IRWIN M. SHULMAN, 4 Wendover Poad, Eastchester, New York, Accountant, Harvey Bennett Associates, Certified Public Accountants, 317 North Avenue, New Rochelle, New York, was interviewed at his office in New Rochelle concerning the \$20,000 payment received by VICTOR LASKY in 1972.

SHULMAN advised that he does income tax returns for VICTOF and PATPICIA LASKY and does not manage their accounts on a regular basis. He made available a year-end work sheet made out by PATPICIA LASKY, believed by SHULMAN to be in her own handwriting, listing the LASKYs' income for 1972. This sheet revealed an entry for \$20,000 for VICTOR LASKY from the Financial Committee to Pe-elect the President, and the entry was dated May 17, 1973. The sum was entered under a column headed "Freelance-Magazines, Books, Newspapers".

SHULMAN stated that he was in contact with Mrs. LASKY on July 3, 1973, concerning the entry, and it was her opinion that she had entered the May 17, 1972 date an error and that the date should be ADTILLIANT. She advised SHULMAN that LASKY did not meet with JEB MAGRUDER in May. SHULMAN stated he had no other records concerning this entry.

Included on the work sheet was an entry dated July 11, 1972, disclosing a payment to PATRICIA LASKY from the Financial Committee to Pe-elect the President in the amount of \$9,750. SHULMAN produced a W-2 form from the Financial Committee to Pe-elect the President showing the sum \$9,750 as income paid to PATRICIA LASKY in 1972.

Accordingly, Lasky was interviewed and the results of the investigation are set forth:

Mr. VICTOR LASKY was interviewed at his residence Mumber 821, Watergate South, Washington, D. C. (WDC), by Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Agents who identified themselves and stated the purpose of interview. LASKY provided the following information:

LASKY advised he is a free-lance writer. He has written speeches, articles for magazines, and several books.

RICHARD HOHARD about doing some writing for the Committee to Reelect the President, Sometime after this conversation, LASKY was contacted by PREDERICK C. LARUE about doing some writing for MARTHA MITCHELL. In April, 1972, LASKY took a trip to California on another writing job. Prior to this trip, he was contacted by LARUE and told that it was set up that he was to write some speeches for MARTHA MITCHELL and he would be paid a retainer of \$20,000.

IASKY could not recall the exact date he left for California. However, his wife, PATTY, checked her diary and found the date was April 4, 1972. IASKY stayed at the Holiaday Inn in San Rafael, California. ROBERT REISNER called IASKY when he was in California and said the deal was okay and to come in and pickup the \$20,000 when he returned to Washington. IASKY said he was suppose to get the money before he left California, but did not have time.

LASKY could not remember when he returned from California. However, his wife checked her diary again which disclosed LASKY's return on April 17, and then April 18 he saw JEB STUAKT MAGRUPER.

LASKY met JEB STUART MAGRUDER at 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue to pick up his \$20,000 retainer. At this time, MAGRUDER made a quick phone call to HUGH W. SLOAN, JR., regarding the retainer. MAGRUDER then asked LASKY if he wanted the \$20,000 in cash or check. LASKY said he wanted it in cash. MAGRUDER paid him the \$20,000 in cash.

LASKY advised that he took the \$20,000 and put it in a safe deposit box which he rents at The Riggs National Bank located at the Watergate Apartments. LASKY then notified his accountant, IRVIN M. SHULMAN, 4 Wendover Road, Eastchester, New York, telephone number 914-DE7-8956 that he had received the \$20,000. LASKY explained that he does this in order for his accountant to keep records of his income and file a quarterly report with the Internal Revenue Service. LASKY said this \$20,000 was reported to the Internal Revenue Service.

IASKY advised that he wrote approximately a dozen speeches for MARTHA MITCHELL, some one line jokes, and several magazine articles which he does not believe were published. He said he wrote non-political speeches and jokes concerning her telephone conversations. IASKY advised that he had met with Mrs. MITCHELL and FREDERICK LARUE to find out what type material she wanted to have written.

LASKY advised that he had met MAGRUDER in 1969 when he had written a book titled <u>The Nixon Years</u>. This book was given to the Putnam's Publishing Company. LASKY was paid a \$40,000 advance by Putnam's for this book. This book was rejected by Putnam's on November 1, 1971. LASKY then returned the advance to Putnam's.

LASKY advised he has some copies of speeches he wrote for MARTHA MITCHELL; however, he did not want to produce them. He advised that Mrs. FORESBURG has some of this material at the Committee to Reelect the President.

ALLEGED ILLEGAL ACTIVITIES

Reference is made to the memorandum of Mr. James Vorenberg dated July 3, 1973, captioned as above.

This will confirm discussions of July 10 and July 11, 1973, between Mr. Philip Heymann of the Special Prosecutor's Staff and Special Agent Charles A. Nuzum of this Bureau. With reference to item 22 captioned "Richard Best." Mr. Heymann was advised this individual undoubtedly Is Richard Lee Bast, proprietor, Redex Corporation, 1404 New York Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C., who has been the subject of an extensive Interception of Communications (IOC) investigation by the PBI concerning alleged violations by Bast of the IOC Statutes. Bast was indicted by the Pederal grand jury, Washington, D. C., on February 23, 1972, for advertising, possessing and transporting in foreign commerce devices used primarily for surreptitious electronic surveillance. A superceding indictment was returned by the grand jury on May 26, 1972, which charged him with six counts of Section 2512, Title 18, U. S. Code (IOC), and one count of violation of Section 1934, Title 22, U.S. Code (exporting implements of war in violation of Department of State regulations).

On September 22, 1972, the U. S. District Court pranted a defense motion to quash a search warrant executed on January 10, 1972, at Redex Corporation, which resulted in evidence which was the basis for indictment of Bast. At the present time the Government has an appeal pending in the U. S. Court of Appeals, Washington, D. C., concerning the decision of the U. S. District Judge,

Mr. Heymann was informed that reports concerning the Bast case have been delivered to the Office of the U.S. Attorney, Washington, D.C., and to the Criminal Division of the U.S. Department of Justice.
