The purpose of this memorandum is to forward for the information of the Special Prosecutor's Office a copy of a letter to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), dated August 21, 1973, from James J. Rowley, Director, U. S. Secret Service (USSS), and to confirm the telephonic conversation of August 29, 1973, between Special Agent Joseph J. Henehan of the FBI and Richard Davis of the Special Prosecutor's Office concerning this matter. The letter concerns a John F. Leigh, who is alleged to have made the statement that he would destroy the Watergate people, mentioning Segretti and Wilson, apparently meaning Donald H. Segretti and Attorney John Wilson who represented H. R. Haldeman and John D. Ehrlichman.

Mr. Davis advised that he was in touch with the attorney representing Segretti and would advise him of the possible threat made by Leigh. He was advised that the Washington Field Office of the FBI had been instructed to advise local authorities and Mr. Wilson concerning this matter.

No further action is being taken by the FBI in this matter in absence of a specific request from the Special Prosecutor and it is noted that according to Mr. Rowley's letter, the Secret Service is conducting an investigation.

The following is being forwarded for your information and/or action as deemed appropriate.

On August 8, 1973, Rose Marie Vernell, 1748 M St., N.W., Washington, D.C. (telephone number 628-6699) advised that when she arrived at work that morning, the subject was sleeping in front of her office door. He told her Watergate was bad and he had come over to destroy these people. asked Vernell to cash a cashier's check in the amount of \$3,500.00 drawn on the National Bank of Wichita dated August 2, 1973, numbered 100381.

ST-109 Vernell was interviewed on August 9, 1973, and stated she met the subject a few days ago and spent the evening with him in an attempt to solve his problems. She denied a romantic or sexual involvement with the subject. repeated that Leigh said he would destroy the Watergate people but only mentioned Segretti and Wilson.

ALLEN was apprised of the fact that this interview was being conducted at the specific request of the Special Prosecutor ARCHIBALD COX. At this point, ALLEN was furnished with an Advice of Rights form and was advised of his rights pertaining to the interview. ALLEN took the form, read it, stated he understood it, and signed it.

ALLEN voluntarily consented to be interviewed without the presence of an attorney.

In February, 1972, ALLEN recalled that he and THOMAS VICTOR JONES, President of Northrup, had discussed the upcoming Presidential election campaign and had agreed to "do something substantial for the re-election of President NIXON." By this ALLEN stated that he intended to make a considerable financial donation for the re-election of the President.

ALLEN stated that in addition to this gift, which he made of his own personal funds, he also made a \$700 gift to the Northrup Good Citizens Committee. ALLEN stated that he is the Chairman of this committee and this committee voluntarily contributes monies in support of national, state, and local candidates. ALLEN states that JERRY DOUGLAS is the Treasurer and a FRANK SMITH is also on this committee. ALLEN states that during the 1972 election year, the Good Citizens Committee raised between \$30,000 to \$35,000 from Northrup employees which he believes was donated to various political candidates.

ALLEN believes that in February, 1972, MAURICE STANS. who was at that time representing the Finance Committee to Re-elect the President, contacted THOMAS VICTOR JONES for a contribution to the Committee to Re-elect the President (CREP). ALLEN states that when STANS came to the offices of JONES' at Northrup, he was not in attendance at this meeting. However, ALLEN states that JONES and he had agreed to donate \$100,000 to the campaign. ALLEN further advised that he and JONES discussed having other individuals who would voluntarily consent to donate certain monies to the campaign to make the \$100,000 donation. After contacting these individuals, the voluntary contributions from their personal funds was as follows:

THOMAS VICTOR JONES - \$50,000 JAMES ALLEN - \$15,000 JAMES WILLSON - \$20,000 BOB LLOYD - \$20,000

ALLEN stated that owing to the interest rates in the United States and a relationship that JONES and ALLEN had with an individual by the name of WILLIAM SAVY, they decided to borrow the money from SAVY and give it to the Finance Committee to Re-elect the President. ALLEN stated in an effort to make this a more "business-like" transactions, they sought the services of STANLEY SIMON and Associates. 70 Pine Street New York, New York. ALLEN states that he dealt directly with STANLEY SIMON. ALLEN recalls that the first contact with SIMON was on February 20, 1972, at which time SIMON handled the mechanics involved for setting up the note in which SAVY would be repaid. ALLEN recalls that JONES made available to SAVY a list presented by MAURICE STANS of at least 50 committees to which donations could be made not to exceed \$5,000 in an effort to avoid the gift tax. ALLEN believes that SAVY in making out the checks took the first 20 organizations.

ALLEN recalls that SIMON made out the repayment notes. The \$100,000 loan from SAVY was made by JONES. ALLEN, WILLSON, and LLOYD in turn took out notes to repay their part to JONES in January, 1973, at an interest rate of three-quarters percent per month.

ALLEN does not recall ever having any information pertaining to MAURICE STANS promising any "special treatment" or considerations to the Northrup Corporation as a result of this rather substantial contribution.

ALLEN further stated that neither JONES nor any other individual stated that ALLEN would be reimbursed for this gift from any other source.

ALLEN stated that he had enough money in his savings account to cover the \$15,000 loan in February, 1972, however, he decided not to take that money out of his savings, but rather to use it for other purposes.

When SAVY made out the checks, he had them sent to JONES, ALLEN recalls. JONES took these checks and gave onehalf of them to MAURICE STAMS in Washington, D.C. and one-half of them to the California Branch of CREP. ALLEN states that he was not present when these checks were given to the representative groups. ALLEN recalls that in July, 1972 (exact date unrecalled) MAURICE STANS and HERBERT W. KALMBACH came to the Northrup Corporation Headquarters, 1800 Century Park East, Century City, California, where they met with THOMAS VICTOR JONES. ALLEN states that he was not present at the meeting. However, after the meeting, JONES informed them that he would be making an additional \$50,000 donation to CREP. ALLEN recalls that JONES told him that this donation would be in cash owing to the fact that JONES had approximately \$50,000 in cash at his residence and wished to make a gift of that money. ALLEN states that he never saw that money nor did he ever count it and he must rely on what JONES told him the amount of the gift was.

ALLEN was asked if he had any further information pertaining to the matter above. ALLEN thought and stated he had no other information.

The following is a description of JAMES ALLEN as obtained from observation and interview:

FRANK WOODROW LLOYD, also known as Bob Lloyd, who resides at 921 East Bay, Balboa, California, telephone 714-673-5129, and who is employed as Senior Vice President of Operations of Northrup Corporation, 1800 Century Park East, Century City, California, was apprised of the identities of the interviewing Agents, and the purpose of the interview at his place of employment.

LLOYD was further apprised that this interview was being conducted at the expressed request of Special Prosecutor ARCHIBALD COX.

LLOYD was furnished with an Advice of Rights form, which he read, stated he understood, and signed.

LLOYD voluntarily consented to be interviewed without the presence of an attorney.

In early February, 1972, LLOYD recalls being involved in a conversation with Northrup Corporation President THOMAS VICTOR JONES wherein a substantial monetary contribution to the Committee to Re-elect the President (CREP) was discussed. LLOYD recalls that at this meeting he advised JONES that he wished to contribute \$20,000 in cash to the fund. LLOYD further recalls that JONES stated that he would take out a \$100,000 loan from an individual LLOYD believes to be a WILLIAM SAVY. LLOYD stated he was not sure that it was SAVY, but believes it may be him. LLOYD stated that JONES advised him that a Mr. FIRESTONE and other individuals (names unrecalled) had called on JONES in February, 1972, in connection with fund raising for the 1972 Presidential campaign. After LLOYD agreed to donate to JONES, who in turn would donate to the CREP, the \$20,000, he gave JONES a personal note which would be drawn eleven months from that date. LLOYD recalls that the interest rate was three-quarters percent per month.

With regard to reimbursement in any way for LLOYD's expenditure of his personal funds, LLOYD advised that he received no indication whatsoever that he would ever receive reimbursement from JONES or any other individual or group.

LLOYD states that he paid the note off in February, 1973. He stated that he borrowed the money to pay off the loan from the Bank of America, Balboa Office, Balboa, California.

LIOYD states that he has contributed an amount, which he cannot recall, to the Good Citizens Committee of Northrup Corporation. Aside from that and his \$20,000 donation via JONES to the CREP, he has not contributed any other funds or services to the 1972 Presidential campaign.

With regard to HERBERT W. KALMBACH and his obtaining a second contribution from JONES, LLOYD states he has no information pertaining to that transaction whatsoever. Further, LLOYD states that he has never had any meeting with KALMBACH, MAURICE STANS, or any other individual or group representing the CREP.

LLOYD was advised that the situation pertaining to the use of foreign bank appeared to be of an unusual nature owing to the fact that JONES would appear to be in a position to obtain a loan of \$100,000 from any United States lending institution. LLOYD stated that he has no idea why JONES negotiated with a foreign bank to obtain the loan which he previously gave to STANS and/or CREP. LLOYD stated that he will make available to the interviewing Agents a Xerox copy of the check in which he paid off the loan to JONES and the second check in which he paid off the interest on the loan.

LLOYD was asked if he had any information pertaining to WILLIAM SAVY. LLOYD stated, "No," he was unaware of SAVY. LLOYD went on to state that the only contact they had in Europe was to sell the Cobra aircraft to the Dutch. It was pointed out by the interviewing Agents that from information from other sources SAVY was well known in the European aircraft industry owing to SAVY's involvement with the Concord SST Project. LLOYD still maintained that he had no knowledge of SAVY or any of his operations.

LIOYD was asked if he had any knowledge of an individual by the name of STANLEY SIMON, who maintained offices at 70 Pine Street, New York City, New York. LLOYD stated that he had no information pertaining to SIMON and that he had never heard of this individual.

GERALD THOMAS DEAL, who is the President of the Cathay Bank, 777 North Broadway, Los Angeles, California, telephone (213) 626-7691, and who resides at 2238 North Edgemont, Los Angeles, California, telephone (213) NO4-9068, was apprised of the identity of the interviewing Agents and the purpose of the interview at his place of business.

DEAL was informed that this interview was at the direct request of Special Prosecutor ARCHIBALD COX and that it was pertaining to what is commonly known as the "Watergate matter".

DEAL voluntarily consented to be interviewed/ without the presence of an attorney.

The Cathay Bank DEAL advised, is a local state chartered bank which is insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). DEAL went on to state that there is only the main office of the bank and there are no branch offices.

DEAL states that he has never met MAURICE STANS, HERBERT W. KALMBACH or any other individual that represented the Committee to Re-Elect the President - Financial Section. DEAL states that he never contributed to the re-election of President NIXON in any form whatsoever, nor did he make available any monies to any individual that had anything to do with the 1972 political campaign efforts.

DEAL categorically denies ever meeting with MAURICE STANS or KALMBACH or any other individual and giving them \$85,000 in cash.

In February 1973, DEAL recalls that the bank records were reviewed by the FDIC auditors and absolutely no \$85,000 discrepancy was discovered. DEAL said that if, in fact, there were an \$85,000 discrepancy, he would know of it.

JAMES D WILLSON, Senior Vice-President - Finance, Northrop Corporation, 1800 Century Park East, telephone number 553-6262, home address, 1715 Chevy Chase Drive, Beverly Hills, California, telephone number 271-0442, was advised of the identities of SA JOHNIE L. JOYCE, JR. and SA RICHARD H. PASHLEY. He was advised that he was being interviewed at the specific request of ARCHIBALD COX, Special Prosecutor, concerning the circumstances surrounding his (Mr. WILLSON's) contribution in 1972, to the Committee to Reelect the President. Mr. WILLSON was furnished with an Advice of Rights and Waiver form, which he read. After reading the form, he called GEORGE GORE, a Northrop Corporation attorney, who then sat in on the interview. Upon Mr. GORE's advice, Mr. WILLSON signed the Advice of Rights form. This form is being maintained in the Los Angeles FBI Office.

Mr. WILLSON advised that THOMAS V. JONES is the President and Chairman of the Board of Directors of Northrop Corporation. He had numerous political discussions with Mr. JONES prior to February 1972. He recalls that in about February 1972, the specific topic of contributions to the campaign of President RICHARD M. NIXON arose. During these discussions, Mr. WILLSON indicated his willingness to contribute. In February 1972, Mr. WILLSON gave Mr. JONES a verbal promise to make a contribution of up to \$20,000 to the campaign, which he followed with an informal handwritten note to Mr. JONES. Within a two week period of the time he sent this informal note to Mr. JONES, he received a request from Mr. JONES that he give him a formal note which pledged a \$20,000 contribution. Mr. WILLSON gave him such a note.

He explained that he committed himself to this contribution as a private citizen, and free from any pressure resulting from his position as an executive with Northrop Corporation. He noted that he was naturally more receptive to the solicitation from Mr. JONES inasmuch as it was from Mr. JONES, who is his boss, in view of the fact that he is president of the corporation. However, he reiterated that it was in no way related to the corporation and he was not pressured into giving the money. Mr. WILLSON was aware at the time that Mr. JONES was going to obtain, or had obtained, a loan from a

foreign lender, the identity of whom Mr. WILLSON did not know. He speculated that his \$20,000 promissory note would be used in some way as collateral to support the loan that Mr. JONES was obtaining. Mr. WILLSON noted that it was within recent weeks that he first heard the name SAVY, as the possible source of this money that Mr. JONES obtained in 1972.

Mr. WILLSON stated that he does not have the original informal note or a copy of it. However, he received the original of his formal promissory note from Mr. JONES on or about January 24, 1973, when he paid Mr. JONES the \$20,000, which he had pledged. He paid Mr. JONES with a personal check drawn on his account at the Wells Fargo Bank, 1800 Century Park East, and made payable to THOMAS V. JONES in the amount of \$20,000. On the same occasion, he gave Mr. JONES a second check drawn on the same account in the amount of approximately \$1,650 which represented his (Mr. WILLSON's) share of the interest payment for one year on the outstanding loan from the foreign lender.

Mr. WILLSON advised that he obtained a \$21,000 loan from Wells Fargo Bank for the purpose of satisfying his promissory note to Mr. JONES. He noted that he has other personal loans outstanding in addition to this \$21,000 loan, and he is paying off this and all his other commitments from his personal funds which include his salary, dividends incomes, and checking and savings accounts.

Mr. WILLSON stated that in return for his contribution, he has not received any special consideration from the corporation in terms of salary increases, bonuses, extraordinary stock options, or in any other form. He noted that his salary is at the same level now that it was three or four years ago, and that his bonus that he received in January of this year in the amount of \$17,000 represented a sizeable decrease in amount as compared to previous bonuses which have been as high as \$50,000 in any given year in the past. Mr. WILLSON pointed out that bonuses are paid out of corporate profits, and that Northrop Corporation profits are down currently by comparison to what they had been in years when bonuses had been higher.



The only other political contribution he has made in connection with his employment at Northrop Corporation was a \$500 contribution to the Good Citizenship Committee of Northrop Corporation, which he gave in October 1972. contribution was made following his receipt of a form letter soliciting contributions which emanated from the committee. Mr. WILLSON does not know if all Northrop Corporation employees receive such solicitation, and Mr. GORE interjected at this point that only employees above a certain salary level are asked to donate to this committee. Both Mr. WILLSON and Mr. GORE noted that contributions to the Good Citizenship Committee are completely voluntary, and there is no pressure from superiors to donate. Mr. WILLSON made no specific designation as to individuals or parties to receive his portion of the committee funds. He has been with the corporation for eight years and the Good Citizenship Committee has been in existence for an least that length of time.

Mr. WILLSON advised that although Mr. JONES had informed him that he had been interviewed by the FBI in connection with the contribution, that he had made to the Committee to Reelect the President, Mr. JONES did not discuss in any detail the subtance of his interview with the FBI.

Mr. WILLSON has among his personal papers his bank statement showing the \$21,000 loan that he obtained from the Wells Fargo Bank. He has the two cancelled checks, which were payments to Mr. JONES to retire the promissory note. He also has the original promissory note which was returned to him by Mr. JONES upon satisfaction of the promissory note.

BERRY was advised that this interview was being conducted at the specific request of Special Prosecutor ARCHIBALD COX stemming from his inquiry into what has been commonly known as the "Watergate matter".

BERRY voluntarily consented to be interviewed without the presence of her attorney. BERRY states that she is the personal secretary of Mr. JONES and as such has access to his private safe located in an area adjacent to his office.

On July 31, 1972, BERRY recalls HERBERT W. KAIMBACH coming to the office of THOMAS VICTOR JONES. She is uncertain, but believes that after KAIMBACH entered JONES' office she received a call from JONES asking her to go to JONES' private safe and remove a portfolio from the safe and bring it to him.

BERRY recalls that she went to the safe, removed the package, but was completely unaware of what was contained in the package, and brought it to Mr. JONES.

BERRY states that she is now aware that the package contained \$50,000 in cash. She states that she knows this now because Mr. JONES advised her of that fact. BERRY states that she did not count the currency nor did she ever see it.

BERRY further advised that there was no chance that any currency other than the cash contained in the envelope, might have been added to the package without her or Mr. JONES' knowledge. BERRY states that only \$50

THOMAS VICTOR JONES, President and Chairman of the Board of Northrop Corporation, 1800 Century Park East, was advised of the identities of SA RICHARD H. PASHLEY and SA JOHN M. O'NEILL, JR. He was advised that he was being interviewed at the request of Special Prosecutor ARCHLBALD COX. He was advised that the interviewing Agents wished to interview him concerning the discrepancy between the amount he recalled having contributed to the Committee to Re-Elect the President and the amount Mr. HERBERT KALMBACH had testified he contributed. He was furnished with an Advice of Rights and Waiver form which he read and signed. This form is being maintained in the Los Angeles FBI Office.

Mr. JONES advised that after Mr. KAIMBACH's testimony before the Senate Committee, he rechecked as well as he could in an effort to assure himself that he had been correct in his previous statement to interviewing FBI Agents and he is sure now as he was then that the amount he gave to Mr. KAIMBACH was \$50,000 in cash. He is also sure from his secretaries telephone records that this contribution was solicited by Mr. KAIMBACH by a telephone call on July 25, 1972, and the envelope containing the currency was delivered to Mr. KAIMBACH shortly after lunch on July 31, 1972.

The three corporate executives who participated in the initial \$100,000 contribution made to the Committee to Re-Elect the President by checks were JAMES ALLEN, Vice President and Assistant to the President, who contributed \$15,000; JAMES WILSON. Senior Vice President - Financial, who contributed \$20,000; and, F. W. LLOYD. Senior Vice President - Operations, who contributed \$20,000. The balance, \$45,000, was contributed by Mr. JONES. He recalls that during the telephone conversation with Mr. KALMBACH on July 25, 1972, Mr. KALMBACH indicated that he was calling as a result of Mr. JONES' statement to KALMBACH months earlier, when KALMBACH, together with MAURICE STANS and LEONARD FIRESTONE, had solicited the initial contribution from him, that if there was a real need for an additional

contribution near the end of the campaign, KAIMBACH should contact him. Mr. KAIMBACH advised that the campaign was drawing to a conclusion and there was a need for additional money. Mr. JONES indicated to Mr. KAIMBACH that he would make an additional contribution and Mr. KAIMBACH said he would come to Mr. JONES' office to pick up the money sometime during the next couple of weeks.

In anticipation of Mr. KALMBACH coming to pick up the second contribution, Mr. JONES brought \$30,000 in cash to his office. He put the money in \$100 bills into a manila envelope, and he believes he had his secretary, "D.D." BERRY, put the envelope into his personal safe in the office. He is quite sure that she had no idea what the envelope contained. He believes that he did this within two days of a call from Mr. KALMBACH. before July 31, 1972, he brought another \$20,000 in cash to the office and put it into the same manila envelope containing the \$30,000. He had counted each group of bills individually and counted the entire group of bills together and determined that it was \$50,000. He does not keep any other significant amount of money in the office safe, and he is confident that no other funds could have become commingled with the \$50,000 during the time he had the money in his personal office safe. He noted that if Mr. KAL14BACH had come to the office to pick up the contribution before the additional \$20,000 was added to the \$30,000, Mr. KALMBACH would only have received \$30,000.

In addition to himself, his personal secretary "D.D." BERRY, his receptionist PRISCILIA JOY EVERTS, and JAMES ALLEN, Vice President and Assistant to the President, have access to his personal office safe.

He recalls that Mr. KAIMBACH called his office on the morning of July 31, 1972, and advised that he would come by Mr. JONES' office that afternoon to pick up the money. Shortly after lunch Mr. KAIMBACH arrived at his office, and stayed 10 to 15 minutes, during which time the money was

delivered to him by Mr. JONES. He does not recall whether his secretary, "D.D." BERRY, brought the money to him in Mr. KALMBACH's presence, or had brought it into him shortly before Mr. KALMBACH entered his office. From the conversation on this occasion, he received the impression that Mr. KALMBACH was assuring him that the money was needed and that it would be put to good use in the campaign effort. He does not recall the exact words used by Mr. KALMBACH which gave him this assurance.

Mr. JONES does not recall whether it was he or Mr. KALMBACH who first brought up making the contributions in cash. His inability to recall this is due to the fact that when he was contacted by Mr. KALMBACH regarding a second contribution he immediately thought of using the funds of a cash contingency fund he had been putting together for years, and since he could see nothing wrong with the use of each this each fund was on his mind.

On the evening of July 31, 1972, around the time Mr. JONES was sitting down to dinner, he received a telephone call from Mr. KAIMBACH. Mr. KAIMBACH advised him that what Mr. JONES had said was a \$50,000 contribution was, in fact, a \$75,000 contribution. Mr. KAIMBACH indicated that he had made a count of the money. Mr. JONES told Mr. KAIMBACH that he was sure that the amount was \$50,000, and has not been able to this day to understand how there could have been any discrepancy.

His next contact with Mr. KALMBACH was on the evening of the national election when he and a group of friends got together at the home of JUSTIN DART in Beverly Hills, California. Mr. KALMBACH was there, and during the course of the evening he mentioned to JONES that in view of the recent disclosures that some of the contributions received by the Committee to Re-Elect the President involved funds from foreign banks, Mr. KALMBACH could arrange for the return of the contributions of Mr. JONES and his three executives which involved foreign banks. Mr. JONES was irritated at the suggestion that there could be anything irregular about the method by which he had made his initial contribution, and expressed his irritation to Mr. KALMBACH.

Mr. KALMBACH made no mention of the cash contributions and never discussed it further after his telephone call to Mr. JONES on the evening of July 31, 1972.

Mr. JONES met a week or so after the election with Mr. KALMBACH at the Nibblers Restaurant in Los Angeles and they again talked about the initial contributions involving foreign checks. Mr. KALMBACH wanted Mr. JONES to talk with representatives of the Committee to Re-Elect the President in Washington, D. C., to discuss the checks. Mr. JONES later did this in conjunction with a trip he had to Washington, D. C. on other business. During the meeting at Nibblers Restaurant, Mr. KALMBACH did not mention the cash contributions.

Mr. JONES said that he recalled having previously discussed the fact that Mr. KAIMBACH had claimed that his cash contribution was \$75,000 rather than \$50,000, with investigators inquiring into his contributions to the Committee to Re-Elect the President. When advised that that fact had not been discussed with interviewing FBI Agents, he said that he had discussed it with investigators of the Government Accounting Office who interviewed him prior to his first contact with FBI Agents regarding this matter.

Mr. JONES expressed his willingness to cooperate completely with the investigation and to make any records in his possession available.

INTERCEPTION OF COMMUNICATIONS

This is to advise that Washington Field Office has advised that Judge Sirica today furnished a 23 page opinion upholding the request by Special Prosecutor Cox for production by the President of the tape-recordings subpoenaed by the Special Prosecutor of conversations had by the President with various members of his staff concerning the Watergate matter.

Judge Sirica issued a one page order which states that with respect to the motion of the Special Prosecutor on behalf of the June, 1972, Federal grand jury (for production of the above-mentioned tapes), it is ordered that the respondent, Richard M. Nixon, or any subordinate, officer, official, or employee with custody or control of the documents or objects & in the grand jury subpoena duces tecum of 7-23-73, is commanded to produce forthwith for the court's examination in camera, the subpoenaed objects or documents not heretofore produced to the grand jury. The order further states that this ruling will be stayed for five days in which time the respondent may make an appeal of the ruling; and should such appeal be made, the stay will be extended indefinitely pend completion of the appeal.

Washington Field Office is obtaining a copy of the Judge's opinion and order.







I wrote to you on May 7, 1973, to request that you permit additional access to FBI reports and files which are relevant to the jurisdiction of this Select Committee. The original agreement with former Attorney General Kleindienst was that the chairman, vice-chairman, chief counsel and minority counsel would be entitled to access, but as a consequence of heavy demands upon the time of these persons, the Committee voted to ask you to extend the agreement to include other members of the Committee staff jointly selected by Senator Baker and myself.

Special Prosecutor Archibald Com wrote to me on June 8 with advice that my letter of May 7 had been referred to him. He said he felt it was reasonable to permit an extension of the agreement to two or three senior staff members, and by letter of July 9, I submitted to him the names of the staff attorneys who would be entrusted with access.

Pursuant to this arrangement, one of the designated attorneys, Mr. Sanders, spoke last week with Mr. Bratt whom we understand has responsibility for executing the agreement in Mr. Com's office. Mr. Sanders specifically sought to review the FD-302s for John Loep and Paul Thatcher. Mr. Bratt advised that this material was not available within the office of Mr. Cox. He said he did not have the authority to requisition it for our review, and that it was his general understanding we would not be entitled to any material which would not be in the files of thAnmon the regular course of business.

> This is in response to the request you made of me in your letter of September 5, 1973, that I submit a memorandum recording the gist of what I had told you concerning captioned matter. A copy of your letter to me is attached. In March of 1972, while assigned to the Files and Communications Division and utilized on the Bureau's tour program, I had occasion to be working at the Tour Control Point located at the entrance of 9th Street and Pennsylvania Avenue. During the course of my normal duties at this station, I escorted Mr. John D. Ehrlichman, then of the White House Staff, and another man to Mr. Hoover's Office for a meeting with the Director.

> Mr. Ehrlichman entered the building at the corner of 9th Street and Pennsylvania Avenue and thus came to our desk for directions to the Director's Office. Upon recognizing Mr. Ehrlichman, I offered to guide him to the Director's Office which he accepted and was done. Recognition of Mr. Ehrlichman was easy as I had seen his photograph numerous times.

Approximately 30-45 minutes later I had occasion to again be on the fifth floor. I was walking toward Pennsylvania Avenue in the 5600 corridor and almost parallel to Room 5633, when the door opened, and Mr. Ehrlichman and another gentleman exited from the Director's Office. I distinctly remember Mr. Ehrlichman looking very red-faced, which he had not been before, and seemingly agitated. It was at this point that I saw and heard Mr. Ehrlichman say, and I quote, "Some of these days they're going to find that old S.O.B. dead in bed." There was hushed conversation between the two as we proceeded down the hallway. At this point I was walking slightly ahead of them. In reference to the man with Mr. Ehrlichman, I had never seen him before, nor have I seen him since. Both men walked to the elevator bank and pushed the down button and I walked down the 9th Street stairway. I did not see them ENCLOSURE again. ST-118 REC-3 /39-4089-2615

This incident had no real significance to me until I learned about six weeks ago from the press that Mr. Hoover had vehemently opposed certain proposals offered him by certain individuals concerning national security.

(2) Recontact manager of the Newporter Inn to request a recheck of the Inn's records in a further effort to locate telephone toll call message slips for calls made by Clark MacGregor.

(3) San Francisco Office is requested to interview Frank Spicer, MacGregor's brother-in-law, concerning a reputed telephone call from MacGregor to Spicer.

(4) A review of FBIHQ telephone logs is requested to endeavor to verify a late night call reportedly made by Mr. Gray to California in the early morning hours of 7/5-6/72.

The Special Prosecutor's Office has advised that there is a possibility that Mr. MacGregor has committed perjury in his testimony in which he denied having telephoned the President in response to Mr. Gray's alleged telephone call to MacGregor. The above mention investigation is being conducted in an effort to determine if documentary evidence exists concerning alleged telephone calls in question.

The results of investigation will be furnished to

the Special Prosecutor's Office.

It is our understanding that the FBI is developing similar indexes for some of the other case files listed on the attachment. We request that similar indexes be developed in those matters which are the responsibility of the Special Prosecutor. We also request a chronological index, by date of FBI interview. of the "McCord and Related Matters, Composite Listing." 139-4089

information to the Miami Office by letter dated June 22, 1973, which notes a number of long distance calls originating at Miami, Florida, and terminating at various distant points. All calls were charged to a fraudulent and non-existent credit card number 355-8361-056U. Originally SBT&T Company would not have referred this matter to the FBI in view of the negligible amount involved, but did so inasmuch as many of the calls terminated with principals who might be identical to those in the Watergate Matter.

advised the first seven numbers in the credit card number (which in this case is 355-8361) represent the subscriber's telephone number. The next three numbers which are 056 denote the Revenue Accounting Office of SBT&T Company which would bill the calls. Jacksonville, Florida has Revenue Accounting Office number 056. The last letter in the credit card number which in this case is the letter "U" corresponds to one of the first seven numbers and acts as a code to the telephone operator who places the call and enables her in the majority of cases to determine promptly whether the call is a legitimate charged call.

There were 76 fraudulent charged calls made totaling \$174.63 which had been reported to date. All calls had been made from coin telephones located at various Downtown Miami, Florida locations.

SBT&T Company normally makes attempts in cases of fraudulent charged calls to contact the telephone numbers called in an effort to identify the party making the fraudulent calls. This operation within the SBT&T Company is known as Central Telephone Investigations (CTI). When it became known that the numbers called appeared to have some relationship to the Watergate Matter efforts of CTI were terminated and the matter referred to the FBI. Three telephone numbers had been called, however, prior to referral to the FBI and the following information is noted concerning those three telephone numbers:

CTI placed a call to Hollywood, Florida number 305-989-4227 on May 21, 1973, which is listed to GEORGE H. BURIFF. Mrs. BURIFF answered the telephone and advised her husband is a teacher at Mc Arthur High School and that "he also stops at the coffee shop". The second telephone call by CTI was a Los Angeles, California number 213-680-2885 listed to LEONARD FIRESTONE. This call placed on May 20, 1973, was answered by a secretary who told CTI caller that FIRESTONE was the retired president of Firestone Tire and Rubber Company. No other information was obtained. The third and last CTI inquiry was made on June 4, 1973, to Washington, D.C. telephone number 202-737-5113 listed to PETER WOLF, Attorney. The identity of the responding person is not noted, but did advise CTI that the person who called that number from Miami had asked for PETER WOLF in reference to Watergate. It was after this inquiry by CTI that the SBT&T Company discontinued its CTI inquiries and referred the matter to the FBI.

BURIFF stated that LANDER had been in the habit of calling him whenever he had a good tip on a horse whereupon BURIFF would send money to the Miami Western Union Office, and if the particular horse won, LANDER was to furnish BURIFF his share of any winnings. He said he received his first call from LANDER about May 23 through May 25, 1972. He said from May to December, 1972, the calls from LANDER were very regular, averaging about three to five calls per week, but after January, 1973, the calls became much more infrequent. He said he received his last call from LANDER probably in May, 1973.

BURIFF stated LANDER sounded like an individual about 50 years of age, possibly older, who had a gift for words and was very meticulous. He stated LANDER sounded like an American, and although having a Latin name, he did not appear to be from a Latin country.

BURIFF advised that an individual, whose last name was SCOTT, about 50 years of age, white and probably an ex-jockey, came to see him at his home either in September or October, 1972, at which time SCOTT attempted to obtain \$200 from BURIFF to deliver to MANUEL LANDER in connection with bets on horses. BURIFF described this money as being so-called "sincere money" or "front money", but in reality he considered it a shake-down by LANDER. He said he did not give this money to SCOTT, but did subsequently continue his small bets whereby the money was sent to LANDER care of Western Union, Miami, Florida. He said this person named SCOTT showed him an identification card indicating he was connected with the race track and thought the card had been issued by Calder Race Track, but is not certain of this.

BURIFF advised during his many conversations with LANDER he (LANDER) had at one time mentioned that he had helped draft some papers for the Federal government in connection with the field of education. LANDER had mentioned knowing a number of very influential people and assumed some of these people had also supplied LANDER with money in connection with horse racing. BURIFF stated he has no specific information in this regard, however.

ALVARO ARMINAN, Desk Clerk, Gibson Hotel, 531 ME 2nd Avenue, advised that MANUEL LONDER, possibly LANDER. resides in Room 209 and has resided at the hotel for approximately one year. He stated the registration card indicates LONDER had furnished an address of 1802 North Dolfield Avenue. Baltimore, Maryland, at the time he signed the registration card. He said LOMDER seems to be a "strange person" who stays to himself, who has no visitors and who apparently has no regular employment. He stated LONDER has a habit of returning to the hotel every day around 3:00 PK, at which time he will ask permission to watch the television in the lobby. ARMIMAN advised he cannot state for certain that LONDER was in the hotel on Thursday, July 19, 1973, but indicated that he (ARMINAN) has not missed LONDER during the past week. He said this would indicate that in all probability LONDER has continued his usual habit of returning to the hotel every afternoon about 3:00 PM, for the past week.

ARMINAN advised that he comes on duty at Moon each day, consequently, has no knowledge of the activities in the hotel lobby prior to Noon. He said apparently LOMDER leaves the hotel before Noon each day, but does not know at what time in the morning LOMDER generally leaves the hotel. He said this information might be obtained from either Mrs. DELORES FUENTES, who owns the hotel or Mrs. MINNIE ORIAK, who is the manager of the hotel and who resides in Room 104. He said Mrs. FUENTES also owns the Park Hotel located on 5th Street, and resides in that hotel.

ARMINAN advised the coin telephone located in the lobby of the Gibson Hotel which is used by most of the tenants has telephone 373-9488.

LONDER could not furnish the telephone credit card number, suggesting that the interviewing agent relate the number to him at which time he could confirm whether or not the number was identical to the number to which he had charged the calls. The telephone credit card number 355-8361-056U was related to LONDER by SA SITHER, at which time LONDER stated the number was the same as the one which he told the telephone operator to charge the long-distance calls made by him. LONDER advised AL allowed him to use this credit card number within the past year and LONDER admitted using the card number many times to charge longdistance calls. He said AL and he made no arrangement for repayment of the calls. LONDER stated he has not seen AL for several months and, in fact, has not seen him since a few days following the time he was initially given permission to use the credit card number. He said he never actually was given, nor did he see, a credit card and had just used the 🗅 number as related to him by AL. He stated most of his calls

had been long-distance calls to various acquaintances and friends in various parts of the United States who are "sports minded people" and who have an interest in horses and are people who are connected with race horse tracks or "that atmosphere". LONDER advised he did not believe he was breaking any law by making long-distance telephone calls when such calls had been put through by the operator and since he had been given permission to use the telephone credit card number as furnished him by his friend AL.

LONDER advised some of his calls had been made to various people connected with the federal government in Washington, D.C., and elsewhere. He stated that he had written a 12 or 13 page report containing ideas and guidelines on foreign policy, many of which have subsequently been adopted and put in use by the U.S. Government. LONDER stated he felt that since he has had a part of formulating this policy by virtue of the fact that some of his policies have been adopted, it was only fair that he receive some pay for this, When asked how the government had received his report setting forth his views on foreign policy, LONDER replied that apparently the government had obtained his report from BILL BAGGS, the former Miami News columnist who has since died. LONDER stated he sent his views in a 12 or 13 page report to BILL BAGGS in 1965 and believes the government apparently obtained a copy of this report from BAGGS. LONDER stated he had another copy of his report in his hotel room but refused to show this other copy to the interviewing agents. When asked to explain what his credentials were in being qualified to formulate guidelines on foreign policy, LONDER replied that although he had only a grade school education, he had educated himself and felt he was very knowledgeable in the area of foreign policy. He stated the recent "SALT" agreements between the United States, the Soviet Union and other powers had contained a number of policies initially suggested by him and which were contained in his 1965 report to BILL BAGGS.

LONDER advised he had called GEORGE BURIFF in Hollywood, Florida, who is a teacher at Mac Arthur High School. He said he does not recall ever sending a CHARLES SCOTT to BURIFF for the purpose of obtaining any money.

LONDER advised he has placed long-distance calls to Washington, D.C., where he has attempted to contact acquaintances and friends connected with Citizens for Reelection of President NIXON, the Department of Justice, the White House, and the Capitol. LONDER refused to identify any specific individual employed in or connected with the aforementioned Washington, D.C., locations stating that his business with the people concerned was personal and that he was known to them. He did state, however, that he was a friend of KEN TALMADGE, who used to be connected with the Citizens for Re-election of President NIXON in Washington, D.C., who quit and returned to Los Angeles, California, where he was employed with the Firestone Rubber Company. He stated his call to the Firestone Rubber Company in Los Angeles, California, was an unsuccessful effort to speak with KEN TALMADGE.

He advised his calls to the Daniel Furniture Company in Mocksville, North Carolina, were to reach his friend, Mr. MARKIAMD, who owns the business and is also in the horse racing business. He said his calls were concerned with horses and considered Mr. MARKIAMD another one of his "sports minded friends".

He stated his calls to the Buda Bakery in Staten Island, New York, were in an effort to speak with JOHN BUDA whom he described as a friend who is also interested in horses and that his calls were probably in relation to horses and horse racing in general. He said his calls to Los Angeles and Newport Beach, California, which were registered to HERBERT KALMBACH and a Mr. DE MARCO were also calls connected with horse racing. He said the same could be said for his calls to Mr. SHERLOCK in South Sloux City, Nebraska, Mr. JONES, JR., of Jones and Jones Corporation of Louisville, Kentucky, PETER WOLF, an attorney in Washington, D.C., Mr. HERSEY of Ansonia, Connecticut and JERRY who owns Jerry's Cafeteria in Lafayette, Indiana. When asked about a number of calls made to Detroit, Michigan, and Mayfair, Michigan, including calls to a FRANK MARTIN in Detroit and Teamsters Local 283 in Detroit, LONDER replied that he had a number of

friends in the Detroit area, and declined further comment. LONDER was asked about a call made on April 24, 1973, to Marshall Field in Chicago, Illinois, but stated he knows no one at Marshall Field and stated he did not make any call to that location.

LONDER advised that he made all of the above long-distance calls from parious pay telephones in the downtown area of Miami but declined to state specifically from where he made such calls. He did state that he is often in the area of the Walgreens Drug Store located on the corner of SE 2nd Avenue and Flagler Street.

LONDER advised he has been married twice and has children and relatives, including a mother still living, but refused to identify any of them by name or location.

LONDER stated he felt the U.S. Government should provide him with a monthly check based on his military service and the fact that he had incurred some disability as a result of his military service, but declined to elaborate.

He added that he has had no regular employment since his military service in World War II, stating that he has always made his living in the horse racing business. When asked if he had any specific employment in the horse racing field he stated he had none but had made his business "in that atmosphere", meaning horse racing generally.

LONDER advised he had never been a patient in a U.S. Veterans Hospital nor had he ever been a patient in any type of mental institution.

MANUEL LONDER, Room 209, Gibson Hotel, 531 NE 2nd Avenue, was interviewed by SAs GORDON B. SITHER and H. GENE RASON. He was advised of his rights by SA SITHER as set forth in a waiver and warning form entitled "Interrogation; Advice of Rights" which he read, stated he understood its contents and thereafter signed. The interview was conducted in Bayfront Park in downtown Miami at the request of LONDER.

LONDER was informed that the interviewing Agents wished to talk to him regarding an additional large number of long-distance telephone calls made during the month of May. 1973, from various downtown Miami pay telephones which were charged to the non-existent telephone credit card number 355-8361-056 U. LONDER advised he had made many long-distance calls to various friends and acquaintances in the horse race business and also to various political personalities and Government departments during April, May and most of June, 1973, charging all calls to telephone credit card number 355-8361-056 U. LONDER said his friend "AL", whom he has not seen in several months, gave him permission to charge all calks to this credit card number and "AL" made no demands or conditions about repaying him ("AL") for the calls charged to the credit card. LONDER said he made most of his calls from various pay booth telephones in downtown Miami, including telephones located in the Walgreen Drug Store, Flagler Street at SE 2nd Avenue, the Federal Court House and the lobby of the Gibson Hotel where he, LONDER, resides.

LONDER said his long-distance calls chargeable to credit card number 355-836-056 U stopped during the latter part of June, 1973, when the telephone operator stopped putting his calls through because the credit card number was no longer a valid card number. LONDER said he did not believe he was

breaking any law as "AL" had permitted him to use his credit card number and the operator had always put his calls through to the distant parties.

Miami to the offices of the President and Vice President of the United States, Department of State, Department of Justice, Department of Defense, the Capitol, Pederal Bureau of Investigation, and the group known as Citizens for Re-election of President NIXON. He said his calls to political personalities and departments in Washington, D. C. were made in reference to foreign policy since he, LONDER, was involved in this country's foreign policy. When asked to explain, LONDER said he helped formulate this country's foreign policy and had stated his guidelines on foreign policy in 1965 in a 13 page document he called his "Baker's Dozen Manifesto". He said he had sent a copy of this document to BILL BAGGS, the former "Miami News" columnist in 1965, and that the United States Government had probably gotten the document or its contents from BAGGS.

LONDER stated he also believed this country used many of his "guidelines" in successfully concluding the recent disarmament talks between the United States and the Soviet Union known as the "SALT Agreements". LONDER said he felt this country owed him money for his contributions in this regard and "everyone else was getting their share" and "why not me".

LONDER said he was given an honorable discharge from the United States Army at Valley Forge General Rospital between January and June, 1945. He said his discharge was a medical type for battle fatigue. He listed his service serial number 32902071 and rank at discharge as private. He said he should be entitled to a monthly disability check from the United States Government but has been unable to obtain one. He expressed bitterness that the Government had made a mistake in reflecting his discharge from the United States Army as dishonorable and wanted the FBI or some Government agency to correct the record.

LONDER displayed a badly worn Selective Service card bearing the name MANUEL LONDER, issued by Local Board 21, Hollywood Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, reflecting a date of 2/23/45 and classification of "1-C Disc.".

ICNDER stated he made at least two calls to the office of Senator SAM ERVIN in Morganton, North Carolina, during April and May, 1973, but never spoke to the Senator. He said he spoke to a secretary who told him the Senator was out of town. LONDER said he made no calls to Senator ERVIN in Washington, D. C. and no calls whatever to anyone anywhere after the telephone company stopped putting his calls through in June, 1973, which were previously charged to credit card number 355-8361-056 U.

LONDER said he was never able to speak to the President or Vice President of the United States but had spoken with the former Attorney General KLEINDIENST and other political leaders. He said his reasons for talking or wanting to talk with these people were for personal reasons and "they know me" and that such matters were of no concern to the interviewing Agents.

LONDER said he had spoken with LEONARD GARMENT at the White House, JACK DURATE (phonetic) of Dallas, Texas, a Mr. HERSEY in Ansonia, Connecticut, and had attempted to talk with HERBERT KALMBACK and Mr. DeMARCO in Los Angeles, California, a Mr. FRANK SHERLOCK in South Slowk City, Nebraska and PETER WOLF in Washington, D. C. He said most of these people were sports minds like himself and interested in horse racing.

LONDER said he has followed the Watergate testimony on TV and felt he had a good understanding of the whole situation. He expressed the view that a small group of powerful men in the Government were trying to direct the Government and all citizens without consultation with the Congress or people on the street.

By communication dated July 20, 1973, the Charlotte Division of the FBI advised as follows:

By communication dated August 8, 1973, the Louisville Division of the FBI advised telephone number 502-636-5661 is listed to Jones and Jones Engineers and Surveyors, 906 Minoma Avenue, Louisville, Kentucky. The corporation is listed as civil engineers with BILL JONES as owner. BILL JONES has telephone number 502-969-3146 listed in the name of the corporation at 4516 Poplar Level Road, Louisville, Kentucky.

By communication dated August 31, 1973, the Charlotte Division of the FBI advised telephone number 704-634-2492 is listed in the Mocksville, North Carolina telephone directory to Daniel Furniture and Electric Company, 745 South Main Street, Mocksville, North Carolina.

This matter was discussed with Assistant United States Attorney LLOYD G. BATES, JR., Southern District of Florida, Miami, who stated on July 2, 1973, that investigation should be conducted in an effort to determine the identity of the person or persons making such fraudulent calls. Mr. BATES suggested he be recontacted following investigation for his prosecutive opinion.

On September 18, 1973, this matter was discussed with AUSA BATES. He advised although a violation of Federal Statute appears to exist in this matter, in view of LANDER's questionable mental condition, he did not believe successful Federal prosecution could be sustained. He declined prosecution in this matter.

SUBJECT: Interview of Mrs. Lyn Rae Gregory

Background

Mrs. Lyn Rae/Gregory (formerly married under the name of McClintock) can be reached through Mr. and Mrs. Mel Alexander, 5491 Brockton Avenue, Riverside, California.

Available evidence indicates that Mrs. Gregory was secretary to Gordon Strachan, an aide to H. R. Haldeman, until early April 1972. Mrs. Gregory reportedly typed so-called "political matters" memoranda that Strachan sent to Haldeman to keep the latter informed of activities at the Committee to Re-Elect the President. These memoranda were produced in three copies (one each for Haldeman, Strachan, and Larry Highy, another Haldeman aide) and prepared once every week or two.

One of the "political matters" memoranda -number 18 -- allegedly was eight to ten pages long with more than a dozen tabs and attachments. The memorandum reported about thirty campaign decisions reached at a meeting in Key Biscayne, Florida, on March 30 or 31, 1972, among John Mitchell, Jeb Magruder, and Fred LaRue. Strachan's secretary (presumably Mrs. Gregory) is publicly reported to have said that she typed this memorandum on Friday, March 31, 1972. One of the thirty decisions is said to have been described in a three-line paragraph in the memorandum as follows:

> "Magruder reports that 1701 now has a sophisticated political intelligence-gathering system with a budget of 300. A sample of the type of information they are developing is attached at tab 'H.'"

At tab "H" Strachan allegedly attached a report had been sent over from the Committee to Re-Elect has entitled "Sedan Chair II." The report began a statement such as "A confidential source reveal." A reliable source confidentially reports. The followed a summary of political information dealing with Senator Humphrey's campaign in Pennsylvania. Strachan reportedly received two other reports like this, but the one attached to Memorandum No. 18 was the most interesting, which is why he forwarded to Haldeman.

Other documents that Mrs. Gregory may have knowledge of include: (1) a five-page double-paced typewritten paper entitled "CAMPAIGN SPENDING - HRM AND DEAN, May 18, 1971," in which Strachan reported the discussion at a meeting of that date among Haldeman, Dean, and Strachan; (2) a talking paper prepared by Strachan on or about June 30, 1971 for a meeting between Haldeman and Mitchell at which political intelligence, including a proposal called "Sand Wedge," was to be discussed; (3) a talking paper prepared by Strachan on or about December 17, 1971, to a meeting between Haldeman and Mitchell at which the following questions were to be discussed: (a) whether John Dean should control rather than merely be the White House contact for political intelligence: (h) whether Gordon Liddy should be charged with responsi bility for all political intelligence activities, and (c) whether \$800,000 should be made available to Haldeman's use during the campaign (\$300,000 for polition tical intelligence, \$300,000 for polling, and \$200,000 for miscellaneous matters); (4) a memorandum from Strachan to Haldeman in late March or early April 19 suggesting that Haldeman call Mitchell to have Liddy report to Robert Mardian (Allegedly this memoranden) was returned to Strachan with Haldeman's handwritt notation -- "Let Dean handle." -- on it.); (5) a co of a memorandum of March or April 1972 from Joh Magruder to Mitchell entitled "Matter of Potential" Embarrassment" in which Magruder urged that a politic prankster for the Republicans should be brought und Liddy's control; (6) a talking paper prepared by Strachan on April 4, 1972, raising the question For meeting that afternoon between Haldeman and Mitchell whether the intelligence system was adequate: and

(7) a memorandum or notes prepared later in April 1972 by Strachan recording an instruction from Haldeman to tell Liddy to transfer whatever capability Liddy had from Muskie to Senator McGovern with particular interest in discovering what the connection between the latter and Senator Kennedy was.

#### Objective of the Interview

In general, establish whether Mrs. Gregory can confirm or deny the information indicated above.

In particular, establish, among other things:

- (1) the period of Mrs. Gregory's employment under Strachan;
- (2) whether she typed, filed, or otherwise was aware of any of Strachan's "political matters" memoranda, and if so:
- (3) whether the memoranda were serially numbered and prepared in triplicate;
- (4) who participated in the preparation or handling of these memoranda (and, in particular, whether Strachan at any time prepared the tabs and attachments himself);
- (5) her best recollection of the date, number (if any), and content of the last "political matters" memorandum of which she is personally aware; and
- (6) her recollection (if any) of memorandum No. 18 or of any of the details given above concerning that memorandum.

Also, establish (1) Mrs. Gregory's recollection (if any) of the miscellaneous documents identified above and any others in any way related to political intelligence; and (2) the date, circumstances, and content of any direct or indirect contacts between Mrs. Gregory and Strachan following her termination of employment with him.

SUBJECT: Interview of Roger Greaves

Background

Roger/Greaves is reportedly living in Los Angeles and working for either Blue Cross or some other entity involved with Medicare. He was previously employed by Allstate Insurance in Los Angeles.

Greaves was allegedly kifed by Herbert Porter of the Committee to Re-Elect the President on the recommendation of Ronald-Walker, an advanceman for the Committee who had previously been Greaves' sub-ordinate at Allstate. Greaves engaged in "Dick Tuck-type political pranks and also gathered political intelligence. He was assigned a code name "Sedan Chair One."

#### Objective of the Interview

We are not interested for the purposes of this interview in any pranks or intelligence activities per se performed by Greaves. Rather, we want to establish the circumstances, date, and content of any reports Greaves may have sent back to his superiors on those activities.

In particular, establish, among other things:

(1) the time period in which Greaves performed (a) as a political prankster and (b) as a political intelligence-gatherer in the 1972 campaign;
