

INTERCEPTION OF COMMUNICATION

Pursuant to a request from Assistant Watergate Special Prosecutor James F. Neal to determine whether or not Everette Howard Hunt, Jr., was staying at the Hotel Pintor Goya, Madrid, Spain, during the period June 29 to July 3, 1972, the following additional investigation was conducted:

[REDACTED] advised she had no further information currently available concerning Duncan Ross, a citizen of the United States, who contacted the Visa Office on July 3, 1972, concerning the loss of his wife's Alien Registration Card. [REDACTED] noted Ross resembled photographs of E. Howard Hunt, but could not state positively Ross and Hunt are identical. She pointed out that Ross bore an "Official" United States Passport.

On September 17, 1974, the files of the Passport Office, Department of State, 1425 K Street, N.W., Washington, D. C., were reviewed in an effort to locate a photograph of Duncan Ross.

Passport Y 1007730 was issued to Duncan Baker Ross, Jr., on June 18, 1971. This is an "Official" Government Passport since Ross is employed by the Department of the Navy, Naval Research Laboratory, Washington, D. C.

A review of Ross' photograph determined that he bears no likeness to Everette Howard Hunt.

On September 19, 1974, a copy of Ross' photograph was furnished to Assistant Watergate Special Prosecutor James F. Neal.

In view of the above, no further investigation is being conducted relative to this matter.

Captioned individual is a member of the Washington News Bureau of the "Los Angeles Times" and is a social acquaintance of SA Richard C. Dennis, Jr., by reason of the fact he lives in close proximity to SA Dennis.

On the morning of this date, 11-12-74, Mr. Houston invited SA Dennis to a luncheon at the "O'Donnell's Restaurant." During the course of the meal, Mr. Houston inquired as to whether or not SA Dennis was aware of former Acting Director L. Patrick Gray, III's testimony in the "Cover Up" trial. Mr. Houston stated that the "Washington Post" indicated that Gray testified yesterday, 11-11-74, that former Attorney General Richard G. Kleindienst had ordered him (Gray) to fire W. Mark Felt. Houston stated that Ron Ostrow, who covers the Department of Justice for the "Los Angeles Times," was interested in writing an article concerning the possibility that W. Mark Felt was "Deep Throat." Houston stated that Ostrow had informed him that the Bureau was investigating Felt as a possible source of leaks during the Watergate investigation. He inquired of SA Dennis whether or not he had heard any information in the Bureau concerning Felt being the subject of FBI investigation. He was informed by SA Dennis that he had no knowledge of any such investigation.

On page 4 of the "Washington Post," this date, it states that former Acting Director L. Patrick Gray, III, testified during cross examination yesterday (11-11-74) that former Attorney General Kleindienst had told him (Gray) to fire Mr. Felt.

Dear Mr. Barrer:

This is to acknowledge your letters dated November 8th,
one of which was directed to Assistant Director John W. Marshall.

As you undoubtedly are aware, investigations and trials
currently are under way in connection with the Watergate case and
it is anticipated that appeals will ensue from some of the lower
court decisions in the Watergate related cases. In line with cur-
rent and long-standing Departmental policy, we are precluded from
disclosing either FBI files or information therefrom which could
deprive individuals of the right to a fair trial or impartial
adjudication.

In addition, the information to which you seek access
is contained in investigatory files compiled for law enforcement
purposes and is thereby exempt from public disclosure pursuant to
the provisions of Title 5, United States Code, Section 552 (b) (7).
While current Departmental policy grants discretionary access to
certain investigatory files of historical interest, it would not
appear that your request comes within the purview of this policy,
since the information you seek is contained in investigatory
files which are less than 15 years old and which are substantially
related to current investigative and/or law enforcement activities.

In view of the above, I regret that I am unable to be
of assistance to you in your documentation endeavors.

This compilation is being prepared as a scholarly work and will be published in a format which will provide the legal, historical, and journalism professions with a comprehensive reference source of information — indexed in depth.

Today Publications & News Service, Inc. is both an accredited news service and a publishing company. Mrs. Myra E. Barrer and I are co-owners of the firm. Mrs. Barrer is accredited as a Congressional reporter and I am accredited to cover the White House, State Department, etc.

In the publishing area, we recently published a book entitled *Women's Organizations & Leaders — 1973 Directory* (December 1973), a major directory which was selected by the American Library Association as one of the "outstanding reference books of the year (1974)." The book was also recommended by the Wilson Library Bulletin with an "A" rating signifying that it is "Important even for a small basic reference collection..." 2--Lists of documents used by or submitted by your group as reference materials.

3--Lists of documents in your possession which are being or have been used by, or submitted by, other government agencies in the Watergate or Impeachment investigations, hearings, or prosecutions.

4—Identification of specific units of government agencies, private organizations, or of individuals who may have documents of the nature just described. This is so that we may better assure a comprehensive coverage of all potential sources of these materials.

5—A copy of the index of materials you may have already submitted to the U.S. Archives or another document storage facility such as a federal records center or a library.

6—If you have not yet sent your materials to such a storage facility, we would like to obtain a list or index of these materials when they are sent.

Once we have obtained these lists, we will then be able to determine which items are in the possession of your organization and which ones we may need a copy of for our work. If a copy is not available for our retention, perhaps we could either borrow a copy for a short period of time or review a copy in your office or library. It would be most useful, however, if we could obtain a copy for our own use.

We would also like to make arrangements to be kept informed about documents that are produced in the future or are obtained by your organization which would pertain to our research. This could be done either by a periodic telephone call to a specific member of your staff or by placing us on your mailing list. It is important to note that we are interested in obtaining the preliminary documents as well as the final ones.

We have already made or are currently making similar arrangements with other government agencies. The Watergate Special Prosecution Force and others have already agreed to assist us in this important work.


Having disclosed the scholastic and historical need for an index which will lead researchers, historians, students and the public to these important documents, may I make it clear that I am not in any way suggesting that my sole purpose in this undertaking is to obtain, for retention, documents from you or your files. I am asking to be allowed to use the documents which are in your possession. From these I need to copy only the title pages, tables of contents, indexes, and similar information which will explain to any reader what might be found within the context of the entire document. Our goal is indexing in depth.

Although we have not yet made the selection, Mrs. Barrer and I have decided to place the entire collection of those documents which we have obtained—when the *Documentation Index* is completed—in the Law Library of a major university or the Law Library of the U. S. Supreme Court.

On the attached pages you will find a copy of the draft Title Page, Table of Contents and a descriptive abstract prepared for librarian purposes.

We would be pleased to meet with you or a member of your staff to answer any further questions concerning this request and its fulfillment by you in the near future.

HAVANA RADIO INTERVIEWS FORMER COUNTERREVOLUTIONARY

[Interview of former Cuban counterrevolutionary leader Carlos Rivero Collado by Radio Havana general director Alfredo Vinas and others--presumably recorded]

[Text] [Vinas] Carlos Rivero Collado appears before us today. He is a former counter-revolutionary leader who has been carrying out revolutionary activities abroad for several years. His social origins and family influence led him to carry out counter-revolutionary activities at the beginning of the revolution's victory and to join various groups and participate in plans including the Playa Giron invasion. In most of these groups he held important positions. Nevertheless, his personal experience led him to understand the intrinsic amorality and repugnance of the enemies of the revolution and the decay and perversity of the capitalist system. In the same way, he found in the example and work of the revolution, his identification with the highest national values and with the interests of the people. Since that time and for many years, Rivero Collado dedicated himself to revolutionary work abroad and he assumed a practical attitude consistent with the political and ideological transformation that had taken place in him. Without further delay we turn over the microphone to the newsmen.

[Jose Prado, Radio Havana] Rivero Collado, when and under what circumstances did you leave Cuba?

[Rivero] I left Cuba on 1 January, 1959 at 5:00 in the morning. I went from the Barranquilla Airport in Colombia to Florida.

[Orlando Castellano, Radio Havana] Rivero, was there a special reason for your departure from Cuba precisely on the same day of the revolution's triumph?

[Rivero] Yes, there was a basic reason. I was 19 years old then and my father, Andres Rivero (Aguero) had been a presidential candidate in the elections of November 1958.

[Jesus Marti, PRELA] Rivero, what (?influenced) you to become a counterrevolutionary?

[Rivero] Apart from my family, there was the environmental influence, that is to say, the influence of the world in which I lived and of which I was a product. This determined why I adopted a counterrevolutionary position from the very first day of January 1959. I would say that the influence of the family, my social origin, the environment, the psychology of the world to which I belonged and the large amount of propaganda against the revolution and socialist ideas--which I thought was all true--determined that I became an enemy of the revolution on that 1 January 1959. I want to add now that I have had to mention my father's name to explain the reasons for my leaving Cuba precisely on the day of the revolution's victory. And even though I have been fully identified with the revolution for some years, my father, as you know, has been and is and I am sure will be an enemy of the revolution. That is, we both maintain completely opposed political attitudes. I want to make clear that despite this, I continue feeling the same affection, respect, and the same deep love I have had for him all my life because in truth my feelings for my father are not only inherent but I am convinced that my father was an honest man, a rare exception in the politics of the Cuba of yesterday.

[Martí] Could you tell us something about your life in the United States and of the process of your political changes?

[Rivero] On 1 January I decided to confront the revolution. I took part in a series of aggressive plans against the revolution which took place in the United States and other countries and which were plotted in 1959, 1960 and 1961 until the Playa Giron invasion in which I also took part. In this way, I was among the founders of a small counter-revolutionary group which was the first one to be founded in the United States to oppose the revolution. It was called the Rosa Blanca. I also took part in other events which occurred at those times and which I do not believe necessary to enumerate. In the Playa Giron invasion I fought in the Playa Larga front and at Playa Giron itself. I was captured and imprisoned for a little over 20 months with the rest of the war prisoners, until December 1962 when, you will recall, there was an exchange of prisoners between the United States and Cuba.

Let me add something about political positions. At the time of our imprisonment I was a political supporter of what has been called the liberal representative democracy. I was a supporter of that political concept from 1959 to 1968. Nevertheless, at the time of our imprisonment I already understood that liberal representative democracy was not the most appropriate system to combat communism. I had become aware of the high degree of dishonesty, cynicism, and perversity of the capitalist system. In early 1963 I decided to become a follower and spokesman of nationalist ideas. Nevertheless, a short time later I also came to understand that this new political position--which was a rejection to my previous political attitude--was in reality a contradiction, a falsehood, because it was evident that maintaining a nationalist counterrevolutionary position necessarily led to fascism, and there are many examples to prove this in the counterrevolution. That is, to avoid what has happened to other counterrevolutionaries who have advanced from the position of simple nationalist counterrevolution to fascism, I decided to maintain myself in the position of real nationalism. That is, a kind of nationalism which in many aspects coincided with the positions which today are being adopted by a group of Latin American nations which promote rapprochement and a policy of respect toward the Cuban revolutionary process. That is, in assuming this attitude I understood that in reality I had two choices: advance toward fascism or maintain myself in an anti-fascist nationalism. I also understood that the difference between the anti-imperialist nationalism, the real nationalism--let us say the Martí form of nationalism--that he described the United States policy with its true name: imperialism--and the position of the true revolutionary was almost unnoticeable, that there was a minimal distance between them.

[Castellano] Rivero, in your previous answer you talked about the so-called nationalist counterrevolutionaries who have adopted the fascist policy, to quote you. It is understood that these fascist groups are responsible for the terrorist attacks against some Cuban diplomatic offices abroad. Is this true?

[Rivero] This is completely true. The fascist counterrevolutionaries are the authors and the organizers of the terrorist campaign which began 10 years ago with the so-called "war through the roads of the world" and which is continuing today with the actions reported by the press during these last few weeks. We can say that the leaders of these terrorist cells are 98, 99 percent fascists. That is, they are public and open admirers of Mussolini, Hitler, Primo de Rivera, and at the present time of the complete fascist Chilean tyrant Augusto Pinochet.

All of the terrorist bands which operate in U.S. territory and in other countries such as Mexico, Venezuela and Spain, are definitely fascist and they have adopted this terrorist strategy because they are aware of that what they call the anticommunist cause--the counterrevolutionary struggle--has failed and they think that terrorism is the only road open to them. We can say that terrorism is the direct result of the failure of the counterrevolution as a political cause. I would say that terrorism is the typical expression of defeat.

[Prado] According to your statements, you appear to know certain secret things about these fascist groups. Do you?

[Rivero] Yes. During the development of my revolutionary work in U.S. territory I had to keep in close contact with most of these fascist groups, founders of terrorist bands which have been operating since (1962).

[Prado] You say that the fascists direct these dynamite attacks. Can you expand on this?

[Rivero] As I explained, the beginning of the terrorist campaign in 1964 was the creation of the Cuban nationalist movement--I reiterate, a movement of broad Nazi affiliation, which is well known in counterrevolutionary circles. The terrorist campaign was born with the terrorist attack against the UN building. Fascist elements hurled a bazooka projectile at the UN building in New York. Fortunately, it did not hit the building and instead fell in the East River. This was the beginning of "the war through the roads of the world" which moved--independent from these criminal actions--from a moderate position to 1967 and 1968--when as a result of this terrorist wave new groups were created, such as Cuban Power, the Secret Anti-Communist Army and other similar groups which carried out this campaign.

United, these terrorist groups unleashed a terror campaign in 1968. In less than a year, more than 70 bombs were placed in U.S. territory. Seventy terrorist attempts took place. These attacks were primarily directed against--as many people, especially those abroad, will recall--the diplomatic offices of the nations which maintained relations with Cuba. That is to say, those European countries and Mexico which had refused to go along with the criminal policy of the Cuban blockade which was decreed by U.S. imperialism. This terrorist campaign in 1968 was also directed at attacking counterrevolutionary elements who were doing their work from a capitalist viewpoint, that is, they had businesses and so on; a campaign was unleashed against the counterrevolutionary capitalists who refused to contribute economically to these terrorist groups because it is obvious that this campaign ran counter to their own interests. Nevertheless, around October 1968, and we all know that in U.S. political life the months before the election are crucial, about 4 weeks before the '68 elections, the U.S. repressive bodies, mainly the FBI, decided to eliminate these groups basically because U.S. public opinion, the U.S. press, were exerting strong pressures, especially on the FBI, so that the general elections might be held in a peaceful atmosphere. Because of this, these groups--Cuban Power, the Nationalist Movement, and other minor groups--were neutralized just 3 or 4 weeks before the 1968 elections.

[Martí] We understand that these terrorist actions continued. Is that right?

[Rivero] Yes, the terrorist actions continued because the neutralization was not effective and moreover it was only temporary. That is, I understand that the neutralization was basically carried out so that the elections could be held in a peaceful atmosphere.

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However, an analysis of the events of the counterrevolution during the past 10 years shows us that more than 3 years later, this terrorist campaign which the FBI thought it had neutralized, reemerged with a criminal action. It was the action which took place in Montreal. You will recall that the Cuban trade offices in Montreal were attacked early in 1972 and destroyed and a Cuban revolutionary was assassinated. This attack was carried out by a terrorist group called Young Cuba and was coordinated with other fascist elements who resided--and I understand they still do--in Montreal and other Canadian cities and who had been cooperating with the campaign of the Cuban Nationalist Movement since 1964. And we must not forget that in 1966-1967 our embassy in Ottawa was attacked twice. That is, this action was carried out by the youth band. The band was formed by a group of young fascists who had belonged, some of them, to former [Cuban] President Carlos Eric Secarras' group and others to the group led by Ramiro de la Fe, a Playa Girón invader, a counterrevolutionary who served a sentence of 2 and 1/2 years in the United States for illegal activities. As I understand it, this operation was financed with a \$2,500 contribution from former President Carlos Eric Secarras. The counterrevolutionaries Eduardo Iru and Rafael Perez (Peral) directly participated in the attack against the Cuban trade office in Montreal. They had the cooperation of an individual with the last name of Soto, a resident in Montreal.

These youths, who had been part of the Young Cuba band, in a short time created another fascist band also dedicated to terrorism. It was named the Cuban Neorevolutionary Action. During mid-1973, they plotted a personal attack against Cuban ambassador to Mexico [name indistinct]. After the bloody coup d'etat in Chile on 11 September 1973, these elements reintegrated themselves with Ramiro de la Fe's group.

At the end of 1973, the individual who we could say coordinated the work of the Chilean counterrevolutionaries was a newsman, a resident in Miami named Pedro Ernesto Diaz. He is closely linked to the Chilean criminal band, fatherland and freedom and to the coupist military group. He established close contacts and strong ties with this terrorist band which had acted in Montreal, Canada, and which was led by Ramiro de la Fe. In this way, these Chilean and Cuban counterrevolutionaries created a so-called pro-Chile committee, essentially aimed at creating favorable propaganda for the fascist military junta because, as is known, the junta's international [word indistinct] from the moment when they committed the crime of assassinating President Salvador Allende and violated the Chilean people's rights incurred a large scale, worldwide repudiation. The junta believed that it needed the help of specific elements inside the United States.

Besides this, a few days after the heroic death of President Allende, a close friend of Chilean tyrant Augusto Pinochet, Col Eduardo Sepulveda, visited Miami and personally met with Ramiro de la Fe and with this group of young terrorists. As I understand it, a kind of bargain was struck between the Chilean fascist colonel and a group of Cuban counterrevolutionaries led by Ramiro de la Fe. The pact specifically provided that if the counterrevolutionary elements in Miami and the northern zone carried out a pro-junta publicity campaign, and if this campaign was successful, Colonel Eduardo Sepulveda would request from the Chilean tyrant that the Chilean military junta supply the Cuban counterrevolutionaries with arms, equipment and money. This help from the Chilean military junta has two objectives: first, to promote the campaigns of the pro-Chile committee which is simply a propagandistic publicity committee, and second, to directly aid the terrorist actions these elements have been carrying out in U.S. territory and in various Latin American and European countries.

[Prado] Does this mean that, according to you, it is fully confirmed that these counterrevolutionary actions are financed by the Chilean fascist junta?

[Rivero] I would not say that the entire terrorist campaign--which is already 10 years old--has been financed by the Chilean junta, nor would I say that the whole terrorist campaign which is taking place at this moment and has been carried out since 11 September 1973 has been financed by the Chilean junta. However, I do assure you that the terrorist campaigns being carried out by the group of Cuban counterrevolutionaries led by Ramiro de la Fe and made up of Playa Giron invaders and of members of the secret anti-communist army, which we named before and which operated in 1968 and was temporarily neutralized, and by the group of young fascists who perpetrated the Montreal crime, I do assure you that the campaigns of these elements are directly financed with money from the Chilean fascist military junta.

I would like to comment on an incident that--even if it is not widely known by the public is perfectly well known by counterrevolutionary elements with fascist leanings operating in U.S. territory. It is as follows: When Cuban Prime Minister Dr Fidel Castro visited Chile in October 1971, a group of counterrevolutionary fascists, sponsored by the CIA, engineered a plot to assassinate both the Cuban revolutionary leader and President Allende. The name of the person who directed this operation, this terrorist attack, is Jesus Dominguez Benitez, known as "the islander." He had been closely linked to Cuban Power, a terrorist organization which, as we have said, operated in 1968. He also participated in the infiltration attempt by a group of counterrevolutionaries in the early part of January 1970 led by Vicente Mendez. This individual, Jesus Dominguez Benitez, had been arrested twice by the FBI and tried on two occasions by two different courts for illegal activities. Nevertheless, this individual was released within a few days, and enjoyed such complete freedom of movement that he was able to gather arms and organize a personal attack against two Latin American heads of state.

The work of this cell, directed by Jesus Dominguez Benitez, had the cooperation of several Cuban counterrevolutionaries residing in Caracas, Venezuela. These false documents acquired for Benitez accredited him as a Venezuelan citizen and newsman. With these documents Benitez traveled to Santiago, Chile to cover the visit of the Cuban prime minister to the southern sister nation. Later it was learned that Dominguez Benitez also had the cooperation of a group of Chilean military elements who had been plotting against President Salvador Allende from the very day the Popular Unity government came to power in September 1970. This individual later returned to Venezuela and eventually to the United States.

Regarding all this, I am prompted to ask why the U.S. authorities cannot control an individual who has been convicted on two occasions by judicial courts in the city of Miami and if perhaps the U.S. authorities do not know how to, cannot or have no intention of protecting their borders against these criminal plans.

[Castellano] Rivero Collado, could you tell us anything about the current plans of these terrorist elements that operate in several countries?

[Rivero Collado] I can assure you that the terrorist campaign which these elements have waged in the last 10 years against the diplomatic missions of several countries from now on is going to be an open war by the most aggressive factions of the counterrevolution against--allow me to repeat--the American nations which favor the lifting of the blockade against Cuba at the next, 14th meeting of American foreign ministers, to be held this Friday in Quito.

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This will mean mainly terrorist attacks against the embassies of the nations that vote in favor of the lifting of the blockade--in the United States and in several countries where these fascist bands operate--as we said before, in Mexico, Spain, Venezuela and other countries. And above all, there is a plan on the part of the fascist terrorist groups of the counterrevolution to assassinate the diplomats, foreign ministers and ambassadors of these nations accredited in this country.

[Martí] Rivero, are you saying that they are planning to kill Latin American diplomats?

[Rivero] That is correct. This strategy was outlined in mid-73, when the aggressive elements of the counterrevolution started to get a glimpse of the positive change of attitude on the part of the Latin American nations toward the Cuban Revolution. It might also be added that the plan of these elements is aimed at two specific individuals: first U.S. Secretary of State Henry Kissinger and second Costa Rican Foreign Minister Gonzalo Pacio, who, as we all know, has been the proponent of this Friday meeting in Quito.

Recently we read a report in a U.S. newspaper which, we could say, broadens and corroborates what we had known from a private source since 1972--basically, that this plan to try to kill the U.S. secretary of state began to take shape in mid--or better said, toward the end of--1973. This plan has been updated in the past few weeks. For example, this fact--which, I repeat, we learned from a private source--has been corroborated by a U.S. newsmen, who I understand is the one most widely read by the U.S. public--Jack Anderson.

[Prado] Besides the terrorist groups you have referred to several times in your replies, we understand that other similar groups or gangs have emerged recently. What can you tell us in this regard?

[Rivero] I would say first of all--I believe I have a series of notes here on these groups to which we will refer--that the terrorist cells of the Cuban Nationalist Movement, of the so-called Cuban Nationalist Movement, continue operating just as they did prior to 1968. These elements have--that is, had--their major effectiveness in what they call the north zone, which comprises the metropolitan area of New York City as well as certain areas of the state of New Jersey. These elements have been the creators, the founders of so-called Group Zero, the so-called terrorist gang that publicly claimed responsibility for the assassination of Jose Y Diaz de la Torriente, a 70-year-old senior citizen whom the fascist counterrevolutionaries accused of stealing the funds of the so-called Torriente plan, which were to be used to combat the revolution.

A few weeks after Torriente was killed, shot, attacked from behind, another 60-year-old man, Ernesto Rodriguez, president of the Christian Democratic Movement in exile, as they call it, that is, of the counterrevolutionary Christian Democrats, was also fatally shot in Miami. Four days after Torrientes' murder, the Cuban Jover 1968 leader and head of the terrorist gangs, Arturo Rodriguez Vives, was found murdered in New York. And at the end of August this year the leader of the Cuban Nationalist Movement, invader of Playa Giron and leader of a cell of the Zero Group, Hector Diaz Limon, was found strangled to death in Union City, New Jersey. This, of course, is but a small, intimate part of what has become to be known as the internal war within the counter-revolution, which, as we have seen, has already claimed the lives of several persons.

Second, we have the so-called Secret Cuban Government, which was founded in 1972 and carried out several spectacular terrorist attacks until 1974 when it joined the so-called Cuban Liberation National Front, FNLC, which today is the most active terrorist group. The Secret Cuban Government is a terrorist gang made up of former members of Cuban Power 1968, a group named Aramir--Aramir Alliance--and the Marti Guerrilla Movement [Movimiento Insurreccional Martiano] which has been the front for this terrorist group. We could say that the headquarters of this Secret Cuban Government was also based in the northern area, that is to say, in what the American people call the industrialized northeast.

In 1973, in November 1973, the so-called Secret Cuban Government was hatching a plan to assassinate the Cuban ambassador to the United Nations, Ricardo Alarcon Quesada. To accomplish this objective the so-called Secret Cuban Government had an apartment in New York City, in what they call uptown or uptown Manhattan, that is the northern part of New York City, where they stored plastic material, explosive plastic material known as G-3, G-4 and DA-9. There they also kept two M-3 machineguns, hand grenades, and several automatic pistols and parts for them. It is worthwhile noting that the plastic material that was being kept in the apartment I referred to is exactly the same as that which the following month, or 2 months later, in January 1974, was found in the children's playground on the premises of our embassy in Mexico. However, this action in Mexico was carried out by the third terrorist gang we are going to analyze. That has taken the name of Cuban Action.

Cuban Action is a terrorist gang made up of members of the Guerrilla Movement for Revolutionary Recovery [Movimiento Insurreccional de Recuperacion Revolucionaria--MIRR], which is not to be confused with the patriotic MIR--in other words, this is the anti-patriotic MIRR, its opposite--and by activists of the so-called Revolutionary Directorate [Directorio Revolucionario]. We can say that in 1973 a young man 26 or 27 years old went to Paris with the intention of blowing up the Cuban Embassy there on behalf of this group. However, the very powerful bomb he was carrying exploded in his hands, killing him instantly and destroying his body, which was never found--in other words, the bomb tore him apart and destroyed an entire floor of the hotel in a town near Paris named (Abrairieville). This individual, [words indistinct] La Cruz, in reality was a victim of the ringleaders of these groups which sent him to Paris--independent of the fact that he was a terrorist. Basically he was a victim of these other elements that take no risks even though they are ringleaders and directors.

Beside the Cuban Action [Accion Cubana] gang, we have the National Front for Cuban Liberation, known as the FNLC, which we could say is a mixture of terrorist cells that have belonged to other earlier terrorist groups. It also comprises mercenaries of the Yankee army trained in Fort Jackson, Fort Benning and Fort Knox, and now also has a number of veterans. The FNLC is also formed by followers of Ramon Crozco Crespo and the of pirates who have carried out several nautical attacks on our fishermen over the past few years, as well as a team of parachutists known as the Golden Hawks and a dissident group of the so-called Authentic Party of the Miami area and other elements.

I would like to add that there is complete coordination among the Secret Cuban Government Cuban Action and the FNLC. In reality, I would say that it is the same group--as we claimed earlier--which branches out to give an impression of being more numerous and to deceive the public. This front, the FNLC, is responsible for sending explosive packages through the mail from Mexico to several Cuban embassies abroad. Of these, one that arrived at the embassy in Lima seriously injured a Cuban woman employee in one arm. And one that arrived at a Madrid post office injured two Spanish postal employees.

[Castellano] Rivero Collado, could you name the counterrevolutionaries that direct these terrorist groups?

[Rivero] There are coordinators, cell leaders, and cell members in these terrorist groups. The coordinators or main leaders of the terrorist gangs are the following: Felipe Rivero Diaz and Guillermo (Novo Sampol) for the so-called Cuban Nationalist Movement and for the Group Zero. Felipe Rivero coordinates operations in Florida and Guillermo Novo Sampol in New York. In the North, Hector A. Fabian, Francisco Hernandez and Guillermo Miguel, of the so-called Secret Cuban Government; Orlando Bosch Avila and Antonio (Calatayud) for Cuban Action; Ramon Orozco Crespo, Angel J. Ferrer, Frank Castro, Humberto Lopez and Alfredo (Sayuz) for the FNLG. A counterrevolutionary named Gustavo Marin Duarte also joined the FNLG recently.

As cell bosses of the aforementioned terrorist gangs we have Orlando (Aquinza) Perez, Ignacio Novo Sampol, and Felipe Martinez Blanco for the so-called Nationalist Movement or Group Zero, which is one and the same; Oscar Luis Acevedo and Edwin Gonzalez, Playa Giron invaders and former members of the Secret Anticommunist Army, for the so-called Secret Cuban Government; also Guido (Sanz) y Perez (Hevilla), Playa Giron invader and former secretary general of the (MIR) which was led by Orlando Bosch Avila, who is the coordinator of the terrorist gang Cuban Action in the city of San Juan, Puerto Rico. We also have Conrado Rodriguez Sanchez, Humberto Lopez Junior, Luis Crespo and Juan Jose (Peruero) for the FNLG.

Lopez and Crespo were seriously wounded in March when a medium-size bomb exploded in their hands while they were trying to set it in a box to be mailed to one of our embassies abroad. This explosion occurred in the home of counterrevolutionary Alfredo Sayuz, who has been serving as coordinator--the man who has been coordinating the work of these three groups. There are other elements who, beside taking an active part in the terrorist campaigns also have tasks we could call "unspecified." Their names are Horacio (Minguillon) and Rolando (Minguillon), Arturo Munoz, Antonio Mendez, Jose Perez Linares Pedro Hernandez, Francisco Molina, Rafael Gonzalez (Labrado), Gabriel (Abay) and Jose Aguila (Caliman). These elements operate in New York City, although Mr Aguila Caliman also resides in the Dominican Republic. Also, Luis (Corno), director of a counterrevolutionary newspaper, Jurto (Malcon), Jose (Llevero), Eduardo Paz and Jesus Lazo. These elements carry out and coordinate terrorist attacks in Miami. We also have Aldo (Rosau), Silvia (Ware) and Peire (Hornap), who operate in the terrorist cells in Los Angeles, California.

[Martí] Rivero, you spoke earlier of a plan [words indistinct] to assassinate Latin American diplomats. I think this subject is very interesting and very important, so I would like an answer: Could you tell us which of these groups is preparing this plan to murder Latin American diplomats?

[Rivero] The plan has been ordered by the following counterrevolutionary elements: Orlando Bosch Avila, Antonio Calatayud, Hector A. Fabian, Ramon Orozco Crespo, Felipe Rivero Diaz, Juan Jose Peruero, Angel J. Ferrer and Gustavo Marin Duarte.

It is known that they have had meetings on this subject over the past few months. It is necessary to recall something we have not mentioned here tonight, and that is the well known fact that on 19 September, as you will recall, Costa Rican Foreign Minister Gonzalo Fazio received a death threat in Washington. This threat was publicly confirmed by the Costa Rican ambassador in Washington, Rodolfo Silva. As you will also recall, the U.S. Secret Service assigned five of its agents to protect the Costa Rican foreign minister wherever he went in Washington.

It is also known that a terrorist cell traveled to Washington around 18 September. This meeting, which agreed to hold this Friday's meeting in suite, a meeting of the Permanent Council of the OAS consultative body, was held in Washington at the Pan American Union building on 20 September.

We should also recall that, as we were saying before, this campaign is directed against the U.S. secretary of state. This is what has been said during the meetings of the aggressive counterrevolutionary circles, and which columnist Anderson now not only confirms but tells us something we did not know about--the fact that these terrorist gangs were planning to kill members of the U.S. Congress who proposed a revision of U.S. policy toward the Cuban Revolution.

[Prado] But you have mentioned, Rivero Collado, that the elements who on various occasions attacked our fishermen were linked with these terrorist acts. Could you explain this more clearly?

[Rivero] Counterrevolutionaries Juan Jose (Peruvero), Antonio Iglesias and Ramon Orozco Crespo come from these pirate groups. (Peruvero) and Iglesias were the two counterrevolutionaries who led the attack on the town of [words indistinct] where two Cuban revolutionaries were cowardly assassinated and several of the local inhabitants were wounded. I understand that among those wounded was a 13-year-old girl whose right leg had to be amputated the next day. After this attack, these counterrevolutionaries together with Ramon Orozco Crespo became involved in the FMLC terrorist plans. Prior to becoming a terrorist, Orozco Crespo carried out a series of attacks on our fishing boats between the years 1972 and 1973--including the one carried out on 3 October 1973 in which they went so far as to kill a humble fisherman and kidnap his body. We must add that this same Ramon Orozco Crespo served for many years as bodyguard--years ago they were all called bodyguards--of Florida multimillionaire (Maurice Ferre). Since we are talking about those who were involved in these activities, I would like to add that these men walk freely down the streets of Miami and New York and publicly boast of such activities as having attacked a fishermen's village causing a 13-year-old girl to lose her leg. They publicly boast about these things and consider them acts of heroism. And some of the members of these aggressive groups truly accept them as heroes. These groups have publicly announced that despite the already obvious international atmosphere of detente, they will continue fighting--and I quote--"even if they have to fight the U.S. authorities themselves."

We must add that these attacks on Cuba have been carried out by boats anchored in the Miami River which goes right through the city. Nevertheless, these boats that have attacked Cuba are still there, apparently (untouched). These men continue to walk freely down the streets of Miami, they still have the weapons, the equipment and the ships they used in [words indistinct] and other such activities. They continue plotting and planning despite the existence of a piracy treaty signed by Cuba and the United States on 15 February 1970.

[Castellano] Rivero Collado, changing the subject a little bit, do you believe the total extent of the Cuban counterrevolutionaries' participation in the Watergate affair has come to light?

[Rivero] I do not think that everything has fully been revealed. Not all of the names have been revealed. I can personally say that the group of five counterrevolutionaries--including James McCord, who is North American but who thinks like a Cuban counter-revolutionary--which broke into the Watergate building was originally a group of six.

At the last minute it was decided that the sixth member was not to participate that night in Watergate. This sixth individual is Angel J. Ferrer, and I think that we have broadly discussed him in our previous statements.

Something else which has not been revealed is the name and direct participation in the Watergate conspiracy of Manolo (Arttime West), civilian chief of the Playa Giron invasion and a CIA agent for many years who, you will recall, approximately 2 years ago was plotting to assassinate the Panamanian chief of government, Gen Omar Torrijos. Arttime has had a long-standing and direct participation in everything dealing with Watergate; nevertheless, his name has not really been publicized.

Another Watergate conspirator--and this is known in counterrevolutionary circles, I am not making this up, this is simply commented upon by other groups--is Mike Suarez Fernandez. Also taking part in Watergate was Humberto Lopez who is linked with the Cuban National Liberation Front [Frente Nacional de Liberacion Cubana], a terrorist group. Mike Suarez Fernandez and Humberto Lopez are activists of the so-called Authentic Party of the Miami area. I understand that according to comments that were made in Miami and New York, counterrevolutionaries of Cuba extraction Eebe Rebozo and (Edgar Marti) are not completely dissociated--they are not even halfway dissociated--from the Watergate conspiracy.

[Marti] You mentioned before that the terrorist campaign is a result of the failure of the counterrevolution. What are, in your opinion, the factors that caused such a failure?

[Rivero] The total failure of the counterrevolution is caused by the demonstrated truth that the Cuban revolution is a historical and irreversible fact. Moreover, I would say that the most recent [factor is] the terrorist campaign that puts the counterrevolutionaries outside the law. This criminal terrorist campaign has given rise to an extensive worldwide rejection, as well as rejection on the part of U.S. public opinion and even more, I would add that terrorism is the swan song of the counterrevolution.

[Prado] You have been in Cuba for some time. How do you feel and what are your impressions?

[Rivero] Well, friend Prado, I feel highly honored and pleased to have returned to my country after so many years absence. In the short time I have been here I have toured the country from one end to the other, and I have honestly been able to realize the extraordinary social transformations that have been achieved by the Cuban revolution. This puts our country in the forefront among nations.

[Marti] One last question. What are your plans?

[Rivero] Right now I am concluding a book about the history of the counterrevolution. It is, one might say, a story that goes from the foundation of the White Rose in January 1959 to the Watergate events which only 3 months ago caused the downfall of the President of the United States. I believe the book will be published shortly.

[unidentified speaker] We wish to thank Carlos Rivero Collado for his participation in this program.

We have presented an interview with Carlos Rivero Collado, former counterrevolutionary leader who, when he ceased being one, carried out revolutionary activities abroad for several years. Thank you very much.

On 11/8/74, PARKINSON was interviewed utilizing polygraph by SAs PEARCE and ANDERSON with SA LANO as an observer. Examination afforded PARKINSON in the office of Watergate Special Prosecutor.

The results of polygraph examination are being set forth in enclosed LHM suitable for dissemination. Additionally, results of interview during the pre-polygraph examination will be made into FD-302 forwarded to the Bureau and WFO.

Bureau note that under agreement for polygraph examination, no effort was made to interrogate PARKINSON for evidentiary purposes.

Polygraph examination was directed towards ascertaining PARKINSON's truthfulness and information previously furnished by him explaining his part and his overall part as attorney for the Committee to Re-elect the President. PARKINSON represented this Committee in civil action brought by the Democratic party.

PARKINSON voluntarily signed Interrogation; Advice of Rights form plus form consenting to interview with polygraph. These forms and polygraph charts and questions are being incorporated into Philadelphia file.

All of the above enclosed memoranda to the Bureau were received on 11/7/74 from JAMES F. NEAL, Associate Special Prosecutor, handling the Watergate special prosecution trial of KENNETH WELLS PARKINSON in Washington, D.C.

Additionally, on 11/7/74 Assistant Watergate Special Prosecutor JILL WINE VOLNER turned over a xerox copy of a memorandum prepared by her dated 1/25/74 under subject "The Evidence of Conspiracy And Obstruction of Justice by KENNETH WELLS PARKINSON." This memorandum is being incorporated into Philadelphia file. The memorandum sets forth circumstantial and evidentiary information against PARKINSON gathered by the Watergate Special Prosecution Office and was used for review and preparation for the polygraph examination of PARKINSON on 11/8/74. It is pointed out to the Bureau that referenced Washington Field airtel of 11/8/74 enclosing letterhead memorandum reporting results of polygraph examination of PARKINSON shows that PARKINSON was practicing deception when he denied seeing or being advised about the enclosures, all of which apparently were prepared by or for defendant HUNT.

The original of memorandum dated 11/7/74 was retained by Associate Special Prosecutor JAMES F. NEAL and was signed by PARKINSON and his attorney.

REL IDW AND STATEMENT OF PROBLEM

The seven Watergate defendants, and others not yet indicted, bugged DNC offices initially against their better judgment, knowing that Larry O'Brien was seldom there, and that many items of interest were being moved to Florida. Furthermore the defendants pressed an alternate plan to bug O'Brien's Pontainebleau convention suite, before occupancy, a low-risk, high-gain operation which was rejected.

The seven defendants again protested further bugging of DNC Headquarters on June 16th-17th, the intercepted conversations by then having shown clearly that O'Brien was not using his office. Again, objections were over-ridden and the attempt was loyally made even though money for outside guards was struck from the operational budget by Jeb Magruder. In fact the entire history of GEMSTONE was characterized by diminishing funding coupled with increasing demands by those who conceived and sponsored the activity.

If initial orders to bug DNC Headquarters were ill-advised, the defendants' sponsors compounded the fiasco by the following acts:

1. Indecisiveness at the moment of crisis.
2. Failure to quash the investigation while that option was still open.
3. Allowing Hunt's safe to be opened and selected contents handed to the FBI.
4. Permitting an FBI investigation whose unprecedented scope and vigor caused humiliation to families, friends and the defendants themselves.
5. Granting immunity to Baldwin.
6. Permitting defendants to fall into the hands of a paranoid judge and three self-admitted liberal Democrat prosecutors.
7. Failure to provide promised support funds on a timely and adequate basis; continued postponements and consequent avoidance of commitments.
8. An apparent wash-hands attitude now that the Election has been won, heightening the sense of unease among all defendants who have grown increasingly to feel that they are being off up as scapegoats ultimately to be abandoned.

Items for consideration:

1. Once the criminal trial ends, the DNC civil suit resumes. In his deposition John Mitchell may well have perjured himself.
2. Pending are three investigations by Congressional committee. The Democratic Congress is not going to simply let the Watergate affair die away.
3. The media are offering huge sums for defendants' stories. For example, an offer to one defendant for his "autobiography" now stands at \$745,000.
4. The Watergate bugging is only one of a number of highly illegal conspiracies engaged in by one or more of the defendants at the behest of senior White House officials. These as yet undisclosed crimes can be proved.
5. Immunity from prosecution and/or judicial clemency for cooperating defendants is a standing offer.
6. Congressional elections will take place in less than two years.

Defendants' Position

The defendants have followed all instructions meticulously, keeping their part of the bargain by maintaining silence. They have not, until now, attempted to contact persons still in positions of responsibility in an effort to obtain relief and reassurance, believing pre-Election security to be a primary consideration.

The Administration, however, remains deficient in living up to its commitments. These commitments were and are

1. Financial support
2. Legal defense fees
3. Pardons
4. Rehabilitation

Having recovered from post-Election euphoria, the Administration should now attach high priority to keeping its commitments and taking affirmative action in behalf of the defendants.

To end further misunderstandings the seven defendant have set November 27th at 5:00 p.m. as the date by which all past and current financial requirements are to be paid, and credible assurances given of continued resolve to honor all commitments. Half-measures will be unacceptable.

Accordingly, the defendants are meeting on November 25th to determine our joint and automatic response to evidence of continued indifference on the part of those in whose behalf we suffered the loss of our employment, our futures and our reputations as honorable men.

The foregoing should not be misinterpreted as a threat. It is among other things a reminder that loyalty has always been a two-way street.

I received a call from Mr. Rivers at noon on the above date and arranged to pick up what he "was able to scrape up on such short notice". I asked the amount and was told \$53,500. I then asked what distribution was to be made and was told that it was up to me, but that I would be accountable at our next conversation. I informed Mr. Rivers that Mr. Liddy had telephoned me the previous night and informed me that since he would be in court on the 19th, he would appreciate it if I could handle any contact for him.

Mr. Rivers said he had not arranged anything about Mr. Liddy (a fact I am not going to pass on to Mr. Liddy as I feel it will anger him), and asked me to spread the \$53,500 out to include Mr. Liddy and his attorney as well as Mr. McCord. He concluded that he would be in touch with me again when he could and repeated that this amount was all he was able to scrape up on such short notice. I thanked him.

| \$10,000 | Under table bail money for Mr. Barker |

(Note: Income replacement was for a period of July-Nov.)

In August, I gave Mr. Barker a total of \$3,000 for expenses of travel for himself and others and for telephone expense and for interest paid on pawning of wife's jewelry.

In other words, I received a total of \$88,000 and have paid out \$91,000 (using the final \$3,000 from my own funds)

You already have an accounting of the \$53,500 received on September 19th.

In view of developments since the commencement of this trial and after discussions with lawyers for the above subject, we have concluded to allow you to administer a polygraph test to Mr. Parkinson with results being used for informational purposes. I hereby advise counsel for this defendant that there are no commitments on either side regardless of the outcome of the test, and I will secure the agreement of this defendant and his counsel that the results of the test are to be kept strictly confidential.

The questions that should be asked of Mr. Parkinson are:

1. During calendar year 1972, did he see, or receive, all or any part of either of the accountings from Dorothy Hunt to William Bittman dated September 19 and October 2, 1972?

2. If the answer to numer one is negative, was he advised during calendar year 1972 of any of the contents of either of these accountings?

3. Did he receive on or around December 1, 1972, a memorandum, or writing, ^{FROM WM BITTMAN} setting forth a list of needs of the original Watergate defendants?

4. If so, did he read all ^{ALoud} or a portion of this memorandum or writing or was it read or discussed in his presence? That is, was he aware of the contents of this writing on or around the date mentioned above?

5. Did he, during the calendar year 1972 receive or have read to him all or any part of a memorandum dated November 14, 1972, prepared by Dorothy Hunt or Howard Hunt and given to William Bittman captioned "Review and Statement of Problem?"
