss REINOSO that if Miss REINOSO did not agree to an interview, a subpoena for Miss REINOSO would probably be issued in order that Miss REIMSSO appear before and be questioned by a Federal Grand Jury investigating the burglary of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters (DNCH) at the Watergate Office Building, Washington, D.C. (WDC). Mr. HUNT then telephonically contacted his attorney, identity not revealed, and his attorney subsequently advised him of what SA MAGALLANES had indicated to him and his wife and to Miss REINOSO as aforementioned.

MAGALLANES then advised Miss REINOSO of what had taken place and along with Mr. HUNT advised her of what his attorney had stated, and she then consented to an interview without any member of the HUNT family being present. SA MAGALLANES then escorted Miss REINOSO to the driveway of the residence and interviewed Miss REINOSO outdoors and she provided the following information:

Miss REINOSO, a Chilean citizen, is presently in the United States employed as a domestic. She arrived in the United States on April 24, 1969, at Miami, Florida, and was employed as a domestic by Dr. RAUL VERO, a physician in the WDC area. Dr. VERO returned to Chile in February, 1971. At the time of her entry into the United States, Miss REINOSO was issued an Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), G-5 Visa. Subsequent to Dr. VERO's departure from the United States, Miss REINOSO obtained an A-3 Visa, which, she explained, is a Visa issued to a domestic who is employed by a diplomat. Miss REINOSO resides and is employed at the residence of Mr. and Mrs. E. HOWARD HUNT as a domestic, but works one morning per week (Thursdays) for a diplomat. Miss REINOSO refused to disclose the identity of the diplomat.

Mrs. HUNT left for a vacation trip on or about May 30, 1972, and returned to her residence on June 21, 1972, in the evening hours. Miss REINOSO did not recall Mr. HUNT depart the residence on any of the weekends that Mrs. HUNT was away on her trip. When questioned of the presence or departure of Mr. HUNT at his residence on June 16, 17 or 18, 1972, and any dates thereafter Miss REINOSO stated that Mr. HUNT ate dinner on the evening of June 16, 1972, but said that she did not know if he left the house on that evening. She stated that on the morning of June 17, 1972, she recalled answering the telephone approximately three times at about 7:30 a.m. or 8:00 a.m. The voices on the telephone were male and they asked for Mr. HUNT. indicated to the eallers that Mr. HUNT was sleeping and could not give the callers anymore information inasmuch as her English She stated that she was certain that Mr. HUNT was in his residence on the morning of June 17, 1972. At this point Miss REINOSO stated that she was very confused as to the dates





and said that the telephone calls may have occurred about one or two weeks prior to Mrs. HUNT's return to Potomac, Maryland.

Miss REINOSO at this time and during the entire interview appeared to be extremely nervous and SA MAGALLANES and SA HUBBARD observed that her voice was shakey and her hands trembled. She was also observed to be constantly looking toward the HUNT residence during the interview.

Miss REINOSO served Mr. HUNT breakfast every morning until Mrs. HUNT returned to Potomac, Maryland, on June 21, 1972. When Miss REINOSO was asked as to when Mr. HUNT departed the residence, Miss REINOSO refused to answer same and gave no explanation for her refusal to answer. Miss REINOSO did not remember how long Mr. HUNT was away from his residence, but said that he has been at the residence for about the last two or three weeks. Miss REINOSO did not remember any individuals visiting the HUNT residence on the weekend of June 16, 17 and 18, 1972.

Miss REINOSO was exhibited the following group of color photographs. Approximately 30 seconds after she was handed the photographs, Mrs. HUNT's daughter, LISA, came out of the residence and approached Miss REINOSO and SA MAGALLANES and SA HUBBARD. She informed Miss REINOSO in the Spanish language that Mrs. HUNT wanted her (Miss REINOSO) to know that she could be interviewed inside the residence or outside of the residence, whichever site she preferred. Mrs. HUNT wanted her to know that whatever arrangement she wished would be perfectly acceptable to her. Mrs. HUNT further relayed the message and wanted to know if SA MAGALLANES was threatening Miss REINOSO in any manner. Miss REINOSO said nothing and just nodded SA MAGALLANES assured Miss HUNT and Miss REINOSO that he was not threatening Miss REINOSO in any manner. Miss Reinoso upon viewing the following photographs, identified the photograph of EVERETTE HOWARD HUNT as identical with her employer, Mr. EVERETTE HOWARD HUNT. She could not identify any other individuals





therein, although she paused at the photographs of CHARLES W. COLSON and DAVID R. YOUNG:

Miss REINOSO has never observed any individuals of Latin extraction in the HUNT residence nor has she observed any individuals who speak Spanish and who appeared to be of Latin extraction at the residence. Miss REENOSO further stated that she has never observed any individuals at the HUNT residence with any type of electronic equipment.

During the period that Miss REINOSO was viewing the above photographs her hands were observed to be trembling and at the point where Miss HUNT approached the interviewing agents and Miss REINOSO, she almost dropped the photographs.

GEORGE GORDON LIDDY voluntarily appeared at the Washington Field Office of the FBI. Mr. LIDDY was accompanied by Mr. THOMAS L. MAROULIS, Attorney at Law, and Mr. MAROULIS' Secretary, SUSAN POUSLEY. Mr. MAROULIS is currently retained by Mr. LIDDY as his legal counsel.

Mr. LIDDY voluntarily submitted to fingerprint processing.

Thereafter, Mr. LIDDY voluntarily furnished the interviewing agents with twenty-three pages of handwriting exemplars. He completed the noted exemplars with his right hand. The contents of these handwriting samples were dictated to Mr. LIDDY by SAs LEARY and LANO. On occasion, Mr. LIDDY was requested by the interviewing agents to vary the size and speed of his handwriting.

It was determined that the Hamilton signatures on specimens Q51, Q52, Q53, Q54, Q55, Q56, Q60, and Q61 were prepared by HUNT.

Characteristics in the Hamilton signature on specimen Q59 and the Warren signatures on specimens Q21, Q22, Q36, and Q43 indicate that these writings also were probably prepared by HUNT.

Lack of comparable writing or discrepant characteristics would not permit writings on other documents in this case to be identified as having been prepared by HUNT.

It was determined that the name on line 18 of specimen Qc63 was prepared by ROBERT A. WAIT, the writer of specimen K16.

Illegibility of the name on line one of specimen Qc67 would not permit a determination of whether this name was or was not prepared by WAIT.

Limited comparable writing and discrepant characteristics precluded a determination of whether or not the name on line two of specimen Qc64 was prepared by GORDON G. LIDDY.

Lack of comparability in the names on line two of specimen Qc64 and line ten of specimen Qc66 prevented a determination of whether or not these writings were prepared by the same individual.



Mr. LARRY MC COY, Assistant to the Director, Office of Federal Elections, General Accounting Office, 441 G Street, M.W., Washington, D.C. (WDC), viewed a Zerox copy of a letter dated June 21, 1972, addressed to the Director, Office of Federal Elections, from the Treasurer, Texas Finance Committee to Re-Elect the President (TFCRP), which explained the failure of that Committee to Zile the periodic report of receipts and expenditures by June 10 as required by law.

He advised that TPCRP and several other Republican finance committees were not formed immediately after April 7, 1972, when the disclosure statute became effective. According to the Registration Form and Statement of Organization, TFCRP was not formed until May 30, 1972, Since the reporting period ended May 31, 1972, TFCRP did not submit a June 10, 1972, report because no funds were received or expended between the time of registration and the end of the reporting period.

MC COX stated that in effect, the June 21, 1972, letter claimed that no contributions were made in Texas from April 7, 1972, through May 31, 1972, for the re-election of President NIXON. He further advised that the Office of Federal Elections could only accept the statement of a State Committee as true unless a subsequent report revealed receipts or expenditures during a prior peporting period.

Such notification shall be verified by the oath or affirmation of the person filing it, taken before any officer authorized to administer the oaths, and such notification shall include a statement as to the disposition of residual funds if the committee is disbanding.

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





WOLFE further stated that it would be necessary to interrogate the computer at Defense Electronic Supply Center for a complete listing of names and addresses of all individuals who have been referred to MC CORD. He stated that this interrogation would furnish the names of both the persons who had received employment and also those who had been referred to MC CORD. 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

The purpose of this memorandum is to recommend. that we contact former Attorney General John N. Witchell in order to arrange an interview with Mrs. Martha Mitchell who, according to the attached "Washington Capital News Service" release of 9/27/72, says she knows something about the alleged bugging of the Democratic National Headquarters

On 7/5/72, Washington Field Office Special Agents interviewed Mr. Mitchell concerning this case and he stated he had no knowledge of the break-in at the Democratic Headquarters, other than what he read in newspaper accounts of the incident. He appeared before the Federal grand jury on 9/14/72, and furnished no additional information.

According to the attached news release, under the by-line of Helen Thomas, Mrs. Mitchell in a telephone interview from her New York City apartment, said that she has "thrown out so many hints" about the bugging incident but that detailed information would have to wait until she publishes a book after the forthcoming election. In view of her statement to reporter Helen Thomas, mentioned above, it is believed we should endeavor to interview Mrs. Mitchell at this time. //

RECOMMENDATION: That former Attorney General Mitchell be contacted to arrange for interview of Mrs. Mitchell. this is approved, it is believed that contact with Mrs. Mitchell should be by Special Agents who have had previous contact with her while Mr. Mitchell and his family were afforded protective services by the FBI, as those Agents have an established rapport with her. ROBERT LEE BROCK, 1614 North 48th Street after being advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent and the nature of the investigation, furnished the following information:

He was separated from service on June 30, 1971, after serving twenty years five months and thirteen days in the United States Army. He was given an honorable discharge and he went into a retirement status. His Social Security Account Number is 415-52-9238 and he attained the rank of First Sergeant (E-8). His military occupational speciality (MOS) at the time of discharge was as an administrative sergeant. He, several years ago, had a field wireman's MOS and he, through the years, has held several other MOS as well. He has no specialized training in the electronics area and can recall little concerning his training in regard to telephone communications.

Prior to being discharged and while in Germany, he made application for job referral assistance through a program which name he cannot recall that offered such services to men who were being discharged from the Armed Forces and returned to civilian life. Among the areas that he indicated an interest in obtaining career type employment subsequent to his discharge were the Investigative-Law Enforcement area.

He was thereafter contacted by several police departments from various cities in the United States; however, he did not obtain employment with any of these police departments apparently because he was over age.

He cannot recall ever having received any type of contact from JAMES WALTER MC CORD, JR. an regard to possible employment. He has never met JAMES WALTER MC CORD, JR. and does not know who this individual is. He has mov personal knowledge regarding the burglary of the Democratic National Party Headquarters in Washington, D.C. The only information he has heard concerning this burglary is what

He stated that he was considerably upset when he learned of the shooting of Governor WALLACE and this feeling was compounded when he learned of the entry of unauthorized individuals into the Headquarters of the Democratic National Headquarters, therefore, he felt compelled to relate the following information because it seemed to be pertinent to the activity at the Democratic Party National Headquarters. He related that on July 26, 1971, on a Monday night, he met with an individual who introduced himself as ED/WARREN. He had received telephone calls from this individual who claimed that he was contacting DE MOTTE on the recommendation of Mr. ROBERT BENNETT of the ROBERT R. MULLEN and Company, Washington, D.C. He met this individual in a motel immediately adjacent to the airport at Warwick, Rhode Island. They spent several hours in a motel room and WARREN tapped most of the conversation.

At this time WARREN gave to him a business card of ROBERT BENNETT with handwriting on the back which he recognized as that of ROBERT BENNETT. The man said that he was working for a group which was doing some research on the KENNEDY family and on the incident at Chappaquidick Island. WARREN said that he was working for a group of people whom he described as only investment and industrial people. He had a very "Anti-KENNEDY" attitude and asked specific questions as to whether or not DE MOTTE knew anything about pornographic movies being shown at the KENNEDY home. He also inquired as to any incidents which might have occurred at parties which he described as drunken orgies.

The only information provided to him by DE MOTTE was the fact that

DE MOTTE explained that WARREN had been referred to him by BENNETT because in 1960 he had worked as Public Relations man for the Yatchman Hotel which was used to house press people and staff people of the KENNEDY campaign group.

During the period from July 26 until October, 1971, he had numerous conversations by telephone with WARREN. He did not have any telephone number to contact WARREN but always left a message with ROBERT DENNETT whenever he wanted to be in touch with WARREN.

In April, 1972, during a telephone conversation with WARREN, DE MOTTE was given a telephone number of 202-293-2746, as a telephone number where he could contact WARREN. He received no compensation but did receive \$50 in cash at the motel for expenses.

He described WARRAN as a white male, rather short, approximately 5 feet 7 or 8 inches, slim wirey build, 45 to 50 years of age, clean shaven, hair receeding.

He related that on July 19, 1972, in a telephone conversation with ROBERT BENNETT he was told by ROBERT BENNETT that EDWARD WARREN was actually HOWARD HUNT who was involved in the invasion of the Democratic Party National Headquarters and that this individual had run out on BENNETT and left him "holding the bag".

### Phone Monitored for 3 Weeks

The following account of the June 17 Waterpate raid is by a key government witness before the grand jury that indicted seven men in the breakin-and-bugging case. He spoke out for the first time in a fipe-hour interview with the Los Angeles Times good and marine

NEW HAVEN, Conn.—Across the street in the Democratic National Committee offices I could see men with; guns and flashlights looking behind desks and out on the balcony.

It was a weird scene at Washington's Watergate compiet The men were looking for several persons, including my hoss-James W. McCord Jr., who was security director for both President Nixon's re-election committee and the Republican National Committee.:

A short while later, McCord and four other men, all in handcuffs, would be led by police to patrol cars and taken To jail. And a White House consultant would rush into motel room across the street from the Democratic offices and peer down on the scene before fleeing the area.

I had been using a walkie-talkie and acting as a lookout for McCord and his men, who were engaged in a bugging operation. For three weeks I had monitored conversations on a tapped phone

in the Democratic offices.

My mission had been to record all conversations. McCord appeared to be especially interested in any information on Sen. George McGovern and the Democratic Party Chairman, Lawrence O'Brien, and anything having to do with political strategy.

When the Committee for the Re-Election of the President hired me for security work with Martha Mitchell, nothing was said about eventual espionage missions involving electronic

eavesdropping.

But then the man I worked directly under, Jim McCord, was not given to long explanations about anything. You would have to know McCord to understand what I mean.

Like myself, McCord is an ex-FBI agent. But he also served 20 years in the Central Intelligence Agency and he is one of those ex-CIA men who do more listening than talking. When he wants you to do something else, he just tells you. No buildup or anything.

When McCord was ready to switch me from protecting John Mitchell's wife to other security work, he simply told me that the President's re-election committee had other work for me. Contrary to some press reports, I got along fine with Mrs. Mitchell during the days I protected her. She is a vivacicus person and I found working with her fascinating.

Fut I felt any work with the re-electi committee would be fascinating and I like Jim McCord.

I never questioned McCord's orders. I felt he was acting under orders and with full authority. After all, his boss was John Mitchell, the committee director and former Attorney General of the United States.

If that was not enough to impress me with McCord's authority and official standing, we were surrounded by former White House aides McCord said were "on loan" to the committee.

My involvement with the committee began May I when McCord telephoned my home in Hamden, Conn. He had seeured a resume I had filed with the so-

o' ex : BI agents in New York and had reviewed it and several other resumes on file with this society. He . felt that because of my age, background and marital status-I am 36 and single-I was best suited for the position which the war of the same with He said they (the committee) heeded someone immediately so Took a plane to Washington that night and registered at the Roger Smith Hotel where we met the next morning. He emphasized that although the job was temporary, it could be a stepping-stone to a permanent position after Presiedent Nixon's re-election.

We walked a block down the street to the re-election committee headquarters at 1701 Pennsylvania Ave., N.W., a block from the White House, and Mc-Cord took me on a tour of committee offices on several floors. As different persons passed, McCord would say things like, "That's so and so, he's from the White House" or, "There's another one who's on loan from the White House.

We went to the office of Fred La Rue to get approval for my employment and McCord said, "Mr. La Rue is over from the White House. He's John

Mitchell's right-hand man."

La Rue was friendly enough, but very businesslike. McCord read some brief data he had jotted down on the back of an envelope: "Al Baldwin, ex-FBI agent, former Marine captain, law degree, taught police science . . ."

La Rue looked me up and down. I was in standard FBI dress-conservative suit, white shirt and tie and black, wing-tipped shoes. Our conversation was brief. I think he asked if I was prepared to travel and I said, "Yes, sir," He replied, "Okay, that's fine."

La Rue Issues Baldwin A Gun

McCord later issued me a loaded 38-snub-nosed police special and said, "You'll wear this." I had no permit or official identification and questioned whether I was authorized to carry it.

He handed me a card bearing his name and the name of the re-election committee and said: "You're working for the former Attorney General and there's no way a policeman or any other law enforcement officer is going to question your right to carry that weapon. But if you have any problem, have them call me."

In McCord's office at committee headquarters I noticed extensive electronic equipment-walkie-talkies, television surveillance units and various other devices. The top to a fancy briefcase was open, exposing considerable flectronic equipment. I was told it was debugging unit.

McCord told me I would be accompanying Mrs. Mitchell on a trip to Michigan and New York. He issued me \$800-eight brand new \$100 hills-and said it was for food, drinks, tips and incidental expenses for the trip

In Michigan, where Mrs. Mitchell attended several affairs, we were joined by La Rue. He mentioned to me at one mint that the pistol I was carrying Hid once been his weapon. As far as Hnew, he was not in security work and I did not know why he would have needed a pistol But I asked no ques-

From Michigan we went to New York City. One of the FBI's bulletproof limousines used by the late J. Edgar Hoover met us at Grand Central Station and took us to a suburban town where we stayed for two days. When we left, the same limousine picked us up and carried us back to Grand Central Station. I was impressed.

Appreciation from John Mitchell

The campaign trip lasted for seven days. Upon our return to Washington, I was called up to the Mitchell apartment in the Watergate where Mitchell thanked me for the job I had flone.

I had expected to leave in two days; n another trip with his wife, but Mc-cord said she was not feeling well and he situation was so "delicate" that Fred La Rue was accompanying her. He said he had other security work for

me and be advanced me another 500—five brand new \$100 bills.

At McCord's direction, I moved from he Roger Smith Hotel to the Howar Johnson Motel across the street from the Watergate. I checked into Room 419, which he had registered under McCord Associates, the name of his security-firm.

McCord gave me a code name. Bill Johnson, and instructed me to investigate antiwar demonstrations that were occuring in Washington about that time. I was supposed to try to learn of any plans of demonstrators to damage Republican headquarters or to disrupt the Republican convention in Miami in 3 Par 198 August.

I still had no committee identification, however, and twice authorities had to telephone the committee to establish my credentials. Once a Secret Service agent stopped me at the Capitol and another time security police stopped me at Andrews Air Force Base. Both times the committee vouched for my credentials.

On May 24, after about two weeks of covering demonstrations, I visited my ome in Hamden. When I returned to Vashington the next day, I found Jim leCord in Room 419 surrounded by as rray of electronical equipment, in cluding walkie-talkies and the debus ging case that had been in his office the re-election committee. A sophisticated receiving set, which a McCord later said was worth approximately \$15,000, was in a large blue. Samsonite sultcase. There was a portable radio with shortwave band and a sarray of tape recorders and other pleces of equipment.

"You'll Be Doing Some Monitoring"

McCord said, "I want to show you some of this equipment and how we're going to use it." Just like that, no preliminaries and no explanations of why we would use it.

You'll be doing some monitoring on this equipment," he said, and proceeded to show me how to operate the

monitoring unit.

Then he took the room telephone apart and inserted a tap in it. To test the device, he dialed a local number for a recorded announcement. The tap

picked up the message.

McCord pointed across the street to the Watergate and said, "We're going to put some units over there tonight and you'll be monitoring them." He didn't have to tell me; I knew the Democratic National Committee, oflices were in the Watergate.

From the balcony outside Room 419, I watched McCord walk across Virginia Avenue and enter the Watergate complex. Subsequently he appeared at window of the Democratic offices and I could see at least one other per by and perhaps two with him.

McCord later returned to the motel room and said, "We've got the units lover there." He began adjusting the

monitoring unit.

We were not sure whose telephones had been tapped. They had tapped one telephone they believed belonged to a street one they hoped belonged to a graft official close to O'Brien.

staff official close to O'Brien.

McCord finally picked up a conversation on one phone on the monitoring unit. At first we thought the phone was used by a man named Spencer, then we decided it was used by a man named Oliver. Finally, we realized it was used by a man named Spencer Oliver, who happened to be coordinator of the State Democratic Party chalrmen.

A number of persons besides Oliver used his phone too. Over the next three weeks I would monitor approximately 200 telephone conversations. Sure dealing with political strategy and other, concerning personal matters. With several secretaries and others using the phone, apparently in the beinef it was one of the more private lines in the Democratic offices, some conversations were explicitly intimate.

"We can talk," a secretary would say, "I'm on Spencer Oliver's phone."

Ed and George: Hunt and Line

McCord told me two men who were working with him were coming into the motel room and he would introduce us by code names since we were all involved in security work. He introduced them as Ed and George. I have since learned they were G. Gordon Liddy and E. Howard Runt Ir., former White House aides.

McCord explained the monitoring devices and other electronic equipment to Liddy and Hunt. They stayed a short while, then left.

On May 26 McCord told me, "We're going into another area tonight."

About midnight McCord and I left in his car and headed toward the Capitol. He was driving and holding a walkietalkie, which he hooked on and held out through the car window. He finally contacted another unit as we neared the Capitol and said we were approaching the area.

He told me to keep an eye open for a Volkswagen, there was someone in it who would be working with us. On a street near the Capitol we passed a small building bearing a McGovern Headquarters sign and McCord pointed and said, "That's what we're

interested in right there."

Not until then did I realize the target was McGovern Headquarters. An upstairs light was on and a drunk was standing in front of the building.

McCord pointed to a row of buildings across the street from McGovern Headquarters and said, "We're trying to rent a place over there where you'll be doing the same thing you're doing in the other place."

As we passed a parked car about a block from McGovern Headquarters, a voice came in over McCord's walkietalkie: "You just went by us, did you lee us?"

McCord replied that he had and bulled our car alongside the parked car. There were people in the front and back seats.

A man stepped from the car, walked ever to our car and slid into the seat

beside me and started talking to Mc-Cord without even acknowledging t was there. It was Liddy, I could not identify the persons in the back seat.

Liddy, who acted as though he was. McCord's superior, was carrying an attache case. But he did not open it. On a subsequent visit to the monitoring room at the motel he inadvertently left the case. The only item in it at that time was a high-powered pellet pistol, wrapped in a towel

McCord cruised around the Mc-Govern Headquarters as he and Liddy talked. Liddy, holding onto his attache case, expressed concern about a spoilight that illuminated the back of the building and asked. To you think we hught to take it out? McCord said he hought it would not be a problem. McCord and Liddy seemed to be nervous because the Volkswagen had falled to show up and because the drunk was still in front of the building. Finally, about 3:30 am. Liddy said, "We can't do it tonight, we'll have to do it another night."

We let Liddy out of his car and Mc-Cord drove me back to the motel where I would resume my monitoring activities. There was no set time for monitoring. The Democrats worked weird hours, like on Sundays and some days until 3 or 4 in the morning. And when I was in the room, I was monitoring from the time I get up until I went to bed.

How the Monitoring Worked

I would keep an eye on the little
TV-type screen on the monitoring unit.
A constant line ran across the screen
when the tapped phone was not in use.

When someone started using the phone, the line would scatter and a would quickly put on the earphones.

The first couple of days I monitored it, I wrote a log of the calls in long-hand. But after that McCord brought a typewriter and I typed the logs from my notes. I kept them in duplicate and gave both copies to McCord.

Initially, I would write Unit 115 in the upper right hand corner of the log. But McCord, realizing that this was the actual frequency monitored, told me to use a code number and I started using the number 118.

I would also write the date and page number in the upper right hand corner. In the body of the log on the left add I would designate the time and write "unit on." Then I would drop down a line and mark the time of the first recorded conversation and specify "call in" or "callout." I would then write the contents of the conversation.

McCord would come by once or twice a day to pick up the logs. Sometimes the logs would be only a page or two long, but on a busy day they might run to six pages.

When something important is the logs would catch McCord's eye, he would quickly sit down and type up a memo from information in the logs. He would start the memo with, "A confi-

Sometimes when I monitored conversations I thought were especially, in portant I telephoned him at the reelection committee and told him there was something of interest to him. The first couple of times I called I started to tell him about the conversation, but

e said, "Don't talk about it by the elephone. I'll come over."

A few days after the monitoring began McCord instructed me to find another room that would give us a be ter view of the Democratic offices an perhaps help us establish contact with the tap there that we had been unable to monitor.

I checked us into Room 723 with a view directly across from the Democratic offices.

About June 6, McCord left for Miami, advising that he would be gone only a day. The next day he telephoned, however, and said he had been delayed. I replied that I had recorded some important conversations. He did not want to discuss them on the telephone but instructed me to deliver my original logs to an official at the President's re-election committee.

He said to put the logs in an enve-Tope and to staple and tape the envehope. He gave me the name of an official and I wrote it on an envelope. It was someone 1 believed was superior to McCord, although I can't recall his name, but it was not Liddy or Hunt.

That evening I carried the envelope to the committee headquarters, An eldcerly guard was on duty in the lobby of The building and he took the envelope. pecognized the name on it and said he would see to it that the official r ceived it.

McCord told me that he was Miami checking on security arrangements being made for the Democratic and Republican conventions. He said that during the Democratic conven-tionwe'd be needed in Miami for monitoring and other security work and that the President's committee had already opened a suite of hotel rooms down there. For about two weeks we had been trying without success to determine O'Brien whereabouts, Also Me-Cord was interested in the precise location of O'Brien's office since he was uncertain that the tap he had been unable to monitor was actually on O'Brien's phone.

On June 12 McCord told me to visit the Democratic Committee offices under my code name to find out what I could about O'Brien's whereabouts and the location of his office. Since I am from Connecticut and familiar with the Democratic Party officials there, I passed myself off as a nephew of our state chairman, John Bailey.

"This is Bill Johnson of Connecticut, nephew of John Balley," said a secre ary who introduced me around.

O'Brien's secretary said, "Oh, yes, would you like to see Mr. O'Brien's of fice? This used to be your uncle's of-

It was the first time I knew that Bai ley was a former national chairman of

the Democratic Party.

I made a mental note of the office a pcation overlooking the Potomac iver, and I asked if anyone knew Brien's whereabouts. His secretary laid he was somewhere in Miami and subsequently I was furnished Q'Brien's . telephone number in Miami.

I returned to the motel room and gave McCord the number and we went

fover a sketch of O'Brien's office. He seemed extremely pleased.

There were also plans to return to McGovern's headquarters on the weekend. McCord said, "You know the place we were at the other night? We've got to go back there.

Later, Liddy and Hunt came into the motel room. With McCord they walked out on the balcony and looked over to-

ward the Democratic offices.

Before Liddy left, he reached into his inside coat pocket and withdrew an envelope containing a thick stack of brand new \$100 bills. He counted off about 16 or 18 bills and handed them to McCord, who put them in his wallet.

On Friday evening, June 16, McCord displayed a unit that I thought looked like door chimes. He removed the unit's cover, exposing a sophisticated

electronic device.

Then to test the device he put it next to the television set and turned the set on. The unit picked up the television reception. It was a bug, as opposed to a telephone tap, and was the first listening device I had ever seen unattached to a phone.

Later in the evening McCord displayed a shopping bag full of different kinds of tools and equipment-screwdrivers, wires, batteries and soldering irons. The room ended up looking like a small electronics workshop.

Waiting for the Lights to go Off McCord indicated to me that in addition to placing new devices at the Democratic headquarters, the unit we had been unable to monitor would either be removed from the offices or put in a new location in the offices.

We both continued working on the devices for some time. During a telephone conversation McCord said he might have to wait until another night to carry out the mission . . . some guy . was still working in the Democratic offices

Suddenly I saw the light in the coinmittee offices go off and I told Mc-Cord, "Hey, look. The guy's leaving fow."

I walked out on the balcony and watched him cross Virginia Avenue and walk into the Watergate complex.

Less than an hour later, the lights on the entire floor above the Demoeratic Committee offices went on I picked up the walkie-talkie-I don't remember whether I identified myself as "Unit 1" or "Base"—but I said, "We've got some activity."

A man whose voice I did not recognize-it was not McCord-responded.

"What have you got?"

I mentioned the lights going on and he replied, "Okay, we know about that, that's the 2 o'clock guard check. Let us know if the lights go on any other place."

My watch indicated it was \$:15. I figured the guard check was late.

Not long after that a car parked in front of the Watergate and three meli got out and went inside. I wondered that meant anything but I did not use the walkie-talkie at that time.

Suddenly, a few minutes later, the lights went on inside the Democratic offices. I noticed the figures of three men. At least two of them came out on the balcony. They were casually dressed and were carrying flashlights and guns. I could see one man in the office holding a gun in front of him and looking behind desks.

Watching from the balcony outside my room, I grabbed the walkie-talkie and said, "Base to any unit." A voice came back: "What have you got?"

I said, "Are our people dressed caswally or are they in suits?" )

An anxious voice asked, "What?" I repeated the question.

"Our people are dressed in suits," The voice said.

"Well," I answered, "we've got problems. We've got some people dressed casually and they've got guns. They're looking around the balcony and everywhere, but they haven't come across gour people." By now, there was all kinds of police activity—motorcycles—and paddywagons driving up and guys jumping out of patrol cars and running up to the Watergate. Then I saw two men carrying suitcases casually walking out of the hotel section. I recognized one as Hunt; he glanced up at the balcony where I stood, and then with the other man walked over and entered a car parked in front of the Watergate. The two of them drove away.

Moments later I was contacted on the walkie-talkie again and told: "We're on the way up. Be there in a minute." I said, "You'd better not park near this building, police are all over the place."

He said, "Okay."

Then I heard a voice from another unit whisper. "They've got us." Then McCord's voice came through: "What are you people? Are you metropolitan police or what?"

Another voice demanded: "What's that?" And then the unit went silent. I tried to renew the contact, but to no

A few minutes later Hunt, wearing a windbreaker, rushed into the root. He was extremely nervous.

"What do you see?" he asked.

I told him I saw McCord and some other men being led away from the Watergate in handcuffs. He walked over, looked down at the scene and then said: "I've got to call a lawyer."

Picking up the phone, he dialed a local number. "They've had it," he told the party on the other end, adding: "Well, I've got \$5,000 in cash with me

Hunt, hanging up the phone, turned and asked if I knew where McCord lived. I said yes, I had been to his house in Rockville. He instructed me to pack all the equipment and take it to McCord's house and asked if I had a place to go.

I said I could go to my home in Connecticut and he said, "Well, get all this stuff out of here and you get out of here. Somebody will be in touch with

you."

With that, he threw his walkie talkie on the bed and rushed from the room.

Does that mean I'm out of a job?" I shouted after him. But he disappeared down the hallway without answering


