#### I. INTERVIEWS OF SUSPECTS

#### FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

OREN S. FROST, 30 Marion Road, Westport, Connecticut, was interviewed at his office at 545 Madison Avenue, New York, New York. At the inception of this interview FROST was advised of his rights as set forth in "Interrogation; Advice of Rights" form which he read and stated that he fully understood his rights. FROST decided not to execute a waiver of rights but stated that he was willing to answer all questions voluntarily. FROST furnished the following:

He is an art designer consultant by occupation and as such, has done work for the Republican Party since 1968 in the nature of designing letterheads and presentation folders.

At some time, probably during 1971, BARTAPORTER of the Committee for the Re-Election of the President (CREP) contacted him and asked him to design a number of organizational charts in connection with the upcoming election campaign. He recalled that the charts prepared dealt with the organizational structure for the waging of the Presidential campaign. The charts set forth titles of organizational workers for the most part, and contained a few names of individuals. He recalled that the charts were approximately four feet by five feet in size. From the size of the charts, he got the impression that the charts would be utilized at a meeting involving many individuals; that is, he thought the charts would be used at a rather large organizational meeting.

He could not recall the exact number of charts prepared but he guessed that approximately five to ten charts were prepared. He advised that the word "gemstone" was not on any of these charts. He felt sure that they were innocuous organizational campaign charts and could not be construed as charts outlining covert intelligence operations. He felt that the charts were to be used at an open meeting and were not of a coded nature.

He stated that after he completed these charts in the form of small pastings, he sent his finished product to the Ad-Stat Company, 440 Lexington Avenue, New York, New York, which enlarged his work onto the four feet by five feet mounted posters.

After the above charts were prepared, he personally carried these charts from New York to Washington D.C. aboard a train. BART PORTER met him at the train station in Washington and the charts were placed in PORTER's stationwagon Thereupon they proceeded to Washington D.C. Headquarters of CREP. At CREP Headquarters he was introduced to JEB MAGRUDER and spoke to him for approximately two minutes. MAGRUDER reviewed his charts and thereafter introduced him to PETER DALEY. The purpose of this introduction was to afford FROST an opportunity to secure future employment as an art design consultant with the Republican Campaign organization.

While at CREP Headquarters the charts were placed in the office of BART PORTER and were generally visible to all due to their general location and their large size. To the best of his knowledge there was no apparent attempt to conceal these charts from anyone. During this visit to CREP Headquarters, FROST also recalled meeting KEN REITZ with whom he exchanged brief greetings.

FROST advised that the above charts were the only charts he had ever prepared in connection with any employment he has had with the Republican Party. He stated that he has never prepared any charts for G. GORDON LIDDY. He advised that he had never met LIDDY and has never had any dealings with anyone holding himself out as a representative of LIDDY,

In November, 1971, PHIL JOANOU, the number one man to DALEY, called FROST from California and asked him to prepare: some art layouts with two or three theme approaches for the Presidential advertising campaign. FROST undertook this assignment and after a few days brought the layout to the Drake Hotel in New York City, where he displayed them to DALEY and JOANOU who selected two themes, and asked FROST to develop them. The layouts selected demonstrated the themeline and format for the Presidential Re-Election Campaign, and consisted of

bumper sticker designs, button designs, newspaper advertisements and an advertising folder. No charts whatsoever were included in these layouts. After this meeting FROST brought the above layout to CREP Headquarters in Washington D.C. During this visit he again saw MAGRUDER and waved to MAGRUDER as he was passing in the hallway. He also recalled seeing REITZ. During this visit FROST displayed his layouts to DALEY and JOANOU and also obtained regular employment from DALEY who decided to hire him at \$800 per week to work for "The November Group" where he was to be responsible for the "graphic look of the campaign".

A Tew weeks later in either February or March, 1972, he started working at the "The November Group" office located in New York/City. His work at the "November Group" lasted until the middle of November, 1972. During the entire period of his employment at the "November Group" he never prepared any charts.

FROST advised that at no time during his employment for the Republicans did he ever hear the word "gemstone". He stated that he knew of no one who was involved in the preparation of charts delineating possible intelligence operations of the Republican organization. While at the "November Group" BILL TAYLOR was his immediate superior who reviewed his art design work. PAUL MULLER was the financial director of the "November Group" and paid his salary.

FROST advised that he maintained a business diary at his residence which would show specific dates of his travels and transactions with CREP, and the "November Group". He advised that original sketches or "roughs" of charts and other art designs work that he has done for the Republicans, may be located at his residence; however, he has destroyed many such items because he could not possibly keep all of his original sketches due to the lack of storage space at his residence.

FROST stated that he could not be more specific as to the dates of his travels and transactions with the Republicans inasmuch as he has been extremely busy during the past several years. Consequently, one event in time tends to coalesce with others as far as his work is concerned.

FROST was advised that it was possible that a subpoena necessitating his appearance in court in Washington D.C. would be issued at a future date.

On May 1, 1973 ROGER J. STONE JR. voluntarily appeared at the New York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation(FBI) where he was interviewed by Special Agents (SAS) VINCENT A. ALVINO and HOWARD R. LINSCOTT who identified themselves as SAS of the FBI. At the inception of the interview, SA ALVINO explained the purpose of the interview and advised STONE of his constitutional rights as set forth in a "Voluntary Appearance; Advice of Rights" form which he read and executed. STONE furnished the following information:

He is presently living at the residence of his parents on Old Farm Road, Lewisboro, New York, telephone 914-533-2734. He is presently engaged as an election campaign worker in the offices of "Mc Mahon For County Executive", 147 Mamaroneck Avenue, White Plains, New York.

In the early part of 1972, STONE was a student at George Washington University, Washington D.C. where he served as the Chairman of a group known as the "D.C. College Republicans". While functioning in this capacity, he built an association with BART PORTER who was in charge of scheduling activities for the Committee for the Reelection of the President (CREP). On numerous occasions, possibly five to ten times, PORTER enlisted his efforts on such matters as crowd-raising, leafletting, and organizing support for President NIXON on various issues. During this period, STONE was also working as an aide to Congressman ROBERT STEELE of Connecticut. STONE saw fit to volunteer that STEELE was at one time an agent for the Central Intelligence Agency.

STONE advised that his relationship with PORTER matured further when STONE was designated by STEELE to coordinate a campaign trip made by STEELE to New Hampshire with the planned activities of CREP. During this trip, STONE was necessarily in contact with PORTER.

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STONE characterized the above contacts in his relationship with PORTER as completely legitimate and he could recall nothing of an illicit nature which PORTER asked him to perform.

However, on one occasion during the Spring of 1972, PORTER summoned STONE to his office at CREP in Washington, D.C. and asked him if he would be willing to make a trip to Manchester, New Hampshire, for the purpose of planting a leaflet at Mc Govern Headquarters and at the Manchester Union Leader STONE agreed to perform this mission and PORTER gave newspaper. him yellow leaflets which stated in effect that EDMUND MUSKIE was the candidate of the Conservative Democrats. PORTER did not explain the intended effect of the leaflet, but STONE assumed that this leaflet would serve to irrevocably divide the factions of Democrats so as to prevent a strong coalition behind the eventual presidential candidate of the Democrats. The pretended issuer of this leaflet was a group named "The Committee for a New Democratic Coalition".

Following the instructions of PORTER, STONE travelled to Manchester, New Hampshire, and planted one copy of the leaflet in the storefront headquarters of GEORGE MC GOVERN. He delivered another copy of the leaflet with a lobby receptionist at the offices of the Manchester Union Leader newspaper and requested that it be delivered to the political editor.

PORTER gave STONE cash in advance to cover the expenses of the above trip. The cash only covered the transportation expenses and the cost of meals. STONE received no monetary compensation for the performance of the act itself. STONE recalled that he travelled from Washington D.C. to Boston via Alleghany Airlines or Eastern Airlines and completed the trip to Manchester from Boston by bus. He returned to Washington D.C. from Manchester on the same day in the same manner.

STONE was accompanied on the trip by MICHAEL COLLIGAN, a fellow student at George Washington University. STONE mentioned the purpose of the trip to COLLIGAN who decided he wanted to accompany STONE. COLLIGAN remained in the street in Manchester while STONE made his visits at the Manchester Union Leader and MC GOVERN Headquarters. COLLIGAN did not receive reimbursement for his out-of-pocket expenses incurred in connection with this trip.

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Upon his return to Washington D.C. STONE immediately telephoned PORTER to advise him that his mission had been accomplished. PORTER indicated that he would recontact STONE in the future.

Approximately two weeks after the above trip, PORTER telephoned STONE at the Adams Hall Dormitory, 730 19th Street, Northwest, Washington D.C. and asked STONE to come to his office at CREP. On the same day, STONE met with PORTER in his office at CREP where PORTER asked him if he would be willing to travel to Manchester to make a cash contribution to Mc Closkey Campaign Headquarters; PORTER wanted STONE to disguise himself as a member of the Gay Liberation Movement when making this STONE flatly rejected this proposal. contribution. he concurred with the basic theme of this tactic and thus suggested to PORTER that the cash contribution be made in the name of a radical campus organization. STONE suggested that the contribution be made in the name of the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA). He thought of YSA because the YSA Chapter at George Washington University was the most prominent of the leftwing, radically-prone groups operating on his campus. PORTER adopted STONE's suggestion and told STONE that he would secure stationary with the letterhead of the YSA.

Approximately two or three days later, PORTER telephoned STONE and had him come to his office at CREP. PORTER furnished STONE with five pieces of white stationary which bore the blue letterhead, "YSA", "Amherst College". PORTER also furnished STONE with \$125.00 in cash; he could not recall the denominational makeup of this cash. PORTER instructed STONE to get the cash changed into one dollar bills and coin, travel to Manchester, donate it to Mc Closky Headquarters, and obtain a receipt on the YSA stationary. PORTER instructed STONE to dress in dungarees and a sweater in order to insure the impression of being a student.

Immediately upon leaving PORTER, STONE went to the branch of the First National Bank of Washington D.C., located near CREP Headquarters, and exchanged the bills that PORTER had given him, into rolls of coin and one dollar bills. He then went home and subsequently found a large jar with a green top that was to be used for delivering the contribution.

One day later, STONE travelled alone from Washington D.C. to Manchester where he went directly to Mc Closkey Campaign Headquarters which he recalled was located on the second floor over a garage or store. He walked into the headquarters and identified himself as the treasurer of the YSA Chapter of Amherst College. He then made the contribution of \$125.00 contained in the jar which he had been carrying in a duffel-bag. obtained a receipt which read "Received from YSA, Amherst College \$125.00".

On the same day, he travelled back to Washington D.C. from Manchester and called PORTER to tell him that he had accomplished his mission. PORTER instructed him to report to him next morning with the receipt.

On the next morning, STONE went to PORTER's office at CREP and handed him the receipt. PORTER then instructed STONE to write a letter to the Manchester Union Leader which stated in essence, that the writer of the letter was a student at Amherst College and that he understood that MC CLOSKEY had accepted a contribution from YSA. The letter stated that he was appalled that MC CLOSKEY would accept a gift from such an organization. The letter was written on a legal-size pad which PORTER had provided. When he completed the letter, STONE gave it to PORTER who said he would handle the mailing of it. STONE then left PORTER's office assuming that he would mail the letter. PORTER never did specifically state to him that he had actually mailed this letter.

Following the procedure of the first mission, PORTER gave STONE cash in advance to cover the expenses of transportation and meals. STONE did not receive any monetary compensation for services performed. His mode of travel was the same as that used on his first mission to Manchester for PORTER. STONE advised that ANN WESCHE, his fiancee, who was a student at George Washington University at the time, knew about the purpose of the above trip.

In April, 1972, after the above two missions, STONE approached PORTER about the possibility of obtaining a job with the Young Voters for the President, a youth arm of CREP. STONE was afforded an interview with KEN RIETZ, the Director of this organization, through the influence of PORTER. Approximately

ten days after the interview, RIETZ informed STONE that he did not have a job for him. At this point, he discussed with PORTER the possibility of obtaining a job with CREP as a "surrogate scheduler" which involved making up schedules of speakers who would represent President NIXON in speaking engagements during the campaign. STONE told PORTER that he would want to be paid \$550.00 per month for this job. PORTER advised that the job only paid \$400.00 per month. STONE felt that \$400.00 per month would not meet his minimum subsistence level and he pressed PORTER for \$550.00 per month. PORTER relented and agreed to pay STONE \$550.00 per month; this sum would consist of a \$400.00 per month payroll check issued by CREP and \$150.00 per month in cash PORTER explained that the \$150.00 received directly from PORTER. in cash would be paid to STONE from him until such time that the CREP payroll check could be increased to \$550.00 per month.

After approximately ten days had elapsed from the time of the above salary discussion meeting, STONE recontacted PORTER to express his anxiety about not yet starting his job with CREP. PORTER told STONE that he would check to determine if STONE had been approved for the job as "surrogate scheduler" and when he should start work with CREP.

About three or four days later, PORTER contacted STONE and said that he was looking for a trustworthy individual to travel to states where campaign primaries were being held to gather intelligence information on a first-hand basis on such matters as organizational morale, factionalism, and the general political atmosphere. In addition, PORTER wanted this individual to be capable of doing sophisticated political pranks which would have the effect of disrupting the election campaigns of political opponents. STONE told PORTER that he would take this matter into consideration and recontact him.

After several days, STONE called MORTON/BLACKWELL of Arlington, Virginia, and asked him if he could suggest someone who possessed those talents that PORTER described. In a few days, BLACKWELL recontacted STONE and told him that MIKE MC MINOWAY was such an individual. BLACKWELL related that he had contacted MC MINOWAY explaining that he had a friend who was doing research on Kentucky politics. MC MINOWAY expressed interest in this type of work and BLACKWELL told MC MINOWAY that

his friend would be contacting him in the future. BLACKWELL did not mention STONE's name to MC MINOWAY. BLACKWELL told STONE that MC MINOWAY was then employed in a General Motors plant in the Louisville, Kentucky area.

STONE then reported to PORTER that he had found MC MINOWAY as the person that PORTER had in mind. PORTER authorized STONE to contact MC MINOWAY under the pretext that he was a representative of a group of conservative businessmen who wanted to hire him to collect information on, and sabotage those liberal democratic presidential candidates. PORTER further instructed STONE to set up a meeting with MC MINOWAY in Kentucky and fly down to confer with MC MINOWAY to see if he was interested in the job; if he could get a leave of absence from General Motors; and, discuss the terms of payment with MC MINOWAY. PORTER instructed that STONE make this initial contact with MC MINOWAY from a public pay telephone.

Pursuant to the above instructions, STONE telephoned MC MINOWAY and arranged to meet him in the lobby at a Holiday Inn or Ramada Inn located near the Louisville Airport. STONE identified himself as JASON RAINER, the representative of the group of conservative businessmen. It was arranged that he would be able to recognize MC MINOWAY by his manner of dress.

Prior to his personal meeting with MC MINOWAY, STONE was further instructed by PORTER that he should at no time use his true name in his relationship with MC MINOWAY or indicate that he was in anyway connected with CREP. PORTER authorized STONE to offer MC MINOWAY a \$1000.00 per month "rate of payment" for personal services in addition to being compensated for expenses incurred. PORTER also instructed STONE to advise MC MINOWAY that any money he received from him should be considered as income and therefore, liable to income tax; he was to be advised that no money would be withheld for income tax purposes by his employers. STONE was given \$500.00 in cash by PORTER to be delivered to MC MINOWAY as an initial "good faith" payment in advance if he agreed to accept the offer. PORTER instructed STONE to obtain a receipt for this payment. MC MINOWAY was also to be instructed to obtain receipts for expenses incurred.

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It was at the above meeting with PORTER concerning instructions to be given MC MINOWAY, that PORTER told STONE that he had been hired by CREP as a "surrogate scheduler". It was confirmed that STONE would receive \$400.00 per month in a payroll check issued by CREP and an additional \$150.00 per month from STONE as a supplement.

STONE did not feel that his success in obtaining the services of MC MINOWAY was a condition precedent to his obtaining the job of "surrogate scheduler". Likewise, he did not feel that the \$150.00 cash supplement was specifically related to the MC MINOWAY operation and therefore not related to compensation for duties performed as a "surrogate scheduler".

STONE then flew to Louisville Airport and met with MC MINOWAY in the lobby of the Holiday Inn or Ramada Inn in the vicinity of the airport. STONE explained the nature of services expected of MC MINOWAY as set forth above. The rate of compensation of \$1000 per month plus expenses was mutually agreed upon. STONE paid MC MINOWAY the \$500.00 in cash as the "good faith" advance payment for two weeks of services and obtained a receipt. STONE told MC MINOWAY that he would be calling him soon with further instructions. STONE assured MC MINOWAY that he would never instruct him to do anything illegal. MC MINOWAY assured STONE that he could obtain a leave of absence from General Motors. STONE flew back to Washington D.C. on the same day; he did not register at any hotel while in Louisville.

STONE immediately reported to PORTER that the employment arrangement with MC MINOWAY had been consummated and gave PORTER the receipt for the \$500.00 payment. Within one week, STONE commenced working at CREP offices as a "surrogate scheduler". The day after STONE reported to CREP offices, PORTER instructed him to contact MC MINOWAY and dispatch him to Florida to begin infiltrating the campaigns of the Democrats during the primary campaign. PORTER instructed that MC MINOWAY learn the different headquarters setup of the Democrats and get started in disruption tactics and pranks against the Democrats.

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Thus, the political sabotage activities of MC MINOWAY were launched. MC MINOWAY was operated by STONE from late April through early August, 1972. STONE estimated that the total payment to MC MINOWAY during this period came to approximately \$9000.00 to \$10,000, consisting of \$4000.00 in salary payments and \$5000.00 to \$6000.00 in expenses.

STONE never met MC MINOWAY after the above Louisville Their method of communication was the telephone with STONE placing the call to MC MINOWAY. STONE recalled that he had conversations with MC MINOWAY on the average of once a week. The telephone conversations for the most part consisted of oral reports furnished by MC MINOWAY. He never furnished written reports of his activities. However, when it was necessary to mail materials to STONE, such as Democrat campaign schedules. advance press releases and expense receipts, which he had acquired, MC MINOWAY would mail this material to a post office box at a Post Office Station in Washington D.C.; he thought the name of the station was the George Washington Station. advised that he did not pick up this mailed material. A CREP volunteer named DAVE CHEW usually picked up the mail, to the best of his knowledge.

STONE paid MC MINOWAY by sending telegram money orders to his wife, Mrs. MICHAEL MC MINOWAY, 133 Manslick Drive, Fairdale, Kentucky. STONE recalled that this address was slightly incorrect, but did not prevent or noticeably delay payment. Payment was usually made in the middle of the month.

STONE advised that MC MINOWAY had complete discretion as to the methods he utilized to acquire information and as to type of campaign disruptions he carried out. He was never given specific assignments by STONE; however, there was the following exception:

During the Florida Democratic Primary Campaign,
PORTER spoke with MC MINOWAY who was then in Miami, and instructed
him to buy a camera and attempt to get a photograph of DICK
NUCK, the noted political prankster who was employed by the
Democrats. PORTER identified himself to MC MINOWAY as the boss
of JASON RAINER. To the best of his knowledge, this was the only
time PORTER was in contact with MC MINOWAY.

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STONE recalled the following highlights in the sabotage activities for which MC MINOWAY took credit:

During the Wisconsin Primary, he sent out engraved invitations to approximately 200 Democrats to attend a campaign breakfast with HUBERT HUMPHREY which failed to take place.

During the Wisconsin Primary, he stuffed envelopes with campaign literature of HUMPHREY designed to appeal to Negroes and Puerto Ricans and mailed them to predominantly white union workers, and vice versa.

During the California Primary, he fouled up the telephone lists of potential voters to be contacted, resulting in the failure to contact many and others being contacted several times.

MC MINOWAY used the name of MIKE SNOW, among others, as he infiltrated the Democrat Primary Campaigns, as a volunteer worker in Florida, Wisconsin, California, and Washington D.C.. He finished his tour as a volunteer for MC GOVERN in Washington D.C. in August, 1972. The code name used for MC MINOWAY between PORTER and STONE was "Sedan Chair II".

STONE ceased operating MC MINOWAY about mid-August, 1972 at the instruction of PORTER. STONE recalled that PORTER returned to Washington D.C. after a brief trip in August and told STONE that the services of MC MINOWAY would not be needed anymore. PORTER did not give any reasons for discontinuing the operation of MC MINOWAY and STONE could offer no speculation in this regard. Following PORTER's instructions, STONE notified MC MINOWAY that his services were no longer needed.

STONE advised that at the time PORTER issued his discontinuance instructions on MC MINOWAY, he also told STONE that he could no longer provide the \$150.00 per month cash supplement to his salary; PORTER advised STONE that he no longer had the cash to continue the supplement. STONE complained to PORTER and J. CURTIS HERGE, the Master Scheduler at CREP, about his cut in pay. About two or three days later, PORTER advised him that he would then start to receive a \$550.00 straight salary check issued by CREP.

STONE advised that he did not consider any of the activities related above which he performed under the guidance and instruction of PORTER, to be a violation of any law. He regarded such activities to be a way of life in the political campaign arenas of this country, and thus, felt no guilt.

STONE advised that the only information which he possessed specifically relating to the Watergate incident, concerned a telephone call which he answered at the residence of PORTER. He related that while PORTER was in California on an official visit for CREP, STONE went to the residence of PORTER at 4340 Garfield Street, Washington D.C., on June 19, 1972 in order to feed and tend to PORTER's dogs. At approximately 6:00 PM, STONE answered a telephone call from an individual who identified himself as JIM MC CORD. The caller initially asked if Mr. PORTER was at home. STONE responded that Mr. PORTER was out of town and asked if there was a message. The caller then said he STONE asked him if this was some kind of joke, was JIM MC CORD. The caller responded that it was not a joke. STONE asked if there was a telephone number where PORTER could reach him. caller responded, "No, I'm in the lockup; I'll get in touch". The caller then hung up.

STONE immediately telephoned CREP Headquarters and was connected to JEAN MASON who gave STONE the telephone number in California where PORTER could be reached. STONE then telephoned PORTER at the Beverly Hills Hotel, Los Angeles, California, and told him about the above telephone call. PORTER asked him to relate the exact text of the telephone conversation two or three times and then told STONE that it was a prank call in his opinion. PORTER told him that someone at CREP would also question him on June 20, 1972 concerning this telephone call. ROBERT ODLE, an official at CREP in Washington D.C., did question him on the morning of June 20, 1972 about the telephone call received from MC CORD.

The only other incident that STONE could recall that might shed light on the overall political sabotage operations of the Republicans, concerned an inquiry by GEORGE GORTON during the summer of 1972. STONE advised that at the time, GORTON was the College Director of the Young Voters for the President. GORTON asked STONE, "Do you have a young Republican in Washington D.C., who needs a job". STONE desponded that he did and furnished GORTON with the name of TEDABRILL, Chairman of the GEORGE WASHINGTON University College Republicans. STONE advised that he was never informed of the nature of the job and that he had no contact with BRILL during the entire summer.

On May 3, 1973, STONE, in response to efforts to locate him, telephoned the New York Office of the FBI and spoke to SA ALVINO. He was advised that it would be necessary to question him further concerning his relationship with PORTER. STONE requested that the questions be asked during this telephone call as a matter of convenience to him. He was advised that he should consider this telephone conversation as an extension of his interview on May 1, 1973. STONE stated that he fully understood and he furnished the following information:

In July, 1972 while residing at 1310 New Hampshire Avenue, Northwest, Washington D.C., he was then working at CREP Headquarters, Washington D.C.. On one occasion, PORTER called him to his office and told him that DARIUS KEATON was sending money addressed to him (STONE) by means of a Western Union money order. PORTER instructed STONE to pick up the money order and deliver the money to him. On the same day STONE picked up the money order at a Western Union branch on Connecticut Avenue, Washington D.C., and immediately delivered the money to PORTER at CREP headquarters.

STONE advised that the money order was made payable to him, bore his residence address, and that KEATON was the sender. STONE was not able to remember the amount of the money order, and could only recall that it was in excess of \$1000.00.

STONE advised that he could remember no other occasion when he received money for PORTER under such circumstances. STONE regarded himself as a mere messenger in the above transaction and he was not advised by PORTER of the intended purpose or disposition of the money. STONE received no indication from PORTER that any portion of the money was to be used in payments to MC MINOWAY.

STONE advised that although the circumstances of the above incident could be considered unusual, PORTER did not explain and STONE did not question the method of transmittal of the money from KEATON to PORTER.

## U.S. Judge Orders Pretrial Hearings

The federal judge in the Gainesville Eight conspiracy case has ordered new pre-trial hearings to determine whether the Justice Department's prosecution of Vietnam Veterans Against the War is based on illegal electronic bugging.

U.S. District Judge Winston E. Arnow scheduled the hearings for June 20 in Pensacola. He acted after defense lawyers submitted new motions based in part on The Herald's reports of alleged entrapment of the veterans.

ON MAY 23, The Herald reported that a Miami man, Pablo Fernandez, has admitted he spied on the VVAW for the Miami Police Department a statement subsequently confirmed by police officials.

Fernandez has also said he tape recorded a telephone conversation with Scott Camil, the VVAW Florida coordinator and one of the defendants, on the instructions of Miami FBI agent Frank Gibbons.

The FBI has refused to comment. The Justice Department prosecutor, Guy Goodwin of Washington, has insisted in a sworn statement to the court that there was no illegal bugging by rederal agencies.

In conjunction with the hearings, Judge Arnow scheduled oral arguments on defense claims that the case should be thrown out because of "governmental a misconduct."

# Florida Agency Admits Receiving VVAW Bug Tape From Lady Spy

By ROB ELDER Herald Staff Writer

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement confirmed Thursday it received a tape recording of a phone conversation with Gainesville Eight defendant Scott Camil last summer from a blonde Miami secretary.

The young woman informer also supplied information allegedly linking the Watergate burglars with the burglary of the Chilean Embassy last May, the officials said, But the state officials said they didn't tell the FBI because the information—was not worthy of dissemination."

In the federal conspiracy case against Camil and other Vistnam Veterans Agains: the War, Justice Department prosecutor Guy Goodwin has insisted under oath that the government knew of "no electronic overhearings of liny kind of any conversations of the defendants," except for one conversation between Camil and co-defendant Alton Foss of Hialeah.

The tape in the Florida officials' possession, however, is reportedly a copy of a recorded call between Camil and Pablo Fernandez, a Miamian who was an informer for the FBI and the Miami Police Department.

AND THE woman informer claims under oath that the was offered "a copy of the FIT papers" which Fernandez told her were solen in the embassy burgla-

The source of the new disclosures is Angelica F.ohan, 31, a former anti-Castro freedom fighter who claims expert knowledge of firearms and explosives and who admits she once tried to convince a TV crew she was "the woman in Watergate," but now says she wasn't.

Mrs. Rohan is married to Miami lawyer Laurence Rohan. She works for another, lawyer, Martin Blitstein. She told her story in a sworm statement to U.S. District Judge W. O. Mehrtens on May 23, after reading a Herald story which for the first time identified Fernandez as a police informer who spied on the VVAW, and offered to sell them guns.

MRS. ROHAN made another sworn statement Wednesday, to State Attorney Richard Gerstein. Sources in Gerstein's office say she claimed second-hand knowledge of a possible plot 10 ussassinate the Democratic vice presidential candidate, who later turned out to be Thomas Eagleton.

But while that and her other statements about the Watergate case were admittedly hearsay, Mrs. Rohan's information about the alleged VVAW entrapment appears to be first hand, sources said.

They quoted her as saying she was present when Fernandez offered to supply the VVAW with Cubin weapons which "could be turned into machine guns by pitting in a little piece of metal."

"SHE (ANGIE) called and volunteered to work with us." Reed says. "She had a lot of connections in the Cuban community."

KEY SAYS Angle told him that certain Miamians were involved in " a demonstration at the Chilean embassy in Washington."

He was not aware until a Herald reporter told him about it. Key said, that the Chilean Embassy was burglarized on the weekend of May 13-14, 1972.

One weekend before that, a group of Miami Cuban exiles went to Washington with Bernard Barker to break up leftist demonstrations at the funeral of FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover. Two weekends after the Chilean Embassy burglary, the first Fatergate break-in occurred. Barker and five others were caught in a second Water-

gate entry June 17, but no charges have ever been filed in the embassy burglary.

KEY INSISTS he never told the FBI or any other federal agency about the wiretap or Mrs. Rohan's embassy information — even though "I knew there was a federal investigation."

The reason he did not tell the FBI, Key said, was that the information did not seem at the time to be specific evidence, and Mrs. Rohan "was my source and I'm going to protect my source."

Law enforcement agencies do not reveal, even to each other, the identities of their "confidential sources," Key taid. So he did not include lifes. Rohan's information in his weekly triefings to the various agencies who relied on The Florida Department of Law Enforcement's intelligence center for convention security information.

But Key did include the information is written reports which went to his immediate superior, Enory Williams director of intelligence and information.

THOSE REPORTS "stopped with me." Williams said Thursday. "The information was not periment to the activity we were involved in. In my judgment, it was not worthy of dissemination to other agencies."

Williams said he was unaware of the Justice Department's claim, in the VVAW conspiracy case, that there had been no electronic eavesdropping on the defendants.

"I hadn't followed the case. I had so interest in it," he said.

In claiming the case against the veterans is not based on wiretapping, Goodwin, the Jusice Department prosecutor, has said he surveyed seven federal agences to make sure they didn't bug the VVAW.

BUT HIS SWORN statement did not list the Florica Department of Law Enforcement, a state agency.

In her own sworn statements to Judge Mehrtens and Gerstein, Mrs. Rohan is described by investigators as also saying that:

Contrary to what Pablo Fernandez has previously told investigators, Fernandez agreed to work for \$700 a week and recruit 15 other men at the same salary to "create disturbances" during the Democratic Convention.

Fernandez says he was offered the job by Eugenio R. Martinez, one of the convicted Watergate burgiars, and turned it down. According to Mrs. Rohan, the plan was shelved only because the Watergate group was caught before the convention.

- She became aware of the Watergate plans in conversations with Fernandez. Mrs. Rohan said. On one occasion Fernandez took her to lunch at a Lum's restaurant and told her, "You're going to leanr how to play spy."

Key, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement agent said Thursday that his lady informer told him last summer that Pablo Fernandez was talking about procuing weapons for the VVAW.

But Key said he did not know them that Fernandez was also a police informer. Mrs. Rohan said she iraveled to Washington the weekend of May 4-6 on the same plane taken by Barker, Vernandez and others who started fights at Hoover's funeral. She claims this was a coincidence; she was going as a courier for a Miami lawyer, she says, and knew nothing, at that time, of the Watergate plans.

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## Witness Says Barker, Sturgis Asked Him to Discredit VVAW

FORT LAUDERDALE + Watergate burglars Bernaid Barker and Frank Sturgs were involved in recruiting agents to discredit anti-war groups during the 1972 national political conventions, the Broward County State Attorney's Office was told Thursday.

The evidence was given in a sworn statement by Vincent J. Hannard of Miramar, a private investigator who was disqualified as a witness in a 1071 Miami psychiatrists testified that Hannard could neither understand the witness oath nor tell the difference between truth and lies.

.In sworn testimony before two assistant state attorneys Hannard said he was contacted by Barker and Sturgis before the first of two Watergate burglaries. He said he was offered work in "intelligence and instigation" during the conventions at Miami Beach.

HANNARD claimed he received separate phone calls from Sturgis, and maybe Barker, and two others and that they asked him to help disrupt and discredit activities of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War - an organization thoroughly infiltrated by police and federal informers before and during the conventions.

Hannard said Sturgis told him that if he was not interested, he would make the offer instead to John Ecs, Miami gun dealer who also was once a registered representative of the Castro gov-

Eck later said he was montacted in April 1972, Lit refused to say by whom, other than that it was someone involved in the Water-

Assistant State Attorney Kenneth Jenne confirmed that he had questioned Hannard about his contacts with the convicted Watergate burglars. He declined to reveal details except to say he took Hannard's statement as part of an investigation into possible conspiracy to commit crimes during the two conventions. -

Hannard said he told Jenne and Robert Butterworth, other assistant state attarney, that in the week prior to May 29, 1972, he received four phone calls proposing undercover convention work of the first attempt to bresk into Democratic National Committee offices at the Waergate hotel and office omplex in Washington.

According to Hannad, each call came from a different person, and each caller tried to persuade him that it was his "patriotic duty" to help undermine the VVÁW.

Hannard said Sturgis ideatified himself as Frank Fiorini, his name before be changed it to Sturgis. Hannard said he was sure it was Sturgis, because he has known him for more than 13 vears and recognized his

THE HERALD has been unable to confirm that anyone using that name ever worked for the CIA in Miami. A spokesman for the agency promised to check the name, then reported that no one using it has worked for the agency during the past 20 years — as far bick as he checked.

Hannard said he could not give a name, if any, used by the fourth person who caled him.

Hannard said he told an FISI agent, Jack Ackerly, about the calls shortly after he received them. Aclerly said he knows Hannard, but

refused to talk about conversations he may have had with him.

According to Hannard, none of the four callers told him what would be expected of him if he agreed to do the proposed undercover work. But he said each mentioned the VVAW and described the task as covert intelligence and instigation.

"It was clear from what they said that I was supposed to incite trouble or riots from the anti-war groups," he said. "I was told it would be activity pertaining to the convention and an opportunity to travel.

"And there would be great rewards when the President was reelected."

HANNARD SAID he was offered \$1,000 a week for that work, but that in the fourth cast the offer was raised to \$1,500.

He said he turned it down because he was suspicious of the motives of the callers — but might have accepted such an offer had it come in writing and from someone he could trust.

Hannard first met Sturgis when the two were active in Cuba during the Castro take-over, he said.

Records show that Hannard was registered as a Castro agent in the United States and in Cuba in 1959 and part of 1960. He was employed until mid-1960 as a detective for Castro, reportedly as a double agent.

During that period, he gave information to the EBI which resulted in the arrest

of three persons charged with conspiring to sell stolen machine guns to the Castro government.

In 1961, he renounced support of the Castro regime and formed a group known as Freedom Fighters for America to launch an anti-Castro attack on Cuba. The effort collapsed, and the group was disbanded.

He was convicted in 1962 of impersonating an FBI agent and has been convicted of operating an ambulance service and a detective agency without required city licenses.

But he was also an informant for federal and local police agencies and was a key witness in several cases.

IN 1961, Hannard was credited with giving information leading to the arrest of a 11e g e d 1 100 racketeer Charles Karps for possessing \$50,000 worth of stolen bonds.

And in 1970, his testimony helped convict former Miami police inspector Francis Lee Napier for conspiracy to sell 875 pounds of marijuana smuggled into Miami from Jamaica.

Defense lawyers disputed Hannard's mental ability to allow investigators to record his conversations with Napier. A psychiatrist testified that Hannard didn't know the difference between truth and lies, and he was disqualified as a witness.

An appeals court set Napier's guilty verdict aside until a determination about Hannard could be made, but Napier pleaded guilty.

## ere Tricked

WASHINGTON - Antiwar veterans, who attempted to heckle President Nixon av a Statue of Liberty "ethnic" ceremony last fall and were howled down by hundreds of Nixon partisans say they were tricked into the incident by accepting an anyonymous package of 50 invitations to the ceremony.

The hecklers, some 20 to 30 members and supporters of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) in New York, were drowned out and some were yanked away by police.

With national television cameras recording the scene. President Nixon interrupted his prepared eneath to moter "I would only hope that tonight the TV streens will pot show those our (demonstrators being escorted away) instead of the thousands here."

THE PRESIDENT raised his hands above his head as chants of support grew among the 3,000 to 5,000 school children, government officials and "ethnics" assembled on the 10-acre Liberty Island in New York harbor.

Four more years, four more years." hundreds in the crowd shouted.

"It was a set-up. We were taken," said one VVAW member this week recalling the incident last Sept. 26.

They were traine to discredit the anti-war movement and the McGovern campaign," said a VVAW worker who gave her name as Coca Crystal.

This view was unanimously supported in interviews with other New York VVAW members and supporters.

In the Statue of Liberty incident, three VVAW riembets in separate interviews gave similar accounts of the VVAVY New York office-

receiving the 50 unsclicited rivitations to the ceremony, a formal dedication of an \$8 million American Museum of Jumistration.

The official U.S. Park Service-embossed invitations came in a plain brown envelone with no return address One day before the Sept. 26 ceremony, said VVAW member Brian Mataresse of New York There was no note or accompanying explanation. be-said.

THE ENVELOPE was addoissed to the VVAW office. at 25 W. 25th St., in Manhattan, Mataresse said, but . was additionally directed to the attention of Pat Parker, a tescher and part-time workerin the VVAW office.

"We decided to get a gioup together and go," igcalled Watarecce, With such short notice, he said, only. about 20 were able to go. ! Other participants say there were about 30.

"We dressed straight and kept our signs and buttons under our coats," said Mataresse. "Some of the women carried anti-war signs folded up in their purs-

The group filtered onto the ferry boat at Battery Park in a Lower Manhattan for the frin to Liberty Island, passing a .. police check point and displaying their invitations, Miciaresse said.

Once on the island, the. group was engulfed by the large gathering of school and ethnic groups. The devionstrators unfurled their signs and began shouting "Stop the bombing, stop the hombing!" and other anti-war slogans

WILLIAM J. O'HARA, an attorney in the law firm of Jackson, Nash, Brophy, Barringer, and Brooks, 330 Madison Avenue, New York, New York, furnished the following information after being advised by Special Agent (SA) VINCENT A. ALVINO that the interview was being conducted in relation to the "Watergate" investigation:

O'HARA explained that he could be considered a conservative in the political spectrum. He has been a general supporter of the foreign policies of President RICHARD M. NIXON, including the manner in which he extricated the United States from the Vietnam War. He served as Chairman of the "Tell it to Hanoi Committee" which opposed the views of several of the nation's political leaders concerning their public opposition to manner in which the war was being conducted.

O'HARA recalled that in the latter part of April, 1972, he received a telephone call from JOSEPH BAROODY who asked if he would be willing to sponsor an advertisement concerning the Vietnam War. O'HARA replied that he would be willing to do so, contingent upon seeing and approving the intended advertisement.

Shortly thereafter, he received the intended advertisement in the mail from BAROODY. The advertisement was in support of NIXON's Southeast Asia policies. Since O'HARA approved of the substance of the advertisement, he mailed it back to BAROODY with his consent that it be published bearing his name as the sponsor. He also sent BAROODY two personal checks dated May 5, 1972 drawn on the Manufacturers Hanover Trust Company which he signed as payor. Check number 913 in the amount of \$3,169.34 was made payable to the Washington Post. Check number 914 in the amount of \$2,688.30 was made payable to the Washington Evening Star. It was his understanding that BAROODY would handle the details of having the advertisement printed in the above newspapers and deliver the checks in payment.

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
O'HARA advised that the advertisement subsequently appeared in the May 8, 1972 edition of the Washington Post and Washington Evening Star.

O'HARA advised that in the latter part of May, 1972 he visited HENRY CASHEN at his office in the Executive Office Building, Washington D.C. During this visit, CASHEN delivered a plain envelope to him and stated that "we would like to help you out with the expenses of the advertisement". O'HARA did not open the envelope until he returned to New York. The envelope contained \$4800.00 to \$5000.00 in cash consisting of one-hundred dollar bills.

O'HARA was questioned as to whom he thought "we" referred to. He advised that he did not know whether "we" referred to the White House, the Committee for the Reelection of the President, or some other group in sympathy with NIXON or the Republican Party.

O'HARA advised that he first met BAROODY at a political dinner in Washington D.C., approximately one year before he approached him about the advertisement. O'HARA became acquainted with CASHEN when he was in Ireland in 1970 and CASHEN was serving as part of an advance group to NIXON's visit to Ireland. Since that time he and CASHEN have become close personal friends.

The following is submitted in response to the request received from you for an PBI interview of David Dulles, 2208 Cathedral Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C. In requesting an interview of Mr. Dulles, you noted that Dulles has advised the Department of Justice that he is able to furnish a great deal of information on the Watergate matter and has requested to be interviewed.

As a matter of background concerning Mr. Dulles, the files of the Washington Field Office (NFO) reveal that Mr. Dulles was the subject of a Departmental applicant investigation in the Summer and Fall of 1966. At the time of that investigation, it was also determined that Mr. Dulles was also the subject of investigation being conducted by the Civil Service Commission for a possible appointment to the Bureau of the Budget.

or WFO revear that Ar. David Dulles is the nephew of John Foster Dulles, late Secretary of State; Allen W. Dulles, former Director of the Central Intelligence Agency; and Avery Dulles.

Mr. Dulles has appeared at WPO intermittently from December 7, 1971, through May 23, 1973. At no time during these visits has Mr. Dulles furnished information concerning the Watergate affair.

MC CORD, President, McCord Associates, 144 Hungerford Plaza, Suite 220, Rockville, Maryland:

# 1. Purchase Order from McCord Associates, Incorporated, #1326, dated April 24, 1972. JAMESON stated this Purchase Order reflected an order for four Kelcom III Transceivers with related accessories (that is, operating crystals, antenna, microphones, ear-phone, leather case, and shoulder harness). The equipment cost a total of \$3,883.20. JAMESON further stated the Purchase Order revealed the signature of JAMES W. MC CORD, JR. JAMESON also noted the Purchase Order had pencilled on it the frequencies of the said Transceivers as:

F1 Tx 156.260, Rx 161.9725 F2 Tx and Rx 161.9175

JAMESON emphatically stated that the aforementioned equipment was not designed for "bugging" and the equipment is not capable of functioning in a "bugging" capacity.

# 2. Invoice addressed to McCord Associates, Inc. Invoice #13210 - Shipping date May 25, 1972. JAMESON indicated that the said invoice was an itemized list of equipment identical to the aforementioned equipment on the Item #1 Purchase Order dated April 24, 1972. JAMESON further indicated that his initials are present in the upper right-hand corner of this invoice next to the Factory Order Number and the Shipping Date.

# 3. REA Air Express Receipt #70-13-67, dated May 25, 1972. JAMESON related the REA Air Express showed the shipment of the aforementioned electrical

#4. Personalized check No. 145 from McCord Associates, Inc., dated June 12, 1972, signed ALFRED L. GRFEN Paid to the order of Bell and Howell, Waltham, Massachusetts. JAMESON stated the said check was payment for the electrical equipment set forth in Item #1.

#5. Purchase Order from McCord Associates, Inc., #1389, dated May 25, 1972. JAMESON advised this Purchase Order reflected that it was a duplication in entirety of the order in the aforementioned Purchase Order (Item #1), dated April 24, 1972. JAMESON further advised this shipment had not been filled.

JAMESON related that the aforementioned equipment orders were placed with one WILLIAM D. MC CUIN of SIC Company, 350 Strathmore Road, Havertown, Pennsylvania. JAMESON indicated MC CUIN is not an employee of B & H, Waltham; however, MC CUIN does work on a commission basis and MC CUIN, up until March 13, 1972, was paid a monthly retainer, prior to suffering a heart attack.

JAMESON stated according to information he received from MC CUIN, MC CORD's company had the security charter for the Republican National Committee. MC CORD, according to MC CUIN, requested that MC CUIN recommend unobtrusive equipment to assist in crowd-control at the Republican National Convention, and MC CUIN recommended the aforementioned equipment set forth in Item #1. MC CORD accepted this recommendation. JAMESON added, to his knowledge, no additional electrical equipment had been furnished to MC CORD by B & H, Waltham.

JAMESON advised, prior to the shipment of equipment by B & H, Waltham, MC CORD's identity

and his security roll at the Republican National Convention, had been verified by THOMAS MC CUIN, an employee of SIC Company and likewise a representative of B & H, Waltham, in the same capacity as his father, WILLIAM D. MC CUIN.

JAMESON advised he has no additional information concerning this matter and he will continue to cooperate with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). JAMESON further advised the original documents, from which Xerox copies were furnished by him, will be made available per FBI request.

Because of the large number of transmitters and receivers expected to be required, there is a serious potential for electrical interference with the introduction of each additional transmitter within the convention hall.

The operation of this station is authorized subject to the following conditions:

- (1) The antenna heights to be employed must not exceed 20 feet above the ground or existing man-made structure on which it is mounted.
- (2) Harmful interference must not be caused to licensed stations operating in the services to which the frequency is allocated. In particular you must provide protection to the Public Coast Radio Stations as follows:

Also assigned Arlington Hall from about January, 1972, to September, 1972, was Captain ROBERT (HOUSTON, JR., with the position of Senior Special Agent Supervisor of Special Operations Branch (now changed to Security Control Branch), which handles selection and assignments of Army Special Agents throughout the world for covert and overt operations.

Captain HOUSTON had previously mentioned to KRAMER, his father (ROBERT HOUSTON, SR.) is a retired Master Sergeant from the Army Military Police. The day after "Watergate" reported arrests, Captain HOUSTON told KRAMER his father was employed by "MC CORD's private security firm" and spent several hours last evening destroying files. Upon hearing this, KRAMER criticized HOUSTON for bragging about this type of activity as this could indirectly reflect adversely on himself and ASA. Captain HOUSTON dismissed the criticism as unwarranted. KRAMER also mentioned HOUSTON's comment to Sergeant Major LEWIS TAYLOR, also assigned at the time to Arlington Hall (now assigned to Baltimore, Maryland, MI Office), who told KRAMER he appeared overly concerned.

Captain HOUSTON is currently assigned to the Monterey Language School, Monterey, California, specializing in Korean. HOUSTON, Senior, reportedly lives in Maryland, a short distance from Washington, D.C.  $\checkmark$

SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR INTERVIEW OF

ACTING ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR

Mr. Felt referred to me for comment and opinion a letter dated May 29, 1973, addressed to you from Stephen H. Sachs which requested your permission for an interview of the Acting Associate Director. The stated purpose of the interview was to provide a means of refreshing Mr. Gray's recollection as to various events, dates, and conversations which occurred during his tenure as Acting Director of the FBI. 4

This request for an interview presents a significant policy question. Mr. Gray's personal involvement in certain activities and his receipt of "numerous requests for testimony from him by the grand jury and committees of the Congress" have raised the possibility that this Bureau may be called upon to conduct investigation that would include inquiries of, and concerning, Mr. Gray. In view of these circumstances, for the Acting Associate Director of the FBI to collaborate in good faith in reconstructing the details of Mr. Gray's activities, at the minimum, would be to invite speculation that such collaboration was in fact a collusion designed to conceal the truth. 4

It would be more appropriate and more in the interests of the FBI for Mr. Felt to be available to testify as to his personal knowledge of relevant facts. In that way, the necessary details may be furnished to the grand jury and those committees of Congress having a need to receive them without clouding matters by pretestimony consultation of the witnesses.

Therefore, it is my opinion that the best interests of the FEI require that the request for interview not be granted,

To his knowledge, STEVENS is still operating this electronics business and resides with his wife, ADRIAN, on Devon Avenue in Chicago, and has a current telephone number of 465-2117.

PHALLS characterized BERNIE GORDON as an old electronic technician who was frequently hired by a number of private investigators in Chicago, primarily for clandestine electronic eavesdropping equipment and its installation. GORDON has been hired on a number of occasions by JACK MORAN, a private investigator, who has offices at 503 LaSalle Street in Chicago. STEVENS is also well acquainted with MORAN and in 1969, STEVENS introduced PHALLS to MORAN. Shortly thereafter MORAM hired PHALLS for some undercover work This undercover work involved the in Peoria, Illinois. racial situation in Peoria and MORAN had supposedly been hired by the "Peoris Journal Star", Peoria's only daily newspaper.
