THAT SHEPPARD LIED TO THE BUREAU IN 1954 AND IN
HIDDEN IN A SAFETY DEPOSIT BOX IN PULASKI, VIRGINIA
SISTER'S NAME, CERTAIN DOCUMENTS WHICH BELONG TO
MOUNT AND WHICH CONTAIN INFORMATION DETRIMENTAL TO
ROCKEFELLER. THE DOCUMENTS ALLEGEDLY STATE THAT ROCKEFELLER

AT APPROXIMATELY 4:00 P.M., AUGUST 13, 1974, WHITE HOUSE COUNSEL TO THE PRESIDENT CONTACTED FBI LIAISON AND FURNISHED SUBSTANTIALLY THE SAME INFORMATION AS REPORTED BY O'BRIEN AND ADDED THE FOLLOWING:

THIS AFTERNOON THE ADMINISTRATIVE AIDE TO SENATOR LOWELL WEICKER CONTACTED THE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT ON CAPITOL HILL AND ADVISED THEY HAD RECEIVED INFORMATION FROM "LOAS" OF THE HERITAGE BOOK SHOP IN PHILADELPHIA, PENNSYLVANIA, TO THE EFFECT THAT [REDACTED] OF WDC HAD POSSESSION OF HUNT DOCUMENTS WHICH WERE DETRIMENTAL TO NELSON ROCKEFELLER. THE AA OF SENATOR WEICKER ADVISED HIS OFFICE WAS NOT TAKING ANY ACTION ON THIS MATTER BUT MERELY REFERRING IT TO THE WHITE HOUSE.

FOR INFORMATION OF PHILADELPHIA, IT WAS AGREED BETWEEN WFO AND THE SPECIAL PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE THAT NO CONTACT WOULD BE MADE BY WFO ON CAPITOL HILL SINCE FBI INTEREST IN THIS MATTER WOULD BECOME KNOWN ON CAPITOL HILL TO THE NEWS MEDIA.

IT WAS FURTHER LEARNED TODAY THAT COLUMNIST JACK ANDERSON AND HIS ASSOCIATE, LES WHITTEN, ARE ABOUT TO RELEASE A STORY ON THIS INQUIRY NOW BEING CONDUCTED. At 11:35 a.m., 8/15/74, Supervisor William H. Pryor, Richmond Office, telephonically advised that the Agent handling the requested investigation in Pulaski, Virginia, advised that he was unable to develop any additional information through established sources at Pulaski. At this time it was requested that a telephonic hookup be made with the Agent in Pulaski and this was done. The Agent at Pulaski handling the matter advised that his established sources could only provide the names of two sisters of Roy Shephard that were presently in Pulaski and they could not provide any additional information of additional sisters living in Pulaski. The established sources advised that the two sisters of Shephard are Mrs. John Preston Lucado and Mrs. Glenn Tracy, who is a widow.

This information was relayed to Mr. James Vorenberg of the Special Prosecutor's Office (SPO), who made the original request for investigation. Mr. Vorenberg was advised that the only way to resolve this matter was to interview one of the sisters for additional family background to determine if any additional relatives lived in Pulaski for the purpose of checking safe-deposit boxes. Mr. Vorenberg instructed that one of the sisters be interviewed and be advised that the inquiry was being conducted by the SPO. These instructions were relayed to Supervisor Pryor in Richmond.

At 1:30 p.m., 8/15/74, Supervisor Pryor called to advise that Mrs. Glenn Tracy was interviewed and she was extremely reluctant to furnish any information of family background whatsoever. She advised our Agent that her brother, Roy Shephard, told her that if anyone was making inquiry concerning him that they were not to furnish any information as Roy in the past picked up and delivered papers for the White House. Mrs. Tracy, after a length of time, informed our Agent that she and her sister, Mrs. Lucado, were the only two relatives living in Pulaski and the other relatives reside within a 25 mile radius of her brother Roy Shephard.

Supervisor Pryor advised that the Agent again checked at the banks and determined that no listing existed for a safe-deposit box concerning Mrs. Locado or Mrs. Tracy.

This information was relayed again to Mr. Vorenberg supra, and he stated that although he was nearly 100% satisfied he would like to have the other sisters' names and any variations thereof checked to see if they had safe-deposit boxes, although he knew that the original allegation was that this sister was to allegedly be residing in Pulaski though the fact is that not all of them do. Mr. Vorenberg was advised that this, if not already done, would be accomplished.

Supervisor Pryor of the Richmond Office was instructed to insure that this inquiry, if not already done, would be established. Supervisor Pryor stated that he would notify the Bureau as soon as all items were completed.

Y., who wrote the Director a letter dated 6/26/54, in which he alleged that information had come to his attention that Communists were being employed at two universities at the request of the FBI so that the FBI could keep a watch on them. The source of LONG's information was obtained and the pertinent persons were interviewed in connection with the allegations and the files of the Philadelphia Office reflect at least part of the allegations were unfounded. Rockefeller Foe Is Phila. Ma

The mystery man who stirred Washington with allegations against former New York Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller was identified Sunday as Hamilton A. Long, a lawyer author and lecturer who maintains offices in the Public Ledger Building at 6th and Chestnut sts.

In a written statement and later before TV camera Sunday, the aging Long explained that he had made the allegations against Rockefeller to the White House "to

avoid President Ford's being caught in another 'Eagleton Affair' like 1968."

His reference apparently was to Democratic Presidential nominee George McGovern's decision to drop Sen. Thomas A. Eagleton as his running mate in the 1972 campaign after learning that Eagleton had undergone shock treatments for severe depression.

White House spokesmen said Long had talked to Philip Buchen, President Ford's former law partner and now Presidential counsel,

by phone a week ago. Long warned that bank safe deposit boxes in Pulaski, Va., contained material on Rockefeller gathered by convicted Watergate conspirator E. Howard Hunt Jr.

The tip touched off a week-long search by the FBI for documents that allegedly would provide evidence that Rockefeller hired "goons" to disrupt the Democratic National Convention in Miami Beach in 1972.

The investigation turned up nothing, said Presidential

Press Secretary Jerald F. ter Horst. He denounced the tip.

Confronted by this rebuff, Long revealed this identity in statements to Washington news services.

He said he had been motivated only by his desire to protect Ford from a "too hasty" decision on a Vice President.

His concern, he said, was merely that of "a citizen concerned about sound government in keeping with the traditional American philosophy and the supporting constitutional system, regardless of what party is in office at any time."

Long denied statements from some White House sources that the attack on Rockefeller originated with "right-wing extremists."

He said he was acting only for himself and "is not associated with any group or organization and has never been active politically."

The statement matched those in a profile on Long circulated a decade ago when he was affiliated with the Redpath Agency, a speaker's bureau with offices in Chicago.
