

The above-captioned matter pertains to our investigation of the Watergate affair. At 3:15 p.m. on 11/15/72, Joe Volz, a reporter 19 for the "Washington Star-Daily News" telephoned Bishop and directed his attention to the attached item in "The Periscope" section of the November 20, 1972, issue of "Newsweek" magazine. He stated that his editors were "extremely interested" in this item, which indicates that the FBI's investigation into the above-captioned matter has produced new evidence of such a nature that Mr. Gray is considering steps to have it placed directly on President Nixon's desk and that the facts that Mr. Gray has are strong enough to spark a public statement on the matter by Mr. Nixon. Volz wished to know if Mr. Gray would make a comment concerning this item.

A check with the Accounting and April Section of the General Investigative Division reflects that no such new evidence has been developed and this item, therefore, is not true. 4

RECOMMENDATION:

That Bishop be authorized to inform Volz that Mr. Gray enies the truth of the attached item in "Newsweek" magazine. 4

MR. NIXON'S MAN AT THE PARTY

A key political decision for President Nixon will be his choice of the next Republican National Chairman. The current party chief, GOP Sen. Robert Dole of Kansas, wants to stay—and has strong backing. Other party leaders, however, would prefer a full-time political pro with no other interests. They would also like a chairman from a big industrial state, as one way to hold the strong blue-collar support Mr. Nixon won last week.

THE NEW AMBASSADORS

Washington's big diplomatic guessing game is whether President Nixon will use political or professional criteria in naming new ambassadors. He has some prizes ready to hand out. Vacant or soon to be are Paris and Stockholm (last held by political appointees); Jerusalem and Moscow (currently filled by professionals). Present clues favor politics. Max Fisher, the Michigan millionaire who is one of Mr. Nixon's close friends and financial supporters, is reported in line for an embassy.

FENCE MENDING IN THE GOP FAMILY

The White House moved swiftly last week to soothe Republican feelings on Capitol Hill, offended by the President's failure to campaign harder for GOP candidates. First, Mr. Nixon's top domestic aide, John Ehrlichman, telephoned Senate Minority Leader Hugh Scott of Pennsylvania to pass on his boss's instructions to "shoot down" rumors that Scott would lose his Senate post. The next day, the President himself called Scott with warm wishes on his birthday.

THE WATCH ON THE RHINE

U.S. troop strength in West Germany will stay within 10 per cent of present levels for the next three years, Bonn has been told very, very quietly by Presidential adviser Henry Kissinger. American troop levels are a most sensitive subject for German politicians, who had feared big cuts were in the offing.

OIL FOR THE LAMPS OF CHICAGO?

U.S. coal operators are fighting to keep the White House from switching some of their prime customers, the Midwest utilities, to the use of oil. The make is dictated by the new clean-air law, which by 1975 will cut sharply the high-sulfur emissions. The choice is either to change the

law (a tough political move) or to bring in "clean" low-sulfur oil from the Middle East. (It is now barred from the central U.S.) The move would mean massive trouble with the U.S. balance of payments. But supporters agree that it will be temporary—to give the utilities the time they need to perfect antipollution technology and methods of "gasilying" coal into clean-burning fuel.

ARAB VS. ARAB

Those recent battles between rival Arab guerrilla factions in Lebanon, in which some 30 were reported killed, were over money, according to intelligence sources. Libya's President, Col. Muammar Kaddafi, had given two leaders of Al Fatah, the biggest guerrilla group, more than \$1,000,000 as part of his program to finance their anti-Israel effort. The leaders, however, kept the money—and the reports say they are using it to unseat Yasir Arafat, top man in Al Fatah.

WATERGATE AND THE WHITE HOUSE

FBI director Patrick Cray is so exercised over new evidence produced by the probe into the Watergate bugging and other political sabotage cases that he is considering steps to have it placed directly on President Nixon's desk. The facts Gray has, insiders say, could be strong enough to spark a public statement on the matter by Mr. Nixon, who to date has largely ignored it.

NEXT, GERMAN SKYJACKERS?

West German security experts are braced for another skyjacking, this one completely divorced from Arab terrorism. They fear that German anarchists may take a leaf from the Arab book in an effort to free a dozen imprisoned members of the Baader-Meinhof group, whose reign of terror had Germany in an uproar last year.

JOB SEEKING AT JUSTICE

One Cabinet officer who wants to stay on for Mr. Nixon's second term is Attorney Ceneral Richard Kleindienst. To help his cause, he is drafting a blueprint for restructuring and refurbishing the Justice Department, proposing new approaches to such problems as prisons, drugs and legal aid. Working against Kleindienst are the enemies he has made among the White House staff and his reputation as a political operator, starting with his 1964 role as a manager of Barry Coldwater's Presidential campaign.

Nationwide survey of independent TV servicement reports Zenith Color TV needs fewest repairs.

Here are the questions and answers from a 175-city survey of multiple-brand TV service shops.

Which color TV needs the fewest repairs?

Independent TV servicemen were asked this question because they are in a unique position to judge the reliability of different color TV brands.

Every major brand sold in the U.S. was included in this study.

This is in response to question #3 by the Acting Director on the attached memorandum dated 11-15-72, T. E. Bishop to Mr. Felt, which states, "I am not aware that DJ has authorized us to investigate 'other political sabotage cases'...have they and are we?" U

To date the Department of Justice has not requested any investigation of political sabotage cases nor are we investigating any. U

On 10-17-72, the activities of Donald H. Segretti (a California attorney hired by Dwight L. Chapin, Deputy Assistant to the President) as related by Segretti to the Bureau on 6-26-72, and his alleged political harassment activities against the democrats as reflected in various articles appearing in the "Washington Post" were discussed with Assistant Attorney General Henry E. Petersen, Criminal Division. Mr. Petersen stated he was fully aware of Segretti's activities and does not believe such are in violation of any Federal statutes and accordingly saw no basis for further investigation of Segretti by the FBI. 4

The FBI Laboratory is also requested to identify any other examination which may be conducted by the Laboratory which will establish any further similarity or difference between any of the recovered devices. The Lab's comments should set out, if possible, when such examination may result in the alteration or destruction of the evidence should that examination be conducted.



Laboratory could run an elemental analysis on the antenna wire used in Qi and Q8 to determine whether of similar composition. If found to be similar, this would not ordinarily be conclusive evidence that both came from the same source but would merely indicate that both could have come from the same source. This type of test, if desired to be conducted, will require removal and destruction of approximately 1 1/2 inches of the antenna vire investorated of Qi and Q8.

Results of Examinations

Transmitters designated Q3, Q4, Q5 and Q8 in the Laboratory Report regarding "James Walter McCord, Jr., Et Al Burglary, Democratic National Committee Headquarters, Washington, D. C., June 17, 1972" dated June 28, 1972, which were returned to the Laboratory on October 1, 1972, were compared with Q1 in the Laboratory Report regarding "Unsub(s) Democratic National Committee Headquarters, Washington, D. C. September 13, 1972, IOC" dated September 28, 1972.

In addition to the information contained in the above mentioned Laboratory Reports the following observations were made concerning Ct., Q1, Q1 and Q6:

Qi is obviously different in design and construction from Q3, Q4, Q5 and Q8 with respect to most observable features. While Qi, Q3, Q4 and Q5 all have alligator clips with No. 30 stamped on them, the stamp on Q3, Q4 and Q5 is one size and the stamp on Q1 is a different size. See attached photograph which shows the difference in the stamp size. C8 has no such clip. The alligator clips on Q1 and Q3 both have black vinyl sitp-on insulators with "Mueller USA" "No. 36" on them and are of the same size and type. The clips of Q4 and Q5 do not have insulators on them. In this regard Mueller alligator clips and clip-on insulators are very sommon and widely available.

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The antenna wire used in QI is dissimilar to the antenna wire used for specimens Q3, Q4 and Q6; while the antenna wire used in QI is similar in appearance to the antenna wire used on Q8, this type wire is widely available.

The type of construction used in QI is different from that used in Q8 in that several of the components of Q3 are mounted in the circuit board and on both sides of the elecult board whoreas in QI all components are soldered to the top of a circuit board. Moreover the elecult board used in Q1 is different in appearance from that used in Q8. It appears from X-rays of Q5 that the components of Q5 are mounted through and on both sides of the circuit board in a manner similar to that used in Q8. No X-rays were made of Q3 and Q4 because of the similarity of Q3, Q4 and Q5 and the possibility of circuit damage resulting from X-rays.

The basic electronic circuit of QI is different from that of Q3, Q4, Q5 and Q8 in that Q3, Q4, Q5 and Q8 all have two funable collections whereas QI has no tunable coll, uses only one coll, and has a tunable capacitor which is not present in the other units.

Other obvious differences in construction and size are apparent from the attached photographs.

The microphone associated with Q8 is similar in appearance to a knowled Electronics 1590 DW083 microphone. It is noted that part of the container used in fabricating QI was fashioned from a Knowles Electronics plactic box. However, Knowles microphones are widely available and there is no way by which the Laboratory can definine whether the plactic box of QI was ever associated with the interophone of Q8.

U 139-4019-1 The Office of Legal Counsel has advised there is authority for the position that the FBI cannot act on a request for investigation except under conditions established by the Attorney General. This is based on the constitutional separation of powers under which the Congress lacks the authority to require the Executive Branch or an agency in the Executive Branch to conduct investigation upon request. Further, the PBI is in the Department of Justice (Title 28 USC 531) which is under the control of the Attorney General. By Title 28 USC 533 the Attorney General is authorized to appoint officials to conduct such investigation regarding official matters under the control of the Department of Justice and Department of State as may be directed by the Attorney General. Clearly, the

In addition, the Department has, from time to time, issued orders that congressional request for testimony must be channeled through the Office of the Deputy Attorney General. Examples of these are memoranda to heads of divisions, bureaus and officials captioned "Testimony Before Committees of Congress," prepared by the Deputy Attorney General 3/26/69, and 3/18/68. These are contained in Bureau files 66-3288-270 and 66-3288-252, respectively. Therefore, we conclude that instructions received from the Attorney General are binding on the FBI and are fully supported in the law.

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

- 1. Lt Colonel James McCord was born on 26 January 1924 at Waurika, Oklahoma. He was graduated from the University of Texas with a Bachelors Degree in Business Administration in 1949, and in 1951 had 15 semester hours at Lincoln Law School, Oakland, California.
- 2. He was enlisted in the Air Force from 23 November 1943 to 24 July 1945 at which time he was discharged to accept a commission as a 2d Lt with a bombardier rating, and was on extended active duty until 14 November 1945. From 15 November 1945 to 30 June 1963 he was on reserve status as an intelligence officer and had 139 days active duty. He was inactive from 1 July 1963 to 30 June 1964. He was then assigned to duty as an intelligence officer with AFESS-FE at Headquarters USAF. During this period, the servicing CBPO was located at Bolling AFB. On 15 June 1970 he was reassigned to duty as Commander, Detachment 23, 1st Censorship Squadron, Arlington, Virginia. This Detachment was under command control of the 1st Censorship Squadron, Ft Totten, New York. The CBPO for the Detachment was at ARPC until 1 May 1972 at which time the responsibility was transferred to the 459th Military Airlift Wing, Andrews AFB.
- 3. Colonel McCord has 17 years, 8 months, and 8 days good reserve time toward retirement. We do not yet have the AF Form 190 for the period from 1 July 1971 to 30 June 1972. There is a report of active duty for training from 17 July 1971 through 31 July 1971.
- 4. His record shows evidence of a background investigation completed in November 1951 and filed at Hqs OSI (IG), Washington, D. C. The current Roady Reserve Agreement (DD Form 1644) obligates him to reserve service until 18 September 1972.
- 5. The officer effectiveness reports and the training reports since 18 February 1967 have been quite complimentary. Many of them are based on intelligence achools including the Defense Intelligence School, U. S. Navai Station, Anacostia, Washington, D. C., and the John F. Kennedy Center for Special Warfare at Ft Bragg, N. C.

Davis further claims that sometime in the Spring of 1972 he flew Barker, McCord and another individual of Cuban descent from Woodbridge, Virginia, to Del Rio, Texas. There Barker, McCord and the other individual met with a man in an automobile, whom Davis claims to be former Secretary of the Treasury John Connally. Davis said he took photographs of this meeting with a hidden camera and he claims to have negatives of photographs of this meeting.

Efforts are being made by Assistant U. 8. Attorney Silbert to have Davis brought to Washington, D. C. for an in depth interview by Special Agent Angelo J. Lano, the case Agent. Failing this, Special Agent Lano will be instructed to immediately proceed to New York City to interview Davis. Leads regarding attached interview with Davis are being held in abeyance pending Special Agent Lano's interview.

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

On December 5, 1972, you raised with Mr. Kinley the question whether, in light of Judge Sirica's liberal attitude towards the scope of admissible evidence in the Watergate trial as reported in the newspapers. the FBI has met whatever responsibility it has to investigate charges of political sabotage which have been widely discussed in conjunction with the Watergate case. #

The proposed memorandum from you to Mr. Petersen submitted herewith for your consideration is an outgrowth of meetings Miss Herwig and I had first with Mr. Kinley and then with Messrs. Gebhardt, Gallagher, Bolz and Nuzum. U

In connection with this proposed memorandum, the grown considered whether to attach to it certain news articles, notably those from the Washington Post, which have discussed these alleged acts of political sabotage. It was decided that if we did this, we would run the risk of failing to forward to the Department some article containing some allegation which someone later will say should have been included in our presentation to the Department. Although Mr. Dalbey has cited certain Federal statutes which may have been violated by the reported acts of sabotage, a decision was made not to specify any particular statutes but instead to leave a consideration of various statutes entirely to the judgment of the Department. U



Following is a reply to these questions, each of which is numbered to correspond with numbers placed alongside the Acting Director's notations. (1) Attached is a copy of the FD-302 setting forth the interview on 7/3/72, conducted of Miss Kathleen Ann Chnow. Also attached is a copy of Washington Field Office teletype dated 7/7/72, containing information as to Miss Chnow's testimony before Federal grand jury. (Note-True name is Chnow not Chenow).

- (2) During interview, Miss Chnow advised as noted in the attached FD-302, she was requested by David R. Young to install a private telephone in a suite at the Executive Office Building and to arrange to have the billing for this phone sent to her home address. According to Young, who was interviewed on 7/3/72 Hunt, while working with Young on the Pentagon Papers, asked to have a telephone installed in the office which would not go through or be billed to the White House switchboard. Hunt told Young he needed a private line for "operatives and CIA contacts" to reach him directly without them knowing this phone was in the In addition, Hunt needed a phone where messages ... White House. could be received by a secretary. It was important for someone to take messages because Hunt was in the office so seldom. Young told Miss Chnow to set up such a telephone which she did. received the bills for this phone at her home address, which we will be address, which we will be address. bills she forwarded to John Campbell of the White House staff for payment. Investigation disclosed Hunt received and made numerous long-distance calls over this telephone, generally to Becomed I. Barker in Miami, who was arrested at the time of the 🚟 Watergate burglary.

developed no information to support this allegation other than that which is shown from review of Hunt's toll call records that he was in frequent contact with Donald Henry Segretti, who was hired by Dwight Chapin of the White House staff to engage in acts of political harassment against Democratic candidates.

- (4) The article states that investigators have said the campaign of spying and disruption against Democratic candidates was conceived by high White House aides. During our investigation of this matter, Dwight Chapin of the White House staff admitted on 8/28/72, that he hired Donald H. Segretti for the purpose of harassing Democratic candidates. Chapin further admitted that he authorized attorney Herbert Kalmbach of the West Coast Committee to Reelect the President to pay Segretti for his services in this regard.
- (5) With regard to the newspaper's statement that according to Miss Chnow there was a special team of so-called "plumbers" assigned to investigate Government leaks to the news media, Miss Chnow did not furnish us any such information during her interview on 7/3/72. Young advised us on 7/3/72, that he was assigned to find "leaks" and Liddy and Hunt worked for Young. In our interview of Miss Chnow, she said she did not know what duties Hunt and Liddy performed.
- (6) With regard to Miss Chnow's testimony before the Federal grand jury, the Washington Field Office teletype dated 7/7/72 (attached), states that in her appearance before the grand jury,

- (7) With regard to the newspaper's account that Miss Chnow said that neither she nor David Young had any idea that Hunt or Liddy might have been involved in undercover political operations, this is virtually the same information she told our Agents. The newspaper quotes Miss Chnow as having stated that after the Watergate bugging, Young "put two and two together;" however, in their interviews, neither Miss Chnow nor Young told us any such thing.
- (8) According to the article, Miss Chnow stated that various individuals from the Committee to Reelect the President called either Hunt or Liddy using regular White House telephones. She said she had no idea of the purpose of these calls and at no time was there any suggestion that they involved anything sinister. This is in agreement with her interview by our Agents as she told them she had no idea as to Hunt or Liddy's duties.
- (9) The article states that Miss Chnow was tracked down in England shortly after the Watergate burglary by a member of John Dean's staff, that she was asked to accompany him to Washington to be interviewed and that subsequently, she was questioned by two FBI Agents in the presence of Dean, Young and another White House aide. We have no knowledge as to any contacts by a member of the White House staff with Miss Chnow in England; nor do we know in what manner she returned to the United States. She was questioned by two FBI Agents in the presence of Dean, and Fred Fielding, Dean's assistant (see attached FD-302).

(10) The newspaper reports that the day before Miss Chnow appeared before the grand jury, Assistant U. S. Attorney (AUSA) Earl Silbert questioned her extensively and asked if she thought that Charles Colson was involved in the bugging. She is quoted as saying that she knew nothing about the bugging. AUSA Silbert advised Washington Field that during Miss Chnow's grand jury testimony,

Miss KATHLEEN ANN CHNOW, was interviewed at room 107 of the Executive Office Building, 17th and Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. (WDC), in the presence of Mr. JOHN DEAN, Legal Counsel to RICHARD M. NIXON, President of the United States and Mr. FRED FIFLDING, Mr. DEAN's chief assistant. At that time Miss CHNOW furnished the following information:

She had been employed in a secretarial capacity to Mr. DAVID YOUNG of room 16, the Executive Office Building, WDC from June 1971 until sometime in March, 1972. During her employment in this capacity in October, 1971, Mr. YOUNG requested of her to have a private telephone line installed in a suite of offices located at room 16 so that Mr. E. HOVARD HUNT will be in a position to receive calls on that phone line. This phone was to be billed to Miss CHIOW at her home address, 501 Slaters Lane, Alexandria, Virginia. Miss CHIOW agreed that this phone was installed per the directions of Mr. YOUNG and that Miss CHIOW brought the bills, approximately two, into the office and forwarded those bills to Mr. JOHN CAMPBELL, staff secretary to RICHARD M. NIXON, President of the United States.

Miss CHNOW advised that this phone remained in the office of room 16 for approximately five months, and to the best of her recollection the phone was taken out in the middle of March, 1972. Miss CHNOW advised that Mr. YOUNG's office consisted of four rooms; Mr. YOUNG's office, center office, conference room and a small reception area. The phone which he had installed and billed to her residence was an actual extension on two phones setting on actual desks in the center office and possibly authorized extension went into the conference room. Miss CHNOW stated that Mr. HUNT visited YOUNG's office on an average of approximately two times a week and that he did not maintain office space in room 16, but had an office on the third floor of the Executive Office

Miss CHNOW advised that she last saw Mr. HUNT in March, 1972, in the EOB. Miss CHNOW believed that Mr. HUNT was assisting Mr. YOUNG in the aftermath of the "Pentagon Papers." Miss CHNOW stated that she was also acquainted with Mr. G. CORDON LIDDY, in that he was the third party that assisted Mr. YOUNG and that he occupied an office in the same general location of YOUNG. The last time Miss CHNOW observed LIDDY was in February, 1972, when he appeared at Mr. YOUNG's office in order to pick up mail addressed to him. Miss CHNOW stated LIDDY left the employ of the White House in December, 1971, for employment with the Committee to Reelect the President. Miss CHNOW advised that she did not know what duties either Mr. HUNT or Mr. LIDDY performed for the White House but that they had occupied staff positions. She advised that the phone installed for Mr. HUNT in room 16 was essentially a private line for Mr. HUNT and it acted as an answering service.

Miss CHNOW stated that at the present time she is not an employee of the U.S. Government and that in fact was on an extended visit of Europe, and returned to the United States per the request of Mr. DEAN.





In January, 1971 a net lease to a partnership consisting of MAX SCHAUB and another individual was terminated as a result of the condemnation of the premises known as the Hemilton Motel at 141-13 West 73rd Street.

The Hamilton Hotel was being operated by the partnership of MAX SCHAUB and after it closed down, no tenants
occupied any part of the premises. He advised that Crel
Associates did not maintain a list of tenants at the
Hamilton Hotel in January, 1971, and that any such list
would be in the possession of the partnership of MAX
SCHAUB which operated the Hamilton Hotel.

LAWRENCE MILLER, Assistant to Commissioner, Department of Relocation and Management Services, New York City Housing and Development Administration, 100 Gold Street, New York, New York, was interviewed and he furnished the following information:

He advised that his department supervised the relocation of tenants from the Hamilton Hotel, 141-143 West 73rd Street, New York, New York, which was closed down on January 9, 1971, pursuant to an order to vacate, dated December 29, 1970, issued by the New York City Department of Health. He advised that as a result of this vacate order, all of the tenants at the Hamilton Hotel had been forced out of their apartments and had to locate new residences. The last tenant of the Hamilton Hotel left on January 9, 1971, and, thus, the order to vacate was fully complied on January 9, 1971.

Willier furnished a copy of the order to vacate as well as a document known as the Building Face Sheet Residential Tenants, which set forth the identities of the tenants occupying apartments at the Hamilton Hotel as of December 29, 1970. No true name or alias of any of the individuals regarded as suspects or subjects in the burglary of the Democratic Party National Headquarters, Washington, B.C., on June 17, 1972, was included on this list of tenants.

MILIER advised that a subpoens duces tecum for the production of the original "Building Face Sheet - Residential Tenants" (tenant list as of December 29, 1970) should be directed to Mr. JUAN VILLANUEVA, Commissioner, New York City Bousing and Development Administration, 100 Gold Street, New York, New York.

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MILIER advised that his department did not prepare a document or memorandum confirming that the order to vacate was fully complied with on January 9, 1971, inasmuch as the other New York City agencies, which had an interest in the compliance of the vacate order, had their representatives at the Hamilton Hotel on January 9, 1971. Thus, there was no need for written verification and dissemination of a document to the effect that the Hamilton Hotel was completely emptied on January 9, 1971.

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IV. ALLEGATIONS AND ADMISSIONS OF ROBERT THURSTON DAVIS

ROBERT THURSION DAVIS was interviewed in Room 237, Skyline Noter Inn. Tenth Avenue and 50th Street, where he was residing while in protective custody of the United States Marshal a Service. DAVIS voluntarily furnished the following information to the interviewing Agents: Assistant United States Actorney (AUSA) JAMES W. RAYHILL, Southern District of New York (SIRY), New York, New York, was present at the interview at the specific request of AUSA EARL BILBERT of Washington D.C.

In the Spring of 1972, while working in Memphis, Tennesses, in protective custody for the United States Secret Bervice, the Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms Division of the United States Treasury Department, and the Office of the Tempesces State Attorney Coneral, DAVIS met and worked with a United States Secret Service (USSS) Agent named TOM SCOTT on an investigating assignment for approximately three weeks TINN DAVIS worked in the Memphis area for approximately six wooks and then came to Fort Belvoir, Virginial where he remained in the protective custody of the United States Marshal's Service under the assumed name of Major ROBERA HARRSTON.

in Washington D.C. named the Black Greco, where again he met up with TOM SCOTT. DAVIS and SCOTT renewed their acquaintance on a social basis and after a short time. Score introduced DAVIS to BERHARD BARKER and JAMES MC OORD as individuals who worked for the United States Government, MO was dating a girl named LINDA who worked at the "Black Grego"

Phortly after becoming associated with BARKER. MO CORD and SCOTT, DAVIS was asked by SCOTT to perform an errand which involved picking up a box from SCOTT and delivering it to ARKER. DAYIS agreed and was given a box by SCOTT at the This Is It bar, Washington D.O., which he delivered to BARKES at a drive-in theater in from Mill, Maryland. DAVIS could not recall the exact name of the theater but believed it had some type of indian name. The box was in an open condition and DAVIS objerved that it contained eight electronic "transmitter

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After making the delivery to BARKER, DAVIS recontacted SCOIT and asked him for an explanation concerning these electronic transmitters. SCOIT indicated that this equipment was going to be used in bugging the Democratic Party Mational Headquarters Washington D.C., because it had been learned that people working for United States Senator MECREE MC GOVERN were in contact with the Cuban Government. Therefore the Democratic Party Mational Headquarters was being bugged in the interest of national security.

Thereafter, DAVIS was asked by BARKER and SCOTT if he would be willing to fly an airplane for them. DAVIS agreed and flew BARKER and an individual named SEGRETTI from Woodbridge Airport to Richmond, Virginia. A Cessna 310 aircraft was used for this flight. DAVIS thought that this aircraft was owned by some company or corporation. The group flew back to Woodbridge after an approximate stay of one half hour at the Richmond, Aiport.

Approximately one week later DAVIS flew BARKER and MC CORD to Baltimore, Maryland, from Woodbridge Airport. The group returned to Woodbridge after picking up some boxes.

After the above flight to Baltimore, SCOTT paid DAVIS \$1500 for his services.

Thereafter, DAVIS flew BARKER and SCOTT from Woodbridge Airport to Baltimore, Maryland, and returned on the same day.

Approximately two weeks later, BARKER asked DAVIS
if he would fly to Texas. BAVIS accepted and flew BARKER.
MO CORD and another individual of apparent Cuban extraction from
Woodbridge to Del Rie, Texas. A Cessas 310 aircraft was used
for this flight. Two refueling stops were made between Woodbridge
Airport and Del Rio, Texas. The flight arrived in Del Rie,
Texas in the late morning hours, possibly around 10 AM ex 11 AM.
Woom arrival, BARKER, MC CORD and the other individual disembarked
from the aircraft. Shortly thereafter DAVIS followed that from
the aircraft to attend to some routine matters relating to the
aircraft and the next flight. He then observed his aircraft
passengers seated in a Ford LTD automobile parked in the wigikity
of the aircraft. Seated in the back seat of this autohobile
with MC CORD was an individual he recognized to be JOHN/CONNALLY.

the former Secretary of the United States Treasury Department. Seated in the front were BARKER, the other aircraft passenger and one unidentified individual. Upon approaching the automobile, he was waved back in a manner indicating that his presence at the car was not desired. DAVIS returned to the aircraft and obtained a hidden camera device. He then went back to the vicinity of the automobile and took photographs of these individuals while they were getting out of the automobile.

DAVIS claims to have taken three camera shots of the above meeting and claims to have three negatives available at the house of his mother in Dallas, Texas. DAVIS also claims to have a flight log of this Del Rio flight.

DAVIS advised that his aircraft has on the ground in Del Rio for less than an hour. BARKER, MC CORD and the other passenger returned to the aircraft and instructed DAVIS to fly back to the Woodbridge Airport. During the flight back, DAVIS observed MC CORD opening a satchel which appeared to contain large sums of money. DAVIS expressed curiosity about the money and BARKER explained that there were certain people concerned about MC GOVERN's relations with the Cubans and that these individuals wanted to finance an operation whereby is would be insured that President NIXON got the facts about this situation.

DAVIS asked in reference to CONNALLY, "Wasn't that one of our great white fathers in the car", and BARKER responded "Yeah!"

Within a few days after the Del Rio plane trip, SCOTT paid DAVIS another \$1500 for his services.

Shortly after the Del Rio plane trip, DAVIS and SCOTT entered on the premises of the Democratic Mational Party Headquarters located at the Watergate Hotel, Washington D.C. Entry was accomplished by SCOTT picking the locks to the doors of the Democratic Party Headquarters. DAVIS claims that he devices that had been planted at various locations within the Democratic Party National Headquarters. SCOTT was knowledgesble

Locations to DAVIS. DAVIS and SCOTT made several entries into the Democratic Party Mational Headquarters on different days for the purpose of checking out hidden electronic transmitting devices. DAVIS advised that during these entries, SCOTT also located other hidden electronic devices which did not belong to his group.

DAVIS advised that he was not involved in the burglary of the Democratic Party National Meadquarters on June 17, 1972, since he had severed his connections with this group prior to that day. He stated that he learned through the media that MC CORD, BARKER and others were arrested in the Democratic Party National Headquarters at the Watergate Hotel on June 17, 1972. He advised that he was invited to go along on this specific trip, but declined because too many individuals were going to be involved and that therefore the chances of being detected were too great.

DAVIS advised that the electronic transmitters used by SCOTT's group operated on frequencies P1-165.7875 and P2-165.3750. He advised that two Kel Corporation units used in the bugging of the Democratic Party National Headquarters were model R-2, serial number 1185, and model T-2, serial number 674. DAVIS voluntarily furnished Special Agent RICHARD SLOAN a 6x9 sheet of paper which set forth the above frequencies and the serial numbers of the above Kel Corporation units, Attached hereto is a copy of the front and back of this sheet of paper furnished by DAVIS.

DAVIS also advised that BARKER, MC CORD and SCOTT often referred to the site of the Democratic Party National Headquarters at the Watergate Hotel by the code name VFirst No. Base.
