GOLDIN advised that his records failed to disclose that HENRY KUHN has resided at 522 West 112th Street, at anytime during the period from 1968 to the present date.

On October 18, 1972 FRANK FELICIANO, Superintendent, 522 West 112th Street, New York, New York, advised that he has been the superintendent at this address for approximately ten years. He advised that no one named KUHN presently resides at this address and he could not recall anyone by this name as having been a tenant in the building during the past ten years.

Apartment 4D at 694 East 149th Street has been occupied by QUINTON RIVERA and his family since 1968. RODRIQUEZ is not one of the individuals residing in this apartment.

A review of the mail directory and lobby-tenant directory failed to disclose that JORGE RODRIQUEZ resided at 694 East 149th Street.

On October 26, 1972, the records of the United States Post Office, New York, New York, were checked but no record of a forwarding address for JORGE RODRIQUEZ from 694 East 149th Street, Bronx, New York was located.

Synopsis: CAROL HOLMES, Manager, Virginia Brady Answering Service, advised numerous reporters and people representing themselves as members of the Press attempted to obtain answering service records of DONALD HENRY SEGRETTE. PIERCE MARTIN, Security Director, General Telephone Company, Santa Monica, advised that he has submitted SEGRETTE's toll records to the Senate Sub-Committee on Administrative Practices and Procedures chaired by Senator EDWARD KENNEDY. FRANKLIN NEWELL FENSLER interviewed and has no information pertaining to subject matter. Subpoenas served to MORTON BARROWS JACKSON, ESTHER KIRBY, MARY DENBURG, and MARGARET ELAINE JOHNSON for their appearance 1/8/73, at trial for subject matter in Washington, D. C. Subpoenas served on Beverly Hilton Hotel and Beverly Wilshire Hotel for records of HUNT and LIDDY's visits. These records were subsequently turned over to AUSA SEYMORE GLANZER at Los Angeles on 12/7/72. MARY DENBURG contacted SA JOHN M. O'NEILL, JR. and advised she would not testify at trial owing to embarrassment her testimony will cause her. SEGRETTE served with subpoena 12/14/72, by Bureau Agents.

On October 24, 1972, CAROL HOLMES, Manager, Virginia Brady Answering Service, Lincoln Boulevard, Marina Del Rey, California, advised that she was contacted by a TOM GALLAGHER who stated he represented one of the "California Committee States Senators' Offices". GALLAGHER presented HOLMES with a facsimile copy of a Congressional subpoena calling for the answering service

messages in her possession for DONALD HENRY SEGRETTI. This subpoena was issued by the Senate Sub-Committee on Administrative Practices and Procedures dated October 20, 1972, and signed by Senator EDWARD KENNEDY. HOLMES stated that she made the messages available to GALLAGHER, who copied this information contained on the messages and informed HOLMES that she would be summoned before the committee and required to bring the original messages with her. GALLAGHER further inquired from HOLMES if SEGRETTI was known to use any other name. HOLMES advised GALLAGHER that SEGRETTI uses no other name that she is aware of. GALLAGHER further inquired as to whether or not the Virginia Brady Answering Service had a client by the name of SIMMONS, to which HOLMES replied that they had no such client.

HOLMES went on to state that SEGRETTI had not called for his messages since October 16, 1972, which she considered unusual, because he normally obtained his messages on a daily basis, even when she believed he was out of town.

HOLMES advised that in the last two months, she has been deluged by television, radio, and magazine reporters in quest of the telephone answering service records of DONALD HENRY SEGRETTI, however, she maintained that she did not make this information available except upon the presentation of a subpoena specifically calling for this information.

On October 19, 1972, PIERCE MARTIN, Security Director, General Telephone Company, Santa Monica, California, telephonically advised that the General Telephone Company's Legal Department had received a subpoena dated October 13, 1972, requiring production of the telephone calls for DONALD HENRY SEGRETTI's telephone number, Area Code 213-821-9990. This subpoena was issued by the Senate Sub-Committee on Administrative Practices and Procedures which is chaired by Senator EDWARD KENNEDY.

MARTIN advised that the General Telephone Company had complied with the subpoena and furnished the telephone records to Senator KENNEDY's committee.

FRANKLIN NEWELL FENSLER, 2727 Pacific Street, Space 13, Highland, California, telephone (714) 862-2025, was advised of the official identity of SA RICHARD H. PASHLEY and was advised that he was being interviewed in connection with the burglary of the Democratic National Headquarters which occurred on June 17, 1972, in Washington, D. C.

Mr. FENSLER advised that until June 30, 1971, he was on active duty with the United States Air Force at Dover, Delaware. After completing slightly more than 20 years in the Air Force he retired and moved to California. For several months he lived at 7968 Cunningham Street, Apartment Three, Highland, California, and moved to his present address in March of 1972. While in the military he worked as a photographer exclusively. He was never trained in communications and received no special training outside of photographic training. Prior to entering the Air Force he spent three years in the United States Army. During his service in the Army his specialty was light and heavy weapons and he received no specialized training in communications. He has never been contacted by JAMES MC CORD or by anyone in connection with employment with the Republican Party. Prior to leaving the service he furnished his name and a resume to the Air Force and he understands that this information was made available to prospective employers, but the only response he ever received as a result of having submitted his name to this service was from the State of Texas which offered him a job as a Correctional Institution Guard. He is presently working for the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Office in their Photo Lab.

BARBARA SLAVIN, 14014 Northwest Passage, Marina Del Rey, California, was interviewed at her place of employment. She was advised of the official identities of SA RICHARD H. PASHLEY and SA RONALD D. ANDERSON. She advised that she considers herself as good a friend of DONALD SEGRETTI's as he has in the apartment complex where they both reside. She last saw him on October 2, 1972, which she described as three weeks ago last Monday. At that time he was at the apartment complex. She has no idea where he is at present. She believes that his father is picking up his mail.

She noted that on October 10, 1972, she was contacted by an individual identifying himself as D. GORTON, a reporter for the "New York Times". He questioned her regarding the whereabouts of SEGRETTI, and she advised him she had no idea where he was at that time. He commented, "We know SEGRETTI is in Nevada". She has been contacted by other representatives of the news media, but does not recall their names or their employers.

JEAN K. ~~NISHIZU~~, 13904 Figi Way, Apartment 232, Marina Del Rey, California, was advised of the official identities of SA RICHARD H. PASHLEY and SA LARRY WAYNE LANGBERG. She was interviewed at her place of employment and furnished the following information:

She became acquainted with DONALD SEGRETTI while she was living in the apartment complex where he resides. She moved to a new apartment about three months ago and had some difficulty with the moving company involved. DONALD SEGRETTI was present at her apartment when the moving men made certain comments, and because she is suing the moving company she asked if he would testify regarding what the moving company employees said. He said that he would testify and she has kept in touch with him until recently. She does not recall exactly when she last talked to him, but believes it was at least two weeks ago. She has been trying to contact him for the past several weeks to advise him that the date set for her small claims court appearance was October 26, 1972. Unable to locate him she had to postpone her trial date. She could furnish no information regarding his current whereabouts.

Mr. A. H. ~~SECRET~~ SECRET SECRET, 5950 Buckingham Parkway, Culver City, California, was advised of the official identity of SA RICHARD H. PASHLEY and SA LARRY WAYNE LANGBERG. SECRET was interviewed at his place of employment. He advised that he last was in contact with his son, DONALD SECRET, on October 8, 1972. At that time DONALD told him that he would not recontact his parents until November 7, 1972, or sometime thereafter. He did not say where he would be in the meantime, and furnished his father with no means of contacting him. Mr. SECRET was advised that a summons had been issued requiring DONALD SECRET to appear in Federal Court in Washington, D. C., on November 15, 1972, and that it was the desire of the interviewing Agents to serve the summons. He said that he had been contacted by someone from "Kennedy's Committee", indicating the United States Senate Sub-Committee on Administrative Practices and Procedures, who also had a subpoena for DONALD SECRET. He was advised that the interviewing Agents were not contacting him with regard to that committee's hearing, but that the summons in possession of the Agents was for a trial in Federal Court.

He advised that his son was acquainted with SA RICHARD H. PASHLEY who had interviewed him previously, and he was furnished with SA PASHLEY's name and office telephone number. He advised that he would furnish this information to his son as soon as he heard from him.

Mr. SECRET advised that he has received numerous telephone calls at all hours of the day and night from newspaper, magazine, television and radio reporters inquiring about the whereabouts and activities of his son. These calls have placed a very great strain on him and his wife who is very ill. He has responded to every inquiry by advising that he has no information, but has received repeated inquiries nevertheless. He intends to institute civil actions against some of the news organizations which have contacted him.

A review of the telephone records for outgoing local calls from the Beverly Wilshire Hotel, Beverly Hills, California, from Rooms 432 and 438 between January 7 and 11, 1972, and from Rooms 338 and 332 between February 18 and 21, 1972, revealed the calls at the times indicated below. Hotel records further indicate that Rooms 432 and 332 were occupied by GEORGE LEONARD during January and February respectively. Rooms 438 and 338 were occupied by HOWARD HUNT during January and February respectively. The telephone records for each day are kept in individual envelopes with that day's date written on the front of the envelope, and in most instances the slip of paper on which the outgoing telephone information is noted together with the room number of the calling party has a time and date stamp on the back. The asterisk next to the telephone number indicates that the time and date stamp indicate the call was made on the day previous to the date appearing on the envelope containing the record of outgoing calls.

Synopsis: THOMAS JAMES GREGORY, Brigham Young University student, Provo, Utah, born 10/5/47, Morristown, N.J., interviewed 12/19-20/72 and advised he was contacted by letter from HOWARD HUNT during 2/72. HUNT provided GREGORY with round-trip United Air Lines ticket from Salt Lake City, Utah, to Washington, D. C., and \$50.00 cash. On 2/21/72, GREGORY traveled to Washington, D. C., and met with HUNT. HUNT hired GREGORY to work as a volunteer for Presidential candidate MUSKIE, and GREGORY was advised to report to HUNT and was paid \$175.00 per week. GREGORY worked for both MUSKIE and McGOVERN campaigns and reported to HUNT during Spring, 1972. On about 5/27/72, GREGORY attended meeting at some hotel near 15th and K Streets N.W., Washington, D. C. Present at meeting were HUNT, JAMES MC CORD, a third man to whom HUNT seemed responsible, a locksmith of Spanish descent, and about 3 or 4 other men, names unknown. Discussion at meeting dealt with possible "bugging" of McGovern Headquarters, 4th and D Streets, S.E., Washington, D. C. GREGORY learned at this meeting that MC CORD had tried unsuccessfully a week or two earlier to "bug" McGovern's Headquarters. GREGORY discontinued association with HUNT on about 6/15 or 16/72. While employed by HUNT, GREGORY received weekly salary of \$175.00 from HUNT and signed written receipt each time.

DETAILS:

On December 19, 1972, Mr. GORDON BIBBINS, 6B-346 Wymount Terrace, Brigham Young University (BYU), Provo, Utah, was interviewed by SA LOFTIS J. SHEFFIELD in an effort to determine if he had any contact or association with EVERETTE HOWARD HUNT, JR., or any knowledge of the burglary of the Democratic National Headquarters, which occurred June 17, 1972, at Washington, D.C. BIBBINS advised he had not had any contact with HUNT, nor did he have any knowledge in regard to this matter, but he was aware that his former roommate, THOMAS GREGORY, a BYU student, had worked in Washington, D. C., during the Spring of 1972 for one of the Democratic Presidential candidates and he might possibly be in a position to furnish some information regarding this matter.

Mr. THOMAS JAMES GREGORY, college student, age 18, born October 5, 1947, at Morristown, New Jersey, presently residing at 571 North 600 East, Provo, Utah, advised as follows:

He has the home address of 12 James Place, Madison, New Jersey, and will be at that address from December 21, 1972, to January 5, 1973.

On February 9, 1972, GREGORY learned through a friend, ROBERT FLETCHER, age about 28, 28 Dorchester Road, Summit, New Jersey, that there was a possible available job in Washington, D.C., at Democratic Headquarters, working for Presidential candidate MUSKIE and feeding information to the Republican Party. He told FLETCHER that he would be interested. FLETCHER indicated the job would pay about \$175.00 a week.

Within about a week GREGORY received two letters at his residence, 547 East 500 North, Provo, Utah. One letter was signed EDWARD WARREN and the other was signed EARL WARREN. In one letter it was stated the writer was interested in meeting GREGORY and that he would be sending him money, as well as a round-trip plane ticket from Salt Lake City, Utah, to Washington, D.C. GREGORY later learned that the sender of the two letters was one and the same person and that this person was identical with HOWARD HUNT. In one of the letters GREGORY was told where to meet the sender of the letter on about February 21, 1972. The letters were postmarked Washington, D.C., or from that area. It is believed that in the second letter a round-trip United Air Lines ticket from Salt Lake City to Washington, D.C., was enclosed. On approximately the same day that this letter was received, \$50.00 was received by GREGORY at Western Union, Provo, Utah, in cash. He did not see who was listed as the sender but assumed it was HOWARD HUNT, a representative of the Republican Party in Washington, D.C.

No telephone calls were received from HUNT, but GREGORY did receive about two telephone calls from ROBERT FLETCHER about one week after he was first contacted by FLETCHER, which would have been about February 15, 1972. GREGORY

did not ever talk to HUNT while GREGORY was in Utah. During the above two telephone calls, FLETCHER informed GREGORY that he had been in contact with HUNT and that it appeared GREGORY would get the job. These two telephone calls were received by GREGORY before he received the second letter mentioned above.

On February 21, 1972, GREGORY traveled by United Air Lines from Salt Lake City to Washington, D.C., where he arrived at Dulles Airport. He was not met at the airport. He traveled by bus to downtown Washington, D.C., and took a taxi to a hotel, possibly the Park Central Hotel, where he registered. In one of the letters mentioned above he had been given a telephone number to call. The afternoon of his arrival in Washington he called that number and reported his arrival to a man later determined by GREGORY to be HUNT.

That evening HUNT visited GREGORY at the hotel where GREGORY was staying. HUNT was a white male, age about 50, about 5 feet 10 inches tall, with medium build. He said that BOB FLETCHER had recommended GREGORY to him. He asked GREGORY if he had any qualms about working as a volunteer for Presidential candidate MUSKIE and reporting to him (HUNT). GREGORY told him that he did not have any qualms, although he actually did have some. GREGORY assumed HUNT was somehow representing the Republican Party. HUNT instructed GREGORY to go to the Muskie Headquarters and offer his services as a volunteer. HUNT told GREGORY that he would receive \$175.00 per week as salary if things worked out.

The following day GREGORY went to the Muskie Headquarters and offered his services as a volunteer, and his services were accepted. He reported that information back to HUNT.

GREGORY returned to Provo, Utah, on February 24, 1972, where he arranged at Brigham Young University to get credit in Political Science classes for a semester of volunteer work in connection with the presidential political campaign in Washington, D.C. On February 29, 1972, he left Utah and flew to Washington, D.C., via United Air Lines. Meanwhile, he had received about \$80.00 in cash at Western Union, which had been sent by HUNT or his office. Also, he had received a one-way United Air Lines ticket from HUNT.

On March 1, 1972, GREGORY went to work as a volunteer at the Muskie Headquarters at 1972 K Street N.W., Washington, D.C. He worked at that headquarters up until April 14, 1972, and during this period of time he reported to HUNT about once a week, giving HUNT general information regarding MUSKIE's campaign.

Within a few days prior to April 14, 1972, HUNT requested GREGORY to go to the headquarters of Presidential candidate McGOVERN, as it appeared MUSKIE was out of the presidential race. On about April 14, 1972, GREGORY went to McGOVERN's headquarters and volunteered his services, which were accepted.

On about May 27, 1972, after GREGORY had worked about six weeks at the McGovern Headquarters, GREGORY attended at some hotel at about 15th and K Streets N.W., Washington, D.C., in Room 601 or 801, a meeting. At the meeting were HUNT, JAMES McCORD, a third man to whom HUNT seemed to be responsible (white, male, about 40 years of age, with black hair, about the same size as HUNT), as well as a locksmith, who appeared to be of Spanish descent, and about three or four other men, whose names are unknown. These three or four men were apparently the men who were later arrested during the burglary of the Watergate Hotel in June, 1972, as GREGORY recalled seeing their photographs in the newspaper following their arrest. At this meeting HUNT mentioned that the group had two walkie-talkies, which were worth about \$2,000. During the meeting there was a discussion about the possible "bugging" of McGovern's Headquarters, which were at 4th and D Streets S.E., Washington, D.C. There was no discussion about "bugging" the Watergate Hotel, although it was known that part of McGovern's Headquarters was possibly to be moved to the Watergate Hotel. There was a discussion about entering at night or daytime McGovern's Headquarters at about 4th and D Streets, Washington, D.C. McCORD had tried unsuccessfully a week or so earlier to "bug" McGovern's Headquarters, when McCORD walked through the headquarters at about 4th and D Streets during daytime hours.

The following information was furnished by THOMAS JAMES GREGORY on December 20, 1972:

At the above meeting there was no discussion about "bugging" the Watergate Hotel. The discussion was only about

"bugging" the headquarters of McGOVERN at about 4th and D Streets S.E. At the meeting it was mentioned that there was some other "job" to do. It was not known to GREGORY what was meant by the other "job."

At the meeting it was arranged that GREGORY would stay late about the following day, May 28, 1972, at McGovern's Headquarters, and that when he left, he would advise HUNT whether or not anyone was still at the headquarters. When GREGORY left McGovern's Headquarters at about 4th and D Streets S.E., there was still another man at the headquarters and he so informed HUNT by telephone.

As GREGORY was leaving the area of the headquarters he saw three of the men who were at the meeting mentioned above. It is believed that two or possibly three of the men were Spanish looking. GREGORY told the three men that there was someone still in the building, and they left the area immediately.

On the following morning of about May 29, 1972, GREGORY observed there was an armed guard from the Burns Detective Agency at the McGovern Headquarters at approximately 4th and D Streets S.E. He later learned the guard had been placed there because of difficulty with a mentally unbalanced man who had been in the headquarters and causing trouble. Thereafter there apparently was guard duty twenty-four hours a day. To GREGORY's knowledge, the building was never "bugged."

GREGORY left Washington, D.C., May 31, 1972, and was out of town on personal business until about June 6, 1972. He worked about two or three more days at the McGovern Headquarters and decided he would not stay any longer because it was against his conscience to become involved in anything other than just reporting information to HUNT. Even though he would never have done anything directly to help on any "bugging," he did not feel right about being connected in any way with any such plans. He was hired to observe activity and not to do other things. Therefore, he did not work at McGovern's Headquarters after Friday, June 9, 1972. He met HUNT on or about June 15 or 16, 1972, at the Roger Smith Hotel, Washington, D.C., and formally terminated his employment with HUNT.

During the period of his employment, beginning in February, 1972, he received a weekly salary of \$175.00 from HUNT in cash, and he signed a written receipt each time. He usually met HUNT in the lobby of the Roger Smith Hotel at about 17th and Pennsylvania Avenue N.W., Washington, D.C. At these meetings he would inform HUNT of what he had observed at the Muskie or McGovern Headquarters. Usually the information related to scheduled talks and subject matter of talks to be given by the candidates, and the information also related to general information concerning the campaign activity,

GREGORY has no knowledge of the "bugging" or burglary of the Watergate Hotel, Washington, D.C.

PETER SHAW, 15010 Cordell Avenue, Woodbridge, Va., telephone 670-4900, Supervisor of Long Lines for American Telephone and Telegraph Company, Washington, D. C., at 10:15 p.m., 10/19/72, advised he received a call from an individual who identified himself as a reporter for the New York Times, Washington Bureau, by the name of JOHN CREWSDON. CREWSDON said he had information that DONALD SEGRETTI of California had called him at the above 670-4900 number and wanted to know what SHAW knew about SEGRETTI.

SHAW said he questioned the reporter as to how he knew SEGRETTI was supposed to have made a call to him since telephone records are not public. He said the reporter stammered at this question but never directly answered same. SHAW said he told the reporter that he was not sure he was a legitimate reporter and never discussed things over the phone with persons he was not acquainted with. CREWSDON said his office phone was 293-3100 (this is the number for the New York Times, Washington Bureau) if SHAW wanted to talk with him.

SHAW said he is not acquainted with DONALD SEGRETTI and has never received a phone call from him. He also checked with his wife who is the other person using the home phone and she had never heard of SEGRETTI. He said the only call they have received from California within the past several months is one from HERB SCHIMEL, Villa Park, California, telephone area code 714, 637-5852 who was interested in buying a pedigreed cat.
