Police Informer Offered Guns

to VVAW

Miami Police confirmed Iriday that they hired the Cuban informer who taid Vietnam Veterans Against the War that he could help them buy machine guns just before the 1972 political conventions.

overt act necessary to produce a charge of conspiracy," said Maj. Adam Klimkowski, Commander of the City of Mami Police Department's Special Investigations Sequences

Police Chief Bernard Carmire confirmed that the Minimistry frames met with the VVAW just before seven VVAW members and one sympathizer were indicted by a federal grand jury for conspiracy to disrupt the conventions with arms, including automatic weapons.

THE indictments apparently were based on other information. Klimkowski admitted that the veterans did not respond to the weapons offer extended by the Miami informer.

The Mami police were working "very closely" with the FBI, Garmire said, but he and Klimkowski denied that their agent was a provocateur.

"At no time would we le cast in the role of a provocateur," Gaunire said. But he courefuled that Pablo

fernandez, an informant paid by his department, "wils probably a fomenter of problems."

Klimkowski confirmed a report by The Herald last Wednesday that the mission of Fernandez, 28, a stock clerk, was to find out whether VVAW Florida coordinative Scott Canni wanted to hay weapons from militant anti-Castro Cuban exiles in Miami. Camil is one of the defendants.

"WE DID not want Camil to actually acquire weapons," Klimkowski said. "We wanted to find out what was in the back of his mind."

The FBI refused to domment because it said the defendants are under indictment.

The police officials made their statements after they were presented Friday afterncion with results of a Herald investigation that independently established that:

Fernandez admits telling Camil and other VVAW members he knew of "50 submachine guns which were supposed to be for sale."
What he did not tell the veterans, he told The Herald, was that he also knew "the FEI was watching those guns."

Bob Davis. a staff member of the Metro Community Relations Board, says he at-

tended a meeting, about two weeks before the Democratic convention opened July 10 in Miami Beach, at which remandez told the VVA.W that "militant Cubans" might "blow up the Center for Dialogue," an anti-establishment meeting place then used by the VVAW.

It was after tolling the votor ans, Davis says, that Fernandez mentioned the 50 submachine guns.

Fernandez maintains the reterans brought up the subject of weapons and he was just playing them along for the police and the FBI. But he admits that far from being the VVAW sympathizer he was purporting to be, he had in fact just returned from a trip to Washington with Bernard Barker and other Miami Cubans to attack left-wing demonstrators at J. Edgar Hoover's funeral.

Barker and three others fivere arrested June 17 when they returned to burglarite the Watergate headquarters of the Democratic National Committee. Fernandez says

HE WAS busy, he said, spying on the VVAW for the Miami police and the FBI.

Klimkowiski confirmed Friday that "Pablo's involvement with the VVAW was with our knowledge and approval." Fernandez operated out of an office called first the Strategic Intelligence Unit (SIU) and later the Defensive Intelligence U n 1 t (DIU), whose "exclusive responsibility was to find out plans of groups that might disrupt the conventions."

The police department first made contact with Fernandez or! Dec. 17, 1971, through officer Raphael Aguirre, a plainclothes member of the D₂U staff.

Beginning Dec. 21, 1971, Fernandez went to the police station as often as three times a week in a series of meetings that continued until after the conventions, Aguirre said. He said that Fernandez was paid on an irregular basis — "sometimes 1 might give him \$10 or \$15."

BEGINNING May 30, and acting on police instructions, Fernandez had at least three meetings with Camil and other VVAW members. "I convinced them I was a leftist," he told The Herald.

The first meeting was at a Haleah drugstore. Fernandez wore a hidden listening device planted on him by the police. The bag dan't work,

Aguirre disclosed Friday, "because Pablo got out of range and we couldn't use it"

Afterward, however, Fernandez reported to the police what was said at the meeting.

The meeting recalled by Davis, the CRB official, took place at the Hialeah home of Alton Foss, then the VVAW Miami coordinator and now one of the defendants in the conspiracy case.

BY THAT time. Fernandez had also met on two occasions with the VVAW at the Miami police headquarters. The VVAW, which requested those meetings, thought they were negotiating with someone who could represent militant Cuban groups and work out an agreement for peaceful demonstrations at the conventions.

Fernandez told them he represented a particularly militant Cuban exile organi-

zation known as Abdala. In fact, he has told The Herald, he was spying on Abdala for another Cuban group.

Some of these meetings it is not clear how many also were attended by two Dade County Public Safety Department officers who had infiltrated the VVAW.

Foss says that these agents, Gerald Rudoff and Harrison Crenshaw, tried to "set me up" on still another occasion to meet with Fernandez to discuss a weapons purchase. He refused to go to that meeting.

KLIMKOWSKI was asked Friday whether he knew, at the time the meetings were taking place, that Rudoff and Crenshaw were in fact sheriff's deputies.

"I'd rather not answer

The Public Safety Department has denied that its officers were provocateurs.

On behalf of the VVAW, Camil said Friday that the police disclosures "just corroborate what we've been saying the whole time—that we were coming to the convention to exercise our constitutional rights, and not to cause problems, and that what problems did occur were caused by provacateurs."

Ironically, Klimkowski agreed that for all his efforts, Fernandez never brought back anything damaging to the veterans on whom he spied.

Informant Told Miami Policeman Of Pre-Watergate Operations

An informant told the Miami Police Department about the involvement of Miami Cubans in clandestine political activity in Washington before the June 17 Watergate burglary.

But the policeman who received the tip says he didn't pass it on to his superiors or to the FBl because he felt it was "vague" and "could be classified as a rumor."

Police officer Rafael Aguirre confirmed in an interview with The Herald that the informant, Pablo Fernandez, told him he hid gone to Washington on May 4, 1972, for the funeral of J. Idgar Hoover, and he had dashed with anti-administration demonstrators.

The Herald quoted Fernandez Wednesday, as saying his boss on that mission was Miami real-estate broker Bernard Barker.

BARKER and five other Miamians returned to Washington May 27 and bugged the Democratic National Committee in the Watergate complex. When Barker and three members of the group again broke into the Watergate June 17, they and James McCord, security director of the Nixon campaign, were caught and the Watergate scandal was born.

It was before the June 17 arrests, the Miami officer hays, that Fernandez, who was working as a paid poince informer, "mentioned he was going to take a second trip to Washington."

Aguirre, whose police job was to gather intelligence remaining to the national political conventions, says Fernandez did not say way he had been asked to go back to Washington.

"He cloaked this trip with secrecy."

Fernandez previously told. The Herald he knew nothing of the return trips. According to Aguirre, Fernandez said he knew about them but might not be able to go "because he was on probation...he killed a man."

(IN 1967, when he was a 22 year-old security guard for the Saxony Hotel on Minmi Busch, Fernandez shot a fellow hotel employe in a dark room. The man died; Fernandez said it was an accident. A second-degree murder charge was reduced to mapslaughter, and, on Dec. 2, 1970, Fernandez was sentenced to seven years probation).

Fernandez, now a heavyequipment stock clerk in a Miami, did not return to Washington with the group that would become known as the Watergate burglars.

Aguirre, the policeman whom Fernandez had been working for since December 1971, says Fernandez never mentioned Barker's name to him.

But a former member of the Metro Community Relations Board says Fernandez tasked to him during the same period about Barker and his efforts to recruit his ami Cubans for clandestine work. Ironically, this man has the same last name as the

policeman with whom Fernandez was talking — Aguirre.

NOW A graduate student in Columbus, Ohio, Ben Aguirre worked for the CRB in Miami during the spring of 1972. He and the policeman, Raphael Aguirre, say they are neither related nor acquainted.

In his work for the CRB, Ben Aguirre told The Herald In an interview last week, he met Pablo Fernandez. On June 16 — the day before the abortive Watergate burglary — Fernandez came to him with "some very dangerous information which could have cost him his bead and could have cost me mine...

"He had information in regard to Mr. Barker and Mr. Martinez (Eugenio R. Martinez another of the convicted bu glars)...

"In essence, he was telling me Mr. Barker and Mr. Martinez were hiring groups (Indicate page, name of newspaper, city and state.)

Fernandez did not specifically mention the bugging or burglary of the Watergate offices, Aguirre says. "I do not think he knew about it."

FERNANDEZ told The Herald he wasn't recruited for that mission, but was offerred \$700 a week by Martinez to embarrass Democratic presidential candidate George McGovern "for the Republican Party." Fernandez, who makes \$800 a month in his regular job, said he turned down the ofter because he already tvas spying on Vietnam Veterans Against the War for the police and the FBI.

The police say they paid Fernandez only sporadically, \$10 or \$15 at a time. The FBI refuses to say anything about him.

The police maintain that they did not take Fernandez seriously while at the same time confirming that they used him as an informer to gather evidence against the VVAW.

On Saturday, The Herald reported Fernandez's spy role against the VVAW, and tile police confirmation that "Pablo's involvement with the VVAW was with our knowledge and approval."

But, in the same interviews, police officials said they discredited the information Fernandez brought them and finally got rid of him: 1

"He was told to stay away from the station . . . he was told, 'Don't call us, we'll call you'" said Police Chief Bernard Garmire.

ALTHOUGH Fernandez had been visiting regular polide headquarters since Dec. 21, 1971, Garmire said he had no knowledge of the informerb work at the time.

Pablo Fernandez until west received the call (from The . Herald last Wednesday), te chief said.

With a Herald reporter present, Garmire questioned his policeman, Aguirre:

Q — At any time did Pernandez tell you he was working for Barker?

A. -- No, sir.

Q. — Did he at any timetell you anything concerning the activities of a guy by the name of Barker?

A. — No, sir.

Q. — Did anyone else tell you . . ?

A. - No, sir.

Q. Did anyone ever sen you anything about a group of coole involving Miamians Intent upon conducting the grary of Waterpate?

A - No. sir.

But, when questioned by a the reporter. Aguirre confirmed that Fernandez fold him of the trip to the Hoover funeral and the disruption of demonstrations there — and the plans for a return trip to Washington on an specified mission.

> Mrs. Hogan Memorandum Mr. Walters to Mr. Felt 5/31/73 requested the Intelligence Division set forth current status of any on-going investigation and inquiry dealing with dissemination of FBI material to Hunt and Liddy by the Internal Security Division and the alleged hiring of Pablo Fernandez to infiltrate the Vietnam Veterans Against the War. These were items 1 and 4 in Mr. Eardley's memorandum to Mr. Cox dated 5/31/73 and are the only items being handled by the Intelligence Division.

Information regarding these matters has been compiled and is being set forth in suitable memoranda which, when completed, will be sent forward.

Memorandum 6/1/73, Mr. Miller to Mr. Felt captioned "Daniel Ellsberg" set forth results of conference that same date with Special Prosecutor Archibald Cox and his assistant, Thomas McBride. Approval was requested therein to send instructions to the field for the purpose of developing information concerning the handling of Ellsberg cas material by Departmental officials. It will be necessary to interview Departmental officials to secure answers to the question Mr. Eardley raised relating to dissemination of FBI material to Hunt and Liddy by the B Internal Security Division. Upon approval, we will conduct the necessary interviews of Departmental officials to be in a position to respond in full to Mr. Eardley's question.

Reference is made to memorandum of Special Prosecutor Archibald Cox to the Acting Director dated June 5, 1973, captioned "Watergate and Related Investigations" which requested that a searching interview be promptly conducted of Robert Thurston Davis.

Mr. Davis arrived in Washington, D. C., for purpose of interview in late evening of November 22, 1972. Preliminary interview revealed Davis could not identify the Watergate Office Building; he could not identify the Howard Johnson Motel across from the Watergate complex; he did not accurately describe the doors leading to the Democratic National Committee Headquarters; and he did not furnish an accurate description of the wiretap device and the "bugging" device. Mr. Davis did, however, identify photographs of James Walter McCord and Bernard L. Barker but the physical descriptions furnished by Mr. Davis prior to his photographic identification were not consistent with the physical descriptions of those individuals.

On November 24, 1972, in a debriefing session, Mr. Davis stated he had developed a photograph taken by himself of John Connally and Bernard L. Barker. He was alleged to have a short tape recording of Barker and Connally and that both of these items were stored at 733 Crockett Drive, Hutchins, Texas. He further stated that a flight brief case and a silver medal box containing dates and license numbers of meeting places, are presently stored at Acme Moving and Storage Company, 3555 North Andrews Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, Florida, under the name of Jerry Harrston. These items are stored in the custody of the U. S. Marshal, Miami, Florida.

Concerning this Bureau's investigation of Mr. Davis, our Alexandria Office on November 28, 1972, determined from the Office of the Provost Marshal, Fort Belvoir, Virginia, that there are no records showing a vehicle registration for Frank Carter, aka Bernard L. Barker, Bernie Barker, or James W. McCord. The Provost Marshal's Office and the Criminal Investigation Detachment, Fort Belvoir, had no record concerning these individuals and no knowledge of any "protective custody" of Robert Thurston Davis. No listings of these individuals could be located at the Post Locator or Housing Office, Fort Belvoir.

JAMES WALTER MC CORD, JR., AND OTHERS

The records of this Bureau concerning Davis, who is assigned PBI number 289 852B, disclose the following: On December 10, 1968, the records of the Federal Correctional Institute, Seagoville, Texas, reflected that Robert Davis has heart trouble and the latest progress report concerning him, dated April 29, 1966, sets forth information that Robert Davis

Davis at Terre Haute, Indiana on May 19, 1964, it was noted that Davis came from a broken home

The psychiatrist did not at that time hote any psychotic or neurotic tendencies. A history of Davis dated April 16, 1964, noted that

The above-stated investigation supplements that reported in the enclosed interview reports and should be considered as such. In view of the investigation already conducted concerning Davis, no further action is anticipated by the FBI in absence of a specific request.

ROBERT THURSTON DAVIS was interviewed in Room 237.

Skyline Motor Inn, Tenth Avenue and 50th Street, where he was residing while in protective custody of the United States Marghal's Service. Entity columnarily furnished the rollowing information to the interviewing Agents; Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) JAMES W. RAYHILL, Southern District of New York (SDNY), New York, New York, was present at the interview at the specific request of AUSA EARL SILBERT of Washington D.C.:

In the Spring of 1972, while working in Memphis, Termessee, in protective custody for the United States Secret Service, the Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms Division of the United States Treasury Department, and the Office of the Tennessee State Attorney General, DAVIS met and worked with a United States Secret Service (USSS) Agent named Toby SCOTT on an investigating assignment for approximately three weeks. DAVIS worked in the Mamphis area for approximately six weeks and then came to Fort Belvoir, Virginia, where he remained in the protective custody of the United States Harshal's Service under the assumed name of Hajor RODERN HAPRETON.

While at Fort Belvoir, DAVIS began frequenting a bar in Washington D.C. named the "Black Greco", where again he met up with TOM SCOTT. DAVIS and SCOTT renewed their acquaintance on a social basis and after a short time, SCOTT introduced DAVIS to BEFNARD BARKER and JAMES MC CORD as individuals who worked for the United States Government. HC CORD was dating a girl named LINDA who worked at the "Black Greco".

Shortly after becoming associated with BARKER,
MC CORD and SCOTT, DAVIS was asked by SCOTT to perform an errand whic
involved picking up a box from SCOTT and delivering it to
BARKER. DAVIS agreed and was given a box by SCOTT at the
"This Is It" bar, Washington D.C., which he delivered to BARKER
at a drive-in theater in Oxon Hill, Maryland. DAVIS could not
recall the exact name of the theater but believed it had some
type of indian name. The box was in an open condition and
DAVIS observed that it contained eight electronic transmitters.

After making the delivery to BARKER, DAVIS recontacted SCOTT and asked him for an explanation concerning these electronic transmitters. SCOTT indicated that this equipment was going to be used in bugging the Democratic Party National Headquarters Washington D.C., because it had been learned that people working for United States Senator GEORGE MC GOVERN were in contact with the Cuban Government. Therefore the Democratic Party National Headquarters was being bugged in the interest of national security.

Thereafter, DAVIS was asked by BARKER and SCOTT if he would be willing to fly an airplane for them. DAVIS agreed and flew BARKER and an individual named SEGRETTI from Woodbridge Airport to Richmond, Virginia. A Cessna 310 aircraft was used for this flight. DAVIS thought that this aircraft was owned by some company or corporation. The group flew back to Woodbridge after an approximate stay of one half hour at the Richmond, Aiport.

Approximately one week later DAVIS flew BARKER and MC CORD to Baltimore, Maryland, from Woodbridge Airport. The group returned to Woodbridge after picking up some boxes.

After the above flight to Baltimore, SCOTT paid DAVIS \$1500 for his services.

Thereafter, DAVIS flew BARKER and SCOTT from Woodbridge Airport to Baltimore, Maryland, and returned on the same day.

Approximately two weeks later, BARKER asked DAVIS if he would fly to Texas. DAVIS accepted and flew BARKER, MC CORD and another individual of apparent Cuban extraction from Woodbridge to Del Rio, Texas. A Cessna 310 aircraft was used for this flight. Two refueling stops were made between Woodbridge Airport and Del Rio, Texas. The flight arrived in Del Rio, Texas in the late morning hours, possibly around 10 AM or 11 AM. Upon arrival, EARKER, MC CORD and the other individual disembarked from the aircraft. Shortly thereafter DAVIS followed them from the aircraft to attend to some routine matters relating to the aircraft and the next flight. He then observed his aircraft passengers seated in a Ford LTD automobile parked in the vicinity of the aircraft. Seated in the back seat of this automobile with MC CORD was an individual he recognized to be JOHN CONNALLY,

the former Secretary of the United States Treasury Department. Seated in the front were BARKER, the other aircraft passenger and one unidentified individual. Upon approaching the automobile, he was waved back in a manner indicating that his presence at the car was not desired. DAVIS returned to the aircraft and obtained a hidden camera device. He then went back to the vicinity of the automobile and took photographs of these individuals while they were getting out of the automobile.

DAVIS claims to have taken three camera shots of the above meeting and claims to have three negatives available at the house of his mother in Dallas, Texas. DAVIS also claims to have a flight log of this Del Rio flight.

DAVIS advised that his aircraft was on the ground in Del Rio for less than an hour. BARKER, MC CORD and the other passenger returned to the aircraft and instructed DAVIS to fly back to the Woodbridge Airport. During the flight back, DAVIS observed MC CORD opening a satchel which appeared to contain large sums of money. DAVIS expressed curiosity about the money and BARKER explained that there were certain people concerned about MC GOVERN's relations with the Cubans and that these individuals wanted to finance an operation whereby it would be insured that President NIXON got the facts about this situation.

DAVIS asked in reference to CONNALLY, "Wasn't that one of our great white fathers in the car, and BARKER responded, "Yeah!"

Within a few days after the Del Rio plane trip, SCOTT paid DAVIS another \$1500 for his services.

shortly after the Del Rio plane trip, DAVIS and SCOTT entered on the premises of the Democratic National Party Headquarters located at the Watergate Hotel, Washington D.C. Entry was accomplished by SCOTT picking the locks to the doors of the Democratic Party Headquarters. DAVIS claims that he accompanied SCOTT in order to check out electronic transmitting devices that had been planted at various locations within the Democratic Party National Headquarters. SCOTT was knowledgeable

as to their specific location and pointed out some of these locations to DAVIS. DAVIS and SCOTT made several entries into the Democratic Party National Headquarters on different days for the purpose of checking out hidden electronic transmitting devices. DAVIS advised that during these entries, SCOTT also located other hidden electronic devices which did not belong to his group.

DAVIS advised that he was not involved in the burglary of the Democratic Party National Headquarters on June 17, 1972, since he had severed his connections with this group prior to that day. He stated that he learned through the media that MC CORD, BARKER and others were arrested in the Democratic Party National Headquarters at the Watergate Hotel on June 17, 1972. He advised that he was invited to go along on this specific trip, but declined because too many individuals were going to be involved and that therefore the chances of being detected were too great.

DAVIS advised that the electronic transmitters used by SCOTT's group operated on frequencies F1-165.7075 and F2-165.3750. He advised that two Kel Corporation units used in the bugging of the Democratic Party National Headquarters were model R-2, serial number 1185, and model T-2, serial number 674. DAVIS voluntarily furnished Special Agent RICHARD SLOAN a 6x9 sheet of paper which set forth the above frequencies and the serial numbers of the above Kel Corporation units. Attached hereto is a copy of the front and back of this sheet of paper furnished by DAVIS.

DAVIS also advised that BARKER, MC CORD and SCOTT, often referred to the site of the Democratic Party National Headquarters at the Watergate Hotel by the code name 'First Base".

Mrs. SALLY DAVIS, 733 Crockett, home telephone number 225-5535, was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agents and the nature of the interview. Mrs. DAVIS volunteered she is currently separated from her husband, ROBERT TRURSTON DAVIS, and is now residing with her mother-in-law, RUTH KEENE in Hutchins, Texas. She is employed by Modern Home Appliance, 219 Preston Valley Shopping Center, Dallas, Texas, telephone number 233-6492, in a clerical capacity.

She last saw her husband in July, 1972, when she returned to the Dallas area from Ft. Belvoir, Virginia. ROBERT stayed in their rented home on the base. While living in the Washington area she recalls that her husband had in his possession several black film strips which appeared to be negatives. She is not familiar with what was exposed on the negatives. Additionally, she observed numerous cassette tapes in DAVIS's automobile which were later placed by him in a dresser drawer in their house. The tapes were lying loose in the drawer and she recalls the film strips were contained in a yellow envelope. She does/know the content of the tapes.

When Mrs. DAVIS returned to Butchins from Ft. Belvoir, she brought none of her husband's belongings but only took her clothing and clothing for her children. The only tape she could produce was a Scotch Cassette entitled, "Shelly school and Driver Linges." Mrs. DAVIS furnished this tape to the interviewing Agets and stated she believes it is a recording of a telephone conversation between herself and either Deputy U. S. Marshals JIM GARDNER or JIM COLOSANTO of Washington, D. C. The conversation deals with her attempts to obtain a driver's license and reasons her children were not enrolled in school.

Mrs. DAVIS reiterated she was in possession of no other tapes or film strips or negatives belonging to her husband. She noted she was aware of very little of her husband's activities and is now in the process of obtaining a divorce. In the event she learns of anything pertinent, she will cooperate fully with the Federal Covernment and furnish same to the interviewing Agents.

Mrs. RUTH KEENE, 733 Crockett Street, Hutchins, Texas, telephone number 225-5535, was advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents and the nature of the inquiry. She is employed for Universal Pool Products, Dallas, Texas, telephone number 241-7811.

ROBERT THURSTON DAVIS and on November 24, 1972, she received a call from him in Washington, D. C., regarding a film strip and cassette tape recording which DAVIS stated were in Mrs. KEENE's residence in Hutchins, Texas. She is aware of no such tape or film strip and advised she has searched the house subsequent to her conversation with her son and was unable to locate anything of this nature. She observed that SALLY DAVIS, her son's wife, returned from Washington, D. C., in July, 1972, but only brought her personal belongings and none of her husband's property.

Mrs. KEENE is now married to SALLY DAVIS's father and resides with SALLY DAVIS. In the event she locates a film strip or tape recording she will immediately make them available to the FBI.

Mrs. SALLY DAVIS, 733 Crockett Street, Hutchins, Texas, was contacted at her place of employment, Modern Fome Appliance Company, 210 Preston Valley Chopping Center, Dallas, Texas, and was interviewed in private. She then It hished the following information:

She reiterated she has no tape or film negative belonging to her husband other than the cassette previously furnished the interviewing Agents. She does not recognize the names BARKER or MC CORD as being acquaintances of her husband and does not recall any friend of her husband who drove a yellow Ford LTD. Her husband, however, drove a yellow LTD for about two months in the spring of 1972. This vehicle was rented from an unknown auto rental agency at National Airport by her husband, using the name ROBERT HARRSTON. The Ford did not have Ft. Belvoir stickers.

During the time Mrs. DAVIS lived with her husband in the Washington area, which was Fovember, 1971, to July, 1972, she was aware of no employment on his part with the Secret Service, nor does she recall any charter flights her husband made, but did remember that on three occasions he left the house stating he was going up in a helicopter with a serviceman stationed at Ft. Belvoir. She did recall a brief trip he made to Memphis, Tennessee, where he made contact with an unknown individual while utilizing a microphone and tape recorder secreted on his person. She believes this work was performed at the request of the United States Attorney's Cffice in Memphis. This is the only instance she is aware of involving his use of wiretaps or similar devices.

She advised her husband has two girl friends she knows of and they might possibly have information about his activities not known to her. They are VIRGINIA "PEACHES" BRITT, a go-go dancer at the This-Is-It Club in Washington, and JERRI HICKMAN, whom she suspects moved into their house after Mrs. DAVIS left.

Krs. DAVIS again promised that if she learned any additional information concerning her husband's tapes or photographs, she would immediately contact the interviewing Agents.

Mr. JAMES JOHNSON, Day Manager, The Black Greco, 2000 L Street, N.W., Washington, D. C., furnished the following information:

The Black Greco is owned and operated by Blackies, Inc., and personnel records are maintained by last name and first initial only. At the present time there is no waitress working at The Black Greco by the name of LINDA. He recalled that there formerly was a waitress working at the lounge whose name was LINDA, but he believes that she left the employment of the owner sometime ago.

Mr. JOHNSON contacted the Personnel Office, which maintained payroll and employment records and was advised that a girl named LIND, WELB had been employed as a waitress at The Black Greco, but that she had not worked at the club since November, 1971.

Mr. JOHNSON telephonically contacted the Night Manager of The Black Greco and also the former Assistant Manager of The Black Greco who is now employed elsewhere in the Blackies chain and both advised him that they cannot recall a blonde waitress named LINDA working at The Black Greco in the Spring of 1972.

She is a good friend of VIRGINIA PRITT, who is also known or "LEACHES" ARITT, who is a gogo dancer at the citt. "PRACE of use of reside with her at 1239 Vermont Averue, N.W. Collington, D. C. until August, 1972, when she approved to LAMISTON. She stated that she is also acquired with Markston, and that he is a Secret Service Agent. She stated that he once showed her his badge which stated that he was a Secret Service Agent and bore number 409. He told her that he was ascigned to protect Governor GEONCE WALLACE and Senator EDWARD KENNEDY. She recalled that his picture was in the Washington Daily News with Senator KENNESS and Governor WALLACE at about the time that Governor WALLACE was shot.

She stated that HARRSTON drives a 1969 to 1971 Chevrolot Corvette with Virginia license plates, and that he has a telephone in the car. She stated that HARRSTON spent a great deal of time at the club, and that he often was in the company of other Speret Service Agents. He always carried a white metal box with him which contained camera equipment, and he frequently took pictures of the dancers in the club.

Miss WADE advised that at the present time, "PEACHES" is not living with HARRSTON because he is in the protective custoff of the Secret Service, inasmuch as he is being sought by the Mafia.

Miss WADE viewed a photograph of ROBERT THURSTON S. FBI Rumber 289 852 B and identified him as the indi-mi whom she knows as ROBERT HARRSTON.

Examination of the two cases revealed that they contained numerous personal items, but no license numbers, dates, or information pertaining to meetings or conferences.

As authorized, the above-described cases and their contents were removed to the Miami, Florida, office of the FBI for future examination by attorneys of the United States Department of Justice.

Assistant Chief of Police Thomas A. Hutson, Dallas Police Department, on June 6, 1973, advised crime scene search by Dallas Police Department Crime Scene Search Unit of the residence of Robert S. Strauss, 6223 Deloache Avenue, Dallas, on July 8, 1972, developed no latent fingerprints or other pertinent physical evidence. Hutson furnished copies of Dallas Police Department Offense Report Number 186384D, which shows the burglary of the Strauss' residence was reported by Jewel Nelson, colored female, age 45, on July 8, 1972. The offense allegedly occurred between the hours of 5:00 p. m., and 9:00 a. m., July 7-8, 1972. The report stated an unknown person entered and ransacked the master bedroom while Strauss was on vacation. Strauss was away at the time the complaint was made and would furnish a list of any property taken upon his return.

Captain Douglas H. Gassett, Crimes Against Property Division, Dallas Police Department, advised the Strauss' burglary was handled by his officers and no suspects have been developed. No property was reported stolen.

On 5/18/73, SAS VINCENT A. ALVINO and JOHN F. MALLEY, interviewed JACK GREENBERG and JAMES M. NABRITT, III, Attorneys at the LDF, 10 Columbus Circle, New York, New York, who furnished the following information:

They advised that their organization was founded by the NAACP in 1939, but became totally independent of the NAACP in the early fifties. The LDF is primarily a law office involved in community legal work and, consequently, over the years has represented clients embroiled in sensitive, public-issue matters receiving widespread publicity.

With reference to GREENBERG's letter. dated 5/2/73, to AUSA SILBERT, GREENBERG repeated the details of the burglary as set forth in this letter. From these details, it could be inferred that the burglars were not after money or valuables, but were motivated by the desire to obtain some kind of information located in LDF files. Assuming the latter motive, GREENBERG and NABRITT discussed those matters considered sensitive which the LDF was involved in at the time and prior to the burglary. Mr. GREENBERG furnished the NYO the results of its survey of sensitive LDF matters pending at the time or prior to the burglary. (See enclosures # 2 and 3).

Concerning the six categories set forth in the LDF memorandum of 5/24/73 (enclosure ‡3), GREENBERG and NABRITT agreed that the school desegregation cases which LDF was handling, would have provided the most compelling motive for the burglary, assuming that "the plumbers" or HUNT and LIDDY were responsible for the burglary. GREENBERG pointed out that the school desegregation cases were politically volatile and that the government might find it advantageous to secure, in advance, any blueprint or time-schedule for initiating such cases, that the LDF might have on file in its office. GREENBERG conceded, however, that any such legal strategy in school desegregation cases obviously becomes known immediately when plaintiff-pleadings are filed, and that any number of legal dilatory tactics could be employed to suspend a final court decision.

They also pointed out that MARDIAN was general counsel of the Intergovernmental Committee on School Desegregation around the time of the burglary and that the LDF was holding conferences with this Committee at the time. They mentioned this aspect in possible support to their theory that LIDDY and HUNT committed the burglary, since it has become public knowledge that MARDIAN quite possibly has promoted

questionable investigative techniques while heading the Internal Security Division of the USDJ.

In summation, they stated that they have no evidence whatsoever bearing on the identity of the burglars and have pointed out possible motives for the burglary under the assumption that LIDDY and HUNT actually committed the burglary.

They were advised that no information had yet come to the attention of AUSA SILBERT that would implicate the subjects in the burglary of the LDF office.

On 6/5/73, Detective VINCENT MANGIAMELE, 3rd Division Burglary and Larceny Squad, NYCPD, 357 West 35th Street, New York, New York, furnished enclosures (4), (5), and (6) which reflect the extent of the NYCPD investigation conducted in the burglary of the LDF. He advised that a latent fingerprint examination was not conducted during the initial investigation of this burglary. It must be noted that since the burglary did not result in personal injury, missing property, and had no unusual circumstances at the time, it would be normal for the NYCPD to close the case immediately; such a policy is necessitated by the enormous volume of burglaries reported to the NYCPD.

No further investigation is being conducted by the NYO concerning the LDF burglary and its possible relation to captioned matter.

RE: LDF Cases involving the Federal Government in the Fall of 1971

As you requested, I have surveyed the cases we were involved in around the time of the 1971 Labor Day weekend to see whether we were involved in anything that might be of interest to "the plumbers." My survey reveals that we were involved in an unusual number of cases in opposition to the government, a number of which related to the general concerns of the White House group as reported in the newspapers.

- 1) In June, 1971 we had won <u>Swann</u> and <u>Davis</u>, which were sure to lead to substantial increases in busing if they were enforced vigorously. It is my recollection that George Wallace was already trying to make political capital because the decisions were handed down by the Nixon court.
- 2) From spring, 1971 to the summer of 1972 we were involved in the <u>Caldwell</u> case. Of course, Caldwell was a New York Times reporter and I know that I talked to Jim Goodale at the Times over the telephone on a number of occasions about various aspects of the case during the summer and early fall of 1971. Also, the <u>Caldwell</u> case arose directly out of the activities of the Internal Security Division, which was then headed by Robert Mardian. We have had reliable information that the ultimate aim of the investigation was to develop a Smith Act prosecution against the Black Panthers.
- 3) In June of 1971 we had filed our brief in the Bobby Seale case and were actively involved in the appeal until the spring of 1972. It is interesting to note that we won the <u>Seale</u> case in the Seventh Circuit because of wire tapping logs that showed, according to the Court, that intrusions were made into the defense counsels of Seale. We never saw the logs and do not know whom they show was being tapped, since the government chose on remand to dismiss the contempt proceedings rather than reveal them, ostensibly because they involved "national security."

- 5) We had won the Muhammad Ali case in June, 1971. Standing alone, of course, that case would not seem sufficient to be of interest, but in conjunction with the other matters we were involved in, it could help the White House jang to conclude that we were part of whatever conspiracies they had decided were in progress.
- 6) Finally, Jim recollects a number of episodes around that time involving school desegregation. One was a rumor going around the Justice Department that we were not going to push. Swann in the fall of 1971 but would wait until 1972 when it would be politically embarrassing to Nixon. Where that story came from has never been established. The second incident was the meeting with George Shultz concerning the effect of Swann, which he recalls as being totally negative and hostile. Both events indicate that the Administration was well aware of the political ramifications of our work at a time when it appeared that Nixon might be in danger of losing the 1972 election.

In light of the newspaper reports as to what was being planned by the White House and particularly in light of the memorandum which Senator Symington has been revealing, the White House was engaged in a general program of political espionage against a variety of groups and organizations that they thought were hostile to the Administration. Given the frame of mind of people like Mardian, et al., it is not inconceivable that they decided to try to find out what we were up to, and/or get hold of a list of our contributors, as the Watergate burglars were trying to get from the Democratic Party files.

On June 7, 1973, an unknown person telephonically (long distance) contacted the Seattle Office of the FBI and advised that he was involved in an illegal business which involved the purchasing of gold bullion outside the United States for persons in the United States. The unknown caller advised that approximately 75% of his clients are doctors.

The caller then advised that he recently observed a person who was testifying at the Senate Committee on the Watergate Hearings who had given him \$1,100,000. in cash to be deposited in foreign banks. The caller advised he charged a fee of \$11,000. for making the transactions and deposited approximately one third of the money in a Swiss Bank Corporation; one third in a Swiss Credit Bank; one third in the Bank of Nova Scotia and purchased \$100,000 worth of gold bullion which is placed in corporate custody in another country. The caller advised that he exchanged the money for travellers checks and has possession of the slips which were attached to the travellers checks. The caller then advised that he has delivered the receipts and certificates of ownership to one of the persons who testified at the Watergate Hearings.

The caller would not divulge his name nor the name of the person who had given him the \$1,100,000. until he had

some form of guarantee of immunity from prosecution. The caller was articulate and sounded to be a white male with no specific accent. He also sounded to be knowledgeable regarding foreign and domestic banking and general business procedures.

The caller advised he was presently in the Seattle, Washington area and would remain in the Seattle area until Sunday, June 10, 1973. The caller then advised he would make a return call to the FBI, Seattle office on Monday, June 11, 1973 in an effort to determine if immunity could be provided in return for information leading to the person who had given him \$1,100,000. to be deposited in foreign banks.

On June 5, 1973, William Robert Harris telephonically contacted the Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) in Los Angeles, California, and furnished the following information:

Harris identified himself as a male Caucasian, born July 30, 1941, at New York City, New York, and having social Security Number 128-32-2350. He advised he is currently employed by the Rand Corporation, 1700 Main Street, Santa Monica, California, telephone number 393-0411, extension 7856, and that his residence is located at 31 Buccaneer Street, Marina del Rey, California, telephone 396-8754. He is currently working for the National Security Council under contract with the Government and is generally involved in classified activities.

Harris advised that earlier that date he reviewed the Saturday, June 2, 1973, edition of the New York "Times," specifically the article entitled "Unused Spy Plan Under FBI Study" with byline by John Crewdson came to his attention. After reading the above article, he realized that the FBI is apparently conducting an independent investigation with respect to the 1970 Domestic Intelligence Plan and that this investigation might possibly relate to him.

Harris stated on June 4, 1973, he sent a letter addressed to the Acting General Counsel Niedleh Lehner

Cappucci, Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD) wherein he requested the General Counsel's Office to conduct an investigation regarding electronic surveillances of his various residences between 1969 and the present date allegedly in the interest of national security. In this letter, he specifically indicated the residences, the places involved with their respective telephone numbers and he set forth these as follows:

Harris advised that in 1969 and later he had a safe in his residence to store classified materials, specifically at his residence of 54 Lime Street, Newburyport, Massachusetts. In May 1972, he requested an electronic sweep of those premises by the FBI. He made this request

in a letter addressed to Special Agent in Charge (SAC) Handley of the Boston, FBI Office. He was later told by Mr. Gerald Zarrow from the Office of Industrial Security, Waltham, Massachusetts, telephone number 617-894-2400, extension 644 or 645, that electronic interference was located on his telephone at his Lime Street residence. Harris further advised that he has additional evidence with regard to electronic surveillances being placed on his other telephones with the exception of his Rand Corporation telephone, which he considers to be "clean".

Harris stated that he did not send a copy of the above referred to letter to the FBI since he wanted to give the Secretary of Defense an opportunity to conduct his own investigation with respect to electronic surveillances of his telephones as well as mail covers and to determine whether these were justifiable and in the interest of national security. In addition to the above letter, he personally telephonically contacted Acting General Counsel Lehner on June 4, 1973, and requested the investigation be completed by June 14, 1973. June 14, 1973, he will be in Washington, D. C. on business and at that time he intends to go to the General Counsel's Office to discover the results of that agency's investigation. He emphatically stated that he did not want to talk to anyone from the FBI prior to June 14, 1973, but that he would like the Bureau in Washington apprised of his situation so that if he does not get a satisfactory answer from the General Counsel's Office he will go directly to the Bureau in Washington and request a complete investigation of this matter by the FBI. He further stated that when in Washington he may elect to contact the Senate Committee investigating the Watergate affair and the Watergate prosecutors. The reason he has not gone to the Watergate prosecutors up to the present time is that he does not want any adverse publicity to fall upon the Rand Corporation by virtue of it being his employer.

Harris further advised that in the past he has done work for the Democratic National Committee and he published an article entitled "Internal Security

Government: Need for President's Reappraisal, "wherein his theme was that prior to any electronic or other surveillance being achducted on individuals, a court order should first be obtained. This article was published in a book entitled "Surveillance and Espionage in a Free Society" edited by R. H. Blum, published by Praeger in New York in 1972.

For your information, I have this day made the following requests to the FBI Washington Field Office.

- 1. Interview of Thomas V. Jones concerning his cash contributions to Herbert Kalmbach in late July or early August, 1972.
- 2. Obtain certified copies of income tax returns and information about any IRS audits or investigations pertaining to Dean, Haldeman, Ehrlichman, Mitchell, Caulfield, Colson, Magruder, LaRue, and Strachan for the years 1970, 1971, and 1972.
 - 2A. Obtain certified copies of tax returns, information about IRS audits or investigations pertaining to Hunt, Liddy, and McCord.
 - 3. All pleadings, depositions, etc. concerning lawcuits filed in 1962 California gubernatorial election in which Haldeman and Ehrlichman may have been involved.

- 4. Ascertain the organizational employed structure of the White House, particularly so far as Haldeman, Ehrlichman, Dean, and Colson are concerned, i.e., to determine who their respective staff assistants are, secretaries, etc.
- 5. Ascertain who the custodians of the White House files are, the organization of the files and the way files are retrieved.
- 6. Ascertain the existence of all records relating to telephone calls through the White House switchboard, and telephone call records maintained by secretaries or administrative assistants for the ex-White House personages of interest to this investigation.
- 7. Interview Murray Chotiner to determine his relationship with John Mitchell, his receipts of money from Mitchell \$18,000, his know-ledge of Chapman's Reports, etc.
- 8. Interview Secret Service to determine how he learned of the Watergate arrest on June 17, 1972, whom he contacted, the conversations, etc.
- 9. Interview Chief Wilson concerning his activities on June 17, 1972, what information he received and to whom he conveyed it.
- 10. Debrief Jane Thomas, Secretary of Dean; Janna Hruska, Secretary of Ehrlichman; the principal secretary of Haldeman concerning their knowledge of such matters as procedures for record keeping and filing, memos re Watergate, contact between Dean and Ehrlichman and Haldeman, telephone and appointment logs, and removal of records from the files at the behest of their respective bosses.

- II. Interview Joe Rafferty concerning all fee discussions including possible unidentified telephone calls, he had for representation of five persons arrested June 17th.
- 17. Interview former Governor Nunn of Kentucky, concerning \$100,000 he received from John Mitchell through Kalmbach in 1971.
- 13. Interview Doug Hallett, former member of Colson's staff, concerning his activities on June 17, 1972; whether he saw Hunt at his office, what he was doing, etc., and generally his contact with Hunt, Liddy, and Colson.

With respect to the requests concerning White House staff persons such as secretaries and the interview of former Governor Nunn, I have suggested that the Washington Field Office clear through the Bureau.

letters are similar in context to the above letter furnished by the Louisville Division, stating "We have known for over 2½ years the entire plan of the Watergate Conspiracy. Several material witnesses to this plot have been murdered or injured..." The fifth letter states in part that the same criminal group responsible for the Watergate Conspiracy murdered J. EDGAR HOOVER and the Duke of Windsor.

The writer of the above letters is obviously identical to JAMES OLIVER JACKSON, aka Jimmie Jackson, Jr. Jimmy Vackson

who has been a cronic letter writer since at least 1963. JACKSON is a male caucasian born 1/19/21. During early 1972, JACKSON and one HERBERT JOHN BURROUS were responsible for mailing numerous inflammatory Letters to various people and organizations throughout the country (including city officials, police departments, chambers of commerce, the Consulate General of Australia and the governor of California) accusing notable business, civic, church and political leaders of being communists or involved in various communist conspiracies. Most of these letters were in the form of a newsletter, hand written and auplicated on letterhead stationary of the International Academy, 13137 Hartsook, Sherman Oaks, California, and signed JIMMY JACKSON, JR., Editor, and/or HERB BURROWS, Reporter. Virtually all were inflammatory and disoriented in context. A number of the letters used the name of J. CHARLIE ABERNATHY, General Manager of the General Motors Ascembly Division in Van Nuys, California, as a return address, and, as a result, in mid-1972 the Los Angeles City Attorney filed misdemeanor criminal libel charges against JACKSON and BURROWS. On 6/29/72, at a hearing in Division 95 of the Los Angeles Municipal Court, Van Nuys, California, JACKSON was found to be legally insane and was committed to Camarillo State Mental Hospital, Camarillo, California; and, on 7/3/72, BURROWS pled guilty to all charges against him.

On 4/28/73, JACKSON telephonically contacted the Los Angeles Office, and, after advising that he was presently a patient at the Sepulveda Veteran's Hospital, Sepulveda, California, claimed that he was suffering from "yew tree po'soning", which, according to JACKSON, causes death with symptons resembling a heart attack. JACKSON also indicated that his mother, JESSICA VANOVER (remarried), was suffering from

the same poison.

For information of Louisville and Washington Field, the BURT FINES referred to above is a Los Angeles area attorney who was a successful candidate in a recent election for the office of Los Angeles City Attorney.

The above is furnished for information of the Bureau in view of the letter writing proclivities and mental condition of JACKSON and the possibility that additional letters concerning captioned matter may be received from this individual.

This memorandum sets forth the investigative requests I discussed with you today. Pursuant to our conversation, I am sending a copy of this memorandum to Agent Lano of the Washington Field Office. It is my understanding that upon receiving such copy, he will begin work immediately on those requests that fall within the jurisdiction of the Washington Field Office. I appreciate your offer to expedite requests for action outside the Washington area. We will send copies of such requests to Agent Lano for his information and coordination. As we discussed, this same procedure will be followed on future requests.

(1) Interview Thomas V. Jones concerning any cash contributions he made to Herbert Kalmbach during July and August, 1972. In addition, Mr. Jones should be questioned as to any contacts with John Mitchell prior to March 1, 1972, concerning the campaign for the re-election of the President. Mr. Jones is a possible suspect of criminal investigations, and the normal procedures which pertain in such circumstances should be followed.

Interview Murray Chotiner to determine his relationship with John Mitchell, the circumstances of any cash receipts from John Mitchell. and his knowledge regarding the so-called "Chapman's Reports." A memorandum explaining the background of this request to aid the agent in his interview will follow. ENCLOSURE

Interview Pat Boggs of the Secret Service to determine how he learned of the Watergate arrests on the night of June 17, 1972, whom he contacted with regard to the arrests and the substance of any conversations, and whether he received any follow-up contacts concerning the incident.

- (8) Interview Doug Hallet, a former member of the staff of Charles Colson, concerning his activities on June 17, 1972, including whether he saw E. In reviewing the contents of this folder 6/14/73, it was discovered that some of the material in the folder was unrelated to the national conventions. This consists of three pages of unlabeled original typing which obviously relates to the investigation of the Watergate burglary. Attached to these three pages is a 5x8 sheet labeled "Calls from Dahlberg Electronics, Inc." Listed were telephone calls to 1) Finance Office of Committee to Reelect the President, 2) Mr. Mardian's Office (former Assistant Attorney General) at Committee to Reelect the President, and 3) Committee to Reelect the President. Inasmuch as this material is not related to the folder in which it was found and since it appears to relate to the Watergate investigation, it should be forwarded to the General Investigative Division for evaluation and disposition. PENNY GLEASON was interviewed at length (7 hours) on 7/1/72 and pertinent results set forth below:

ATTITUDE AT COMMITTEE:

At initial stages of investigation, attitude was that FBI was conducting "whitewash" investigation; that had FBI and not MPD caught MC CORD, ET AL, in act, the matter would have been quashed at that time; and that "cover up" was further substantiated by subsequent requirement that committee attorneys be present during interviews.

Current attitude at committee is one of "panic" and that FBI is conducting in-depth investigation:

HIGHLIGHTS OF INTERVIEW (from 47 pages of notes):

JAMES W. MC CORD

- 1. GLEASON knew of no connection between MC CORD and others arrested with him.
- 2. GLEASON stated she knew general contents of MC CORD's confidential files and that she does not believe same contained any information re plans for break-in.
- On 6/16/72 (afternoon) MC CORD told security officer to obtain key for each file cabinet and desk for finance committee on second floor and that HUGH SLOAN or GORDON LIDDY would pick up keys on morning of 6/17/72. Unknown which one.
- 4. On 6/15/72, MC CORD gave security officer JACK WISE \$30 cash to purchase tear gas cannisters - WISE returned with carton of "Sheriff" tear gas cannisters.

ROBERT HOUSTON (#1 man to MC CORD):

- Removed MC CORD's files from office on 6/18/72. 1.
- 2. Has been "less than complete" in furnishing information to FBI.
- Is believed to have removed walkie-talkie type battery charger from security office.

- 4. Has talked with MC CORD since release from jail.
- 5. On 6/19/72, HOUSTON removed desweeper from security office.
- 6. Has removed tames from security office, tapes believed by GLEASON to contain information re security preparation for convention.

ROB ODLE:

- 1. Has been furnishing FBT with "busy work" type leads to tie up agents.
- 2. Wrote memo to "JEB" MAGRUDER in late or early June requesting MAGRUDER to contact AG to obtain FBI daily teletypes for MC CORD as MC CORD had when at C.I.A.
- 3. Was allegedly told by Mrs. MC CORD that "Well, it looks like your project failed." This was told to GLEASON by MARTHA DUNCAN on or about 6/21/72, and DUNCAN's source of this information remains unknown at this time.
- 4. MAURICE STANS' secretary told GLEASON that STANS was fearful of sending files for review by FBT through ODLE because "something might happen" to them before SAs had chance to examine them.
- 5. On 6/17/72, ODLE had personal converation with GARY BITTENBENDER at committee office. BITTENBENDER believed to be MC CORD's source at MPD Intelligence and happened to be present when MC CORD booked in at police cell block.
- 6. On 6/17/72 GLEASON heard ODLE tell his secretary to get Assistant A.G. SANTARELLI on phone. GLEASON was on way out of ODLE's office and did not hear what transpired thereafter.

GORDON LIDDY

1. On morning of 6/17/72, was seen in committee offices with POWELL MOORE, MITCHELL's press man. GLEASON had never seen them together before.

MAURINE DEVLIN (receptionist on 2nd floor finance committee):

1. On 6/30/72, told GLEASON that she recognized photo of BERNARD BARKER from spread of photos displayed by Buagent on date unknown by GLEASON. DEVLIN recognized BARKER as having been in finance office previously. DEVLIN is believed to have declined to admit this fact to interviewing agent at that time.

On 5/22/73, NORMAN HERBERT KAYE appeared at the Ft. Lauderdale RA of the FBI and advised as follows:

During the spring of 1970 KAYE went to Harvard University to meet ABRAM CHAYES, Professor of Law at Harvard, who was then also a member of the Board of Directors of Trans-East Airlines. KAYE upon contact with CHAYES observed an individual in CHAYES' office whom he later learned was GORDON LIDDY, Watergate conspirator. When KAYE met CHAYES on that occasion he reminded CHAYES that he had just read a Newsweek magazine article which pointed out that CHAYES intended to support GEORGE MC GOVERN's presidential candidacy. KAYE ridiculed CHAYES' choice and pointed out that Senator MUSKIE was the "front runner". CHAYES told KAYE that MUSKIE would not make the grade and that the man that was just in his office

(GORDON LIDDY, whose identity was not known to KAYE) was his "insurance" that MUSKIE would not make it as a candidate. KAYE is of the opinion that LIDDY's contact with CHAYES is significant in view of information coming to light in the various Watergate probes in that it shows LIDDY's involvement as early as 1970 in affairs relating to the MUSKIE candidaty. KAYES speculated that the contact between CHAYES and LIDDY shows a possible double agent character of LIDDY in conspiring to embarrass the president and if called upon KAYE would relate the above information.

The Bureau is being advised of the above since the wife of NORMAN KAYE is a friend of Mrs. R. D. ALBERTAZZLE, the wife of the pilot of President NIXON. Mrs. JACQUELINE KAYE wrote a letter to Mrs. ALBERTAZZLE in about July, 1972 in which Mrs. KAYE set forth information regarding what she considered to be political intrigue on the part of the Dead River Corporation in the State of Maine and various matters relating to EAYE's problems with the Dead River Corporation. The KAYE family received correspondence on about 5/21/73 from Mrs. ALBERTAZZLE wherein Mrs. ALBERTAZZLE stated she kept their previous letter and asked for permission to make it available to the FBI in Washington. Since it is anticipated that Mrs. ALBERTAZZLE might contact the FBI, the above is being made available for information.

For the information of the Bureau, background information concerning KAYE and information previously furnished by him is set forth in referenced Miami teletype dated 12/22/72. In summary, KAYE stated that he was the organizer and former president of the Board of Directors of Trans-East Airlines in Bangor, Maine. KAYE alleged that he was forced out of the company by individuals who were friendly to SALVATORE PISELLO, an organized crime affiliated individual from New York City who is presently exporting meat through Trans-East Airlines facilities.

KAYE made efforts to expose the political intrigue which he spaculated was operating against his interests in alleging that the Dead River Corporation in Maine was involved with his adversaries to discredit him and according to KAYE the Dead River Corporation as its objective to dominate Maine politics and ultimately national politics.

As a result of KAYE's activities, he and his wife have been threatened at their home in Maine by two unknown individuals and have received various threatening telephone calls both in Maine and at their present home in Ft. Lauderdie, Fla.

On the weekend of 5/18 - 20/73, KAYE and his wife traveled to Bangor, Maine to supervise removal of the furniture for transportation to Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. at which time they received a written threat to keep out of Bangor, Maine or they would be killed.

Mismi is handling the threats to KAYE by separate communication under his individual case caption.

On June 7, 1973, Donald Louis Disier, Jr., who is an applicant for a position with the Atomic Energy Commission, furnished the following information to Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI):

In June, 1972, he lost his position with the Committee on Government Procurement due to a reduction in force.

He is an admitted homosexual, although he states he is "bisexual". He is not a member of the Gay Liberation Movement, although he agrees with their ideas and principles.

While he was employed with the United States Government in Washington, D. C., his homosexual activity was known to his associates. He was a member of the Committee to Re-elect the President. When his job was terminated in June, 1972, he wrote a letter to Charles Colson, Special Assistant to the President, telling Colson he was acquainted with Ray (Wormwood, who Colson also knew. This letter stated Disier was available to help in the campaign of President Nixon.

In the middle of July, 1972, Disier received a letter on White House stationery signed by Colson. letter acknowledged Disier's letter and resume and stated Colson would be in contact with Disier.

About one week later, Disier received a telephone call from a female who stated she was calling for Colson. Disier cannot recall the woman's name. She said Colson asked her to call Disier about the possibility of him attending the Democratic Party convention in Miami, Florida in August, 1972. The caller advised she was aware Disier was a homosexual, (Disier assumes she or Colson learned this from Wormwood), and stated Colson, even though he had never met Disier, felt Disier could go to Florida and through his education and personality organize a responsible and intelligent demonstration of "Gay People" for McGovern. The caller told him Colson wanted him to do this because Disier was a person the Gay community would trust.

The caller told him that his position would be a "consultant", and although no salary was mentioned, Disier is aware that this type of job paid \$125.00 per day. The caller also advised that if Disier were successful in Florida, he would be considered for "permanent employment on the White House Staff" after the election.

Disier refused the offer since he was already on the Committee to Re-elect the President, was an admitted homosexual, and to do what Colson or the caller wanted would be unethical and would betray himself and his beliefs. The caller told Disier to think about it and to call back if he changed his mind.

In the recent testimony of Hugh W. Sloan, Jr., before the Senate (Ervin) Committee, he is reported to have testified that when FBI Agents interrogated him shortly after the break-in they did not question him about Liddy, Hunt, the funding, the accounting or the general Watergate operation.

Sloan also is said to have testified that FBI Agents were present when Sloan advised the federal prosecutors that Magruder told him that he might have to perjure himself with respect to the amounts of money given to Liddy. (See attachment)

The implication left is that (1) the FBI investigation was far short of being comprehensive, and (2) that the federal prosecutors used a witness whom they had good reason to believe was attempting to suborn perjury.

It seems probable that either or both the Ervin Committee and the Special Prosecutor will be checking these implications, and in preparation for an inquiry I wish a prompt report on such facts as are known to the FBI. In this regard please advise:

- 1. Furnish the names of the Agents, if any, who were present when Mr. Sloan was interviewed.
 - 2. Submit copies of any records reflecting such interviews.

undoubtedly materially contributed to the success of the cover-up story throughout the investigation by the Bureau and by the grand jury in the Summer of 1972.

With respect to Sloan, who is now pictured on national television as being a highly moral individual who wants the truth to come out, the fact is that when we were trying to interview him in July, 1972, he was quite uncooperative and never did make himself available to FBI Agents for interview.

Set forth hereinafter are answers to the questions posed by the Acting Director which, with respect to Sloan, set forth in detail efforts to interview Sloan, as furnished by SA Lano, WFO, on 6/14/73.

(1) Furnish the names of the Agents, if any, who were present when Mr. Sloan was interviewed.

ANSWER: SAs Joseph Kelly and John Denton of WFO advised that on or about 6/23/72, after the Bureau had identified Alfred Baldwin as being a participant in the monitoring of the telephone taps at Democratic National Committee Headquarters (DNCH), they showed photographs of Baldwin as well as those of the arrested subjects to numerous CRP employees including Hugh Sloan. At that time the only specific tie-in between the Watergate incident and CRP was the fact that McCord had been the Director of Security at CRP. Gordon Liddy had not been identified and there was no information then known regarding funds used for the electronic equipment and for the entire operation. There was no basis at that time for questioning Sloan or any one else at CRP concerning those matters. Sloan replied in the negative relative to identification of Baldwin and all subjects, other than McCord.

(2) Submit copies of any records reflecting such interviews.

ANSWER: SA Kelly has advised he believes that he included Sloan's name with a number of others at the CRP who were shown photographs as part of a negative contact. FBIHQ was not advised of these negative contacts. This is in accordance with standard reporting practice to summarize negative information and not report such as it would not add to the investigation.

(3) Advise as to whether, in fact, Sloan made the statements which he now has revealed to the Committee.

ANSWER: As set forth above, Sloan was not questioned by Agents about financing of the break-in nor was he questioned concerning the Dahlberg check, the Mexican checks (which were found through search of Barker's bank account in Miami on 6/22/72) or payments to Liddy since on 6/23/72, there was no logical reason to question Sloan about them.

The first information that CRP was connected with the Dahlberg check was on 7/6/72, when Dahlberg gave a signed statement in Minneapolis that he gave that check to Maurice Stans on 4/11/72, in Washington, D. C. WFO endeavored to interview Stans immediately but he was not available until 7/14/72.

On 7/14/72, Stans said he had given the Dahlberg check to Sloan. He said Liddy cashed the Dahlberg check and the Mexican checks and the cash was given to CRP.

During the interview on 7/14/72 in the early morning Stans said that Sloan had resigned two weeks previously. Later, the Agents learned that Sloan had in fact not resigned and a second interview was conducted of Stans the afternoon of 7/14/72. During the second interview on that date Stans said Sloan had orally resigned two weeks previously but officially on 7/14/72.

The following are efforts made by WFO to interview Sloan:

7/12/72--CRP advised Sloan was out of town (West Coast trip with Stans from 7/7/72 until 7/13/72); however, he did not return on that date.

7/14/72--Sloan was not located at CRP.

7/17/72--Sloan was reached by Agents at his home, said he would talk to the Agents but wanted to talk to his lawyer first. Subsequently, Kenneth Parkinson, CRP attorney, advised WFO that Sloan had secured an attorney named Ed Taptich who was not going to permit Agents to interview Sloan. Later on the same date, 7/17/72, Taptich called WFO and advised he had been released by Sloan as attorney. Sloan called WFO the same day and said he would contact WFO in the morning relative to interview.

7/18/72--Agents went to Sloan's home but could not locate him there or at CRP.

7/19/72--Sloan called WFO and said he had a new lawyer, was consulting him and would have the attorney contact WFO.

7/20/72--James Stoner, attorney for Sloan, called AUSA Silbert and requested time for Stoner to debrief Sloan. Silbert agreed and Stoner said he would recontact Silbert to arrange an interview.

7/21/72--Stoner contacted AUSAs Silbert, Glanzer and Campbell and briefly told them Sloan had given Liddy \$200,000 in the past six or seven months and related that Liddy had handled the cashing of the Mexican checks and the Dahlberg check and arranged for Sloan to appear on Monday, 7/24/72, at Silbert's office for debriefing.

7/24/72--Sloan, with his attorney, appeared and gave a statement to the AUSAs. SAs Dennis Hoffman and Michael J. King were present but did not conduct the interview. There was no indication then of any perjury by Sloan or efforts by Magruder to have Sloan change the figures regarding the money he had passed on to Liddy.

7/31/72--Sloan testified before Federal grand jury

In view of the fact that Sloan, accompanied by his attorney, had given a detailed statement to the AUSAs handling the grand jury, and had testified before the grand jury, there was no useful purpose in having FBI Agents again plow the same ground over with him.

(4) State when, if ever, the FBI learned that large sums of money were furnished by CREP to Liddy. If such information was obtained, relate the circumstances.

ANSWER: The first indication that large sums of money were furnished by CRP to Liddy was obtained the night of 7/18/72, during an interview of Mrs. Judith Hoback which was conducted at her home and at her request, outside the presence of CRP attorneys. She advised that she thought Liddy had obtained cash in the amount of either \$81,000 or \$89,000.

(5) If information concerning the large sums being furnished to Liddy by CREP was obtained, state what efforts were made to determine what the money was used for, and who authorized the payments.

ANSWER: Interviews were conducted of Magruder, Porter and Stans relative to authority for these payments and the story obtained was the cover-up story which had been agreed to by Magruder, Porter and others; i.e., that Magruder had authorized Liddy to head up an intelligence gathering activity on behalf of CRP, the total expenditures of such to be \$250,000 and that no illegal activities should be engaged in.

(6) Advise when, if at all, the FBI Agents learned that Magruder was trying to cover up the amounts paid to Liddy, and relate the circumstances.

ANSWER: The only information relative to an effort by Magruder to cover up amounts paid to Liddy was that furnished.



other individuals now known to be involved maintained their story and perjury cannot be criminally prosecuted if there is no corroboration. It cannot be tried on the basis of one person's word against another's.

(7) Advise when the FBI learned of the participation of Hunt and Liddy in the break-in.

ANSWER: On 7/5/72, Baldwin advised the AUSAs handling the grand jury of the participation of Hunt and Liddy. Full details of this were obtained on 7/10/72 when a lengthy detailed interview was conducted by Agents of Baldwin after arrangements for the interview had been worked out between Baldwin's attorney and the AUSAs.

(8) Advise when the FBI learned that Hunt was a White House employee, and that Liddy was a CREP official.

ANSWER: Hunt's apparent involvement in the Watergate incident was learned the afternoon of 6/17/72, when his country club bill and check in payment thereof were found at the Watergate Hotel in one of the rooms rented by the subjects. Hunt's connection with the White House was discovered in the late afternoon of 6/17/72, after search of the field office indices showed a Special Inquiry investigation on Hunt for a position as consultant at the White House. That evening, Mr. Alex Butterfield, Deputy Assistant to the President, confirmed that Hunt had been employed at the White House but Butterfield believed he was no longer working there. We never did develop that Hunt worked at CRP.

Apparent involvement of Hunt caused WFO to obtain his toll call records by subpoena from the C & P Telephone Company. Among the leads set forth to identify and interview subscribers to the telephone numbers called by Hunt was that of an individual named Jack Bauman, Winter Haven, Florida On 6/23/72, Bauman told us of efforts by Hunt to him to work on a project involving the setting up

Hunt to hire him to work on a project involving the setting up of a special security staff to work on behalf of the Republican Party. Bauman related that Hunt had been accompanied by an individual who seemed to be Hunt's supervisor. On 6/26/72, WFO obtained from MPD the address books which belonged to Martinez and Barker. One of the entries in Barker's address book was the name "George" and the telephone number 333-0362 which was determined on 6/27/72, to be a number at CRP utilized by Gordon Liddy.

Liddy was contacted on 6/28/72, but declined to be interviewed although he did say he was a former Bureau supervisor. Since Liddy's description was similar to that of the unknown individual, furnished by Bauman, a copy of Liddy's photograph from his FBI personnel file was sent by telecopier to Tampa for display to Bauman. On 6/29/72, Bauman said he was almost positive that Liddy was the individual who accompanied Hunt but requested a photograph of better quality be displayed. On 7/3/72, a more up-to-date photograph of Liddy which WFO had obtained, was shown to Bauman and he positively identified Liddy as being the one who accompanied Hunt.

(9) State what information, if any, led to a supposition, if such there was, that Liddy and Hunt were acting on their own, without any knowledge or authority from their superior officers.

ANSWER: Such supposition came as result of all the interviews conducted of White House and CRP employees as well as the testimony before the Federal grand jury. During all these interviews no information was developed indicating any one was involved other than Liddy, Hunt and the arrested subjects.

(10) State what efforts were made to determine whether persons other than Liddy or Hunt officed in the White House and CREP were involved in the break-in.

ANSWER: Interviews were conducted of White House and CRP personnel and they were subpoensed to testify before the Federal grand jury. Toll calls of the subjects were subpoensed and subscribers were run out to determine their association with the subjects.

(11) State what efforts, if any, were made to determine the source of income to the defendants (all seven of them) for bail, living expenses and attorneys' fees.

ANSWER: No efforts were made to determine the source of income to the defendants for bail, living expenses and attorneys' fees as such. The bank accounts of the subjects were reviewed during the investigation but this was primarily to endeavor to determine the source of the funding of the break-in at Democratic National Committee Headquarters (DNCH). Background investigation was conducted regarding each of the defendants including contacts with neighbors, friends and associates, but this was part of the overall investigation and not specifically directed toward the source of bail, living expenses and attorneys' fees.

(12) State what efforts were made, if any, to determine whether any of the defendants had engaged in other break-ins, or wiretaps.

ANSWER: Contact was made with the MPD concerning previous break-ins at the Watergate but no useful physical evidence

had been developed by MPD in its investigation of those break-ins. MPD was also contacted concerning the break-in at the Embassy of Chile as a Miami source had informed that he had heard Barker had been involved in that break-in. However, no further corroboration was obtained from any other sources, Barker would not permit interview and no useful evidence had been obtained by MPD in its investigation of the break-in of the Embassy.

(13) State whether the scope of the investigation was controlled by the United States Attorney's office.

ANSWER: The investigation was a joint effort between the FBI and the U. S. Attorney's office; however, primary control rested with the FBI as the investigative agency. There was very close cooperation in this case and there was an interchange on a daily basis of information, possible leads developed and investigative results achieved, to insure the Bureau and the U. S. Attorney's office were not working in cross purposes and to assure that there would be no duplication of effort by the Bureau and the grand jury.

(14) State whether the directions from that office were verbal or written.

ANSWER: Directions from the U.S. Attorney's office were received in verbal form during daily conferences. Such directions would be in the form of leads made logical by testimony before the grand jury.

(15) State whether any records exist showing the nature and degree of control being exercised by the United States Attorney's office over the FBI in the Watergate investigation.

ANSWER: The U. S. Attorney's office did not control the FBI. As stated above, any investigation requested, including logical follow up of leads, was conducted. Results of investigative results of that sort are set forth in teletypes and investigative reports.

On 6-15-73, at 10 am, Supervisor James Joseph Dolan attended a meeting at the Office of Special Prosecutor Archibald Cox, 1425 K Street, Washington, D. C. In attendance at the meeting were Thomas F. McBride, a staff assistant of Special Prosecutor Cox; Roger Whitten of the Special Prosecutor's Office; Robert Higgins, Office of Federal Elections, General Accounting Office (GAO); and William Hendricks of the Criminal Fraud Section of the U. S. Department of Justice.

Mr. McBride, who held the meeting, advised this was a planning session for the coordination of activities between each of the agencies present. He principally requested certain summaries and copies of documents from the Criminal Fraud Section of the Department and also copies of documents in possession of GAO pertaining to financial reports submitted to GAO by the numerous election campaign committees.

He stated the Special Prosecutor's Office, as of this date, is planning to proceed in its investigation by a special grand jury, and as a result of these grand jury hearings, anticipates requesting specific investigation from the FBI, which in his opinion will more than likely require the investigative efforts of Special Agent Accountants. He anticipates that the Special Agent Accountants will be needed to trace funds and other contributions made to the different political organizations.

On May 14, 1973, Earl J. Silbert, Principal Assistant to the United States Attorney, in Washington, D. C., advised a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, (FBI), that he had received a letter from the above captioned organization, who commented in their letter that perhaps those persons convicted in the burglary of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters, had also been responsible for the captioned burglary. Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) Silbert requested the FBI conduct an inquiry in the allegation.

On May 18, 1973, Jack Greenberg and James N. Nabritt, III, attorneys at the Legal Defense Fund (LDF), 10 Columbis Circle, New York, New York, furnished the following information:


They advised that their organization was founded by the NAACP in 1939, but became totally independent of the NAACP in the early fifties. The LDF is primarily a law office involved in community legal work and, consequently, over the years has represented clients embroiled in sensitive, public-issue matters receiving widespread publicity.

With reference to Greenberg's letter dated May 2, 1973, to AUSA Silbert, Greenberg repeated the details of the burglary as set forth in this letter. From these details, it could be inferred that the burglars were not after money or valuables, but were motivated by the desire to obtain some kind of information located in LDF files. Assuming the latter motive, Greenberg and Nabritt discussed those matters considered sensitive which the LDF was involved in at the time and prior to the burglary. Mr. Greenberg furnished the New York Office the results of its survey of sensitive LDF matters pending at the time or prior to the burglary (see enclosures number 2 and 3).

They also pointed out that Mardian was general counsel of the Inter-governmental Committee on School Desegregation around the time of the burglary and that the LDF was holding conferences with this Committee at the time. They mentioned this aspect in possible support to their theory that Liddy and Hunt committed the burglary, since it has become public knowledge that Mardian quite possibly has promoted questionable investigative techniques while heading the Internal Security Division of the United States Department of Justice.

In summation, they stated that they have no evidence whatsoever bearing on the identity of the burglars and have pointed out possible motives for the burglary under the examination that Liddy and Hunt actually committed the burglary.

They were advised that no information had yet come to the attention of AUSA Silbert that would implicate the subject in the buglary of the LDF office.

On June 5, 1973, Detective Vincent Mangiamele, 3rd Division Burglary and Larceny Squad, New York City Police Department (NYCPD), 357 West 35th Street, New York, New York,

furnished enclosures (4), (5), and (6) which reflect the extent of the NYCPD investigation conducted in the buglary of the LDF. He advised that a latent fingerprint examination was not conducted during the initial investigation.

It must be noted that since the buglary did not result in personal injury, missing property, and had no unusual circumstances at the time, it would be normal for the NYCPD to close the case immediately; such a policy is necessitated by the enormous volume of burglaries reported to the NYCPD.

Attached to this communication are copies of documents obtained during the inquiry.

Accordingly, since there is nothing to support the allegation that the defendants in the "Watergate" case were involved in this matter, no further action is being taken.

Fall of 1971

As you requested, I have surveyed the cases we were involved in around the time of the 1971 Labor Day weekend to see whether we were involved in anything that might be of interest to "the plumbers." My survey reveals that we were involved in an unusual number of cases in opposition to the government, a number of which related to the general concerns of the White House group as reported in the newspapers.

- 1) In June, 1971 we had won <u>Swann</u> and <u>Davis</u>, which were sure to lead to substantial increases in busing if they were enforced vigorously. It is my recollection that George Wallace was already trying to make political capital because the decisions were handed down by the Nixon court.
- 2) From spring, 1971 to the summer of 1972 we were involved in the <u>Caldwell</u> case. Of course, Caldwell was a New York Times reporter and I know that I talked to Jim Goodale at the Times over the telephone on a number of occasions about various aspects of the case during the summer and early fall of 1971. Also, the <u>Caldwell</u> case arose directly out of the activities of the Internal Security Division, which was then headed by Robert Mardian. We have had reliable information that the ultimate aim of the investigation was to develop a Smith Act prosecution against the Black Panthers.
- 3) In June of 1971 we had filed our brief in the Bobby Seale case and were actively involved in the appeal until the spring of 1972. It is interesting to note that we won the Seale case in the Seventh Circuit because of wire tapping logs that showed, according to the Court, that intrusions were made into the defense counsels of Seale. We never saw the logs and do not know whom they show was being tapped, since the government chose on remand to dismiss the contempt proceedings rather than reveal them, ostensibly because they involved "national security."

- 5) We had won the Muhammad Ali case in June, 1971. Standing alone, of course, that case would not seem sufficient to be of interest, but in conjunction with the other matters we were involved in, it could help the White House gang to conclude that we were part of whatever conspiracies they had decided were in progress.
- 6) Finally, Jim recollects a number of episodes around that time involving school desegregation. One was a rumor going around the Justice Department that we were not going to push Swann in the fall of 1971 but would wait until 1972 when it would be politically embarrassing to Nixon. Where that story came from has never been established. The second incident was the meeting with George Shultz concerning the effect of Swann, which he recalls as being totally negative and hostile. Both events indicate that the Administration was well aware of the political ramifications of our work at a time when it appeared that Nixon might be in danger of losing the 1972 election.

In light of the newspaper reports as to what was being planned by the White House and particularly in light of the memorandum which Senator Symington has been revealing, the White House was engaged in a general program of political espionage against a variety of groups and organizations that they thought were hostile to the Administration. Given the frame of mind of people like Mardian, et al., it is not inconceivable that they decided to try to find out what we were up to, and/or get hold of a list of our contributors, as the Watergate burglars were trying to get from the Democratic Party files.

The complainant feel that these persons might be responsible for the breakin in their premises. They further stated to the best of their recolection no Documents of any value are left in this office.

Mr Greenborg apprised the Police Commissioners Office of this article and wrote a letter to Mr. Earl J. Silbert Principle Asst. U.S. Attorney, U.S. Court House Wash. D.C. requesting any information is to the two subjects involved in the Calif. breakin were in anyway connected with the breakin in

Further investigation reveals that at the time of the breakin the building was open 24 hours a day and a signin book was in the lobby for mersor who were entering to sign and discloses where they were going after business hours.

A offeck with Mr. John J. Ryan the bldg. Mgr at place of occurrence 10 Columbus Circle discloses that no records were available for that period and that they ware only kept for about a year.

This branch of the NAACP represent such persons as Bobby Scale, Earl Caldwell NY Times Reporter and School Segregation in the South.

BACKGROUND: The attached relates to the investigation requested by Special Prosecutor Cox concerning newspaper accounts in the Miami area about 6/1/73 to the effect that "several Cubans are ready to lay bare the facts relating to break-ins other than the Watergate." Miami has previously interviewed with negative results five of the individuals recruited by Bernard L. Barker to accompany him to Washington, D. C., 5/3-4/72, to engage in an altercation with protesters at the Capitol where the late Director Hoover lay in state. One additional individual, Reinaldo Pico, is unavailable until after 7/2/73.

According to the attached, Gonzalez, Barker, Sturgis and Martinez, presently incarcerated at Federal Correctional Institution, Danbury, Connecticut, say they have no information and Martinez is of the opinion that whoever released the story to the press was endeavoring to "make news." Results of the investigation by Miami and New Haven will be furnished to Mr. Cox' staff as soon as reports are received.

The attached relates to the investigation requested by James Vorenberg of Special Prosecutor Cox' staff concerning an alleged \$1,000,000 "discretionary fund" at the Department of Commerce which was the subject of a memorandum dated 7/28/71, written by Jeb Magruder to the Attorney General. That memorandum set forth that Dick Whitney, Secretary Stans' political Special Assistant, told Magruder the fund was being used for activities which would be beneficial to the reelection of the President, and suggested that Mr. Stans might discuss this plan with other cabinet officers to see if they could develop the same kind of fund.

According to the attached, Whitney claims that at no time did he tell Magruder that such a fund existed at the Department of Commerce. Further, he did not see the 7/28/71 memorandum. However, Whitney recalls that one Larry Jobe, former Assistant Secretary of Administration in the Department of Commerce, subsequent to July of 1971, told Whitney that Whitney had brought a copy of the memorandum to Jobe. Whitney does not recall that incident.

Dallas is in the process of locating and interviewing Jobe concerning the matter. Jobe is reported to be employed at Alexander Grant and Company, Dallas, Texas.

Mrs. Hogan Mr. Archibald Cox, Special Prosecutor, advised his office has a large volume of information such as Department of Justice files, reports and memoranda from the FBI, grand jury testimony, Congressional Committee testimony, etc. There is a need for review and comprehensive indexing and cross-referencing and Mr. Cox requests that Bureau personnel familiar with data processing operations contact his office and discuss the extent to which "....the F. B. I. could provide technical assistance to us in developing a comprehensive information management and retrieval system."

On 6/13/73, Mr. James Vorenberg, of Mr. Cox's staff, telephonically contacted the Acting Director and requested that Bureau personnel familiar with files and records be designated to contact his office to set up a filing and indexing system. Assistant Director Marshall contacted Mr. Vorenberg in response to his request and advised him of the request contained in the 6/5/73 memo for assistance in establishing a computerized index. Assistant Director Marshall and Mr. Vorenberg agreed that both requests should be handled simultaneously to insure coordination.

In response to Mr. Cox's 6/5/73 memo I have been in touch with a Mr. Peter Rient, telephone 393-2310, of Mr. Cox's staff. He was unaware of Mr. Vorenberg's request and after checking into the matter has advised me that Mr. Vorenberg was unaware of the request contained in the 6/5/73 memo. These two requests should be treated together as any computerized index will necessarily have to relate to source documents and any such source documents must be filed in such a manner that the material referred to by the computerized index 151973 retrievable.

Today I telephonically contacted Mr. Rient and he advised that the Special Prosecutor's office now contemplates obtaining the services of a consultant to spend one or two weeks in their offices studying their needs. Thereafter, a judgment will be made as to what recommendations and requests should be



Results of Examination:

K39 is a clear plastic box with label containing the words "UHER ACCESSORIES, MODEL 802-5." The box contains a miniature FM radio transmitter with microphone and 9-volt battery. K39 transmits on a frequency of 107.8 MHz. A small wire with white insulation and black tracer, 19 1/2" long, protrudes from one end and serves as an antenna. The radiated power is approximately 54 Milliwatts. A slide-switch is incorporated to turn the battery power on or off as desired. The circuit board in K39 appears to be the same material as that used in a miniature FM transmitter Meetified as Q8 in Laboratory report dated, 6/26/72. Such items as resistors, coll forms, capacitors and feed-through insulators appear to have the same origin and electrical value. The layout of parts and workmanship characteristics appear to be the same in both cases. only apparent difference between K39 and Q8 is the physical size of the microphone used. The Knowles 1591 microphone used in Q8 is much smaller than the one used in K39. There are significant similarities of design and construction.

K40 is a black metal box 8 1/4" long by 2 1/16" wide by 1" high containing a miniature radio frequency transmitter. There are no significant similarities of design or construction between K40 and 48 described in Labor story report dated, 6/20/72.

K39 and K40 are being returned to your office via registered mail.

A contact with on April 6, 1973, was negative as to Stevens Research Laboratories, 2050 West Devon. A re-check on April 9, 1973, revealed a report prepared in October, 1972, which stated that STEVENS declined all information saying he was under government contract to produce a certain product and could give no information on it.

The NPRC check for STEVENS at St. Louis revealed he was enlisted under the name of ALISTO JOSEPH GIOVANNONNI, II, apparently his true name. Chicago indices contain one reference to that name in Chicago file 44-710. GIOVANNONNI was interviewed by the FBI on 8/6/64, at which time he alleged he had been stopped on 8/5/64 by Chicago Police Department Officers, questioned about his activities, roughly searched and told to go home. He felt this violated his civil rights, but indicated he had not been beaten. No investigation conducted subsequent to interview.

A check of the Haines Criss-Cross Directory on April 6, 1973, for the address 2050 West Devon revealed a telephone listing to Stevens Research Labs, telephone number 973-3770. Also listed was Audiotronics Labs, telephone number 973-6708.

On April 9, 1973, it was determined that 973-3770 was disconnected. Calls to 973-6708 were being referred to 275-6449, which is the publicly listed number for BERNARD GORDON, 4827 North Sheridan, Chicago, ILL.

- Mrs. WILLIAM FEIGENBAUM, 2050 West Devon, telephone number 973-6018, furnished the following information:

She and her husband have owned the building at 2050 West Devon since October, 1972. One of the tenants at that time was MICHAEL STEVENS, who rented office space on the first floor for his company, Stevens Research Laboratories. STEVENS claimed he made microphones and "bugging" equipment. He has told Mrs. FEIGENBAUM he has sometimes manufactured such equipment for the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI).

Mrs. FEIGENBAUM understands STEVENS had rented office space in the building for at least a year prior to October, 1972. On November 15, 1972 STEVENS executed a lease for another year's tenancy at \$105 a month rent, but vacated the premises about January 15, 1973, when he could no longer meet his rental payments. The phone company and the electric company also have made inquiry about the whereabouts of STEVENS, presumably because of monies he owes them.

Mrs. FEIGENBAUM thought it possible that STEVENS may have changed the name of his organization to Microtronics or a similar sounding name. She did not believe the name Audiotronics sounded familiar.

STEVENS had an associate in the business whose last name was GORDON. Mrs. FEIGENBAUM recalled little about him.

She did not know STEVENS current address, but felt it was someplace in the neighborhood. STEVENS' wife, ADRIAN works in the Devon Bank, 6445 North Western Avenue. STEVENS had a home phone number of 465-2117.

STEVENS did not complete a rental application in November, 1972, so Mrs. FEIGENBAUM had no specific information concerning STEVENS' background.

She did not know her husband's immediate whereabouts because he sells carpet and was on the road. She stated she would make some phone calls in an effort to locate him and would have him contact the Chicago Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

She stated STEVENS was driving a 1972 Ford Galaxie black over gray in color, which car was the property of her father, AL LEAVITT, also of 2221 West Highland.

She stated that the business associate of her husband was BERNARD GORDON.

MICHAEL MARCUS STEVENS was contacted at Pan-O-Gold Pancakes, 565 West Diversey, Chicago, which location he had telephonically furnished to the Chicago Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. STEVENS was advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents and that he was to be questioned about his knowledge of the wiretapping and electronic surveillance of the Democratic Party National Committee Headquarters in Washington, D. C. STEVENS at first insisted that any interview take place in the restaurant or any other public place so that the conversation could not easily be recorded by the FBI. the Agents assured STEVENS there was no monitoring of the conversation, he agreed to be interviewed in the Bureau automobile. When a place of relative seclusion was located, STEVENS immediately asked if he was potential subject in the "Watergate" case and if he was suspected of being in violation of the Federal Wiretapping Statutes. He was familiar with the Section numbers and language of Title 18, United States Code, which relates to interception of communications. STEVENS was advised that he, in fact, was a potential subject and had certain Constitutional rights, including the right to remain STEVENS said he would "like to cooperate 100%" but would be a "fool" to furnish information which might implicate himself if he had no assurances that he stood to gain by giving such information. Consequently, he asked that he be granted immunity from prosecution before he answered questions. He volunteered to accompany the Agents to the Chicago Office of the FBI while his request was made known to the United States Attorney in Washington, D. C.

Assistant United States Attorney, EARL SILBERT, Washington, D. C., was told of STEVENS request and took it under advisement. STEVENS was so advised and left the FBI Office.

During casual conversation with STEVENS it was learned he did not have a college degree but had attended the University of Maryland for a few semesters. His knowledge of electronics was largely self-taught, although he did pick up some information when he was in the United States Army. He is employed by Creative Carpets, 411 North LaSalle Street. Chicago. He was born May 30, 1942, in Cincinnati, Ohio.

Consequently the number called in England cannot be ascertained. IBT had no further information about the September 14, 1972 call received collectfrom Campo, California. The toll ticket with any additional information would be located at the telephone company servicing Campo, California.

HAROLD C. CARISTEAD was interviewed at his business office, 2021d and Holland Avenue, and furnished the following information:

HC (NAISTEAL)

DOROTHY HUNT, his wife's cousin, first made inquiry about obtaining a motel franchise in the summer or fall of 1971. She was not specifically interested in any one type of franchise, even though Mr. CARLSTEAD was the owner of two Holiday Inn franchises in Lansing and Harvey, Illinois. She sought only general information on the procedures necessary to obtain a motel franchise. Mrs. HUNT indicated E. H. HUNT, her husband, would be a partner in any franchise, but she never mentioned any other potential partners. CARISTEAD assumed there would have to be additional partners due to the fact that about \$300,000 of equity money would be needed to set up a motel. He doubted the HUNTs had that much money themselves. Mrs. HUNT said she was interested in building a motel in Nicaragua because she and her husband knew some influential people there and because of the absence of such a facility there.

About one month after the initial conversation, CARLSTEAD inquired from Mrs. HUNT whether she had done anything further in regards to a franchise. She said she had not. CARLSTEAD heard nothing fore about the HUNT's interest in a motel franchise for almost one year except for a comment by Mrs. HUNT that she and E. H. HUNT had visited Nicaragua. As best CARLSTEAD can recall, this visit took place sometime prior to the time the press reported HOWARD HUGHES was staying in Nicaragua.

On the day of the plane crash fatal to Mrs. HUNT, E. H. HUNT flew to Chicago. He mentioned that Mrs. HUNT was carrying about \$10,000 in cash with her. HUNT told CARLSTEAD the money was being brought to Chicago so that

it would be immediately available if arrangements could be worked out to obtain a rotel franchise for the HUNTs.

CARISTEAD recalled that in a telephone conversation immediately before the flight to Chicago, Mrs. HUNT told Mrs. CARISTEAD she was coming to Chicago to discuss some financial matters. Mr. CARISTEAD assumed she was going to request a personal loan to help meet the trial expenses for her husband. No mention was made of the motel franchise in that conversation.

CARISTEAD stated that \$10,000 was the approximate application fee for a Holiday Inn franchise at that time (December, 1972). Such a fee is paid to Holiday Inn, Incorporated, at Memphis, Tennessee. It is not usual for the fee to be paid in cash. CARISTEAD did not ask HUNT why cash was carried when other forms of payment would be acceptable. CARISTEAD was of the personal opinion that Nicaragua would be a poor site for a motel franchise. He has had no conversation with HUNT since the funeral of Mrs. HUNT.

The attached relates to the widely publicized documents which John W. Dean, III, took from the White House about the time he resigned as Counsel to the President and secreted in a safe deposit box.

In U. S. District Court today Dean advised that classification of "Top Secret Handle Via Commit" was placed on most documents by FBI. (It is believed "commit" should be "comint" meaning "Communication Intelligence," the highest classification). Dean also stated that most documents were prepared by the FBI. Judge Sirica dispatched his Law Clerk and Dean to recover documents, certified copies of which are to be made available to the U. S. Attorney and Senators Baker and Ervin of the Select Senate (Watergate) Committee. The court is to maintain custody of the original documents.

Special Agent Lano, Washington Field, advised today he is not familiar with the classification, he does not know the content of the documents, and he believes the FBI will not be given a copy of the documents by the court nor will we be able to review the documents. However, Special Agent Lano was instructed to make a concerted effort to determine the substance and origin of the documents in

question.
